Golden Slipper Stakes winner Farnan ruled out of Saturday's Everest

Dollar For Dollar steps in to fill the vacant Aquis Farm slot

n Everest (1200m) start for Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Farnan (Not A Single Doubt) has been abandoned on the eve of the barrier draw for the \$15 million race despite Racing NSW veterinarians giving the valuable colt the all-clear to run on Saturday.

The valuable colt, the subject of a highpriced deal in August to announce the return of Kia Ora Stud as a major Hunter Valley stallion farm, was last night ruled out by trainers Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott and Everest slot holder Aquis Farm. *Continued on page 2>>*

<< Continued from page 1 Farnan, co-owned by Kia Ora Stud, Aquis Farm and Phoenix Thoroughbreds, is expected to barrier trial at Rosehill on Friday in a hit-out connections hope will be enough to convince them to press ahead with his interrupted campaign culminating in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Flemington on October 31.

As a result of Farnan's defection from the Everest, Aquis Farm turned to the Tony and Calvin McEvoy-trained eight-year-old gelding Dollar For Dollar (High Chaparral), runner-up in the Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and Gilgai Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at his past two starts.

Farnan, who was beaten first-up as favourite in the Run To The Rose (Gr 2, 1200m) on September 12, worked strongly in an exhibition gallop on September 30, but a foot issue last week ruled him out of a tilt at last Saturday's Roman Consul Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m).

"It's very disappointing as The Everest is a huge race on the world stage, but like an Olympic final, you don't go there unless you're 100 per cent," Kia Ora bloodstock and breeding managing Shane Wright told ANZ Bloodstock News.

The horse is doing very well, but he's just had one or two little setbacks and missing a gallop, so you have to do the right thing by the horse and be guided by your trainers.

"Team Kia Ora would like to wish the very best of luck to Aquis on Saturday and their choice of replacement for the slot."

Aquis Farm managing director Shane McGrath echoed the sentiments of Wright and believes Farnan can reinforce his place as his generation's dominant colt.

"The Coolmore is a traditional three-year-old race and it's going to be a cracker this year and he'll possibly trial during the week and then head on to Gai and Adrian's Flemington stables," McGrath said.

"If he lives up to his Golden Slipper run, he'll be the one they'll have to beat, there's no doubt about it."

Tony McEvoy could not hide his excitement after receiving the unexpected call-up for The Everest.

"Dollar is at the top of his game and he was heading up for the 1200-metre Sydney Stakes anyway, so he's in tip top shape for the race,"

"What a journey this little horse has taken us on already and hopefully he can climb to the top."

Three Bridges backs Haut Brion Her to fly farm's flag in Everest

Meanwhile, Victorian stud farm Three Bridges Thoroughbreds has passed up the lure of a maiden Group 1 win for valuable homebred mare Haut Brion Her (Zoustar) to instead chase the riches of The Everest.

Haut Brion Her was yesterday confirmed as the last runner in the 12-horse, \$15 million Everest after Peter Liston orchestrated a deal to buy the slot owned by Chris Waller Racing to ensure the mare gained a start in Sydney's most talked about race.

Liston, principal of Three Bridges, combined with Haut Brion Her's co-owners Gary Johnson and Steve Gardiner, to purchase the \$600,000 slot in the race rather than reaching an agreement with the Waller-led syndicate.

"We've got some very good clients and they've supported us all the way through with Haut. We believe in the product we breed, raise and race and this is our way of showing everybody that we're proud of what we do," Liston told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

"Hopefully we get a good barrier draw and Chris can put his magic touch on her. It'll be a great day whatever happens, but it'd be even better if God shone on us and we can finish in the placings, if not win it."

<< Continued from page 2 Other Everest slots have also been traded this year, with miRunners paying \$880,000 for one held by Greg and Barb Ingham, while Hong Kong owner Bon Ho also entered into a private arrangement to purchase the slot owned by the Australian Turf Club in order for current favourite Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt) to run in the race.

A dominant Sheraco Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner at Rosehill on September 12, Haut Brion Her was a well-backed favourite in the Golden Pendant Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) two weeks later, but worked hard from the outside barrier before tiring to finish seventh, two and a half lengths behind Subpoenaed (Rip Van Winkle).

Liston reasoned that despite not yet having a Group 1 win on her record, a strong performance in The Everest would also add significantly to Haut Brion Her's breeding value, while he also heeded the advice of her trainer Chris Waller.

"The reason we've gone to the Everest is that when she won the Blazer Stakes in Melbourne, the jockey (Michael Walker) and Chris both thought that she goes a lot better the Sydney way," the Victorian studmaster said.

"Chris was considering the Manikato and if this didn't come up, it might have been a secondary thought, but it is mainly that she does go better the Sydney way..

"She would be the first mare to win The Everest, so I don't think that would be forgotten (by breeders and yearling buyers)."

Waller said: "Haut Brion Her has shown her brilliant speed this preparation with a superb win in the Sheraco and I know she is capable of giving this race a shake up. Her work has been faultless the last two weeks which gives

me great confidence that she will be primed to put in a big performance on Saturday."

Haut Brion Her's racing career hung in the balance 12 months ago after suffering a tendon injury but a long rehabilitation in Victoria has seen her return to arguably career-best form.

"After the Blazer, she had an injury that required quite a bit of time off, so we sent her to Lee Everson, who deserves a lot of credit," Liston said. "HOPEFULLY WE GET A



Caulfield Cup 'free hit' for Mirage Dancer

Trent Busuttin regards the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) as a free hit for Metropolitan Handicap (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Mirage Dancer (Frankel). The British import's first start in Australia was in last year's Caulfield Cup and connections place no pressure on the seven-year-old to improve on his third-placed finish behind Mer De Glace (Rulership). "He's now a Group 1-winning son of Frankel. He's done his job for his connections," said Busuttin, who trains in partnership with Natalie Young. "It's a free hit in the Caulfield Cup now and he's in the form to run well." Mirage Dancer has 55 kilograms in the Caulfield Cup, one kilogram less than last year, and was not penalised for his Metropolitan win. The final field for the Caulfield Cup will be announced after the Coongy Cup (Gr 3, 2000m) at Caulfield tomorrow, with the winner receiving a golden ticket into the Group 1 three days later.

Pike latest jockey to ride Dalasan

Willie Pike will take the ride on Dalasan (Dalakhani) in Saturday's Caulfield Cup, after connections agreed a compensation figure with Billy Egan, who was contracted to take the ride. Fresh from four winners on Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) day at the weekend, Pike will ride Group 2-winner Dalasan for the first time on the weekend, after his intended mount Port Guillaume (Le Havre) was ruled out of the race last week due to injury. Dalasan is yet to win this preparation but finished a close fourth to Verry Elleegant (Zed) in a blanket finish to the Turnbull Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) last time out.

Kah misses date with Prince

Jamie Kah missed yesterday morning's planned trackwork with Caulfield and Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) bound Prince Of Arran (Shirocco) due to a complication with the jockey's riding gear. Kah was supposed to ride the Charlie Fellowes-trained British raider at Werribee racecourse, but Prince Of Arran was instead partnered by his travelling foreman Aled Beech, who has ridden him regularly since he arrived at Werribee's International Horse Centre earlier this month. "Everything was planned for her to come here this morning to ride him in a slow piece of work, just a canter around, but there was a bit of an issue getting her gear through the quarantine side of things," Beech told Racing. com. "She would need to leave a lot of her riding gear behind over the other side and wouldn't be able to get that back before Saturday morning (the end of the quarantine period) so it was a bit difficult."

