Cumani Chases Derby Dream With Single Choice

A trainer with a pedigree to win a Derby believes he has a genuine chance to achieve the feat when he saddles Single Choice for one of Australia's oldest Classics at Morphettville on Saturday. Matt Cumani, son of dual Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Luca Cumani, goes into the South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) with Single Choice, son of dual Group winning sprinter Anders, with the gelding an \$11 chance heading into Saturday's event.

Despite being by a sprinting son of Not A

Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice) the sireline has indeed proved versatile at middle distance and beyond with the likes of Group 1 South Australian Derby (2400m) winners, Qafila (Not A Single Doubt), Howard Be Thy Name (Redoubt's Choice) and 2024 Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200) winner Knights Choice (Extreme Choice) to name but a few.

Single Choice will be aiming to follow in those footsteps and has earned the confidence of his trainer with his victory in the Galilee Series Final (Listed, 2400m) at Flemington last start, his first attempt at the trip at his 10th outing.

Tagaloa adds Spice to Brisbane Carnival

Spicy Lu signalled she's primed to reproduce her Melbourne spring form at the Brisbane winter carnival with a barrier-to-box victory in the BRC Princess Stakes (Listed, 1600m) at Eagle Farm.

The Nick Olive-trained daughter of Yulong Stud stallion Tagaloa (Lord Kanaloa) skipped five lengths clear approaching the home turn on Saturday and kept lifting for stable apprentice Coriah Keatings on a track downgraded to a Heavy 8.

Canberra-based Olive admitted he was concerned when the rain came and so were punters who allowed her to drift out to \$6. "We were worried about the wet track but thank God things have paid off," he said. "Coriah rides Spicy Lu every morning and knows her backwards.

Continued from page 2 Single Choice appears to draw much of his stamina from his dam, Sebring Sally (Sebring), who Cumani came to know while working for her trainer Chris Waller. She was stakes-performed over staying trips, finishing fourth in the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) after placing in The Roses (Gr 2, 2000m) and winning the Strutt Stakes (Listed, 2100m) in Hobart.

Sebring Sally being by Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Sebring adds another layer of complexity to the pedigree, though there is more stamina further back through the female line, with third dam Donna Cara (Sir Tristram) a Listed winner out to 2100 metres.

Anders' home farm Widden Stud will no doubt be pleased to see his first-crop son Single Choice adding strings to the stallion's bow in the way he has, given the young sire's black type wins came in the San Domenico Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) and The Rosebud (Listed, 1200m).

"It is a bit odd, given what sort of racehorse Anders was," Cumani told ANZ News. "But I always lean on the fact Single Choice doesn't look anything like Anders, in body type or colouring. So in my mind he takes after the mare.

"Still, there's not really a huge amount on his page that suggests he'll stay, but here we are in a Derby."

In any event, when Cumani saw the two-year-old Single Choice at the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale of 2024, he felt that physically the gelding before him fitted the mould of the runners he most favours, those who may be able to stretch out over Classic distances.

"He was a lovely type, and I loved his shape," the Ballarat trainer said.

"He wasn't big and strong as you might expect an Anders to be. He was a bit finer with a long middle distance horse's stride, and I particularly remember he had a nice shoulder angle. Plus he was nice and settled and relaxed, which you obviously want in a stayer.

"He had a really long stride, and I liked the way he breezed up as well. They did a good time, and whilst he didn't win, he was twitching his ears at the finish, having a look around, so he had more in the tank. If he'd needed to he could have kicked a bit more."

Cumani bought into Anders - whose 2026 fee has dropped to \$9,900 after he covered 21 mares at \$13,200 last year - though he usually prefers proven sires at sales, with Dundee (High Chaparral) his well-documented favourite. He's glad he made an exception this time.

"I generally steer away from first season sires at yearling sales, but at a breeze-up I can take a slightly different approach, because we have more information to go on," he said.

"So I'm more happy to take a chance on a stallion we know nothing about, and put a bit more weight to how the horse has performed in the breeze-up.

"Plus I liked the dam. I worked with her at Chris Waller's, and I just thought at the right price he was a horse we could have a bit of fun with. We probably lucked in because he had a minor issue with a fetlock on an x-ray that might have put some people off, but my vet told me it wouldn't be a problem at all."

Bought for \$NZ80,000 - around \$A65,000 - Single Choice opened his account in a manner more commensurate with his sire in winning a 1200m maiden on the Ballarat synthetic last August by 4.25 lengths, at start No.3.

He then achieved the always difficult task of winning his next start, in a three-year-old benchmark 64 over 1300m at Bendigo, by 0.4 lengths.

But after an educative Sydney trip where he ran a meritorious fifth in strong company in the Tapp-Craig (EDS: Non-black type 1400m), the penny clearly dropped when Single Choice contested the Carbine Club Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Flemington on Derby Day. Running

as a \$31 outsider, he made impressive ground from last of the eight runners to finish third.

