Nature Strip made Everest favourite after drawing barrier five

Classique Legend loses place at the top of the market

Nature Strip (Nicconi) replaced Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt) as favourite for Saturday's \$15 million Everest (1200m) after last night's live barrier draw took place on the Sky Deck of Sydney's Centrepoint Tower.

The Chris Waller-trained gelding, who lost his position at the head of the betting after his disappointing fourth in the Premiere Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) earlier in the month, dislodged Classique Legend at the top of the market after the pair drew

barriers five and six respectively, with Nature Strip made a \$4.20 chance. Classique Legend is now quoted at \$4.40.

Gytrash (Lope De Vega) drew gate seven after his trainer Gordon Richards was forced to press the red button to generate the barrier draw three times after the system malfunctioned. The television coverage, however, showed Gytrash drawing barriers seven and one before chief steward Marc Van Gestel ordered the program to be reset. Once given the go-ahead to once again hit the button on the Sky Deck,

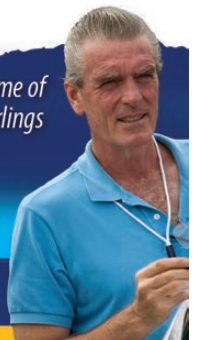

The second barrier to be drawn was that of Melbourne-trained sprinter Tofane (Ocean Park) who came away with barrier 11. Richards' early assessment of Concorde Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) winner Gytrash's barrier draw for The Everest was positive.

<< *Continued from page 1* The son of Lope De Vega (Shamardal), who has not raced since his September 5 victory over Nature Strip, was eased to \$6.50.

"He's (saddle cloth) number seven in the draw and he's drawn barrier seven, so I am happy with that," Richards told Sky Racing last night.

"We felt we didn't have to go any further; we were happy going six weeks between runs and I can tell you the horse has done really well with that break."

Premiere Stakes winner Libertini (I Am Invincible), who defeated Classique Legend and Nature Strip last start, came

up with the outside barrier of 12. She eased in betting from \$6 to \$8 after the draw.

"We're slightly deflated after that barrier draw. We did look like we were going to get a nice inside draw at one stage," said James Harron, whose Everest syndicate won the battle for Libertini after her first-up victory.

"But look, she's quite a dynamic (mare), she can do quite a lot. She

can come back off the pace - she showed that last week... we will dust ourselves off and get ready for Saturday.

"She's certainly the in-form horse of the race. She's beaten some of the favourites already. By all reports, she's come on beautifully from that run and her coat's come through which they were looking for."

New racing radio network set to shake-up airwaves

Radio station SENTrack will attempt to challenge the entrenched Australian racing broadcast media landscape dominated by wagering giant Tabcorp and industry-owned assets even if the man behind the new venture does not see it that way.

Melbourne-based media entrepreneur Craig Hutchison, a former sports journalist who has built an Australian content empire, the recently rebranded Sports Entertainment Network, has no doubt there is space in the market for what some pundits would claim to be a cramped space.

"It's a massive industry, racing, and we were already heavily invested in it and we had many clients in it through our sporting platforms, particularly radio, so it made sense to extend that relationship with the industry into a dedicated 24/7 racing platform as the new sound of racing, pacing and chasing as we call it," Hutchison told ANZ Bloodstock News in an extended interview yesterday.

"I feel there is a gap in the market. Most audio platforms in Australia in racing are fantastic in their own right with RSN, Sky Sports Radio, RadioTAB in Queensland and TAB Touch Radio in WA, but all of those four are owned by industry (or Tabcorp).

"Their interests are heavily and understandably aligned with their owners whereas we are unencumbered by having to cover 12,000 races a year like they all do because of their obligations."

SENTrack's biggest foray into the coveted Sydney market, via the 1539AM radio frequency, will occur on Saturday when it broadcasts the Everest meeting at Randwick after an agreement was yesterday finalised with Racing NSW, allowing the station to air live thoroughbred racing for the first time.

Matt White, the former Channel Ten sports commentator, will host Saturday's coverage while the deal will also see SENTrack broadcast the Golden Eagle (1500m) meeting at Rosehill on October 31 in conjunction with Derby Day at Flemington.

Hutchison recently landed the radio rights, negotiated with the Victoria Racing Club (VRC), to broadcast the four days of this year's Melbourne Cup Carnival as he attempts to make an impact on the racing media landscape.

SENTrack, which has the support of Harness Racing Victoria and its greyhound racing counterpart, does not yet have an agreement with Racing Victoria to broadcast thoroughbred racing in the state on an ongoing basis.

"We'd clearly like to do more racing, but interestingly in a recent survey we conducted, we asked our audience if they'd like more audio of live races or whether they enjoy the antics of our identities throughout the races and our audience voted for our identities, so it's a little bit

Gogglebox in its design - you're listening to people watching the races and the results," the Pacific Star Network chief executive and managing director said.

"But we do love the (Victorian) industry and we spend a lot of time talking about it. We want to be as supportive as we can to all industries and our head office is here in Melbourne.

"We admire Racing Victoria and we congratulate them on getting the industry through Covid the way that it has and we'd like to play a deeper role in Victorian racing, for sure."

In March, Racing Victoria chief executive Giles Thompson

hinted at the governing body's willingness to expand its reach via SENTrack to coincide with its heavy investment in RSN9278 and television station and media outlet Racing.com.

Thompson said in an RSN interview: "We as stakeholders within the industry are part of RSN and we understand what RSN does for us and RSN does great things for us.

