Mula keeping faith in Caulfield Guineas hope Mamaragan

Interstate trip to do the trick for Thompson's Group 1-placed Wandjina colt

ohn Thompson has adopted a proven training technique often used by the late Bart Cummings in an attempt to extract the best out of his exciting three-yearold Mamaragan (Wandjina) not only for the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) but for the longer-term benefit of the colt.

2, 1200m) winner who was twice Group 1-placed in the Golden Slipper Stakes (1200m) and Inglis Sires Produce Stakes (1400m) to round out his two-year-old season, has already arrived in Melbourne from trainer Thompson's Randwick stables ahead of tomorrow's Guineas.

<< Continued from page 1 "One reason we've taken him down there is that John believes that he is still very immature and Bart always liked to take horses interstate as he felt that it matured them," breeder and part-owner Wilf Mula said yesterday.

"We'd already accepted and it's \$11,000 to scratch him, so going down there is two-fold. Hopefully we have some luck for a change and, secondly, the trip gives him that experience as we'll probably see the best of him in the autumn.

"John says he looks better than ever."

Michael Rodd will ride Mamaragan from barrier 12 following the scratching on Tuesday of Bill Stutt Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) winner Glenfiddich (Fastnet Rock).

Last start, Mamaragan ran sixth in the Golden Rose after being ridden aggressively out of the barriers by Nash Rawiller to hold out favourite Rothfire (Rothesay) for the early lead.

Mula has put the disappointment of the Golden Rose behind him and he does not expect the colt to take any ill-effects from the experience of being ridden forward.

"We've never lost faith in Mamaragan and John said he's just unbelieve on the track - he'd beat anything. It's just a matter of getting his head right," he said.

"He's a horse who does what you want him to do (in the run). We

like the horse, we know he has ability and we've worked him (in the anti-clockwise) way of going for a couple of weeks and he's landed on the right foot every time."

Mula bought Forbidden (General Nediym) carrying Mamaragan for \$65,000 at the 2017 Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale and was able to retain 30 per cent of the colt after selling him for \$180,000 at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

"I had three horses for sale that day and I sold them all pretty well, so I kept a share in all of them," he said.

"I happened to be standing next to John and I said, 'who have you bought the horse for?' and he said nobody, so I said I'd take 30 per cent."

Mula has since on-sold Forbidden, but he has kept a yearling filly by Foxwedge (Fastnet Rock).

"I have retained her because I sold the mother to a good friend of mine. The Foxwedge fillies are going well and Paul (Whelan) and I bred Foxwedge, so I have been able to keep the family going that way."

Forbidden is being covered by Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) this year.


Mula's involvement in the Caulfield Guineas does not end with Mamaragan, with the Aston Bloodstock principal also breeding and co-owning the Mick Price and Mick Kent Jr-trained **Cambourne** (Redoute's Choice).

The colt, who was co-bred and sold by the late Paul Whelan's Luskin Park Stud at the 2019 Magic Millions sale for \$300,000, has progressed rapidly to justify his place in the Guineas.

Cambourne won his first start at Donald in country Victoria on September 4 before again winning at Bendigo 12 days later. He then ran fourth in the Caulfield Guineas Prelude (Gr 3, 1400m), finishing two and a quarter lengths behind Crosshaven (Smart Missile).

"Mick believes he is a miler. It's been a very compressed preparation as he only started racing just over a month ago, but I think the horse has ability and is up to black-type," Mula said.

"We sold him for 300,000 and I kept a fair bit of him as well as I don't like to let them go just in case one of them is a champion."

Lion's Roar value in Spring Champion

When John O'Shea went to the yearling sales 18 months ago intent on buying the progeny of Group 1 winner Contributer (High Chaparral), one colt stood out, and now that horse is one of two the trainer has in tomorrow's Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m). O'Shea trained Contributer during his time at the helm of Godolphin and when he saw Lion's Roar, he did a double take. "He looks exactly the same. He is a deep bay, he's got a big, deep girth and he's got a bit of character about him," O'Shea said. "He is just a replica of his father." Lion's Roar was scratched from the Gloaming Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m) after he had a reaction which required treatment, forcing him to run last Saturday at Newcastle and he duly won. O'Shea says the hiccup has had no bearing on the three-yearold's Spring Champion preparation and he is surprised by his \$18 quote. "It's hard to work out because the other day he was going to start 7-2 behind Love Tap in the Gloaming and he's subsequently come out and won when he was \$1.70, so there you go," O'Shea said.

Socrates also lines up in Spring Champion

John O'Shea is also happy Lion's Roar's stablemate Socrates (Tavistock) is going the right way after breaking his maiden over 1600 metres at Kembla Grange last start. "He is raw but if ever there is a horse with the pedigree to win a Spring Champion it's this horse," O'Shea said. "He's got a magnificent pedigree (being out of O'Reilly mare Tricia'o) and the first time we asked a question of him, which was at Kembla, he responded. They're both really nice

horses. Their main targets since early in the year was to run well in the Spring Champion so we're really happy with where they have ended up."

Distance to suit Flit

Godolphin will rely on classy mare Flit (Medaglia d'Oro) in tomorrow's Silver Eagle (1300m) after scratching promising stablemate Criaderas (Lonhro) from the \$500,000 Randwick feature. Trainer James Cummings has opted to take a softer option with Criaderas, who will instead contest a Benchmark 88 on the undercard. It leaves Flit as their sole Silver Eagle runner and Cummings is anticipating a form turnaround from the Group 1 winner. Flit has finished out of the placings at her past two starts after an encouraging first-up second to next week's Everest (1200m) contender Eduardo (Host). At her most recent start in the Sheraco Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) she got back to last from a wide draw and made late headway in a leader-dominated race. Cummings expects her to be suited by a distance rise to 1300 metres in tomorrow's lead up to the Golden Eagle. "She's freshened up nicely since putting in a game effort in the Sheraco, which was a strong race," Cummings said. "But I expect her to be much more in touch with the field at this trip."

Blinkers go on Icebath

Connections of Icebath (Sacred Falls) have elected to refit blinkers to the mare in an attempt to get her back to winning ways in tomorrow's Silver Eagle. "I raced her in blinkers once as a two-year-old but to be fair she probably shouldn't have had that start," trainer Brad Widdup told Racingnsw.com. "I've kept them off her but I think now is the time. It's been frustrating that she hasn't won, she's loomed up, so I hope they do the trick. Her benchmark rating shouldn't be what it is. It's a throw at the stumps, we had the Golden Eagle as a target if she's going well enough. It's all a pipe dream at the moment."

