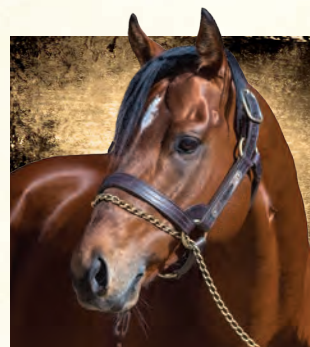

<< *Continued from page 1* The tremendous rise of I Am Invincible, from \$11,000 in his first four seasons to a high of \$247,500 last year, looks set to continue, even with a reduced fee in 2020 due to the economic turmoil caused by the coronavirus pandemic.

His son and Yarraman companion **Hellbent** has also been reduced slightly, coming down to \$22,000 from \$27,500 for what will be his third season at stud.

"It was a difficult decision, but we're all aware that we could be going into difficult times," Yarraman Park Stud's Arthur Mitchell told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday. "We thought that it was the right thing to do, to bring them back, and to leave a bit more meat on the bone for breeders so to speak.

"We've been lucky that Australia is continuing to race when most countries aren't and so there is still racing interest. I don't think any of us know just how much this virus is going to play out on the economy and on people. We're all assuming it's going to be somewhat tough in a lot of areas.

"It's pretty serious stuff, it's going to hurt in many ways and I think it might be quite tough for the breeding industry for a few years. As a result, we have reduced both of our stallions, I Am Invincible and Hellbent, to a degree which we think is very fair in the marketplace."

The last four years, I Am Invincible has covered more than 200 mares

a season with his 2019 matings representing a who's who of the Australian racing industry.

Mares believed to be in foal to I Am Invincible currently include two of the greatest Australian race fillies of all time, Winx (Street Cry) and Black Caviar (Bel Esprit), as well as Winx's dam Vegas Showgirl (Al Akbar) and Black Caviar's daughters Oscietra (Exceed And Excel) and Out Of Caviar (Snitzel).

Add in the likes of Group 1 winners English (Encosta De Lago), Guelph (Exceed And Excel), Lucia Valentina (Savabeel), Mossfun (Mossman), Princess Coup (Encosta De Lago), Royal Descent (Redoute's Choice), Samantha Miss (Redoute's Choice), Shamal Wind (Dubawi), Shoals (Fastnet Rock) and Snitzlerland (Snitzel), as well as proven producers Ballet D'Amour (Stravinsky), Essouaira (Exceed And Excel), Extremely (Hussonet), Lipari (Redoute's Choice), Listen Here (Elusive Quality), Pinocchio (Encosta De Lago), Pontiana (Redoute's Choice), Stylish Bel (Bel Esprit) and The Broken Shore (Hussonet), and I Am Invincible's dominance - both on the racetrack and in the breeding barn - looks set to continue for many years yet.

“The last two years, he has definitely covered some outstanding mares,” Mitchell said. “He’s covered some of the elite mares in Australia and he’s had a phenomenal time on the track.

“The last two years, he’s had 40-odd stakes winners, he’s had six sons and one grandson retire to stud in the last three years. He’s been dominant in the sales ring and he throws such good-looking horses and obviously they can run, they perform week in and week out. He really can’t be doing any better.

“Some stallions have gone up, some have come down, it’s an individual decision but he’s come down to make it a bit more attractive for breeders. He’s already got a lot of bookings and we think at the \$190,000 (plus GST) he offers very good value.”

The reduction to I Am Invincible’s fee comes on the back of a year in which he was crowned the champion sire of two-year-olds by winners in 2018/19. The 2018/19 season also saw him produce 28 stakes winners, topping the previous record of 26 held by both Danehill (Danzig) and Snitzel (Redoute’s Choice).

This year, 102 I Am Invincible yearlings went through the sales ring, all conceived during the 2017 season when the stallion stood for \$110,000. Selling at an average of \$460,281, the average return to breeders was more than four times his service fee.

Mitchell said that the days of I Am Invincible serving 200-plus mares are likely to be over, with the rising 16-year-old set for a smaller book in 2020.

“He’s getting a bit older so we are going to give him a reduced book,” he

said. “We are going to trim him up a bit, we want to be in a position to look after him as he reaches what very well could be the prime of his career.”

Joining his sire once again on the Yarraman Park roster is Hellbent. The 2018 William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner will serve his third book of mares this year, having covered 182 mares in 2018 and 156 mares in 2019.

“His books are full of quality and they are a lot better than I Am Invincible’s books were at the same stage,” Mitchell said. “He’s not far off full already, he’s filling up already and he’ll be full in the next few weeks. However, we feel that the reduction to \$20,000 (plus GST) is the right thing to do in this marketplace.

"We're very happy with his foals, they are so like his father's foals. It's quite amazing. We believe he's a great chance and he will again cover a good book."

Mitchell is grateful for the support of the breeding industry and hopes to be able to return that support through what is likely to be a testing period.

"I'd like to thank all the breeders who have supported both our stallions," Mitchell said. "Certainly I Am Invincible has more than paid his way and people have had a huge amount of success, both on the racecourse and in the sale ring where he is the dominant stallion. I'm sure that the people that have supported Hellbent will be equally well-rewarded."

