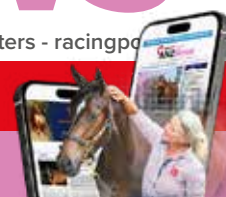

Hidden Motive

Kurrinda looking to the future with exciting Group-winning prospects

Kurrinda Bloodstock have felt exhilaration and pain in equal measure this spring but can at least hope racing's roller coaster carries them to success in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and two-year-old riches in the new year.

On the down side, a new season which had promised so much for their unbeaten colt - and future Yulong stallion - Private Harry (Harry Angel) has transpired in near-disastrous

fashion, with the sprinter likely to be out until next year's Brisbane winter carnival.

The four-year-old was subject to a 50 per cent buy-in from Yulong last March worth more than \$8 million, with Zhang Yuesheng's empire choosing him for their slot in next Saturday's Everest (Gr 1, 1200m).

But the horse has been forced out for a lengthy spell by deep bruising in the near fore knee which plagued him as he ran fifth at both runs this spring, the first defeats of his seven-start career.

Mullins camp changing tack with Cup hopeful Absurde

The Willie Mullins-trained Absurde (Fastnet Rock) will line up in Saturday's Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) as the Irish maestro plots a different campaign for the twice Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) runner. The seven-year-old gelding is being aimed at another crack at the Cup after running seventh in 2023 and fifth - beaten under two lengths - in 2024. "We've come out early to get a run into him this time," Mullins' assistant trainer David Casey said.

Continued from page 2 On top of that has come acrimony and public outcry after jockey Ash Morgan - the expat Welshman largely put on the map by his association with the colt - was taken off the horse after the first of those two unplaced runs.

While Kurrinda director Sean Driver was moved to clarify that and other Private Harry matters on Sunday during an interview with ANZ News, his group has at least been cheered by two other recent results.

On Saturday their three-year-old colt Hidden Motive (Capitalist) - a \$120,000 son of roudy 1-winning mare Secret Agenda (Not A Single Doubt) who is trained, like Private Harry, by Newcastle's Nathan Doyle - sealed his ticket to the Coolmore with a tough win in Rosehill's Roman Consul Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). The all-the-way victory, at \$17, came in class-record time.

And that came a week after the most expensive purchase in Kurrinda's history, Shiki (Too Darn Hot), claimed the first fillies'

two-year-old race of the season in Randwick's Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m).

Driver told ANZ Hidden Motive would soon be sent to Melbourne for familiarisation with the Flemington straight ahead of the stallion-making Coolmore on November 1. Morgan, who's ridden him in six of his eight starts and all three of his wins, will have first refusal of the ride.

Shiki, who Kurrinda bought at Magic Millions Gold Coast for \$420,000 before striking a deal with her trainers Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott, is spelling at the syndicator's Hunter Valley farm. She could next be aimed towards the Gold Coast's \$3 million Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) in January, or perhaps held up for the Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) in March.

Also in the plus column, two starters are set to carry the Kurrinda blue and white in Saturday's \$2 million The Kosciuszko (1200m) in \$13 shot Boston Rocks (Hellbent) and \$26 chance So You Pence (So You Think).

Driver summed up his spring's dramatically mixed fortunes with: "It is what it is. That's racing."

But what was also clear was his level of disappointment over Private Harry's fate, and his deep discomfort over the Morgan situation and its surrounding public commentary.

Driver revealed to ANZ that Private Harry had been struggling with his knee issue not just in his last-start fifth in the Premiere Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) on October 4, but for the past month.

Affecting also his first-up fifth in The Shorts (Gr 2, 1100m), the problem had been managed "in-house", Driver said, but Sydney's hard tracks had not helped.

"It's devastating - there's no other word for it," he said.

"On data, we knew he was going better than ever. He was going about three lengths better than his Galaxy win. We knew we had the horse flying, and his fitness levels were good, but we knew the issue we were dealing with, right at the pointy end of when we needed to get results.

"It's not an ability issue. It's soundness issues.

"It's the third and fourth carpal bones in his near fore knee. There's no cartilage, ligament or suspensory or tendon damage at all. It's just very deep bone bruising we've been battling with for the past month.

"We dealt with that in-house and we thought we'd be able to manage him accordingly, but unfortunately the firm tracks found us out.

"We've got no doubts about his ability. It

was just unfortunately an injury at the wrong time of year."

Driver said Tim Clark - Private Harry's new rider in the Premiere - had felt the problem manifest when he gave the stallion his head after straightening for home, having first cruised up to leader Mazu (Maurice) under a hold.

"Tim told me that when he put three-quarters of a length on Mazu on the bridle, he thought he was going to win by three, but as soon as he let him go he felt his stride shorten by half," Driver said.

