Like father, like daughter: Melody Belle aims to emulate Commands

*Champion New Zealand mare set for her return in the Missile Stakes today,
a race won by her sire as a juvenile more than two decades ago*

On a chilly winter's day at Rosehill in 1999, the final day of the 1998-99 Australian racing season, two-year-old Commands (Danehill) returned for his fourth start in the Missile Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m), the traditional starting point of Sydney spring racing.

The John Hawkes-trained Commands, sporting the famous cerise silks of the Ingham brothers that were so prolific in Sydney during that period, was among the favourites in the ten-horse line-up. At the head of the market was another two-year-old, Breeders' Plate (Listed, 1000m) winner High Rolling (Snippets), while Group 1 winner Masked Party (Marsday) also had his supporters. *Continued on page 2>>*

The regally bred Commands, a brother to five-time Group 1 winner Danewin, was by champion sire Danehill (Danzig) out of the unraced Cotehele House (My Swanee), a daughter of the great matriarch Eight Carat (Pieces Of Eight), making her a half-sister to Octagonal (Zabeel). To this day, it remains as attractive a pedigree as there is.

Ridden by Larry Cassidy, Commands settled midfield as the June Stakes (Listed, 1100m) winner Hot As Hell (County) set decent fractions in front. Upon straightening, he loomed up to win but he was joined and headed by the John Size-trained Padstow (Francis Bacon), with the wayward Padstow going on to win by a narrow margin.

However, a protest was lodged and was quickly upheld, meaning that Commands is in the history books as the 1999 winner of the Missile Stakes.

It remains the last victory by a two-year-old at weight-for-age against the older horses in stakes company. A number have tried since, most recently Away Game (Snitzel) in the Robert Sangster Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), but none have been successful.

Twenty-one years later, Commands' daughter Melody Belle will aim to follow in her father's footsteps by taking out today's Missile Stakes, for which she was the \$3.60 favourite with the TAB last night. Now a Group 2 over 1200 metres, it still remains Sydney's first step towards spring riches.

Melody Belle would not be the first horse sired by Commands to take the early season feature - Rain Affair was a two-time winner of the event in 2011 and 2013.

And for Melody Belle, it would not be the most prestigious win of her career, far from it - with ten Group 1 wins, a couple of Group 2 victories and a Karaka Million (RL, 1200m) to her name, it may struggle to crack the top 15.

However, it would be a most poignant throwback to her late sire, who died in July, 2014 of a heart attack. Melody Belle is from his last crop.

"Commands is a horse that is very dear to everyone, to everyone that has worked for Darley since that period when we became involved in 2008," Darley's long-term head of sales Alastair Pulford told ANZ Bloodstock News. "For him to get an absolute stand out like Melody Belle is a very fitting tribute to him because he was a great servant to the stud."

"Commands had to make his own success. He's one of a current group that includes I Am Invincible, Not A Single Doubt and Written Tycoon that had to make it their own way, and he ended up being a very high class stallion."

Pulford joined Darley in 2003 and was part of the team that was involved in one of the biggest shifts in the breeding industry in recent years, when they bought out all of the Ingham bloodstock assets, including Woodlands Stud. He reveals that it was Commands who was the main drawcard for Sheikh Mohammed's operation to acquire the historic property.

"Actually he was the main reason behind the purchase of Woodlands," Pulford recalled. "He started to show some promise as a stallion and through various conversations he was identified as a horse that could be very good for us to own. One thing led to another and it became apparent that the whole stud might be a good asset for Sheikh Mohammed, but Commands was the whole catalyst behind the Woodlands purchase."

"The fortunate unknown quantity at that stage was Lonhro who hadn't had any runners at that stage with his first crop being early two-year-olds."

"Commands and then Lonhro acted as the catalyst for Darley to become what it is in Australia today. It was all around the stallions at the time, and then acquiring those wonderful bloodlines and training facilities as well was wonderful. Essentially, though, Commands was the start of the conversation."

Melody Belle is one of two Group 1 winners from Commands' final crop, with the other being this year's Robert Sangster Stakes winner Bella Vella.

