Senior racing and breeding figures and NSW's shadow racing minister have ramped up calls for the public release of the Hazzard Review into how the sport is run in the state, after confirmation it is now in the hands of cabinet and will remain confidential while that process takes place.

Racing Minister David Harris told a NSW parliament estimates committee on Wednesday the report on Hazzard's review of the NSW Thoroughbred Racing Act of 1996 - which was tendered in late July - was now with cabinet and "in-confidence".

This is despite Harris telling estimates on February 25 the report looking largely into the operations of regulator Racing NSW would be released once he had it.

Asked then by MP Scott Farlow "Will you be making that report public upon its arrival?", Harris had simply answered: "Yes."

Facing estimates on Wednesday, however, Harris said the report - compiled after former state minister Hazzard took depositions from racing and breeding stakeholders for more than two months - was now with Premier Chris Minns' cabinet.

Asked when it would be made public, Harris said: "My reply when I get asked that is that once it's been through the processes it will be released."

Harris was told by Greens MLC Cate Faehrmann: "You've got the review, a lot of people are calling for the release of that, and a helluva lot of people are calling for reform when it comes to Racing NSW."

Asked by Faehrmann "why aren't you making it public?", **Continued on page 3**

Profoundly tops Inglis Digital at \$360,000

Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) placegetter Profoundly (Farnan) topped Wednesday's Inglis Digital August (Late) Online Sale when selling to Boomer Bloodstock for \$360,000.

The mare was offered by her trainer Michael Freedman on behalf of her owners and was purchased by Boomer Bloodstock's Craig Rounsefell for client Peter Murray.

"Peter is building a very strong, young, boutique broodmare band at Three Bridges and Profoundly fits the mould perfectly for what he is looking for," Rounsefell said.

"We've already done plenty of work on a mating plan for her but we will make a final decision on which stallion she visits within the next week.

"We thought she was very fairly valued at \$360,000, that's about where we thought she would land and sometimes the cards fall your way and they certainly did today."

Continued from page 2 Harris replied: "People have to understand Racing New South Wales operates within an exceptionally demanding governance environment. It's uniquely tasked with balancing competing commercial viability, strict regulatory oversight and vital animal welfare obligations.

"It's been a decision of government that cabinet scrutiny provides the necessary cross portfolio alignment and rigour to ensure that any proposed legislative updates are legally robust, carefully balance public accountability with the industry's commercial viability, and adequately protect Racing New South Wales's

crucial social licence without unintended disruptions to the state's racing economy.

"The short answer is that it's been decided the report will go through a cabinet process, so now it's subject to that cabinet process.

"So it'll be up to cabinet."

Harris's comments came after more than 20 prominent industry figures - including Gai Waterhouse, John Messara, Ron Finemore and Matthew Sandblom - co-signed a letter sent to Harris on Sunday calling for the immediate release of the report.

Wednesday's confirmation it was being handled in-confidence in cabinet sparked a fierce reaction from several quarters of the racing and breeding industry.

The head of the peak breeding body in the industry's national heartland of NSW slammed the news as another sign participants in racing in the state had no say in how it was run.

Thoroughbred Breeders NSW (TBNSW) president Hamish Esplin told ANZ Bloodstock News the whole Hazzard review, initially

sparked by the parliamentary inquiry into the failed proposal to sell Rosehill Racecourse, had now been thrown into question.

Continued from page 3 this state, has now suddenly become private,” Esplin said. “Why? It makes no sense.”

Asked if he could see a reason why the report had been sent in-confidence to cabinet, Esplin said: “No, except to say that every participant is now a cynic, and made so because of decisions by this government behind closed doors. It’s only going to spark suspicion.”

Esplin said industry participants deserved the right to read the review as it was tendered by Hazzard.

“As participants in the breeding and racing industry in NSW, we were not involved in the decision to extend the terms of directors on the board of Racing NSW on two occasions, the composition of the selection panel for direct appointments to Racing NSW, approaches to the NSW Government regarding the sale of Rosehill Racecourse, the decision to render black type racing in Australia under the control of foreign bodies, the failure of Racing NSW to deliver a strategic plan, and the failed implementation of the (NSW) Racing for the Regions program,” Esplin said.

“The one time we as participants have been involved is in the Hazzard review, and we’re being told by the minister that we’re not allowed to read it.”