Anders 'frightens off rivals'

Impressive San Domenico Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) winner Anders (Not A Single Doubt) has deterred all but two rivals from facing him in tomorrow's Blue Sapphire Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield. Only the Anthony Freedmantrained Hanseatic (Street Boss) and Danehill Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) third Ranting (Zoustar) will compete against Anders for the \$400,000 prize. "Anders looks to have frightened a few of them off but we're still excited that it will certainly be a different type of race," MRC chief executive John Blanksby told Racing.com. "It'll be very tactical and very interesting. While there will be limited turnover on a race of three runners, we're looking at it as an engagement tool as it will be a gripping race and something away from what we're used to."

Winter form to pay off for Collett

Jason Collett will ride in The Everest (1200m) for the first time on Saturday when he will partner the well-fancied Group 1 winner Gytrash (Lope De Vega), who was last seen winning the Concorde Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) on September 5. Collett believes his winter form has enabled him to pick up the ride, with his talent showcased on Saturday when taking out the Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) on Montefilia (Kermadec). "Everyone says the pressure doesn't get to them but at some point it always does," Collett told Racing NSW. "Last Saturday was going to be a great example of whether it did or it didn't. It was a good chance for me to showcase it isn't affecting me like it may have in the past. For David (Payne, trainer) to give me the opportunity on that filly, favourite in a Group 1, that was great. You take the opportunity, get the result and it's led to another one. It's snowballing I suppose in some ways. It may come back to me having a good winter. This is a big week and it was a good way to start it last Saturday."

Vanna Girl's campaign at the crossroads

Carnival plans for Vanna Girl (Husson) are in limbo after she jarred up in the Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) on October 3, when finishing 14th of 17. The four-year-old's spring program will not be locked in until she is assessed in the coming days. "She felt the track a bit and pulled up a little bit jarred up for a few days afterwards," said Trent Edmonds, who trains in partnership with his father Toby. "We've treated her with a couple of quiet days, some swimming and some anti-inflammatories as well. She got back in what was basically an uncompetitive

Depending on how quickly she recovers, Vanna Girl may start in Saturday's Craven Plate (Gr 3, 2000m) at Randwick, with another option being the Rosehill Gold Cup (2000m) on October 31.

Peters' pair to head to Eagle

The Bob Peters-owned pair of Windstorm (Redoute's Choice) and Superstorm (Sebring) are set to head to the \$7,500,000 Golden Eagle (1500m) at Rosehill on October 31. Windstorm won at stakes level for the first time on Saturday in the Weekend Hussler Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Caulfield, while Superstorm finished third in the same day's ToorakHandicap (Gr 1, 1600m). "It was a good win, he [Windstorm] is going really well," Peters told Racing.com. "I'm going to look at the logistics of sending him and Superstorm to the Golden Eagle now. It was always in the back of my mind that we had this option if they were both going good enough." Superstorm is an \$11 chance for the Golden Eagle with Sportsbet, while Windstorm is \$13.

Future uncertain for injured Tagaloa

Tagaloa (Lord Kanaloa), who took out the Blue Diamond Stakes (Group 1, 1200m) in February, will miss the Spring Carnival following his 14th-placed finish in Saturday's Caulfield Guineas. Tests carried out yesterday have shed light on the three-year-old's performance, leaving his future uncertain. "It's obviously really disappointing, but we ride the highs and lows in this game

constantly," Trent Busuttin, who trains in partnership with Natalie Young, told Racing. com. "The scans and tests have shown he has a slight throat issue where he may have displaced his soft palate during the run and he's also feeling his suspensory ligament a bit. His immediate future is out in the paddock and it will be up to the ownership group where he goes to from here."

Boss on Sir Dragonet as Bowman accepts ban

Glen Boss will ride leading Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) contender Sir Dragonet (Camelot) in the October 24 showpiece after Hugh Bowman decided not to appeal his ten-meeting ban for careless riding. Bowman, who was punished for his ride on King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice) in the Caulfield Guineas on Saturday, elected to begin the ban after Saturday's Caulfield Cup meeting, which enables him to partner Cup favourite Anthony Van Dyck (Galileo). Sir Dragonet's owner Ozzie Kheir confirmed the appointment of Boss, who is a three-time Cox Plate winner, yesterday afternoon. The former Aidan O'Brien-trained Sir Dragonet is yet to run in Australia after making the move down following four consecutive runner-up efforts, most recently in the Tattersalls Gold Cup (Gr 1, 1m2f) at the Curragh in June. He is currently in quarantine at the Werribee International Horse Centre and will join up with new co-trainers Ciaron Maher and David Eustace next Saturday morning.

Chapada gets Cup penalty

Chapada (Bullet Train) has improved his position of gaining Melbourne Cup entry after he received a 1.5 kilogram weight rise following his Herbert Power Stakes (Gr 2, 2400m) win on Saturday. Chapada, who secured his place in this weekend's Caulfield Cup with the victory, now has a weight of 52 kilograms for the Melbourne Cup, moving him up to 45th in order. Due to the conditions of the race, his Caulfield Cup weight will remain unchanged at 50.5 kilograms. "Chapada ran very well when second in the Group 3 Naturalism over 2000 metres and then, when stepping out to 2400 metres on Saturday, he was very strong at the end of the Herbert Power defeating Zebrowski

and Platinum Invador, who have 52 kilograms and 53 kilograms respectively in the Melbourne Cup," said Racing Victoria's executive general manager of racing Greg Carpenter.

Racing Queensland finalists announced

Racing Queensland has announced the finalists for the 2020 TAB Queensland Thoroughbred Awards, which will be broadcast on Sky Racing on Monday. A total of 25 trophies will be awarded including Trainer, Jockey and Apprentice of the Year, as well as the TAB Queensland Horse of the Year. "It's been an unforgettable year in more ways than one," RQ CEO Brendan Parnell said. "However, it is important that we are able to celebrate the accomplishments of our human and equine stars. Over the past 12 months, Queensland has shone on the national stage with the likes of Rothfire, Alligator Blood and Vanna Girl doing us proud. NEW ZEALAND

Glory Days right for Livamol

The rekindled career of stayer Glory Days (Red Giant) will be put to the test in the Livamol Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) at Hastings on Saturday. The winner of last year's Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) and placed in the Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m), the mare was retired after finishing outside the placings in the New Zealand St Leger (Listed, 2600m) at Trentham in March. However, a potential sale fell through and her connections decided to bring her back into work for another spring campaign, and the eight-year-old ran an eyecatching fourth in the Website Angels 2100 at Te Rapa on October 2. Carrying 61 kilograms, Glory Days fought fiercely to finish less than a length behind the winner Vadavar (Redoute's Choice). "It was a really good run," trainer Bill Thurlow said. "It was a very big performance and we were really pleased with her. She's come through that in great order and seems to just keep improving in this preparation. I'm very happy with her."

