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Arrowfield cop big blow as Vandeeek ruled out for season

Arrowfield Stud have suffered a major and late blow on the eve of the breeding season, with shuttle sire Vandeeek (Havana Grey) ruled out of action for the entire spring.

The five-year-old was found to have incurred a tendon injury while in quarantine in Victoria ahead of his transfer to the Hunter Valley.

He had been due to stand his second

shuttle season, at an unchanged \$22,000 (inc GST), after a hugely popular first Australian spring last year in which he served 151 mares.

But the grey sprinter will now recover at Arrowfield before being returned to England's Cheveley Park Stud ahead of the northern season.

Arrowfield owner John Messara said the news came as a heavy setback so close to the September 1 start of the breeding season, with Vandeeek having filled a speed berth in the farm's seven-stallion roster, as well as a two-year-old profile.

Ceolwulf ready for Winx return

Four-time Group 1 scorer Ceolwulf (Tavistock) will line up in Saturday's Winx Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick as he continues preparations to secure a third successive King Charles III Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) crown this spring. Trained by Joe Pride, the now six-year-old has captured the last two runnings of the 1600-metre Group 1 and Pride feels a return to action this weekend is the correct timing. "He needed a good rest, and he's now had that rest," Pride said.

"It's a big disappointment so close to the season starting," Messara told ANZ News.

"It's a blow because we're getting the first of his foals and they're very nice foals and we're very keen about this horse. He's a terrific speed horse for us.

"And his half-brother Gstaad has done so well in Europe in the last 12 months, to add a bit of sauce to the meal."

The Aidan O'Brien-trained Gstaad (Starspangledbanner) has won four of his ten starts and placed second in his other six since debuting in May, 2025. His wins have included two at the elite level - in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (Gr 1, 8f) at Del Mar in November,

then in his second start at three in the Curragh's Irish 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m), by three lengths.

Coincidentally Gstaad was this month ruled out of a fourth clash with his great rival, and now also retired, Bow Echo (Night Of Thunder), who had beaten him into second in three Group 1s - due to a cut and infection on a hind leg incurred in one such runner's up finish in Goodwood's Sussex Stakes (Gr 1, 1m).

Vandeek's injury is also to a hind leg. Some mystery surrounds how it was suffered, with no outward signs that he'd hit himself while in quarantine, such as a cut or an abrasion.

But the fact the injury was sustained in a hind tendon meant the task of serving some three mares a day on his hind legs would be beyond him.

"We've had various vets look at him and by far the most prudent way forward is to give him time to recover," Messara said.

"He's recovering, but he needs more time to recover.

"We'll let him recover here until we feel

comfortable that he's over it and can travel back to England. We like to send the package back as well as it arrived."

Messara said Arrowfield would be eager to have Vandeek return next year.

"We're very bullish about the horse," he said. "We like the pedigree, he's a great type, and he's thrown these lovely foals.

"We've only got a few of his foals so far but we like them all. And other people are happy with theirs too.

"So we're hoping he can resume stud duties with us next year."

Continued from page 3 With his oldest northern progeny yearlings, Vandeek fed the thirst for pure speed at Arrowfield alongside its stallions generally associated with longer distances - flagbearer The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice), Dundee (High Chaparral) and his son Castelvechio, and Japanese shuttler Maurice (Screen Hero) and his son Hitotsu.

Another superbly bred English shuttler Lead Artist (Dubawi), who won from 1600 metres to 1800 metres, will stand his first season this spring.

Vandeek's debut 2025 book included 12-

time stakes winner Catkins (Dubawi), and Group 2 victor Noire (Foxwedge), while 2018 Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) queen Maid Of Heaven (Smart Missile) was also covered by the stallion but missed.

The shuttler also served stakes-winner producers including Cries And Whiskers (Street Cry), the dam of dual black type victor Weeping Woman (Lonhro), Cat By The Tale (Tale Of The Cat), Infiorata (Dream Ahead) and Private (Encosta De Lago).

