Quality over quantity the key to success for red-hot Freedman

Sam, assistant trainer to his father Anthony, looks ahead to an important weekend of runners as the stable continues to produce high-class prospects

Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), TJ Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and VRC Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) would be an impressive Group 1 four-timer for any stable across a 12-month period, but to complete the feat with just 60 horses in full work is a particularly noteworthy achievement.

Anthony Freedman has done just that,

saddling Lyre (Lonhro) to victory in Victoria's most prestigious juvenile contest before Super Seth (Dundeel) snatched victory from fellow star three-year-old Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) in a thrilling Caulfield Guineas.

Stable stalwart Santa Ana Lane (Lope de Vega) produced the best sprinting performance of 2019 when pulling three and a half lengths clear of a star-studded TJ Smith field, while Warning (Declaration Of War) added lustre to a fine year when running his rivals ragged in the Victoria Derby.

Begood ready for Orr test

Daniel Bowman believes he will find out more about the level his Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Begood Toya Mother (Myboycharlie) is at when the gelding contests the weight-for-age C.F Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield tomorrow. "If he can't be highly competitive on Saturday at weightfor-age then he's just not a weight-for-age horse," Bowman said. "We've got him as good as we can. He's ticked every box. He's drawn a great gate, he's second-up. It's Caulfield over 1400 metres and his only defeat at Caulfield was in the Memsie when he probably wasn't fit enough and did a few things wrong but was only beaten two and a half lengths. If he can bring his A-game then he should be highly competitive." Morning Briefing page 8 >>

<< Continued from page 1 The key to those achievements? A focus on quality, rather than quantity, plus a vital network of senior staff.</p>

That is the view of Sam Freedman, assistant trainer to his father and an increasingly important cog in the stable's workings, particularly regarding media output.

Speaking to ANZ Bloodstock News, Freedman says: "We keep our numbers to around 60 horses in work, which really allows us to focus on having quality, rather than quantity, and to give every horse the best opportunity to show their best.

"We're fairly upfront with our owners and if we think a horse isn't going to measure up to paying high training fees, we'll say. We want to make sure each horse is up to a good level and while there would be the opportunity to expand if we wanted, that would probably dilute the quality."

Commenting on the importance of essential individuals to the day-to-day running of the operation, Freedman continues: "We've got some really good key staff at all of our properties.

"Steve Adams runs the Flemington base - he's been with Dad for 15 years and he does an amazing job up there. Brad Taylor, our racing manager, he's a key member of staff, as is Rebecca Smith at Pinecliff."

Freedman operates out of two locations, with the more traditional Flemington base supplemented by Pinecliff - a state-of-the-art, custom-

built training facility at Mount Eliza. Sam believes having the option of both locations allows for plenty of variation among the string.

"We've been at Pinecliff for six years and it always takes a bit of time to get used to a new property, but I think we've really worked it out," he says.

"We've got a good balance between Flemington and Pinecliff, working out which horses work out in which spot, and it seems to be working really well."

The proof of the pudding is always in the eating and racetrack performance is ultimately the key metric of success.


While that success was sustained across 2019, Freedman has issued a positive bulletin on the stable flagbearers moving forward. Indeed, Warning is being set for a four-start autumn preparation that could pave the way for an audacious spring campaign.

"He's coming along well and is probably a little ahead of schedule," Freedman says. "He looks physically very fit and he's a naturally cleanwinded horse.

"He travelled to Sydney overnight on Tuesday and he may have a trial next week. We'll look to head to the Hobartville (February 22) for his first-up run, before he goes to the

Randwick Guineas (March 7), Rosehill Guineas (March 21), and then the Australian Derby (April 4).

<< Continued from page 2 "He'll go down that tried and true route in Sydney. He's just a lovely stayer who is proven at that sort of trip and hopefully he can complete the Victorian-Australian Derby double."

Looking ahead, Freedman adds: "You really want to win a Caulfield Cup and a Melbourne Cup and it takes pretty special horses to win those sort of races. With a horse like Warning, if he can keep going the right way he could feature in a couple of those races in the spring."

Super Seth made a striking return to action when taking out the Manfred Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield last week, seeing off his five rivals - including stable companion Groundswell (Fastnet Rock) - by a length and a quarter.

