## Toronado most popular Victorian stallion of 2019

*Yulong's foundation sire Grunt also favoured by breeders in first season at stud*

Swettenham Stud is coming off a record breeding season for the Adam Sangster-led operation while fellow Victorian farm Yulong's foundation stallion Grunt (O'Reilly) also covered a near benchmark number of mares for a first season sire in the state.

Victorian breeders backed Toronado (High Chaparral), the sire of inaugural The Showdown (1200m) winner Prince Of Sussex, who also has boom Tasmanian filly Still A Star

in his first crop, with 197 mares in 2019, the most mares covered by any stallion domiciled in the southern state.

The most popular sire was not the only success story for a rejuvenated Swettenham Stud, with Toronado's barnmates Puissance De Lune (Shamardal) (153) and the relocated Akeed Mofeed (Dubawi) (133) also covering their biggest books by some margin.

Swettenham Stud's Sam Matthews believes the farm's strong season, and that experienced by many of their rivals, bodes well for the future of the industry.

### MORNING BRIEFING

#### Rosehill on standby for Millennium meeting

Rosehill racecourse is on stand-by to host Saturday's valuable Inglis Millennium meeting if Warwick Farm becomes waterlogged. Racing NSW says it has been monitoring the forecast for western Sydney and will continue to do so in the lead-up to raceday. The Bureau of Meteorology is predicting up to 85 millimetres of rain could hit Warwick Farm over the next three days. "In consultation with the Australian Turf Club, as a contingency, the Rosehill Gardens racecourse has been placed on stand-by to conduct the meeting should the Warwick Farm track be deemed unsafe to race on," Racing NSW stewards said. The stewards will also keep a close watch on the condition of the Rosehill surface. *Morning Briefing page 4 >>*

“From our point of view, the more success in Victoria, whether its Swettenham Stud or our counterparts around the traps, we quite enjoy seeing that,” Matthews said yesterday.

“I haven’t looked at the numbers but I would say less mares travelled to the Hunter because of the increased quality in Victoria. Fingers crossed we can continue that.”

The implementation of the Vobis Sires race day at Caulfield in April, featuring the \$1 million The Showdown, won last year by the Matt Laurie-trained Prince Of Sussex, and \$500,000 Vobis Sires Guineas (1600m), is another boost for the Victorian industry.

“Vobis, Vobis Gold, Vobis Sires, so there are so many additional sums of prize-money to race for in Victoria and the market’s strong,” Matthews said.

“Our stallions, we follow closely and they have sold incredibly well and people are getting the returns on the track, which means they come back and buy more.

“We’re over the moon in Victoria as a whole and it was definitely a record season for us.”

Yulong Investments Yuesheng Zhang’s entry into the stallion ranks via the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Grunt also proved popular in the spring.

The Mick Price-trained Grunt, who covered 178 mares at a fee of \$13,750 (inc GST), came close to the 186 mares Darley’s Impending (Lonhro) served

in 2018, while he surpassed the number shuttler Toronado achieved in 2015.

Yulong chief operating officer Sam Fairgray was delighted with the number of mares Grunt covered in his debut year.

“He’s got 160 mares in foal and he ended up with about 90 per cent fertility which is fantastic for his first year at stud,” he said.

“Breeders supported him well and we’re really pleased. For our first stallion, he was the dream horse because he did everything so easily and he was popular.

“Every person who came and looked at him wanted to send their mare because he is a good-looking horse - they just loved him. That made it easier as well.”

Grunt’s fertility was a big factor and as news of his early pregnancies got back to breeders, more mare owners booked into the son of O’Reilly (Last Tycoon).

“That is a big factor for breeders knowing that they are going to send their mare and their mare’s got a high chance of going in foal,” he said.

“It is very frustrating for them having to send mares back time and time and again.”

Another Victorian operation with a relocated stallion on its roster was Rosemont Stud through Shamus Award (Snitzel), the sire of Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Mr Quickie.

After standing his first five seasons at Widden Stud, the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) winner Shamus Award moved to Rosemont last year where he covered 149 mares, up on the 84 he served the previous season.

Aquis Farm’s maiden Victorian stallion, the Group 1-placed Lean Mean Machine (Zoustar), was also well patronised by breeders, covering 147 mares at Aquis’ Seymour property.

His success was in stark contrast to Siege Of Quebec (Fastnet Rock), who was withdrawn from service early in the breeding season due to a lack of breeder support.

Sun Stud’s first season shuttler National Defense (Invincible Spirit) covered 159 mares, while Palentino (Teofilo) covered 146 and stalwart Magnus (Flying Spur) also hit triple figures with 111. Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Fiorente (Monsun) covered 141 mares.