Yarraman Park sends four to Chairman's Sale

Yarraman Park will also be represented by four mares in tomorrow's virtual Inglis Chairman's Sale: recently-retired dual Group 1 winner **In Her Time** (Time Thief), stakes winners **Longport** (Casino Prince) and **Lubiton** (Snitzel) and stakes-placed **Calming Influence** (Commands). Both Lubiton and Calming Influence are offered in foal to I Am Invincible.

While In Her Time may be the consignment's highest-profile member, the other three are notable additions in their own right.

"They are a classy group," Mitchell said yesterday. "Lubiton will only be having her second foal. Her first foal is a very nice Hellbent. She's a nice running, good sort of Snitzel mare. She's got to be attractive to most commercial studs, or anyone who wants to buy a nice, young mare really."

"Calming Influence is being sold to dissolve a partnership, for legitimate reasons. She's got a nice yearling (by I Am Invincible) with Toby Edmonds up in Queensland, she's got a weanling filly and she's being sold back in foal to him. She's pretty much got her bases loaded; if things went the right way, she'd become very valuable, very quickly."

"Longport produces exceptional foals. She had a lot of ability on the track - defeating Group 1 winners such as Norzita and Dear Demi. Longport would be a great investment for any breeder - her foals are very consistent, they sell well and are in some of Australia's leading stables."

The Inglis Chairman's Sale will take the form of a virtual sale and will begin at 3pm local time tomorrow afternoon.

Sun Stud drops fees across the board

<< *Continued from page 1* Sun Stud last night revealed its nine-stallion roster for 2020, with the Queensland-bound Love Conquers All (Mossman) the only withdrawal from the Victorian farm’s 2019 line-up. Each one of the nine stallions has had a fee decrease, ranging from modest to marked.

“I think most farms have gone through the market over the last couple of weeks and I do think it is probably the hardest year in terms of pricing stallions,” Sun Stud’s sales and nominations manager Phil Marshall told ANZ Bloodstock News. “We’ve come to the conclusion that, as far as the economy is concerned, we need to cut the service fees across the board.

“I personally see this as a positive; we need to support the breeders as much as we can. At the end of the day, the breeders make the industry. If it wasn’t for them, we wouldn’t have one. We want to try and give a little bit back to them, as much as we can.”

Fiorente is the headline act, with stakes-winning brothers Power Scheme and Hawkshot - who now races in Hong Kong as Beauty Legacy - both performing strongly in black-type company. However, Marshall points out that, while Fiorente is generally remembered as a stayer, he was a horse with speed himself and he has proven the ability to impart that onto his stock.

“Fiorente is doing a wonderful job and he’s done a terrific job at stud from the get-go,” Marshall said. “The price decrease is just to make him better value and more customer-friendly. It’s not a reflection of the horse, it’s more a factor of the economy, and that’s the same with all of our service fees this year. It’s not really an indication of how they are going, it’s an indication of how tricky the economy is at the moment and how we want to support breeders.

"Fiorente has produced a number of talented horses and not just staying horses either. He had Hawkshot who proved to be a top-notch miler, he's a horse that has got a lot of speed - David Hayes joked one day that he'd be able to win over 1000 metres, which would be some achievement if that ever happened. A horse like Power Scheme too, [Hawkshot's] brother, he's got another Group placing this year in the Carbine Club Stakes and he looks to be more of a miler.

"A lot of people will remember Fiorente for that Melbourne Cup win, it's the race that stops the nation and the one race that people generally remember of a horse's career. When you look back through it, though, he was very unlucky in a Cox Plate, he was a superb winner over a mile in the Feehan at Moonee Valley and a lot of people forget that he ran third in an All Aged at Randwick over 1400 metres. So he wasn't devoid of speed himself.

"That's why we sell him as the 'fast stayer' because he's one of the few horses we've seen in Australia over the last 10 years that have a genuine turn-of-foot. I think that's key. You don't become an elite horse over any distance unless you've got a turn-of-foot and he certainly possessed that."

Magnus (Flying Spur), Sun Stud's "Mr Consistent", has had the smallest decrease in stud fee, down only 6.6 per cent to \$15,400. That comes after a year in which the rising 18-year-old produced his fourth Group 1 winner, Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) conqueror Streets Of Avalon, as well as Flemington stakes winners Kemalpas and Halvorsen.

"Mr Consistent is exactly how we describe him," Marshall said. "He's

a horse that doesn't really deserve a drop in fee. We've simply dropped him a little bit because of the economy. He's such a good horse. He's been thereabouts so many years, he's consistently a top-20 stallion. He had another Group 1 winner this year with Streets Of Avalon.

"He ticks all the boxes for breeders. They sell well, they sold up to \$160,000 this year, so ten times the service fee. He produces a great type and we know that they run, they make great sprinter-milers. He's unbelievable value for me for people of all aspects. As a breed-to-race horse, he's perfect; as a breed-to-sell horse, he's exceptional value. *Continued on page 13>>*

“He’s great for people that are just entering the breeding scene, we see a lot of young breeders use him as he’s quite a safe bet. And a lot of the experienced breeders from around the country support him year on year because they just know what they are going to get.

“In a market that is uncertain at the best of times, given that you don’t know what you’re going to get at the end of the day, but certainly more so this year, breeding to a horse like Magnus makes a lot of sense; he’s a very safe option and a very good value option. Certainly in Victoria, I don’t think there’s any better value out there than him.”

Dual Group 1 winner **Palentino** (Teofilo) had his first yearlings go through the sales ring this year at an average of almost \$65,000.

