Golden Slipper sire Sidestep to remain in Queensland

*Deal sees son of Exceed And Excel
continue at Telemon Thoroughbreds*

Sidestep (Exceed And Excel), the sire of Saturday's Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Kiamichi, will stay in Queensland for the 2019 breeding season despite his sudden rise to prominence.

Darley last night confirmed the emerging young sire, whose first crop daughter Kiamichi led most of the way to win the world's richest

two-year-old race on Saturday, will stand at Dan Fletcher's Telemon Thoroughbreds for at least another year where he is expected to cover a full book of mares.

The announcement also ended a day of discussion between the two parties about how best to manage Sidestep's burgeoning career after he initially seemed to have become "lost" among the plethora of new stallions being retired to stud each year.

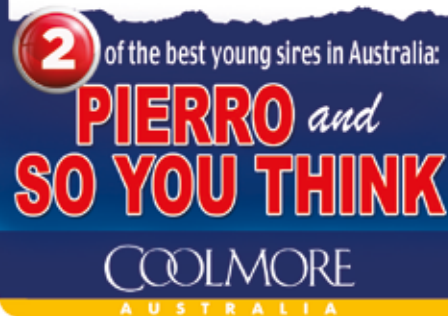

Last-start Phar Lap Stakes (Gr 2, 1500m) winner Verry Elleegant (Zed) will wear ear muffs in the Vinery Stud Stakes (registered as the Storm Queen Stakes) (Gr 1, 2000m) at Rosehill on Saturday. The three-year-old filly, who is trained by Chris Waller after starting her career in New Zealand before a stint with Darren Weir, also wears a nose roll. "It seems to be effective," Waller told Racing NSW. "The more you try to change them often can bring you undone. But we will be putting some ear muffs on just to try to get her to relax a bit. That's the only thing I want to do, get her to switch off a touch." Stablemate Zalatte (Medaglia d'Oro), who pulled up lame in the Phar Lap Stakes when seventh, is also set to run in the Vinery. *Morning Briefing page 4* ➔

Alastair Pulford, Darley stallions' head of sales, said Sheikh Mohammed's stud operation was pleased to honour the two-year agreement reached last year and, in turn, would also support Sidestep with its own mares in 2019.

"We are thrilled not only for ourselves but for Dan Fletcher and Joe Heather (stud manager), who gave the horse the opportunity he would have been denied in the Hunter Valley last year," Pulford told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"We are also delighted to support Telemon and the Queensland breeders for another year in the knowledge that there is a precedent.

"Spirit Of Boom and Better Than Ready have emerged with very good two-year-old crops in the past two years and prior to that, the year Written Tycoon spent in Queensland, it turned

his career around because he sired Golden Slipper winner Capitalist."

Sidestep began his career alongside his champion sire Exceed And Excel (Danahill) at Kelvinside before relocating to Fletcher's fledgling Telemon Thoroughbreds as his foundation stallion last year, his fourth season at stud, in a bid to provide the dual Group 2 winner with more opportunities.

Sidestep covered 57 mares at a fee of \$7,700 (inc GST) in 2018 after covering just 36 mares the previous year in NSW, but his breakthrough Group 1 win as a sire is sure to see his popularity swell.

Fletcher, who purchased the Telemon Thoroughbreds property in 2016 and began operations after a lease on the farm expired last year, believes Sidestep's Golden Slipper success could be the boost his stud needed.

He also said the decision was an important one for Queensland breeders and for the development of Sidestep, a factor also recognised by Darley management.

"The mare population up here has got an amazing record of producing two-year-old success," Fletcher told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"He is an up-and-coming young sire and he is arguably the hottest young stallion. It is of great advantage to Queensland breeders to be able to use him."

When Telemon Thoroughbreds announced it had secured Sidestep for stud duties last year, Fletcher provided breeders with an incentive to support the stallion in that if they sent a mare to him in 2018 they could send another mare to him for the same fee in 2019.

"One of the most encouraging things for us is that Darley is sending some nice mares of their own up to him as well and are determined to support him," he said.

"If we do cap him at 150 to 160 mares, which is the Darley way as they don't like to have their horses overworked, there is probably not going to be a hell of a lot of room for other people to get in.

"From what we have already taken, and I know everyone says this, but it is an absolute fact: the horse will (be full) really quickly." *Continued on page 3>>*

<< *Continued from page 2* Pulford agreed that breeders' awareness of Sidestep had grown exponentially and he would be immensely popular this year.