"But RSN is a largely Victorian-focused radio station. Now it's going to be syndicated into Tasmania and South Australia.

"If we want to get into New South Wales or Queensland via radio then we need to think about other ways to do that.

"Again, conversations are confidential but if we are exploring media strategies, that's what it's about. It's about finding new audiences, not competing against our own existing assets."

Dedicated racing coverage is not new to the Sports Entertainment Network, formerly known as Crocmedia which was founded by Hutchison and James Swanwick in 2006, produces television and online video content for Racing Queensland, most recently the Northern Dreams show hosted by Simon O'Donnell which previewed and reviewed cup carnivals in the north of the state such as Townsville and Cairns.

The introduction of SENTrack, which launched in March, is an offshoot of Pacific Star Network's main radio station SEN, which holds broadcast rights to sports leagues such as the AFL and cricket and has strong ties to Melbourne, as well as an expanded presence in South Australia.

Whether the emergence of the SENTrack platform threatened the market share and revenue streams of Sky Sports Radio in NSW and the racing networks in other states, Hutchison was diplomatic, declaring he respected Tabcorp "enormously".

"They are the supermarket of the industry and we're the corner store, so we respect them and we feel we're doing a great job for all chasing, pacing and racing," he said.

"We're just trying to be polite and we think that everyone in the industry will benefit from (SENTrack) including

<< *Continued from page 4* them. I don't know how they feel about us, but we feel nothing but admiration for them."

Hutchison also sees the recruitment of long-time Sky Racing presenter Andrew Bensley, who left Tabcorp in April after more than 20 years, as a way of strengthening the station's reputation with a knowledgeable racing audience.

"I think Andrew Bensley's arrival on December 1 will make a big difference as it will provide a different lens to the whole platform and we think that's exciting," he said.

"We've probably missed a little bit of that credibility that he will bring to it. He will give us a bit more contrast between fun, tips, social as he is a respected industry figure (who will broadcast) in the morning, so I am looking forward to that."

One potential revenue advantage SENTrack has over its well-established rivals is that it can access the advertising dollars spent by corporate bookmakers who are denied airtime on Sky Racing and its associated radio platforms.

"That's one element of it, for sure, but SENTrack also gives us scale. It was a way to have a connection with Brisbane and Perth," Hutchison continued.

"We had relationships with those towns in wagering anyway, so it's strategically aligned. I also think there's a lot of advertisers who like the audience but haven't known how to access it or how to be part of it.

"These (racing) industries are wonderful because they employ so many Australians. It creates economic turnover. People instantly go to wagering, but there's areas like breeding, syndications, strappers, trainers and transport.

"It's important for us to perhaps demystify the industry and what we've found is that the industry is so willing to promote itself by making people available and by how often they talk (to the media)."

Hutchison, who maintains a public profile through his involvement with various AFL-related shows, added: "We want to be pro-industry, we want to be pro-participant by celebrating the trainers, jockeys and owners.

"The industry runs an enormous amount of events every day and no one remembers quite how big a job the industry does every day.

"On any one day, around the country, there's dozens of races, harness races, they're massive events that drive economic outcomes in those towns every day and yet it's a bit taken for granted by people, so we actually wanted to take a breath and celebrate what happens every day.

"Hopefully we've been able to do a bit of that, but it's still early days."

SENTrack can be heard in Melbourne via 1593AM, in Sydney on 1539AM, in Brisbane on 1053AM, on the Gold Coast on 1620AM, in Perth on 657AM, in Wollongong on 575AM, on the NSW Central Coast on 801AM, in Ingham on 96.9FM and Atherton on 99.1FM. Hutchison expects to add more frequencies around Australia with streaming online also available.

Tragedy as Winx loses first foal

The incomparable Winx (Street Cry) has tragically lost her first foal, a filly by I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit). Chris Waller issued a statement yesterday on behalf of Winx's ownership group, who have been devastated by the news. "It is with great sadness that the Kepitis, Tighe and Treweek families wish to inform everyone that unfortunately overnight Winx lost her foal," the statement said. "Our thoughts and attention at the moment are on Winx, ensuring that she remains healthy, as anyone in this situation would respect. It is a traumatic time for a mother and those involved and Winx is now the centre of our attention following the loss of a beautiful filly this morning." The champion mare was retired from racing after recording her 37th win in the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Randwick in April last year. The victory was her 33rd in succession and gave her a world record 25 Group 1 wins, amassing more than \$26 million prize-money. She was served by I Am Invincible last season and was reported to be doing well in the lead up to the birth of her first foal.

Outreach colt sets Magic Millions breeze-up benchmark

A colt by Exceed and Excel's (Danehill) group-performed son Outreach ran the quickest time during yesterday's third breeze up session leading into next month's Magic Millions Gold Coast 2YOs in Training Sale. The colt, consigned by Kenmore Lodge as **Lot 96**, is the third foal of the twice-winning mare Abblackahawka (Black

Hawk) and he clocked a slick 10.28 seconds for his 200-metre gallop at the Gold Coast Turf Club yesterday. The speedy youngster hails from the family of Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) winner Proprietor (Belong To Me) and is by Outreach, who at his only start pushed subsequent Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Vancouver (Medaglia d'Oro) when second in the Canonbury Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m). He's a brother to the Slipper winner Overreach.

