## Merchant Navy colt holds sway on second day of Magic Millions National Sale

Weanlings by first season sires prove popular on day two at the Gold Coast

unter Valley pinhookers are relying on the progeny of two high-profile first season sires to appeal to a wide cross-section of buyers at next year's yearling sales and they backed their judgment by purchasing the two highest-priced lots at the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale yesterday. MAGIC MILLIONS

Valiant Stud principal Fergal Connolly was prepared to go to \$210,000 for a colt by Coolmore's dual hemisphere Group 1-winning sprinter Merchant Navy (Fastnet Rock) while Sledmere Stud's Royston Murphy went to \$200,000 for a son of fellow young sire Russian Revolution (Snitzel).

The session-topping Merchant Navy colt, the most expensive foal by a first season sire to sell this year, was *Continued on page 2>>*

HUNTER STALLION PARADES CANCELLED - PAGE 15 << *Continued from page 1* offered by Rothwell Park who was also the vendor of the \$410,000 Zoustar (Northern Meteor) weanling colt sold on Thursday.

Connolly made a quick-fire impression on day two with a \$160,000 outlay on a Fastnet Rock (Danehill) filly from the family of Godolphin's Group 2 winner Ghisoni (Lonhro) before adding the Merchant Navy colt six lots later.

"It's great to be here on the Gold Coast to see the quality weanlings on offer and I have to commend all the vendors who have turned out their horses in excellent condition, particularly the last two drafts we've purchased from in Rothwell Park and Aquis Farm. The horses looked outstanding," Connolly told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"We're very excited to have a Fastnet Rock filly going forward and a Merchant Navy colt. It is so good to actually work with Merchant Navy again, being so close to the family having worked at Segenhoe for years.

"Having him foal there and watching his racing career, I've been very close to the whole process."

The colt is the first foal out of the Group 1-performed Awoke, who is in foal to Deep Field (Northern Meteor) and was purchased by Nick Vass for \$350,000 at the broodmare sale earlier this week; he was catalogued as Lot 1030.

"The Merchant Navys are very good solid conformed types. This colt moved very well and I thought he'd appeal to so many people with his family being very up to date and modern. He's a standout colt for me with

the way he moved," he said.

"We will aim to come to the sales and reoffer these horses for people to come and see and my prediction is that there will be a lot of people looking at them."

The Fastnet Rock filly, meanwhile, is the fourth foal out of the unraced Antillanca (Street Cry), herself a half-sister



to Ghisoni and daughter of Surround Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) winner Portillo (Red Ransom). She was consigned by Aquis Farm as Lot 1024.

"I think (\$160,000) is great value. You've got a race filly first, but a broodmare for life," Connolly said.

"She's a nice type of Fastnet filly like Atlantic Jewel. It's a very modern family with Darley and Godolphin in the second dam."

With the intention of reoffering his weanling purchases as yearlings, Connolly believes the pair will find favour with trainers and owners even amid the coronavirus pandemic.

He said: "The way the economy is at the minute I think we all foresee a little bit of a drop off in the market but outstanding types will always sell.

"Trainers will always want the nice horses, so I am confident that the horses we've purchased, for that reason, will meet the market." *Continued on page 4>>*

## Sledmere takes shine to Russian colt

Earlier in the full-day session, a Russian Revolution colt fitted the criteria for Sledmere Stud and pinhooking partner Cangon Stud and Murphy believes the just-turned yearling may have even been deserving of a price tag higher than \$200,000.

"We only really came here with the intention of buying a couple of horses and he was the one we definitely wanted to leave with and hopefully we can bring him back here next year," the Sledmere principal said.

"We're very big fans of Russian Revolution. We've seen his stock at home and I think his stock will come here in January and be very popular.

"When the trainers get to see them I think they will see what we see. They are good, athletic

horses who are well-muscled."

A half-brother to MRC Vain Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) winner Got The Nod (U S Ranger), the colt is the eighth foal for Silent Cash (Secret Savings), an unplaced half-sister to the juvenilewinning, Group 2-placed Silent But Deadly (Choisir). Consigned by Newgate Farm, the home of Russian Revolution, he was catalogued as Lot 947.

Murphy said comparing weanlings against their own stock at home had played an important role in determining the likely rate of development of the foals offered this week.

"As I've said to a few people looking at horses this week, I think they change so much (from May to July) and, before we go to a sale, we always walk around the paddocks at home to look at what we have so when you get to the sales you know what you're comparing to," he said.

"Even from our own draft, we've got horses who will change a lot in the next few months.

