Redvers' excitement grows over Zoustar's first northern hemisphere yearlings as Kameko seeks to carry the late Roaring Lion's baton at Tweenhills

tallions who truly stamp their legacy in both hemispheres are naturally a rare commodity. In shuttling terms, Danehill (Danzig) bridged the gap between Europe and Australia before his sire-sons Exceed And Excel and Fastnet Rock assumed the mantle, while More Than Ready (Southern Halo) and Medaglia D'Oro (El

Prado) lay claim to being the equine conduits between the US and Australia.

First for American Pharoah

Coolmore shuttler American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile) sired his first Australian winner yesterday when Head Of State (2 c ex Derelique by Danehill Dancer) made a big impression with a two-length success at WarwickFarm. Purchased by Coolmore from the Lime Country draft at last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Head Of State was the most expensive horse sold from American Pharoah's first Australian crop when he realised \$850,000.

<< Continued from page 1 Of course, those connected to any horse are unlikely to prove the most objective source of scrutiny, but Zoustar's southern hemisphere exploits need little introduction. A winner of the Golden Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on the track, the Widden Stud resident has already been crowned champion first and second season sire in Australia, his 16 stakes winners worldwide headlined by triple Group 1 heroine Sunlight and Singapore champion Top Knight.</p>

With Zoustar's first northern hemisphere crop now yearlings, ANZ Bloodstock News caught up with Redvers during a busy Sunday morning as the current foaling season hits top gear. We speak shortly after a "whopping great" Zoustar colt arrived overnight at his Tweenhills Stud in Gloucestershire, the northern hemisphere base of Zoustar and home of exciting new recruit Kameko (Kitten's Joy). More on him to come.

Redvers, who also serves as racing manager to Sheikh Fahad Al Thani's Qatar Racing operation, was in lucid and engaging form as we discussed a range of racing's most pertinent topics, but his excitement was palpable when the talk turned to the son of Northern Meteor (Encosta De Lago).

"He is a wonderful opportunity for UK, Irish and French breeders and anybody who has been to the sales in the southern hemisphere knows what to expect when they open the door of a Zoustar," Redvers says of the stallion who covered 149 mares at Tweenhills in 2019 and 124 last year.

"They all look very similar, with that wonderful head and hip. He puts this amazing action into his progeny, which really appeals to the market and is why the southern hemisphere sales prices are so strong."

Anticipating the sales ring traction his European yearlings will command later this year,

Redvers continues: "While a lot of people who will look at the Zoustars won't have seen him race, won't recognise the form, and probably won't recognise Northern Meteor and Encosta De Lago if they have a parochial approach to racing, when they see the physicals and all of the amazing accolades landed on him, I think it's going to be a bit of a no-brainer. If they're not buying the best ones, I certainly will be."

Zoustar will stand at £25,000 (approx. AUD\$44,500) this year and he has already kicked off 2021 in taking fashion, producing the top lot at the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale *Continued on page 4>>*

<< Continued from page 2 at Karaka, an NZD\$800,000 filly who was knocked down to Coolmore and Te Akau Racing, while his 51 lots sold at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale grossed \$14.76 million at an average of just shy of \$290,000.

A third high-class book of mares awaits him in the coming months, with Redvers continuing: "For the most part, we haven't tried to reinvent the wheel ourselves. We're acutely aware of what's worked with him down south and we've gone down the same route, sending him the majority of our sprinter-miler and precocious mares because that's what he is - a very fast, champion three-year-old sprinter."

Among Zoustar's yearlings on the ground is a colt out of Wind Fire, a dual Listed-winning daughter of Distorted Humor (Forty Niner) who ran third in the Norfolk Stakes (Gr 2, 5f) at Royal Ascot, and a son of La Rioja (Hellvelyn), who won the Dick Poole Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) as a juvenile prior to finishing fourth in the Commonwealth Cup (Gr 1, 6f) at three.

"These two colts have stallion potential written all over them," says Redvers, before quickly pointing out that another youngster on the farm, a filly out of the stakes-winning sprinter Arabda (Elnadim), is bred on the same cross as Zousain (Zoustar).

Now resident alongside his stallion at Widden, Zousain carried the Qatar Racing colours during his 13-race career, while his neck second to Sunlight in the 2018 Coolmore completed a trifecta for Zoustar, who also produced the third, Lean Mean Machine.

Redvers also notes how the Karaka sales topper is out of a Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare and a variation of that cross is evident in Zoustar's yearling filly from Lightening Quick, a Group 3-winning daughter of Frankel (Galileo) who is herself out of Qatar Racing's Cheveley Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) heroine Lightening Pearl (Marju).

She, alongside a filly out of Queen Mary Stakes (Gr 3, 5f) third and American Listed winner Out Of The Flames (Showcasing), is described by Redvers as "gorgeous" and "very fast-looking".

"These are a good bunch of yearlings, but the current foals will be even better next year as they're bred from the best mares he has covered so far. The only clear route is up," he adds.

Con Te Partiro among a stellar maiden book for Kameko

The latest addition to the four-strong roster at Tweenhills is last season's 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) winner Kameko, who carried Sheikh Fahad's claret with gold braid colours to success in the Vertem Futurity (Gr 1, 1m) at two, the only Group 1 hitherto run on an artificial surface in Europe.

Trained by Andrew Balding, Kameko also ran fourth in the Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f) after his Guineas success, faltering late as his stamina limitations ebbed away, while he was a luckless fourth behind Mohaather (Showcasing) in Goodwood's Sussex Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) just three weeks later.

Introduced to breeders at £25,000, he is set to receive robust home support from Qatar and Tweenhills by covering 45 mares between the two outfits, including dual Group 1 winner Con Te Partiro (Scat Daddy).

Originally trained by Wesley Ward, Con Te Partiro was a Listed winner at two and a Royal Ascot winner at three, but her career scaled new heights when she joined the stable of Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott in 2019, winning the Coolmore Classic (Gr 1, 1500m) the following year prior to taking out the Queen Of The Turf Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) on her penultimate outing back in April.

"We paid USD\$1.5 million for her in Kentucky and not many first season sires get sent a million-plus mare in their first book. She's just an extraordinary bit of kit and we're looking forward to seeing what they can get up to," Redvers says.

A Classic-winning colt with a bright future at stud inevitably leads the conversation towards the question of a potential shuttle deal, a topic that is particularly acute given the sudden and tragic loss of Qatar Racing's Roaring Lion (Kitten's Joy) in August 2019. Having covered his first northern hemisphere book that spring, the four-time Group 1 winner was due to stand at Cambridge Stud, but he was euthanised before the southern hemisphere breeding season began after suffering complications from two colic surgeries.

Asked if Kameko could be tasked with shuttling himself, Redvers says: "There are a couple of ongoing conversations, although nothing is ruled in or out at the moment. We won't be making any decisions on his future until we know he is fertile and capable of doing the job, but all the signs are very positive at present."

The symmetry between Kameko and Roaring Lion has occupied plenty of column inches, with both being Redvers-sourced Keeneland September graduates by Hill 'N Dale Farms' champion sire Kitten's Joy (El Prado).

