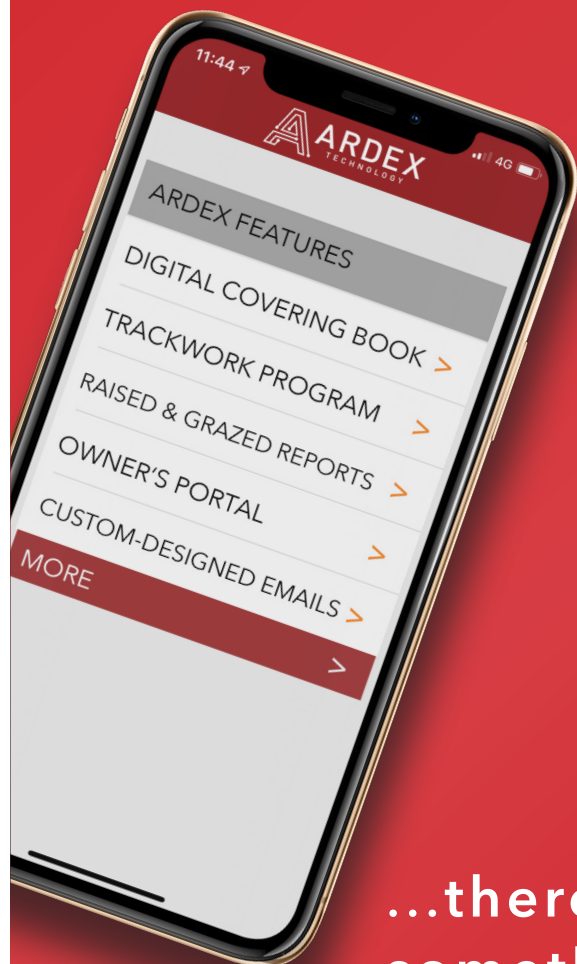

Invincibella to be sold at MM Broodmare Sale

Invincibella (I Am Invincible), who became the first horse to land the same Magic Millions Raceday contest for three consecutive seasons when taking out the Magic Millions Fillies And Mares (1300m) last Saturday, will return to the Gold Coast in May to go under the hammer at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale. "She'll be highly sought after, possibly even by international buyers," Denise Martin, principal of owner Star Thoroughbreds told Racing.com. "She'll be a wonderful broodmare - she really is a lovely big, strong mare who really has a way about her. It's really special - I bought my first horses here when I established Star Thoroughbreds 25 years ago." Invincibella has won 12 of her 43 starts for prize-money of \$3,075,103, including last season's Tatt's Tiara (Gr 1, 1400m). *Continued page 4 >>*

Alligator Blood has continued to frank the already solid Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) form, while the three-year-old battalion also includes Castelvechio (Dundeel) - runner-up and the first Australian-trained horse home in last year's Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) - plus The Everest (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Yes Yes Yes (Rubick). The latter heads an exceptional sprinting contingent that also includes the filly Loving Gaby (I Am Invincible), who boasts a spring win over the older horses in the Manikato Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m).

David Vandyke, trainer of Alligator Blood, may have seemed cautious in his assessment of the gelding when the dust had settled on Monday morning.

"At the moment I'm not sure," he told radio RSN when asked what heights the horse could reach.

However, that could be interpreted as neutral, negative or positive and many - including rival trainer Leon Macdonald and Waikato Stud, who bought a controlling interest in Alligator Blood's Caulfield Guineas conqueror Super Seth (Dundeel) - have endorsed a crop which looks to be strong from sprinting through to the milers and middle-distance performers.

"I think they're a very good group overall," Macdonald told ANZ Bloodstock News.

The South Australian trainer prepares Carbine Club Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) winner Dalasan (Dalakhani), who was runner-up to Alligator Blood in the Guineas Prelude (Gr 3, 1400m) before being thwarted by drawing 16 of 16 in the Guineas itself.

"I've always had a very high opinion of my bloke and Hughie (Bowman) was pretty impressed with him when he won at Flemington (Carbine Club)," Macdonald said.

