Inglis buys online auction house Wanamaker's to enter billion dollar North America bloodstock market

nglis will expand its digital presence into the United States after entering an agreement to purchase online thoroughbred auction house Wanamaker's in a bid to capture a share of the US\$1.2 billion American bloodstock market.

The Australian auction house has been the world leader in online thoroughbred auctions, investing heavily in its Inglis Digital business for more than a decade and it has been investigating opportunities to enter the North American market since late 2019, a move subsequently delayed by the onset of the pandemic in early 2020.

The purchase of the Wanamaker's business has been 12 months in the making and Inglis managing director Mark Webster believes that now is an opportune time for the company to enter the US sector.

The online bloodstock market in America, he says, is five-to-six years behind the far more mature Australasian one, which was accelerated during the booming years of the Covid outbreak and has won vast acceptance from buyers and sellers. Continued on page 3

Continued from page 2 "It's a play into North America, but it's also a global opportunity for us because people tend to deal in US currency and America is the biggest market in terms of thoroughbred breeding. It's got twice as many broodmares as Australia and Australia's number two in the global market," Webster told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"So, it represents a good opportunity for us to apply what we've learnt [in Australia] and adapt that to the American market, but we can also access other markets from there. There's obviously South America, but also Europe and the Middle East.

spent \$8.64 million in Australia - to conduct a recruitment drive and make key appointments ahead of its official takeover of Wanamaker's.

Inglis Digital USA will conduct its first rebranded online auction in July.

Webster says Inglis' intention is to provide America's thoroughbred investors with the liquidity that the Australian market receives.

"People can trade out of a horse, whether it's a share or a whole horse, and do that at any time that suits them rather than waiting for live sales," the long-serving Inglis managing director said.

"If you've got a horse that just won a decent race and you want to trade out or you've got a sibling to a decent horse, you can trade out in a timely manner. You don't have to wait another year for the broodmare or racehorse sale to come around.

"That's what we've learnt from this [market evolution], the physical sales are great, but the timing of them doesn't necessarily work well for industry participants.

"That's what we're bringing to the table, that ongoing liquidity and ability to trade."

The Australian arm Inglis Digital has turned over, on average, more than \$90 million per year in its twice-monthly and occasional bespoke online auctions since its inception seven years ago. Its international expansion will see it come up against well-known American auction house Fasig-Tipton, which recently also moved **Continued on page 5**

Continued from page 3 into the online auction space following Wanamaker's initial forays.

Keeneland, America's biggest thoroughbred auction house, is yet to enter the online space.

Wanamaker's hosted its first online auction in June 2020 and since then has sold horses such as Fiya (Friesan Fire), who sold for US\$400,000 in July of that year and went on to become a multiple stakes winner.

The connections of Bandonarun (Uncle Lino) parlayed an impressive allowance score at Laurel Park into a US\$330,000 sale just weeks later during the October 2023 auction.

Wanamaker's co-founder Liza Hendriks will remain with the company under the rebranded Inglis Digital USA banner as chief executive, a position she currently holds. The company will be based out of Lexington, Kentucky.

Hendriks, who founded the company with fellow Godolphin Flying Start graduate Jack Carlino, will be joined in the new venture by senior director of sales and recruitment Kyle Wilson, formerly the assistant director of sales development with Keeneland.

Kelly Brophey, the owner of Clarity Bloodstock, will serve as director of sales operations.

"We couldn't be more delighted to announce our partnership with the esteemed auction house, Inglis," Hendriks said.

"As we embark on this exciting journey together, I am personally thrilled to continue serving as chief executive, with our newly formed team.

"Digital sales in the American market have already proven immensely beneficial, offering year-round trading opportunities and eliminating the need for horses to endure extensive travel for physical sales."

Webster suggested that the two Inglis Digital businesses will be able to leverage off each other,

particularly via the Inglis-owned software development company Ardex Technology.

"This is really just the start of the innovation we plan to bring to North America and there's more innovation coming to Australia as well," he said.

"We're using artificial intelligence now to match buyers with horses and that will be rolled out in the local market in the coming months more formally and that's the sort of thing we can take to North America.

"[Ardex Technology] gives us a bit of an advantage to develop things in-house and apply them to Inglis, but also to share them with customers. Magic Millions uses Ardex Technology to run their business, so we're happy to share what we develop.

"Build once, sell many times' has been the model since I have been involved with the company."


