Homebred filly Fringes is ready to fire in the Oaks

Award-winning racing photographer Trish Dunell is hoping for a picture perfect performance from her homebred filly Fringes (Niagara) in this Saturday's Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) at Eagle Farm.

Despite a medical episode which, in her own words, has left her with a "questionable brain", Dunell will be trackside with son Cameron to see if Fringes, whose moniker is derived from the names of her grandchildren, can upset Chris

Waller's well-fancied fillies Panova (Trapeze Artist) and Chispa (Savabeel) and deliver a first Group 1 success for the hobby breeder.

Fringes, who is hunting a hat-trick of wins for South Australian trainer Michael Hickmott, is one of seven New Zealand-bred fillies in contention to win the final Group 1 contest of the season for three-year-olds.

Perhaps unsurprisingly, she is the only Oaks runner sired by obscure stallion Niagara (Encosta De Lago), whose racetrack highlight came courtesy of victory in the 2012 Ajax Stakes (Gr 2, 1500m) for Gai Waterhouse.

Lloyd set for UK debut ahead of Royal Ascot

Rising Australian star Zac Lloyd will get his first taste of British racing this week when he rides at Doncaster on Friday, marking the beginning of an international tour that will also include Royal Ascot and then on to his place of birth for Durban July in South Africa.

The 22-year-old arrives in England in career-best form after a standout season that has yielded more than 100 winners, including his maiden Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) aboard Guest House (Home Affairs). Lloyd currently sits second in both the Sydney metropolitan and New South Wales premierships.

Continued from page 2 Niagara, who stands for just NZ\$2,500 at Hau Ora Farm in New Zealand’s Hawke’s Bay region, has thus far registered a pair of stakes winners on Australian soil – and Dunell has bred both.

After Fancify had made her black-type breakthrough in the 2024 Hong Kong Jockey Club Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) on Melbourne Cup Day, Fringes recently joined her former stablemate in the stakes club when she showed strength and stamina in equal measure to claim the SA Fillies Classic (Gr 3, 2546m) on Goodwood Day in early May.

Her pilot that day, Ben Melham, has jumped ship to ride the \$3.80 Oaks favourite Panova but his able replacement Tim Clark is a man in form, having notched a pair of stakes wins in Queensland on successive Saturdays aboard Abounding (Rich Enuff) and Alalcance (Mastercraftsman).

Given that Fringes, like most Kiwi-bred horses, prefers some give in the ground she might not get conditions to suit at Eagle Farm, with fine weather predicted in Brisbane for the remainder of the week.

However, Dunell is still daring to dream that her tough filly, who started her career in the care of New Zealand trainer Ilone Kelly before being transferred to Hickmott’s yard, is capable of outrunning her opening quote of \$27.

“It would just be amazing, unbelievable, thrilling to win a Group 1 with a horse I’ve bred,” she told ANZ News.

“I also bred Spalato (Elusive City), who won some big races in Singapore including the Derby, but they’re not internationally recognised as Group races.

“The original plan wasn’t to send Fringes over to Australia, but they’re only three once and Michael has such a great affinity with the Niagaras. He really knows how to train them, as we saw with Fancify [now with Ciaron Maher].

“I’ve been so pleased with how this filly has adapted and thrived in Australia. She’s such a good looking and sweet-natured girl, and she has come such a long way in a very short period of time. One big advantage she has is her appetite, I think eating is her favourite pastime.”

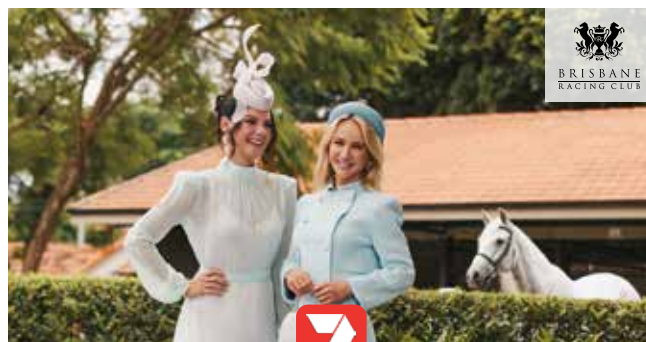
The origins of the Fringes story can be traced back to 2014, when Dunell – on the advice of her friends and fellow breeders Jo and Greg Griffin of Lime Country Thoroughbreds – purchased Miss Jaydeejay (Golan) for \$24,000 at the New Zealand Bloodstock Winter Bloodstock Sale at Karaka.

The mare, a full-sister to the 2007 Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) hero Kibbutz, was in foal to Ocean Park (Thorn Park), and the resulting filly subsequently fetched \$58,000 at the following year’s New Zealand Bloodstock National Weanling Sale.