"Alligator Blood keeps winning and the Guineas winner (Super Seth) looks a good horse, so I wouldn't be knocking this group. Having said that, I'm not frightened of any of them. I think Dalasan's up to them all."

Dalasan, an \$80,000 purchase at the Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale from the Mill Park Stud draft, is 'ready to go' according to his trainer.

"He'll gallop tomorrow morning, have a jump-out next week and then go to Caulfield on February 1 for the Manfred Stakes," Macdonald said yesterday.

Dalasan is set to gallop with Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) third Free Of Debt (Unencumbered), who has been sidelined with a ligament injury since the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in March.

"He's ready to go. He only had a short time off after the spring and he's come to hand really well," Macdonald added.

"The number one option would be to head towards the Australian Guineas but going to Sydney for the Hobartville and the Randwick Guineas is the other possibility. Both Guineas are a million dollars.

"If we have to take on Alligator Blood that wouldn't bother me. They've both been good buys, haven't they? Eighty (\$80,000) for ours and 55 (\$55,000) for Alligator Blood."

Both Guineas are a week apart, with the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Flemington on February 29 preceding the Randwick event on March 7.

Vandyke said yesterday that Alligator Blood would have a ten-day 'freshen up' before any firm decision was made regarding his programme.

"If he's well, we'd look to come down to Melbourne and stay with my good friend Mick Kent at Cranbourne. He would run in the CS Hayes Stakes (February 15), where he gets in beautifully under the set weight and penalty conditions, as a springboard to the Australian Guineas," Vandyke said.

The subsequent exploits of Dalasan and Alligator Blood already give the Caulfield Guineas form a robust look, not to mention the eight-placed Soul Patch (Shamus Award), who went on to land the Moonee Valley Vase (Gr 2, 2040m) prior to running third in the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m).

Dalasan will return to the track one week after Caulfield Guineas sixth Conqueror (Fastnet Rock) contests the \$1 million Karaka Million 3YO Classic (RL, 1600m) at Ellerslie on January 25.

Sydney-based Kiwi James McDonald will ride Conqueror in the Karaka Million with he and the Lindsay Park training team seeking back-to-back wins in the race after last year's success with Long Leaf (Fastnet Rock).

Conqueror was a NZ\$1 million purchase at the 2018 New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale and like NZ\$750,000 buy Long Leaf, he was bought from the Curraghmore draft.

Nominations for the \$5 million All-Star Mile (1600m) at Caulfield on March 14 include Alligator Blood, Super Seth, Dalasan, Castelveccchio and Soul Patch alongside Caulfield Guineas third Groundswell (Fastnet Rock) and exciting New Zealander Catalyst (Darci Brahma), who is unbeaten in five starts since running seventh on debut.

The Clayton Chipperfield-trained Catalyst, who trials in the same heat as Cox Plate third Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle) at Matamata this morning, is also bound for Melbourne. He is likely to return in the Mr Tiz Trophy (Gr 3, 1200m) on Karaka Millions night, with the CS Hayes Stakes and Australian Guineas slated on his Melbourne programme.

The filly Mystic Journey (Needs Further) won the inaugural All-Star Mile last year after beating the three-year-old males in the Australian Guineas.

Loving Gaby, along with Flit (Medaglia D'Oro), Funstar (Adelaide), Acting (Savabeel), Pretty Brazen (Brazen Beau) and Southbank (Fastnet Rock), are the highest-rated fillies nominated for this year's contest.

Away Game to target Slipper

Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) winner Away Game (Snitzel) is being set for the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Rosehill on March 21. "She will be one run into the Slipper," co-trainer David Eustace said. "Whether it's the Silver Slipper leading in we can work that out. She will have a few easy days and then look towards the Slipper." Away Game, who made it two wins from three starts at the weekend having previously landed the Calaway Gal Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Doomben, is the TAB's \$15 co-second favourite for the Slipper, behind impressive Golden Gift (1100m) winner Dame Giselle (I Am Invincible) at \$11.