Dry track key to Superium

Joe Pride is hopeful the return to a quicker surface will result in a turnaround in fortunes for Superium (Verrazano). The four-year-old lines up in a Benchmark 78 over 1000 metres at Randwick tomorrow looking for a first win since December last year. Despite his losing run, Superium has not been beaten far on his most recent starts and Pride told Racingnsw.com: "I'm convinced he was going really well but he just couldn't let down on those heavy tracks. He wasn't running poorly but he wasn't running to his best and you need that to be winning on Saturday in Sydney." As regards Superium's chances tomorrow Pride continued: "He strikes his first dry track for some time and I liked the way he trialled. He's a nice horse, a big strong boy and hopefully this is his preparation where he can make the transition because he spent the last 12 months pretty much plateauing in his benchmarks. I can blame the wet tracks but this preparation he has to do it. He's dynamic fresh, he always runs good races fresh and I like him at Randwick."

Blazing Miss heating up for return

Mark Newnham is eyeing a step back up into stakes company for Blazing Miss (Sizzling) ahead of the four-year-old's return to competitive action at Randwick tomorrow. The Widden Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) third will take on Superium et al with her trainer having already pencilled in a tilt at The Nivison (Gr 3, 1200m) on October 24. "She's a good mare and she's improved every prep. She got through to winning a couple of Saturday class races and she's coming up well," Newnham told Racingnsw.com. "Even though she's only had one trial she's had enough work to be effective over 1000 metres. She's adaptable enough, she can race right on pace or sit off them and it won't worry her carrying a bit of weight. She's always been very big so it's taken a while for her to grow into herself. She always had ability but needed to get a bit of strength."

Griffiths makes case for Yosemite

Although Yosemite (Redwood) is the rank outsider in tomorrow's Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) her trainer Robbie Griffiths believes she deserves her place in the Caulfield contest. Griffiths said at her last start Yosemite showed she could mix it with the local fillies except for one, Instant Celebrity (Not A Single Doubt), who she finished seventh behind in the Thousand Guineas Prelude (Gr 2, 1400m). "I think Instant Celebrity could be outstanding but there wasn't much between the rest," Griffiths said. "I think there was a half-length between second and sixth, then a gap of three lengths to my filly." Griffiths said he felt Yosemite would have finished with that group of fillies but she had a horrendous run. "She had an outside draw and it was our plan to be guiet on her from an outside barrier, but not for her to be three lengths behind the secondlast horse early in the race," he said. "She had to use a lot of energy from the 800 metres to the 200 metres to get back into the race and then she was just burnt out by then."

Sharp Fox ready for Guineas

Paul Preusker is hoping a belated decision to scratch Lunar Fox (Foxwedge) from an 1800metre handicap could result in a Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) win. Lunar Fox is aimed at the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) and Preusker was thinking that the Flemington race last Saturday was the best path to take towards that race. Lunar Fox's sharp track work though caused Preusker to deviate from that path and he changed tack to the Group 1 race. "He's got the freshness in his legs to be ready for a mile and then he can go to the Derby," Preusker said. Lunar Fox has not started since he finished fourth in the Stutt Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) behind Glenfiddich (Fastnet Rock) on September 25. "I probably dug a bit deep with him when we went to the Valley and he was a bit tired after," he said. "Whether he's got the turn of foot to match it with the better ones I'm not sure."

Small field for Caulfield Stakes

Russian Camelot (Camelot) will have just five rivals in the Caulfield Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) as he looks to sure up his Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) favouritism. The Danny O'Brien-trained northern hemisphere-bred four-year-old won the Underwood Stakes (Gr 1, 1800m) convincingly and is again expected to take out tomorrow's weight for age race. "I'm very happy with him. It looks a nice test again for him and 2000 metres will be more to his advantage," said O'Brien who dismissed suggestions his stable star was scaring off rivals. "You'd have to ask the other trainers about that. The Caulfield Stakes though is a race which historically attracts small fields."

Williams gives Gailo Chop a rap

Matthew Williams will saddle two of the rivals Russian Camelot faces in the shape of Gailo Chop (Deportivo) and Harbour Views (Le Havre) and although the pair were put firmly in their place by the favourite in the Underwood, Williams remains keen to have another crack. "He frightens a few away and you get a six-horse field. Small fields, obviously he's the one to beat, but stranger things have happened," Williams told Racing.com. "Someone has got to make him earn the money. It's a million-dollar race, and from the Harbour Views point of view, with OTI having a little bit of his family now, it puts status beside his name if he can run in the top three. Both have come through (the Underwood) well. Probably more so Gailo. He has been a bit surprising his last couple of gallops. He has worked the best that he ever has since we had him. His work on Tuesday morning here on the course proper at Warrnambool, he really hit the line and really wanted to stretch out and was full of running. I really think he is in a terrific place. I expect him to do similar to what he did last year when he went to this race and held his own there."

Buffalo River to set strong tempo

Mike Moroney is keen for Craig Williams to ride Buffalo River (Noble Mission) more forcefully when the four-year-old makes his stakes race debut in tomorrow's Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) at Caulfield. Buffalo Rover led under Damian Oliver before being collared late on by Windstorm (Redoute's Choice) first-up and his trainer believes he would have been better served going quicker earlier in the race. "I thought that he possibly went a bit slow through the early sectionals last start," Moroney told RSN927. "He didn't get beaten far and I thought he went terrific for his first-up run. That's when he's at his best, when he can put those (fast) sectionals in and take them off the bit a wee bit. I would think that's going to be his best chance, by leading and making it a truly run race to make them all carry their weight. He looks really well and he's definitely taken improvement out of his first-up run."

Sircconi capable of springing surprise

Sircconi (Nicconi) lines up in the Toorak in fine shape having pleased connections in his work since finishing fourth in last month's Feehan Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m). "He's terrific, he's had a little freshen up since the Feehan," the six-yearold's trainer Nick Ryan told Racing.com. "We've targeted this race, his home track, over a mile. He has been up for a long time, but I can't fault the horse, I'm really happy with him. He's drawn well in barrier 11, he can roll across at his own leisure and it looks quite an open race for him." Ryan said he was delighted with Sircconi's work alongside stablemate Mahamedeis (Magnus) on Saturday. "It was a really nice piece of work. We are there (at the race) now. He is in terrific order. And there is some rain forecast to be coming, so for Sircconi's sake, the more the better."