"That is why it's important to talk to vendors and ask them where they think they are in their stage of life. This is what we do, so hopefully we can get it right."

As for the market over the past two days, Murphy was matter of fact.

"Like every sale I have ever gone to, the good horses have sold well," he said.

## Lime Country make mark

The leading buyer at the sale was Lime Country Thoroughbreds in conjunction with agent James Bester, who purchased four lots at an average of \$112,500.

After securing a Written Tycoon (Iglesia) filly for \$230,000 on day one, they added colts by Russian Revolution (\$115,000), a son of American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile) (\$70,000) and a colt by Vancouver (Medaglia d'Oro) (\$35,000).

"James has advised clients of the farm in the past and he was my pick for a weanling agent to work with. We've used different agents for different things," Lime Country's Jo Griffin said.

"But as far as weanlings go, James always buys an athlete, a race horse before anything else. That's his top priority and I think as the market is what it is trainers are more and more racehorse-focussed above pedigree.

"They can be more forgiving on some issues and James can see past the obvious issues."

As could be expected, all measures year-on-year at the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale declined, but importantly, trade has occurred during the Covid-19 pandemic. *Continued on page 6>>*

<< *Continued from page 4* Last night, there were 186 weanlings sold at an average of \$41,485 at a median of \$24,500. The clearance rate was at 72 per cent which held on what was achieved on the small day one afternoon session.

"When you look at what is going on in the world I am satisfied with the results, although I did expect there to be a little bit more strength in the middle end than what there was," Magic Millions managing director Barry Bowditch said last night.



## Snitzel, Savabeel in rare air as a new season dawns

hampion sires Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) and Savabeel (Zabeel) have added to their title reigns on both sides of the Tasman as the 2019-20 racing season came to a close yesterday.

Arrowfield Stud's Snitzel won his fourth champion Australian sire title in succession with his runners earning \$17,863,769 in the 2019-20 season. He joins Danehill (Danzig), Star Kingdom (Stardust) and Delville Wood (Bois Roussel) as the only stallions to win four consecutive titles in the last 80 years.

Snitzel, who turned 18 today, had more than \$2 million to spare over his nearest chasers I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) and Pierro (Lonhro), whose progeny earned \$15,853,261 and \$15,791,748 respectively.

Among his best performers of 18 stakes

winners were bombproof filly Away Game, winner of the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) and two Group races as well as finishing second in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and fourth in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m); Arrowfield 3YO Sprint (Gr 2, 1200m) conqueror Splintex; and I Am Excited, who retired to the breeding barn after her win in The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) at Rosehill.

Arrowfield Stud principal John Messara believes that Snitzel's fourth title is all the more satisfying given that he didn't have the boost of

Redzel's winning cheque from The Everest this season, as he did in 2017-18 and 2018-19.

"He's a horse that, for some reason, people don't fully appreciate his deeds and his achievements," Messara told ANZ Bloodstock News. "I think he's etching his place in history now quite seriously, as very few horses have won four consecutive seasons.

"People will sit back on the results this year and think to themselves, hang on, this guy's won four in a row in an unbelievably competitive market with only access to a small proportion of mares. It's very gratifying.

"I think in his first and fourth years, he's done it the hard way. And he's done it by a pretty big margin this year, a couple of million dollars, which I think is a great achievement.

"The other thing is that he hasn't got access to all the Danehill-line mares which represent a pretty big swathe of the Australian gene pool. So he's doing it with a couple of hands tied behind his back and he's still beating all of the competition and it is a pretty competitive situation."

Arrowfield Stud also claimed the leading broodmare sire title with the late Redoute's Choice (Danehill) making it two trophies in a row. The three-time Australian champion sire was the damsire of 20 stakes winners in 2019-20, including four at Group 1 level: Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) victor Super Seth (Dundeel), Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) scorer Flit (Medaglia d'Oro), The Goodwood (Gr 1, 1200m) hero Trekking (Street Cry) and Regal Power (Pierro), triumphant in the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and also his highest earner through his success in the All-Star Mile (1600m) at Caulfield.

While Snitzel has now eclipsed Redoute's Choice with his fourth champion sire title, Messara still believes that this season's titleholder has some way to go to match his sire and his grandsire Danehill - although he does believe he has the potential to join that pantheon.

"I think he probably still sits third to those two (Danehill and Redoute's Choice) but there's nothing to say that he won't climb," Messara said. "And I say this, because he's had a harder task than the other two and it's nearly impossible for him to do what they did.

