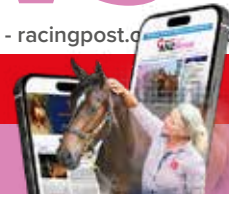

Freedman eyes Oaks win with unlikely stayer Profoundly

A filly bred to sprint and a trainer not known for stayers will attempt to defy the odds at Randwick on Saturday when Michael Freedman's Profoundly (Farnan) seeks top tier glory in the Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m).

Originally purchased at Inglis Classic by Freedman's brother Lee for just \$65,000, Profoundly hails from the first crop of 2020 Slipper hero Farnan (Not A Single Doubt). While the Kia Ora stallion has made an impressive start to stud life, his progeny have raced 203

times up to 1400 metres, and six times beyond a mile.

Profoundly is among that half dozen, and last Saturday became her sire's first stakes winner past 1400 metres in taking the traditional Oaks lead-up, the Adrian Knox Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) at Randwick. She'll head back there on the one-week back-up as she seeks a huge residual value boost in the tougher staying test.

On the dam's side, the slightly-built filly is out of Profound Wisdom (Al Samer) who raced 15 times for two winter wins, over 1400 metres at Mildura and 1550 metres at Morphettville.

Continued from page 2 Her sire Al Samer (Redoute's Choice) contested the 2005 Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) after winning Canberra's Black Opal (Gr 3, 1200m). He also claimed Rosehill's Darby Munro Stakes (Listed, 1300m) in a career restricted to seven starts. As a broodmare sire, he's had 113 winners up to 1600 metres, and 15 beyond 1800 metres.

Profound Wisdom's dam Ghaliah (Secret Savings) raced nine times, up to 1350 metres, for a 1300-metre maiden win.

Profound Wisdom had one stakes winner from five runners before Profoundly scored on Saturday, that being Sebonack (Capitalist), who has two career wins - both over 1000 metres - including Caulfield's Chairman's Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) on debut.

"I really don't know where she gets her staying power from, to be honest," Freedman said of Profoundly. "She's by a Slipper winner out of that type of mare.

"But sometimes pedigrees can be defied a bit. Extreme Choice siring a Melbourne Cup winner would have surprised everybody too."

That example, of a Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and Moir Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) hero leaving the 3200-metre Cup-winner Knight's Choice is probably more, err, extreme than what will be attempted by Profoundly this weekend.

But Freedman said that what Knight's Choice and Profoundly had in common was an ability to settle, "which is crucial in staying races", with Knight's Choice cuddled at the rear

of the field before sprinting home in the straight to win Australia's greatest race.

And while casting a glance over Profoundly's pedigree might raise eyebrows, what meets the eye physically does suggest she would be capable of staying.

"That's what Lee said about 18 months ago when he first got her," Freedman told ANZ News. "He said, 'I think I've got a pretty handy Farnan filly who I think could stay a bit.' He was right on both counts.

"She's certainly built like a staying type. She's quite a rangy type, doesn't carry a whole lot of bulk, but she's got a very good lung capacity, which showed on Saturday. She's got a nice deep girth, long foreleg, all the attributes of a staying type.

"There's nothing sprinting about her physically, and she does relax very well in her races, which is a big asset."

The youngest Freedman assumed Profoundly when the eldest retired from training at the end of **Continued on page 5**

Continued from page 3 last season, remaining on as foreman when Michael took over his Gold Coast stable.

Having won a 1300-metre Eagle Farm maiden for Lee at start number two, she had three more northern runs under Michael's name, including a 1600-metres second at Doomben, before earning promotion to Sydney.

She made her southern debut in last October's Reginald Allen Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Randwick, working home impressively from last of 11 at the 400 metres for a 2.4-length fourth behind Panova (Trapeze Artist), who also won Flemington's Carbine Club Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at her next start.

"She got a long way back and made up a lot of ground late, and the form out of the race ended up looking pretty strong," Freedman said.

After a spell, Profoundly has fully bloomed this autumn. A first-up victory in a 1400-metre Warwick Farm females' Benchmark 72 was followed by an eye-catching 0.3-length third

in the Kembla Grange Classic (Gr 3, 1600m).

"She was four-wide with no cover most of the way, but probably wins in another two strides," Freedman said of the Group 3 placing. "She really put the writing on the wall that day at Kembla. Arguably, she could be three-from-three this prep."

Her third-up run came last Saturday when, in her first try beyond 1600 metres, Profoundly settled well in midfield on the fence before Berry found the better going on Randwick's Soft 7, coming home down the middle of the straight to end up careering away to a dominant 2.2-length win.

And so to this Saturday, where the filly will try to add an extra 400 metres of pedigree defiance in the Oaks while also negotiating the quick back-up. Bookmakers give her a fair chance of doing it successfully, with Profoundly the \$3.50 second-favourite behind Ohope Wins (Ocean Park), and with that filly's Chris Waller-trained stablemate **Continued on page 6**

Continued from page 5 Soverato (Vadamos) – runner-up in the Adrian Knox – next best at \$8.

While the Knox is accepted as the traditional Oaks lead-up, only one filly has achieved the double in the past 12 years, and she was exceptional in other senses of the word, being Godolphin's dual Group 1 winner and five-time stakes victor Colette (Hallowed Crown).

Furthermore, only three have done in the double in the past 21 years.

