Nature Strip named Australian Racehorse of the Year

Top sprinter joins greats of the turf as Waller dominates virtual ceremony, presented from Brisbane

ature Strip (6 g Nicconi - Strikeline by Desert Sun) was last night named Australian Racehorse of the Year for the 2019-20 season, giving trainer Chris Waller his fifth straight victory in Australia's most prominent equine award, while former stablemate Yes Yes Yes (4 c Rubick - Sin Sin Sin by Fantastic Light) became the first Champion Three-Year-Old Colt or Gelding to secure the title without a Group 1 win to his name.

<< Continued from page 1 The ceremony was due to be held in Brisbane this year but, due to Covid-19 restrictions, was instead presented virtually by Sky Racing's Bernadette Cooper from an empty Eagle Farm, being broadcast on both Sky Thoroughbred Central and Racing.com.

Nature Strip had been widely expected to pick up the title in a year where he dominated the sprinting ranks, taking out the Moir Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m), the VRC Sprint Classic (Gr 1, 1200m) and the T J Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in emphatic fashion.

However, managing owner Rod Lyons still said it was a "pleasant surprise" to be able to join some of the champions of the Australian turf, like Winx (Street Cry), Black Caviar (Bel Esprit), Makybe Diva (Desert King), Might And Power (Zabeel) and Kingston Town (Bletchingly) as the country's top horse.

"It's a wonderful thrill," Lyons said. "There are some great horses around in this country, some great trainers, and so to have won this award is something quite special. I'm sure all of the owners across the length and breadth of Australia and New Zealand are just as proud and thrilled as I am.

"A special thanks to Chris, to J-Mac (regular rider James McDonald) and particularly Stuey (Stuart Williams) who rides him work on a regular basis, he's got him where he is today. This trophy is every bit as much theirs as it is ours."

For Waller, who had won the award with Winx the last four years before adding a fifth title with Nature Strip, it was a satisfying result given the gelding's notorious quirks earlier in his career.

"It is amazing to get a horse like this, he has gone from a horse that has been a genuine Group 2 winner, and then in one season has won multiple Group 1 races including the biggest sprint races on the racing calendar," Waller said.

"It is a privilege to be part of his career and respect should also be given to my team for the work they have done with

Nature Strip behind the scenes making sure that he is well prepared and continues to peak throughout each preparation resulting in some really big wins.

"Obviously those who voted for him to be Australia's Horse of the Year share our sentiments towards the horse and we are looking forward to the spring unfolding with some more exciting wins."

Winx in 2016 had been the first Sydney-trained horse to be named Australia's champion racehorse since Lonhro (Octagonal) in 2004, but the award has remained based in Sydney's west since then.

Nature Strip's title means that Widden Stud's Nicconi (Bianconi) becomes only the second active sire to have produced an Australian Racehorse of the Year, along with Sun Stud's Bel Esprit (Royal Academy), sire of Black Caviar.

"Nicconi has always had terrific statistics, a great strike-rate of winners to runners, and so many lovely horses and we've always had plenty of time for him," Widden principal Antony Thompson told ANZ Bloodstock News earlier this year. "We believed he'd get that star and he's certainly done that in Nature Strip, who is the fastest horse in the world. He's been a great feather in the cap for Nicconi and it really cements what a fantastic sire he is."

Another win for Everest hero Yes Yes Yes

Coolmore Stud was also celebrating after freshman sire Yes Yes, who was also trained by Waller during his short racing career, was named Champion Three-Year-Old Colt or Gelding, taking out a strong category that featured Group 1 winners Bivouac (Exceed And Excel), Alligator Blood (All Too Hard), Castelvecchio (Dundeel) and Russian Camelot (Camelot) as rivals.

In fact, last year's winner of the \$15 million The Everest (1200m) became the first ever to take the prize without a Group 1 victory to his name, signalling once again the significance of The Everest despite its lack of black type status.

"I'd like to dedicate this award to all the staff at Chris Waller's yard, particularly Chris himself and Mick Channon Jnr too but everyone in that operation who gets up day after day, before the sun comes up," Coolmore Australia's Tom Magnier said. "It's thanks to you that we are here accepting an award like this. They did an unbelievable job with this horse to get him to The Everest and it was something I will never forget.

"To have the first colt to win The Everest and in record time, it's truly exciting and to have him at home in the breeding barn, it's a real thrill."

Farnan lands champion juvenile honours

Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Farnan (3 c Not A Single Doubt - Tallow by Street Cry) was named last season's Champion Two-Year-Old in what was arguably the strongest of the categories in terms of depth.

Only twice in the last decade has the award not gone to the Golden Slipper winner: in 2018-19 with Microphone (Exceed And Excel) and in 2013-14 with Earthquake (Exceed And Excel). In order to secure the title, though, Farnan - who also won the Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m), Silver Slipper Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) and the Wyong Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1100m), along with a maiden success at Canberra - had to prevail against a top line-up of youngsters.

Among his rivals for the award were Group 1 winners Tagaloa (Lord Kanaloa), Rothfire (Rothesay) and King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice) - the last-named the only contender to win two Group 1 races as a juvenile while bombproof filly Away Game (Snitzel), winner of the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m), completed the line-up.



"He's had a remarkable year," said Aquis Farm chief Shane McGrath, on behalf of the ownership group that now includes Kia Ora Stud as well as Phoenix Thoroughbreds. "This is what dreams are made of and it's great to be able to share it with such great people. We look forward to next year when he's named Champion Three-Year-Old."

Added co-trainer Adrian Bott: "He's thoroughly deserving of the title and on behalf of Gai Waterhouse and myself, I can certainly say it's been a real privilege to train the horse."

<< Continued from page 4 Farnan will run in this weekend's Roman Consul Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) before backing up a week later in The Everest, where he holds the Aquis slot.

He was not the only award winner to have sported the Phoenix Thoroughbreds silks throughout his champion season.

The Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained Loving Gaby (4 m I Am Invincible - Maastricht by Mastercraftsman), winner of the Manikato Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) along with three Group 1 placings throughout her three-year-old season, was named Champion Three-Year-Old Filly.

Also recognised was Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) hero Vow And Declare (5 g Declaration Of War - Geblitzt by Testa Rossa), who was named Champion Stayer, while Group 1 winners Regal Power (5 g Pierro - Broadway Belle by Redoute's Choice) and Fierce Impact (7 g Deep Impact - Keiai Gerbera by Smarty Jones) shared the Champion Middle Distance Horse title.

Snitzel recognised for fourth success

The virtual ceremony recognised the exploits of Arrowfield Stud's Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) in landing his fourth consecutive Australian Champion Sire title, becoming the

most decorated stallion since his grandsire, the pioneering Danehill (Danzig).

It was the eighth time in the last 15 years that an Arrowfield stallion has been crowned Australia's leading sire.

"Snitzel has done an amazing job having won the title the last four years," said Paul Messara in accepting the award for Arrowfield. "It's very exciting for the farm and for all of our team here. It's been a big group



effort, it takes a whole village to achieve these championships.