“Just like with Fiorente, Palentino was another one who on the racetrack showed a breathtaking turn-of-foot to win those two Group 1s down at Flemington,” Marshall continued.

“He was just an elite miler, which is great to see in a racehorse. He’s gone through the process extremely well - he got to the races, he’s won two Group 1s, he’s come to stud, he’s covered an exceptionally high number of mares in his first three seasons and to top it off, he produces an excellent type.

“We’re delighted to see that a lot of those yearlings have gone into the right stables. It’s very exciting to see what his two-year-olds do. I’m not sure he’s the horse to get a really precocious type, I think they are going to be more summer or autumn two-year-olds, but I’m happy to be proven wrong.

“He’s ticked all the boxes so far; he’s produced great types, they’ve sold well, the market really likes them, they’ve gone into top metropolitan stables. Everything has gone well so far and if he does surprise us with a couple of early two-year-olds, then he is going to be an extremely popular stallion this year.”

The horse that clearly excites the Sun Stud team the most is **National Defense** (Invincible Spirit), winner of the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere (Gr 1, 1600m) on the Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) undercard in 2016. He returns for his second season in Victoria, having first made the trip last year after missing the 2018 season at late notice due to injury.

"The support that National Defense received last year blew us away," Marshall said. "We didn't expect it. We knew he was going to be popular, but at one stage he had 180 mares booked to him. He ended up covering in the high-150s and, to be honest, we weren't 100 per cent expecting it."

"The year before, we got dealt a huge blow when he was injured towards the latter part of the season in Ireland and we were told that he wasn't going to be able to travel. It took the wind out of our sails a little bit. We sometimes know that it is hard for a horse that you've pumped up to come one year, then doesn't, it can be hard sometimes the following year. It certainly didn't work that way with National Defense, though."

"Of our horses here at Sun Stud, he's probably been the most popular horse I've seen in terms of talk around the traps at the sales. He's just supremely popular with all types of breeders so we're very confident that he's going to cover another book again. We're only in early May but already the signs are that he's going to probably be the most popular horse again this season."

"And really, what's not to like about him? He's the highest-rated two-year-old son of Invincible Spirit to ever stand in Victoria, a Group 1-winning two-year-old, he's a lovely type. That Invincible Spirit line does look the most likely one to really come to the forefront in Australia over the next few years. He's exceptional value in his second season and I'm very excited to see his first crop of foals hit the ground come July or August. We really think he could be the real deal."

Fighting Sun (Northern Meteor), **Thronum** (Snitzel) and veteran **Bel Esprit** (Royal Academy) will all stand for \$7,700, while **Ready For Victory** (More Than Ready) and **Squamosa** (Not A Single Doubt), sire

of yesterday's Wangoom Handicap (Listed, 1200m) winner Order Of Command, complete the roster at \$4,400.

"Once again, Squamosa reminded us of the value he offers to all breeders with Order Of Command winning the Wangoom," Marshall said. "He's living proof of what Squamosa is capable of producing, which is a tough sprinting type. Order Of Command is so tough, as he was winning the Wangoom, and he set a weight-carrying record with his 62 kilograms, which is quite remarkable in a race that dates back to 1886. He's now won over \$600,000, too."

"Ready For Victory has only had a handful of runners and he had a very good debutant who won recently, Macleay up there in the Gerald Ryan stable. He looks like he can go on to bigger and better things, Gerald has always had a big opinion of him and he is entered for the J J Atkins so he is one to watch."

Two for No Nay Never

Former Coolmore Stud shuttler No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) sired his second southern hemisphere winner yesterday, and first in Australia, when Cordyceps Miracle (2 c ex Zagalia by Zabeel) took out a maiden over 1300 metres at Canberra. Trained by Richard Litt, the colt defeated Our Cheeky Monkey (Nicconi) by half a length with Mossy Oak (Moshe) a further three and a half lengths back in third. Cordyceps Miracle was a \$350,000 purchase from the Coolmore Stud draft at the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. He is out of Group 1 winner Zagalia (Zabeel), making him a half-brother to Group 3 scorer Dawnie Perfect (Big Brown). No Nay Never shuttled to Jerrys Plains from 2016 to 2019 and stood for a fee of \$44,000 (inc GST) last year. He now permanently resides at Coolmore Ireland, standing for €175,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

Three for Bull Point

Kingstar Stud resident Bull Point (Fastnet Rock) sired his third first-crop winner yesterday when the Michael Hickmott-trained Fearless Vision (2 f ex Risky Blonde by Zizou) broke through at her third start to win a 900-metre maiden at Murray Bridge. The two-year-old filly defeated She's Krupt (Krupt) by a long neck with Lady Of Status (Hussonet) a further neck back in third. Fearless Vision is the only named foal out of the four-time winning mare Risky Blonde (Zizou) who herself is out of a half-sister to Group 3 winner and three-time Group 1 placegetter, Shamee Rose (Nadeem). Bull Point covered 109 mares at a fee of \$7,700 (inc GST) in 2019.

First for Carlton House

Carlton House (Street Cry), runner-up in the 2014 Ranvet Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m), sired his first

stakes winner yesterday when Too Close The Sun (4 g ex Old Money by Old Spice) took out the Warrnambool Cup (Listed, 2350m). Trained by Lindsey Smith, the four-year-old defeated Mirimar (Kalanisi) by a length with Sin To Win (Sir Percy) a further length away in third. Too Close The Sun is out of Group 1-winning Perth mare Old Money (Old Spice) making him a half-brother to Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) scorer Trap For Fools (Poet's Voice). Carlton House stood in Australia for two seasons in 2014 and 2015, producing 57 live foals.

