Homebred Enthaar leads ambitious plans for Emirates Park

Lootah family planning to once again stand a number of stallions at its historic base in the Hunter Valley

The iconic Emirates Park brand has been enjoying a resurgence of late with Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) favourite Enthaar (Written Tycoon) its latest trailblazer on Australian racetracks and the filly's arrival on the major stage is timely with the stud farm's owners setting a new long-term strategy for their bloodstock interests.

The Lootah family, founders and owners of

Emirates Park, has reduced its prized broodmare band from 280 to 60 and is now planning to once again stand stallions at its historic base at Murrurundi in the Hunter Valley.

They took back their famed 4,000 acre property, purchased in the 1980s, from leaseholders Aquis last year, and, during the Fung family-owned operation's three-year tenure there (2017-2020), took the opportunity to review their own breeding and racing business, setting an ambitious course for the future.

Profiteer possesses golden pedigree for a Slipper

Can one race cause the industry to erupt?

This is, of course, in reference to the Inglis Millennium (RL, 1100m), held at Randwick on Saturday, February 6 and featuring a runaway winner.

A surprising aspect of the brilliant front-running display by big-margin winner Profiteer (Capitalist) is not merely the swiftness of his performance but also the swiftness of the reaction in the sale ring over the following 48 hours. *Industry News page 12 >>*

“One key thing is that Emirates will be a long-term operation as we have the next generation coming through and that’s the exciting thing, we know it will be here for another 30 years at least,” Emirates Park general manager Bryan Carlson told ANZ Bloodstock News.

“Hussain’s (Lootah) goal over the last few years was to buy fillies to put back into the broodmare band, build up families and breed to sell and keep. The main goal is to breed a Golden Slipper winner.

“Long term, we will have stallions again. It will be a maximum of three to four and we will stand the best and send those mares from the broodmare band to them,” said Carlson.

Since the late 1980s Emirates Park has produced many top class horses including Al Maher (Danehill), Secret Savings (Seeking The Gold), Shamekha (Secret Savings) and purchased and raced Golden Slipper-winning fillies Estijaab (Snitzel) and Mossfun (Mossman).

Australia’s leading two-year-old filly, Enthaar, is an Emirates Park homebred and carries the same racing colours as Estijaab and Mossfun (Mossman), the famed green with white sash, which represent Hussain Lootah, the 31-year-old son of founder Nasser.

“Mossfun and Estijaab we bought and it would be good to win a third (Golden Slipper) with a home bred,” added Carlson.

“For Hussain and Nasser and myself, I think it shows we can breed a good horse. Hussain is so passionate about their matings and breeding and, seeing the results now, it’s all paying off.

“They are not in the media all the time but they are so passionate and I think to win a Blue Diamond with a very good filly is what they want and shows what we are doing is working.”

Unbeaten at her first two starts, coming in the season’s two-year-old curtain raiser, the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) and Chairman’s Stakes at Caulfield (Gr 3, 1000m), Enthaar has been labelled a potential superstar by industry pundits.

“She’s always been a very nice type but you don’t know until they get on the track. She looks to be a very exciting horse for the future.”

While the racing dream is well and truly alive, Emirates Park has also reset its focus on breeding to sell quality stock.

At last month’s Magic Millions Yearling Sale on the Gold Coast two of their graduates sold for seven-figure sums, including a colt by Enthaar’s sire, Written Tycoon (Iglesia), for \$1.2 million to Spendthrift Australia.

Shortly after the hammer fell, Carlson confirmed that they would retain a share in the colt, the most expensive son of Written Tycoon ever sold at public auction.

"We are trying to create that brand where people are buying good horses off us.

"We want to stand out at the sales and bring quality horses that people know are for sale."

Testament to Emirates Park's commitment to mix it at the pointy end of the market is the fact they have recently brought in some major industry players to join their team.

In December, highly respected horseman Tony Scott, who was previously stud manager for Aquis Farm when the group was based at the Hunter Valley property, was engaged to manage their young stock.

"Having experienced people around you makes a business. Going forward we will slightly build up those key areas and look for those people," said Carlson, adding that necessary, practical improvements will also be made to the farm's infrastructure to support their strategy.

"I think the farm is going in a great direction. We don't want it to happen overnight but slowly.

With so much feed around Carlson wisely encouraged Nasser and Hussain to take advantage and invest in some cattle early last spring.

Now, as you drive past the property along the New England HWY you can see sizable herds of steers and heifers grazing happily on lush pastures.

"The farm looks fantastic. We use the cattle to go through the paddocks after the horses.

"We bought them at the right time and we are growing it up to be a small-scale cattle operation."

While winning a Blue Diamond or Golden Slipper might be of paramount importance over the coming years, Carlson's pretty chuffed to be making his first foray into selling cattle online today under the Emirates Park banner.

And he can safely expect some good results. A bit like the yearling market at the moment, cattle are commanding huge prices.

