Confidence high despite absence of some Victorian buyers at the last minute

Magic Millions National Yearling Sale set to get under way with some well-credentialed horses on day one

he depth of the buying bench for the Magic Millions National Yearling Sale has taken an unexpected hit, but the auction house is confident the market strength that has been prevailing all year will continue at the Gold Coast today.

The three-day sale, which comes on the back of record weanling and broodmare auctions in the past fortnight, has a 430-lot Book 1 catalogue of horses going under the hammer today and tomorrow before a third session of 166 Book 2 yearlings are sold on Thursday.

"There's a great buzz on the grounds. I think our catalogue stacks up really well, both on paper and physically and it is always a sale where, if you're willing to shop for a bit of value, you'll find it," Magic Millions managing director Barry Bowditch said yesterday.

"We're hopeful there's plenty of good racehorses to set the track alight in the years to come."



<< Continued from page 1 New Zealand buyers Phill Cataldo, Paul Beamish, Paul Willetts and Roger Cooksley have been on the grounds inspecting yearlings and they have been joined by the likes of Australian agents Suman Hedge, who has delayed his return to Victoria due to the Covid-19 outbreak, Sheamus Mills, Justin Bahen, Paul Moroney and trainer John McArdle.

Te Akau Racing's David Ellis and Jamie Richards have also remained in Australia after witnessing champion mare Melody Belle (Commands) sell for \$2.6 million last week and they, too, were busy inspecting yearlings yesterday.

Sydney trainers Annabel Neasham, Gerald Ryan, Lee and Cherie Curtis, Victoria's Mick Price, Kiwi trainer Roger James, Western Australia's Ben Pearce and Tasmania's Adam Trinder are also at the sales.

But at least nine Victorian buyers who arrived on the Gold Coast last week are unable to attend the Magic Millions sale due to Queensland government restrictions imposed in response to Victoria's seven-day Covid lockdown.

"Under the circumstances, we've missed quite a few inspectors who couldn't get here from Victoria, but in saying that, we think we've got a good cross-section of buyers," Bowditch said.

"There's quite a few Kiwis here, all the other states are wellrepresented and with Victoria there are still some here (who had arrived for the weanling and broodmare sales), but the ones who can't get here, we are trying to do our best to help facilitate them purchasing yearlings."

On day one, Torryburn Stud has an I Am

Invincible (Invincible Spirit) half-brother to this season's Widden Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) runner-up Centimental (Snitzel) (Lot 1547) set to go through the ring, Milburn Creek has a Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) brother to the stakes-placed Spend, being out of stakes-winning mare Walk With Attitude (Hussonet) (Lot 1619), and Eureka Stud will offer a Capitalist (Written Tycoon) three-quarter brother to Group 3 winner Vibrant Rouge (Lot 1447).

On Wednesday, yearlings by Toronado (High Chaparral), Hellbent (I Am Invincible), Zoustar (Northern Meteor), Almanzor (Wootton Bassett), Exceed And Excel (Danehill) and Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice) could also feature prominently among the top lots.

While owners and trainers seeking racehorses are expected to be the major players, traders are also set to make their mark, says Bowditch.

"Obviously, this is a sale where the breeze-up buyers have done really well in the past. They have bought horses at a value price who have gone on and been really good breeze-up sale horses for them," he said.

"They like to go back to the well and this is a sale they've shopped well at in the past."

The sale starts at 10am today.

Chester's Choice piece of history as last Redoute's yearling heads through the ring

David Chester, an iconic Magic Millions figure, has many achievements to his name during his more than five decades in the industry and today he will add another piece of history when he opens today's National Yearling Sale.

Chester will sell Lot 1401 at 10am today, the first horse through the ring, who just happens to be the last yearling by champion stallion Redoute's Choice to be sold at auction.

Offered by Arrowfield Stud, he is the second living foal out of winning Japanese mare La Fouine Tail (Neo Universe).

Chester also sold the first Redoute's Choice yearling, a Newhaven Park-consigned colt, as Lot 11 at the 2003 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

Out of Star Way (Star Appeal) mare Nicety, the colt was bought by trainer Alan Scorse for \$50,000. Named Private Certifier, he went on to win seven of his 64 starts with a further 14 placings.

"I don't know whether you'd call it an honour - it just shows my age, selling the first and the last one," he said yesterday.

"Who would have thought Redoute's Choice would have turned out the way he did. He's just been amazing, a three-time Australian champion sire, so many Group 1 winners, I think it's 39 Group 1 winners, and to think you'd sell the first and last, I think it would create a bit of history.

"David Coles and John Inglis might have done it with some of the great stallions like Star Kingdom and Without Fear and those sort of horses. It's quite unique."

Chester had inspected the Arrowfield Stud colt and he's impressed by what he's seen.

"I really like him. He's first-up and it's always difficult selling the first in a sale," he said.

"It takes a while for buyers to find their feet and set their market, but to have a horse like that as Lot number 1, it sets us up for the day."

Newhaven Park's John Kelly yesterday also recalled the first Redoute's Choice yearling put to market.

"I remember the horse, he won six or seven races, and over the years we've sold quite a few Redoute Choices and he's been a very good stallion to us and now we've got quite a few Redoute's Choice broodmares," Kelly said.

"I can't add anything to what everyone else has said, he's been a

breed-shaper, he's been a great stallion for a lot of people and he's been a great stallion for Australia's industry."

In 2003, Redoute's Choice's fourth season at stud, he had just 75 live foals, his lowest number until 2016 during 19 years standing at Arrowfield. To date, the champion stallion of 2006, 2010 and 2014 has total progeny earnings of \$178 million and an elite 11.8 per cent stakes winners to runners ratio.

Kelly recalls backing his judgment and supporting him that year and he was subsequently rewarded in spades through the sales ring. Nicety was one of those Newhaven mares, visiting Redoute's Choice four years in succession and producing three foals.

The last of those was Daaloob who was bought by Shadwell Stud's Angus Gold for \$600,000 at the 2006 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, just as owners and trainers were starting to realise what an impact Redoute's Choice was having.

"We were very keen on Redoute's Choice from the beginning. We went to him every year and we kept going to him," he said.

"People probably forget, but Redoute's Choice after his first crop had raced, he was considered to be going only ordinary.

"He had about 75 yearlings in a crop and we had about eight of them when he came good. It was very advantageous for us. We had a good year."

Chester will "open the batting" today, as he does at every Magic Millions sale, but don't expect anything outlandish from the experienced auctioneer when Lot 1401 walks in.

He said: "I just want to get him sold and make sure the vendor gets a good price for him and get onto the second lot up."

Messara appointed chair of Racing Australia

John Messara AM has been appointed as an independent director and elected as chair of Racing Australia, replacing Greg Nichols whose term concluded in April 2021. It is the first time an independent director has been appointed since the establishment of Racing Australia. Messara, the founder and owner of Arrowfield Stud, was inducted into the Australian Racing Hall of Fame last month for his service to the industry in several roles, including chairman of Racing NSW from 2011-16 and as the inaugural chair of Racing Australia from 2014-16. "After more than four years away from administration, I can see how much more our industry can achieve with strong interstate relationships and collaboration," said Messara. "I look forward to working with all the Principal Racing Authorities, the directors and Racing Australia's executive for the benefit of everyone who works and invests in the Australian thoroughbred industry."

Standoff's Oaks bid stalled by restrictions

Standoff (Smart Missile) will run at Flemington this Saturday instead of having a shot at the

Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) due to a change to the Covid-19 protocols. Co-trainer and partowner Grant Dalziel travelled as far as Tarcutta in NSW last Thursday with the filly on his float before Queensland racing officials contacted him to inform him of protocol changes due to the latest Covid-19 outbreak in Melbourne. "I got to Tarcutta (north of Albury) the other night and had all the travel documents and was sitting down in a horse motel there having my dinner when I got the phone call from the people in Queensland that all the rules had changed. What originally happened was I was able to get a Covid test and was able to continue to work with the horse if I was all-clear. So, that was fine but when they rang the next time, I had to quarantine for two weeks so I just turned around and came home," said Dalziel. Instead of running for a shot at Group 1 success in Brisbane, Standoff will now contest a \$135,000 heat of the Silver Bowl Series for three-vearolds over 1400 metres at Flemington.