"He is suddenly on everyone's radar. He was a pretty good horse himself, but those 'nearly' horses are always hard to get started and it normally takes them a lot longer," he said.

"If you look at the cases of horses like Written Tycoon or I Am Invincible, it takes a while, but Sidestep has jumped right in with a not only a Group 1 winner but a Golden Slipper winner in his first crop.

"That gives us confidence that he can certainly throw a very good one and hopefully he will follow that on with others.

"He has had the three winners to date and, even though the other two have been in the country, they have been impressive in their own right and who knows what else is to come.

"David Hayes has a good filly in Melbourne who has certainly got her fair share of ability, so at this stage he doesn't look like a one-horse wonder, but there is a long way to go obviously."

Following on from Kiamichi's Slipper win, a race Sidestep finished runner-up in to Overreach (Exceed And Excel) in 2013, he also sired Sunday's dominant Muswellbrook two-year-old winner Longbottom.

Sidestep has shot to the top of the first-season sire table by earnings over Better Than Ready (More Than Ready) and Rubick (Encosta De Lago) courtesy of the James Cummings-trained Kiamichi's \$2 million first prize-money won on Saturday.

Stablemate Microphone (Exceed And Excel) was runner-up, while

the Anthony Freedman-trained Lyre (Lonhro) completed the Godolphin-owned trifecta in the \$3.5 million Golden Slipper.

Pulford said: "Sidestep is potentially a very important horse for us. Had he saluted in the Golden Slipper that year his whole career would have gone down a different path.

"It has been well-documented that he had a really tough path into the Golden Slipper, and he ran extremely well, but he has now had to do it the hard way at stud.

"We are also very excited about Microphone, who ran second in the Slipper, and Sidestep is the lesson, so he can certainly turn himself into a high-class stallion as well."

A 2019 service fee for Sidestep, which will be increased, is expected to be set in the coming weeks.

Meanwhile, Pulford declared the feedback about Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner **Kementari** (Lonhro) had been "extraordinary" from breeders since it was announced earlier this month that the four-year-old had been retired to stud.

"We have sold a limited number of breeding rights in him to very much a 'who's who' of the breeding industry, which we are delighted with, and applications for nominations have been pouring in," he said.

"He will be one of the first horses full in the Hunter Valley, if not the first, just because we have announced the fee early. I would imagine by the time everybody else has announced their fees we will have 120 mares booked to him."

Kementari's service fee is \$33,000 (inc GST).



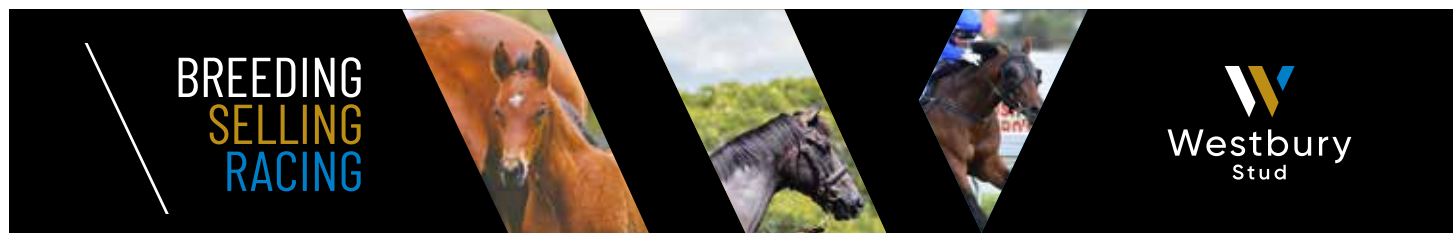

Australia

Six for Rubick

The Steven O'Dea-trained Contemptuous (2c ex Contempt by Commands) ran out a two-length scorer of the Exclusive Trophies Maiden Plate (1000m) on debut at Grafton yesterday, becoming the sixth individual winner for first-season Coolmore resident Rubick (Encosta De Lago). Oyashio Drift (Kuroshio) finished second, while there was a short-head back to No Doubt A Lady (Not A Single Doubt) in third. Contemptuous was conceived from the first crop of Rubick, in which he covered 214 mares at a fee of \$17,600 (inc GST). Rubick's two-year-olds have been headlined by the Chris Waller-trained Yes Yes Yes, who won the Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) on March 9 prior to running seventh in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on Saturday.

