# Zoustar heads Widden's 2026 roster at \$275,000

Widden Stud has announced its 2026 service fees on a diverse roster of 19 stallions split between NSW and Victoria, headlined by reigning Champion Australian sire Zoustar, who continues to dominate on the track and in the sales ring.

**Zoustar** (Northern Meteor) was the world's leading sire of winners in 2025 and has carried that momentum into 2026, with nine individual stakes winners of 15 stakes races so far this season in Australia. The latest arrived on Saturday, when the Team Hawkes-trained sprinter Grand Larceny landed a fitting victory

in the SAJC John Hawkes Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Morphettville.

On the international stage, champion Zoustar mare Joliestar is set to take on some of the world's best sprinters in the Queen Elizabeth Jubilee Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) at Royal Ascot on Saturday, June 20. She is the opening \$2.50 favourite following Group 1 triumphs in the Canterbury Stakes (Gr 1, 1300m) and T J Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Randwick.

"Zoustar is at the height of his powers and maintains excellent fertility with his recent books of mares surpassing the quality of all that have gone before," Widden Stud owner Antony Thompson said. **Continued on page 3**

### Gelded Royal Insignia set for fresh start in Town Plate

A stakes-winning brother to Widden Stud sire Written By (Written Tycoon), Royal Insignia is set to begin a new chapter when he resumes in the \$200,000 Wagga Wagga Town Plate (1200m), returning to the races for the first time since being gelded.

A winner of the Manfred Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) as a three-year-old, the Grahame Begg-trained galloper subsequently lost his way, leading to the decision to geld the well-related son of Written Tycoon (Iglesia).

"It's a bitter pill to swallow, but he just wasn't putting it all together on race days, even though he has shown an enormous amount of ability," Begg said. **Continued on page 11**

“Last year we welcomed mares from many of the very best stud farms in the country to be covered by Zoustar and they included Everest and four-time Group 1 winner Bella Nipotina in her first season at stud, Medaglia Valore, the dam of Campione D'Italia, and Via Africa, the dam of Autumn Glow.”

Zoustar's dominance has been emphatically reflected in the sales ring, where his progeny continue to be among the most sought-after yearlings in Australasia.

“This year he produced six yearlings selling for \$1 million or more and averaged more than \$544,000 from 57 yearlings, underlining the extraordinary commercial appeal,” Thompson said.

Zoustar stands at a fee of \$275,000 (inc. GST).

**Jacquinot** (Rubick) and his first yearlings were well received at the majors this year with 16 selling at Magic Millions Book 1 for an average of \$218,000, with a top price of \$425,000

for a colt from Bonheur (I Am Invincible).

“Ciaron Maher purchased three of his top five-priced yearlings which speaks volumes for their quality,” Thompson said. “The feedback from breakers and trainers has been incredibly positive and we can't wait to see them on the track next season. His value this year is exactly what the market is looking for and he represents a great option for breeders.”

Jacquinot was a dual elite-level winner of the Golden Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and C F Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and he stands at a fee of \$19,800 (inc. GST).

Offering a wide variety of proven stallions to budget conscious breeders is also a high priority at Widden, and its affordably-priced sires have rewarded their supporters.

Stallion of the moment, **Trapeze Artist** (Snitzel) sired his second Group 1 winner on Saturday when Panova cruised home in the Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) at Morphettville.

Panova heads eight Australian stakes

winners for Trapeze Artist this season, comprising two-year-olds Spicy Miss, Chilly Girl and Where's The Circus, three-year-olds Panova and The Crimson Pirate, Sydney stayer Piggyback, Godolphin mare Pinito and Group-winning sprinter, Disneck.

“Trapeze Artist's success has been building for some time, and his fee reflects the value he offers this season,” Thompson reasoned. “Breeders will be incredibly well-placed sending mares to him.”

Trapeze Artist stands at a fee of \$27,500 (inc. GST).

Another current on-fire Widden stallion, **Zousain** (Zoustar) was also on the mark at Morphettville on Saturday with Verzain in the Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) for local trainer Phillip Stokes. She went back-to-back at stakes level following the Without Fear Stakes (Listed, 1050m).

“Verzain is tough and she's a valuable filly now,” Stokes said post-race. “There was good speed up front and she **Continued on page 5**

Continued from page 3 was strong through the line. If she pulls up well, we will have to think about the David Coles Stakes [Gr 3, 1200m] in a fortnight."

Zousain is the very image of his sire Zoustar and has proven a highly reliable source of winners in his own right. He's also proving popular in Hong Kong - where he has sired four individual winners this season - highlighted by Salon S, who is undefeated in four Sha Tin starts for trainer Frankie Lor.

Zousain remains in high demand and his yearling sale results continue to provide incredible results for breeders, having sold for \$375,000, \$300,000, \$260,000, \$250,000 and \$220,000, alongside a further 15 yearlings achieving \$100,000 or more.

Zousain stands at a fee of \$22,000 (inc. GST).

**Supido** (Sebring) is building momentum with his current two-year-old crop being his biggest ever. From just six runners, he has already sired outstanding 2026 Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) winner Unit Five, suggesting there is a wealth of untapped talent in the pipeline.

With his second-largest crop of yearlings and the first bred at a higher fee, the son of Sebring (More Than Ready) is locked and loaded for an upswing.

Supido stands at a fee of \$9,900 (inc. GST).