Esplin referenced RNSW chair Saranne Cooke’s March statement likening racing stakeholders to public company shareholders, enjoying returns paid to participants, in which she also took aim at “agitators” in the industry.

“The analogy was that we as participants

are shareholders of a public company, but we are not. We have no right of appearance, no vote, and certainly no control,” Esplin said.

“All we have had is the right to speak to Mr Hazzard, but we’re told again we’re not allowed to hear what he says in reply.

“Nothing has changed. The participants are pawns in a game that we cannot see and we cannot affect. And **Continued on page 6**

Continued from page 5 all we have left is to agitate.”

The Racing Reform Group (RRG), whose steering committee includes prominent breeding and racing figures Arthur Mitchell, Julia Ritchie, Brian Nutt and Jason Abrahams, also lamented Wednesday’s news.

“We’re extremely disappointed, but not surprised,” said Nutt, the group’s secretary, Attunga Stud’s owner and former vice-president of the Scone Race Club, who was among signatories to the letter sent to Harris on Sunday.

“It’s something that Mr Hazzard has put a great deal of work into, it’s something that was commissioned by the government, and yet they seem to be hiding behind cabinet privilege.

“I could only speculate on why they’re doing it.

“We’re going to keep the pressure up and work to get the government to release the report.”

Nutt said the RRG would continue to push for the report’s release.

“We’re still engaging with politicians. I’m still meeting with various politicians from all parties and putting our case,” he said.

The National Party’s shadow racing minister David Layzell - also the Member for Upper Hunter in the breeding heartland - said it was crucial the government made public the report while deliberating its response, especially with only six sitting weeks left in the parliamentary year, equating to only 18 days in which both houses convene.

“We now understand the Hazzard Report is before cabinet and it is now the decision of Premier Minns when he wants to release the report,” Layzell said in a statement to ANZ.

“The minister in his evidence at budget estimates stated very clearly that he passed the ball to the Premier to decide.

“This report should be released to the public because it is in the best interest of the racing industry to do so. There has been significant contribution made by industry participants to raise issues and they are keen to see their information included and assessed.

“There is no reason why the report shouldn’t have been released to the public while the government deliberated their response. I do not know the reasons why the report has not been released to date. I have no knowledge of what is in it that would warrant secrecy.

“I trust and expect that the premier will release the report in an appropriate timeline. However, with just six weeks left of parliament for this year, it is important that they do so ASAP. Time is running out.”

Contacted by ANZ, Waterhouse texted simply: “How long do we have to wait to hear the truth?”

Continued from page 6 Hazzard was appointed last August to conduct his review, to particularly investigate RNSW's governance, board appointments and tenure, transparency, stakeholder consultation, integrity, horse welfare, and the industry's sustainability.

Industry critics argue that significant changes since the Thoroughbred Racing Act was introduced in 1996, including the rise of corporate bookmakers and changes in the distribution of wagering revenue, have raised questions about whether the legislation remains appropriate for the modern industry.

The terms of reference excluded consideration of Racing NSW's status as a body corporate independent of government and the industry's funding arrangements, these exclusions that drew criticism from some industry participants.

Harris told the estimates committee reviews of racing were being conducted in countries other than Australia.

"A lot of these practices and things were put in

place in a different era, before a lot of technology," he said. "So I think it's appropriate that we are now looking at the appropriateness of the act.

"We are doing it with great seriousness, and subject to those cabinet deliberations we'll be announcing what we'll do going forward."

Labor's racing minister was taken to task by Nationals MLC Wes Fang, accusing him of a lack of consultation with industry groups including the NSW Trainers' Association, TBNSW, and the RRG. Harris confirmed he had not met with any of the three.

"All three bodies have asked to meet with you, but you haven't met with any of them," Fang said, adding "you can't just leave it to Racing New South Wales, Minister".

He was also asked about the contentious Racing for the Regions program. A spokesman for Harris told the committee new processes had been put in place and were being delivered upon to ensure the scheme was now running more efficiently than it had been. This included monthly status reports from RNSW.

Early in the budget estimates hearing, Independent MLC Mark Latham also cited the government "handing over five crown land leases for racecourses to Racing New South Wales".

Latham asked whether Racing NSW's regulatory structure created what he described as an "obvious conflict of interest", arguing that "the regulator regulates itself".

"Does it worry you, this obvious conflict of interest ... that the regulator regulates itself?" Latham said.

Harris replied: "... I think that's part of what we're having a look at, is whether the current legislation remains relevant."

