Kahma strikes as Bosson and Richards reunite

The rider and trainer, who began 2020 with a flourish of Group 1 wins, combine for their first feature score since March in Guineas

ne of the most potent combinations in world racing, trainer Jamie Richards and rider Opie Bosson, reunited yesterday to lift another Group 1 trophy, this time with Kahma Lass (3 f Darci Brahma - Distinctive Lass by Orientate) in the New Zealand 1000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Riccarton.

It was the first time since New Zealand's Covid-enforced lockdown in late March that the duo had combined to taste Group 1 glory, with their previous joint victory coming with champion two-year-old Cool Aza Beel (Savabeel) in the Sistema Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Ellerslie.

Before that though, the pair had enjoyed a stellar start to 2020, taking the Telegraph Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) and the Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) with Avantage (Fastnet Rock), the Waikato Sprint (Gr 1, 1400m) and the Chipping Norton Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) with Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle) and the Surround Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) with Probabeel (Savabeel), in addition to Cool Aza Beel's Sistema win.

<< Continued from page 1 Perhaps it was fortuitous then that their partnership should continue once more at the top level with Kahma Lass, owned by Sistema founders and Cambridge Stud principals Brendan and Jo Lindsay.

Sent out among a slew of runners in the market just behind the top two in betting, Tinker McPhee (Nostradamus) and Cornflower Blue (Savabeel), Kahma Lass was among the last out of the gates and settled beyond midfield on the rail in a race that lacked any real speed.

Last weekend's New Zealand 2000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Aegon (Sacred Falls) ended up in a similar position, but unlike her male counterpart, Kahma Lass did find herself unsettled by the slow tempo as she found herself on the heels of the pair in front.

However, as Bosson so often does, he weaved a passage between runners, getting onto the back of numerous rivals at just the right time before the seas parted at the top of the Riccarton straight.

Still with three lengths to make up in what was a sit-sprint affair, it took most of the straight for Kahma Lass to reel in the market fancies; first Tinker McPhee, and then Cornflower Blue.

South Island representative Miss Tycoon Rose (Written Tycoon) flashed home for Michael and Matt Pitman, producing an eye-catching run under Samantha Wynne to grab second, but it was Kahma Lass who scored by three-quarters of a length, adding her name to an honour roll that includes King's Rose (Redoute's Choice), Katie Lee (Pins), Daffodil (No Excuse Needed), Seachange (Cape Cross) and Tycoon Lil (Last Tycoon) in the last 25 years alone.

Cornflower Blue held down third, a nose behind Miss Tycoon Rose, with a further three-quarters of a length to Tinker McPhee in fourth.

A veteran of only four starts after yesterday's win, Kahma Lass broke her maiden at her second start at Avondale before charging home to be beaten a nose behind De La Terre (Reliable Man) in the Soliloquy Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Te Rapa.

"She'd done really well and had gone the right way since her Te Rapa run," Richards said. "Her work had been very good and she arrived down from Matamata in good order with everything going to plan.

"We knew she was pretty sharp when she trialled up as a twoyear-old but she had to get through some maturity issues.

"Today, it all worked out pretty well as they went no tempo. She was back

getting on heels at the half mile but she got the run through them without having to come to the outside, which was probably the winning of the race.

"She's a good filly and we had the right man on board as Opie told me he needed the (earlier) win in the Welcome Stakes on Avonallo which put him right."

Richards, who brought up a second individual Group 1 winner for the Lindsays after Probabeel's wins in the Surround Stakes and the Epsom Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m)

"We get a big thrill out of winning races for Brendan and Jo as they have been fantastic supporters," he said. "That's the great thing about Brendan and Jo, they let you give them time when it's needed and they have reaped the rewards here."

An excited Brendan Lindsay added: "Wasn't that fantastic? I could see she was going well at the top of the straight, but what a ride, it's pretty bloody exciting. We thought we had a chance but there were plenty of good fillies in the race so we're just delighted to end up on top."

