Lyndhurst's stallion duo leading the ranks in Queensland

The state of Queensland got the new season off to a flier last Saturday courtesy of the Tony Gollan-trained Boomtown Boss' (Spirit Of Boom) success in the opening stakes race, the Aurie's Star Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) at Flemington, and as the 2026-27 campaign begins Lyndhurst Stud manager Jeff Kruger is hoping for yet another big year with his leading stallion duo.

Jeff is part of the famed Kruger family that has held ownership of Lyndhurst since 1956, and stands both Better Than Ready (More Than Ready) and Barbaric (I Am Invincible) on the Warwick-based property.

Better Than Ready landed his fourth successive champion sire's title in Queensland during 2025-26, while the eight years younger Barbaric took champion first-season honours in the state.

Having had 278 runners for the season, Better Than Ready sent out a total of 128 winners to collect between them 220 wins, four stakes victories, and prize-money earnings of \$10,378,727 to leave him in 15th place overall in the General Sires' Table and over \$2 million clear of his nearest Queensland-based rival in Spirit Of Boom (Sequalo) - the sire of Boomtown Boss and son of former Lyndhurst champion Sequalo (Rustic Amber).

Cornerstone Stud to disperse entire bloodstock portfolio

South Australian breeding operation Cornerstone Stud will conduct a complete dispersal of its bloodstock through the Inglis Digital August (Early) Sale, which runs from August 7 to 12.

The offering will comprise Cornerstone's entire commercial breeding portfolio, including broodmares, weanlings, young stock, racehorses and breeding interests.

John Frankhuisen acquired Cornerstone Stud in 2017 and subsequently transformed the business from a traditional stallion operation into a commercially focused broodmare enterprise.

The portfolio has been developed around proven female families, disciplined broodmare selection and commercially oriented matings, with the operation producing bloodstock for the Australian and international markets. Continued on page 9

Continued from page 2 Meanwhile, Barbaric left it ultra late in the season to stake his claim for the first-season honours, with Armand making a winning debut at Gatton over 1100 metres on July 30 to bring him level on five winners with Jonker, a son of Spirit Of Boom, and ahead overall – with Barbaric's \$232,810 in prize-money earnings narrowly outweighing the \$213,975 accrued by Jonker.

"That actually came down to the last race because he and Jonker actually were on five winners apiece at the end," Kruger told ANZ News.

"Although Barbaric had only had nine runners, and I think Jonker had 19."

Off an opening fee of \$8,800 (all fees inc GST) for his first three seasons, Barbaric made a statement early with quality foals seeing his books increase season after season to cover almost 100 mares by his third year before covering 89 mares in 2025 at a fee of \$6,600. He remains at that fee this season.

"His results are encouraging off a small

book, he did cover 79 mares in his first crop but we only got 60 odd live foals with mares having bad luck," Kruger added.

"We always knew we'd be on the back foot, but it was good to get that first-season sires title over the line."

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Continued from page 4 Barbaric was sent to Kruger and Lyndhurst by Newgate Farm's Henry Field in a deal that was originally spoken about at a bar, so Kruger reveals.

"I planted the seed a while ago with Henry at Newgate" he recalls. "He was sitting at a bar seven or eight years ago in Melbourne and I said to him you can't stand them all so if you get one give me a ring.

"He gave us a deal that was too good to refuse on Barbaric.

The now 17-year-old Better Than Ready, however, is partly owned by Yarramalong's Richard Foster and sits alongside some of Lyndhurst's greats as a multiple winner of the Queensland champion sires' title.

"He joins a host of other Lyndhurst stallions on this list, the likes of Sequalo, Celestial Dancer, Grand Chaudiere, Smokey Eyes," Kruger said.

"He looks great. I'm pretty chuffed that he's gone four years in a row now up here as champion sire in Queensland."

Better Than Ready's top performer on the track in prize-money terms was Chidiac, winner

of the \$1 million Country Championships Final (1400m) under Zac Purton in April and also winner of the Hawkesbury Crown (Gr 3, 1300m) just a month later.

"Look, all it takes is one decent race and that's what has happened, Chidiac won the \$1 million championships race back in April," Kruger added.

"We had a lead already but that just put him further ahead, and the year before Chrysaor won the Callander Presnell - which is a \$1 million race at Randwick.