Price and Kent Jnr pair to kick off in Memsie

Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr will have a pair of runners in Saturday's Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield. Both Sabaj (Manhattan Rain) and Planet Red (Admire Mars) ran well in Group 1 contests last season, with the former hitting fourth in both the All-Star Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) and Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) while the latter finished second in both the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), but Price expects both to come on for their runs this weekend. Blake Shinn partnered Planet Red in a recent Pakenham jumpout on August 11 behind Sheza Alibi (Saxon Warrior), while Sabaj finished just in front of his stablemate in the same heat. "They're both going well but I don't expect either of them to win, I suppose," Price said. "Sabaj is a Cranbourne Cup winner who has a nice race in him while Planet Red is a three-year-old going into his four-year-old year. I think they'll both be suited in mile handicaps, like the Toorak and those sorts of races."

Custom bidding to bounce back

Custom (Street Boss) will return to stakes company on Saturday as the Ciaron Maher-trained mare lines up in the Courtza Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield. Having taken out a Benchmark 74 (1200m) at Caulfield back in July, the daughter of Street Boss (Street Cry) was then sent off an odds-on favourite to follow up back at the track in a Benchmark 88 (1200m) but could only manage third. However, Custom returned to Caulfield on Tuesday morning for a gallop that provided Maher confidence heading back to the track this weekend. "She worked well and she is a nice horse," Maher said. "It was a bit disappointing last time, but she ran a huge

Third-top lot honours were shared between racehorses Without Parallel (Time Test) and No Friends (Cool Aza Beel), both selling for \$165,000. In all there were six lots to realise \$100,000 or more in the August (Late) Sale including Fire Star (Deep Field) selling to David Pfeffer for \$140,000 and Avengers (Snitzel) realising \$120,000 to the bid of the Executive Racing Club.

In total, the sale grossed \$3,551,400. Entries are now open for the Inglis Digital September (Early) Sale, which will run from September 4-9. Entries close at midnight next Wednesday, September 2. To enter [click here](#).

Cafe Millenium to line up on Memsie card

Lindsay Park will send Mr Brightside's (Bullbars) galloping partner to line up alongside their stable star on Saturday's Caulfield card. Cafe Millenium (Not A Single Doubt) will run first-up in the Evergreen Turf Handicap (1400m), just two races after Mr Brightside returns in the Memsie Stakes. A three-time winner at Listed level, Cafe Millenium has progressed from winning a Benchmark 84 (1420m) contest at his second start for Ben, Will and JD Hayes to now becoming a stakes victor. "He's been the work partner of Mr Brightside the whole way through the preparation," Ben Hayes said. "And I think Cafe Millennium is going particularly well and he's not just a morning glory. He's always worked well at home, and he always gives you confidence going into races, whereas Brightside is the opposite, always being a bit lazy in his gallops."

Competitive showing expected from Diameter

Champion trainer Chris Waller is hoping that Diameter (Brazen Beau) can produce a bold effort first-up in Saturday's Up And Coming Stakes (Gr 3, 1300m). The Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m)-placed colt will head to Rosehill for the Group 3 contest looking to add a second stakes win to his CV after landing last season's Fernhill Mile (Listed, 1600m). Diameter was entered for both the San Domenico Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) and the Up And Coming Stakes,

with Waller opting for the latter. "He's Group 1-placed over a mile, and a winner over a mile, but he's by Brazen Beau so I think he'll find some speed and be competitive first-up," Waller said.

Run To The Rose next for Central Europe

Waller also had Central Europe (Frankel) on hand for the Up And Coming following his first-up third behind fillies Chilly Girl (Trapeze Artist) and Blue Door (Stay Inside) in The Rosebud (Listed, 1100m), however he will be next seen in the Run To The Rose (Gr 2, 1200m) on September 12. "I just feel if we run him too many times, he's not going to get to his grand finals as well as he could if we space his runs," Waller said. "He goes third-up into the Golden Rose, and then he can either go up in distance to a Caulfield Guineas or back in distance to races like the Everest and the Coolmore sprint."