The 151 mares covered by Vandeek in his debut season - booked in before breeders could clap eyes on him at Arrowfield's stallion parade - made him Arrowfield's third-most patronised sire of 2025, behind only the 178 of The Autumn Sun - who missed the previous season with injury - and Castelvechio's 155, according to studbook figures.

Acquired to fill a speed and juvenile hole bearing in mind the advanced years of Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) - who ultimately died in June last year - Vandeek had brought some

Australian blood back down south, as the fifth foal of Mosa Mine (Exceed And Excel).

That mare didn't win in 11 starts but is out of a half-sister to Balbonella (Gay Mecene), the Group 1-winning dam of Champion Sprinter and leading dual hemisphere sire Anabaa (Danzig) and French 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) victor Always Loyal (Zilzal).

Described by regular rider James Doyle as "a pure ball of speed", Vandeek had six starts, all at 1200 metres, and was unbeaten in four outings at two. Those included two elite titles in Deauville's Prix Morny and Newmarket's Middle Park Stakes.

After being named France's Champion 2YO Colt, he returned at three to finish third in a Haydock Group 2 and Newmarket's July Cup (Gr 1, 6f) before being retired to stud after a minor injury.

Boasting a Sadler's Wells (Northern Dancer) sireline and carrying a 5f x 3m duplication of Danehill (Danzig), Vandeek is also the best performer so far by **Continued on page 5**

Continued from page 4 hot stallion Havana Grey (Havana Gold), who earned laurels as Europe's leading first, second and third season sire.

Messara was delighted to have secured Vandeek last year.

Arrowfield at first made enquiries about securing Havana Grey himself, but when they were unsuccessful the farm looked a generation lower.

To their considerable excitement, they discovered a chance had arisen to buy into new sire Vandeek, with a stake Messara recalls as around 25 per cent being put up for tender.

"We thought he was the best son of Havana Grey, and if we can't get the old man, let's go for Vandeek," Messara said last year.

"He was a champion sprinter, and with a nice pedigree. And while we've got stallions who would get a two-year-old, we didn't really have an obvious, or a specialist, two-year-old getter, with Snitzel starting to look like he might be on the way out.

"We thought Vandeek would fit well into our roster."

Arrowfield moved to buy that stake in Vandeek that would hopefully help them secure him as a shuttler.

Unfortunately, they missed. Fortunately, an old friend hit.

"The farm that won the tender was Cheveley Park, and one of our favourite people runs it in Chris Richardson, an old friend from way back," Messara said.

After Arrowfield's Jon Freyer flew to England for a glowing inspection of the stallion, a shuttle deal was struck.

Vandeek arrived in July last year armed with a ballistic fertility rate from his first season in Britain exceeding 90 per cent.

"I think he's a horse who suits our local conditions," Messara said at the time. "If I didn't think that, I wouldn't have chased him.

"He's good-looking, sound-looking, a very classy-looking individual. He's athletic and was an early goer. And at his price he's great value."

The Chris Waller-trained Narbold (5 g ex Noblest by Pivotal) became the 42nd individual stakes winner for Coolmore's former shuttler Churchill (Galileo) when taking out Thursday's Rowley Mile (Listed, 1600m) at Hawkesbury. Ridden by Tommy Berry, the five-year-old gelding proved 1.3 lengths too strong for Punch Lane (So You Think) with a further 0.8 lengths back to the third-placed Juja Kibo (Belardo). Bred and raced by Rosemont Stud, Narbold is a half-brother to Blue Diamond Prelude (F) (Gr 2, 1100m) winner Palm Angel (Starspangledbanner) being one of three foals to race out of the imported Pivotal (Polar Falcon) mare Noblest, herself a sister to dual Group 1 winner Peeress – the granddam of Lockinge Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) scorer Audience (Iffraaj). Churchill, who shuttled to Coolmore Australia between 2018-24, stood the 2026 northern hemisphere breeding season at Coolmore Stud for a fee of €15,000 (approx. AU\$24,630).