Williams to remain in QLD

Champion Melbourne jockey Craig Williams will continue to ride in Queensland as Victoria remains in lockdown due to an outbreak of Covid-19.Victorian-based riders Jve McNeil, Ben Allen and Jamie Kah have all returned home after competing in Group 1 races at Eagle Farm last Saturday and have accepted rides for tomorrow's eight-race card at Sandown Hillside. Williams has opted to stay in the Sunshine State with bookings at Eagle Farm for the next two weekends. This Saturday, the 44-year-old will ride the Chris Waller-trained Only Words (Sweynesse) in the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) plus Wisdom of Water (Headwater) for Annabel Neasham in the Queensland Day Stakes (Listed, 1200m). Williams' agent Jason Breen confirmed on Racing.com

yesterday that he will also ride in the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) and Q22 meeting at Eagle Farm on June 12 and continue to reassess Melbourne's Covid-19 situation prior to making any plans to return to his home state. Williams has won the past five jockeys' premierships in Melbourne, winning between 63 to 83 races each season. Williams is currently equal sixth with 35 wins alongside McNeil, with Kah on 89 wins and set to win her first Melbourne title.

King to ride Vega in Stradbroke

Rachel King is set to partner Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m) winner Vega One (Lope De Vega) in the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) on June 12, with Jamie Kah to remain in Victoria. Trainer Tony Gollan was complimentary of Kah's ride aboard the fiveyear-old at the weekend, but she is set to remain in Melbourne for the foreseeable future due to Covid-19 border restrictions. "I was watching Jonker out in front and thought he was going to hang on and all I could see was Vega One behind a wall of horses. So, I've got no idea how Jamie (Kah) got through, the more I watch the replay the more I marvel at the ride," Gollan told RSN. Vega One is the current \$6 favourite for the Stradbroke.

Dice Roll Ryan's headline horse

Trainer Nick Ryan has labelled Dice Roll (Showcasing) the best horse in his boutique stable at Flemington after recording two wins from his two Australian starts. "I reckon he's easily gone straight to the top," Ryan told Racing.com. As a three-year-old, Dice Roll won four of his first five starts before running third in the 2018 French Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). He was then sold to Hong Kong where he didn't perform. "He obviously didn't acclimatise to life in Hong Kong, the tracks were too hard for him. He ran third in a French Guineas, that's one of the classic races around the world, he didn't fluke that. The best thing he did was have 18 months in the paddock and it's like he's been re-born." Ryan has resisted the temptation to run him in the Stradbroke during the Queensland carnival and will continue to campaign him in Melbourne next month. "I did seriously contemplate it, but I think he's a spring horse and, with Sircconi and Mahamedius going up there, I need some bullets for the spring." Dice Roll will trial at Traralgon next Tuesday before running in a heat of the Winter Championship on June 19 and, all going to plan, the final on July 3. Then he will be targeted at Group 1 races in the spring. "We'll likely go to the PB Lawrence, Feehan Stakes ... Group 2 over a mile and a golden ticket into the Cox Plate."

Duty Dynasty impresses in trial

Duty Dynasty (Snitzel), the younger halfbrother to Group 1 winner Hungry Heart (Frankel), impressed in a jumpout win at Cranbourne yesterday. Ridden by Tom Stockdale, the Snitzel colt clocked 51.0 seconds to comfortably win the 800-metre hitout. It was the fastest of the eight 800-metre jumpouts staged at Cranbourne and bettered the times recorded by horses in the three-year-old and open heats. Trainer Natalie Young said that the Yulong Investments-owned colt was doing all the right things in his first serious racing preparation but the stable was keen to let him prove his talent on the racetrack before getting too excited about his future. "He's shown us a lot on the track so far, he's a lovely type and he's obviously got a nice pedigree, being a half to Hungry Heart. The jockeys that have come in to work him have said that he can definitely gallop. He looked to do it pretty easily but you can't get carried away about an 800-metre jumpout at Cranbourne. He'll have another jumpout in a couple of weeks over 1000 metres and then we'll hopefully get him to the races," said Young to Racing.com.

Kent: Ayrton defeat 'good experience'

Co-trainer Michael Kent jr is taking positives from Ayrton (Iffraaj) losing his unbeaten record when finishing second to Apache Chase (Better Than Ready) in the Fred Best Classic (Gr 3, 1400m) on Saturday. The threeyear-old was set to contest the Stradbroke if he won the Fred Best, but will now line up in the Gunsynd Classic (Gr 3, 1600m) at Eagle Farm on the same day. "Everyone gets caught up in the hype but it was always going to be very tough for Ayrton to go to a race like the Stradbroke at just his fifth start," Kent jr, who trains in partnership with Mick Price, told RSN. "He's still a baby and in a Stradbroke you're running against very seasoned horses with 20, 30 or more starts under their belt. It's always been a very hard race and a very hard race to win and Ayrton is still working it all out." Kent added that Ayrton's first defeat "was a good experience for him."

Arthritic gel blamed for positive

Trainer Kylie Vella was fined \$2,000 - of which \$1,500 is suspended for 12 months at a Victorian Racing Tribunal on Monday in relation to a positive swab from the late Admiral's Joker (Bel Esprit) at Flemington in May 2019. Admiral's Joker tested positive for prohibited substance Diclofenac, which was likely obtained from an anti-inflammatory gel Voltaren used by Vella's husband Steven that contains Diclofenac, following a Benchmark 84 win. VRT chairman judge John Bowman said the positive appeared to be entirely accidental, but the trainer should have been aware that it could be risky for a person handling a horse to use such medication. The horse's later death was unrelated to this case.

Ryland to stand Spirit Of Valor

Luke Ryland, who operates Lethbridge-based farm Ryland Thoroughbreds with his partner Bec Hausler, believes Spirit Of Valor (War Front) can prove a bargain buy at \$40,000 as he begins his career at stud. Spirit Of Valor, who is a Group 2 winner and finished a head runner-up in the 2018 Manikato Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), finished his 26-start racing career in January and was bought from the Inglis Digital March Sale. The rising seven-year-old will stand for an introductory fee of \$5,500. "If he'd won the Manikato Stakes that night, we wouldn't have been able to afford the couple of million to buy him, that's for sure," Ryland told Racing.com. "We'd love to see him get 30 or 40 mares in his first season. We think he's affordably priced at \$5,500 and the perfect stallion for those owner-breeders or trainers that breed a few of their own to race. And we are selling lifetime breeding rights for him and we've had a lot of interest in those so far - at \$11,000 you get two serves in his first year, two in his second and then one serve every year after that."

Black Caviar daughter entered for Flemington

A gallop this morning at Pakenham will help trainer Peter Moody decide whether champion mare Black Caviar's (Bel Esprit) daughter Invincible Caviar (I Am Invincible) will make her debut this weekend. Invincible Caviar has been entered for a two-year-old fillies race over 1100 metres at Flemington and a twoyear-old maiden over 1000 metres at Bendigo on Saturday. She's the fifth foal out of Black Caviar, but is the first to be trained by Peter Moody, who also prepared the legendary mare. "We'll have a look after her work tomorrow morning and then start putting plans in place. She'll be running wherever the track is firmest as well. One thing we seem to have learned in the last few weeks is she appreciates being on top of the ground," Moody told RSN. Of Black Caviar's previous foals to race, only Oscietra (Exceed and Excel) and Prince Of Caviar (Sebring) have been successful and Invincible Caviar has been showing promise in her jumpouts so far at Pakenham.

Graceful Girl to back up

The Grant and Alana Williams-trained Graceful Girl (Nicconi) is likely to back up in stakes company after her impressive win at Belmont last Saturday. Raced by Bob and Sandra Peters, Graceful Girl has not finished out of the money in her six career starts, winning three races and placing on as many occasions since making her debut last year. Jockey William Pike is confident she can make an impact in Saturday's Raconteur Stakes (Listed, 1400m). "I will leave it up to the powers that be, but I think she will be able to handle it. She is just a professional little racehorse who loves to race. I think young horses that are in the zone, which I think she is, put them in anything and they will have a redhot crack," said Pike. He said that Graceful Girl didn't have it all her own way on Saturday and her ability to sprint sharply in the straight was impressive. "I was held up and she did it from the back foot. It was a really nice effort and I thought it was a good effort to do it without any momentum leading into the straight. To gun them down like she did was really nice."

Allen to ride Media Award

John Allen has picked up the ride on Media Award (Shamus Award) in the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m). Allen, the winner of three Derbies in Australia this season, ventured to Queensland last Wednesday and steered Explosive Jack (Jakkalberry) to third placing in the Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) at Eagle Farm last Saturday. Allen was booked to fly back to Victoria on Sunday morning, but received confirmation he was to ride the Chris Calthorpe-trained Media Award on Saturday evening. At her last start Media Award won the Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) at Morphettville on May 1 and was ridden by

Luke Nolen on that occasion. With border closures in place due to the recent outbreak of Covid in Melbourne, Nolen and several other Victorian jockeys not already in Queensland are not permitted to make the trip. "There had been a little bit of word about it when the borders were closed and I got word on Friday that I might be in the running for it. But it wasn't confirmed until Saturday evening. The plan was to fly home on Sunday morning but obviously she looks a live chance in a Group 1 race and I thought it was worth the while staying," said Allen.