"Initially he was thought of as being a sire of colts only, being a better sire of them than the fillies, but as his career progressed and he probably had some better quality mares, that trend turned around, as it so often does," Pulford said.

"In his last crop, of which Melody Belle is one, there's also the Sangster Stakes winner Bella Vella, so two Group 1-winning fillies from his last crop. And Melody Belle is probably, certainly in terms of achievement, his best runner. It's a real shame that he died when he did - he had a heart attack early - as even though he was going into his 18th year, there were probably a couple of good years left in him."

"He was a very fertile stallion. He covered large books, they were sound, durable and had great temperaments. I think that was certainly one of the great things about him as a stallion. For our own matings at Godolphin we used him all the time when there was a temperament issue with a mare. Commands was the number one choice."

Trainer Jamie Richards said earlier this week that his main aim with Melody Belle will be the 100th Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) at Moonee Valley.

It was a race that Commands also contested mere weeks after his Missile Stakes victory, except things did not go to plan; he ran off the track approaching the 800 metres and, despite the urgings of Corey Brown, his race was done and dusted.

Instead, Richards will be hoping that he can emulate the winner of that year's Cox Plate - and the last New Zealand mare to take victory in Australasia's weight-for-age championship - Sunline (Desert Sun). However, with Victoria under stage four restrictions due to Covid-19, the prodigious trainer is waiting to see where the spring will take his stable star.

"We'd like to try to end up in the Cox Plate but we've just got to work out how we can get to Melbourne with staff and all of that," Richards said. "The plan is to have those first couple of runs and maybe one more, then work out what we do."

After today, Melody Belle will head next to the Winx Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) before her spring path is determined further, with the George Main Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) another likely stepping stone before she reaches her major targets.

One of her hallmarks is her versatility, striking success in stakes races from 1200 metres to 2040 metres. That is a noteworthy trend among Commands' progeny, with his 13 Group 1 winners ranging from Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) winner Undue to Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) conqueror Purple.

"It's one of the great things about him and his sire line - it is often so versatile and is not one-dimensional," Pulford said.

"He was a very good horse and the Missile Stakes was certainly his biggest win, but he did run third in the Caulfield Guineas behind Redoute's Choice and Testa Rossa.

"He was one of an elite crop and so his feats on the racecourse were probably less respected than what he deserved as it wasn't until later that we realised just how good that crop was.

"In a different year he might well have been the stand-out colt of his year and with all the benefits of the quality mares that a Group 1 winner gets when they do go to stud, but we are seeing just what he can produce with

Melody Belle and it would be very satisfying to see her win the Cox Plate."

Ironically, it may be Sheikh Mohammed's trio who are best-placed to upset Melody Belle in today's Missile Stakes. Flit (Medaglia d'Oro) and Savatiano (Street Cry) are close up in betting behind the champion Kiwi mare, while Cascadian (New Approach) will also return in the feature.

Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Flit tackles open-age company for just the second time, having finished second-last when stepping out in the All-Star Mile (1600m) at Caulfield in March. However, that day, she refused to settle under Damian Lane, opening up a big lead before weakening significantly.

"There will be a fair amount of attention on her to see how she graduates from a Group 1-winning three-year-old to an open company performer," trainer James Cummings said. "She's always had the look of a filly who will grow into a well-furnished older mare.

"She's shown more boldness in her training this time in and she is more-than-capable of racing well fresh as she showed with a fleet-footed performance to win the Light Fingers Stakes first-up back in February."

While the boys in blue will be attempting to bring down Commands' daughter today, they are likely to benefit from the Commands sire line in the future with his sons Epaulette and Holler both on the Darley roster. Epaulette, who has had three crops to race, will stand for \$22,000 (inc GST) this season at Kelvinside, while Holler, whose first crop have just turned two, is available at Northwood Park for \$7,700 (inc GST).

"I think Epaulette and also Holler, who is yet to have runners, are really good chances," Pulford continued. "They were both high class racehorses - speed horses - who can be expected to throw horses, particularly Epaulette, that can run over a bit further, very much like Commands does.

