# Chayan Caps Chairman's Night In \$5.6m Coup

Promising two-year-old Chayan (I Am Invincible) became the second most expensive horse sold at a breeding stock auction in Australia at the Inglis Chairman's Sale on Monday night.

The Annabel and Rob Archibald trained filly - a Group 2 winner from just four starts and was eighth as favourite in the Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) - was eventually knocked down to Coolmore's Tom Magnier for \$5.6 million, after a tense 10-minute bidding duel with Yulong for the last lot of the night.

A day after his 49th birthday, businessman and former Singapore Turf Club steward Eric Koh received a timely gift when selling Chayan, who he bought at Magic Millions Gold Coast 16 months ago for \$250,000.

Her sale price, on top of the \$335,000 prize money she won for Koh in a career highlighted by her 2.97 length Reisling Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m), places her second on the Australian breeding stock sales pecking order behind star sprinter Imperatriz (I Am Invincible), bought by Yulong for \$6.6m at the 2024 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale.

**Luck's a fortune for Walters family**

Any Luck (Puccini) gave the Walters family a day to remember when the \$300,000 Warrnambool Cup (Listed, 2350m) fell her way on Thursday, with Kate Walters guiding the six-year-old mare to the biggest win of her career for her father, trainer Wayne Walters. Backing up after finishing fourth in a Benchmark 70 over 2350m on Tuesday, the New Zealand-bred mare proved too strong late, outstaying the \$4 favourite Alder (Australia) by a half-head, with Tempesti (Albert Dock) a further 1.75 lengths away in third. **Continued on page 12**

Continued from page 1 prices represent a boon for Yarraman Park's triple champion sire I Am Invincible, Chayan's sale also completed a glorious double for Longwood Thoroughbred Farm.

Michael Christian's Victorian stud bred and raised Chayan, as well as the mare whose 2025 Chairman's Sale record price of \$4.2m she eclipsed on Thursday night - Bella Nipotina (Pride Of Dubai).

While Chayan will likely have much racing

ahead of her, Magnier indicated it was likely her first cover would come from Super Seth (Dundeel), who Coolmore bought from Waikato Stud for more than \$50 million in February.

Added as one of 11 supplementary lots, sold from Newgate Farm's draft,

and scheduled with a flair for the dramatic as the last of 115 fillies and mares offered, Chayan was comfortably the top lot on the glamour night of the Australian auction scene.

Second highest price on the night was star sprinter Benedetta - daughter of I Am Invincible's son and studmate Hellbent - who was bought by Yulong for \$1.9m and held the clubhouse lead for most of the night after selling from Widden Stud's draft as Lot 35.

Yulong also bought the third-highest priced offering in triple New Zealand Group 1 winner Provence (Savabeel), the lone offering from the Newgate-Milan Park consignment as Lot 100, for \$1.8 million.

Zhang Yuesheng's empire emerged as the leading buyer, snapping up eight mares for a combined \$8.45 million. Magnier leapt into second in making Chayan his second purchase of the night, with an **Continued on page 4**

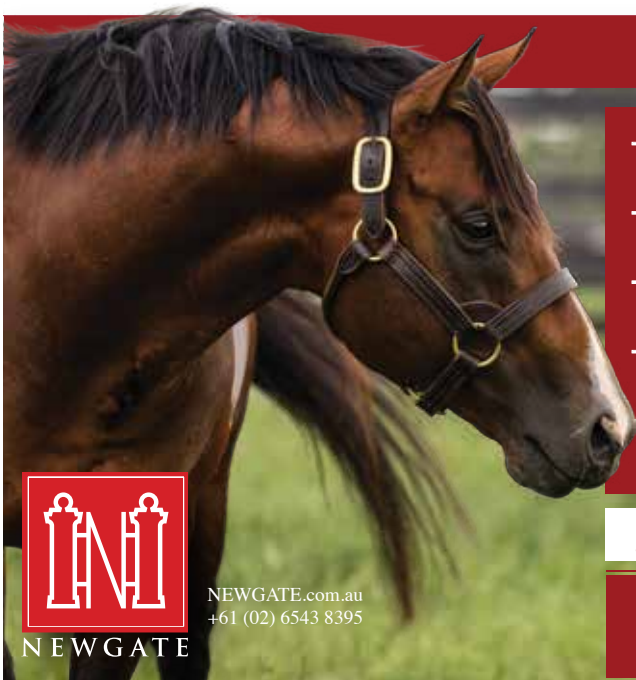

Continued from page 2 aggregate of \$6.4 million.

Those two heavy hitters left a long gap to third place buyer, Japan's Katsumi Yoshida of Northern Farms, who bought three lots for a total of \$2.4 million.

Outside those rankings the figures underlined what was a relatively difficult sale,

with the impacts of global economic troubles evident again, much as they were at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale.