Three for Calyx

Coolmore Stud's former shuttler Calyx (Kingman) was handed his third southern hemisphere winner on Wednesday when

Grinzinger Pod (2 f ex
Rockthenightaway
by Shooting To
Win) made a
winning debut at
Bendigo. Having
run second in
an 800-metre trial

at the track last month, the Ben Brisbourne-trained filly was sent off a \$15 chance under Lachlan King but defied those odds with a narrow 0.1 lengths success over Markdel (Snitzel) with a further 2.5 lengths back to Pantoja (Pariah) in third place. "I had a phone call to ask if I would call John [Wheeler] and ask if I could train this filly, and I did, and he sent me a couple of other young ones as well, which I'm really grateful for," Brisbourne said. "It's really good to get that relationship started and hopefully go on to bigger and better things now." Purchased for \$38,000 by John Wheeler from the Morning Rise Stud draft at last year's

Inglis Gold Yearling Sale, Grinzinger Pod is the first foal to come out of the Shooting To Win (Northern Meteor) mare Rockthenightaway, herself out of the stakes-placed winning mare Cindarockinrella (Fastnet Rock). Rockthenightaway has a yearling colt by another Coolmore stallion Churchill (Galileo) and a weanling colt by Tassort (Brazen Beau), who was sold for \$70,000 when consigned by Bell River Thoroughbreds at this year's Inglis Australian Weanling Sale. Calyx shuttled to Jerrys Plains Farm in 2020 and 2021 but has not returned since. He stands at Castlehyde for a fee of €12,500 (approx. AU\$20,380).





Recent history firmly points to the AD Hollindale Stakes as being the key to finding the winner of the XXXX Doomben Cup on Saturday.

The past six winners of the Cup have had their final lead-up run in the 1800-metre Hollindale, which was run this year at the Sunshine Coast.

Huetor, successful in the past two Cups, finished fourth in the Hollindale two years ago and second last year. This campaign he filled fifth place.

There is a widely accepted belief some horses peak at the same time in the calendar. Is Huetor superior in Queensland during The Star Stradbroke Season or could it be the return to the winner's circle for last year's dominant Ladbrokes Queensland Derby winner Kovalica, who finished third to Huetor in the XXXX Doomben Cup the start prior? We'll find out on Saturday.

This year's Hollindale winner Numerian was having his first start since winning the 2400-metre Perth Cup over summer. It was a top training effort by Annabel Neasham to produce the gelding in such fine fettle after a long break.

The ground was very heavy for the Hollindale and Numerian's chances on Saturday might hinge on track conditions, but he is no stranger to Brisbane success as a Sky Racing Q22 winner himself.

A bumper card of support races with big fields will shape the markets for future Group 1s throughout the carnival including ballot exemption to The Star Stradbroke on the line in the Ladbrokes BRC Sprint, which produced subsequent Stradbroke winner Tofane in 2021.

Waller bullish on Kovalica's chance

Champion trainer Chris Waller is confident that his four-year-old Kovalica (Ocean Park) is ready to produce a big effort when he tackles Saturday's Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m). The 2023 Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) hero has had one start so far this campaign, running a strong third in the Hollindale Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) behind the re-opposing Numerian (Holy Roman Emperor) on a Heavy 10, and Waller feels getting back to a sounder surface will be a huge boost for the son of Ocean Park (Thorn Park). "He finished off really well, the last 200 metres were good," Waller told Racing. com. "His work since then has been very good and we can't fault him. I know he hasn't won since the Derby last year, but now up to more suitable distances, I think we'll see some good form from him. He's ready to bounce, he's a proper horse." Nash Rawiller will retain the ride on Kovalica with the pair set to jump from barrier three.

Bott hoping Doomben Cup trio can outrun odds


Tulloch Lodge are set to deploy three outsiders for Saturday's Doomben Cup, but Adrian Bott has a sneaky suspicion they may outrun their odds. Hoo Ya Mal (Territories) (\$21), Serpentine (Galileo) (\$26) and New Endeavour (New Bay) (\$41) are all accepted for the 2000-metre Group 1, and Bott is keen to see if 2022 Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) runner-up Hoo Ya Mal can progress from his first-up eighth in the Hollindale Stakes. "I don't think we've seen him at his best yet, he's shown glimpses of that, so we just want to get some consistency for him," Bott, who trains in partnership with Gai Waterhouse, told Racing. com. "I thought he'd come back as best as we had kicking off this campaign and I don't think we saw that first-up ... he didn't necessarily enjoy the Heavy track in the Hollindale. He got further back than we anticipated, it was very slowly run, so no doubt he's open to some sharp improvement. He'll enjoy getting back on top of the ground." Meanwhile, Serpentine,

who landed the 2020 Epsom Derby, returns from a short break following his fourth placing in the Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m), while New Endeavour is set to be on the back-up following last weekend's Chairman's Handicap (Gr 3, 2000m) second. "They're a couple of nice ones, we're hoping to target some of the staying races," Bott said. "Serpentine most likely we'll see in the Doomben Cup to kick him off, potentially on a Q22 path. New Endeavour raced on Saturday, just went down in second, but he's a potential to back-up in the Doomben Cup, Goldman will also come up for some of the staying features."