"Danehill had, like Star Kingdom before him, a totally open book. Danehill came here to a totally virginal population, he got all the outcrosses, it was all there for him. He could access every mare in the country and see what worked and what didn't work.

"Redoute's was much the same because, while Danehill did impact a lot of mares and he had some decent-sized books, there was still a great proportion of the population that was still available.

"This poor guy is limited to all the non-Danehill line mares but half of them are Danehill. It's difficult. He's had to do it with all those sons and

grandsons of Danehill, fusing their genes and all those mares that can't really go to him. So give him a lot of credit for that.

"But those other two did it earlier than he did: Danehill did it first season, Redoute's did it second season. This guy worked into it over a number of years.

"So perhaps we're judging him harshly; perhaps we should be more generous towards him."

With a new season now upon us and a clean slate across the board,

"Frankly, I know this might sound a bit cheeky but I can't see any reason why he wouldn't do it again next year," he said. "He's had a large number of two-year-old winners, 30-odd, it's not his record number of two-yearold winners but it's a large number. He's got a bunch of nice three-year-olds around as well that are going to go on.

"The work in progress is there and his yearlings, too, I'm aware of a number of nice yearlings going through as well so he's got twoand three-year-olds from the year just ending and he's got yearlings, good numbers from good quality mares. So why won't he continue?

"We've got to try and elongate his useful life as best we can, not give him too much to do but give him enough to get a nice spread of mares. That will be the challenge now. But he's very fertile and he's in very good fettle."

> Snitzel will stand for \$165,000 (inc GST) this season, headlining an Arrowfield roster that also includes rising star Dundeel (High Chaparral). His 2019-20 was highlighted

by Rosehill Guineas (Gr 1, 2000m) winner and Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) runner-up Castelvecchio, who joins his sire at Arrowfield, as well as Waikato Stud newcomer Super Seth.

"Dundeel had a crop last year that was extraordinary, far better quality than previous crops; obviously, because he came out with those Group 1 winners," Messara said. "And again this year, he's going to have a big book with enormous quality among the mares too. Dundeel is on the launching pad well and truly."

Dundeel will stand for \$66,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

For the second year in a row, Yarraman Park Stud's I Am Invincible has just edged out Snitzel by winners, 183 to 175, continuing his incredible rise that has seen him take all honours bar a champion sire title.

Loving Gaby has been the flagbearer for I Am Invincible with her pair of Group 1 wins in the Manikato Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), while Group 1 placegetters Libertini and Miss Leonidas were also among his winners last season.

## Sweet six for Savabeel in New Zealand

In New Zealand, a shortened season due to the Covid-19 pandemic has seen Waikato Stud's Savabeel wrap up his sixth consecutive Grosvenor Award as champion New Zealand sire

Savabeel joins Volksraad (Green Desert) as the only stallion to win six champion New Zealand sire titles in a row since the great Foxbridge (Foxlaw) won 11 straight between 1940-41 and 1950-51.

Savabeel's progeny won NZ\$3,108,669 in 2019-20, finishing ahead of Darci Brahma (Danehill) with NZ\$2,015,075 and Fastnet Rock (Danehill) with NZ\$1,682,075.

His winners were led by Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) victor Cool Aza Beel and top filly Probabeel, who was his second-highest earner in New Zealand despite only racing in the country twice, winning the Karaka Million 3YO Classic (RL, 1600m) and an Awapuni three-

year-old plate.

However, while Savabeel stands alone as champion New Zealand sire, it is his fellow Waikato Stud stallion Ocean Park (Thorn Park) who will take out the Dewar Award which is determined by progeny earnings in both New Zealand and Australia.

Kolding's win in the inaugural Golden Eagle (1500m) and the Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) proved decisive, as did Tofane's win in the All Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m).

"We're just extremely proud to have two stallions clean up all of the awards again this season," Waikato Stud's Mark Chittick said earlier this week.

"Obviously Savabeel has been doing that by himself over the last few years, and he's had another great year in 2019-20 and earned another champion sire title in New Zealand. But it's really nice to be able to share those awards between multiple stallions on our roster this year."

Savabeel will stand for NZ\$100,000 (plus GST) at Waikato Stud this season, with Ocean Park's fee set at NZ\$20,000 (plus GST).



**Pride from Coolmore** as Dubai lands first season honours

Since I Am Invincible's breakout season in 2013-14, only once has a champion first season sire not been a graduate of Australia's five juvenile Group 1 races - that being Smart Missile (Fastnet Rock), who was scratched at the barriers before the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m).