Ceolwulf ready for Winx return

Four-time Group 1 scorer Ceolwulf (Tavistock) will line up in Saturday's Winx Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick as he continues preparations to secure a third successive King Charles III Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) crown this

spring. Trained by Joe Pride, the now six-year-old has captured the last two runnings of the 1600-metre Group 1 and Pride feels a return to action this weekend is the correct timing. "He needed a good rest, and he's now had that rest," Pride said. "We'll see a better version of him this spring, and it has always been a good time of year for him. He's won his four Group 1s all in the spring, and I don't think it's coincidental. I think it's going to come down to track conditions on the day [in the Winx]. If it ends up being a bit wet and a few of the key chances come out, he could end up being a top three chance. But I've certainly learned not to expect too much of him early in his preparations. He's never won first-up. He's run some nice races, but that's all I need to see from him, a nice return, and he'll build into the preparation as he always does."

Form boost for Screen Icon ahead of Silver Shadow

Randwick-based trainer John Thompson feels the form of The Rosebud (Listed, 1100m) augurs well for his filly Screen Icon (Nicconi) as the dual stakes placegetter bids to tackle Saturday's Silver Shadow Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at her local track. The Rosebud was taken out by Chilly Girl (Trapeze Artist), who finished a half-length ahead of Screen Icon in a barrier trial on August 7 won by Group 1 performer Apocalyptic (Extreme Choice). "Her first trial was good, and her second trial in a strong heat was franked by Chilly Girl coming out and winning well on Saturday," Thompson said. Screen Icon placed in the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) and Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at two, and will again be ridden by familiar partner Chad Schofield this weekend. "He knows her well. She has been beginning well and putting herself there in her trials, so I'll leave it up to him," Thompson said. "It's a pretty even lot [of fillies]. It's just a matter of which one has taken a step up from last 'prep' to this. Her trials have indicated she's going great, and in her work at home she's been going well."

Thompson to drop Bomshell on rivals

Jockey Ben Thompson feels that Cherry Bomshell (Lucky Vega) is in a good place ahead of her return in Saturday's Silver Shadow Stakes. The three-year-old filly has won three of her four starts to date, including when last seen in the Percy Sykes Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) in April, and having ridden the daughter of Lucky Vega (Lope De Vega) to third in a barrier trial on August 7, Thompson is happy with her condition heading into the weekend. "She's already put a good score on the board, now going from two to three I thought it was invaluable to come and have another feel," Thompson told Racing NSW. "She's not an overly big filly but she looks to have done well in all the right ways in her brief break. She felt the same as she has the other three times I've ridden her, and that's classy."

Stable on weather watch with Ole Dancer

Peter Moody and Katherine Coleman will be waiting to see what the weather brings before confirming Ole Dancer (Ole Kirk) will take her place in Saturday's Carlyon Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) at Sandown. The daughter of Ole Kirk (Written Tycoon) was a Group 1 winner during her three-year-old season, landing the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), but Coleman revealed the mare will be kept to shorter distances this preparation. "She's come back good," Coleman said. "She has had that one trial. We're looking at keeping her to shorter trips this time around, but we're also keeping a watch on the weather and track conditions, so whether she kicks off this weekend or we wait for the following week, I think she will be forward enough to run well wherever we go. We felt that she lost a bit of that spark in a couple of her runs when we tried to stretch her out, so we've decided to drop her back in trip, keep her fresh, and pinging. That's how we're looking at the prep at this stage and whether we do end up getting her back out 1400 [metres], we'll be open minded."

