Air Horse Transport ready to emerge after months of being grounded

Calthorpe hoping Magic Millions carnival will lead to horses getting back in the air

he proprietor of the Victoria-based
Air Horse Transport is banking on the
upcoming Magic Millions carnival
kick-starting his business's recovery
after months of border closures and minimal
equine movement had it on the brink of collapse.

Chris Calthorpe revealed that the Queensland border's reopening to Victorians

from today would play a pivotal role in helping his equine freight operation return to normality with some of the state's leading trainers signalling their intent to target January's \$12 million Gold Coast carnival.

"Covid-19 has been 100 per cent detrimental to my business. It nearly finished me and I am lucky that I have been able to just hang in there. It has been terrible," Calthorpe told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

<< Continued from page 1 "When you have got a good, steady stream of horses, it is worthwhile, but there's a lot of uncertainty and we basically missed all the Brisbane carnival, all the Perth carnival and a lot of horses coming into Melbourne from Perth who came by road instead this year.

"Brisbane-bound horses also went by road who would normally fly, we missed all those as well.

"We have managed to hang in there just with the view that we will get a few to go up to Brisbane for the Magic Millions."

Calthorpe intends to have horses on flights weekly in the lead up to Christmas until the week of the Magic Millions race day, to be held on

January 16.

Tony McEvoy is one trainer who has previously campaigned horses, particularly two-year-olds, in Queensland in the lead-up to the Magic Millions carnival, most successfully with Sunlight (Zoustar) in late 2017 and early 2018.

Calthorpe said: "I have had quite a bit of interest. Once the Premier of Queensland announced that she was going to open the border (today), people have started to plan things.

"Because of the uncertainty of borders being shut and whether you can get staff up and back, that's been one of the main problems for the past six to seven months.

"People don't want to send a Group 1 horse to another trainer and have no staff there."

While things are looking up for Calthorpe, he was delivered another blow yesterday when a flight from Sydney to Perth took off but the plane did not have any horses on it, meaning there were no last-minute interstate acceptors for Saturday's \$1 million Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) at Ascot.


He had canvassed Melbourne and Sydney trainers a fortnight ago about using yesterday's flight but none took up the offer.

"The flight is on, but no one got on it. It is very disappointing," he said.

"I think a lot of it has got to do with the WA border still being shut. It is hard to get grooms in there. It is getting beyond a joke, WA."

Calthorpe was able to facilitate one flight to Perth in late October for interstate horses, a service which Godolphin used to send Trekking (Street Cry) and Kementari (Lonhro) to the west while Matthew Williams sent veteran Gailo Chop (Deportivo) as did Lindsey Smith with Trap For Fools (Poet's Voice).

<< Continued from page 2 The next four to five months will determine the appetite trainers have to once again fly horses to carnivals across the country.</p>

"Hopefully in the next couple of weeks we'll start moving horses up to Brisbane and into the New Year and things start to get back on track and we can get business back to what it was 12 months ago," he said.

"The Brisbane carnival last year I think I flew up 34 horses in six weeks. Last year to Perth, I took over 18 horses for the carnival on one plane and then they all came home. We also did ten or 15 up to the Gold Coast over Christmas and New Year for the Magic Millions carnival.

"From now on until Easter, it is quite a busy period for us, so hopefully we don't fall back into a Covid-19 trap and we will keep going forward and we'll be right."

The racetrack results, meanwhile, will determine how many horses are sent from Melbourne to Toowoomba, the airport used by the international airline contracted by Calthorpe.


"A lot of the Magic Millions horses will race here (in Melbourne). I know a few of them are racing on Boxing Day at Caulfield," he said.

"It is all dependent on prize-money to get a start, so you nominate and then see where you are in the ballot order, so a lot of them don't like to send them up there until they know they are going to get a run."

