# **Backers pushing for** Thailand to become new international racing hub Greenfield site in Bangkok secured with view of building large

racing and training centre

hailand is being touted as the new Asian racing hub capable of replacing the doomed Singapore industry with plans to build a racecourse on a greenfield site in the country's capital with the capacity for up to 1,500 horses.

Influential Singaporean owner Eric Koh, a former steward and now an entrepreneurial restauranter, is acting as an honorary adviser to

the Thailand Horse Racing Association as plans are drawn up to professionalise and grow the cottage sport into a flourishing industry with international appeal.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been signed between property developer JCK Co Ltd, a publicly listed company on the Stock Exchange of Thailand, and the owner of a parcel of land near Bangkok's international airport which has been deemed suitable for a new racecourse and training centre to be constructed. # **Archo Nacho** in Danehill premiere

Archo Nacho (Sioux Nation) is among the entries for Saturday's Danehill Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Flemington, but trainer Matt Laurie is still hopeful that the three-year-old gelding can gain a start in the following week's \$20 million The Everest (1200m). We want to know sooner than later because it dictates what we want to do with the Cont. on page 7 >> << Continued from page 2 Koh revealed more certainty over the proposal would be known in the coming months, but he hopes construction of the racecourse could be completed in three years' time, and he believes the Thai population would support racing in droves.

"I think using Hong Kong and Singapore as the model, they [Thailand Horse Racing Association] would like something of a similar scale," Koh told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"I think they have the passion, the enthusiasm and the population to sustain that vision because, population wise, there's [about] 72 million people and that's way more than Hong Kong [7.5 million] and Singapore [5.9 million] has.

"Walking into their racecourses is like walking into a full Sha Tin or Bukit Timah racecourse, so the passion and interest for horseracing is definitely there.

"There's also the fact that the Thais love to gamble, so I think there's the potential if racing is run professionally."

The desire is for the new track to race twice a week, requiring a horse population of about 1,500, a number which Singapore had during its halcyon period in the late 2000s, with initial prize-money about on par with what neighbouring Malaysia races for, which is approximately AU\$4,750 to a little over AU\$12,000 per race, whereas Singapore conducts races with prize-money from approximately AU\$22,000 to healthy six-figure pots.

"Our initial prize-money target, because that will have to come from betting revenue, so as betting revenue grows with the betting licence and the totalisator licence, which we will be applying for with the racecourse operations, so I am expecting a very quick increase in prize-money that will grow in tandem with the betting revenue," said Koh, who manages the Singapore racing interests of Thailand-based Falcon Racing and King Power and his own Team Cheval racing portfolio.

"So, for a start, I would see prize-money at probably on par with Malaysia in year one and in year three we should be looking at something near to what Singapore has been offering."

<< Continued from page 3 There are about 1,200 horses in training at Sha Tin and Conghua to sustain the Hong Kong racing industry and Koh envisages owners and trainers would be heavily reliant on Australian and New Zealand-bred horses to meet the needs of the Thailand Horse Racing Authority.

Koh said: "My projection would be very similar to what we have in Singapore where 82 to 85 per cent of the horses come from Australia or New Zealand."

Thailand Horse Racing Association's Stud Book manager Teeraporn Pamornsakda confirmed the organisation was keen to expand the local industry.

"We have been instructed from Mr Eric Koh about methods of developing the Thailand horseracing industry which commit to raise the level of racehorses and the new racecourse to meet international standards," Pamornsakda told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"At present, it is in the process of asking for permission to construct the new racecourse from government."

As things stand, the Royal Bangkok Sports Club conducts horseracing about twice a month, but it is effectively a private organisation which was first established in late 1904. The Royal Thai Turf Club which raced at Nang Loeng racecourse in Bangkok was decommissioned in 2018 with the 32-hectare venue repurposed as a memorial park by Thailand's King Rama X.

Koh said those behind the new racecourse project would hold talks with the Royal Bangkok Sports Club about it becoming a partner in the new development.

"As it is now, I just would like to get in place a good regulatory system, so I am starting to work with the Royal Bangkok Sports Club," Koh said.

"This project, in terms of the regulatory side of things, will start with them immediately and it depends what their land lease is and what their plans are."

Koh added: "They [Royal Bangkok Sports Club] run their own tote,

ANZ Bloodstock News has learned that there are also other parties keen to invest in the burgeoning Thailand racing industry, with advanced discussions underway about building racecourses in other regions of the country.

Koh is also aware of the potential for a Thai racing circuit to be developed.

"I think there will be a few training centres spread across the country and that's where the whole regulatory side will come in," he said.

"If we are going to be inclusive and if we are going to put horses at all these training centres, then the controls and regulations need to be strictly imposed to ensure the integrity of the races and things like that."

The funding of such a large-scale development will be significant and outside venture partners could be called upon to help underwrite the racecourse.

"This is a project that involves not just horseracing as there's plans for an 18-hole golf course, there'll be malls and hotels," Koh said.

"It's a fully fledged integrated project, so in terms of shareholders or partners, to make it a viable and sustainable project, maybe we need to be open to having other partners who can contribute to horseracing.

"While they can self-fund the development, they are keeping their options open with good partners who can help support and give horseracing a boost, then we should welcome them into the project as well"


Singapore racing is slated to end in 12 months' time, but there is a danger the 180-year-old industry could close before that intended date as participants seek alternative careers or countries to be able to continue to train and ride.