Ground no concern for Nakeeta

Surround Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Nakeeta Jane (So You Think), the highest-profile of three Mark Newnham-trained runners in Saturday's Vinery Stud Stakes at Rosehill, is versatile in regard to underfoot conditions, according to her trainer. "I'm happy with the way they are all going," Newnham said. "Nakeeta Jane naturally has the Group 1 form on the board and everything indicates she will enjoy getting up in trip. She pulled up well after a tough run in the Randwick Guineas and Josh Parr came and rode her this morning and was really happy with her work. She worked on the course proper at Warwick Farm - the ground was heavy and he seemed to think she got through it well. So wet or dry, I wouldn't have too many concerns." Nakeeta Jane (\$6) will be joined by stable companions Scarlet Dream (\$9) (Sebring) and Greysful Glamour (\$51) (Stratum) in the Vinery.

Ardrossan to line up in Star Kingdom

A strong barrier trial performance by Ardrossan (Redoute's Choice) has convinced New Zealand

trainer Stephen Marsh that the sprinter's Sydney campaign which will make a delayed start in Saturday's Star Kingdom Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) at Rosehill. "He got crook on the way over and he missed a bit of work after that," Marsh said. "He's a good-doing bugger and he needed a hit-out so we ran him in the trial last Friday. James McDonald rode him and he was happy with the way he felt and ran. This race on Saturday will tighten him up again and there's the Queensland carnival just around the corner, so we could look at that. But we'll get through Saturday first before making any plans. He wants a good track to show his best and that's a bit of a worry the way the weather has been in Sydney lately."

Saccharo on track for Bendigo Guineas

Archie Alexander has issued a positive bulletin on Saturday's Bendigo Guineas (Listed, 1400m) contender Saccharo (Magnus), comparing him favourably with last year's winner So Far Sokool (Showcasing), who Alexander saddled to a four-length success. "It looks the right race," he said. "We won it last year with a horse that wouldn't be as good as him, so I'd like to think he will be a decent chance. I thought his first-up run was good. He had a big weight and things didn't really go right. Stepping up from 1200 to 1400 metres, everything looks good for him." Fifth in the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) in October, Saccharo ran third in a Ballarat handicap (1200m) on his return earlier in March.

Derby aspirants spelled

Stephen Marsh, meanwhile, has confirmed that his Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) hopefuls Crown Prosecutor (Medaglia d'Oro) and Vernanme (O'Reilly) will be spelled. Crown Prosecutor, who won the New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) at his previous start, finished ninth in the Rosehill Guineas (Gr 1, 2000m) while Vernanme was 11th. "They're both coming home for a spell," Marsh said. "They'll

have a good break and we'll look at spring racing for them. "In Crown Prosecutor's case, you'll not see a lot of him in New Zealand next season as he'll go over to Australia early in his next campaign. He's done a good job and we had a crack in Sydney, but he's ready for a spell now, while Vernanme is a horse with a future, too. He's growing a bit and he'll end up a good horse."

Guineas placegetters to run in Derby

A frustrated Mike Moroney will press on to the Australian Derby with Arrogant (Ocean Park) and Chapada (Bullet Train) after the stablemates filled the placings behind The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) in Saturday's Rosehill Guineas. Arrogant, who finished fourth in the New Zealand Derby, gave connections of The Autumn Sun a fright while Chapada was an unlucky third. "He's got enough talent to win these races," Moroney told Racing.com of Chapada. "Even Ollie (Damien Oliver) said if he'd drawn a gate in the C.S. Hayes, he would have gone close to winning it. He's a good horse but he's just been luckless."

Sires likely for Gaby

The Ciaran Maher and David Eustace-trained Loving Gaby (I Am Invincible), who ran an eye-catching race to finish fourth behind Kiamichi (Sidestep) in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on Saturday, is set to step up in distance for the ATC Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick on April 6. Loving Gaby is currently the \$8 co-third favourite of three for the contest, a perch she shares with the Golden Slipper second and third - Microphone (Exceed And Excel) and Lyre (Lonhro) - while the market is headed by the Richard Litt-trained Castelvechio (Dundeel), who won his first two outings before running a three and a quarter-length third to Microphone in the Skyline Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) on March 2.