"We've just let him tell us which way he wants to go," Cumani said.

"He was able to win over shorter distances as a young three year old. We didn't jump him up too quickly given his pedigree, but it became pretty clear he needed and wanted further.

"The ultimate push was in the Carbine. Things went his way because they went quickly in front. But he was both left flat footed early, and was able to finish off well, so his stamina came into play late on. That was a final sign, on top of all the others, he could get a bit of distance.

"He's also got a great temperament which also suggests he can settle anywhere in the field. Wherever you want to put him, he'll go there. Plus he's more professional now than in his early days."

After a spell, Single Choice was stepped up to 1800m on resumption in BM66 class at Caulfield Heath and was unlucky not to snatch it in a 0.02 length second.

He stayed at the same trip second-up and won Caulfield's Autumn Classic (Gr 2, 1800m). He rose again in distance for the Alister Clark Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) where, forced to work out wide, he ran a pass-mark 2.5 length fifth. Cumani then stepped him up a further 400 metres and revelled in his 1.25 length victory in the Galilee final.

Continued from page 3 half furlong in the SA Derby, which in 2005 switched to 2500m for no real reason other than deference to Flemington and its track-shape enforced Derby distance.

Cumani will be seeking the holy grail of his first G1 success and to emulate his famous father in becoming a Derby-winning trainer. He's come close on three occasions in the Flemington edition, with his string of Dundee (High Chaparral) progeny placegetters Hit The Shot in 2020 and Deal Done Fast last year, and with Kingofwallstreet running fourth in 2024 - all of whom lend fodder to Cumani's trainers' tower nickname of 'Crocodile Dundee!'

"To win a Group 1 would be enormous for our stable. And to win one, you've got to have lots of goes at it," Cumani said. "The trainers who regularly win the Group 1s are usually the ones who always have runners in Group 1s.

"And to win a Derby would mean a lot to me. I grew up having the Epsom Derby as the pinnacle, the race to win, a stallion-making

race in my earlier days, and a race that was vitally important. All my old man's horses were possible Derby horses when he bought them, and I guess I go about it in a similar way."

Cumani admits he is hopeful rather than confident of Derby success, still to be fully convinced Single Choice is a genuine stayer. Then again, similar queries once surrounded Knight's Choice (Extreme Choice) before his Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) success. What the two share is an ability to settle in their races and produce a sharp turn of foot at the end of a staying contest, particularly when the tempo suits.

"His best asset is his ability to settle. He may well not be a true stayer, and we haven't had a proper test at 2400 or 2500 metres yet," Cumani said.

"In the Galilee, they went slowly for the first 1400 metres. Hopefully this Derby will be run like that race. It'll help him if he gets a good barrier, can save ground, and they run a slow first half and he settles well and doesn't become

part of an early rush to the front, which is what usually happens in the SA Derby.

"Then he can bide his time while everyone else makes themselves tired making early moves and possibly reacting off a slow tempo.

"If that's the case (jockey) Jamie (Mott) can do exactly what he did on him last start - sit and wait until he needs to go, then accelerate to the line. It was his first ride on the horse and he summed him up perfectly."

Cumani conceded Single Choice had "been beaten in races where things haven't gone perfectly for him".

"That could limit his upper end, but then again, he has a similar profile to a lot of good horses, who've also won over various distances and have his sort of temperament and character," he said.

"As an older horse, we'll do a bit more work on finding exactly what his perfect distance is. It may well be back to 1800 to 2000 metres.

"But we'll try to get a Derby with him first, and you have to be impressed with what he's done so far."

"I ran second in a Caulfield Cup with Single Gaze which is probably the biggest thrill of my career but this comes close," Olive claimed after Spicy Lu went all the way in the Ethereal. "It's great to get a win down here in Melbourne because she's had no luck but got the job done today.

"I don't have a lot of money to spend and I picked her up for \$30,000 in Book 2 at the Gold Coast Magic Millions."

Spicy Lu was offered through the Vinery consignment as agent for the Esplin family in 2024. Her dam All Salsa (Charge Forward) was a Randwick winner for Ron Quinton and she descends directly from Salsabil (Sadler's Wells) who won the 1990 English 1,000 Guineas and English Oaks and became the first filly in almost a century to beat the colts in the Irish Derby.

Sheikh Hamdan rated Salsabil the best filly he ever raced and, despite a tragically short stud career, she foaled the Group winners Sahm (Mr. Prospector), Bint Salsabil (Nashwan) and Alabaq (Riverman) who is the second-dam of All Salsa.