Still, Freedman has solid grounds to hope Profoundly will cope with the back-up and the rise in distance – not to mention class.

"I'm none the wiser than anybody else about the back-up, but she seems to have come out of Saturday well," said Freedman of Profoundly, who had three-week breaks between her second and third starts this campaign.

"She's pulled up great. She more or less ate up on Saturday night. She seems bright and happy at this stage and it's all systems go for Saturday.

"She won't need to do much between now and Saturday. But you hope they can do the back-up, and they give you all the signs that they will, but I guess until you try you never know.

"It is the same for the distance. You're hoping she'll get the trip and she gives every indication she will, but until you try it's a guessing game.

"But that said, just going on what we saw on Saturday, she was very strong through the line in her first try over the 2000 metres.

"Tommy said she gives him the feeling she'll run the 2400 metres. She hardly had

much of a blow after the 2000 metres on Saturday, and Tommy said she was very strong through the line. They're all the things you look at as indicators as to whether she'll run the trip out or not."

He added: "She's now physically and mentally developed

a bit more. She looks like she's ready to have a try at the mile and a half.

"She stepped up to the 2000 really well, so hopefully she can do something similar this Saturday, even though she's up against tougher opposition as well."

Profoundly's trainer, too, will be charting new territory, metaphorically and physically.

Freedman has enjoyed outstanding success since going it alone following his split from brother Richard in 2022. His highlights have included winning last year's Golden Slipper with Marhoona (Snitzel), who claimed a second elite victory last month in Rosehill's The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m), and taking the 2024 ATC Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) with Manaal (Tassort).

Super filly Apocalyptic (Extreme Choice) won the final three legs of last spring's Princess Series at Randwick, culminating in the Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m), while Freedman has also won a Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) with Communist (Russian Revolution).

The Randwick conditioner's rise was

reflected in the fact he was involved in the purchase of four seven-figure lots at last week's Inglis Easter sale – more than any other trainer.

"I don't know if that's good or bad," he joked, alluding to the pressure that befalls. "But still, you'd rather have those horses coming into your yard than someone else's."

Yet for all his success, Freedman has not quite built a reputation as a trainer of stayers.

"I copped some ribbing from my fellow trainers before the Adrian Knox, that I'd need to ask someone where the 2000 metre start was," he said with a laugh. "And I'm pretty sure I haven't had a runner in the Oaks before.

"It's fair to say I've probably been a bit more heavily balanced towards two-year-olds and shorter course racing, though not by design. But it's nice to have a staying type in the stable."

When told Profoundly would become just the third filly in 17 years to win the Knox-Oaks double if successful, Freedman drew a breath but remained hopeful.

"The stats aren't great," he said, "but at least it's been shown it can be done."

Star juvenile filly Chayan (I Am Invincible) and Group 2 winner Philia (All Too Hard) headline the first supplementary entries confirmed for next month's Inglis Chairman's Sale, adding further depth to the elite broodmare and racing stock catalogue.

The Annabel and Rob Archibald-trained Chayan, a daughter of I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit), will be offered as an exciting racing and breeding prospect through the Newgate draft on behalf of owner Eric Koh.

A dominant winner of the Reisling Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Rosehill last month, Chayan has raced just four times and was subsequently sent out favourite for the Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m). She had earlier placed in the Blue Diamond Prelude (Gr 2, 1100m) (F) behind Streisand (Magnus) and finished within three lengths of that filly in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) despite covering ground.

Koh described the filly as a standout opportunity.

"She's very focused, she's very talented and she just keeps improving, she is a special filly that has her entire racing and breeding career ahead of her," he said.

"Her win in the Reisling was ultra impressive, she was eased down in the closing stages and the fact James McDonald chased us for the ride is a strong indication of just how good this filly is, if the World's Best Jockey wanted to be part of her journey from so early on.

"The authority with which she won that day

showed just how good she is. She then started favourite in the Golden Slipper but things just didn't pan out for her and she was still only beaten four lengths.

"She has so much potential and has only just started out, she's already proven at Group 2 level, she's a very good type and has so much upside, being a daughter of I Am Invincible."

"I've been receiving several calls from interested parties wanting to buy her...and the Chairman's Sale might be the fairest way to sell her so I don't disappoint anyone by saying no to their offer. I've been to the sale before and it's one of the best in the world."

Also added to the catalogue is Philia, a daughter of All Too Hard (Casino Prince) and blue hen mare Meerlust (Johannesburg), making her a half-sister to multiple Group 1 winner Duais (Shamus Award) and a three-quarter sister to Group winner Baccarat Baby (Casino Prince), whose first foal Tron Bolt (Toronado) topped last November's Inglis Ready2Race Sale when realising \$900,000.

The Group 2-winning filly put together four consecutive victories last season, including success in the ANZ Bloodstock News The Roses (Gr 2, 2000m) at Doomben, and will be offered through Widden Stud.

Widden's Antony Thompson said Philia presented as an ideal broodmare prospect from an active and proven family.

"Philia possesses all the attributes breeders are looking for in an elite broodmare prospect," Thompson said.

"We raised her at Widden, so we know her and the whole family well. Each and every year Meerlust breeds good looking foals and Philia is no exception.

"It's a very active family, as we saw with Baccarat Baby's two-year-old Toronado achieving the highest price of the breeze-up sale season, and he is now in training with Chris Waller and well regarded by all accounts.