No Doncaster for Happy Clapper

Pat Webster has confirmed three-time Group 1 winner Happy Clapper (Teofilo) will not defend his Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) crown at Randwick on April 6 and will instead line-up against Winx (Street Cry) in the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) the following week. Happy Clapper has finished runner-up to Winx on five occasions throughout his career, including when given an enterprising ride by Blake Shinn in the Chipping Norton Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) on his penultimate outing. "If you could guarantee me Happy Clapper would draw inside five then he'd be running in the Doncaster," Webster said. "But if he draws 20, with that weight, he can't win. I'd rather give him a nice easy trial on Friday and then we've got another two weeks to the Queen Elizabeth and hopefully he can run second to Winx again."

Hiyaam sidelined

The talented Mick Price-trained staying mare Hiyaam (High Chaparral) will miss the Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) after contracting a virus. The Group 1-winner, who claimed the Vinery Stud Stakes (registered as Storm Queen Stakes) (Gr 1, 2000m) last autumn, returned to winning form in the Randwick City Cup (Listed, 2000m) on March 9 before suffering the setback. "It's pretty disappointing with her as she was tracking really well towards the Sydney Cup," Price told Racing.com. The trainer, however, confirmed that stablemate Seabrook (Hinchinbrook) would line up in this week's Vinery Stud Stakes. "Brett Prebble will ride her and she's a quality filly that be strong at the trip for the first time," he said.

Sydney Cup penalty for Midterm

In other Sydney Cup news, the Liam Howley-trained Midterm (Galileo) has incurred a 1.5

kilogram penalty for the contest following his two-length success in the N E Manion Quality Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) at Rosehill on Saturday. Midterm, who is the \$8 co-second favourite for the Sydney Cup - a price he shares with Manion Quality Cup third Shraaoh (Sea The Stars) - will now carry 51.5 kilograms in the \$2 million contest, moving him up to joint-19th place in the ballot. The Charlie Appleby-trained Dubhe (Dubawi), who was last seen winning a 3200-metre handicap by four lengths at Meydan, is the \$5 favourite.

Wishart to represent Queensland jockeys

Queensland apprentice jockey Maddy Wishart will compete in the fourth round of the National Apprentices' Challenge at Strathalbyn tomorrow. Wishart, who is indentured to Group 1-winning trainer Paul Butterworth at Eagle Farm, has ridden 46 winners, 27 this season. Star Adelaide rider Raquel Clark breathed new life into the Challenge with her win at Doomben last week as the series heads towards an exciting finish. Queensland looked to have the series at its mercy until Clark brought up her 100th winner for the season with a dashing ride on Dream Kisses (Dream Ahead).

Jockey Robertson charged over betting

RV stewards have charged jockey John Robertson on the grounds of illegal betting activities, alleging he made, and/or facilitated, and/or had an interest in the making of 27 bets between October 26 2016 and April 18 2018. The bets totalled \$1,320.00 and did not involve any races Robertson rode in. The charge issued against Robertson will be heard by the RADB on a date to be fixed and they follow hot on the heels of similar charges levied against apprentice Chris Caserta and fellow rider Daniel Schmitt in recent weeks.

Talty appointed as AJA chief

Martin Talty has been appointed as chief executive of the Australian Jockeys' Association (AJA). Talty joins the AJA after previously holding racing administrative positions at the Victoria Racing Club, where he was the executive general manager of racing, as well as roles in Dubai. AJA chairman Des O'Keeffe said:

"Martin Talty's application stood out amongst the 80 received," O'Keeffe said. "The board was unanimous that a stellar 30-year career in world racing identified Martin as the perfect fit for this important role." Talty was aware of the task ahead of him. "There are issues within the industry that are forthcoming that will have a direct impact on Australia's jockeys but with the co-operation of Racing Australia and each state's regulatory bodies I am confident that successful outcomes can be achieved to the benefit of all within the industry," Talty said.