Victoria’s premier stallion, the 17-year-old Woodside Park Stud-based Written Tycoon (Iglesia), covered 135 mares last year at a fee of \$110,000 (inc GST), down from 162 in 2018.

Darley’s Brazen Beau (I Am Invincible) covered 126 mares, while his Northwood Park barnmates Impending and Frosted (Tapit) covered 175 and 104 mares respectively.

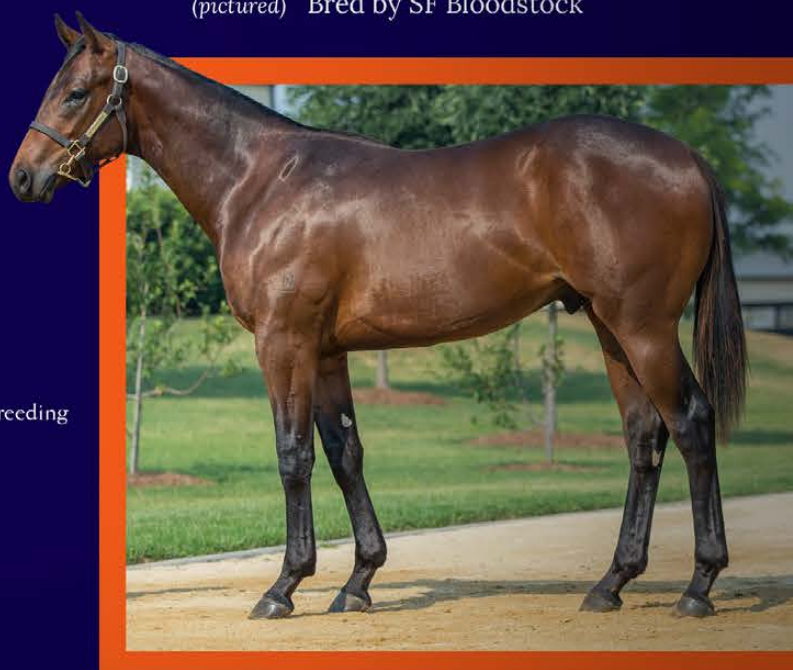

Six Group 1 winners feature among the field of 12 set to contest the CF Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield on Saturday.



The weight-for-age contest will see Avilius (Pivotal), Hey Doc (Duporth), Scales Of Justice (Not A Single Doubt), Fierce Impact (Deep Impact),

Kings Will Dream (Casamento) and Begood Toya Mother (Myboycharlie) race for the \$300,000 first prize. The Anthony Freedman-trained Ringerdingding (Sebring) has drawn barrier one with So Si Bon (So You Think), one of two runners for the Lindsay Park stable, drawing the widest gate. The Lindsay Smith-trained Scales Of Justice will be attempting to replicate his Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) victory at the course and distance of last spring. Fierce Impact and Begood Toya Mother are chasing their first victories at weight-for-age

## Mirage Dancer first-up in Orr

Mirage Dancer (Frankel) will have a first start over a trip shorter than 1600 metres since winning on his debut as a two-year-old in the UK when he runs first-up in Saturday's CF Orr Stakes. The race at Doncaster in 2016 was over 7f (1408m) and Natalie Young, who trains in partnership with Trent Busuttin, says it will be interesting to see the horse again over that trip. After 16 starts for Sir Michael Stoute, Mirage Dancer transferred to Busuttin and Young's care on arrival in Australia last spring, finishing third in the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) and then 14th behind Vow And Declare (Declaration Of War) in the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m). "Last prep when he was going into the Caulfield Cup and the Melbourne Cup his coat wasn't quite right," Young said. "But when we got him in this preparation, we clipped him up straight away and he looks phenomenal. He trialled up really nicely last week, he's run around Caulfield before, he's been in big fields at his past two starts, so I think he'll go a really nice race fresh up."

## Bold Star aiming to go back-to-back

Gordon Richards is raising the bar again with progressive sprinter Bold Star (Needs Further), who could earn a crack at the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) if he steps up in Saturday's Rubiton Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) at Caulfield. "I'm pretty happy with him," Richards said. "He just keeps stepping up to the next level all the time, which is pretty good. With the (Group 1) Lightning Stakes the week after and the Oakleigh Plate the week after that, I thought the Rubiton was probably not going to be quite the top-quality sprinters. Even though it's set weights and penalties the opposition is about

what he's capable of beating. There's a couple of quick horses in it, which is going to suit him because he likes the pace on, and there's a few 1400-metre to mile horses resuming and they can always run well fresh. But I think he has got to be amongst them again."