Smith wins first Warrnambool Cup

Having just returned from Perth, Lindsay Smith watched Too Close The Sun win the trainer his first Warrnambool Cup while isolated near Port Fairy. Smith set the gelding for yesterday's race after he scored at Moonee Valley over 2040 metres in March. "After his win at The Valley, I thought that he was a lot better than he was getting credit for," Smith said. "This is an up-and-coming horse and even stronger than he was six months ago. If he comes out of today, well then, we might head to the Andrew Ramsden." The Andrew Ramsden (Listed, 2800m) will be run at Flemington on Saturday week and the winner gains a ballot exemption into the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) in November.

O'Brien takes Command in Wangoom

Order Of Command (Squamosa) produced a massive effort at Warrnambool yesterday, winning the Wangoom Handicap (Listed, 1200m) with 62 kilograms on his back and providing Danny O'Brien with his first Warrnambool carnival win. The five-year-old

fought off a strong challenge by Superhard (All Too Hard) in the straight to win by a neck with Inn Keeper (Host) a length away in third. "It's just great to win a feature race at the carnival even though we're not there," O'Brien said. "No one can be, but it takes nothing away from the win. We missed the autumn and had this race in mind and given his rating will go up we'll have to look at maybe Group 2 races for him. He's been there before in the Salinger on Derby Day and he looks like he likes soft ground, too."

Mungrup Stud releases fees

Mungrup Stud in Western Australia yesterday announced that Playing God (Blackfriars), the sire of Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) winner Kay Cee, will stand for a fee of \$16,500 (all fees inclusive of GST) in 2020, an increase of \$5,500 from 2019. The son of Blackfriars (Danehill) will be joined on the roster by first season sire I'm All The Talk (Stratum) and Oratorio (Stravinsky) who will both stand for \$7,700, while A Lot (Tapit) will stand for \$5,500.

Byrne back for Barbie



Jim Byrne has returned from injury in time to partner Outback Barbie (Spirit Of Boom) in the BRC Sprint (Gr 3, 1200m) at Doomben on Saturday. Byrne hasn't ridden since finishing second on Shogun Sun (Written Tycoon) at Eagle Farm on March 23. The jockey broke his left leg below the knee after the finish line at Doomben on December 18. He had a pin inserted in the leg and after intensive rehabilitation was able to return to race riding in March. Following which, Byrne's leg swelled up after riding at Eagle Farm, requiring a second operation. His manager Cameron Partington said Byrne received medical clearance and rode trackwork this week.

Graham hopes Victorem trial form holds

Trainer Jenny Graham is hoping Victorem (I Am Invincible) can show plenty in the BRC Sprint at Doomben on Saturday, his first start back since finishing second in the Kosciuszko Stakes (1200m) at Randwick in October. The gelding ran third in a Doomben trial behind Just Orm (Falvelon) and it has turned out to be a strong guide. Four of the horses who ran in the trial - Just Orm, Silvera (High Chaparral), Totally Charmed (I Am Invincible) and Sir Barnabus (Rothesay) - have won at their next starts. "It has turned out to be a very strong trial and hopefully he can be the next winner to come out of it," Graham said. Victorem is headed to the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) at Eagle Farm on June 6, and the plan is for him to have his final lead up to the Stradbroke in the Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Eagle Farm on May 23.

Edmonds stable fires up winter contenders

Promising juvenile The Drinks Cart (Unencumbered) resumes at the Gold Coast on Friday, heading a two-track assault by Toby and Trent Edmonds. The J J Atkins (Gr 1, 1400m) hopeful resumes in the QTIS 2YO Handicap (900m) and will be joined by Grey Missile (Red Element) who is bound for the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m). The Drinks Cart was set aside for the winter after three runs in the summer, after finishing third in a qualifying race for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) in January. The Drinks Cart, Wisdom Of Water (Headwater) and Loving Miss (Love Conquers All) are the three stable nominations for the J J Atkins. The training partnership's Tyzone (Written Tycoon), who finished runner-up in the Stradbroke last year, is back from Sydney to run in the BRC Sprint as a stepping-stone for another tilt at the Stradbroke.

Greyworm favourite for Takeover Target

The five-year-old gelding Greyworm (Master Of Design) is favourite to gain a successive stakes win in the Takeover Target Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Randwick on Saturday. The Hawkes Racing-trained gelding was a dominant one and one-quarter length winner of the Hall Mark

Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) over the same course and distance last start, defeating the Godolphin-owned pair Trekking (Street Cry) and Kementari (Lonhro). Trekking and Kementari will not be among the opposition on Saturday but their stablemate Deprive (Denman) will attempt to improve on his sixth finishing in the Hall Mark. "He was very good first-up in the Challenge Stakes and his following two runs in competitive events have pleased us," James Cummings said.