Callsign Mav to stay at home

Callsign Mav (Atlante) will remain in New Zealand following his third-placed effort in the Windsor Park Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) at Hastings on October 3. The John Bary-trained four-year-old, who landed the Tarzino Trophy (Gr 1, 1400m) at odds of \$82.60 in September, was nominated for a shot at the Golden Eagle (1500m) but connections have instead circled the Manawatu Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Awapuni in December as his next major target. "He was pretty tired (after the Windsor Park Plate) and we put him out in the paddock. We felt he had two really tough runs on firmish tracks," Bary said. "We are really proud of him. No one mentioned he gave 1.5 kilograms away to the two mares that ran him down. We threw a nom in because they were free, but the Golden Eagle is right-handed and he has never raced right-handed, which is a worry. If you are going to Australia, in my experience, you have got to be bomb proof. He's going to get three weeks total (in the paddock) and then he will come back in and we will probably set him for that weight-for-age Group 2 at Awapuni in December."

Evergreen Sampson scores

The 11-year-old gelding Sampson (Dubai Destination) provided Howie Mathews and his wife, Lorraine, with another win in the Egmont Cup (2100m) on Saturday. With 60.5 kilograms on his back, the remarkable Sampson gave weight to all his rivals but managed to defeat Hi I'm Nikkita (He's Remarkable) by a nose on his 83rd start. "What can I say?," the winning trainer said. "He's a great old horse. I did think I was selfish bringing him back into work this year, but then what do you do? He's a professional racehorse and he loves it. He's a happy horse and basically the only one I have in full work so he gets one on one. He gets the royal treatment. We're lucky he's been sound right through and he just loves racing. He may be 11, but he doesn't show it and he proved that on Saturday. He just wanted to win." Sampson's list of victories is headed by the Awapuni Gold Cup (Gr 2, 2000m) and the Trentham Stakes (Gr 3, 2100m), both won in

Bidding opened yesterday for the Tom Dabernig and Ben Hayes-trained mare who won four times in 22 starts and was last seen finishing 13th in the Blazer Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Flemington on October 3. Andrew Seabrook, managing director of New Zealand Bloodstock, told Racing.com: "She could be the top-priced mare ever sold online. I think she'll bring seven figures, I really do. You'd think the big Australian studs will be interested in her. We've already had a lot of interest and she went live two minutes ago." Bidding runs through until 7pm NZ time (5pm AEDT) on Thursday.

14 for Territories

Darley shuttler Territories (Invincible Spirit) sired his 14th individual winner when Aldaary (2 g ex Broughton's Revival by Pivotal) made a successful debut at Yarmouth yesterday. The William Haggas-trained newcomer landed a novice contest over six furlongs by beating Media Guest (Belardo) by a comfortable three and three quarter lengths. A 150,000gns purchase from Tattersalls Book 2 last year, Aldaary is the fifth winning foal out of the Pivotal (Polar Falcon) mare Broughton's Revival. Territories stands at Kelvinside for a fee of \$11,000 in 2020.

16 for Shalaa

The Andrew Balding-trained Skibo Castle (2 c ex Noelani by Indian Ridge) got off the mark at the third attempt yesterday to bring up Shalaa's (Invincible Spirit) 16th individual winner. Skibo Castle was unplaced in his first two starts but capitalised on a four-runner field to land a novice contest over six furlongs at Windsor, beating the short-priced favourite Pure Dreamer (Oasis Dream) by a short head. A €130,000 purchase by Alex Cole at Arqana last year, Skibo Castle is the eighth foal out of Noelani (Indian Ridge), who herself is a sister to Prix de l'Abbaye (Gr 1, 1000m) winner Namid. Arrowfield Stud shuttler Shalaa stands in NSW for a fee of \$33,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

UK: European wondermare Enable retired

The curtain yesterday came down on Enable's (Nathaniel) glittering career after connections opted against having one final start and retired the wondermare with immediate effect. Khalid Abdullah's hugely popular six-year-old, winner of 11 races at the highest level, secured her legacy as one of racing's brightest stars with backto-back victories in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) and a record three wins in the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 4f) at Ascot. For the second successive year, Enable failed in her bid for a historic third success in the Arc earlier this month when finishing sixth at Longchamp on desperate ground. With her whole season built around the Arc, it was expected that she would bow out in Paris but afterwards connections left the door ajar for one final appearance, possibly on Saturday's British Champions Day at Ascot. Trainer John Gosden said the final decision would be made by Abdullah and vesterday the leading owner's Juddmonte operation announced Enable would be retired immediately. Enable raced 19 times over five seasons and recorded 15 wins, including 11 at Group/Grade 1 level, and amassed £10,724,320 in prize-money. Those earnings are a record for a horse trained in Europe, exceeding Highland Reel (Galileo).

UK: Kingman to cover star mare

Enable will be covered by Banstead Manor Stud star Kingman (Invincible Spirit) next season, Juddmonte revealed after her retirement was announced. This mating plan is not considered a surprise, given that Juddmonte stallion Kingman has enjoyed another scintillating season with Palace Pier and Persian King landing Group 1 wins around Europe. As Khalid Abdullah's Enable, the daughter of King George and Eclipse hero Nathaniel and broodmare Concentric, is inbred to Sadler's Wells (Northern Dancer), it effectively ruled fellow Juddmonte resident Frankel (Galileo) out of the equation and Invincible Spirit's (Green Desert) son Kingman is free from such blood. In a statement, Douglas Erskine Crum, CEO of Juddmonte, said: "After consulting her trainer John Gosden and his racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe, Prince Khalid has decided that Enable will be retired from racing and will now join the Juddmonte broodmare band to be covered by Kingman in 2021."

Magisterium (Elzaam) was the same distance away in third. Tiznow stood at WinStar's Kentucky base for a fee of \$40,000 (approx. AUD\$55,500) in 2020.

O'Gorman colts set Magic Millions benchmark at Warwick Farm

he attention has this week turned to the Australasian two-year-old sale market with key breeze-up sessions for next month's Magic Millions and New Zealand Bloodstock auctions taking place at Warwick Farm and Te Rapa yesterday as buyers prepare for next Tuesday's Inglis offering.

Tamworth consignor Mel O'Gorman breezed up eight two-year-olds, including the five fastest of the morning headed by a colt from the first crop of Arrowfield Stud's Japanese shuttler Mikki Isle (Deep Impact) who stopped the clock at 10.26 seconds.

"I was really happy with them all. I felt that I had a strong bunch of colts coming into the morning, so I thought they would run good times and they all ran accordingly," O'Gorman told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"I've really liked this (Mikki Isle) horse from day one and every time I stepped up his work he has handled the whole preparation so well.

"He's such a professional and he's a tough, mature horse for a two-year-old and, given Mikki Isle was a champion sprinter-miler, I think this makes him a really attractive horse to a lot of people because, as you can see, he can run time but on type he gives you the impression that he would run a mile or further."

The Mikki Isle colt, who is a half-brother to recent winner Azaly (Dundeel), is the third foal out of the unraced mare In The Clear (Redoute's Choice) while O'Gorman also showcased a Starspangledbanner (Choisir) colt who ran 10.45 seconds, a son of Hinchinbrook (Fastnet Rock) who ran 10.49 seconds and a Shalaa (Invincible Spirit) colt who stopped the clock at 10.58 seconds.