Redvers continues of Kameko: "At the time I thought we'd bought the cheapest horse we'd got for years and I couldn't believe he only cost USD\$90,000 as he was such a good physical. You still don't expect him to do what he did, but he always looked very special to us.

"Andrew was training a couple of much more expensive horses for us at the time, but from a very early stage he kept talking about this Kitten's Joy horse who was going to be the next Roaring Lion. It's rather a wonderful story."

Roaring Lion set to stamp legacy with sole crop

While Roaring Lion's opportunity at stud was cruelly cut short, he did cover 133 mares at £40,000 during his sole breeding season.

The resulting offspring perked the interest of breeders in the foal market, with eight selling last year for an aggregate of £889,814 and an average of £111,226. However, Redvers only sees those numbers going one way.

"Because the stallion was dead, from a commercial point of view that creates a slightly stagnant foal market. I feel fairly confident that when we get to the yearling market there will be a completely different state of affairs, because trainers buy horses they want to train," he says.

"We've got 35 or so by him on the farm and we'll be looking at every single one in the ring. They have huge hips and there is a lot of his shape, girth, and head there.

"It's going to be fascinating and I certainly know, if he was still alive, I would be walking around on cloud nine at the moment thinking we are on the verge of something great, but we've just got to make the most of what we've got and hope there is a proper one amongst them."

Redvers also paid heed to Brendan and Jo Lindsay of Cambridge Stud, noting their foresight in relation to importing European bloodlines and the recent success of Almanzor (Wootton Bassett) at the first three southern hemisphere yearling sales of the year.

"Another reason I'm particularly heartbroken about Roaring Lion's untimely demise is that Cambridge is a very exciting and dynamic operation to be involved with," he says.

"Alarge pat on the back to them for investing massively in Almanzor. The manner in which they approach things shouldn't be a complete surprise when you consider that Brendan and Jo Lindsay are stratospherically successful business people, and they have approached Cambridge in a similar way, appointing some of the best people to their team."

Redvers on...Brexit

"From a bookings point of view, between France and Ireland we'd normally have 30-40 mares come to our stallions a year. We're in single digits for 2021 because the uncertainty is creating a bit of havoc. The VAT issue is also a nightmare. For example, we have a very smart Deep Impact filly out of Lightening Pearl who is due to go into training with Johnny Murtagh in Ireland. She's probably worth £1 million standing on her head,

but if you've got to pay £200,000 VAT and not see it again until she returns to the UK, it takes the price of another couple of yearlings out of your cash flow. I've also got a lot of mares currently booked to go to Ireland but we wanted to foal them here first because

of the Great British Bonus scheme. After Brexit, we can't ship the mares until the foals are 30 days old, which is a double whammy with the VAT issue, so it might well be that we've got to cancel those contracts and keep the mares here. We might find that if things don't sort themselves out quickly, a lot more UK-based mares come on stream that are currently pencilled in to Irish or French stallions, so things might net-out. But it's all a bit tiresome and all everyone wants to do is get back to a tripartite-type agreement where there is free movement of bloodstock between us and we can all trade and push on."

Redvers on...prize-money and early retirement

"The only disappointment with Kameko is that we had to retire him to stud at the end of his three-year-old career, purely on commercial grounds. He's put on about 56 kilos since he arrived at Tweenhills in November and he looks absolutely magnificent. You'd love to see him back in training at four and running in Group 1 races like the Lockinge and the Queen Anne, but the prize-money he could win would barely cover his insurance premium. In these post-Covid times, the prize-money in Britain has been pretty poor, but at least historically in the Group 1s it's not been too bad. Yet in 2021 it was terrible, and who knows how much money we left on the table just in a race like the Guineas. To put a Guineas winner back in training at four, you've got to be thinking you've got a chance of winning at least £1 million or £1.5 million or more, because if something happens and he gets hurt, you're going to hurt his value by many times that. It's a shame he won't get the chance to cement himself as a genuine champion, which all of us closest to the horse genuinely believe he is."

Redvers on...virtual sales

Redvers, alongside his long-standing associate Hannah Wall, teamed up with Rosemont Stud's Ryan McEvoy and agent Suman Hedge in sourcing colts for the newly established Victorian Alliance at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. Overall, the partnership bought six lots for an aggregate of \$3.6 million, including a \$1 million son of Zoustar from Widden Stud.

"It has been a fascinating experience because I've never worked a yearling sale online. I've come to the firm conclusion that you can't buy yearlings alone by that method, but if they are *Continued on page 6>>*

<< Continued from page 5 presented really well, it can certainly help you to form a strong opinion, and sometimes it can be an advantage being slightly detached because you look at things in a slightly less emotive fashion. It's really opened my eyes to online sales platforms and the need for industry to embrace that going forward. Necessity being the mother of invention, the Kiwis have really nailed the process. The void between the way horses are being presented online in the UK and Ireland and the way they are being presented in New Zealand is quite an education. Part</p>

of it is a generational thing, and there are one or two young stud managers in the northern hemisphere who understand what is required. The older generation have always done something in a certain way and are just pining for that time to return as fast as possible, rather than embracing change. From our point of view, we need to take heed very rapidly, because unless we get our funding structure sorted out over here, we're going to become a nursery for other racing jurisdictions anyway. Those of us who are growing the horses, racing and marketing them need to wake up to the future marketplace."

Redvers on...the Australian marketplace

"What is extraordinary is that so many of the big operations have started working together because it's so competitive. Everyone has a chance of finding the next champion and it's almost a meritorious and democratic system. What I find so exciting is that you can go

to a yearling sale, identify all of the horses you love, and almost not have to bid on a single one, and simply go around the parties who have bought them and take five or ten per cent shares in all of the ones you really rated. You have a serious chance of having the whole lot paid for if you know your onions and are working with the right teams. It's a much healthier and more dynamic system than the one we have in Britain, where the marketplace essentially revolves around meeting the needs of two or three families."

First for American Pharoah

Coolmore shuttler American (Pioneerof The Nile) sired his first Australian winner yesterday when Head Of State (2 c ex Derelique by Danehill Dancer) made a big impression with a two-length success at Warwick Farm. Purchased by Coolmore from the Lime Country draft at last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Head Of State was the most expensive horse sold from American Pharoah's first Australian crop when he realised \$850,000. Sent into training with Chris Waller, the blue-blooded juvenile shaped with plenty of promise to run fifth in the \$1m Golden Gift (1100m) on debut at Rosehill in November and he built on that form under James McDonald yesterday, downing Wilsons Prom (Xtravagant) over 1300 metres. Collier Bay (Capitalist) was a further head back in third. Coolmore owns Head Of State in partnership with the likes of Waller, Sir Peter Vela, Debbie Kepitis' Woppitt Thoroughbreds, Peachester Lodge and Robert McClure and he is a half-brother to Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Man From Uncle (Uncle Mo). Head Of State was bred by Brad Crismale and his unraced dam, Derelique (Danehill Dancer), was bought by Colm Santry Bloodstock for the Crismale family for \$80,000 from the 2009 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. Her offspring have since sold for almost \$2 million. Yesterday's result ensured American Pharoah became the 18th first season sire to produce a winner in Australia this year, while he has sired 97 individual victors worldwide. They include 14 stakes winners, headlines by top-tier scorers Van Gogh and Harvey's Lil Goil. The US Triple Crown hero covered 100 mares

at a fee of \$55,000 in 2020, including Derelique again, with the daughter of Danehill Dancer (Danehill) having produced a filly by him the previous season.