Trap For Fools wins trial before Group 1

A comfortable trial win at Lark Hill yesterday has Perth native Trap For Fools (Poet's Voice) set for the Kingston Town Stakes (Gr 1, 1800m) on Saturday. The Lindsey Smith-trained Trap For Fools, winner of the 2018 Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington, contested the Kingston Town that same year, finishing sixth to Arcadia Queen (Pierro). This time around, he returns to Perth after midfield efforts in the Underwood Stakes (Gr 1, 1800m), Cranbourne Cup (Listed, 2025m) and Moonee Valley Cup (Gr 2, 2500m). However, his trial win with Peter Hall in the saddle yesterday, in which he had almost three lengths on Red Army (Patronize), suggests he is capable of figuring in Saturday's feature. "He felt really good, he felt like a young horse out there and I was quietly surprised," Hall said. "He felt really good in his action. It was good to have a feel of him today, I haven't ridden him for a little while. Group 1 races are always tough but he's a good old horse and he still feels like he wants to be out there." The Kingston Town will mark the first time in which Trap For Fools meets his stablemate and younger half-brother, Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) runner-up Too Close The Sun (Carlton House), on the racetrack. The barrier draw will be conducted tonight.

Isotope back on track for Mode Plate

Enigmatic filly Isotope (Deep Field) will sport a barrier blanket, blinkers and a browband for Saturday's Mode Plate (Listed, 1200m) as Tony Gollan tries to rectify her barrier issues. The three-year-old was fractious first-up, missing the start badly before charging home for second, and her trainer sent her to the Beaudesert trials with that raft of gear changes in a bid to improve her manners. "Kevin Thomas did a great job with her out at Washpool Lodge and gave me a lot of advice to follow, which we did," Gollan said. "That was the idea of going there to help her with the barriers and she was perfect. She had a hell of a lot of different gear on her but she did everything right and trialled in second gear." Also among the entries is J J Atkins (Gr 1, 1400m) runner-up Gotta Kiss (Not A Single Doubt) and stakes winners Macroura (Snitzel) and Plutocrat (Rich Enuff).

Portelli calls for two-yearold calendar shake-up

Gary Portelli has called for more second tier two-year-old races to be scheduled during the late spring and summer in Sydney. Portelli believes a dearth of juvenile events at the midweek and provincial level is resulting in trainers putting their youngsters in the spelling paddock, rather than blooding them. The metropolitan schedule has also been light with seven two-year-old races held in town since the start of the juvenile racing season on October 3. Portelli said the current structure limits the chances to qualify horses for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) at the Gold Coast in January. "It is so hard to get two-year-olds up to Brisbane now. We've lost a couple of two-yearold races this season already and to get horses qualified, it's a nightmare," Portelli said. "We don't like to be pressuring our horses as it is but with the lack of racing, you feel like you've got pressure on you because you buy these horses at the Magic Millions with a vision for your owners to be racing in the Magic Millions in January. You've got to get qualified but you don't want to be pushing them and putting them in races when they're not ready, or throwing them in the deep end straight away."

OTI launches two towards Pakenham Cup

OTI Racing's Terry Henderson believes they have two great chances in Saturday's Pakenham Cup (Listed, 2500m) in the shape of emerging stayer Attorney (Makfi) and the more experienced Haky (Muhtathir). The Matthew Smith-trained Attorney ran on strongly to finish fourth behind Sound (Lando) in the Zipping Classic (Gr 2, 2400m) last start, a race in which Henderson said was not run to suit the six-yearold. "He's got to be one of the leading chances in the race. He's come back to work a more settled horse and he's had a good campaign," Henderson said. "Like many of these overseas horses he started with a bang out here then had a flat campaign but he's back on track now." The Archie Alexander-trained Haky finished ninth in the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 3, 2600m) won by another OTI horse in True Self (Oscar), a race in which Henderson believes the seven-year-old was not suited by being ridden quietly. "I think he's going really well but the riding tactics of drifting back haven't worked. He'll take up a forward position," he added.