Aside from the Champion Sire title, determined by earnings, and the two Group 1 titles for trainer (Chris Waller) and jockey (Craig Williams), which is based on wins, each of the categories was determined by the votes of more than 70 members of the media and handicappers.

Windsor Park Stud stallion Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor) brought up his first Australian winner on Saturday, nearly five years to the week since his Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) success, when Mongolian Brave took out a 1000-metre Wagga maiden on debut. For trainer Tim Donnelly, who purchased Mongolian Brave from last year's New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale out of the draft of Riverrock Farm, the gelding is typical of the type of horses available at the November auction. "I love the New Zealand horses," he said. "You go to New Zealand to buy stayers as far as I am concerned and they are reasonably priced, well raised and well educated. (Mongolian Brave) breezed up well and ran good time. I looked at all of the Mongolian Khans and liked them. He will get to 2000 metres; his mother only won over 1200 metres and 1400 metres but I think the third dam is by Zabeel and he is a relaxed horse. I like him as a horse even though he can still do things wrong, and he is a bit immature. He's a November 16 foal so he's still a baby and really hasn't turned three yet." Mongolian Khan, yet to have a New Zealand winner but also the

producer of a winner in Malaysia, stands at Windsor Park Stud for NZ\$10,000 (plus GST) in 2020.

Bowman looks to build on Legacy

Hugh Bowman is hoping his decision to forgo some plum spring rides in Sydney will pay dividends when he partners King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice) in Saturday's Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). Bowman won two Group 1 races aboard the Peter and Paul Snowdentrained colt in the autumn and partnered him into third behind Ole Kirk (Written Tycoon) and North Pacific (Brazen Beau) in the Golden Rose (Gr 1, 1400m). "I thought his Golden Rose run was as good as the winner and the second horse and he will improve from it," Bowman said. Caulfield can be a difficult track for horses to handle at their first attempt and compounding the issue is the threeyear-old's inexperience racing anti-clockwise. However, Bowman has more confidence in King's Legacy coping. "He is very good on his feet, so I don't see going the other way as problematic. I am pretty confident that if I get the right run, the track's not going to pose a problem to him."

Pike to partner Ole Kirk

WA's champion jockey William Pike is set to ride Ole Kirk for the first time after connections yesterday confirmed he had been booked for the ride on the Caulfield Guineas favourite. Tommy Berry was on board the Hawkes Racing colt for his Golden Rose win but will remain in Sydney to ride in Saturday's Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) meeting at Randwick.

Cherry Tortoni set for Guineas

Patrick Payne couldn't be happier with Cherry Tortoni (Night Of Thunder) going into the Caulfield Guineas but the trainer rates Glenfiddich (Fastnet Rock) as the horse to beat. At his last start, Cherry Tortoni ran on strongly to finish second to Glenfiddich in the Stutt Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m), beaten two lengths, and Payne isn't confident he can make up that leeway on Saturday. "I liked his run at The Valley. It was his first time under lights and he finished on well to run second behind a good horse in Glenfiddich and the third horse, Holyfield, is also a pretty smart horse," Payne said. "I think Glenfiddich could be a star and I don't think we can beat him but you never know. There's likely to be a bit more pressure on in a Caulfield Guineas." Payne said he was considering putting blinkers on Cherry Tortoni for the Caulfield Guineas, in which he will be ridden by regular partner Billy Egan."He's very casual early on in his races. If I put blinkers on him he might settle a little closer," Payne added. "I don't think it will make a huge difference but it might make a difference."

Camelot to push Cox Plate credentials

Danny O'Brien may not have any runners in the Caulfield Guineas but Saturday's meeting will still be a big day for the trainer with his exciting Russian Camelot (Camelot) set to have his third run of this campaign when he takes his chance in the Caulfield Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m). The four-year-old is red-hot favourite for his next engagement off the back of his impressive win in the Underwood Stakes (Gr 1, 1800m) and O'Brien yesterday reported the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) favourite to have come out of that race in fine shape. "He's great," O'Brien told Racing. com. "He was super for us the other day. He's third up and going to 2000 metres now so we're looking forward to seeing what he can do."

Love Tap a Cox Plate possible

Love Tap (Tapit) goes into Saturday's Spring Champion Stakes as warm favourite with connections hoping he will put in a display which could pave his way to a tilt at the Cox Plate. "The owners (Dynamic Syndications) are keen to pay up for him (in the Cox Plate) and keep that option open and if he did come out and win easily on Saturday, then you'd have to consider it," Richard Freedman, who trains in partnership with his brother Michael, told Racing.com. "But he is a gangly sort of horse really that's in his first racing prep and is probably 12 months away but you don't get offered often the chance to carry 49.5 kilograms in a big race like that." Freedman added that if Love Tap was to head to Melbourne it would be solely to contest the Cox Plate, with a tilt at the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) not on agenda.

Orderofthegarter a confirmed Herbert Power runner

Danny O'Brien will have another runner with big race aspirations later in the month firmly on his radar line up at Caulfield on Saturday after the trainer confirmed leading Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) hope Orderofthegarter (Galileo) will run in the Herbert Power Stakes (Gr 2, 2400m). Orderofthegarter, winner of the Naturalism Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) on his most recent start, is set to be joined in Saturday's race by O'Brien's VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Miami Bound (Reliable Man).

Felicia to stand up in Northwood Plume

Dean Binaisse is confident Felicia (Unencumbered) can repeat the level of form she showed when taking out the How Now Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) on her most recent outing when she returns to Caulfield for Saturday's Northwood Plume Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m). "Three weeks between runs has been perfect and we're just really getting a handle on her and how to train her now," the Mornington trainer told Racing.com. "She just keeps raising the bar, I don't think we've reached the bottom of her yet so I can't wait to see her race on Saturday. I've said all the way through that I will be conservative with her and won't run her on a firm track whatever the race is. Luckily it doesn't look like we'll have to worry about that this week with quite a lot of rain forecast leading up to raceday. It looks like everything is working in her favour this week with the weather and also, even though her rating has gone up to 99, she will only get one kilogram extra out of her last win."

D-day for Alligator Blood

Saturday's Silver Eagle (1300m) at Randwick is shaping as a pivotal race in determining spring carnival plans for Alligator Blood (All Too Hard). While Queensland racing fans have pinned their hopes on Alligator Blood making a clean sweep of his interstate targets, his trainer David Vandyke is not buying into the hype. Alligator Blood competed in a jump-out between races at the Sunshine Coast on September 27 but his effort received only a lukewarm review from connections. "Look, it was fair," Vandyke said. "He seems to have come back OK. Whether he's come back as good or better remains to be seen and I think next week will tell us a lot." Alligator Blood will travel by float to Sydney tomorrow before lining up in the Silver Eagle in which he will carry 58.5 kilograms under the set weights and penalties conditions. The fouryear-old opened his spring campaign with a fast-finishing third to The Odyssey (Better Than Ready) in an 1110-metre sprint at Doomben on September 12.