"So sometimes, it only takes one race, but that's the way it is these days."

With close to 70 per cent winners-to-runners, it is not surprising this is the fourth title for Better Than Ready, who is a son of Vinery's late top sire More Than Ready (Southern Halo), places him joint-third for most title wins by a Lyndhurst stallion - behind the imported great Smokey Eyes (Stardust) and Celestial Dancer (Godswalk) and alongside Grand Chaudiere (Northern Dancer).

"He was sort of one out of the blue, Richard

Foster had been talking about standing the horse but he had nowhere for him to go," Kruger recalled of the decision to stand the stallion.

"I'd helped him syndicate the horse and he was relatively cost effective, we made money on the syndication before we started."

As well as the stallion duo, Lyndhurst is renowned for its excellent hosting ability for mares in foal, and Kruger revealed that there are plenty back again for the upcoming breeding season.

"We have 60 mares of our own, and we foal about 120 a year," he adds.

"Because we've got a 24-hour CCTV facility, and have done for 30 years, we're actually a bit ahead of the times when it comes to that.

"My father started all that before most of the big farms would have done it, so we have a lot of mares coming just to foal."

With just the two stallions currently stationed at Lyndhurst, the job Jeff, Griff and their team have done for 2025-26 is quite a remarkable one. Could Better Than Ready make it five?

Jimmysstar heads star-studded Warwick Farm trials

Jimmysstar (Per Incanto) will launch his spring campaign in a high-quality Warwick Farm trial session on Tuesday as Ciaron Maher prepares the Group 1-winning gelding for a first-up tilt at the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) later this month. The seven-year-old, who raced through until the Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m) in May, is set to resume over 1400 metres rather

than the shorter sprint route he followed last season. Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Guest House (Home Affairs), Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) victor Attica (Lonhro) and recent \$5.6 million Coolmore acquisition Chayan (I Am Invincible) are also among the headline performers set to trial.

Roulette King targets Golden Eagle

Roulette King (Casino Prince) is being aimed at the \$10 million Golden Eagle (Gr 1, 1500m) after

trainer Trevor Rogers confirmed the progressive four-year-old will resume this spring. A winner of his first four starts, culminating in the Alister Clark Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m), the gelding attracted significant offers following his autumn campaign, but his connections elected to retain him. Purchased for \$50,000 from the 2024 Inglis Premier Yearling Sale, Roulette King is expected to return via a mid-August jump-out before a possible first-up run in the Tontonan Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Flemington on September 12.

Gibbons keen on Quirindi trio

Andrew Gibbons is optimistic of making an early impact at Quirindi on Tuesday, with winning prospects aboard Magatama (Maurice), Luke Skywalker (Pariah) and Immortal Rose (I Am Immortal) in the opening four races. Gibbons expects Magatama to improve sharply in her second preparation after an encouraging Gosford trial win, while Luke Skywalker has been consistent since joining David Hatch and brings recent placed form. Stablemate Immortal Rose will chase back-to-back victories after breaking through at Quirindi last start, with Gibbons believing the lightly raced mare still has further improvement to come.

Short-priced pair spearhead McVicar team

Jerilderie trainer Paul McVicar will rely on short-priced favourites Siyaasi (Capitalist) and Winter Hail (Frosted) to lead his three-horse team

at Gundagai on Tuesday. Siyaasi has finished placed at his past three starts, while Winter Hail broke his maiden in impressive fashion at Narrandera after also winning a Wagga trial. McVicar expects both to be hard to beat, with Brodie Loy booked for the pair. Locally trained National Asset (National Defense) will also chase a third consecutive victory later on the seven-race program.

Watadeel lands fourth Darwin Cup for Hickmott

Watadeel (Dundeel) returned to winning form with victory in Monday's Darwin Cup (2050m), providing trainer Michael Hickmott with a fourth success in the Northern Territory feature. Ridden by Darwin-born Zac Spain, the gelding settled just off the pace before quickening clear to defeat Rematch (Real Impact) by 1.8 lengths, with dual defending champion Hadouken (Real Impact) a further 1.5 lengths away in third. Hickmott revealed Watadeel had overcome a respiratory complaint following his unplaced

effort in the Chief Minister's Cup (1600m) and said the victory ranked among the highlights of his career, while Spain described winning his hometown Cup as more meaningful than either of his two Group 1 victories.