## Light autumn for Chivalry

Age Of Chivalry (He's Remarkable) will have his first-up run in Saturday's Rubiton Stakes with connections planning to restrict his autumn workload. "A lot of these autumn races are weight-for-age races and whether he's quite ready for that, time will tell," said Mark Zahra, who trains the four-year-old in partnership with Mathew Ellerton. "But we're keen to give him a light autumn, give him two or three runs and tip him out and give him a nice break and then set him up for the handicaps again this spring." Looking to the future, Zahra told Racing.com: "This is his kick-off and maybe two weeks into the Futurity (Stakes), but we're keen to look after him. He did take a while to let down after a tough spring and we're conscious we've got a nice horse and we want to keep that for the next few years down the track."

## Griffiths double-handed in Diamond Prelude

Robbie Griffiths will run Glenfiddich (Fastnet Rock) and Mysterious Art (Wandjina) in the Blue Diamond Prelude (C&G) (Gr3, 1100m) in an attempt to cement their places in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Caulfield on February 22. Glenfiddich and Mysterious Art are outsiders on Saturday as they look to turn the tables on their Blue Diamond Preview (C&G) (Listed, 1000m) form with Hanseatic (Street Boss) where they finished second and sixth respectively. "Glenfiddich is coming off a really good return and Mysterious Art wasn't that far back," Griffiths said. "Mysterious Art handled himself pretty well on debut and I think he got a lot out of the experience. Glenfiddich has the experience of the spring behind him and we were confident going into his first-up run from the good draw he'd give us a good run. He held second place quite comfortably and there was a margin to third to say we are right in the mix and the extra distance shouldn't be a problem."

## Larimer Street to strike in Millennium

Connections of Larimer Street (Brazen Beau) are hoping he will be able to make the most of the inside gate when taking on the red-hot favourite Cellsabeel (Hinchinbrook) in the \$2 million Inglis Millennium (RL, 1100m). After a delayed trip from Sydney, the Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young-trained colt had his final gallop for Saturday's race on a heavy track at Warwick Farm on Tuesday. "We would normally go up on Saturday night but because of the heat up in Sydney we left on Sunday night," Young said. "He travelled up really well and galloped over 800 metres with Hugh Bowman on. There's going to be another 30 millimetres on Friday and Cellsabeel, who won on heavy last start and carries the two kilos less, is going to be the one to beat. Our horse got through it fine according to Bowman, but under race conditions it might be different. But we've drawn one and if he handles the track I think he'll be a really nice chance."

## Pandemic Godolphin's Eskimo Prince hope

Godolphin hold a strong hand in Saturday's Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) with the operation responsible for the three most favoured runners in the eight-strong field at Warwick Farm. The James Cummings-trained Pandemic (Sepoy) has been posted at \$2.30 ahead of Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Kiamichi (Sidestep) at \$4.60, despite the wet-track credentials of his stablemate. Pandemic has earned his favouritism courtesy of a recent win against older horses in benchmark company and Cummings said: "He made a flashy return against older horses to continue his winning form. This is a better race, but to do what he did last start was a positive sign." Of Kimachi, Cummings added: "Her preliminaries have been very strong and she won her last trial in good style. The forecast of wet going will be to her liking and we are hoping that will offset the Group 1 penalty she will carry." The Anthony Freedman-trained Chenier (Medaglia d'Oro) is the least experienced of the Godolphin trio having had two starts at Sandown as an autumn-two-year-old. Assistant trainer Sam Freedman said: "His first-up win was very strong at Sandown and he then ran well enough when second at his only other start."

## Distance to help Microphone

James Cummings believes the step back up in distance will suit the Godolphin-owned Microphone (Exceed And Excel) when he chases his first win as a three-year-old in Saturday's Autumn Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Caulfield. The colt won four of his six starts as a two-year-old and was second in the Golden Slipper Stakes but he is yet to win in two outings this season. "Microphone's first-up run in the Australia Stakes was pleasing and he clearly demonstrated that he was looking for further," Cummings said. "He got going again late and the 1400 metres here will be more suitable."

## Hill hoping for a wet Eagle Farm

Bruce Hill is hoping the weather forecast is correct ahead of Bodega Negra's (Hidden Dragon) intended 100th start of his career in the Canadian Club Handicap (1600m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. Up to 150 millimetres are tipped to fall in southeast Queensland this week and Hill said: "He will run provided there is some rain and they are predicting it, but we all know the predictions don't always come true. I would love a bog track for him and it would be great for his 100th run. But a softish track would even do as any give is a bonus." Hill continued: "Bodega Negra is just a lovely old horse. He loves his work and he is a pleasure to have around the stables. I know a lot of trainers say it about their horses but I genuinely would love to have a stable full of horses like him."