While it won't be immediate, Koh hopes the respective groups behind the Thailand investment can reap the rewards by making it a destination desired by international participants and horses.

"When the time comes, we'll open it [Thai racing] for international applicants and we'll see who is interested - trainers and jockeys," he said.

"To rationalise [this development], we want to make it an international racing hub that could possibly replace Singapore.

"We want to be global and international and then, of course, the staging of international races will come in time."

# Archo Nacho in Danehill premiere

We want to know sooner than later because it dictates what we want to do with the horse." The last-start Poseidon Stakes (Listed, 1100m) scorer has made just three starts in his career to date, for two wins and an unlucky second. "I'm not saying he's a Giga Kick, by any means, but he kind of went up there with a similar sort of make-up and obviously the three-year-olds seem to go pretty good with the light weights," Laurie said. "I think everyone is aware of that and they're looking at these sort of horses."

# Hill Stakes for Werther

Danny O'Brien's in-form six-year-old Young Werther (Tavistock) will bid to land his maiden stakes win this weekend when the gelding lines up in the Hill Stakes (Gr 2, 1900m) at Rosehill. The son of Tavistock (Montjeu) broke a 21-run

losing streak when scoring over 2000 metres at Flemington in July, before then going back-to-back with a last-start win in a Benchmark 100 (2040m) at Moonee Valley on September 9. "The Hill Stakes is worth \$2 million and the Turnbull is only worth \$750,000, so this is a good chance for him to be involved in a big prize-money race," O'Brien said. "The Turnbull usually defines whether or not you should be running in the Caulfield Cup. Most years it's the best form race for the race and if she puts her hand up and runs super in the Turnbull I'd certainly have no problem running her in the Caulfield Cup."

# Stakes-placed Facile breaks through

Having finished runner-up in the Inglis Nursery (Listed, 1000m), Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) and Reisling Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m), the Gerald Ryan and Sterling Alexiou-trained Facile (Trapeze Artist) recorded a first win when scoring in a Benchmark 68 (1100m) event at Warwick Farm yesterday. Ridden by Tyler Schiller, the three-year-old daughter of Trapeze Artist (Snitzel) - a \$420,000 purchase by her trainers at last year's Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale - was sent off the oddson favourite and held off the fast-finishing Joliestar (Zoustar) by a half-length. "She's got improvement in her; it's seven months since she's raced, she's only had one jumpout (and) one trial and she had a little setback about six weeks ago, which is why she hasn't run earlier," Ryan said. "She's a nice filly. She'll win better races." Tyler Schiller revealed he was impressed with the fillies' fighting qualities. "She doesn't really give you a feel that she has a lot, but I think she's got a lot of fight," Schiller said. "She did a little bit of work to get across and then fired herself up a little bit, which probably took away from her finish, but I thought she's got a nice cruising speed and she quickened well and she's got more in store than this."

# Lyre's sister smashes rivals by nine lengths

The Ben, JD and Will Hayes-trained Ersa (Lonhro) continued her progressive ways as she broke her maiden in impressive style at Ballarat. Having finished last-but-one on debut at Sale in August, the three-year-old filly produced a much better showing to finish fifth on her next outing at Sandown-Hillside, beaten just two lengths by the winner Grinzinger Belle (Shamexpress) that day, and improved again yesterday to defeat Seamingly (Divine Prophet) by a whopping nine lengths, under jockey Mick Dee. Sporting the colours of Gerry Ryan's Limerick Lane, Ersa was a \$200,000 buy for Robert Roulston Bloodstock from the Yulong draft at last year's Inglis Premier Yearling Sale. Ersa is a sister to 2019 Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) heroine Lyre, being out of the Street Cry (Machievallian) mare Erato, herself a half-sister to dual Group 1 winner Impending (Lonhro), Group 3 winner Forget (Exceed And Excel) and Listed scorer Epidemic (Lonhro).

# Flemington goal for impressive Manchego

Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale graduate Manchego (Toronado) the perfect start to his race career with a maiden win at Ballarat, putting a longer-term Flemington stakes goal on the cards for the three-year-old. Trainer Matt Cumani, who paid \$95,000 for the Armidale Stud-sold, Ken Breese-bred gelding, outlined the Amanda Elliott (Listed, 1400m) on Champions Day as a potential spring target for Manchego. The gelding took a narrow gap to take out the 3YO Maiden Plate (1200m) yesterday under jockey Declan Bates. "It's always a relief when there's a bit of talk about them, and everyone at the track here for the last week has said you have a good one there," Cumani told Racing. com. "You wonder how it gets out; although his trial form has been impressive, he had every right to come here and do something

Ridden by Damian Lane, the daughter of Written Tycoon (Iglesia) toughed it out on the front end to defeat Capitalisation (Capitalist) by three-quarters of a length, with a further long-neck back to Scully (Shooting To Win) in third. Gumdrops was a \$600,000 purchase for Sheamus Mills Bloodstock out of the Lime Country Thoroughbreds draft at least year's Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. She is the only foal to race from two out of the Group 3-winning Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice) mare Sugar Bella.