Country Championships on Giddy Up Griff's radar

Lightly raced gelding Giddy Up Griff (Exceedance) will continue his education when he steps out in Tuesday's Benchmark 58 Handicap (1450m) at Quirindi, with trainer Wayne Wilkes already eyeing a potential Country Championships campaign next year. The Vinery Stud-bred gelding impressed when coming from near last to score on debut at the track last month and Wilkes believes there is significant upside as he is gradually stepped up in distance. Wilkes will also saddle Share Our Secret (Overshare), who has shown improvement in two starts for the stable and will wear a tongue tie for the first time in the 1450-metre maiden.

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Its recent graduates include this season's Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) winner Shiki (Too Darn Hot). Cornerstone Stud general manager Sam Pritchard-Gordon said the dispersal would mark the conclusion of an important chapter for the operation.

"The decision to conclude the breeding

operation has not been taken lightly," Pritchard-Gordon said. "However, by conducting a complete dispersal through Inglis Digital, buyers will have a genuine opportunity to access the quality bloodstock that Cornerstone Stud has assembled over the past three years."

Cornerstone has implemented a structured transition program to coordinate the dispersal and manage the process for clients, prospective purchasers and other industry stakeholders.

Frankhuisen said he was proud of the operation's development and the horses it had produced during his ownership. "Cornerstone Stud has been an incredibly enjoyable and rewarding part of my life," he said.

"I'm immensely proud of what we've built, the people I've had the privilege to work alongside and the horses we've bred. While it's time to close this chapter, I sincerely hope the mares and young stock go on to enjoy continued success for their new owners."

Prospective buyers will be able to inspect the stock by arrangement with Pritchard-Gordon, while bidding will take place through Inglis Digital from August 7 to 12.

Four finalists named for Victorian Racehorse of the Year

Four horses have been named as finalists for the Victorian Racehorse of the Year award, which will be presented at the Victorian Racing Awards in Melbourne on Saturday night. The finalists are Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) and Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Half Yours (St Jean), Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) winning Observer (Ghaiyyath), Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m)-winning sprinter Tentyris (Street Boss) and defending champion Via Sistina (Fastnet Rock). Via Sistina will bid to become the first horse to win the award more than once since Winx (Street Cry) claimed three consecutive titles between 2017 and 2019. Presented by Evans & Partners, the award is decided by a panel of Victorian racing officials, journalists and broadcasters and considers performances on Victorian tracks during the 2025-26 season. The winner will join an honour roll that includes Black Caviar (Bel Esprit), Winx, Verry Elleegant (Zed) and Anamoe (Street Boss). The feature individual award will be the 31st Scobie Breasley Medal, presented by Gallagher Bassett. Racing Victoria stewards award 3-2-1 votes for the best rides at each metropolitan meeting throughout the season. Blake Shinn has won the medal for the

past three years, although his latest campaign was interrupted by the serious leg injury he suffered on Melbourne Cup Day. The Tommy Corrigan Medal, presented by Country Racing Victoria, will recognise the leading jumps jockey based on stewards' votes at each jumps meeting. The Colin Alderson Rising Star Award will be presented to a Victorian-based trainer aged 40 or younger whose career is progressing strongly, while the Most Outstanding Training Performance will recognise excellence by a Victorian-licensed trainer in Australia or internationally. Victoria's jockeys will vote on the VJA Rising Star Award and Damien Oliver Most Valuable Jockey Award. The winners of Victoria's statewide and metropolitan trainers' jockeys' and apprentice jockeys' premierships will also be honoured.

Racing industry warns against gambling advertising overreach

Australian racing representatives have urged a Senate inquiry to focus on evidence and outcomes when considering further restrictions on gambling advertising, warning excessive regulation could damage the industry and push wagering towards illegal offshore operators.

Acting Racing NSW chief executive Graeme Hinton, Racing Victoria chief executive Aaron Morrison, Racing Australia chief executive Paul Eriksson and Thoroughbred Breeders Australia chief executive Andrew Hore-Lacy appeared at Monday's inquiry into the federal government's proposed gambling reforms.

