he offering of some of Australia's most sought after breeding stock at today's virtual Inglis The Chairman's Sale could provide greater clarity about the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on the bloodstock and racing industry.

 $\label{thm:continuity} Featuring 11 \ Group \ 1-winning \ or \ producing$ mares and others in foal to the country's most

commercial stallions, the 90-lot sale is the second major auction since the Australian - and global - economy was effectively halted as world leaders attempt to stem the spread of Covid-19.

The Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, which was conducted as a virtual auction in the same format as the Chairman's session, was down close to 15 per cent year-on-year, a figure lauded by most industry participants given the outlook in the lead-up. *Continued on page 2>>*

Rosemont joins forces with Magic Millions for online sale

Magic Millions' push into the digital thoroughbred auction space has gained momentum with large Victorian farm Rosemont Stud calling on the company to help conduct an exclusive online sale comprising nearly 100 weanlings and broodmares.

The decision to embark on an online-only sale by Rosemont principal Anthony Mithen in partnership with Magic Millions comes just days after the auction house completed its first digital sale in conjunction with Cornerstone Stud.

end and typically it does when you're under pressure, which is why the Easter sale held up pretty well only being down 15 per cent," Webster told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

"I certainly think if that translated across to the broodmare sales and the broodmare market being down that sort of level, then (vendors) would still be willing to trade at that level,

"If you look at the service fees they are down 15 to 20 per cent generally if you are trying to put a line through it, so that gives you an indication of where the market is.

"Heading into Easter, people

were speculating that bloodstock values would halve and that certainly has not been the case."

Last year's Chairman's Sale, which achieved four million-dollar lots, averaged \$422,455 with 55 of the 60 mares changing hands.

The auction will start at 3pm and will lead into Sunday's final bidding countdown for the fully online Australian Broodmare Sale of 399 lots.

"The good thing with both of these sales we're running over this long weekend - the virtual and the digital - is that we've run successful auctions using both formats in the past month," Webster said.

"Easter with the virtual format was a real winner and there will be people who will be bidding online and over the telephone based on their preference from 3pm, and the interest has been what we would have expected from buyer registrations. That's all looking OK at this point of time

"Will there be some value there? I think there will be."

This year's Chairman's sale could also be a guide to the market's acceptance of high-profile first season stallions Trapeze Artist (Snitzel), The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) and Justify (Scat Daddy) who all have mares in foal to them being offered.

<< Continued from page 2 Coolmore's unbeaten US Triple Crown winner Justify has four mares in foal set to be offered tonight, including Bob Peters' Celebrity Dream (Thorn Park), while Arrowfield Stud's The Autumn Sun also has a quartet of mares catalogued, with Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Nettoyer's (Sebring) dam Cleanup (Dehere) among them.</p>

The launching of The Autumn Sun and Justify by two of the major Hunter Valley studs also flowed through to last year's Chairman's Sale with the three top lots secured by Coolmore and Arrowfield respectively.

The drama-filled and, at times, theatrical sale saw four seven-figure lots headed by Coolmore's Tom Magnier purchasing Loving Gaby's (I Am Invincible) dam Maastricht (Mastercraftsman) for \$2.25 million and Srikandi (Dubawi) for \$2 million, while Arrowfield's Jon Freyer went to \$1.7 million for Norzita (Thorn Park).

Coolmore's high-priced mares were covered by Justify while Nortiza was served by The Autumn Sun.

Glenesk Thoroughbreds is consigning 11 mares for The Chairman's Sale and has two of the five lots in foal to Widden Stud's first season sire

"We've had a really good number of inspections and people coming through our farm. We've had over 30 groups of people come through. I suppose you'd be disappointed when we've got 11 of the 84 lots in the sale, so we've nearly got 15 per cent of the catalogue," Brett Howard said.

"The other thing is, we've got :

a couple older mares; a proven producer in Cleanup, the mother of Nettoyer, we've got three stakes-winning mares off the track in Smart Coupe, Think Bleue and Noire, and the balance are maiden mares in foal to horses like Trapeze Artist, The Autumn Sun, Justify, Pierro, Not A Single Doubt and Dundeel.

"We've got such a good cross-section of horses at that end of the market. If you had to throw a net out to go fishing to catch all the buyers, you'd have to think with that array of horses you'd nearly catch every buyer in the market."

Howard said his clients were prepared to put their mares on the market with considered reserves with the view of creating competition, while agent James Harron has been inspecting mares in the past few weeks and believes vendors will be prepared to trade.

"I think there is a nice bunch of quality mares on the market and the message I've been getting around the farms is that people are going to be realistic and meet the market," Harron said.