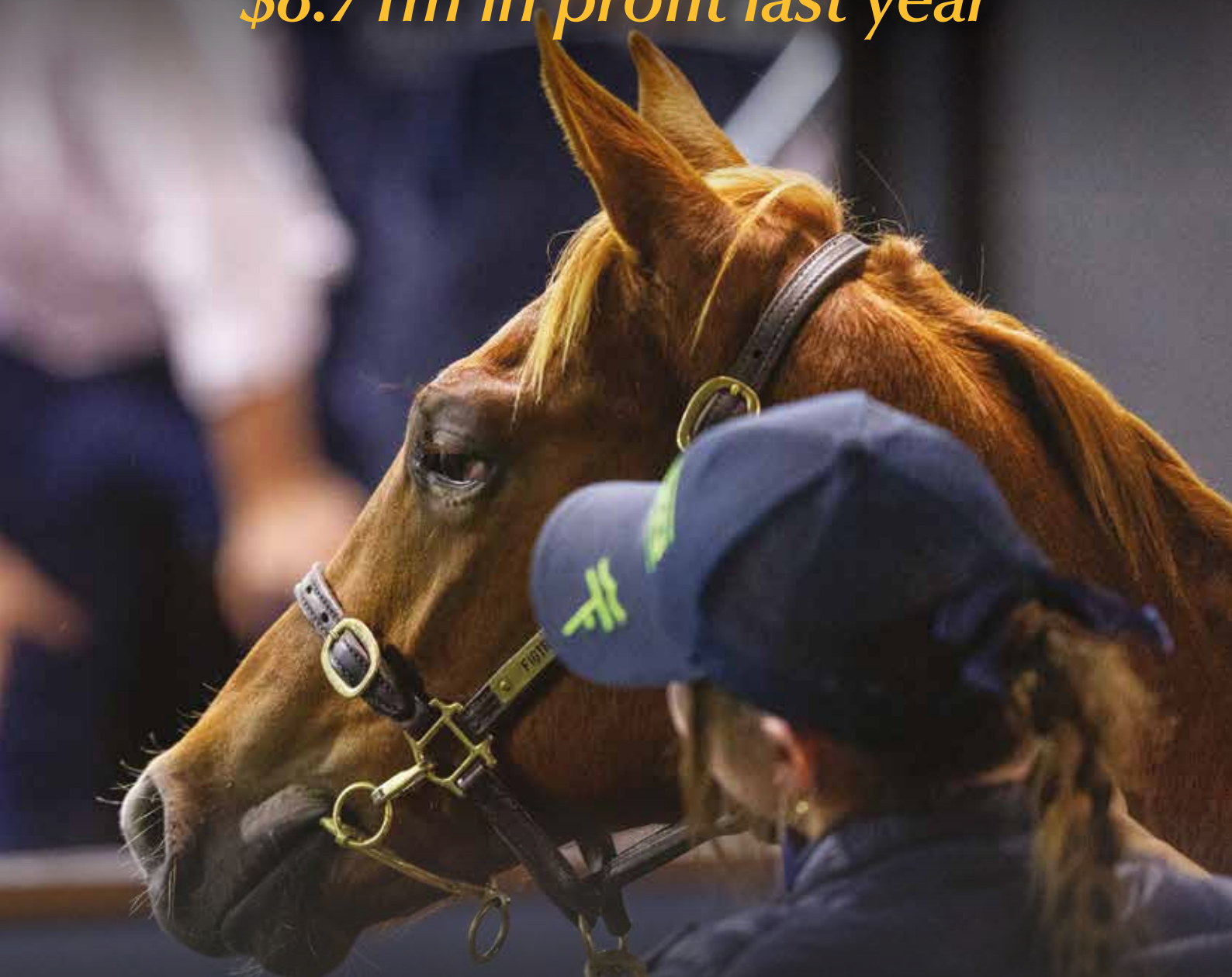

Douglas dreaming of Derby success

Ultra-consistent three-year-old Kaye Jay (Crackerjack King) will aim to round out a prosperous first racing preparation with victory in this Saturday's \$1 million South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) at Morphettville. With his stable star Giga Kick (Scissor Kick) in the spelling paddock following his unplaced effort in the All-Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m), Clayton Douglas is pinning his hopes on Kaye Jay to deliver late-season Group 1 glory. Kaye Jay has been a model of consistency early in his career, breaking his maiden at Sandown on his second start before a placing in the Alister Clarke Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) and recording a further two fourths at Group level. Douglas believes the gelding, who impressed in a Balnarring jump-out last week, is now ready to build on a highly encouraging effort in the ATC Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) at Randwick. "He ran really well

in the Derby in Sydney," Douglas told Racing.com. "He was probably in the inferior part of the track and had a horse stop ahead of him down the side, so he had to go back in to make up some ground. He's a nice horse and he's going great. He had a little tick-over trial at Balnarring last week and a month between runs won't be a worry for him, so I'm looking forward to Saturday." Kaye Jay is fifth in the line of betting behind Ciaron Maher's imported colt Accidental Bid (Phoenix Of Spain), who created an enormous impression when winning the Ladbrokes Sky Heights Stayers Series Heat 2 (Bm62) over 2000m at Pakenham on 16 April by 7.75 lengths.