The package announced in April proposes a ban on wagering advertisements during live sport and at sporting venues, tighter restrictions across television, radio and digital platforms, stronger enforcement against illegal gambling operators and enhancements to the BetStop self-exclusion register.

The government has retained provisions allowing racing-related advertising and content, which industry representatives argued were essential to the sport's commercial viability. Hinton described the legislation as the largest suite of gambling reforms in Australian history but warned further restrictions could threaten livelihoods and increase migration to unregulated markets.

"What concerns us, notwithstanding the protections afforded to racing in this bill, is

that any further reduction in advertising or increased regulation could not only destroy the viability of our industry and take away livelihoods, it could result in increased harm," he said.

Hinton said racing and sports wagering accounted for approximately ten per cent of gambling expenditure in Australia and called for proportionate measures focused on supporting people experiencing gambling harm.

Morrison said wagering advertising had already fallen by more than 41 per cent in recent years, while racing industry revenue had declined by 24 per cent over the past three years. "Our request is simply that the recognised racing carve-out that's part of the bill is a practical, proportionate and workable solution," Morrison said.

He also distinguished prohibited inducements from promotional offers available to existing customers, including enhanced odds and money-back specials. The government's proposal may limit television gambling advertisements to three per hour between 6am and 8pm, with a complete ban during live sport in that period.

It could also restrict radio, podcast, search-engine and online advertising and prohibit celebrities, athletes and influencers from promoting wagering products. The inquiry also heard from former rugby league player Luke Bateman, who detailed his experience with gambling addiction and alleged betting company employees had offered to obtain illicit drugs for him at events to encourage further wagering.

NZ Horse of the Year finalists confirmed

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing has announced the finalists for the 2025-26 Horse of the Year Awards, to be held at Auckland's New Zealand International Convention Centre on September 6. Champion three-year-old contenders are headed by NZB Kiwi (Listed, 1500m) winner Well Written (Written Tycoon), alongside Belle Cheval (Savabeel), Ohope Wins (Ocean Park) and Road To Paris (Circus Maximus). Undeclared juvenile Lara Antipova (Russian Revolution) features among the two-year-old finalists, while dual Group 1 winners Legarto (Proisir), First Five (Almanzor) and Waitak (Proisir) headline the senior categories. Australian-trained contenders Dream Roca (El Roca), Jigsaw (Manhattan Rain), Kingswood (Roaring Lion) and Paradise Storm (Masked Marvel) are also among the finalists.

NZB confirms Mega Maiden Series return

New Zealand Bloodstock's Mega Maiden Series will return for a third season in 2026-27, with 40 bonus races scheduled across New Zealand from September through to May. Karaka Millions-eligible horses aged three and older that win a designated maiden race will earn a \$25,000 bonus, with \$20,000 paid to the owner and \$5,000 to the trainer. A total of bonuses were claimed during the 2025-26 season, headed by winners including Dorothea (Proisir), Frozen Fortune (Proisir), Young Jackson (Proisir) and Shameless Star (Shamexpress). The initiative offers a total of \$1 million in bonuses throughout the season.

Jaarffi to race on for Cambridge Stud

Group 1 winner Jaarffi (Ifraaj) will race on as a seven-year-old after owner-breeders Sir Brendan and Lady Jo Lindsay elected to postpone her retirement to stud for another season. The Cambridge Stud homebred broke through at the highest level in the Otaki Māori WFA Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) in February and will again target New Zealand's weight-for-age features. Trainer Lance Noble said Jaarffi

would follow a similar path to last season, beginning with the Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) in November before progressing towards the Zabeel Classic (Gr 1, 2000m). Noble also confirmed promising three-year-olds State Of Valour (Sword Of State) and Liguria (Snitzel) are on track for spring campaigns.

JPN: Puro Magic sets new JRA 1000-metre record

Puro Magic (Asia Express) successfully defended her Ibis Summer Dash (Gr 3, 1000m) title with a record-breaking front-running performance at Niigata on Sunday. Sent out favourite, the five-year-old mare became just the third horse to win consecutive editions of the straight-course turf sprint, clocking 53.5 seconds to establish a new JRA record for the trip. Hironobu Tanabe replaced the injured Kohei Matsuyama and allowed the mare to use her natural speed to lead and defeat Lord Kanaloa (King Kamehameha) pair Lord Trail and Cowslip. The victory was the fifth graded-stakes success of Puro Magic's career and followed her win in the Hakodate Sprint Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at her previous appearance. Although the course record was broken, the fastest single sectional time of '9.6 seconds' for 200 metres is still held by the flying Calstone Light O (Warning) in 2002.