This Chairman's sale would have always faced a strong challenge to emulate last year's extraordinary edition, in which an extremely star-studded catalogue drove all key metrics to exceptional levels.

Bella Nipotina and Amelia's Jewel (Siyouni) both eclipsed the auction's previous record - fetching \$4.2 million and \$3.8 million respectively, while 14 lots fetched seven figures, smashing the sale's previous high of nine from each of the prior two years.

Against that backdrop, and with added pressure from economic uncertainty following the war on Iran, the 2026 Chairman's Sale finished well down on last year across all key measures, with its gross and clearance rate landing much closer to 2024 levels than the exceptional 2025 edition.

At the close of business, the average sat at \$495,000, down from \$707,000, while the

median was \$300,000, down from \$400,000. The clearance rate of 73 per cent compared unfavourably to last year's 87 per cent, and the gross was \$39.08 million - 28 per cent below 2025's figure of \$54.43 million, despite two more lots having been sold (79/77). Nine seven-figure lots were moved, down from last year's 14.

While the 2026 catalogue may have lacked the depth of 2025's, the clear conclusion was global economic instability had had a palpable impact, including a knock-on effect for breeders and prospective buyers who endured a softer than expected Easter yearling sale.

Inglis will still take encouragement from the broader progress the Chairman's Sale has made over the past decade. Inglis Bloodstock CEO Sebastian Hutch also pointed out the relatively high number of pregnant mares offered on Thursday night will have weighed on the clearance rate.

While pleased with the appeal of a sale which he believed **Continued on page 5**

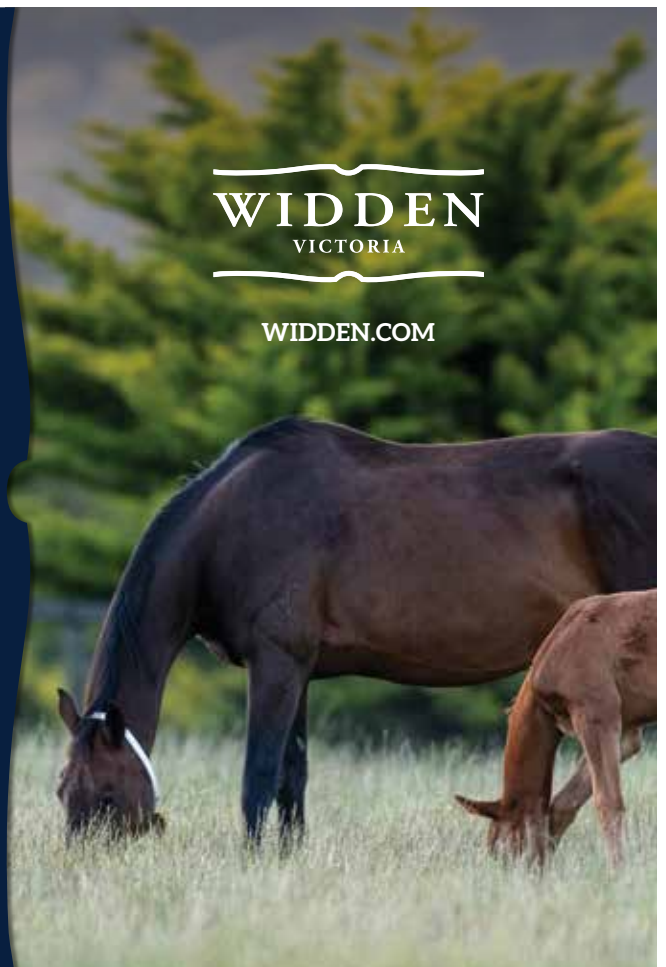

**Continued from page 4** would convince more owners to sell at Chairman's in future, Hutch said: "I think we probably saw some evidence of what was in play at Easter this evening".

"The necessary confidence for people just to step in and go wasn't there," he said. "There are plenty of challenges in the market but they shouldn't be pertinent factors on a night light like this. We're talking about high end quality stuff. Ultimately, it comes down to confidence, and people stepping in to bid the number they need to bid to buy mares.

"I think that's a inevitable consequence of the Easter Yearling Sale playing out the way it played out."

Hutch said had the Chairman's been held immediately after the Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale - which began the weekend the US and Israel started attacking Iran - it would have been "outrageously" successful.

"We finalised the catalogue between the end of the Classic sale and the start of Easter yearling sale inspections," he said. "At that time, this looked an appealing catalogue in the context of what was likely to be brought to market this year. Obviously the market felt that way about plenty of the stock, just not all of it.

"Certain vendors came out of Easter, maybe not having turned over as much as they'd anticipated. That having a knock-on effect at the breeding stock sales - I'd say that's a contributing factor.

"I'd have liked it to have been better in parts, but am I satisfied to have gotten to where we've gotten too? Yeah, I am."