'Hey Doc the class horse in the race'

Hey Doc (Duporth) heads a trio of South Australian sprinters set to contest tomorrow's Schillaci Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) at Caulfield with connections hoping for big things from the Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner. The Tony and Calvin McEvoy-trained seven-year-old will be joined in the line up by Octane (I Am Invincible) and Bold Star (Needs Further) having finished eighth on his reappearance in the Moir Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) last month. "He's extremely well, he's trained (on) really good," Calvin McEvoy told trsa.com. "He ran a bit further than the 1000 metres he was so wide on the track. Caulfield is a track he hasn't won at, but he did run third in the Guineas there and it's a long time since he's raced in sprint races there. He's the class horse in the race but coming up against some nice up-and-coming horses in good form. If they do get the rain that's forecast, a heavy track would be a bit of an unknown. I respect the opposition but couldn't have him any better prepared."

Port Guillaume out of Caulfield Cup

Leading fancy Port Guillaume (Le Havre) will miss next week's Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) after being removed from the race by Racing Victoria veterinary officials. Lindsay Park Racing issued a statement yesterday afternoon which read: "Unfortunately, after a second veterinary examination today, Racing Victoria have withdrawn Port Guillaume from the Group 1 Caulfield Cup. As is the case for all horses under the care of Lindsay Park, Port Guillaume's welfare is our top priority and we will be performing further diagnostic testing to determine the colt's prognosis. This is very disappointing for owner and loyal client Edmond Lee, however, we are looking forward to tackling the future with what is a very progressive and exciting horse." Port Guillaume was due to make his Australian debut for new trainers Tom Dabernig and Ben Hayes having previously been trained in France by Jean-Claude Rouget where he won four of his six starts, including a Group 2 success at Deauville back in August.

Aidan O'Brien sextet have Werribee hit-out

Aidan O'Brien's international contingent of six have begun their spring carnival build up with a workout on the course proper at Werribee. The sextet galloped in pairs with Cox Plate hopefuls Armory (Galileo) and Magic Wand (Galileo) stretching their legs, while 2019 Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f) winner Anthony Van Dyck (Galileo) partnered with Wichita (No Nay Never). The youngest members of the group, Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) aspirants Tiger Moth (Galileo) and Santiago (Authorized), were paired together for their hit-outs. O'Brien's travelling foreman TJ Comerford said the team came through their work with flying colours. "They were all very good. It's their first piece of work since they've got here," Comerford said. "They all just went through the motions really. It was just a step out onto the grass and it all went well."

'Surprise Baby spot on'

Paul Preusker said he has got all the rust out of Surprise Baby (Shocking) who will now head straight to the Melbourne Cup for his next start. The six-year-old has returned superbly this preparation and will be third-up into the Melbourne Cup, where Preusker is confident he is ready to peak. "He had a light stretch out (Wednesday) morning and I'm really, really happy. I think he is spot on for a Melbourne Cup," Preusker said. "He will go straight to the Cup. I think he is right. This year, it has been a little bit the opposite. We are just landing the plane rather than taking off and climbing to heights. There's a lot of residual fitness there and it's just a matter of drawing on it when we want it." Surprise Baby returned with an eyecatching run in the Feehan Stakes at Moonee Valley and then backed it up with another strong performance in the Turnbull Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) last Saturday. "I think the horse is doing an exceptional job. He is fit and ready to go," Preusker continued. "These (first two runs) are just getting the rust off him and piping him out a bit. He's probably doing a real good job in comparison to last year."

Nature Strip given green light by vets

Nature Strip's (Nicconi) bid for the \$15 million

The Everest (1200m) remains on track after he passed an important veterinary examination. The Chris Waller-trained sprinter was given an endoscopic test after trackwork yesterday under the watchful eye of Racing NSW's chief veterinary officer Dr Toby Koenig. "Dr Koenig has reported that the endoscope confirmed that Nature Strip has responded well to a combination of antibiotic and bronchodilator therapy and in his current condition the gelding is suitable to race," Racing NSW stewards said. Nature Strip performed below expectations when he led and finished fourth to Libertini (I Am Invincible) in the Premiere Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick last Saturday. He was subsequently found to have mucus in his trachea and was treated. Waller has told stewards the speedster will undergo a further precautionary endoscope next week to confirm his place in the Randwick sprint.

Tempo key to Red Chase's chances

Desleigh Forster is banking on a genuine tempo at Doomben to enable Red Chase (Red Element) to exact revenge on his Weetwood Handican (Listed. 1200m) conqueror Jadentom (Rothesay). Red Chase produced a barnstorming finish when runner-up to Jadentom after being held up and losing momentum on the home turn in the Weetwood Handicap at Tooowoomba on September 26. "There was a bit of a traffic jam on the corner and he was blocked for a run for a few strides but when he got out he really flew to the line," Forster said. "In the straight he made his run near the rail, which some people thought was a no-go zone. Whether or not the fence was off that day I'm not 100 per cent sure, but his run was super." As expected, the Weetwood was a high pressure test and Forster is hoping for a similar tempo in tomorrow's Go The Maroons Handicap (1200m). "The 1200 metres around Doomben is a lot easier than Toowoomba, which means those speed horses might get it a bit easier this time," she said.

"The faster they go up front, the better it's going to suit us. From the one alley he should just lob on the rail and hopefully be as close as he can be without getting him out of his comfort zone. He'll be getting to the line nice and strong late."

Schweida posts Odyssey warning

Kelly Schweida has warned punters not to ignore The Odyssey (Better Than Ready) when the four-year-old lines up against Red Chase and Jadentom again tomorrow following his tenth place finish in the Weetwood. "I still can't work out what went wrong but I wouldn't be sacking him on one run," Schweida told Racingqueensland.com. "He did beat Alligator Blood two runs back but for some reason he never travelled at any stage in the Weetwood and it was one of the worst races of his career. I had him vetted after the race and checked him all over but we couldn't find anything wrong with him. The whole race was run upside down and he did go up sharply in the weights so maybe that had an effect."

Gemma's Son out to upset Clairvoyance

David Harrison believes Gemma's Son (Snippetson) has the ability to beat favourite Clairvoyance (Nostradamus) when the pair clash in tomorrow's Crown Perth 3YO Classic (1000m) at Ascot. Nostradamus has made a spectacular start to her racing career with three wins from as many starts, although Gemma's Son displayed above average potential as a juvenile after winning four of five races, including the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (1200m) and the Perth Stakes (Listed, 1100m). "I'm looking forward to the race and I think it will tell us a lot more about Clairvoyance than Gemma's Son," Harrison told The Races WA. "She has never had any pressure applied to her in a race previously and she will be getting that on Saturday. If she absorbs that pressure and goes on and wins, then she may very well be as good as everyone is saying. But Gemma's Son is a high-speed horse who can reel off pretty slick sectionals and has never been beaten over 1000 metres. It will be interesting to see if they go head-to-head which one will crack. It's my intention that Gemma's Son will lead and I'm confident he can win."