Miss Damita would go on to win five races for Mick Price, including both the Mortlake Cup (2000m) and the Woodford Cup (1700m), but rather than return to Ocean Park the plan had always been to send the mare to Niagara, a stallion with whom Dunell had formed an instant bond.

Those early matings unfortunately produced more misses than hits, with Fringes’ full-sister Opaline failing to make it to the track while their sibling The Yes Girl has won one of 13 starts. However, Dunell’s persistence has now paid off in spades, with the penultimate foal Miss Jaydeejay delivered before her untimely death last year clearly possessing a potent combination of talent and tenacity.

Continued from page 3 “Niagara tends to leave stayers, and even though she won on debut over 1400-metres, we always thought that Fringes would excel over extended trips,” she told ANZ News.

“Having said that, Niagara is very versatile and can also produce shorter distance horses, such as Fancify and [Fringes’ stablemate] Synchro. His progeny aren’t early get-up-and-going two-year-old types, which might explain why the yearling sales in Australia haven’t attracted many Niagara buyers. They tend to do little early on, so they are much better if they are left alone to fully mature.

“Niagara isn’t well known, particularly in Australia, but I just love him. I flew to Australia to visit him before he arrived here in New Zealand to start his stud career, and it was love at first sight. He was just an absolutely gorgeous sweetheart, so laid-back. And he leaves foals that are as laidback as he is.”

Hickmott is an equally ardent admirer of Niagara, and the stallion will always hold a

special place in the horseman’s heart given that his durable daughter will represent the stable’s first runner in a Group 1.

A little under 12 months ago, Hickmott had expected to sample his first taste of Group 1 action only for Party Crasher (Ocean Park) to be scratched at the gates ahead of the Queensland Derby (2400m).

But that bitter disappointment will be consigned to history if Fringes, who arrived safely in Brisbane on Tuesday night, can somehow plot a path to victory from barrier 16 in Saturday’s \$700,000 contest.

“The filly is in a really good zone at the minute, she’s fit and in good form so we go there as confident as you can be in a Group 1 race,” Hickmott told ANZ News.

“We were pretty light on her when she first came over from New Zealand, because we always knew we wouldn’t see the best of her until we stretched her out over 2000 metres and with the blinkers on, she showed what she’s capable of in her last two starts.

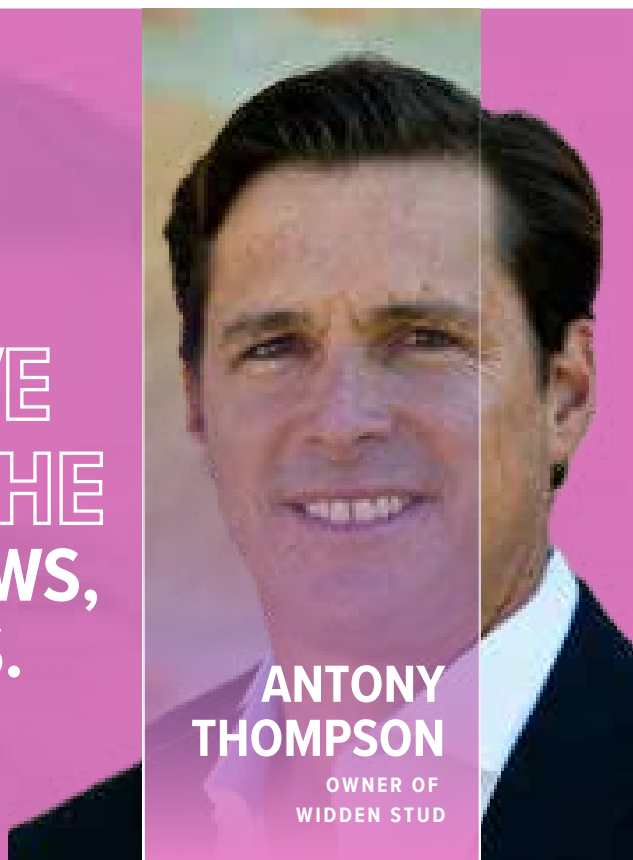

Vallice opens account and sparks spring ambitions

Promising two-year-old Vallice (Maurice) has given the Ciaran Maher stable plenty to think about after breaking through for his maiden victory at Sandown on Wednesday. Having his second start, Vallice was impressive claiming the Thoroughbred Club Of Australia Handicap (1400m), prompting discussions about whether he should continue racing this campaign or be given a break ahead of a potential spring preparation. Ridden by Tasmanian apprentice Jabez Johnstone, Vallice settled prominently before proving too strong late, defeating favourite Meness (Ghaiyyath) by a length, with Satono's Shout (Satono Aladdin) a short-head away in third. An objection from the connections of fourth-placed Gallantry (Brave Smash) was dismissed by stewards. Maher's National assistant trainer, Jack Turnbull said the colt had always shown ability and continued to improve with racing. "He's always shown a bit, and we think he will get out over a trip in time," Turnbull said. Vallice had caught the eye first-up when finishing fifth and Turnbull