"At this level, the mares are very hard to acquire and I think ... you have to (take a long-term view) in the breeding game.


"There's a lot of people who want to upgrade their stock in line with where the market's been (in recent years) ... and these upcoming mare sales could be a good opportunity to do that."

Meanwhile, Webster revealed Inglis had dedicated more staff and resources to the handling of buyer registrations and credit applications from domestic and international investors in recent weeks. Inglis now has close to 5,000 registered accounts.

"With our existing clients, we've got a very good profile on them, so I actually prefer being able to review and approve credit under this current model because for people to bid they need to go online and let us know what their intentions are more clearly," he said.

"At a physical sale they may just turn up and start bidding without giving us any notice. For us there's more visibility and transparency over the whole bidding process."

Eric The Eel sold to Hong Kong

In a deal brokered by Magic Millions & Washpool Lodge, Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) third Eric The Eel (Olympic Glory) has been sold to Apollo Ng for an undisclosed price and will continue his career in Hong Kong, with the aim of running in next year's Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m). The three-year-old has had 14 starts for Queensland trainer Stuart Kendrick, winning four times and earning A\$245,300 in prize-money. Eric The Eel was originally purchased by Neil Douglas for \$7,000 at the Magic Millions National Yearling Sale from the draft of Arrowfield Stud.

Oliver's Camelot query

Damien Oliver is sure Russian Camelot (Camelot) is a horse on the rise but accepts the progressive colt could have had a better build up to tomorrow's South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m). "I've got a lot of time for Russian Camelot - I think he's a very good horse," Oliver told RSN927. "(He) probably doesn't have the ideal preparation - he's only had two mile runs and it would be probably better if he had a 2000-metre run but Danny's (O'Brien) put a fair bit of work into him and he trialed well over 1400 metres last week and if he relaxes, I think he'll be hard to beat." Oliver has ridden Russian Camelot in three of his four starts but with Covid-19 restrictions in place, he has been forced to hand the ride to John Allen tomorrow.

Third time lucky for Derby hope

John McArdle will send Themoonlitegambler (Good Journey) to South Australia for the South Australian Derby at Morphettville following his last two Adelaide starts in the Port Adelaide Guineas (Listed, 1800m) and Chairman's Stakes (Gr 3, 2035m), placing behind current Derby favourite Dalasan (Dalakhani) both times. Each time he has contested, Themoonlitegambler has left his stables on Thursday night and returned on Sunday. "He's a bit of a finicky fella. He prefers to come home and be in his own surroundings," McArdle said. Drawn in barrier one, Themoonlitegambler will be ridden by Dean Holland, replacing Emily Finnegan who was aboard on his last two starts. "Emily's done nothing wrong other than she probably got going a little bit earlier on him than we wanted," McArdle said. "He can pull a bit hard and get a bit strong so we've elected to go with the more experienced and a little stronger jockey."

Stokes saddles Rock Steady in Derby

Philip Stokes will run some bright prospects at Morphettville tomorrow but will also saddle outside chance Rock Steady (Reliable Man) in the South Australian Derby. "He ran enormously, we felt, in the Chairman's at a similar price running fifth behind Dalasan," stable foreman Tommy Stokes told Racing.com. "We know he can stay, that's one thing in his favour, and with the rain that is forecast that won't bother him in the slightest." Rock Steady will be having his fifth career start in the Classic, just like main contender Russian Camelot (Camelot).

Kementari set to regain glory days

Kementari (Lonhro) has arrived in Brisbane in a bid to recapture the form of his glory days. He will be the first runner for the Godolphin operation to run in Brisbane this winter in tomorrow's BRC Sprint (Gr 3, 1200m). It will be his third run since returning to the track

after being gelded when found to be sub-fertile at stud. Trainer James Cummings is aiming Kementari at the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) at Eagle Farm on June 6. Cummings is more than happy with how his gelding is going. "Two bold thirds since resuming from a 12-month break should have him close to peak fitness," Cummings said. "We were delighted with the way he shouldered into clear running in the Hall Mark and charged to the line."

Barbie set for another feature Doomben win

Outback Barbie (Spirit Of Boom) will bring up her 20th start when resuming at her favourite track, Doomben, in the BRC Sprint tomorrow. The sprint is usually one of the lesser lead-ups to the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) but this year it has become a major warm-up race for the Group 1, with the winter carnival drastically reduced due to coronavirus restrictions. Outback Barbie has recorded three Stakes wins at Doomben, but is yet to place in four starts at Eagle Farm, where the Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) and Stradbroke will be run. "Outback Barbie has twice been Group 2-placed on the big Randwick track and she handled Rosehill on a trip to Sydney," trainer Tony Gollan said. "I suppose we will find out if there have been genuine excuses at Eagle Farm or she just hates the place. Just a bad time to find out."