Dual Group 1 winner Antino retired

Antino (Redwood) has been retired after sustaining a tendon injury following his fourth placing in the Brisbane Handicap (Listed, 1600m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. The Tony Gollan-trained seven-year-old was found

to have heat and swelling in his right fore tendon, with further veterinary examinations confirming the injury was incurred during the race. After consultation with connections, the decision was made to retire the son of Redwood (High Chaparral). Antino retires with 13 wins from 33 starts, including victories in the Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) in 2024 and the Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) in 2025. He was also crowned Queensland Horse of the Year in consecutive seasons. "It is with tremendous sadness, we have had to make this decision given the thrills and excitement he has provided the racing industry from fans to our staff and owners," Gollan said. "I wish to thank Jeetu Ramchandani and the ownership group for the opportunity to train Antino and my wider team who have contributed to his training and preparation since the gelding joined our stable in 2022. "Antino will enjoy a well-deserved retirement after his rehabilitation from injury." A consistent performer at the highest level, Antino placed behind Sir Delius (Frankel) and

Racing Victoria Off The Track Carnival returns to Boneo Park

Following a hugely successful inaugural edition, Racing Victoria (RV) has reaffirmed its long-standing commitment to equine welfare with the return of the Off The Track (OTT) Carnival hosted by Boneo Park, which will be held from 11-13 September. Expanding from two days of competition to three in 2026, the second annual OTT Carnival will welcome up to 500 thoroughbreds through the gates at Boneo Park on the Mornington Peninsula, cementing its position as the largest equestrian event dedicated to thoroughbreds in Victoria. Open to retired racehorses from across the country, the OTT Carnival bridges the gap between racing and equestrian disciplines by showcasing the versatility of the thoroughbred. Its position during Melbourne's world-famous Spring Racing Carnival is timed to shine a positive light on the multitude of post-racing initiatives available to former racehorses, with the likes of Group 1 winners Zaaki and Hartnell among a host of racetrack stars excelling in their second careers. The competition is open to all OTT riders, with no membership required, and entry fees are capped at \$100 per horse per class (inclusive

of administration and facility fees), making the event both accessible and affordable. Thanks to RV's principal sponsorship, the prize-money pool will increase this year by more than \$30,000, with over \$260,000 on offer across the three days of competition. Jamie Melham was amongst the crowd last year, and the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winning jockey is looking forward to returning to Boneo Park to take in the action later this year. "Last year was incredible," she said. "I've been to Boneo many times, and I've never seen that many competitors and people excited to come and watch."

Engine Of War ready to fire in the SA Derby

Engine Of War (Circus Maximus) will be on the quick back-up in the South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) this Saturday, with trainers Mick Price and Michael Kent Jr looking to replicate a successful blueprint from 2022. The stable followed the same path with Jungle Magnate (Tarzino), now known as Beautyverse since moving to Hong Kong to race, who progressed from the Chairman's Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) to claim Derby honours, and after Engine Of War's encouraging showing in the lead-up, connections are keen to adopt that proven approach once again. Engine Of War finished 2.2-lengths in arrears of the Chairman's Stakes winner Impulsive Reaction (Shamus Award) at Morphettville last Saturday, and with that galloper untested at the Derby distance, bookmakers believe Engine Of War, the \$6 second favourite, can turn the tables. "He'll definitely back-up, he's pulled up super," Kent Jr told Racing.com. "We've taken this route before – Mick won the Chairman's with Jungle Magnate before he won the Derby. "Last year, Warmonger was unlucky in the Chairman's and then unlucky in the Derby." Engine Of War, who will be ridden by Daniel Stakhouse in the Derby, closed off smartly from the back of the pack

to finish fourth in the Chairman's, with Kent Jr adamant he will relish the extra distance of Saturday's three-year-old staying classic. "It went as expected, we had the wide gate, and with a view to backing him up seven days later we didn't want to punch him forward and expose him early," Kent Jr said. "He looked like he'll eat up 2500 metres, and I thought he was the flashing light run of the race."

Three cheers for Ka Ying

While Hong Kong superstar Ka Ying Rising (Shamexpress) heads for a well-earned holiday, former travelling companion Ka Ying Cheer (Reward For Effort) is set to step out in regional Victoria this Saturday when Bendigo Jockey Club hosts its annual standalone metropolitan fixture. Ka Ying Cheer, who kept the world's best sprinter company in quarantine ahead of his win in The Everest (Gr 1, 1200m) last year, will look to avenge his only defeat in Australia when he returns to action for the Lindsay Park training team. After winning at Pakenham in February on his Australian debut, the six-year-old repeated the dose at Seymour later that month before making it three wins on the spin at Caulfield in mid-March. He was subsequently beaten at the same venue earlier this month, but co-trainer Ben Hayes expects Ka Ying Cheer – who like Ka Ying Rising is owned by Leung Shek-Kong – to bounce back to form this weekend. "He managed to win three in a row and kind of just got to his grade, but he's working nicely going into Saturday," said Hayes. "He didn't run badly last start, but he just needs things to go right. He's deep into his prep now and he has shown that he's up to good city class races, so that's probably where he'll be at from now on." The Bendigo meeting is headlined by the Golden Mile (Listed, 1600m) and the Bendigo Guineas (Listed, 1400m), which are both worth \$200,000 in prize-money.