# US-buy War Frontier resumes with maiden win

War Front (Danzig) colt War Frontier, a US\$250,000 buy for his co-trainer Mick Price at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling Sale, broke his maiden at the second attempt yesterday when easily running out a threeand-a-quarter lengths winner of a 1400-metre event at Ballarat. Ridden by Damian Lane for Price and his co-trainer Michael Kent Jnr, who had scored with Gumdrops just two races earlier, the four-year-old entire defeated South Pole (Almanzor), with a further neck back to Easy Turn (Star Turn) in third place. Out of the unraced Speightstown (Gone West) mare Agreeable Miss, War Frontier is a brother to stakes scorer Alkaraama and to stakes-placed winners Smart Folks and Faydhan, while also being a half-brother to stakes winner and Grade 1 placegetter Mark Of Approval (Lemon Drop

Jockey Craig Williams made the trip for the 1000-metre hitout in which the four-time Group 1 winner defeated Saint Bathans (Maurice) by half a length. "That's very typical of him," Hayes, who trains in partnership with his brothers JD and Will, told Racing.com. "He is a little bit on the lazy side, which is what we've always said about him, we've never been confident with him going into a race because he leaves it for race day. But we were very happy, Craig just let him balance and got him to the outside and took him through his paces and on the line, he had his ears pricked and just did what he had to. It was exactly what we wanted and will tighten him up nicely. Going a month between runs, I think it was just a good hitout just under two weeks from his race and we wanted a good gallop in company and doing it in a trial is probably the best way to do it more like pressure."

## Mazu cleared to trial

Mazu's (Maurice) co-trainer Paul Snowden has revealed that the five-year-old gelding, who was withdrawn from his engagement in the Premiere Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick on Saturday, had responded well to chiropractic treatment and appears to have overcome the minor injury sustained at the stables. Snowden confirmed that he intends to trial Mazu at Rosehill this morning in preparation for The Everest. A veterinary clearance has been provided to Racing NSW stewards which will allow the horse to participate in the barrier trial.

# I Wish I Win set for Pakenham trial

Group 1 winner I Wish I Win (Savabeel) will take in a gallop at Pakenham this morning as he prepares for next weekend's The Everest at Randwick. Last season's TJ Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) scorer produced a solid first-up run when third in the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield on September 2, but will head into The Everest off the back of a six-week break. "He's in really good order and he'll just have a nice piece of work there tomorrow and that should have him ready for Saturday week," Peter Moody, who trains in partnership with Katherine Coleman, told Racing.com. Bookmakers have I Wish I Win as the \$4.50 second favourite behind last Saturday's Premiere Stakes winner Think About It (So You Think), who is at \$4.

# Melbourne Cup ruled out for West Wind Blows

Having completed his time in quarantine at Werribee, the Simon and Ed Crisford-trained West Wind Blows (Teofilo) is set for next weekend's Turnbull Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington. The son of Teofilo (Galileo) does hold an entry in the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) but that is not one of the races being considered by the Crisfords during his time in Australia. "At the moment he's going to the Turnbull next weekend, then you've either got the Cox Plate or the Caulfield Cup," Ed Crisford said. "We'll see how he gets on next weekend before we decide, but at the moment we're leaning towards the Caulfield Cup. A mile and a half around Caulfield is probably more his sort of race than a mile and a quarter at Moonee Valley. He's got 54 kilos for the Caulfield Cup, which is a pretty fair weight for him. He's doing really well down there and is the type of horse who could be very competitive. To be honest, I don't think he's a Melbourne Cup horse. Two miles just might not suit him. After Australia you've got Dubai, Saudi and Hong Kong potentially, so he's going to go travelling this winter."

The veteran jockey has partnered the daughter of Playing God (Blackfriars) to five of her six career victories, with the Colin Webster-trained mare now set to be aimed at the Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Ascot in December. "You sort of have to head that way and it would be very valuable if she could run top three in that race [Winterbottom Stakes]," Knuckey said on Tabradio. "That's everybody's dream, it's worth \$1.5 million and it's a Group 1. I know we are just coming off a Listed race at Belmont, but she's a winner. She's won six out of 11, she's a winner, why not have a go at it. That's the dream and if you can pull it off or run a place, it's going to be very valuable to her."

# Kiwi Bosson to ride at Valley, Flemington

New Zealand-based jockey Opie Bosson will be back riding at Moonee Valley on Friday night before then heading to Flemington on Saturday where he will partner the last-start Group 1 winner Skew Wiff (Savabeel) in the Rose Of Kingston (Gr 2, 1400m). The four-year-old daughter of Savabeel (Zabeel) was ridden by Bosson for that latest victory, where she defeated Dragon Leap (Pierro) by a head in the Tarzino Trophy (Gr 1, 1400m) at Hastings.

# Skirt The Law spelled

Queensland's champion trainer Tony Gollan will now have just one runner in next Saturday's Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) at Caulfield, after revealing that Skirt The Law's (Better Than Ready) spring campaign is over. Last year's Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) heroine had finished runner-up in the Quezette Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) and third in the Cap D'Antibes Stakes (Listed, 1100m) before then running seventh in the Scarborough Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Moonee Valley on Saturday, being beaten five and a half lengths by the winner Coeur Volante (Proisir) and she was described as having pulled up badly immediately after the race.