## Melham to ride Dalasan

Ben Melham will take over the ride on South Australian-trained three-year-old Dalasan

(Dalakhani) when he continues his autumn campaign in the CS Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Caulfield on February 15. Melham replaces Craig Williams on the Leon Macdonald and Andrew Gluyas-trained colt following his first-up third as a short-priced favourite behind Super Seth (Dundeel) in the Manfred Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield last Saturday. Macdonald said Williams was not sacked from Dalasan having only been booked for the one run at Caulfield, although he was critical of Williams' ride in the Manfred where Dalasan gave a start to the leaders before producing the quickest last 600 metres of the race. "I like Ben's style and he was persistent in trying to get on the horse in the spring when he knew Raquel (Clark) wasn't riding him," Macdonald said. "There was a day when he rang me and spoke for half an hour about him. As far as Ben has gone about his business, he has not gone out and back-stabbed anybody, so we'll see how it works out, but he's got a pretty hard assignment at his next run to beat Alligator Blood."

## Alligator Blood arrives in Melbourne

Star three-year-old Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) has arrived safely in Melbourne ahead of his tilt at the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and All-Star Mile (1600m). The Magic Millions Guineas (RL, 1400m) winner travelled from David Vandyke's Sunshine Coast base to Flemington yesterday and he is scheduled to run in Saturday's week's CS Hayes Stakes prior to his main assignments. "Door to door it was just six hours, so it was pretty easy," Vandyke told


Racing.com. "He travelled down really well. Obviously, he's had a little bit of experience travelling. He came down with his pony and he appeared to be in good shape." Alligator Blood suffered the only defeat in his eight-start career when being pipped by Super Seth (Dundeel) in October's Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), during which time he was stabled at Cranbourne. "We normally stay at Cranbourne but with our first two runs being at Flemington, it just seemed the sensible thing to stay there," Vandyke added.


## Santa Ana Lane could step up in trip


Star sprinter Santa Ana Lane (Lope de Vega) could be issued with a new challenge this year as connections contemplate stepping the five-time Group 1 winner up in trip. The seven-year-old was last seen running fifth in the Sprint Classic (Gr 1, 1200m) on November 9 and has spent most of his career racing over 1200 metres, although he did land the Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) in 2017. "Now he's getting a bit older, we've toyed with the idea that he might be more of a 1400-metre horse now, so something like an All-Aged (Stakes) might be an option," assistant trainer Sam Freedman told Racing.com yesterday after Santa Ana Lane had worked at Balnarring. "Even in the spring, we might try and stretch him out to a mile. His pedigree says that he could potentially run that trip and now he's a bit older, he could be lacking that bit of zip over the 1200 (metres) and who knows, he might be able to settle a bit closer over the 1400 to mile."

## Kaakit Akit impresses

The Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained Kaakit Akit (Artie Schiller) made a strong impression when winning on debut at Kensington yesterday. A Gooree Park Stud home-bred, the daughter of Artie Schiller (El Prado) quickened a length and a quarter clear of her seven rivals in the Astern at Darley Maiden (1100m) to tee herself up for a tilt at stakes company. "That was a very professional performance and there is a lot of upside and improvement to come from her," Bott said. "Black type is the next step and it would be great to get that for her family." A half-sister to the dual Listed winner Tactical Advantage (Bel Esprit), Kaakit Akit yesterday became the sixth winner from six foals to race out of Above Perfection (Encosta de Lago), a stakes-placed daughter of the dual stakes winner Actress (Snippets), who is a sister to the dam of Group 1 winners Desert War (Desert King) and Laser Hawk (Artie Schiller). Above Perfection has a yearling colt by Shalaa (Invincible Spirit), a weanling filly by Smart Missile (Fastnet Rock) and was covered by Exceed and Excel (Danehill) last spring.

## Magic Millions sale vouchers on offer at Wagga

Two \$5,000 vouchers to be used at either the Magic Millions Adelaide or QTIS March Yearling Sale on the Gold Coast next month will be up for grabs at the Murrumbidgee Turf Club's race meeting at Wagga on February 28. MTC chief executive Steve Keene yesterday confirmed the partnership with auction house Magic Millions, with the winning trainers of two designated races on the card receiving the vouchers. Flight and accommodation costs for the trainers to attend either sale will also be covered by Magic Millions. ## Kembla Grange moved to Newcastle

Saturday's NSW provincial meeting scheduled for Kembla Grange has been moved to Newcastle due to the heavy rain expected to hit the Illawarra region. Racing NSW officials yesterday re-opened nominations for the transferred meeting until 4pm. Acceptances will be taken this morning.