Tiptronic to spell

The Graham Richardson and Rogan Norvalltrained Tiptronic (O'Reilly) will spell in Queensland after trailing the field home in the Lord Mayor's Cup (Gr 3, 1800m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. The Kiwi seven-year-old weakened in the home straight and a post-race veterinary examination revealed the gelding to be suffering from atrial fibrillation. "He didn't pull up flash. He fibrillated and it wasn't anybody's fault, it just happens, and they can do that occasionally," Richardson said. "It was quite disappointing because his work last Tuesday was outstanding, but he is good now which is the main thing. He is going to spell over there for six to eight weeks and it will do him the world of good. He is not a great spring horse. I will bring him up slowly when he is back in New Zealand."

Stokes continues synthetic form with a treble

Unique Artist (Ivawood) spearheaded a treble for in-from trainer Phillip Stokes at Pakenham Synthetic on Monday. Mr Joobs (Hampton Court) and Dominus (Iffraaj) also saluted the judge to continue Stokes' good form at the circuit, where he has had six winners and two seconds since the first meeting on the synthetic track on April 29, with none of his 12 runners finishing outside the top four. "Full credit to the team, they're all racing well," Stokes said. "My staff at Pakenham are doing a great job."

Tenlon notches double on second raceday

Eighteen-year-old Rockhampton apprentice

Tahlia Fenlon rode a winning double at just her second day of race riding at Gladstone on Saturday. Better still, Fenlon's first winner - the Kevin Miller-trained Absolute Bonza (Bon Hoffa) - smashed the course record when running 58.40 seconds in the 1000-metre Benchmark 65. "It was so good as he just ran all the way from out of the barriers and didn't stop," Fenlon said post-race. Just 80 minutes later, Tahlia brought up her winning double aboard Arjaycee (Dreamscape) in the Benchmark 45 over 1517 metres.

Hayes impressed with Lindsay Park progress

David Hayes is pleased with Lindsay Park's progress under Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig since he left for Hong Kong last season, and is optimistic about the training establishment's future with his son JD Hayes set to replace Dabernig at the start of the 2021-22 season. "They've done well. They were the leading trainers over the Flemington carnival, which is not easy to do," he told Racing.com. "Considering that Sheikh Hamdan passed away and I moved up here, there's been a lot of change down there and now it will be Ben and JD, subject to JD getting his licence. I'm really excited for them. The stable isn't as big as it was without Shadwell, but they'll be able to build up, and sometimes it's good not to be too big when you're young and starting, and hopefully they'll be successful, and the horses will follow into the stable. They've got a great facility; they know how to use it and I think they're going to do well." Hayes added: "I think it's very important that they stand on their own two feet. I'm there for advice, not to dictate.".



Widden Victoria launch pretraining and spelling facility

Upton will head up the pre-training division, bringing the experience he has gained from working for the likes of Peter Sidwell of Sutton Grange, Robbie Laing, Andrew Noblet, David Moodie's Yungaburra and most recently Woodside Park. The facilities at the property, located 50 kilometres from Flemington, include a high speed treadmill, water walker, 1600-metre sand track and starting gates. "The resources on offer will cater for both breaking and spelling, the lush pasture and spacious, tree-lined paddocks the ideal location to freshen up or recuperate horses that are in need of time, as well as educating those embarking on their racing careers," Widden said in a statement.

RQ to alter minimum bet limits

Racing Queensland is set to alter its Minimum Bet Limits with Wagering Service Providers. From July 1, Queensland will become the first state to have no timing restrictions on MBLs across all three codes (thoroughbred, harness and greyhound). "From the moment operators release the final field markets, punters will be able to access the Minimum Bet Limits." RO CEO Brendan Parnell said. "This includes win and place options for all three codes. The introduction of Minimum Bet Limits were well received by punters in Queensland and we anticipate that they will welcome the opportunity to access them from the moment the markets open." Overall MBL liability amounts remain unchanged.

Stakes winner Kaharau set for jumping future

Kaharau (Ad Valorem), a winner at Listed level and runner-up in the 2019 New Zealand Cup (Gr 3, 3200m), will be sent over jumps for the rest of his career. The nine-year-old gelding won his 2000-metre Open Hurdle trial at Cambridge on Monday, impressing both rider and trainer. "That's the first time I have ever seen him jump. I was quite pleased with him," Kenny Rae said of Kaharau, who won 14 races on the Flat. "At this stage he is going to go to Ellerslie on Saturday or Ruakaka on June 19, and he is going to Hastings for a maiden hurdle race on July 3." Jumping has revived Kaharau's racing career, as he was planned to be sent to the retirement paddock. "He was given away and came home and we brought him back into work to get the twoyear-olds going down on the beach," Rae said. "He did a few trips to the races with the young horses as a mate. He has had a lot of races, but he just loves being in work. Emily [Farr] has always had a high opinion of him."

"I think he's exciting, not only for his physique - he's such a big horse. I would say he's got the potential to be a Group 1 horse," Hayes told Racing.com. "If he was home [Australia], he'd be running in the proper races, like the (Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes) or the Toorak or the (Cantala), that sort of thing. I'm really keen with him and Fantastic Treasure to get them at a rating where they can target the better races next season, because the thing I've been missing are horses in those premier races in Hong Kong. I think those two have got the class to compete at the top."

HK: Premiership goal for Hayes

Meanwhile, Hayes is keen to add to his two trainers' titles, won in the late 90s, next season, having trained the most winners in Hong Kong since the beginning of April. "Last time I think I finished fourth in my first year, this year I reckon I'll finish in the top eight," he said. "Then I got beaten in a photo finish in my second year and I won it the third. I'll be disappointed if we're not up near the top next year and hopefully win a premiership soon."

INNOVATIVE POINTS-BASED SYSTEM SEES WAIKATO STUD IN RUNNING FOR LEADING VENDOR IN AUSTRALIA

ire premierships are decided on monies earned, that's just how it is, and how it has been, for some considerable time.

Another measure, such as AEI (Average Earnings Index), has been used over time, providing further analysis of a sire's performance.

BLACK TYPE PREMIERSHIP (BTP) HAVE ENTERED THE FRAY WITH YET ANOTHER MEASURE: ALLOTTING POINTS FOR ALL BLACK-TYPE PERFORMANCES

Wins and winners; stakes wins and stakes winners; stakes-winners-to-winners ratio; stakes-winners-to-runners ratio – are more categories to assist in determining a stallion's quality.

In an innovative attempt to further quantify and assess the quality of runners, sires, dams and vendors, an organisation named Black Type Premiership (BTP) have entered the fray with yet another measure: Allotting points for all black-type performances.

And, in quite a coup for the famed New Zealand stallion farm and nursery, Waikato Stud, the Mark Chittick-owned operation has, until recently, topped the rankings as the leading vendor for not just New Zealand, but Australia as well.

Their system, which is certainly subjective, has some merit. The only argument might be their settling upon certain values, and the differences in values, assigned to each winning or placed performance.

The full points criteria is as follows;



Fabric SPORTPIX

One point is given to any horse that finishes third in a Listed or Restricted Listed race. Second earns two points and winning earns four points.

BTP believes that a Group 3 third placing is equal to a Listed win, thus awarding four points. Second earns five points and a Group 3 winner seven points.

This pattern repeats itself for Group 2 and Group 1 races. Third in a Group 2 earns the same seven points as a Group 3 winner. Second earns eight points and the Group 2 winner ten points.

For Group 1 race performances, third earns the same ten points as a Group 2 winner, second earns 11 points and a Group 1 winner earns the maximum 13 points.

Several weeks ago, one of Chittick's associates forwarded him a report that, using this new points allocation method, had Waikato Stud as the leading vendor of stakes performers for Australia. Not New Zealand and Australia combined, but Australia alone.

Quite rightly, Chittick was very interested to learn that his operation, despite being based in New Zealand, had them heading Arrowfield as leading vendor as of that particular week.

Bolstered by Group 1 winners Probabeel (Savabeel), Mo'unga (Savabeel), and Saturday's Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Kukeracha (Night Of Thunder), as well as a plethora of Group winners including All Saints Eve (Sacred Falls), All Hallows Eve (Sacred Falls), Aegon (Sacred Falls), Fabric (Ocean Park) and Missybeel (Savabeel), Waikato Stud find themselves in such a lofty position.