"The first foal of another half sister, Amiche, was bought by the Waterhouse-Bott stable at Inglis Easter last week, so there is plenty happening and a lot more to come I would expect."

Inglis bloodstock sales manager Harry Bailey welcomed the additions, noting Chayan in particular represented a rare opportunity at public auction, while Philia had long been targeted for inclusion.

"It is incredibly rare that a filly the quality of Chayan gets offered at public auction at this stage of her career and she represents an opportunity that is pretty unprecedented in terms of recent Australian auction history," Bailey said.

"We have had our eye on Philia for a long time and to be honest were resigned to the fact that we wouldn't be able to get her, but all's well that ends well and she is another great addition to what is already a very appealing catalogue."

"I am very hopeful that the sale already contains a high proportion of the best fillies and mares that will be offered to market this year and we are working hard to strengthen the catalogue further before it is finalised later this month."

Chayan and Philia join a significant group of high class fillies and mares set to be offered at Riverside on May 7, including Goodwood Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Benedetta (Hellbent), triple Group 1 winner Provence (Savabeel), millionaire mares Arabian Summer (Too Darn Hot) and Generosity (Divine Prophet), half-sisters to Group 1 stars Aeliana (Castelvecchio) and Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt), as well as the dams of Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) quinella Guest House (Home Affairs) and Streisand and the dam of Group 1-winning juvenile Captured By Love (Written Tycoon).

Whisky On The Hill to press on with Sydney Cup bid

Whisky On The Hill (Ribchester) is set to back up in Saturday's Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) at Randwick, with trainer Glen Thompson opting to press on with the in-form stayer despite securing a ballot exemption into the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m). Thompson admitted there had been internal discussion about protecting the gelding's handicap mark, but ultimately elected to strike while the iron is hot. "There's always the concern about another win giving him more weight in the Melbourne Cup but that race is a long way away," he said. "While he's racing well... if you sit around and wait, you can kick yourself later on. The golden ticket guarantees that you can be there but it doesn't guarantee that

you will." The six-year-old booked his place in the Cup with a tough win in the Roy Higgins Quality (Listed, 2600m) at Flemington on March 28, adding to earlier black-type success at the same track in the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 3, 2600m), and Thompson is keen to capitalise on his momentum. Jockey Damian Lane played a major role in the decision to head to Sydney, particularly given his willingness to ride at a light weight. "With 53.5-kilos, Damian Lane was keen to ride again and his feedback was a main factor," Thompson said. "If he was willing to get down to that weight, that's a very good push." Thompson reported the horse has trained on strongly since his Flemington success. "He had his main gallop on Monday and pulled up really well," he said. Whisky On The Hill is rated a \$15 chance for Saturday's contest, with the Ciaron Maher-trained Mr Monaco (Territories) the \$4.50 favourite.

Middle Earth to resume as Maher plots Queensland path

Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) placegetter Middle Earth (Roaring Lion) will resume in Listed company at Caulfield on Saturday, kicking off a campaign aimed at Queensland's winter features and beyond. The Ciaron Maher-trained stayer has not been seen

since finishing third at Flemington on the first Tuesday of November, with assistant trainer Jack Turnbull outlining a deliberate plan to give the horse a freshen-up ahead of a longer build into the spring. "Middle Earth will trial on Monday and then go first-up into the Anniversary Vase [Listed, 1600m] at Caulfield, before heading to Sydney and then onto Queensland," Turnbull told Racing.com. Races such as the Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) and Q22 (Gr 2, 2200m) headline the gelding's targets, with Maher's team adopting a similar approach across a group of staying prospects. "Like a few others...they all had nearly two months out to prepare for the winter," Turnbull said. "To give them just a couple of weeks off and expect them to get to races like the Tancred or a Sydney Cup, it is very hard to do." Middle Earth is part of a cohort including fellow imports Sayedaty Sadaty (Anodin), Royal Supremacy (Make Believe) and Gilded Water (Fastnet Rock), with the stable optimistic the group can progress further into spring targets, including a return to the Melbourne Cup. "If they improve or even stay where they are we could have a lot of fun with them," Turnbull said. Gilded Water is also set to trial, while Group 1 winner Another Wil (Street Boss) will feature in Monday's Cranbourne jump-outs as he begins his return.

McGuren and Palmer combine with trio at Grafton

Trainer Samantha McGuren will team up with apprentice Grace Palmer in a three-pronged assault at Grafton on Tuesday, with Palmer's 3-kilogram claim set to play a key role. Divine Effort (Divine Prophet) will start the team's day in the Maiden Plate (1708m), with the former Victorian-based gelding stepping out for his second run for the stable. Divine Effort drops to 56 kilos with the claim, and McGuren expects the four-year-old to improve on his first run for the Ballina based trainer. "The step up in distance looks to be in his favour and the prospect of a dry track also should help," McGuren told Racing NSW. "He was beaten a fair way [last start] at Ballina but managed to beat half the field home. I'm looking forward to seeing an improved run." McGuren's best-placed runner may be last-start Port Macquarie winner Patrioticintention (Starspangledbanner), who has drawn barrier nine in the Benchmark 62 (1408m) and drops to 55 kilos with Palmer in the driver's seat. "His best runs of late have been when racing on the pace and he won well last time [over 1200 metres] when he led," McGuren said. "He's back up in distance on Tuesday and with Grace's claim he gets in with a nice weight. He should push forward and take plenty of beating again." Jewels Statement (Press Statement) rounds out the trio in the Benchmark 82 (1005m), drawing barrier six and also getting in at 52 kilos. "She's a talented mare who won well at Grafton in September," McGuren said. "She resumed with a second at Taree last month and the claim will help her."