Dunn expecting improvement from Oaks filly

Murwillumbah-based trainer Matthew Dunn is hoping that Oceans Of Energy (Dundeel) can stamp home her Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) claims when she lines up in Saturday's The Roses (Gr 2, 2000m) at Doomben. Having run a last-start fifth in the Gold Bracelet (Listed, 1800m) at the Gold Coast, the daughter of Dundeel (High Chaparral) will be stepping out to this weekend's distance for the first time and will again be ridden by the 'underrated' Michael Rodd. "When I pushed the button the other day, she just went," Dunn said of the filly's homework. "She'll improve a bit and the run last time was good in the conditions. She can really come on this week, and I'd say she'll progress to the [Queensland] Oaks. Michael [Rodd] rode her really well last time and he'll stay on her. I think he's being really underrated by the big stables here."

King Magnus on trial for Brisbane

The run of King Magnus (Magnus) in a 1400-metre handicap on Saturday's Sandown card will determine where the eight-year-old continues his winter campaign. If successful in this weekend's contest, a heat of the VRC-CRV Winter Championship, the Robbie Griffiths and Mathew de Kock-trained gelding is likely to head for the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) at Eagle Farm on June 15, with him likely to be

weighted out of a crack at the VRC-CRV Winter Championship Final (1600m) at Flemington on July 6. "If he's successful on Saturday, there's a chance we could take him up to Brisbane for the Stradbroke as we will probably be weighted out of options down here," Griffiths said. "We could stay on for the other heats of the Winter Championship, but he's already been weighted at 62 kilos, so if he wins, he'll be up around the 64-kilo mark. While you can claim in the heats, it will still be a big task for him to carry that sort of weight, while in the final there is no claims. He's likely to be weighted out of the Winter Championship final if he wins a heat along the way."

Bethencourt continues comeback run

Both the South Grafton Cup (1600m) on July 14 and Coffs Harbour Cup (1600m) on August 2 will be targets for the Kim Waugh-trained Bethencourt (Puissance De Lune) as the now seven-year-old continues his comeback from a career-threatening leg injury at Randwick. A fetlock issue had connections of the gelding considering retirement but, after choosing a lengthy period of rehabilitation, they have reaped the rewards as the son of Puissance De Lune (Shamardal) scored in a Benchmark 94 (1600m) at Gosford last month in what was his first start for 11 months. "The owners were great getting the operation done," Waugh said. "They could have easily just retired him, but he was still producing and going so well, so we did the surgery and to come back and win first-up was pretty good." Having then run down the field in a Benchmark 100 (1500m) at Rosehill a fortnight later, Bethencourt was an acceptor for last week's Scone Cup (Listed, 1600m) but was scratched due to an outside gate and will now tackle a 1600-metre contest at Randwick on Saturday. "We'll get through his next run and decide what we want to do," Waugh said. "I'd really like to go to the South Grafton Cup with him and the Coffs Harbour Cup, those places often get soft tracks and it doesn't matter how heavy it is, he loves it. They're the two races I'm waiting for."

Derby next for Bullets High

A rallying success in a 2130-metre handicap at Warwick Farm has trainer Joe Pride ready to fire Bullets High (Ace High) at next month's Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m). The gelded son of Ace High (High Chaparral) was sent off the \$3.50 favourite for Wednesday's event and, after being headed briefly entering the 100-metre mark, rallied gamely to deny Gottabesavvy (Savabeel) in the final strides to score by 0.1 lengths. "They are strung out to the point where you think, well that was a good staying test, and it probably tells you a fair bit," Pride said. "He showed that one quality that a lot of the horses won't have in the Derby and that's the ability to stay a trip. He is working it out and he's got good ability, we can all see that. I hate using the old racing cliches but they're only three once. He's going to have a spell after it anyway. If he is eating and doing well during the week, I think I'll send him up. He has already been to Queensland once this prep and it didn't dent the sides. He is a pretty tough horse, he's just not too bright."

Guineas aspirations for Private Life

Another winner at Wednesday's Warwick Farm meeting to have potential Classic aspirations is the Chris Waller-trained Private Life (Written Tycoon) after the colt produced a dominant performance in a 1100-metre event. Having run fourth on his debut at Canterbury on May 1, the son of Written Tycoon (Iglesia) hit the lead at the 100-metre mark and comfortably pulled clear to beat Shalaa Gold (Shalaa) by 1.4 lengths under a confident James McDonald ride. "From

"It's important for when you're taking on better horses and that's what he will be doing as a three-year-old. He will probably go out now, it's getting a bit too late to get to Queensland, but I did want to give him two runs as a two-year-old for that exact reason – [for] experience and then to come back as a three-year-old, grow, develop and he should continue to improve. He could be a Guineas horse as a three-year-old."