"The Hinchinbrook is a readymade two-yearold, tough as nails and a very sound horse and he is by a proven stallion who is also proven in Hong Kong. I think he should be very attractive to the Hong Kong market," O'Gorman said.

"The Starspangledbanner is a horse with a bit more scope and size on him and he can certainly gallop and run time but he actually, if you look at the mare's pedigree, is out of a European mare who was running over two miles

"He should be an attractive option for people looking for something that may develop into a nice three and four-year-old over a mile and 2000 metres."

O'Gorman believes buyers, particularly those from Asia, will still need to source stock and will look to the two-year-old sales to do that despite not being able to travel to the sales themselves.

"Racing's obviously continued (for the most part) all around the world, and we're lucky that it's kept going in Hong Kong and I feel that there is still a need for these horses," she said.

"We're going into a bit of an unknown but if you are presenting the right stock I think they will still sell well."

O'Gorman returned to her Tamworth base late yesterday where she will now focus on her draft of five two-year-olds entered for the Inglis Ready 2 Race Sale at Riverside Stables. She had a colt by Zoustar (Northern Meteor) last month run the fastest time of her team, setting 10.77 seconds.

"It will be nice to get the Magic Millions colts back home to the farm and given them a couple of weeks before they head to the Gold Coast and I am back down on Friday for another group of horses for clients at the Inglis sale," she said.

"I am looking forward to the Inglis sale to get a feel for how the market is going to play."

A colt by Woodside Park Stud shuttler Cable Bay (Invincible Spirit), who is being offered by Nolen Racing, ran the fastest time of the Seymour session in Victoria last week.

t's Caulfield Cup week and for us we're playing a bit of a waiting game at the moment. True Self has definitely made the field, which is fantastic and I think with her style of racing she will really be suited

San Huberto is right on the cusp. A lot will depend on how two horses, who are behind him in the order of entry for the Caulfield Cup, run in the Coongy at Caulfield tomorrow. A win from either of the two favoured horses in that race could see them elevated above San Huberto, and by my reckoning that puts us as first emergency, so we'll be eagerly waiting to see if we make the final field with him.

We call around the trainers to see what their intentions are with their horses nominated and most of the trainers are pretty good - they'll tell you what they're doing, if they even know themselves.

With these races, like the Caulfield Cup and the Melbourne Cup, the trainers are under a lot of pressure from connections to start, irrespective of whether they have a good chance in the race.

There's two or three horses in the Caulfield Cup that you would say, really, are just making up the numbers but, to a lot of people, it's a dream just to have a runner in the race.

One feature of Covid-19 is that we've

ownership model, because they're great races for doing exactly what you have horses for, and that's to race and win stake money.

Having a Group 1 for a gelding is all very nice but it doesn't do anything other than give you a bit of status. If you asked me 'would you rather run in the \$500,000 Rosehill Cup or a Group 1 worth \$300,000?' We'd go the Rosehill Cup every time.

These pop up races are relatively new. And owners are actually finding them very appealing. Such as the All Star Mile, for example, and The Everest. The prestige these races carry is big.

But one thing that still very much holds its value is the Melbourne Spring Racing Carnival. Our owners have always wanted to have a horse race through the carnival, regardless of the race. We know in this industry that bragging rights are very important and a runner in the Melbourne Cup carnival offers that more than anything else!

Golden Conqueror Rules The Sand

acau's sand superstar Golden Conqueror (Rothesay) made it eight wins from nine starts on the sand surface with a dazzling display of speed in winning Saturday's Class 1 over 1050 metres.

Ridden by regular rider Roger Yu, Golden Conqueror after flying the gates and taking command of the race, proceeded to give his rivals a galloping exhibition after he sped away to a five length break coming to the home turn. Horses like the speedy Fasuba (Power) and Sheng Li Superstar (Harbour Watch) were simply no match for the son of Rothesay (Fastnet Rock) who coasted home an easy winner over Mountain Tiger (Coats Choice), with Crispy Biscuit (Written Tycoon) running on for third.

In what was his toughest test to date Golden Conqueror was far superior, and has now picked up close to \$1.5 million HKD in prizemoney for his connections, the Golden Pistols Racing Syndicate.

On a day where the feature event was the Inglis Ready 2 Race Sale Stakes, it was fitting that the four-year-old should score. As a two-year-old, Golden Conqueror was an \$55,000 purchase at the 2018 Inglis Ready 2 Race Sales. The gelding was an instant success in Macau bolting in at his first start on a rating of 35 points; after Saturday's demolition job the gelding would be looking at another seven or eight points from the handicapper; that will take him close to the 100 mark and make him one of the top ten rated gallopers in the enclave.

Trainer Tommy Tse, who works in partnership with Louis Ho, has done a fine job with the four- year-old with his only defeat on the all-weather surface being a length and a half second to Rock To Road (Stryker) back in February, otherwise his record would read nine straight and unbeaten on the sand.



Golden Conqueror

The neat looking brown gelding has had only one run on the turf for a very creditable fifth, beaten one and a half lengths behind Fortune Treasure (Dalakhani) in the Macau Sprint Trophy (Listed, 1200m) in August. On a very fast track the gelding led and was only caught late in a race run in a slick 1.08.4.

Fausto Henrique returned to the race track victorious to win the days feature the Inglis Ready 2 Race Sale Stakes on the favorite Mr Fortune (Jet Spur) for champion trainer Tony Fung.

Mr Fortune endured a nightmare run from gate ten and was posted out seven deep going into the back; Henrique however didn't panic and just let the horse slowly travel forward until he joined a line of three on the lead as they started the circle from the 600 metres to the turn. The four-year-old son of Jet Spur (Flying Spur) shrugged off the tough run and raced away in the straight for an easy win over The Moon's Back (Hussonet), with Blackjack Mok (All Too Hard) in third.

Mr Fortune has been another bargain buy for Macau owners having been bought for the modest sum of \$20,000 at the 2018 Magic Millions National Yearling Sales. Saturday's win was his fourth from 11 starts with three placed efforts and over \$600,000 HKD in prize-money.

Henrique was runner up in the Jockey's Championship last season on 40 winners to Luis Corrales 57 wins. He had not ridden since August 23rd due to a careless riding suspension from last season. This at times has been his undoing and proving a costly pattern. Should he remain free of suspension this season he has all the attributes to be the champion jockey.

Peter Lao the longshot king was back in the winner's circle Saturday with an all the way win in the Class 6 over 1350 metres on Mr Half Lamma (Battle Paint) for trainer W H (Rambo) Tse.

Mr Half Lamma was set alight to lead by Lao and rated to a nicety, before finding plenty in the straight to score his maiden win and give Lao his second win for the season, and Rambo Tse his first with only three runner's to date from the stable for the new racing year.

A former Champion Macau apprentice who was in the top bracket of riders in the enclave for many years, Lao made a comeback to race riding last December after three years out of the saddle and found it tough going. He only managed to ride six winners late last season, five of them at massive odds, but it at least brought him to the attention of trainers once more and better rides appear to be coming his way.