Chairman's 2026 was given a major and unusual boost by its last lot among more than 100 seasoned mares - a two-year-old.

Koh said Chayan's sale came about through a "three-pronged" campaign of convincing - from an old friend, from Inglis, and from Newgate Farm's Henry Field. It had also been spurred after lucrative private offers for the filly from Yulong boss Zhang.

"When she was favourite in the Slipper, I told everybody she's a keeper and I'm looking to breed eventually," said Koh, who owns 13 more racehorses in Australia, and "a few" others in Ireland, Malaysia and South Korea.

"But then I was put in a corner by a

dear friend (who suggested selling). Nicky Wong from Inglis rang and said the team from Inglis had a good meeting, and they think she could potentially be one of the best selling two-year-old fillies.

"Then Henry Field rang - ever

convincing Henry, and I was put in a corner. Between friends and dear friends, I put her in the sale."

He added he had told Zhang, his friend of 16 years, that it was "a bit awkward to talk dollars and cents with you", and decided the fairest way to sell the filly would be at auction.

"It's unbelievable," he said of the sale. "I came here thinking maybe \$3.6 million, that'll be the top. Beyond \$4 million, then \$5 million, to \$5.6 million, was unbelievable."

Magnier said he was delighted to have executed one of the toughest tricks in breeding - beating Yulong at a sale.

"Yulong know what they're doing; there were smart people on her," Magnier said. "Annabel and Rob Archibald have been ringing me about this filly for a while. They like her a lot, and she looks very smart. Hopefully she's got good upside.

"When we've got stallions going very well like Home Affairs, Shinzo, Switzerland, you have to go out and find the mares for them.

"We'll give her to Rob and Annabel and they can dictate (Chayan's racing future). At the end of the day we'd have Super Seth probably marked down for her when she's finished racing."

The sale was also a triumph for Longwood Thoroughbred Farm.

"To have two horses who we bred and were raised on the farm in Bella Nipotina and Chayan top last year's and this year's sale, for a combined \$9.8 million, yes that's something that makes us very proud," an emotional Michael Christian told ANZ News.

"For them to develop into such valuable animals is just wonderful. It's a tough game,

and we're competing against some of the biggest studs in the world, so to have our brand on these two is something that feels extremely satisfying."

Rising seven-year-old Benedetta - a triple stakes winner including of the SAJC The Goodwood (Gr 1, 1200m) - is likely headed for a first mating this spring with Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Devil Night (Extreme Choice). The rising four-year-old will stand his first season at Yulong's newly acquired Segenhoe Stud in the Hunter Valley this spring, at a fee to be announced.

"I think she'll let down into a beautiful mare," Yulong's chief operating officer Sam Fairgray said.

"She's obviously in race condition now, but she's got a lot of quality about her and they'll be a nice match. Devil Night is a very good looking horse, so I think he'll suit a lot of mares.

"It'll be nice to be able to give him a mare of her quality in her first year at stud. Mr Zhang is all about supporting these young stallions and giving them the best start at stud.

"She's one of the better mares that's raced over the past 24 months. We already owned a little share in her so it's great to get the remainder of her."

Fairgray said six-year-old Provence (Savabeel) would likely be a cover for Private Harry (Harry Angel) when he commences stud duties at Yulong's newly bought Hunter Valley property, which the group's general manager Jun Zhang told ANZ News would be known as "New Segenhoe".

"You don't find many Savabeel mares who've won three Group 1 races, so to get her is fantastic," Fairgray said. **Continued on page 6**

**Continued from page 5** "I'd be leaning towards Private Harry for her at this stage. Just physically they're a good match. She probably needs a little bit of substance. She's quite an athletic filly, and he'll probably give her a little bit of substance."

Yulong bought three other seven-figures lots including four-year-old Listed winner and Group 1 placegetter Snow In May (The Autumn Sun) for \$1.05m, from Segenhoe's draft.

They paid Newgate the same amount for 12-year-old Hazlebrook (Hinchinbrook) - a city placegetter and lower level stakes producer whose value was boosted by being in-foal to Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt).

Yulong also went to a neat \$1 million for nine-year-old Moldova (Snitzel), dam of New Zealand Group 1 winner Captured By Love (Written Tycoon), in-foal to Home Affairs (I Am Invincible).

"It's about adding quality and that's what we're trying to do," said Fairgray, whose ever-expanding group will retire some 20 mares off the track for the coming breeding season.

"Getting the higher end mares is the key now. We see time and time again it's the stakes performers who produce stakes performers."

Yoshida paid Widden \$1.4 million for the evening's fourth-highest lot, the supplementary four-year-old Philia (All Too Hard), who's won a Group 2 and a Listed.

And Stefan Pardi's Equine Growth Fund paid Newgate \$1.2 million for Kiki Express (Sepoy), a six-year-old Melbourne Listed winner whose filly first foal by Anamoe (Street Boss) fetched \$800,000 this year.