"He looked after him accordingly. He limped onto the truck after the race. He was three-out-of-five lame, and we knew the spring was over straight away."

Driver said Private Harry had arrived at Kurrinda's farm on Saturday after a week at the REC veterinary practice, and would require box rest and "12-to-14" weeks out.

While discussions will be held with Yulong and Doyle, Driver said that rather than next autumn, the entire may more likely be aimed at the Brisbane winter, given his bulk - and comportment - demanded more time for rehabilitation than for smaller horses.

"It's something we'll have to discuss with Nathan. It's probably that we have to manage his career accordingly now, and stay away from firm tracks," Driver said. "I'd probably more likely aim up at the Queensland winter carnival, to be honest.

"By the time you've had 12-to-14 weeks with [spelling] a colt, there's a lot of ground work you have to do.

"It's tough, because you can't put him on the water walker or anything like that. He's very bullish. He's a proper colt, he's hard to manage, so he's banned from the walker and the water

walker. You've got to do things differently.

"It takes another third of the time compared to a normal horse to get him up fit and going, because he's such a heavy, big, gross colt.

"Treadmills are fine, just no walkers or aqua walkers. He's banned from those.

"He knows he's a boy now."

After much public speculation over which part of Private Harry's ownership group was responsible for Morgan's dumping, Driver voluntarily addressed the controversy when agreeing Hidden Motive's Roman Consul win, under Morgan, was a salving tonic after the Private Harry saga.

"Exactly. It was just fantastic. The public hear one side of the story, and it's not accurate. I won't get into that, but it's great to see Ash Morgan, Nathan and myself back together," he said.

"If you've noticed, I've still used Ash on a lot of my horses since he was taken off Private Harry. I think that speaks more volumes as to what really went on."

Driver also added he'd been "talking to Yulong probably every other day" about their precious entire.

"As far as I'm concerned, we're programming as if the horse is going back to Nathan. Nothing's changed as I've been told anyway," he said.

"The horse will be back to Nathan, as of today, until I hear otherwise. Until Yulong decide or discuss anything else with him either, it's just business as usual."

While Private Harry recovers, Kurrinda and Doyle can look forward to the Coolmore bid of Hidden Motive.

They bought the colt relatively cheaply at \$120,000 at Magic Millions Gold Coast after he was initially passed in. That made him the cheapest of the four yearlings out of the now-deceased five-time stakes winner Secret Agenda to have gone to auction. Her first - Negotiation (I Am Invincible) - fetched \$750,000 at Inglis Easter, won his first three starts for Ciaran Maher, but hasn't won again in 13 more tries.

"Nathan and I both liked him and we actually thought he'd sell for much more than what we paid," Driver said of Hidden Motive, who ran fourth in last year's Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m).

"He was a bit slack in the pasterns to my liking, but to Nathan's credit, he said he'd be able to manage the horse accordingly, and he's

done a fantastic job.

"He had moderate sesamoiditis as a yearling. I never really have an issue with sesamoiditis, as long as you manage it. We still got him to the first two-year-old race of the season in the Breeders' Plate. He probably should've won that race - he was a bit unlucky. Nathan's done a terrific job managing the horse.

"We've always liked this fella. What he lacks in brilliance - he doesn't have that classy edge about him, but he's very tough and on-speed. That's what Australia loves, isn't it?

"The obvious step is the Coolmore. I'll talk to Nathan. We'll probably send him down there early to have a look up the straight. I think he'll be very good up the straight - I don't think that will bother him."

On the question of his Coolmore rider, Driver added: "If Ash is willing to sacrifice a Saturday in Sydney, he'll be getting the first opportunity to stick with him."

Shiki, meanwhile, is spelling at Kurrinda's farm.

"I'll talk to Adrian [Bott] about her. She'll either have a fortnight off or 28 days off," Driver said. "There's the Magic Millions there, but if we don't follow that path we'll follow the same path as Lady Of Camelot."

The Waterhouse-Bott trained Lady Of Camelot (Written Tycoon) was spelled after her fourth in the 2023 Gimcrack and didn't resume until winning the Widden Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) in February, 2024. She then ran second in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) before taking the Slipper at start No. 4.

"Shiki was the most expensive yearling we've bought," Driver said. "She was expensive compared to our others, but quite cheap considering she was a Too Darn Hot out of an Exceed And Excel mare. The mating really worked.

"She was the biggest Too Darn Hot at the sale, a lovely big, strong filly, and she's got great residual value now.

"She's probably tripled her price already. The owners have had a great result with her, and there'll be plenty of improvement to come."

