
eading New Zealand racing figures have welcomed the government's decision to grant a rescue package to its ailing industry, saying that the bail-out provides a secure platform on which the industry can rebuild in the wake of "years of bad administration" and the crippling impact of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Racing minister Winston Peters, also the

nation's deputy prime minister, announced a NZ\$72.5 million support package for the industry, which will be included in the Ardern government's budget handed down by finance minister Grant Robertson on Thursday.

Of most urgency is a \$26 million relief grant to allow the Racing Industry Transition Agency (RITA) to pay its outstanding supplier bills, with RITA facing the risk of defaulting on its debts by Friday.

Frankel relation an Inglis bargain for Kent breeder McPhee

A buyer's market usually prevails at bloodstock auctions during economic downturns, with bargains available for those prepared to do their homework or think outside the box.

A small breeder from Kent has seized on such an opportunity by unearthing a maternal 'aunt' to Frankel (Galileo), no less, for a scarcely believable \$13,000 in the Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale held online on Sunday.

Stuart McPhee's new purchase is Star Effort, a nine-year-old by Casino Prince (Flying Spur) out of Endless, an unraced daughter of Sadler's Wells (Northern Dancer) and Lancashire Oaks (Gr 3, 1m4f) winner Rainbow Lake (Rainbow Quest).

<< Continued from page 1 A further \$24 million will ensure that RITA and New Zealand's three racing codes - including New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR) - are able to resume their activities while maintaining what Peters calls "baseline functionality".</p>

Also included is \$20 million to construct two new synthetic race tracks at Awapuni in Palmerston North and Riccarton in Christchurch. They will complement a track already under construction in Cambridge, a crucial first all-weather surface in the perennially rain-soaked New Zealand.

The remainder of the package will be allocated to the Department of Internal Affairs in a fast-tracked bid to stop wagering revenue from leaving New Zealand's shores. A rise in off-shore gambling, coupled with Covid-19's effect on wagering, has had a knock-on effect to community and sport groups that rely on a share of gambling revenue to operate.

"We knew from the beginning of the Covid pandemic that the racing industry was facing an unparalleled crisis in its history," Peters said yesterday. "The racing industry is seriously underestimated for its important contribution to our regions and our economy.

"Our studies indicate that it contributes \$1.6 billion to the economy each year, there are 15,000 full-time racing industry jobs and nearly 60,000 indirect jobs. There are 15,000 owners, 800 trainers and 200 jockeys. Not only is New Zealand's bloodstock world class, it's a significant export earner. All are facing an unprecedented threat."

New Zealand's racing industry was in the middle of a reform package

after Peters commissioned Australian racing heavyweight John Messara to prepare a review of the industry.

The Messara Report, which was delivered in August 2018, was blunt in its assessment of the state of New Zealand racing, declaring that the "thoroughbred racing industry in New Zealand today is in a state of serious malaise".

The report offered 17 recommendations across a wide

variety of areas, including governance, funding, prize-money, racecourse rationalisation, TAB outsourcing and animal welfare.

RITA, which replaced the New Zealand Racing Board (NZRB) and manages the TAB, the New Zealand tote, across all three codes - thoroughbreds, harness racing and greyhounds - has been tasked with implementing the report's recommendations and administering the industry's overhaul, acting as a temporary governing body until a permanent structure can be put in place.

<< Continued from page 2 industry has experienced several years of financial underperformance. It was part-way through a serious reform program, when Covid arrived. As one expert put it, this has created a perfect storm," Peters said.

"We can't gild the lily - this has taken the industry to the brink of insolvency. It's a matter of urgency for the government to provide support. We have to protect what we have and we have to rebuild for the future.

"Sadly, there has been some internal squabbling in racing circles. Some

blame [RITA] for the problems it inherited. Look, to be honest, we've had enough of mostly old men leaning against the rail, scratching their derriere and blaming everyone else. Fortunately, common sense is now prevailing and most accept that common sense is the key to recovery."

On behalf of the thoroughbred racing industry, NZTR chairman Dr Alan Jackson welcomed the intervention but also warned that it was a lifeline that should not be taken for granted.