**Anders** (Not A Single Doubt) has posted two stakes-winners from his first crop this season, including promising young stayer Single Choice. A winner of four from ten starts including the Autumn Classic (Gr 2, 1800m), Single Choice has next Saturday's South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) in his sights for trainer Matt Cumani.

With his oldest progeny just three-year-

olds, the future looks bright for Anders, who also stands at a fee of \$9,900 (inc. GST).

Written By, Portland Sky, Rebel Dane and Sweet Ride complete the NSW roster, offering breeders a mix of proven performance and emerging sires, catering for broader breeding requirements.

"We have a strong group of value option stallions who continue to perform," Thompson said. "They offer breeders flexibility across pedigree and commercial appeal, while still producing quality yearlings and giving breeders the opportunity to race their own stock."

**Written By** (Written Tycoon) continues to excel both in the sales ring and on the track with strong ongoing support from breeders again last season. He stands at a fee of \$22,000 (inc. GST).

**Portland Sky** (Deep Field) has sired impressive first-crop winners Daryte and Portland Miss, with the latter set to contest the \$200,000 Inglis 2YO Challenge (1200m) next week. He stands at a fee of \$8,800 (inc. GST).

**Rebel Dane** (California Dane) is coming off his largest crop of two-year-olds to date and has already produced the promising stakes winner Rebel Tuesday. He stands at a fee of \$6,600 (inc. GST).

**Sweet Ride** (Deep Field) will have the valued support of owners Bert and Gai Vieira, who will once again send him in the vicinity of 30 mares this year. **Continued on page 7**

**Continued from page 5** Trained by Annabel Neasham, Sweet Ride defeated subsequent Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Madame Pommery (No Nay Never) on debut as a summer two-year-old at Rosehill. He also finished runner-up in the Pago Pago Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) before coming back as a spring three-year-old to win the San Domenico Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) at Rosehill.

"Bert and Gai wanted to stand the horse at Widden through the relationship we've forged via Trapeze Artist," Widden's Matt Comerford told ANZ News. "To be able to stand him adds to our relationship but he wouldn't be here if we didn't think he was a really good hope."

Sweet Ride will be covering his third book at a fee of \$11,000 (inc. GST).

**Southport Tycoon** (Written Tycoon) heads the Widden Victoria roster at Romsey and is expected to be strongly supported by breeders as he covers his second book. The dual Group 1-winning son of Champion Sire Written Tycoon (Iglesia) covered 127 mares in his first season.

"We couldn't be more pleased with the level of support he received, particularly the quality of mares in his first book," Thompson explained. "The excitement around his first crop of foals is building, and he is an exceptionally well-credentialed stallion. We look forward to him

attracting another strong book this season."

Southport Tycoon stands at a fee of \$33,000 (inc. GST).

Russian Camelot, Doubtland and Dirty Work continue to deliver strong results on the track with their three-year-old crops.

**Russian Camelot** (Camelot) gelding Beyond Question placed at Group 3 level at Flemington second time out in February and followed up with an Albury Guineas (1400m) victory last month. He was reportedly sold to Hong Kong for \$1 million, giving a strong indication of the continued progression of the Russian Camelot progeny.

More recently, Strangethingdesire was a front-running debut winner for Team Hawkes at Geelong last Wednesday and he looks to have a bright future for Montague Park's Justin Lovatt.

**Doubtland** (Not A Single Doubt) continues to find favour in the sales ring - his top colt selling for \$320,000 to X Bloodstock at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Sale. With 16 individual winners this season, he continues to offer strong value for breeders.

**Dirty Work's** (Written Tycoon) juvenile division is performing strongly, highlighted by Never Ordinary winning the Dequetteville Stakes (Listed, 1050m) as an odds-on favourite at Morphetville last month. Dirty Work's talented NZ filly Summer Schemer also won the Eagle Charters Stakes (1100m) at Ellerslie for trainer Shaun Ritchie in February.

**Continued from page 7** Russian Camelot, Doubtland and Dirty Work all stand for \$11,000 (inc. GST).

"It is exciting to see the promising results from their first two crops to race," Thompson said of the trio. "Breeders have supported them well, and they are continuing to return value both in the sales ring and on the track."

**King Colorado** (Kingman) enters his third season at stud with a strong line-up of foals from his first crop and early indications suggest the Group 1-winning two-year-old is well on track.

A son of Kingman (Invincible Spirit) boasting a deep and highly commercial pedigree, he was trained by Ciaran Maher to claim the JJ Atkins Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Eagle Farm.

"The support we have received for King Colorado, both from shareholders and breeders, has given him an exceptional start," Thompson said.

"The quality of his first crop is expected to drive an increase in mare numbers again this season, particularly at such strong value. Kingman continues to be a world-class sire and his sons are making an impact despite relatively limited opportunities."

King Colorado stands for \$13,200 (inc. GST).

Completing the Widden Victoria roster are Nicconi, Gold Standard and Bruckner.

**Nicconi** (Bianconi) has been a cornerstone of the Victorian operation since its launch and his 2026 sales results highlight continued commercial strength. His standout results include a \$500,000 filly at Magic Millions Gold Coast and a \$300,000 colt at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Sale.

"Nicconi is a marvel," Thompson said. "While his book is now carefully managed, he remains incredibly fertile and continues to deliver exceptional results for his supporters. He will cover a book of 50 mares this year, and for breeders seeking proven commercial success, it's hard to pass by a sire at this fee averaging over \$100,000 at the yearling sales this season."

Nicconi stands for \$13,200 (inc. GST).