Both colts could follow a similar path moving forward, with Freedman saying: "Both pulled-up from the race very well. Groundswell didn't handle the heavy track, so we're toying with where we go with him. He has a couple of options - the CS Hayes (February 15) next week and also the Zeditave (February 22), which might be better suited.

"Super Seth has come through the race really well and we're in a similar sort of scenario with him. He'll be nominated for the CS Hayes, but there is a chance he might head to the Futurity (February 22) a week later.

"We think he's dynamite at Caulfield and 1400 (metres) there against the older horses, we certainly think he's up to it. Hopefully that's a Group 1 he can add to his CV."

Now a seven-year-old, Santa Ana Lane has been a fine servant to the Freedman team, winning five times at the top level and amassing \$7,478,828 in prizemoney.

Touted for a trip to Royal Ascot last year, Freedman elected to keep the son of Lope de Vega (Shamardal) closer to home, and an opportunity for European fans to see the star speedster in the flesh looks increasingly unlikely.

"He trialled at Balnarring

on Tuesday and it's probably the best he's gone for a very long time," Freedman continues.

"We'll probably head towards the TJ Smith (April 4) and then possibly the All-Aged (April 18). There is an outside chance we'll go to Royal Ascot, but he's heading into the twilight of his career, and it's never an easy trip to do with a horse.

"He doesn't owe the stable or his owners anything. We just want to make sure he's fit, healthy and going really well if we're going to make a decision like that, but at this stage we're just focussed on the TJ Smith."

If Santa Ana Lane is the elderly statesman of the Freedman stable, Hanseatic (Street Boss) represents the next generation who have the world at their feet.

The Godolphin-owned juvenile shot to the head of the Blue Diamond market with an imperious performance in the Blue Diamond Preview (C&G) (Listed, 1000m) on January 25, skipping two and half lengths clear in the closing stages and leaving the clock-watchers open-mouthed with his finishing splits.

Hanseatic will take the next step up the ladder when he contests the Blue Diamond Prelude (C&G) (Gr 3, 1100m) at Caulfield tomorrow, and while Freedman is upbeat he can maintain his unbeaten record, he did stress how the flashy chestnut is still learning his trade.

"He's come through his Preview win really well," Freedman says. "He seems to have bounced out of it nicely. He's a pretty exciting colt and we're pretty hopeful he can measure up against the better two-year-olds.

"He was a bit fresh and full of himself at the races last time and he's still doing a lot wrong on raceday. We probably won't know until Saturday how he behaves on the day, but he's a bit of a hot and stressy horse anyway, that's just his nature, so we'll do what we can to combat that.

"But the positive is that he's done it twice now at the races and it hasn't affected his performance, so we're not too concerned if he was to muck around a bit. Ideally, though, when you head towards the big days, you want them on their game all the time."

Assessing the opposition to Hanseatic in the Blue Diamond Prelude, which has drawn a field of 13, Freedman adds: It's a good test for him on Saturday with Rulership coming down (from Peter and Paul Snowden's Sydney base).

<< Continued from page 4 "It's probably a much better race than the Preview and he's probably got to keep improving, like most of the two-year-olds if they're going to measure up at the top level. But he seems to be going the right way."

Hanseatic will be joined at Caulfield by 2018 Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) winner Ringerdingding (Sebring), who contests the CF Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) eight days on from his first-up fourth in the Australia Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Moonee Valley.

Freedman is hopeful the \$500,000 feature will pan out suitably from a pace perspective, although he has put a query by the inside barrier in the 12-horse field.

"He's going super - it was a really good first-up run at The Valley," Freedman says. "He's really well, he's improved, and he'll appreciate getting out to the 1400 (metres).

"He's probably not ideally drawn in one - he's a horse that tends to race a little better when he gets to the outside of the field and to come with one run, so that's a little issue that John Allen (jockey) will have to overcome.

"But having horses like Hey Doc and Begood Toya Mother in the field you know that it's not going to be a slowly-run affair, which will really suit him. He'll probably be in the second-half of the field and can hopefully just be saved for one crack at them."

Looking ahead, Freedman added: "We're taking it one run at a time with him, but the All-Star Mile is probably a really nice race for him if he could get into that.

"He's proven against some of the best milers in Australia and we think we've got him back to his best form, so we're hopeful he can get into that field.