Pride Of Dubai (Street Cry) continued that streak when the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and ATC Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner added the champion first season sire title, by earnings, to his resume.

The Coolmore Australia stallion had 11 winners with his progeny earning \$1,311,389; the late Spill The Beans (Snitzel) and oneseason shuttler Night Of Thunder (Dubawi) filled second and third with \$1,033,561 and \$925,392 respectively.

Among Pride Of Dubai's leading lights were Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) winner Tanker, the Listed-placed Dubai Star and twotime victors Sense Of Honour and Maha.

However, his highest earner, Bella Nipotina, remains a maiden after seven starts, having finished second in the Inglis Millennium (RL, 1100m) and the Inglis Banner (RL, 1000m) and fourth in four stakes races, including the Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m).

"Pride Of Dubai is a particularly exciting young sire who has gone from strength to strength this season," Coolmore Australia stud manager John Kennedy told ANZ Bloodstock News. "We expect him to kick on to the next level with his rising three-year-olds as he has a host of contenders for exciting races in

the spring. He is extremely popular with both breeders and yearling buyers and is one of many exciting young stallions on the Coolmore Australia roster."

Coolmore Australia will stand Pride of Dubai for \$38,500 (inc GST) in 2020.

Aquis Farm's Spill The Beans, who died in November, and Vinery Stud's Headwater (Exceed And Excel) shared the spoils as far as numbers of winners, with both first crop stallions recording 13 victors apiece.

Spill The Beans began strongly with his first winner in late October, but within days he was gone, leaving just three crops on the ground and having served his last mares, ensuring a fourth crop this spring.

"Spill The Beans has done everyone proud, especially with Aquis having the equal champion first season sire (by winners) this year," Aquis Farm chief executive Tony "Tubba" Williams told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday. "Being a son of Snitzel, being a really good Group horse himself and unlucky not to be a Group 1 winner, with him standing in Queensland he got a lot of nice mares. It's a good feather in the cap for everyone involved that first got hold of Spill The Beans and stood him at stud. Aquis are very happy that he's reached that level in his first season."

Spill The Beans was the third straight Queensland-based stallion to top the first season sire list by winners, following in the hoofprints of Spirit Of Boom (Sequalo) and Better Than Ready (More Than Ready), and while he won't be able to build upon that success beyond his next three crops, Aquis Farm hopes they have a ready-made replacement in Dubious (Not A Single Doubt).

"There's no doubting, over the last three or four years, with Spirit Of Boom, Better Than Ready and Spill The Beans - that's actually a pretty good record for Queensland to have," Williams said. "We feel that Dubious is the ideal horse to follow on from those three to complement the broodmare band in Queensland. He's by one of the hottest stallions in the country in Not A Single Doubt, record-breaking Breeders' Plate winner, Group 2 winner here in Queensland of the Champagne Classic.

"He was a very hardy and honest horse. He raced in a Coolmore in Melbourne in the spring, he raced in Perth in December, he raced up here in the Magic Millions in January as a three-year-old. It just goes to show how hardy he was. He is without a doubt the quintessential two-year-old type horse and we think he's the type of horse Queenslanders require for their broodmare band up here. I can't see why he won't be as successful as some of these horses I've mentioned."

The headline over the last three months of the season, though, has been the surge of Headwater.

In mid-May, Headwater had had just three winners, led by Magic Millions 2YO Classic fourth Wisdom Of Water, and sat equal seventh on the table by number of winners. However, ten winners through late May, June and July - taking him to 13 have catapulted him to the top and have given him momentum heading into the upcoming season, where he will stand for \$13,750 (inc GST).

"He did get a few early - Wisdom Of Water was out early and he had a few others early," Vinery Stud bloodstock manager Adam White told ANZ Bloodstock News. "It's good for him to follow it up late in the season and there's a few that, just lately, have looked like they'd get a good 1400 (metres) to a mile which is a good sign as well. So we're looking forward to them turning three and seeing how they train on.

> "The breeders were pretty astute in finding him pretty early. It didn't take long for him to get his full book and he's got a nice group of mares. He's always been



an easy horse for us to sell because he's goodlooking, he's got the pedigree, he could run and now they are running. It's great to have a young horse on the rise like him."

Wisdom Of Water is set to be Headwater's banner horse this spring. Formerly trained by Toby and Trent Edmonds in Queensland, the Aquis Farm acquisition has been transferred to Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr in Melbourne with a light campaign aimed at the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on his agenda.