"The Minister described this as the first step in the restoration of racing, and emphasised that this a long-term process," he said. "The industry needs to be aware that the support package is a leg-up, not a hand out and there are expectations from government that the industry will make the necessary changes required to live within its means.

"NZTR, along with the other codes, will also be continuing to work with RITA to ensure that future reforms are in line with those expected by the Minister and others in government."

The package, which was announced live on free-to-air television by Peters, was warmly received by some of New Zealand's biggest stakeholders.

"We all know that change is needed and we are fortunate enough to have a government that understands the value of the racing industry and the contribution that it makes to the economy - both domestically and in export dollars," David Ellis, whose Te Akau operation is an industry leader in both New Zealand and abroad, told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday. "We need now to be proactive and finish up with a leaner and sharper and more efficient industry.

"I think that Covid-19 has changed the world and certainly the racing industry in many ways. Our industry is not exempt from the Covid-19 problem. The landscape is different, but the industry leadership now has the financial support and the legislative framework to empower it to make the tough decisions that are necessary for the future prosperity of our industry."

<< Continued from page 4 Andrew Forsman, who - with Murray Baker - has formed one of New Zealand's most formidable training partnerships, believes that the government's lifeline will give the industry an opportunity to implement a more efficient and effective model, especially with more stakeholders choosing to invest in Australia rather than New Zealand.

"We're suffering from 20 years of poor administration, I guess," Forsman said. "RITA, who took over from the TAB, was riddled with debt but thankfully the government has bailed them out and given them enough to prop us up.

"Hopefully, we can now put in the measures in place that were laid out in the Messara Report two years ago to try and get the industry running efficiently again.

"We just have to get back on to a level playing field, clear that debt and allow RITA a little bit of room to move in cutting costs. That's something that has had to happen for a while and it hasn't happened, we've been too top-heavy and with no return to the stakeholders. We are starting to lose investment to Australia with a thriving industry over there."

While acknowledging that Peters is viewed as a divisive figure in the New Zealand political arena, Forsman believes that having a racing minister with a passion for the industry has been a positive for its stakeholders and participants.

"Ithink Winston has at least made things happen for us: commissioning the Messara Report, putting RITA into place, those things," Forsman said. "They've had a pretty big mess to clean up, two decades of neglect really, and at least Winston has been on our side in that regard.

"Hopefully now, we can put the right processes in place and have a sustainable model heading forward."

Fellow Group 1-winning trainer Tony Pike, president of the New Zealand Trainers' Association, is another with praise for the government's actions.

"It is obviously huge for the industry," he said. "Without government support the TAB, or RITA were heading west. By the sounds of it, they hadn't been paying suppliers for a while, with \$26 million to clear their current liabilities. This provides us with enough money to carry on until domestic racing gets back on track in addition to sports and gaming."

However Pike pointed out that, while it has been framed negatively

in the New Zealand mainstream media as a lifeline for the gambling industry, the racing scene is much sphere.

"For people at the coalface, it is not considered a gambling industry," he said. "It employs a huge number of people and an enormous amount of care is taken Forsman looking after the horses and we are renowned on the world stage.

"It is a stimulator for the local

economy. Areas like Cambridge and Matamata, their local economies rely heavily on the thoroughbred industry. It is a massive export earner with horses being sold overseas and income coming from overseas investors who support breeding and training in New Zealand."

Now, with the future of the industry secure in the short-term and promising in the long-term, the primary focus is returning to a sustainable racing product in the medium-term, with racing set to kick off again in early July and a host of top New Zealand gallopers set for spring riches on both sides of the Tasman.

"It's certainly a very exciting time for Te Akau, we have a stable full of really nice horses and the best lot of yearlings that we've broken in," said Ellis, who is set to be represented by Group 1 winners such as Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle), Melody Belle (Commands) and Probabeel (Savabeel) later this year.

"It's nice to be able to send our team to the track, start educating the yearlings in the barriers and start the whole process again. It's a very exciting time for certain."