The Multiplier sold to Hong Kong

Recent Morphettville winner The Multiplier (The Factor) will continue his racing career in Hong Kong following a private sale, the three-year-old's trainer Will Clarken has revealed. "You never like to see talented horses leave your stable but ultimately the offer was agreed by the ownership group as too good to refuse," Clarken told Racing. com. "I guess the disappointment for me to lose him is offset by the fact I own 50 per cent of him. To pick him up for just \$25,000 at the Adelaide Magic Millions Sale, it has been a good result. My understanding is he is going to David Hayes in Hong Kong but initially he is heading to his property at Euroa for a spring break."

Rawiller cleared over Iailbreak ride

Nash Rawiller was yesterday cleared by Racing NSW stewards after they resumed their inquiry into his riding of Jailbreak (Rubick) when the gelding finished fifth, beaten a length and a half, as favourite in a Benchmark 72 at Randwick on September 30. The stewards looked at Rawiller's riding of the four-year-old in the home straight and whether there was an opportunity to take advantage of a run that developed for a short distance after entering the home straight. Rawiller explained that a narrow run had developed, however he was content to continue to trail those in front of him. The stewards accepted Rawiller's explanation that any amount of movement from either runner would result in Jailbreak having to be checked as it was not positioned to resist a shift.

Weir case adjourned again

A decision on whether former trainer Darren

Weir will be committed to stand trial on animal cruelty and conspiracy charges has been adjourned until October 19. Weir and his former employees Jarrod McLean and Tyson Kermond face a string of indictable charges as a result of police surveillance of stables during the 2018 spring carnival. Weir also faces weapons-related charges.

Owners allowed back at regional Victoria meetings

Racehorse owners who reside outside metropolitan Melbourne will be allowed to attend country Victoria meetings from Monday under Covid-safe protocols. Racing Victoria and Country Racing Victoria yesterday announced the policy change yesterday, outlining protocols including arrival times on a club-by-club basis and that a maximum of 30 owners per race with pre-registration will be allowed on-course. RV chief executive Giles Thompson said: "Owners are essential to our sport. They fund the training, care and welfare of our horses and have kept people in jobs right across Victoria with their ongoing commitment to racing during the Covid-19 pandemic.

"With the reduction in Covid-19 cases and the easing of social restrictions in regional Victoria, we are delighted to announce a framework with the support of the Victorian government that allows us to welcome regional owners back to regional race meetings from next week."

Ballarat turf meet moved to synthetic

Today's Ballarat race meeting was yesterday moved from the turf to the synthetic track due to an unsafe patch of wet ground after the winning post. Racing Victoria officials, in consultation with the Ballarat Turf Club, inspected the surface yesterday after more than 20 millimetres of rain in the previous 24 hours and made the decision to switch the meeting.

Gelded Unition to return to best

Unition (Fastnet Rock) will tackle tomorrow's Fairview Motors Matamata 1400 as he looks to cement his claims on a trip to Riccarton for the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 2000m) on November 7. Bred and raced by China Horse Club Racing, the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained Unition looked a potential star in two starts last season as a two-year-old, winning a Listed race at Pukekohe on debut before finishing third in the Wakefield Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) at Trentham last December. But a lacklustre eighth placing resuming in last month's Northland Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Te Rapa led to a considered decision to have the colt gelded two days later. "We've seen a big change in him, change of attitude. Let's hope that shows on Saturday," Baker said. "He's got real ability but he just wasn't showing it. It's a good field on Saturday so if he runs well, it's going to be heartening that we're on the right track. We expect an improved performance." Since being gelded, Unition trialled at Te Aroha in stylish fashion, scoring by two and a half lengths in a 1000-metre open heat. "It was a good trial and he seemed to have a bit in hand too. If he runs well on Saturday, we'll look at the Sarten and the 2,000 Guineas," Baker added.

Fursdon yearning for change of luck

Karen Fursdon is hoping her stable star Yearn (Savabeel) will have a bit more luck in this year's running of the Taranaki Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Hawera tomorrow. "Two years ago

we had a bit of bad luck in the race with the saddle slipping and the jockey just had to let her run she was pulling that hard, they even lost an iron," Fursdon said. "We put a line through that race." Fursdon couldn't be any happier with the seven-year-old after her first-up fourth-placing at Ruakaka last month. "She is very well and has worked up really good," she said. "I couldn't be happier with her. She has come through her Ruakaka run very well. She carried a lot of weight (62 kilograms) at Ruakaka and most of the other trainers claimed, which was the sensible thing to do, and we were always going to be up against it with the weight she carried. She's not a horse I would put an apprentice claimer on fresh-up. She can get very strong. I couldn't be happier with the way she looks. She just looks amazing. I am really looking forward to it."

Guineas not ruled out for Proisir filly

A bold debut from promising Avaquinella (Proisir) at Timaru would please her trainer Lance Robinson but only an emphatic win would see the filly press on towards a Classic target. Avaquinella has impressed winning two of her three trials and Robinson has a good opinion of the filly who still holds a nomination for the New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Riccarton on November 14. Robinson will produce her in today's Onceuponatime at Belmont Park Maiden (1200m) at Phar Lap Raceway with Terry Moseley booked to ride from a potentially awkward barrier draw of 13. "She's pretty smart. She had a little issue on the way through which put us on the back foot a bit. She just had a splint come through which put us a fortnight to three weeks behind where we wanted to be," Robinson said. "We'll give her the run tomorrow and see how she gets on. She might go to the paddock after this because we've got behind and there's not a lot for her after Saturday, unless she was to win really impressively. She's got a bit of a tricky draw too but we'll line up and see what she's got. We really like her a lot though. She's a really nice filly."