Carriedo impresses with dominant Sandown victory

Progressive filly Carriedo (Lope De Vega) signalled bigger things to come when backing up her maiden win at Geelong with the emphatic metropolitan success at Sandown

on Easter Monday, comfortably taking out a Benchmark 64 over 1400 metres. Trained by Grahame Begg and ridden by Jordan Childs, the daughter of Lope De Vega (Shamardal) Settling comfortably, she cruised into the race before striking the front inside the final furlong and quickly putting the contest beyond doubt, drawing clear to score by 4.8 lengths. "It was great, it was a really good watch and that's how we mapped it," Begg's racing manager, Rohan Hughes, told Racing.com. "She's a good beginner, very professional. She's got a very good turn of foot, she's always shown that in trackwork and trials." Hughes indicated the filly would be more likely to work through the grades than head straight to stakes company. "[That's] probably more Grahame Begg's style," he said. "But when you win like that you've probably got to consider all of your options. Whether she's ready, Grahame's got to work that out. I think he just likes to develop them in the right way and get them to become believers and winners. If they're good enough, they're going to get a stakes opportunity ultimately in any case." The three-year-old now boasts two wins and two placings from five starts, with all bar one of those runs coming this year, and shapes as a filly on the rise as she steps up in distance. Carriedo was a \$280,000 purchase from the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale and is raced in a partnership that includes Yarraman Park and US-based breeder Craig Bernick.

New Zealand

22 for Zed

Rapidly progressive mare Girl Talk (4 m ex Gossiping, by Al Akbar) provided her late sire Zed (Zabeel) with his 22nd individual stakes winner when capturing the Manawatu Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 2400m) at Wanganui on Monday. Bred by Grangewilliam Stud, Girl Talk is the sixth foal and first stakes winner out of the winning Al Akbar (Success Express) mare Gossiping. Zed, the sire of elite-level performers including Verry Elleegant and Ladies Man, died in 2024.

Nickalls thrilled after Girl Talk stakes breakthrough

Girl Talk was rewarded for her consistency with a breakthrough stakes win in the Manawatu Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 2040m) at Wanganui on Easter Monday. The four-year-old has made good progress after a winless three-year-old season which included a fifth-place finish in the Lowland Stakes (Gr 2, 2100m) and a New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) start. Following her maiden win in October the mare has produced consistent results, including a last-start success over a mile at Wanganui. Returning to that track on Monday, she drifted back from barrier one to settle last under Samantha Collett before improving three-wide at the 800 metres and sustaining a long run to reel in Psychone (Rageese) and score by a head. Monologue (Contributer) was another 0.3 lengths back in third. Trainer Stephen Nickalls said the performance reflected the mare's toughness and a well-judged ride. "I'm over the moon, it was a massive effort," he said. "There was decent pace, so they were rolling on a bit, but Sam made all the right moves, she got out and got rolling and how tough was she in that last 100 metres?" Nickalls said the mare had taken time to furnish but had now put everything together this preparation. "It's just phenomenal, she has given us a lot of thrills along the way and has

come a long way in a short space of time," he said. "She came into work as a maiden and is going out a Group 3 winner, it's pretty special." Nickalls also acknowledged regular rider Kate Hercock, who missed the ride through suspension. "Kate has done everything on her from her first start... I feel for her for not being able to ride her today," he said. "She spoke with Sam and I before the race just to give us as much advice as she could."

Westbury duo strike Ellerslie double as Tarzino juveniles shine

Westbury Stud sires Tarzino (Tavistock) and El Roca (Fastnet Rock) combined for a winning double at Ellerslie on Saturday with a pair of Cody Cole-trained stablemates. Tarzino produced a quinella in the opening two-year-old event, with Amourette leading home Grocer's Girl - also trained by Cole - in the 1200-metre contest to score by 0.6 lengths. In the final race on the card, El Roca four-year-old Atmospheric struck in the Rating 75 (1500m) for the stable. Westbury principal Gerry Harvey enjoyed a standout day, having bred both Ellerslie winners, while also celebrating Group 1 success at Randwick with Inglis Sires' Produce (Gr 1, 1400m) victor Campione D'Italia (Snitzel) and Country Championship Final (1400m) winner Chidiac (Better Than Ready). "We bookended the program at Auckland and Gerry also had a great day in Australia," Westbury general manager Russell Warwick said. Warwick highlighted the strength of Tarzino's current juvenile crop, which followed a surge in demand after his early Classic success. "The most relevant piece to the Tarzino story is the

crop of two-year-olds he's got at the moment came off the year when he had a very big and very good book of mares," he said. "It was after the two three-year-olds [Jungle Magnate and Gypsy Goddess] won a Derby and an Oaks and every man and his dog wanted to go to him." Amourette, a \$50,000 NZB Book 2 purchase, is out of the More Than Ready (Southern Halo) mare Nouveau Amour and is a sister to Karapiro Classic (1600m) winner Wallen. Meanwhile, Atmospheric, a \$45,000 Ready to Run graduate, is out of the Redwood (High Chaparral) mare Lunaris and from the family of Pago Pago Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Tarleton (Viscount). He's got a nice pedigree... the second dam of Atmospheric is by Galileo so he's got some significant bloodlines," Warwick added.