Group 1 targets for Head Of State

Head Of State does not feature among the nominations for next month's Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), but Waller still has lofty targets for the promising colt. "You can see he is still a little bit green. He just wobbled around the bend a little bit," Waller said. He's probably not a natural on-pace horse but he did everything right to let down strongly and he will take a lot of improvement from it. I would think he is a Sires', Champagne type of horse but if not, he will be a Guineas horse in the spring." McDonald was equally enthusiastic, describing Head Of State as a "beauty". "It's really nice to get a good, dominant win on the board because I reckon he's a pretty good horse who will measure up in good races come 1400 (metres), a mile," McDonald said. "He's just got a lovely action and a good mindset." McDonald went on to land a treble yesterday with victories aboard the Waller-trained Seleque (Deep Field) alongside Newsreader (Press Statement) for John O'Shea.

Warrior strikes Gold to stay unbeaten in three

Turk Warrior (2 g Outreach - Ehor by Val Royal) made it stakes win number two and stretched his unbeaten record to three when he produced a dominant performance in the Gold Sovereign Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Launceston yesterday. Trained by Glenn Stevenson, the progressive gelding emulated his dam, Ehor (Val Royal), in winning both the Gold Sovereign Stakes and Elwick Stakes (Listed, 1100m), having taken out the latter prize second time out on January 24. The producer of five winners, Ehor secured the double in 2007. Sent off the red-hot \$1.35 favourite yesterday, Turk Warrior gave his supporters little reason to worry as he stamped his class on the eight-runner field, pulling three and a half lengths clear of Outbound (Outreach) in second to complete a quinella for Widden Stud's young sire Outreach (Exceed And Excel), for whom Turk Warrior was a first stakes winner. Meanwhile, Adam Trinder trained the second, third and fourth home as Outbound finished a long-neck in front of Miss Tuppence (Capitalist), who in turn was a head clear of Miss Charlie Brown (Myboycharlie). Bred and consigned by Grenville Stud, Turk Warrior was passed in for \$24,000 at the Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale last year. Ehor's Zululand (Fastnet Rock) yearling colt will be offered at the corresponding auction on February 22 as Lot 106, while she was covered by Grenville Stud's Stratosphere (Snitzel) in September, having slipped to the same sire the previous year. Turk Warrior's second dam is Group 1 winner Love To Dance (Citidancer).

Inglis Digital top lot Kosciuszko-bound

A tilt at the \$1.3 million The Kosciuszko (1200m) is on the cards for Mo's Crown

(Uncle Mo) after the five-time winner topped yesterday's Inglis Digital February (Early) Online Sale. The four-year-old realised \$110,000 when bought by Australian Bloodstock having been offered by Jason Coyle Racing and he will now be transferred to the stables of Cody Morgan. "He's a city performer and has also raced at Group level and has a NSW metropolitan benchmark rating of 80. These types of horses are hard to come by in the current market," Australian Bloodstock's Luke Murrell said. "We think he could be a Kosciuszko horse in the spring and based on the strong market at the recent Inglis Classic Yearling Sale, he looks like a good buy at that level." Second top lot yesterday went the way of Ord (Written Tycoon), with the maiden three-year-old knocked down to Gangemi Thoroughbreds for \$80,000. All Winners Thoroughbred paid \$70,000 for last-start Randwick winner The First Of May (Zoffany), while Tony and Di Marwick's Secret View Thoroughbreds offered their 2021 yearling draft in yesterday's catalogue, with six youngsters sold for \$109,500.

Possible West Nile virus case detected in Adelaide Hills

Equine authorities are on alert after the detection of a possible case of the West Nile virus-Kunjin strain in a horse in the Adelaide Hills. The South Australian Department of Primary Industries and Regions was notified of the development and while the case remains unconfirmed, PIRSA is urging horse owners and veterinarians to act with diligence. The virus, which can cause serious disease in both humans and horses, is transmitted by mosquitoes from animal-to-animal. Initial testing did not determine if the antibody was from a recent infection or from a past infection, with additional testing being undertaken. Meanwhile, horse owners are being encouraged to manage mosquitoes on their property by removing potential breeding areas such as pot plants or water tanks and by rugging horses in the mornings and evenings as well as using insecticide to help reduce the incidence of bites.

Dreamforce ready for Apollo mission

Chris Waller's quartet of runners seemingly hold the key to Saturday's Apollo Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Randwick, but John Thompson is confident of a bold showing from the returning Dreamforce (Fastnet Rock). The winner of the George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m) last autumn, Dreamforce finished a narrow second to Alizee (Sepoy) in this race 12 months ago. A track and distance specialist, the eight-year-old shaped well in two recent barrier trials and Thompson said the feedback from regular rider Nash Rawiller has been glowing. "He was very happy after the trial and he galloped him here on Tuesday on the Kensington track and said he's going super," Thompson said. "We've had no problems with him this time, he's happy and his trials have been very good. He is going well and he should run well." Dreamforce will break from barrier two as a field of ten have accepted for the Apollo, although Mo'unga (Savabeel) has also been paid up for the CS Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Flemington.

Mugatoo out to secure ASM berth

Also featuring among the ten acceptors for the Apollo is Australian Bloodstock's Mugatoo (Henrythenavigator), who is out to secure a wildcard berth for next month's All-Star Mile (1600m). "That's our plan provided he runs well on Saturday, and while he might find it hard to win at 1400 metres first-up, I think he'd be very strong late and that will set him up nicely for a mile," Australian Bloodstock director Jamie Lovett told Racing.com. "You'd reckon he'd be up there leading the pack to get one (a wildcard). The formline out of the Cox Plate is incredible and there won't be any that miss out with a formline like his." Mugatoo, who has slipped to 12th in the voting leaderboard for the All-Star Mile, was last seen running fourth behind Sir Dragonet (Camelot) in the Cox Plate on October 24. If the wildcard option does not materialise, Lovett added: "He'll go to the Ryder and then the Queen

Inside seeks Slipper berth in Pierro Plate

Impressive Randwick debut winner Stay Inside (Extreme Choice) will get the chance to outline his credentials for next month's Golden Slipper Stakes when he lines-up in the Pierro Plate (1100m) at the same track on Saturday. Trained by Richard and Michael Freedman, the \$200,000 purchase from last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast auction came two and three-quarter lengths clear on debut last month and he is one of 13 juveniles set to line-up over 1100 metres at the weekend. "It'll be interesting to see if he can make the necessary improvement to put him in the mix with some of the better two-year-olds," Michael Freedman told Racing NSW. "We're going in with an open mind to see how he measures up. He's trained on well since then and is a little more switched on now. With two-year-olds you like to see them coping with the rigors and not showing signs of needing the paddock. Touch wood he's not showing that at the moment." Reflecting on the debut win, Freedman added: "He probably surprised a little bit, I was happy enough going into the race thinking he could run well. Until they do it you never really know but he ran out that race the other day over the shorter trip pretty strongly. It suggests the 1100 metres on Saturday will suit then hopefully beyond that."