"If not, there are plenty of options for a horse with his profile, including the Futurity or the Doncaster (April 4)."

Promising three-year-old Southbank (Fastnet Rock) rounds out the three-strong Freedman assault on Caulfield, with the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) placegetter set to resume in the Kevin Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m).

"She's a very good filly," Freedman says. "She was third in the Guineas in what was essentially her first proper preparation and she's a horse we're really excited about for the autumn.

"Her trials have been excellent, her work has been super and she

seems to be maturing all of the time.

"She's out of a Zabeel mare and she'll appreciate getting out in trip, but she's certainly sharp enough to run very well at 1200 (metres), and we'd be disappointed if she wasn't right there fighting out the finish."

Meanwhile at Warwick Farm, exciting Godolphinowned three-year-old Chenier

(Medaglia d'Oro) is set to make his highly-anticipated return in the Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), although the wet forecast for Sydney could put those plans on hold.

The son of Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado) made a deep impression when winning a Sandown maiden by five lengths on debut last March, but sustained an injury following his subsequent runner-up effort at the same track in April.

"He's comeback really well," Freedman continues. "He had a little injury at the end of his first preparation, so we gave him the time to get over that.

"His trials have been really good, but the 1200 (metres) is probably on the sharp side for him. He's likely to end up at 1400 to a mile in time."

However, regarding the ground, Freedman adds: "He probably won't line up if the rainfall is heavy, which is expected.

"He's a very exciting horse and we've got a lot of time for him. But we just think he's going to perform better on top of the ground, and we would rather save him for a better track."

The Freedman stable houses an enviable amount of ammunition for both this weekend and beyond, but Sam is phlegmatic in regard to setting goals for the future.

"We just want to keep winning as many Group 1s as we can," he says.

"We're never going to feature towards the top of the trainers' premiership with the numbers we have, but as long as our strike-rate is strong and we're placing horses correctly then we'll be very happy."

Fidelia set for Caulfield return

After a fruitful winter campaign followed by a winless spring, Robbie Griffths will continue to raise the bar with his stakes-placed mare Fidelia (Not A Single Doubt) this autumn, kicking off in tomorrow's Bellmaine Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m). "She had a great winter and she had some fantastic performances in the spring but didn't get the accolades because of bad luck in running, bad barriers, and rain on Derby day," Griffiths said. "It was a shame because I think her performances equated to a horse that should have won one, two or three during the prep. She's had a rest, she's come back and has been working well. Normally in these types of lead-up races she runs out the back then finishes off and runs third, fourth or fifth and she'll probably do the same. She's got the ability to win but it's just a bit short of her best distances, but it hopefully sets her up well for the remainder of her campaign."

Cummings excited about Sunborn

After being involved with her half-sister, Edward Cummings took a chance on purchasing Sunborn (Casino Prince) at last year's Inglis Classic Sale and that chance could pay off as she takes on tomorrow's \$2 million Inglis Millenium (RL, 1100m). "She looked like a strong, well-balanced filly, a really sensible horse," Cummings said. "She is a very goodmoving horse and the added benefit I had is I had trained her half-sister, by High Chaparral, with my father, so I knew a little bit about the family." On Sunbourn's chances in Australia's second-richest juvenile race Cummings added: "She put the writing on the wall early with some

nice trials and then won on debut and I thought her run was very good in the (Inglis) Nursery, albeit it unlucky. I think she has gone on from that race and after a short let-up, she is there to run well on Saturday."

Regimental Band in doubt for Group 3

With the forecast rain set for Warwick Farm and the likelihood of a bottomless track, Kris Lees said he is likely to scratch Regimental Band (I Am Invincible) from the Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) tomorrow and instead target the Light Fingers Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) the following week. "We're still undecided on whether we will run. We're just keeping an eye on the weather," Lees said. "I think she will like soft ground but I just don't want her first-up on a heavy track. She may even run the following Saturday but she seems to be coming up well." However, stablemates Attention Run (Hurricane Run) and Hallelujah Boy (Tosen Phantom) will resume in the Bowness Stud Mile (1600m) and both boast outstanding form on rain-affected ground. "They will be suited over further but both are capable of running well fresh as well,"