Dwyer's Cote Atlantique too strong in Seymour Cup

Having saddled up his star mare Asfoora (Flying Artie) to land the Prix de l'Abbaye (Gr 1, 1000m) in France on October 2, Ballarat-based trainer Henry Dwyer was celebrating a stakes success much closer to home on Sunday when his five-year-old gelding Cote Atlantique (5 g Kodiak - Liwa Palace by Oasis Dream) landed the Seymour Cup (Listed, 1600m) at Seymour. Ridden by Beau Mertens, the imported son of Kodiak (Danehill) ran out a 0.4 lengths victor over Saint George (Roaring Lion) with a further 0.1 lengths back to El Rocko (Fastnet Rock) in third. "We thought he was going to have a tough early preparation because he was going to be running in good races against good horses and we thought this'd be his first chance to win a race for the prep," Dwyer told Racing.com. "Everyone's a genius in hindsight, I suppose, but we did say the Seymour Cup was his main target for the short term and then probably the Sale Cup after that and then maybe a break, come back for the autumn. I reckon he'll be a really good lightweight chance in some good races in Sydney in the autumn. He's a nice horse." Dwyer purchased Cote Atlantique for 340,000gns at last year's Tattersalls Autumn Horses-In-Training Sale.

Caulfield Cup would suit him and I'm hoping he goes in there with a chance. Hopefully they go a good gallop, and they sustain it over the shorter trip, as that is what he likes. He's used to the travelling, and he perked up when he got here. He recognises where he is and he's enjoying the sun on his back. It's been quite windy during the day, but that doesn't worry him as it's quite windy back home. He seems good and everything has been good so far and he worked well on Thursday. We'll keep him ticking over. I think he's pretty straight and in a good place. We'll see how he goes on Saturday, but the plan following that is to go to Flemington for the Melbourne Cup."

Beadman happy with Waller's Everest trio

Now in the training set up of Chris Waller, Darren Beadman is looking forward to the stable having a trio of runners in Saturday's The Everest (Gr 1, 1200m). Waller will send out Lady Shenandoah (Snitzel), Joliestar (Zoustar) and Angel Capital (Harry Angel) in the \$20 million showpiece at Randwick, where they will have the challenge of defeating the world's best sprinter Ka Ying Rising (Shamexpress). David Hayes' Hong Kong raider had a barrier trial at Randwick last week, running third under a tight hold from regular rider Zac Purton. "It's a sandier profile at Randwick than say, Rosehill, and Sha Tin does have that degree of sand profile as well. Probably not as much as Happy Valley," Beadman said when referring to Ka Ying Rising. "Then it's also a bit more undulating. It's not a billiard table like Sha Tin.

He has been able to go to Canterbury, which is quite undulating so he has got a feel for all that. But good horses adapt to any circumstance. Everyone is entitled to their opinion. All I know is that our three horses are good." While Joliestar and Angel Capital both trialed against Ka Ying Rising, Lady Shenandoah was given a solo hitout between races at Rosehill on Saturday, clocking a leisurely 1:06.84 for the 1000 metres, her final 600 metres in 36.83 seconds. "She is doing better now than before she went down to Melbourne," Beadman said. "She is licking out the feed bin and she is spot-on."

Ceolwulf to wear blinkers in King Charles defence

Warwick Farm-based trainer Joe Pride is hoping that the addition of blinkers could see Ceolwulf (Tavistock) land back-to-back runnings of the King Charles III Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Randwick. "I've kept a gear change up my sleeve for a fair while with this horse with a set of blinkers and they'll go on this Saturday," Pride told Racing NSW. "I think they will help him but I'd love to get a wet track as well." Ceolwulf has been consistent in four starts so far this season, and was most recently sixth in the Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m). "He's been racing well throughout the preparation without winning," he said. "I'd love to get a bit of a soft track, there's potentially some stormy weather around Friday so I'll be cheering for that. I think he's had the preparation to win the race but if he doesn't get that [edge off] they are slick. It's hard to compare his Epsom runs, I'm not going to say his Epsom run was better this year than last year but he did carry top weight on what was a moderate speed for what he requires. He should get a nice fast run race and I think he'll be in the finish."

Cox Plate under consideration for Globe

Co-trainer Mick Price has revealed that it would be hard to knock back the chance to run last Saturday's Might And Power Stakes

(Gr 1, 2000m) winner Globe (Charm Spirit) in the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m). Price, who trains in partnership with Michael Kent Jnr, has had conversations with the seven-year-old gelding's ownership group on whether to pay the \$200,000 late entry fee into the Cox Plate. "It's a \$200,000 pay up, they pay \$100,000 down to eighth and it would be a small field," Price told Racing.com. "I'm not sure when I have to make that pay up, but if he has a good seven to ten days, why wouldn't you? He only just got beaten at Moonee Valley in a 1500-metre race there. I think those big horses, once they get to 2000 metres around there, they handle it better than a bustling little 1500-metre race. I've got no troubles about him getting around Moonee Valley. If the horse is physically well, it's a handball in."