A win on the well supported City Gold (Oustrip) for trainer Stanley Chin on the second day of the new season got him underway, and now with the win on Mr Half Lamma things should be on the up for the veteran rider, who is looking as good as ever and riding with his old confidence once more.



New first season sire winners

Belardo - Hale Bopp (2 c ex Emperors Pearl by Holy Roman Emperor) brought up Belardo's (Lope De Vega) ninth individual winner when landing the Irish EBF Median Sires Series (C & G) Maiden (7f) at Dundalk on Friday night. The Ger Lyons-trained two-year-old was making his second start after finishing fourth of five in a maiden at Naas in June won by Military Style (War Front), who subsequently took out the Tyros Stakes (Gr 3, 7f). Sent off at 3-1 on Friday, Hale Bopp saw off the Joseph O'Brien-trained Charmed (Charm Spirit) by half a length, with Bears Hug (Kodi Bear) a further neck behind in third. First season sire Belardo stood at Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland for €10,000 (approx AUD\$16.350) in 2020 and has three stakes winners to his name so far.

Cable Bay - Jouska (3 f ex Quiet Protest by Kingmambo) provided Woodside Park shuttle stallion Cable Bay (Invincible Spirit) with his second individual stakes winner when causing an upset in the Boadicea Stakes (Listed, 6f) at Newmarket on Saturday. The Henry Candytrained filly was sent off at 18-1 following one win in her previous eight outings but cosily saw off 14-1 shot Sunday Star (Kodiac) by half a length, with Jovial (Dubawi) a further length behind in third. Leading fancies Millisle (Starspangledbanner) and Maid In India (Bated

Breath) failed to make an impact in the finish. Cable Bay, who shuttles from Highclere Stud in the UK, stands this season at Woodside Park for a fee of \$9,900 (inc GST).

Exosphere - Darley's Exosphere (Lonhro) sired his eighth individual winner and third in the northern hemisphere from just eight starters when Total Knockout (2 c ex Bahama Mama by Invincible Spirit) got off the mark at the second time of asking with victory in a 1200-metre claimer at Fontainebleau on Monday. The Frederic Rossi-trained colt beat Pic Sylver (Penny's Picnic) by half a length, with Lockdown (Charm Spirit) another length and three quarters away in third. Exosphere stands for a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) at Kelvinside in 2020.

Pride Of Dubai - Newcomer Just Beautiful (2 f ex Astrelle by Makfi) emphatically overturned favourite Daphne May (Mayson) in the fillies' novice auction division two (7f) at Kempton, scooting to a five-length victory for trainer Ivan Furtado to become the 22nd individual first crop winner for Pride Of Dubai (Street Cry). She's A Lion (The Last Lion) was a further half-length away in third. Just Beautiful

Shalaa - Pockley (2 c ex Wanting by Acclamation) got off the mark on Wednesday evening at Newcastle at the sixth attempt and became the 15th individual winner from the first crop of Shalaa (Invincible Spirit). The Roger Fell-trained juvenile took out the sixfurlong nursery under Jason Hart, showing a good attitude by rallying back when headed close home to get up by a short head from Navajo Spring (Charm Spirit), while the pair were three and a half lengths clear of Camerily Joe (Helmet) and the rest of the field. Al Shaqab shuttler Shalaa stands this season at Arrowfield Stud for a fee of \$33,000 (inc GST).

New Group or Grade 1 winners

American Pharoah - An American Triple Crown winner was the sire of a Group or Grade 1 winner for the first time in 13 years on Saturday as Harvey's Lil Goil (3 f ex Gloria S by Tapit) took out the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (Gr 1, 9f) at Keeneland, bringing up a first toplevel winner for American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile). Already a Grade 1 placegetter, having finished third to Preakness Stakes (Gr 1, 9f) winner Swiss Skydiver (Daredevil) in the Alabama Stakes (Gr 1, 10f), the Bill Motttrained Harvey's Lil Goil defeated her laststart conqueror Micheline (Bernardini) by three-quarters of a length with Magic Attitude (Galileo) a further half-length away in third. "She's a little superstar," assistant trainer Kenny McCarthy said of Harvey's Lil Goil. "She pretty much goes on any surface for us. At least in my mind, I think the turf probably is a little bit easier for her to handle." The last Triple Crown victor to have a winner at the highest level was Affirmed (Exclusive Nature), whose remarkable son The Tin Man scored the last of four Grade 1 wins in the Shoemaker Mile (Gr 1, 1m) at

Hollywood Park in 2007. American Pharoah, who will have his first Australian two-year-olds this season, stands at Coolmore Australia for \$55,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

Into Mischief - Reigning leading North American sire Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday) brought up his eighth Grade 1 winner on Saturday when Dayoutoftheoffice (2 f ex Gottahaveadream by Indian Charlie) took the Frizette Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) at Belmont. The Timothy Hamm-trained filly, who won the Schuylerville Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) at Saratoga in July, defeated the highly-regarded Vequist (Nyquist) by two lengths with more than ten lengths back to Cilla (California Chrome) in third. She is now likely to head to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' (Gr 1, 8.5f) at Keeneland next month. "She's a big, scopey filly, and I wanted to have some horse for the end of the year. The plan was to have a fresh horse for this time of the year," said Hamm, who notched his first Grade 1 victory. "When you put a plan together that works - the team of Siena Farm and myself and all our assistants - you feel vindicated. We all thought this filly was special when she won at four and a half furlongs because we knew she would be able to get longer than that." Into Mischief, who is on track to win his second

sires title, stood for USD\$175,000 (approx. AUD\$241,600) in 2020.

Lawman - Pretty Gorgeous (2 f ex Lady Gorgeous by Compton Place) brought up a sixth individual elite-level winner for Lawman (Invincible Spirit) when taking out the Fillies' Mile (Gr 1, 1m) at Newmarket on Friday. The Joseph O'Brien-trained filly was due to run in France last weekend before the O'Brien's were forced to pull out all their runners due to contaminated feed, but nothing was stopping the 5-2 favourite from winning this contest. Ridden by Shane Crosse, Pretty Gorgeous saw off Indigo Girl (Dubawi) by half a length. Lawman stood at Haras de Grandcamp in France for €10,000 (approx AUD\$16,300) in 2020.

Siyouni - A rollercoaster week ended in delight for Aidan O'Brien after St Mark's Basilica (2 c ex Cabaret by Galileo) led home Wembley (Galileo) to earn a one-two for the trainer in the Dewhurst Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) at Newmarket on Saturday, bringing up a fifth individual elitelevel winner for Siyouni (Pivotal). A race that has exerted much influence on the southern hemisphere stallion ranks, with five of the last six winners having shuttled to Australia or New Zealand, including the Darley pair Too

Ridden by Frankie Dettori, who landed his first Group 1 contest for O'Brien, and the pair defeated many of the leading contenders for next year's 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m), with St Mark's Basilica being cut from 33-1 to 12-1 for the race in May 2021. Wembley, who finished three quarters of a length behind his stablemate under Ryan Moore, was made a 20-1 shot for Newmarket's Classic. The O'Brien family completed the top three with the Joseph O'Brien-trained 11-4 favourite Thunder Moon (Zoffany) finishing a further one and three quarter lengths behind in third. Victory earned Siyouni his 39th individual stakes winner, with St Mark's Basilica recording only one maiden success prior to this. Siyouni stood at Aga Khan Studs' Haras de Bonneval base for a fee of €100,000 (approx AU\$163,500) in 2020.