Accession set for Warwick Farm redemption

Twelve months ago, the Star Thoroughbreds-raced Accession (Brazen Beau) was narrowly beaten by subsequent Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Castelvecchio (Dundeel) in the Inglis Millenium and syndicator Denise Martin is hoping for redemption when the gelding returns to Warwick Farm for the Inglis Sprint (1200m) tomorrow. "On this day last year he was unfortunate in the \$2 million two-year-old race to encounter Castelvecchio. He shot to the

lead and just got run down very late," Martin said. "Hopefully this year, back to the scene of the event, he can be really competitive. I think we'll know where we're at fairly quickly this preparation and I'm sure the gelding procedure will have helped him. He did a great job as a two-year-old, so hopefully he can continue on now in his three-year-old year."

Lockwood on the attack at Eagle Farm

Tough stayer Art Attack (Excellent Art) will take the first step towards a northern Cups campaign when he has his first start for Barry Lockwood in the Cascade Handicap (2200m) at Eagle Farm tomorrow. The gelding had been a good performer for Coffs Harbour trainer Jenny Graham, winning seven races and \$209,000 in prize-money before being purchased by one of Lockwood's stable clients. "Art Attack will have a couple of starts around here and then head north to Mackay," Lockwood said. "The eventual aim is some of the northern Cups, which will suit him. They are worth good money this year."

Kendrick to play key role at Eagle Farm

After dual-nominating Playthefield (Sepoy) this weekend, Stuart Kendrick looks likely to run the Magic Millions Maiden (1200m) placegetter in the QTIS Three-Year-Old (1600m) at Eagle Farm tomorrow. Kendrick said he had been keen to get the three-year-old out to 1600 metres on the big Eagle Farm track. "He has drawn the extreme outside barrier but he gets back anyway so it shouldn't be a major problem," Kendrick said. "Like everyone else we are trying to work out how the track will play if we get the predicted rain. But wet or dry it shouldn't be a major worry."



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Redzel wins trial, set for Lightning

After comfortably winning a trial at Randwick yesterday, star sprinter Redzel (Snitzel) looks set to take his place in the Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Flemington next Saturday. In the second of two heats on the course proper, the Peter and Paul Snowden-trained seven-year-old beat Quackerjack (Not A Single Doubt) by a length and a half over 900 metres. The first of the course-proper trials was over 1000 metres with Greysful Glamour (Stratum) edging Sweet Deal (Casino Prince) on the line. Prince Fawaz (Fastnet Rock) was another two lengths away in third, with Pancho (Dissident) and crowd favourite Happy Clapper (Teofilo) both working home well to run fourth and fifth.

Castelvecchio to return in Hobartville

Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) runner-up and future Arrowfield Stud resident Castelvecchio (Dundeel) is set to kick off his autumn campaign in the Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Randwick on February 22. In 2013, Castelvecchio's sire Dundeel (High Chaparral) won the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), Rosehill Guineas (Gr 1, 2000m) and ATC Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) and those three races are on the agenda for the three-year-old as he looks to follow in his father's footsteps. "He'll have another trial on the 13th (February) over 1200 metres then go to the 1400-metre Hobartville then onto the Randwick Guineas, Rosehill Guineas and a possible Derby. Obviously, the Queen Elizabeth will be his grand final so we have some really nice big races there," trainer Richard Litt told Racing.com. "That is Dundeel's path and he's following in his father's footsteps maybe we could say."

McGill eyes All-Star

Young trainer Logan McGill is hopeful the votes will keep coming for his Sale Cup (Listed, 1600m) winner Gold Fields (Churchill Downs) in the All-Star Mile (1600m) ballot. The seven-year-old currently sits ninth on the leaderboard with 2,574 votes. "It's been a real thrill the way the voting has gone - it's really good to see how popular he's been. It's been a surprise, but it's been a good journey for all of us," McGill told Racing.com. "I've never had a Group 1 runner and obviously the prize-money here is the equivalent to a Group 1 so definitely it would be a big thrill."