Ala Moana with Oaks potential

Jockey Blake Shinn came away impressed with the winning effort of Ala Moana (Lean Mean Machine) at Bendigo on Wednesday and feels that the Danny O'Brien-trained filly has every right to head for next month's Queensland Oaks. The daughter of Lean Mean Machine (Zoustar), who ran third in February's Tasmanian Oaks (Listed, 2100m), showed plenty of staying prowess in the 2200-metre event as she pulled right away from runner-up Freedom Escape (Hallowed Crown) to score by 3.3 lengths. "She ran a great race at Caulfield last time, but look, it's not easy to do, tackling the older horses and from a wide draw at a difficult start here today," Shinn told Racing.com. "But she won the race at the start, put herself in the right spot. She got out at the right time and her class shone through. I'm impressed by her, she's got a good set of lungs on her. Danny's great with these fillies - she might be worthy of a trip up north now. She'd be a Queensland Oaks type, she ran the 2200 metres out strongly. That was a good win, I thought it had merit. They're only three once and if [managing owner] Mark Sowerby wants to do it, she might run a competitive race in Queensland."

Import impresses at Bendigo

The Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young-trained import Craig (Territories) proved far too good for his rivals on debut at Bendigo on Wednesday. The three-year-old son of Territories (Invincible Spirit) lined up in the 1400-metre maiden as a \$3.50 chance under Luke Currie and stretched

impressively clear of his eight opponents to beat Neferure (Justify) by 4.3 lengths. "Being a European horse, you've got Caulfield Cup in the back of your mind one day on to a Melbourne Cup and being by Territories he should get out to a trip later on," Young told Racing.com. "He's a nice progressive horse, but it was still only a maiden, so you can't get too carried away, but winning like that, they give you a little bit of hope. He didn't jump too flash, but Luke didn't panic. There was plenty of speed on early and he brought him out wide, gave him clear air and he's finished off brilliantly. We'll find another race for him in a couple of weeks, probably up to the mile and see how far we can press him through in the next six weeks and then give him that little let-up."

Nolen in box seat for I Wish I Win ride

Luke Nolen could be set to reignite his partnership with Group 1 winner I Wish I Win (Savabeel) when the Peter Moody and Katherine Coleman-trained gelding lines up in the Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m) on June 1. I Wish I Win has been ridden by James McDonald on his last two outings but, with McDonald set for Japan to partner Romantic Warrior (Acclamation) in the Yasuda Kinen (Gr 1, 1600m) on June 2, Nolen looks first choice to regain the mount. "I'm sure we'll lean that way," Mark Chittick, who owns I Wish I Win in partnership with Moody, told RSN. "The opportunity came up with James and we've had a long-term relationship and that's why we took the opportunity and there is absolutely nothing against Luke or anyone else. We became aware on Sunday, and I was with Moods, that James was going to be in Japan. James thought he was

going to be able to ride him in the Kingsford-Smith because there was a flight at nine o'clock, but when they put the provisions in place to go into lockdown beforehand, that took that opportunity away from us. Moods put three names in front of me to ride him in the Kingsford-Smith and I said I'd be happy with any of the three, but you make the final decision. If it is Luke, it would be great to get Luke back on the horse and also get a favourable draw."

Without A Fight in final stages of recovery

Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) and Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) hero Without A Fight (Teofilo) is in the final stages of his recovery from a tendon injury according to horse rehabilitation expert Lee Evison. The Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained seven-year-old has been stationed at Evison's famous Longwarry property since the injury was discovered last December. "He is well and truly over halfway or probably more," Evison told Racing.com. "When they do start to heal and heal well, the process can quicken up quite quickly, so right now he is in a good place. He is a sound and happy horse. He does his work out on the jogger every morning and he's got a really good base fitness to him, so when he does get back to Anthony and Sam, I think they will be pretty happy with that. He started off fantastic with his rehab and it [the tendon] settled down really quickly. It then went through a little bit of a slow patch, but things are actually starting to pick up good for him. His last scan was very encouraging."

Giga Kick northbound

Clayton Douglas' stable star Giga Kick (Scissor Kick) will head north this winter but is highly unlikely to take to the track according to the trainer. "Everything's all good, he's poking along at this stage, he's just in work doing a little bit," Douglas told Racing.com. "We're starting to screw down as to what our plan might be, whether we take him for a drive and get him out of the cold weather - a decision will be probably made on that in the next couple of weeks. We might take him to Sydney, or whether we trek up to Queensland to get a bit of sun on his back for a while, we'll work that out."

New Zealand industry worth NZ\$1.9 billion to economy

he Racing New Zealand board have announced the release of the 2022/23 Size and Scope Report that outlines an industry generating close to \$1.9 billion in value-added contribution to the New Zealand economy.

The Size and Scope report of New Zealand Racing is a comprehensive look at the racing industry and is the biggest of its type since 2017. Welcomed by deputy Prime Minister and minister for racing Winston Peters, the report provides a detailed look at the economic, social and employment benefits of racing across all three codes (thoroughbreds, harness, and greyhounds) at a national and regional level.