Miss Gem gets chance at black-type

Gold Coast trainer Michael Costa has seized the opportunity to chase black-type with Miss Gem (Smart Missile) despite the filly taking a jump in class at Doomben. Costa has accepted with Miss Gem and Supergiant (Red Giant) in the Doomben Guineas (Listed, 1600m) tomorrow. Miss Gem has a win and four placings from seven starts to date and Costa believes the 1600-metre trip will suit her. "It is vital to get some black-type for fillies and you have to give them a chance," Costa said. "The winter black-type races have been cut back and this is one of her few chances to get black-type this winter."

Thornton to make mark without allowance

Apprentice Stephanie Thornton gets her chance to make an impact on her first day of riding without an allowance. Thornton outrode her city allowance when riding a treble at Doomben last Saturday. She will take advantage of a modification to the rules due to Covid-19 protocols, which allow jockeys to ride at both metropolitan meetings at the Gold Coast on Friday and Doomben on Saturday. Thornton realises it is essential that she maintains momentum without the privilege of a claim. "For me it has been about the right opportunities and I really appreciate the support I have been getting from owners and trainers," Thornton said. Her rides include Gotta Kiss (Not A Single Doubt) in the 2YO Handicap (1110m) and Deep Image (Testa Rossa) in the BRC Sprint at Doomben.

Takeover unexpected Target for Snitz

Coronavirus restrictions have led Matthew Dunn to set up a small satellite stable in Sydney, which includes consistent sprinter Snitz (Snitzel), who was impressive when winning at Randwick last start. Tomorrow, the five-year-old will step up to stakes grade in the Takeover Target Stakes (Listed, 1200m). "When I sent him to Sydney I didn't envisage him going to a race like this," Dunn said. "I thought, we'll just trot along down there and try to pinch a couple of benchmark races with him. His last run was a

career-best for sure and if he can build on that and get a little bit better, who knows where he can end up?"

Lees cautious about Kinloch's city debut

Despite an eye-catching debut win over 900 metres at Newcastle, Kris Lees is not getting too excited about two-year-old colt Kinloch (I Am Invincible) ahead of his metropolitan debut in the Central Coast Mariners 2YO Handicap (1200m) at Randwick tomorrow. "It's a big jump from a maiden at Newcastle to Saturday two-year-old grade and he's going up to 1200 metres, so it will be a good guide to where he's at," Lees said. "He is a pretty relaxed fellow so I'd be surprised if he doesn't run the 1200 out strongly." The Waikato Stud-owned colt holds a nomination for the J J Atkins (Gr 1, 1400m) at Eagle Farm on June 6.

Weight and barrier against Lashes

Handy mare Lashes (I Am Invincible) will kick off her latest campaign in tomorrow's Tooheys Handicap (1100m) at Randwick, but a hefty weight of 60 kilograms and wide draw has trainer Matt Smith cautious about her return. While Smith has been happy with her build-up he believes a big weight on a drying track is not ideal, nor is the outside draw in the 12-horse field. "She looks great. Her work has been good and she's had a couple of trials. I can't fault her," Smith said yesterday. "But she's got a bit of a task on Saturday with the weight. She actually won with a decent weight last prep, 59 (kilograms), but she likes a wet track which helped that day and she'd had a run which helped as well. And it is hard from those barriers whichever way you dissect it."

Berry back with super Randwick book

After enduring a run of suspensions, Tommy Berry will return to Randwick on Saturday with what he believes is a strong book of rides. He combines with Team Hawkes in the two feature races, riding Scarlet Dream (Sebring) in the Gosford Gold Cup (Listed, 2000m) and consistent sprinter Greyworm (Master Of Design) in the Takeover Target Stakes (Listed (1200m). Both races take on a new complexion this year having been moved from the tight-turning Gosford circuit to the wide expanses of Randwick because of coronavirus restrictions. "The Gosford Cup at Randwick, I never thought I'd see it," Berry said. "But there's a lot of things that have happened over the last two months we never thought we'd see. It's nice to see the meeting getting all the support it deserves because it has got good cattle in both races."

Pegus eyes Sentimental hat-trick

Mark Pegus is hoping his decision to bypass the Warrnambool Cup (Listed, 2350m) and bring Sentimentalist (Written Tycoon) back in distance pays off with a hat-trick. After victories in the Stawell Cup (2000m) and the VOBIS Gold Heath at Caulfield (2000m), Sentimentalist is aiming to add tomorrow's Neds Handicap (1800m) at Caulfield to his record. Pegus had Sentimentalist entered in Wednesday's Warrnambool Cup, but thought the rise to 2350 metres may eventually end the gelding's preparation. "If I went out to the 2350 metres, where do I go with him next," Pegus said. "I didn't think he was in all that well at the weights either and it was going to be a tough race with Lindsey Smith's horse (winner, Too Close The Sun) on his home track. Those things counted against him, so we've decided to come back to Caulfield."