Celestial Falls to make Randwick return

Stakes-placed filly Celestial Falls (Hinchinbrook) is set to make her return to racing on the same day her half-sister Greysful Glamour (Stratum) lines up in the Gosford Gold Cup (Listed, 2100m). Both are trained by Mark Newnham and Celestial Falls is on target to run in Saturday's Westpac Rescue Helicopter Service 3 & 4yo Benchmark 78 Handicap (1400m). Like Greysful Glamour a year earlier, Celestial Falls won last spring's VRC Oaks Trial (1800m) but has not raced since October. "She got sick in Melbourne after the Ethereal and I had to spell her," Newnham said. "She spelled down there and then she had a little paddock accident which put her back another six weeks so that's why she didn't race through the autumn in Sydney." The original plan for the filly was the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) but the race will not be run this winter due to the coronavirus pandemic. Instead, Newnham is hoping to get the filly to Brisbane for The Roses (Gr 2, 1800m) at Eagle Farm on June 13.

Elizabeel chasing first win at Randwick

John Sargent is convinced Elizabeel (Power) has a bright future ahead of her and hopes the filly can secure a city win as a juvenile before beginning her three-year-old season. She will have her third start in Saturday's Central Coast Mariners 2YO Handicap (1200m) at Randwick after finishing fifth on debut at Warwick Farm, before having excuses when second to Bellevue Star (Sebring) in a 1200-metre maiden at Canterbury. "She's been knocking on the door in her two runs and she gets in well at the weights with Robbie Dolan to ride her," Sargent said. "I expect a big run from her."

Stanley looks for some Magic at Caulfield

Victorian trainer Brent Stanley has in previous seasons been keen to head north for the Brisbane carnival. However the closure of interstate borders because of Covid-19 has meant those trips require extensive planning. In spite of this, Stanley is not ruling out sending his three-year-old It's Kind Of Magic (So You Think) to Brisbane. First, Stanley wants to see how his filly fares in the Darren Gauci Handicap (1200m) at Caulfield on Saturday. She returns after a spell, last seen when finishing ninth in the Magic Millions 3YO Guineas (RL, 1400m) in January, where the hot weather and delay to the race scuppered her chances. "It was a hot, stinky day and she got herself hot and flustered and when they got in the barriers one broke through," said Stanley. "It went all pear-shaped so it was one of those runs to forget about."

September Run breaks maiden at Canterbury

After being tested in Group company earlier this year, two-year-old filly September Run (Exceed And Excel) has begun her latest campaign with a narrow win at Canterbury that star jockey Hugh Bowman believes had plenty of merit. Returning from a spell in yesterday's Iron Jack Handicap (1200m) for two-year-old fillies, the Chris Waller-trained juvenile was behind a wall of horses before bursting through a gap approaching the 100 metres to win by a nose. "She had herself well worked up before the race and I thought it took its toll on her late in the piece," Bowman told Sky Thoroughbred Central. "She gave a winning burst when the gap came but she was completing her run on the line and it was just her tenacity that got her over it. I think she'll improve from that because she was pretty wound up pre-race. She's in for a good winter campaign."

Sunshine Coast trainer Stuart Kendrick recorded his 900th career victory yesterday, fittingly at his home track of the last seven seasons. "I remember my first winner at Mackay with a horse called Monojet like it was today," Kendrick said. "I was working selling real estate but that win encouraged me to go full-time. But the past two decades have flown by. I have been lucky to have some great owners and some very good horses. To get 900 winners is a thrill but now the thing is to get 1000 as soon as possible." Kendrick reached the milestone with victory for two-year-old colt Superare (Exceed And Excel), who holds an entry for the JJ Atkins on June 6.

Zoutori heading to Goodwood

Mathew Ellerton and Simon Zahra's Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) runner-up Zoutori (Zoustar) will jump out at Flemington tomorrow ahead of a tilt at The Goodwood (Gr 1, 1200m) on Saturday week. "His first-up form is outstanding, and it will take a pretty good horse to beat him (in The Goodwood)," Zahra told Racing.com. "He's won three races when first-up from six starts, including the Group 2 Bobbie Lewis last spring, and most recently his run in the Oakleigh Plate against the pattern to finish second (when first-up) was huge. He has been up at the farm poking around the paddock for three weeks (since the William Reid) then he's been back in work and already had one jumpout at Flemington last Friday. He'll jump out again this Friday and he'll have an easy week next week and travel to South Australia."

Changes to Victorian jumps, highweight races

Racing Victoria has announced amendments to its coronavirus protocols that keeps different riding groups separated. RV has separate groups for jockeys that ride in jumps and highweight races. With the Casterton and Coleraine race clubs unable to appropriately segregate jumps and flat jockeys, RV has decided to make programming changes. The Casterton Cup (2000m) meeting on May 17

will become an all-Flat fixture. The meeting at Casterton on June 27 now becomes a day for jumps riders only with a fourth jumps race added and the three flat races converted to highweight races. Meetings at Casterton and Coleraine on August 9 and 16 respectively will be a mixture of jumps and highweight races. RV's executive general manager of racing Greg Carpenter said the industry biosecurity protocols are as important now as they were six weeks ago.

Kingston Town Classic winner back in work

Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) winner Kay Cee (Playing God) has returned to work with Neville Parnham and will target the Belmont Guineas (Listed, 1600m) on June 20. "A brief winter campaign will keep her ticking over," Parnham said. "It's best to have her active ahead of the Ascot summer carnival."