Laming charged for race day treatment

Victorian trainer Richard Laming and two stablehands have been charged for stomachtubing Jamaican Rain (Manhattan Rain) on raceday. Racing Victoria stewards uncovered the actions during a Melbourne Cup day stable inspection which led to the mare's scratching from the Flemington meeting. Stewards on Thursday issued two charges against Laming and one each against registered stablehands Marnu Potieter and MD Zeyaur. Stewards allege Laming, on the morning of the race and before the CAT arrival at the stable, stomach-tubed, caused the stomach-tubing, attempted to stomach-tube and/or was a party to the stomach-tubing or attempted stomach-tubing of Jamaican Rain. Potgieter faces the same allegations as Laming, while Rahman has been charged with being a party to the alleged stomach-tubing or attempted stomach-tubing of the mare. Laming faces a second charge of obstructing, hindering or delaying the CAT in exercising their powers and performing their functions and duties in that he deleted or incited another person to delete, files from a network video recorder. All three will face the Victorian Racing Tribunal at a future date.

Vale Peter Lawrence

Tributes have been paid to Melbourne Racing Club icon Peter Lawrence, who died this week aged 81. Lawrence served on the MRC committee for 31 years and was chairman for 11 of those, while he also held a number of other key positions with the Victoria Racing Club and the Victorian Amateur Turf Club during his time in the industry. The PB Lawrence Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) carries his name, while he was a highly-regarded stockbroker for Bell Potter and a life member of Melbourne Savage Club away from the track. "He was an absolute legend of our club, absolute legend," MRC chairman Peter Le Grand said. "He was such an influential man and was just a loveable fella, a lovely man. He made an enormous contribution to our club." Details for Lawrence's memorial service are yet to be finalised, although the MRC will fly the club's flags at half-mast and show his picture on the screen at Caulfield tomorrow.

Stewards on weather watch for Warwick Farm

Sydney racing officials remain on weather watch as predictions for torrential rain threaten tomorrow's Inglis Millennium meeting at Warwick Farm. Stewards have already nominated Rosehill as a back-up venue for tomorrow's fixture, but such is the level of rain forecast, both tracks could be washed out. Chief steward Marc Van Gestel said most of the rain predicted for today was expected to fall in the morning and officials would inspect Warwick Farm around 1pm. "We will then make a decision as to whether the track is still suitable or not," Van Gestel said. "At the same time we need to consider Rosehill and whether it will be suitable as well. Inspections of both tracks will be conducted and we'll ascertain suitability for both of those venues." The Bureau of Meteorology is predicting between 45-80 millimeters of rain at Warwick Farm today and a further 35 to 70 millimeters tomorrow.

Paul Gillard new senior Gold Coast steward

Paul Gillard will return from North Queensland to take over as senior steward on the Gold Coast. The previous long-term Gold Coast head steward, Ian Brown, resigned last year to take up a position as racing manager with the Gold Coast Turf Club. Queensland Racing Integrity Commission boss Ross Barnett said the permanent appointment of such a competent

and respected steward reflected the importance of the Gold Coast as a major racing community in the state. "With the planned upgrade and expansion of the Gold Coast facility, the volume and quality of racing will continue to expand, and it's important the commission provides a high standard of integrity and consistent application of the rules," Barnett said.

Flemington set for Rapid Racing

Rapid Racing is set to get underway at Sunday's twilight fixture at Flemington. The meeting will feature seven races between 4pm and 7pm, with 30-minute gaps between races, all of which will be run on Flemington's straight course. The meeting also incorporates a jockeys' challenge, with a team of metropolitan riders competing against a team of jockeys representing the country, with a running points score based on the top four placegetters in each race. There will also be an individual points score for both jockeys and trainers. Four of the seven races attracted full fields of 12 plus emergencies, while two had 11 acceptors yesterday.

NEW ZEALAND

44 for Darci Brahma

The Oaks Stud resident Darci Brahma (Danehill) sired his 44th stakes winner yesterday when Sinarahma (5 m ex Shez Sinsational by Ekraar) took out the Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes (Listed, 1600m) at Tauherenikau. Vee Cece (Canford Cliffs) finished second, beaten a length and a quarter, with a further neck back to Vichy (Cape Blanco) in third. Trained by Allan Sharrock, Sinarahma was securing her fifth success in 13 outings having run ninth in last year's Manawatu Breeders (Gr 3, 2000m) her only other start in stakes company. Darci Brahma stood for a fee of NZ\$15,000 last year and he is the sire of ten individual Group 1 winners, including star New Zealand threeyear-old Catalyst.