Gibbons looking forward to partnering Southend

Jockey Dylan Gibbons was determined to partner the Gerald Ryan and Sterling Alexiou-trained Southend (Palace Pier) in this weekend's Up And Coming Stakes and is hopeful the colt can repay that faith this season. Having scored on debut at Newcastle back in March, the three-year-old Palace Pier (Kingman) colt then landed the Baillieu Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m) before a sixth-placed finish in the Champagne Stakes. "If you're not excited about seeing a horse like that come back, well what's wrong with you," Gibbons told Racing NSW. "He did a good job in his first preparation, winning his first start and going on to win a Group 3. This time of year if you don't chase better rides on nice horses you've ridden you'll lose them pretty quickly. I was making sure I kept tabs on him to get back on him."

Xtreme to head back to Rosehill

Having returned with a first-up second placing in a Class 3 Highway (1300m) at Rosehill on August 15, the Paul Snowden-trained Xtreme (Exceedance) will head back to the Sydney track on Saturday in a bid to go one better. The four-year-old was a \$160,000 yearling purchase and

made three starts for a third and a second before being resold to Patriot Bloodstock for \$20,000. Sent to Snowden, the son of Exceedance (Exceed And Excel) has since won two and placed in a further four of his seven starts for the Port Macquarie-based trainer, but wasn't an easy horse to deal with in the beginning. "He was dirty on the world the horse, he wasn't an easy horse to work with," Snowden said. "I nearly threw the towel in myself. I've been very candid about my opinion of him early on with the owners and I just changed something in his work and it just flicked him." Xtreme tackles this weekend's Buy Your Kosciuszko Tickets At TAB Highway (1400m) bidding to improve his record. "He's been really good ever since, he worked great on Tuesday morning," Snowden added.

Step up in class due for Tenenbaum

The Brad Widdup-trained Tenenbaum (Snitzel) began his three-year-old career with a Benchmark 64 (1200m) win at Canterbury. A full-brother to 2025 Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) winner Cap Ferrat, the Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) colt was ridden by Chad Schofield and defeated Yangzi River (Tassort) by 2.2 lengths. There was a further 0.3 lengths back to the third-placed Sprightly Affair (Home Affairs). "He's always shown a hell of a lot of promise," Widdup said. "Unfortunately last time he got crook leading up to the better races and we had to change tack. He went to a maiden and won well and everyone saw what happened in the Clarendon Stakes. He never really got a fair crack. He's bounced back and he's in at the right time of year. We'll try to sneak around the edges and see how far we get with him this time through, but he looks a horse with talent." Widdup revealed that Tenenbaum could now head to stakes grade, with his record standing at two wins from four outings. "He's still learning. I don't think I'd want to go 2000 [metres] in the spring, or to a Derby or anything," he said. "But there are a lot of good races."

Piedmont opens account at Canterbury

Regan Bayliss came away from Canterbury pretty impressed with Piedmont (Pinatubo)

after the filly broke her maiden at the second time of asking. Having run third over 1200 metres at the same track on debut, the daughter of Pinatubo (Shamardal) improved upon that debut with a 1.2 lengths success over Affari (Home Affairs). There was a further 1.4 lengths back to the third-placed Made In Italy (Pierro). "She's a pretty smart filly and has a lot of good attributes to her," Bayliss said. "She's got a good brain, great action and a really good attitude. She pinged out, relaxed well and showed a good turn of foot in the straight." Piedmont is a half-sister to Group winners Encryption (Lonhro) and Emanate (Lonhro) being the fifth winner from seven foals to race out of Guelph (Exceed And Excel), who was Champion 3YO Filly.

J-Mac back in Melbourne

James McDonald will return to Melbourne to ride for the first time this year, with six mounts booked at Caulfield on Saturday. 'J-Mac' was last seen in Melbourne riding Via Sistina (Fastnet Rock) to success in the Champions Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m), and takes the rides aboard Confederation (Wootton Bassett) in the McNeil Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), Star Of India (Galileo) in a 2000-metre handicap, Enviaible (Frankel) in the Benchmark 78 (1400m) for fillies and mares, and Craig (Territories) in the Benchmark 100 over 1400 metres. McDonald will also have a ride for Chris Waller in both the Memsie and Heatherlie Stakes (Listed, 1700m).

Brighthill announce death of Savile Row

Henrietta, Duchess of Bedford and Brighthill Farm have reported the death of Savile Row (Makfi). The Group 1-performed son of Makfi (Dubawi) had looked set for a promising season when paraded at last weekend's Gavelhouse Stallion Parade, but sadly he has died at the age of 13. "He looked the picture of health on Saturday, but unfortunately when we went to his paddock on Monday morning, he had succumbed to a heart attack," Brighthill Farm's Nick King said. "This is particularly sad for Henrietta, who had a lot of faith in the horse. Since purchasing him in June, she had wanted to give him every opportunity at stud and she was achieving just that, with a number of mares booked in at the time of his passing." From limited opportunities, Savile Row sired 14 winners from 25 runners, including stakes-placed fillies She Suits Herself and Perfectly Suited, along with Group 2 fourth-placegetter Suit Yourself.