Super Saver - Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 10f) winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon) registered his fourth individual Group or Grade 1 winner on Saturday when Happy Saver (3 c ex Happy Week by Distorted Humor) took out the Jockey Club Gold Cup (Gr 1, 10f) at just his fourth start. The Wertheimer Et Frere homebred was given a perfect rails-hugging ride by Irad Ortiz Jr, squeezing through to defeat fellow threeyear-old Mystic Guide (Ghostzapper) by threequarters of a length with a length and a quarter to odds-on favourite Tacitus (Tapit) in third. "I was very proud of the horse and his performance," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "I'm happy for the connections. The Wertheimers have been loyal supporters for many years, and I'm appreciative of that. It's great to get a Grade 1 win for them. He's by a Derby winner we trained, so it's fun all the way around." Super Saver is the latest stallion to have produced a Group or Grade 1 winner this season having been sold to stand in Turkey, along with Authorized (Montjeu)

and Daredevil (More Than Ready). He stood his first season at the Jockey Club of Turkey's Izmit station, 100 kilometres east of Istanbul, for a fee of 25,000 lira (approx. AUD\$4,400) in 2020.

War Front - Claiborne Farm's War Front (Danzig) made it 23 individual Group or Grade 1 winners on Saturday when Civil Union (5 m ex Photograph by Unbridled's Song) scored a first win at the highest level in the Flower Bowl Stakes (Gr 1, 10f) at Belmont Park. The Shug McGaughey-prepared Civil Union, who has made her way through the grades this season, is likely to be given her chance at the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (Gr 1, 9.5f) after taking the Flower Bowl by a head over My Sister Nat (Acclamation), the half-sister to last weekend's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) hero Sottsass (Siyouni). "It was probably a hard race on her, but she's a big and strong mare," he said. "I'll see what Mr Allen (owner Joseph Allen) wants to do. If she was doing as well as she's done all summer, it's probably worth giving it a whirl. But I'll just have to wait and see." Civil Union is a sister to Prix du Jockey Club (Gr 1, 2100m) placegetter War Dispatch, who has raced in Hong Kong and New Zealand since as Green Dispatch. War Front stood for US\$250,000 (approx. AUD\$345,150) in 2020.

Written Tycoon - On a standout day for Woodside Park Stud's Written Tycoon (Iglesia), Odeum (3 f ex Movie by Red Ransom) gave the stallion his 11th individual Group 1 winner with her victory in Saturday's Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). Woodside Park Stud's Written Tycoon (Iglesia) became the first horse in almost half a century to produce the winners of both the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and Thousand Guineas in the same year, something not achieved since Sovereign Edition's (Sovereign Path) top fillies Surround and Savoir took the Caulfield Guineas and Thousand Guineas respectively in 1976. Odeum produced a dominant performance to take the Classic, defeating Personal (Fastnet Rock) by a length and three-quarters with a long head to Instant Celebrity (Not A Single Doubt) in third. Written Tycoon is standing his first season at Arrowfield Stud in 2020 at a fee of \$77,000 (inc GST).

New stakes winners

Al Kazeem Harper (2 c ex Fuschia by Averti) won on debut at Saint-Cloud in July and stepped straight up to stakes company at Bordeaux Le Bouscat on Thursday where he remained unbeaten in the Grand Criterium de Bordeaux (Listed, 1600m), becoming the fourth

individual stakes winner for his sire Al Kazeem (Dubawi). Trained by Andrea Marcialis, Harper was a convincing winner, taking over with over 300 metres to go, he beat Reina Madre (Kingman) by a length and three quarters, while Guerre D'Amour (Camelot) was a further half length away in third. Harper is out of the winning Fuschia (Averti) however there is no black type on his page till his Listed-winning third dam Pink Valley (Never Bend) and her progeny, three of which won stakes races. He was sold by Oakgrove Stud for just 800gns as a foal and made 26,000gns as a yearling when selling to Marco Bozzi Bloodstock. Al Kazeem started his stud career at The Royal Studs in 2014, but following early fertility issues he moved to his breeders' Oakgrove Stud for the 2016 season with a fee of £12,000 which remained the same until this year when it was listed as private.

Authorized - Euchen Glen (7 g ex Jabbara by Kingmambo) won his first stakes race on his 32nd career start to bring up a 34th individual stakes winner for Authorized (Montjeu) when upsetting Logician (Frankel) to take out the Cumberland Lodge Stakes (Gr 3, 1m4f) at York on Friday. The John Gosden-trained Logician, who was unbeaten in six starts heading into this contest, was sent off the 1-3 favourite but tired in the closing stages and finished last of four. 18-1 chance Euchen Glen, who has had a double figure starting price on every start this season, battled hard to defeat Desert Encounter (Halling) by half a length, with Highland Chief (Gleneagles) well beaten in third. Authorized, who won the 2007 Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f), now stands in Turkey.

Bago - Stella Veloce (2 c ex Oh My Baby by Deep Impact) brought up an 11th individual stakes winner for Bago (Nashwan) when landing the Saudi Arabia Royal Cup (Gr 3, 1600m) at Tokyo on Saturday. The two-yearold defeated the favourite Infinite (Maurice), who was the only filly in the field of ten, by three lengths, with Seiun Deimos (Lohengrin)

a further two and a half lengths back in third. Bago, who won five Group 1s during his race career including the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) in 2004, stands in Japan and is the sire to two Group 1 winners, Big Week and Chrono Genesis.

Bullet Train - Blueblood Bullet Train (Sadler's Wells), a three-quarter brother to Frankel (Galileo), produced his second individual stakes winner on the flat on Saturday when Chapada (5 g ex Diamantina Dior by Oasis Dream) took out the Herbert Power Stakes (Gr 2, 2400m) at Caulfield. Trained by Mike Moroney, the Group 1-placed Chapada has been an infrequent winner throughout his career but was the subject of plenty of support on Saturday, starting at \$4.60 second favourite. The Daniel Stackhouse-ridden Chapada came with a strong run from beyond midfield, pulling out to the centre of the track on straightening and coming home solidly to score by a length and a quarter. Zebrowski (Savabeel) stayed on well for second, with Platinum Invador (Redwood) making good ground for third. Purchased for just \$32,500 by Paul Moroney Bloodstock from the 2017 Inglis Classic Yearling Sale, Chapada is the third of four foals to race out of his dam Diamantina Dior (Oasis Dream) and hails from a family that includes top stayers Capri (Galileo) and Bauer (Halling). Bullet Train shuttled to Australia for five seasons from 2013 to 2017, standing at Bowness Stud. He now stands as a dual-purpose sire at Woodfield Farm Stud in County Waterford, Ireland.

