Cambridge Stud excited about the future for Sword Of State

Cambridge Stud are allowing themselves to hope Sword Of State (Snitzel) could be "one out of the box" after another impressive winner on Saturday kept the first-season stallion's perfect Australian record intact.

Warwoven - the second-most expensive lot from Sword Of State's first crop of yearlings - debuted in highly impressive style with a 2.2-length victory in Randwick's TAB Plate (1000m).

Sword Of State has only a small sample size, but the fact his only other Australian runner - and run - yielded a black type win via Lindsay Park's Torture in Caulfield's Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) has made for a dream start for the Cambridge sire.

With Warwoven, a \$380,000 Gold Coast buy for trainer Bjorn Baker and associates, headed for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m), expectations are high that Sword Of State's 50 yearlings at next month's Karaka Sale will be in keen demand - as will his three at the season-opening Magic Millions sale. **Cont. on page 3**

covers in 2024 to more than 170 in the spring just gone.

"He's begun incredibly well, really," Cambridge's sales and nominations manager Scott Calder told ANZ News.

"To have his first two Australian runners win is one thing, but for one of them to be a stakes winner, and the other to win at Randwick like Warwoven did on Saturday and be headed towards the Magic Millions, you have to pinch yourself a little bit. It's been a fantastic start.

"He's building momentum in New Zealand, but certainly the Australian results are what's really driving the excitement.

"He was by far our most popular stallion this year through the spring, which was largely because of how well his yearlings sold earlier this year. And then When Torture came out and won a stakes race earlier in the spring, the hype just went into overdrive really.

"We try to keep our feet on the ground, but it's hard not to get ahead of yourself with what he's doing so far.

Continued from page 3 three runners, but the signs are encouraging.

Te Akau Racing's Sword Of Stars has been second in both of her starts and is on her way to the rich Karaka 2YO Million (RL, 1200m).

And last Tuesday at Avondale, two of the stallion's progeny won barrier trials in gelding High Goal - his second-top priced New Zealand yearling at NZ\$400,000 - and filly O'Valerie, who beat another Sword Of State into second place in Imperial Rose.

"He's got a couple entered for the two-year-old race at Ellerslie on Boxing Day as well, so he's building momentum over here," Calder said.

"He was by far our most popular stallion this year through the spring, which was largely because of how well his yearlings sold earlier this year, and hopefully they'll sell well again next month."

Bred by Sir Owen Glenn's Go Bloodstock, and bought by Te Akau's David Ellis for \$600,000 at the Gold Coast, Sword Of State had long been destined to stand at Cambridge.

The stud was part of the colts syndicate that raced him with Te Akau in a brilliant career of six wins - four at stakes level - from 11 starts, including the Sistema Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) for juveniles.

Cambridge increased their stake in him after that stellar two-year-old season, hoping for the precocity that he so far looks to be delivering, which Calder admitted made for an exhilarating change within the New Zealand landscape.

"It's a bit new for us really. Normally in New Zealand we're waiting for late season two-year-olds or three-year-old Classic horses, so it's a bit of a unique position to be in," he said.

"But he's always been a horse who's appealed as a precocious stallion, and if you look at his pedigree and everything about him, you'd have liked to have thought he could

measure up with the Aussies. That's what he's got to do and he's making a good fist of it.

"It's exciting for us, and it's exciting for everyone in the industry in New Zealand really.

"He's got 50-odd yearlings at Karaka. Everyone's always waiting for that next young stallion to put their hand up, so hopefully it can be him.

"In the New Zealand context we found he really stood out for his precocity. If you compare his race record and his bloodlines, there are some very highly rated horses in New Zealand, but I don't think many of them can compare to Sword Of State when it comes to that two-year-old form."

Sword Of State's 29 Karaka yearlings last January averaged a robust NZ\$155,000, topped by the NZ\$540,000 colt bought from Cambridge's draft by Mulberry Racing out of Perth Listed winner Fuld's Bet (I Am Invincible).