Purchased by Te Akau Racing's David Ellis for NZ\$290,000 from the Curraghmore draft at last year's Karaka Premier Yearling Sale, Kahma Lass is the sixth named foal, all winners, out of the Listed-placed Distinctive Lass (Orientate) and the third stakes winner.

Kahma Lass is a sister to ten-time winner in Singapore and Malaysia, Distinctive Darci, whose standout victory came in the Merlion Trophy (Listed, 1200m), a Singapore Group 2. She is also a half-sister to five-time Listed winner and Group 1-placed Kuro (Denman), as well as the Listed-placed Southern Lad (Ocean Park), and hails from a family full of speed.

Third dam Special (Habituate) remains one of the fastest horses to grace the Australian turf in the last half-century, breaking the track record in winning the 1988 Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m). It was a mark that would remain for 25 years, until Black Caviar (Bel Esprit) bettered the time in the 2013 Lightning.

Kahma Lass' win also brought up an 11th Group 1 winner, and 50th individual stakes winner overall, for Darci Brahma (Danehill). The Oaks Stud resident, who raced in the Te Akau tangerine, stands for NZ\$15,000 (plus GST) in 2020.

Vale Norzita: Bittersweet success for Carif

Carif's win in yesterday's Sandown Cup (Listed, 3200m), sporting the late Dato Tan Chin Nam's colours - the black and white checks with yellow sleeves that have been triumphant in some of Australia's greatest races - should have provided a moment of great satisfaction for Think Big Stud, especially given it came on the day that the legendary Bart Cummings would have turned 93.

<< Continued from page 2 carry those colours in the Cummingstrained So You Think (High Chaparral) and Norzita (Thorn Park), had long promised to take out a staying feature. He finished fifth in the Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) at three and then second in each of the ATC St Leger (2600m), Hotham Handicap (Gr 3, 2500m), Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 3, 2600m) and the Chairman's Handicap (Gr 2, 2600m) at four.

For Arrowfield Stud, though, it was a bittersweet result after they announced the death of Norzita yesterday morning following a paddock accident.

The 11-year-old mare, who won the Flight Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and was third to Sacred Falls (O'Reilly) and Pierro (Lonhro) in a vintage Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m), was purchased by Arrowfield for \$1.7 million at last year's Inglis Chairman's Sale, in foal to Snitzel (Redoute's Choice).

She foaled a Snitzel filly last year before she joined the stellar group of mares visiting The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) in his first season at stud.

Hours later, her first-born Carif finally broke through for a long overdue victory at stakes level, although perhaps not in the two-mile November feature that would once have been anticipated. However, it does potentially place the Peter and Paul Snowden trainee on a path towards the first Tuesday in November next year.

Striding up powerfully under Jamie Kah after what was a stoutly-run 3200 metres, Carif led home a quinella for So You Think, drifting out under pressure but doing enough to hold off South Australian Fillies Classic (Gr 3, 2500m) heroine Realm Of Flowers by a short neck.

French import San Huberto (Speightstown) bounced back from a disappointing Australian debut in the Geelong Cup (Gr 3, 2400m), finishing third, two lengths behind the winner.

Mark Zahra, who rode Realm Of Flowers, lodged an objection against Carif, but it was quickly dismissed.

Post-race, Peter Snowden suggested that gelding Carif may bring out the best in him for 2021, but it remains to be seen whether Norzita's death may change those plans.

"It wasn't the two-mile race that we were after but at least it was two miles and it was good to see him win," he said. "Jamie rode him an absolute treat. Ten-out-of-ten ride.

"It was good to see him win. He even wanted to duck out and shake my hand towards the line but I said, 'I'll see you later.'

"He is a really nice horse. He's a great type to look at. It's just a shame that things have taken so long. I don't like to tell him that he's going to

get gelded but it just might be the making of the horse. He gets a bit more genuine and he can knuckle down and do his job. He's a great worker, sound as a pound, he's a good eater, everything you want to see in a staying horse but he just lacks a turn-of-foot and that might come."

Not only was it a poignant win for Carif with Norzita's passing, but it also came on the day that his fourth dam Summoned (Crowned Prince) was recognised with the Summoned Stakes (Gr 3, 1500m), won by Carif's stablemate Missile Mantra (4 m Smart Missile - Wecansay Mak by Starcraft).