Sweet success for dashing debutante

\$1.6 million dollar Blueblood filly Moscatel (Snitzel) blitzed her rivals on debut at Randwick-Kensington on Monday, with connections keen to raise the bar with the juvenile in the coming weeks. The half-sister to Percy Sykes Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Eneeza (Exceed And Excel) got her career off to the best possible start with a 4.5-length demolition under hoop Tim Clark. The fourth foal produced by Group 2 Euclase Stakes (1200m) winner Sweet Sherry (Bel Esprit), Moscatel jumped the \$3 favourite on Monday but made a mockery of the betting by powering to an all the way win for her connections. "There is a two-year-old fillies race at Scone that she might be well-suited to, the Listed Woodlands Stakes," co-trainer Adrian Bott commented post-race. "That's the reason we wanted to be here today and that should give her enough time to get through to a race like that or, if not, we could look through to Queensland." Bott and co-trainer Gai Waterhouse had initially pegged Moscatel as a potential Golden Slipper contender (Gr 1, 1200m), but ultimately elected to bide their time with the filly. "We bought her as a nice precocious type, but she's just needed that little bit of time and we've always been happy to be patient with her," Bott revealed. "She's got herself here on her own merits, and I'm sure there's a lot of upside off the back of today."

Abscess delays Joker

Perth sprinter JOKERS GRIN (Maschino) faces a race against time to make the Brisbane winter carnival after a foot abscess interrupted the early stages of his eastern campaign. Now with Chris Waller, last year's \$5million Quokka winner had been set to kick off an eastern seaboard campaign in the ATC Hall Mark Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Randwick on April 18 and continue into the BRC Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Eagle Farm this Saturday. "He was placed in a Randwick barrier trial behind

Overpass and Chris and J-Mac were happy with his progress," part-owner and breeder Mark Jones said on Monday. "But then the abscess put everything on hold. It's still a bit tender and plans are up in the air but hopefully he recovers in time for a first-up crack at the Doomben 10,000 on May 16." Jokers Grin won the \$5million Quokka twelve months ago and returned to Ascot for summer carnival victories in the Prince Of Wales Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) and Colonel Reeves Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m). His dam Walk In Beauty (Barely A Moment) foaled another Maschino colt for Jones in October.

Nearco Stud celebrated a stakes double with its graduates at the weekend with Drops Of God (Hello Youmzain) and stablemate Perlino (Super Seth) both making their black type breakthroughs, at Te Rapa and Riccarton respectively. The pair of lightly-raced fillies now have three wins apiece for co-trainers Mark Walker and Sam Bergerson, with Drops Of God carrying the colours of farm principal Greg Tomlinson. Drops Of God strolled to victory in Saturday's Cambridge Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), having placed at her previous start in the Almanzor Trophy (Gr 3, 1200m), while Perlino followed up her minor placing in the NZB Insurance Stakes (Listed, 1600m) with success in the Warstep Stakes (Listed, 2000m). "It was the sort of day that breeders dream

about," said Tomlinson's bloodstock consultant Patrick Cunningham. Drops Of God continued the remarkable record of his dam Distinctive Lass (Orientate), who also produced the New Zealand 1000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) heroine Kahma Lass (Darci Brahma). "She's rising 22 now but has continued to produce year on year and has had 10 foals to the races for nine winners and five stakes winners," Cunningham said. "She has a clean bill of health and is currently in foal to Super Seth. What a mare she is, to put it lightly." Drops Of God was initially due to go through the ring at Karaka in 2024, before fate intervened and she was retained to race by Nearco in partnership with Raptors Thoroughbred. "She got up to the complex but at the 11th hour she went lame, and that pulled the pin on her going through the sale," Cunningham said. "She would no doubt have commanded a lot of money, but that's how it went and Greg is reaping the benefits now."