felt Wednesday's victory confirmed the merit of that performance. With spring targets already entering the conversation, the stable is weighing up whether to press on or give the colt time to mature. "It's that time of year when you start thinking about spring and keeping in mind how old he is and the pedigree he has," Turnbull said. "Maybe he has a breather and comes back for those better races." Turnbull said races such as the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) or even a Derby campaign could be considered in time. "He's bred to get over a trip and he's a beautiful horse who will keep improving." Vallice is the first foal out of German mare Moselle Valley (Guilliani), a half sister to Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Mawingo (Tertullian). The colt was purchased by Maher from the Aristia Park draft at the 2025 Inglis Melbourne Premier Sale, for \$200,000.

In Flight on course for Brisbane

Dual-state acceptor In Flight (Flying Artie) will bypass Randwick this weekend, with trainer Joe Pride opting to stick with his original Queensland plan and target the Moreton Cup (Gr 2, 1200m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. The mare was entered for both the Moreton Cup and the ATC Bob Charley AO Stakes (Listed, 1100m), which she won last year, but Pride confirmed Brisbane was always the preferred option provided she drew favourably. "She was always going to go to Queensland as long as she could draw well," Pride said. "I just needed a back-up plan, which was accepting down here. But she has drawn perfectly up there so she will run up there." A winner of the ATC Sapphire Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) during the

autumn carnival, In Flight was well below her best when unplaced in the Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Eagle Farm last start after being forced to settle back from a wide draw. Pride believes the race shape worked against her and has been pleased with her progress since returning home. "I brought her home and trialed her up and she's good," he said. "She is a really good mare. The best version of her is probably on soft tracks, which she's unlikely to get up there, but she's in good shape." The Moreton Cup offers added significance, with the victor earning a ballot exemption into next week's Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) at Eagle Farm. Out of a Listed winning American mare, Waveline (Stravinsky), In Flight was purchased by Proven T/breds and Pride Racing for \$220,000 from Goodwood Farm at the 2022 Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale. She was catalogued but withdrawn from this year's Chairman's Sale.

Freedmans face disqualification over race-day treatment charges

Melbourne Cup-winning trainers Anthony and Sam Freedman may face a mandatory minimum six-month disqualification after pleading guilty to race-day treatment charges relating to horses Kira (Lonhro) and Moonhaven (Shalaa). The matter was heard before the Victorian Racing Tribunal on Wednesday, with a decision on penalty adjourned until July 1. The charges stem from events at the Freedman stable's Cranbourne satellite facility on August 16 last year, when Racing Victoria Compliance Assurance Team stewards observed Kira receiving treatment via a nebuliser. Stable

staff later confirmed Moonhaven had also received nebuliser treatment earlier that morning. Both horses were subsequently scratched from their scheduled races at Caulfield. The tribunal heard the treatments involved therapeutic medications prescribed for diagnosed respiratory conditions. The Freedmans submitted that the incident resulted from administrative and human error, with both horses intended to race at Sandown the following week rather than at Caulfield where they remained accepted. Racing Victoria barrister Greg Buchhorn acknowledged the trainers' early guilty pleas and requested a three-month disqualification, arguing special circumstances existed. However, he noted the rules require a disqualification, with the tribunal only able to reduce the mandatory minimum period if special circumstances are accepted. Counsel for the Freedmans, Matthew Stirling, argued the trainers bore limited culpability, highlighting their strong compliance record and the absence of any deliberate wrongdoing. Stirling said a lengthy disqualification would have significant consequences for the operation, potentially requiring horses to be transferred to other stables and placing up to 70 staff positions at risk. The tribunal also heard the stable failed to maintain treatment records, an offence Racing Victoria submitted should attract a \$1,500 fine. A penalty decision will be delivered on July 1.