Four for Al Kazeem


Harper (2 c ex Fuschia by Averti) won on debut at Saint-Cloud in July and stepped straight up to stakes company at Bordeaux Le Bouscat yesterday where he remained unbeaten in the Grand Criterium de Bordeaux (Listed ,1600m), becoming the fourth individual stakes winner for his sire Al Kazeem (Dubawi). Trained by Andrea Marcialis, Harper was a convincing winner, taking over with over 300 metres to go, he beat Reina Madre (Kingman) by a length and three quarters, while Guerre D'Amour (Camelot) was a further half length away in third. Harper is out of the winning Fuschia (Averti) however there is no black type on his page till his Listed-winning third dam Pink Valley (Never Bend) and her progeny, three of which won stakes races. He was sold by Oakgrove Stud for just 800gns as a foal and made 26,000gns as a yearling when selling to Marco Bozzi Bloodstock. Al Kazeem started his stud career at The Royal Studs in 2014, but following early fertility issues he moved to his breeders' Oakgrove Stud for the 2016 season with a fee of £12,000 which remained the same until this year when it was listed as private.

UK: 3.4m guineas for sister to Japan and Mogul

At the time of going to print, day two of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale Book 1 was being headed by two multi-million dollar daughters of Galileo (Sadler's Wells). Leading the way was the 3,400,000gns (approx. AUD\$6.45million) paid for the full-sister to Japan and Mogul. Bred by Newsells Park Stud and offered as Lot 463, she is out of the magnificent Shastye (Danehill), whose progeny have realised a massive 14,340,000gns at Tattersalls, and she was knocked down to MV Magnier. The second gem was, Lot 374, the first foal out of the multiple Graded winner and Del Mar Oaks (Gr 1, 9f) placed Prize Exhibit (Showcasing), a full-sister to Sussex Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) winner Mohaather, who will stand at Shadwell's Nunnery Stud in 2021. The filly was offered by Barronstown Stud, who purchased the mare for 775,000gns at Tattersalls in December 2017, and she also went the way of Magnier for 2,800,000gns (approx. AUD\$5.31million).

UK: Enable a possible for British Champions Day

Enable (Nathaniel) was back in action on the Newmarket gallops yesterday with connections said to be considering running her in the British Champions Fillies & Mares Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 4f) at Ascot on October 17. Last Sunday's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m), in which the John Gosden-trained six-year-old finished sixth, was widely anticipated to have been her final start before retirement, but a decision on her future is set to be made on the weekend. The news that the 11-time Group 1 winner could have one last swan song prompted the bookmakers to introduce her into the betting for the Ascot contest as their 13-8 market leader. Gosden has won two of the last four runnings of the Fillies & Mares Stakes with Journey (Dubawi) in 2016 and Star Catcher (Sea The Stars) a year ago.

aving posted two wins in trials, Follow Your Dreams (Contributer) made a convincing start to his career when proving to be too speedy for his four rivals, continuing Ruakaka trainer Kenny Rae's good record of spring success at Riccarton with early season two-year-olds.

The Contributer (High Chaparral) colt was strongly fancied in Saturday's first two-year-old contest in the south this season off the back of an effortless six-length trial victory on the track last month despite having to cede outright favouritism to the Jamie Richards-trained Matamata raider Avonallo (Belardo).

The two colts locked horns from barrier

rise although the filly Quarantina (Wrote) kept them both off the rail in the early stages as she pushed up from an inside barrier.

Avonallo briefly hit the front at the top of the straight, however Follow Your Dreams balanced up and produced a powerful burst to pull away from his rival in the final 100 metres to score comfortably by two lengths in a sharp 45.46 seconds for the 800 metres, the last 600 metres in 31.68.

Rae, who prepares his team with daughter Krystal Williams-Tuhoro, had been nervous before the race however his charge lived up to his opinion of him with a comprehensive performance.

"I was a little bit nervous as we have such a high opinion of him," Rae said.

"I had hoped I was right as he has a lot of ability and a great temperament.

"I had gone to the sales to buy a horse for Lisa (wife) and I to race. We ended up getting a few friends in with us and I kept thirty per cent.

"He's very good and right from the moment we broke him in we knew he had ability.

"I was that taken with him after we had bought him, I paid up for the Karaka Million just a few weeks later."

Rae will continue a southern campaign with Follow Your Dreams who has the Welcome Stakes (Listed, 1000m) on November 14 as his main target.

"He's thrived since we've been down here and hopefully that will continue," he continued.

"We'll just keep him ticking over, do a bit of work in the pool and the like as he's already very professional so doesn't really need to do much educational work.

Bred by Kevin Hickman, Follow Your Dreams is the first foal out of the O'Reilly (Last Tycoon) mare Dare To Dream. He was knocked down to Rae for \$24,000 from the Valachi Downs draft of Book 2 of the 2020 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale.

His grandam Danvers (Danzero) is a sister to AJC Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Danglissa, whose six wins also included three further Group victories, as well as running second in The Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Caulfield.

Follow Your Dreams kept up a strong gallop and being a grandson of High Chaparral (Sadler's Wells) may well be a factor when tried over more ground later this season and next.

Classic Unicorn scores classy Valley victory

lassic Unicorn (Per Incanto) sealed a Chris So double with a smart win in Wednesday night's feature, the Class 2 High Island Handicap (1000m), justifying his handler's belief that this could be the promising chestnut's 'coming-of-age' campaign.

After an unbeaten debut season, the fiveyear-old mixed his form last term but saw off a strong field of sprinters at Happy Valley to take his eye-catching record to four wins from eight starts.

"He's five years old now, he's calmer, he's mature, and he has more confidence," So said. "This year he has put on weight, because the last two years he was quite skinny but after the summertime, he's come back different."

Derek Leung fired the gelding out of gate ten to skip along close to the speed in a wide alley and had to work for the lead before pouring on the pressure at the 550-metre mark. The speedster kicked on in the straight to score by one and three-quarter lengths ahead of the fast-finishing Gunnison (Not A Single Doubt)

and third-placed Multimillion (Tycoon Ruler), while the race-favourite, Highland Fortune (Declaration Of War), could only manage fourth.

"He's more relaxed, he still has the early speed but it's not crazy and that's why he can finish off – he's older now, mentally stronger and everything about him, he's just grown up," Leung said.

"Because he has so much early speed, if someone challenged him, he would fight back and not give up, that's why he used to use too much energy early. We went fast but he felt as if he had something left, I had confidence in him."

Classic Unicorn arrived in Hong Kong from New Zealand as an unraced PPG (Private Purchase Griffin) and since then has risen 31 points in the ratings.

"I think both tracks are fine, it depends on his rating now, because Happy Valley has the bend, we think it does suit him more, but we'll discuss it with the owner," So said.

Vagner Borges kicked off the trainer's double with victory aboard Faithful Trinity (Wiener Walzer) in section two of the Class 4 Shek Pik Handicap (1650m).