# Vauban settling in at Werribee

Current Melbourne Cup favourite Vauban (Galiway) has been pleasing David Casey after arriving into post-arrival quarantine at Werribee

over the weekend. "Touch wood, he seems fine," Casey, the travelling foreman for trainer Willie Mullins, told Racing.com. "He travelled well, it seems he's eating and drinking since he came and arrived. He didn't lose a lot of weight and he's put it all actually back on since he came. Delighted with him. [He] had a little hack this morning [Monday], nothing strenuous - so, so far so good. I went over and rode him last Tuesday before he left, gave him a nice bit of work and was very happy with him." The last-start Ballyroan Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 4f) winner will likely head straight towards the Cup on the first Tuesday in November. "I imagine it will be straight in, it's looking that way," Casey said. "I imagine the next couple of weeks will be pretty quiet for him and then we'll start building him up closer to the race."

# Melbourne Cup penalty for Iust Fine

Following his win in Saturday's The Metropolitan (Gr 1, 2400m), the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained Just Fine (Sea The Stars) has incurred a Melbourne Cup penalty that will see the imported stayer's weight elevated 0.5 kilograms to 53 kilograms. The son of Sea The Stars's (Cape Cross) win in the weekend's Group 1 contest took his unbeaten record in Australia to three. "The half kilo penalty balances the fact that Just Fine carried the minimum weight of 50kg in the Group 1 Metropolitan, and he already had 52.5 kilograms in the Melbourne Cup," Racing Victoria's chief handicapper David Hegan said. "So, he was expected to run a big race and duly did so in extending his unbeaten run in Australia. When measuring his performance through the horses that finished between third and fifth, who are all heading towards the Melbourne Cup, and also factoring in his updated domestic rating with an overall profile as Group 1 winner over 2400 metres, a slight adjustment to his weight was required. The adjusted weight of 53 kilograms therefore confirms a performance level that is commensurate with his last two wins."

# Teetan hoping for Melbourne call-up

Hong Kong-based rider Karis Teetan is hoping that he can gain a call up for a lightweight Melbourne Cup ride this spring. Teetan, who has ridden more than 600 winners in Hong Kong, can comfortably make the Melbourne Cup minimum of 50 kilograms. "I would love to," Teetan told Racing.com. "I'm a natural lightweight and I know this race has a lot of lightweight horses, so if I could ever get an offer to go to Australia to ride in a Melbourne Cup, I would not wait one second to say yes. Since I was in South Africa, I've always heard about the Melbourne Cup, but when I came to Hong Kong, I learned a lot more about the Melbourne Cup and how big and important the race is for a lot of Australian people."



# No Guineas for Tokyo Tycoon

Exciting three-year-old Tokyo Tycoon (Satono Aladdin) has been ruled out of the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Riccarton next month. The heavy going proved too tough at Hastings on Saturday for the Mark Walker and Sam Bergerson-trained runner, with the \$1.40 favourite finishing fifth in the Hawke's Bay Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m). Bergerson was met by a very tired horse following the race and the decision was made to send the talented son of Satono Aladdin for a spell and shift their focus towards the million Karaka Million 3YO Classic (RL, 1600m) in January. "The track didn't suit and Opie [Bosson, jockey] said he never felt comfortable," Bergerson said. "[The track] was quite loose, and he couldn't accelerate on that ground. I looked at him in the tie-ups after the race and he was pretty knackered. He left feed over the weekend. We chucked him on the scales and he was pretty light for him. He is going to go out for a spell. We are going to give him three weeks out in the grass and let him recover, and then just aim him for the Karaka Million at the end of January."

# Feature mile targets for Malt Time

It may have taken a few years and 21 starts, but trainers Shaun and Emma Clotworthy may have found Malt Time's (Adelaide) new pet distance. The seven-year-old mare, who had previously been kept to sprint distances, winning the Legacy Lodge Sprint (Listed, 1200m) last November, was tested over a mile for the first time in the Arrowfield Stud Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) at Hastings on Saturday, where she finished runner-up behind Mustang Valley (Vanbrugh). Her connections were impressed with her last start run in the Tarzino Trophy (Gr 1, 1400m), and having placed in the Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) last year, were intrigued about testing her over further ground. "We were going into a bit of the unknown with the mile. We weren't sure whether she would get a mile because she does tend to travel a little bit keenly," Shaun Clotworthy said. "She had raced well in the first leg, the Tarzino, and she had improved. We were happy with her but weren't sure of the track conditions [Heavy 9], but she handled the cut in the track and raced well. We were rapt. Long-term, we may look at the Rich Hill Mile and the Thoroughbred Breeders' at Te Aroha in the autumn."

# Semper Magico relishes wet deck

A downpour of rain at Hastings on Saturday was welcomed by consistent stayer Semper Magico (Per Incanto), who skipped through the heavy conditions to win his third race in succession in the Betta Inspect It Premier (2000m). The eight-year-old gelding defeated Hit The Road Jack (Jakkalberry) by two and a quarter lengths, while All In All (Ekraar) was a further length and a quarter away in third. "He had the three-kilo claim which obviously helped him, but I think when the track deteriorated like that, he handles bad ground fairly well, so it probably gave him a bit of an advantage, but we were certainly happy with the end result" said trainer Mark Oulaghan. "He was always a good galloper, he could always gallop since he was a young horse, but he was just a bit immature in the mind, and couldn't quite put it together. He was mainly running over 1400 metres and 1600 metres earlier on and this is the first preparation we've got him out over 2000 metres and he seems to be handling it pretty well. He's come a fair way in his last four or five starts, he possibly may run at Rotorua in three weeks' time I'm not sure. While he's maintaining his form we'll keep him going but he raced a bit during the winter in the sprints so he's probably getting to the stage where he'll need a spell soon."