JPN: Lloyd and Lane to represent Australia

Damian Lane and Zac Lloyd will represent Australia in the 2026 World All-Star Jockeys at Sapporo on August 22 and 23. Lane returns for his second appearance after finishing seventh in 2024, having added four Group 1 wins across Australia and Japan during the past season, including the NHK Mile Cup (Gr 1, 1600m).

Lloyd will make his series debut after finishing second in the Sydney jockeys' premiership with 79 wins, highlighted by victories in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and Queen Of The Turf Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m).

International

UK: Jockey Club quits Racecourse Association

The Jockey Club has announced it is leaving the Racecourse Association (RCA), joining Ascot in giving up its membership of the racecourse trade body at the end of the year. In a statement released on Sunday, the Jockey Club said: The Jockey Club today announces that it will join Ascot in leaving the Racecourse Association at the end of 2026. The decision follows the completion of the RCA's governance review, which began in March this year. Jim Mullen, The Jockey Club's Group chief executive, said: "While acknowledging the work that has taken place since March, we have consistently set out throughout the review that it needed to address not just the racecourse voting shares within the RCA, but the organisation's role in representing racecourses politically through its 50% holding of member shares in the BHA. This review has addressed the RCA's internal arrangements, but not the constitutional arrangements through which racecourses collectively exercise their influence over the governance of British racing. The RCA's proposals fail to address our fundamental concern that the RCA can continue to act to stifle the necessary changes needed in the industry. Nothing proposed would displace the RCA as the political representative of British racecourses and in our view, confirmed by recent discussions, the RCA would continue to vote against necessary changes such as the introduction of an independent BHA board and substantive changes to the fixture list."

RSA: The Autumn Sun filly scores on South African debut

Umoyawokubambelela (The Autumn Sun) became the first South African winner for Arrowfield Stud's five-time Group 1-winning sire when making a stylish debut over 1200 metres

at Scottsville on Sunday. Trained by Wengesai Masawi, the filly overcame a slow start to score by two lengths under Gavin Lerena despite racing greenly. Purchased for \$180,000 from Glen Lee Thoroughbreds' draft at the 2025 Inglis Premier Yearling Sale, she survived two life-threatening bouts of colic after arriving in South Africa. Her victory capped a remarkable journey and highlighted the resilience behind the aptly named filly, whose Zulu name translates to "spirit of holding on."

FR: Blue Bolt lands Rothschild to extend Group 1 streak

Blue Bolt (4 f Blue Point - Mayhem by Whipper) cemented her status as Europe's leading female miler with a determined victory in Sunday's Prix Rothschild (Gr 1, 1600m) at Deauville. The Andrew Balding-trained four-year-old rallied strongly under Colin Keane to defeat Irish 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) winner Precise (Starspangledbanner) by half-a-length, with Moon Target (Cracksman) a further one and three-quarter lengths away in third. The €400,000 Arqana August Yearling Sale graduate has now won back-to-back Group 1s following her Falmouth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) success at Newmarket, becoming the first horse since Roly Poly (War Front) in 2017 to complete the Falmouth-Rothschild double.

12 for Siyouni

Soreanga (3 f ex Saltita by Galileo) became the 12th individual Group 1 winner for Siyouni (Pivotal) when she landed the Preis der Diana (Gr 1, 2200m) at Düsseldorf on Sunday. Bred and raced by Gestüt Fährhof and trained by Andreas

Wöhler, the chestnut filly was always prominent under Eduardo Pedroza before quickening clear in the straight to score by 3.5 lengths. The victory was her fourth from six starts and followed wins in the Hamburger Stutenpreis (Gr 3, 2200m) and the Großer Preis der Privatbank ODDO BHF (Listed, 1600m). Soreanga is out of the unraced Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare Saltita, whose previous black-type performers include Group 1-placed Salt Bay (Farhh) and Group 2-placed Palavecino (Cacique). Siyouni stood the 2026 northern hemisphere breeding season at Haras de Bonneval for €150,000 (approx. AU\$266,000).