"We're really keen to see what he does in Melbourne, he's obviously being aimed for the Coolmore," White said. "He's a very fast horse, he's very effective over 1200 metres so it will be great to see him run up that Flemington straight and just seeing what he can do."

Vinery Stud was also represented last season by another first-crop sire in Press Statement (Hinchinbrook), who recorded five winners.

"We're very happy with how he's going too," White said. "He was a later two-yearold himself. He's had five winners, four of those have been in Sydney and the other one (Incredulous Dream) was at Bendigo and that filly later ran in a stakes race. His winners have been good winners and I think, once they turn three, hopefully he will be able to follow his sire Hinchinbrook and what his progeny did when they got a bit older. We're really happy with how he's started and how they are going to come along as three-year-olds.

"He's always been a popular horse, he's a horse that a lot of people have labelled a bit of a smokey and a dark horse. I quite like that. He's got a good supporter base there and he's getting another good book this year so we're as excited with him as we are with Headwater."

Press Statement will also stand for \$13,750 (inc GST) this term.

## Novara Park celebrates as Sweynesse stands tall

Wellfield Lodge newcomer Vespa (Elusive City) was hot on his heels with his progeny earning NZ\$121,695, the pair well clear of third-placed No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) on NZ\$51,465

"Novara Park is extremely proud that Sweynesse has won the leading New Zealand first season sire on winners, stakes-winners and earnings," Novara Park principal Luigi Muollo told ANZ Bloodstock News. "The leading first season sire award is very encouraging and we expect Sweynesse's progeny to excel as threeyear-olds over 1600 metres and beyond, as he did himself.

"I am very thankful to my stud manager Ray Knight and the team on the farm for the great job they have done as well as the syndicate of breeders behind the stallion."

Knight added: "It's a really good result, and a great way for the stallion to start his career. It's been a funny old year for everyone with Covid-19, but it's been very encouraging for us to see his first progeny perform as well as they have.

"The particularly exciting thing is that we've heard a number of very positive reports about some of his other progeny who are still in the wings and haven't yet stepped out on the racetrack."

Sweynesse is aiming to follow in the footsteps of his sire Lonhro and that stallion line of Octagonal, Zabeel and Sir Tristram. Pierro has been the leading son of Lonhro at stud, with the Coolmore Australia stallion producing six Group 1 winners to date.

"Sweynesse continues the tradition of his successful sire line in New Zealand and Australia," Muollo said. "His grandsire Zabeel was dominant for many years and Savabeel has continued that dominance. Sweynesse's sire Lonhro has been an outstanding sire and is a proven 'sire of sires' with Pierro leading the way in Australia.

"We left Sweynesse's service fee unchanged at NZ\$6,000 (plus GST) for the upcoming breeding season and he offers incredible value with upside to breeders. Bookings have been very good and we expect him to be fully booked at some stage in the season."

## Meteor eclipsed by record second season effort from Field

In a season of notable achievements, one of the premier accolades fell to Newgate Farm's Deep Field (Northern Meteor), who was named champion second season sire by winners.

His 86 individual winners was the best second season sire performance on record, taking him past his own sire Northern Meteor (Encosta De Lago) who produced 80 winners in his second year in 2013-14.

Deep Field has already struck success abroad, as well, as he has had the best start to a stallion career with his runners in Hong Kong as well. He will stand for \$55,000 (inc GST) at Newgate Farm this year.

On earnings, though, Deep Field had to settle for second behind Coolmore's Rubick (Encosta De Lago), whose prize-money figures were boosted by The Everest (1200m) success of his roster mate Yes Yes Yes. In total, Rubick's progeny earned \$10,765,806 throughout 2019-20.

Rubick will stand for \$33,000 (inc GST), with Yes Yes Yes given an introductory fee of \$38,500 (inc GST).

Across the Tasman, Windsor Park Stud's shuttle stallion Charm Spirit (Invincible Spirit) was named champion second season sire, adding to his first season sire success last year.

"After being champion first season sire last year, it's great to see Charm Spirit follow that up with the second season title as well," said Windsor Park's general manager Steve Till.

"We're delighted with how well his progeny have performed. To have four Group-winning three-year-olds in New Zealand and Australia this season is fantastic, and they've won from 1200 to 2200 metres. They're very versatile fillies and colts.

And so, just like that, the starting gun has been fired on the race for the 2020-21 titles.