Cumani sweats on Cup start with San Huberto

Matt Cumani will take a special interest in today's Coongy Cup (Gr 3, 2000m) as he is hoping the winner will be a horse who won't back up in the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m). As it stands, Cumani's imported galloper San Huberto (Speightstown) is on the cusp of getting into the Caulfield Cup field, which will be announced after the running of the Coongy Cup. The winner of the midweek feature gains an automatic berth in Saturday's \$5 million race. "I'm not sure exactly where he sits. Maybe around second emergency but then there's the Coongy and we'll have to see what the winner does, plus horses might change their path depending on the weather," Cumani said. "I'm going to prepare him as if he's in and we're planning and programming for Saturday." Cumani went to Werribee yesterday morning to watch San Huberto gallop and he was pleased with what he saw. "He's very athletic and he's got a nice action and a good

pedigree," Cumani said. If San Huberto can get into the Caulfield Cup field, Fred Kersley will ride him. If he doesn't gain a run, he will go to next Wednesday's Geelong Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) where he will be ridden by Damien Oliver. Nonconformist up to Coongy task

Grahame Begg believes Nonconformist (Rebel Raider) will bounce back to form when the four-year-old lines up in the Coongy Cup. The gelding could manage just a midfield finish on his most recent outing but Begg told Racing.com: "He's shaping up really well for Wednesday and I'm confident we'll see him return to his best. He is versatile, and I think we'll try and settle a little closer. We don't necessarily want to lead, but we can definitely be closer." Looking ahead, Begg continued: "I was leaning towards spelling him, but if he runs well tomorrow there are still a few races for him at Flemington that would be suitable."

Anders in race of tactics

Co-trainer David Eustace is not treating today's Blue Sapphire Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) as a track gallop for Anders (Not A Single Doubt) despite the flying colt having only two other horses as opposition. Eustace, who trains in partnership with Ciaran Maher said he was approaching the Caulfield contest with confidence but he respected the other two runners, Hanseatic (Street Boss) and Ranting (Zoustar). "Hanseatic's a good horse and Ranting's an improving, talented galloper," Eustace said, speaking on RSN Radio. "With

only three runners it becomes very tactical. He's got great gate speed and gets into stride quickly, so we have every intention to lead. It won't be a track gallop by any means, but we go into the race with confidence." Anders has had two starts this campaign for two easy wins at Rosehill in the The Rosebud (Listed, 1100m) and the San Domenico Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m). The colt then headed to Melbourne to run in the Moir Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) on September 25 but was scratched on race eve due to an elevated temperature. "He's back to his best. He's ready to go based on his work and jump-outs," Eustace added.

It's Me on song for Kosciuszko

Scone trainer Brett Cavanough is delighted with how stable stars It's Me (Shamus Award) and Fender (Toronado) have worked in the lead up to their assault on the \$1.3 million Kosciuszko (1200m) at Randwick. It's Me and Fender were snapped up quickly by sweepstake winners last month and both horses have been given a freshen-up in preparation for the valuable race for country-trained horses. Unbeaten mare, It's Me, blasted into favouritism for Saturday's race following a scintillating three-length win at Randwick on September 19 when she ran a shade outside the 1000-metre track record held by dual Everest (1200m) winner Redzel (Snitzel). "She has been working really well and we are very happy with everything leading into Saturday's race," Cavanough said. "We are hoping to draw between (barriers) four and eight." It's Me has been allotted 53 kilograms and will be partnered by Jason Collett. High speed four-year-old Fender has won four of his five runs to date with his only defeat being a late-fading seventh in the Theo Marks Stakes (Gr 2, 1300m) where he worked hard to lead from the outside draw. Fender is proven over the 1200-metre Randwick circuit having won a TAB Highway in April. "He's been working well too and I expect he'll probably settle in the first four," Cavanough added.

Duryea looking for Front Page draw

Geoff Duryea is hopeful Front Page (Magnus) can get a helpful barrier draw as the four-

year-old looks to regain the winning thread in The Kosciuszko. The gelding posted three consecutive successes prior to his second place finish last time out and Duryea told Racing.com: "Really I'm in the lap of the gods. I can't choose his barrier and I can't choose the weather, so I'm just focusing on my job at the moment and ignoring the outside noise. All I can do is go with the flow and make sure the horse is 100 per cent, and right now he's exactly that."

Grandslam up to Cox Plate challenge

Connections of Grandslam (Myboycharlie) are set to pay the late nomination fee which will allow their charge to take his chance in the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) at Moonee Valley on October 24. The brother to three-time Group 1 Jameka is likely to be the only three-year-old in the race which he heads to off the back of a third in last Saturday's Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). "He is a colt, he's going to have a very light weight," co-trainer David Eustace told Racing.com. "He rolled along well in the Guineas out in front, which is a tactic he can use again with that low weight if he draws well enough. You are only going to get one crack at a Cox Plate with that sort of weight on your back. The boss (Ciaran Maher) said straight away after the race that he'd love to have a look at the Cox Plate, made the enquiries on Sunday and Monday and we've got the inclination he'd be considered for it. He has made drastic improvement this prep and we think he will improve again fourth-up."

Cantala likely for Wichita

Connections of Wichita (No Nay Never) have all but ruled out a tilt at this month's \$7.5m Golden Eagle (1500m) for the English 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) runner-up despite recent betting moves suggesting otherwise. The northern hemisphere three-year-old opened \$51 for the October 31 contest with Sportsbet before firming into \$16 and now sits on the second line of the betting for Rosehill's richest race as a \$7.50 chance. However, TJ Comerford, trainer Aidan O'Brien's travelling foreman, yesterday stated that the Cantala Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Flemington on the same day as the

Golden Eagle remained the colt's number one target. "The plan is to take him here to the mile race on Derby Day, the Cantala," Comerford told Racing.com. "We only train them here as if they were running on a certain day. His work day is aimed at the Cantala, Wichita is training up to a mile on Derby Day." Wichita is the \$6 favourite with Sportsbet for the Cantala Stakes with Arcadia Queen (Pierro) and Mr Quickie (Shamus Award) both quoted at \$7.50.