GER: Soreanga lands German Oaks in dominant style

Soreanga provided owner-breeder Gestüt Fährhof with Classic success when taking out Sunday's Henkel-Preis der Diana, the German Oaks, at Düsseldorf. The Andreas Wöhler-trained filly travelled prominently before quickening clear to defeat favourite Lapotheose (Wootton Bassett) by three and a half lengths, with Noble Lips (Gleneagles) another three lengths away in third. The victory completed a German Derby-German Oaks double for Wöhler in 2026 and gave the trainer a record-extending seventh success in the fillies' Classic, while winning rider Eduardo Pedroza claimed his fifth German Oaks victory.

GER: Sommersby lands Fritz Henkel-Preis

Sommersby (6 g Amaron - Still Standing by Martillo) completed a memorable afternoon for trainer Andreas Wöhler and jockey Eduardo Pedroza with a front-running victory in Sunday's Fritz Henkel-Preis (Gr 3, 1600m) at Düsseldorf. The six-year-old made every yard of the running to score by a length and a quarter over Aster (Outstrip), with Montanus (Amaron) a further three-quarters of a length away in third. The victory was Sommersby's ninth from 20 starts and his first at Group level.

31 for New Bay

Symbol Of Majesty (3 f ex Sovereign Parade by Galileo) became the 31st individual stakes winner for New Bay (Dubawi) when landing Sunday's Prix de Psyché (Gr 3, 2000m) at

Deauville. Trained by John and Thady Gosden and ridden by William Buick, the filly edged clear inside the final 110 metres to record her third victory from five starts, defeating Evita (Persian King) by a half-length. There was a further short-head back to Lefteye (Siyouni) in third place. She is out of the Galileo mare Sovereign Parade, making her a half-sister to champion two-year-old filly Commissioning (Kingman), winner of the Fillies' Mile (Gr 1, 1m), and Listed winner Military Academy (Fastnet Rock). New Bay stood the 2026 northern hemisphere breeding season at Ballylinch Stud in Ireland for €75,000 (approx. AU\$133,000).

14 for Profitable

Simplify (3 f ex Fanrouge by Red Clubs) became the 14th individual stakes winner for Profitable (Invincible Spirit) when she landed the Queensferry Stakes (Listed, 6f) at Chester on Sunday. Trained by Andrew Balding and ridden by Oisin Murphy, the filly produced a strong late surge to reel in favourite Calico Blue (Calyx) and score by a head. There was a further length back to the third-placed Lifeplan (Kodi Bear). A four-time winner from nine starts, Simplify was purchased for £21,000 at the 2024 Goffs UK Premier Yearling Sale. Profitable now stands at the Jockey Club of Turkey, having previously stood at Kildangan Stud in Ireland.

US: Survie fuels Breeders' Cup Turf ambitions

In-form trainer George Boughey may have a Breeders' Cup Turf (Gr 1, 12f) contender on his hands after Survie (5 m Churchill - Sotteville by Le Havre) made a winning North American debut in Sunday's Glens Falls Stakes (Gr 2, 12f) at Saratoga. The five-year-old produced a sharp turn of foot under Flavien Prat to defeat Storm Miami (Blue Point) by a length and three-quarters, with Alluring Angel (Fastnet Rock) another two lengths away in third. Purchased for 1.9 million guineas at the 2025 Tattersalls December Mares Sale by M V Magnier and running in the silks of Michael Tabor, Survie was recording the fifth win of her career. Boughey indicated the Christophe Clement Turf Stakes (Gr 1, 12f) at Saratoga, a Breeders' Cup Turf "Win and You're In" qualifier on August 15, is the likely next target.

Kiwi Chronicles

The follow through

Awarded New Zealand Breeders of the Year a little more than a week ago, Cambridge Stud has not taken its foot off the accelerator since.

Sir Brendan Lindsay was presented the award as a result of a successful year of breeding multiple Group winners, more than 100 individual winners and a year which also saw the stud top the 2026 NZB Centenary Yearling Sale as well as head the same sales' turnover figures.