NZTR appoints representatives to Establishment Board

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR) has appointed current NZTR chair Paul Humphries and NZTR director Dean Lawrence as its representatives on the newly formed racing industry Establishment Board. The time-bound board, independently chaired by Dean McKenzie, brings together representatives from NZTR, Harness Racing New Zealand and TAB NZ. It will assess options for a more sustainable and efficient industry governance and operating model. Humphries brings

extensive commercial and governance experience, alongside a lifelong involvement in thoroughbred racing as an owner, breeder, sponsor and administrator. He has previously held administrative roles at a club level and as chair of the NZTR Members' Council. Lawrence combines racing administration experience with a strong public-sector and international background. He has held senior roles with Inland Revenue and is currently on the panel of experts for the International Monetary Fund in revenue and tax administration. His racing experience includes serving as president of the Otago Racing Club and as a board member of Gallop South, as well as longstanding involvement in thoroughbred ownership and breeding. Recommended proposals developed by the Establishment Board will remain subject to the approval of the relevant organisations and any applicable governance, consultation or statutory requirements. The Establishment Board is expected to begin its work shortly. NZTR will keep the thoroughbred racing community informed as the programme progresses.

Singletary chasing turnaround in Guineas

A recent trial success has given Andrew Campbell confidence that his promising three-year-old Singletary (Satono Aladdin) is back on track. The Otaki trainer had to regroup following a disappointing end to the son of Satono Aladdin's (Deep Impact) juvenile campaign and is looking for redemption in the Wanganui Guineas (Listed, 1200m) on Saturday. Singletary came in for strong support on his home track in the Ryder Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at the end of July, but had little luck in the running and finished out of the frame. "He started favourite and was caught three wide all the way and over-raced," Campbell said. "It was disappointing on face value, but it may have also been the track, it was quite holding that day." Singletary has been freshened and produced an encouraging performance earlier this month at Foxton where he led all the way and was untouched to claim his 1000-metre heat by three lengths. "He won easily enough so we'll roll the dice again and have a crack at the Guineas, he's better than his last start," Campbell said.

Moxie on song for Proisir Plate

Group 2 winner Moxie (Strasbourg) showed she is on song for next week's Proisir Plate (Gr 1, 1400m) at Ellerslie following her convincing trial win over 1150 metres at Te Awamutu on Tuesday. The five-year-old mare took owner-trainer Ken Harrison on a great ride last season, which included victory in the Dubai Classic (Gr 2, 1400m) at Ellerslie on Champions Day, and he said she has returned a more impressive animal this season. "She seems bigger and stronger, and she is coming along nicely," Harrison said. Moxie made her first public appearance of the season when unplaced in a Group and Listed trial over 1100 metres at Taupo earlier this month. She was asked for more on Tuesday and delivered on an unsuitable Heavy 8 track. "She didn't really like the track that much, it was a bit Heavy for her, but I am very happy," Harrison said.

Shailer pair building nicely into spring campaigns

Justin Case (Banquo) and Magice (Savabeel) contributed to a memorable season for Kris Shailer in his return to the training ranks last term, and he is hoping they can continue their form into the new season. Shailer, who runs Waikato Stud's pre-training arm, Courtza Park, said Matamata Slipper (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Justin Case has developed over his spell. The gelding made his first public appearance of the season at the Te Awamutu trials on Tuesday, where he finished runner-up in his 850-metre heat, and Shailer was pleased with what he saw. "It was a nice trial yesterday and I am pretty happy with him, he seems to be coming up quite nicely," he said. "He will more than likely go the Colin Meads for his first-up run and then I have no plans after that. It is a little bit unknown

what he is going to be up against or how he is going to measure up." Magice, who won one and placed in one of his four starts last season, also trialled yesterday, and placed in his 1150-metre heat. "He has done a good job in the few starts that he has had with me," Shailer said. "I think he is a very impressive horse. He trialled nicely, he is very big in condition, so we gave him a decent hit-out."