Vandyke weighing up options for Gator

Alligator Blood (All Too Hard), who was promoted to favouritism for the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and the All-Star Mile (1600m) following his victory in the Magic Millions Guineas (RL, 1400m) last Saturday, is not guaranteed to head to Melbourne for his next assignment. "I'll make a decision next week about our next move," trainer David Vandyke told Sky Sports Radio. "Whether

he's going to head towards Melbourne or whether he goes for an extended break." Looking further ahead with the three-year-old, Vandyke added: "He is a gelding and he could be around for years to come. So whether we go to Melbourne or not, I've had people say he could be an Everest horse or a Golden Eagle horse. There are a lot of races for him."

Guineas winner nearing return

The Anthony Freedman-trained Super Seth (Dundeel), who is the only horse to have beaten Alligator Blood having pipped him at the post in the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) last October, finished third in a Flemington jump-out on Friday and is likely to have one more trial before resuming in the Manfred Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield on February 1. "He was only just going for his first soft hit-out," assistant trainer Sam Freedman said of Super Seth's trial, which was won by fellow Group 1-winning colt Microphone (Exceed And Excel). "We got him off the farm (Pinecliff) and took him up to Flemington and he jumped out really well. He tracked up behind them and Mark Zahra rode him and was really happy with his action. He had a nice blow afterwards so he'll have

another trial and then we'll look to get him back to the races in the next three weeks. He seems to be going the right way that's for sure."

Sunlight back in training

Three-time Group 1 winner Sunlight (Zoustar) is back in training with Tony and Calvin McEvoy, with the four-year-old being set for an autumn campaign that could include a trip overseas. Sunlight underwent surgery last month having sustained a split-bone injury on her near-hind leg, which will prevent her from defending her Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) crown on March 7. "It (injury) just might mean she will end up in Sydney for her main targets and then there is always the option and the dream of going to Royal Ascot with her as well," McEvoy Mitchell Racing's Flemington foreman Michael Shepherdson told Racing.com. "It was a straightforward procedure which went well and she has been back in our Flemington stable for two-to-three weeks now. We have ramped up her rehabilitation and she is now performing light exercise with some daily walking. She seems to be enjoying it, she is in great condition and each week we will just progressively step up the intensity of her training from here on."

Kensington on agenda for Time To Reign

The Kensington Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Flemington on Saturday is set to be sprinkled with star quality as Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Microphone will clash with Silver Slipper Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) winner Time To Reign (Time For War). The duo finished second and fifth respectively in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) last March and this will be the first start since for Time To Reign, who won a Warwick Farm trial by nearly 10 lengths earlier this month. "He's definitely coming down and we'll see what happens on Saturday as regards to his autumn," trainer Gary Portelli told Racing.com. "Everyone saw his trial the other day. He's working well. A 1000-metre race first-up with blinkers on should be perfect for him and Damien Oliver is to ride." The Kensington Stakes attracted eight nominations and was subsequently left open for entries until this morning.

Portelli hoping for rain

Portelli has also nominated Dio D'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro) and Ronstar (Zoustar) at Rosehill on Saturday, with the former set to relish conditions if the predicted rain materialises. "We obviously need rain to help with the fires so hopefully we get as much as they say we will," Portelli said. "If it looks like we are going to be on a rain-affected track, Dio D'Oro will love that so he will run at Rosehill rather than Warwick Farm on Wednesday. If it is wet, Ronstar will wait for another day." Both Dio D'Oro and Ronstar are nominated for the Benchmark 78 over 1200 metres, while the latter holds an entry in the same grade over 1350 metres.

Kendrick trio chasing Millions consolation

Stuart Kendrick held three of the five emergencies for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) - Way Beyond (Spill The Beans), Cosmic Gossip (Spill The Beans) and Poupee (Better Than Ready) - and while none of the trio got a run, they will seek consolation in the Sunshine Coast 2YO Classic (1200m) on Saturday week. "In hindsight we might have got a run for Way Beyond by running in a Sunday two-year-old race and getting enough prize-money, but that is in the past and we can now concentrate on the Sunshine Coast,"

Kendrick said. "They have all been racing well and they are back on their home track. The Sunshine Coast race is a good idea and it adds to what is a good summer carnival ending meeting."