"My guess is that Epaulette will end up in a very similar place to his father and the hope is that Holler can do the same."

Lucas Cranach to Leneva Park

Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) third Lucas Cranach (Mamool) will move up the road this spring when he shifts from Bullarook Park Stud to Leneva Park in Longwood. Lucas Cranach, who won the Hansa-Preis (Gr 2, 2400m) at Hamburg and the Peter Young Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) at Caulfield, has stood seven seasons at Bullarook Park Stud, all at a fee of \$5,500 (inc GST). Among his best performers so far are Brisbane open-class performers Get Stuck In and Advance Warning, as well as Melbourne metropolitan winner Lucabelle. He will stand for \$5,500 at Leneva Park, the operation of Luke Vandersluys.

First foal for Prized Icon

Koorinal Stud's Prized Icon (More Than Ready) welcomed his first foal on Thursday when Cosmic View (Mossman) produced a chestnut filly. The Gooree-bred Prized Icon won the Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) as a two-year-old before adding the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) at three. Prized Icon served 115

mares last year at a fee of \$11,000 (inc GST) and will again stand for that fee this year at the Riverina farm.

Eduardo ready for stiffest test for Pride

Eduardo (Host) will have the advantage of race fitness on his side when he attempts to deliver his trainer Joe Pride a third win in today's Missile Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Rosehill. The former Victorian made an immediate impact on debut for the stable to win the July Sprint, his first victory since taking out a Group 2 race in Melbourne in 2018. Today's feature will be a serious test for Eduardo and one that will tell Pride how high to aim with the seven-year-old this spring. "It's a real crossroads race for him because if he went really well, it takes him to another level," said the trainer, who won the Missile with Rain Affair (Commands) in 2011 and again two years later. "There are plenty of things we will learn that will be used to make a plan going forward." Of the 13 Missile runners, nine are resuming and Pride suspects that could play into Eduardo's hands. "It's very much to his advantage to be taking them on now, at least until we get a line through the horse and find out how good he is," Pride continued. "It's nice to be taking them on now when I'm assuming they're a little bit vulnerable."

Victoria's highest priced yearling returns to Melbourne

Octane (I Am Invincible), the highest priced yearling sold in Victoria when he made \$1.4 million at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Sale in 2017, returns to the southern state for the first time in 17 months when he runs in today's Farewell To Rod Gaylard (1000m) at

Flemington. In six starts for Ciaran Maher and David Eustace the best the now five-year-old could do was win a maiden at Wangaratta, but a switch to Phillip Stokes has seen him rejuvenated, winning five of his six starts since his move to Adelaide. "I took all the gear off him and basically started all over again with him. He's been great with his attitude," Stokes said. Having kicked him off in the lowest grade his trainer could find, Octane strung together three wins before he was spelled. He gave away too big a start when resuming with a fourth at Morphettville before bouncing back to win his past two runs. "It's a defining race for him (at Flemington). We can find out whether he's up to a better class of race," Stokes added.

Murray Bridge a stepping stone for Zerene

Connections of Just Zerene (Zoustar) are anticipating a big run from the mare when she has her second start this preparation in the opener at Murray Bridge this afternoon. The four-year-old will contest the Adelaide Galvanising Handicap (1200m) having finished third in the Lightning Stakes (Listed, 1050m) on her return to action last month. "We've always known how much talent she has, we're glad she's got some black type now, but we think she can win some of those black-type races," co-trainer Calvin McEvoy told Racing.com. "She was a touch underdone first-up and we knew that she could be vulnerable late, which was the case. She's derived plenty of benefit from that run in the Lightning and she's going really well. The 1200 metres will really suit her, we've taken the edge off her with that first-up run and let's hope we see another strong performance from her on Saturday."