First for Wolf Cry

Larneuk Stud's Wolf Cry (Street Cry) produced his first Australian winner when General Wolffe (2 c ex Hypernova by High Chaparral) ran out a clear winner of a two-year-old maiden over 1200 metres at Doomben yesterday. Trained by Ronald Cameron, General Wolffe was having his fifth race start as he came home five and a half lengths clear of the chasing pack. Wolf Cry himself was a speedy youngster whose four starts at two yielded three stakes placings: the Breeders' Plate (Listed, 1000m), Lonhro Plate (Listed, 1100m) and the Skyline Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) where he finished third behind subsequent Golden Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Exosphere (Lonhro). Wolf Cry is one of two stakes horses from the multiple stakes-placed daughter of Redoute's Choice (Danehill) Starfish which hails from the family of blue-hen mare Eau D'Etoile's (Sir Tristram) family. Wolf Cry stands for a fee of \$3,300 (inc. GST).

Remarque and Shaquero sizzle at trials

Leading Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) hopes Shaquero (Shalaa) and Remarque

(Snitzel) produced scintillating barrier trials at Rosehill yesterday. The pair clashed in a 900-metre heat with Shaquero showing tremendous gate speed to lead early before James McDonald handed up the front-running role. The Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) winner finished strongly to just edge out Remarque, who turned in an eye-catching performance to make up many lengths from the back. "He came out like a startled rabbit which was really good, straight into gear," McDonald said. "He has just been that ultimate professional from the moment he trialled first time out. Lovely horse." Shaquero's time of 54.30 seconds was the second fastest of the 900-metre two-year-old heats behind Team Hawkes' unraced youngster Clemenceau (Capitalist).

Haut Brion Her back bigger and better

McDonald was also impressed by the Chris Waller-trained Haut Brion Her (Zoustar), who defeated Dirty Work (Written Tycoon) in a 900-metre hit-out. The mare was a brave fifth in The Everest (1200m) and beat all bar Gytrash (Lope De Vega) in the Yes Yes Yes Stakes (1300m) last spring and McDonald said she had returned a more furnished horse. "Haut Brion Her went super. She has matured into a beautiful mare," he said. "She just feels a lot stronger than she did last prep and trialled super." King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice) and Eduardo (Host) were among the other heat winners at yesterday's bumper session, while John Sargent's Golden Slipper hopeful Four Moves Ahead (Snitzel) also won her trial impressively. "That was a good blow out today and she is in line for the Silver Slipper," Sargent said. The Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained

Forbes (Capitalist) was due to trial against Shaquero and Remarque but was scratched at the barrier after becoming cast in the stalls.

Bivouac out to emulate Black Caviar

James Cummings is hoping Bivouac (Exceed And Excel) can add his name to the long line of champions who have won the Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) and complete the unofficial triple crown of Flemington sprint events. In the past year, Bivouac has won the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) and VRC Sprint Classic (Gr 1, 1200m) and the Black Caviar Lightning is the other major sprint held each season down the famous straight. If he can win tomorrow, Bivouac will emulate the deeds of superstar mare Black Caviar (Bel Esprit), who the race is named after, as she won the same trio of events in 2011 and 2012 over a 13-month period. "History confirms just how significant this race is. Have a look at the long list of champions it's produced," Cummings said. "He's going to be serving it up to them again. This high-class field shouldn't be underestimated though." Bivouac hasn't started since he destroyed his opposition to win the VRC Sprint Classic at Flemington on the final day of the spring carnival in November. On that occasion he dominated the race and defeated Nature Strip (Nicconi) by three and a quarter lengths. The victory elevated him in the world rankings to be named equal top sprinter alongside The Everest winner Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt). "He loves the Flemington straight as he demonstrated winning two of his three Group 1s here," Cummings said. "He will come into this race full of confidence after that impressive trial at Rosehill."

Pippie primed for Lightning upset

Chris Meagher, who trains Pippie (Written Tycoon) in partnership with his father John, is confident the five-year-old mare can win tomorrow's Black Caviar Lightning. Winner of the Moir Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) in September, Pippie is in her final campaign before retiring from the racetrack and Meagher is hoping she can topple market principals Bivouac and Nature Strip in what could potentially be her final race in Group 1 company. "I'm very happy ... all the boxes seem to be ticked," Meagher told Racing.com. "My main problem is Nature Strip and Bivouac. I think she can (win). The thing is, this is basically our grand final ... I read Bivouac might be going to England and the big horse generally takes one decent run to hit his straps. We are going to be meeting them at 100 per cent, where they are going to be 95 per cent, sort of thing. Well, we are hoping that anyway."

Tough Lightning task for Swats That

Troy Corstens, who trains Swats That (Shamus Award) in partnership with his father Leon, will be delighted if the three-year-old filly can finish in the frame in tomorrow's Black Caviar Lightning. Swats That returns to action after finishing runner-up to September Run (Exceed And Excel) in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in October and connections are keen to see where she is at in comparison to the older horses. "If she can run top four, I'd be rapt and if she can sneak a place, we'd be ecstatic and if something happens and she wins, then even better," Corstens said on the Moody On The Mic podcast. "It's a good place to kick her off against the older horses and see where we're at. Maybe we're not up to them, maybe September Run is in the same boat, you just don't know until you pitch them up against those older horses."