Big win for Wee Nussy

Patience and persistence have paid off for the connections of well-bred filly Wee Nussy (Savabeel), who claimed an overdue first victory at Ellerslie. The three-year-old is the daughter of Group 1 performer Contessa Vanessa (Bullbars), who won the Eight Carat Classic (Gr 2, 1600m) and Sunline Vase (Gr 3, 2100m) during her career for trainers Graeme and Debbie Rogerson. Bred and raced by Lyn Salvidge and Bruce Amies, Wee Nussy had always shown her trainer Barbara Kennedy plenty of talent at home, but had failed to convert that potential into raceday success with just one minor placing from her eight starts prior to Monday's win. However, after a freshen-up Wee Nussy dropped back in distance to 1400m at start number nine, and duly shed her maiden status in the capable hands of Kennedy's husband Warren. "A bit of a freshen-up seems to have done the trick and she has come here and put them to bed quite nicely," said her trainer post-race. "She has always shown us quite a bit of ability back home, but getting her to the racetrack she has just

Ka Ying Rising earns lofty comparisons

An effusive David Hayes believes Ka Ying Rising (Shamexpress) is now worthy of comparison with Black Caviar (Bel Esprit) after rounding out another unbeaten season with a 20th consecutive victory in the Chairman's Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m). Ka Ying Rising registered his ninth triumph at racing's highest level with another imperious performance for Hayes and regular rider Zac Purton at Sha Tin on Sunday night. Hayes concedes the freakish five-year-old has now comfortably surpassed the feats of his previous flagbearer Better Loosen Up (Loosen

Up), and the Hall of Fame trainer believes he may even end his career as one of the best racehorses in the history of the sport. "Better Loosen Up will still hold pride of place because he was the world's highest-rated horse for a year, but I think this bloke is in another stratosphere," Hayes told Racing.com. Having previously tasted defeat, Ka Ying Rising is unable to match the achievements of Black Caviar, who ended her career with an unblemished race record having won all 25 starts for trainer Peter Moody. After breaking the Sha Tin track record at each of his past two starts, however, Hayes is adamant that Ka Ying Rising deserves to be mentioned in the same breath as the late, great mare. "I'm a Black Caviar fan from way back, but I think this one can at least be compared to her now," he told Racing.com. "With Black Caviar, they used to say she would go round at Bernborough odds – now you can say they go round at Ka Ying Rising odds, they're the shortest any horse has ever been."

International

Daryz harbours Ascot aspirations

Daryz (Sea The Stars) will be targeted at June's Royal Ascot meeting after returning to action in style with victory in the Prix Ganay (Gr 1, 2100m) on Sunday. Trainer Francis Henri Graffard confirmed the entire would

be aimed at the Prince of Wales's Stakes (Gr 1, 1m1f), with the longer-term plan geared towards the defence of his crown in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 1m4f) at Longchamp in October, for which he now holds outright favouritism. Daryz, who shares a barn with the reigning world horse of the year Calandagan (Gleneagles), easily accounted for his rivals at Longchamp on the Saturday afternoon, with Graffard impressed by both the performance under jockey Mickael Barzalona and the four-year-old's condition. "The horse is definitely stronger and is more mature," said Graffard post-race. "It was the perfect race to make his comeback in. They didn't go fast but he was perfectly in tune with what Mickael was asking him to do. He got there without being woken up and when Mickael asked him to accelerate, he reacted immediately." His pilot was equally enthusiastic, with Barzalona quick to point out the searing pace his mount displayed. "That was a super first run of the year," he said. "He'd been working very well at home and looked in magnificent condition today. He was very relaxed even though they didn't go fast and he really picked up strongly, so much so that it was all over well before the line. "On what he's done there he showed he's still a real force, and in terms of distance he looks very versatile."

Is she the one?

New Zealand's ANZAC Day racing drew good attendances and even better fields at both the Te Rapa and Riccarton venues. The deep south, in the shape of Mosgiel's Brian and Shane Anderton, raided Riccarton to snag a Ghibellines (Shamardal) double in two of the three features.

Fraser Auret, who bred world-great Ka Ying Rising (Shamexpress), oversaw Khanshe (Mongolian Khan) to bag Te Rapa's Travis Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) and Te Akau Racing landed Riccarton's third feature, the Warstep Stakes (Listed, 2000m), with Perlino (Super Seth). Te Akau also took home Te Rapa's Cambridge Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), the performance by Drops Of God (Hello Youmzain) by far the best of the day.

A talented field assembled for the Cambridge Breeders' Stakes and Drops Of God drew the outside alley (14). Nevertheless, the stable was confident, issuing instructions to Craig Grylls to be positive from the gates. Sure enough, the filly had the lead before the first turn and rounding into the home straight Grylls let out the reins. She responded and inside the 300 metres Grylls merely kept the filly's mind on the task but she was never under pressure, waltzing clear by two and half lengths in a slick 1:09.79, the only runner to break 70 seconds on the Soft 6 surface, for her third win in four starts.

Four trials included a soft win but she didn't face a raceday until her 3YO career, early December, bolting in at Te Aroha. Ellerslie on New Years Day saw another win, stepping up to Benchmark 65 class comfortably.

Returning to Ellerslie for Karaka Millions

night she stepped up again, this time to Group 3 level in the Almanzor Trophy (1200m) where she strode to the lead at the 200 metres but was run down by future Group 1 filly Belle Cheval (Savabeel) who, next start, almost burst the Well Written (Written Tycoon) bubble in the rich The NZB Kiwi (Listed, 1500m).