Logan hoping her fillies can snare more black-type

Byerley Park trainer Donna Logan was pleased to step her stakes-performed fillies, Parfait Dimanche (Anders) and Belle Rebelle (Ribchester), out at the Te Awamutu trials on Tuesday, and she is hoping they can both match their black-type feats from last season this spring. While winless as a juvenile, Parfait Dimanche placed in both the Eclipse Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) and Colin Jillings 2YO Classic (Gr 3, 1200m), and Logan was pleased to see the daughter of Anders (Not A Single Doubt) take out her 850-metre heat on Tuesday. "It was a good trial," Logan said. "She has strengthened up a lot since she went out for a spell and really fought hard to the line on her own merits. She has pulled up well from the trial this morning, so I am very pleased with it. I may well look at Hastings as a kick-off point on the 12th of September for the Sir Colin Meads Trophy over 1200 metres, or there is a maiden there on the same day. We are just planning at this point where to take her." Stablemate Belle Rebelle, who was runner-up in the Star Way Stakes (Listed, 1200m) last season, didn't cop the Heavy 8 track conditions at Te Awamutu and finished fourth in her heat. "Belle Rebelle was in a really hot heat," Logan said. "Masa [Hashizume] said she didn't like the track at all, so I thought it was a pretty good effort from her."

UK: Blue Point colt tops day one of Doncaster Premier Yearling Sale

A colt by Blue Point (Shamardal) out of the four-time stakes-winning mare Happy Romance (Dandy Man) topped the opening day of the Goffs Doncaster Premier Yearling Sale on Tuesday when selling for £250,000 (approx. AU\$473,790). Sold to Rabbah Bloodstock, the purchase completed a full-circle moment for the McMurray family, who raced Happy Romance after she was bought by Peter and Ross Doyle for £25,000 at the 2019 renewal of the Goffs Doncaster Premier Yearling Sale. The mare would also go on to finish runner-up in Group 1 company during her racing career under Richard Hannon. "Happy Romance was the first filly we bought and put in training, and she did really well for us," said Oliver McMurray. "I did the mating myself, as I love my pedigrees. Blue Point had just had a cracking season, with Rosallion having just won the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, and I noticed that he'd worked well with Danehill-line mares before. Sending him Happy Romance, being so precocious and speedy, just looked like a good commercial mating." Turnover for the opening day of the sale came in at £7,859,000 (approx. AU\$14.89 million), very similar to in 2025, while the average was down two per cent at £43,905 (approx. AU\$83,210), and the median was down four per cent to £32,000 (approx. AU\$60,650). The clearance rate dropped to 81 per cent from 88 per cent as 179 lots sold from 221 offered.

It's In The Blood

Bootlegger

Some pedigrees are like a lone whistle, the hybrid vigour type coming out clear and clean. Others are more like a seven-part harmony.

For lovers of an intricate pedigree, that belonging to dual Adelaide stakes winner Bootlegger (Too Darn Hot) is what's known in technical breeding terms as "a doozy".

South Australian breeder Robert Hill-Smith and his advisor Damon Gabbedy decided to put the mare Princess Youmzain (Dalakhani) to an unproven second-season shuttler to Australia named Too Darn Hot (Dubawi), and like a golden run at the blackjack table, the cards all fell into place.

The result is that the pedigree of Bootlegger - a poster boy for South Australian breeding who claimed his second black type win with a tough all-the-way victory in Saturday's Leon McDonald Stakes (Listed, 1400m) - is an intriguing one indeed.

Princess Youmzain did little elsewhere - she won one race over 1800 metres in Germany from four starts for Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m)-winning trained Andreas Wohler, and her other four foals of age have been moderate - but her mating with Too Darn Hot produced a lattice work of some beauty, especially now it's been franked by Bootlegger's performances.

There are four powerful duplications in key positions in the first five generations, strengthened further when you expand to six.

The first that stands out is Delsy (Abdos). Born in 1972, she was Group 3-placed in her native France but soared in the breeding barn.

She's the dam of the outstanding Aga Khan-bred broodmare Darara (Top Ville), who won the Prix Vermeille (Gr 1, 2400m) and left no fewer than four categorised Champions and five Group 1 winners. Darara was bought by Lord and Lady Lloyd Webber of Watership

Down Stud in 1994 for a hefty 470,000 Irish guineas, just short of \$1 million Australian.

Among Darara's progeny was Darazari (Sadler's Wells), who won a Group 2 in France and came to Australia to win the 1999 Ranvet Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Rosehill.