Penalty for Persan for Cups

Persan (Pierro) has been penalised one kilogram for both the Caulfield and Melbourne Cups (Gr 1, 3200m) following his win in last Saturday's Bart Cummings (Gr 3, 2510m) at Flemington. The Ciaron Maher and Dave Eustace-trained four-year-old's Cups weight rose from the minimum of 50 kilograms to 51

kilograms for both races. The Bart Cummings is a ballot exempt race for the Melbourne Cup so Persan now joins Oceanex (Ocean Park), winner of the Andrew Ramsden STakes (Listed, 2800m) as a guaranteed starter on November 3. RV's executive general manager of racing Greg Carpenter said: "Persan is an emerging young stayer who has now been placed in all 10 starts for the Maher-Eustace stable. He accounted for a strong field in winning The Bart Cummings on Saturday in a performance that warrants him being lifted off the limit weight in both cups. Persan is now exempt from the ballot in the Melbourne Cup and the one kilogram penalty in the Caulfield Cup advances him to 51st in the order of entry for that race ahead of second acceptances."

Cox Plate locked in for Probabeel

Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Probabeel (Savabeel) is on course to have her next start in the Cox Plate, her trainer Jamie Richards has confirmed. "She's going well so you've got to be happy," Richards told Racing. com. "She will go straight there, I don't think she needs another run. She will have a couple of bits of work. We are just working on the logistics now of when she goes to Melbourne, and staff, and everything like that. We will work on it and see how we go. (Owner) Brendan (Lindsay) has been very keen on the 100th running of the race. We followed a similar path with Te Akau Shark last year and managed to finish third. This year hopefully we might be able to go a little bit closer."

Fierce Impact on track for Plate

Fierce Impact (Deep Impact) remains on course for a tilt at the Cox Plate despite his defeat in the Hill Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) at Randwick. The six-year-old was sent off the \$2.20 favourite for Saturday's race, his first start over 2000 metres since finishing unplaced in last year's Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m), but could finish only third behind Kolding (Ocean Park) and Avilius (Pivotal). Despite that reversal, his trainer Matthew Smith yesterday said the three-time Group 1 winner is still being targeted at the October 24 contest.

Sir Dragonet has Cox Plate as main aim

Connections of Sir Dragonet (Camelot) intend to give the European import two serious workouts before he makes his eagerly anticipated Australian debut in the Cox Plate. Formerly trained in Ireland by Aidan O'Brien, Sir Dragonet was promoted to the second line of the betting for the Plate after he was transferred to the care of Ciaron Maher and David Eustace recently. Maher yesterday said the lightly-raced colt, who was last seen finishing second behind Magical (Galileo) in the Tattersalls Gold Cup (Gr 1, 1m 2f) at the Curragh on July 26, is set to be put through his paces on the weekend as he is readied for his Moonee Valley assignment.

Clipperton booked for Santa Ana Lane

Sam Clipperton was yesterday booked for the ride on the Anthony and Sam Freedmantrained Santa Ana Lane (Lope De Vega) in the \$15 million The Everest (1200m) at Randwick on October 17. Coolmore snapped up Santa Ana Lane for their slot last week and the sprinter is set to contest the world's richest turf race for the third time after finishing sixth at his first attempt and then runner up to Yes Yes Yes (Rubick) 12 months ago. Ten slots have been filled for The Everest with James Harron and Chris Waller the only contenders yet to lock in a runner for the race.

Spring over for Rubisaki

Rubisaki's (Rubick) spring campaign is over after it was discovered the four-year-old suffered an injury when finishing unplaced in the Rose Of Kingston Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Flemington on Saturday. The Patrick Paynetrained mare had enjoyed a fruitful autumn but

Joe O'Neill of owners Prime Thoroughbreds said she is now set for a stint in the paddock. "Patrick had his vet do a scan (Monday) morning and she has a slight tear of her suspensory. She will require a ten-week spell and she will go to the paddock immediately and then be brought back to be prepared for an autumn preparation in Sydney," O'Neill told Racing.com. "These things happen with horses and it's not life threatening or career ending. So in that regard, we are disappointed, but pleased the injury she has sustained is only a slight one."

Australian contingent for O'Briens to be tested

Aidan and Joseph O'Brien have had their horses in Melbourne tested by Racing Victoria after the pair were forced to scratch all their runners over the weekend, including four who were due to contest the prestigious Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m), due to contaminated feed. The out of competition testing of the ten horses from the O'Brien stables took place yesterday, with the results expected to take up to a week. Racing Victoria moved to conduct the testing as a matter of urgency after O'Brien and his sons Joseph and Donnacha withdrew runners from all meetings after urine samples that were sent to a French lab returned positive for the prohibited substance Zilpaterol. That move followed news Gain Equine Nutrition had advised its customers to stop using their feed products after batches had become contaminated with Zilpaterol, which is unlicensed in Europe but is used in the US and elsewhere to promote weight gain, mainly in

RV react to contamination news

Racing Victoria yesterday issued a statement on the procedure that had been undertaken following the news of the positive tests from France on the horses trained by Aidan O'Brien. RV issued a statement which read: "Racing Victoria (RV) can advise that its integrity services team are liaising with Irish trainers Aidan and Joseph O'Brien regarding the circumstances that led to the stable scratching runners in France and Ireland across the weekend due to concerns regarding the alleged contamination of horse feed that it utilises. Reports from both

trainers and international racing authorities are that feed used by both stables has been found in Europe to be contaminated with the prohibited substance Zilpaterol. Following discussions with the O'Brien stables, RV stewards have today conducted out of competition testing on their horses at Werribee to determine whether Zilpaterol is currently in any of the horse's systems." Racing Victoria said it classifies Zilpaterol as a beta-agonist, which are permitted for therapeutic use but are a prohibited substance in a horse's system on race day.

Nichols recovering after heart attack

Shane Nichols has revealed doctors have told him he's lucky to be alive after he suffered a heart attack on Sunday morning. The trainer remains in the Peninsula Private Hospital after having an operation to put a stent into his heart. He is expected to be released from hospital in the next few days. "I never felt like I was going to die but doctors told me I got pretty close," the 51-year-old told Racing.com. "I'm one of the lucky ones, I've had a few friends who have died from a heart-attack. I'd been feeling ordinary for six months, really tired and listless and I just hadn't gone and got myself checked. I had actually said to my wife and kids that I thought something was a bit wrong with my heart and I should go and get a stress test but I just thought I'd hold off until after Covid and then go and do something about it. Obviously I left it too late and I would urge others to go and get themselves checked if they're not feeling well."

Vale Hellova Street

Tasmanian champion Hellova Street (Helike) died of a colic attack on Saturday morning, just hours before he was set to contest his 60th race start in the Paris Lane Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Flemington. He was ten. Trained throughout his career by Scott Brunton, Hellova Street won 20 of his 59 starts and was twice crowned Tasmanian racehorse of the year. He won 13 stakes races including two Tasmanian Newmarket Handicaps (Listed, 1200m), three weight-for-age Mowbray Stakes (Listed, 1600m), and the Chatham Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Flemington in 2017.