Diamond Prelude for Jabali Ridge

Jabali Ridge (Jabali) is being set for the Blue Diamond Prelude (Gr 3, 1100m) at Caulfield on February 8 following his impressive two-length success at Flemington last Saturday. Trained by Mick Price and Michael Kent Jr., Jabali Ridge does not hold an entry in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) itself, but his next outing will determine if connections stump up the \$55,000 supplementary fee. "What we'll do with him is probably send him down to Monomeith on the water walker for a few days to have a little freshen-up then give him a little trial before the Prelude," Price told RSN927. "And then into the Blue Diamond two weeks later if we get the right information on the eighth."

Gytrash aiming for Lightning

Gytrash (Lope De Vega), who has been sidelined through injury since finishing a luckless second in the Heath Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) at Caulfield on August 31, is set to return in the Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Flemington on February 15. "He's been in work now for about five weeks and he's heading towards I'd say the Lightning first and then the Newmarket, all things being equal," trainer Gordan Richards said. "He jarred up pretty badly after his last run and he needed to have a bit of a break to get him back on track. If we had given him just a short break and got him back racing then you're in no-man's land. So we thought we'd tip him out then and have a break with the Lightning and Newmarket in mind."

Parnham eyes All-Star for Platoon

Platoon (Playing God), who finished third in the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) last November, is being aimed towards the All-Star Mile (1600m) and trainer Neville Parnham has issued a positive bulletin on the progressive gelding. "He's come on even better as a four-year-old," Parnham told Racing.com. "Some of those horses that race early train-off a bit but he enjoys his racing and

as he's gotten older - he's got better. I expect him to be better again this campaign and if so, he might come up to the level of Playing God. He's good enough - he's a quality horse." Parnham trained Platoon's sire Playing God (Blackfriars) to win eight of his 42 starts, including successive renewals of the Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) in 2010 and 2011.

All-Star hopefuls to gallop in Adelaide

In other All-Star Mile news, South Australia's two major hopefuls for the \$5 million contest will gallop together in Adelaide today. Chris Bieg confirmed Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) third Free Of Debt (Unencumbered) will partner Carbine Club Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) winner Dalasan (Dalakhani) in a workout at Morphettville before the former undertakes a special exhibition gallop between races at Murray Bridge on Saturday. "I'm just trying to arrange a galloping partner for him on Saturday but as far as everything is going, he's looking like he could be in for a big campaign," Bieg told Racing.com of Free Of Debt. "In relation to the whole voting, he's got a pretty good following in South Australia. He was a very good two-year-old that had some issues come Golden Slipper time, so I think we'll get a pretty good campaign behind him and he's in a pretty good position to get some votes."

Kolding to trial at Rosehill

Key trials are coming thick and fast today, with Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) and Golden Eagle (1500m) winner Kolding (Ocean Park) set to line up over 900 metres at Rosehill. Chris Waller is also contemplating the All-Star Mile for his four-year-old, although he could remain in Sydney depending on the likelihood of him obtaining a place in the final line-up in the \$5 million race. "Kolding is an interesting horse as he just keeps getting better," Waller said. "I've got a slight leaning to the All-Star Mile, but how do you set a horse for the race if you don't know he will get a start? So, unless I have a good indication he is going to get a start in the race, we can stay home and target the Apollo Stakes, Chipping Norton Stakes and George Ryder Stakes, which I don't mind. If he was to go to the All-Star Mile, I would run him in the Orr Stakes as the All-Star Mile is at Caulfield this year."

Millions topper to head to Pakenham

The Lloyd Kennewell-trained Strategy, an unraced son of I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) who topped last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale when realising \$1.7 million, will undertake his first official trial at Pakenham today. "Last preparation he had a jumpout or two and showed really good speed but mentally he just wasn't ready for it all he just wanted to overdo it and run through the bridle," Kennewell told Racing.com. "We put him away knowing he wasn't a pre-Christmas two-year-old. He has done a bit of dressage and had a bit of re-mouthing and we have worked hard at getting his head right so he is ready to go this preparation. He is very fast, he has plenty of speed, he jumps the lids (barriers) really quickly and does everything right in that way. Mentally we are just trying to get him to do things the other way - to get him to relax and switch off." Kennewell suggested Strategy could debut in a Moonee Valley maiden on January 24 or in the Blue Diamond Preview (Listed, 1000m) (C&G) at Caulfield the following day.