**Gold Standard** (Sebring) is represented by his largest crop of two-year-olds off the back of his Group 1-winning daughter Sheeza Belter. And the emergence of \$1 million VOBIS Platinum Showdown (1200m) winner Big Wigs provides further excitement for his progeny moving forward.

**Bruckner** (Snitzel) topped the 2020 Melbourne Premier Sale as a yearling and his first-crop yearlings have also been well received this year, highlighted by a \$120,000 colt out of Anuddawinna (Magnus) at the same sale in March.

The son of Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) won the McNeil Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield and was also a gallant second in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) behind Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m)-winning sire Home Affairs (I Am Invincible).

"We all knew what a good-looking yearling Bruckner was and to see Nick Ryan pay \$120,000 for his colt out of Anuddawinna is very encouraging," Thompson said. "In a tough market, the value on offer is clear, and the quality around his race record is undeniable."

Gold Standard and Bruckner both stand for \$5,500 (inc. GST).

"Our focus this year is firmly on the breeder, ensuring they have access to the best value options within the Widden roster," Thompson added. "The team is happy to assist with mating plans, whether for sale or breed-to-race objectives, and we encourage breeders to reach out."

#### Seven for Home Affairs

Home Siren (2 f ex Rebel Assault by Excelebration) added to the impressive start of Coolmore's first-season sire Home Affairs (I Am Invincible) with a gritty debut victory over 1000 metres at Port Macquarie on Sunday, becoming his seventh individual winner. Prepared by Cassandra Schmidt, the filly showed early speed to position up on the pace before edging clear late and holding off challengers to score narrowly over Street Boss (Street Cry) gelding Polymer. A \$150,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast yearling purchase for owner Darren Blair, she had earlier been secured for \$55,000 as a weanling by Cartown Bloodstock from the Morningside draft, marking a successful

pinhooking result. She is a half-sister to Group 3 winner Siren Assault (Rich Enuff) and the second winner from Rebel Assault (Excelebration), an imported Irish stakes winner. Home Affairs has made a fast start at stud with eight stakes performers already headed by Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Guest House, and he stands at Coolmore Stud in the Hunter Valley at an increased 2026 service fee of \$176,000 (inc GST.)

#### Gelded Royal Insignia set for fresh start in Town Plate

Royal Insignia has not raced since an unplaced finish in the Testa Rossa Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Caulfield in late November, but has been readied for his return with two jump-outs and

a trial. He has shown an ability to perform well fresh, recording a win and two placings from four first-up attempts, and will be looking to recapture his best form at Wagga. Should he return to form, a Queensland campaign is under consideration with races such as the Moreton Cup (Gr 2, 1200m) and potentially the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) on the radar, although his rating will need to improve to secure a start at the top level. "He needs to get his rating up. But there are other races outside that, plenty of lovely races up there. The Moreton Cup [Gr 2, 1200m] and there are races on Tatt's Day," Begg added.

#### Stokes follows proven path with Deakin

Phillip Stokes will follow a proven path with six-year-old import Deakin (Australia), using a light winter preparation to set the gelding up for a potential Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) campaign. The Bart Cummings (Gr 3, 1600m) at Morphettville on May 9 will mark his return, a race long used as a launching pad for imported stayers ahead of the spring. Deakin has not raced since finishing eighth in the Caulfield Cup last October, and was subsequently ruled out of the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) under Racing Victoria (RV) veterinary protocols. He has since undergone surgery to have screws inserted into his fetlocks and has been prepared for his

return with two jump-outs, including a recent 1500-metre trial at Caulfield Heath. "He's been away six months and had an operation to put screws in his fetlocks," Stokes said. "That was his second jump-out and he'll go to Adelaide and go around in the Bart Cummings, which will be a good starting point. It will only be a two-run preparation and then he'll have a little break before the spring. I didn't want him having almost a year off." The Lord Mayor's Cup (Listed, 2000m) at Rosehill on May 30 is set to be his second run before a break, with Stokes keen to avoid a prolonged spell. "All things being equal and if we're happy with him, we'll put him on a Caulfield Cup path once again, not Melbourne Cup," he said. Stokes remains a little frustrated by the circumstances that ruled Deakin out of last year's Melbourne Cup, explaining the stable followed veterinary directives despite holding a different view. "They said he had some changes in his fetlocks... we had to follow protocol, and we've done everything they told us to do, but it set us back a long way," he said, adding the gelding may be better suited short of 3200 metres.

### Accidental Bid emerges as SA Derby wildcard

A UK import has emerged as a key player for Saturday's South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) at Morphettville, with Accidental Bid (Phoenix Of Spain) pressing his claims in just two Australian starts. Trained by Ciaran Maher, the colt has impressed with back-to-back wins at Pakenham, including a dominant 7.75-length win over 2000 metres that propelled

him to the head of the market for the Group 1 feature. Purchased by Australian Bloodstock, Accidental Bid is being aimed at the Derby in a similar mould to past success stories. "Buying a northern hemisphere two-year-old, we've been trying to do it for years but with no luck," Australian Bloodstock's Jamie Lovett told Racing.com. "We've been trying to get a Derby horse in a similar way to Russian Camelot. If you get the right one, they will just be better than them [locals] because they are superior stayers." Expectations were initially cautious despite his debut win. "He didn't give us a great deal of confidence going into his first run last month... I was still a bit guarded and then it was hard not to get excited when you saw what he did over 2000 meters," Lovett said. Accidental Bid is still catching up in maturity, but his progression has been rapid. "He was born in May, so he's six months behind our horses on foaling date – you need a lot of things to go right," Lovett said. "Russian Camelot was a Group 1 horse anywhere and I'm not suggesting he's that, but he's shaping the right way. Ciaran said he's bounced off that run the other day so the only reason not to go would be a possible hard track. The way he won, you've got to head that way." Lovett added that a strong showing could see the colt be spelled with bigger spring targets in mind.