Also at Randwick, James McDonald is expecting a bold run from the Chris Waller-trained Hungry Heart (Frankel) when she makes her return in the Light Fingers Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). The leading jockey said the three-year-old worked sharply on Tuesday and while she "needs to raise the bar a bit", he is confident the filly has it in her after two forward barrier trials in the past month. "We've always had her in high regard and she needs to repay that, but I'm sure she will," McDonald told Racing NSW. "Being a Frankel she is always going to improve as she gets older so hopefully we can now reap the rewards. She's quite a deceiving filly, she always gives the impression from a rider's point of view that she will stay and stick on a bit but she might be a bit sharper than what we first thought. So I expect her to be very hard to beat over six furlongs." Hungry Heart, who hasn't raced since finishing seventh in the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) on October 10, ran a close second behind Dame Giselle (I Am Invincible) first-up in the Furious Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) in the spring.

Meanwhile at Flemington, co-trainer Troy Cortsens acknowledges three-year-old filly Swats That (Shamus Award) is facing her

biggest test to date in Saturday's Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m). "It's well and truly sending her in the deep end," Corstens, who trains in partnership with his father Leon, said. "She's facing two of the world's best sprinters in Bivouac and Nature Strip and that's just for starters. Then there's a myriad of stars such as Pippie and Fabergino. Where the two three-yearold fillies, September Run and Swats That stand, well who knows? We'll find out." Swats That ended her last preparation with a second behind the reopposing September Run (Exceed And Excel) in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on October 31, and the Chris Waller-trained filly was the only horse to defeat Swats That in the spring having also downed her first up in the Cap D'Antibes Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Flemington. In between those runs, Swats That won the Champagne Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Moonee Valley and the Thoroughbred Club Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield. "She's flying. She's been terrific in her two jump-outs. I think she's come back in excellent form," Corstens said. Swats That will be ridden by Jye McNeil, who replaces her regular rider John Allen.

Mallyon to reunite with Halvorsen

Queensland-based jockey Andrew Mallyon will reunite with Halvorsen (Magnus) in the Lightning Stakes as part of a long-term commitment made by the five-year-old's co-trainer, Robbie Griffiths, after the duo won the Standish Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) on New Year's Day. "He knows the horse really well and I always promised him he could ride him when this horse gets to weight-for-age and the better races and so he's coming back," Griffiths, who trains in partnership with Mat de Kock, told Racing.com. Mallyon has ridden Halvorsen nine times for five wins and looking ahead to the weekend assignment, Griffiths added: "He faces a task, but he is good down the straight and while he'll probably be racing for the minor end, it'll be a good lead-up to the Newmarket, which is his ultimate goal."

King eyes Saturday return

Group 1-winning jockey Lachie King is set to return to riding with three mounts at Flemington on Saturday after suffering a horror fall at Yarra Valley last week. "I am very lucky, realistically. I got out of it pretty good," King told Racing.com of last Saturday's incident. "It looked like a pretty heavy fall when I watched the replay. I was really lucky the horse bounced over the top of me and I had no horses behind me, so I'm very lucky and I've counted my blessings a bit. Hopefully I will be back at the races on Saturday."

Futurity confirmed next-up for Kirk

Co-trainer Wayne Hawkes has confirmed Ole Kirk (Written Tycoon) will have his next start in the Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Caulfield on February 20 having made a pleasing return to action with a running-on third in the Inglis Sprint (1200m) last Saturday. "He is definitely coming to Melbourne for the Futurity Stakes, that's the next race on the agenda," Hawkes, who trains in partnership with his father John and his brother Michael, told RSN927. "It's obviously a one-week back-up to the Australian Guineas, so you would have to come through the Futurity in great form and pull up well. The Australian Guineas is still on the table with every other race. He's still nominated for the Australian Guineas and he's still in the Australian Guineas until we choose to not accept. It's as simple as that." Meanwhile, Hawkes confirmed Written Beauty (Written Tycoon) will head to Melbourne to contest the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) on the same day.

Star-studded morning at Rosehill trials

Rosehill is set to host an important set of trials this morning, including a 900-metre clash between Golden Slipper contenders Remarque (Snitzel), who was a two-length winner on debut for Team Hawkes last month, and Chris Waller's Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) hero Shaquero (Shalaa). Also in action will be Master Of Wine (Maxios), King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice), Haut Brion Her (Zoustar) and star filly Montefilia (Kermadec), while the Joe Pride-trained Eduardo (Host) will warm up for his first-up assignment in the Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1000m) at Randwick on March 6 before pressing onto the Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) at Rosehill two weeks later. "He looks great. He has filled out a bit more and he is knowing his routine a bit better now," Pride said.

SA performer surges up ASM leaderboard

Regalo Di Gaetano (Supreme Class) is all but a confirmed All-Star Mile runner after he shot up to seventh in the voting leaderboard as of yesterday. Trained by Richard and Chantelle Jolly, the last-start Durbridge Stakes (Listed, 1100m) fourth was on Monday occupying 14th spot with 1,395 votes, but that number had risen to 4,805 after a plea to South Australia's Italian community to vote the five-year-old in. In the same 48-hour period, Russian Camelot moved from 4,109 votes to just 4,660 votes. Voting for the \$5 million All-Star Mile will enter blackout mode at 10pm tomorrow before closing at midnight on Sunday. Regalo Di Gaetano's regular partner Caitlin Jones is set to keep the ride at Moonee Valley on March 13. "I've been fortunate to create a really good bond with the horse and I've spoken to the owners a few times and they're keen to stick with me if he does get in," she told Racing.com.

Voting incentives gained 'no traction whatsoever'

Additional incentives for voting a horse into the All-Star Mile have proved largely unsuccessful, according to two sets of connections. Connections of South Australian star Behemoth (All Too Hard) offered a ten per cent ownership stake for the day, but owner Grand Syndicates' racing manager Sam Lyons told Racing.com: "To be honest, what I think is important is having a horse you can get up on that leaderboard quickly because you don't see it change much after even a few days. The fact that we had something like that ready the first minute, the first day (of voting), it drags in a lot of votes really quickly and that can give you the head start really quickly." Malua Racing, who have Mamzelle Tess (O'Lonhro) in the mix, also offered a ten per cent ownership stake for the day as well as another five per cent for each of two separate charities, The Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre and Pinchapoo. "It was a little surprising I guess because we got no traction whatsoever," Mamzelle Tess co-trainer Troy Corstens said.

Blood to return to pretraining in March

Group 1 winner Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) could be back in pre-training by March after successfully recovering from spinal surgery, owner Allan Endresz has told Racing.com. "We've got the green light. He's come out the end super and they're saying early March we can start making preparations for pre-training," Endresz said. "We are really pumped. They've given him the complete once over...we were delighted (to hear the news) on Monday." Alligator Blood, who won the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) last year, will now be trained by Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott and Endresz continued: "We don't want to rush him. He's a bit frisky and excited in the paddock. But he's just got this real sense of wanting to run and carry on. But he will tell us (how far he wants to go). We will use the teams we have got for pretraining...and then we will focus on a trial and he will head on a truck down to Sydney and we will let Gai take over."