William Thomas after another Caulfield win

Cranbourne trainer John Price believes William Thomas (Sepoy) will need to reach a new level if he is to back up his Bel Esprit Stakes (Listed, 1100m) win with another victory in tomorrow's Lamaro's Hotel South Melbourne Handicap (1100m) at Caulfield. Tomorrow's line-up is not dissimilar to the one he blitzed three weeks ago, but this time William Thomas rises from 56.5 kilograms to 60 kilograms. "That certainly was a personal best for him," Price said. "I thought he had a level that was slightly under that, so it was very pleasing to see. You can be lucky to get a good horse, but to get a real good horse, they're harder to find. He's carrying 60 kilos in this race so hopefully he can rise again."

Command'n'conquer education trip to Coast

Unbeaten Toowoomba gelding Command'n'conquer (Warhead) will be on a look-and-learn mission when he travels to the

Gold Coast today. The Queensland winter has been severely truncated because of the impacts of coronavirus and, like most trainers, Steve Tregea has been left searching for suitable feature races. In the end, he pinpointed the Gold Coast Guineas (Gr 3, 1200m) on May 16 and the Fred Best Classic (Gr 3, 1400m) at Doomben on May 30 as the gelding's targets. Command'n'conquer will have his lead up to those races in the Lord Mayor Handicap (900m) today. "The 900 metres isn't ideal but it was the race which appeared most suitable," Tregea said. "The Gold Coast can be a tricky track for horses at their first start there. I want him to have a good look at the track before we head back for the Guineas."

Smith chasing Cup spot

Warrnambool Cup (Listed, 2350m) winner Too Close The Sun (Carlton House) will take on King Of Leogrance (Camelot) in the Andrew Ramsden Stakes (Listed, 2800m) at Flemington Saturday week, as Lindsey Smith attempts to fulfill a lifelong dream. Smith, who trained a treble on day two of the amended Warrnambool carnival, told Racing.com that the chance for his galloper to qualify for the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) was too good an opportunity to miss. "It's the only way to go," Smith said of the Andrew Ramsden. "It's a decision-making thing about his life. He'll go into that. He's in form, he'll go the distance and the track will suit him and he could get an open invite into a race that personally, is something that I've always wanted to do."

Moody to return at Ballarat

Peter Moody is set to have his first runner in his comeback to the training ranks, with Shepard (Sea The Moon) listed to run at Ballarat. The gelding is due to run in the Hertz Ballarat Handicap (2000m) on Sunday and will be ridden by Luke Nolen, who has had a long association with Moody, chiefly through wondermare Black Caviar (Bel Esprit). Formerly trained by David Brideoake, Shepard

was transferred to Moody, his owner, a day after the trainer opened his stable at Pakenham. "The horse is well. He's in good form," Moody said. "But he probably wants further than 2000 metres. His first-up run at Geelong the other day was good and this will bring him on nicely for a mile-and-a-half race."

Aguante set for Group 3 after Hickmott celebrates four-timer

Aguante (Reliable Man) will head for the South Australian Fillies Classic (Gr 3, 2500m) after her dominant six-length win in the opening Maiden contest over 2000 metres at Murray Bridge on Wednesday, the start of a memorable four-timer for locally based trainer Michael Hickmott. "She came in very good condition from Brad Widdup," Hickmott said. "I was very happy with the condition she came in. I have just ticked her over for three weeks and pressed on from there." On the four-timer Hickmott added: "It was a fantastic day and it's always good to do it on the home track as well. One of the horses that won yesterday is a filly which I bred, which made it even better. That's definitely the best result I have had in a day numberswise." Hickmott confirmed that several more horses will be joining his stable from across the Tasman, including Avondale Guineas (Gr 2, 2100m) fourth Tibetan (Shocking).

Nothdurft to appeal three-month ban

Baylee Nothdurft, who currently leads both the state and metropolitan apprentice and senior jockey premierships in Queensland, will appeal a three-month ban handed down to him by stewards for failing to ride with sufficient vigour and purpose when finishing fourth on Vega One (Lope De Vega) at the Sunshine Coast on April 25. Stewards reopened the case yesterday and after considering evidence from Nothdurft decided to impose the three-month ban which is due to begin on Friday, May 15. His master, Tony Gollan, confirmed Nothdurft will appeal.