Queen's blessing to Australian racing industry

The Queen has told Prime Minister Scott Morrison that she is pleased Australian racing is still going amid the coronavirus pandemic. "Was very kind to receive Her Majesty's call this evening to check in and see how we're all getting on in Australia," Morrison wrote on his official Instagram and Facebook pages. "The Queen was very interested to hear about our progress in combating COVID-19 and was so pleased we have managed to prevent the terrible impacts. Her Majesty was also pleased to hear our horse races were still running in Australia and sent her very best wishes to all Australians." The Queen's racehorse Carlton House sired his first Stakes winner through Too Close The Sun in yesterday's Warrnambool Cup.

Vale Shamrock

Dual Group 1 winner Shamrock (O'Reilly), the only filly in the last 30 years to win the ATC Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m), has died in Japan. Shamrock, who also won the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) when trained by Danny O'Brien, was sold to Japan after her racing career. She produced six foals; three have raced for two winners,

including three-year-old Satono Shalom (Lord Kanaloa), who shapes as a Japanese St Leger (Gr 1, 3000m) contender. She died in late October, according to the Japanese Stud Book. "Shattered to hear this news. Never to be forgotten," tweeted part-owner Jeff Dimery.

He's Remarkable (Pentire), the sire of dual Group 1 placegetter Age Of Chivalry, is on offer from Mapperley Stud on online sales house gavelhouse.com as **Lot 125**. "Due to the competitive nature of the stallion market in the Waikato, we feel he would be better suited to carry on his stud duties in a different part of the country, or perhaps even a different country for that matter," Mapperley principal Simms Davison said. "He's Remarkable is a beautiful looking stallion, he's got a wonderful pedigree behind him and he leaves a great type. There is still international demand for his progeny, and with Age Of Chivalry targeting Group 1 races in the spring, he still has plenty to offer as a sire going forward." Well-related colt arrives at Te Akau

David Ellis welcomed an exciting addition to the team this week when a Tavistock (Montjeu) yearling colt out of dual New Zealand Broodmare of the Year Bagalolli (Zabeel) arrived at Te Akau Stud. Ellis purchased the colt privately on behalf of Hong Kong-based Edmund Wong, who now also owns Bagalolli. The Zabeel (Sir Tristram) mare has been in headlines of late being the dam of recent Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Toffee Tongue (Tavistock) and Galleywood Hurdle (3200m) winner Gobstopper (Tavistock). Bagalolli is also the dam of former Hong Kong horse of the year Werther (Tavistock) and Group 1 performer Milseain (Tavistock).

Beauty Generation likely to join Hayes

The Hong Kong racing media reports that David Hayes will likely take over as the trainer of two-time Hong Kong Horse of the Year Beauty Generation (Road To Rock) next season, with the gelding to be campaigned towards winning a record-equalling third Hong Kong Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) in December. Beauty Generation has been trained by John Moore since the horse

arrived in Hong Kong, but with Moore forced to relinquish his licence at the end of the season due to reaching the age of 70, a new trainer will be needed. Hayes, who was a two-time Hong Kong champion trainer before returning to Australia in 2005, will once again be based at Sha Tin as of next month, with the first horses able to join his stable from mid-July.

INTERNATIONAL

More than 1,000 entries for France return

The appetite for a resumption of racing in France was writ large on Tuesday when three comeback meetings scheduled for Monday drew over 1,000 entries in a tidal wave of enthusiasm for resumption. A total of 1,069 horses have been entered for the fixtures at Longchamp, Toulouse and Compiègne, which will be the first to take place since racing shut down in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic in March. Trainer Freddy Head was not

surprised by the staggering entry and said: "We have missed two months of races, so people are eager to run – and to get some money. All the horses are going to be running, which means it is going to be very competitive and the races are going to be very tough."

Police stop Danish meeting after one race

Police in Denmark stormed and shut down a race meeting in Aalborg on Monday as the gathering broke social distancing regulations. The Danish government has enforced an assembly ban whereby no more than ten people can gather and moments after the finish of the first race at Racing Arena Aalborg the local police arrived. The shutdown came as a surprise to racing officials as they had been staging racing behind closed doors for two weeks at the track. The racing authority reportedly wrote to the national police for clarity on Sunday regarding whether they would be able to race the following day, but received no answer.

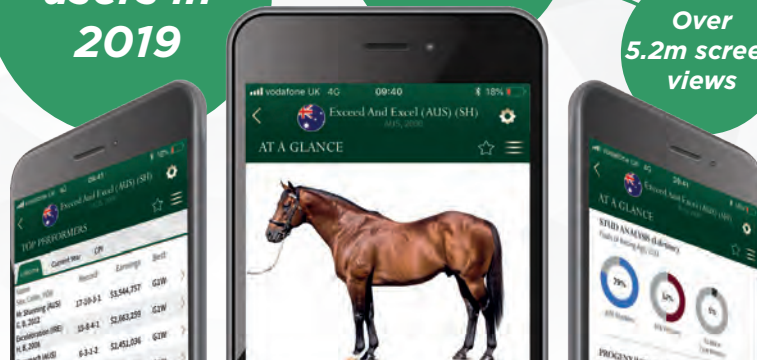

Inglis looks to maintain online momentum with blue-chip Chairman's Sale

Australia's oldest thoroughbred auction house Inglis has shown the rest of the world that online-only sales can be a viable alternative to live events during the coronavirus crisis.

Its prestigious Easter Yearling Sale, held in virtual format with no horses or buyers on site in Sydney last month, recorded a decline in average of just 13 per cent with remarkably only A\$10,000 shaved off the median price.