First runner for Raymond at Caulfield

Fledgling trainer Maddie Raymond will saddle her first runner at Caulfield tomorrow when European import Wentwood (Pour Moi) lines up in the closing Ladbrokes Cash Out Handicap (1400m). Raymond, who will continue in her role as stable manager for Lindsey Smith for the foreseeable future, worked closely with 2015 Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Prince Of Penzance (Pentire), while she has also gained

experience abroad, working for Willie Mullins and preparing Brave Smash (Tosen Phantom) for Kris Lees ahead of last year's Al Quoz Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) at Meydan. "I'm looking forward to it," Raymond told Racing.com. "For probably the past 12 months I've had the intention to have a runner and I've taken things slow - I'm only young and I'm in no rush." Regarding Wentwood, Raymond added: "It's his first race in Australia so it's just a race to see where he is at. He's in really good order and I think he's got ability. There's still improvement to come and sometimes with these imports it can take them a little while to find their feet."

Romeo out until April

Tony Romeo is eligible to resume his training career in April after the Victorian Racing Tribunal imposed a suspension on Monday for failing to provide veterinary treatment to three horses. Romeo was suspended for 12 months, with nine months of that term suspended for two years after Rinaldo (Reean), French Blue (More Than Ready) and We're Gonna Rock (Fastnet Rock) were found malnourished at his Digger's Rest property last winter. Stewards originally charged Romeo with failing to provide nutrition to the trio, but it was later discovered that the horses had access to feed but had not been eating it.

Shark and Catalyst to face off in trial

Exciting three-year-old Catalyst (Darci Brahma) will face-off against Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m)

placegetter Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle) in a 1000-metre trial this morning, ahead of his first-up assignment in the Mr Tiz Trophy (Gr 3, 1200m) on January 25 and then an Australian campaign. "Tomorrow is his first trial back and I see he's up against Te Akau Shark as well so that will give us a good line on him," trainer Clayton Chipperfield said yesterday. "His first start back will be on Karaka Million night and then we'll come to Australia straight after that for the CS Hayes (February 15) and then it's two weeks into the Guineas. He's come up 100 per cent. He's not yet 100 per cent fit but he's a good 10 kilograms heavier than last time and that's all muscle."

Moroney considering options for Levin runner-up

Michael Moroney is yet to decide on where his Levin Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) runner-up Harlech (Darci Brahma) will head to next but plans to run in the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) have been dented. "If he had won that (the Levin Classic) and won it well, he'd have come straight over (Australia) here and been set for the Randwick Guineas," Moroney said. "He'd have won a New Zealand Group 1 and if he could win a Group 1 in Australia, like the Randwick Guineas, he'd be very valuable (as a stallion prospect). He still ran a top race and she (winner Travelling Light) must be a very good filly. But now that he's been beaten everything is up in the air at the moment. He's had a trip away and we'll see how he has come through it after a few days. We'll go through the programmes and work out what is best for him. It's a matter of looking at everything."

Veterans to target another Wellington Cup

More than 40 years since winning the Wellington Cup (Gr 3, 3200m) with Big Gamble (Sobig), 66-year-old Howie Mathews is hoping 'the old boys' can take out the race again as he saddles 10-year-old Sampson (Dubai Destination) in the staying feature at Trentham on Saturday. "I'm too old to be partying like that now. I'm a pensioner," Mathews said jokingly. "But we'll be celebrating for sure if Sampson wins on Saturday. It will be Sampson's third start in the Cup. From memory, Big Gamble had three starts in it, too. Just to have another Wellington Cup runner will be pretty awesome and I think he can win it."