In 2022/23, the New Zealand racing industry generated total direct spending of \$1,385,600. However, the flow-on effects linked to this expenditure increased the size of the industry's value-added contribution to almost \$1.9 billion.

A total of 13,632 full-time equivalent jobs were sustained by the New Zealand racing industry, with around 39 per cent the direct result of the racing industry activity whilst the remainder are in down-the-line industries that produce and supply goods and services to support racing in New Zealand.

In total, there are more than 40,600 roles occupied in the New Zealand racing industry as employees, participants, or volunteers. Many of these are specialised, industry specific roles - particularly



in the breeding and training/racing related disciplines. Furthermore, many participants hold more than one role within the industry.

In 2022/23 close to 639,100 attendances were recorded at thoroughbred, harness, and greyhound race meetings in New Zealand. There are more than 18 race meetings held in New Zealand every week providing live entertainment to more than 639,000 attendees.

"We're proud of the contribution the New Zealand racing industry makes to the economy. Racing is currently experiencing positive momentum off the back of the 25-year partnership between Entain and TAB NZ announced in 2023, and this report validates the importance of the industry as a whole," Racing NZ chairman Mike Clarke said.

"Employment is an important metric to measure the health of our industry, as the passion of our people is what drives us forward. There is no doubt racing is a vital part in maintaining healthy communities and employment opportunities in New Zealand."

The son of Ten Sovereigns (No Nay Never) will line up in the Champagne Stakes (Listed, 1600m) after resuming with a third placing at New Plymouth over 1200 metres. "He ran a big race at Taranaki the other day and we had this one in the back of our minds," Phelan said. "We rode him back to get home over 1200 metres and it turned out he was run off his feet early, so he did well. We had him up early, but through the summer two-year-old races they were just too fast for him, he hasn't got that turn of foot on those tracks. He has matured a lot and had a bit of time now, which has done him good. We'll have a throw at the stumps at the 1600 metres, it's not going to be easy and probably be the survival of the toughest and the fittest. We've got Michael McNab engaged so that's definitely a bonus as well."

De Russian Rocket targets first success

With three runner-up results from just five raceday appearances, De Russian Rocket (Sweet Orange) is due a win, and trainer Ebony Turner is hoping it comes at Wingatui on Friday. The three-year-old son of Sweet Orange (War Front) has been a consistent performer for the Riverton horsewoman and will be out to continue his purple patch of form in a 1400-metre maiden. "He has been going really well, I am really happy with him," Turner said. "He has come through his races each time better and better. He is a bit of a handful to deal with, so it is good to see him put his best foot forward on raceday." Turner said De Russian Rocket is suited to rain-affected tracks and is hoping there is some precipitation around Wingatui ahead of Friday. "Ideally, I would have liked to have seen some rain around, but any bit of give in the track will help him, he is definitely not a summer horse," she said. De Russian Rocket has been allocated 58.5 kilograms but will get some weight relief courtesy of apprentice jockey Denby-Rose Tait's three-kilogram claim. "Being the highest rated horse in the maiden, I saw it fit to pop Denby back on, she did a good job at Invercargill, and we get some weight off his back, which is a bit of help because he is not the biggest horse," Turner said.

Sorghaghtani strikes at Taupo

Co-trainer Graham Richardson believes the best is still to come for progressive mare Sorghaghtani (Mongolian Khan) after her rise through the grades continued with a victory in a 1750-metre event at Taupo on Wednesday. The now four-year-old daughter of Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor) had more than a year off the scene after a trio of starts as a three-year-old and has returned a furnished galloper, winning twice and finishing runner-up twice from just five outings. Running under Opie Bosson on Wednesday, Sorghaghtani ran on well in the closing stages of the race to defeat front-runner Gin Gin (Ghibellines) by

Having failed to hit the frame in her previous five attempts at Listed level, the Charlie Johnstontrained mare made amends here as she got her head in front with 50 yards left to run, holding off the William Haggas-trained Red Danielle (Sea The Moon) by three-quarters of a length. Irish raider Snowcapped (Churchill) ran a further half-length behind in third. A homebred for Miss Kirsten Rausing, Madame Ambassador is the seventh foal out of German Group 1 winner Lady Jane Digby (Oasis Dream), making her closely related to winners Galapiat (Galileo) and Francophilia (Frankel) and a half-sister to four further winners. Churchill, who stands at Coolmore's Irish base for a fee of €30,000 (approx. AU\$48,960), has been confirmed to shuttle to Jerrys Plains Farm for a fee of \$19,800 (inc GST).