Blinkers off Hungry Heart

Chris Waller will run Hungry Heart (Frankel) without blinkers in the Light Fingers Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick tomorrow as he attempts to end her 12-month winless run. Hungry Heart posted three consecutive runner-up performances in the spring before

finishing seventh in the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). The three-year-old filly landed the Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) last February and Waller is hoping the removal of headgear can help return her to the winners' circle. "I just don't know if she needs them. They haven't done anything for her," said Waller, who will consider stepping her up in trip later in the autumn. "She might actually be a pretty sharp horse so 1200 and 1400 (metres) excites me to start off a preparation, and if we have to go over further we will. But we're in no rush." Hungry Heart will be one of two runners for Waller in tomorrow's Group 2, along with stakes placegetter Joviality (I Am Invincible), who resumes for Star Thoroughbreds.

Verry Elleegant out of All-Star Mile

A curveball has been thrown in the All-Star Mile (1600m) leaderboard as Chris Waller has withdrawn Verry Elleegant (Zed) from the race. The five-year-old mare, who is set to contest the Apollo Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) tomorrow, sat third in the leaderboard ahead of today's blackout, but Waller informed voters yesterday that she is unlikely to run. "At this stage it is unlikely that she will travel to Melbourne for the All-Star Mile and will most likely head to the Chipping Norton Stakes following this race (Apollo Stakes)," Waller said in a statement on Twitter. Tasmanian mare Still A Star (Toronado) is the main beneficiary of the withdrawal as currently she sits in 11th in the table, with each runner under Verry Elleegant set to be bumped up a place. Strong Apollo hand for Waller

Verry Elleegant heads a strong Apollo Stakes line-up for Waller, who is set to throw four darts at the Group 2. Three of his runners - Verry Ellegant, Kolding (Ocean Park) and Funstar (Adelaide) - filled the first three lines of the betting last night, while he also has outsider Toffee Tongue (Tavistock). Verry Elleegant is the pre-race favourite, but Waller is expecting the mare to improve for the run as she makes her first start since the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m). "If she's within three or four lengths

of the likes of Dreamforce turning for home, she will certainly be a genuine chance but whatever she does, she will only improve on," Waller said on Twitter. Kolding, meanwhile, has the benefit of a recent run after finishing runner-up behind Savatiano (Street Cry) in the Expressway Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Rosehill on January 30 and Waller is hot on his chances, providing the rain stays away. "I'm hoping we don't get the rain that is forecasted for his chances because he is clearly better on a good track, although his first-up performance was still full of merit on an unsuitable surface. This has seen him peak for a Group 1 mile which will be the Chipping Norton in two weeks' time, however I still see him a genuine chance on Saturday."

Funstar 'most likely' All-Star Mile runner for Waller

Waller is keen on the chances of Funstar for tomorrow's Apollo Stakes and has listed her as the stable's most likely runner in next month's All-Star Mile, despite her sitting 51st in the order last night with less than 100 votes. "I think she is still a really good horse who is capable of winning more Group 1 races," Waller said. "She will run well on Saturday and will certainly be a genuine chance over the 1400-metre distance. I would rate her the most likely of my stable to head to the All-Star Mile at this stage whilst keeping all options open with other horses, respecting the voting system and the fact that there are some wildcards still to be given out." He continued: "The All-Star Mile will fit in well with Funstar's preparation and I think she would be a genuine chance. We will see how she goes on Saturday and then work out what is required to get her there, if that is still the race we decide to head towards."

Colette to improve from autumn opener

Golden Eagle (1500m) winner Colette (Hallowed Crown) is set to improve from her first-up run when the four-year-old mare returns for her autumn preparation in the Apollo. The ATC Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) winner raced just four times in the spring and her trainer James Cummings reports she has returned well. "She's coming along nicely after her light spring campaign," he said. "The early stages of her preparation have also been nice and light." Colette holds several entries for Group 1 races over a mile and up, including the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m), Coolmore Legacy Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m). "There's no doubt she'll improve with the run and you can expect to see her to quickly step up in distance," Cummings added. Meanwhile Godolphin's Edward Manifold Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) winner Thermosphere (Exosphere) continues her preparation in the Light Fingers Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) on the Randwick card after finishing third in Benchmark 88 company on January 30. "She made a nice return at Rosehill that will hopefully give her a fitness edge on some of her rivals. There's nothing like a run to bring them on," said Cummings.

Mugatoo eying All-Star Mile votes

The lure of a start in the \$5 million All-Star Mile has prompted Kris Lees to begin Mugatoo's (Henrythenavigator) spring campaign in the Apollo Stakes. It will be just the second time the six-year-old has run over a trip less than a mile, having taken out the Winter Challenge (Listed, 1500m) at Rosehill last July, as Lees looks to keep him fresh for the 1600 metres of next month's All-Star Mile. "That's why we are running him on Saturday, otherwise I would have waited for something like the Chipping Norton," Lees said. "But I just thought a 1400-metre race with one trial, it will be a bit like a second trial and that will give us four weeks until the All-Star Mile. Hopefully he is forward enough but still fresh enough to sprint well." Mugatoo currently sits 12th in the All-Star Mile leaderboard, over 1300 votes adrift of Still A Star. "He is just out of the voting at the moment and he will need to run well over 1400 to be any chance to go there," Lees said.