Fine season continues for Sandhu

Comanche Brave (Sacred Falls) became Julius Sandhu's eighth winner for the season when the three-year-old led throughout to land the \$50,000 Benchmark 64 Handicap (1800m) at Sandown yesterday. "I'm really pleased," Sandhu told Racing.com. "This was an exciting day for us as a stable, I'd been waiting to get this guy out to a trip and I think he'll step out even further. Beau (Mertens) rode him a treat and he knew from his race at Yarra Valley what he had under him when he got rolling. I told him to get him rolling as soon as he could, he did and the horse responded so I'm happy." By winning for the second time in four starts, Commence Brave continued Sandhu's fine campaign to date. Six of his eight winners have been at metropolitan level, taking his career Melbourne tally to 12 since preparing his first runner at Moonee Valley in December 2017.

McGrath notches first city winner

Narrowly beaten over 1300 metres on the Lakeside track three weeks ago, D'jumbuck (Starspangledbanner) atoned for that defeat to provide Cranbourne-based trainer Brian McGrath with his first Melbourne winner on the Hillside course at Sandown yesterday. "We thought he was going to be hard to beat but he got there a little bit too soon and Jamie (Kah) just thought he was waiting for the other horse (Lofty Star)," McGrath told Racing.com of the three-year-old's last-start second. With that defeat in mind, Kah rode D'jumbuck patiently yesterday and, after guiding the gelding to a short-head victory, she said: "He still got there too soon because he got there and he waited for them, but it was a lot better than last start. I think if we could get him to settle even one pair further back he's going to be a nice horse."

Cup targets for Defibrillate

Patrick Payne-trained Defibrillate (Shocking) will be out to make it four wins in a row when he returns to the track at Caulfield next week. The six-year-old brought up the hattrick when taking out the Lord Stakes (Listed, 1700m) at the same venue on Boxing Day prior to victories on January 9 and 30. "He is running on February 20 at Caulfield, which is probably not the ideal course for him," part-owner and co-breeder Graham Richardson said. "He has had two starts for two wins there, but it is quite tight. He is going there over 2000 metres in a Listed race." Looking ahead, Richardson added: "I will leave it to Paddy Payne and he will make his mind up whether he will go towards the Australian Cup two weeks later, which is a big ask, or continue to the Mornington Cup, which is a great race too."

Record-breaking turnover across Queensland summer carnival

Racing Queensland has revealed the Queensland summer carnival achieved recordbreaking turnover in its nine-week campaign. Turnover on the 2020-21 summer carnival grew by \$77 million to \$325.9 million (+31 per cent), eclipsing its winter counterpart for the first time. Wagering highlights included the Grand Prix (Gr 3, 2200m) (+43 per cent), Mooloolaba Cup (1600m) (+47 per cent) and TAB Wave (1800m) (+37 per cent). Magic Millions raceday at the Gold Coast maintained its standing as Queensland's largest wagering day with

turnover growing to \$68.4 million (+17 per cent). "The TAB Queensland summer racing carnival continues to come along in leaps and bounds," Racing Queensland CEO Brendan Parnell said. "We enjoyed strong turnover growth across all nine meetings, and for the first time, the uplift in wagering on The Wave and Magic Millions set a new Queensland turnover record of \$104 million across two meetings."


RA whip committee to finalise report

Racing Australia's committee overseeing each state's position on the future of the whip is set to finalise its report next Monday. "There has been dialogue, collating each PRA's point of view that will be handed to the board ahead of their meeting on February 26," RA chairman Greg Nichols told Racing.com "It will just be liaising and talking to the participants next Monday. RA is constitutionally bound and every state's view will be properly articulated at that time." Meanwhile, the Country Mile Race Series, which will trial whip limitations in Victoria, gets underway at Colac this weekend and trainers have supported the initiative with more than 50 horses nominated for the opening contest.

Belle out to make history in Herbie Dyke

Jamie Richards is hoping he will witness history at Te Rapa on Saturday when Melody Belle (Commands) contests the Herbie Dyke Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m). Melody Belle equalled Sunline's (Green Desert) record of 13 Group 1 wins for a New Zealand horse when victorious in the Thorndon Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) at Trentham last start and Richards believes she is in good shape to obtain the outright record. "I think she has gone the right way," he said. "It was important that we had her forward enough to run well and also handle the travel to Wellington. She hasn't missed a beat since she has been home. She has done some nice work and I am really happy with where she is at for the weekend. I think it is her pet trip now. In all of her track work and all of her races she always runs around the corner and takes a long time to pull up, indicating that she wants to go a bit further. Her 2000-metre



Levante primed for Te Rapa test

Ken Kelso is looking forward to seeing his exciting mare Levante (Proisir) again take on Avantage (Fastnet Rock) in the BCD Group Sprint (Gr 1, 1400m) at Te Rapa on Saturday. Levante has won six of her eight starts but lost out to Avantage in her sole outing in Group 1 company in the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on New Year's Day. Levante returned to winning form in the Westbury Classic (Gr 2, 1400m) at Ellerslie on Karaka Million night and Kelso is confident that taking on Avantage over a longer trip will play to Levante's strengths. "They slowed the pace mid-race in the Railway and that left her a bit flat-footed, but she came home pretty good," Kelso, who trains in partnership with his wife Bev, said. "The step up to 1400 metres helps her too. She proved that in the Westbury. She's very happy at 1400 metres and probably even further."

Sound tasked with dual Cup program

The Mike Moroney-trained Sound (Lando) will make his second trip to New Zealand in a bid to secure his first Group 1 success. The eightyear-old entire, who was trained in Germany before moving to Moroney's stable in 2018, secured his first southern hemisphere win in November's Zipping Classic (Gr 2, 2400m). Earlier in the year, he finished runner-up to Roger That (Shinko King) in the Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) and he will bid to go one better in the corresponding contest on March 13. He will tackle the Avondale Cup (Gr 2, 2400m) on Saturday week in preparation for his main target. "He's still a stallion and a lovely horse with a future at stud but we're looking forward to winning some more races with him before then," Moroney told Racing.com. "He did a smart piece of work on the grass Tuesday and I'm confident if he runs up to his best he'll be the horse to beat in both races. He retained a good degree of residual fitness from his last spring campaign and he is clearly up to winning a race like the Auckland Cup, which would be terrific as he has a large percentage of New Zealand ownership."

Late call on Tokorangi target

Co-trainer Pam Gerard is weighing up her options with talented filly Tokorangi (Redwood), who holds nominations for Te Rapa's two three-year-old features on Saturday, the Waikato Guineas (Gr 2, 2000m) and the David and Karyn Ellis Fillies Classic (Gr 2, 2000m). "All week I was probably going to go to the Guineas but then I looked last night and this morning and thought that the way they are going, maybe the fillies was the way to go," said Gerard, who trains in partnership with Mike Moroney. "I knew Andrew Scott's horse was going the other way and a few of the others like Save To Love. But they have paid up for the filles race as well so I'm thinking of switching back to the Guineas. I have a far better draw there. We ummed and ahed about paying up for both but it is a tough one."