Forsman added: "We're very happy to be back in the swing of things and very glad to have a job. A lot of people aren't that fortunate.

"While we're probably at half-capacity at the moment, we'll fill up over the next few weeks. We have lost owners to Australia and that's always frustrating, but we just have to knuckle down now. It's certainly nice to be back and we can't wait to be back and racing."

Peters - whose press conference received more attention for his call, as the most senior Maori member of Jacinda Ardern's government, to adapt the traditional hongi greeting for the coronavirus era - did have one hope for New Zealand to be able to match their trans-Tasman rivals Australia.

"I don't know if this news will reach the Queen but I hope that it might reach Buckingham Palace," Peters said with a grin in response to a question about the Queen's approval of the continuation of racing during a phone call with Australian prime minister Scott Morrison last week. "She has a great interest in racing and is seriously knowledgeable about it.

"In the long-term, if we get all the steps correct, there is no reason why racing in this country cannot be a world-class industry, stronger than ever. We are out of the gate, but we have a distance to cover before we get to the home straight and the winning post. That said, we are going to make racing great again."

Larneuk Stud announced its 2020 stallion lineup yesterday, with a 20 per cent decrease on last spring across the board. Cluster (Fastnet Rock) will stand for \$5,500 (all fees inclusive of GST), O'Lonhro (Lonhro) is at \$4,400 and Wolf Cry (Street Cry) - who is set to have his first twoyear-olds next season - is at \$3,300. "Larneuk has been standing stallions for over 20 years but we've never seen anything like the current situation," Larneuk's Neville Murdoch said. "You can try and put positive spin on things, but breeders - the very breeders who support the Victorian industry, year in and year out - are facing some tough times. The sad irony is, that this is the exact time you should be breeding, particularly given that demand will be even greater on the other side of all this coronavirus mess. We just want to look after those who have looked after us and will certainly be doing deals on multiple bookings."

Maurice filly tops online auction

A yearling filly by Japanese shuttle sire Maurice (Screen Hero) has topped the latest sale on

bloodstockauction.com which featured a draft of yearlings consigned by Arrowfield Stud. Catalogued as Lot 63 and sold for \$66,000, the filly is out of Omniyah (Fastnet Rock) who is a half-sister to Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) winner La Bella Dama (Desert Sun). Arrowfield's highest-priced lot was a colt, also by Maurice, who was purchased for \$55,550. Out of the Magnus (Flying Spur) half-sister to three-time Group 1 winner Don't Doubt Mamma (Not A Single Doubt), Miss St Tropez, the colt is also related to star mares Tuesday Joy (Carnegie) and More Joyous (More Than Ready). Private sale tops Inglis Broodmare

The private sale of the Jazcom Thoroughbredsconsigned Miss Exfactor (Your Song) to Aquis Farm for \$280,000 has topped the online Inglis Broodmare Sale which concluded on Sunday. "She is for Pierata, who we will be supporting heavily in his first season" said Aquis Farm Managing Director Shane McGrath. "She's very good-looking and fast, which are usually the right criteria for broodmare success in Australia. Credit to the guys at Inglis, their work didn't stop when the sale finished, and we were glad to agree to a deal. The response to Pierata has been extraordinarily positive - I don't think there is a better looking horse retiring to stud this year - so we are very excited." The clearance rate for Sunday's sale has now risen to 72 per cent with the prospect of further sales to be completed in the coming days.

Swettenham Stud launches breeder support package

Swettenham Stud has launched an initiative to assist breeders by offering extended payment

plans and a guarantee of progeny produced by its stallions. All breeders whose mares are bred to Swettenham Stud stallions in 2020 will have the option of paying service fees in monthly instalments of seven per cent through Thoroughbred Payments. This will start when the mare receives a 45 day scan which essentially spreads the payments over the period until the foal is about five months-old. Should the mare fail to produce a live foal, all payments will be refunded to the breeder unless they want to continue paying and receive a free return. "We've spoken to our breeders and heard their challenges in the current circumstances and we believe this will assist them to budget for the stallion that they want, and with a guarantee of the foal getting to weanling stage," Swettenham Stud principal Adam Sangster said.