Sues faces Heptaminol charges

Victorian trainer Mark Sues has been charged with two separate counts of contravening the prohibited substance rule with heptaminol. The charges follow a Racing Victoria stewards investigation into the circumstances surrounding the pre-race urine samples of the Sues-trained pair Skytain (Kempinskey) (Traralgon, November 2, 2019) and Infernal (Onemorenomore) (Moonee Valley, December 6, 2019) which were found to contain the banned substance. Heptaminol is an amino alcohol which is classified as a cardiac stimulant and is a prohibited substance on race day.

Punter probe adjourned

Racing NSW stewards yesterday adjourned an inquiry into comments made by controversial punter Glenn Pollett about jockey James McDonald to consider evidence. Pollett was hauled in front of stewards after a complaint was made about comments on the online racing show RacingRant on April 20 which suggested McDonald may bet on his own rides in races. "We are investigating a program in respect to remarks made on the show and have taken evidence from both parties (Pollett and McDonald), which we will consider," Racing NSW chief steward Marc Van Gestel said.

Vale Darby McCarthy

Multiple Group-winning jockey Darby McCarthy has died aged 76. The Queenslander was a pioneer for indeginous sportspeople in Australia. McCarthy won the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) on three occasions in the 1960's and the 1968 Doomben 10,000 (Gr 1, 1400m) on Gay Gauntlet (Red Gauntlet). He later moved to Sydney, winning both the AJC Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) on Divide And Rule (Alcimedes) and the Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) in 1969. McCarthy was inducted into the Queensland Racing Hall of Fame in 2004. Queensland Racing Minister Stirling Hinchliffe expressed his condolences. "He was a real boy from the bush whose talent as a jockey surpassed much of anything our racing industry had ever seen," Hinchliffe said. "We will never truly understand

the many barriers he overcame to become one of the finest athletes ever produced in Queensland, if not the nation."

Mildura Cup transferred

July's Mildura Cup carnival has been reduced from two days to one and transferred to Swan Hill in order to comply with Covid-19 biosecurity provisions surrounding participants and officials. The meeting will take place on Friday, July 24 with no additional meeting scheduled for July 25. Mildura's one other fixture scheduled this season, on June 22, will also be transferred to Swan Hill. RV executive general manager, Greg Carpenter, said yesterday: "While today's announced changes to the Mildura Cup Carnival are not ideal for the (Mildura Racing Club), these are unprecedented times and we must continue to work within the current biosecurity protocols in order to ensure the safe continuation of racing throughout the Covid-19 pandemic."

NEW ZEALAND

RITA to slash TAB jobs

The New Zealand Racing Industry Transition Agency (RITA) have suggested there could be job losses at TAB to as much as 30 per cent of the workforce due to the financial impact of Covid-19, with revenues down 47 per cent below forecast in April. Further details of the proposed changes will be presented to staff on Tuesday, May 11. RITA executive chair Dean McKenzie said: "Despite far reaching efforts to reduce costs across the TAB, including salary reductions, staff taking leave and reducing all non-essential expenses, it simply was not enough to offset the blow Covid-19 has had, and will have, on our industry. The implication of the pandemic extends beyond the immediate impact to the TAB, with racing and sport looking

very unpredictable over the next year. The reality is the TAB will need to be a leaner, more efficient business with fewer roles, and focused on driving our core wagering and gaming business."

Private property to Parsons' advantage

The husband and wife training partnership of John and Karen Parsons have spoken of their fortunate position during the racing's lockdown, with the pair able to utilise their private property to work some of their younger stock. "It didn't affect us too much," said Karen Parsons. "All our staff live in and we have our own place. We just worked the young horses. We have an 1100-metre track and access to the beach. It's been bloody good!" The partnership had enjoyed a fruitful season before shutdown ensued, with five Stakes successes, including dual Group 2 winner Kiwi Ida (Squamosa). "We have had a few offers and people have said take her to Australia but it is like taking coal to Newcastle," Parsons said. "It's hard to take sprinters to Australia. We are old and John wants the pleasure of seeing her go for one more year."

A former Coolmore Ireland resident who also shuttled

to Australia for five seasons, Canford Cliffs now stands at Highlands Farm Stud in South Africa for a fee of R30,000.

22 for Clodovil

Rathasker Stud resident Clodovil (Danehill) sired his 22nd individual stakes winner yesterday when Majestic Colt (5 h ex Majestic Dubawi by Dubawi) took out the Grosser Hannoverscher Sprintpreis (Listed, 1300m) at Hanover in Germany. The five-year-old entire defeated Tosen Shauna (Alhebayeb) by a neck with Namos (Medicean) a further three-quarters of a length back in third. Majestic Colt is one of two winners out of Group 3-scoring mare Majestic Dubawi (Dubawi) who herself is out of a half-sister to Listed winner South Rock (Rock City). Clodovil stands at Rathasker Stud in Ireland for a fee of € 8,000 (inc GST) and is also the sire of 2014 Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) winner Moriarty.