Darara also left Dar Re Mi (Singspiel), who for the Lloyd Webbers won three Group 1s in Ireland, England and Dubai. When she was covered by Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) - who like Dar Re Mi had top-tier winning parents - it resulted in another triple Group 1 winner, Too Darn Hot.

Delsy's other star progeny was Darshaan (Shirley Heights), who won the Prix du Jockey Club (Gr 1, 2100m), for the Aga Khan. At stud his progeny included 2003 European Horse of the Year Dalakhani, who won four times at the top level before going to stud.

Dalakhani shuttled to today's column's neck of the woods - Cornerstone Stud in South Australia - for three seasons in the early 2010s.

But back in Europe he sired the British-bred Princess Youmzain.

And thus Bootlegger has this great progenitor Delsy repeated in his pedigree at 4f x 4m in strong places - Too Darn Hot's female line and Princess Youmzain's paternal line.

Bootlegger is also powered by inbreeding to three key stallions - Sadler's Wells (Northern Dancer), Shirley Heights (Mill Reef) and Mr. Prospector (Raise A Native), the last two of whom appear in triplicate within the first six columns.

Sadler's Wells sits at 5m x 4f, as Dar Re Mi's third sire (via his son In The Wings) and as the sire of Bootlegger's third dam Wells Whisper.

Shirley Heights is at 5m, 6f x 4m, He's the sire of Dubawi's damsire, the damsire of In The Wings, and flows strongly into Princess Youmzain as her third sire.

And Mr. Prospector makes his presence felt in a 5m x 5m, 6m. He's Too Darn Hot's fourth sire and comes in twice in the bottom half

since Princess Youmzain is inbred to his son Miswaki - Dalakhani's damsire and the father of Bootlegger's fourth dam Whakalyric. Showing the strength of his daughters, Miswaki is also the damsire of the great Galileo (Sadler's Wells), although he's not here.

There's a few more duplications in the sixth column which can't hurt.

Buckpasser (Tom Fool) is at 6f x 6f and appears five times in the first seven columns.

Lyphard (Northern Dancer) is at 6m x 6f, the latter as Bootlegger's fifth damsire. The French stallion Herbager (Vandale) is at 6f x 6m, though somewhat buried, and appears four times overall in the first nine generations. And the great Northern Dancer (Nearctic) is at 6m, 6m x 6m, 5m amid six spots in total.

For good measure the influential mare Lalun (Djeddah) brings up the rear at 8m, 8m, 9m x 7m, 7m, while her fellow North American blue hen Natalma (Native Dancer) takes seven spots, six as Northern Dancer's dam.

Overall, though, it's that key repetition of Delsy that is strongly at play. She's the highest contributor of blood to Bootlegger, with 12.5 per cent, ahead of Shirley Heights' 10.94 per cent and the 9.38 per cent each from Sadler's Wells, Miswaki and Northern Dancer.

While Princess Youmzain herself was no star on the racetrack, Bootlegger's female line boasts a good dose of quality.

That third dam Wells Whisper threw two Listed winners in Germany, one of whom bore a German elite winner in Well Timed (Holy Roman Emperor), who took Dusseldorf's Preis der Diana (Gr 1, 2200m).

And unraced second dam Wonder Why (Tiger Hill) threw two Group winners including Akeed Mofeed (Dubawi), who claimed the Hong Kong Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) and Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) amid four stakes wins. He was another stallion to stand at Cornerstone Stud for a time - among a few other farms in a modest breeding career to date. This South Australian proximity and familiarity helped influence Hill-Smith to buy Princess Youmzain, he says.

But while Bootlegger's pedigree is laced with all of these juicy repetitions, they came about as something of a bonus. The main impetus was finding a stallion to suit Princess Youmzain on type.

She was bought out of Ireland by Cornerstone, continuing their association with Dalakhani, and later purchased privately from that farm by Hill-Smith, in-foal to Pierro (Lonhro). But until fifth foal Bootlegger she'd had precious little success at stud.

That Pierro filly - Clover Beat - at least fetched \$100,000 when bought as a yearling by Busuttin Racing, but never saw a racetrack.

Hill-Smith, the owner of Yalumba Wines who breeds through his Vintage Bloodstock holdings, next bred Zain Prince (So You Think). Now seven, he's won four times in the bush and once placed at Morphetville. Next came Hungry Guest (Merchant Navy), who was unplaced in five starts.