Like Hazlebrook (Hinchinbrook), the mare's value was enhanced by being in-foal to Extreme Choice.

"I thought she'd cost \$1.5 million, or \$1.7 million," Pardi said of Kiki Express. "I couldn't believe it's been knocked down to me, really."

"In-foal to Extreme Choice, who averaged \$1.6 million at the Easter sale, and she's a great mare who produces good foals - I think it's exceptional buying."

While a share, believed to be 1.67 per cent, in Extreme Choice offered on the night failed to meet reserve at a top bid of \$900,000, the impact of Newgate's sub-fertile sensation was reflected in the three mares sold in-foal to him.

The third, nine-year-old triple city winner Sizzlefly (Sizzling) was bought from Newgate's consignment for \$600,000 by Mitchell Bloodstock.

Newgate topped the vendors by aggregates with 15 lots fetching \$12.85 million, and was second on average (\$857,000) to Widden, whose four sellers averaged \$962,500.

I Am Invincible was leading sire by aggregate, with five sold lots realising a total of \$7.01 million and an average of \$1.4 million.

#### St Gotthard to leave stablemates behind

Chris Waller is expected to bypass Saturday's 2YO Handicap (1200m) at Gosford with St Gotthard (Snitzel), with the \$2.7 million colt instead likely to head north for the Ken Russell Memorial Classic (Gr 3, 1200m) at the Gold Coast. The full brother to Group 1 winner Switzerland made a successful debut in a Maiden Handicap (1200m) at Warwick Farm last month and heads the betting for the Queensland feature. "At this stage, St Gotthard is going to go to the Gold Coast," Waller said. "He's a nice horse and he's gone the right way since winning." Purchased by Coolmore and partners for \$2.7 million from Arrowfield Stud at the 2025 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, St Gotthard has earned almost \$40,000 from his lone start. His withdrawal would still leave Waller with four runners in the Gosford juvenile event — Zynaro (Zoustar), Quarterback (Super Seth), Whitehall (I Am Invincible) and Air Of Solace (I Am Invincible). Zynaro will make his NSW debut after finishing third over 1000m at Mornington, while Quarterback produced a placing at Kensington at his only start. Whitehall and Air Of Solace were both unplaced on debut but are expected to improve with race experience. "Zynaro is coming up

**Y**ulong was a major player at the Chairman's Sale, which is par for the course, but this year it came with a decidedly different feel following Zhang Yuesheng's purchase last week of Segenhoe Stud.

Some mares bought by the green and white army will be heading north to their newly acquired Hunter Valley property and its five stallions, instead of boarding the usual Yulong truck headed south to their established farm in Victoria.

Yulong's purchase of historic Segenhoe stunned many in the breeding world and jolted the established order in the NSW heartland, but chief operating officer Sam Fairgray said on Thursday night the industry's reception to the move had been warm.

"It's been really, really positive," he said. "The industry has really embraced what Mr Zhang has achieved so far and for us to branch into the Hunter, everybody sees it as a real positive for the industry, and there's been really, really good feedback on it, so it's great."

Yulong's Hunter stallion barn will be led by Alabama Express (Redoute's Choice), standing at an unchanged \$66,000, and will also feature newcomers Private Harry (Harry Angel) and Devil Night (Extreme Choice), whose fees are yet to be announced. The

roster will be rounded out by Lucky Vega (Lope De Vega) at \$27,500, down from \$38,500, and Tagaloo (Lord Kanaloo), who's unchanged at \$22,000.

Fairgray said Yulong would not be extravagant with its Hunter Valley fees.

"We're going to set our fees at very reasonable levels, so I think breeders will see that we're there to be serious and we want to be fair in the way we set our fees and help breeders," he said.

"Hopefully we'll build the relationships and get bigger and bigger."

Fairgray, who'll remain at Yulong's Victorian base, said the new property's transition from a broodmare-only concern to a stallion farm was expected to run smoothly.

"Segenhoe is a functioning farm, so it'll just keep on running," he said. "We'll have to add a few staff, having the stallion facility there, but we'll do that over the next few months."

Bustling (Frosted) will return to racing for trainers Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr at Caulfield this Saturday after being sidelined since an unplaced run back in 2024 in the Run To The Rose (Gr 2, 1200m). A star performer in Perth as a two-year-old, he was purchased for a significant sum by a Neil Werrett Bloodstock syndicate but has since battled a myriad of problems before resuming to win a Caulfield 850m barrier trial last month. Bustling has opened as \$4.40 favourite for the \$230,000 Tour D'horse Sprint (1000m) with Mark Zahra on board. Mick Price is just happy to see him back after a 2 year hiatus. "He had some bone problems and just assorted different niggles. We keep getting him up, then we keep giving him time, we keep getting him up then we keep giving him time. But everyone's done a good job with him and he's now as right as we can have him. He's a happy horse, he's big, strong and he's grown a lot since his two-year-old days. Price is hoping the track will get a chance

to dry out in the lead up "He hates wet tracks but he's ready to run well." Bred at Oakland Park, the birthplace of Northerly, Bustling was voted WA two-year-old Of The Year after scoring a dominant fourth-length victory in the 2024 Karrakatta Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) at Ascot.