First Season sire St Mark's Basilica notches another

Promising filly La Barrita (2 f St Mark's Basilica - Cabarita by Redoute's Choice) is set for another tilt at blacktype after an impressive maiden victory at Doomben on Wednesday, providing another boost for Coolmore's first season sire St Mark's Basilica (Siyouni). Trained by Tony and Calvin McEvoy, the two-

year-old had shown ability in her first two starts, finishing third on debut at Warwick Farm before tackling the BRC Bill Carter Stakes (Listed, 1350m). Despite settling well back, she finished strongly into sixth and hinted that a maiden win was imminent. Dropping back to 1200 metres on Wednesday, La Barrita was sent out favourite and delivered accordingly. With Ben Thompson aboard and blinkers removed, she settled comfortably before producing a strong finishing burst to score by more than a length from the three year old's Arctic Bright (Per Incanto) and Had It All (Zoustar). A \$260,000 Magic Millions purchase by Damon Gabbedy's Belmont Bloodstock Agency and McEvoy Mitchell Racing from Segenhoe Stud, La Barrita was bred by Fairway Thoroughbreds and is the first foal to race from Cabarita. Her pedigree is packed with quality. Cabarita is a daughter of Gr.3 winner Avenue (Anabaa), a full sister to dual Group 1 winner Virage de Fortune (Anabaa), while the family has enjoyed recent success through Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Apocalyptic (Extreme Choice) and Group 3 winner Hidrix (Extreme Choice). La Barrita became the fifth Australian first-crop winner for St Mark's Basilica, who is enjoying a strong start to his stud career with dual Stakes winner Aristopolos and will return to Coolmore Australia this spring at a service fee of \$38,500.

Long Leaf to stand at Grassdale Pastoral

Grassdale Pastoral in Gippsland, Victoria has announced that multiple stakes-winning two-year-old, Long Leaf (Fastnet Rock) will relocate from Western Australia to stand at the property for the 2026 breeding season. The announcement comes as the renowned Grassdale property enters a new era following a recent change in ownership after more than 150

years in the hands of the one family. Grassdale Pastoral director and Highland Bloodstock principal Christopher Constantine has outlined plans to support and grow thoroughbred breeding across Gippsland and regional Victoria. "Long Leaf was an early-running two-year-old, a stakes-winning juvenile, a million-dollar race winner at three and is by one of Australia's great stallions in Fastnet Rock," Constantine said. A dual stakes-winning juvenile and winner of the \$1 million Karaka 3YO Classic, Long Leaf was raced by Coolmore and Sir Peter Vela and trained by David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig. He won four races and earned almost \$950,000 in prizemoney. The \$750,000 Karaka yearling is by champion sire Fastnet Rock (Danahill) out of Frustrating (Stravinsky), a half sister to Terravista (Captain Rio), Tiger Tees (Dubawi), Ball of Muscle (Dubawi), Our Lukas (Generous) and Super Easy (Darci Brahma). His career highlights included early victories in the Merson Cooper Stakes (Listed, 1000m), Blue Diamond Preview (Listed, 1000m) and Karaka 3YO Classic (Listed, 1600m), while he was also Group placed in the Vain Stakes (Gr 3, 1100), Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) and Caulfield Guineas Prelude (Gr 3, 1400m). Long Leaf stood his first six seasons in Western Australia and Service fee details, breeder incentives and parade dates will be announced in the coming weeks.

Beneath The Rock emerges and hints at bigger things

Well-related filly Beneath The Rock (Unite And Conquer) has opened her account in style, with connections hopeful the half-sister to Stakes producer and multiple Group Two winner Invincible Gem (I am Invincible), can continue to work her way through the grades after an impressive victory at Warwick Farm on Wednesday. Beneath The Rock had shown promise when finishing third on debut at Scone on Cup day and took a significant step forward in the Drinkwise Plate (1300m), leading throughout to score a dominant victory. Trainer Kris Lees' racing manager Danny Greer said the stable had expected improvement from the three-year-old and was pleased to see her deliver on race day. "She showed good gate speed from barrier one and Tyler gave her a lovely ride. She was able to quicken when he asked and put the race away," Greer said. Jumping from barrier one, Beneath The Rock defeated first starter Claudel (So You Think) by two lengths, with favourite Our Huntress (Ardrossan) a further three-quarters of a length away in third. Greer believes the filly has the pedigree and racing style to eventually stretch out in distance, much like her talented half-sister. "I'd like to think she'll get a mile in time," he said. "She ran through the line strongly and there's a lot of upside there." Jockey Tyler Schiller agreed, "She was powering through the line and it took a bit to pull her up afterwards," Schiller said. "She's definitely got plenty left in the tank."