Half-sister to Seabrook leads March Sale

Tennessee Icestorm (Zizou), a half-sister to Group 1-winning filly Seabrook (Hinchinbrook), currently leads the way in the Inglis Digital March Sale with a bid of \$60,000. Catalogued as **Lot 242**, the six-year-old was placed once at two and is out of the unraced Don Eduardo (Zabeel) mare Midnight Revels, herself a half-sister to Group 2 winner My Emotion (Savabeel). Aalaalune set for Group 1 Sires' challenge

The Jacob McKay-trained Aalaalune (Reliable Man) will bid to break her maiden in elite company this weekend when she lines up in the Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Awapuni on Saturday. The filly went down a short head to Yourdeel (Dundeel) in the Sistema Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at her last start, where she shaped as if a step up to 1400 metres would see the five-raced maiden in a better light. "She has been racing so well and deserves to win a good one," McKay said. "She went so close in the Sistema. She tried so hard and the 1400 metres will be much better for her at Awapuni. Reese Jones will ride her again. She did a bit of quiet half-pace on Saturday and I was really happy with her. It won't take much to have her spot on for the Sires'. She's already race fit."

Winning return for Wynne

Southern jockey Samantha Wynne made a winning return to the saddle on Saturday aboard Diorissimo (Showcasing) at Riccarton. The Irish-born rider had been on the sidelines since August after undergoing surgery on her anterior cruciate ligament having injured her knee at Wingatui last May. "You don't know how much it means to you until it's half taken away," Wynne said. "It was brilliant being back in the winners' enclosure and hopefully there are many more to come. I have had some great support and I won't forget the people who have been there for me throughout. Hopefully I can repay them by riding lots of winners."

Asia

Beauty Generation given Chairman's entry

Hong Kong champion Beauty Generation (Road To Rock) heads a field of ten entered for the Chairman's Trophy (Gr 2, 1600m) at Sha Tin on April 7. The likes of Conte (Starcraft), who has been placed behind Beauty Generation on his previous two outings, and Group 1 winner Pakistan Star (Shamardal), who was fourth in last year's renewal, also feature among the entries. Meanwhile, Beat The Clock (Hinchinbrook) and Mr Stunning (Exceed And Excel) will renew rivalries in the Sprint Cup (Gr 2, 1200m) having filled the first two places in the Centenary Sprint Cup (Gr 1, 1200m) in January. Beat The Clock won on that occasion having also taken out last year's renewal of the Sprint Cup.

Cruiser team keen on Royal Ascot raid

Connections of Lim's Cruiser (Casino Prince), Singapore's champion sprinter in 2017, are eyeing a potential tilt at Royal Ascot's Diamond Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in June should the gelding come through his first two domestic targets in good style. Trainer Stephen Gray has the Rocket Man Sprint (Listed, 1200m) on May 5 pencilled in as a first-up assault before aiming towards a third successive victory in the Lion City Cup (Listed, 1200m) on May 25. "If things go well in his first two (comeback) races, I am keen to look at Royal Ascot," Gray told iRace. "If things go well here, and Royal Ascot eventuates, I would also consider staying for the Group 1 July Cup on the final day of

Newmarket's three-day July Festival meeting. These are good options with the hope of some easing in the tracks and the timing is perfect."

International

Hong Kong ruled out for Aussie sprinters

Group 1 winners Brave Smash (Tosen Phantom) and Viddora (I Am Invincible) will not race in Hong Kong after their Al Quoz Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) assignment in Dubai on Saturday. The pair are also entered for the Chairman's Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m) at Sha Tin next month, but The South China Morning Post has reported Australian quarantine rules would prevent the pair from racing in Hong Kong on the way back from Dubai. Australia's Department of Agriculture and Water Resources recently reached an interim agreement with Hong Kong authorities about horses racing there, though that only covers those travelling directly from Australia to Hong Kong. There is no arrangement in place for horses travelling to Hong Kong from other countries before returning to Australia.

26 for First Samurai

Claiborne Farm stallion First Samurai (Giant's Causeway) was provided with his 26th stakes winner on Sunday courtesy of Cutting Humor's (3 c ex Pun by Pulpit) victory in the Sunland Park Derby (Gr 3, 9f). The Todd Pletcher-trained colt had just enough in reserve to repel the late thrust of Anothertwistafate (Scat Daddy) by a neck, with the pair pulling five and three quarter lengths clear of Mucho Gusto (Mucho Macho Man) back in third. First Samurai is currently standing at Claiborne Farm in Kentucky for a fee of US\$15,000. [Click here](#) to watch the replay.

Melbourne unlikely for high-class Stradivarius

Winning the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) was rivalled perhaps only by the Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 10f) as one of the final frontiers for British-trained horses until Charlie Appleby saddled Cross Counter (Teofilo) to victory in the Flemington showpiece last year, but the lure of Australia's greatest race is unlikely to attract Europe's premier stayer - the John Gosden-trained Stradivarius (Sea The Stars) - in 2019.