# MYS: Malaysia Captain finds winning form

Malaysia Captain (Toronado) caused a huge upset when he landed the Magic Millions Gold Coast 2YO Sale Trophy (1400m) at Sungai Besi on Saturday. Purchased by China Horse Club for \$130,000 as an unraced two-year-old, Malaysia Captain came over from Singapore where he won three races when racing as Resolution. Ridden by Lim Shung Uai for trainer Richard Lines and racing over 1400 metres for the first time, Malaysia Captain proved too good for the odds-on favourite Emperor Taizong (Arlington) and won by three and a half lengths. "He is a genuine horse," said Lines. "The 1400 metres was a question mark, but he got a soft lead which made the difference today. Hopefully we will see him winning more races."



# UK: Record-setting Marsha dies aged ten

Marsha (Acclamation), the dual Group 1 winner who holds the record price for a thoroughbred sold at auction in Europe, has died aged ten. Trained by Sir Mark Prescott for owner-breeders the Elite Racing Club, the daughter of Acclamation (Royal Applause) proved a tough and talented performer over three seasons of racing. Having recorded two stakes wins during the summer of her three-year-old season, Marsha then became a Group 1 winner at Longchamp when driven out by Luke Morris to win the Prix de l'Abbaye (Gr 1, 1000m) in the same campaign. Her career highlight came when she nosed out Lady Aurelia (Scat Daddy)

and Frankie Dettori in the Nunthorpe Stakes (Gr 1, 5f) the following year. Marsha was then runner-up to Baattash (Dark Angel) in defence of her Prix de l'Abbaye crown before the curtain came down on a career which yielded seven victories and more than £650,000 in prizemoney. Her final race was when sixth in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (Gr 1, 5f) at Del Mar. At the end of a hugely successful racing career highlighted by those Group 1 strikes, she was offered as a breeding prospect at the 2017 Tattersalls December Mares Sale and was bought by Coolmore for 6,000,000gns.

### 32 for Frankel

Kelina (3 f ex Incahoots by Oasis Dream) became the 32nd elite-level winner for Juddmonte Farms stalwart stallion Frankel (Galileo), when landing the Prix de la Foret (Gr 1, 1400m) at Longchamp on Sunday. Trained by Carlos Laffon-Parias, the threeyear-old filly was manoeuvred through a tight gap to lead by her rider Maxime Guyon and kept on strongly to beat odds-on favourite Kinross (Kingman) by a half-length, surviving a post-race objection from the runner-up's jockey Frankie Dettori. Another UK raider Shouldvebeenaring (Havana Grey) finished third, beaten one and three-quarter lengths by the winner. A half-sister to Listed-placed winner Ansilia (Dansili), Kelina is the third foal out of the Listed-winning Oasis Dream (Green Desert) mare Incahoots, herself a sister to Listed scorer Dream Clover and a half-sister to Group 1 winners We Are (Dansili), With You (Dansili) and Call The Wind (Frankel). Frankel stood the 2023 northern hemisphere breeding season at Banstead Manor Stud for a record fee of £275,000 (approx. AU\$523,030).

# FR: Highfield Princess leaves it late in Prix de l'Abbaye

Having failed to fire in the Flying Five Stakes (Gr 1, 5f) at the Curragh on September 10, the John Quinn-trained Highfield Princess (6 m Night Of Thunder - Pure Illusion by Danehill) returned to winning ways in Sunday's Prix de l'Abbaye (Gr 1, 5f) at Longchamp. The mare added a fourth elite-level win to her record when she defeated Perdika (Unfortunately) by a length. Aesop's Fable (No Nay Never) finished a further short-head away in third. Quinn said after the win that the mare could now head to the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (Gr 1, 5f) at Santa Anita on November 5 or the Hong Kong Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) at Sha Tin on December 10.

# Three for Ten Sovereigns

Coolmore's first-season sire Ten Sovereigns (No Nay Never) was handed his third individual stakes winner when Mysterious Shadow (2 f ex Eclairante by High Chaparral) scored in the Premio Coolmore (Listed, 1500m) at San Siro on Sunday. The Endo Botti-trained filly was sent off the odds-on favourite to follow up her decisive debut win last month and defeated Atmosfera (Arcano) by one and three-quarter lengths, with a further half-length back to Rebel Music (Ribchester) in third. Out of the unraced High Chaparral (Sadler's Wells) mare Eclairante, Mysterious Shadow is a half-sister to fellow stakes winner Estrosa (Sioux Nation). Ten Sovereigns stood the 2023 northern hemisphere breeding season at Coolmore's Irish base for a fee of €17,500 (approx. AU\$28,860).