Loca makes a winning start

Loca (Zoustar), a \$900,000 buy for Spendthrift Australia at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, got off the mark at the first time of asking when taking out an 1100-metre maiden at Ballarat yesterday. The Team Hawkes-trained colt beat Tesorina (Brazen Beau) by a nose with Sweet Sixteen (Sebring) another half a length away in third. "I don't really think it was his forte on the artificial," co-trainer Wayne Hawkes told Racing.com. "His head was up a bit, his ears were back a bit, probably resented it a bit coming around to the corner. He got the job done and Dwayne (Dunn, jockey) nursed him there. He only won by a small margin, but you only have to win." Loca is the third foal out of the American Listed-winning mare Shakeira (Freud).

Right Chord returns to Exceed And Excel

Pierro's sister Right Chord (Lonhro), purchased by James Harron last week at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale for \$1.05 million, will return to Exceed And Excel (Danehill) once she gives birth to her first foal by the leading sire later this spring. "She will return to Exceed and Excel, I couldn't think of a better mating for her," Harron said in response to a comment on Twitter. Right Chord was unraced and became the first million-dollar sale by Godolphin at public auction in Australia. Exceed And Excel will stand for \$132,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

Gytrash to chase the Everest dream

Gytrash (Lope de Vega) is set to head to Sydney later this month as his trainer Gordon Richards looks to bag a spot in the world's richest turf race, The Everest (1200m), with the Group 1-winning sprinter. "He will have a gallop between races at Morphettville on Spring Stakes Day, August 15 and then at some stage in the ensuing days after that he floats off to Sydney," Richards told Racing.com. "He is heading to Clare Cunningham at Warwick Farm and her partner Jason Collett is booked to ride him when he kicks off up there in the Concorde Stakes at Randwick on September 5. I'm really happy to have Clare and Jason locked in to look after the horse and I know he is going to be in good hands both on and off the track."

Oceanex to kick off in Makybe Diva

Oceanex (Ocean Park), already guaranteed a berth in the Melbourne Cup courtesy of her hard fought victory in the Andrew Ramsden Stakes (Listed, 2800m), looks set to jump up in grade with next month's Makybe Diva Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) pencilled in as her next port of call. The Flemington contest on September 12 has been identified as her most suitable starting point due to the lack of trails being staged due to Covid-19 regulations. "The difficulty with that mare I think is I don't have any official trials," co-trainer Mick Price told Racing.com. "Usually, I would use a 1200-metre trial or a 1500-metre trial to get her ready for a mile first-up, but I am pretty much sure that we'll just run first-up in the Makybe Diva with her. From there, we've got the Turnbull, Caulfield Cup and Melbourne Cup. It's four runs but if I have to throw one in the middle, maybe a Moonee Valley Cup. She doesn't need a lot of racing. She's a clean-winded mare and you need to maximise each run you have."

Tabcorp and Inglis partnership to continue through 2023

Inglis announced yesterday that it had secured Tabcorp as its official wagering and broadcast partner, through TAB and Sky Racing respectively, for another three years, taking the partnership through to 2023. That will be a 15-year partnership at the end of this agreement. "It's rare for too many corporate partnerships to remain strong for 15 consecutive years and everyone at Inglis is so thrilled that Tabcorp and Sky Racing have committed to our journey for another three years," Inglis managing director

Mark Webster said. "It shows the strength of the relationships that a contract renewal such as this can be done in the middle of such challenging times globally."

Seven and Racing Victoria extend partnership

The Seven Network will remain the free-to-air home of Victorian racing, save for the Melbourne Cup Carnival, with Racing Victoria and Seven announcing a five-year extension to their partnership yesterday. Network Ten had been rumoured to be interested in the Victorian free-to-air rights to go hand-in-hand with their \$100 million Melbourne Cup Carnival deal last year, but the status quo prevailed. The deal ensures that Racing.com will be able to continue on Channel 78 until 2025, while it also means that 21 feature meetings in Victoria will be shown on Seven. The doyen of Australian sports broadcasters Bruce McAvaney said: "Racing's resilience has already been fully tested this year and its ability to connect with the Australian public has been reinforced. The Seven Network's relationship with the sport in Victoria is enduring."