New Zealand Cup aim for Communique

North Canterbury Cup (1800m) winner Communique (Redwood) will be aimed at the New Zealand Cup (Gr 3, 3200m) on November 14 after carrying the Valachi Downs colours to victory at Riccarton on Saturday. Aided by a patient Craig Grylls ride, Communique was strong through the line and the progressive four-year-old will be out to add more black-type to her resume, having won at Group 3 level in her Classic year. "She will run back at Riccarton in about three weeks' time in the Spring Classic over 2000 metres," cotrainer Stephen Autridge said. "The plan is to run her on the first day of the New Zealand Cup Week Carnival over 2500 metres and then on the last day in the Cup if we're happy. She is bred to stay. She is by Redwood out of a Zabeel mare and she came from last when winning over 2100 metres in stakes company as a three-year-old. Earlier on in this preparation I had some concerns that mentally she might not have been strong enough, but every day that has gone by, she has just got better and I think the trip down there might help to make her."

INTERNATIONAL

Eight for Exosphere

Darley's Exosphere (Lonhro) sired his eighth individual winner and third in the northern hemisphere from just eight starters when Total Knockout (2 c ex Bahama Mama by Invincible Spirit) got off the mark at the second time of asking with victory in a 1200-metre claimer at Fontainebleau yesterday. The Frederic Rossitrained colt beat Pic Sylver (Penny's Picnic) by half a length, with Lockdown (Charm Spirit) another length and three-quarters away in third. Exosphere stands for a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) at Kelvinside in 2020.

Tapit (Pulpit) brought up his second Grade 1 winner for the weekend when Valiance (4 f ex Last Full Measure by Empire Maker) broke through at the highest level to win the Spinster Stakes (Gr 1, 9f) at Keeneland on Sunday. The Todd Pletcher-trained Valiance defeated a strong field, holding off Grade 1 winner Ollie's Candy (Candy Ride) to score by threequarters of a length with Kentucky Oaks (Gr 1, 9f) heroine Shedaresthedevil (Daredevil) a further two and a half lengths away in third. "Just blown away," said Aron Wellman of coowners Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners. "It's been such an emotional year dealing with the craziest times that the world has seen. We're just so honoured to win a race like this with such a regally bred filly." Tapit, who stood at Gainesway in Kentucky for \$200,000 (approx AUD\$278,300), made it 27 individual Group or Grade 1 winners with Valiance's win: he will try to make it 28 with favourite Love Tap in Saturday's Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Randwick.

80 for Into Mischief

Last year's leading sire in North America, Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday), who appears on track to add a second title, brought up his 80th individual stakes winner on Sunday when Mutasaabeq (2 c ex Downside Scenario by Scat Daddy) swept from last to first to take out

the Bourbon Stakes (Gr 2, 8.5f) at Keeneland. The Todd Pletcher-trained Mutasaabeq, a maiden winner on dirt who was also Grade 1-placed on the surface, switched to turf in the Bourbon and seemed to relish the grass, scorching home out wide to score by two and a quarter lengths; Abarta (Into Mischief) finished second, with Nathan Detroit (Union Rags) a further three-quarters of a length away in third. Mutasaabeq could head to either the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (Gr 1, 1m) on the same turf track over just a halffurlong shorter, or he could remain at the trip but switch to the dirt for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (Gr 1, 8.5f) on the same card. Into Mischief stood for \$175,000 (AUD\$243,500) at Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky in 2020.

US: Horologist shocks in Beldame

Multiple Grade 1 placegetter Horologist (4 f Gemologist - Cinderella Time by Stephen Got Even) defeated three rivals to win the Beldame Stakes (Gr 2, 9f) at Belmont on Sunday as the longest shot on the board. The Bill Mott-trained Horologist rumbled home a three-length winner under jockey Junior Alvarado, defeating Point Of Honor (Curlin), with even-money favourite Dunbar Road (Quality Road) - carrying the same Peter Brant silks as the same day's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) hero Sottsass (Siyouni) - a further two and a quarter lengths away in third. "I waited until the five-sixteenths just to check a little and see where she was," Alvarado said. "When I tapped her on the shoulder and she lowered her head instead of picking it up, I wasn't sure how much I had, but I wanted to use what I had to open up." Mott said that the owners of Horologist "made the decision not to supplement" the filly to the Breeders' Cup Distaff (Gr 1, 9f) at Keeneland next month.

US: First graded stakes win for Plum Ali

Plum Ali (2 f First Samurai - Skipping by Stroll) remained undefeated after three starts with victory in Sunday's Miss Grillo Stakes (Gr 2, 8.5f) at Belmont. Given a tremendous ground-saving ride by Jose Ortiz, the Christophe Clementtrained Plum Ali was switched into clear running on the swing for home and ran on past Caldee (More Than Ready) for a two and a quarter length victory. "She's a very nice filly. She's won in different scenarios, different tracks, and different jockeys," Clement said. "That's what good horses do. They face the challenge and they win. It's very exciting. It's nice when they keep facing these things and win. At the top of the stretch the topthree finishers were together, so nobody has any excuses." Next month's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf remains on Plum Ali's agenda.

US: Wet Your Whistle potential for Turf Sprint

A victory to Grade 1 winner Wet Your Whistle (5

g Stroll - Winlocs Glory Days by Belong To Me) in the Belmont Turf Sprint Invitational (Gr 3, 6f) has him set for next month's Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (Gr 1, 5.5f) at Keeneland, although trainer Michael Trombetta is still weighing up his options. "I'll have to talk to the owner and see what's involved. In these kinds of races, especially the turf sprinters, it's a select group that all run against each other and all beat each other here and there," Trombetta said. "If you're going to take a chance, these are the kind of horses to do it with." Ridden by Jose Ortiz, last year's Highlander Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) hero Wet Your Whistle took the Belmont feature by three and a quarter lengths over Chewing Gum (Candy Ride) with Archidust (Verrazano) a further nose away in third.

IR: Racing on the brink as health body recommends extreme lockdown option

Racing in Ireland could face another shutdown if the government opts to implement the

recommendation of the National Public Health Emergency Team (NPHET) by imposing Level 5 lockdown restrictions across the entire country. Level 5 is

the most extreme option on the Living with Covid-19 roadmap that was published by the government on September 15. Most of the country is currently at Level 2, with Dublin and Donegal the only two counties at Level 3 due to their increased numbers of coronavirus cases recently. However, the government's chief medical officer Dr Tony Holohan, who had been on temporary leave since July and was due to return to work yesterday, called an emergency meeting. It was subsequently reported that NPHET had recommended the entire country be placed on Level 5, which is the only phase in which racing isn't specifically referenced as being allowed to continue in some shape or form. It simply states that "no matches or events" will take place.