Nichols back at the track

Shane Nichols was a welcome face back at trackwork yesterday morning, a week after being released from hospital having suffered a heart attack. "It was nice to be back at work this morning and clocking a few," the trainer told Racing.com. "I'm feeling pretty good, other than being lightheaded occasionally because of the blood pressure tablets I'm on. I'll go to the stables again later in the week and then I have another appointment next week to see how I'm going." Nichols was present to check on the wellbeing of his stable star Streets Of Avalon (Magnus) ahead of Saturday's Moonga Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m). "He's in super condition, we just need a dry track," he said. "It's a good race this weekend and the likes of Zoutori and Windstorm will be hard to beat, but with that dry track I think we'll be right in the finish. We'll also likely back up next weekend on Cox Plate Day in the Group 2 Crystal Mile if he comes through the run well."

Owner defends Dalasan jockey switch

The owner of Caulfield Cup hope Dalasan (Dalakhani) yesterday explained the reasoning behind replacing Billy Egan with Willie Pike in Saturday's race. Egan was booked to ride, however Pike became available after the Lindsay Park-trained Port Guillaume (Le Havre) was taken out of the race. "We did try and get Will Pike to ride Dalasan initially. But he already committed to another ride," prominent owner and breeder Harry Perks told RSN927. "And because of Covid and because of the light weight (52.5 kilograms), we were pressured into finding a good jockey. Obviously Willie Pike was our preferred

jockey, but we offered the ride to Billy Egan and he accepted. Normally a big field and having an experienced jockey like Willie Pike gives the horse the best opportunity. We are quite happy to pay Billy, if the horse was to win, the same commission he would get if he rode it. It's one of those things. He was very good about it... and happy to stand down."

Tommy Stokes fined for laying horses

The son of trainer Phillip Stokes has been fined \$4,000 by Thoroughbred Racing South Australia after being found guilty of betting breaches. Tommy Stokes, who is a stablehand at his father's SA training base, was issued the fine for placing 26 lay bets on horses in his care between April 8, 2017 and April 19, 2020. Stokes pleaded guilty to breaking rule AR237(2). He was fined \$6,000 for the offence, but that was discounted to \$4,000, taking into account mitigating factors. He made a profit of \$170.91 laying the horses. The hearing followed an inquiry which opened last month, leading to Stokes' betting and mobile phone records being analysed. "Stewards noted that there were no communications of concern or any communications by Mr. Tommy Stokes in respect of the lay bets he had engaged in," the stewards report of the findings read. "Mr. Tommy Stokes explained the basis upon which he engaged in the lay bets, and advanced that his decision-making process was based on exposed form, barrier draws, and his general assessment of the quality of the field in which these horses participated."

Night of Champions to go ahead

The NSW Racehorse Owners' Association yesterday announced its annual Racing's Night of Champions awards event will be held live. While jockeys are not permitted to attend in adherence to Covid-19 regulations for the sport, trainers, owners and strappers will be in attendance to accept their awards and those of the top horses of the 2019/20 racing season. The black tie event will take place in the Ballroom at Royal Randwick on October 22, starting at 7pm.

NZB breeze ups conclude

Day Two of the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale Breeze Ups saw the final 126 two-year-olds sprint down the straight of Te Rapa Racecourse. A total of 255 horses breezed up across the two days, with the two-year-olds now heading to Karaka for NZB's Ready to Run Sale on November 18 and 19. NZB's managing director Andrew Seabrook was pleased with the outcome across the two days of breeze ups. "As the sale has grown over the last twenty years, we've seen a significant improvement in the level of presentation and breeze ups, but this year was just exceptional," he said. "So we must commend the vendors, preparers and jockeys for presenting and breezing their two-year-olds in fantastic order." The full breeze up clips and parade ring footage will be made available for viewing on www.nzbc.co.nz by Friday, as well as streamed on Trackside in New Zealand, plus SKY Racing and Racing.com in Australia. Tiptronic up to Livamol test

Group 1 winner Tiptronic (O'Reilly) bypassed the first two legs of the Hawke's Bay Spring Carnival and trainers Graham Richardson and Rogan Norvall are hoping a less travelled path will benefit him at Hastings on Saturday. The seven-year-old will line-up in the Livamol Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) after carrying big weights in his three lead-up runs. "I intended not to go down for the Windsor Park Plate because I thought it would be a hard race for him and it was a hard race for a lot of them," Richardson said. "Hopefully I have done the right thing. Last start he had 63 kilograms on his back. The horse who won carried nine kilograms less than him and the second horse wasn't too far behind. He was less than two lengths from the winner. I was very happy and Chad (Ormsby, jockey) was really happy with his run." Richardson has been pleased with how Tiptronic has come through his run last Friday and he is looking forward to watching his charge compete over his favoured distance this weekend. "He pulled up well and he has done extremely well since," Richardson

continued. "He had a nice hit-out this morning and he should be spot on, knowing that it is going to be a stronger field than previous years. He has won around that distance, including the Herbie Dyke at Te Rapa in February."