### Agatha out to find winning groove at Kensington

Patience has been the key with lightly raced filly Agatha (Capitalist) as she prepares to resume at Kensington on Monday, with trainer Michael Freedman confident the three-year-old can begin to repay that faith when she lines up in the Drinkwise Plate (1100m) at the scene of her debut placing. Her profile only hints at the time invested, having undergone multiple barrier trials since early last year with setbacks interrupting her progress, but Freedman is optimistic a smoother preparation will now allow her ability to come through, telling Racing

NSW: "I think she is city class, hopefully if she can continue to improve and stay sound we might be able to eye off a bit of black type with her. She's been niggled with a few little issues so we've had to keep stopping. She has nice enough ability." Agatha has trialled twice this time in after a single appearance in December and shapes to face only a small field. "So far she's had a good prep this time and hopefully she can run well," Freedman added. The stable will also make a race morning call on Gridlock (Home Affairs) as to whether he takes his place in the 1100-metre maiden handicap or heads north for a Queensland debut. "He'd need to be able to come in a few gates there; it's a tricky track at the best of times," Freedman said. "If we don't run I'll throw him in the entries for the Dalrello next Saturday because he's the kind of horse I'd like to campaign up there."

### Baker eyes improvement from Sapphire Rose on return

Bjorn Baker is cautiously optimistic about the return of lightly raced filly Sapphire Rose (Blue Point) at Kensington on Monday, confident she can make up for lost time this preparation despite a lengthy break between runs. The three-year-old returns in the TAB Handicap (1100m) for her first start since July, when she scored impressively at Canterbury, and while mindful she may improve with racing, Baker believes she has talent to measure up. "She's a nice filly to have back this time of year," he told Racing NSW. "She's promising, she has a good win record and has won in town as well. She's had a long time off, I think she will get better for a run or two, but we have been mindful she's had a long time off so she's had a couple of really good trials and a couple of solid hit-outs at home." Baker has also opted to debut \$800,000 colt King Of The Nile (I Am Invincible) at Kensington after bypassing Saturday's Randwick meeting, noting: "He's a nice horse, obviously an expensive yearling, and I think

he's trialled really well. Even though he hasn't won a trial, he's a horse we do have a big opinion of. I think with gate three we'll have to be more positive. We've kept him up to the mark since his last trial which I thought was good." Stablemate Battle Hymn (Written Tycoon) is expected to improve in the Asahi Super Dry Handicap (1250m) after an unlucky return. "He had no luck at all, not saying he would have been in the finish but he'd have finished closer. He'll be an improver," Baker said.

### Dilmi keeps Probability Theory on steady Oaks path

Nacim Dilmi is taking a measured approach with promising filly Probability Theory (Microphone) as she steps out in the Midway Handicap (1300m) at Kensington on Monday. The trainer is opting to keep things simple with the last-start Gosford winner before raising the bar later in her preparation, with a long term goal of contesting the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m). Dilmi explained there was clear intent behind bypassing a 1400-metre assignment at Randwick on Saturday in favour of slightly shorter and easier company. "It was a convincing win [at Gosford over 1200 metres], she wants further, which we know, so to do it at that distance was very good," he told Racing NSW. "I know 1400 metres probably would've been the right step but 1300 metres on a bigger track than Gosford, I thought the race was more suitable for her. I'd like to give her every chance to win again. After that we can step her up in distance." The filly showed promise in her first campaign, including a fifth placing behind Green Spaces (Street Boss) in the Spring Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m). Dilmi is confident her pedigree will carry her over further, but is keen to refine her race manners. "She's still doing a few things wrong and isn't fully screwed down yet," he said. "It's more for the experience." Stable star Matcha Latte (Maurice) has been sent for a spell after his playing in the Provincial-Midway Championships Final (1400m) at Randwick,

with Dilmi pleased to see the gelding head to the paddock in top condition. "On the Sunday he looked a bit tired, which is normal after a big run, and on the Monday he was running around like a lunatic," he said.

### Wetter the better for Didham pair

Aylesbury trainer Richard Didham is relishing the onset of winter conditions, diverting a pair of runners to Wingatui on Monday in search of rain-affected ground. Candle (Super Easy) and Speed Dial (Time Test) were initially earmarked for Riccarton's ANZAC Day meeting, but shifting weather patterns prompted a change of plans, with southern conditions expected to suit both mares. Candle heads to the Otago Painting Solutions (1200m) off a narrow defeat at Ashburton and shapes as a leading chance. "She was massive in defeat last start – I thought she got the bob," Didham said. "She's proven on wet tracks, so Wingatui looked the right option." The five-win mare will jump from barrier two under apprentice Alan Lai, whose claim reduces her impost. Stablemate Speed Dial also shapes well in the Otago Engineering (1500m), her profile suggesting she will relish testing conditions. "She's won on heavy and soft tracks before, and she's nicely weighted with the claim," Didham said.