Antino named Queensland Horse of the Year

Antino (Redwood) has solidified his status as Queensland's premier thoroughbred, claiming a second consecutive Horse of the Year title at the 2025 Queensland Thoroughbred Awards. The Tony Gollan-trained gelding produced a blistering spring campaign in Melbourne during the 2024/25 season, breaking through for his maiden Group 1 victory in unforgettable fashion via the Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m), alongside placings in the Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and Champions Mile (Gr 1, 1600m). As a result, he was again named the Queensland 4YO and Older Horse of the Year at this afternoon's Awards ceremony. It was a day to remember for Gollan, who extended his reign as the state's premier trainer, claiming the Jim Atkins Trainer of the Year Award for the 12th straight season after saddling 193 winners across the state, whilst also claiming the Metropolitan Trainers' Premiership with 134 victories. To cap off the afternoon, the

eight-time Group 1-winning trainer was also inducted into the Queensland Racing Hall of Fame for a career that has netted more than 2,000 victories. The remainder of the award winners can be found [here](#).

Atzeni to be Down Under for Caulfield and Melbourne Cups

Hong Kong-based jockey Andrea Atzeni will be back in Melbourne this spring after having been booked on British stayer Meydaan in both the Caulfield Cup and Melbourne Cup. Atzeni rode Zardozi (Kingman) in both Cups last year and will renew his association with trainers Simon and Ed Crisford when he comes to Melbourne next week. "He used to ride a lot for us before he went out to Hong Kong and he's halfway here now, I suppose," Paul Holley, the Crisfords' travelling foreman, told Racing.com. "He'll be coming down. He's [Meydaan] a little bit different to West Wind Blows but I think now he's learning, he's still learning to race really. He was doing it the wrong way round last season but he's growing up all the time and I think we're going to see the best of him still to come."



New Zealand

35 for Per Incanto

Twain (5 g ex Fleur De Lune by Stravinsky) became the 35th individual stakes winner for Little Avondale's Per Incanto (Street Cry) when landing Sunday's Sweynesse Stakes (Gr 3, 1215m) at Arawa Park. Ridden by Vinnie Colgan for trainer John Bell, the five-year-old gelding defeated Midnight Edition (Wrote) by 0.3 lengths with a further 0.8 lengths back to Glamour Tycoon (Written Tycoon) in third. "It's great for myself, the owners and the guys working with me in the stables, it's pretty gratifying for the team," Bell said. "A lot of work has gone into him, he's had a few issues that we've worked around successfully so it's a nice result. I had him a little underdone in the Foxbridge, he ran fourth and had a good blow afterwards, so we learned from that. He was absolutely brilliant today and Vinnie Colgan rode him superbly, it was a true, professional ride. He rode him exactly to plan

and the horse responded, Twain is an amazing athlete and both rider and horse deserved the win." Bred and owned by Elizabeth Martin, Twain is a brother to winner Forte being out of the Stravinsky (Nureyev) mare Fleur De Lune, winner of the 2013 Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m). Per Incanto is standing for a fee of NZ\$60,000 (plus GST).

Powerful debutant kicks off Wexford treble

Promising colt Yamato Satona (Satono Aladdin) made an impressive start to his racing career at Arawa Park on Sunday, kicking off a winning treble for his trainers Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott. Racing in the colours of harness racing legend Barry Purdon, who owns the colt alongside his wife Katrina and Dean Shannon, Yamato Satona had shown promise through the trials and closed second-favourite in the Green Light Insurance Brokers (1400m). Guided by Joe Doyle, the colt was green early in the running but eventually settled to find cover three-wide in midfield. One of the outsiders in Kenwood House (King's Legacy) burst to the lead at the 150 metres, but all eyes were on Yamato Satona, who came from near last on the corner to scorch home and score by 0.4 lengths. "We were really pleased, he settled in well, stayed the 1400 metres and for an inexperienced young horse to quicken in the manner he did, we couldn't be happier," Scott said. "He's put in a performance that suggests he has good levels of ability and where we go to from here, we'll let the dust settle over the next few days. Hopefully he has a good summer ahead of him, as his experience levels increase, his confidence will come with it and once he gets out to a mile, he's certainly going to have a successful season." The stable collected their second win of the meeting courtesy of Sicillian (Magna Grecia) in the Arawa Park Hotel Rotorua (1400m), before Smart Love (Savabeel) blew away her Rating 75 rivals with serious authority in the Campbell Infrastructure (1400m).