## Sarrismo Coasting at Gosford

I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) gelding Sarrismo will get his chance to test his back type credentials when he steps out in Saturday's \$500,000 The Coast Quality (Listed, 1600m) in the stand-alone meeting at Gosford. Trainer Tom Charlton confident the progressive gelding is continuing to improve through his current preparation. The four-year-old heads into the stakes feature chasing a fourth consecutive victory after wins at Warwick Farm, Doomben and most recently the Orange Cup (1600m), a performance that secured him a ballot exemption for the \$3 million Big Dance (1600m) at Randwick on Melbourne Cup Day. Charlton said the spring feature remained the long-term aim, but Saturday's assignment would provide an important measure of where Sarrismo fits among better company. "That will be his primary aim in the spring," Charlton said of the Big Dance. "I guess we just work out whether this will finish him for the campaign, or whether we push on for one more run. This preparation, he seems to be putting it together. He's won his three runs, and looks to be stepping forward each time. It's his toughest test, but it looks like the right option to have a crack." Andrew Adkins retains the ride after partnering the gelding to victory at Orange, with Sarrismo dropping from 61kg to the 53kg limit on Saturday. Charlton said the draw should allow the gelding to settle prominently, which he expects will suit. "He will have to improve, but he's drawn well so he should naturally be able to be ridden in a forward position, which should suit him," he said. "We will see where he fits into that next grade." Sarrismo, who has finished in the top three in all nine starts, was purchased for \$340,000 by Lib Petagna and partners from the

2023 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, with breeders Yarraman Park retaining a share in the gelding.

## Gruelling Grand Annual a fitting grand finale

German-bred gelding Instigator (Nayef) may be rising 13, but age did not weary him in Thursday's gruelling Grand Annual Steeplechase (5500m) at Warrnambool. Trained by Aaron Purcell and ridden by Braidon Small, Instigator prevailed by a half-head from Hit The Road Jack (Jakkalberry) after negotiating 33 fences under 64kg, with Gambu (Redwood) a further 15 lengths away in third. Winning trainer and jockey were swamped by well-wishers after the feature, with the result carrying extra significance for Small, who underwent surgery, radiation and chemotherapy after being diagnosed with a brain tumour in 2023. Small, the son of former Vo Rogue (Ivor Prince) rider Cyril Small, went close to three years between wins before partnering Instigator to victory at Terang last month and admitted he was disappointed following the gelding's Brierly Steeplechase (3450m) run on Tuesday. "You get up and keep moving forward. That's what you've got to keep doing," Small told Racing.com. "I went through all the surgery, radiation and chemotherapy in the hope of getting back to riding racehorses, especially jumpers. I went home with my head between my knees and sulking. I've always had full faith in Aaron and the team at home and Aaron wouldn't have run him today if he didn't think he was right. He obviously ate up well, trotted up well this morning and he had a bit more pep in his step on the way to start, so he was obviously feeling good. That was great fun." Purcell, who won his first Grand Annual with Ginolad (Perugino) in 2008, confirmed Instigator had run his final race due to Australian rules preventing jumpers from racing beyond their 13th birthday. "It's a forced retirement this year, otherwise we would be bringing him back next year," Purcell said. "This is the horse's last start ever and it's amazing it's come off."

## Pride eyes another Gosford strike with Kerguelen

Joe Pride will chase a sixth success in Saturday's Takeover Target Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Gosford, with Kerguelen (Lonhro) set to continue the trainer's long association with the feature sprint. Pride has used the race as a launching pad for several smart performers over the past two decades, including Think About It (So You Think), who won the 2023 edition before progressing to Group 1 victories in the Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m), Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) and The Everest (1200m). Earlier winners Title (Honours List), See The World (Danzero) and Ball Of Muscle (Dubawi) all recorded their maiden stakes victories in the race, while Kuro (Denman) added the feature later in his career. "I'm not sure there is another race I've won more times than this one," Pride said. "I've had good success. I have quite often been able to use it as a progression race. It's a nice race along the way for a horse being introduced to stakes racing." The Godolphin-owned Kerguelen heads into Saturday's assignment chasing a maiden black-type breakthrough after contesting stakes company at his past two starts, the latest a fast-finishing fifth behind stablemate Mazu (Maurice) in the Hall Mark Stakes (Gr

3, 1200m) at Randwick. "He ran amazing sectionals and that's what he can do," Pride said. "He can break 33 seconds coming home. He will do that again on Saturday, it's just what sort of head start he will be giving. But he will be the horse to beat. I want to get him into the Stradbroke, but he needs to be winning a race like this to go there." Kerguelen has won six of his 16 starts and earned more than \$500,000 in prizemoney.