Real Hussey launching MM Guineas bid

Gillian Heinrich will get a better guide whether Real Hussey (Real Impact) can make it to the \$2 million Magic Millions Guineas (RL, 1400m) when the gelding steps out in the QTIS Three-Year-Old Handicap over the same distance at the Gold Coast tomorrow. Real Hussey is by Japanese sire Real Impact (Deep Impact) out of Moonlight Hussey (Hussonet), making him a half-brother to Heinrich's leading Magic Millions Classic hope - True Moonlight - who is by Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice). He was passed in for \$90,000 at the Magic Millions sales after just failing to reach his \$100,000 reserve. Real Hussey needs a boost in prize-money to qualify for the Magic Millions Guineas but his form suggests he's on the right path - he on debut at the Gold Coast in October and is coming off a last start second to Test Of War (Testa Rossa) over 1200 metres at the Gold Coast on November 14. "He's going well and wasn't beaten far when he ran second last time," Heinrich said. "He's a half-brother to True Moonlight, who is getting ready for the Magic Millions Classic and he'll have no trouble getting 1400 metres. He's stepping up in grade this week but he'll need more prize-money to qualify for the Guineas. I liked his last run when he was caught wide off a bad draw and he should be very competitive again. It's only a small field but they can be very tricky races to win."

Away Game third in trial

Away Game (Snitzel) remains on track to chase an historic Magic Millions double after pleasing her connections in a trial at Rosehill yesterday. The four-time winner finished third behind Mission River (Redoute's Choice) in the 900-metre hit-out, without being given too hard a time by Glen Boss. Ciaron Maher, who trains Away Game in partnership with David Eustace, said the filly had recovered from the minor issue that forced her out of the spring, adding she is likely to return to the track in the Gold Edition Plate (Listed, 1200m) at Doomben next month. "She was very good this morning," Maher told Racing.com. "She had a trial in Melbourne, which was good, and she did everything we wanted her to today in Sydney. There's a race on the 19th (of December) for her. The aim is the three-yearold Magic Millions race on the Gold Coast." Away Game, who won last year's Magic Millions Classic before defeats in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), will attempt to become the first horse in history to win both the two-year-old and three-year-old Magic Millions features in consecutive years.

Fake Love wins heat

Magic Millions 2YO Classic-bound filly Fake Love (I Am Invincible) looked in top form when running out an impressive winner of a 900 metre trial at Rosehill yesterday morning. The MRC Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) winner posted the fastest two-year-old time of the morning as she stopped the clock at 53.62 seconds, finishing a length and a quarter in front of the unraced Ashema (I Am Invincible), with Stavanger (Redoute's Choice), also unraced, a further two and three-quarter lengths away in third. The John Sargent-trained homebred filly Healthy Beauty (Maurice) built on the promise she showed in her earlier trial by winning Heat 8 in impressive fashion, finishing a length and three-quarters in front of the unraced Field Wiri (Deep Field). Jessica Rabbit (Sooboog), the half-sister to Group 1 winner Oohood (I Am Invincible) who finished down the field in the Kirkham Plate (1000m) at Randwick in October, won her trial in 54.60 seconds, finishing in front of Batemans Bay (Exceed And Excel) and Glamour And Glory (Star Turn). Earlier, the Peter and Paul Snowden-trained Astrologer (Star Turn), who was third in the Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) at Randwick in October, won his trial when getting the better of Turboart (Flying Artie) and I Am Good At This (I Am Invincible) in a time of 54.71 seconds.

Listed race for One More Jack

A tilt at the Christmas Handicap (Listed, 1200m) at Morphettville on December 12 is the next on the agenda for One More Jack (Typhon) following his win in Saturday's City Of Marion Stakes (Listed, 1200m). Shane Oxlade said the five-year-old had pulled up perfectly from his last-stride victory and would now try to become the first horse since Hidden Value (Face Value) in 2012 to complete the late-year Listed sprint double. "It's a thrill to win any race, but always good to win those better ones," Oxlade told trsa. com. "He came home and ate everything. He had an easy day yesterday, went on the walker today and he'll just poke around between now and the Christmas. Another Listed race at home is always a nice option." One More Jack was ridden by Paul Gatt for the first time on the weekend, and Oxlade said the gelding surprised

his new jockey given the blistering tempo in the race. "Gatty' said he was never on the bridle," Oxlade continued. "He said he was thinking 'Gee, if this horse wins this he's going good,' but once he got out and got a bit of clear air and a chance to wind up he just finished too good."