Vale Caryl Williamson

The Australian racing industry is in mourning after the death of Australian Associated Press (AAP) turf editor Caryl Williamson, aged 67. AAP editor-in-chief Tony Gillies announced that Williamson died peacefully at her home in Sydney yesterday. Williamson, a common fixture around Sydney's press rooms, joined AAP in 1984 as a casual copy taker, but her passion for horse racing and her breadth and depth of knowledge saw her promoted to become AAP's turf editor in 1996, a position she would hold for 24 years until her death. Highly respected for her tireless work ethic, her passion and her willingness to help anyone determined to make their way in racing or in journalism, her copy has been used on a daily basis by most of the big publications in Australia and abroad. Wide draws for leading Goodwood contenders

A field of 15 have accepted for the Goodwood (Gr 1, 1200m) at Morphettville with leading contenders Gytrash (Lope De Vega) drawing barrier 12 and The Inevitable (Dundeel) drawing gate 15. Five-time Group 1 winner Santa Ana Lane (Lope De Vega), who won the feature Adelaide sprint two years ago, will carry the top weight of 59 kilograms under the set weights plus penalties conditions. Santa Ana Lane drew barrier 10 while last year's Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Trekking (Street Cry) has barrier six. Triple Group 1 winner Sunlight (Zoustar) has barrier three and her stablemate Xilong (Deep Field), who won the Euclase Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) last time out, has drawn the inside barrier. Danny O'Brien, who experienced recent top-flight success with Russian Camelot (Camelot), will run Order Of Command (Squamosa) who has drawn barrier two.

Richards okay with wide draw

Gordon Richards' initial thought after Gytrash drew barrier 12 for Saturday's Goodwood was that it was not an ideal starting position, but on reflection, the trainer believes the gate is not disastrous and will not deny the four-yearold his chance of winning Adelaide's timehonoured Group 1 sprint. "First thought was he was about five holes out further than what I would have hoped for," Richards said. "Second thoughts, it is what it is. I don't think it will worry him. He steps away nicely and there's a bit of pace inside and outside him which should break the field up enough. He sat three and four deep last time and won running away. There's also only one bend at Morphettville, so it should be alright."

Stick 'Em Up to run in SA Fillies Classic

John Sargent is aiming Stick 'Em Up (Dundeel) at the SA Fillies Classic (Gr 3, 2500m) in Adelaide, but has also nominated her for the Andrew Ramsden Stakes (Listed, 2800m) in Melbourne. The Andrew Ramsden, for three, four and five-year-olds, carries a ballot exemption into this year's Melbourne

Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) for the winner. "That was only as a back up if she didn't get into the race in Adelaide," Sargent said. "She is going to run in the Fillies Classic." Stick 'Em Up ran fifth in both the Adrian Knox Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) and the ATC Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) at Randwick during the Sydney autumn carnival and will head into her next start off the back of a 2350-metre Class 1 win at Newcastle. "She was not ridden the best in the Oaks and we're trying to get some black type with her while she's still a three-year-old," Sargent said.

Melbourne Cup dream starts at Flemington

The disappointment of missing a guaranteed start in the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) has swung connections of Skelm (Animal Kingdom) on a quest for an even richer target. Skelm is one of 15 horses nominated for the Andrew Ramsden Stakes at Flemington on Saturday. Trainer Terry Kelly said he and the owners of Skelm had planned on winning the Mornington Cup (Listed, 2400m), run in March, which would have provided a ballot-free entry into the Caulfield Cup. He ran a fast-finishing third in the race to Aktau (Teofilo). An ex-Godolphin-owned horse, Kelly purchased Skelm for \$12,000 unraced. The Andrew Ramsden will not have a capacity lineup this year with only 15 nominations that includes Adelaide Cup (Gr 2, 3200m) winner King Of Leogrance (Camelot), last start Warrnambool winner Too Close The Sun (Carlton House) and recent Adelaide winner Oceanex (Ocean Park).