Hungry Heart's first foal to trial

The first of only two foals out of Australian Champion Filly, Hungry Heart (Frankel) is set for a debut trial on Friday at Randwick for Go Bloodstock and connections. The two-year-old

named Pen or Sword (Written Tycoon) was a \$1.25m yearling from the Yulong draft at the 2025 Inglis Easter Yearling Sale when knocked down to Chris Waller Racing and Mulcaster B/stock. His dam, Hungry Heart was a dual Group One winner having claimed the ATC Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) and the Vinery Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and retired to stud in 2022 but passed away prematurely in November last year leaving behind two colts by Written Tycoon (Iglesia). Hungry Heart was the first foal out of Harlech (Pivotal) who produced a three quarter brother to Pen Or Sword called Tycoon Resources (Written Tycoon). Now a three year old, Tycoon Resources won its only trial at Hawkesbury for Blake Ryan before being exported to Hong Kong where he has won both his starts impressively for Tony Cruz.

She's No Saint targets Northland feature

Promising juvenile She's No Saint (Prague) will continue her preparation at Ellerslie on Saturday before a potential tilt at the Northland Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Ruakaka in August. Trainer Michelle Bradley has been pleased with the filly's progress and is hoping she can break through for a maiden victory in The Lawn Shed 2YO (1200m) before stepping up to black-type company. "I'd love to get a win out of her and my main plan is to aim toward the Northland Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) here at Ruakaka in August," Bradley told [LOVERACING.NZ](#). The daughter of Prague showed early ability when finishing second on debut behind subsequent Champagne Stakes (Listed, 1600m) winner Incandescent (Per Incanto), while third-placed Enchantment (Hello Youmzain) later won the Welcome Stakes (Listed, 1000m). She subsequently qualified for

the Karaka Millions 2YO (RL, 1200m), where she finished sixth behind Australian raider Dream Roca (El Roca). Bradley believes the filly can improve on her resuming effort after enduring a difficult run. "She's come through it well and she's bright, happy and fit and I just hope we get a better run in transit," she said. "She got through a heavy track at the Avondale trials, so I don't think she'll mind Ellerslie."

Single Red faces Oaks challenge from wide draw

Single Red (Vanbrugh) will need to overcome another awkward barrier when she tackles the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday after drawing gate 21, including emergencies. The Andrew Forsman-trained filly has performed creditably throughout her Queensland campaign, finishing second in the Gold Coast Bracelet (Listed, 1800m) before running fourth in The Roses (Gr 2, 2000m) behind fellow Oaks contender Fireball Miss (Bivouac). "We would have loved a good draw, that's probably what cost her in her first couple of runs over there - just being left exposed without cover and electing to go forward, which hasn't worked out both times," Forsman told [LOVERACING.NZ](#). "She was left a bit of a sitting shot turning for home. "I guess from the wide draw we will try to snag her back for a bit of cover and hope the race is run genuinely so she gets her chance. "She hasn't been beaten

far, she's been right there and while last start was disappointing, she wasn't far away. If she does get some luck in the Oaks, she's going to be competitive again." Back home, Forsman is set to be represented by Pacifico (Ardrossan) at Ellerslie on Saturday, with the gelding chasing a third consecutive victory following wins in the Rotorua Cup (Listed, 2200m) and at his most recent outing. Forsman remains pleased with the gelding's condition. "He's going really well, I can't fault him and his work has been good," he said. "As he keeps winning, he keeps getting more weight, which will catch up with him at some point you'd think. But while he's racing in good form, we'll keep him going and see how we get on. "You've got to weigh up taking two or three kilos off or going with an experienced rider, which has worked for him in his last couple of starts." Forsman is also hopeful Accentuate (Turn Me Loose) can return to winning form after finishing runner-up last start. "I think the best is yet to be seen of her, she'll be a good four-year-old mare as she matures and she's still got a lot of strengthening up to do," he said. "She's got good ability and it would be nice to get another win with her this preparation."

Solid Gold gets second chance in the Oaks

Solid Gold (Savabeel) will get a second opportunity at Group 1 success when she backs up in Saturday's Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) at Eagle Farm following her fifth placing in last weekend's Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m). The Roger James and Robert Wellwood-trained filly was sent forward from a wide barrier in the Derby and, after settling prominently throughout, weakened late to finish just over five lengths behind Providence (Wootton Bassett). "I was initially disappointed, but then when I watched the replay on a

number of occasions, she did work for a long way, probably the best part of 600m before she got to her position," James told NZ Racing Desk. "There were a few that went around them and she never really got a chance to actually relax because the pace was so torrid. "I'm not criticising the ride at all, the draw is what I think cost us dearly." Tommy Berry retains the ride and, after drawing barrier four, James is hopeful the daughter of Savabeel can enjoy a more economical run. "I'd rather be drawn one than 18," he said. "It was not her normal pattern to be going forward as much as she did last week, but the alternative when you draw that wide is you go right back, because you're never going to get in. "Can you win it from last? Questionable. We made a decision and it didn't work." James believes the filly has come through the Derby in good order and is confident the drop back to 2200 metres will suit, having won the Championship Stakes (Gr 3, 2100m) at Ellerslie before travelling to Queensland. "This filly is a big scopey filly but I am pleased with the way she came through her Derby effort," he said. Meanwhile, stablemate Sweynesday (Sweynesse) will return to New Zealand after two unplaced runs in Queensland, while James and Wellwood will also saddle promising fillies Cosmic Dream (Cosmic Force) and Arwen (Ancient Spirit) at Ellerslie on Saturday.