40 nominated for Perth Cup

The Perth Cup (Gr 2, 2400m) has attracted 40 entries, but potential favourite Too Close The Sun is not among them. His half-brother Trap For Fools is entered though, the only nomination for Lindsey Smith, while one-time Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) runner Neufbosc (Mastercraftsman) is also among the first declarations. Five of the last six Perth Cups have been won by owner-breeder Bob Peters and he has seven entries: Royal Command (Street Sense), Truly Great (Dundeel), Mystery Miss (Animal Kingdom), Midnight Blue (So You Think), True Attraction (More Than Ready), Adornment (Medaglia d'Oro) and Morning Song (Bernardini). The Perth Cup will be run at Ascot on January 2.

Allibor Hong Kong deal done

Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) winner Allibor (All Too Hard) will do his future racing in Hong Kong after connections received a milliondollar deal for the gelding. Trainer Symon Wilde said that sort of money was too good to refuse. "It was a very, very tough decision, but we have had him vetted and it looks like he will make his way to Hong Kong," Wilde told RSN927. "The money is sort of almost ridiculous, seven figures. You've probably got to be logical about it. The racing game is an up and down sport. Logic tells you that you should probably take the money. He has vetted out clear and it will

be in the next week or so he will be heading to Hong Kong. We don't get a lot of quality horses. When you get one like him, I really do firmly believe he is just going to get better and better."

Small steps for It's Me

The Kosciuszko (1200m) winner It's Me (Shamus Award) has begun her road to recovery as she aims to return to trainer Brett Cavanough. It's Me injured a tendon during her scintillating victory in the \$1.3 million feature and Grand Syndicates racing manager Sam Lyons is confident she will return to her best. "We've had the first scans come back now after her first bit of rehab with Lee Everson and they were very positive compared to last time," Lyons told Racing. com. "The last time she hurt her tendon it was a seven or eight out of 10, this time it suggests it's a four. We are very, very hopeful she comes back as good as ever. She's a very, very, very exciting prospect when she does return. There's no plans as to what we aim for. She's pretty tight in Everest markets, but I probably think we might look to get her over further."

Stallion Hampton Court dies

Cornwall Park Stud yesterday announced the death of Hampton Court (Redoute's Choice) on November 17 from natural causes, aged nine. The Victorian farm, purchased by Peter Boyle and Lisa Gordon in May, had stood Hampton Court this season, having previously shuttled for Spendthrift. Hampton Court, who won the Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) in 2014, has American stakes placegetter Fast Verdict from his first northern hemisphere crop, while he has had winners in the US, Australia, Mexico, South Korea, Canada, Malaysia and Peru.

Warrnambool Cup aim for Kissinger

Former Kiwi Kissinger (Tavistock) continues to make positive strides under new trainer Lindsey Smith, winning a Benchmark 64 over 2000 metres at Warrnambool on Sunday. In doing so, the former Nigel Tiley charge advanced his career record to four wins and two placings from eight starts, with Smith excited by the future for the lightly-tried fiveyear-old. "I think it was a better win than the margin suggests," Smith said. "He's worked for most of the race. That's what happens when you draw the outside. He got a little bit weary the last little bit, but he'll have a rest now. He's a nice horse and we'll get him in the Terang Cup and hopefully that leapfrogs him into the Warrnambool Cup. I think he can come back and improve. I quite like his chances." Sporting the colours of Spicer Thoroughbreds, Tiley and his wife Lee remain in the ownership of the progressive galloper, as they do with stablemate Riding The Wave (Malibu Moon), who has also made a favourable impression from his new quarters with Smith.