Group 2-winning mare Marotiri Molly retired

Group 2-winning Per Incanto (Street Cry) mare Marotiri Molly has been retired from racing and will now prepare for the next phase of her career in the breeding barn, drawing the curtain on a consistent and high quality career for trainer Matt Dixon. The seven-year-old won seven of her 23 starts and was placed a further seven times, highlighted by her victory in the Manawatu Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and placings at Group level including the Thorndon Mile (Gr 2, 1600m), Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and Cuddle Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m). She remained competitive through her final preparation, placing in three consecutive Group races before finishing 12th in the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m), after which the decision was made to retire her. "It's always a bit sad to

lose those ones, she's done a great job," Dixon said. "Her Group 2 win was a real highlight and when she ran third to La Crique in the Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes, where she came from last, that was one of the best runs of her life." Dixon said the timing was right to retire the mare while she remains in excellent condition. "She has retired sound and will head to the broodmare paddock now," he said. "She's lightly raced, but she's rising eight...she is such a valuable mare and it's probably a good time now to let her letdown for a few months and hopefully get her in-foal nice and early." Bred by her owners Beven and Christine Parlato, Marotiri Molly is out of the Group 3-performed Al Akbar mare Marotiri Miss and will head to Milan Park, where a mating plan will be finalised.

Ka Ying Rising breaks Sha Tin track record and posts 19th straight win

Zac Purton and David Hayes were left to scramble for adequate superlatives after Ka Ying Rising (Shamexpress) continued his imperious reign with a phenomenal display of speed and power to win the HK\$5.35 million Sprint Cup (Gr 2, 1200m), notching a fourth Sha Tin track record with a record-extending 19th successive victory on Monday.

Breaking the Sha Tin 1200-metre mark for the third time with a searing gallop of 1m 07.12s – despite running the first 300 metres of the race into the teeth of blustery southerly wind and being eased down late – Ka Ying Rising (128lb) conceded 5lb to six rivals before sweeping to a four-and-a-quarter length win over Helios Express (Toronado) (123lb) with Raging Blizzard (Per Incanto) (123lb) behind in third.

Continuing an amazing season, Ka Ying Rising followed his record-breaking gallop of 1m 19.36s in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (Gr 1, 1400m) on February 22 with an equally extraordinary effort, prompting Purton to describe the display as “right up there” with the finest of the five-year-old's towering performances, as he lauded Ka Ying Rising's devastating acceleration as his “best” yet.

Settling second behind Stellar Express

(Zoustar) (123lb), Ka Ying Rising clocked 21.47s between the 800 and 400 metres, with successive splits of 10.75s and 10.72s before Purton asked the world's highest-rated horse to lengthen stride.

Responding with a scorching 10.45s burst to the 300 metres, Ka Ying Rising spreadeagled the field to lead by almost ten lengths before Purton allowed the gelding to cruise to the line over the final 100 metres, improving his overall record to 20 wins from 22 starts.

“It [the win] is right up there, for sure,” Purton said. “The way the track is today with the strong headwind down the back straight and every horse that's been uncovered around the circle – he was on the fence, but he had nothing outside him – has just fallen in a hole. That wind has really gassed them,” Purton said.

“So, he had to absorb that, and I suppose a few other horses had to as well, but things were there to try and unsettle him a little bit with the extra weight to carry, as well, coming back in distance but he's just different.”

Asked if Ka Ying Rising, who first shattered Sacred Kingdom's (Charge Forward) longstanding 1200-metre track record of 1m 07.50s with a gallop of 1m 07.43s and then bettered it again two starts later with a time of 1m 07.20s, could have gone even faster, Purton said: “I wasn't out there to run time today.

“Of course, Stellar Express ran along and that set it up and I just got my horse into a lovely rhythm, and he let down so beautifully. It's the best he's accelerated at the top of the straight, so it was there for him to do it [run even faster], but I wasn't looking for him to do it.”

Hayes believes Ka Ying Rising's maturity is a key in his continuing development.

“Just behind the gates and everything he does, he's taking it in so well, and to saddle him up he's a quieter horse. He's just really maturing and it's been a golden year this year, but I think that he'll have another one next year,” Hayes said, addressing a defence of the world's richest sprint The Everest (G1, 1200m) at Royal Randwick in Sydney, Australia after his 2025 victory.

“I think he'll be a better horse when he goes down for The Everest,” Hayes said.

“We'll just keep on doing what we're doing because it's working so well. It's not stressing our horse and we're hoping to have him for another couple of seasons, especially one more at the top, and he's nearly two and a half years undefeated.

“Zac's words, he said, ‘I think he's getting better.’ He just said ‘he loves taking a sit, if they go fast, he's a better horse. The faster they go, the better he is,’ those were his words.”

Unbeaten since February, 2024, Ka Ying Rising will attempt to claim a second Hong Kong Speed Series sweep – and bonus of HK\$5 million – with victory in the HK\$24 million Chairman's Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m) at Sha Tin on April 26.