One of them, a filly from Cambridge's draft, was co-bought by the England cricket team's Kiwi coach Brendon "Bazball" McCullum, who'll be hoping the stallion can bring him better fortune than he's enjoyed in the current Ashes series.

This year's 25 book one yearlings are set to be highlighted by Lot 513, a half-brother to Cambridge-bred star Ceolwulf (Tavistock), who boosted the page in timely fashion with his back-to-back elite spring double of Randwick's King Charles III Stakes (Gr 1, 1609m) and Flemington's Champions Mile (Gr 1, 1600m).

Cambridge is also buzzing over its Lot 214,

a filly out of Vera Drake (Footstepsinthesand), a winning half-sister to triple stakes-winning stayer Vengeur Masque (Monsun).

"Ceolwulf had an amazing spring, and is one of the best horses to come off Cambridge for quite some time," Calder said.

"To have a half-brother by Sword Of State, who's sort of the sire of the moment, he's a horse we're very excited about bringing to the sale. Conformation wise he also stacks up to his pedigree."

As for the Kia Ora Stud-bred Warwoven - the first foal of 2021 ARC Royal Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) winner Needle And Thread (Makfi) - Cambridge couldn't hope for a better advertisement for its seven-year-old stallion.

"Late last year, once the on-farm parades started in Australia, he was a horse who kept getting mentioned to us back in New Zealand," Calder said.

"He was the highest seller of a nice group of Sword of States at Magic Millions Gold Coast, and it's vindication for everyone that he's gone on and shown ability. Hopefully he can continue to do that - it certainly looks like he's got upside.

"It was interesting to hear Bjorn's comments after the race. The horse hadn't worked that flash during the week, and he thought 1000 metres might be a bit sharp for him, so to win like that was impressive. Plus, he could potentially be better over a little bit further. Leading to the Magic Millions, that's a really good sign."

I just want to see her harness her speed, which she can do. She was in need of that run and we've got a few things to work on which we're aware of. A different race set-up for her will be beneficial because she can be adaptable."

Unit Five to acclimatise in Sydney

Saturday's debut Magic Millions VIC 2YO Classic (1100m) winner Unit Five (Supido) is likely to move to Sydney by the end of this week as he prepares for next month's Magic Millions 2YO Classic on the Gold Coast. The Ciaron Maher-trained colt ran out a dominant 2.5

lengths winner at the weekend and his trainer is aiming to work on him getting accustomed to going on his opposite leg in preparation for the 2YO Classic. "He'll go to Sydney, he's got to get up there pretty quickly and maybe have a trial," Maher said. "You want to get up there, get acclimatised, gallop on the track. We train them both ways but it would be good to get him up there and get used to that. He'll have a few easy days and head to Sydney later in the week." Unit Five was Maher's fourth two-year-old winner for the season from 12 starters and he said the processes the team has in place in Victoria and NSW are showing to be working. "The system is working, we refined it a little bit last year," Maher said. "Ballarat they're coming through there, it's predominantly two-year-olds, and so is Bong Bong."

Gracie's Rain to have Black Pearl tilt

Pakenham-based trainer Mick Huglin is targeting the Black Pearl Stakes (Listed, 1200m) for his mare Gracie's Rain (Akeed Mofeed) after the five-year-old scored in a Benchmark 78 (1200m) at Caulfield Heath on Saturday. The consistent performer scored by 2.5 lengths in the 1200-metre sprint and Huglin feels she has now earned herself a shot at black type. "She's obviously getting up in the rating points now, so she'll go to that Black Pearl race at Geelong in two weeks," Huglin said on Correct Weight on RSN on Sunday. "That will be that box that we can try to tick off, and I think the good thing about yesterday was it was the first time in that grade of horse that I've been confident she has run out the 1200 metres strongly." The Black Pearl Stakes is run at Geelong on January 3, while Huglin is also considering the Mystic Journey Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Hobart on February 8. "It's probably not the worst option for us, it's just the logistics of it we need to start looking at this week," the trainer said. "I just wanted to get through yesterday before we started really locking things in. I think the

Mystic Journey, the 1200-metre mares race, that will be the race after Geelong. But she's definitely earned her crack at it."