Bugsy to return at Sandown

One horse that will definitely return at Sandown on Saturday is the Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr-trained Bugsy (Harry Angel). The three-year-old Harry Angel (Dark Angel) colt scored on debut over 1000 metres at Sandown-Hillside back in March before then running third in the Redoute's Choice Stakes (Listed, 1200m) a month later, and looks to tackle this weekend's Chef's Hat Handicap (1000m). "He won track and distance on debut, albeit very greenly, and he had probably come to the end of his prep when he ran third in a Listed race," Kent Jnr said. "Whilst he only got beaten a length and ran third, I thought there was a bit more there and that he had come to the end of it by then, so we gave him a nice break, and have set him for the spring. He's trialled up well and I think there's improvement to come. His trackrider thinks the run will bring him on and it's hard to disagree with him. He's a strong colt but I think he's forward enough for 1000 metres."

Unbeaten record on line for Tennessee Bound

Having won all six of her starts to date, the Ciaran Maher-trained Tennessee Bound (Written Tycoon) will bid to make it seven when she lines up at Sandown on Saturday. The five-year-old Written Tycoon (Iglesia) mare will tackle the Dr Sheahan Plate (1300m) having gone through the grades, with her latest success coming in a Benchmark 84 (1100m) at Caulfield on July 25. "We'd have her in, give her a break, and thankfully [owner] Gerry [Ryan] just said do what you have to do," Maher's assistant trainer Jack Turnbull said. "She's a mare that has taken time and hopefully the time given repays us, but we can't hide her now as we've placed

her as best as we can. She's in a 1300-metre Benchmark 88 and we feel as though that's that next bracket, but it's tougher again than what she has been meeting. If she was successful, a race that comes to mind is the Let's Elope, potentially stepping up to 1400 [metres]."

Third time lucky for Almairac

Mornington-based trainer Cliff Brown will take his chance with Almairac (Golden Horn) in Morphettville on Saturday despite the gelding having drawn wide again. The son of Golden Horn (Cape Cross) was down to race in Sydney last Saturday but drew wide, and also drew wide again at Sandown on Wednesday. He now has gate 12 of 13 acceptors in The Footbase Group Handicap (1994m) at Morphettville this weekend. "He's kept drawing wide and he's done the same on Saturday, but I'm just going to chance my arm," Brown said. "That would be three times in a week that he would have missed a start because of poor barriers. It's come about because he drew ten of 12 at Randwick, drew 11 at Sandown, and the start at Randwick can be a bit tricky, and we've got 12 on Saturday. The heavy track probably got him last time, but he had had a bit of a gap between runs, and for the pattern of the day, he ran pretty well. There has been rain in Adelaide, but it's clearing up, and I've got to race him somewhere, and that seems the most logical one. He's worked very well. I'm happy with how he is, but I'd love to draw a gate."

Headwall set for classy Rosehill trial

Last year's Concorde Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) winner Headwall (Dream Ahead) is set to head to Rosehill for a trial before then heading back to the aforementioned Group 3 sprint where he will bid for back-to-back victories. The now eight-year-old gelding is yet to race since his Concorde win in September 2025, having suffered a leg injury following that success. He has been given a gradual build up by trainer Matthew Smith and was withdrawn from a nomination for this weekend's Show County Quality (Gr 3, 1200m) at Randwick. "I put him in and had a look, but decided I didn't really want to change tack," Smith said. "I want to go

to the Concorde and then go to The Shorts. He's trialling Friday now and he's low flying. I think he's going better than last 'prep'."

Memsie comeback more likely for Aeliana

Current Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) favourite Aeliana (Castelvecchio) is likely to make her return in the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) on Saturday week. The three-time Group 1 winner had been accepted for Saturday's Winx Stakes, but Chris Waller told SEN's Giddyup With Gareth program on Thursday morning that the Memsie was a more likely first-up option. "Quite likely," Waller said. "I don't think we put a jockey down for Saturday and I don't want to get a fine, so it tells you that we are not going to run but she's there if we change our mind. You just never know. She is in the field so you might as well wait, but at this stage I would say she is unlikely and will go to the Memsie."