The Andrew Balding-trained Venetian Prince (3 c St Mark's Basilica - Arabian Queen by Dubawi) provided first-season sire St Mark's Basilica (Siyouni) with another high-profile success when landing the Derby Italiano (Gr 2, 2200m) at San Siro on Tuesday. Stepping beyond a mile for the first time, the colt settled comfortably under Jason Watson before producing a strong finishing burst

in the straight to overhaul Grand Son Of Dark (Dark Angel) in the closing stages. Salitos (In Swoop) filled third place. Venetian Prince had previously finished fourth in the Craven Stakes (Gr 3, 1m) before contesting the 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m), but appreciated both the drop in grade and the step up in distance. The victory provided Balding with a first win in Italy's premier Classic after recent placings with the now Ciaron Maher trained pair, Royal Supremacy (Make Believe) and Relentless Voyager (Ulysses). Bred by Littleton Stud and raced by Jeff Smith, Venetian Prince is the sixth foal and sixth winner out of Juddmonte International (Gr 1, 10.5f) heroine Arabian Queen (Dubawi). He is a half-brother to Group 2 winner and dual Group 1-placed filly See The Fire (Sea The Stars), Group-performed Royal Playwright (Lope De Vega). The colt becomes another notable performer for Coolmore's St Mark's Basilica, whose first northern hemisphere crop has already produced Group 1 winner Diamond Necklace and a growing list of stakes performers, while his first Australian-bred runners include Listed winner Aristopolos and recent winner La Barrita. St Mark's Basilica will stand the upcoming breeding season at Coolmore Australia for a fee of A\$38,500 (inc GST).

He struck the front over a furlong out and held off the late challenge of Alburno (New Bay) by 1.25 lengths, with French Group 1 performer Facteur Cheva (Ribchester) a further 0.25 lengths away in third. Bred by H. Pfister, Best Lightning is out of the Big Shuffle (Super Concorde) mare Best Dreaming and recorded his ninth career victory from 44 starts. The win was his second at Group 3 level this season after a string of consistent performances in Germany and Italy.

Lloyd set for UK debut ahead of Royal Ascot

Rising Australian star Zac Lloyd will get his first taste of British racing this week when he rides at Doncaster on Friday, marking the beginning of an international tour that will also include Royal Ascot and then on to his place of birth for Durban July in South Africa. The 22-year-old arrives in England in career-best form after a standout season that has yielded more than 100 winners, including his maiden Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) aboard Guest House (Home Affairs). Lloyd currently sits second in both the Sydney metropolitan and New South Wales premierships. Lloyd has limited international experience having only ridden in Singapore previously but did spend time in Newmarket

two years ago whilst serving a suspension thanks to introductions from a James Cummings led Godolphin Stable. Having landed in England on Monday night, Lloyd has wasted little time getting to work, riding trackwork for trainer George Boughey before watching several high-profile Godolphin gallopers, including Opera Ballo (Ghaiyyath) and Rebel's Romance (Dubawi) at Newmarket. "It's been a great start," Lloyd said told Racenet, "I've already had the chance to see some top-class horses and work with some outstanding trainers." Lloyd is set to ride at Doncaster on both Friday and Saturday, with agent Terry Hines securing multiple bookings, including rides for Charlie Appleby and Harry Charlton. "I've got at least four rides on both days, so I'm extremely appreciative of the support," Lloyd said. The Sydney based jockey will remain in England through Royal Ascot, where he expects to ride throughout

the five-day carnival alongside fellow raiders James McDonald and Josh Parr. "I've got rides at Royal Ascot, a few actually," Lloyd said. "It's going to be an amazing experience." Following his UK stint, Lloyd will travel to South Africa where he has secured a ride in the prestigious Durban July for leading trainer Justin Snaith, adding another international highlight to a breakthrough season.

It's In The Blood

Headley Grange

After several roundabout tales, Bob Manwaring's hunch has been emphatically vindicated with Headley Grange (Exosphere) becoming the second elite winner the hobby breeder has produced from just a handful of mares, taking Saturday's Kingsford Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1300m).