VRC still hoping for Melbourne Cup crowds

Victoria Racing Club chief executive Neil Wilson yesterday revealed details of a number of differing plans which would enable a crowd to be present at Flemington on Melbourne Cup day. Wilson said the club had measures in place for numerous crowd limits, varying from no one on course to up to 30,000 people, but stressed the final figure will be determined by a fall in Covid-19 cases in Victoria. "We've got 127 hectares, lots of space, three grandstands, lots of areas to put people," Wilson told Racing.com. "We can manage those in different Covid requirements, density requirements of 2 metres to 4 metres, caps of 300 to 500 per venue. We have mapped all of that out. We are ready to go. We have also built a model where we can configure temporary infrastructure if we are lucky enough to need it. We can do that right up to quite late because we have taken up some different thinking about infrastructure."

Covid brings halt to sale of WA TAB

The Western Australian government yesterday announced that negotiations about the sale of the WA TAB to Tabcorp will be pushed back to next year. The state's treasurer Ben Wyatt told 6PR that the negotiations, which had already been stop-start over a number of years, would again be on hold until economic conditions were more favourable to both parties. "With the ongoing issues, particularly out of Victoria, we've basically made the decision to disengage at the moment and move forward next year, hopefully when we are on the other side of the disruptions around the coronavirus," Wyatt said. "It's obviously had an impact on Tabcorp and we're going to be in a better position to get a better return for the TAB when there's a bit more certainty around equity markets."

Racing Queensland boosts midweek maidens

Racing Queensland (RQ) announced this week that prize-money for its midweek metropolitan maidens will receive an increase from \$27,500 to \$35,000, as of September 1, to bring them in line with standard midweek metropolitan purses. RQ will also add an extra 50 races to their calendar, adding an extra race to the primary TAB meetings on Thursdays, Fridays and Sundays. "Our stakeholders have stressed to us the importance of raising midweek metropolitan maidens," RQ chief Brendan Parnell said. "With standard midweek prize-money rising to \$35,000 last year, maidens were the major anomaly and we're correcting that now."

QTIS registrations to close

Nominations for 2018 foals to be eligible for the Queensland Thoroughbred Incentive Scheme (QTIS) close on Monday, with the final payment also due on that date. The registrations were extended until August 10 due to the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, but for a 2018 foal to be eligible, they must be nominated by Monday. The QTIS program offers plenty of incentives for owners, including eligibility for the \$500,000 QTIS 2YO Jewel (1200m) in March.

Love the lure for Thompson

Stakes-winning rider Ben Thompson is set to continue his career in Queensland after undertaking a mammoth trip to be alongside his partner, fellow jockey Steph Thornton. After riding a winner at Cranbourne on Wednesday, Thompson arrived at the Gold Coast yesterday, having been granted one permit to travel across New South Wales and another to enter Queensland. "We've been together for two-and-a-half years but between Covid and my Singapore stint last year, I don't think either of us thought we'd get to spend so little time together," Thompson told Racing.com. "It's coming up to five months since we last saw each other and it was still a big unknown when we would be able to again. Life is too short to be unhappy."

NEW ZEALAND

Vale Ron Ladd

One of the unsung promoters of the New Zealand racing and breeding industry, Ron Ladd, QSM, died earlier this week aged 93. Ladd made a huge impression through his services to racing and breeding, an input which resulted in him becoming a Life Member of the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Association (NZTBA) and the Te Aroha Jockey Club. Ladd also served on the NZTBA council and was vice president from 1993 to 1996 as well as two terms as president of the Waikato branch of the NZTBA. He was the instigator of FAMIS, the Fillies and Mares Incentive Scheme, which was the first of its kind in the southern hemisphere, and was also the driving force behind the Te Aroha Jockey Club's placement scheme of sire nominations, from which funds went to the club's flagship event, the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m). He was determined to have the feature fillies and mares event elevated to Group 1 status and was so proud when successful in 2002, the year it was won for the second consecutive year by Saint Cecile (Pompeii Court). Ladd will be farewelled on Monday.