Summoned, one of the great blue hens who produced Zeditave (The Judge), Square Deal (The Judge), Alannon (Noalcoholic), Zedagal (The Judge) and Pampas Fire (Prince True), is the matriarch of a family that includes the likes of Melito (Redoute's Choice), Pariah (Redoute's Choice), Greys Inn (Zabeel), Smart Call (Ideal World), Jet Spur (Flying Spur), Military Rose (General Nediym) and Zac Spirit (Flying Spur).

Now, Carif can add his name to the list of stakes winners produced by the family, with the promise of more to come.

He was the first of two stakes winners for Coolmore's So You Think yesterday, with the enigmatic So Si Bon (7 g So You Think - Black Minx by Lonhro) adding the Eclipse Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m) to his record.

So You Think stands for \$38,500 (inc GST) in 2020.

The day's other staying feature, the Zipping Classic (Gr 2, 2400m), went to German import Sound (8 h Lando - Sky Dancing by Exit To Nowhere), also ridden by Kah.

It was Sound's first Australian win and was the culmination of a preparation in which the Mike Moroney-trained stayer appeared more likely than ever to add to his record.

Sound entered after the narrowest of defeats in the Hotham Handicap (Gr 3, 2500m), edged out by compatriot Ashrun (Authorized) by a short head, and was sent off as \$5 second favourite yesterday.

Run at a dawdle for the first half of the race, with Jason Maskiell aboard rank outsider Levendi (Pierro) slowing the tempo to little more than a canter, almost every horse struggled to settle through the early stages.

The only jockey to attempt to shake things up was Kah on Sound, whipping around the field from beyond midfield to sit outside Levendi from the 1200 metres.

It was arguably that one move that won Sound the race as, when the sprint went on down the long Sandown stretch, it was simply impossible for any horse to concede that sort of Continued on page 4>>

<< Continued from page 3 tactical advantage to the eight-year-old.

At the line, he held a length and a quarter margin on Brimham Rocks (Fastnet Rock), with Cranbourne Cup (Listed, 2025m) winner Future Score (Cape Cross) continuing his honest form in third.

"It was a great ride, it really was," Moroney said. "Levendi took her into the race which was lovely because I think the other day, one time she rode her, she said that she got left alone in front for too long but he carted us for long enough to give our horse a chance today which is great.

"He certainly did deserve that. It is probably just the last 18 months that he's started to look well. He came over from Germany and we had a season before we ran him in the Melbourne Cup and it looked that way, too. It took him a while to really condition up but he has now. He's got really strong.

"We were just disappointed that we got left in New Zealand after the Auckland Cup, stranded there, because he missed the Sydney autumn as well. Bit disappointing but he's going terrific and he deserved that.

"They are six months behind but that still makes him seven and a half. He's bred that way too. It is a slow maturing family. I still think he's got another good preparation in him."

Sound is the ninth of ten foals to race out of Italian Listed winner and 2010 German Broodmare of the Year Sky Dancing (Exit To Nowhere). Among her other foals is German Horse of the Year Scalo (Lando), Group 3 winner Sexy Lady (Danehill Dancer) and Group 3 placegetter Scolari (Monsun).

The extended family also includes Lisa Danielle (Wolf Power), 2012 American Broodmare of the Year, and her son, two-time American Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry), as well as stout types Call The Wind (Frankel), Dominant (Cacique), Glorious Sinndar (Sinndar) and Assign (Montjeu).

Sound is from Lando's (Acatenango) second to last crop, with the stallion euthanised at his birthplace, Gestut Hof Ittlingen, three months after the Zipping Classic winner was foaled.

Deal's earnings pass a Sweet million with Hunter win

North of the Murray, the John Thompson-trained Sweet Deal (6 m Casino Prince - Dorothy Evelyn by Royal Academy) became the second winner of the \$1 million The Hunter (1300m) at Newcastle with a strong win under Nash Rawiller yesterday, capping a career that saw her score her first win at the Broadmeadow track.