17 for Lord Of England

Irish bred Stex (4 m ex Sun Society by Law Society) landed her first stakes victory in the Grosser Hannoverscher Stutenpreis (Listed, 1800m) at Hanover yesterday, providing her sire Lord Of England (Dashing Blade) with a 17th individual stakes win. The four-year-old mare is out of the Group 3 placed Sun Society who has produced four winners to date, with Stex her first at black-type level. Stex is bred and owned by Rennstall Gebr Barth and features Grosser Prix Von Berlin (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Sirius (Dashing Blade) further down the page. Lord Of England, who is also the sire of 2017 Herbert Power Stakes (Gr 2, 2400m) winner Lord Fandango, stands at Gestut Etzean in Germany for a fee of €6,500.

German racing resumes at Hanover

Racing in Germany restarted at Hanover yesterday after receiving the necessary government clearance. Deutscher Galopp had hoped to restart at Dortmund on Monday, however that plan was shelved after the governing body did not receive the necessary approval from authorities. Hanover ran a 12-race card, including three Listed events and a total of 157 runners. The Dr Busche Memorial (Gr 3, 1600m) for three-year-olds is set to take place at Berlin on Saturday, which features several contenders for the German 2,000 Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m), including undefeated juvenile Rubaiyat (Areion).

Proposal for Derby-Oaks meeting

Officials at Epsom racecourse, the home of the Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) and Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f), are looking at proposals to run the two races on the same date after plans were submitted to the local council. A provisional date of July 4 has been put forward, with a central issue being the closure of the Downs, a public space, for the day. Epsom and Ewell council will consider the proposals in a meeting on Tuesday, however David Gulland, Liberal Democrat councillor for Epsom and Ewell, was optimistic. "The Derby is important – and I'm really pleased the Jockey Club is trying to find an innovative way of having it – but we need to think about the wider issues, obviously the health aspect," said Gulland. "The plans seem sensible on paper and if the Jockey Club explains why it has to go ahead in this way, the local residents will support it – if it's done the right way."

Hill 'n' Dale Farm secures Charlatan

Hill 'n' Dale Farms has secured the breeding rights to undefeated colt Charlatan (Speightstown), who won the first division of the Arkansas Derby (Gr 1, 9f) last weekend at Oaklawn Park, bringing his record to three

for three. The farm announced the purchase on Wednesday. "Horses with Charlatan's immense ability, combined with superior pedigree, conformation, depth of female family, and star-quality appeal are a very rare commodity," said Hill 'n' Dale president John Sikura. Charlatan is out of the multiple Graded stakes-winning Quiet American (Fappiano) mare Authenticity, who won or placed in 11 of 12 starts. She was third in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Distaff (Gr 1, 9f) and second in three other Grade 1s.

Tavistock's Saint Eustace out to give Frost second SA Derby

welve years after Bill Frost had Zarita (Pentire) become the first filly to claim the Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m)-South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) double, the Victorian owner and breeder will be attempting to take out the staying race for a second time.

Saint Eustace (Tavistock) will be aiming to add his name to the South Australian Derby honour roll as well as join Frost's growing list of talented horses that he has raced.

Trainers Mick Price and Michael Kent Jr have had the Group 1 race earmarked for Saint Eustace since his Geelong maiden victory in March.

Perhaps unconventionally, Saint Eustace was sent to South Australia for the Port Adelaide Guineas (Listed, 1800m) before connections elected to use the VRC St Leger (Listed, 2800m) as his lead-up run to the Derby.

"After he won his maiden we mapped out a series of races and we thought that the St Leger gave him the best chance to win the Derby," Kent told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"We couldn't go back to Adelaide three times in a row and we didn't want to leave him over there because we can't travel (due to coronavirus).

"But we wanted to give him one look over there, bring him back and give him a run in Melbourne and we thought the St Leger was the race. Bill has always wanted to win a St Leger and he very nearly did and now we've had two weeks to keep the speed in his legs going back in distance."

Zac Spain takes the ride on Saint Eustace tomorrow after combining with the stable to take out the Port Adelaide Cup (Listed, 2500m) last week.

"He's very clean-winded and we've had Regan Bayliss on him since and he's been thrilled with his work," Kent said.