That was the view of Gosden, who saddled the son of Sea The Stars (Cape Cross) to five consecutive victories last season, with the first four of those - the Yorkshire Cup (Gr 2, 1m6f), the Gold Cup (Gr 1, 2m4f), the Goodwood Cup (Gr 1, 2m) and the Lonsdale Cup (Gr 2, 2m) - landing his connections a £1 million windfall as he captured the inaugural Weatherbys Hamilton Stayers' Million, a seven-figure bonus offered to any horse who won one of four qualifying contests before capturing the three most prestigious staying prizes run in Britain.

Speaking during a media morning at his Clarehaven Stables on Monday, which was held to launch the second year of the Stayers' Million, Gosden believed the passion for European racing exhibited by Stradivarius's owner, Bjorn Nielsen, would prevent the five-year-old from departing for Australia in the autumn, regardless of his exploits in Britain beforehand.

"The owner is very into the European programme and he loves the European programme," Gosden said in front of a parading Stradivarius, who paid handsome testament to his current wellbeing by rearing in front of the crowd of assembled journalists on more than one occasion.

"I get the feeling he's devoted to this horse and he wants him to stay in Europe. There was no question of us running in the Melbourne Cup last year, and Bjorn was brought up in Epsom, so he's a great lover of anything to do with the Derby and the Classic, middle-distance horse. He'll stay where his heart is, I think."

Gosden saddled Muntahaa (Dansili) to finish ninth in the Melbourne Cup last year, although his chance of victory was undermined by the heavy rainfall that struck the track on race-day morning, while the Shadwell-owned gelding has subsequently joined the Lindsay Park team, running 11th in the Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) on March 9.

The Weatherbys Hamilton Stayers' Million, which was devised as a way of breathing life back into the breeding and racing of staying horses in Britain - a facet that has waned at the hands of the commercial market - has been expanded to cover four additional qualifying races in Europe and the Middle East for 2019.

The first of those is the Dubai Gold Cup (Gr 2, 3200m), run at Meydan on Saturday, the market for which is headed by Cross Counter,

who is set to make his first start since winning the Melbourne Cup when lining up in the US\$1.5 million prize.

The carrot of a £1 million bonus is surely not lucrative enough to shape a campaign for a horse owned by Sheikh Mohammed, but should he qualify himself with victory at the weekend, the path down which Cross Counter is asked to tread in Europe this summer will make for interesting viewing.

The Oleander-Rennen (Gr 2, 3200m), run at Berlin-Hoppegarten on May 12, has also been added to the list of qualifiers and that is the likely starting point for Torcedor (Fastnet Rock), who was transferred to the care of Andreas Wohler last August having been purchased by Australian Bloodstock from a Te Akau Racing syndicate. Australian Bloodstock and Wohler teamed up to land the 2014 Melbourne Cup with Protectionist (Monsun).

Torcedor raced once for Wohler, finishing last in the Preis Von Europa (Gr 1, 2400m) at Cologne in September, while he was subsequently ruled out of an intended southern-hemisphere raid having suffered a low-grade virus and high temperature shortly before he was due to enter quarantine in Germany. Formerly trained by Jessica Harrington in Ireland, he was beaten a length by Stradivarius when running third in the Gold Cup at Royal Ascot.

The Alain De Royer-Dupre-trained Americain (Dynaformer) landed the Prix Vicomtesse Vigier (Gr 2, 3000m) prior to winning the Melbourne Cup in 2011 and the Longchamp Group 2 has also joined the roster of Stayers' Million qualifiers.

As has the Vintage Crop Stakes (Gr 3, 1m6f) at Navan, which has been touted as the likely reappearance contest for the Aidan O'Brien-trained Capri (Galileo). The five-year-old is officially rated 120 - the same as Stradivarius - while he finished half a length in front of that rival when winning the St Leger (Gr 1, 1m6.5f) at Doncaster in 2017.

The embryonic market for the Melbourne Cup is headed by \$15 favourite Cross Counter, while the second-line of the betting includes fellow Godolphin representatives Avilius (Pivotal), who won the Ranvet Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Rosehill on Saturday, and the Appleby-trained Dubhe (Dubawi), who is favourite for next month's Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) at Randwick.

How are Gosden's stars shaping up?