US: Bolt D'Oro filly tops **Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale**

A filly by Bolt D'Oro (Medaglia D'Oro) punctuated a steady day of trade during the second session of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale on Tuesday when selling to Winchell Thoroughbreds for US\$1.25 million (approx. AU\$1.88 million), the highest price of the two-day sale. Trainer Steve Asmussen signed the ticket. Consigned by Wavertree Stables (Ciaran Dunne), agent, the filly is out of the winning Arch (Kris S) mare Werewolf and is a half-sister to stakes winner and Graded stakes-placed

Howling Time (Not This Time) and to stakes winner Air Recruit (Air Force Blue). The filly descends from the accomplished female family of Grade 2 Desert Party (Street Cry) and stakes winner Elliecat (Crafty Prospector). A total of 188 horses sold for a gross of US\$18,949,500 (approx. AU\$28.51 million) during the auction's second day, good for an average price of US\$100,795 (approx. AU\$151,680). The median price came in at US\$50,000 (approx. AU\$75,240), and a total of 35 horses did not sell in the session. All told over the auction's two days of trading, 343 lots sold for gross receipts of US\$32,751,500 (approx. AU\$49.28 million), compared to 375 sold for \$34,795,500 in 2023. This year's average price of US\$95,485 (approx. AU\$143,690) established a record. The figure rose from last year's average of \$92,788 and eclipsed the 2022 record of \$95,391. This year's median price of US\$50,000 was identical to last year's price and also tied the sale record. A total of 71 horses failed to meet their reserves this year, compared to 62 a year ago.

Ridden confidently by Matthew Chadwick, Superb Capitalist slotted his fourth course and distance victory with success in the Class 2 Wiltshire Handicap (1200m) to provide Cruz with his 45th win of the season and momentum for the final Group 1 of the Hong Kong season.

Preparing to saddle La City Blanche (Cityscape) and Five G Patch (Camelot) in the Champions & Chater Cup, Cruz said of Superb Capitalist: "This horse is very consistent and he likes this track. I'm going to bring him back here again for another race."

With five wins from 16 starts, the Capitalist (Written Tycoon) four-year-old earned a PPG Bonus of HK\$1 million (approx. AU\$192,950) as well as HK\$1.59 million (approx. AU\$306,790) in prize-money.


Dennis Yip, who will start Massive Sovereign (No Nay Never) in the staying feature at the weekend, also figured prominently on Wednesday with Lean Master's (Havana Grey) victory.

Searching for his first Group 1, Yip has already forged new territory this season with Massive Sovereign's stunning Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) triumph on March 24 and he was delighted with Lean Master's effort to lead throughout under Harry Bentley to win the first section of the Class 4 Hereford Handicap (1200m), the gelding's first course and distance victory of the campaign.

"The horse is in very good form and everything was good for him tonight. He's a front runner and it was difficult to catch up from behind," Yip said of the bay, who sped straight to the front from barrier one.

"He had the speed, good form and he keeps improving. He's from Europe and he's only a four-year-old so I think he can keep improving and go up to Class 3."

Midori Glory (Shooting To Win) made a successful debut for Ricky Yiu, clinching the Class 3 Renfrew Handicap (1000m) for Matthew Poon. The Shooting



"The draw helped him first time here, but I didn't worry about the sharp turns because in the morning he can cope with everything," Yiu said. "He's acclimatised really well and Shooting To Win is a good sire for Hong Kong. The owner bought him as a yearling.

"Eventually he will step up to 1200 metres, but I think 1000 metres is good at the moment. Whether it's here or Sha Tin it doesn't matter."

Cody Mo notched his 15th win of the campaign with Romantic Laos' (Pins) tenacious performance to land the Class 3 Selkirk Handicap (1650m) for Derek Leung after Arthur's Kingdom (Camelot) struck at his 26th start in Hong Kong to claim the Chester Handicap (2200m) for Me Tsui under Karis Teetan.

Now a seven-year-old, the Camelot (Montjeu) gelding was runner-up as a two-year-old in the 2019 Criterium de Saint-Cloud (Gr 1, 2000m) when trained by Aidan O'Brien. Until tonight, the gelding had finished in the top-three only once in Hong Kong.

Teetan made it a double with Forever Glorious' (Archipenko) tough win in the Class 4 St George's Challenge Cup Handicap (1650m) as Francis Lui moved to 57 wins for the term, only two shy of Pierre Ng (59) with 14 meetings left in the season.

Michael Chang took his season tally of wins to 14 with three-year-old New Power's (Swiss Ace) success under Keith Yeung in third section of the Class 4 Hereford Handicap (1200m) before Danny Shum-trained Satirical Fan (So You Think) controlled the tempo from the outset and fought courageously to land the Class 4 Lancashire Handicap (1650m) to provide Ellis Wong his 20th victory of the season.

Shum completed a brace when The Perfect Match (Complacent) snatched a short-head victory over Telecom Speed (Street Boss) in the second section of the Class 4 Hereford Handicap (1200m) under Hugh Bowman.