## Bowman to miss Warwick Farm

Hugh Bowman has ruled himself out of riding at Saturday's Inglis raceday at Warwick Farm due to personal issues. The Sydney premiership-winning jockey had five rides at yesterday's Kensington meeting and also rode at last Saturday's Expressway Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) meeting but missed two metropolitan meetings on the Australia Day weekend after the death of his brother-in-law.

## Travers and Budler cleared

Jockey Michael Travers and apprentice Damon Budler have been discharged from hospital after falls at the Albury race meeting on Tuesday. Travers fell from Audrey's Destiny (Keep The Faith) shortly after the start of race six and was taken to hospital complaining of back and neck pain. X-rays taken of Travers' neck and ankle cleared him of any break and was discharged on Tuesday evening with soft tissue injuries. Budler, who fell after the post having won race one on Equally Wild (Equiano), was cleared of any fractures to his leg and was discharged yesterday.

## Vorster recovering from fall

Group 1-winning jockey Barend Vorster is continuing to recover from the broken collarbone he suffered when riding the ill-fated Manuel (Commands) in last month's Australia Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). Having undergone surgery last Wednesday, Vorster told Racing.com: "The surgery went well. They put a plate in and a couple of screws and now I'll just wait until I see the doctor hopefully on Friday for an update. I'm doing exactly as the doctors ask and hopefully I can be back riding in six weeks."

## Moroney calls for training academy

Mike Moroney has called for a training academy for aspiring stable staff to ensure they enter the industry with the correct knowledge and skills, particularly in light of the constant strain being placed on time, resources and finances in the wake of a packed racing calendar. "Part of the welfare of horses is to make sure that they are well handled. At the moment it's always (on) the trainer, the foreman, or the assistant trainer to pass that (knowledge) on. But with all the racing we've got, we can't do that," Moroney told RSN927. "There has got to be a school started, a proper school with the right people (in charge), that racing think are the right people to pass the right things on before we lose the older people that really know what they're doing and have done it the old-school way." Moroney continued: "For argument's sake, a place like here at Flemington, there's enough room here to put some boxes up that are moveable boxes. If you put 20 boxes up where you've got the nice quiet horses to teach people to ride, have the right people here teaching them. There's a lovely quiet little track here too to do it. I am sure it will really work."

## NEW ZEALAND

## Wyndspelle retired after suspensory injury

Connections of Group 1-winning miler Wyndspelle are looking for a stud home for the son of Iffraaj (Zafonic) after he was retired from racing after sustaining an injury. Prepared at Otaki by John Benner and Hollie Wynyard through the latter half of his career, Wyndspelle won close to NZ\$700,000 in prize-money which included a victory in the Captain Cook Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) prior to a second in the Thorndon Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) last month. "He strained a suspensory ligament," Benner said. "He gives everything when he races and with rehab it would take three to four months to go again. He has done enough now and he owes us nothing and has been a very good, sound racehorse. "He has got a great CV, seven times Group 1-placed at all age groups and distances, and winning the Group 1. He is a special horse. Hopefully that Group 1 win will secure him a job at stud somewhere."



## Shark ready to swoop in Group 1

Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) placegetter Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle) will try to secure an elusive first Group 1 success when he lines up in the BCD Group Sprint (Gr 1, 1400m) at Te Rapa on Saturday. Trained by Jamie Richards, the five-year-old came within a short-head of landing the Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) on his penultimate outing at Randwick prior to chasing home Japanese sensation Lys Gracieux (Heart's Cry) and Castelvechio (Dundeel) at Moonee Valley on October 26. "He has had a trial and a decent exhibition gallop and he is a naturally fit horse that should be ready to rock 'n' roll," Richards said. "This is the first time that we have ever been able to give him a spring campaign and then bring him back for an autumn campaign. Each year before this he has sort of gone off a little bit and needed a good long spell, so I guess that is one query but we are very happy with him. The plan has been to kick him off here before we look at Sydney and it would be great if he could get that Group 1 for his CV before he headed over the Tasman."