## **Hunter stallion** parades cancelled

The Covid-19 pandemic has caused the cancellation of the majority of the Hunter Valley stallion parades, which were scheduled to operate under a new blueprint this year. The parades were due to be held over six days from August 18 to August 23, but with the Covid-19 situation in New South Wales remaining at a critical point, the Hunter Thoroughbred Breeders Association (HTBA) yesterday announced that any formal structure to the parades was cancelled. "Breeders are still welcome to contact the individual studs directly, to make private appointments to view stallions and bloodstock," the HTBA said in a statement yesterday. "All visits to individual farms will be conducted in strict adherence to the government health and safety restrictions which are in place at the time. This collaborative decision between the stallion farms has been made for the safety of breeders and stud staff." Some farms will also conduct virtual parades, as was recently conducted by Godolphin in the UK.

## **Maribyrnong Plate** winner returns

Hard Landing (All Too Hard) will make his return to the races at Moonee Valley today on his first day as a three-year-old, with trainers Tom Dabernig and Ben Hayes aiming to make up for lost time. The well-bred Hard Landing, out of Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) winner Snitzerland (Snitzel), debuted over the same course and distance as that of his dam's biggest victory, winning the Maribyrnong Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) in November with Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Tagaloa (Lord Kanaloa) and Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) runner-up Glenfiddich (Fastnet Rock) in behind. However, a poor tenth in the Blue Diamond Prelude (Gr 3, 1100m) for colts and geldings ruled him out for the rest of the autumn. "We were surprised at how quickly he stopped, but in the days after we were quickly forgiving of it as he got quite sick," Dabernig said. "So we had to put him on a heavy course of antibiotics and turn him out for a spell. He looks all healthy and well and his recovery after work seems normal."

## New Freedman partnership hopes for winning start

Anthony and Sam Freedman will be attempting to get the best possible start to their training partnership when they send out three runners at Moonee Valley today. Their first runner will be Wilmot Pass (Rubick) in a Benchmark 84 handicap, while Bedford (Tavistock) and Danon Roman (Deep Impact) step out in a 2040-metre quality. "It's exciting," Sam Freedman said. "Not a lot will change but it's nice to be joining Dad in the partnership, so hopefully we can have a good start. They don't give away metro races so it's not going to be easy. It's nice to have a few nice chances there and hopefully we can just build into the season nicely."

## Victorian prize-money returns to pre-Covid levels

While Melbourne and the Mitchell Shire remain on lockdown with no end in sight, one aspect of normality will return today with Victorian prize-money boosted to the same levels that it was at in March, before the Covid-19 pandemic properly set in. Racing Victoria chief Giles Thompson said it was important that prize-money be restored to encourage participation in the Victorian industry. "Whilst we remain in the grip of the pandemic and its impact will continue to be felt for some time, we recognise that prizemoney is the lifeblood of our industry and it is fundamental to ongoing investment and jobs in Victorian racing that we maximise it in a responsible manner," Thompson said. "There are 110,000 people employed or participating in Victorian racing, many of them in regional communities. Restoring minimum prizemoney levels not only benefits everyone in our industry, there is a flow on of investment into many associated businesses also."

## **Everything old is** new again for Austin

Trainer Jarrod Austin's most successful metropolitan horse last season was Inanup (Bon Hoffa), and he hopes that the gelding can continue with his good run of form when he lines up at Randwick today. "Any city win is a good win, especially for a small team like us," Austin said. "He was bouncing around coming off the track this (Friday) morning so I'm really happy with how he is. He's the quietest horse we've got in the stable. Anything you want to do, he's just ready to do it. You can ride him forward, you can ride him back. He will do whatever you ask him to do. It seems every time he goes around he flies under the radar but that suits us. He has just crept through the grades without much fuss and he never runs a bad race."

## Mr Bellagio on trial at Eagle Farm

The Toby and Trent Edmonds team have one eye on the summer with Mr Bellagio (O'Lonhro), but they will test his credentials in a 1400-metre open handicap at Eagle Farm today. Mr Bellagio finished sixth in the Eye Liner Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Ipswich firstup off a let-up, beaten only a length and a quarter after a tough run. "I thought his Eye Liner run was very good. As I said before that race just a bit of rain helps him and hopefully we will get some on Saturday," Toby Edmonds said. "He's back to 1400 metres which is his go, and all being good on Saturday the summer is a definite option."

## Azzareach to fire for in-form Bougoure

Trainer Danny Bougoure has scored with four of his last six runners and he will be hoping to continue that trend with promising three-year-old Azzareach (Outreach) at Eagle Farm today. Azzareach stepped out for the first time in a Gold Coast 900-metre maiden handicap on July 4, winning by a length and three-quarters after settling outside the speed early. "Azzareach was a good winner at the Gold Coast at his only start but these Brisbane two and three-year-old QTIS races are always very tough, but the money is good so it is worth having a go," said Bougoure of Azzareach, who will race in the same colours as Strawberry Road (Whiskey Road), trained by Bougoure's father Doug.