## Kennewell can do attitude ahead of Adelaide

Cranbourne trainer Lloyd Kennewell will look to claim a hometown Group 1 when Meridius (Extreme Choice) lines up in Saturday's \$1 million The Goodwood Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) at Morphettville on Saturday. Meridius races for a large syndicate managed by his wife Melissa and they've enjoyed a successful Adelaide carnival to date winning support races with Vangogh Bankcheque (Anders) and Gerry Harvey homebred Straand Deal (Dundeel). It will be the third time Meridius has raced at Group 1 level but the first since his 3yo days when he ran in the MRC Caulfield Guineas (1600m) and VRC Coolmore Stud Stakes (1200m). "He's going good and probably should have won the Victoria Handicap," Kennewell said of his last start in a Group 3, "He's won there, he knows the place well and I'm keen to run him in." Kennewell has called on one of Perth's leading riders Chris Parnham. The trainer said it had been difficult securing a rider with a number of his 'regulars' not heading to Adelaide for The Goodwood meeting. "There weren't many riders going over to ride on Goodwood Day which I thought was quite interesting," Kennewell said. "Mark Zahra wasn't going, neither was Craig Williams, Jamie Melham was going to ride mine, but she's up on the Gold Coast to ride Half Yours. "There was a lot going on with riders, so I wanted to get on the front foot and get a very good rider, and

Chris is an 'A grader'. "We've got a bit of a relationship with him, so he's going over, and we're very happy to have him on." Meridius was a \$170,000 buy at the 2021 Gold Coast Magic Millions March Yearling Sale and has earned over \$700,000. Kennewell will also saddle up stable raiders Kokako (Swiss Ace) in the Proud Miss Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) and Howcani Resistyou (Russian Revolution) in the David Coles AM Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m).

## Gold Coast limelight beckons Beadman

Beadman (Snitzel) will return to the scene of his most dominant win when he lines up to tackle the \$200,000 Gold Coast Guineas (Gr 2, 1200m) on Saturday with Peter Snowden hopeful the colt can recapture the form that saw him romp away with last year's Ken Russell Memorial (Gr 3, 1200m). The Randwick-trained three-year-old has had mixed results this campaign, resuming with a win in the Fireball Quality (Listed, 1100m) at Randwick before unplaced runs in the Darby Munro Stakes (Listed, 1200m) and Arrowfield 3YO Sprint (Gr 2, 1200m), where he was caught wide and faded late. Snowden said the stable had reassessed the way the colt should be ridden, with a quieter run likely to suit him better. "From those wide gates, we've been forced to go forward on him, and I don't think it's the way to ride him. A bit more conservative might be the way to go. He won that day at the Gold Coast by (almost) ten lengths by jumping and leading, but I think it was a false read because the track was a bog. He is a good wet tracker, a lot of horses didn't handle it and he did, and he just got further and further in front, so he might have been a bit flattered by the track. In my mind, his best runs have been when he's just sitting off the speed." Snowden Said. James McDonald has stayed with Beadman, who has drawn barrier eight in the 16-horse field, while Snowden will be chasing a fifth success in the race.

## Luck's a fortune for Walters family

Any Luck (Puccini) gave the Walters family a day to remember when the \$300,000 Warrnambool Cup (Listed, 2350m) fell her way on Thursday, with Kate Walters guiding the six-year-old mare to the biggest win of her career for her father, trainer Wayne Walters. Backing up after finishing fourth in a Benchmark 70 over 2350m on Tuesday, the New Zealand-bred mare proved too strong late, outstaying the \$4 favourite Alder (Australia) by a half-head, with Tempesti (Albert Dock) a further 1.75 lengths away in third. The victory added another country cup to a record that already included wins in the Avoca Cup (1860m), Penola Cup (1600m) and Millicent Cup (2050m), while taking her earnings beyond \$440,000. "I know her inside and out and I've ridden her since she was two," Kate Walters said. "I thought her run on Tuesday was huge and she dropped 5 1/2 kilos today. She's tough, as Alder got in front of her and she kicked back. I said to Dad that as we had drawn the outside gate, we should go back, but he said don't go too far back. So, it worked out in his favour." Wayne Walters said the performance had not come as a surprise after the mare's effort earlier in the week. "She knocked up here the other day after pulling its brains out and I thought she would be right for Thursday," he said. "Plus, she carried 59½ kilos on Tuesday and dropped to 54 today." Any Luck was bred by Max Smithies at Monovale Farm in Cambridge and is out of Luckzat (Lucky Unicorn), who Wayne Walters prepared to finish fourth in the 2013 Warrnambool Cup (Listed, 2350m).