Manwaring was convinced Lonhro (Octagonal) would work well when looking for a mating with his "tough" stakes-placed mare Hard Go Jo (Hard Spun) in 2019.

Trouble was, the stallion was outside the budget, with Lonhro standing for \$77,000. He looked around for Lonhro's sons. There was Pierro, but he was going for \$88,000 at the time.

Then there was Exosphere, standing alongside Lonhro at Darley, Kelvinside, but for just \$22,000.

"I really wanted to go to Lonhro but couldn't afford it. I thought Exosphere was one of his best credentialed sons at stud," Manwaring said of the winner of the Golden Rose (Gr 1, 1400m) and three Group 2s, whose eldest were just hitting the track.

In the end, Exosphere never reached the stratosphere, though alas he died prematurely in 2024, aged 12. He's now up to 11 stakes winners from 258 runners, but his top earner Headley Grange - and his other Group 1 winner Skybird - have at least proven the late stallion's capacity to leave a good one.

Headley Grange has come about from Manwaring's purchase of his second dam, Go Johemma (Johannesburg) in 2007, from a deceased estate clean-out, for \$27,500. She was unraced and just about to turn three, and Manwaring liked the look of her, and her pedigree.

The pedigree of Headley Grange is a little underwhelming, though there's some class deeper in. Five dams could fit on the page until

a couple of years ago, but that unplaced fifth one, Top Sort (Sound Reason), was worth the mention, as a full-sister to dual top-tier winner Sound Horizon. In 1987-88, that stallion won what was then a Randwick 1600 metre Group One double in the Epsom Handicap and All Aged Stakes, among six black type victories.

Top Sort threw Oaks Day (Twig Moss), who was rather aptly named. She came second in Flemington's fillies' staying test in 1994, running into a good one in Arborea (Imperial Prince), who won two Group ones and four other stakes races.

Oaks Day's first three foals were city winners, and the first of them - Love And Scandal (Marauding) - threw Go Johemma.

"It was a toss-up between buying Go Johemma and another mare, but with her second dam running second in a VRC Oaks, I went with Go Johemma," says Manwaring, who has an expansive cattle and crop farm near

Cootamundra as well as a trucking business.

Manwaring, also keen on Johannesburg (Hennessy) as a broodmare sire, literally went to great lengths to turn Go Johemma into a stakes winner.

Starting with Warrnambool trainer Matthew Williams, she won at Hamilton on debut in November, 2007, then started in Sandown's Twilight Glow Stakes (Listed, 1400m) but ran seventh, after a ride that displeased connections.

After six more starts she was moved to Melbourne and Danny O'Brien for three more, then to Adelaide's David Jolly for two more.

"I thought it'd be easier to win a stakes race in Adelaide, but the tracks were too hard for her," Manwaring tells It's In The Blood.

Finally, still searching for a second win, she went to the Gold Coast's Trevor Bailey with immediate results, two Sunshine Coast wins in her first three starts with him.

After a next-start failure, she stepped up to Ipswich's Gai Waterhouse Stakes (Listed, 1350m) at \$71 - and just about pulled off a black type coup.

"She looked like she was going to win so the jockey sat up 20 yards out, and we got nipped on the line," says Manwaring of a painful 0.1 length loss to Dorf Command (Commands).

Go Johemma added one more provincial win before retirement. Manwaring put her to Hard Spun (Danzig) and produced Hard Go Jo, whom he retained. The chase for black type began again.

Starting in Victoria with Mark Riley, she ran three straight seconds capped off by going all the way to Murtoa just to run into a filly who would win two Group twos and be Group one-placed. Badawiya (Al Maher) won by seven lengths, but there was a further 10 lengths to the third horse.

Hard Go Jo won her next start at Warrnambool, but after two more unplaced runs was sent to Goulburn and Danny Williams for an unfruitful stay, before finally ending up in Wagga with Chris Heywood.

"I sent her up there to my mate (Heywood). I thought she might have been good enough to win a Wagga Gold Cup, but she kept blowing a tendon out," Manwaring said. "But she kept coming back as well, and won twice there.

"So she was bloody tough - just dogged, and kept on going. That's that Danzig blood, and Hard Spun, who I liked as a stallion and I reckon is going well as a broodmare sire now too," he says of horse with a 5.0 per cent SWTR ratio in that department.

At least some of that toughness appears to have rubbed off on Hard Go Jo's offspring.

First foal Daddy's Girl (So You Think) went to trainer Noel Mayfield-Smith at Coffs Harbour.