Sinarahma lands Wairarapa Breeders'

A jubilant Allan Sharrock cut a delighted figure post-race and he is already making lofty plans for Sinarahma moving forward. "She was dominant today and I am probably looking forward to next year more than anything," Sharrock said. "She will go to the Cuddle Stakes, but I said to Emma (partner) before the race that I think the Livamol Classic next season is her race. She is just maturing and she is the first foal of the mare and is not that big. She is going to be a better six-year-old than a five-year-old. I think it is the best I have had her. She never turned a hair on the trip. We stayed at Woodville last night and she ate and drank everything."

Bostonian and Melody Belle trial at Tauranga

Bostonian (Jimmy Choux) and Melody Belle (Commands) put the final touches to their upcoming Australian campaigns when running first and third respectively in a special 1050-metre trial at Tauranga yesterday. The first heat featured both Melody Belle and Bostonian along with Stewards Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Sheezallmine (Super Easy), who strung out the field with a true early pace. She eventually held on for second as Bostonian cruised home a length to the good, with Melody Belle finishing off nicely back in third. "She trialled well. They went a decent clip and she was out of her comfort zone without the hood on," trainer Jamie Richards said of Melody Belle. "She was there to do a bit today and treat it like a race to tighten her up and bring her on, so she's got plenty of improvement to come."

Dragon ready to fire for Guineas

Co-trainer Lance O'Sullivan expects progressive three-year-old Dragon Leap (Pierro) to improve on whatever he does in tomorrow's Waikato Guineas (Gr 2, 2000m) as he builds towards next month's New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) prior to a tilt at the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m). A dual winner from three outings, Dragon Leap was last seen winning the Auckland Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) on New Year's Day. "He certainly hasn't gone backwards, but it's a bit of a gap between runs and whatever he does Saturday, there's certainly a lot of improvement in the horse," O'Sullivan, who trains in partnership with Andrew Scott, said. "He's certainly not primed for this. This is not the grand final. We

want to ride him to get the trip and hopefully it's all a part of the learning curve for him. He's not a flashy track worker, but he certainly looks well in condition."

Catalyst set for Melbourne trip

Clayton Chipperfield has issued a positive bulletin on leading three-year-old Catalyst (Darci Brahma) as he prepares to depart for Australia on Sunday. The recent Mr Tiz Trophy (Gr 3, 1200m) winner will contest the CS Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Flemington next Saturday, with that outing set to lead into the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and All-Star Mile (1600m), so long as Catalyst secures sufficient votes to grab a place in the \$5 million contest at Caulfield. "He had a nice hit-out on Wednesday and he pulled up super, so he is ready," Chipperfield told RSN927. Catalyst has secured almost 3000 votes in the All-Star Mile voting, just behind the Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained Heart Of Puissance (Puissance de Lune). Compatriot Melody Belle sits in third, while Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) comfortably heads the list. "A few weeks back we were sitting about eighth, ninth and didn't have too many (votes)," Chipperfield added. "We are getting in a comfortable position, but we are still not there yet."

Lane to miss Catalyst ride

However, Catalyst won't be partnered by Damian Lane in the CS Hayes after the leading rider incurred a 12-meeting suspension for careless riding at Bendigo on Wednesday. Lane was aboard the Anthony Freedman-trained Meuse (Snitzel), who survived a protest having passed the post a length and a half in front, but stewards believed Lane rode his mount along while shifting inwards, causing runner-up Rapidora (Oratorio) to be checked and lose her rightful running. Lane was suspended for 12 meetings, five of which are metropolitan, with his ban starting after tomorrow's CF Orr Stakes meeting at Caulfield and concluding in time for Pakenham's night meeting on February 20. Lane has the right to appeal, while Troy Harris has ridden Catalyst to his past five victories in New Zealand.

She was four deep early in the run and still three deep at the 800 metres before finding a spot on the fence. Taking closer order from the 600 metres, she moved out at the top of the straight, balanced, and went after the leader.

Between runners, she levelled up at the 50

metres and was going too well at the line to win by a long-neck.

The third foal out of the stakes-placed mare Cassie May (Red Clubs), Bonita Aurelia was purchased from the draft of Wentwood Grange as a weanling for \$500 at the Karaka May Sale by AG & CM Trestrail.