Spurred by those titles the stud has followed through, the last stakes race of the season, the Ryder Stakes (Listed, 1200m), taken out by Back Of The Bus, a daughter of resident stallion Hello Youmzain (Kodiac). Not to be outdone, value resident sire Embellish (Savabeel) chimed in by siring Saturday's Winter Cup (Gr 3, 1600m) victress Quintabelle in a first rate beginning of the new season.

At Flemington, Almanzor (Wootton Bassett) joined the party when Touchdown landed the 2026 Melbourne Cup Carnival On Sale Handicap (1620m) while at Rosehill, the first of the day went the way of Attractiveness, another daughter of Hello Youmzain, in the Midway Handicap (1400m). Results such as these are somewhat timely leading into the breeding season which gets underway in less than a month.

Front of the queue

Showing real grit in the postponed Ryder Stakes at Otaki late last week, Back Of The Bus prevailed by just a head yet she fully deserved the win when all things are considered. The club was forced to delay the meeting due to a strong weather system the previous Saturday but the track still rated a Heavy 10 resulting in a winning time of 1:16.27.

Back Of The Bus was not first away yet recovered to find the front briefly before sitting just back and outside the leader. At the top of

the straight Lisa Allpress immediately sent her into the lead and maintained the lead all the way to the line, fighting off two persistent and solid challenges before lifting just shy of the post. This was a courageous effort from the filly who was making her fifth start.

A June 20th winner at Ellerslie in the Winter Series 2YO Final (1200m), Back Of The Bus is no mudder having scored the Ellerlie win in a good time of 1:11.83, her last 600m in 35.08. Her first black-type occurred courtesy of a third placing in last month's Castletown Stakes (Listed, 1200m), also at Otaki. Representing Hello Youmzain's second crop, she becomes his sixth southern hemisphere stakes winner and the second to bag the Ryder Stakes, Platinum Diamond the winner of the 2025 edition.

The stallion is proving to be a prolific sire of winners. His oldest in the northern hemisphere are four-year-olds and with two crops in the south Hello Youmzain has sired 137 individual winners. He has several Group winners in Europe and the best in the south would appear to be Drops Of God, an impressive winner of the Cambridge Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m)

last April. Her return is much anticipated.

Back Of The Bus is another example of the growing number of successful purchases from an on-line sale, she from the Wentwood Grange draft of NZB's 2025 National On-Line Yearling Sale and found by her trainer Tony Pike who post race commented: "She is a really tough and brave filly."

Pike was attracted by her pedigree: "She is out of a family I know reasonably well. She is out of a half-sister to Witz End. Now she has got a good enough pedigree to carry forward to stud when that time comes," said Pike who trained Witz End (Savabeel) to win four times and place in Group company. Witz End has since transferred to Terri Rae at Riccarton, adding three more wins including the Listed Hazlett Stakes (1200m) at Wingatui last February, bolstering the black type close up in the family.

No let up

For Cambridge Stud the new season began as it ended with Embellish striking first blood in the race for stakes wins, namely Quintabelle's strong win in the Winter Cup.

The just-turned six-year-old jumped away well but soon drifted to be worse than midfield yet rider Toni Davies was able to improve around the big bend and although widest, was well placed before starting the run home. A bump when making her run put her off stride but once balanced she chased hard to be level with the leaders inside the 200m. Travelling too well she strode clear for a decisive two lengths win, her career sixth and maiden stakes win. "Third up and with a huge drop in weight we thought she was going to be a key player," said trainer Anna Furlong.

Quintabelle never raced at two, won twice at three and recorded two Listed placings in the latter half of her three-year-old season. At four she added back-to-back wins at Wingatui and Riccarton where she also finished third in the South Island Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) while at five she collected a sole win last February at Riccarton. She has not been overraced. Saturday's win was her 26th start and she has banked \$235,000, a healthy return on the \$25,000 outlaid by Invercargill trainer and part-owner Robert Dennis from Book 2 of NZB's 2022 National Yearling Sale.