Stakes races on the agenda for King's Secret

King's Secret (Shalaa) looks set for a step up to black type company after his Benchmark 94 (1100m) success at Randwick on Saturday. The half-brother to Private Eye (Al Maher) was securing his fifth win from just ten starts as he defeated Zealously (Harry Angel) by 1.7 lengths. "He looks exactly the same as [Private Eye]," the gelding's trainer Joe Pride said. "Those dolls that go inside each other [Matryoshka dolls], he's the miniature one. He's tiny compared to Private Eye, but you've got to say, at the same point in their careers this horse is probably going just as well as him. He's got a big shadow to live in there, but let's not worry about that. In his own right, he is a very nice horse." Pride felt Saturday's run was a perfect test for the son of Shalaa (Invincible Spirit), who passed with flying colours. "He was here with a point to prove today that he was hopefully going to graduate to stakes company and based on what I saw today and what I've seen in the past, I don't think there is any doubt about that," Pride said. "He's got speed to put himself into a race. He's got acceleration. I'm not sure he's Private Eye, but he's a good brother."

Lamont rides first winner

Apprentice jockey Ruby Lamont rode her first career winner at Sale on Sunday, steering the Mick Kent-trained Icaro (Needs Further) to a half-length victory in a 1732-metre maiden. Lamont was having her 22nd race ride and was winning for a trainer who has guided her through the early days of her career, on a horse she knows very well. "Very emotional," she told Racing.com. "It's taken a while to get here but I'm grateful for my boss and everyone around me who's helped me get here today. I just have to say thank you to everybody. He's an absolute

trooper that horse, he did really, really well. It's definitely taken all the rides I've had until now to learn what I've had to learn tactically - I was able to do a lot of that today and I felt like that helped us get us there and come out with the win." Kent was also delighted with the result, having overseen Lamont's development, and the accompanying hard work, for the past two years. "Rapt for that, I'm a bit emotional actually," he said. "She's worked really hard; they do a lot of work, these kids. She turns up every morning at four o'clock in the morning, for a couple years she's been going. She hasn't had the rub of the green yet but she trialled this horse early on and she went really well with it. All the boys have been having a crack at him and not getting it right. Last week I said, 'I might put you on that horse, I think he'll run well for you,' so I'm really pleased."

New Zealand

Tapanui Cup victory a tonic for Jones

Tomasina's (Darci Brahma) victory in the Tapanui Cup (1335m) at Gore on Sunday couldn't have come at a better time for owner Stanley Jones. He is in hospital recuperating from surgery after breaking his leg this week and trainer Sabin Kirkland said his mare's win would be a great tonic. "I am very happy, especially for the owner's sake," Kirkland said. "He fell over and broke his femur this week, so he is in hospital and had a major operation. I am sure he was pleased to see that." Tomasina took a solid formline into the race, having finished fifth in the Stewards' Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Riccarton last month before finishing runner-up in the Winton Cup (1400m), and Kirkland was confident of another bold showing. That confidence was justified as Tomasina ran out a four lengths winner over Henry Hubber (Rip Van Winkle) in the hands of Terry Mosely. Kirkland was pleased with the performance, and said treatment of Tomasina's joints has been a key factor to her recent success. "It was sensational," he said. "She had a bit of trouble with her fetlocks, we got them injected and she is just a different horse. You can't make plans on raceday, we will just see how she pulls through, but looking at her now, she looks great."