Melody Belle saves best for race day

Melody Belle (Commands) will be out to land her 12th Group 1 victory after connections paid a late entry to supplement the Jamie Richards-trained mare for the Livamol Classic where she will once again take on stablemate Advantage (Fastnet Rock). There was just a nose separating the pair last start, with Melody Belle prevailing in the Windsor Park Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) to make an instant impact upon her return from an Australian campaign. "She galloped with Advantage this morning and it was a bit similar to their gallop together before the Windsor Park Plate," Fortuna Thoroughbreds' John Galvin, who manages the Fortuna Melody Belle Syndicate, said. "It rained, so the track was wet, and on the corner Advantage skipped away a bit from Melody Belle and went to the line a length or two ahead of her but Melody Belle kept on running through the line and past the line. It caused us a bit of head scratching last time it happened but that is her and we know what she did in the mile (Windsor Park Plate) so she will be right on Saturday. She is an older mare now and she has it worked out, she knows what race day is and what trackwork is."

ASIA

HK: Fownes sets Legend and Dragon against Golden Sixty

Caspar Fownes will launch a two-pronged assault on Sunday's Oriental Watch Sha Tin Trophy Handicap (1600m) when Southern Legend (Not A Single Doubt) and Dances With Dragon (Savabeel) take their places en route to December's Hong Kong International Races. While Golden Sixty (Medaglia d'Oro) and Beauty Generation (Rock To Road) are set to renew their rivalry, Fownes has his pair in the mix to topple the favoured duo, something he has achieved dramatically in the past. The handler brought an end to Beauty Generation's ten-race win streak in this contest last season

with Rise High (Rubick), before overthrowing the veteran champ again when Southern Legend won the Champions Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) in April. But Fownes admits Sunday's task will be a difficult one for both his entrants. "Golden Sixty looks hard to beat and Beauty Generation also but I think third place is up for grabs. Dances With Dragon kept on coming (last time), he was beaten four lengths but now stepping up to the mile it's going to be a bit better for him," Fownes said.

INTERNATIONAL

UK: Earthlight to stand at Kildangan Stud

Godolphin's Earthlight (Shamardal) has been retired following his second place in the Prix de la Foret (Gr 1, 1400m) earlier this month and will take up stallion duties at Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland. Trained by Andre Fabre, Earthlight completed an unbeaten juvenile campaign with victories in the Prix Morny (Gr 1, 1200m) and

Middle Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f). He ended the year as champion juvenile in France and joint-second in the European two-year-old classifications behind the fellow Godolphin-owned Pinatubo (Shamardal), who will stand at Dalham Hall Stud for 2021. Injury prevented Earthlight from pursuing a Classic campaign in the first part of this season but he still won two of his four starts at three, landing the Prix Kistena (Listed, 1200m) on his return and the Prix du Pin (Gr 3, 1400m) on his penultimate start at Longchamp.

IRE: Oxx announces retirement

John Oxx, the trainer of the great Sea The Stars (Cape Cross), has announced he is to retire at the end of the season. Oxx, who turned 70 in July, has sent out 33 Group 1 winners during his 41 years as a trainer but will be remembered most for his handling of Sea The Stars, who went through a spectacular three-year-old campaign unbeaten by winning the English 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m), Epsom Derby (Gr

1, 1m 4f), Coral-Eclipse Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f), Juddmonte International Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f), the Irish Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f) and the Arc (Gr 1, 2400m) in 2009. Oxx, who was crowned champion trainer in Ireland in 1995, told the Racing Post he had no regrets over a training career, which began in 1979. "The time is right and we're happy to stop at the end of the season."

UK: Racing dealt a further blow as betting shops closed

British racing's finances were dealt a further blow on Monday night when the ramping out of Covid-19 related restrictions led to the closure from today of more than 350 betting shops. The shops are all situated in the City of Liverpool region, the first in the UK to be placed in the highest category of the newly created three-tier system of regional restrictions. Although no time period was placed on the controversial closures, British Prime Minister Boris Johnson said a review would take place every four weeks.

Expectations surpassed as 400,000gns Kingman colt tops strong Book 2 opener

Pinning down expectations in such uncertain times is not straightforward. Nonetheless, even the hopes of the most optimistic out there are likely to have been surpassed on day one of Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale.

Granted the highs may not have been quite so giddy as 12 months ago, when Book 2 witnessed its first seven-figure lot, but just about every other market metric bore a striking similarity to the same session 12 months ago. Given the backdrop to a uniquely challenging sales season, that in itself is an achievement.

By the close of trade on Monday, turnover had hit 15,236,500gns (approx. AUD\$29million) - down just five per cent against the record-breaking session 12 months ago; the average was 70,540gns (approx. AUD\$134,250) - down ten per cent; and the median was 52,000gns (approx. AUD\$99,000) - having been 55,000gns, just five per cent higher - in 2019.

The most striking metric of all was the clearance rate as 85 per cent - up from 82 per cent - of the lots on offer found a buyer, with 216 sold from 255 presented.

Anthony Stroud spent plenty of Book 1 standing by the parade bidding on behalf of Godolphin, an exercise that resulted in

Sheikh Mohammed's operation making 22 acquisitions at a total spend of 16,430,000gns.

Stroud returned to his spot by the parade ring early on in Monday's session and duly secured the Kingman (Invincible Spirit) colt out of Allez Y (Rip Van Winkle) with a bid of 400,000gns (approx. AUD\$762,000), a price that proved a high point of a marathon session of selling.

"I like Kingman, obviously," said Stroud after he had signed the docket on behalf of Godolphin.