Hayes: Crosshaven the All-Star three-year-old

With no three-year-old currently occupying a spot in the top ten places on the All-Star Mile leaderboard, co-trainer Ben Hayes is hoping Crosshaven (Smart Missile) can fill the void in the \$5 million contest at Moonee Valley on March 13. Crosshaven finished third when resuming in last Saturday's C. F. Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and the Lindsay Park team now face the task of rallying supporters to vote for the gelding, who currently sits 14th on the leaderboard. "He is obviously very well credentialed, he is a horse who in my opinion other than Ole Kirk is one of the best-performing three-year-olds so far this season," Hayes said. "If Ole Kirk does not head that way, I think he is probably the obvious choice if he doesn't get in with the votes to be a wildcard. I thought it was a great run (in the C. F. Orr Stakes). He jumped well, sat just behind the pace and presented at the top of the straight and, first time against the older horses, really battled on well and was really strong through the line."

Tailleur introduced to Group racing

A serial winner through the Benchmark grades, Godolphin's Tailleur (Shooting To Win) steps up to Group company for the first time tomorrow in Randwick's Triscay Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m). Having amassed a record of five wins from seven starts, James Cummings is confident the four-year-old is up to the task. "She's been nothing but impressive coming through the handicaps," said Cummings. "Now at start number eight it's a case of 'welcome to Group racing'. There'll be a bit more pressure here, but she's delivered on all her promises so far." Cummings will also saddle up Roheryn (Lonhro) in the Southern Cross Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Randwick and the trainer said he has come out

of his run in the Magic Millions Sprint (1200m) in good order. "He hasn't gone backwards from his interstate campaign," Cummings said. "He got back from the wide gate (10) last start but still ran on nicely after a very good win first-up."

Widdup raising the stakes with Icebath

Brad Widdup is chasing black type with his Golden Eagle runner-up Icebath (Sacred Falls), starting with tomorrow's Triscay Stakes. "It's all about chasing a bit of black type with her," Widdup told Racing NSW. "She hasn't won a black-type race and she's a 104-rater so there aren't any easy options." Leading into her first-up assignment, Icebath finished third to Written Beauty (Written Tycoon) and Dirty Work (Written Tycoon) in a trial over 900 metres at Warwick Farm. "She's had a pretty faultless prep, 1200 metres might be a bit short for her first-up but you've got to kick them off somewhere," he said. "I think the tracks aren't your traditional February tracks, they're not rock hard, so she should get a track she likes." A positive showing tomorrow could see the Widdup target the Coolmore Classic (Gr 1, 1500m) with the mare, who has Group 1 entries for the Doncaster Mile and Queen Elizabeth Stakes. "I think the Coolmore is a good race for her and if rain comes in any of these races she's going to come right into it."

Victorem on trial for Group 1 shot

Jenny Graham still holds Group 1 ambitions for her six-year-old gelding Victorem (I Am Invincible). The winner of the Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Doomben in May last year, Victorem missed the spring with a bone chip, but the trainer believes he is in good shape heading into his reappearance in the Southern Cross Stakes. "He's not screwed right down yet but I'm happy with where he is at this stage," Graham told Racing NSW. "I was happy with how he trialled and how he's come on so we'll give it a shot." Graham has pinpointed the Canterbury Stakes (Gr 1, 1300m) next month as his next attempt to win at elite level. "They're not going to give it to me," she continued. "We'll have to be on song but going forward he has improvement left and hopefully he will run a great race and improve off that. If everything goes in the right pattern I feel the horse is still capable at a high level for sure."

Brando in form ahead of CS Hayes

Listed winner Brando (Savabeel) will make his Australian debut when he contests tomorrow's CS Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Flemington for Jamie Richards. The colt, a winner of three starts in his native New Zealand, finished runner-up in the Levin Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) on his last start and Richards hopes to continue on to the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) with the three-year-old. "I am pleased with him and I think he has gone the right way," the trainer said. "He has had a month between runs and is back to 1400 metres with the blinkers on. He had an exhibition gallop at Pukekohe before he went over and did some nice work on Tuesday morning." Brando will have to overcome an awkward draw in barrier 12, with Richards conceding he'll need some good fortune. "The visitors' draw never makes it easy over there," he said. "He will be inclined to maybe go forward a little bit, but the grand final (Australian Guineas) is still a couple of weeks away, so we will work it out once we speak to the form guys."

Diamond unlikely for Flowers

Godolphin will launch a dual attack on tomorrow's Talindert Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Flemington. Trainers Anthony and Sam Freedman believe a better performance is in store for Frost Flowers (Frosted) after being in season when finishing third behind Dosh (Rich Enuff) in the Blue Diamond Preview (Gr 3, 1000m) when sent off the \$1.65 favourite. "She was in season last start," said Sam Freedman. "We're not sure what effect it had on her, but from a good gate in an even race we're expecting to see a better run." The training partnership have, however, considered a run in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) unlikely, even on the back of a good performance. "If she happened to win well, we would consider continuing on to Sydney, but the Blue Diamond is a bit unlikely at this stage." Meanwhile, James Cummings will saddle Maribyrnong Trial Stakes (Listed, 1000m) winner Ingratiating (Frosted). "He's got experience and toughness, but he's not particularly well off at the weights," said Cummings.