What A Charma too strong in Staphanos Classic

Talented stayer What A Charma (Jimmy Choux) brought his heavy track form onto an improving surface at Arawa Park on Sunday

when claiming the major spoils in the \$80,000 Staphanos Classic (1950m). The eight-year-old son of Jimmy Choux (Thorn Park) found career-best form through the winter and early spring, winning the Kiwifruit Cup (2100m) in June before a string of solid performances in open grade, including a last-start third behind Diamond Jak (Jakkalberry) on Matamata Cup Day. The inclusion of class mare Val Di Zoldo (War Decree) meant much of the Staphanos field were compressed down to 54 kilograms, including What A Charma, who closed an \$11 hope. In the hands of Lynsey Satherley, What A Charma surged down the centre of the track inside the final 200 metres to defeat Gigi (Ghibellines) by a half-length. "He's a lovely old horse and he always tries, that's the main thing," winning trainer Mark Irwin said. "Lynsey did a great job on him today. He went pretty well last start so I thought I'd back him up, he's won here at Rotorua before. He loves his work and was as good as he's ever been this week so we thought we were in for a bit of a show if it was wet. It dried up a bit but he grew another leg today."

Tajana on target for Soliloquy after Taupo gallop

New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) favourite Tajana (Darci Brahma) warmed up for her next feature assignment with an exhibition gallop between races at Taupo on Friday. The Darci Brahma (Danehill) filly has had two starts as a three-year-old this season for two Group 3 victories, capturing the Northland Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Ruakaka on August 16 and the Sunline Vase (Gr 3, 1400m) at Ellerslie on September 20. Cambridge trainers Shaune Ritchie and Colm Murray are building her towards next Saturday's Soliloquy Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Ellerslie, which will be her final lead-up for the 1,000 Guineas three weeks

later. The TAB rates Tajana a \$3.50 chance for the Riccarton classic, sharing favouritism with Lollapalooza (El Roca). "I was delighted with her gallop at Taupo on Friday, it was exactly what we were hoping for," Ritchie said. "With four weeks between races, we decided not to trial her with this unfortunate run of wet tracks we've been having for trial meetings. We thought a day out at Taupo would just tighten her up that little bit to have her ready to go in the Soliloquy next Saturday. We weren't chasing time, but she dragged George Rooke down the straight and past the finish line. Even when she was cantering back, George had a bit of trouble easing her up. She went past the birdcage and up the straight a little bit. It shows she hasn't lost any of her eagerness to run. We think she's all set for the Soliloquy, while still leaving that ten per cent of further improvement up our sleeve leading into the 1,000 Guineas. That's the right race for her and her grand final for this preparation. With three weeks and a flight in between times, we think she'll be right where we want her to be."



Asia

Eight for Silver State

Lavanda (4 f ex God Pirates by Behkabad) became the eighth individual stakes winner for Silver State (Deep Impact) when scoring in Sunday's Ireland Trophy (Gr 2, 1800m) at Tokyo. Ridden by Mirai Iwata for trainer Naoya Nakamura, the four-year-old filly scored by a half-length over Angola Black (Kizuna) with a further neck back to the third-placed Kana Tape (Lord Kanaloa). Out of the winning Behkabad (Cape Cross) mare God Pirates, Lavanda is a half-sister to winner Dir Brand (Henny Hughes).

UK: Australian stakes-winning stallion Counterattack moves to Iran

Dr Hamid Khalili has announced that he has purchased former German-based stallion Counterattack (Redoute's Choice). The now 13-year-old was trained in Australia by Chris Waller to land three stakes races - including the Fred Best Classic (Gr 3, 1400m) at Doomben - while also hitting the frame in the Coolmore

Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), Doomben 10,000 (Gr 1, 1200m) and the Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m). Counterattack will now be based in Iran. "We are delighted to announce that we have purchased the stallion Counterattack, and he has just moved to Iran," Khalili, who is a senior lecturer at the Manchester School of Architecture and a trustee for the National Horse Racing Museum in Newmarket, said. "My brother, who will also manage him, and I acquired him primarily to support our own and our close friends' limited bloodstock, though he will also be made available to selected mares owned by breeders. For a long time, we had been actively looking for a suitable sprinter stallion from a fresh bloodline - one with scope, size, and enough stamina to complement speed - but nothing really ticked all the boxes until we found Counterattack. He does. On pedigree, he is blue-chip: bred on the same cross as Snitzel, by Redoute's Choice, Danehill's best son and a proven breed-shaper, and a half-brother to two Group 1 winners. On the track, he was rock-solid and consistently competitive at Group 1 level, notably finishing second to Redzel with an unlucky run in the Doomben 10,000. Most importantly, he is already proving himself as a sire with an exceptionally high winners-to-runners rate both in Australia and Europe. His first European crops include a Classic winner, See Hector, as well as several other black-type performers. We have owned stallions before, such as Hot Streak, Red Jazz, and Captain Gerrard, but we strongly believe Counterattack is on a different level. We feel extremely fortunate to have secured him."