The points ranking, which is calculated weekly, has, since May 30, seen Waikato Stud ease to second behind Arrowfield. Third lies Widden, followed by Bhima, Tyreel, Rosemont, Sledmere, Coolmore, Mill Park and Newhaven rounding out the top ten. Segenhoe, Newgate, Gilgai, Bowness and Vinery follow and the next New Zealand vendor is Wentwood Grange, the vendor of George Main (Gr 1, 1500m) stakes and All Aged Stakes winner (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Kolding, a son of Ocean Park (Thorn Park).

Waikato Stud's Ocean Park, due in large part to the exploits of Kolding, also holds a prominent position in the BTP leading sires table in Australia. When points are compared to the current Australian Sire Premiership by earnings table, it makes for interesting reading, and one that reflects favourably on New Zealand stallions.

Ocean Park sits 31st re earnings yet sixth on points. Barnmate Savabeel (Zabeel) sits 13th on the earnings list yet ninth on the BTP points chart. The deceased Tavistock (Montjeu), formerly of Cambridge Stud, sits 14th in earnings and seventh equal on points. The term "punching above their weight" comes to mind.

The big money effect

Assessing leading sires through prizemoney earnings has become more complex in recent years through the emergence of high-value 'pop-up races'. In Australia in particular, the traditional method (total earnings) has been skewed lately due to the huge prizemoney on offer via races such as The Everest (1200m), the All-Star Mile (1600m) and the Golden Eagle (1500m), among others.

The four Everest winners and their influence on the General Sires' Premierships is profound.

Although In 2018 Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) would have topped the premiership regardless of Redzel's first Everest success, the following season Snitzel would have fallen from first to second without Redzel's \$6.83 million for the season, the horse having gone back-to-back in the lucrative race.

This current season is similarly affected. Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice) sits a very close second, a little more than \$240,000 behind Written Tycoon (Iglesia) as at the end of May. However, without the \$7.13 million earned by his Everest-winning son Classique Legend, Not A Single Doubt would be in 17th position.

Conversely, The Everest is not a stakes race and therefore does not have any standing in BTP's calculations, despite many arguing it to be the strongest sprint race on the Australian calendar.

In New Zealand, BTP lists the current leading sires as Savabeel (Zabeel), Fastnet Rock (Danehill) and Per Incanto (Street Cry) which matches the same order as the current earnings list.

A points system is a welcome alternative to the earnings method, the debate will continue to rumble on.

BPT has Kiwi mare on top

Elsewhere in the BPT rankings and New Zealand celebrates more success as, with 83 points, Opulence (Danroad), dam of Verry Elleegant, enjoys a clear lead of 17 points in the Dam's category over Retsina (Redoute's Choice), who has Savatiano (Street Cry) and Athiri (Lonhro) performing well as a duo. Far Fetched (Pins), dam of Probabeel is seventh. Explosive Jack's dam Extra Explosive (Ekraar) lies 13th.

It does get better

At the NZB Karaka National Weanling Sale last month, Waikato Stud veterinarian Dr Chris Phillips sold a Deep Field (Northern Meteor) filly for NZ\$90,000, declaring: "I couldn't ask for anything better," having purchased the weanling's dam Kibira (Redoute's Choice) carrying the foal, for \$45,000 through the April 2020 Inglis Digital Online Sale.

"I bought the mare in foal to Deep Field but bought her mainly to send to Too Darn Hot," Phillips said. "I am a huge fan of Dubawi and I was present when Time Test was foaled. He was my favourite foal that season."

On Saturday it did get better for Phillips. No doubt his purchase of Portrait Of A Lady (A. P. Indy) was influenced by his keenness on Dubawi (Dubai Millennium), as she was carrying Saturday's Queensland Derby winner Kukeracha, by Dubawi's son Night Of Thunder.

"I knew how good Night Of Thunder was, having kept a close eye on the European racing and I loved his sire Dubawi," said Phillips.

He bought the mare for \$40,000 at the 2017 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale and sold Kukeracha for NZ\$130,000 at the 2019 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale.

Anthony Mithen of Rosemont Stud in Victoria perfectly timed his purchase of Cameo (Shamardal) at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale last week. Cameo is a half-sister to Kukeracha and was successful at Group 3 and Listed level, two of her four wins. She has

already produced a Sydney winner and is in foal to Epaulette (Commands). His \$210,000 outlay now looks most reasonable on reflection.

The local scene

One stakes race was run in New Zealand this past weekend, the Futurity Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Ellerslie.

Still green and described as "a big goof" by his trainer Carl Henderson, Atullibigeal (Street Boss) could not have been more impressive, racing clear by three lengths over the latter stages despite star-gazing from the top of the straight and now has his sight set of the New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) next season.

"Thankfully, he was quite explosive and very strong to the line and that is how he is at home when he is working, as he will just take off when you give him a squeeze," said Henderson. "He is still a big goof though and has a lot of maturing left to do."

Although Atullibigeal was foaled in Australia, his dam Kellys Ocean Jewel (Dansili) spent her first seven seasons at stud in New Zealand, foaling two winners to Pins (Snippets) and two to Bullbars (Elusive Quality).

Exported to Australia in 2015 she has produced a further two winners there including Atullibigeal, her first stakes winner. She is six winners from six to race.

Unraced, Kellys Ocean Jewel is a halfsister to two French stakes winners including Cinnamon Bay (Zamindar), dam of the Champion French colt and Prix du Jockey Club (Gr 1, 2100m) winner New Bay (Dubawi). His granddam, the stakes placed Trellis Bay (Sadler's Wells), is a three-quarter sister to dual Group 1 winner Beat Hollow (Sadler's Wells) and half-sister to Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winner Wemyss Bight (Dancing Brave).

Trellis Bay is also a half-sister to Hope (Dancing Brave), dam of Champion Sprinter and successful sire Oasis Dream (Green Desert) as well as French Classic winner Zenda (Zamindar), dam of European Horse of the Year Kingman (Invincible Spirit).

Brent Gillovic of Highview Stud might be excused for doing a little dance after the debut victory of And We Danced, a two-year-old filly by his resident sire Wrote (High Chaparral), his first southern hemisphere winner.

On looks, Wrote's stock made quite an impression with buyers at the 2020 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale and sold well.

At Hastings last Wednesday And We Danced also made quite an impression, especially considering that she was racing against older horses. She was in heavy traffic starting the run home but accelerated nicely when in the clear and was resolute to the line.

Gillovic was, needless to say, very pleased: "It's nice to get off the mark and the filly is certainly well above average. I didn't think she was going to get up, but it was a big effort. Bill (Thurlow) said this filly really wasn't a two-year-old and she will only get better. She showed a real will to get up and win, and had a great turn of foot in the end."

Wrote, a Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (Gr 1, 8f) victor, who previously stood at Northwest Farm in Florida, has sired 33 winners in USA. His fee for the upcoming season has been maintained at \$5,000 (plus GST).

Kiwis spend big

Kiwi studs and agents stepped up in person and with solid bank accounts at last week's Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale.

It was farewell to Melody Belle (Commands), Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge) and Bonham (Per Incanto), reaching \$2.6 million, \$1.9 million and \$1.6 million respectively and they will remain in Australia.

However, the Kiwis responded strongly, purchasing more than 70 lots and signing sales dockets to the tune of more than \$16 million.

New Zealand agent Dean Hawthorne was responsible for the single highest outlay of \$2 million for the 2019 South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Qafila (Not A Single Doubt). The now five-year-old was a Listed winner at two and added a Group 2 win before her Derby success, earning more than \$700,000. Her dam, the French-raced USA-bred Zighy Bay (Tapit), is a half-sister to Japanese Group 1 winner Mozu Superflare (Speightstown). Qafila is in foal to Dundeel (High Chaparral).

Hawthorne also had to go to seven figures to purchase Zamzam (Redoute's Choice) for \$1.25 million. The Listed winner and Group 1 placed Zamzam is from a half-sister to Tully Thunder (Thunder Gulch), winner of the Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) and dam of Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Levendi (Pierro).

Bruce Perry, in conjunction with Jamieson Park on two lots and Little Avondale Stud on one lot, signed for seven mares including Quilista (Scandal Keeper) for \$1 million. Starting her racing career in Western Australia, where she won four times, Quilista took her talents to Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland adding five wins, two in Sydney, including the Sapphire Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). She produced

an I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) filly last spring and is in foal to Pierata (Pierro).

Perry had to go to \$800,000 to purchase 15-year-old Faint Perfume (Shamardal) who is in foal to I Am Invincible. The Champion 3YO Filly of her crop, Faint Perfume scored the VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) and the Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m). At stud she has done a magnificent job, producing two Group winners including Adelaide Cup (Gr 2, 3200m) winner Good Idea (So You Think). Her dam Zona (Zabeel) is a half-sister to Banc De Fortune (Galileo), granddam of Bonham, who sold for \$1.6 million earlier in the sale.