Pat Webster calls it quits

The man behind Sydney sensation Happy Clapper (Teofilo), Pat Webster, will saddle up his final runner this weekend when Kosciusko (All Too Hard) runs at Newcastle. The Randwick trainer admitted that he had been struggling for motivation since three-time Group 1 winner Happy Clapper retired in April and he told the Daily Telegraph that he made the decision to retire "on my terms" yesterday morning. Webster, who started as an apprentice jockey in 1965, has been based at Randwick for his entire 55-year career, with his best horses including At Sea (Aurealis), Shy Hero (Last Tycoon) and Ab Initio (Spectacular Spy). Webster will continue to work with Racing NSW as their Drugs and Alcohol Mentor and as a Racing Mates Ambassador.

Gelagotis pleads not guilty to bicarb charge

Peter Gelagotis has pleaded not guilty to two administration charges relating to the bi-carb reading taken from Strong Influence (Squamosa) before the gelding finished third in a race at Sandown on June 26 last year. Strong Influence returned an initial reading of 37.8 millimoles per litre in plasma on a 36-millimole threshold. The Victorian Racing Tribunal heard yesterday that Gelagotis had pleaded guilty to a lesser charge of taking Strong Influence to the races in June 2019 with a prohibited substance in its system but not of administering to affect the result of a race nor of causing the horse to be administered the substance. Gelagotis is due to give evidence this morning.

Owner defends Strong Influence's trainer

Owner and breeder Ron Thomas yesterday told the hearing he was shocked and surprised when informed his horse Strong Influence had returned an illegal reading for TCO2 (bicarb) at Sandown last year. Former Sydney Swans manager Thomas, who has 17 horses across 11 different trainers, told the tribunal: "I am 73 years of age and an ex-senior coach,

so I do rate myself a good judge of character and I think Peter is (of good character)." Thomas, who races said he never doubted Gelagotis' integrity and had subsequently taken shares in horses with him since the Sandown positive. "I am comfortable with Peter training our horses," he told VRT chairman Judge John Bowman.

Clarke improving

Popular trainer Udyta Clarke remains in a serious condition but she continues to improve in hospital after suffering a brain bleed last week. The 72-year-old is conscious and communicating with nurses at Monash Hospital, where she was taken last Monday after being found unresponsive at her Cranbourne stables.

Ryan out indefinitely

Apprentice Brock Ryan will see Racing NSW medical officer Dr David Duckworth this morning as he continues his recovery from a nasty fall at Canterbury on Friday. Ryan was transported to Royal Prince Alfred Hospital after he was knocked unconscious in the fall from Carluca (Volitant). He has been cleared of major head injuries but is still suffering swelling, while he is also experiencing pain in his left elbow. He is unlikely to ride again until the new year.

Adelaide meet moved to main track

Saturday's meeting at Morphettville has been transferred from the Parks track to the main course, it was announced yesterday. No reason was given for the switch, but the announcement was made half an hour before nominations for the meeting closed. Entries for all races have been extended until 10am ACDT this morning.

Millicent horse trainer Ned Walker, his wife Nan and their daughter Sue died on Saturday when their Ford Territory collided with a Toyota Landcruiser near Mount Gambier. A stint on the sidelines last season appears to have done jockey Michael McNab the world of good after he rode a winning stakes double at Ellerslie on Saturday, bringing his stakes tally for the season to three, equaling his haul from last term. Great battle for training honors

ith only three months into the new racing season a great three-way battle is already ensuing for the Trainers Premiership, with three former champion trainers locked in a great clash for supremacy.

A winning double on Saturday's all-weather card took former 2016 Champion Trainer Sio Cheong to a narrow lead on 12 wins, just one ahead of last year's Champion Tony Fung, with Stanley Chin the leading conditioner in 2019 in third spot on ten victories. Prior to Saturday all three trainers were sharing first spot on ten wins apiece, in what was a first for the Club.

Top Mountainlegend (Manhattan Rain) a new addition to Sio Cheong's yard was the first of his winners when he easily accounted for his opposition in the Class 3 over 1510 metres under Roger Yu.