International

Three for King Of Change

Onemoredance (3 f ex Voice Of Salsabil by Poet's Voice) became the third individual stakes winner for Starfield Stud stallion King Of Change (Farhh) when causing an upset in the Garnet Stakes (Listed, 1m) at Naas on Sunday. Ridden by Ben Coen for trainer Johnny Murtagh, the three-year-old filly prevailed by a half-length over Smiling (No Nay Never) at odds of 33-1. There was a further head back to the third-placed Soft Winds (Night Of Thunder). Bred by Pierce Molony, Onemoredance was

first purchased for 11,000 by Kings Syndicate at the 2022 Goffs November Foal Sale before being resold to Murtagh and Linehan Bloodstock for 32,000 at Book 2 of the 2023 Goffs Orby Yearling Sale. She is the first foal out of the Poet's Voice (Dubawi) mare Voice Of Salsabil, herself a half-sister to Grade 3 winner Qaraaba (Shamardal). King Of Change stood the 2025 northern hemisphere breeding season for a fee of £5,000 (approx. AU\$10,120).

Ten for Study Of Man

Lawwades Stud stallion Study Of Man (Deep Impact) chalked up his tenth individual stakes winner on Sunday when Fleur De Chine (4 f ex Chinoiseries by Archipenko) scored in the Bluebell Stakes (Listed, 1m 4f) at Naas. In what was another upset victory on the Naas card, the Jessica Harrington-trained four-year-old filly came from the rear of the 16-runner field to beat Beset (Expert Eye) by a length and a half under Colin Keane at odds of 22-1. There was a further two and three-quarter lengths back to Royal Entry (Fracas) in third. Bred and raced by Miss Kirsten Rausing, Fleur De Chine is a half-sister to the Group-placed winner Empress Wu (Sea The Moon) being the third foal out of the winning Archipenko (Kingmambo) mare Chinoiseries, herself a sister to Group 1 winner Madame Chiang. Study Of Man stood the 2025 northern hemisphere breeding season for a fee of £25,000 (approx. AU\$50,620).

220 for Exceed And Excel

Darley's recently retired stallion Exceed And Excel (Daneshill) sired his 220th individual stakes winner on Saturday when Dubai Treasure (4 f ex Juneau by Dubawi) registered an all-the-way victory in the Bodicea Stakes (Listed, 6f) at Newmarket. Ridden by Oisín Murphy for trainer Saeed bin Suroor, the four-year-old filly made all and was unchallenged

to run out a three lengths winner over Hold A Dream (Bated Breath), with a further length and three-quarters back to Alfa Kellenic (Havana Grey) in third. Bred and raced by Godolphin, Dubai Treasure is the first foal out of the winning Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) mare Juneau. Exceed And Excel was retired last year.

UK: Prix de l'Opera winner Barnavara to be sold at Tattersalls

Recent Prix de l'Opera (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Barnavara (Calyx) is a major new addition to the Sceptre Sessions of the Tattersalls December Mares Sale. The ownership syndicate, Alpha Racing, must always sell the horses at the end of their three-year-old careers, and will offer her through Baroda Stud. The Jessica Harrington-trained filly has progressed throughout the year, winning the Kooyonga Stakes (Listed, 1m) in June before in the Jannah Rose Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 2.5f) at Naas on her next start. The daughter of Calyx (Kingman) took the Blandford Stakes (Gr 2, 1m 2f) before her gallant effort at Longchamp. BBA Ireland's Patrick Cooper, who bought Barnavara for €70,000 at the Goffs Orby Sale, explained the reasoning. "The rules of the syndicate are that the horses are sold no later than the end of their three-year-old careers," he said. "She is a big filly standing a good 16.2 hands, so what she has achieved this early in her career is remarkable. She won her maiden in May of her two-year-old year and has run another dozen times since. She has a great constitution and an attitude to die for. She just doesn't lie down. Alpha Racing has been going for eight years now and we have pretty much given everyone back the share price every year. Hopefully this year's group might do a little better than that. We have a core that has been in since the beginning and others come and go

depending on circumstances. We will be sorry to see her go, but we are stocking up for next year and the bills need paying. The sale will be her last race for us and we are expecting a large turnout."