### Places To Be switches to Ellerslie after Breeders' Stakes miss

A change of plans will see Places To Be (Hello Youmzain) line up at Ellerslie on Monday after missing a start in Saturday's Cambridge Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Te Rapa, with trainer Kelly Van Dyk confident the filly can make the most of her opportunity in the ANZAC Day 3YO (1200m). The homebred has shown ability across six starts, including a debut win at Taupo, and performed creditably when fourth in

the Almanzor Trophy (Gr 3, 1200m) on Karaka Millions night, a race that has since produced multiple high-class performers. "Following her run in the Almanzor Trophy she had a couple of weeks in the paddock," Van Dyk said. "We had targeted the Cambridge Breeders' with her but unfortunately she missed getting into that field, which was unbelievably strong, so it's cool that we're able to race at Ellerslie. I'm really happy with her going into it... she trialled well and has had some really good form around her, so I'm expecting her to race well." Bred and raced under Van Dyk's Prima Park banner, the filly has continued to develop. "She is definitely talented on her day... she has matured and I think she is going to be even better next season," she said, indicating a likely return to the paddock after Monday's run with a spring campaign in mind. Van Dyk will also saddle up Hit 'n' Run (Belardo) in the TAB 2100 (2100m), with barrier manners key. "The step up to 2100 metres looks ideal... we are just needing everything to go right for her tomorrow," she added.

find the lead before travelling strongly into the straight and holding off late pressure from More Bliss (Ghaiyyath) to score by 1.5 lengths. A stakes-performed filly earlier in the season, Single Red had placed in both the David And Karyn Ellis Fillies Classic (Gr 2, 2100m) and New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) behind subsequent Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Ohope Wins (Ocean Park), and her return suggested further improvement to come. "She had to do a bit more than we thought, especially in that first furlong or so, and was potentially soft very late, but I think that shows there is good improvement there," assistant trainer Joe Walker said. "She's got a bit of class and hopefully it's on to some nice Queensland targets now." That campaign is set to begin with the Gold Coast Bracelet (Listed, 1800m) on May 9, potentially progressing through The Roses (Gr 2, 2000m) and the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m). "All going well, we would love to get her to all three, but it is certainly initially the first two," Walker said. Bred by Ben Kwok, Single Red is out of the High Chaparral (Sadler's Wells) mare Sea Dweller, a half-sister to Group 3 winner Russian Alliance (Russian Revolution), and is raced in partnership with OTI Racing.

### FR: Arc hero Daryz dazzles in Prix Ganay return

Last October's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) hero Daryz (4 c Sea The Stars – Daryakana by Selkirk) proved a class apart on return at Longchamp on Sunday, with the Aga Khan colt producing an explosive effort to land his second Group 1 win in the Prix Ganay (Gr 1, 2100m). Trained by Francis Graffard and ridden by Mickael Barzalona, the four-year-old breezed into contention at the 400-metre mark before blistering clear when asked the question, going on to score by a facile three and a half lengths in the 2100-metre feature. Multiple Group-winning gelding Bright Picture (Intello) was second, with Group 1-winning mare Aventure (Sea The Stars) third, another length and three quarters away. It marked the first start for the son of Sea The Stars (Cape Cross) since his Arc win, which saw him storm home to defeat triple Oaks heroine Minnie Hawk (Frankel) by a head. His record now boasts six wins from eight starts and earnings of over €3 million (approx. AU\$5 million).

### FR: Asmarani makes it three straight in Prix de Barbeville

Asmarani (4 g Sottsass – Azama by Sea The Stars) confirmed his emergence as one of France's most progressive stayers with a third consecutive victory in the Prix de Barbeville (Gr 3, 3000m) at Longchamp on Sunday. Widely expected to be the horse to beat after two earlier wins this season, Asmarani settled just off the pace before asserting inside the final furlong and holding on to score by three-quarters of a length over dual Group 1 winner Double Major (Daiwa Major). Espoir Avenir (Montmartre) was the same margin further back in third. The small but select field of four also featured defending champion Présage Nocturne (Wootton Bassett), who had contested both the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m), finishing a respectable fourth, and the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) (19th) in the spring. Asmarani is from a deep Aga Khan family, being out of Sea The Stars (Cape Cross) mare Azama, who is a half-sister to Azmiyna (Galileo) – the dam of Group 1 winner and Group 1-producing sire The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice), along with Group winners and high-class performers across both hemispheres.

# Ka Ying Rising extends winning streak to 20 and breaks track record again in Chairman's Sprint Prize

**K**a Ying Rising (Shamexpress) confirmed his status as the world's best horse with a record-breaking victory in the HK\$24 million (approx. AU\$4,281,600) Chairman's Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m) at Sha Tin on Sunday to crown a flawless season, sealing the Hong Kong Speed Series and extending his winning streak to 20.

He has now broken the Sha Tin track record in each of his last two runs – one at 1200 metres and also in the 1400-metre Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (Gr 1, 1400m).

His time of 1m 07.10s was slightly better than his previous record of 1m 07.12s. Ka Ying Rising now owns six of the nine fastest times ever run over 1200 metres on turf at Sha Tin.

After a slowly run first 200 metres, Ka Ying Rising accelerated over the final 400 metres, running a blistering 21.52s – his fastest final sectional.