### 169 for Distorted Humor

Balladeer (4 c ex Golden Ballad by Galileo) provided his sire Distorted Humor (Forty Niner) with a 169th individual stakes winner when

landing the John Henry Turf Championship Stakes (Gr 2, 10f) at Santa Anita on Sunday. Ridden by Victor Espinoza for trainer George Papaprodromou, the four-year-old entire defeated Masteroffoxhounds (War Front) by a half-length, with a further length and a quarter back to Speaking Scout (Mr Speaker) in third place. Balladeer is the only winning foal from two to come out of the unraced Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare Golden Ballad. Distorted Humor was pensioned by WinStar Farm in 2021.

# Ten for Bolt D'Oro

Spendthrift Farm stallion Bolt D'Oro (Medaglia D'Oro) was handed his tenth individual stakes winner when Ruby Nell (3 f ex Rich Love by Not For Love) scored in the Unzip Me Stakes (Listed, 6.5f) at Santa Anita on Sunday. The Richard Mandella-trained filly was ridden by Edwin Maldonado and beat Fast And Shiny (Bernardini) by a length, with a further three and a quarter lengths back to Free And Humble (Free Drop Billy) in third place. A half-sister to four winners, Ruby Nell is out of the winning Not For Love (Mr Prospector) mare Rich Love. Bolt D'Oro will stand the 2024 northern hemisphere breeding season for a fee of US\$60,000 (approx. AU\$93,680).

# US: Cody's Wish returns to winning ways

Having been beaten into third in the Whitney Stakes (Gr 1, 9f) last-start, popular entire Cody's Wish (5 h Curlin - Dance Card by Tapit) took out the Vosburgh Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at the Belmont At The Big A on Sunday. A winner of four Grade 1s, the five-year-old returned to winning ways, beating Accretive (Practical Joke) by a length-and-a-half. Great Navigator (Sea Wizard) finished another three-and-a-quarter lengths away in third. Owned by Godolphin, the Bill Mott-trained Cody's Wish has won ten of his 15 career starts and has accrued US\$2,586,030 (approx. AU\$4,043,200) in career prize-money.

# US: Caramel Swirl awarded Gallant Bloom success

Caramel Swirl (5 m Union Rags - Caramel Snap by Smart Strike) added a third stakes win to her CV when the stewards awarded her a dramatic running of the Gallant Bloom Stakes (Gr 2, 6.5f) at Belmont At The Big A on Sunday. Trained

by Bill Mott, Caramel Swirl passed the post in third, but was handed the race after it was deemed Sterling Silver (Cupid), who finished first, and second-placed Headland (Paynter), caused the mare interference.

# US: Zandon dominant in Woodward Stakes

Having not tasted victory since his win in the Blue Grass Stakes (Gr 1, 9f) in April 2022, Zandon (4 c Upstart - Memories Prevail by Creative Cause) regained the winning thread when he took out Sunday's Woodward Stakes (Gr 2, 9f) at Belmont At The Big A. Trained by Chad Brown, the colt was sent off the pre-race favourite and he duly delivered, defeating Film Star (Flatter) by a comfortable four and a half lengths. Law Professor (Constitution) finished another neck away in third. The colt was bought by Mike Ryan for US\$170,000 at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in 2020.

# US: Adare Manor continues winning run

The Breeders' Cup Distaff (Gr 1, 9f) at Santa Anita on November 4 could now be on the cards for Adare Manor (4 f Uncle Mo - Brooklynsway by Giant Gizmo) after she cruised to victory in the Zenyatta Stakes (Gr 2, 8.5f) at Santa Anita on Sunday. The filly went into the race having won her previous four appearances, three of them at stakes level including the Clement L Hirsch Stakes (Gr 1, 8.5f) on August 5. Sent off the wellfancied odds-on favourite, Adare Manor justified the support, beating Desert Dawn (Cupid) by an emphatic five and a quarter lengths. Micro Share (Upstart) was another six and a half lengths adrift in third. Adare Manor has now won seven of her 13 starts and has won US\$981,600 (approx. AU\$1,534,700) in career prize-money.

# When a negative becomes a positive

espite the arrival of daylight saving time, our New Zealand winter refuses to let go and neither does the rain which caused both Saturday's Hastings features to be affected, making quite a contrast to the lovely spring conditions for the club's first day, three weeks earlier.

Presented with a Heavy 8 surface, hot favourite Tokyo Tycoon (Satono Aladdin) floundered in the Hawkes Bay Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m) but worse was to come. The track was further downgraded and Legarto (Proisir) as well as the 2022 Arrowfield Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) champion, La Crique (Vadamos), were both raceday withdrawals from this year's edition, drastically reducing the quality of the field.

What is a negative for some can become a positive for others and that proved to be the case

for Mustang Valley (Vanbrugh) who relished the deterioration of the track, motoring clear after she took over at the 200 metres. The mare was always comfortable, even when travelling wide throughout. From the 800 metres she kept gaining on the leaders and was almost level with pacemaker Callsign Mav (Atlante), at the top of the straight. Inside the 200 metres she looked to come away, was briefly challenged from the 100 metres, but found more late to win convincingly.

Hastings has been kind to the now fiveyear-old daughter of Vanbrugh (Encosta De Lago) having taken out the Livamol Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) last October. A six-time winner in 26 starts, she is from his initial crop and remains Vanbrugh's premier representative ahead of one of the better three-year-olds from last season, Wild Night, also bred by Windsor Park Stud. These two can claim full responsibility for the turnaround in Vanbrugh's fortunes as a sire. His first crop included 36 foals, followed by 15 in his second, and just 11 in his third. Consequently, from those three crops only 31 have made it to the races, 14 of which have won.