Since then, the pioneering Inglis Digital platform, which hosted internet auctions of horses long before lockdown restrictions made them an essential tool, has received several positive updates.

The April Online Sale last week achieved a record gross of \$4.14 million for 420 lots sold, and on Saturday Bella Vella (Commands) became Inglis Digital's first Group 1-winning graduate when scoring an all-the-way victory in the TAB Classic (registered as Robert Sangster Stakes) (Gr 1, 1200m) at Morphettville.

Inglis is now doing everything in its power to ensure the momentum behind its virtual sales endures and even strengthens for two further important fixtures in its calendar that have been forced online – tomorrow's Chairman's Sale, offering a boutique selection of elite racemares tailored to appeal to the world's leading breeders, and Sunday's Australian Broodmare Sale.

Sebastian Hutch, general manager of bloodstock sales and marketing at Inglis, admits to some surprise that the Easter Yearling Sale held up so well in the circumstances, despite having confidence in the lots on offer.

"We were confident that the catalogue was of an extremely high standard – both in terms of the physical credentials of the stock and their respective pedigrees – while a huge amount of work, over an extended period of time, had gone into the promotion of the sale," he says.

"But in the circumstances the outcome was

a pleasant surprise. Irrespective of the amount of promotional work we do, or the regularity with which we liaise with buyers, we can never really know how much money is in the market, so to end up with such spirited competition through the sale was a huge relief.

"I would say that the results at the fall of hammer far exceeded the expectations of anyone involved, and the fact that in excess of 20 yearlings have been sold since then to bring the clearance up to near 70 per cent and a gross in excess of A\$72 million has been a further boost to the sale."

Hutch attributes the buoyancy of the online auction to a number of factors.

"It's the best yearling sale in the southern hemisphere and people see an opportunity in the potential to buy quality stock at a discount, so I think that will have been a significant factor," he posits.

"Racing in Australia is a very lucrative product relative to many other parts of the world, with prize-money levels far exceeding those in many other jurisdictions, while the fact that our racing authorities have been in a position to keep racing going in a responsible manner through this crisis undoubtedly helped the sale.

"There was some extraordinary promotional work done by vendors in the lead-up to and during the sale in an effort to give themselves every chance of achieving a positive result and certainly some were very well rewarded.

"Similarly, buyers and their agents approached the sale with a vigour and enthusiasm that gave the sale the necessary platform to be a relative success. That said, we learned a lot from the sale and identified plenty of areas for improvement, which will hopefully prove value in helping us to achieve better results for more people in future."

A blueprint for the rest of the world

The success of the Inglis Online platform sets a benchmark for which the rest of the world can follow, with key northern hemisphere yearling sales due to take place later this year.

If the Inglis sales have proved anything, it's that Europe and the wider bloodstock world might have to embrace online platforms due to Covid-19 restrictions, if not to sell the stock then at least to advertise it to prospective buyers who may not be able to travel.

But there has been plenty of chat about how pre-sale inspections on vendors' farms – ingrained in Australian buying culture – were vital to the strength of Inglis Easter but may not be so easily replicated in Britain and Ireland.

Hutch cut his teeth working in racing and breeding establishments in Europe and so can offer valuable insight on the subject.

"Obviously the tyranny of distance is always going to be a factor, however investors in Australia seem to perceive there to be a multitude of benefits to pre-sale visits to inspect stock in advance of the major yearling sales," he says.

"It allows people to monitor the development of the most valuable of stock over a period of time, while also making assessments in a more relaxed environment than the hustle-bustle of the sales grounds. It also allows buyers to familiarise themselves with the environments in which these horses are being developed, while also establishing relationships with the farms that are developing them.

"Breeders make up a huge percentage of racehorse owners in Australia and I think trainers in particular see the value of visiting owners at their respective farms as an important part of developing new associations and cultivating new owners.

"Theoretically it's plausible to see this working to an extent in Europe in advance of the most elite sales, but there's no disguising the fact that vendors in Australia were fortunate that the crisis struck towards the end of our yearling sales season."

Just as crucial to the relative health of the Easter yearling sale was that Inglis had sown the seeds of success for online bidding with the launch of its digital platform three years ago.

"Our managing director Mark Webster has been a tremendous advocate for innovation in the bloodstock industry for a long time," Hutch explains. "The development during his tenure of online bidding and digital auctions has been of huge significance for Inglis over an extended period of time and familiarity with these services meant there was an unwavering confidence in the ability of Inglis to deliver a viable sale irrespective of the circumstances.

"The co-operation and patience of both vendors and buyers was a hugely important

factor in trying to deliver a positive outcome, but fortunately there was a real conviction among stakeholders to make the sale happen, which was very important."

Chairman's Sale tweaks

So to this week's Chairman's Sale, which was launched in 2017 and has needed a few tweaks to secure its position as the market leader in offering the cream of Australian breeding stock, Hutch admits.

"Like any sale, work is done with vendors and buyers to try and identify an optimum format," he says. "In the first two years of its existence, the Chairman's Sale ran directly after the Easter Yearling Sale.

"It was hugely successful in the first year, but not so in its second year, with an increased catalogue. Last year the decision was made to shift it to the current date, three or so weeks after the Easter Yearling Sale, and it worked very well.

"The market to sell the best fillies and mares in Australasia is hugely competitive, so some changes were made to the terms of the sale, which encouraged participation from people with some quality stock in 2019 and there was renewed focus on the standards of service being offered, particularly in the case of vendors.