Runaway aims at Ramsden

After a series of modest efforts on the flat in 2019, including when finishing 19th in the Melbourne Cup, the owners of 2018 VRC St Leger (Listed, 2800m) winner Runaway (Manhattan Rain) were focusing on a jumps career. However, connections are once again aiming at another tilt at the Melbourne Cup as part owners Rosemont Stud have been told by co-trainer Gai Waterhouse that the Australian Hurdle hopeful will now run in the Andrew Ramsden Stakes at Flemington. "We might have been going to the Cranbourne

jumps trials this week instead of the Ramsden if we were allowed but apparently the jumps trials coming up are only for horses going for their jumps ticket," Rosemont stud principal Anthony Mithen told Racing.com. "Gai was keen to give him another trial but in the absence of being able to do that, she needs to get miles in his legs. He's there for a good bowl around and to keep his fitness up."

Michael Rodd toughing it out in isolation

After returning from Singapore, Michael Rodd is looking forward to finishing his time in isolation and earning a living again. Rodd said he had a few loose ends to tidy up which delayed his 40 hour trip home via Doha. "I'm back to ride and I don't know what is happening in Singapore and it could even be a permanent move the way it is shaping," Rodd said. "Hard work is not something I'm worried about, it's something I've always done. I'm looking forward to getting out and seeing some old faces and meeting some of the new ones, in both the jockeys' room and training ranks. I'm really looking forward to it, especially after being holed up here for two weeks." Rodd hopes to be back riding at Flemington on Saturday week and needs to get clearance from stewards to start out again.

No change to Victoria biosecurity protocols

Racing Victoria yesterday announced that, despite the Victorian government easing some of its Covid-19 restrictions last night, the industry will not make any changes to their strict biosecurity protocols. The industry working group will continue to review the protocols on an ongoing basis. RV chief executive Giles Thompson said: "The biosecurity protocols we have in place go over and above government directives, guidelines and advice and they are what have allowed us to ensure the safe continuation of racing and training over the past two months. The government has stated that Victoria can expect more positive cases and outbreaks as it starts to ease restrictions. As a result, we must continue to do everything in our power to minimise the risks of an outbreak occurring in our industry."

Tasmania set to lose key stallions

Two of Tasmania's most exciting stallions may be bound for the mainland as the Covid-19 crisis hits home in the one state in which racing has not continued. Needs Further (Encosta De Lago), sire of inaugural All-Star Mile winner Mystic Journey, and Alpine Eagle (High Chaparral), whose oldest progeny are yearlings, are potentially heading for Victoria or New South Wales, with Armidale Stud's David Whishaw telling RSN 927 yesterday that discussions are ongoing. "Without speaking out of school there is quite a bit of pressure on us to keep Needs Further," Whishaw said. "However, he has achieved great things down here off limited books of mares and the opportunity would be for him to be located where he could secure better books of better mares. It has always been our dream to compete with studs on the mainland because there is no better breeding ground in Australia than Tassie but recent events have made things extremely tough."

Rivet joins Smith's Warrnambool base

Racing Post Trophy (Gr 1, 1m) winner Rivet (Fastnet Rock) has found a new home in a third country, joining Lindsey Smith at Warrnambool. A Group 1 winner as a two-year-old, defeating subsequent Australian Group 2 winners Yucatan (Galileo) and Raheen House (Sea The Stars), he also won the Champagne Stakes (Gr 2, 7f) as a juvenile, defeating two-time Dubai World Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Thunder Snow (Helmet). Purchased by Hong Kong owner Peter Law, he joined the John Moore stable but failed to fire in Hong Kong, placing in just two of his 18 starts. He had his last start in Hong Kong in July last year.

Appo's Wuhan journey

Brisbane jockey Beau-Dene Appo is counting his blessings after escaping the epicentre of the Covid-19 outbreak in time when riding an international Invitational Stakes winner in Wuhan, China, last December. "How lucky was I?" Appo rhetorically asked RacingQueensland.com. The son of former successful Queensland jockey Lyall Appo, Beau-Dene relocated to Brisbane in mid-April to be based in Rockhampton and ride at the central Queensland meetings under the racing regions model in response to Covid-19. Appo, 27, has ridden around 350 winners with the majority being in south east Queensland and numerous winners in Brisbane.