Catching his breath after a hectic weanling sale the previous week was agent Paul Willetts whose twelve purchases included one in conjunction with Boomer Bloodstock. His most expensive outlay was \$425,000 for the Lonhro (Octagonal) mare Wawail, who was a dual Group winner at Flemington. Her dam, El Dana (Redoute's Choice) was also a Flemington Group 2 winner. Wawail is in foal to Deep Field (Northern Meteor).

New Zealand Bloodstock, as well as Bevan Smith, each bought three lots while Jen Campin went to \$300,000 for Wellington Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m) winner Gold Bracelet (Pins). Gold Bracelet is from a sister to Hong Kong Champion Miler Beauty Flash (Golan).

Several New Zealand studs were very active. Windsor Park Stud signed for five lots while Mapperley Stud signed for four and Waikato Stud three lots.

Waikato Stud outlayed \$320,000 for an empty, yet very well related mare. by their own Savabeel (Zabeel). Corvina is a half-sister to Group winners Vavasour (Redoute's Choice), Vilanova (Commands) and Celebrity Dream (Thorn Park). Her dam is the Group 3 winner Valpolicella (Red Ransom) and represents a wonderful family established, and continued very successfully, by, Haunui Farm.

Cambridge Stud chimed in with two purchases, the first, two-year-old Queen Of Wizardry (Not A Single Doubt) for \$525,000, a Brisbane winner this season. She also finished fifth in the recent Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick.

Their second purchase was the Encosta De Lago (Fairy King) mare Pizzazz, in foal to Written Tycoon, for \$350,000. Pizzazz is a sister or half-sister to three stakes winners and to the dam of Sistema Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) victor Summer Passage (Snitzel).

Quinella for Moore as Hostwin Achilles lands Derby Trial

perfectly executed ride by J B Hamel gave Nick Moore his second Group victory when Hostwin Achilles (Deep Field) took out Saturday's Group 3 Derby Trial (1500m), defeating his much more fancied stablemate Circuit Miles (Fastnet Rock).

Moore was bullish all week about the chances of Circuit Miles, the horse that he has set for the Derby, with Hostwin Achilles ending up in the race purely as an afterthought.

"I'm absolutely stoked, what a surprise that was; and to quinella the race as well. I do think Circuit Miles should have won, only bad luck beat him, but I am thrilled with the win by Hostwin Achilles and so happy for the owners Mr. and Mrs. Tam," said Moore. "Jason (Tam) has been a huge supporter of mine, and was also a great supporter of my Father as well.

"We won the Guineas with Hostwin Saturn last year and now we've got a Group 3 with this horse.

"Initially I wasn't going to run him, as he is by Deep Field and more of a 1200-metre sprinter; he can get a bit hot and fired up. But the way he ran on late in his last run over 1200 metres, I thought 'well the race is for four-year-olds and I'll just give it a shot'.

"But I've got to say that I never expected him to be knocking off my main runner Circuit Miles, but J B (Hamel) gave him a beautiful ride. He found cover and got him to relax and just hit the front right at the right time."

From barrier six, Hamel parked Hostwin Achilles in fifth spot, one off the rails with cover on the back of Cherry Road (Niagara). Initially wanting to over race in the early stages, the Frenchman got the gelding to switch off and relax beautifully.

A crucial move from the 600-metre mark by Cherry Road who went forward to sit outside the leader, ultimately proved to be the undoing of Circuit Miles. Hamel followed Cherry Road forward and that put him alongside Circuit

Miles and kept him locked away on the back of the leader.

Timing his move to perfection, Hamel set his mount alight at the 250-metre mark and sprinted quickly to hit the lead. Corrales on Circuit Miles was held up momentarily and had to wait until Hamel went to find clear running.

Circuit Miles really lifted late and cut the margin back to a half-length on the wire. Race favourite Beauty Bolt (Redoute's Choice) ran on strongly for third, a further half-length away after having to come wide from the 600-metre mark to get into the race. Both Circuit Miles and Beauty Bolt will relish the Derby trip of 1800 metres.

Hostwin Achilles was originally with Team Snowden at Rosehill where he raced as Devan, placing in four of his seven starts around the provincials. The horse was then sold and ended up in the hands of Adam Duggan at Gosford, who won two races from three starts with the chestnut at Ouirindi and Taree.

"My brother James sourced the horse for me. He was well bred and we initially bought him to sprint. He was very high strung and nervous when he arrived, and would run his races before he started," said Moore.

"I've just taken my time with him trying to get him to relax. I changed his feed and we take him walking around a lot in the evenings to give him a pick of grass and relax him. He's really turned a corner of late.

"I'll run both him and Circuit Miles in the Guineas, but I can't see Hostwin Achilles in the Derby. I couldn't see him getting 1800 metres, but Circuit Miles will love it."

Smith's Star smashes record

Star Of Yiu Cheung (Casino Prince) returned to the racetrack with a record-breaking all the way win in Saturday's Class 1 & 2 (1200m) under Shogo Nakano.

Prepared by Wayne Smith, last year's Derby and Macau Gold Cup runner-up simply destroyed his opposition and smashed the long standing 1200-metre record set by Warcat (Felix The Cat) in October 2008. When the clock stopped it was a super slick 1.07.2 recorded by Star Of Yiu Cheung, snipping .01 off Warcat's old standard of 1.07.3.

Beginning smartly off his inside gate, Star Of Yiu Cheung quickly took command of the race to lead on the bridle. At the top of the straight, Nakano gave him more rein, and the big bay lengthened his stride to power away from his rivals and win by almost seven lengths untouched.

"I knew he would win, but I never thought he would do it that easy and break the track record on the bridle, that was mind blowing," Smith said. "He had not run since January after he pulled up with muscle soreness in his back after he ran on the sand. Plus, he had to have a sinus operation as well, so it's been a bit of a trying time, it's a relief to see him back like this. He was only 80 per cent fit for this race, so there is still some improvement there.

"He got a really bad sinus infection and needed an operation. Dr Grant Scott assured me that he had great success with horses he had done in the past, and he did a great job with him."

Smith has earmarked the Class 1 on June 12 over 1500 metres as the gelding's next start. "I'll aim him for that and we'll see what comes along after." Smith said.

"In any other year without Covid we would be having some fun. It's a pity we can't travel to Hong Kong or Dubai with him."

The Class 1 on June 12 will prove to be a thrilling contest, as Star Of Yiu Cheung will run into his Derby nemesis Sacred Magnate (Foxwedge), who snatched victory from him in the last stride in the race last year.



Sacred Magnate also went around on Saturday's program in the second division of the Class 1 & 2 Handicap (1200), but was denied victory by the speedy Crispy Biscuit (Written Tyccon) ridden by Fausto Henrique.

Crispy Biscuit, prepared by Patrick Lee, was given a gem of a ride by Henrique to park off the speed set up by Loxwood (Pierro). Once in the

straight, he soon got the better of Loxwood and looked as though he would win comfortably, however Sacred Magnate sprouted wings over the final stages and only came up a nose short at the line.

Interesting to note the difference in the run times of 1.08.3 Crispy Biscuit, compared to Star Of Yiu Cheung's 1.07.2.

The Chris Wallertrained filly finished third to subsequent dual Group 1 runner-up Hilal (Fastnet Rock) on debut in February and that form proved good enough for Divina to get her head in front in the 1250-metre 2YO Fillies Maiden. Sent off a \$3 chance under James McDonald, Divina defeated Smart Little Miss (Smart Missile) by a short head, with Santorini Sun (Choisir) another length away in third. A \$190,000 buy for last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Divina is the second foal and second winner out of Sakitto (Domesday), who is a half-sister to the stakes-placed Hairpin (Octagonal), the dam of Group 3 winner Detours (Ad Valorem). Astern, the sire of Cinderella Stakes (Listed, 1050m) winner Seradess, will stand at Darley in NSW for \$16,500 (inc. GST) in 2021, down from last year's fee of \$22,000.

Capitalist - The Tony and Calvin McEvoytrained Hurtle (2 g ex Murtle Turtle by Murtajill) demolished the field on debut at Ballarat last Monday to provide leading first season sire Capitalist (Written Tycoon) with his 16th individual winner. Ridden by Dean Holland, the



gelding was sent off a \$2 chance and rewarded favourite backers with a comfortable five and a half-length success over Rock Melody (All Too Hard), with Ostracised (Divine Prophet) a long neck further back in third. Capitalist, who now has 15 Australian winners and one in New Zealand, will stand at Newgate Farm for an increased fee of \$99,000 in 2021.