Drops Of God's sire Hello Youmzain (Kodiac) is already proving to be a prolific sire of winners. Retired to stud in France in 2021, his oldest runners in the Northern Hemisphere have just turned four while south of the equator, domiciled at Cambridge Stud, he has just two crops of racing age and between the two he has sired 118 individual winners, among them 12 stakes winners and further 13 stakes-placed performers.

His seven stakes winners in Europe include three (Godspeed, Electrolyte and Misunderstood) to have succeeded at either Group 2 or Group 3 level but until Saturday and Drops Of God, four Listed winners was his tally in the south.

'Tis the season for stallion fee announcements, studs drumming up business for next season and Cambridge Stud will be excited about a boost in interest for Hello Youmzain. So they should as Drops Of God is

his best advertisement. She could be the one to light the fire.

Drops Of God has plenty to live up to as her dam, Melbourne winner and Listed-placed Distinctive Lass (Orientate), had produced four stakes winners when the filly was catalogued but withdrawn from the NZB's 2024 Karaka Yearling Sale. They are headed by New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr1, 1600m) winner Karma Lass (Darci Brahma), also a Listed winner in Melbourne.

Also included are Kuro (Denman), a five-times Listed winner in Australia. Southern Lad (Ocean Park) won the Ramornie Handicap (Listed, 1200m), a tough race to win. In Malaysia is millionaire Distinctive Darci (Darci Brahma) plus Wairau Cove (Darci Brahma), second in the 2022 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes. Drops Of God is Distinctive Lass's ninth winner which also includes Milunka (All Too Hard), the dam of current stakes performer To Bravery Born (Snitzel).

Maybe they all inherited some of their ability from Distinctive Lass's grandam Special (Habituat), a triple Group 1 sprinting star who landed Flemington's Newmarket Handicap (1200), The VRC Sprint formally the Gadsden Stakes (1200m) and Lightning Stakes (1000m).

Not unexpected

Te Akau Racing sent two out for the Warstep Stakes (Listed, 2000m) but it was warm favourite Perlino (Super Seth) who took out the winning prize, the filly's third win in seven starts as well as a ninth individual stakes winner for recently-sold Super Seth (Dundeel).

Perlino was a tad slow to begin but recovered sufficiently to sit midfield. From the 600 metre mark all she needed was a path which she found soon after straightening but there were four runners to pass. She was travelling best to take the lead at the 200 meters then ran clear. The result was never in doubt.

Perlino's win was not unexpected as her form included two good wins at her home track plus she finished a creditable third in the NZB Insurance Stakes (Listed, 1600m), two weeks prior when up against a stronger field.

A David Ellis purchase from the 2024 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale (Book 1), Perlino was catalogued alongside Drops Of God in Gordon Cunningham's Curraghmore draft but Perlino sold for NZ\$120,000.

Similar to Drops Of God, her trial form was average and her first start was also at Te Aroha, on December 7th. That day, Perlino was slow away but ran on late for seventh, with commentator George Simon noting her finish. Te Akau decided that Perlino might be better suited at their South Island stable and on her way south stopped off at Otaki to run a fighting third on Boxing Day.

At her new home Perlino signalled her future with an eight-length win over 1600 metres, was trapped three wide without cover in the Dunedin Guineas (Listed, 1600m) then won again from an outside draw back at Riccarton. Her solid finish from out of the pack for third in the NZB Insurance Stakes ensured favouritism for the Warstep and she duly delivered.

As a Listed winner her residual value has certainly been enhanced and she may have earned a return to her former base at Matamata and some northern stakes races. Being by Super Seth adds to her value plus there is plenty of black-type in her bloodlines. Her dam is an Exceed And Excel (Danehill) half-sister to dual Sydney Listed winner Malice (Teofilo) and her grandam is a sister to Group 3 Sydney winner Mica's Pride (Bite The Bullet), in turn the dam of four-times Group 1 winner Criterion (Sebring).

Double plunder

The deep south's powerhouse Anderton training team from Wingatui, in combination with their recently passed White Robe Lodge stallion Ghibellines (Shamardal), had a field day at Riccarton, marching home with two black-type races, namely Inflamed (Ghibellines) in the Great Easter Stakes (Listed, 1400m) and Bauble (Ghibellines) in the Canterbury Gold Cup (Gr 3, 2000m).

In what may be her last season of racing and perhaps even her last race, Inflamed recorded the best win of her first rate career by running down lightly-weighted up-and-comer Iron Hawk (Written Tycoon). The mare was giving him 4.5 kilos and would have been excused if she hadn't won. Instead, she threw everything but the kitchen sink to get past within the shadows of the post to add win nine in a 37 start career with a bank in excess of NZ\$377,000.

The current season has been especially fruitful for the 6YO. In 11 starts she has won five times including three stakes, all at Riccarton, earning nearly NZ\$250,000. Proving most versatile, last November she landed the Listed Stewards' Stakes (1200m)

on a Heavy 9 track. Two starts back she scored the South Island Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) in 1:34.29 and on Saturday ran a slashing 1:22.28 for the 1400m.