Almost despairing, in 2020 Hill-Smith sent his Princess Youmzain to Too Darn Hot, standing his first season in Australia at \$44,000 (inc GST). The bad luck continued when she missed, but his second try a year later produced Bootlegger.

"To say Princess Youmzain was a bit disappointing as a broodmare is a bit of an understatement," Hill-Smith tells *It's In The Blood*.

"She had a helluva good pedigree. Dalakhani wasn't the best, but he's not a bad broodmare sire. And Akeed Mofeed was still producing winners when I bought her.

"I probably over-covered her, considering the performance of her produce, but

Too Darn Hot had a beautiful pedigree and I thought, 'This is the last shot'."

Gabbedy, of Belmont Bloodstock, was also keen on the mating.

"We liked Too Darn Hot's credentials. We loved him as a sire prospect and loved the Dubawi sireline," he tells *It's In The Blood*.

"But most importantly, he was physically compatible for Princess Youmzain. She was a very tall, lanky, skinny mare. Her two foals prior to Bootlegger were like her - tall and lanky. We thought, 'We've got to find a stallion who's physically compatible for her'.

"Too Darn Hot was small-to-medium sized, chunky like a Not A Single Doubt type of stallion, and we thought that physical was the best that would suit her.

"That was the first criteria."

Then Gabbedy and Hill-Smith explored what the pedigree would look like.

"And I thought - this is a really interesting pedigree, actually," Gabbedy says.

"There's a double of Mr. Prospector, a double of Shirley Heights, a double of Sadler's Wells - and then you get inbred to Delsy.

"I couldn't find many stats on inbreeding to Delsy, but a wise man once told me inbreeding to superior females is not a bad idea.

"So the double-ups looked appealing. Then we looked at Dubawi over Dalakhani as well. That hadn't been done heaps but was showing some promising signs."

Dubawi over Dalakhani is now more than promising. With four stakes winners from 11 runners at 36 per cent, it's the legendary sire's second-best nick of 11 runners or more.

Too Darn Hot over Dalakhani runs at 16 per cent, thanks to Bootlegger being among its three winners from six starters. But the Darley shuttler's first Group 1 winner was Fallen Angel, who claimed Ireland's Moyglare Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) and has Dalakhani as second damsire.

Gabbedy says the physicals at the top of Bootlegger's pedigree offset any fears about possible stoutness in the foal.

"Shirley Heights has good inbreeding stats, and Mr. Prospector is a fantastic influence," he said.

"You do have to be careful with doubling Sadler's Wells, because you can get quite stout offspring. And Princess Youmzain's damsire was Tiger Hills, by Danehill, which brings stoutness too.

"But Dubawi and Too Darn Hot were sort of more milers, so we were trying to get their

physical into the mare. It's really good when it works out alright."

Bootlegger went to the 2024 Inglis Premier Yearling Sale but was passed in at \$125,000.

Hill-Smith organised some friends to join him in the ownership, and now the Clarken-MacGillivray trained four-year-old gelding is rewarding them in spades, with Saturday's win following on from his first stakes success in the Morphetville Guineas (Listed, 1600m) last autumn.

"He's improved. He's an honest horse," says Hill-Smith, who also bred 2014 South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Kushadasi (Choisir) and last autumn's Auraria Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m) winner and Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) runner-up Mating Call (Brazen Beau).

"When Bootlegger won his second race we got offered quite a lot of money from Hong Kong. But it's hard to have a good horse and have some fun, so we decided to keep him, and I'm glad we did. Saturday's win was at weight-for-age, so it was a very good performance."

Somewhat ironically, Princess Youmzain was moved on before Bootlegger proved she could throw a good one. After she missed to Darley's Victor Ludorum (Shamardal) in 2023, Hill-Smith sold her the following year for all of \$600, carrying a colt by Dubious (Not A Single Doubt).

That two-year-old colt remains unnamed at this stage, and Princess Youmzain sadly died four months after his birth, aged 13.

But through that spicy mating with Too Darn Hot, the lanky British-bred mare has left a worthy legacy.

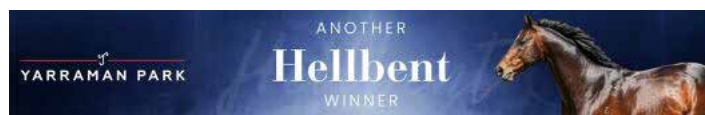