Divine Prophet - Selling Sunset (2 f ex Rolling Stock by High Rolling) got off the mark at Casino on Friday to give Divine Prophet (Choisir) his fifth individual winner. The Kacy Fogden-trained filly was racing for the third time when successful in the Parker/Kissane Solicitors Handicap (1200m) as the \$1.57 favourite. Selling Sunset made all and scored by two lengths under Matthew Bennett, ahead of runner-up Bean Foggy (Spill The Beans), with Waltz (Hinchinbrook) three lengths behind in third. The winner is a half-sister to three-time winner Jazari (Not A Single Doubt), out of the eight-time winner up to a mile, Rolling Stock (High Rolling). Her fourth dam is the Group 2-winning black type producer Fiancee (Baguette). Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Divine Prophet stands at Aquis Farm for a fee of \$16,500 (Inc. GST).

In what has been an extraordinary season for the first season sire, from limited foal numbers he has sired Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Stay Inside and recent stakes winner Xtremetime. Tiger Of Malay defeated Converge (Frankel) by a neck, with Port Louis (Maurice) a half-length further back in third. Tiger Of Malay was bred by Bridie O'Bree and bought for \$255,000 from the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale last year. Extreme Choice will be standing for a private fee at Newgate Farm this breeding season.

Flying Artie - Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) sired his eighth individual winner when Flying Tyrol (2 f ex Burgeis by Catbird) landed the Hibernian Hotel Maiden Handicap (1000m) at Goulburn on Friday. Keagan Latham drove the John Thompson-trained filly to score by a neck from Shocking Force (Air Force Blue) with Devine Miss (Headwater) another halflength behind in third. Flying Tyrol's dam is the speedy and talented Burgeis (Catbird), a Listed winner who placed third behind Reaan (Hussonet) in the 2008 Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m). Burgeis is out of a winning halfsister to Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) victor Stratum (Redoute's Choice) and Group 3 scorer Dystopia (Redoute's Choice). The Garnett Taylor-trained filly improved on her third-placed effort behind Sequesay (Rothesay) on debut in February with a one and three-quarter-length win in the QTIS 2YO Maiden Handicap (1100m). I'm Strolling (Better Than Ready) was second, with Jungle Beat (Drumbeats) three lengths behind the winner in third. Miss Mecca is the first winner out of dual Listed-placed mare Miss Elvee (Elvstroem), who is a half-sister to Group 3 winner Magnapal (Magnus) and the Group 1-placed Red For Lou (Testa Rossa). First season sire Kiss And Make Up, who was retired after finishing down the field in the Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) on his third start, will stand at Aguis Farm for \$8,800 in 2021.

Rebel Dane - Lloyd's Crown (2 g ex Mahogany Room by High Rolling) became first season sire Rebel Dane's (California Dane) second individual winner after taking out the Clanbrooke Racing Handicap (1000m) at Sandown on Wednesday. The Rebecca Waymouth-trained gelding finished a narrow runner-up on debut at Pakenham earlier in May and followed that up with a head victory over Along The River (Written Tycoon). Rambeau (Brazen Beau), who defeated Lloyd's Crown last time out, was two lengths further away in third, while the \$2.20 favourite Tycoon's Girl (Written Tycoon) finished last of the seven runners. The win capped off a productive Wednesday for Dual Group 1 winner Rebel Dane, whose son Rebel Shadow finished a narrow runner-up on debut at Canterbury. The Glen Eden Stud stallion has so far had four runners and two winners, with the other being last-start Ken Russell Memorial Classic (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Subterranean, who is set to run in Saturday's BRC Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m). Rebel Dane, who had 28 live foals in his first crop and 26 in his second, will stand for \$8,800 (inc. GST) in 2021.

Star Turn - My Snow Queen (2 f ex Lionel Left Me by Casino Prince) gave Star Turn (Star Witness) his 13th individual winner when taking the Iron Horse Global Maiden Plate (1300m) at Goulburn on Friday. The John Sargent-trained \$1.45 favourite drew clear under Keagan Latham on a Soft 5 track to win by three and a quarter lengths from After Dinner (Choisir), with She's Justified (Vancouver) a further three and a half lengths behind in third. The filly was winning at the third attempt, having placed fourth on debut at Warwick Farm on April 28 and runner-up at Hawkesbury a week ago. J & J Thoroughbreds purchased My Snow Queen for \$5,000 as a weanling out of the 2019 Great Southern Sale, having been offered by Oakford Thoroughbred Farm, Maldon. She went unsold at \$2,000, after failing to hit her \$5,000 reserve, at the 2020 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale when offered by Tallarook, Chambers Flat, Qld (agent). Austin racing then bought her for \$15,000 at last year's Scone Yearling Sale, the vendor being Jazcom Thoroughbreds, The Oaks. My Snow Queen is out of a winning halfsister to Hawkesbury Gold Cup (Gr 3, 1600m) winner Amovatio (Al Maher). Her fourth dam is the multiple Group 1-winning champion Emancipation (Bletchingly). Star Turn stands at Vinery for a fee of \$16,500 (inc. GST).

New Group/Grade 1 winners

Deep Impact - Shahryar (3 c ex Dubai Majesty by Essence Of Dubai) took out the Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) (Gr 1, 2400m) on Sunday to earn the late Deep Impact (Sunday Silence) his 49th individual elite-level winner and also provide him with a recordbreaking seventh Japan Derby winner. The Hideaki Fujiwara-trained colt demonstrated an impressive late turn of foot to defeat odds-on favourite Efforia (Epiphaneia) by a nose, while Stella Veloce (Bago) was one and a quarter lengths back in third. "It's so great to have won the Derby which I had made it my target with this colt ever since his debut," said winning jockey Yuichi Fukunaga. "We were keeping an eye on the race favourite but the race didn't go as smoothly as planned and we were in a tight spot so we were forced to make our charge late, but this colt really gave a terrific effort." A brother to 2017 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) (Gr 1, 2000m) victor Al Ain, Shahryar is one of five winners out of Grade 1 winner Dubai Majesty (Essence Of Dubai).

Kendargent - Skalleti (6 g ex Skallet by Muhaymin) got up late to get the better of Tilsit (First Defence) after a photo-finish to Sunday's Prix d'Ispahan (Gr 1, 1850m) at Longchamp, earning Haras de Colleville resident Kendargent (Kendor) his first elite-level winner. Sent off the odds-on favourite under Gerald Mosse, Skalleti lunged in the dying strides to deny the Charlie Hills-trained Tilsit by a head, with My Oberon (Dubawi) a short neck further away in third. Despite never winning a Group 1, Skalleti has proved himself at the top level on numerous occasions, most recently when second to Addeybb (Pivotal) in the Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 1m2f) at Ascot last October. Skalleti lost his off-hind shoe during the race, and winning trainer Jerome Reynier said: "It's great that he's been able to show he is a top horse on more than just soft ground. We never got hung up on winning a Group 1, but I've been really concentrating on building a career for this horse. Now he's shown he's one of the best

older horses in Europe. We'll let him down now and the main aim is to take our revenge in the Champion Stakes." Out of stakes winner Skallet (Muhaymin), Skalleti is a brother to Group 2 winner Skazino and the Listed-placed Skalleto. Kendargent, the sire of 33 individual stakes winners, stands for a service fee of €10,000 (approx. AU\$15,800).

Lope De Vega - Vega One (5 g ex One Funny Honey by Distorted Humor) overcame several injury problems this last year to become a Group 1 winner at his 25th start, coming from nowhere with a late run to defeat stablemate Jonker (Spirit Of Boom) and Signore Fox (Exceed And Excel). In doing so he became the 13th Group 1 winner for former shuttle stallion Lope De Vega (Shamardal), when winning the Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. The Tony Gollan-trained five-year-old is a half-brother to One More Honey (Onemorenomore), winner of the Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) in 2017. Lope De Vega stands at Ballylinch Stud for a fee of €125,000 (approx. AUD\$197,600).

Night Of Thunder - Kukeracha (3 g ex Portrait Of A Lady by A.P. Indy) denied Explosive Jack (Jakkalberry) a record-equalling fourth Derby success as he won the Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. The Chris Waller-trained Kukeracha came out on top in a close battle with stablemate Senor Toba (Toronado), with Explosive Jack finishing in third, a length behind the leading duo, to deliver Night Of Thunder (Dubawi) a first Group 1 winner. The result completed a clean sweep for New Zealand-breds in Australian Derbies this season. Kukeracha, who races in the Neville Morgan colours worn by Kolding (Ocean Park) and Shaquero (Shalaa), was a \$130,000 purchase from the NZB Karaka Yearling Sale. Out of Portrait Of A Lady (A.P. Indy), Kukeracha descends from Champion 3YO filly in Ireland, the Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winner Alydaress (Alydar), a sister to Park Appeal (Ahonoora), the dam of Cape Cross (Green Desert), as well as Flames Of Paris (Blushing Groom), the dam of BTC Cup (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Hot Snitzel (Snitzel).