### Hezashocka ready for Rotorua Cup

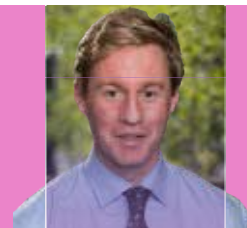
Byerley Park trainers Shaun and Emma Clotworthy are in two minds whether to pray for rain ahead of the Rotorua Cup (Listed, 2200m) at Arawa Park on Saturday. Their veteran stayer Hezashocka (Shocking) has a great strike-rate on heavy ground but that may have waned with age after successfully plying his trade in such conditions on both sides of the Tasman. Hezashocka will shoulder 58kg with Opie Bosson aboard and will have to break a long run of outs going back to the 2024 Premier's Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) at Eagle Farm. He won the Ellerslie Championship Stakes (Gr 3, 2100m) on a Heavy 9 as a three-year-old for the Clotworthys before OTI Racing Manager Terry Henderson bought into the ownership group and he relocated to the Victorian stable of Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr. He won a further four races including the Premier's Cup and Gosford Cup (Listed, 2200m) as well as finishing third in the VRC Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington before returning home. "His form had tailed off in Australia, but his penultimate run at Ellerslie showed that he wanted to be competitive again and that may have been down to the better surface that day," Clotworthy said. "He's been doing a bit of jumping and schooling and he's taken to that quite well, I can't really fault him."

### Dee Oyster dishes up perfect family result at Ellerslie

Slashing debut for two-year-old son of Blue Point (Shamardal) Dee Oyster who made

a winning start to his career at Ellerslie on Wednesday, giving trainers Sophia Nolan and Hanna Orting an early on investment, The gelding was originally sourced for NZ\$30,000 from Seaton Park's draft at the 2024 New Zealand Bloodstock National Weanling Sale before being offered at the 2025 Inglis Ready2Race Sale and passing in with a reserve of \$120,000. Raced by Nolan alongside her husband Derek and father-in-law, Dee Oyster had shown ability in his early work and confirmed that promise with a one-length victory over Phillyjean (Hello Youmzain) in the MyRacehorse 1100 after sitting outside the leader throughout. Jockey Masa Hashizume, who had partnered the juvenile in trackwork and at the trials, was confident heading into the race. "Originally we were going to give him another trial but then this race came up," Sophia Nolan said. "Masa really liked him at the trials and I think he was pretty keen to be on him, so that gave us a bit of confidence to come here and he got the job done." Hashizume said the gelding had impressed him from an early stage. "I galloped him before the trial and he gave me a really good feel," he said. "Derek really rated this horse and I galloped him on Saturday as well at Puke and I was really confident today. The horse was giving his all, he was still keen in front, but he is a professional and proper horse." Nolan said the stable would now assess whether Dee Oyster continued through the winter or was saved for spring targets. "We will bring him home and see how he comes through it and then we will make a plan from there, whether it is bigger three-year-old targets or some of the winter series," she said.

# Hong Kong trainers' premiership tussle tightens further after Sha Tin dirt fixture

The 2025/26 Hong Kong trainers' championship continues to hang in the balance after Mark Newnham and Caspar Fownes maintained the status quo at Sha Tin's all-dirt meeting on Wednesday night (6 May), while Danny Shum continued his push for the title.

With 19 meetings left in the season, Newnham (52) leads Fownes (51), Shum (51), David Hayes (48), Francis Lui (45) and 13-time champion John Size (44) in one of the tightest battles in the history of Hong Kong racing.

Size was the first of the title contenders to strike when Meepmeep (128lb) forged clear late to land the Class 5 Osmanthus Handicap (1650m) under Hugh Bowman before Newnham scored with Notthesillyone (135lb) in the second section of the Class 4 Carnation Handicap (1200m) under Luke Ferraris.

Fownes joined the fray in tandem when Sky Vino (124lb) forged to a tough in the Class 3 Camellia Handicap (1650m) for Joao Moreira before Shum saddled the most spectacular winner of the meeting when Blazing Wind (122lb) surged to a five-and-three-quarter length margin in the Class 3 Begonia Handicap (1200m) under Zac Purton.

Newnham hailed the consistency of unlikely hero Notthesillyone after the gelding's fourth victory this campaign.

"He's been a great contributor to the trainers' championship, I'll tell you. Considering last year he was a winner in Class 5, I didn't factor him winning four races this time around but he's kept improving," Newnham said.

"I've underestimated him before, so I'm not saying he can't (win in Class 3) but I didn't think he'd be able to carry the 135lb today. He's raced beyond my expectations, so with a light weight in Class 3, who knows?"

Regarding the championship, Newnham said: "Don't worry, there's a big pack chasing, so every win counts and very important at this

end of the season."