Apprentice Graham found guilty by WA stewards

Apprentice Chris Graham has been found guilty by Western Australia stewards of failing to give Pushin' Shapes (Viscount) every possible chance to win the Kirin Megumi Handicap (1600m) at Ascot on Saturday. Graham was also charged with failing to take the horse out at the top of the straight, and ride with sufficient vigour and purpose. The 27-year-old pleaded not guilty on grounds that his saddle had slipped and had concerns for his safety throughout the race on the Daniel and Ben Pearce-trained seven-year-old. Graham has been stood down from his rides, with a penalty due to be issued by the end of the week.

Pitman welcomes prospect of Riccarton synthetic

Michael Pitman expressed excitement at yesterday's announcement that the South Island may get a synthetic track installed at Riccarton. Pitman, who trains in partnership with his son Matthew, said that he has been a vocal advocate for the installation of an all-weather track at Riccarton. I've been very constant in my wish for a synthetic track for ten years," Pitman said. "The synthetic tracks in Victoria get supported by all the best trainers.

I've been to Singapore, Hong Kong and England where they race on a lot of synthetic tracks. It is not just the racing but the training of horses in winter getting them ready for spring racing, I think it is a big plus. There is probably nobody in Christchurch that has a bigger commitment to racing than myself, Diane and Matthew. With a synthetic track, instead of 23 days of racing hopefully it will be closer to 40."

Entries open for NZB's Ready To Run Sale

The New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale is now taking entries. The sale, which has produced graduates like Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle), Beat The Clock (Hinchinbrook), Gingernuts (Iffraaj) and Surprise Baby (Shocking) in recent years, is scheduled for November 18 and 19. Breeze-ups will be conducted on October 15 and 16. Entries for rising two-year-olds can be made through portal.nzb.co.nz, with a deadline of June 10.

ASIA

Thoroughbred sales return to South Korea

Jeju Island, south of the Korean Peninsula, played host yesterday to one of the first in-person thoroughbred sales in the world since Covid-19 was declared a pandemic with a two-year-old auction in the breeding hub. Only 28 of the 151 catalogued lots were sold, with any horse not reaching the 20 million won (AUD\$25,000) threshold immediately being passed in. The sale-topper was a Take Charge Indy (A P Indy) colt out of Patti's Sweet Song (Unbridled's Song), from the family of Dolphin Street (Bluebird) and Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo), purchased for 90 million won (AUD\$113,000). Racing remains suspended in Korea, with their tracks at Seoul and Busan affected by an inability to race without spectators.

Hamelin enjoying his Hong Kong start

Antoine Hamelin has made a fine start to his Hong Kong career since emerging from quarantine five weeks ago, and the Frenchman is showing no signs of slowing as one of only three jockeys with a full book of nine rides at Happy Valley tonight. "It's a busy day again, I'm feeling good – I'm very happy to get a lot of support and every day of racing I have good rides and good chances to win," Hamelin said. With nine wins to his name from nine race meetings, Hamelin is shooting at a strike rate of 11 per cent. "I just need to do my best and get a little bit lucky but for me, here, I have support, I've had a few winners – life's good," Hamelin said.

Crowds slowly returning to Hong Kong racecourses

Tonight's Happy Valley meeting will feature the largest on-course crowd in months as the Hong Kong Jockey Club slightly relaxes restrictions on racecourse attendees. The Hong Kong government last week announced that social distancing measures in place to combat the spread of Covid-19 were to be eased, allowing the HKJC to open its doors to more people. While members of the public still aren't allowed to be trackside, Jockey Club members and their guests will be able to return, although they will have to fill in a health declaration, undergo temperature screening and wear a mask.