Regardsmaree stays in grade

Nick Ryan has refrained from stepping Regardsmaree (So You Think) up in grade as the four-year-old chases a hat-trick of wins. The

gelding followed up a Benchmark 70 win on Boxing Day with a three and a quarter-length success at Benchmark 84 level at Caulfield on Saturday, tempting connections to look at the Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) next week as his possible next step. However, they have opted to keep him in a lower grade for now and he will back-up in the Seppelt Wines Plate (1400m) at Flemington tomorrow. "He's only an 82-rater so I'd rather go to a race like Saturday and then we can think about other races going forward," Ryan told Racing.com. "I am just trying to take him through his grades, more or less. Even if he was to place in a good race he will get (ratings) points so he's better off going through his grades. He'll get there, but we don't have to rush it. I am pretty sure he's got the ability."

Gollan to let Miami Fleiss do the talking

Promising filly Miami Fleiss (Spirit Of Boom) impressed trainer Tony Gollan when winning her debut at the Sunshine Coast by seven lengths last month but he is keeping a lid on future targets until after her Doomben outing tomorrow. The three-year-old will line up in the QTIS 3YO Fillies Handicap (1200m) and was last night a best-priced \$1.50 to remain. "She's a nice filly and she's always shown us she had a lot of ability," Gollan told Racing Queensland. "It's a big step up from winning a Caloundra maiden on a Friday night to a city race on a Saturday. It's way too early to talk about races in Sydney or our winter carnival and I'll measure it all up after she runs on Saturday."

Kylease run hangs in the balance

Connections of Kylease (Chosir) are weighing up whether to run the five-year-old at Doomben tomorrow after drawing an unfavourable barrier. Kylease has been handed barrier 11 for the Class 6 Handicap (1200m), with several speedrunners drawn to her inside, and co-trainer Matt Hoysted revealed they are considering their options. "It's a race that looks to have a heap of speed so we'll have to sit down and talk with the owners but there's a chance she may not take her place from that barrier," said Hoysted, who trains in partnership with Steven O'Dea. "If we don't run, I'm sure there will be another suitable alternative in the not too distant future. There's no rush to find another race."

Behemoth delighting connections

Connections of Behemoth (All Too Hard) were ecstatic with his first-up win in the Durbridge Stakes (Listed, 1100m) on January 30, with managing owner Sam Lyons confident he is back bigger and better than before. Behemoth won the Memsie Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and the Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) in the spring before finishing down the field in The Everest and returned with a three-length triumph at Morphettville. "We talk about him coming back bigger and better and another cliché line that we all use but he really has this time and he's doing things that he hasn't done previously," Lyons told Racing.com. "He used to like getting to horses and floating and not really putting them away but this time, as we saw first-up, he was really getting past horses and putting them away and he's doing that in his work as well. He was quite rotund, as anyone who saw him at the races in Adelaide knew, so for him to be able to come out and tighten the screws on that day rather than us having to do it much earlier, it just made a lot more sense," Lyons said. Behemoth is set to line up in the Futurity Stakes next weekend before tackling the All-Star Mile.

Health scare for Apache Cat

Eight-time Group 1 winner Apache Cat (Lion Cavern) will undergo treatment for eye cancer later this month, with Living Legends CEO Dr Andrew Clarke confident a positive outcome can be achieved. "On the 23rd they will scrape off as much of the (cancerous) tissue as they can and they ... (will do) radiation treatment," Clarke told RSN. "It only goes 2 millimetres deep. So he will have the radiation treatment on it and the prognosis is very good, but ... you've still got to be nervous about these types of things. The good thing is we have got onto it early." Clarke said he began to get concerned with the issue in November last year, adding: "Back in late November he had a little bit of what looked to be conjunctivitis and I had a look and I just wasn't happy, there was a little angry spot in there," he said. "We had a couple of visits to Andrew (Turner, an eye specialist) and about three weeks ago we had to take Pache and have a biopsy done. It is the typical sort of sun-type tumour you get on your skin."

Duo handed suspensions at Sandown

Liam Riordan and Ethan Brown were both suspended at Sandown on Wednesday. Riordan was handed a seven-meeting ban after breaking the whip rules aboard third-placed Sandsation (Dissident) in the second race. Riordan was found to have used his whip seven times prior to the 100 metres and 18 times in total. His penalty will run from February 19 until midnight February 25 and he was also fined \$200. Brown was handed a ten-meeting suspension for careless riding aboard the unplaced Yulong Island (Exceed And Excel) in race seven. His suspension will start at midnight February 14 and expires midnight February 22.

NEW ZEALAND

Entries open for NZB South Island Sale

Entries for New Zealand Bloodstock's South Island Sale are now open, with the sale set to be held on NZB's online subsidiary Gavelhouse Plus for the second year in a row. Quality Southern-breds continue to showcase their versatility and durability on the international stage, with southern raiders Etah James (Raise The Flag) and The Chosen One (Savabeel) celebrating a quinella in last season's Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m), and the South Island Sale will contain a selection of progeny from leading southern sires, out of New Zealand-bred mares. All South Island Sale stock will be inspected by NZB agents, with New Zealand-based agents also available to inspect on behalf of prospective buyers who cannot physically attend the sale. The catalogue is set to go live on Gavelhouse Plus on March 29, with bidding available from April 12 and the first lot closing incrementally from 7pm (NZT) on April 14. The South Island Sale will operate under usual NZB terms and conditions, allowing selling to registered bidders only and paying the vendor out as it would a traditional auction. Entries for the South Island Sale opened yesterday and will close on March 17 at 5pm.