"We put added work into research work for the catalogue for the Chairman's Sale as well as other additional promotional work, and the

response to that from sellers and buyers was hugely positive.

"In 2019, three of the four highest-priced pregnant mares sold at auction in Australia, including the two most expensive ones, were sold at the Chairman's Sale, which was a tremendous reward for the work done by our bloodstock team."

International buyers should disregard Australian broodmares at their peril, especially in the year after one, Believe'N'Succeed (Exceed And Excel), produced Anthony Van Dyck (Galileo), and another, the Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f) winner's half-sister Bounding (Lonhro), was responsible for the son of Curlin (Smart Strike) who was the most expensive colt sold at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale at US\$4.1million.

"Australian bloodstock is taking on an ever more prominent position in the context of the industry internationally," says Hutch, who goes on to nominate five entries in this year's Chairman's Sale who might appeal to global investors in particular.

"Samaready (Lot 73) is the highest-rated two-year-old filly in Australia for at least the last ten years and is in foal to Snitzel, carrying a full-sibling to a high-class filly in Exhilarates," he says. "It's incredibly rare for mares of this quality to come on the market. As a daughter of More Than Ready, she is an outcross to most major international sire-lines, which adds to her appeal.

"In Her Time (**Lot 42**) has been a fabulous sprinting mare for a number of seasons mixing it with world-class sprinters with the security of Group 1 races against her own set as a safety blanket. She's a granddaughter of Redoute's Choice and is closely related to Everest winner Yes Yes Yes, so has a very persuasive pedigree and profile.

"Youngstar (**Lot 78**) is a Group 1-winning granddaughter of User Friendly, who was obviously a wonderful filly in Britain for Bill Gredley. Youngstar has a three year-old Group 1-winning half-sister named Funstar, while another three-parts sister by Galileo, Baggy Green, is the dam of recent Group 1 winner Tofane, so it's a very progressive pedigree indeed.

"Go Indy Go (**Lot 85**) was a star two-year-old filly by Bernardini, winning the Group 1 Champagne Stakes beating colts. Daughters of Bernardini look to be making a big impression as broodmares around the world and this mare is from a quality pedigree that has the potential to make a positive impression anywhere in the world.

"Booker (**Lot 31**) won the Group 1 Oakleigh Plate over five and a half furlongs, just like Starspangledbanner, and beat Australia's current sprinting sensation Nature Strip in the process. She's a beautiful mare and in many respects has a lot in common with a mare like Bounding."

The Chairman's Sale catalogue also features mares in foal to blue-chip northern hemisphere-based stallions such as Lope De Vega (Shamardal), Frankel (Galileo), Kingman (Invincible Spirit) and Medaglia D'Oro (El Prado), which should leap off the page to the top broodmare owners.

online as their Australian counterparts – would be reluctant to spend big money on mares, sight unseen, with the click of a mouse.

"Far from it," says Hutch. "There was a genuine appetite from international participants to engage with the online platform during the Easter Yearling Sale, with Marie Yoshida, Northern Farm and the Badgers Bloodstock team among those to embrace the technology and take part.

"A number of the major international parties who are invested in breeding in Australia have an affiliate or a partner here, which mitigates their need to engage directly; but, that said, there are still plenty of internationals looking closely at the opportunities that might be presented by the sale.

"We ran a test auction in advance of the Easter Sale, which debunked the concerns of many, to the point where the online nature of the sale has not been raised as a concern by any buyers so far in advance of the Chairman's Sale."

Prospective purchasers need to register to bid – "a very easy process," says Hutch – on

the Inglis website by following a few steps and applying for credit.

Looking further along the Inglis sales calendar, Hutch is unable to rule out further fixtures having to be held online with so much uncertainty surrounding the nature of the coronavirus and restrictions to everyday life that need to be made to deal with its spread and any second wave.

"The feeling is that the challenges presented by the pandemic will be prolonged and difficult," he says. "In the short term, we have a series of weanling, yearling and breeding stock sales scheduled for July. We're hopeful that we're in the position to host these as traditional auctions with horses and buyers on site, but under the circumstances, it's hard to be certain.

"There are sure to be plenty of other challenges to face as a by-product of the pandemic going into 2021, but we have a strong team of people who are determined to help our stakeholders achieve positive outcomes and irrespective of conditions. That will remain the focus going forward."

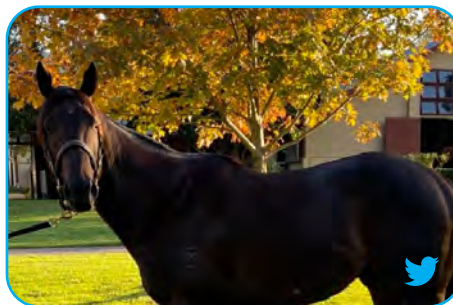

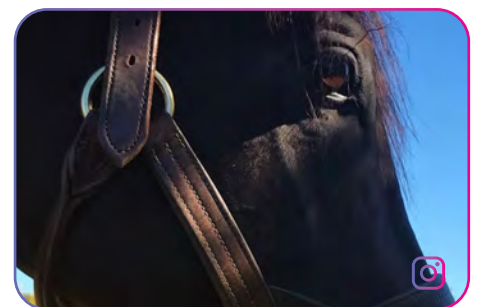