Introduced last year when won by Savatiano (Street Cry), The Hunter is one of two million-dollar races at provincial NSW tracks, in addition to next week's The Gong (1600m) at Kembla Grange.

Sent out as a \$10 hope in the 15-runner field with Ranier (Lonhro) the \$6 favourite to give trainer James Cummings and Godolphin a perfect two-from-two in The Hunter, Sweet Deal tracked up in an ideal position midfield on the rail.

Leader Special Reward (Demerit) kicked powerfully at the top of the straight and looked to be going strongly, but Rawiller allowed Sweet Deal to improve along the inside, only going around one horse - the pacesetter.

In the end, Rawiller's tactical nous and his trademark strongman

riding style proved the difference as Sweet Deal scored by a length over Special Reward. Asiago (Medaglia d'Oro), who raced outside the winner and came with a searching run out wide, finished third, two lengths behind Thompson's mare.

It was an emotional win for the typically stoic Rawiller, with Sweet Deal having been the ticket towards rebuilding his career in Sydney after he was suspended for 15 months by Hong Kong stewards.

"She was my first Saturday city winner back after Hong Kong, obviously after 15 months on the sidelines, and she's just kept raising the bar as we've gone along," Rawiller said.

"It's great to see her bounce back. She's had a Group 3 win before and to come back and win a \$1 million race, it's not just exciting but it's a great thrill to do it on her."

Sweet Deal, who won her maiden at Newcastle as a three-year-old in September, 2017, after twice being stakes-placed at two, also won the Tibbie Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at the track last year. She added to her resume with wins in the Triscay Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) and the Toy Show Handicap (Gr 3, 1100m) this year.

Yesterday's win takes her earnings to \$1,357,020, having won ten of her 37 starts. She was a \$67,500 purchase by Boomer Bloodstock from the draft of Lincoln Farm at the 2016 Inglis Classic Yearling Sale and Mick Talty of Edinglassie Stud, where Sweet Deal was born and raised, cut a delighted figure in the aftermath.

"From an early age I felt that she was a filly that was going to mature into a good race mare and John Thompson and his team have done a wonderful job with her," he said.

"Sweet Deal was bred by Pip Cooper, who is a fantastic supporter of our farm, so this is a particularly satisfying result and I think there might still be better to come from her in the autumn.

"She is another quality racehorse to carry our 'target' brand which is again going to be well-represented at each of the Classic, Premier and Easter Yearling Sales in 2021."

Thompson said that one final goal remained for Sweet Deal before she retires to stud next spring.


"She will have a spell now and there is a lovely mares series during the autumn for her to have a crack at a Group 1 one last time," he said, referring to races like the Coolmore Classic (Gr 1, 1500m) and the Coolmore Legacy (Gr 1, 1600m).

Sweet Deal's dam Dorothy Evelyn (Royal Academy) had not been served for three seasons after producing the eventual stakes winner in 2014, but produced another foal by Casino Prince (Flying Spur) - this time a colt - in 2018.

Vinery Stud's Casino Prince stands for \$5,500 (inc GST) in 2020, with Sweet Deal his third million-dollar earner after All Too Hard and Lim's Cruiser. A number - including Escado, Hooked and Mighty Lucky - fell just short of the million-dollar mark.

18 for All Too Hard

Vinery Stud Stallion All Too Hard (Casino Prince) sired his 18th individual stakes winner yesterday when Allibor (3 g ex Libor Lady by Exchange Rate) took out the Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) for trainer Symon Wilde and jockey Dean Yendall. The three-year-old prevailed by the minimum of margins over Sweet Reply (Deep Field), with a further length and three-quarters back to Valanetti (Sebring) in third. Returning \$4.40, Allibor fended off the \$2.70 favourite Sweet Reply despite idling in the closing stages to join the likes of dual Group 1 winner Behemoth and Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) hero Alligator Blood as stakes winners for his sire, who is standing for a fee of \$27,500 (inc GST) in 2020. Allibor was purchased from Book 1 of the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale in 2019, being knocked down to his trainer and Cameron Cooke Bloodstock for \$60,000 from the draft of Blue Gum Farm.