Busy weekend for Richards

Jamie Richards is getting used to having runners at multiple venues across Australasia and this weekend will be no different. The premiership-leading trainer in New Zealand will be at Te

Rapa tomorrow where he is hoping Melody Belle (Commands) will set a record for the most Group 1 wins by a New Zealand-trained horse (14) should she add the Herbie Dyke Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) to her career tally. He will also saddle strong chances in the other feature races with Advantage (Fastnet Rock) running in the BCD Group Sprint (Gr 1, 1400m), Perfect Scenario (Iffraaj) lining up in the Waikato Guineas (Gr 2, 2000m) and Amarelinha (Savabeel) set to contest the David & Karyn Ellis Fillies Classic (Gr 2, 2000m). While Richards will be on course at the Hamilton track, he will be taking a keen interest in the action across the Tasman where he will have runners at both Flemington and Randwick. "I will be keeping a close eye on the weather everywhere and relying on the great staff that we have in Australia, like Craig Thornton in Sydney and Ashely Handley in Melbourne," Richards said. "We have been travelling horses there for a little while now and made good contacts. Brad Taylor is a big help to us in Melbourne and John Thompson has been a really big help in Sydney, clocking horses and giving us advice."

Force Of Will out of Guineas

Force Of Will's (Power) path to the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) has hit a snag just a month out from the Trentham Classic. The filly was set to line-up in tomorrow's Waikato Guineas, however, trainers Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott have taken a cautious approach and scratched her from the race after findings from her bloodwork yesterday morning. "We took a routine blood off her and she just wasn't 100 per cent in the blood. They need to be 100 per cent to be competitive," Scott said yesterday. "We will just give her a quiet weekend and take another blood on Monday. She hasn't got a temperature or anything, her blood picture just isn't 100 per cent." Force Of Will wasn't nominated for the New Zealand Oaks but a late entry was likely if she performed up to expectations tomorrow. Scott said they will now just take a race-by-race approach, with the Sir Owen Glen bred and owned filly. "We are only taking it one race at a time. We will just see how quickly she recovers from this minor setback," Scott said. "If she recovers quickly, we can make some plans. But we will just take it one step at a time, the horse's general health has got to come first."

Khimar War set for Riccarton challenge

Riccarton galloper Khimar War (Sweet Orange) will return to his home track tomorrow where he will resume in the Rangiora Equine Services Open Handicap (1100m). The five-year-old has pleased his connections this preparation, having placed on four occasions, including a third-placed finish in the Hazlett Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Wingatui on Boxing Day. That performance enticed his owners to push forward to the Telegraph (Gr 1, 1200m) at Trentham last month where he finished eighth, beating home three of his Island compatriots, including the reopposing Enzo's Lad (Testa Rossa). Lance Robinson was pleased with his Trentham effort but said the conditions of the race and quality of the field didn't suit his charge. "We were really happy with his run, but he was never really a chance at weight-for-age in a field like that," the trainer said. "We were happy with the way he was going, that is why his owners decided they wanted to have a crack." Robinson has been happy with the way Khimar War has returned to his stable and said his only concern ahead of tomorrow is the track condition. "He had a week off in the paddock after he got home and had a bit of a freshen-up. He has come back in great shape and we have been really happy with his work since then," he said. "The only thing that worries me is the track at the moment has come up as a Slow 8. We had a lot of rain on Tuesday night and he is really a firm track horse. But hopefully the track will come back by Saturday."

Vale Arthur Ormond

NZTBA life member and former president Arthur Ormond died earlier this week. Born in 1947, he was a foundation member of the NZTBA Wellington branch and then of the Hawke's Bay branch. First elected to the NZTBA council in 1991, Ormond was its president from 1996 until 2001. He was the NZTBA's nominee to the board of New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing from 1999 until 2001 and chaired the New Zealand Equine Industry Training Organisation for more than ten years. He was also instrumental in establishing New Zealand Thoroughbred Marketing (NZTM) with a vision to market the New Zealand thoroughbred and related products both domestically and internationally. Ormond is survived by his wife Nic, the couple's four children and their nine grandchildren.

ASIA

HK: Whyte to unveil first American Pharoah

Douglas Whyte will unveil the first of American Pharoah's (Pioneerof The Nile) progeny to race in Hong Kong on Sunday when he takes the wraps off former Aidan O'Brien trainee Congratulation in the Class 1 Chinese New Year Cup Handicap (1400m). The four-year-old was previously known as Monarch Of Egypt when under the care of O'Brien and prior to export finished runner-up to Siskin (First Defence) in the 2019 running of the Phoenix Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at the Curragh. He also competed at the top-level against that year's European champion two-year-old Pinatubo (Shamardal) two starts later. But while facing a seemingly daunting debut assignment at Sha Tin, with a trio of 100-plus raters among his opposition, Whyte remains hopeful a combination of three trials and a resume featuring top-class northern hemisphere form holds him in good stead. "I'm

going in hopeful that he'll run well," Whyte said. "The way that he has progressively increased his competitiveness at the trials shows to me that he's at the right frame both mentally and physically to run a race - it's a small field, it's a competitive field but he's got the quality behind him."