Stock Legend (Sidestep) got off the mark in Hong Kong from an improbable position after missing the break by close to seven lengths in section one of the Class 4 Shek Lei Pui Handicap (1200m), recovering to fire home a double for Vincent Ho.

The Francis Lui-trained galloper stalled at the start and veered left but managed to tack on to the field after 200 metres, and, aided by a fast-pace and a calm Ho, he swooped to conquer.

"Unbelievable, I was like what happened?" Ho said. "It was lucky the pace was on, I just kept pushing him and he got a good spot following Alexis (Badel) and we got a gap and by the 400-metre mark I knew he should have a chance because he felt good in his trackwork."

Naboo Star (Casino Prince) kicked off Ho's double in emphatic style, going from last-to-first to foil the mid-race Alexis Badel move aboard Sacred Ibis (O'Reilly) in the Class 3 Plover Cove Handicap (1650m).

"He has a great turn-of-foot and they were bunched up a little bit so it wasn't as if I had to make up too many lengths, but it was still tough," Ho said. "Alexis put in a great ride when he just took off, but my horse can't do that, I had to be patient and the horse did very well."

Ferraris and O'Sullivan off the mark

Trainer David Ferraris bagged his first win for the new season as veteran galloper Gouten Of Garo (Per Incanto) burst clear in the opener, the Class 5 Tai Lam Chung Handicap (1000m).

"This is his specialist distance, the five furlongs at Happy Valley, nothing else suits him; this is his pet distance, so if we can pick up another one this season we'll be happy," Ferraris said.

The seven-year-old finished second firstup after trying to make all. This time, from the wide ally, apprentice Jerry Chau opted to settle outside the leader Apollos Bow (Hussonet) before pouncing on the turn to score by a comfortable two lengths.

"It was a very good ride – I thought the horse would suit Jerry because he's an on-pace runner. It was a bit of a concern when he couldn't get across but he didn't panic, he just sat alongside of him and I think with the 10lb difference, the other horse just couldn't match him for speed," the South African handler said.

Paul O'Sullivan was the other trainer to get

off the mark for the season and he did so with Mehboob (Snippetson) in the Class 3 Kam Shan Handicap (1200m).

"He's been very consistent that horse: when he first started you couldn't stop him and now he's learnt to jump, put his head down, settle, and roll into it," O'Sullivan said.

Winning start for Ares

Talented four-year-old Ares (Zacinto) made his first start this season a winning one by taking section two of the Class 4 Shek Lei Pui Handicap (1200m) under a masterful frontrunning ride from Zac Purton.

"It was a good run, especially because we drew gate ten and he had a big weight to carry, so I spoke to Zac and said we'll jump and just see, but if you're faster than them then you can lead," winning trainer Frankie Lor said.

And lead he did as the Australian ace bounced the gelding straight to the lead and he was never headed from there, scoring by half a length from the fast-finishing Namjong Sings (Your Song).

"He slowed the pace by himself, so it looked a little bit easy, especially mid-race," Lor said.

The lightly-raced New Zealand-bred was found to be lame after his last start and since then has been based at Conghua.

"After his last run he had a right hind leg issue, so I sent him to Conghua and he put on some weight there, though unfortunately he dropped a bit when he got back to Hong Kong,"

Badel's night at Happy Valley went from frustration to satisfaction as the Frenchman put three consecutive runner-up efforts behind him with victory aboard Regency Master (Savabeel) for trainer Danny Shum in section one of the Class 4 Shek Pik Handicap (1650m).

"I must say thank you to Danny (Shum) for his support because he is a nice horse," Badel said. "The draw helped me a lot and the horse didn't steal the race, he has done it pretty strongly and I hope he can repeat it – it was a great effort."



Godolphin's seven-figure spree continues as 1,100,000gns Dubawi tops day two

t was not all plain sailing for vendors during day two of Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, as was to be expected given the market downturn experienced this year, but Sheikh Mohammed's appetite for the most choice offerings continued to supply some soaring highs.

Godolphin signed for the four most expensive yearlings on day two, headed by a 1,100,000gns (approx. AUD\$2.1million) Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) colt, taking the operation's Book 1 buys to 17 lots acquired for a total of 12,700,000gns (approx. AUD\$24milion) - around 26 per cent of turnover across the two days.

Mike and Michelle Morris may be relative newcomers to the breeding ranks, but their sizeable early investment produced a big result on Wednesday when Anthony Stroud, bidding on behalf of Godolphin, went to 1,100,000gns for the couple's Dubawi colt consigned as Lot 225 by Highclere Stud.

The seven-figure youngster is the first foal out of Intricately (Fastnet Rock) who won the Moyglare Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) for Chantal Regalado-Gonzalez and Joseph O'Brien in 2016.

Intricately's race record helped to ensure that she topped day one of the Tattersalls December Mares Sale in 2017 when knocked down to John and Jake Warren on behalf of the Morrises at 1,700,000gns.

"I'm thrilled for Mike and Michelle Morris," said Highclere's Lady Carolyn Warren. "They're clients of ours, Jake bought the mare for them, and they're lovely people. They stepped up and bought this fantastic mare and she's really repaid them.

"He's a gorgeous colt, he was gorgeous from the day he was born, he's been so straightforward and has a fantastic temperament. I'm delighted for Anthony Stroud and Sheikh Mohammed. Dubawi is a

brilliant stallion and this colt looks like he's got a bit of magic about him." Warren explained that the Morrises' boutique broodmare band boards at Highclere, and also includes the likes of Hertford Dancer (Fowedge), whose Dubawi colt sold for 300,000gns (approx. AUD\$570,000) as Lot 195 shortly before the seven-figure son of Intricately.

"The Morrises have some other mares with us, we sold a Dubawi colt out of Hertford Dancer, who we own in partnership, earlier today," she said. "Anthony bought that colt too so that was great.

"They're doing it the right way and it's lovely to see them having such success. Michelle is a great horsewoman herself and Mike is very interested in racing. Intricately is in foal to Kingman and she has another Dubawi colt at foot, so we might see him up here next year too."

Elite Racing ready to roll the dice again

The seven-figure mark was reached for a second time later in the day when the Frankel (Galileo), Lot 295 half-brother to brilliant sprinter Marsha (Acclamation) was knocked

down at 1,000,000gns (approx. AUD\$1.9milion). However, it transpired that the blue-blooded colt had been bought back on behalf of the colt's breeders, the Elite Racing Club.