Cape Cross - The late Cape Cross (Green Desert) continues to produce new stakes winners more than three years after his death, with Future Score (6 g ex Theola by Kalanisi) giving the former Darley stallion his 121st individual stakes winner with his victory in Sunday's Cranbourne Cup (Listed, 2025m). The Matt Cumani-trained Future Score was sent out at \$15 and defeated Odeon (Zacinto) by a length and three-quarters, with defending champion Dr Drill (Dansili) third. Cape Cross died in 2017, having been retired a year earlier due to fertility issues.

Dark Angel - Fantasy Lady (2 f ex Warshah by Shamardal) battled hard to hold off Sense Of Style (Zoffany) by a short head in the Staffordstown Stud Stakes (Listed, 1m) at the Curragh on Sunday, earning Dark Angel (Acclamation) his 66th individual stakes winner. The Paddy Twomey-trained Fantasy Lady was yet to break her maiden prior to this race, with her best effort coming when runner-up over seven

Dark Angel stood at Yeomanstown Stud in Ireland for a €85,000 (approx AUD\$139,000) fee in 2020.

Dubawi - Godolphin's One Ruler (2 c ex Fintry by Shamardal) took out the Autumn Stakes (Gr 3, 1m) at Newmarket to earn Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) his 190th individual stakes winner. The Charlie Appleby-trained One Ruler, who finished third in the Flying Scotsman Stakes (Listed, 7f) at Doncaster last time out, saw off Aidan O'Brien's Van Gogh (American Pharoah) in relatively comfortable fashion, with one and three quarter lengths between the pair. Godolphin and Charlie Appleby also took third place with Dhahabi (Frankel) finishing a further one and half lengths back. Dubawi stood at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud for a fee of £250,000 (approx AUD\$450,500) in 2020.

Dundeel - Arrowfield Stud's Dundeel (High Chaparral) registered his 11th individual stakes winner on Saturday when Ain'tnodeeldun (3 c ex Ain'tnofallenstar by Starcraft) took out the Hill Smith Stakes (Listed, 1800m) at Morphettville on Saturday. The Anthony and Sam Freedmantrained Ain'tnodeeldun, a runaway maiden winner at Sale at his most recent start, was sent out as the odds-on favourite and justified that support, defeating filly Victoria Quay (Dundeel) by three-quarters of a length to lead home a onetwo for Dundeel with outsider Passing Phase (Spill The Beans) grabbing third. Ain'tnodeeldun, a \$240,000 purchase at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale Book 1 from Bhima Thoroughbreds, is the sixth foal of dual Listed winner Ain'tnofallenstar (Starcraft), who herself is a daughter of the Group 1-placed Ain't Seen Nothin' (Nothin' Leica Dane). Dundeel stands for \$66,000 (inc GST) at Arrowfield Stud in 2020.

Galileo - Lone Eagle (2 c ex Modernstone by Duke Of Marmalade), who is co-owned by Aquis Farm along with Ballylinch Stud, brought



up Galileo's 331st individual stakes winner when battling hard to land the Zetland Stakes (Gr 3, 1m2f) at Newmarket. Lone Eagle was purchased by Aquis Farm for 500,000gns at the Tattersalls Book 1 Yearling Sales last October and may well grace Australian turf later on in his career. He was prominent throughout under the in-form Silvestre de Sousa and had to work hard to fight off the challenge of Recovery Run (Nathaniel) who stayed on well under Oisin Murphy to finish one and three quarter lengths behind the winner. Mystery Angel (Kodi Bear) finished a further seven lengths behind in third.

Hot Streak - A Case Of You (2 c ex Karjera by Key Of Luck) impressively took out the Anglesey Stakes (Gr 3, 6.5f) at the Curragh on Sunday to bring up Hot Streak's (Iffraaj) second individual stakes winner and his first success at Group level. A Case Of You, trained and owned by John McConnell, followed up his maiden victory over 7f at Down Royal to strike convincingly under Gary Carroll. The Aidan O'Brien-trained Lipizzaner (Uncle Mo) finished a length and a quarter behind in second, with the eyecatching Giuliana (Muhaarar) powering home up the inside rail to grab third. Hot Streak's only other progeny to strike at stakes level is Flaming Princess, who landed the Prix Cavalassur (Listed, 1000m) at Deaville last year. Hot Streak stood at Tweenhills Farm & Stud in England for a fee of £5,000 (approx AUD\$9,000) in 2020.

I Am Invincible - Yarraman Park Stud's I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) brought up his 57th individual stakes winner on Saturday when Fake Love (2 f ex Anatina by Fastnet Rock) took out the Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Caulfield. Backed into \$5 equal favouritism, the filly bounced out to lead from the inside gate under Mark Zahra. In a professional performance, she scooted away early in the straight before holding off the late-surging Extreme Warrior (Extreme Choice) by a length and a quarter with a long head to Naples (Street Boss) in third. Bred by Segenhoe Thoroughbreds, the July-born filly was sold for \$380,000 at the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale last year before she was passed in for \$425,000 with a reserve of \$450,000 at this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. She is the second foal to race - and the first winner - out of dual Listed winner Anatina (Fastnet Rock), who produced a Hellbent (I Am Invincible) colt last year before missing to both So You Think (High Chaparral) and Deep Field (Northern Meteor) in 2019. I Am Invincible stands at Yarraman Park Stud for \$209,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

Lope De Vega - Lope De Vega (Shamardal) brought up stakes winner 76 after his two-yearold daughter Aunt Pearl (2 f ex Matauri Pearl by Hurricane Run) won the Jessamine Stakes (Gr 2, 8.5f) at Keeneland on Wednesday evening by two and a half lengths from Spanish Loveaffair (Karakontie) with Ingrassia (Medaglia D'Oro) a further two and three-quarter lengths back in third. Lope De Vega stands at Ballylinch Stud in Ireland for a fee of €100,000 (approx. AU\$163,300).

Maxios - Coolmore's Maxios (Monsun) sired his seventh individual stakes winner when Euclidia (3 f ex Mathematicienne by Galileo) ran out a clear winner of the Prix Panacee (Listed, 2400m) at Toulouse on Monday. The Christophe Ferland-trained three-year-old was winning for the second time in six starts when beating Deia (Soldier Hollow) by three and a half lengths. Phoceene (Olympic Glory) was another length away in third. Out of the winning Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare Mathematicienne, a sister to Listed winner Galipad, Euclida is a half-sister to three winners, including the Group 3 victor Soustraction (Lope De Vega) and the Listed-winning Prix Marcel Boussac (Gr 1, 1600m) runner-up Matematica (Rock Of Gibraltar). Maxios stood at Castlehyde Stud for a fee of €6,000 (approx. AUD\$9,900) in 2020.

Oasis Dream - Godolphin juvenile Erasmo (2 c ex Sant Elena by Efisio) followed up his maiden success last time out with victory in the Prix Saraca (Listed, 1400m) at Chantilly to earn Oasis Dream (Green Desert) his 122nd individual stakes success. The Andre Fabre-

Pivotal - Last Empire (4 f ex Final Dynasty by Komaite) brought up Pivotal's (Polar Falcon) 152nd individual stakes winner when taking out the Prix de Bonneval (Listed, 1100m) at Chantilly on Saturday. The Kevin Ryan-trained filly arrived in France following two consecutive secondplaced finishes in Listed contests at Beverley and Ayr but went one better in this, defeating Bavaria Baby (Dabirsim) by half a length, with Silent Wave (War Front) in third. Pivotal stood at Cheveley Park Stud for a private fee in 2020.