"He had natural pace which is a good help here and he's only lightly-raced so there's certainly plenty of upside to him," Bowman said of the Complacent (Authorized) three-year-old. "He showed plenty of courage."

Hong Kong racing continues at Sha Tin on Sunday with the running of the HK\$13 million (approx. AU\$2.5 million) Champions & Chater Cup.

It's In The Blood

uying horses is often about deciding what problems you might be able to excuse, but there's one glaring character flaw Andrew Baddock can not abide.

"There's no bigger fault than a lack of ability," he says.

The former long-term manager of Gooree racing and breeding had this in mind in September, 2022, when doing what he often does for the cause of his boutique private bloodstock operation - sifting through an Inglis online catalogue to see if something had slipped through the cracks.

He found a five-year-old mare by Turffontein (Johannesburg) who'd had just four starts for her owner-breeders and trainer Ed Cummings. The first was a narrow second in a style hard to perform - coming from the back up the short straight at Gosford. The last was a 1000 metre Thursday maiden win

at Kembla Grange, just six weeks before this online auction.

The reason she was being sold - for there had to be one - was an issue duly notified: roarer. Some might say there's nothing worse. Baddock reckons not being able to run is.

So he went for her and he snared her, for just \$2,500. He sent her to the renowned Randwick Equine Centre, where his trusted vet Jonathan Lumsden performed tie-back surgery, costing \$4,000.

Baddock has his own farm, near Gooree at Mudgee, where he could take the mare for her rehab, keeping his investment in her to basically just that \$6,500.

The mare, Aureus Angel, has since earned 100 times her purchase price - \$250,100 to be exact - and not in the lucrative Sydney scene but in Brisbane, where she's missed a place only once in nine post-op starts with trainer Chris Munce.

She reinforced her value further last Saturday when, following three black type placings last year, she became a stakes-winner by taking the Bright Shadow (Listed, 1110m) at Doomben. Baddock and Munce hope she can now end her campaign a Group 1-winner - either in the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) or the Tattersall's Tiara (Gr 1, 1400m) at Eagle Farm - before likely entering the breeding barn.

Her tale brings lessons in a few areas, including peering closely into the cracks.

"I was having a look through the online catalogue," Baddock tells It's In The Blood. "I do like to look around the fringes, and do some research and keep abreast of what's happening with different families, which ones might be coming on."

Last August, for example, he spotted a mare named Bring Me Showers (Sebring). She'd only won one of 16 but had a three-year-old halfsister, owned by Gooree, named Tropical Squall (Prized Icon) who'd just won a Canterbury maiden on debut. Baddock bought Bring Me Showers - in-foal to Xtravagant (Pentire) - again for possibly his favourite number, \$2,500.

Six weeks later, Tropical Squall won the Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m), and a week after that Baddock sold Bring Me Showers for \$32,500, to Tasmania's Grenville Stud.

Better still, in June 2020, Baddock bought nine-year-old Backpacker Express (Big Brown) through Magic Millions online. Her two runners were a city winner and a winner, but she was empty and had missed the previous year, and Baddock nabbed her for just \$1,000. He sent her to \$22,000 sire Zousain (Zoustar), sold the resultant filly for \$160,000, and she's now Drifting, winner of two from four including the Magic Night Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m).

Another lesson is that of all the people it takes to prepare and sell a horse, one of the most important might be often overlooked, especially when you can only see them online: the photographer.

"I was looking through and I saw this great type," he says of Aureus Angel. "The people who were selling her were Hanover Lodge at Wilberforce. I've seen them sell a few and they do a great job getting good photos of them. It was a great standing shot, and when I was flicking through, it just grabbed my eye straight away. I said, 'Jeez that's a good sort'.

"She was a beautiful big mare, with great length, a terrific big hindquarter, a long rein and a massive girth. She wouldn't have made a two-year-old type as a yearling, but she was a cracking type."

Next came a check of her race record.

"She'd only had four starts, so very lightly raced, but she'd just got beat in her first start at Gosford, coming from near-last, which is hard to do at Gosford," he says.

"Then she'd won her fourth start at Kembla, and as most people know, provincial racing around Sydney is pretty damn tough.

"And then she'd gone in the wind, and I think the owners had thrown their hands up. But I spoke to Ed Cummings and, to his credit, he was pretty bullish about her. He was thinking about buying her himself, but he had too many in his stable."

Certain judges have their doubts about tie-back operations, with horses often said to return not as good as before. Baddock isn't among them.

"We knew we were buying damaged goods," he says. "And tie-backs can sometimes be a bit hit-and-miss. But they say it's about a 70 or 80 percent strike-rate.

"At Gooree, we'd had good success with them. We had a horse called Barkada (Spectrum) who'd had a tie-back, and went on to win the Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m).