INTERNATIONAL

UAE: Salute The Soldier back to winning ways

Salute The Soldier (Sepoy) posted a first win of the campaign when gunning down the front-running Capezzano (Bernardini) to take out the second round of the Al Maktoum Challenge (Gr 2, 1900m) on the Meydan turf last night. The Fawzi Nass-trained six-year-old has been lightly raced since scoring in Group 3 company at the same track in March last year but he showed he retained all his old ability when cruising into the lead late on before going on to win by a length from Thegreatcollection (Saint Anddan),

who did his best work late on. Ajuste Fiscal (Ioya Bigtime) was a further three-quarters of a length away in third. Salute The Soldier now has two stakes victories among his tally of seven wins in 20 starts.

UAE: Zakouski shines in Group 2 win

Zakouski (Shamardal) registered his fifth win in just eight starts when building on his promising return with a victory in Meydan's Al Rashidiya (Gr 2, 1800m). The Charlie Appleby-trained five-year-old, who had finished second behind Lord Glitters (Whipper) on his comeback run last time out, turned the tables on that rival as he found plenty for William Buick to take up the running close home on his way to a three-quarter length win. Front runner Court House (Dawn Approach) just held off Lord Glitters to fill second spot. Now the winner of three stakes races, Zakouski is out of the unraced Octagonal (Zabeel) mare O'Giselle, the dam of Group 3 winner Albrecht (Redoute's Choice).

Timely Profiteering: Impressive Capitalist colt possesses golden pedigree for a Slipper

BY LLOYD JACKSON

Can one race cause the industry to erupt? This is, of course, in reference to the Inglis Millennium (RL, 1100m), held at Randwick on Saturday, February 6 and featuring a runaway winner.

A surprising aspect of the brilliant front-running display by big-margin winner Profiteer (Capitalist) is not merely the swiftness of his performance but also the swiftness of the reaction in the sale ring over the following 48 hours.

The two-year-old chestnut colt was the subject of a majority buy-back by Newgate Farm days prior to the running of the Inglis Millennium, having sold him this time last year at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale for \$165,000. Nevertheless, the original owners have every right to be congratulating themselves after witnessing such a dominant raceday effort.

Despite the Soft 5 track, Profiteer's sectionals were impressive, as was the manner in which he continued to draw further clear over the entire 1100-metre journey. The extra 100 metres of the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) should not present any problem whatsoever.

Whether his competition has, so far, been stiff enough remains to be seen but on debut (December 12) his slashing 33.3 seconds for the closing 600 metres at Flemington is well worthy of respect. His 1:02.8 for the 1100 metres was not too shabby either.

The response was immediate and immense.

On day one at last week's Inglis Classic Yearling Sale his sire, Newgate Stud's Capitalist (Written Tycoon), set a new record (for this sale) of \$600,000 for Lot 182, a chestnut colt. That record lasted barely 24 hours when Lot 374, also a chestnut colt, made \$625,000.

The clamour for Capitalist's yearlings also carried over to his fillies with three offerings (Lots 13, 154 and 396) fetching between \$260,000 and \$380,000.

Mick Malone of Kitchwin Hills, who prepared the sale-topping colt on behalf of

Scone veterinarian Richard McClenahan, summed up the furore: "It is a perfect storm, isn't it? The horse wins the Millennium and here we are - Profiteer just added so much value to the colt," Malone said. "It would be interesting to know what that horse was worth if that horse hadn't won. It probably added \$200,000 to \$300,000 to his price."

Capitalist's oldest progeny are two-year-olds and Profiteer is his first stakes winner.

On potential, Profiteer has that in spades. His racing style is reminiscent of Vain (Wilkes), Todman (Star Kingdom) and Manikato (Manihi) - all winners of the Golden Slipper, a race which is now clearly the target for Profiteer, whose influence on the Australian bloodstock market after just two racetrack starts has been profound.

One of the greatest examples of one horse greatly influencing the industry took place in the middle of last century. The country was New Zealand and the horse was Mainbrace (Admiral's Luck), the Chestnut Thunderbolt, whose race record was nothing short of outstanding.

In 25 starts New Zealand Hall of Famer Mainbrace was defeated just twice. At two on

debut he finished third, then finished off the season unbeaten in his remaining six starts. His first start at three saw him beaten by The Unicorn (Gold Nib), who was also responsible for Mainbrace's debut defeat, then proceeded to win 15 on the trot. At four he stepped out just twice, taking his winning tally to 17, then suffered the cramps which turned out to be a blocked artery in a hind leg.

His sire Admiral's Luck was the first son of Precipitation (Hurry On) to stand at stud in New Zealand and Mainbrace was from his first of only four crops.

Precipitation being the flavour of the month, combined with Admiral's Luck's premature demise, two more sons were soon recruited by NZ studs. Summertime became Champion NZ Sire three times and Count Rendered twice. Agricola would follow a little later to become Champion Sire in Australia in 1967-68.

As if that were not enough, New Zealand stud masters raided England for Admiral's Luck's half-brothers, from Gainsborough Lass (Gainsborough), Knight's Romance (Royal Charger), his brother Pride of Kildare plus Resurgent (The Phoenix). All enjoyed well above average success as sires.