Power - Helvic Dream (3 g ex Rachevie by Danehill Dancer) pulverised the International Stakes (Gr 3, 1m2f) field at the Curragh on Sunday to earn Power (Oasis Dream) his 14th individual stakes winner. The Noel Meadetrained gelding has endured a frustrating season with three third-placed finishes and one second in five runs, but his consistency finally paid off when trouncing 2-1 favourite Up Helly Aa (Galileo) by seven and a half lengths. The Joseph O'Brien-trained Raise You (Lope De Vega) finished 12 lengths behind the winner in third. Power, who won the Irish 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) in 2012, stood at Coolmore in Ireland until he was sold to Cambridge Stud in New Zealand, where he was the leading first-season sire during the 2016-17 season. In 2019, he was relocated to Oaklands Stud in Australia where he currently stands.

Redoute's Choice - The late Redoute's Choice (Danehill) registered his 174th individual stakes winner on Saturday when Windstorm (4 g ex Storm Alert by Metal Storm) swept home to take out the Weekend Hussler Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Caulfield. Racing in Bob Peters' cerise and white colours, the Grant and Alana Williams-trained Windstorm came from a long way off the pace to defeat Phaistos (Helmet) by three-quarters of a length with Archedemus (Lope De Vega) a length and a half away in third. Windstorm is the second stakes winner out of Group 1 placegetter Storm Alert (Metal Storm), who won the Cockram Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield in 2006; he joins 2017 Pinjarra Cup (Listed, 2300m) victor Dark Alert (Testa Rossa). Windstorm took his record to seven wins from 10 starts, with earnings of \$440,690. Redoute's Choice died at Arrowfield Stud in March last year.

Emeralds, trained by John Sargent, was sent out as the \$8 equal second favourite in a wide-open market. Sprinting through along the inside under Jason Collett, she was able to catch the gallant Greysful Glamour (Stratum) in the final bound with a length and a half to Nimalee (So You Think) in third. Passed in at the 2018 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, Emeralds hails from an Aga Khan family, with her dam Doulmera (Mr Greeley) a half-sister to Group 1 winner Dalkala (Giant's Causeway), with her second dam Daltaya (Anabaa) a three-quarter sister to Dalghar (Anabaa). She is the only one of Doulmera's foals to race, with a two-year-old half-sister to Emeralds - Four Moves Ahead (Snitzel) - also in training with Sargent. Doulmera has also produced a Pierro (Lonhro) colt, while she slipped to Dundeel (High Chaparral) last year. Widden Stud's Sebring died in February last year.

Sixties Icon - 25-1 shot Nastase (2 c ex Rough Courte by Clodovil) sprung a surprise by taking out the Rockingham Stakes (Listed, 6f) at York, bringing up Sixties Icon's (Galileo) 15th individual stakes winner. Natase, trained, owned and bred by Mick Channon, fought hard to see off The Queen's horse Light Refrain (Frankel) by a neck, with the Richard Faheytrained Internationaldream (Acclamation) two lengths off the winner in third. Sixties Icon stood at Norman Court Stud in England for a fee of £6,000 (approx AUD\$10,800) in 2020.

Siyouni - It was a successful week for Siyouni as Prix Charles Laffitte (Listed, 2000m) winner Zaykava (3 f ex Zarkava by Zamindar) and Prix le Fabuleux (Listed, 1800m) victor Rajani (3 g ex Ramora by Monsun) took Siyouni to 40 individual stakes winners, in addition to St Mark's Basilica's Dewhurst Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) success. Zaykava, the fourth foal to race out of Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) heroine Zarkava (Zamindar), took out the Prix Charles Laffitte at just her second start on Friday, scoring comfortably. A day later, Rajano made it three wins from four outings when defeating Ecrivain (Lope De Vega) under Pierre-Charles Boudot, with the recently-gelded Now We Know (Kendargent) back in third. Siyouni, who is responsible for four Group 1 winners including last weekend's Arc hero Sottsass, stands at Haras de Bonneval where his fee for 2020 was €100,000 (approx AUD\$163,300).

So You Think - Coolmore Stud's So You Think (High Chaparral) brought up individual stakes winner number 27 on Saturday when Peltzer (3 c ex Miss Otto by Elusive Quality) added his name to the high-class honour roll that belongs to the Stan Fox Stakes (Gr 2, 1500m). Stepping back in grade after finishing fifth to Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Ole Kirk (Written Tycoon) in the Golden Rose (Gr 1, 1400m), Peltzer led all the way under Tim Clark to defeat Prime Star (Starspangledbanner) by a half-length with a nose back to Jet Propulsion (Rubick) in third. Purchased by Gerald Ryan and David Raphael for \$260,000 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale last year, Peltzer is the fourth foal to race out of Miss Otto (Elusive Quality) and remains her only winner to date. She produced a Street Boss (Street Cry) colt in 2018, a sister to Peltzer in 2019 and she is back in foal to So You Think once again. So You Think stands for \$38,500 (inc GST) in 2020.

Tavistock - The well-fancied Tavi Mac (5 g ex Bellaroof by Maroof) brought up the late Tavistock's (Montjeu) 22nd individual stakes winner when taking out the Team Wealleans Matamata Cup (Listed, 1400m) in impressive fashion on Saturday. The gelding, who finished runner-up behind Avantage (Fastnet Rock) in the Foxbridge Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) last month, was sent off the \$2.10 favourite under Opie Bosson and left the field for dead as they entered the straight, extending the lead all the way to the line to defeat runner-up Hay Tiger (Tiger Prawn) by three and a quarter lengths, with fast-finishing secondfavourite Burgundy Belle (Burgundy) coming home in third. Tavistock stood at Cambridge Stud before he died aged 14 last year.

The Gurkha - Best Of Lips (2 c ex Beata by Silver Frost) provided first season sire The Gurkha (Galileo) with his first stakes winner when landing the Preis Des Winterfavoriten (Gr 3, 1600m) at Cologne on Sunday. The Andreas Suborics-trained Best Of Lips followed up his maiden win over 1800 metres last time out with a convincing three-and-a-half-length success under Franny Norton. The colt pulled well clear of Sea Of Sands (Sea The Stars) in the final furlong, with Mythico (Adlerflug) a further four lengths back in third. The Gurkha, best known for his 2016 Sussex Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) success, has had nine individual winners from his first crop. The Gurkha stood at Coolmore in Ireland for €12,500 (approx AUD\$20,500) in 2020.

Tiznow - WinStar Farm's Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy) sired his 81st individual stakes winner courtesy of a victory for favourite Royal Approval (2 f ex Touch The Moon by Malibu Moon) in Sunday's Matron Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) at Belmont. The Wesley Wardtrained two-year-old, who contested the Queen Mary Stakes (Gr 2, 5f) at Royal Ascot, was winning for the second time in four starts when beating Union Gables (Speightstown) by three-quarters of a length. Magisterium (Elzaam) was the same distance away in third. Tiznow stood at WinStar's Kentucky base for a fee of \$40,000 (approx. AUD\$55.500) in 2020.