Cassie May is out of the unraced mare Losers Weepers (Keeper), who herself is a sister to the stakes-placed Shock and a half-sister to Group 3 runner-up Vereza (Zabeel).

Further down the page is Sudden (Boucher), the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1,

1200m) placegetter and dam of 1992 champion two-year-old in Australia Burst (Marauding).

Bonita Aurelia is also related to dual Group 2 winner Eclair Choice (California Dane).

Ray Knight, stud manager at Novara Park, who stand Sweynesse, described the result as awesome.

"Her win is very encouraging and there are more to come," he said.

Sweynesse's first crop are two-year-olds and he was also represented the previous week at Ellerslie by Dragon Queen, who finished a promising fifth in the Karaka Million (RL, 1200m).



Standout returns fast sectional times in impressive Expressway Stakes victory

ppropriately-named colt Standout (Exceed And Excel) looks set for a very good preparation after producing fast sectionals in his impressive first-up performance when taking out last Saturday's Expressway Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick.

Having his first start since finishing second to Cosmic Force (Deep Field) in the Roman Consul Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick in October, Standout settled back in fifth place before running on strongly for a very easy win.

Standout defeated three-time Group 1-winning mare Alizee (Sepoy) by a length and a half in the good time of 1:09.56 for his fourth win in five starts.

The race featured a strong pace, which was established by noted front-runner Irithea (Snitzel), who clocked the first 1000 metres in a very smart 57.76.

The tempo suited Standout and he probably produced the best performance of his career to date in winning the weight-for-age feature, certainly judging by the manner in which he won and the standard of his sectionals times.

Standout clocked 55.63 (last 1000m), 44.74 (last 800m), 33.52 (last 600m) and 22.48 for his final 400 metres – excellent closing sectionals, especially at his first start for four months, and he did it with jockey Tommy Berry seemingly having something in hand.

The runner-up **Alizee**, who was also resuming from a break, settled in last place in the seven-runner field, took a split under Hugh

Bowman on straightening, went to second at the 100 metres and then battled on very well, albeit without threatening the winner.

In coming from so far back, her closing times compared very well to the winner, clocking 55.53 (last 1000m), 44.63 (last 800m), 33.61 (last 600m) with her final 200 metres in 22.46.

The consistent mare **White Moss** (Mossman), who had tracked the leader, also did well in fighting on gamely for third at her first run since May, and she too looks set for a good preparation.

The fourth-placed **Kolding** (Ocean Park), who was having his first start since taking out the inaugural \$7.5 million Golden Eagle (1500m) at Rosehill in November, also caught the eye.

Again ridden by Glen Boss, Kolding settled

back in sixth place, improved on turning for home and kept making ground to finish two and a quarter lengths from the winner.

Kolding was timed to run 55.71 (last 1000m), 44.82 (last 800m), 33.74 (last 600m) with his final 200 metres in 22.59.

Earlier in the day at Randwick, talented filly **Away Game** (Snitzel) followed her impressive late-closing victory in the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) on January 11 with a very smart performance when winning the Widden Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m).

Taken to the front on this occasion after working in the early stages, Away Game travelled well for Tom Marquard before drawing away to score decisively by two and a quarter lengths in a time of 1:04.42 (11.71 200m rate), equivalent to 1200 metres in 1:10.27.

It was Away Game's third win in four starts and she was backing up after her strong late-closing victory at the Gold Coast, in a race of totally different circumstances, which demonstrated the versatility and quality of the Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained filly.

Her early sectionals verified the standard of the win, with a 200 metre breakdown (from the 1000m) of: 10.39, 10.65 (400m in 21.04), 11.63 (600m in 32.67), 11.58 (800m in 44.25) and 12.23 for a fast 1000 metre time of 56.48.

In the following race, her stablemate **Prague** (Redoute's Choice) took his record to two starts for two wins, advancing from his debut victory in a two-year-old maiden (1200m) at Canterbury on January 17 to take out the Canonbury Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) in very good style.

Also ridden by Tom Marquard, Prague settled outside the leader Nitrous (Deep Field), got the upper hand halfway down the straight and then drew away to score by a length and three-quarters from the Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) winner Global Quest (More Than Ready).