Waikato stallion parades set for 22, 23 August

The 2020 Gavelhouse.com Stallion Parade in the Waikato region is set down for Saturday, August

Day one, which is sponsored by NZB Insurance, will feature Valachi Downs and Mapperley Stud in the morning before Weowna Park's Ocean Emperor (Zabeel) and Grangewilliam's Wyndspelle (Iffraaj) will parade at Seaton Park. Lunch at Waikato Stud will be followed by Rich Hill Stud and Brighthill Farm to close out the first day. Sunday, day two, will feature Highview Stud, Norwegian Park and Windsor Park before lunch at The Oaks Stud. Novara Park and Cambridge Stud will bring a close to the stallion parades, with NZB Airfreight the sponsor of day two.

Matchmaker heads for Sydney after Guineas campaign

Impressive Riccarton debut winner Matchmaker (Makfi) will continue her career in Sydney this spring after breeder-owners Gus and Bianca Wigley reached a deal to sell a half-share in the filly. The Nick Wigley and Kayla Milnes-trained filly triumphed by three and a quarter lengths in two-year-old company at Riccarton last month, with Wigley revealing there had been plenty of interest in the filly after she won a Rangiora trial 11 days earlier. The deal results in her breeders retaining a half-share with new owner Manoj Wanzare and Matchmaker will remain in the Wigley-Milnes stable until after the 1000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) in November, when she will transfer to Sydney trainer Chris Waller. "We were reluctant to sell because we wanted to target the 1000 Guineas. (Bloodstock agent) Andy Williams put a very good offer together on behalf of Manoj Wanzare, a client of Chris Waller," Gus Wigley said. Matchmaker will have her next start at Riccarton next Saturday.

Stakes-performed Sampson to kick off at 11

Evergreen galloper Sampson (Dubai Destination) will kick-off his 11-year-old season at Hawera today and trainer Howie Mathews said his pride and joy is training like a horse half his age. "The way he is and his demeanour, he is like a five-year-old. He does not show his age and the way he works you wouldn't think he is getting on in years," Mathews said. The multiple stakes winner defied his age last term when placing in the Marton Cup (Listed, 2200m) and New Zealand St Leger (Listed, 2600m) and he will be out to try and replicate those feats this season. Sampson will kick-off his campaign in the See You Saturday October 10th (2100m) at Hawera after pleasing his trainer when placing in his two recent trials over 1000 metres and 1200 metres. "They were only over short distances but he trialled really well," Mathews said. "Tony Allan rode him and said he was full of himself and he was really pleased with him. We can't fault him. His track work has been very good. With two trials under his belt we did think of a mile but he really hasn't got great form over a mile."

Return to Pakenham possible for Big Mike

Although he won't be able to compete at Te Rapa himself today, jumps jockey Shaun Phelan is taking solace in lining up stakes winner Big Mike (Don Eduardo) in the SkyCity Hamilton Waikato Cup Day Tickets On Sale Now Mile (1600m). Phelan trains the eight-year-old in partnership with his father Craig and they are hoping for another big season from the gelding. Big Mike won his 1100-metre

trial at Te Rapa last week, beating home Group 1 winner True Enough (Nom Du Jeu), giving his connections a boost of confidence heading into his first-up assignment. "He is pretty forward. He has come back really good and won his trial nicely," Phelan said. "We didn't know exactly where he was at but he just seems to have come back really well this preparation. We would love to go to Victoria and aim for the Pakenham Cup again, but we don't know what is going to happen. He will have to hit some really good form over here to justify going."

Six for Dabirsim

Dabirsim (Hat Trick) sired his sixth individual stakes winner when Velma Valento (5 m ex Bunny Lebowski by Echo Of Light) just edged out favourite Glycon (Le Havre) in a tight finish to the Prix du Pays d'Auge (Listed, 1800m) at Clairefontaine yesterday. The Christophe Ferland-trained five-year-old was winning for the fourth time in 19 starts when scoring by a short neck from the runner-up, who in turn was two lengths in front of the third home, Ridaa (New Approach). Dabirsim stood at Haras de Grandcamp for a fee of €12,000 in 2020.