## Za Za Gabor on the rise

Za Za Gabor (O'Reilly), who was last seen running third in the Rich Hill Mile (Gr 2, 1600m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day, is out to snare a first stakes success in today's Wairarapa Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes WFA F&M (Listed, 1600m) at Tauherenikau. Trained by Mike Moroney and Pam Gerard, Za Za Gabor is a two-time winner who has twice made the frame in black-type company. "She is a really lovely type of mare who is starting to come into her own and I think she is really well placed down there," Gerard said of today's assignment. "I am really happy with her draw (3), she should get a nice sit in behind them. She hasn't had a race in a little while and even though it was a long trip it just seems to be the right race for

her." Looking ahead, Gerard added: "I think she will be quite a force coming up into some of these mares races later on in the season, particularly with a bit of give in the ground. She will come back and we will look at the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders and maybe the Travis Stakes, but we will just see how she goes on Thursday first."

## Sydney on radar for Glory Days

Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Glory Days (Red Giant) will not be asked to defend her crown next month, but the seven-year-old is likely to be set for another start in the Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) having finished third behind Shraaoh (Sea The Stars) in that race last year. A tilt at last year's Melbourne Cup was aborted after Glory Days sustained an injury in the lead-up to the race, but trainer Bill Thurlow has issued a positive bulletin on the talented stayer as she is set to return in the Pohangina Cup (1200m) at Awapuni tomorrow. "That's our plan to get her back to Sydney, for the Sydney Cup, that will be great," Thurlow said. "There is also the Queen Elizabeth. We will just see how she is, but we couldn't be more happy with her at the moment." Commenting on her first-up run, Thurlow added: "It will be more like a trial on Friday because there have been no trials or jump-outs in the Central Districts with the firm tracks. I would have loved to have given her a trial somewhere, but it just hasn't worked. The 1200 metres is too short."

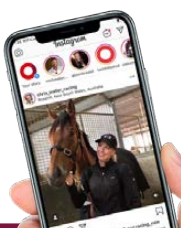
## Per Inpower on Silver Bowl trial

The Kuah Cheng Tee-trained Per Inpower (Per Incanto) is set to line-up in the 1400-metre Class 2 at Kranji tomorrow in order to test his credentials for the Silver Bowl (Listed,

1400m) on February 29 - the first leg of the revamped Singapore Four-Year-Old Challenge. Having taken time to mature, Per Inpower has blossomed of late - winning his last four starts - and Tee is hoping that progression continues tomorrow. "We noticed early this horse had potential, but earlier on he was still learning," he said. "He was quite cranky mentally. With more time and racing, he has matured and that's when he started to win races one after another. It's taken a lot of time to get him right but the owner has been very patient and lets me do what's necessary for the horse. As he's also a light-framed horse, I have kept his races well spaced out, and I always give him a barrier trial before each race."

## Betting shops closed as Hong Kong battles to contain spread of coronavirus

Betting shops in Hong Kong have been closed with immediate effect in the latest move to combat the spread of the deadly coronavirus, which claimed its first victim in the territory on Monday. Two more cases of residents who had not left Hong Kong being infected has brought tougher measures from the government, and the Jockey Club was quick to follow suit in the battle against the disease which has claimed more than 400 lives. The Hong Kong Jockey Club has now closed all 101 off-course betting shops and, from Thursday, is also suspending many of its telebetting services, which will hit its revenue stream from betting turnover. The HKJC issued a statement which read: "We understand from the government that the next two weeks will be critical in terms of containing the disease and preventing a community outbreak. Regarding the racecourses at Happy Valley and Sha Tin, the Club is critically considering a further reduction of on-site participation by our customers starting from this Saturday."

**THE GROOM OF YES YES YES, AND FORMER ASSISTANT TRAINER TO HIS FATHER, MICK, IN THE UK, PAYS TRIBUTE TO THE EVEREST WINNER FOLLOWING HIS PREMATURE RETIREMENT**

From the Oxford Dictionary: Disappointment (noun) – the feeling of being sad because something has not happened or been as good, successful, etc, as you expected or hoped.

I can tell you the exact date. Monday, August 15, 1994. Five days before the start of the Premier League season.

I was in the shower, feeling a bit down but also privileged to have witnessed something remarkable. I was 20, driven, fiercely competitive and fitter than I'd ever be in my life. And then another man joined me in the shower.

His name was Matthew Le Tissier. He walked in, had a chat about something or other and then left. I can't recall what he said because, having just witnessed something remarkable on the training pitch, he'd confirmed half an hour earlier the nagging doubt that I'd never be good enough to make a living out of playing football.

I wish you could have seen how good he was on the training pitch that Monday morning. He was blessed by brilliance, while I was a mere bystander – albeit a bystander with bags

of energy who never stood still, trying so hard but failing so convincingly to make up for my shortcomings.