Group 1 trainer has nice ring for Foote

It was a milestone day for Cambridge trainer Ben Foote at Trentham on Saturday as he landed his first Group 1 win with star filly Travelling Light (El Roca) in the Levin Classic and the former jumps jockey is enjoying the ride. Bred and raced by good friend Col MacRury, Travelling Light

has a near perfect record, with five wins from six starts and a third placing in the New Zealand 1000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). "Col is a lovely, genuine person and it was a very special day on Saturday for both of us," Foote said. Training a Group 1 winner had become Foote's priority after preparing Amanood Lad (Germano) to win the 2014 Great Northern Steeplechase (6400m). "There was a lot of effort and work put in to winning the Great Northern Steeplechase and that was the race that I really wanted to win," Foote said. "Once I had crossed that bridge it is fair to say my focus was on getting a Group 1 horse and it is very pleasing to achieve that."

Yearlings on show in Karaka Preview

Sky Thoroughbred Central will be broadcasting previews of the 2020 New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale tonight and next Tuesday evening from 7:30pm. Tonight's Part 1 will feature yearlings from Cambridge Stud, Waikato Stud, Hallmark Stud, The Oaks Stud and Westbury Stud while next week's edition will showcase highlight

Big weekend for Oscar Chavez

Panamanian rider Oscar Chavez was the star of the weekend's racing in Macau, winning five of the 12 races held on Friday night and Sunday's race cards.

Chavez had a total of eight rides over the two days, and was off to a flying start on Friday night with the Geoff Allendorf-trained Luen On Prosperity (Written Tycoon), who broke through for his maiden win in the Class 5 & 6 (1200m) at his fourth race start.

Luen On Prosperity has taken a little while to come to hand; however given his impressive victory on Friday night in a time of 1.09.3, which was well inside standard for the grade, the gelding is set for better things.

"He is an improving type whose trackwork has always contradicted his raceday form," Chavez said.

"He has also been ridden forward to lead in his three runs before today so Geoff (Allendorf) suggested that we give him a bit more time to settle and sit off the lead today.

"It helped a lot with the crazy speed they went out in front. He's still very green and took

a bit to get into his stride in the straight but was really strong at the end."

Chavez had to wait until the fifth race of the night, the Class 3 & 4 (1350m), to notch up his second winner for the meeting aboard Lucky Pearl (Darci Brahma).

Lucky Pearl, who contrary to his name has been a real luckless galloper recently with bad getaways and two lots of interference from his

past three runs, was able to turn that around under Chavez for a narrow win

Premier Choice (Hidden Dragon) from the Alan Tam yard landed Chavez his third win for the night when he scraped home under a lovely rails hugging ride to win by a neck from Lucky Gold (Captain Rio) in the Class 4 (1050m).

On Sunday's turf program, Chavez picked up where he left off on Friday with a last to first performance on the Geoff Allendorf-prepared Victory Supreme (Love Conquers All) who was able to nail Northern Legend (Northern Meteor) on the line to win the first race of the day, the Class 4 (1500m).

Next up was the Class 2 & 3 (1200m) and another winner for Chavez and Allendorf with Australian import Oneofthegreats (Snitzel) landing the jockey his fifth win for the weekend.

"Yes it's been a great weekend. That's for sure," Chavez said.

"Oneofthegreats has always shown ability and is a nice horse that will run from 1200 to 1500 no problem.

"I was a bit worried about the wide draw (11) but we had a quick jump and I was able to get across easily and sit off the leader Striking Brahma. Once in the straight he was really strong at the finish.

"Victory Supreme has been a bit of a difficult horse that is still very green and a bit field shy.

"Today from the wide draw, Geoff said to just come right back and ride him patiently and then give him clear running in the straight.

"He really showed a good turn of foot over the last two hundred and he will keep improving if we ride him this way."

With 16 winners to his name this season and only four behind the Premiership leader Roger Yu, Chavez looks a good chance of taking the crown should he focus on Macau for the remainder of the season

Chavez has been one the top riders in Singapore and Malaysia for over two decades and was the Champion jockey in 1996.

He was runner-up on numerous occasions to local champion Saimee Jumat and has over 1300 winners to his credit; having ridden in Hong Kong, Dubai, USA, India and France.

For the past two seasons Chavez has

spent much of his time in Macau, posting 30 winners last season and finishing in fourth in the Jockeys' Premiership behind Brazilian Ruan Maia.