Aysar withdrawn from Guineas

There was drama before yesterday's Sandown Guineas as Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) runner-up Aysar (Deep Field) was scratched due to a mishap in the stalls area two hours before post-time. The Lindsay Park-trained three-year-old, who was last seen running second in the Carbine Club Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Flemington, was found to be lame having sustained an injury to his off-hind leg. As such, no runner in the remaining eight-strong line-up boasted a domestic rating of 65 or more.

Second Sandown Guineas for Wilde

Allibor's victory was the second Sandown Guineas success for Symon Wilde, following on from the success of So Swift (Barely A Moment) in 2011, who he trained in partnership with his father, Bill. Both Allibor and So Swift were facing their toughest assignments to date, the former going into yesterday's contest as a three-start maiden while the latter had won in minor company at Hamilton on his previous outing. "Just so proud of the horse and proud of the team that was a huge thrill," Liam Hoy, the stable representative of Wilde, told Racing.com. "It was a little bit of an afterthought (coming to) the Guineas." Regarding the application of headgear, Hoy added: "He's such a laid-back customer. He doesn't exert himself at all. Just the blinkers, we thought, might have made him a bit more tractable over the mile and it certainly put him a pair closer and it made the difference."

34 for Reset

The Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained Junipal (5 g ex Palatine Hill by Palace Music) took out yesterday's Sandown Stakes (Gr 3, 1500m) by a length and a quarter to become the 34th individual stakes winner for former Darley stallion Reset (Zabeel). Last seen running ninth in the Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) having previously landed handicap wins at Moonee Valley and Caulfield, Junipal came home too strong for Kenya (Galileo), while Buffalo River (Noble Mission) was a further length adrift in third. Reset was pensioned from stallion duties last year and his roll of honour is headlined by Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Rebel Raider,

Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) scorer Faulkner and Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) hero Pinker Pinker.

177 for Redoute's Choice

Late Arrowfield Stud flagbearer Redoute's Choice (Danehill) sired a pair of new Group 3 winners yesterday. The Elanora (3 c ex Yesterjoy by More Than Ready) landed the Spring Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Newcastle for Chris Waller, taking his record to two wins from four outings with a half-length victory over High Supremacy (Savabeel). Ellsberg (Spill The Beans) was a further two and a quarter lengths adrift in third. Later, Celebrity Queen (4 m ex Celebrity Miss by More Than Ready) took out the Colonel Reeves Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) at Ascot to become the 177th individual stakes winner for Redoute's Choice, who was euthanised at the age of 23 last year following a traumatic loss of mobility.

Elanora a potential Derby contender

Tommy Berry was effusive in his praise for The Elanora following yesterday's success. "He could be a Derby horse because he is that relaxed and he was strong at the end of that race," the winning rider said postrace. Waller's stable representative Charlie Duckworth noted how The Elanora had been something of a slow-burner, but was a threeyear-old with a bright future ahead of him. "When he won at the provincials first up we thought he might be mentally a bit behind the others," Duckworth said. "Then the blinkers went on and he has continued to take the necessary steps and today is the cherry on top for his spring preparation. He is a very exciting colt."

Celebrity Queen Winterbottom-bound

Colonel Reeves Stakes one-two Celebrity Queen and Stageman (Written Tycoon) will head to the Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on November 28 after the stablemates fought out the finish to the traditional leadup. The double was last achieved by Barakey (Key Business) in 2012 and owner Bob Peters expects both Celebrity Queen and Stageman to be competitive. "Celebrity Queen has been one that took a bit of time and it's paying off for us now," Peters said. "She's out of a More Than Ready mare so that might explain why she can handle such a wet track. It was always the plan to head there if we could get in, so now that Celebrity Queen has won this, I'd imagine she would be in."