Wootton Bassett - Incarville (3 f ex Ilhabela by Azamour) survived a lengthy stewards' inquiry in a thrilling edition of the Prix Saint-Alary (Gr 1, 2000m) at Longchamp last Monday to become the fourth individual elite-level winner for Coolmore's Wootton Bassett (Iffraaj), who will shuttle to Australia for the first time later this year. Ridden by Christophe Soumillon, the three-year-old filly flew down the outside late on to score a last-stride win in a blanket finish, with the first four home separated by just a length. Cirona (Maxios) was a head behind Incarville in second, with Es La Vida (Soldier Hollow) the same distance further back in third. Incarville, who finished second in her two previous runs at Group 3 level, is one of four winners from as many to race out of Ilhabela (Azamour), who is a half-sister to dual Group 1 Classic winner Vahorimix (Linamix). Wootton Bassett, who is currently based at Coolmore in Ireland, will stand for \$71,500 in his first southern hemisphere season.

Cable Bay - King's Lynn (4 g ex Kinematic by Kyllachy) provided the Queen with a Royal winner at Haydock when the four-year-old took out the Achilles Stakes (Listed, 5f) and became the fourth individual stakes winner for former Woodside Park shuttler Cable Bay (Invincible Spirit). The Andrew Balding-trained four-yearold was held up behind the leaders under Oisin Murphy, was ridden to lead a furlong from home and showed his determination when headed in the final 110 yards to rally back and get up by a neck from Moss Gill (No Nay Never). The pair were two lengths clear of Count D'Orsay (Dandy Man) in third. King's Lynn is a homebred full-sister to Group 3 winner Collinsbay, out of the juvenile winner Kinematic (Kyllachy), who is a half-sister to Listed scorer Musical Comedy (Royal Applause). Cable Bay stands at Highclere Stud where his fee this year is £8,000 (approx AUD\$14,725).

Distorted Humor - Gershwin (3 c ex Music Note by A. P. Indy), the half-brother to Dubai World Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Mystic Guide (Ghostzapper), was successful in the Penn Mile (Gr 3, 8f) at Penn National Racecourse and he became the 161st individual stakes winner for Distorted Humor (Forty Niner). Trained by Mike Stidham, like his brother, the Godolphin homebred tracked the pace on the rain affected track and bursting through three wide from the second turn, he took it up halfway up the stretch and went on to win by two lengths from The King Cheek (Laoban). Chess's Dream (Jess's Dream) was third. Gershwin has now won two of his six starts for prize-money of US\$249,600. Distorted Humor stands at WinStar Farm where his fee this year was listed as private, having stood for US\$50,000 (approx AUD\$38,555) for the previous three years.

Galileo Gold - Galileo Gold (Paco Boy) sired his first stakes winner when Ebro River (2 c ex Soft Power by Balmont) won the National Stakes (Listed, 5f) at Sandown on Thursday evening. The Hugo Palmer-trained juvenile took the lead approaching the furlong pole in

the straight dash, drifted left under James Doyle once clear but drew away to win by three and a quarter lengths from Little Earl (Havana Gold) with Navello (Ivawood) a further three-quarters of a length behind in third. It was Ebro River's second win at his third start, having followed a sixth on debut at Newmarket with a win at Doncaster, also over five furlongs on soft going. Bred in Ireland by Tally-Ho Stud, the Al Shaqab Racing-owned youngster is out of Soft Power (Balmont), a winning half-sister to Girl Power (Key Of Luck), the dam of champion sprinter Slade Power (Dutch Art). Charlie Gordon Watson Bloodstock and Al Shaqab purchased Ebro River for 75,000 guineas out of Tattersalls Book 2 last October. Galileo Gold stands at Tally-Ho Stud for a fee of €5,000.

Ghostzapper - Award Winner (5 g ex Devine Actress by Theatrical) became Ghostzapper's (Awesome Again) 84th individual stakes winner when causing an upset in the Charles Whittingham Stakes (Gr 2, 10f) at Santa Anita. The David Hofmans-trained gelding narrowly edged out Acclimate (Acclamation) in the closing stages to score by a head after a fierce battle up the straight. Red King (English Channel) was another two and a half lengths back in third, while short-priced favourite United (Giant's Causeway), who landed this contest last year, finished last of the four-runner field. Out of Listed winner Devine Actress (Theatrical), Award Winner is a half-brother to four-time Grade 1 scorer and sire Oscar Performance (Kitten's Joy) and Grade 3 winner Oscar Nominated (Kitten's Joy). Ghostzapper stands at Hill 'N Dale Farms in Kentucky for US85,000 (approx. AUD\$110,227).

Gleneagles - Coolmore sire Gleneagles (Galileo) was provided with his first Classic winner and 12th individual stakes winner courtesy of Novemba (3 f ex Nevada by Dubai Destination) taking out the German 1,000 Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) at Dusseldorf on Sunday. The win continued a great run for the sire who was recording his fourth new stakes winner in May. The Peter Schiergen-trained three-yearold made all and romped to a seven and a halflength victory from the Godolphin runner Sky Angel (Dark Angel) and Belcarra (Estidhkaar), who were split by a neck for second and third respectively. Novemba won her maiden on her second start at Hannover and has since run second in the Preis der Winterkonigin (Gr 3, 1600m), while Sunday's victory takes her tally to two wins from six starts. The Gestut Brummerhof homebred is out of Listed winner Nevada (Dubai Destination), who is a half-sister to Champion German Three-Year-Old Miler Nordico (Medicean) and Classicplaced Nordic Flight (Adlerflug). Dual 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) winner Gleneagles stands at Coolmore in Ireland for a fee of €25,000 (approx. AUS\$39,528).

Gold Ship - Win Kiitos (4 f ex Excuse by Boston Harbor) became Gold Ship's (Stay Gold) fourth individual stakes winner after landing the The Meguro Kinen (Gr 2, 2500m) at Tokyo on Sunday. Having finished last of 15 in Grade 2 company on her last start in March, Win Kiitos showed considerable improvement from that effort to score by a comfortable two lengths over Heat On Beat (King Kamehameha), with outsider Admire Alba (Heart's Cry) another one and three-quarter lengths back in third. Win Kiitos is one of six winners out of dual Listed scorer Excuse (Boston Harbor), who is also the dam of the Grade 2-placed Win Exceed (Manhattan Cafe). Gold Ship, the sire of last weekend's Yushun Himba (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Uberleben, stands at Big Red Farm in Japan.

Reshabar is the first foal out of a winning half-sister to Fillies' Mile (Gr 1, 1m) and Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (Gr 1, 1600m) runner-up Nathra (Iffraaj), who also scored at Group 3 level. Iffraaj stands at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket where his fee this year is £20,000 (approx. AU\$36,532).

Kallisto - Aff Un Zo (3 c ex Andarta by Platini), who broke his maiden at start six last time, stepped forward to take the Grafenberger Derby Trial (Listed, 2200m) at Dusseldorf on Sunday and became the eighth individual stakes winner for the late Gestut Rottgen stallion Kallisto (Sternkonig), who died last year. The Markus Klug-trained three-year-old flew late down the centre of the track to win comfortably by a length and a quarter from Sisfahan (Isfahan), with Elegant Maximus (Maxios) a further length and a half away in third. A €13,000 BBAG yearling purchase by his trainer, Aff Un Zo is out of a winning sister to Champion German middle distance filly Antara (Platini) and Group 3 scorer Andolini, who is also by Kallisto.

Kizuna - Sefer Rasiel (3 c ex Dark Sapphire by Out Of Place) eased to a comfortable victory in Sunday's Shirayuri Stakes (Listed, 2000m) at Chukyo to become the 14th individual stakes winner for Kizuna (Deep Impact). A winner of just one of his previous seven starts, the Daisuke Takayanagi-trained colt stepped up on his second try at Listed level to romp to a fourlength win over Anagosan (Mikki Isle). Shortpriced favourite Machaon d'Or (Gold Ship) was another length away in third. One of ten winners from as many to race out of Dark Sapphire (Out Of Place), Sefer Rasiel is a half-brother to Listed scorer Logan Sapphire (Daiwa Major) and the Graded-placed pair of Sappheiros (Kinshasa No Kiseki) and Cordierite (Daiwa Major). Kizuna, winner of the 2013 Japanese Derby, stands at Shadai Stallion Station.