I don't think I cried that day because, as I say, the nagging doubts were already there but, 26 years later, that same feeling of utter disappointment consumed me on Saturday morning when I got home from work.

To the naked eye it did not look good and the scan had done nothing to assuage my nagging doubt that perhaps he'd done more than simply knock himself. Ross the vet, in his uniquely forthright fashion, confirmed my biggest fear.

Sod it, why not be honest? I cried. Daft really because nobody had died.

My best mate died last month and, although I shed a few tears, I did not cry half as much as I did on Saturday. Mainly because John Verney was 84 years old and also because we had already expressed the love we had for each other. JV was coming to Royal Ascot this June until the uncompromising ravages of being an old git dashed his promise.

A promise, as it turns out, that was not going to be fulfilled anyway.

Yes Yes Yes was 'my horse' for exactly a year

– I've had socks for longer than that, but socks will never be quite as life-affirming as Yes Yes Yes.

I could do Coolmore's marketing job for them here, but that's neither my style nor my emotions right now. Because Coolmore probably would not describe the latest stallion to join their roster as 'the funniest bugger to ever look through a bridle'.

I've a feeling that Yes Yes Yes is, though.

He'd be the bloke you most look forward to seeing in the pub or the daft rescue dog who greets your return home from work with the kind of enthusiasm that makes you wish people are that way.

In short, every single thing he did brought joy. Firstly (and obviously) to him, for he is only a horse, but as a knock-on effect he brought joy to everyone in our barn.

I'd bring him out of his box and everyone – our foreperson Candice, Connor, Ali, Ben, Adam, Garry, George, the whole team – would often say 'Yessie!' as he swaggered along looking forward to whatever the next ten yards would throw his way.

Invariably that would be his work-rider Daniel Cremin before he came back to us and

he'd tackle other activities, all of which are routine and predictable.

The wash bay was brilliant. The saltwater treadmill was brilliant. The pool was brilliant – even though he could barely swim. In fact, the three of us required to drag him through the pool viewed it as a survival exercise.

Having seen his enthusiasm for mundane interactions with a hose pipe, iodine shampoo, saltwater and a pool of water, my mind boggles at how he's going to enjoy visiting the covering barn. His stallion man is in for a treat.



I saw a tweet from David Pipe the other day lamenting the loss of two of his horses in a week. Working with racehorses can be as

cruel as it is rewarding, so I'm well aware that, on a scale of 1-10, my disappointment needs to be tempered.

In my time I've spent a few, but also far too many, moments swearing about the whereabouts of a vet who says he's "five minutes away" while waiting in the company of a catastrophically injured racehorse on the Berkshire downs. Those are truly terrible occasions, but they also must be acknowledged.

A minute in their company never leaves you. Minutes that feel like hours, all bizarrely taking place while the horse is picking grass until the ultimate relief is administered.

That is why I'm asking myself why the retirement of a racehorse to stud has hit me so hard.

I've overcome far worse in my life, we all have, but I guess it's the fact that, as with

Matthew Le Tissier all those years ago, I genuinely feel as though I witnessed brilliance – even if I was yet again a bystander in the whole game.

Just watch The Everest.

I also promised myself that I'd decide where my future lay once he had slaughtered what you Poms tried to throw at him in the Diamond Jubilee – with John Verney watching on.

I don't know. This article might be fuelled by a hurt ego. All I do know is that Yes Yes Yes made me smile and laugh every day, a bit like John Verney always did.

I feel very proud but a little bit robbed.

Thankfully, Yessie will now go on to a life of luxury and untold glories as a stallion, although he'll never get to enjoy a pint of 'Good Old Boy' in his retirement as John Verney did so very often.

# Ho hits 300 with a night-capping hat-trick

Vincent Ho collected his 300th Hong Kong win at Happy Valley yesterday when he delivered Massive Pocket (Stratum) with a late burst to land section two of the Class 3 Sports Road Handicap (1200m).

Fittingly, Ho's main patron Francis Lui provided the milestone success, a win that edged the handler to a narrow lead in the trainer's premiership.

The rider was, as ever, level-headed in victory – landmark or not – as he rounded out the card with a hat-trick in the night's final three contests.

"I'm definitely pleased to reach the 300 but I didn't really count the numbers, I just knew when people told me I was almost there," Ho said.

"Massive Pocket ran well from that gate (12) – he jumped ok and I knew the pace was on so I slotted in and got him to relax.