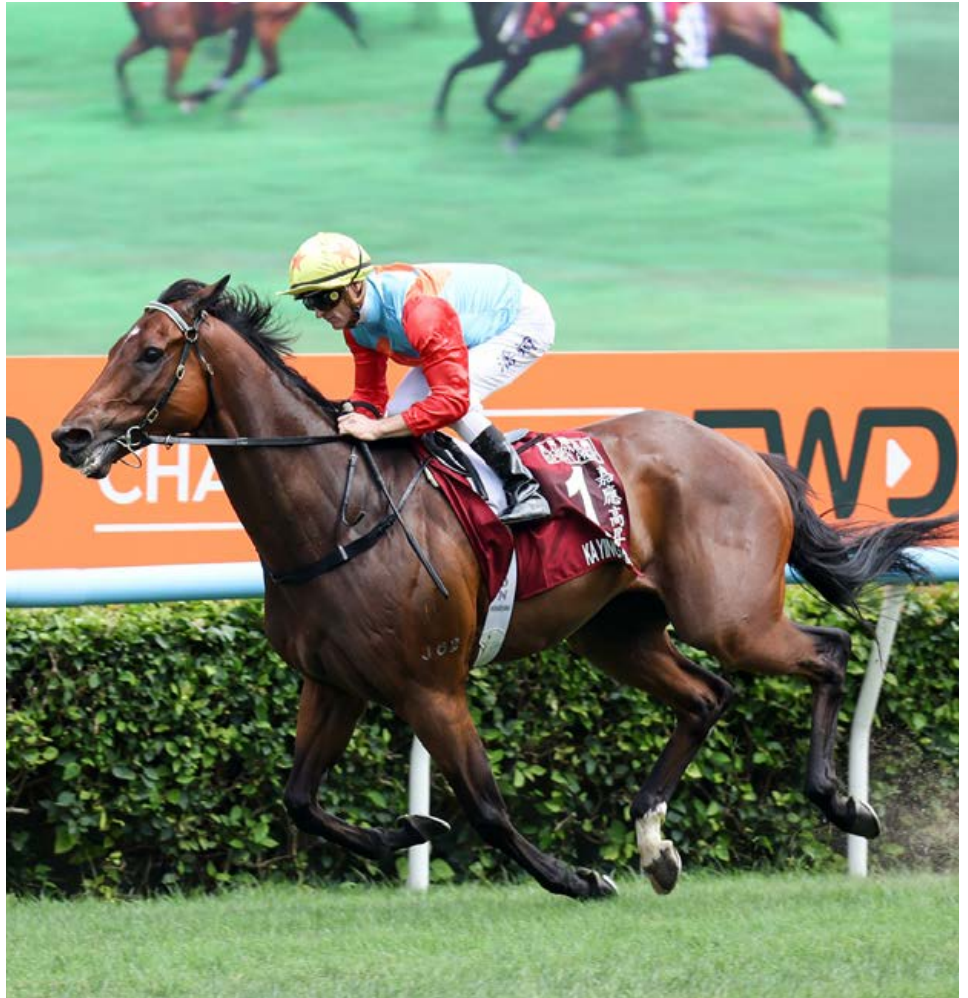
Adding the Chairman's Sprint Prize to his Centenary Sprint Cup (Gr 1, 1200m) and Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup triumphs completes the Hong Kong Speed Series for a second consecutive season and delivers connections a bonus of HK\$5 million (approx. AU\$892,000). He becomes just the second horse to win the Series twice.

Stablemate Tomodachi Kokoroe (Written Tycoon) flew the gates, but Ka Ying Rising was able to sit in third position with his main rival, last-start Group 1 winner Satono Reve (Lord Kanaloa), sitting on his outside.

Superbly ridden again by Zac Purton, the world's highest-rated horse was urged to go at the 300 metres and did what he has done so often, and left the field in his wake.

Despite not being ridden out, he set another track record and finished four-and-a-quarter lengths in front of Satono Reve, who was again behind the great sprinter.

An emotional Purton said Ka Ying Rising

was something special, and it was amazing what he could do.

"It was pretty painless," Purton said. "His speed was nice, he was in a good rhythm, and it was just a matter of him turning up and doing what he has all season, and he did that.

"It was nice to break the track record again, albeit just slightly. When I let him go he quickened, but he did take a couple of strides to balance up a little, but once he quickened, he quickened extremely well and a long way out he felt very comfortable and very confident."

David Hayes admitted he was relieved to win, given the pressure of having his horse start at such short odds when the second favourite was 90/1.

"You tend to worry that you are going to let everyone down," Hayes said. "He doesn't, does he? In the Year of the Horse, he is now one of the all-time greats, I think. The way he is running times and rating so incredibly well.

"A long time ago I thought he might have been the best horse I trained, and about a year ago I thought he was definitely the best horse I trained, and now I think he is one of the best horses I have ever seen."

Hayes said he considered himself lucky to have a horse of Ka Ying Rising's class.

He said the rising six-year-old would now be spelled before defending his title in the world's richest race on turf, The Everest (Gr 1, 1200m) in Sydney, in October.

## Romantic Warrior conquers “toughest-ever” challenge to win fourth QEII Cup

James McDonald has hailed Romantic Warrior (Acclamation) as “bullet proof” after the evergreen champion swept to a fourth victory in the HK\$30 million (approx. AU\$5,352,000) QEII Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) at Sha Tin on Sunday to reaffirm his standing as one of the world’s premier middle-distance stars.

Pitted against Group 1 winners from around the world, Romantic Warrior surged to his 14th Group 1 triumph, boosted his world record earnings to HK\$271.46 million (approx. AU\$48,428,464) and improved his career record to 23 wins and five minor placings from 30 starts for trainer Danny Shum and owner Peter Lau.