Lucky Sweynesse returns to prominence with Chairman's Trophy triumph

Rejuvenated miler Lucky Sweynesse (Sweynesse) (123lb) triumphed for the first time in 729 days on Monday by defying a brave My Wish (Flying Artie) (123lb) in the HK\$5.35 million Chairman's Trophy (Gr 2, 1600m) at Sha Tin for jockey Derek Leung and trainer Manfred Man.

Lucky Sweynesse broke from barrier ten as Chancheng Glory (Mor Spirit) (123lb) led with Storm Rider (Dracarys) (123lb). Positioned behind the pacesetters, Lucky Sweynesse peeled three-wide turning for home, hitting the front at the 250 metres as My Wish surged late. Triple Crown hero Voyage Bubble (Deep Field) (128lb) was third, while Galaxy Patch (Wandjina) (123lb) found fourth place.

The former Hong Kong Champion Sprinter (2022/23) Lucky Sweynesse – making only his second start over 1600 metres – was sidelined for more than a year due to a left fore fetlock injury found following his 2024 Sprint Cup win.

Man said: "He makes me feel surprised. When he was young, he was a sprinter, but now as a seven-year-old, he can go one mile. This horse is very fit, and we are lucky in this race that we had two horses go to the front. He stayed behind the leaders and he ran very comfortably – the horse did very well."

Lucky Sweynesse's initial attempt over a mile came in January's HK\$13 million Stewards' Cup (Gr 1, 1600m) when he was second to 13-time Group 1 winner Romantic Warrior (Acclamation). Leung has partnered the horse in his past seven races, including his most recent second to Ka Ying Rising in the HK\$13 million Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (Gr 1, 1400m).

Leung said: "I'm very happy. I need to thank the owners – Mr Cheng and his family for their support, and also the trainer. The team looks after the horse very well."

Four-time Group 1 winner Lucky Sweynesse – who clocked 1m 33.65s on Monday a short head in front of race favourite My Wish – next targets the HK\$24 million Champions Mile (Gr 1, 1600m), where he could face internationals Jantar Mantar (Palace Malice) and Docklands (Massaat).

"Derek Leung has ridden him a few times – he knows the horse. This time the horse was a 100 per cent fit. In my lifetime, this horse is the perfect one, and we'll keep his training normal – his age is seven – so I don't want to push him too hard," Man said.

Meanwhile at Sha Tin, Mark Newnham extended his lead at the top of the Hong Kong trainers' championship with a double, giving the Australian horseman 47 wins for the season and a four-victory lead over Caspar Fownes (43).

Newnham struck with Thousand Spirit (Exceedance) (134lb) under Lyle Hewitson in the Class 4 Peel Handicap (1200m) before Aerodynamics (Royal Mo) (129lb) claimed a PP Bonus of HK\$1.5 million in the Class 3 Homestead Handicap (2000m) for Zac Purton.

Andrea Atzeni continued his great run of form with victory aboard David Hall's Zouper Fellow (Zousain) (118lb) in the Class 4 Lugard Handicap (1000m) before Douglas Whyte's Supreme Winner (Epaulette) (117lb) landed a solid plunge under Alexis Badel in the Class 5 Severn Handicap (1200m).

Winner of a record 13 Hong Kong

Champion Jockey titles, Whyte combined with apprentice Nichola Yuen to snare the Class 3 Bluff Handicap (1000m) with Fast Responder (Ten Sovereigns) (118lb), who gave Yuen her second Hong Kong success in two meetings.

The Jamie Richards-trained Big Return (Divine Prophet) (124lb) provided Badel with a race-to-race double with success in the Class 4 Pollock Handicap (1600m). Slowly away, the gelding eventually burst clear after briefly struggling to gain clear running in the straight.

Lucky Man (Shamexpress) (118lb) claimed the Class 4 Plunkett's Handicap (1400m) for trainer Jimmy Ting and jockey Harry Bentley as Mighty Masts (Merchant Navy) (132lb) earned a PP Bonus of HK\$1.5 million with victory for Chris So and James Orman in the Class 3 Harlech Handicap (1400m).

Brett Crawford's Mugen (Deep Field) (126lb) bounced back to form with a narrow win in the Class 2 Barker Handicap (1400m) under Hugh Bowman. Winner of the Premier Cup Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m) in 2024, Mugen had not won in 14 subsequent starts.

Hong Kong racing continues at Happy Valley on Wednesday, April 8.

Kiwi Chronicles

We don't know

One performance, that of Sheza Alibi (Saxon Warrior), is the talk of Australasia this Easter. Her Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) was simply outrageous. She gave the field a start and had the audacity to mow them down, levelling up at the 200-metre mark before bolting clear with 100 meters to run. Randwick commentator Darren Flindell was left gasping.

It is performances such as this that are so engaging for our racing and breeding community. The filly's history is not only one of rags to riches, but also peasant to princess, which brings to mind an interview Kiwi Chronicles had with Hallmark Stud's Denny Baker a few years back.

Denny began his long involvement with thoroughbreds at Kinross Stud, the home of the great sire Summertime (Precipitation), approaching studmaster John Malcolm for work. Given a month's trial Denny passed the audition and was taken on full-time. Malcolm gave the young man one piece of advice to remember as he went about his daily duties: "Denny, here at Kinross we treat every horse on the farm identically. We don't have favourites because we don't know which are the good ones."