The son of Frankel is the final foal out of Elite Racing's ill-fated star broodmare Marlinka (Marju), who tragically succumbed to colic earlier in the year. She left three winners, with Nunthorpe (Gr 1, 5f) and Prix de l'Abbaye (Gr 1, 1000m) heroine Marsha joined by the talented Judicial (Iffraaj) and Marseille (Excelebration).

Elite Racing manager Dan Downie will be hoping that becomes four winners in the years to come when the Frankel colt sports the club's famous white and black-spotted silks.

"We know he's a nice horse so it's exciting for the club to be able to keep one like this," he said. "We've always said to our members that we don't have an endless pot of money and we need to make sure the club is secure financially. If he were to have made a lot of money we couldn't afford not to sell, but that wasn't to be."

The Frankel covering that resulted in this colt was, at least in part, funded by the sale of Marsha, who set a European record when sold to Coolmore for 6,000,000gns at the December Sale in 2017.

Hillwood living the dream

Godolphin's haul also took in the Lope De Vega (Shamardal) colt out of Moi Meme (Teofilo) offered as Lot 320 by Hillwood Stud when Stroud got the better of David Redvers with a bid of 900,000gns (approx. AUD\$1.7milion).

The youngster's page boasted a significant update as his two-year-old full-brother King Vega was last seen finishing a close second in the Solario Stakes (Gr 3, 7f).

"He's been a lovely horse all along but that was beyond our wildest dreams," said an emotional Charlie Vigors of Hillwood. "He was bred at home by Fortescue Bloodstock, which is a syndicate of mainly London-based investors who have been buying some blue-chip mares. It's great when you get a reward like that.

"We put a sensible reserve on him but that's the beauty of public auction; two people can lock on to the same horse and after that anything can happen."

The colt is the third foal of Moi Meme, a French Listed winner, who was signed for by Old Mill Stud at €440,000 at the Arqana Breeding Stock Sale in 2015.

The eight-year-old has been mated with Lope De Vega exclusively since she retired to the paddocks. The Ballylinch Stud stallion stood for €45,000 in the first year Moi Meme visited him, a fee that has since risen to €100,000.

"The mare has a lovely Lope De Vega filly foal on the ground and she's back in foal to him

again," continued Vigors. "Her progeny have all been so nice that she's been married to Lope De Vega, who's obviously one of the top young sires.

"We picked him out as a sire on the up a few years ago, but we need paydays like this to be able to keep going back to him now!"

Gryada's legacy grows

The purchase of Gryada (Shirley Heights) in December 2006 continues to pay rich dividends for Nicholas Jones of Coln Valley Stud, as a Dubawi colt, Lot 186, from a burgeoning branch of the great mare's family went the way of Godolphin at 800,000gns (approx.

AUD\$1.52milion) early on during Wednesday's session.

The six-figure youngster is the first foal out of Gryada's daughter Great And Small (Galileo) who carried Jones's silks to success in a Chester maiden and a career-best effort when fourth in the Noel Murless Stakes (Listed, 1m6f).

There was a distinct sense of deja vu about the transaction as last year's Book 1 saw a Kingman (Invincible Spirit) colt out of another daughter of Gryada, Grace And Favour (Montjeu), go Godolphin's way at 2,300,000gns, while a Showcasing (Oasis Dream) colt out of a third daughter, Grace And Glory (Montjeu), was knocked down for 600,000gns in 2018.

Despite the remarkable strike-rate of Gryada's daughters, Jones said the nature of the breeding business meant he had suffered his share of pre-sales anxiety.

"It's a nerve-racking game, this," he said.
"Those three minutes are the only time we have
any revenue coming into the stud. It's the one
chance we get each year to have cash coming
in, rather than going out, so I'm delighted.

"I do love the breeding game but I lose about a stone in weight coming up here every year. Although my wife would say that's a good thing!"

The pedigree has grown exponentially since Jones purchased Gryada for 180,000gns through Amanda Skiffington 14 years ago, thanks in no small part to the mare's son Fame And Glory (Montjeu) and daughter Yummy

Mummy (Montjeu), who is better known as the dam of Legatissimo (Danehill Dancer).

Jones reflected on the impact the late Gryada has had on Coln Valley since her acquisition, saying: "Gryada died a few years ago, she was quite old when I bought her, but she left these three fillies for us. She's been a wonderful broodmare for us and given us an enormous amount of fun.

"Great And Small is the third daughter of Gryada we have and this is her first foal. I have a full-brother to this colt at home, so I've just told Anthony Stroud I hope to see him here next year too! She's in foal to Bated Breath.

"All the colts we've sold out of Gryada's daughters have sold well, which is exciting and means I can afford to keep the fillies now."

Jones went on to explain that it was the exploits of Gryada and her daughters that had supplied the finances to fund nominations to the likes of Dubawi and Kingman.

He said: "She's also enabled us to go to these top stallions. I'm not sure what will happen with fees next year but our mares will still want to go to the best stallions, so I'm afraid I'll be writing a lot of cheques to the stallion owners.

"We have a small stud and try to have the best mares we can afford. I have a wonderful stud manager, Ian Emes, he's actually retiring next month after spending 18 years with me. Glen Eddery will be taking over."

Frankel filly sparkles

Godolphin's spree continued right into the evening when Stroud went to 700,000gns (approx. AUD\$1.32milion) for the Frankel filly out of the Listed scorer Pearly Steph (Oasis Dream) offered as Lot 350 by French-based consignor Haras de Saint Pair.

The page is replete with black type and traces back to Saint Pair's foundation mare Pearly Shells (Efisio). Pearls Galore (Invincible Spirit), who appears beneath the second dam, added further black type when she finished second in the Fairy Bridge Stakes (Gr 3, 7.5f) on her most recent outing.

"She's a lovely filly," said Saint Pair's Andreas Putsch. "We have plenty of the family, the family has been with me all the way since Pearly Shells, who won the Prix Vermeille and who we bought as a yearling at Goffs. Breeding is a long-term business and we've built the farm around her basically."

One more for Westerberg

Georg von Opel's Westerberg signed for the session's fifth-top lot after Tom Goff from Blandford Bloodstock went to 680,000gns (approx. AUD\$1.29milion) for the Siyouni (Pivotal) filly out of Listed winner Mischief Making (Lemon Drop Kid), that was offered as Lot 309 by Highclere Stud.

The filly is a sibling to five winners, most notably Cliveden Stud's Lancashire Oaks (Gr 3, 1m 3.5f) heroine Horseplay (Cape Cross) and the Listed-winning More Mischief (Azamour).