Group 3 aim for Sword Of State

Group 2 performer Sword Of State (Snitzel) recorded his second win from just three starts when taking out the Stable Books 1100 at Matamata yesterday and is now set for a return to the track to contest Waikato Stud Slipper (Gr 3, 1200m) on February 27. The Jamie Richardstrained juvenile was backed into \$1.10 favouritism after placing in the Eclipse Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day and won accordingly in the hands of Opie Bosson. "They went along at a genuine tempo and he was chasing the whole way and got there the last bit," Richards said. "I don't think the second horse (Dragon Biscuit) is a bad galloper. I watched him do some work here at Matamata and he looks to be able to go along alright. He (Sword Of State) will go to the Matamata Slipper here in 17 days. He is going to have to be at his best, but I think he can improve off the back of that."

Oaks hopeful off the mark

Ali Arc (Bullbars) broke her maiden at the fifth attempt at Matamata yesterday with a comfortable one-length victory in her 1600-metre contest and co-trainer Graham

Richardson is now eyeing a tilt at the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) next month. "She looks like she needs more ground already and we always thought that is what she would do," Richardson, who trains in partnership with Rogan Norvall, said. "She has come alright at the right time and it (the Oaks) has always been the plan from when we bought her." Richardson admitted Ali Arc may not be at her best for the Trentham feature but Classic opportunities only come around once in a horse's career. "She has needed time and she will definitely be better next year, but you are only three once," Richardson said. "There are a couple of options to get there. There's the Sunline Vase on Derby Day or the Lowland, but that would be two trips away and I don't think she would handle that so we would possibly go to Ellerslie."

Comme Bella Fille impresses at Matamata

Catherine Cameron has a promising threeyear-old filly on her hands in the form of Comme Bella Fille (Complacent), who was successful in the Lyndhurst Farm Maiden (1400m) at Matamata yesterday. Comme Bella Fille came from the rear of the field under Tegan Newman to score in the manner of a filly that will be effective over further. "She has always been a nice, athletic filly and has wanted to please," Cameron said. "She got flattened at her first start and then ran a super third at Te Rapa before we freshened her up. She had a quiet trial at Rotorua last week and we had to back her up this week if we were any hope to get to something like the Sunline Vase, which would be our preferred target."

SGP: John issued with threemonth suspension

John Sundradas has received a threemonth suspension for failing to ride Super Talent (Hussonet) with sufficient vigour and determination in a Class 5 contest at Kranji on Sunday. From the 600 metres, stewards determined that John did not encourage Super Talent to obtain the best possible position, with the six-year-old finishing ninth of 12. John will be suspended from riding in races from February 14 to May 13 inclusive.

USA: Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale ends with a flourish

The final moments of the Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale saw a flurry of activity with a number of late high-profile buys culminating in the last lot of the day - Saguaro Row, a six-year-old Union Rags (Dixie Union) mare - selling for \$500,000 (approx. AUD\$646,500), the second-highest priced horse of the day. Fasig-Tipton reported 218 horses sold from 260 offered on Tuesday. The aggregate for the day came to \$8,550,400 (approx. AUD\$11.1 million), the average was \$39,222 (approx AUD\$50,700) and the median was \$11,000 (approx. AUD\$14,200). Across the two days of sale, 425 horses were reportedly sold for \$12,506,700 (approx. AUD\$16.2 million). During the same sale in 2020, 368 horses sold for \$9,777,100. "Obviously, the sale was dominated by the highlights later in the sale, but we had quality horses throughout the sale," said Fasig-Tipton president and CEO Boyd Browning. "It's the same story over and over, quality sells. The demand for quality offerings is tremendous."

IRE: Australian-bred mare tops Goffs February Sale

Rubira (Lope De Vega), winner of the 2018 1600m) Champagne Stakes (Listed. New Zealand, realised €100,000 (approx. AUD\$157,000) to top Part 1 of the Goffs February Sale yesterday. Purchased by Alex Elliott from the Baroda Stud draft, Rubira (Lot 253) made 11 starts for one win in the southern hemisphere, where she was under the care of Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman. Rubira, who has been purchased in foal to Ballylinch Stud Stallion New Bay (Dubawi), is out of Ad Valorem (Danzig) mare Duty Bound, who won a Goulburn maiden during her six-race career. Buyer Alex Elliott purchased her for a syndicate in Ireland he'd put together and will look to put her in foal to Camelot (Montjeu) this year. "You've got to be a good quality mare to have won a Listed race," said Elliott to ANZ Bloodstock News. "She's in foal to New Bay who made a great start with his two-year-olds and we'll look to put her back in foal to Camelot this year, which obviously appeals to the Australian market." Meanwhile, Bert Kerr - the purchaser of last year's Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Twilight Payment (Teofilo) claimed Mehmas (Acclamation) gelding Drish Venture for €50,000 (approx. AUD\$78,400) on Tuesday. Kerr, who operates the world's oldest bloodstock agency with the successful bidder's uncle and namesake having founded Kerr & Co back in 1920, bought Twilight Payment at another Goffs auction for €200,000 in 2018.

UK: Travellers returning from Dubai face hotel quarantine under new Covid measures

Jockeys, trainers and stable staff returning to Britain from Dubai face the prospect of quarantining in a hotel for ten days at their own expense under enhanced Covid-19 travel restrictions due to come into force on Monday. While the UAE was added to the UK government's red-list countries last month, requiring the toughest isolation measures for those returning from the nation, racing professionals involved in the Saudi Cup on February 20 will also encounter disruption following the withdrawal of the elite athlete quarantine exemption. In its February newsletter, the Professional Jockeys Association wrote: "Elite Athlete Traveller Exemption has been withdrawn for Dubai. Please also note that it has been announced that returners from countries on the 'red list' will have to quarantine in a hotel on their return to the UK. As for Saudi Arabia, we have been informed by the BHA that Public Health England would not support the BHA issuing Elite Athlete Traveller Exemptions for Saudi Arabia. Arrivals from Saudi Arabia will therefore have to adhere to government guidance and quarantine on return but can opt for the test-to-release scheme."

USA: Maxfield to return in Mineshaft Stakes

The lightly-raced Maxfield (Street Sense), who won the Breeders' Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 8.5f) in 2019, will begin his 2021 season in the Mineshaft Stakes (Gr 3, 8.5f) at Fair Grounds on Saturday. Maxfield has only raced twice since his sole Group 1 win and was last seen landing the Tenacious Stakes (Listed, 8.5f) at Fair Grounds on December 19. "He was always going to be a big strong horse - he's always been a big-framed horse. But he's grown into that frame and is close to the finished article," trainer Brendan Walsh told Bloodhorse of the Godolphin-raced colt, who will bid to extend his unbeaten record to five at the weekend.