Her family has been active recently as her half-brother Dionysus (Ocean Park) won the Waikato Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) in December 2023, completing his career of six wins which also included the Queen Elizabeth Cup (Gr 3, 2400m). Quintabelle and Dionysus are the only two winners from La Quinta (Tavistock), an unraced half-sister to the dam of dual Group 1 winner Quintessa (Shamus Award), victress in the 2025-26 Proisir Plate (Gr 1, 1400m). Their dam, La Quinta Gold (Encosta De Lago), ranks as a sister to Australian Group 3 winners Besame Mucho and Gold Lottey.

Embellish is now the sire of seven individual stakes winners and Quintabelle represents his initial crop from which four of the seven have emerged. Quintabelle won't be the last although breeders' interest is waning as his mare numbers have dropped. His value is undeniable.

What about me?

Cambridge Stud's Almanzor got the new season off to a flying start and has a more than promising sort in Touchdown who is building

a top resume of five wins and three placings in only nine starts, the latest at Flemington on Saturday at Benchmark 84 level.

The just-turned five-year-old has had an interesting life. He was foaled in New Zealand but offered for sale as a yearling at the 2023 Wm Inglis Easter Yearling Sale. He failed to reach his reserve and was returned to New Zealand where he landed a trial win at Taupo in November, 2024 before being sold to Australian interests.

Transferred from the stable of Glen Old in Matamata to the Hayes stable in Victoria, Touchdown placed on debut in May last year, breaking his maiden at Sale the following September at four. Shortly after he worked through the grades completing a hatrick of Caulfield (Heath) wins. Saturday's win was his best yet, drawing clear from the 150m to win convincingly, taking his earnings to \$223,000.

He is the sixth foal and fifth winner from Shamardal Luck (Shamardal) making him a half-brother to Rough Habit Plate (Gr 3, 2000m) winner Shocking Luck (Shocking), who began his career in New Zealand and was successful in Hong Kong as Zilong. Their grandam, Perth winner and Group 2 placed Colour Me Lucky (Is It True) ranks as a half-sister to the Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Starstruck (Haulpak). She was a grand campaigner, scoring 13 wins. The Hayes boys bought Touchdown's yearling half-brother by Shocking (Street Cry) at NZB's 2026 Centenary Yearling Sale last January.

Hello again

In full circle, Hello Youmzain similarly got the stallion's Australian season away when Attractiveness emerged from a sticky position to land her third win in eight starts. The four-year-old mare is working through the grades nicely, having won at Gosford last December and rather

impressively at Newcastle this past June.

At Rosehill, in the Benchmark 72 over 1400m, she sat midfield but was trapped on the fence rounding into the straight, then barged her way out of a tight spot soon after, balanced up and finished strongly for the win, her rider Chad Schofield more than likely copping a close look from the stewards.

A \$120,000 purchase from Blandford Lodge's 2024 NZB Yearling Sale (Book 1), Attractiveness is the second winner from two to race from the High Chaparral (Sadler's Wells) mare Hot In High Heels, a dual winner whose dam Fairygem (Viscount) was a Listed winner at Randwick. Fairygem is a half-sister to Captain Cook Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Penny Gem (Pentire) who also placed at Group 1 level on four occasions.

Te Akau ace

There was a double connection to New Zealand in the Horse's Birthday Handicap (1410m) at Flemington where Rich Hill Stud sired and Te Akau Racing's Stage 'N' Screen (Ace High) clung on very gamely to bag her fourth win at start 17. The mare's chances did not look good turning for home but when the leader drifted away from the fence she was able to drive through but did not reach the lead until the 150m. To her credit, she fought really hard to deny her challengers.

A trial winner at Te Awamutu at two, Stage 'n' Screen was sent to Te Akau's Cranbourne stable and broke her maiden at Seymour in October 2024. The stable must think something of her as she was given her chance in the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) before wins at Pakenham and Sandown (at four) last December. Purchased by David Ellis for \$200,000 at the 2023 NZB Ready to Run Sale, Stage 'N' Screen has recouped her purchase price plus \$10,000.

She is a half-sister to Caulfield winner and Group 1 placed Japanese Emperor (Satono Aladdin) as well as Ellerslie winner Imperial Empress (Satono Aladdin). Another half-sister, Aladdin's Girl (Satono Aladdin), a \$900,000 Karaka yearling purchase, has been placed. Their dam and the dam of New Zealand Filly of the Year Amarelinha (Savabeel) are three-quarter sisters.