If any thoroughbred falls into that category, it is Sheza Alibi, who was found as a weanling at an online auction for \$10,000. That was just the start. She began her racing at Rockhampton a year ago, finishing a distant second. The winner that day was Universal Harmony (Brave Smash) who'd had eleven starts (six placings) in Victoria without success before leading all the way to win easily. Since then, Universal Harmony, a

\$200,000 purchase at the 2022 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, has added three more wins. He has remained in Rockhampton since.

Sheza Alibi returned to Rockhampton later in April to win well, forging clear late to score with some authority, which prompted a start at Townsville on June 7 in the QTIS 2YO Classic (1200m). Her performance that day was the signal. Worse than midfield turning in, she weaved between runners, before defeating Satisfied Mugs (Invader), impressively by 1.29 lengths.

Her 2YO season wound up in late June with a fighting second in the Listed Tattersall's Stakes (1400m) at Eagle Farm. The winner was none other than Autumn Boy (The Autumn Sun), who would later finish second to her in both the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m).

Both made their way to Caulfield in October, Autumn Boy via Sydney before landing the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) on October 11, narrowly. Meanwhile, Sheza Alibi made her 3YO debut a week later, producing a steady third in the Gothic Stakes (Listed, 1200m) behind future Group 1 star Tentyris (Street Boss).

Since then, Sheza Alibi has not tasted

defeat, reeling off a Group 3 win at Flemington before pulverising the Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) field by nearly six lengths, a statement performance if ever there was one.

A short break saw her return to Caulfield in February where, in the Angus Armanasco Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) she somehow found a lane hard against the rail before running away.

On March 7 at Randwick, in the Group 1 Randwick Guineas over 1600 metres, she had her second meeting with Autumn Boy, but this time she turned the tables, giving him a start, ranging alongside at the 200 metre mark, then bounding clear by more than three lengths, setting her up as a short-priced favourite for the Doncaster Mile.

With her record now at seven wins in ten starts, comparisons with the great mare Sunline (Desert Sun) were made immediately after the Doncaster, as the latter was the last 3YO filly to land the race in 1999.

Sheza Alibi was handicapped with just 49kg whereas Sunline won the Doncaster carrying 52kg, arriving in Sydney with ten wins in eleven starts. Two of those were at Randwick, including the Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) the previous October. She returned to Randwick to land a second Doncaster three years later, carrying

58kg but not before adding two successive WS Cox Plates (Gr 1, 2040m) to her stunning career of 13 elite level victories among 32 wins in total.

Sheza Alibi has her career in front of her, and it is important not to get too far ahead of things, as racing can be fickle. Great careers are not guaranteed. Nevertheless, the buzz around Sheza Alibi is real, justified and genuine. She is clearly very special, but we will just have to wait and see how her career unfolds.

Yes, there is

Readers must know by now that Kiwi Chronicles likes to find out “where they come from” and, yes, there is a Kiwi connection with regard to Sheza Alibi but it requires a deeper dive into the stud book.

Before that, her dam, Sheza Gypsy (Shaft) showed some ability, winning six times in only 20 starts. A specialist at Taree, where she landed five of her six wins including an open handicap, Sheza Gypsy also scored a valuable race at Port Macquarie which makes her online purchase, in July last year, at just \$1250, rather surprising although the mare was empty and has not had a foal since 2023, that being Nomadic (Kings Legacy) a placegetter in the 2026 Baillieu Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m).

Sheza Gypsy's half-brother is Rom Baro (Time Thief), a Canberra Guineas (Listed, 1400m) winner before a Hong Kong career of four further wins under the name of Kingsfield. Their dam Gypsy Mai (Our Maizcay) won five times including three in Sydney where she recorded a Listed placing in the Angst Handicap (1400m). Gypsy Mai's half-sister Beethog (Shovhog) won at Group 3 and Listed level in Queensland and produced Riesling Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Glistening (Zoustar).

One New Zealand connection could be via Gypsy Mai's sire Our Maizcay (Maizcay), the brilliant 2YO and 3YO who, although bred in Australia, began his stunning race career in New Zealand but to find the true New Zealand connection requires going back to Sheza Alibi's fifth dam, Flaxisis (Pundit). The winner of five races including at Ellerslie, Flaxisis was exported to Queensland where she foaled Lumley Fair (Lumley Road). His best win was the Rockhampton Cup (2000m) but he also won six in Brisbane and stakes placed in town.

Flaxisis's brother, Colonel Flack (Pundit), ran second in the Great Northern St Leger (Gr 2, 14f), while her half-brother, Claudius (Alcimedus) won eight races, including two open handicaps, and was third in the Waikato Gold Cup (Gr 3, 12f). Their grandam, Delco (Brer Fox) was a two-year-old stakes winner at Avondale.

Sheza Alibi is far and away the standout in the family, otherwise pretty thin on the ground as far as stakes winners are concerned, with just four descending from Flaxisis and all are mentioned above. A fitting reminder: we don't know which ones are the good ones.

Trending

It has become increasingly evident that New Zealand's shrinking foal crop has led to increasing numbers of Australian-conceived and bred lots featuring prominently in New Zealand sales catalogues.