FR: Champion juvenile to return in Prix de Fontainebleau

Last year's champion French two-year-old Sealiway (Galiway) is set to resume in the Prix de Fontainebleau (Gr 3, 1600m) at Longchamp in April en route to a Classic campaign that will contain the Poule d'Essai des Poulains (Gr 1, 1600m) and possibly a rise in trip for the Prix du Jockey Club (Gr 1, 2100m). "He has had a good winter and is in good shape," Pauline Chehboub from Haras de la Gousserie, owners of Sealiway with breeder Guy Pariente, told Horse Racing Planet. "He has been working good but he has done nothing serious yet. I can't wait to see him on the racecourse again. First, we will run in the Prix de Fontainebleau and after that the target will be the Poule d'Essai des Poulains and then we will see about the Jockey Club. His trainer thinks he has a lot of stamina so we will see if he can stay or not."

ears? What fears. After three further days of remarkable trade in the Australasian yearling market, the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale continued in the same vein as preceding sales at the start of the year, the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale and New Zealand's Karaka Yearling Sale, producing astonishing figures as the sales ground reverberated with energy.

Aggregate; up. Average; up. Clearance rate; up. With metrics soaring across the board, over recent years and to varying degrees and timelines, the Inglis Classic Sale is becoming the yearling auction that no player can afford to miss.

Building from a value sale, focused on type for the domestic market, it has evolved into a global powerhouse, delivering champions for the influential Asian jurisdictions in Hong Kong and beyond, a goldmine for the rapidlygrowing syndication industry and, fueled by the sheer number of stallions the sale has produced, colt funds and stud masters are increasingly discovering it to be a catalogue that delivers commercial opportunities for standing stallions.

"We looked at the stats," said James Harron after purchasing the sale's second top lot by Capitalist (Written Tycoon) out of Mystical Tale (Encosta De Lago) for \$600,000 on Sunday.

Among those statistics he would have discovered I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit), his sire-sons Brazen Beau and Hellbent as well as Arrowfield stallion Castelvecchio (Dundeel) as graduates of the sale.

Asia has already reaped the rewards. Group 1 winner, Hot King Prawn (Denman), is a 2016 graduate of the sale, while Nothingilikemore (Husson), winner of the Hong Kong Classic Mile (Listed, 1600m), passed through the Classic sales' ring a year prior, purchased for just \$40,000 from the Toolooganvale draft.

A decade ago, results from the 2011 edition of the Inglis Classic Sale saw Asia take home just 1.7 per cent of the offerings sold from the Inglis Classic.

Fast forward through the next ten years and those figures have rocketed. Asia, led by trainer Ricky Yiu, clients for leading bloodstock agent John Foote, as well as George Moore and family saw a peak spend of a tick over \$6 million at the 2018 Inglis Classic Yearling Sale, with this year's edition farewelling just under \$5 million of horseflesh to the jurisdictions of Hong Kong, Singapore and China, among others.

A notable spike can be viewed in 2017, where spend increased by \$2.5 million to \$3,070,000 for an 8 per cent share of trade.

For syndicators, a swelling industry indicative of the very vibrancy of the thoroughbred business and appetite for racing ownership on these shores, the sale offers exactly the type of horse and price range for their eager target market.

A decade ago, syndicators were responsible for less than \$1 million in purchases from the sale, a 6.4 per cent share of trade. Triple Crown Syndications, with a spend of \$185,000, led a handful of promoters seeking to secure horses for syndication.

Enter Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Brazen Beau (I Am Invincible) (Ontrack Thoroughbreds), Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) winner She Will Reign (Manhattan Rain) and Group 1 winner Yankee Rose (All American) (both Darby Racing), among others, and

spending at the Inglis Classic Sale by syndicators has increased exponentially, peaking at \$6.7 million in 2018, with 2021's spend falling just shy of that figure. Market share, similarly, has grown from a lowly 6.4 per cent in 2011, to 12.5 per cent in 2021.

For colts' funds and stallion masters, this is a sale that has been incrementally chomped at. Aquis Farm, jumping on to the scene in 2017, had invested heavily, buying ten colts that year.

But the emergence of James Harron and his much envied battalion of high-flying investors seems a significant launch into the Classic Sale. Harron, whose syndicate has raced the likes of Capitalist, Pariah (Redoute's Choice) and King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice) on the track, purchased four colts from this year's Classic sale, up from two a year ago and a solitary Spirit Of Boom (Sequalo) purchase in 2019. In 2018, his cheque book was reserved for elsewhere.

syndicate, too, have invested here in recent years, securing the Zoustar (Northern Meteor) colt out of Blazing Snitzel (Snitzel) in this year's edition, while three colts in 2020 went the way of the racing and breeding giants.

It is an evolution that has the propensity to propel the Inglis Classic Sale into the next realm on the auction ladder and, from humble beginnings, this evolution makes it a sale that no one can ignore.

TREVOR MARSHALLSEA'S IN-DEPTH PEDIGREE ANALYSIS

ome racetrack stories are glorious from start to finish, like Black Caviar or Frankel. Others pick up off a slower start, like Phar Lap or Winx, and it can be the same at stud.

After some faltering beginnings belying his regal pedigree, Street Boss may be building into the latter category.

Last Saturday's imperious win by Arcaded in the Blue Diamond Prelude (Fillies) (Gr 2, 1100m) at Caulfield was more resounding evidence that despite turning 17 next month, her sire's best days could still be ahead of him.

The highest-priced yearling from his great sire Street Cry's first crop, Street Boss lived up to the rating by becoming a dual Grade 1 winner on the track in the US. However, he went through some humble beginnings to his shuttling career in Australia with Darley.

The chestnut finished outside of the top 100 on the general sires list through his first three seasons up to 2014-15. Although Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) winner The Quarterback was one stand-out of his in the couple of years afterwards, it's been in the past three campaigns that Street Boss has really started to make his presence felt.

He rose to 49th in 2018-19, 42nd the year after - championed most notably by another Blue Diamond Prelude (Colts and Geldings) (Gr 3, 1100m) winner in Hanseatic - and is now sitting 33rd at present. His current flagbearers are exciting Perth flyer Elite Street, who has won five of his eight starts - including the Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in November - and is being set for the Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) on Saturday alongside Arcaded.

Reflecting his improved showings, the average price of Street Boss' yearlings has also been on an upswing, from a paltry \$35,000 in 2015 to \$112,500 so far this year.

Darley's head of sales Alastair Pulford explains there was a significant, and shocking, reason for Street Boss' chequered start at stud - an injury to a hock in his first season in the breeding barn.

"It was a nasty injury, his fertility was only so-so, and I think he was really impeded by that injury," Pulford tells It's In The Blood. "We decided to give him a second year off, so he didn't have a second crop. He came back and covered small books until the runners started coming through.

"Now he's starting earning a lot of respect in the last few years, from us and other leading Victorian breeders, and he's enjoying a later resurgence. He started off a low base and he's had to do it the hard way. "He's done a pretty solid job, really, and is just getting more and more recognition."

Pulford admits that after Street Boss' results through his initial seasons, Darley themselves were perhaps not giving him the best chance.