Crop five (now two-year-olds) numbered 31 and his sixth crop, many of which we will see in January, totalled 35. The turnaround, courtesy of Mustang Valley and Wild Night in the last 12 months, has been dramatic. Vanbrugh covered 106 mares in 2022 and with his fertility averaging around 80 per cent, his future looks brighter than in 2019.

As to why Mustung Valley relishes the wet, the finger cannot be pointed at Vanbrugh. His three Group victories including the Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) were all achieved on good tracks.

# Planned, no impulse

Retained by her breeder, Windsor Park Stud, Mustang Valley is, so far, the sole winner from her dam, Cream Of The Crop (New Approach) whose granddam is a half-sister to champion Might And Power (Zabeel), also a graduate of Windsor Park Stud.

That connection is the reason that Windsor Park's Rodney Schick outlayed just \$5,000 for the Adelaide winner, presented as a maiden mare at the 2017 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale.

Kiwi Chronicles caught up with Schick who confirmed that Cream Of The Crop was on his radar as soon as the catalogue was available.

"I was in France a few years back and tried to buy Cream Of The Crop's granddam Buenos Aries but while on the way to view her got a call to say she was not for sale," he said.

"At the Magic Millions sale Cream Of The Crop was certainly not an impulse buy but no one else bid. I had a lot more than \$5,000 for her. Call it good luck or good judgement!.

"She is a big, scopey mare, a lovely type and we had already had great success with the family. She is by a good stallion backed up with several more top sires so has nice lines. Good families can sometimes go quiet for a generation but they often bounce back."

She owes the stud nothing and her line is assured as her first four foals are all fillies. Her 2021 Darci Brahma (Danehill) filly sold last January for \$150,000 and she has a yearling filly by Hello Youmzain (Kodiac).

Schick added: "The Hello Youmzain filly is headed for Karaka in January. Cream Of The Crop absorbed her Savabeel foetus last season but she has been served by him again this season and has tested positive. Another filly would be great."

Zabeel (Sir Tristram) crossed with this family created a freak. Schick is trying for another Might And Power, no doubt. Look back a little further and readers will notice that this is also the female family of the great Sir Tristram (Sir Ivor) himself.

### A different Satono Aladdin

The Tote had us believe that Tokyo Tycoon was still the one to beat in the Guineas however, according to Opie Bosson, the previously

unbeaten (at least on raceday) gelding was not able to quicken in the ground, plugging away for fifth.

Meanwhile, paternal half-brother Lantern Way got the better of Solidify (Redwood) over the last 100 metres to secure both his maiden stakes success and maiden win at start six, taking his earnings to \$136,660. He was due the breakthrough having recorded two black-type placings in his previous five starts.

Last week's Kiwi Chronicles detailed Satono Aladdin's rise in fame including Rich Hill Stud's John Thompson's mention of Lantern Way who was bred and sold by the stud along with the stallion's Tokyo Tycoon and the talented Lupo Solitario.

Lantern Way became stakes winner number five for the son of Deep Impact (Sunday Silence) and was a \$40,000 purchase by his trainer, Lisa Latta, from Book 2 of the 2022 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale.

His granddam, Say No More (Pentire), was a quality mare and winner of two Group 1 miles, namely the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes and the Thorndon Mile. Thanks to John Thompson for pointing out that Rich Hill Stud's Pentire (Be My Guest) also features as the damsire of Sotono Aladdin's Pennyweka and Lupo Solitario.

# Proisir strikes again

Taking all before him last season was Proisir (Choisir), whose five individual Group 1 winners laid the foundation of a maiden New Zealand Sire Premiership. Two of those five, Legarto and Prowess, each had one start in Australia. Both won. Legarto stormed home in the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and Prowess dealt with a high-class collection of three-year-old fillies in the Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m).

So far this season in New Zealand Legarto's flashing home for third in the Tarzino Trophy (Gr 1, 1400m) was the stallion's best stakes effort, until Friday evening.

The Moonee Valley meeting revealed yet another Proisir filly with, not only talent, but also a rare quality of huge determination to get the job done. Her name is Coeur Volante and her racing style is not dissimilar to Legarto's in that she has a propensity for getting back and making it difficult for herself when the business end of the race is unfolding.

On debut, last May at Sandown, she probably should have won but was severely checked twice when looking for a run. How she ran fourth when the race was virtually over shows her fierce determination.

Mid-June at the same track, she was taken to the outside once straightened and maintained a strong run, which included a sharp sprint to level up to the leader, then went on for a smart win.

Last Friday night's Scarborough Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) saw her get into trouble again. She ran up along the rail to be handy enough for the run home but ran into a pocket. There was no room but somehow she found a tiny lane but had to shove her way through. No sooner had she found space than she ran into a tiring

runner and had to switch back towards the inner. That available turn of foot was produced and she shot through and put the race away.

Ballymore Stables' Paul and Mike Moroney found Coeur Volante at the NZB 2022 Karaka Yearling Sale (Book 2), outlaying \$90,000. An attractive, dark bay, she is the second winner from Shanina, a Testa Rossa (Perugino) winner of five races. Shanina's other winner, Hasstobemagic (Scissor Kick), was Listed placed. The filly was offered via Kelly Van Dyk's Prima Park draft on behalf of the breeder, Fairdale Stud's Duncan Fell.