The time for the 1100-metre journey was 1:03.94, (11.62 200m rate), equivalent to 1200 metres in 1:09.75 and noteworthy was the fact that the overall time was 0.48 seconds faster than

recorded by Away Game in the Widden Stakes.

Prague's 200-metre breakdown was also impressive: (from the 1000m) 10.51, 10.88 (400m in 21.39), 11.33 (600m in 32.72), 11.31 (800m in 44.03) and 11.83 to give the colt a fast 55.86 for his last 1000 metres.

At Saturday's Caulfield meeting, the Anthony Freedman-trained colt **Super Seth** (Dundeel) scored an impressive first-up victory in the Manfred Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), taking his record to five wins from eight runs.

Having his first start since his late-closing victory in the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m)

on October 12, Super Seth settled closer than anticipated in third place on the rails before overhauling the leader Free Of Debt (Unencumbered) to win by a length and a quarter.

The time on the soft 7 track was a reasonable 1:12.83. That was mainly due to a moderate first 200 metres in 14.38 – the pace was actually quite sound in the conditions from that point.

The front-running **Free Of Debt** returned 200 metre sections (from the 1000m) of: 11.40, 11.31 (400m in 22.71), 11.80 (600m in 34.51), 11.54 (800m in 46.05) with his final 200 metres in 12.44 for a last 1000 metres in 58.49.

Super Seth naturally clocked faster splits, with his final 1000 metres in 57.95, and the quality colt now looks primed for another very good preparation.

The favourite Dalasan (Dalakhani), who was also resuming, settled further back than expected after being a bit slowly away. He did well on the watch in making up late ground from second last in the six-runner field to finish third, a head behind runner-up Free Of Debt.

Dalasan was timed to run his last 1000 metres in 57.89, last 800 metres in 46.55, last 600 metres in 35.21, last 400 metres in 23.48 with his final 200 metres in 11.92 – the fastest closing sectional times of the race.



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Court hears of defendant's lavish lifestyle funded by £9 million fake-syndicate fraud

n Australian court has heard how former leading racing figure Bill Vlahos allegedly used an elaborate fake betting syndicate to defraud 71 people of \$17.5 million, which went into funding his extravagant lifestyle and personal business ventures.

During a plea hearing in Victoria County Court on Tuesday, Vlahos, who last year pleaded guilty to two counts of obtaining financial advantage by deception worth \$17,520,225, for which he could face up to ten years in prison, was shown to be running a Ponzi scheme under the guise of a successful betting group.

Vlahos, 54, ran The Edge punting club between 2008 and 2013 with investors believing they were making "spectacular" returns when in fact their money was being used on business class flights, credit cards, private schooling, luxury accommodation and cars, the court was told.

During this time Vlahos also purchased a \$5 million Redoute's Choice (Danehill) half-brother to Black Caviar (Bel Esprit), who later died of a spider bite, for the BC3 Thoroughbreds syndicate, which he reportedly propped up with \$16 million in illicit funds.

"It's a Ponzi scheme," prosecutor Deborah Mandie said. "Money goes in, money goes out, which perpetuates the scheme."

The bets Vlahos told club members he was making he either did not place or did not resemble the figures he claimed to be putting on. He faked betting tickets, results slips and bank documents in an attempt to perpetuate the fraud.

An international betting expert named Daniel Maxwell, or "Max", was also invented by

Vlahos and brought into The Edge fold to keep funds rolling in and to prevent withdrawals.

The scam collapsed in 2013 with Vlahos initially facing 347 charges totalling more than \$120 million in fraudulently obtained funds before agreeing a plea deal.

Defence lawyer Justin Wheelahan said Vlahos's plea of guilty should be a key factor in determining an appropriate sentence. Vlahos remains in custody ahead of another hearing on February 14.

She made her move from the 600 metres and was poised to challenge at the top of the straight before chiming in at the 200 metres and then slipping clear and was in control at the post, winning by a length and quarter. A super run from Vee Cece who was a clear last at the 800 metres, accelerated heading into the straight but ran into traffic. Seeing daylight at the 150 metres, she thrust between runners and

finished strongly for second. **Vichy** ran up from midfield at the 600 metres, tracking the winner upon straightening and kept up a solid run for third. **Za Za Gabor** was handy enough at the top of the straight and battled home best of the rest for fourth.