Sky Vino posted his fourth win from 21 starts after overcoming barrier 10 under a driving ride from Moreira.

"Tonight was quite tough - it was pretty hard conditions out there, but from the wide gate, Joao got him in a good position and

it was an exciting finish. The horse deserved that second victory for the season," Fownes said.

"He's been a very honest horse, racing well on both dirt and grass. So, he's a good, consistent horse and he deserved a win for my good clients. At this stage he's done his job, but obviously we're going to keep going and try and build another race for him some time in the future."

Taking his Hong Kong career tally to 1,988 wins, Zac Purton maintained a perfect record aboard Blazing Wind, prevailing for his third victory on the gelding from three rides to keep Shum in the championship hunt.

Manfred Man slotted a double when Robot Knight (121lb) posted his second course and distance victory with success under Britney Wong in the Class 5 Magnolia Handicap (1200m) before Juicy Dragon (126lb) scored emphatically under Andrea Atzeni in the third section of the Class 4 Carnation Handicap (1200m).

California Bay (122lb) made a successful transition from turf to dirt under an inspired ride by Karis Teetan to win the first section of the Class 4 Carnation Handicap (1200m). Trained by Tony Cruz, the Dundee gelding had been winless in his first 16 starts in Hong Kong after being trained in Australia by Peter Snowden.

Perched in fourth place deep into the home straight, Teetan waited for a narrow gap to open before driving the four-year-old to victory.

"It was a nice win, eventually," Teetan said. "The horse was in good shape today and he had a good trip from a good draw (barrier two) and it was the first time he had been off the bit, because he's been overdoing it in races. In the straight, and once he got the gap, he quickened up well."

Cruz was delighted with Teetan's brilliant ride.

"It was a perfect race. I think the barrier draw was a big help, and also Karis really brought a perfect race because when they came into the straight it was a bit tight and he made the dash on the inside," Cruz said. "So, it's very seldom horses make the inside run and get up and win. But credit to Karis Teetan."

Teetan completed a race-to-race double when Me Tsui's Night Purosangue (118lb) wore down Chill Kaka (124lb) to land the Class 4 Chamomile Handicap (1650m).

Weighing 1,241lb, Night Purosangue coasted to his second and course and distance victory to give Teetan 33 wins for the campaign after Pierre Ng's Yoda's Choice (112lb) slotted his second course and distance victory in the Class 4 Lotus Handicap (1800m) under apprentice Nichola Yuen.

Hong Kong racing continues at Sha Tin on Saturday afternoon (9 May).

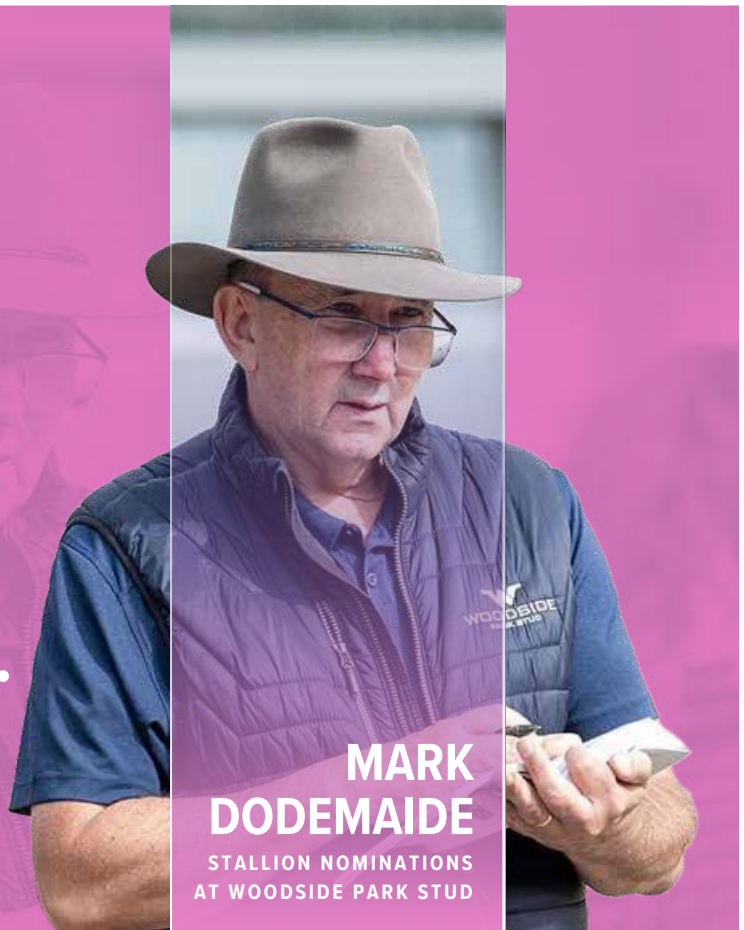