Kiwi Seize The Day pleases in jumpout

Kiwi Group 1 winner Seize The Day (I Am Invincible) is progressing nicely in Australia for trainer Mark Walker and pleased the trans-Tasman conditioner with his 1000-metre jumpout win at Caulfield Heath on Wednesday. The I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) colt was a standout as a juvenile in New Zealand last season, winning two of his three starts for Walker and New Zealand training partner Sam Bergerson, including an emphatic victory in the Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Trentham in March, cementing his place in Te Akau's Cranbourne barn in spring. "He jumped out nicely," Walker said. "He improved a lot fitness-wise from his first jumpout and it was good to have the opportunity to travel to Caulfield just to get him out of the stable. He kicks off next Saturday at Caulfield in the McNeil [Stakes]. Because he is a Group 1 winner, he will have to carry the Group 1 penalty, so he gets 59kg. It isn't ideal, but it is the right race to start him off in. Then it is three weeks to the Caulfield Guineas Prelude, and it is set weights and penalties, so he will have to carry the 59kg there as well. And then it is the Caulfield Guineas on October 10, so it's three weeks in between runs, which is nice."

Rumbled Again retired by Trotter

Cranbourne-based trainer Michael Trotter has called time on the racing career of Rumbled Again (Night Of Thunder). The now nine-year-old mare won back-to-back runnings of the Summoned Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) and retires with a career of 58 starts for eight wins and a further 13 placings, with over \$770,000 earned in prize-money. "She was just an absolute star from the beginning," Trotter told Racing.com. "She's taken us to the biggest race days over the spring carnival for the last four of five years, so it's been a hell of a ride. And she was the last horse I ever broke in too, so it is always nice to have that little bit extra attachment. If you look at it in context, it was another great run the other day [seventh at Caulfield] – she didn't get beat far, surrounded by some bloody good horses, and didn't get a track to suit. But it's probably just come to that time – she's a nine-year-old now and she's done an amazing job for us."

Swan Hill transferred to Murtoa

Racing Victoria (RV) and the Swan Hill Jockey Club advise that Friday's Swan Hill meeting has been transferred to Murtoa due to the condition of the track owing to wet weather. RV stewards inspected the Swan Hill track on Thursday following 26mm of rain over the previous 36 hours and deemed it unsafe for racing. Scratchings will be reinstated for the Murtoa meeting with six distance changes required as a result of the transfer. Due to reduced field limits, two horses become emergencies in races 2, 3, 7 and 8 while three horses become emergencies in race 6.

Vale Tom Higgins

Port Macquarie-based trainer Tom Higgins has died at the age of 71. Higgins fittingly had his last runner on his home track at Port Macquarie on July 31 with Charmed Star (Knight Exemplar). His last winner was a month earlier as The Big Ticket (Stratum Star) scored at Taree. He was known for always presenting his horses in excellent condition and the best of them was stayer Sky Biscuit (Sky Chase). He took Sky Biscuit from running sixth of seven in a maiden at Kempsey in late 2004 to

win 14 races, he was transferred to Neville Voigt for four starts in early 2008 before returning to Higgins. In that preparation he ran second in the Chairman's Handicap (Gr 2, 2600m), third in the McKell Cup (Listed, 2400m) and second in the Brisbane Cup (Gr 2, 2400m).