Purchased for HK\$4.8 million at the 2021 Hong Kong International Sale, Romantic Warrior has won 14 of 15 starts over 2000

metres at Sha Tin, including a record four Hong Kong Cups (Gr 1, 2000m) and a Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) – and his latest accomplishment was never in doubt.

Settling fourth behind a modest tempo set by Numbers (Tivaci) and Giovanni (Epiphaneia), Romantic Warrior enjoyed a trouble-free run and, after the pace quickened from the 800 metres, the veteran accelerated powerfully at the 300 metres to take the lead and quickly put paid to his opposition.

Clocking 21.91s for his final 400 metres, Romantic Warrior won by a length from Masquerade Ball (Duramente), with Sosie (Sea The Stars) a half-length further away, in 2m 00.64s to confirm his standing as an international 2000-metre powerhouse.

“It’s an honour to be riding a horse like him,” McDonald said. “It makes a jockey’s life so easy. He makes things happen which other horses don’t and that’s why he has got the record that he has got.

“He is bullet proof, really. He starts well, puts himself in a good spot, rests when he has to rest

and then shows an incredible turn of foot.

“I thought the opposition today was very warranted, and had great respect for it and was actually quite worried about it with that Masquerade Ball. I thought he was incredible, and he is one of the best in Japan.

“His run in the Japan Cup was nothing short of incredible. We had great respect for him today, and if he was ever going to get beaten, it was a horse like that.

“He [Romantic Warrior] feels enormous. I take my hat off to Danny and his team and they are just simply incredible.

“It’s probably the best he has ever looked. He just looked so unbelievably well, and he is so relaxed. In Dubai and Saudi, he was really worked up, and even in his work, he was worked up.

“It’s a dream come true and he is a dream come true and I pinch myself every time I hop on him.”

Shum confirmed the HK\$13 million Standard Chartered Champions & Chater Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) at Sha Tin on May 24 was Romantic Warrior’s next objective, where victory would complete the Triple Crown – following victories in the Stewards’ Cup (Gr 1, 1600m) and Hong Kong Gold Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) – and earn a HK\$10 million bonus.

“I have to speak to Peter [about the Triple Crown] but why not? There’s a \$10 million bonus and [Voyage] Bubble did it, so hopefully Romantic Warrior can hopefully do it too,” Shum said.

“I’m thankful I have Romantic Warrior, and Romantic Warrior is also thankful for me. My team has done a lot of hard work with him. He’s been in good form this season – it [2000m] is his best distance in Hong Kong. I was quite confident he could win this.

“I don’t tell him he’s eight years old, I always keep telling him he’s five only – that is a joke, but he races very easily and he’s very good. He’s a super, super champion.”

Shum was equally effusive about McDonald, who has been aboard the champion in 16 victories, including in top-tier triumphs in Australia, Japan and Dubai.

“He’s [McDonald] the number one jockey in the world. He loves Romantic Warrior and Romantic Warrior loves him,” Shum said.

## My Wish gives Newnham Group 1 breakthrough in Champions Mile

**M**ark Newnham celebrated a Group 1 breakthrough in Hong Kong on Sunday as stable star My Wish (Flying Artie) continued a phenomenal stretch for the trainer by capturing the HK\$24 million (approx. AU\$4,281,600) Champions Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) at Sha Tin.

Newnham won March's HK\$26 million Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) with Invincible Ibis (Hellbent) – also ridden by Hugh Bowman – and today, the duo united once more on the big stage to give the third-season trainer a first Group 1 at Sha Tin.

Victory is the second for Bowman in the Champions Mile, who rode Red Lion (Belardo) to land the contest last year, and the Australian was proud to unite with his compatriot on Champions Day.

Bowman said: “The results speak for themselves. I’m not one of his most used jockeys, but fortunately, [Mark] seems to find me when he’s got the better horses, and what a fantastic job he’s doing. Not only with the elite animals, but all of the horses in his stable. It’s a pleasure to work with him and for him – long may it continue.”

Breaking from barrier ten, My Wish eased to the tail of the field as Copartner Prance (Epaulette) led ahead of Red Lion with Lucky Sweynesse (Sweynesse) and Jantar Mantar (Palice Malice) trailing. Turning for home, Voyage Bubble (Deep Field) made his move, while Bowman angled My Wish into the clear.

As the pacesetters faded and six-time Group 1 winner Voyage Bubble was beaten for speed, My Wish pounced. Hitting the front at the 200 metres, My Wish – the smallest horse in the field at 1,011lb – staved off Cap Ferrat (Snitzel) and Docklands (Massaat) respectively, while Invincible Ibis was fourth. The winning time was 1m 32.37s, lowering his own Sha Tin 1600-metre turf Group-race record, with a neck separating first and second.

Newnham said: “It couldn’t be going any

better really. Like Hugh said, we were fairly confident with the horse, at least as much as you can be going into a Group 1 race. His work here last Saturday morning was exceptional.

“I was just sitting in the grandstand and he came flying by. Hugh’s a man of few words generally when he’s hopped off one after galloping them, but I could just tell in his voice that it was as good as the horse could go. We knew then that if things worked out during the race that his turn of foot would be superior at the end, and it has been.

“I was proud of both horses. Invincible Ibis, when he comes back next season, he’s going to acquit himself well in this grade. My Wish has taken a season and a bit to win his Group 1, but I think the way he’s going now, that I don’t think we’ve seen the last of it.”

My Wish and Cap Ferrat’s one-two is a reversal of the 2025 Hong Kong Derby, when the latter edged him by a short head in the third

leg of the Four-Year-Old Classic Series.