Caulfield Cup, which at the moment looks touch and go. The weather here is predicted to be wet this week and wet next week. That may change our view of San Huberto, who really does not want a wet track. This may sway us to go to the Geelong Cup if Caulfield is heavy. We'd like to have both the horses in the Caulfield Cup, but if not, they'll both go to Geelong.

Sound Of Cannons and Selino have both arrived in fantastic order. John O'Shea is delighted with Sound Of Cannons. They could head to one of the Cups, either Geelong, Bendigo or Moonee Valley.

This will basically depend on the way they've settled. They'll all have a piece of work,

either this Saturday or the following Tuesday, and from there we'll make a decision on which races they go to.

They all have to get through a further stage with the vets at Racing Victoria, who are developing a reputation of being pretty tough. They've got a new CT scanner down there, and they'll make sure that the horses are sound before they are allowed to compete. And they won't hesitate to tell trainers that their horses are not up to scratch.

This year they also made sure that the horses were sound in Newmarket. They actually took one horse out of quarantine that was otherwise coming over here because they found that it wasn't sound.

Given the fact that we have had far too many fatalities in the Melbourne Cup over the last seven to eight years and others that have gone amiss, I very much have sympathy with Racing Victoria's wish to not put horses into the race that are going to be at greater risk than

would be normal.

These horses are coming from tracks in Europe where, generally, the tracks are a lot softer, with a lot more cushioning than what was once the case at a track like Flemington. In fairness, I think that Flemington has had a change of curator in the last couple of years and I think the track is racing a lot kinder for horses than it used to.

OTI has a very aggressive approach to horse welfare and I think the authorities are right to take it seriously also. I think the whip is something that ultimately has to go as is the need to eradicate rock-hard tracks.

The industry has to be on the front foot about selling the aspects surrounding horse welfare that are good in racing, not just be on the defensive.

People have always raced horses since the time immemorial and they always will. So it's a matter of showing people the really good things that we do and promote them. I've publicly offered some of the critics of racing the chance to come out and show them what happens at a stable and show them the care that these horses get. No one ever takes up that offer.

Our best chance of winning the Melbourne Cup year is with San Huberto who will be trained by Matt Cumani, and it was with his father, Luca, that OTI has come closest to winning the race when Bauer was agonizingly the runner-up in 2008.

He won the Geelong Cup to qualify for the field, which was fantastic, but he was an outsider for the Cup itself. He was 33-1 in the race and Luca had another horse, Mad Rush, who was highly fancied. Bauer had been a relatively nondescript kind of horse. But he liked top of the ground and the race really suited him.

The worst thing about it was that I thought we'd won. I knew Bauer's backside was in front of the other horse, but Bart's (Cummings) horse, Viewed, was about a foot longer and got his nose in front!

I'd won the Melbourne Cup in 1995 with Doriemus who then ran second in 1997 behind Might And Power, so I'd had a taste of what victory and defeat was like before. To an extent we were very disappointed in that first

30 seconds, but when the dust settled we were delighted to have run second with him because he had so far exceeded our expectations.

There are certainly shades of his father in Matt, but Matt is his own man, as he's already shown by simply going over to Australia. He's adapted to the Australian way. Luca himself said it would probably take him about ten years to adapt to the way of training in Australia, and Matt's been able to do it in three or four.

What you're dealing with, being Luca or Matt, is that you're dealing with a very ethical operation. You always know where you stand and as a result of that you've got great confidence in introducing people into racing to have horses with them. And unfortunately in racing you can't always say that.

Weekend runners

Gallic Chieftain - Herbert Power. The horse is racing extremely well. He'll have the ideal conditions for the race as it'll be wet. It will be a slightly weaker race than normal and I think he's got a good chance of making it into the Caulfield Cup through that

Harbour Views & Gailo Chop - Caulfield Stakes. Harbour Views fell out of the barriers last time out which ruined his chances at the start, but he's still in good order and we'd

'Prize-money distribution vital factor in rising strength of Australian racing'

Godolphin Flying Start's Caitlin Smith, 24, from Euroa in Victoria, graduated university in 2017 with a Bachelor of Animal Science (Honours) from Charles Sturt University. Prior to commencing the Flying Start course, she worked at Blue Gum Farm and Lindsay Park Racing, and completed a professional placement with William Inglis & Son Ltd.

fter six months apart, I am thrilled to welcome my Godolphin Flying Start classmates to Australia's largest breeding hub, the Hunter Valley in New South Wales.

It is here that we will spend the next few months immersing ourselves in one of the strongest thoroughbred jurisdictions in the world. Australia has progressed considerably over the past couple of decades from a battling racing nation to an international leader. It is progressive, vibrant and inclusive, making it attractive to participants at all levels.

Among other factors, the prize-money structure is a significant contributor to the prosperity of racing in Australia. However, it is not solely the investment at the top end, it is the distribution of prize-money across all levels of racing.

In 2018, Australia offered more than €400 million in prize-money spread across 20,000 races. It is behind only Japan and the United States. While the average prize-money per race may not appear as strong, apart from the United States, Australia programmes the most races per season in the world.

France offers on average just under €25,000 (approx AUD\$41,000) across 4,900 races, while Ireland offers on average over €26,000 (approx AUD\$42,500) across 1,200 races. This is a stark contrast to Australia, which manages to uphold strong prize-money levels across all levels of racing. Australia offers far greater opportunities for owners and trainers to make money at the base level, which I believe is critical to the prosperity of our industry.

Australia has witnessed an 84 per cent increase in prize-money over the past decade. This rise is greater than that of the UK, France and Ireland combined. The strength of the Australian industry is reflected by robust wagering agreements and healthy relationships with key government bodies.

Additionally, Australia is far less reliant on its owners as a source of prize-money. Australian owners contribute less than four per cent towards gross prize-money, compared with 15 per cent in the UK and 23 per cent in Ireland

The robust prize-money structure ensures that owners have a realistic chance of making a dollar on their investment. In New South Wales and Victoria, minimum prize-money for metropolitan weekend racing is \$125,000 and \$50,000 for midweek contests, while the minimum offered at country meetings is no less than \$22,000.

In comparison, the UK's equivalent of a metropolitan weekend card at Newmarket, offers the same, if not less, prize-money than that of a typical country race meeting in Australia. This distribution of prize-money has been a critical factor in the rising strength of the Australian industry.

While gross prize-money is an important indicator, prize-money offered at grassroots is possibly the greatest measure of a jurisdiction's prosperity.

While Australia has seen significant boosts to feature races such as the Everest and Melbourne Cup, its investment in country racing is its greatest asset. In 2019, Racing New South Wales invested an additional \$81 million in country racing with boosts to minimum levels and the addition of country-restricted races such as the Kosciusko, Highway Series and Country Championships.

It is important to highlight the reality that the majority of racehorses have average ability at best, and that this is a shared fact worldwide. Having grown up in a country racing setting in north-east Victoria, I have an appreciation for the struggles within the lower racing grades and am passionate about the prosperity of grassroots racing.