Marsh all smiles after Te Rapa exhibition gallops

Trainer Stephen Marsh had a massive grin on his face at Te Rapa on Saturday and it wasn't just because promising stayer Roctave (Roc De Cambes) had overcome some mid-race difficulties to win the MVP Cars 2100 (2100m) and secure his place in the Dunstan Horsefeeds Stayers Championship Final (2400m) at Ellerslie on Boxing Day. Marsh also took stable stars El Vencedor (Shocking) and Well Written (Written Tycoon) to Te Rapa for an exhibition gallop to complete their Boxing Day preparations for the Zabeel Classic (Gr 1, 2000m) and Auckland Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m) respectively, with both coming through with flying colours. El Vencedor showed he is at peak fitness as he broke 34 seconds for the last 600 metres of his gallop in effortless fashion, while Well Written also looked happy as she finished off a more sedate gallop that saw her close in around 38 seconds for her last 600 metres. "I'm really happy with both of them, they have pulled up well and will have taken plenty out of the day," Marsh said. "El Vencedor is going great and the gallop will have brought him on again. I think he is right there now with his fitness and having the services of Mick Dee [jockey] on Boxing Day is also a plus for him. It's great to be able to have the use of jockeys of his class and he knows how to win the biggest races here and across the Tasman. She [Well Written] has just been ticking over since she got home from Riccarton, but she is such a clean-winded filly that you don't really have to do a lot with her. Today was more about giving her legs a good stretch, while getting her back into raceday mode with the float trip and being involved in the atmosphere on raceday. We didn't want her doing too much so she just had a run along and that will tighten her up nicely. She has some big races coming up over the next three months, which is so exciting, and she looks a picture to kick that programme off"

Exciting filly's Oaks preparation hits a snag

The Dirty Dee's (Derryn) Oaks preparation hit a slight snag this week when trainer

Robbie Patterson was forced to scratch her from Saturday's Eulogy Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) but he is hoping to get her quickly back on track. The three-year-old daughter of Derryn (Hinchinbrook) garnered plenty of attention following her impressive debut victory at New Plymouth last month, drawing comparisons to her former Oaks-winning stablemate Leica Lucy (Derryn). Those comparisons were further enhanced when she finished runner-up over 1400 metres at Trentham a fortnight ago, the same position Leica Lucy filled in the same race following a similarly hampered run. Leica Lucy went on to win the Eulogy Stakes at her next start, and The Dirty Dee was heavily favoured to do the same, however, she suffered a muscle strain and Patterson elected to withdraw his filly. "It was disappointing [having to scratch], but we have still got a horse," Patterson said. "It was only slight muscle problems. Her muscle enzymes were through the roof, so we had to put her aside." Patterson is hoping to get The Dirty Dee quickly back on track and head to Trentham next month for the Desert Gold Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) before tackling the David & Karyn Ellis Fillies Classic (Gr 2, 2100m) at Te Rapa in February, and ultimately the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) at Ellerslie. "She will keep, we will try and get her to the Desert Gold and then the one at Te Rapa, and the Oaks will be a fortnight later," Patterson said.

Asia

First for Saturnalia

Shadai Stallion Station's Saturnalia (Lord Kanaloa) chalked up his first Grade 1 winner and sixth individual stakes winner when Cavallerizzo (2 c ex Balladist by Heart's Cry) scored in Sunday's Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Hanshin. Ridden by Cristian Demuro for trainer Tatsuya Yoshioka, the juvenile colt defeated Diamond Knot (Bricks And Mortar) by three-quarters of a length with a further length back to the third-placed Admire Quads (Real Steel). Bred by Northern Farm and racing in the silks of Silk Racing Co, Cavallerizzo is the only foal to race out of the winning Heart's Cry (Sunday Silence) mare Balladist. Saturnalia is stood for a fee of ¥10,000,000 (approx. AU\$96,110).