Lord Kanaloa - Lord Kanaloa (King Kamehameha) sired his 27th individual stakes winner when his daughter Lei Halia (3 f ex Lightly Tune by Manhattan Cafe) came out on top in a tight finish to the Aoi Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Chukyo on Saturday. Trained by Toshiaki Tajima, the filly was winning for the third time in five starts as she beat Yoka Yoka (Squirtle Squirt) by a nose. All At Once (Makfi) was another length away in third. Lord Kanaloa stands at Shadai Stallion Station for a fee of ¥15,000,000 (approx. AUD\$177,075).

Motivator - Monty (6 g ex Antebellum by Anabaa) broke through at stakes level on Saturday in the Grand Prix de Bordeaux (Listed, 1900m) and became the 32nd stakes winner for Motivator (Montjeu). The six-yearold completed a stakes double on the card for trainer Jerome Reynier when beating the favourite Pao Alto (Intello) by a length and three quarters. The progressive gelding was coming off the back of a fourth place finish in the Prix Ganay (Gr 1, 1900m) earlier in May and he was only beaten two and a half lengths in the Prix d'Harcourt (Gr 2, 1800m) last month. He is a half-brother to Listed-placed Victory Bond (Medicean), out of a half-sister to Group 2 winner and Group 1-placed Ziyad (Rock Of Gibraltar). Motivator stands at Haras du Quesnay where his fee this year is €7,000 (approx AU\$11,070).

Mshawish - The Pennine Ridge Stakes (Gr 2, 9f) was switched from the turf track at Belmont to a sloppy main track and the Todd Pletchertrained Sainthood (3 c ex Lemon Hero by Lemon Drop Kid) bounced back from a downthe-field run in the Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 10f) to take the honours for WinStar Farm and China Horse Club. The colt was due to tackle the turf for the first time, having won on his second start at Fair Grounds on a fast dirt track in February and his other run coming when he was a length second in the Jeff Ruby Steaks Stakes (Gr 3, 9f) on the synthetic surface at Turfway Park. The victory provided former shuttler Mshawish (Medaglia D'Oro) his first stakes winner, with Arabian Prince, Igloo and Taylor Avenue also hitting the crossbar in stakes company to date for the Taylor Made stallion, who stands for US\$7,500 (AUD\$9,726) this year. Ridden by Joel Rosario, Sainthood was sent off as favourite and prevailed by a length from The Reds (Ash Zee) while Shawdyshawdy (Summer Front) was five lengths adrift in third. Future plans for Sainthood include the Belmont Derby (Gr 1, 10f). He was a US\$62,000 Ocala yearling purchase and is out of Listed-placed Lemon Hero (Lemon Drop Kid), who is a half-sister to stakes winner Saint Gold (English Channel).

Nathaniel - Nathaniel (Galileo) sired his second new stakes winner in as many days when Bubble Gift (3 c ex Bubble Back by Grand Lodge) took out the Prix Hocquart (Gr 2, 2200m) at Longchamp last Monday. Ridden by Gerald Mosse, the three-year-old colt picked up late on the outside to defeat Gregolimo (Galiway) by a neck, with Lambo (Protectionist) a length behind the winner in third. Trained by Mikel Delzangles and out of Bubble Back (Grand Lodge), Bubble Gift is a half-brother to Group 3 winner and Classic-placed Bubble Chic (Chichicastenango) and stakes-placed Queen Bubble (Layman). Nathaniel, also the sire Sunday's French Listed winner Nationalista, stands at Newsells Park Stud for a fee of £15,000 (approx. AU\$27,400).

Noble Mission - Gam's Mission (3 f ex Auntie Martha by War Pass) provided trainer Cherie DeVaux with her first Graded win when taking out the Regret Stakes (Gr 3, 9f) at Churchill Downs. Ridden by Adam Beschizza, the three-year-old filly collected her third consecutive win with a three-quarter-length defeat of favourite Spanish Loveaffair (Karakontie). Flown (Kitten's Joy) was a length behind the winner in third. Gam's Mission is out of Auntie Martha (War Pass), a daughter of the Grade 1-winning Auntie Mame (Theatrical). Auntie Martha, herself a winner on the track, has produced two winners from as many to race. The win provided Noble Mission (Galileo), a brother to Frankel and the sire of dual Grade 1 scorer Code Of Honor, with his fourth individual stakes winner. Noble Mission stood at Lane's End Farm in Kentucky in 2020 but is now standing at the Shizunai Stallion Station in Japan.

Paco Boy - The Jean-Claude Serooul homebred Paco (3 c ex Momo No Sekku Leroidesanimaux) claimed black-type success on his first attempt in the grade when landing the Derby du Midi (Listed, 1900m) at Bordeaux Le Bouscat on Saturday and became the 14th individual stakes winner for former Waikato Stud shuttler Paco Boy (Desert Style). The Jerome Reynier-trained three-year-old was prominent throughout, hugged the rail around the bend, took the lead and toughed it out to the line to see off Absurde (Fastnet Rock), Singledon (New Bay) and Pouvoir Royal (Mayson) in a blanket finish, the distances a neck, nose and short neck respectively. Paco is one of two winners from as many runners out of the Listed-placed Momo No Sekku (Leroidesanimaux) and is from the family of Group 1 winners Hartnell (Authorized) and Land Of Plenty (Stratum). Paco Boy stood seven seasons at Highclere Stud until he was sold to Turkey in 2017.

Screen Hero - Kurino Gaudi (5 h ex Kurino Billionaire by Diablo) finally got off the mark in stakes company when taking out the Azuchijo Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Chukyo on Sunday, earning Screen Hero (Grass Wonder) his 12th individual stakes winner. The five-year-old has narrowly missed out in stakes company on multiple occasions, including a second-placed effort in the 2018 Asahi Hai Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m), but managed to get the better of Shivaji (First Samurai) by a length. Meisho Titan (Lord Kanaloa) was a further length back in third. Screen Hero, the sire of six-time elite-level scorer Maurice, stands at Lex Stud in Japan.

Street Boss - The brilliant season being put together by Street Boss (Street Cry) juveniles in Australia received a New Zealand addition thanks to the victory of Atullibigeal (2 g ex Kellys Ocean Jewel by Dansili) in Saturday's Auckland Futurity Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Ellerslie. The Carl Henderson-trained juvenile gained revenge on his last start conqueror Lady Maroal (Power) as he strode three lengths clear to provide Darley's Street Boss with his 51st individual stakes winner. Atullibigeal is one of six to race from the Dansili (Danehill) mare Kelly's Ocean Jewel, all of whom are winners, and descends from the family of Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winner Wemyss Bight (Dancing Brave). Street Boss will stand the coming southern hemisphere season at Kelvinside, NSW, at a fee of \$55,000, including GST.

Tapit - Magic On Tap (5 h ex Aubby K by Street Sense) took out the Triple Bend Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at Santa Anita to earn Tapit (Pulpit) his 144th individual stakes winner. The lightlyraced five-year-old was making his second start in Grade 2 company after finishing fourth in the Californian Stakes (Gr 2, 9f) last time out and looked to appreciate the drop down in trip when defeating Shooters Shoot (Competitive Edge) by two lengths. Exaulted (Twirling Candy) was one and three-quarter further lengths behind in third. Magic On Tap improved his overall mark to three wins and two seconds from six starts. He was bred in Kentucky out of the late Grade 1-winning mare Aubby K (Street Sense), who died in 2019. Her last foal was a Tapit filly, now a two-year-old named Definitive. Tapit stands at Gainesway in Kentucky for a service fee of US\$185,000 (approx. AU\$240,000).

Zoffany - The late Zoffany (Dansili) sired his 42nd individual stakes winner when Lismore (4 f ex Tecla by Whipper) powered up the Sandown hill to win the Henry II Stakes (Gr 3, 2m 50y) on Thursday under Jamie Spencer. The four-year-old led with half a mile to go and galloped on resolutely to finish four and a half lengths ahead of runner-up Ranch Hand (Dunaden) with Ocean Wind (Teofilo) another 11 lengths behind in third. The Irish raider was having her third start for trainer Henry de Bromhead, having worked her way up the ranks with four wins from 12 starts for her previous handler Sir Mark Prescott. Lismore was a 60,000 guineas buy-back at Tattersalls last December, with her owner-breeders Sonia and Anthony Rogers of Airlie Stud having purchased her dam Tecla (Whipper) for 190,000 guineas from the Ecurie Christiane Head consignment at the same auction back in 2013. Tecla has also produced the Listed scorer Testa (Acclamation) and is herself a half-sister to the Group 3 winners Johnny Barnes (Acclamation) and Albisola (Montjeu).