## Melody Belle back in business

Champion New Zealand mare Melody Belle (Commands) will return in next weekend's Missile Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) after winning a trial on Randwick's Kensington track yesterday. The Jamie Richards-trained Melody Belle finished strongly to win by a half-length in the 850-metre trial, defeating Fierce Impact (Deep Impact) and Quackerjack (Not A Single Doubt). The other two Group and Listed trials were won by Godolphin pair Home Of The Brave (Starspangledbanner) and Savatiano (Street Cry).

## O'Brien stars return for gallop

Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Vow And Declare (Declaration Of War) and South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) conqueror Russian Camelot (Camelot) took their first steps towards the spring's biggest features when they had an exhibition gallop between races at Geelong yesterday. "They were here to have a day out," O'Brien told Racing.com. "They came to the racetrack to enjoy a stretch of the legs on the course proper. Vow And Declare was there to lead the gallop as he likes to bowl along in his work with Russian Camelot sitting back off him. They weren't there to run any sectionals that they weren't comfortable running, but they're very good horses so they'll run good sectionals anyway. Damien (Oliver) said Russian Camelot was very competitive and wanted to get up to Vow And Declare, but he made sure he stayed relaxed and went to the line with plenty in hand." The pair are scheduled to return in the Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) next month.

## South Australian races renamed for Hall of Famers

Six of South Australia's stakes races have been renamed by Thoroughbred Racing South Australia (TRSA) in order to recognise six members of the SA Thoroughbred Hall of Fame. The Laelia Stakes (Listed, 1600m) will now be known as the Clare Lindop Stakes; the Tokyo City Cup (Listed, 1800m) is now the John Letts Cup; the Penny Edition Stakes (Listed, 1400m) to be run later this month - has been renamed the Leon McDonald Stakes; the National Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) is now the David Coles AM Stakes; the Euclase Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) has been rebadged to recognise the great Tobin Bronze (Arctic Explorer); and the Without Fear Stakes (Listed, 1050m) is the new name for the Queen Adelaide Stakes.

## Little Avondale celebrates 80 years

Little Avondale Stud has added another major milestone to its rich history, celebrating 80 years of operation. Founded as Te Parae Stud and passed down through three generations of the Williams family, New Zealand's oldest family-owned stud has amassed a proud list of accomplishments. There have been famous names such as Sunbride (Count Rendered) and Oncidium (Alcide), and in 1974 they were the very first in Australasia to crack the NZ\$100,000 mark for a yearling. "This anniversary is a pretty special time for us, and it's an occasion that we're all very proud of," Sam Williams said. "We had a few locals around for a little get-together this week, including some long-time supporters of the farm and the family. We also had all of the members of the family who were around. We all toasted the occasion together, shared some stories and reminisced. It was really cool. We've just been really lucky to be able to continue the legacy that was laid down before us by our grandparents. There's a lot of history here. We're only caretakers of this land, and we love having the opportunity to work with horses. They're amazing animals that have given so much to so many people, and it's a privilege to care for them for a living."

## Te Akau celebrates 'thrilling' season

Te Akau Racing principal David Ellis has just one word to summarise the 2019-20 season thrilling. The tangerine and blue army rose to the fore on both sides of the Tasman, posting 12 Group 1 wins for the season and clinching the New Zealand trainers' premiership for Jamie Richards with 101 wins. It was Richards' first premiership title in a solo capacity, having previously won it in the 2015-16 term in partnership with Stephen Autridge. "It was a huge thrill to win 12 Group 1 races in one season - nine in New Zealand, one in Melbourne, and two in Sydney," Ellis said. Ellis identified Avantage's (Fastnet Rock) win in the Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Ellerslie in March as a season highlight, as he said it showed the training prowess of Richards. "With Avantage's win, it was also Jamie's 32nd Group 1 win," Ellis said. "For a guy who is only 30 to have won 32 Group 1 races is something pretty special. It's not easy to train a horse to win a Group 1 at 1200 metres, 1400 metres, 1600 metres, and 2000 metres, but that's what she did."