Top Mountainlegend is an Australian import who raced in New South Wales as Classic Jade when prepared by Gary Moore at Rosehill. The gelding won a maiden at Newcastle and a Benchmark 58 at Goulburn from his nine starts before being sold onto Macau. He was originally with Geoff Allendorf in Macau where he proved a model of consistency, winning over 1500 metres on the turf and placing on six other occasions, before being sold to his new owner Mr Ip Ka Wing.

The gelding was confidently supported at his first run for Cheong on the turf over 1200 metres, and after having the run of the race found himself locked away behind a wall of horses in the straight, going to the line hard held. There were no such problems on Saturday when after a quick getaway he enjoyed the run of the race in the box seat under Roger Yu, before taking command in the home straight and racing away for an easy win.

Kelvin's Choice (Snitzel) another Australian import gave Cheong his double when he ran out an easy winner in the Class 4 & 5 Division (2) over 1050 metres with Peter Ho in the saddle.

Smart Arrow a lovely big strong four-yearold had formerly trialed at Doomben and the Gold Coast with his best effort a fair second at the Gold Coast. The bay seems to have really taken to the sand surface in Macau, and stood out in three trials prior to Saturday's race.

The gelding no doubt has plenty to learn and needs to settle down and relax, but he most certainly will pay his way for owner Mr Lee Wing Yan.

The win on Smart Arrow was the first leg of a double for Yu who sits in equal third spot with J B Hamel in the riders standing with nine wins each. Luis Corrales and Eric Cheung each share top billing with 12 winners to date. Nick Moore continued his great strike-rate with Hostwin Poseidon (Dream Ahead), one of only two runners on Saturday, taking out the last of the day in super fashion by four lengths eased down.

Hostwin Poseidon, a bay colt from the Stratum (Redoute's Choice) dam Abrasions, was an \$85,000 purchase at the 2019 Gold Coast 2YO's In Training Sales by owner Mr Jason Tam.


The colt has now won three races from six starts and judging by the ease of his win will have no problems handling the higher grade.

Prepared by America's top turf trainer Chad Brown, French import Orglandes made her first start in California a winning one, defeating Going To Vegas (Goldencents) by a half-length with

a further length back to Quick (Olympic Glory) in third. The Red Carpet, formerly the Beverly Hills Handicap and a Grade 1 at Hollywood Park from 1988 to 2002, has been won by New Zealand mares Happyanunoit (Yachtie) and Black Mamba (Black Minnaloushe) in the past. However, Orglandes is the first foreign-bred mare to take the feature since Japanese Group 1 winner Nuovo Record swept past her American rivals in 2016. Le Havre stands for €40,000 (approx. AUD\$64,600) at Montfort et Preaux, now under the Sumbe banner, in 2021.

No Excuse Needed - Hunta Pence (8 g ex Vanitas by Pins) notched his first stakes victory on his 54th start when taking out the Wanganui Cup (Listed, 2040m) on Saturday, in the process providing the late No Excuse Needed (Machiavellian) with his 19th individual stakes winner. Hunta Pence defeated Overtheriver (Mettre En Jeu) by a length, with Sir Nate (Nadeem) another four and a half lengths back in third. No Excuse Needed, who stood at Wakaito Stud, was fatally injured in a 2015 paddock accident aged 17.

Not A Single Doubt - Niedorp (4 m ex Black Tulip by Lonhro) earned Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice) his 74th individual stakes winner when taking out the Spirit Of Boom Classic (Listed, 1200m) at Doomben Saturday. Niedorp defeated Blazing Miss (Sizzling) into second, with Jadentom (Rothesay) in third. Arrowfield's Not A Single Doubt, the sire of 14 individual Group 1 winners, was retired from stud service in January 2020, following a diagnosis of pulmonary disease.