With 16 winners to his name this season and only four behind the Premiership leader Roger Yu, Chavez looks a good chance of taking the crown should he focus on Macau for the remainder of the season.

Pearl Green (Fastnet Rock) showed his class in Sunday's Winter Trophy (Gr 2, 1800m) with a dominant victory lumping his 130 pounds with ease in a personal best time of 1.47.8.

Ridden by Fausto Henrique, Pearl Green

ducked his head down just as the gates opened and came out very slowly.

Henrique never panicked and cut across the back of the field, settling third last in the run, a lot further back than most anticipated.

Still well back at the 600 metres, the son of Fastnet Rock (Danehill) moved within striking distance of the leaders before the turn.

He let down magnificently in the straight to power past Luen On Dance Kid (Snitzel) who like most of the field, had a 14 pounds pull in the weights on Pearl Green.

Trainer K H Leong has done a fine job with the now six-year-old, having won 12 races and placed on 13 occasions from his 29 starts in Macau, earning well over HK\$5 million in prize-money.

The performance of the day on Sunday was the Danny Wong-trained Eclair Sunshine (All Too Hard) who simply ran his opponents off their legs in the Class 2 (1500m).

Given a daring ride by Frankie Choi, Eclair Sunshine was allowed to run freely from the 1200 metres and opened up a seven length break on the field.

Passing the seven hundred he extended that to a huge margin of more than 10 lengths.

Showing great stamina in the run down the straight, the five-year-old held on to win by three lengths on the line from Big Alloy (Foxwedge) who finished well from the back, with Sixth Sense (Shamardal) in third.

Jabali - Queensland-based, Clear Mountain Fairview resident Jabali (Exceed And Excel) sired his first winner on Saturday when the Mick Price and Michael Kent jnr-trained Jabali Ridge (2 g ex Single Princess by Not A Single Doubt) landed the opening Arbour Plate (1100m) at Flemington. First season sire Jabali covered 27 mares at a fee of \$4,950 last year, while his race-record was headlined by a second-place finish behind Earthquake (Exceed And Excel) in the 2014 renewal of the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m).

New Group / Grade 1 winners

El Roca - Westbury Stud resident El Roca (Fastnet Rock) sired his first Group 1 winner on Saturday when Travelling Light (3 f ex Cissy Bowen by Colombia) took out the Levin Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) at Trentham. El Roca stood at a fee of NZ\$9,000 (plus GST) last year, while his progeny also includes the Group 1-placed Bella Mente and the stakes performer Moeraki.

Exceed And Excel - Fresh from a record-breaking result at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Darley flagbearer Exceed And Excel (Daneshill) provided a timely reminder

of his global prowess when Irish import Queen Supreme (3 f ex Call Later by Gone West) landed the Paddock Stakes (Gr 1, 1800m) at Kenilworth on Saturday, becoming the 15th top-tier winner for her sire.

Var - Avontuur Stud resident Var (Forest Wildcat) sired his tenth Group/Grade 1 winner when Vardy (4 g ex Cupid by Jet Master) landed the Queen's Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) at Kenilworth on Saturday. Vardy has now six of his nine starts, while Var's progeny also include Variety Club and Via Africa.

New stakes winners

Amadeus Wolf - Late shuttler Amadeus Wolf (Mozart) was handed his seventh stakes winner on Saturday when Amadeus (7 h ex Jaywalk by Dangerous) landed the Chester Manifold Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Flemington. Amadeus Wolf shuttled to Australia for three consecutive breeding seasons between 2010 and 2012, covering 87 mares at a fee of \$11,000 in 2011. He died of a stroke at Haras des Faunes in France in 2017, while his progeny include Australian Group 2 winner Mister Sea Wolf.

Deep Impact - Late Shadai Stallion Station resident Deep Impact (Sunday Silence) sired his 147th stakes winner on Sunday when the Kazuo Fujisawa-trained Sanctuaire (3 f ex Hilda's Passion by Canadian Frontier) landed the Shinzan Kinen (Gr 3, 1600m) at Kyoto. Deep Impact, who was euthanised in July having suffered a catastrophic loss of mobility, is the sire of seven-time top-flight winner Gentildonna and first season Arrowfield Stud resident Mikki Isle.