"He comes from Norelands, who do a fantastic job, and he's a well-balanced horse who moves very well. We've had a lot of luck with Kingman with Palace Pier and Persian King and this colt will be trained by Andre Fabre."

The March foal is out of Allez Y, a winning daughter of Rip Van Winkle (Galileo) and Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) runner-up L'Ancrese (Darshaan) whose siblings include Vintage Crop Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 6f) winner Master Of Reality (Frankel), Listed scorer Chamonix (Galileo) and the progressive stayer Frankstellia (Frankel).

Allez Y was trained by Fabre for the Coolmore partners and was bought for John Camilleri, who breeds under the Fairway Thoroughbreds banner, by De Burgh Equine and James Harron Bloodstock for 170,000gns at the 2016 December Sale.

"He's a very nice horse and those ones are easy to sell," said Norelands' Harry McCalmont. "There's a strong market here for nice horses. Allez Y boards with us at the moment but she's actually heading down to Australia soon."

"She's in foal to Lope De Vega at the moment. This colt belonged to a client of ours called John Camilleri, who bred Winx. We've got some nice mares for him and I'm delighted to sell a good one for him."

The session-topping sale continued a hot run of form for Norelands, as the County Kilkenny operation sold the Frankel (Galileo) half-sister to Golden Horn (Cape Cross) to Godolphin for 2,000,000gns during Book 1, and then saw past graduate St Mark's Basilica (Siyouni), who cost MV Magnier 1,300,000gns, land the Dewhurst Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) on Saturday

Redvers leaves it late

The second-top lot came much later in the session when David Redvers went to 390,000gns (approx. AUD\$740,000) for the Dark Angel (Acclamation) filly out of Extricate (Exceed And Excel) offered by Yeomanstown Stud. The February born youngster's page featured a significant update as her half-sister Queen Of Love (Kingman) was last seen maintaining her unbeaten run in the Prix Coronation at Saint-Cloud (Listed, 1600m).

Queen Of Love, a €650,000 Arqana Breeze-Up graduate, is the second black type winner from three runners for Extricate, as her first foal is the Listed-winning Dark Liberty, who is also by Dark Angel.

"I thought she was lovely," said Redvers. "She's been bought to join Qatar Racing and she's one to join our breeding programme in the long term. She looks all speed and is just a little cracker."

The dam hails from a Cheveley Park Stud family but, as David O'Callaghan explained, has taken a somewhat unusual route into the Yeomanstown Stud broodmare band.

"The dam was bred by Cheveley Park Stud but Guy [O'Callaghan] actually found her out in Sweden, brought her back and entered her in the sales before Gay [O'Callaghan] bought her off him," he said. "He'll be sorry now! She has another full-sister on the ground, she's very nice, and she's back in foal to Dark Angel. She'll stick with him for the time being."

David O'Callaghan added of the six-figure yearling: "It's a very fast family and she's a sister to what looks a very promising filly in Queen Of Love. She looks very fast herself and I hope she rewards her new owners."

Stroud steps back in

Having secured the session-topping Kingman colt, Stroud was back in action later on when signing as Stroud Coleman Bloodstock at 350,000gns (approx. AUD\$666,000) for the Churchill (Galileo) filly offered by Newsells Park Stud.

The filly is out of Date With Destiny (George Washington), and is therefore closely related to the Royal Whip Stakes

(Gr 3, 1m 2f) winner Beautiful Morning (Galileo), who was sold to Lady Bamford through Hugo Lascelles for 1,400,000gns at the 2018 December Mares Sale.

The 350,000gns mark was hit again just four lots later when Alastair Donald of Sackville Donald secured the Dark Angel filly out of Delevigne (Redoute's Choice) offered by Highclere Stud.

The pedigree is packed with speed as the dam is an unraced Redoute's Choice (Daneshill) sibling to Haydock Sprint Cup (Gr 1, 6f) victor Regal Parade (Pivotal) and the Acomb Stakes (Gr 3, 7f) scorer Entifaadha (Dansili).

"I loved her, she's my favourite filly in the sale," said Donald. "We stretched a bit to get her, but everyone was on her. She walks for fun, it's a lovely family to be involved with and there is probably more to come as well. She's been bought for King Power Racing."

Mehmas mania continues

Mehmas (Acclamation) continues to carry all before him in this year's first-season sire standings, with the Tally-Ho Stud resident having supplied 34 winners, among which are the likes of Middle Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) hero Supremacy and the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) scorer Minzaal.

Tom Goff is clearly among the Mehmas fancub as the Blandford Bloodstock agent

went to 320,000gns (approx. AUD\$613,150) for a colt out of Ashtown Girl (Exceed And Excel) offered by Cregg Stud.

"I think you could describe the sire as a revelation," said Goff, who stood alongside Amo Racing's Kia Joorabchian and John Gosden during the bidding. "A lot of people wrote him off at the start of the year as cheap speed but he's defied all expectations."

"I had a brief to buy a colt who will make a sharp two-year-old and he fits the bill perfectly. He's a beautifully topped individual with a great action and looks rapid. He'll be trained by John Gosden."

Ashtown Girl went unsold as a yearling at just €8,000 but has gone on to breed two winners, including the stakes-placed Ziarah (Iffraaj).

She was among 177 mares in Mehmas's second book, which was covered at a fee of just €10,000. John Noonan of Cregg Stud in Fermoy, County Cork said Monday's six-figure transaction was a personal best in terms of sales ring success.

"He's been the busiest horse at the sales," said the consignor. "The mare has been very lucky for us, I didn't sell her as a yearling but she's been good to us since. She's in foal to Ribchester at the moment."