Winning trainer Mike Moroney is a believer. "We brought her back to target the Thousand Guineas and that's where we'll head towards," he said.

Ambitious plans but the way she attacks the line she has shown enough to be a threat to any three-year-old filly in Australia. Is it too early to call her a star? Perhaps, but do not be surprised if she goes on with it.

Coeur Volante represents a nice family, even if it went quiet for a generation. Her granddam, Feisty Rose (Fusaichi Pegasus) is a half-sister to Sydney Listed winner, Rose Of Peace (Hussonet). Both are daughters of one the best Australian three-year-old fillies of her crop, Rose Of War (Danehill) who landed four stakes races (two of them at Group level) and ran second in the VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m).

Rose Of War herself was half or full sister to three stakes winners while her dam, Savana City (New Regent), was also a top-ranked three-year-old filly and included the Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) among her eight wins. This is a strong female family and Coeur Volante might be the next.

# Where and who

Advanced years provides no excuse for taking shortcuts but the writer did just that last week regarding the background of Golden Rose (Gr 1, 1400m) victor Militarize (Dundeel) in last week's Kiwi Chronicles.

Thanks to Mark Chitty, of Haunui Farm, for alerting me that Militarize was not in New Zealand "for mere weeks" as the column incorrectly stated. In fact he was in New Zealand for 13 months, long enough to benefit from our superb growing conditions, as well as to be exposed to all-important early education. Thanks Mark. Good point.

Why a horse's suffix is determined by their place of birth rather than their place of conception, remains a valid question.

Earlier in the year Kiwi Chronicles discussed this same topic as there was not

only the example of Militarize but also the reverse example of Little Brose (Per Incanto), winner of the prestigious Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m). Little Brose was conceived in New Zealand yet foaled in Australia. He has the AUS suffix but our industry is more than happy to claim him as one of ours. His breeder is a New Zealander, addressed in the following paragraph.

Readers may well understand such a conundrum, furthered by Chitty who asked a similar question: "The conundrum re AUS or NZ bred applies also to any breeder query. Is the breeder the person who mates the mare in the first place and gains the conception, or the owner of the mare when she foals down?"

That question might be answered with a question: Who paid the service fee?

Blue Point - Indivar (2 c ex Bitter Lake by Halling) provided Darley shuttler Blue Point (Shamardal) with a 39th individual winner when breaking his maiden at the fifth attempt in a handicap over six furlongs at Redcar. Indivar is closely related to the Listed-placed winner Loch Lundie (Shamardal), being the fourth foal out of the winning Halling (Diesis) mare Bitter Lake, herself a half-sister to Group 1 winner Lyric Of Light (Street Cry). Blue Point, who stood the 2023 northern hemisphere breeding season at Kildangan Stud for a fee of €35,000 (approx. AU\$57,730), will stand the southern hemisphere season at Northwood Park for \$44,000 (inc GST).

Calyx - Former shuttler Calyx scored his 15th first-crop winner courtesy of Accumulate (2 c ex Dazzling Rose by Raven's Pass) breaking his maiden over seven furlongs at Newmarket. Accumulate was bought for 65,000gns at the 2021 Tattersalls December Foal Sale, before being snapped up by Coolmore's MV Magnier for 170,000gns at Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale the following year. Ingleby Ivy (2 f ex Luna Moon by Equiano) broke her maiden at the second time of asking when scoring over six furlongs at Ripon, handing Calyx (Kingman) with his 16th individual first-crop winner. A 12,000 gns buy at last year's Tattersalls Somerville Yearling Sale, Ingleby Ivy is out of dual winner Luna Moon (Equiano), herself a half-sister to Listedwinning duo Tabaret (Bertolini) and Saigon (Royal Applause). Calyx shuttled to Coolmore Australia for two seasons, but did not return in 2022. He stood the 2023 northern hemisphere breeding season at the operation's Irish base for a fee of €10,000 (approx. AU\$16,460).

**Tassort** - Newgate Farm-based first-season sire Tassort (Brazen Beau) got his career off with a bang when his first runner, Manaal (2 f ex Red Lodge by Midshipman), showed her class when taking out the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) at Randwick. Bred and raced by Emirates Park, Manaal is the third winner out of US Listed-winner Red Lodge (Midshipman), who was bought for US\$500,000 at the 2018 edition of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. Tassort, who Emirates Park stand in partnership with Henry Field's Newgate Farm, commands a fee of \$11,000 (inc GST)

Ten Sovereigns - Former shuttler Ten Sovereigns (No Nay Never) scored his 21st firstcrop winner when Seven Eleven (2 f ex True Verdict by Danehill Dancer) broke her maiden over five furlongs at Down Royal. Purchased for 30,000gns at last year's Tattersalls Somerville Yearling Sale, the filly is out of the Group 3-placed mare True Verdict (Danehill Dancer), herself a sister to fellow stakes-placed filly Foolish Ambition. Ten Sovereigns shuttled to the now defunct Valachi Downs for one season in 2020. The stallion stood the 2023 northern hemisphere breeding season at Coolmore Stud for a fee of €17,500 (approx. AU\$28,940).