Johnson appointed chief executive of Waikato Thoroughbred Racing

Waikato Thoroughbred Racing (WTR) has announced the appointment of Nick Johnson as its new chief executive after a comprehensive search. Johnson joins WTR from the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Association (NZTBA), where he has served as chief executive since October 2023, bringing with him broad commercial experience, strong industry relationships, and a passion for thoroughbred racing. His appointment comes at an important time for WTR as the organisation builds on the successful merger of Waikato Racing Club, Cambridge Jockey Club and Waipa Racing Club, while progressing plans for its Greenfield development and continuing to strengthen racing and events across the Waikato region. WTR chair Bruce Harvey said the WTR board was delighted to welcome Johnson to the role. "Nick brings a great mix of industry knowledge, commercial experience and enthusiasm for thoroughbred racing, and we believe he is very well placed to lead WTR through its next chapter," Harvey said. "WTR has undergone plenty of change over the past few years and we are a club with an important role to play, not only within the Waikato but in the future of New Zealand racing. We have ambitious plans ahead

of us, particularly as we continue to progress the Greenfield project, while at the same time ensuring we continue to deliver quality racing, events and facilities across our existing venues."

Crocetti on song for season resumption

Last season was one to forget for the connections of dual Group 1 winner Crocetti (Zacinto), and they are hoping he can return to his form of old this term. Following an unsuccessful hit-and-run mission on The Quokka (1200m) in Perth last year, the son of Zacinto (Dansili) just had the two starts last season, and things went awry on more than one occasion. Crocetti will resume in Saturday's Foxbridge Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) at Te Rapa, and while pleased with his charge, Danny Walker is aware of the task ahead of him against a strong field. "I think it is one of the best Foxbridge Plates there has been for years," Walker, who trains in partnership with Arron Tata, said. Alabama Lass (Alabama Express) currently heads the market for the race on \$2.50, with Crocetti the fourth elect at \$10, behind First Five (Almanzor) (\$6.50) and Churchillian (Churchill) (\$8.50). All going to plan, Crocetti will progress to the first two legs of the Spring Triple Crown. "He will go from here to the Proisir Plate and then to the Howden Mile, and that is all that is left for him in the spring," Walker said.

Pike has healthy respect for Foxbridge favourite

Tony Pike is approaching in-form mare Churchillian's task at Te Rapa on Saturday with a major dose of realism. The Cambridge trainer has the seven-year-old in top order for the Foxbridge Plate and is only too aware of the challenge the daughter of Churchill (Galileo) faces in the weight-for-age feature. Churchillian is an accomplished frontrunner and ideally suited by the inside gate, with Samantha Collett again booked for the ride. "Obviously, the draw helps but I think off her barrier trial I'd be surprised if they can beat Alabama Lass," Pike said. "We've drawn to get a good trip right on speed and she's very genuine, but it is a step up in class to be honest, coming off fillies and mares' races. I'm sure she will run well but will need everything to go her way."

Manzor Blue to kick off Melbourne Cup preparation

Quality stayer Manzor Blue (Almanzor) will begin her path towards the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) in November when she heads to Hastings on Saturday to tackle the Charlie Whyte Open Mile (1600m). Raced by New Zealand-based syndicator Go Racing, Manzor Blue established herself among the top echelon of New Zealand's staying ranks last season after winning the Wellington Cup (Gr 3, 3200m) at Trentham in January before finishing runner-up to Aussie raider Paradise Storm (Masked Marvel) in the Auckland Cup (Gr 2, 3200m) at Ellerslie on Champions Day in March. Following those results, her connections began to dream of a Melbourne Cup tilt, and a plan was set in motion to contest the race that stops two nations. The daughter of Almanzor (Wootton Bassett) trialled over 1000 metres at Foxton last week and was set to resume over 1400 metres at Hawera a fortnight ago, however, trainer Lisa Latta elected to withdraw her from that race in favour of a mile a fortnight later. "She was in at Hawera the other day, but it was pretty wet, and she is better suited to the mile," Latta said. "She looks fantastic, I couldn't be happier with her."

International

UK: Libertango bags second Group success in Lowther

Libertango (2 f No Nay Never - Ein Gedi by Oasis Dream) looks likely to bid for Group 1 glory next after she bagged Group 2 honours

in Thursday's Lowther Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) at York. Having already scored an impressive victory in the Albany Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) during June's Royal Ascot meeting, the daughter of No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) then ran second behind Senorita Bonita (Starspangledbanner) in the Duchess Of Cambridge Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) at Newmarket last time out. Ridden by usual partner Billy Loughnane for trainer George Boughey, the juvenile filly got back to winning ways as she came from the rear of the field to grab long-time leader Star Of State (State Of Rest) and score by a half-length. There was a further length back to the third-placed Jolivette (Wootton Bassett).