"We realised a few years ago, probably about 2016, we weren't using him to his full potential," he says. "His statistics, even though he hadn't covered a lot of mares, were actually pretty good. We'd hardly sent him a mare prior to that. So we started taking notice of him and started sending him decent mares."

One of the first moves in that direction was to have him cover the Exceed And Excel mare Itameri - only a maiden winner but from the uber-successful Scandinavia female line (Black Caviar, again). The result was Hanseatic, who was a narrow second in last year's Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and promises to be one of Godolphin's major stars.

"We sent him another raft of decent mares in 2017, whose offspring are now two-year-olds, and they included Gloriette," Pulford says.

A daughter of Lonhro foaled in 2013, Gloriette also scored just one win, at Hawkesbury, out of nine starts. But the pedigree drips with quality.

She is out of the Redoute's Choice mare Viennese, who showed good ability on the track, winning at Group 3 and Listed level in Adelaide and Caulfield. Darley paid a hefty \$1.4 million for her at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in 2007 to kick this family off for their empire.

There was little wonder Viennese fetched such a price. Out of the dual Listed winner Snippets' Lass, she is a sister to Snitzel, who had won the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) and been placed in the Newmarket and T J Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) the year before.

Given his deeds at stud since, which need no documenting here, the potential of the distaff line looks immense. And if that wasn't enough, Viennese is also a half-sister to another Group 1 performer in the late Hinchinbrook (Fastnet Rock).

Fast forward a decade and Darley put Viennese's third named foal, Gloriette, with Street Boss. The resulting foal - Arcaded - has flown away with her first two starts, both at Caulfield, to become prominent in the betting for both the Blue Diamond and Golden Slipper.

"Putting Viennese to Lonhro (to produce Gloriette) was a risk in terms of scope, and Gloriette was a speedy two-year-old who didn't really race on, but then putting Gloriette to Street Boss seems to have worked rather well," Pulford says.

"Gloriette and Viennese aren't strapping big horses, so Street Boss (who stands at 16.1 hands) was a very good physical match for the mare.

"And that Street Cry-Lonhro cross is responsible for Lyre, Osborne Bulls and others, so the two match up very well it seems."

Lyre, by Lonhro out of the Street Cry mare Erato, won the 2019 Blue Diamond and has three Group 1 placings so far besides, while Osborne Bulls, by Street Cry out of the Lonhro mare Jerezana, was second in five consecutive Group 1s in a \$2.87 million career.

So far, Arcaded looks like proving the success of the cross once again and possibly helping Street Boss to keep on improving.

"He's never really had the opportunities he probably deserved either here or in America, but he's had some very good horses in America, and equally he's developing into a very good stallion here," Pulford says.

"We're hoping he can be like some of these stallions here. Written Tycoon (now 18) and Not A Single Doubt (19) seem to be producing better horses the older they get, and we think Street Boss can really do the same."

As for Gloriette's immediate future, while she unfortunately slipped to Street Boss the year after Arcaded arrived, she now has a colt foal at foot by Epaulette and is back in foal to him again.



Happy Valley treble sends Moreira 30 clear of Purton in jockeys' championship

oao Moreira has extended his lead in the Hong Kong jockeys' premiership with another display of dominance, notching a Happy Valley treble yesterday to lead reigning champion Zac Purton by 30 winners - 89 to 59.

Marching relentlessly to a fourth Hong Kong jockeys' crown, Moreira again snared riding honours with victory on Daily Beauty (All American) and Kurpany (Mayson) for Caspar Fownes before securing the meeting finale on Equaletta Blitz (Equiano) for Jimmy Ting.

With 43 meetings left in the season, Moreira is on target to challenge the Hong Kong record of 170 wins he set in 2016/17.

Shading compatriot Vagner Borges, who enjoyed a confidence-boosting double, Moreira will now start a two-meeting ban.

Moreira's stunning season continued as Fownes secured precious breathing room in the battle for the 2020/21 Hong Kong trainers' championship with a double to stretch his lead to four - 43 to 39 - over John Size.

Chasing a fourth title, Fownes confirmed his standing as 'King of the Valley' after Kurpany posted a sizzling display of sustained speed in the Class 3 Azalea Handicap (1000m) for Moreira.

"We're just trying to progress the horse, he's still learning. If he can get another win for us, that would be nice," Fownes said.

"There's a race here for him on February 24, but obviously he'll get ratings points for that win."


Moreira also combined with Fownes to prevail on Daily Beauty in the first section of the Class 4 Orchid Handicap (1200m).

"He finally drew a gate. Actually, he's been racing really well all season," Fownes said.

"He's quite versatile from 1200 metres to 1650 metres and I just thought I'd bring him back to the sprint distances, the good gate helped and the little bit of the sting out of the ground was good, too.

"His very first run in Hong Kong was an absolute bottler and it was wet then."

Borges delivered a reminder of his skill with victories on Danny Shum's President Star (Dundeel) in the Class 5 Primula Handicap (1650m) and Spontaneous (Unencumbered) for Paul O'Sullivan in second section of the Class 4 Orchid Handicap (1200m).



"It was quite a bad bow (of the tendon), he spent ten months doing nothing.

"He spent some time up in Conghua and he came back down here and his trials indicated he was a little bit better than he was last year.

"He had a good gate (two), got a good ride, things went his way. I thought he was forward enough to run well tonight.

"It was a good team effort from the boys at home."

Spontaneous was the third winner from O'Sullivan's five past starters to continue the 11-time New Zealand champion trainer's impressive momentum heading into the second half of the current season.

"We're fortunate enough to have a few new ones coming on and I think the second half of the season should be good," he said.

Tony Millard lauded Gallant Crown's (Hallowed Crown) tenacity after the gelding completed a winning hat-trick with victory in the Class 4 Peach Blossom Handicap (1650m) under Karis Teetan.

"He's quite deceiving because he's not the biggest horse in the world," Millard said. "He's a little fellow but he's certainly got a heart on him.

"He's improved from run to run and today the pace suited him where they eased up. That was good for him because they didn't go too hard.

"He also showed he can run on the wet. He'll go into Class 3 now with bottom weight and we'll see how good he is.

"He's won three in a row and not many do that."

Alexis Badel predicted a bright future for the
Francis Lui-trained Sunny Star (Flatter), who
claimed the Class 3 Daffodil Handicap (1650m).

"He's a nice horse, he can only improve. It was a small field and a tactical race but the pace was very good. I was happy on the fence and my horse has been very brave," the Frenchman said.

"He picked up very well and he has got great abilities. He'll be a very interesting horse in the future.

"He's a very straight-forward horse and he's got a good turn of foot, which is important in Hong Kong."

Lui also prevailed with Dionysus Collin (Dream Ahead) under Vincent Ho in the Class 4 Peony Handicap (1800m).

Derek Leung continued his excellent run of form, following a treble at Sha Tin on Saturday with victory aboard the Ricky Yiu-trained Joyful Win (Shooting To Win) in the Class 4 Gladiolus Handicap (1000m).

Hong Kong racing continues at Sha Tin on Sunday with the Chinese New Year Meeting.