US: Citizen Bull to stand at Ashford Stud

Coolmore America have announced that Citizen Bull (Into Mischief) will take up stud duties in 2026 at its base in Ashford Stud in Kentucky following his final start in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (Gr 1, 8f). Citizen Bull got his career off to a flying start with an easy win over five and a half furlongs on the main track at Del Mar in mid-August of his juvenile season. Following his impressive debut, trainer Bob Baffert pitched him straight into Grade 1 company three weeks later in the Del Mar Futurity (Gr 1, 7f), where, from the widest gate, he ran a hugely promising third. Delivering greatly on the potential shown in the Futurity, Citizen Bull subsequently notched a pair of Grade 1 victories with dominant successes in the American Pharoah Stakes (Gr 1, 8.5f) by a comfortable two lengths and again by a similar margin in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (Gr 1, 8.5f), to secure his Champion 2YO status. His three-year-old campaign saw him add two further runaway victories to his resume with an almost four-length win in the Robert B. Lewis Stakes (Gr 3, 8f) and a five and a half-length win in the Shared Belief Stakes (Listed, 8f) last start. "The only Eclipse Award-winning two-year-old male by Into Mischief, Citizen Bull will make a fantastic addition to our roster," Ashford Stud's Dermot Ryan said. "He is from that very potent Into Mischief / Distorted Humor cross that has already given us the proven Grade 1 sire Practical Joke, and hails from the family of up-and-coming young Ashford sire Tiz The Law."

Tomodachi Kokoroe to be aimed at top sprints after latest victories

David Hayes is hopeful Tomodachi Kokoroe (Written Tycoon) can complete a remarkable journey by gaining a start in the Hong Kong Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) in December after the evergreen galloper clinched the Class 2 Shing Mun Handicap (1200m) at Sha Tin on Sunday.

Imported to Hong Kong as a 64-rater as the winner of six races in a row in Australia as Bank Bank Bank, Tomodachi Kokoroe slotted his sixth Hong Kong win from 33 starts and took his prize-money to beyond HK\$13 million (approx. AU\$2.55 million) with his latest success under Harry Bentley.

The Written Tycoon (Iglesia) gelding will be aimed at two key lead-up races to the Hong Kong Sprint on December 14 – the Premier Bowl Handicap (Gr 2, 1200m) on October 26 and the Jockey Club Sprint (Gr 2, 1200m) on November 23.

“It’s not bad when they carry the grandstand and go via the Cape,” Hayes said, referencing Tomodachi Kokoroe’s feat to overcome a wide run and win. “That was a very good win and he’ll go into the lead-up races to the Hong Kong Sprint.”

Now seven, Tomodachi Kokoroe has

returned for his fourth Hong Kong season in sparkling form, notching successive victories under Bentley, whose five wins this campaign include a remarkable four triumphs in Class 2.

Despite rising ten pounds in the handicap and jumping from barrier 11, the former Australian galloper edged out Lady’s Choice (Charm Spirit) by a neck with Baby Crystal (Per Incanto) third in 1m 08.33s.

“It was a great performance. He [Tomodachi Kokoroe] had to raise his game, obviously, with the ten-pound hike,” Bentley said. “He jumped really well and I was following Baby Crystal

across and I thought I was going to be in the one back, one off position, but then I think it was Lady’s Choice hanging out, so it didn’t make my life too easy with that and I had to go a little bit wider than ideal.

“But credit to the horse, he really dug deep and stuck his head out in that last 100 metres. Great training performance and the horse is trying extremely hard.”

Fresh from a treble last Wednesday night at Happy Valley, Tony Cruz’s stable continued its hot run of form with a double, both under the guidance of Angus Chung.

He Was You (Rich Enuff) claimed the Class 5 Chai Wan Kok Handicap (1200m) before Good Luck Babe (Delago Deluxe) landed the Class 4 Sha Tsui Handicap (1400m), propelling Cruz to nine wins for the season and fourth place overall behind Mark Newnham (11), Caspar Fownes (nine) and Hayes (nine), who both have more minor placings than Cruz.

Fownes enhanced hopes of a fifth trainers' championship with a brace after the win of Sky Heart (Ardrossan) for Ellis Wong in the Class 3 Yau Kom Tau Handicap (1400m) and the runaway triumph of Daily Trophy (Tarzino) under Lyle Hewitson in the Class 4 Lo Wai Handicap (1200m, dirt).

"I think once the rain came and the track was sealed that he [Daily Trophy] tends to like this particular surface better than the normal dirt. He won on a similar surface last season from the back with Harry Bentley. It was good," Fownes said.

"Lyle [Hewitson] did a good job – I'm happy for him to get a winner for us. He's been working

hard and the horse has done well."

Hewitson produced an even better ride on Newnham's Bull Attitude (The Autumn Sun) in the Class 4 Sham Tseng Handicap (1600m), saving ground from barrier two and waiting for a late split to deny Happy Universe (Zacinto).