Ocean Park - Ocean Beyond (3 g ex Frankly by Pins) continued the unbeaten start to his career when taking out the McKenzie Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Moonee Valley on Saturday, earning Waikato Stud's Ocean Park (Thorn Park) his 11th individual stakes winner in the process. Ocean Beyond, purchased by Daniel Bowman for \$60,000 at New Zealand Bloodstock's Ready-To-Run Sale last November, impressed on

debut at Moonee Valley, comfortably landing his maiden (1212m) by one and a quarter lengths, and made relatively light work of this Listed contest with a half-length defeat of Deep Speed (Deep Field). The front two pulled three lengths clear of third-placed Free To Move (Unencumbered), while \$2.50 favourite Nicolini Vito (Nicconi) finished sixth of the seven runners. Ocean Park, the sire of Group 1 winners Kolding and Tofane, stands at Waikato Stud for NZ\$20,000 (plus GST).

Oratorio - Ultra Magnus (5 g ex Field Star by Lecture), who finished runner-up in the Sun Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) earlier this year, provided Oratorio (Danehill) with his 59th individual stakes winner when taking out The Merchants (Gr 3, 1160m) at Turffontein on Saturday. The Peter Muscutt-trained gelding scooted clear impressively in the final 100 metres to score by two lengths from Eden Roc (Var), with Bold Ransom (Bold Silvano) a head behind in third. Oratorio, a multiple Group 1 winner in Europe when trained by Aidan O'Brien, stands at Avontuur Estate in South Africa for R20,000 (approx. AUD\$1,775).

Rulership - Wonderful Town (2 c ex Sea Of Love by Deep Impact) joined the likes of Victoire Pisa (Neo Universe), Epiphaneia (Symboli Kris S) and Tosen Stardom (Deep Impact) on Saturday by taking out the Kyoto Nisai Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) at Hanshin, giving sire Rulership (King Kamehameha) his 15th individual stakes victor. Ridden by Ryuji Wada, the Yoshitada Takahashi-trained Wonderful Town - sent out third favourite - came from a long way back and wide to produce a tough staying performance, defeating Lagom (Orfevre) by three-quarters of a length with a further three-quarters back to Machaon d'Or (Gold Ship) in third. Rulership will stand his ninth season at Shadai Stallion Station in 2021.

Sacred Falls - Late Waikato Stud stallion Sacred Falls (O'Reilly) sired this third individual stakes winner when Zee Falls (3 f ex Zelitist by

In breaking her maiden at start four, Zee Falls ensured trainer Stephen Marsh won the threeyear-old feature for the third consecutive year, following on from the victories of subsequent New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Crown Prosecutor (Medaglia d'Oro) in 2018 and Derby placegetter Scorpz (Charm Spirit) 12 months ago. The Johno Benner and Hollie Wynyard-trained Key (Exceed And Excel) ran second, beaten three-quarters of a length, while White Lightning (Reliable Man) was a further length and a quarter back in third. Zee Falls was purchased by Marsh from the Waikato Stud draft at Book 1 of the 2019 New Zealand Bloodstock Yearling Sale draft, realising \$130,000. Thursday's victory continued a purple patch for the ill-fated Sacred Falls, who has produced Group 1 winner Aegon, Group 3 winner All Saints' Eve, and stakes performers Icebath, Tommy Gold, and Salto Angel. Sacred Falls died last December after a short battle with a rare illness of the liver.

Speightstown - WinStar Farm tasted success at Aqueduct in New York on Saturday when veteran Speightstown (Gone West) brought up stakes winner 119 with Discovery Stakes (Gr 3, 9f) victor Forza Di Oro (3 c ex Filare l'Oro by Hard Spun). In a field of five, the Bill Mott-trained, Junior Alvarado-ridden Forza Di Oro scored by almost four lengths over favourite Monday Morning Qb (Imagining) with Shared Sense (Street Sense) a length and a half away in third. Speightstown will stand for USD\$90,000 (approx. AUD\$121,850) in 2021.

Spill The Beans - Tellall (3 g ex Devil's Angel by Danehill Dancer) provided the late Spill The Beans (Snitzel) with his first stakes winner when taking out the Trevor Eagle Memorial (Listed, 1500m) at Ellerslie on Saturday. Tellall impressively defeated Helsinki (Savabeel) by one and a half lengths, with Fleetwood Maca (Rock 'n' Pop) close behind in third. Spill The

Beans, who has 27 winners from 81 runners, died unexpectedly last November after standing at Aquis Stud between 2016 and 2019.