Profiteer has quite a lot in front of him yet, however current buyers of Capitalist stock may be proven prudent after being blown away by his son's dazzling five-and-a-quarter-length success.

The mighty prize and prestige of the Golden Slipper is the driving force for many industry leaders as winning it provides a massive launching pad for any prospective future stallion.

Of course, Capitalist himself captured the race in 2016, but that is far from the only incidence of the Golden Slipper looming large in his bloodlines.

Capitalist's paternal grandsire Iglesia (Last Tycoon) is out of a mare by Marscay (Biscay), the 1982 Golden Slipper winner, while the granddam of Capitalist's sire, Written Tycoon, is by 1969 winner, the incomparable Vain (Wilkes).

Capitalist's Group 3-winning granddam, Compulsion, is a Danehill (Danzig) sister to

the 1996 Golden Slipper victress Merlene. Their dam, Bold Promise, is the daughter of 1977 Golden Slipper hero Luskin Star (Kaoru Star).

Regarding Profiteer's female family it, too, reveals heavy influence of the stallion-making race. Profiteer's paternal grandsire Redoute's Choice (Danehill) is from a daughter of 1990 winner Canny Lad (Bletchingly).

His fifth dam, Polished, is by Vain (see above) and Polished's dam Star Facet

(Sostenuto) is a half-sister to the 1970 winner and Triple Crown Champion Baguette (Rego).

They were from the fabulous producer Dark Jewel who, not only was by Star Kingdom (Stardust), sire of the first five winners of the Slipper, but foaled five stakes winners including three Group 1 winners: Baguette (above), dual Group 1 champion Cabachon (Edmundo) plus Baguette's sister, the VATC One Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 8f) winner Heirloom (Rego).

Profiteer became the 41st stakes winner to descend directly from Dark Jewel. They include seven Group 1 winners, the others being Spinning Hill (Dolphin Street) with three Group 1 successes, Cinder Bella (Victory Dance) (2) plus The Quarterback (Street Boss) and Danglissa (Danzero), Profiteer's third dam.

The big question is: can Profiteer join his blood relatives (on both sides of his pedigree) and take out the great race?

With the race five weeks away, we don't have too long to wait.

Ironically, it was under similar conditions over the same distance that this week's Maiden Of The Week appeared.

Wednesday saw the 2015 winner of the Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 10f), Preakness Stakes (Gr 1, 9.5f) and Belmont Stakes (Gr 1, 12f), American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile), record his first Australian winner when Head Of State (2 c ex Derelique by Danehill Dancer) proved too strong at Warwick Farm.

Sent out the \$1.70 favourite after a handy trial win in January, the Chris Waller-trained Head Of State demonstrated the talent that saw him given his opportunity in the \$1 million Golden Gift (1100m) at his first start, racing clear to score by two lengths over reliable yardstick Wilsons Prom (Xtravagant) with Collier Bay (Capitalist) in third.

The win has Waller dreaming of Group 1 races with the Coolmore-owned colt, with the ATC Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and the Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) both likely targets.

"That was pretty exciting for American Pharoah, I was lucky enough to meet the horse

and his trainer (Bob Baffert) at Coolmore in America and it was a real highlight for me," said Waller. "This is his first Australian winner, but it won't be his last.

"Head Of State was a little bit green to my eye and wobbled around the bend a little bit. He's probably not a natural on-pace horse, but he did everything right and let down strongly and he will take a lot of benefit from the win. We see him as a Sires, Champagne Stakes type of horse and if not he'll be a Guineas horse in the spring."

An \$850,000 purchase from the Lime Country Thoroughbreds draft, on behalf of siblings Brad and Deanne Crismale, at last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, being knocked down to Tom Magnier, Head Of State is the sixth named foal out of unraced mare Derelique (Danehill Dancer).

Her best performer so far has been Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) winner Man From Uncle (Uncle Mo).

Second dam Hides (Giant's Causeway), also unraced, is a half-sister to Group 1 performers Shania Dane (Danehill) and Scintillation (Danehill), while the extended family includes Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winner Slip Anchor (Shirley Heights) and two-time Group 1-winning sprinter Hello Youmzain (Kodiak), who will shuttle to Cambridge Stud in New Zealand later this year.

Derelique produced another American Pharoah filly in 2019 and, after missing to So You Think (High Chaparral) last year, she returned to American Pharoah in September.

For the first time in nearly two decades, a son or daughter of an American Triple Crown winner is eligible for the Maiden Of The Week title by breaking through for their first victory in either Australia or New Zealand.

The last was the Kevin Robinson-trained Lawrence Clan, a son of 1977 Triple Crown hero Seattle Slew (Bold Reasoning), who won a 1300-metre maiden at Goulburn on April 3, 2001.

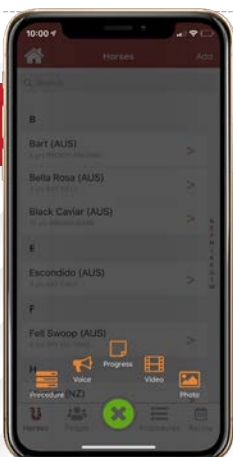