At the same time, race fields are also shrinking. A recent report by the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Association claims that by 2030 our racing industry will need another 500 horses to maintain current field sizes. Obviously, we need more owners too.

As our stallion and broodmare numbers decline, there is now a vacuum which is being partly filled by Australia where many agents and pinhookers are active at both weanling sales and yearling sales.

Naturally, that leads to a higher proportion of Australian-conceived foals making up the fields of our racing. A week ago, Kiwi Chronicles detailed that of the 13 acceptors for the March 28, Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m), nine were either conceived or foaled in Australia.

To date, there have been 120 stakes races run during this current season, 28 of which, almost 25 per cent, fit the category above, not

including one from Great Britain and one from France. Saturday's re-scheduled Gore Guineas (Listed, 1200m) is another case in point.

Better Shared (Overshare) pounced from gate one and never relinquished the lead thereafter although it is just as well that the race was not five metres further because she was all out to hold on by a short half head for her second win in five starts.

Her three races at two resulted in one fourth placing, then a throat operation forced a lengthy break of eight months. She returned to Riverton early in March to lead throughout on a Heavy 10 surface as lead-in to Saturday's stakes breakthrough.

Stop Press: In a rare move, trainer Kelvin Tyler backed Better Shared up two days later (Easter Monday) in a Rating 65 1200m, where the filly again led soon after the start and was never headed, making it three wins on the trot.

Better Shared is the seventh foal from Eagle's Reach (More Than Ready) and third winner from four to race. She was conceived in Australia but foaled in New Zealand. All the mare's previous matings were in New Zealand, but if the breeders hope to replicate Better Shared, they are out of luck as her sire, Overshare (I Am Invincible), is now standing in Indonesia.

Grandam Talons Shown (Flying Spur) was a good city winner in Melbourne, where she landed four of her six wins. Talons Shown's half-sister, Fledged (Bluebird) is the dam of Ellerslie Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner and sire Fully Fledged (Align).

Gone but not forgotten

The only other New Zealand stakes race of the Easter weekend was the Manawatu Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 2040m) run at Wanganui and fittingly the winner, Girl Talk (Zed), was bred in the region.

Her sire, the late Zed (Zabeel), stood just up the road at Waitotara, at Grangewilliam Stud. Girl Talk herself was bred by the stud, while her dam is by Al Akbar (Success Express), who also stood at Grangewilliam, completing a notable breeding trifecta.

After a successful stud career, which involved covering station mares in the South Island, Zed passed away in September 2024. That season, he covered two mares, both of which got in foal. Never fully appreciated, Zed will live forever as the sire of the great mare Verry Elleegant, while Girl Talk brings his tally of stakes winners to 22, three of which have landed Group 1s.

Girl Talk had the last say, grinding down the leaders over the final 100 metres to score

her maiden stakes win and career win five in just 15 starts. Unraced at two and six unplaced efforts at three, she turned things around earlier this season when breaking her maiden last spring then promptly adding two more wins in succession. She arrived at Wanganui off a Benchmark 75 win, also at Wanganui, last month.

She is the fourth winner from six to race out

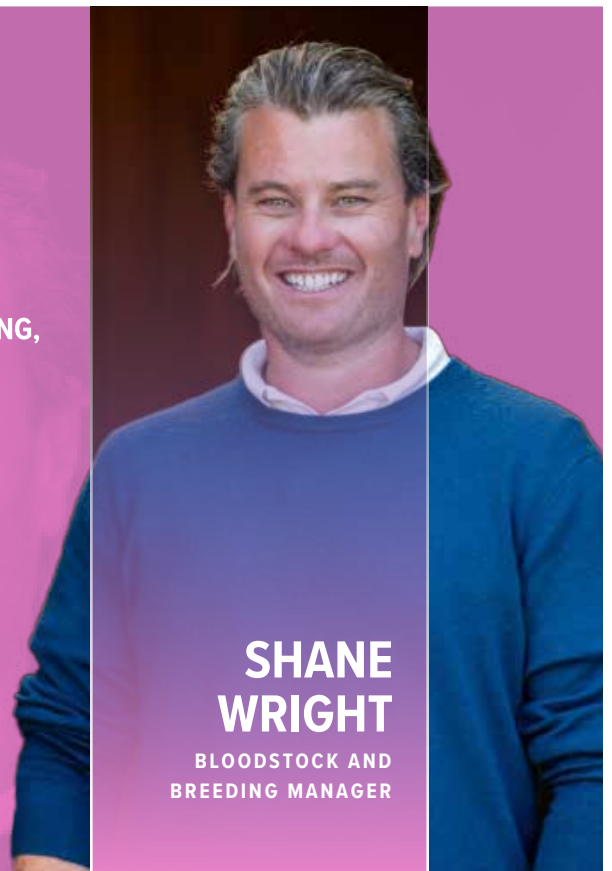
of Gossiping (Al Akbar), a five-race winner who almost registered black-type when finishing a close fourth at Group 3 level. Her grandam, Chatty Hawk (War Hawk II) was a Listed winner of nine races. Chatty Hawk's dam, Zamazaan Lady (Zamazzan) is a half-sister to Hunza (Pakistan II), the dam of Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Courtza (Pompeii Court), in turn the dam of champion sire O'Reilly (Last Tycoon).