We often forget that country racing accommodates the majority of our products, and without it there is no alternative.

Taipa treble for Cheong

treble on Saturday afternoon's all-weather program at Taipa has given former Champion trainer Sio Cheong a great kick start for the new season, giving him five winners from the first three race days.

Cheong got off the mark quickly with the Australian import Blackjack Mok (All Too Hard) in the first of the day, the 0 to 45 Special Conditions race over 1510 metres.

Blackjack Mok was put into the race out of the gates by Luis Corrales to park on the back of pacemaker Heart Of Iu Cheong (Intrinsic) and was always traveling like the winner in the run. Once heads were turned for home Corrales set the gelding alight, and he let down nicely to race away for an easy three and a quarter lengths win over Epinart (Thorn Park), with favourite Star Of City Gold (Swiss Ace) winding up in third.

It was win number two in Macau for Blackjack Mok, who originally commenced his racing career with Chris Waller at Rosehill. Purchased for AUD\$290,000 at the 2016 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sales, the gelding won a Wyong maiden over 1600 metres racing as Devil's Luck, and placed on three other occasions from his 12 starts in Australia, before being exported to Macau.

Ironically, Saturday marked 13 years since his dam Devil Moon (King Cugat) won the Turnbull Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington.

The gelding proved to be a bit of a handful early in Macau and on two separate occasions tried to savage another horse during a race. Cheong, it appears, now seems to have the gelding focused on racing.

The ease of Saturday's win suggests more victories are in store and though his two wins in Macau have been on the sand, his talents are not just reserved to the surface with five placings in decent company on the turf.

Cheong didn't wait long to post his

next winner: Red Phoenix (Sidereus), who stormed home to victory via the rail in race two, the Class 4 over 1350 metres under Frankie Choi.

Red Phoenix was friendless in the betting, jumping at odds of \$341 (for a \$10 unit) for the win, but he picked up his maiden win in Macau after 14 starts.

The five-year-old is much-travelled, having started his career with Toowoomba trainer Mark Webb, before ending up in North Queensland with Ricky Ludwig at Atherton.

The gelding proved to be consistent, winning seven of his 26 runs and placing nine times collecting over AUD\$200,000 in prize money along the way.

Casino Mok (Casino Prince) rounded out

Cheong's day with a brilliant all-the-way win in the Class 3 over 1350 metres under Eric Cheung.

In a daring ride, Cheung set the sevenyear-old alight out of the gates to lead clearly and kept the tempo hard up front. The gelding maintained a strong gallop right down to the wire and held on to win by three-quarters of a length over equal favorite Still So Cute (Thewayyouare), with Eclair Mirage (Ocean Park) in third.

Casino Mok, who raced as Lord Macau in Australia and was even entered in the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) as a three-year-old, commenced his racing career with Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott after being purchased for AUD\$170,000 at the 2015 Gold Coast Magic Millions Yearling Sales.

The gelding won three races from 24 starts, two of those over 1400 metres and another over 1600 metres and did place over 1900 metres at Canterbury. However, in Macau, the bay has really found his niche in sprints, having won five races with four of those over the 1200 metres.

Cheong was crowned Champion Macau trainer in his debut season in 2015-16 with 43 winners and was runner-up to Stanley Chin on 41 winners, to Chin's 52 victories, in 2018-19. With some nice

recent additions, Cheong could be a dominant force in the championship race this season.

Alan Tam, another former champion trainer, got himself on the scoreboard for the new season when he led in the last two winners on the card with Harvest Year (Power) and Rose Hero (Snitzel).

Harvest Year, a full brother to Tam's brilliant sprinter Fasuba, got home in the Class 5 & 6 over 1050 metres with a last stride lunge under Roger Yu to beat Silent Height (Redwood) in a deceiving finish that fooled many.

Harvest Year stretched late and got his head down right on the line to win by a nose to give him two wins from only four starts.

Harvest Year is much in the same mould as Fasuba, who has won nine races on the sand. Both are not the biggest of horses but are well put together, solidly built types; both have slick gate speed and plenty of tenacity.

Whilst Harvest Year has a long way to go to reach the heights of Fasuba, his win on Saturday showed great determination to pull three lengths off Silent Height over the last 100 metres.

Rose Hero is another very promising horse that Tam has in his yard judging by his win in the last of the day, the Class 4 over 1510 metres.

Ridden by J B Hamel, Rose hero was always travelling well in the run before darting away at the 200 metres for a big win.

A New Zealand import, Rose Hero raced there as Autumn Flash where he won a 1400-metre maiden at Matamata on a good track, and placed on three more occasions whilst in the care of Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott, so his future will not just be confined to the all-weather surface.

3) Which stallion do you think is shaping as the next big thing?

Of the first season stallions, I would have to say Shalaa. He has had the early winners in Europe, he now has a Breeders' Plate winner here after the weekend and I don't know a single trainer that has one that doesn't like them.

4) What do you like to do during your down time?

It's very rare that I get any at the moment, but when I do it's usually spent with my beautiful wife Jess and two young children, Jack and Grace. But I love to cook and wish I had the time to play more golf and become more than a hacker!

5) Favourite football code (or sport) and team?

AFL and Collingwood

6) Favourite meal?

Yum Cha/Dim Sum

7) What's something that people wouldn't know about you?

At last count, I had 87 cookbooks, although I have donated a few since. I find them really interesting reads!

8) How did you get involved in racing?

I was born and bred into the game on both

sides. My father is Gerald Ryan, who rode for 18 years and has trained for nearly three decades, while my maternal grandfather was Les Coles, who rode for many years and won the Caulfield Cup and Melbourne Cup double on Even Stevens in 1962.

9) How did you get involved in educating and prepping ready to race horses?

Dad had always educated a few for clients every year and I helped prep those, but they were sold in other drafts. I decided I wanted to do something for myself to get into the marketplace so I made it my own thing and created Blake Ryan Racing four years ago.

10) What is the process you go through in preparing these horses?

The preparation process for my horses is as identical as possible to any racehorse's early education. Depending on what sale they come from, I like to give them five to six weeks

off after the yearling sales before breaking them in. They will then have a minimum of two preparations in the stables prior to the final breeze preparation, but to me it's vitally important that I don't treat them as a so-called "breeze-up horse" as they would once have been termed. You just treat them as a horse you are training like any other, but one that just so happens to be going to a sale in October.

11) Favourite horse?

Blessed to grow up in the 1990s and it was just an amazing decade throughout. Started with the greats like Vo Rogue, Super Impose and Better Loosen Up through to Let's Elope, Rough Habit, Naturalism and Mahogany, a couple of years later we had that great three-year-old crop with Saintly and Octagonal and then the great Sunline/Northerly rivalry. It's a super tough question, but I'll bite the bullet and say Northerly. Tough as nails, he steered like a shopping trolley; he always looked in trouble yet nearly always found a way.