## Catalyst building towards Sydney sprint features

Clayton Chipperfield is pleased with the progress of his stable star Catalyst (Darci Brahma) as he builds towards a spring campaign in Sydney. Catalyst is likely to have at least one trial before crossing the Tasman and is set to have a hit-out at the Taupo trials on August 12. "He will go there and have a nice blowout and we will know where he is at from there, but he certainly feels a lot bigger under me and is a lot stronger," Chipperfield said. "He is a lot more switched on mentally too which is certainly positive when we're looking at Australia because he has got some big goals ahead of him." Catalyst is likely to resume in The Shorts (Gr 2, 1100m) at Randwick on September 19 and the versatile sprinter-miler could be in for a busy but potentially lucrative October with the Silver Eagle (1300m) on October 10 a likely stepping stone to the Golden Eagle (1500m) at Rosehill on October 31. "In between the Silver Eagle and the Golden Eagle is The Everest (A\$15 million, 1200m), so if he can get a slot in that, that is possibly on the cards as well," Chipperfield said.

## Marquand is the Goodwood Master

One Master (6m ex Enticing by Pivotal) came good under a daredevil ride by Tom Marquand to extend her impressive career record in the Oak Tree Stakes (Gr 3, 7f) at Goodwood yesterday. Bred by owners Roy and Gretchen Jackson's Lael Stable out of a fine dynasty stretching back to brilliant juvenile Superstar Leo (College Chapel), she became one of the 101 worldwide Group winners for Fastnet Rock (Danehill) quite some time ago, and has twice taken the Prix de la Foret (Gr 1, 7fm) in France. Brought to challenge with a typically late sweep, One Master found her way through traffic and ended up collaring Valeria Messalina (Holy Roman Emperor) right on the line. The world-renowned Fastnet Rock, twice a champion sire in Australia, will stand for a fee of \$165,000 at Jerrys Plains in 2020.

## Tilsit takes Thoroughbred honours

Tilsit (3c ex Multilingual by Dansili) struck for former Juddmonte stallion First Defence (Unbridled's Song) as he held on following a long enquiry to the Thoroughbred Stakes (Gr 3, 1m) at Goodwood yesterday. The Charlie Hillstrained colt is from the last crop of the sire who was subsequently sold to Saudi Arabia. Arriving from a Newcastle maiden over the same trip, Tilsit came across the eventual length and half runner-up My Oberon (Dubawi) inside the final 200 metres but kept the race in the stewards' room. Hot favourite Khaloosy (Dubawi) was only third.

## Six for Maxios

German bred and trained filly Liberty London (4f ex Ledicea by Medicean) continued her admirable progress in the Prix Luth Enchantee (Listed, 2400m) at Clairefontaine yesterday as she became a sixth stakes winner for Maxios (Monsun). Third in Listed company in her homeland last time, Gestut Ittlingen's homebred had to be driven hard by Pierre-Charles Boudot but rose to the challenge in beating Edisa (Kitten's Joy) and Goderville (Air Chief Marshal) by half a length and a short head. Dual Group 1 winner Maxios stands for a fee of

€6,000 (approx \$AUD9,900) at Castle Hyde Stud in Ireland.

## Four up for brilliant Battaash

Battaash (6g ex Anna Law by Lawman) was the headline act of Glorious Goodwood's fourth day and the son of Dark Angel did not let his supporters down with an unprecedented fourth consecutive victory in the King George Stakes (Gr 2, 5f). Charlie Hills' veteran has carried all before him at the minimum trip, landing virtually every race of consequence including the King's Stand Stakes (Gr

1, 5f) at Royal Ascot this year. He was at his speedy best to crack the track record at 55.62 seconds and beat the useful Glass Slippers (Dream Ahead) and Ornate (Bahamian Bounty). Battaash, bred by Ballyphilip Stud and bought by Shadwell for 200,000gns at Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Sale, is one of 64 stakes winners for Dark Angel (Acclamation), who stands for &85,000 (approx &AUD140,000) at Yeomanstown in Ireland.

## Glorious afternoon for Haggas and Marquand

Pablo Escobarr (4g ex Bewitched by Dansili) maintained his decent course record with a biggest victory to date in the Glorious Stakes (Gr 3, 1m4f) at Goodwood yesterday. Owned by Hussein Abbas Lootah, the son of the mighty Galileo (Sadler's Wells) was offered by Capucines at Arqana in 2017 and bought for €200,000 by bloodstock agent Richard Knight. Already a Listed winner, he was providing a big race double on the day for trainer William Haggas and jockey Tom Marquand as he pulled away from old stager Desert Encounter (Halling) and Le Don De Vie (Leroidesanimaux). He became a 215th registered worldwide Group winner for the Coolmore giant, who stands for a private fee.