Gosden was crowned champion trainer for the third time following a remarkable 2018 that yielded 13 Group / Grade 1 victories worldwide, and he also provided an update on a number of his brightest hopes for the forthcoming season.

Calyx (3 c Kingman - Helleborine by Observatory) – unbeaten in two starts as a juvenile, but injured after winning the Coventry Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) at Royal Ascot

"He's in good form and he's been pleasing us in every way. He's coming back from an injury and he hasn't run since June, so you can't just rush forward and you've got to go very diligently. He did his first half-speed on Saturday, so he's coming forward well. I'm not going to set a date for his return, because that's wrong when a horse is coming back from something like what he went through. He will tell me when he's ready."

Enable (5 m Nathaniel - Concentric by Sadler's Wells) – seven-time Group 1 winner who won a second Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) in October

"She has started cantering again. We are hopeful she will be running in something like the Coronation Cup at Epsom. There wouldn't be any point in starting her earlier than June – if you want to get to the Arc, you don't want to be starting in the middle of April and there aren't really the races for those older horses. She's in great order and we're very pleased with her – she's even bigger and stronger again."

Lah Ti Dar (4 f Dubawi - Dar Re Mi by Singspiel) – sister to Too Darn Hot who finished runner-up in the St Leger (Gr 1, 1m6.5f)

"She'll probably head to the Middleton at York and we might then go for the Pretty Polly at the Curragh. She's a big girl – she's totally different to her brother as he's got a ton of speed and she's got middle-distances written all over her. She was very green in the St Leger – she kept looking around – and she only got rolling in the last furlong and it's not often you run out of real estate in a race like that."

Stradivarius (5 h Sea the Stars - Private Life by Bering) – five-time winner in 2018 and landed inaugural Weatherbys Hamilton Stayers' Million

"He's in great order. He's just started cantering and building up in his preparation. All being well we will go for the Yorkshire Cup (won last year) in May. He's done great over the winter – he's not a big horse, but he's thickened out and strengthened."

Too Darn Hot (3 c Dubawi - Dar Re Mi by Singspiel) – crowned champion two-year-old in Europe following an unbeaten four-race campaign

"I've been pleased with him and he's training nicely. Frankie sat on him at the weekend and was very pleased with his development from two to three. It was the second time he's sat on him this year – the first time I told him to sit in behind and stay there like a good boy, but I let him pop out and pass his lead horse on Saturday and I was very happy with him. We're building towards the Greenham at Newbury with him. For me, he's guaranteed to stay a mile, the mile and a quarter probably, but beyond that I simply wouldn't know."

Wissahickon (4 c Tapit - No Matter What by Nureyev) – unbeaten in his last five starts, including the Winter Derby (Gr 3, 1m2f) at Lingfield Park

"He's in good form. I was going to send him to run in the Sheema Classic this weekend, but he had a little mucus in his scope and he missed a couple of works, so he will now go for the Easter Classic back at Lingfield on April 19."

Without Parole (4 c Frankel - Without You Babe by Lemon Drop Kid) – won St James's Palace Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) at Royal Ascot last year and will line-up in the Dubai Turf (Gr 1, 1800m) at Meydan on Saturday

"He's cantered on the training track out at Meydan and he's in great order. He's going to have the pleasure of looking at a super filly in Almond Eye. He's pleased us and I'm confident a mile and one furlong or a mile and a quarter will be his distance this year – the Frankel's can see out the last part of their races well and he's probably going to be at his best over a mile and a quarter."

Australian Foxtrot on NZ Trophy

The evergreen Volpe Veloce has continued the tremendous run of success by Australian-breds in New Zealand this year with a decisive victory in Saturday's Group Two Japan New Zealand International Trophy over 1600m at Tauranga.

It was the 12th career victory and seventh black type success for the 5YO Foxwedge mare who had earlier won the Group One Railway Stakes, Group Two Eight Classic and, somewhat fittingly on Australia Day this year, the Group Two Westbury Classic.

Volpe Veloce will next start in the Group One New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes over 1600m at Te Aroha on Saturday week and is poised to join fellow Australian-breds – Crown Prosecutor (New Zealand Derby) and Enzo's Lad (Telegraph Handicap) – as 2019 Group One winners in New Zealand.

(Danzdanzdance, third in the Group One Ranvet at Rosehill Gardens on Saturday, also won the Group One Zabeel Classic on Boxing Day).