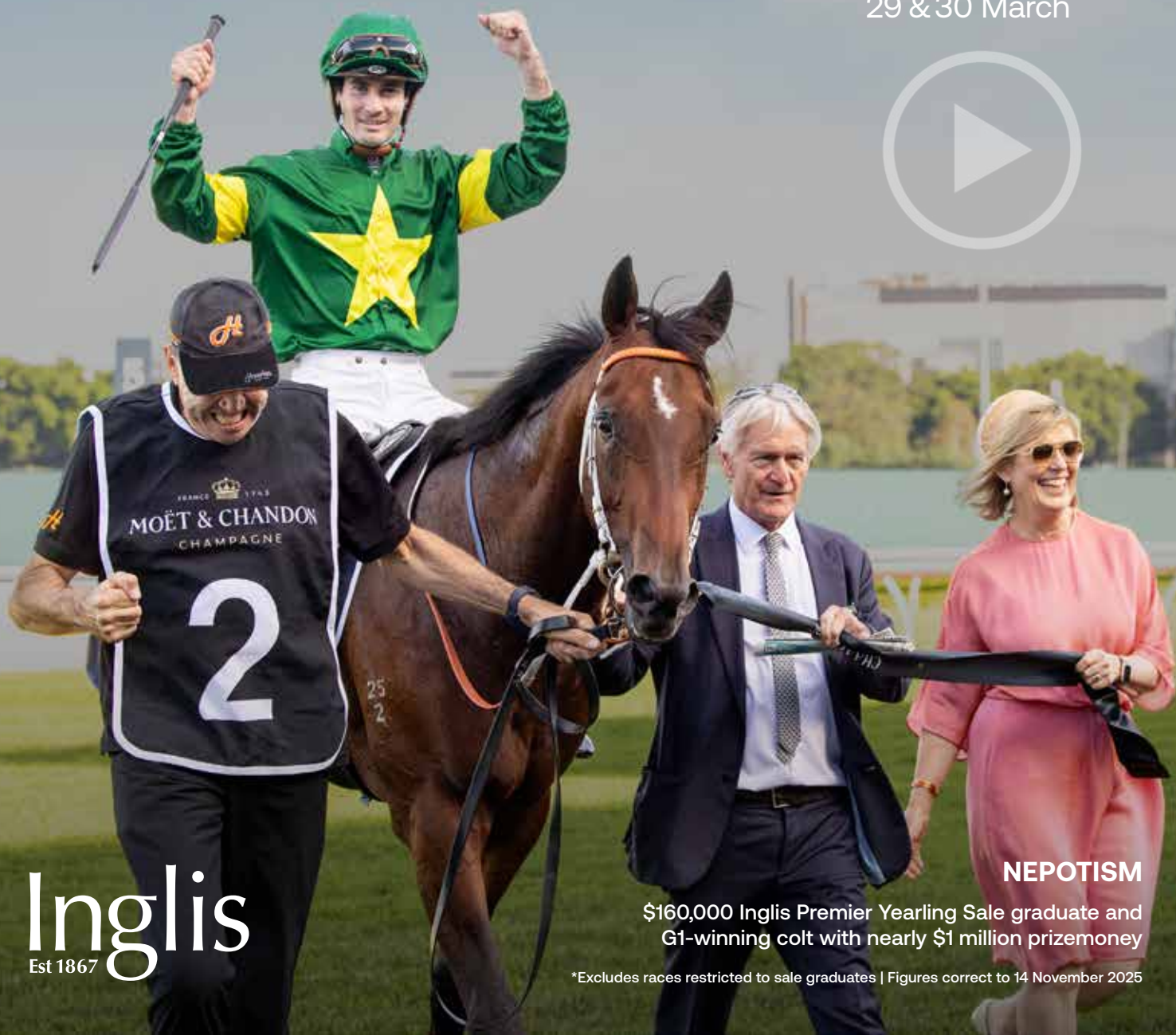

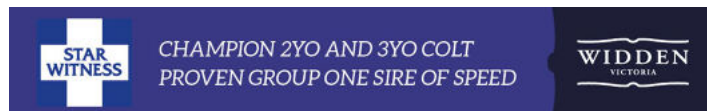