"I have ten Flat mares and five National Hunt - I'm a National Hunt man through and through really. I'm delighted that Mehmas has had so much success for the O'Callaghans."

Brown's brace

Goff's Blandford colleague Richard Brown entered the fray later on when going to 280,000gns (approx. AUD\$417,750) for the Nathaniel (Galileo) colt out of Desert Berry (Green Desert) offered by Strawberry Fields Stud. The colt is a sibling to three winners, most notably the classy Archie Mckellar (Archipenko), who races as Flying Thunder in Hong Kong.

The progeny of Desert Berry have also enjoyed their share of success in the sales ring too, as her Archipenko (Kingmambo) colt jointly topped day two of Book 2 in 2019 when bought by the Hong Kong Jockey Club for 425,000gns.

"He's an outstanding individual and you like to see Green Desert with Nathaniel," said Brown. "He's just an exceptional moving horse but he's going to need plenty of time as he's a Classic type."

Earlier in the session Brown went to 185,000gns (approx. AUD\$352,000) for the Grove Stud-consigned No Nay Never (Scat

Daddy) filly out of Bewitchment (Pivotal) whose price had risen significantly since she was signed for by Church Farm and Horse Park Stud at 90,000gns as a foal. The dam is a half-sister to the Group 1-winning Hooray (Invincible Spirit).

"The stallion has just had a Group 1 winner with a filly in the Cheveley Park Stakes [Alcohol Free] and she's from a very good Cheveley Park family," said Brown. "She looked fast and absolutely lit up the ring walking around here."

Shades of Zebedee

Loughtown Stud enjoyed a good result when Ross Doyle struck a winning bid of 220,000gns (approx. AUD\$419,000) for the operation's Invincible Spirit (Green Desert) filly out of the Listed-placed Cristal Fashion (Jeremy).

The filly's page traces back to the likes of Crystal Music (Nureyev), Libran (Lawman) and Space Traveller (Bated Breath), but it was a likeness to Zebedee (Invincible Spirit), that caught Doyle's attention.

"I said to Richard Hannon as we went down to see her that I think she's the best filly I've seen in Book 2," he said. "He agreed with me and said we had to have her. She comes from a great farm and she's by a top stallion and I thought she was an outstanding physical too."

"She's out of a black type mare, and the last time we bought an Invincible Spirit out of a black type mare that turned out to be Zebedee. Obviously he was a colt but she reminded us of him."

BILL WILLIAMSON: WEARY BUT WONDERFUL

Dual Arc winner added to Incomparables

William James Williamson (December 19, 1922 – January 28, 1979) won 36 Group 1 races in England, Ireland and France including the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe twice.

His international tally of Group 1 wins was bettered only by Scobie Breasley and Togo Johnstone among our "Incomparables" - the Australian jockeys who had sustained and remarkable success in England, Ireland and France from the 1900s to the 1970s.

At home, his resume included six Melbourne jockeys' premierships and victories in the Caulfield and Melbourne Cups and the Cox Plate among numerous major race wins.

The jockey, nicknamed Weary Willie, featured in the famous triple dead-heat in the 1956 Hotham Handicap and was, of course, famously aboard Rising Fast in the 1955 Melbourne Cup. He'd won the Caulfield Cup, that year, on the great New Zealand-bred stayer who'd won the two Cups and Cox Plate treble 12 months earlier.

Rising Fast, with 63.5 kilograms, was beaten a length in that 1955 Melbourne Cup by Toparoa who had 15.5 kilograms less and whose rider Neville Sellwood was suspended for two months for causing interference to Rising Fast. No protest was lodged.

Williamson purportedly said Rising Fast was tiring under his weight and the interference did not have any bearing on the result. Perhaps it was just not his style to protest; it certainly

wasn't to elaborate at length on any race outcome.

Some sources say his nickname was borne of his impassive response to either victory or defeat. Others point to a sleepy-eyed look, laconic nature, dry wit and a slow-measured stride. He disliked self-promotion.

It's believed he never bothered to add up the number of winners he rode and could be vague about his successes and even the names of champions he had ridden.

Perhaps it was this understated approach that his name is less readily recalled, than say a Breasley or George

Moore, when Australia's great jockeys are discussed.

He was, at the very least, among them and it is some distinction that he relegated Lester Piggott to second prize in each of his Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe wins, aboard Vaguely Noble (1968) and Levmoos (1969).

Piggott is believed, after Williamson's second Arc win, to have described him as "the best big-race jockey in the world".

His compatriot and fellow Arc winning Incomparable, Pat Glennon had no doubt where Williamson ranked. "Bill is the finest jockey I've ever ridden against, including Moore, (Yves) Saint-Martin and Piggott," he said.

Ron Hutchinson, another Incomparable, says: "Williamson and Breasley were the best two jockeys I've ever seen."

Jockeypedia's biography asserts that Williamson "enjoyed a highly respected career where he was held in greater esteem than either Scobie Breasley or Ron Hutchinson, both of whom excelled in Europe."

Michael Phillips, racing correspondent of The Times during this era, described Williamson "as the finest rider to leave Australia".

Williamson rode in Malaya in 1959 but left Australia, more permanently, in 1960, when reportedly lured to Ireland by trainer Seamus McGrath and they would combine to win the Arc nine years later. He scored two of his eight Irish Classic wins in his first year - both for John Oxx senior with whom he'd combine for a further four Classic wins in Ireland between 1960 and 1996.