Volpe Veloce is from the Barathea mare, Bardego, who has had quite the journey herself and is currently ensconced at David and Kayley Johnson's Rushton Park in Victoria.

Bred by Tyreel Stud, Bardego was sold to the Corstens training operation for \$45,000 at the 2001 Adelaide Magic Millions Yearling Sale and would go on to win her first two starts, including the Group Three Blue Diamond Preview.

Unfortunately, the filly had "knee issues" and was retired to stud by owner/breeder Phil Sly after five unsuccessful runs as a 3YO.

Bardego had a fairly inauspicious start to her breeding career, missing to Snowland and having her Belong To Me foal die, while her first runner – Syzygy – could, at best, manage a second in a Mackay Maiden in Queensland.

However, all was forgiven with her second runner, Delago Bolt, who captured the Black Opal at two, ran a little over a length behind Black Caviar when fourth in the Group Two Danehill and finished his career with five wins and nine placings for \$612,575 in stakes.

Bardego's next four foals failed to rise to similar occasions however and the mare was sold to Nick Vass Bloodstock for \$57,500 at the 2011 Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale.

The second foal for Vass? Volpe Veloce.

However, by the time Volpe Veloce had arrived on the scene, Bardego had been on sold to Randwick Bloodstock Agency on behalf of Rushton Park at the 2015 Magic Millions National Brodmare Sale.

The first Bardego foal for Rushton Park, a full sister to Volpe Veloce called Zorro Rapido, was purchased by Sheamus Mills for \$300,000 at the 2017 Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale, while a follow up – a filly by Helmet – would make \$200,000 at the 2018 Gold Coast Magic Millions Yearling Sale. The now 2YO, Silk Jacket, is with Matt Cumani and “progressing nicely”.

“She (Bardego) has been a terrific mare,” Rushton Park’s Kayley Johnson points out. “Unfortunately, she didn’t get in foal the year after foaling the Helmet filly, but produced a lovely Holler filly last November. She then missed on a late cover to Impending but she’ll probably end up going to Brazen Beau this spring.”

Volpe Veloce's continued success is likewise a boon for Victoria's Woodside Park which, earlier this year, secured Foxwedge for stud duties this spring.

Since the announcement, Foxwedge's progeny have won nearly 60 races including the Group Two Guy Walter and Group Three Triscay with Alassio, along with stakes placings to Dyslexic, Charleise, Freddie Fox Trot and Big Alloy.

Woodside – whose stallion lineup this year will include Written Tycoon, Rich Enuff, Cable Bay and Tosen Stardom – is set to announce its fees at Easter, with Price assuring broodmare owners that Foxwedge's fee will be “competitive”.

HOOFFNOTE: John Jeffs, the much loved ‘meet and greet’ for stud farms at major yearling sales, was front man for Tyreel Stud when Bardego was sold as a yearling in 2001 and, 16 years later, directing inspections for Rushton Park when Volpe Veloce's full sister (Zorro Rapido) was knocked down to Ciaran Maher for \$300,000.

Doubles up for Henrique and Chin

Brazilian rider Fausto Henrique took riding honours with a winning double on Friday night's sand program to take him to 12 winners for the current season.

Henrique, who was being hailed as a premiership hope for this season after kicking home 14 winners last year when he arrived for the latter part of the season, was also a late starter this season due to a suspension. However, it has been a somewhat steady start to the new racing year with the talented rider even going without a winner in the month of February; March has seen better results with Friday's double giving him four winners for the month with two racedays still to come.

Horsenumberone (All Too Hard) was the first of Henrique's winners when the gelding showed great speed in his Macau debut to run away with the first of the night - the 0-55 3&4YO Handicap over 1200 metres on the turf. The four-year-old easily defeated Tremendous Wins (Turffontein) by four and a half lengths, with the M\$1.5 favourite Still So Cute (Thewayyouare) a struggling third.

Horsenumberone, who is prepared in Macau by Danny Wong, had only been very lightly raced in Australia with two starts in

Victoria when racing as Way Too Hard under the care of Robbie Laing.

Following a barrier trial win on a heavy track at Cranbourne, the gelding ran a creditable fourth at the same venue on a soft track at his first start, before a nice second at Pakenham on the synthetic followed.

The gelding was then exported to Macau where if Friday night's victory is any indication, he will have no trouble at all in paying his way.