Top juveniles set for Phoenix showdown

Three of Europe's most exciting juveniles will face off in the Phoenix Stakes (Gr 1, 6f), after Steel Bull (Clodovil), The Lir Jet (Prince Of Lir) and Ventura Tormenta (Acclamation) were declared for tomorrow's race at the Curragh. The Lir Jet and Ventura Tormenta have already clashed this

season, with the latter coming out on top in the Prix Robert Papin (Gr 2, 6f) last month. Prior to that, The Lir Jet had landed the Norfolk Stakes (Gr 2, 5f) at Royal Ascot. Steel Bull, running for the first time for new owner Chantal Regalado-Gonzalez, steps up in grade having captured Molecomb Stakes (Gr 3, 5f) at Goodwood last week. While Aidan O'Brien has been the dominant force in the race with 16 wins overall, he has not tasted success since Sioux Nation (Scat Daddy) scored in 2017. Admiral Nelson (Kingman), Giorgio Vasari (Air Force Blue) and St Mark's Basilica (Siyouni) represent the trainer this time around in the ten-strong field.

Earthlight heads field of 11 in Maurice de Gheest

Earthlight (Shamardal) will have to overcome Golden Horde (Lethal Force) and Space Blues (Dubawi) if he is to extend his unbeaten run to seven in the Prix Maurice de Gheest (Gr 1, 1300m) at Deauville tomorrow. The Andre Fabre-trained three-year-old secured two Group 1 successes as a juvenile, both by a neck, and made a winning start to this season when landing a Listed race at the track last month. Mickael Barzalona will once again partner Earthlight, as he has done in all of his previous starts, and this will be a fifth trip to Deauville for the Godolphin-owned son of Shamardal. One of Earthlight's victories came in the Middle Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) at the expense of the Golden Horde, who bids for revenge under Adam Kirby. Space Blues, winner of the Lennox Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) at Glorious Goodwood last week, bids for a fourth consecutive victory, and was third in this race last season for Charlie Appleby and William Buick.

Cornerstone's Sir Prancealot has chance to build on stateside success

Tonight's Yellow Ribbon Handicap (Gr 2, 8.5f) at Del Mar presents another sizeable opportunity to Sir Prancealot, the Cornerstone stallion who has become something of a hit in the United States.

Having raced in Britain for a one-season campaign with the Richard Hannon stable which concluded by clinching the Flying Childers Stakes (Gr 2, 5f) at Doncaster, he spent his first five seasons at Tally Ho in Ireland and has produced eight individual stakes winners worldwide. One came earlier this week at Naas when juvenile Miss Amulet, from his final Tally Ho crop, beat hot favourite Frenetic (Kodiac) in the Marwell Stakes (Listed, 5f).

Sir Prancealot moved to Cornerstone Stud in South Australia in 2017, before a few of his European exports began a quiet revolution in America.

It started two years ago with a couple of turf mares who spent far more time on the track than he ever did. Beau Recall, who is the defending champion in the Yellow Ribbon, picked up the Royal Heroine Stakes (Gr 2, 8f) at Santa Anita, while British import Madam Dancealot, who took the Dick Poole Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) at Salisbury, broke through in the San Clemente Handicap (Gr 2, 8f).

His progeny make up three of the eight-runner field for the extended mile handicap. Brad Cox reports Beau Recall to be in decent form while she is up against Lady Prancealot, who gave her sire his first top-level score in the American Oaks (Gr 1, 10f) at Santa Anita

in late December. The consistent T o n a h u t u completes the trio for Doug O'Neill.

Further up the Californian coast from Del Mar, any further developments will be greeted eagerly. Sir Prancealot has just finished his first season shuttling at Tom and Nancy Clark's Rancho San Miguel after a deal was made with Checkmate Thoroughbreds and Cornerstone. He is scheduled to return there in 2021.

"I know it's August and a little way from the breeding season but to keep him in the breeders' minds, it would be great to have some luck there," said Rancho San Miguel general manager Dennis Yokum.

"Our breeding season starts in February, like in Europe, and on opening day at Santa Anita last December he had a Grade 1 winner, so that kind of promotion certainly helps you, it gives you something to talk about that first month you're booking mares. We couldn't have drawn it up any better than that."