"She's been bought for Georg von Opel's Westerberg," confirmed Goff after signing the docket. "She's an absolute queen, a lovely filly with a fabulous outcross pedigree. John Gosden is going to train her."

Goff's other purchase on behalf of :

Westerberg turned out to be Miss Yoda (Sea The Stars), who won the German Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) having been one of the joint top lots at the 2018 BBAG Yearling Sale at €280,000.

Strong start for Almanzor

Cambridge Stud stallion Almanzor (Wootton Bassett) has made a promising start at the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. Six of his yearlings sold for an aggregate of 750,000gns (approx. AUD\$1.42milion) in the first two days of the sale, at an average of 125,000gns, (approx. AUD\$237,000) and median of 125,000gns.

Sackville Donald Bloodstock Agency went to 210,000gns (approx. AUD\$397,000) to secure Almanzor's highest priced yearling of the sale so far, Lot 336, the colt out of Nehalennia (Giant's Causeway), a daughter of former Champion Two-Year-Old Airwave (Air Express).

Cambridge Stud was also active at the sale, purchasing Lot 177, the Almanzor colt out of stakes winner Gemstone (Galileo) in partnership with Haras D'Etreham for 100,000gns (approx. AUD\$189,000).

Aggregate sales on day two dropped by 33 per cent compared to the corresponding session last year at 21,377,000gns (approx. AUD\$241.37milion). The average was also down by 26 per cent at 179,640gns (approx. AUD\$341,000) and median was clipped in by 17 per cent at 125,000gns (approx. AUD\$237,000). The clearance rate was 77 per cent, having been 84 per cent 12 months ago, as 119 of 154 offered yearlings found a buyer.

Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Yearling Sale on par With 2019

Average and median prices in line with last year's auction

he Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearlings Sale conducted at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium held its own despite dealing with the ongoing pressures of Covid-19 and final numbers were close to those seen during normal circumstances.

From 573 entries in a catalogue much larger than last year, the sales company reported 379 yearlings were sold for gross receipts of \$9,161,200 (approx. AUD\$12.69milion) at an average price of \$24,172 (approx. AUD\$33,750) and a \$14,000 median price (approx. AUD\$19,500). The 105 head that went unsold represented an RNA rate of 21.7 per cent.

In 2019, 300 yearlings averaged \$24,253 on gross sales of \$7,275,900, with the median also \$14,000. Last year's RNA rate was 21.3 per cent.

The number of six-figure transactions this year was 11, identical to 2019.

"Under the circumstances, with Covid-19 and its impact on 2020, we'd have to say the sale was a tremendous success in terms of being able to accomplish similar results to last year and it was a pretty good year last year," said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning Jr. "The market is still not easy. When there is a median of \$14,000, nobody who sells a horse for \$14,000 or less is making any money, we all know that. But it's not significantly different, if much different at all, from this marketplace last year."

Browning said attendance at the sale and the level of trade over the last two days reflected on the resiliency and professionalism of horsemen and women in the region.

"I continue to be shocked every year by the depth and diversity of buyers at the Timonium sales, both at the two-year-old sales and the yearling sales" he said. "It was well-attended and the sale felt good throughout both days and

plenty of commerce was conducted. I think in relative terms of Covid-19 and the calendar year 2020, we are very, very pleased with the results. We have been able to maintain the status quo, which I think is a win in the world we are living in right now."

The sale-topper was a colt from the first crop of Horse of the Year Gun Runner (Candy Ride) purchased by Bobby Lambe's Lambe Bloodstock for \$270,000 (approx. AUD\$377,000) from the offerings of Becky Davis, agent. The colt, Hip 371, is out of a half sister to two stakes winners including Melody Lady (Unbridled's Song), the dam of recent Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap (Gr1, 6f) winner Volatile (Violence). The colt's second dam is the Mutakddim (Seeking The Gold) millionaire Lady Tak, whose ten wins in 19 starts included the Test Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) and Ballerina Handicap (Gr 1, 7f)

Danzel Brendemuehl of Classic Bloodstock said Lambe bought the colt to be re-sold as a two-year-old next year, and that they are moving toward quality with their pinhook prospect purchases.

"We saw him and fell in love with him," she said of the colt, adding that she and Lambe tried to scare off the competition with an opening

bid of \$100,000. "He ticked all the boxes for us. We tried to steal him by opening up at \$100,000. It's his (Lambe's) birthday and he gave himself a present. He never told me to stop. That horse looked so fast to me. The Gun Runners are first-year horses going to the two-year-old sales so they'll love him.

"I don't want to pinhook the way I have in the past," said Brendemuehl. "If I have to sell horses I only want to do it at the top end. We're trying to find horses that check off all the boxes, especially this year when you're aware of how things can go wrong."

Lambe and Brendemuehl hit a home run earlier this year when a Not This Time (Giant's Causeway) colt they had bought for \$40,000 at last year's Midlantic yearling sale sold for \$650,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale.

Among the six-figure horses sold during the closing session was a Street Sense (Street Cry) colt purchased by West Bloodstock, agent for Mike Repole's Repole Stable and Vinnie Viola's St. Elias Stables, for \$240,000 (approx. AUD\$335,000).

Cataloged by Chanceland Farm, agent, as Hip 383, the colt was bred in Maryland by Mrs Robert

Manfuso and Katharine Voss and is a half brother to stakes winners Cordmaker (Curlin), Las Setas (Seville), and Corvus (Dance With Ravens).

"He was one of the top horses here," said agent Jacob West. "He looked like a big two-turn horse, like a classic-distance horse. That's what Mr Repole and Mr Viola are looking for, and we had to come here to find him. But a good horse can come from anywhere. We have a team and when it all comes together, it benefits the breeder."

Considering market demand for quality, West said he was not surprised at the price.

"It was a fair price for a nice horse," West said. "That is what he was worth. Being offered at public auction everybody had a chance to buy him so that's what he's worth."

The sale was conducted with pandemicdriven protocols, with seating in the sale pavilion limited to less than 75 per cent capacity. There were also masking and social distancing safeguards in place.

Given the uncertainties within the marketplace due to concerns over the coronavirus, the polarization that has been present in all equine sales the past several years is even more pronounced now, said consignor David Wade of Northview Stallion Station.

"It's very similar to what it's been the last few years, except magnified," Wade said. "The top is there, but once you start getting down below that, it's rough for everybody. Except for three, four, or five horses, we're getting them sold but we're not making any money and that's probably true with all the consignors here."