He would later win the 1,000 Guineas, in 1969, for Paddy Prendergast while his final major success in Ireland was in the 1972 Irish Derby on Steel Pulse with compatriot Hutchinson in second on Scottish Rifle.

Steel Pulse was trained by Scobie Breasley, who'd retired from riding four years earlier, and was owned by Indian shipping magnate Ravi Tikkoo for whom Williamson would later act as racing manager.

The following year, Steel Pulse was secured for a reported \$675,000 (and syndicated at \$15,000 a share) by Fred Peisah to stand at his Lomar Park Stud in New South Wales. "He is the greatest stakes winner imported to Australia — and by far the most costly," reported the Canberra Times.

The Derby win was tagged, in the press, as "tremendous consolation" for Williamson who'd earlier that year lost the Epsom Derby mount on winner Roberto to Piggott.

Williamson had been injured in a fall at Kempton 12 days before the Derby but had been cleared to ride. However, Roberto's owner John Galbreath was unconvinced and his argument apparently was that he wouldn't have fielded a ball player in a game on those terms (he was owner of the Pittsburgh Pirates baseball team). Williamson was offered the winning percentage and said to Piggott: "I don't mind. I'm getting the money anyway."

Williamson was certainly fit to ride as he landed a double on the same Epsom card and one writer observed that "the wild ovation he received from the crowd made plain its sympathy for him".

Breasley was, unsurprisingly, well acquainted with Williamson long before they teamed up to win that Derby. "When I went to England in 1950, I was number one rider in Victoria and Williamson was second on the list. He knocked on my door the actual night before I left for England and asked that, given that we were no longer rivals, could I please help him become a better jockey.

"I told him that he never seemed to try to get a good start with his horses and that he was also too content to sit four or five deep. I told him to concentrate on his starts, and to find the fence more often. He listened to my advice and became a better jockey," Breasley said, according to alchetron.com.

The Epsom Derby may have eluded him but you sense Williamson was not inclined to dwell on

such things and, just a few years earlier, he'd been the toast of the racing world with his triumphs in Paris.

His 1968 winner Vaguely Noble was celebrated to say the least. His sire Vienna was bred by Sir Winston Churchill and his grandsire Aureole bred by The Queen.

Vaguely Noble was foaled in the year of his breeder Major Lionel Holliday's death and the family, faced with huge death duties on the Major's estate, reluctantly offered him at the December Sales despite two commanding wins at the close of his two-year-old season.

He made a then world record public auction price of 136,000 guineas, sold to American plastic surgeon Dr Robert Franklyn. He entrusted his training to Etienne Pollet who three years earlier had won the Arc with Sea Bird (ridden by Australian Pat Glennon).

The Arc was the only option for Vaguely Noble as he was not entered for any Classic races and it was mission accomplished

courtesy of a copy-book Williamson ride which ensured a three-length win from a field which was reckoned to be not much inferior to the quality line-up which Sea Bird had despatched.

The following year, amid less fanfare, Williamson did it again - this time claiming the great race on 50-1 chance Levmos, who was owned and trained by McGrath,

whose faith in the Australian jockey was well rewarded, albeit after a long wait since the jockey's arrival in Ireland.

Williamson was born in Williamstown, Melbourne, son of Victorian-born parents William James Williamson, machinist, and his wife Euphemia Agnes, née Whitehead.

Brian Stoddart, in the Australian Dictionary of Biography, writes of Williamson: “He left Mordialloc-Chelsea High School at age 14 and was apprenticed to the trainer F. H. (Fred) Lewis; he and his brother the jockey Robert Lewis were Bill's great-uncles. Williamson's first winning ride was in 1937 on Lillirene, coincidentally the last winner that Bobby Lewis had ridden.

“On 5 January 1942 Williamson was mobilized for full-time duty in the Militia. He served in Melbourne as a driver with the 119th General Transport Company and as a clerk at the Bulk Stationery Store. Discharged from the army on 30 October 1944, he returned to the racetrack.

“On one occasion in 1946 Williamson missed his train and had to hitchhike to a race-meeting at Albury, New South Wales. Engaged for five events at the meeting, he triumphed in all of them.”

Williamson died of cancer on January 28, 1979 at South Caulfield.

POSTSCRIPT: The Incomparables are Frank Wootton, Frank Bullock, Bernard Carslake, Rae Johnstone, Scobie Breasley, George Moore, Edgar Britt, Ron Hutchinson, Bill Pyers, Neville Sellwood, Bill Williamson, Garnet Bougoure, Wally Sibbritt and Glennon.

They won 104 of the 117 Classic races in England, Ireland and France (including 53 in England alone) claimed by Australian jockeys and won 315 Group 1 races in those countries. In all, I have 38 individual Australian jockeys winning 363 races of current Group 1 status in England, Ireland and France.

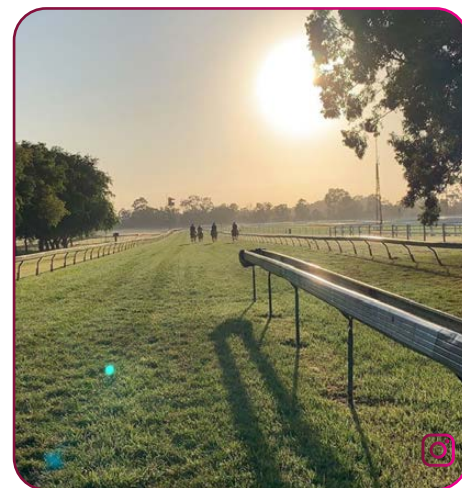