Rip Van Winkle - Germanicus (4 g ex St Germaine by Keeper) secured a first Group-

race victory in the Anniversary Handicap (Gr 3, 1600m) at Trentham on Saturday to provide Westbury Stud stallion Rip Van Winkle (Galileo) with his 31st stakes winner. Germanicus has now won four of his 13 starts, while Rip Van Winkle - who stood for a fee of NZ\$12,500 (plus GST) last year - is best known as the sire of Phoenix Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) winner Dick Whittington and consistent Group-level performer Te Akau Shark.

Scat Daddy - Magic Star (4 f ex Meadow Breeze by Meadowlake) scored a half-length victory in the Marshua's River Stakes (Gr 3, 8.5f) at Gulfstream Park on Saturday, to hand late Coolmore sire Scat Daddy (Johannesburg) his 126th stakes winner. Scat Daddy's legacy includes Coolmore shuttlers No Nay Never and Mendelssohn, with the former having sired 2019 The Everest (1200m) starter Ten Sovereigns.

Shocking - The John and Karen Parsons-trained Camino Rocco (6 g ex Our Centasea by Centaine) won the Trentham Stakes (Gr 3, 2100m) on Saturday to provide Rich Hill Stud resident Shocking (Street Cry) with his ninth stakes winner. Shocking, who won the 2009 renewal of the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m), is the sire of New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Fanatic and stood for a fee of NZ\$8,500 in 2019.

Tapit - Tusk (7 g ex It's Midnight by Shamardal) landed a belated first success in Graded company when securing the Tropical Turf Stakes (Gr 3, 8f) at Gulfstream Park on Saturday to become the 131st stakes winner for Gainesway Farm resident Tapit (Pulpit). Tusk has now won eight of his 37 starts, while Tapit's progeny also include Belmont Stakes (Gr 1, 12f) winner Tonalist.

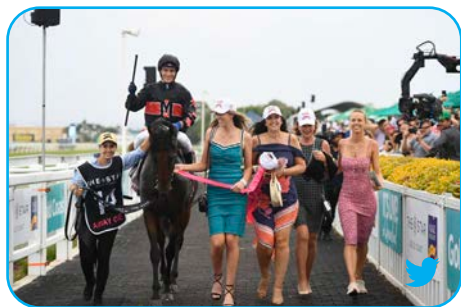

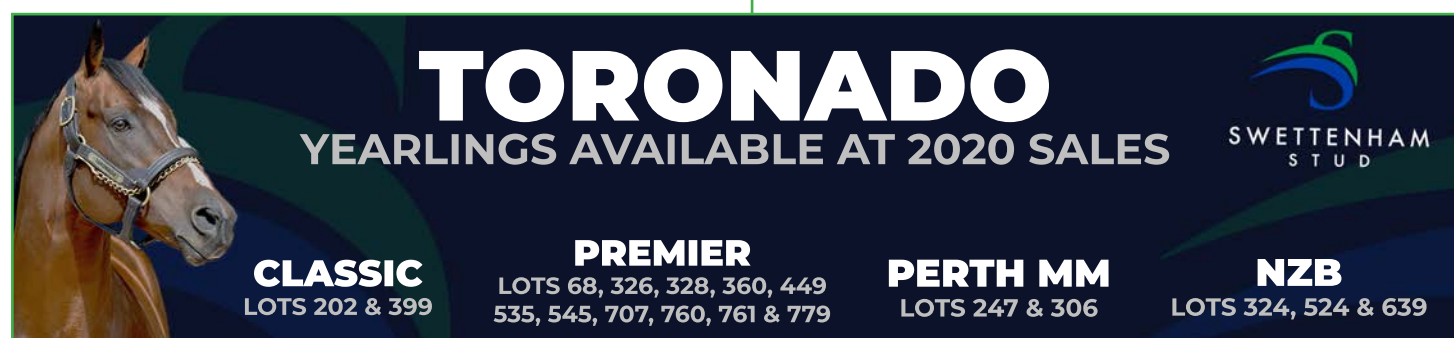