88 for Teofilo

Saiga (3 f ex Vorda by Orpen) became Teofilo's 88th individual stakes winner on Monday when she took out the Prix Caravelle Haras Des Granges (Listed, 2100m) at Toulouse. Bred and raced by Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Thani and his Al Shahania Stud, Saiga is the second foal to race out of Cheveley Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) winner Vorda (Orpen). Coming off a disappointing fifth at Pornichet in March, the Phillippe Sogorb-prepared Saiga was sent out at 25/1 but rallied strongly under Anthony

Crastus to defeat Moon A Lisa (Sea The Moon) by a head with Neige Blanche (Anodin) a length away in third. Teofilo, who shuttled to Australia for six seasons resulting in 342 live foals, is standing his 13th season at Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland this year at a fee of €40,000.

Two for Al Kazeem

Al Kazeem (Dubawi) recorded his second individual stakes winner on Monday when Usak (3 g ex Qatari Elegance by Giant's Causeway) took out the Prix FBA Aymeri de Mauleon (Listed, 1600m) at Toulouse. Bred by Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Thani's Al Shahania Stud and raced by its principal, the Phillippe Sogorb-trained Usak was ridden back in the field by Jean-Bernard Eyquem before pulling widest of all on straightening. Finding the best ground, he raced clear for a length victory over Thunderspeed (Night Of Thunder) with Nobody's (Vespone) back in third. Fourtime Group 1 winner Al Kazeem stands for a private fee at Oakgrove Stud in Wales this year, having commanded £12,000 in 2019.

Frankel relation an Inglis bargain for Kent breeder McPhee

buyer's market usually prevails at bloodstock auctions during economic downturns, with bargains available for those prepared to do their homework or think outside the box.

A small breeder from Kent has seized on such an opportunity by unearthing a maternal 'cousin' to Frankel (Galileo), no less,

for a scarcely believable \$13,000 in the Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale held online on Sunday.

Stuart McPhee's new purchase is Star Effort, a nine-year-old by Casino Prince (Flying Spur) out of Endless, an unraced daughter of Sadler's Wells (Northern Dancer) and Lancashire Oaks (Gr 3, 1m4f) winner Rainbow Lake (Rainbow Quest).

Endless is thus a half-sister to Kind (Danehill), the Listed-winning dam of unbeaten

dual world champion Frankel – now one of the world's leading young sires – plus multiple Group 1 winner Noble Mission (Galileo).

This most cherished family rarely comes on the market, but former mining magnate Nathan Tinkler managed to buy Endless as a three-year-old for 105,000gns at the Tattersalls December Breeding-Stock Sale of 2009, when Frankel was on the verge of turning two.

Endless joined Tinkler's Patinack Farm operation in Australia, and Star Effort is the result of her mating with home stallion Casino Prince – a Group 1-winning son of Flying Spur (Danehill) who became the sire of champion All Too Hard.

Endless made few waves with her Australian-bred progeny – including Star Effort, who was unraced – and since Tinkler's fall from grace and the dispersal of the Patinack Farm stock she has now returned to be bred from in Europe.

With three unraced foals on the ground, Star Effort found herself part of the Evergreen Stud Farm draft for Sunday's Inglis sale, usually a live event in Sydney but forced into being held online only this year by the coronavirus crisis.

This is where McPhee came in, or rather logged on. He takes up the story.

"I'd tried to get involved with another Inglis online sale a few weeks ago, after I'd seen someone on Twitter commenting that they had noticed mares selling for much less than the covering fee of the sires they were in-foal to," he says.

"So I had a look and there were indeed horses going surprisingly inexpensively. I registered to bid at that sale, but there were only a few pedigrees I was familiar with – naturally, most were from deep Australian or New Zealand families.

"I placed a few bids but I set myself low limits and didn't end up getting anything. The important thing, though, was that I got through the registration process and was ready for next time. Inglis were very helpful in telling me what to do and putting me in touch with some studs down there."

McPhee was better prepared for the Australian Broodmare Sale, which comes after the Chairman's Sale of elite racemares but still recorded an average price of \$39,384 with a top lot who made \$280,000.

"I upped my spending limit a little for this sale, as there were a few more mares who had either raced up here or were from European families," McPhee says. "There were even a few mares by Shamardal, which will obviously be at the top of most breeders' wish lists after the year he had.