12) Favourite race?

I've always loved the Caulfield Guineas, it's a classic race on my favourite day of the Melbourne spring and I can't wait for this Saturday. Think of the battles - Redoute's Choice vs Testa Rossa, Encounter vs General Nediym, Kenwood Melody vs Laurie's Lottery. Add in the wins of Our Maizcay and Mahogany, for instance, and they are all etched in memory.

13) Race you'd most like to win?

Happy winning any race anywhere as they all take hard work to win! But the big dream race would be an Everest, any of the Australian big four races or one of the big features at the Hong Kong International Races.

14) Favourite sales story (from anywhere)?

Not the most expensive horse I've ever sold but as far as a feel-good story goes, it would

have to be the Walking Or Dancing x Survival colt I sold two years ago, now named Hua Yu Feng Fan. I paid \$22,000 for him at Scone, he made \$80,000 at the Ready 2 Race Sale, went to China and has won four races and close to AUD\$250,000 including the Inglis Guineas. Those results are why I do it - I bought a nice horse that sold well and has more than repaid his new owners and they came back and bought another one off me last year. Building relationships and buyers having good experiences is the best way to grow both the sale and your business.

New first season sire winners

Belardo - Belloccio (2 c ex Three Cards by Mastercraftsman) won on debut at Salisbury on Thursday to provide Belardo (Lope De Vega) with his eighth individual winner. The David Menuisier-trained colt landed the opening novice stakes by a neck from Aleas (Archipenko), with the well-fancied 5-4 favourite Mohaafeth (Frankel) back in third. Haunui Farm shuttler Belardo will have his first southern hemisphere two-year-olds this season, and has Emmy Vein accepted for the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) on Saturday. The stallion is also responsible for dual Group winner Isabella Giles and stands this season for \$10,000 (plus GST).

Flying Artie - Princess Bojack (2 f ex Catseye Surprise by Testa Rossa) took the first two-year-old race of the season in Queensland on Saturday, becoming the first winner for Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) with his first runner. Sent out the \$4.20 second favourite, the Michael Nolan-trained Princess Bojack led all the way under Michael Cahill to score by three-quarters of a length over the closing Stellar Magic (Star Turn) with two and a half lengths to Headlander (Better Than Ready) in third. Purchased for \$50,000 from the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale this year out of the Murrulla Stud draft, Princess Bojack is the first foal to race

from the Testa Rossa (Perugino) mare Catseve Surprise, a five-time winner. Flying Artie stands for \$16,500 (inc GST) at Newgate Farm in 2020.

Frosted - American shuttler Frosted (Tapit) recorded his first stakes winner, his first individual Australian winner and his seventh winner overall as Ingratiating (2 c ex Obsequious by Lonhro) took out the Maribyrnong Trial Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Flemington on Saturday. The James Cummings-trained Ingratiating produced a tough effort to run down the already-raced General Beau (Brazen Beau), winner of the Darley Spring Preview (900m), with the greenas-grass Cloudy (Frosted) in third, four and a half lengths behind the runner-up. A Darley homebred, Ingratiating is the fourth foal out of the Lonhro (Octagonal) mare Obsequious, who won the Light Fingers Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) and the San Domenico Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) in the 2010-11 season. Frosted stands for \$22,000 (inc GST) at Darley's Northwood Park in 2020.

Shalaa - Shaquero (2 c ex Fimatino by Not A Single Doubt) became the first stakes winner, the first individual Australian winner and the 14th winner globally for Arrowfield shuttler Shalaa (Invincible Spirit) on Saturday when the Chris Waller trainee captured the Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) at Randwick. Jumping out towards the lead, Shaquero was well-rated by James McDonald before stretching out to win by a length and a quarter. Construct (I Am Invincible) finished second, with another Snowden runner, Astrologer (Star Turn), filling third. Bred by Bob Hannon and sold by Fernrigg Farm at this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Shaquero was purchased by Guy Mulcaster Bloodstock for \$160,000. He is the fourth foal and the second winner for Fimatino (Not A Single Doubt), herself a half-sister to top Singapore sprinter-miler Ghozi (Catbird) and Sunset Express (Success Express), the dam of Cox Plate winner and Group 1-producing stallion Shamus Award (Snitzel). Shalaa is standing his fourth season at Arrowfield Stud for \$33,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

New Group or Grade 1 winners

Adlerflug - German stallion Adlerflug (In The Wings) registered Group 1 winner number five last night when Torquator Tasso (3 c ex Tijuana by Toylsome) took out the Grosser Preis von Berlin (Gr 1, 2000m) at Hoppegarten. Having placed in the Deutsches Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) and the Grosser Preis von Baden (Gr 1, 2400m) on his last two starts, finishing behind Arc contender In Swoop (Adlerflug) and the well-travelled Barney Roy (Excelebration), the Marcel Weiss-trained Torquator Tasso looked well-suited on paper. However, he had to fend off a determined surge from Dicaprio (Adlerflug) to win by a short head, with a length and a quarter to Kaspar (Pivotal) in third. Adlerflug stands at the historic Gestut Schlenderhan in western Germany, having stood for a fee of €10,000 (approx. AUD\$16,350) in 2020.

Clodovil - The incredible progression of Tiger Tanaka (2 f ex Miss Phillyjinks by Zoffany) notched up an extra gear when she landed the prestigious Prix Marcel Boussac (Gr 1, 1600m) on Longchamp's Arc card and in the process provided her sire Clodovil (Danehill) with his third individual elite level winner. Having started the season in lowly claiming company, the €6,500 purchase took her career tally to six wins in seven starts when keeping clear of the scrimmaging in a rough race to score by threequarters of a length under Jessica Marcialis, the partner of winning trainer Cha Rossi. Tasmania (Zoffany) emerged out of the pack to take second, with Rougir (Territories) doing her best work late on to finish third, a further length and a half away. Tiger Tanaka won her first four starts before finishing third of four when upped in company to contest the Prix Robert Papin (Gr 2, 1200m) at Chantilly back in July. She got back to winning ways when contesting a Group 3 on testing ground at Deauville last month. The first foal out of the winning mare Miss Phillyjinks (Zoffany), Tiger Tanaka is related to numerous winners, however none of them have come close to matching her achievements. French

Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Clodovil stood at Rathasker Stud for a fee of €8,000 (approx AUD\$13,000) in 2020.

Declaration Of War - Former Coolmore stallion Declaration Of War (War Front) produced his sixth individual Group or Grade 1 winner on Saturday when Gufo (3 c ex Floy by Petionville) took out the Belmont Derby Invitational Stakes (Gr 1, 10f). The Christophe Clement-trained Gufo took his record to five wins from seven starts with his first top-level triumph, defeating Todd Pletcher-trained stablemates No Word (Silent Name) and Mo Ready (Uncle Mo) to score by a length. "He won well. I thought he had a great trip from Junior (Alvarado, jockey), and when he asked him to guicken, he really guickened well in the stretch. He's a good horse," Clement said. "If you look at all his races this year, he's been running well all year round. I know he got beat last time in the Saratoga Derby, but he actually ran a winning race when you look back at it." The win gives Gufo an automatic berth into the Breeders' Cup Turf (Gr 1, 12f), but Clement said the Hollywood Derby (Gr 1, 9f) at Del Mar was also under consideration. Declaration Of War now stands at JBBA Shizunai in Japan.

The Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young-trained Mirage Dancer was given a top ride by Nash Rawiller, settling midfield after a slightly slow beginning before making ground towards the inside. Bursting through between runners, he chased down favourite Mugatoo (Henrythenavigator) to win by a head with a further head back to Angel Of Truth (Animal Kingdom) in third. It capped a significant day for Frankel down under, with Hungry Heart second in the Flight Stakes and Finche third in the Turnbull Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m). Frankel stands at Banstead Manor Stud in Newmarket, having stood for £175,000 (approx. AUD\$316,000) in 2020.

Galiway - Haras de Colleville resident Galiway (Gaileo) sired his maiden elite level winner when his son Sealiway (2 c ex Kensea by Kendargent) sprinted clear of his four rivals to post an impressive winning performance in the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere (Gr 1, 1400m) at Longchamp on Sunday. The Frederic Rossitrained juvenile was always travelling best of the small field on the testing ground before quickening well under Mickael Barzalona to register an eight-length win. Odds-on favourite Nando Parrado (Kodiac) kept on at one pace for second, with Laws Of Indices (Power) another three-quarters of a length behind in third. Sealiway was winning for the fourth time in six starts, having scored in Listed company at Vichy prior to his second in the Prix la Rochette (Gr 3, 1400m) over this course and distance on his previous outing. A €62,000 purchase at Argana last year, Sealiway is the third foal out of the Listed winning Kendargent (Kendor) mare Kensea. Galiway stood for a fee of €10,000 in 2020.

Kermadec - Montefilia (3 f ex Bana Wu by Shirocco) took a giant leap forward when striking at the highest level in the Flight Stakes

Bought by Payne Racing for \$130,000 at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling sale, Montefilia took her earnings to \$425,925 after Saturday's victory. Dual Group 1 winner Kermadec stands at Darley Kelvinside for \$13,750 (inc GST).

Laoban - American first season sire Laoban (Uncle Mo) joined Nyquist (Uncle Mo) and Not This Time (Giant's Causeway) as a freshman stallion to produce a Grade 1 winner this season when Simply Ravishing (2 f ex Four Wishes by More Than Ready) led home a quinella for trainer Kenny McPeek in the Alcibiades Stakes (Gr 1, 8.5f) at Keeneland on Friday. Leading all the way under Luis Saez, Simply Ravishing scored by six and a quarter lengths over her stablemate Crazy Beautiful (Liam's Map) with Travel Column (Frosted) a further length and a quarter away in third. Simply Ravishing joined Restless Rider (Distorted Humor), Dream Empress (Bernstein), Take Charge Lady (Dehere) and She's A Devil Due (Devil His Due) as a McPeek-trained winner of the Alcibiades: all four of his other winners went on to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (Gr 1, 8.5f), with three of them finishing in the placings. That is a likely target for Simply Ravishing, with the race to be held at the same track and trip as the Alcibiades this year. Laoban stood for USD\$5,000 (approx. AUD\$7,000) at Sequel Stallions in New York in 2020.

Le Havre - Le Havre (Noverre) brought up his fifth Group 1 winner last night when Wonderful Tonight (3 f ex Salvation by Montjeu) provided some consolation to trainer David Menuisier after a tough week, taking out the Prix de Royallieu (Gr 1, 2800m) at Longchamp. Menuisier's stable star Thundering Blue (Exchange Rate) died after breaking down at Goodwood last week, but his eyes are only on the future after Wonderful Tonight gave him a second Group 1 victory. Menuisier had been

Wootton Bassett - The Francis-Henri Graffard-trained Wooded (3 c ex Frida La Blonde by Elusive City) took out the Prix de l'Abbaye (Gr 1, 1000m) at Longchamp on Sunday to provide Wootton Bassett (Iffraaj) with his third individual elite-level winner. Ridden by Pierre-Charles Boudot, Wooded never had to leave the rail in pursuit of his first Group 1 success and defeated the 17-10 favourite Glass Slippers (Dream Ahead) by a neck, with Frankie Dettori's mount Liberty Beach (Cable Bay) close behind in third. Coolmore's new recruit Wootton Bassett also sired Group 1 winners Almanzor and Audarya.

Pierro, a champion first, second and third season sire in Australia, stands at Coolmore for \$137,500 (inc GST).

Pride Of Dubai stands at Coolmore Australia for \$38,500 (inc GST) in 2020.

Sacred Falls - Aegon (3 g ex Toss Up by Zabeel) provided the late Sacred Falls (O'Reilly) with his second individual stakes winner when taking out the Hawke's Bay Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m) at Hastings on Saturday at his second start. Making all on Friday, he stayed on gamely to prevail by a head from Albaflora (Muhaarar) with the pair a length and three-quarters clear of Without A Fight (Teofilo). Derby winner Sir Percy stands at Lanwades Stud in Newmarket where his fee for 2020 was £7,000 (approx. AU\$12,500)

Turffontein - Khoekhoe (3 c ex Walvis Bay by Cape Cross) took out the Super Impose Stakes (Listed, 1800m) at Flemington on Saturday, becoming Turffontein's (Johannesburg) seventh individual stakes winner. The Matt Cumani-trained colt built on a sixth-placed finish in last month's Exford Plate (Listed, 1400m) to defeat Young Werther (Tavistock) by a head, with Albarado (Savabeel) a further length behind in third. Turffontein, who won the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) during his race career, stands at Blue Gum Farm for a \$6,600 (inc GST) fee.

WOODSIDE PARK STUD

Written Tycoon - Woodside Park Stud's Written Tycoon (Iglesia) brought up stakes winner number 37 on Saturday when Enthaar (2 f ex Final Agreement by Not A Single Doubt) recorded a remarkable victory in the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) at Randwick. Sent out a heavy favourite after a promising trial on the Kensington track late last month, the Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained Enthaar was trapped wide and on the speed in what was a fast-tempo affair, particularly for two-year-olds having their first start. What could have been trouble for most youngsters was hardly a concern for Emirates Park homebred Enthaar, though. She raced up under little urging from James McDonald and, when the rider asked for an effort, she extended away in the twinkling of an eye, quickly putting up three lengths on her rivals. Mallory (Not A Single Doubt) and Total Babe (I Am Invincible) chased resolutely but they were in a separate race as Enthaar stopped the clock at 57.06 seconds - only 2018 winner Catch Me (I Am Invincible) has managed to go faster, breaking the 57-second barrier by the narrowest of margins. Written Tycoon is standing his first season at Arrowfield Stud for \$77,000 (inc GST) in 2020.