"Noel reckoned she could be a black type filly," Manwaring says. "But she had a severe accident in her box, kicked out and smashed a sesamoid.

"In the meantime, I'd bred to Exosphere, and since Noel had a great opinion of Daddy's Girl, he rang me about the Exosphere colt."

He was named Headley Grange and duly went to Mayfield-Smith.

"Noel trained it for 12 months with no expenses, and that's how he ended up with half the horse," the breeder says.

Things started promisingly, with a Grafton win and a Taree second, before an unplaced crack at Eagle Farm, when, Manwaring says, the horse overheated in the sultry conditions.

Manwaring felt his young horse was city class, and told Mayfield-Smith he wanted to send him to Joe Pride in Sydney.

"Noel said, 'Well, buy me out.' I put an offer to him, which he didn't accept, so we decided we'd put him up for sale to get true value," the breeder says.

"I rang a couple of mates and said, 'We're gonna have to pay a bit for this horse. He's city class.'"

The three-year-old went on Inglis Digital, in November 2023, and Manwaring emerged successful with a bid of \$120,000, aided by a 25 per cent stake for his friend Steve Foley. "I was prepared to go a bit higher," he says.

Headley Grange went to Pride, won his first start for him in Kembla Grange class 1, and his progression has gone like clockwork from there. His next wins came in 68, 64, 72, 78 and 94 class, until last June he started on the lowest rung of black type and won Randwick's Civic Stakes (Listed, 1400m).

His next four runs produced three more wins, including Newcastle's Cameron Handicap (Gr 3, 1500m) and Rosehill's Alan Brown Stakes (1400m) - non black type but worth \$1.5m.

"That's Joe's way of training," says Manwaring, 61. "He doesn't like to jump them up in class too quick. It's all about keeping them in their grades and getting them used to

winning.

"I reckon if I'd said to Joe, 'Put him in a Listed race' after his first win with him, he'd have said, 'Put him with another trainer.'"

Finally, Headley Grange graduated to the big time in the autumn just finished, running meritoriously in four elite events despite a series of bad barriers. He was fourth in the Canterbury Stakes (Gr 1, 1300m) won by Joliestar (Zoustar), fifth in the Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m) won by Autumn Glow (The Autumn Sun), seventh in the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) won by Sheza Alibi (Saxon Warrior), and fifth in the All Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m), behind Beiwacht (Bivouac).

"He came up against three of the best mares in Australia, and had a couple of bad barriers," said Manwaring, also lamenting that for the first three of those runs, Headley Grange was without his regular rider Adam Hyeronimus.

"The horse can be a bit quirky and play up behind the barriers, but Adam knows him really well and gets on well with him," he said of the jockey who's been aboard for seven of the gelding's 12 wins.

Finally, after a freshen up, Headley Grange took the next step along his methodical path last Saturday, becoming the second Group 1 winner Manwaring has bred, alongside 2017 JJ Atkins (Gr 1, 1600m) hero Capital Gain (Ad Valorem).

"There's a chance he could add another one too, in the Stradbroke Handicap," his breeder

and part-owner says of the five-year-old who's spun that \$120,000 outlay into \$2.46 million.

A bit like the tradesmanlike horse himself, Headley Grange's pedigree is low on the fancy stuff, with only two bits of inbreeding.

Danzig (Northern Dancer) is there at 5m x 3m, starting the sireline of Exosphere's dam Altitude (Danzero) and as the sire of Hard Spun.

Perhaps more impactful is that the great Sir Tristram (Sir Ivor) is at 5m x 5m in strong places, starting Exosphere's sireline through Zabeel-Octagonal-Lonhro, and as the sire of Headley Grange's third damsire Marauding.

Mr. Prospector (Raise A Native) is doubled at 5m x 6f, while some strong colonial blood comes through a 6m, 6m x 7m of Star Kingdom (Stardust), with Kaoru Star and Biscay on either side of Altitude's pedigree, and Biscay down low as Marauding's damsire.

As for influential mares, Lalun (Djeddah) is at 7m x 8m via her two most famous sons Never Bend (Nasrullah) and Bold Reason (Hail To Reason).

And Somethingroyal (Princequillo) is at 8m x 8m, 8m in useful spots, as the dam of Sir Tristram's second sire Sir Gaylord (Turn-To) at top and bottom, and with Secretariat (Bold Ruler) the damsire of Storm Cat (Storm Bird), Johannesburg's grandsire.

Nearco (Pharos) is by far the dominant sire with 18 mentions, while Mumtaz Begum (Blenheim) and Selene (Chaucer) share the mares' gong with seven spots apiece.