"But it was this one mare, Star Effort, who took my eye, as she just had the most fantastic page - you don't get much better than being a close relation to Frankel."

"I set myself a limit of \$15,000, around £7,500, to buy her and to be honest I didn't think I stood much chance."

No wonder McPhee was pessimistic when you dig further into the family history.

"I was aware that Star Effort had not sold for \$200,000 two years ago [at the Inglis Chairman's Sale]," he explains. "Even more remarkably, Endless had made \$1.05 million not that long ago [when bought by Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum at the 2013 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale].

"Her two-year-old filly by Teofilo is Gai Waterhouse, too, so that could deliver a nice pedigree update in time, and she's also comparatively young at nine."

But there were a few reasons for hoping she could be secured cheaply, as McPhee points

"The only thing that gave me a chance of buying her was that she's not in foal, and that can often put buyers off - even me usually, as I'd rather have a chance of getting an immediate return by selling the foal," he says. "Also, Casino Prince is a perfectly respectable sire but he's not the height of fashion, even in Australia.

"The bidding was at \$3,000 for her when

I first looked at the sale, so I thought there would be no harm in making an early play even if it went over my limit in and I managed to get her for \$13,000."

Valiant Stud in the Hunter Valley has taken care of Star Effort and she will remain in Australia for the coming southern hemisphere breeding season.

"I'll decide on whether she stays there or comes back depending on what I choose to cover her with," says McPhee, who is looking forward to browsing websites and brochures to find a compatible stallion.

"If she doesn't get in foal in three months I'll bring her to Europe as there's likely to be more commercial demand for her family here than in Australia, judging by what happened in the online auction."

McPhee says the online bidding process was "very slick" and has words of encouragement for anyone who might be worried about digital auctions having to take place in Europe due to lockdown restrictions - for broodmare sales, at least.

"There were lots of informative photos and videos of the mare," he reports. "I think with the rise of ebay and similar websites we're all more familiar with buying things online these days.

"It's less of an issue with broodmares, of course, and there's a much higher risk for foals and yearlings as you can't run your hands down their legs or get a feel for them in the flesh.

"But, that said, if it came to it in the current circumstances, an online sale would be hugely more desirable than the alternative of no sale at all."

McPhee, who owned the useful sprinter Joe Packet (Joe Bear), has been breeding for around 15 years - ostensibly as a side project as he works full-time as a business change director, with his salary funding the equine venture.

"I've been close to breaking even in recent seasons without quite doing so," he says. "I have seven or eight mares with Rossenarra Stud, some at Manor House Stud Farm and a few in

and Storm Cat among others. I'm just starting to use a few more expensive stallions as well, so costs have gone up but so too, I hope, has the likelihood of the progeny making a profit.

"I particularly like looking at the annual dispersals from the Maktoum family and Juddmonte to see if I can find an unraced or lightly campaigned three or four-year-old filly to win a race or two with and then breed from."

McPhee managed to do just that with Nafaayes, who is by Sea The Stars (Cape Cross) out of a daughter of Al Bahathri (Blushing Groom) and cost 7,000gns from Shadwell. She went on to win two races and is now pregnant to Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f) hero Masar (New Approach).

First Link also did the trick for him. The daughter of First Defence (Unbridled's Song) from the family of Close Hatches (First Defence) and Siskin (First Defence) was bought for just 3,000gns from a Juddmonte draft, and she won three races before being put in foal to champion two-year-old US Navy Flag (War Front) this season.

"The stallion selection is the fun part for me, really," says McPhee. "It's like a puzzle: which sires will work on pedigree? Which are commercial? Which are underrated?

"I don't always get it right - I have a Flatbred foal by Wings Of Eagles, and the sire has been pushed into the National Hunt ranks. But he was a good Derby winner and I'm prepared to back my judgement by putting the foal in training myself if need be."

It will be fascinating to follow McPhee's mating plans for Star Effort, and indeed finding out whether online auctions held during the Covid-19 pandemic turn out to be a rich source of inexpensive breeding-stock gems.