Statue Of Liberty - The pensioned Statue Of Liberty (Storm Cat) produced his 22nd individual stakes winner when Grandview Avenue (5 g ex Magic By Gosh by Magic Albert) took out Saturday's Carlyon Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Moonee Valley. Sent out as a \$7.50 chance in a wide-open market, the Simon Ryan-trained Grandview Avenue looked the winner a long way from home, eventually crossing the line a length and three-quarters in front of Prophet's Thumb (I Am Invincible), with the returning Prezado (Denman) a length and a half away in third. Bred by Ryan's fatherin-law Peter McLaren, Grandview Avenue is a brother to Magic Millions 2YO Clockwise Classic (1000m) winner Claro El Banco. Statue Of Liberty was retired in 2018, having stood 12 seasons in Australia at Eliza Park and its successor Sun Stud.

Stormy River - A breakthrough Listed win for Sky Power (3 g ex Feltzer by Indian Rocket) in the Prix Lyphard (Listed, 1900m) on the Deauville all-weather track on Wednesday provided Haras de Saint Arnoult resident Stormy River (Verglas) with his 14th individual stakes winner. The gelding, who was winning for the fourth time in 14 starts, came out on top in a blanket finish, edging out Winter Reprise (Intello) and Bugle Major (Mizzen Mast) by a head and the same. Group 1 winner Stormy Rover stood for a fee of €2,200 (approx. AUD\$3,565) in 2020.

Street Sense - Royal Command (7 g ex Stormy Nova by Metal Storm) brought up a 73rd individual stakes winner for Street Sense (Street Cry) when comfortably taking out Saturday's Tattersall's Cup (Listed, 2100m) at Ascot. Seven-year-old Royal Command, who finished third in the Ascot Gold Cup (Listed, 1800m) a fortnight previously, took the lead inside the final 200 metres and pulled clear with ease

Ridden by Jose Lezcano, Mrs. Danvers defeated Ice Princess (Palace Malice) by six and a half lengths, with Thankful (American Pharoah) a further four lengths behind in third. Gainesway Stud-based stallion Tapit, who had his first stakes winner in Australia earlier this year with Love Tap, will stand for US\$185,000 (approx. AUD\$250,500) in 2021.

Typhon - One More Jack (5 g ex Husson Spirit by Hussonet) gave Glenrae Stud's Typhon (God's Own) a first stakes winner when victorious in the City Of Marion Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Morphettville on Saturday. Typhon stands for \$1,650 (inc GST) in 2020.

What A Winter - Winter Smoke (3 f ex Chatanooga Chuchu by Cataloochee) made it three wins in six starts when her victory in Saturday's Magnolia Handicap (Gr 3, 1160m) at Turffontein provided her sire What A Winter (Western Winter) with his 13th individual stakes winner. Trained by Ashley Fortune, Winter Smoke beat Gallic Princess (Vercingetorix) by three quarters of a length, with Double 'O' Eight (Eightfold Path) a further half a length behind in third. What A Winter is the sire of three elite level winners in his native South Africa.

Wordsmith - Tasmanian owner-breeders Paul and Elizabeth Geard enjoyed another stakes winner by their resident GeeGee Stud stallion Wordsmith (Testa Rossa) when Gee Gee Secondover (5 g ex Gee Gees Firstover by Over)

took out the Tasmanian Newmarket (Listed, 1200m) at Launceston on Wednesday. Second favourite Street Tough (Tough Speed) was a further length adrift in third. In doing so, Gee Gee Secondover

became the sixth individual stakes winner for Wordsmith, a Group 3-winning son of Testa Rossa (Perugino) who is standing the 2020 breeding season at the Geards' Broadmarsh base for a fee of \$4,400. Gee Gee Secondover joins fellow homebreds Geegees Goldengirl, Gee Gees Top Notch, Gee Gee Double Dee, Gee Gee Josie and Geegees Classicboy as stakes scorers for Wordsmith, who covered 26 mares at a fee of \$5,500 in 2019.