"We had a good draw today, so we could hold him up and save ground – it was perfect," Newnham said. "Inside the last furlong, he was strong. It was great to get a win with him."

Zac Purton extended his lead in the jockeys' championship to 11 over Hugh Bowman with a double, prevailing aboard Chris So's Oldtown (Territories) in the Class 4 Yan Chai Trophy Handicap (1200m) and David Hall's Mr Energia (Swiss Ace) in the Class 3 Shek Wai Kok Handicap (1200m, dirt).

Eight-time champion Purton has 18 wins for the campaign.

Preparing to partner Meydaan (Frankel) in the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) in Melbourne on Saturday, Andrea Atzeni struck aboard Jamie Richards-trained Jubilant Winner (Capitalist)

in the first section of the Class 4 Kwok Shui Handicap (1200m).

The Italian, who rode Giavellotto (Mastercraftsman) into fourth place in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) in Paris on October 5, said: "It's brilliant to be able to travel and it's great that the Club allows us to do it, obviously without missing races here, and to ride in the Arc last week and the Caulfield Cup this weekend is absolutely brilliant."

The Danny Shum-trained Matters Most (Advertise) earned a PP Bonus of HK\$1.5 million (approx. AU\$294,240) when the four-year-old snared the Class 3 Chinese Recreation Club Challenge Cup Handicap (1200m) under a smart ride by Wong to commence the apprentice's afternoon double.

Formerly trained by Ralph Beckett, the Advertise (Showcasing) gelding won two races in the United Kingdom before export to Hong Kong.

Hong Kong racing continues on Wednesday night at Happy Valley.

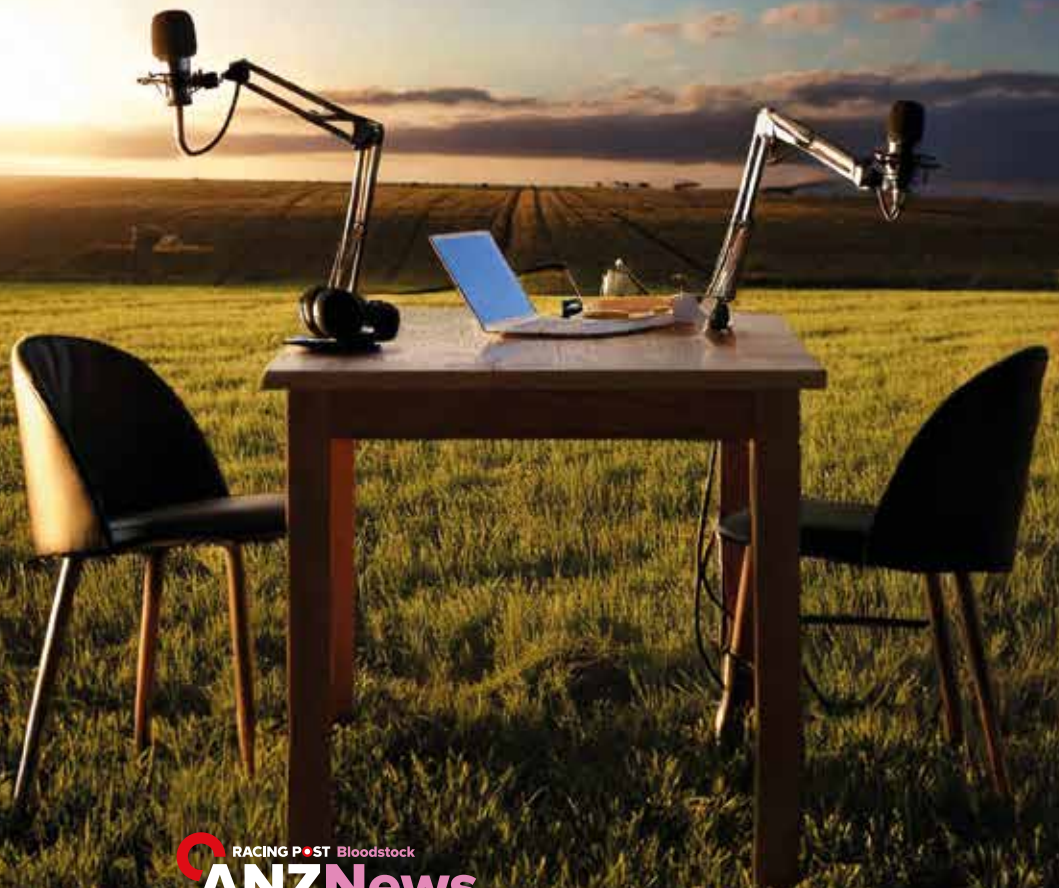