Inflamed will be a welcome addition to White Robe Lodge's broodmare roster as she ranks as a three-quarter sister to Turnbull Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) winner and \$2.5 million earner Smokin' Romans (Ghibellines). Sadly, the stud announced that Inflamed's dam, stakes winner Ortem Fire (Gallant Guru), passed away within the last week. Four of her five foals are fillies, including her 2025 filly by Ancient Spirit (Invincible Spirit), so her line will not be lost.

The best finish of the day belonged to the Canterbury Gold Cup (Gr 3, 2000m). With 100 metres to run a half length covered the first seven runners and one did not know where to look but out in the middle of the track it was Bauble, from last into the straight, who stormed to the line in front. He was unwanted in the betting and the 7YO ran out of his skin to record win eight from 35 starts for earnings of NZ\$211,000.

She can

Khanshe (Mongolian Khan) appears to be getting better with age. The 5YO mare has faced the starter seven times this season for three wins, two of which are the Phar Lap Trophy (Gr 3, 1600m) and on Saturday the Travis Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m).

Of the eight actual runners (two were declared non-runners after a mishap in the stalls), Khanshe sat either last or second last for most of the journey. Matt Cameron was very patient when sitting last into the home straight and his patience was rewarded at the 200 metre mark with space one off the fence. The mare grabbed the bit and chased after the leader, getting the upper hand in the last few strides.

In 20 lifetime starts Khanshe has recorded six wins but her best effort may have been her close fourth in the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Trentham last month. In any case she was due another good win and there is every chance that she will return for some of our better races next season.

Exported to China, her sire Mongolian

Khan (Holy Roman Emperor) lost breeders' interest after five seasons, serving just six mares total in his last two seasons. Khanshe is his best progeny to date.

Khanshe's dam Folies Bergere (O'Reilly) is responsible for two stakes winners this season, the other being Listed winner Circus Dancer (Circus Maximus), two of five winners. Grandam, Dashing Donna (Don Eduardo) was a talented sprinter whose best win was Ellerslie's Newmarket Handicap (Listed, 1200m) where she also ran second in the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m).

Over in Oz

At Flemington, the first three winners on the card were bred in New Zealand including the unbeaten Blind Raise (Ace High), winner of the Anzac Day Stakes (Listed, 1400m), raising to six the number of individual stakes winners for Ace High (High Chaparral) who stands at Rich Hill Stud.

The youngster caught the attention of many with an impressive debut win at Sandown on

Easter Monday but in Saturday's stakes he took it to a new level, thundering clear from the 300 metres then eased to win as he liked.

ANZ News contacted Rich Hill supremo John Thompson who commented: "For Ace High to get a Flemington 2YO stakes winner is a bit of a game changer. If Blind Raise should continue to Brisbane and land the JJ Atkins (Gr 1, 1600m), that would put Ace High in rarified territory. It has been a breakout season for the stallion, with ten stakes performers so far including Group 1 winner She's a Dealer."

Thompson added that hard workers Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young deserve their success after having sourced Blind Raise at the 2025 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale for NZ\$70,000 from The Oaks Stud draft.

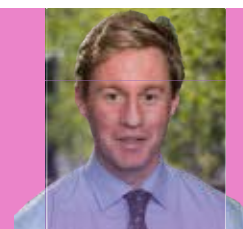
Blind Raise has a pedigree. His dam is a winning daughter of champion sprinter Seachange (Cape Cross), a six-time Group 1 winner, while his dam's half-sister produced \$3.5 million earner and one-time boom performer Storm Boy (Justify).

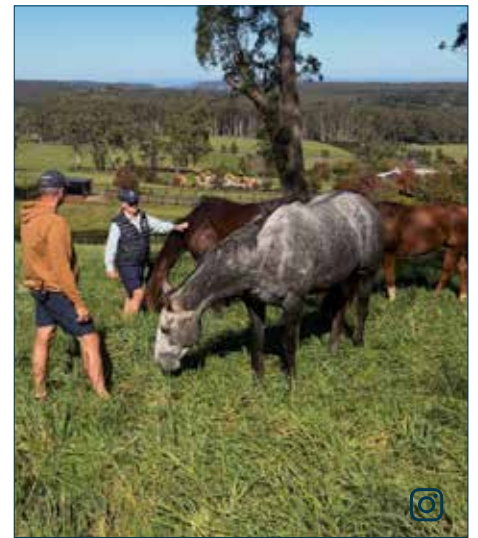

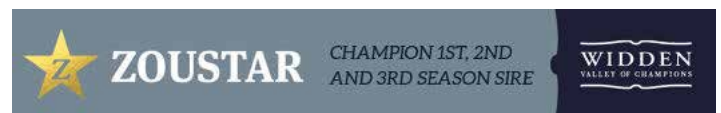