"He's drawn the right barrier in six. He can flop out, look to relax and then get out at the right time. He's got a good sense of timing about him, that horse." While Frost will be hoping to achieve the ultimate success at Morphettville with Saint Eustace, an NZ\$160,000 New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale graduate from the Cambridge Stud draft, he will also have homebred filly **Ready Set Sail** (More Than Ready) resuming at Caulfield.

Also trained by Price and Kent, Ready Set Sail dead-heated with Flit (Medaglia d'Oro) in the TBV Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) during last year's Melbourne autumn carnival.

Since then the two fillies have experienced vastly different results: Flit won the MRC Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) while Ready Set Sail was unplaced in three starts during the spring and has not raced since.

A daughter of Frost's talented mare Jolie Brise (Fastnet Rock), Ready Set Sail has drawn barrier ten in the Darren Gauci Handicap (1200m) for three-year-old fillies.

"She's a beautiful, big filly but she just didn't come up in the spring," Kent said.

"This time in, we've had the most amazing prep with her. Everything's gone perfectly and we couldn't do any more with her without going to the races.

"She has trialled super and race day is her test now. She's got to stand up under race day pressure but she's very exciting."

Frost, who agists his select broodmare band at Widden Stud, also raced Group 2-winning mare Ballet Society (Stravinsky) who he sold in 2017 to China Horse Club carrying this season's Reisling Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Dame Giselle (I Am Invincible).

The property developer also has two exciting unraced fillies who could make their mark during the spring, the NZ\$115,000

unraced Savabeel (Zabeel) Karaka graduate called The Lion Inside, and the recently acquired **Annavisto** (Reliable Man) who was formerly trained by Tony Pike in New Zealand.

Frost is racing the Reliable Man (Dalakhani) filly with her breeder, Nearco Stud's Greg Tomlinson, and AFL footballers Jobe Watson, Cale Hooker and Tom Bellchambers.

"Greg Tomlinson, who is a fantastic breeder, is staying in and also in the ownership are the Essendon boys – Jobe Watson, Cale Hooker, Tom Bellchambers. Bill's taken a major share and she will race in his colours.

"She won a trial impressively at Te Teko in February and out of the trial, the second horse went and won its next trial and the third horse in the trial is Safe Passage who went and won her first start by four lengths (at Matamata in March)," Kent said.

"She flies in on Monday for a Guineas-Oaks prep and she looks most promising."

The deal was completed prior to Covid-19 causing New Zealand racing and the country to shut down.

On The Lion Inside, Kent said: "She's unraced and is being set for the spring. She's just come back into work and (jockey) Michael Walker had massive raps on her."

Five-star Purton Dances into premiership lead

ac Purton arrived at Happy Valley on Wednesday in search of the ignition that might fire him through the final two months of the season to a fourth champion jockey title – a dazzling five-timer might prove to be the spark he wished for

The Australian blitzed a hat-trick of wins through the first three of nine contests, met with frustration in races four, five and six, but charged through the final third of the card with two more scores, capped by a victory of some aplomb aboard Dances With Dragon (Savabeel) in the finale.

That all propelled him to a four-win lead in what continues to be a relentless two-way tussle with Joao Moreira for the crown that each has worn three times.

"It's been a bit of a grind, so hopefully I've now got a few more like this ahead of me," Purton said after sealing his first five-win haul of the campaign.

Dances With Dragon's success in the Class 2 Camellia Handicap (1650m) ensured he made the 20 kilometre journey home to Sha Tin with a lead of 114 to 110 over his

Brazilian rival. Purton kept his cool on the Caspar Fownes-trained top-weight as he searched for a clear run and then unleashed a decisive turn-of-foot to fend off the Moreira-ridden Enrichment (Teofilo).

"It wasn't as cool as it probably looked!"
Purton said. "It was a messy race with quite a bit going on. I had to get off the fence down the back because the horse in front couldn't hold a spot and was going nowhere; I had to come out around on the corner and then back in and through them. We were lucky to get the run we got but the horse did a good job, he was up to the task."

Yiu extends lead

Ricky Yiu has 19 race meetings still to navigate in his push for a first Hong Kong trainers' championship after a double widened the gap on his closest premiership pursuer Francis Lui to nine wins, with a 12-win cushion over Tony Cruz in third.

Yiu utilised Purton's talents to guide Loriz (Smart Missile) to success in the opening Class 4 Gladiolus Handicap (1200m). The four-year-old strode to a length success under the reigning champ.

"Zac is a strong rider and he rode the big

horse really well – those big horses always run well for him – so I'm very pleased," Yiu said.

The trainer followed up with After Me (Equiano) in the fourth contest, section two of the Class 4 Lotus Handicap (1650m). Frenchman Antoine Hamelin has fast-developed a reputation as a rider with a powerful drive and he showcased his strength with a pushing, arm-thrusting, last-to-first run that pipped the Purton-ridden Eptiwins (Poet's Voice).