“I’m very proud of the horse. I was very confident going into the race. The pace was really quite on, which suited him, and I got a smooth passage through. When I asked for a top effort, he gave it to me in a stride,” Bowman said.

Newnham’s 49 wins this season position him second in the trainers’ championship behind leader Caspar Fownes (50 wins). Danny Shum (49) and David Hayes (46) trail.

Newnham said: “I’ve got a great team of people. I have two terrific assistant trainers – Henry here at Sha Tin, and Ivan at Conghua.

“All the way down from the work riders, head lads and mafoos – everyone is really invested in the stable and, that’s something that I really enjoy, because I know tomorrow when I get to the stable, they will all be buzzing, all be smiling and it’s a reward for everybody’s hard work.”

# Wilcher adds further depth to the Darling View team

The chance to work with one of the country's most exciting stallions persuaded Kyle Wilcher to make the long journey west to take up the position as Darling View Thoroughbreds' assistant stud manager, and the experienced horseman hasn't looked back since joining the Atwell family's farm.

Some six weeks ago, Wilcher packed his bags and relocated to the town of Mundijong, just over 50 kilometres south of Perth. As well as relishing the opportunity to join one of the state's most high-profile and forward-thinking farms, Wilcher is also embracing the region's temperate climate - particularly during the winter months - as well as a more laid-back lifestyle.

That is not to say that his new gig on the 400 acre farm isn't keeping him very busy, with around 75 foals to look after and nine staff to manage in his role.

But Wilcher, who has gained nearly two decades of experience across a variety of roles in the industry, has readily adapted to his new surroundings and is keen to gain as much knowledge as he can from the Atwell family, led by Darling View's owner and director Clive Atwell.

His son, Brent, is the farm's stud manager and Wilcher's boss, with the family matriarch Trish Atwell playing a key support role on the administrative side of the business.

Darling View stands Western Australia's premier stallion in Playing God (Blackfriars), and the ambitious operation has just added Royal Patronage (Wootton Bassett) to a roster which already featured up-and-comers Lightsaber (Zoustar) and Splintex (Snitzel).

It would be fair to say, then, that Wilcher has joined the farm at one of the most exciting periods in its history.

"The whole family has really looked after me since I arrived," he told ANZ News.

"I'm really enjoying myself so far and even though I've had a lot of experience in

the industry, I'm still learning every day. What really enticed me was the opportunity to work with the farm's stallions. I hadn't been on stallion duties in any of my previous roles, so it was too good an opportunity to turn down.

"Playing God is an absolute gent even though he knows he's the boss. The other two boys [Lightsaber and Splintex] are also great to deal with, they are like little pet dogs really. They're both very quiet and rarely act up, although Lightsaber can sometimes turn it on a little bit and get a bit excited in the yard, but there's no malice with him.

"We've also just announced Royal Patronage, which is huge news not just for the farm but for the whole breeding industry in WA. The chance to work with these kinds of stallions was really enticing, and I was keen to challenge myself. You can also be much more hands-on with a smaller roster compared to some of the bigger farms in Scone."

Wilcher's previous roles include stints at Hunter Valley institutions Torryburn Stud and Edinglassie Stud, where he was mentored by Mick and Michelle Talty.

When the husband and wife team made the decision to downsize after running Edinglassie for more than three decades, Wilcher sought

pastures new and took the opportunity to manage Salomina Lodge, the spelling farm owned and operated by leading syndicators Australian Bloodstock.

After a short stint at Middlebrook Valley Lodge to help them prepare their draft for this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Wilcher made contact with Brent Atwell through their mutual friend Brian Nutt, who runs Attunga Stud.

A short time later, Wilcher was boarding the plane to Perth to further his education and experience in the industry - although given his life-long passion for horses, the 36-year-old sees it more as a calling than a career.

"I grew up in the town of Maitland not on a farm, but for as long as I can remember I've loved horses," he said.

"I've always been big on racing and when Octagonal and Sainly first came on the scene, that's when I really fell in love with it. Dad's always had an interest in it and my grandparents and extended family were involved in the industry.

"One of my Pops was a racecaller, he called the trots and the greyhounds at Maitland for over 30 years. And my other Pop George was a jockey, so it's always been in the blood."

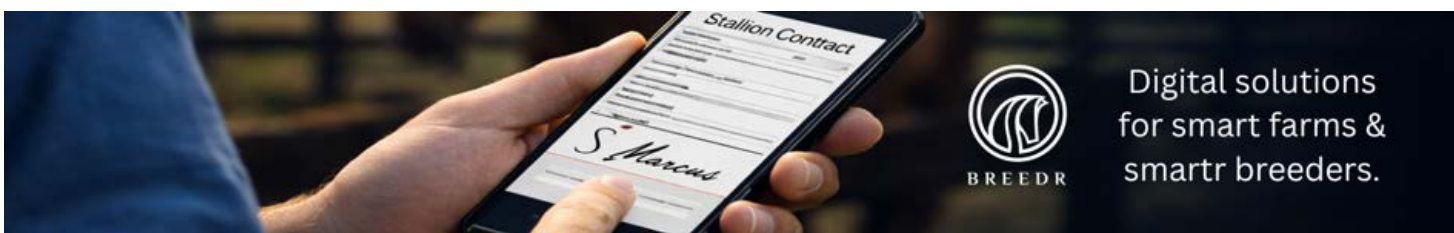