Breeders did take notice and Yokum added that the ten-year-old was a model professional.

"He was a really good boy and was well received here," he reported. "He bred 105 mares and at the last check we had 96 of them in foal, so he was doing a good job."

"He's got a nice disposition, he's good to be around and he carries himself well. He acts like a class horse as well, he ate and drank all the way when he shipped here and arrived in tip-top shape. He's travelled the globe - been more places than I have."

With favourites in Britain including Sir Dancealot and Sir Busker, plus his first southern hemisphere progeny preparing to run, the farm is looking forward to welcoming back its knight in shining armour.

"He's had quite a bit of success with the small group of horses that have come over here, and we'll be excited to see him again," said Yokum.

"We just need somebody to win a Grade 1 on opening day again. We're spoiled now, we think this is just something that happens!"

Sir Prancealot, who has 41 southern hemisphere two-year-olds set to hit the track, will stand at Cornerstone for a fee of \$9,900 in 2020.

Perfect 10 for Blackfriars

Scenic Lodge champion Blackfriars (Danehill) has claimed a 10th WA sires' premiership in a row and, like most of his titles, he doubled the prize-money of the next best stallion on the ladder.

Blackfriars (\$6.17 million), who has his final two-year-old crop in action this season, defeated fellow Scenic Lodge sire Snippetson (\$3.05 million) with Yarradale Stud's War Chant third (\$2.91 million).

"He was an amazing horse and he can add another couple of premierships because his two year-olds have never been a significant factor in all those years," Scenic Lodge's Jeremy Smith said. "We are so proud of what he achieved and there were more Group 1 wins in Melbourne and Sydney last season with Black Heart Bart and Come Play With Me."

Blackfriars joined the Muchea stud's roster when it was known as Durham Lodge. The name changed to Scenic Lodge in August, 2012 to honour its foundation sire who won nine consecutive WA titles between 2002 and 2010.

"Scenic climbed to number two in Australia at one stage," Smith recalled. "It's hard to believe, but we've now won 19 WA sires' premierships in a row."

Snippetson (Snippets) is the leading active sire in the west and there's every chance he could take over the mantle when the numbers

begin to dwindle for Blackfriars.

"We purchased him off Widden Stud and his first two crops over here have produced the top two-year-olds Tinsnip and Gemma's Son," Smith said. "That's exactly what we bought him for."

Snippetson had the WA two-year-old premiership sewn up in April before first-season sire I'm All The Talk swooped in the final weeks of the season.

I'm All The Talk (Stratum) covered his first four books at Mungrup Stud before transferring to Darling View Thoroughbreds last month along with Playing God (Blackfriars).

Darling View's Brent Atwell now stands four stallions with Patronize (Redoute's Choice) and Lucky Street (Oratorio) already on the roster at Mundijong.

"It's full-on here now and the two new stallions have been very popular," Atwell said. "Steph Mitchell worked with them at Mungrup and she has joined our team, too."

Playing God stands for a WA-high \$13,200

(inc GST) service fee and he's already on the board as a Group 1 winning sire courtesy of Kay Cee in the 2019 Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m). Trainer Neville Parnham has side-stepped a Melbourne spring campaign with Kay Cee to concentrate on a running double in

Perth's premier weight-for-age event at Ascot on December 5.

Among the mares in Playing God's first Darling View book is Russian Playmate (Dr Johnston). Owned by Geoff and Vicki Durrant, she is the dam of last year's ATC Metropolitan Hcp (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Come Play With Me.

I'm All The Talk won a Skyline Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Warwick Farm for Gary Portelli and he sired six first-crop winners in 2019-20 headed by Watch Me Dance in the WA Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m). Madam Torio helped him clinch the two-year-old title by winning a Belmont nursery on July 22.

Magic Millions will conduct Mungrup Stud's Complete Dispersal Online Sale, which opened for bidding yesterday. Comprising 167 lots, it features yearlings, two- and three-year-olds and broodmares.