UK: Kalpana clings on in Yorkshire Oaks

The Andrew Balding-trained Kalpana (5 m Study Of Man - Zero Gravity by Dansili) backed up her last-start King George VI And Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 4f) success with victory in Thursday's Yorkshire Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f). Ridden by Colin Keane, the five-year-old mare chased down tearaway front-runner Sugar Island (Dubawi) and hit the front with a furlong to run. However, having made the effort to catch that long-time leader in the softening conditions, Kalpana began to tread water and was almost caught by the fast-finishing Sparan Nua (Dawn Approach), clinging on by a short-head at the line. There was a further two and a half lengths back to Minnie Hauk (Frankel) in third place.

69 for Acclamation

Lethal Beauty (3 f ex Amazonka by Camelot) became the 69th individual stakes winner for late Rathbarry Stud stallion Acclamation

(Royal Applause) when proving too strong in Wednesday's Prix Occitanie (Listed, 1900m) at La Teste De Buch. Ridden by Ronan Thomas for trainers Carlos and Yann Lerner, the three-year-old filly scored by a length and a half over Exceed The Stars (Zelzal). There was a further short-head back to City Queen (Dubawi) in third place. Out of the Camelot (Montjeu) mare Amazonka, she is a half-sister to Coventry Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) winner and soon to be Costillon Stud stallion Rashabar (Holy Roman Emperor). Acclamation died in 2024.

The Matthew Smith-trained Queen's Gamble (Anders) looks set for a step up in class to the Tea Rose Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) next month after producing a dominant display at Warwick Farm on Wednesday.

Ridden by Tommy Berry, who had been aboard for two of the fillies' previous three outings, the daughter of Anders (Not A Single Doubt) broke her maiden in style, defeating Satin Serenade (Frankel) by two and a half lengths.

Albert Palias (Snitzel) finished a further 1.8 lengths back in third place. The win prompted Smith to nominate the Group 2 Tea Rose as the filly's likely next start.

"At this time of year, you've nearly got to have a crack at them if they're going well like that, and she's progressive," Smith said.

"The Tea Rose, it's about four weeks away, which is perfect."

Queen's Gamble had placed in all of her three starts prior to her Warwick Farm win,

and Smith was buoyed by the fact Berry had remained with her again on Wednesday.

"The fact Tommy stayed with her is a big plus because he sits on a lot of nice horses and he could have easily jumped onto something else," Smith said.

"The fact he stayed on, I thought, there's a bit more in the tank than what we're seeing.

"He was confident when she got over a little

bit further, she'd be better, and we've definitely bumped into a couple of handy ones [at her previous starts]."

Bred by K F Leung, Queen's Gamble was purchased by her trainer for \$25,000 at the 2025 Inglis Classic Yearling Sale and is out of the unraced Zoustar (Northern Meteor) mare Gifted Queen, making her a half-sister to winner Lucky Compass (Nicconi).

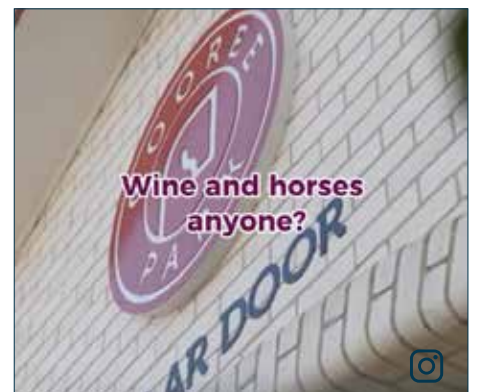