Plus I had great confidence in Jonathan Lumsden.

"There's a lot more successes with the procedure these days. They've really got it down pat. It might depend a little on who you go to, but we've always gone to the same people, and we've got no complaints so far.

"The thing was, we knew she had ability, she was a cracking type, we just had this one issue that we thought we'd roll the dice and try to fix.

"It's funny - people will pay amazing money for yearlings unbroken and untried. Here, we had one who'd been tried, she was a last-start winner, but she had a throat issue. I felt, for the money we'd paid, it was worth the risk."

Baddock matter-of-factly says "I didn't really care what she was by or out of", which is a slight shame, this nominally being a pedigree column. But on closer inspection, he was heartened that she was out of Sebring mare - echoing that purchase of Bring Me Showers - in Miss Marriott.

And while Miss Marriott was a non-winner from seven starts, she hailed from a rich family. Her third dam Brocade (Habitat) was a Group 1 winner in France who'd thrown two dual toptier victors, in Barathea (Sadler's Wells) and his full sister Gossamer.

Barathea, winner of the Irish 2000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Breeder's Cup Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) in the early 1990s, went on to sire six Group 1 winners in a stud career including three shuttles to the Hunter Valley's Widden Stud, with his best performer worldwide coming here in Easy Rocking, winner of the VRC Salinger Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in 2000.

Aureus Angel's sire Turffontein also won two Group 1s but can't boast a top-tier winner as a sire. Now standing at Tasmania's Motree Thoroughbreds for \$4,400, the rising 20-year-old's best-performed are two Group 2 victors, while Aureus Angel has become his ninth stakes winner.

"He's probably not the most commercial stallion but they can all get one or two good ones," Baddock says, noting another by the sire, Coal Crusher, ran fourth in the Canterbury Stakes (Gr 1, 1300m) in March.

"Aureus Angel's pedigree was a bit of an after-thought for me, but she's from Barathea's family, which is a good European family."

Aureus Angel also has a well-placed, gender-balanced duplication of Brocade's sire, the 1969 English Champion Miler Habitat (Sir Gaylord). Not only is he Aureus Angel's fourth damsire, he's the sire of Turffontein's second damsire, Bassenthwaite.

And with Sir Gaylord present three times in Aureus Angel's pedigree, there's four spots for his blue hen dam, Somethingroyal (Princequillo) at 7m, 7m, 7m x 7m, the top one being her best known son Secretariat (Bold Ruler). That's in his optimum role as a sire of

broodmares, this one being Terlingua, dam of Turffontein's third sire Storm Cat (Storm Bird).

Aureus Angel also may draw strength from a triplication of Habitat's US Reine-de-Course dam Little Hut (Occupy), at 6m, 6m x 6m, while there's a healthy spread of the great Mr Prospector (Raise A Native) through two daughters and a son at 5f x 6m, 6f.

All of that went into the strapping five-yearold mare who so powerfully struck Baddock's eye in that online catalogue photo.

After her rehab - including a stomach ulcer treatment which vastly improved her surly mood - he sent her to Brisbane and Munce. When at Gooree, Baddock had enjoyed much success with Munce as a jockey, including the 2006 Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) of sixtime top-tier victor Desert War (Desert King).

In February last year, Aureus Angel won her first competitive outing for Munce, in a Doomben barrier trial.

"Chris rang me afterwards and said, 'She goes enormous, this mare," Baddock says.

Next, she won then came second at Ipswich, then won two in a row at Eagle Farm before her hat-trick of thirds: in Eagle Farm's Helen Coughlan (Listed, 1200m) and Dane Ripper Stakes (Gr 2, 1300m), and the Sunshine Coast's Glasshouse Handicap (Listed, 1400m).

Between the last two of those, she was an

unused second emergency for the Tattersall's Tiara - which Munce won with Palaisipan (So You Think).

"Chris had said, 'If she gets a run, she's the main danger to Palaisipan," says the 60-year-old Baddock.

It didn't eventuate, but she may have her chance in this year's edition.

The only hitch in the story is that while Aureus Angel has thrived in the Queensland sun, she apparently doesn't like it too hot. She had one run in late November in Doomben's Tattersall's Classic (Listed, 1200m) and ran tenth of 12. Though she still picked up \$2,500 - which Baddock could say neatly covers her purchase price - Munce turned the mare back out immediately, feeling she wasn't happy in the summer heat and humidity.

She resumed with her sparkling victory on Saturday, coming from tenth on the turn over what was feared a too-short 1110 metres, leaving her shrewd buyer salivating over what she might do over 1400 metres at the roomier Eagle Farm, in the Stradbroke and or the Tattersall's Tiara.

Whatever she achieves from here, there can't be that many stakes-winners since the Takeover Target (Celtic Swing) days who've been bought anywhere near as low as \$2,500.