"He's a gutsy little horse, he had a strong rider and he's finished strongly," Yiu said. "They were too quick for him at first; he was at the tail, a long way back, and not many jockeys can work that far out and get them to win from there – you need to be a strong rider."

Hamelin bagged a brace when the Douglas Whyte-trained The Runner (Snitzel) took section one of the Class 4 Gladiolus Handicap (1200m) after Purton's mount Momentum Galaxy (The Factor) lost about four lengths at the start.

Earlier, Purton had immediately followed his win in the opener with a perfectly-judged front-running triumph in the next, section one of the Lotus Handicap (1650m), on the Peter Ho-trained Rich And Lucky (Kingman). That victory took the trainer to 12 for the term.

And Purton made it a quick-fire trio when Bright Kid (Show A Heart) defied odds-on favourite Yee Cheong Pegasus (Lonhro) to take race three, section two of the Gladiolus Handicap (1200m). It was the five-year-old's first Hong Kong win at his first start since returning to the Chris So stable from the Whyte yard.

"The key was to freshen him up," So said.

"He was with me and then he left but has come back and I decided not to give him a barrier trial before this race and it worked - then we got the good draw (1) and Zac gave him a perfect ride."

Purton made it four and counting when the Danny Shum-trained Reel Bizzy (Kodiac) dug in to repel rivals in the seventh, the Class 3 Chamomile Handicap (1650m).

Moore momentum continues

The John Moore-trained Larson (Better Than Ready) posted a comfortable success in the Class 3 Carnation Handicap (1000m), passing the post two and a quarter lengths clear of the field under Chad Schofield."He's a model of consistency, this horse. He's really hit his straps and now that he's moving into Class 2 there's a 1000-metre race here in June for him – with a light weight I think he'd be competitive," the trainer said. Moore is in his final Hong Kong season and has picked up momentum with nine wins from the past five meetings and six from the last three. Larson's win left the seven-time champion trainer in fourth place with 14 to make up on Yiu in the premiership.

"Horses are just coming into form – after a great season last season the horses were at their highest and hit a brick wall in terms of their ratings but they've raced and re-rated themselves to get back to a rating that puts them in a winning position again," he said.

"But I don't think we can catch Ricky – even though I've got a lot of momentum at the moment, and we still have horses that can win races, Ricky has superior numbers in Class 4 and I think that gives him a golden opportunity to knock off a premiership.

"If I could finish in the first three that would be a very good season," Moore continued. "I did say if I could get to 50 or 55 winners, I'd be very happy and that's looking possible with 42 on the board. And when you look at prize money, we're almost up to HK\$100 million."

t is hard to overlook a maiden victory in a Group 1 race, so Toffee Tongue (Tavistock) - arguably Australia's best maiden before her breakthrough in the Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) at Morphettville - earns her spot in this column after she finally found the winners' circle on Saturday.

In recent years, juveniles aside, Oohood (I Am Invincible) and Preferment (Zabeel) are among the only horses to break their maiden status at Group 1 level when they won the Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) respectively. Toffee Tongue now belongs alongside them, having scored her first win - a Group 1 win - at start nine.

on behalf of Jonathan Munz's Pinecliff Racing at the Karaka Yearling Sales, the Chris Waller-trained Toffee Tongue had hinted that a win was on the cards after finishing second to Godolphin filly Colette (Hallowed Crown) in both the Adrian Knox Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) and the ATC Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) on her two previous starts.

Ridden in the Group 1 by Damien Thornton, she settled handier than usual before starting to race keenly. Thornton, though, was able to bring her back underneath him.

The crucial decision came when Thornton stuck to the inside upon straightening rather than searching for space off the fence. She accelerated through, before holding off the late charge of Moonlight Maid (Puissance De Lune) and Affair To Remember (Toronado) to win by three-quarters of a length.

"She's obviously got a very bright future," Thornton told RSN927 earlier this week. "She's a Group 1 winner now. I'm sure she will come back a stronger filly in the spring, who knows what level she can reach.

"You see some fillies win an Oaks and some can progress to a Caulfield Cup if they're good enough, while some don't. I think it depends on how they come back after a spell."

Northern Hilite produced six winners including stakes scorer Strong Credentials (Carson City), the dam of eight-time victor No It Ain't (Yes It's True).

Toffee Tongue's unraced four-year-old sister Candyland, who is believed to be in foal to Pierro (Lonhro), will be offered by Holbrook Thoroughbreds on behalf of owners Bob and Sandra Peters at today's Inglis Chairman's Sale. She is catalogued as Lot 32.