"But the horse I was following wasn't going anywhere, he wasn't helping at all, and the one on the inside was just staying there so I couldn't get on the fence – eventually, and luckily, the gap opened on the inside and he flew home.

"He has a good turn-of-foot but a very short sprint so it actually helped him when I got held up a little bit – he was able to produce that short burst."

Just one race after hitting the round number, Ho moved onto 301 when he drove Naboo Star (Casino Prince) home for his old boss Caspar Fownes.

"Vincent has always shown that he had a lot of potential as a jockey," Fownes said of his former stable apprentice.

"He's worked to hone his skills and now he's the real deal – you could take him anywhere in the world, put him on any horse and he's going to get the job done."

That is due in no small part to the rider's dedication in heading to Europe each year to

learn and develop. He has spent the past two summers in England based at Mark Johnston's stable and prior to that he gained valuable experience over several off-season stints in France.

"He's up there, he's a world class jockey," Fownes continued. "He rides them very cool, he's in the zone, his timing is really good and he's got a clock in his head for pace. He's doing really well and I'm proud of him, and he deserves all the success he's having."

Ho stormed the last race, section one of the Class 3 Sports Road Handicap (1200m), on the Lui-trained This Is Class (So You Think) to take his season's tally to 34 wins, of which 14 have been in tandem with Lui, including the recent Hong Kong Classic Mile (Listed, 1600m) on Golden Sixty (Medaglia d'Oro).

Lui, meanwhile, moved ahead of long-time championship leader Ricky Yiu with 35 wins thanks to his own treble on the night, initiated when Matthew Chadwick drove the 32/1 shot Fox Cheunger (Hussonet) to success in the opener, the Class 5 Bowrington Handicap (1200m).

## Methane sparks for Hewitson

Lyle Hewitson has found a loyal ally in trainer David Ferraris and the pair teamed up with Methane (Pierro) to land the night's trophy race, the Class 4 Craigengower Cricket Club Challenge Cup Handicap (1650m).

Hewitson endured a long lean run before opening his Hong Kong account at the end of December and his two wins since, both at the Valley, have come aboard Ferraris' runners. His fellow South African has provided him with 51 of 205 rides this term.

"Opportunities have been better. When you get your first win under your belt and you get good results, you start to ride with a lot more confidence and trust your judgement," Hewitson said.

"All winners in Hong Kong are special, especially when you're starting out. It's fantastic to win a trophy race but it's important for me regardless of whether it's Class 5 or Class 1. It's great to be on the board once again, and building momentum is so important."

Methane, a 15/1 shot, had learned what was required of him through four defeats over



shorter distances and arrived at the Valley primed for his first attempt at 1650 metres.

"If a horse is going to be decent he will always show something over a shorter trip and that's what he did," Ferraris said.

"He was a little bit disappointing the start before last but after that his most recent start impressed me, he finished off really nicely, and he was working really well going into this race, so we were pretty confident.

"He's won a hell of a good race, he's a very nice little horse this – it's just a shame the owner (Andrew Shuen) is in England."

Hewitson, 22 and already a two-time champion in South Africa, settled Methane midfield. The four-year-old peeled out on the turn for home, quickened to the lead with 200 metres to race and scored by three quarters of a length in 1.39.90.

"He went through a little bit of a growing phase and he just needed to step up in trip, he was a little bit uncomfortable over the six furlongs and he's been working up a storm at home. He had the right trip, a pretty fair draw and today everything went to plan," Hewitson added.

## Another Van Niekerk double

Jockey Grant van Niekerk has maintained his good form since the start of the year and after a double on Sunday followed up with a brace yesterday to make it 28 wins for the campaign so far.

The South African galvanized the Me Tsui-trained Good For You (Thorn Park) to steal the Class 4 Percival Handicap (1200m) by a short-head in a head-bobbing duel with California Rad (Fastnet Rock). About 30 minutes later he rolled clear in the Class 4 Wong Nai Chung Handicap (1650m) on the same trainer's top-weight Thunder Stomp (Fastnet Rock).

"It's going well – I just have to stay out of the

stewards' room!" said Van Niekerk, who has a careless riding suspension deferred until the end of this month.

"Thunder Stomp came out so quickly and he's got such a big action I opted to use it. I got away with a little bit of murder in the beginning because I went quite slow, and, half-way round the turn, when I asked him to extend he responded."

Winning Ways (Lope de Vega) is perhaps not the most aptly-named horse but the Danny Shum-trained six-year-old was game for Zac Purton as he took the Class 4 Canal Handicap (1000m) – his first Hong Kong win at the 22nd attempt.