13 for Dundeel

Arrowfield Stud resident Dundeel (High Chaparral) brought up his 13th individual stakes winner yesterday when Truly Great (5 g ex Truly Special by Jeune) took out the R J Peters Stakes (Gr 3, 1500m) at Ascot. Sent out an odds-on favourite having won five of his previous nine starts, including two straight this preparation, the Grant and Alana Williamstrained Truly Great produced a terrific turn of foot on the soft track, sweeping home to defeat Flow (Street Cry) by a length and a half with the same margin back to Moschard (Moshe) in third. Truly Great is the fourth winner out of Perth-based stayer Truly Special (Jeune), who has also produced WA Oaks (Gr 3, 2400m) winner Special Alert (Not A Single Doubt) and Esperance Cup (2015m) hero Truly Gold (Nicconi). Dundeel stands for \$66,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

Truly Great wins Peters for Peters

Next Saturday's Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) is the next port of call for Truly Great after he scored his first stakes win in the R J Peters Stakes, named for his owner Bob Peters. It was Peters' second straight win in the race, having won it for the first time with Mississippi Delta (High Chaparral) last year. Three horses in the last 20 years have completed the Peters-Railway double - Northerly (Serheed) in 2000,

El Presidente (Dante's Fury) in 2007 and Scales Of Justice (Not A Single Doubt) in 2016 - but that trio highlights the quality that is needed to be able to make that progression. "I did double check myself after every commentator said I was being a bit ambitious bringing him back in distance," Peters said wryly. "But the way he'd been winning, he's a strong horse and he got there. I think now he needs to go to the Railway next weekend - that was why he was here today, to get into the race - and then after that, we'll look at where he goes. I think he'll get the mile and a half (of the Perth Cup)."

Warrnambool Cup winner adds Ascot Gold Cup

Also likely to head to the Railway Stakes is runaway Ascot Gold Cup (Listed, 1800m) winner Too Close The Sun (5 g Carlton House - Old Money by Old Spice), who added yesterday's contest to his triumph in the Warrnambool Cup (Listed, 2350m) in May. The Lindsey Smith-trained Too Close The Sun relished the heavy track, racing clear for a four and a quarter length victory over Utgard Loki (Frost Giant) with Royal Command (Street Sense) a further length away in third. "Joey (Azzopardi, jockey) has given him a fantastic steer today and I would say there's a big chance (of running in the Railway) but that's up to Lindsey, obviously," said owner Geoff Evans. "There are so many options there - the Kingston Town, the Van Heemst, which I would love to win again, and then the (Perth) Cup. He's one of the better horses that I've bred so I'm very lucky."

41 for Street Boss

Anamoe (2 c ex Anamato by Redoute's Choice) broke his maiden with a short-head success in the Merson Cooper Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Sandown vesterday to provide Darley stallion Street Boss (Street Cry) with his 41st stakes winner. The Godolphin homebred, who is trained by James Cummings, built on the form of his Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) fifth when repelling the challenge of Forbes (Capitalist), while The Art Of Flying (Flying Artie) was a further two and threequarter lengths away in third. A half-brother

to Leopardstown Listed winner Anamba (Shamardal), Anamoe is one of four winners from Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) heroine Anamato (Redoute's Choice). Street Boss is standing for a fee of \$27,500 (inc. GST) at Darley's Northwood Park this year.

Street's the juvenile Boss

Anamoe was the first leg of a juvenile double for Street Boss, with the Godolphin-raced colt joining his stable companion Sliders, who recorded a first-up success in the \$127,000 Max Lees Classic (900m) at Newcastle. The two-yearold is a homebred sister to the Group 3-placed Flow and a half-sister to Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Flit (Medaglia d'Oro) being out of the Blue Diamond Prelude (F) (Gr 3, 1100m) runner-up Glissade (Redoute's Choice). She is bred on the same cross as Anamoe as he is also from a daughter of Redoute's Choice (Danehill). "I've had a bit to do with her during the early parts of her career and she has just been a natural," said winning rider Rachel King. "I think she is still very untapped. She did that very comfortably today. She doesn't quite know how to really put them away yet but coming off the back of one trial, I thought it was really impressive."

Bred by Windsor Park Stud, Hindaam is out of the placed mare Bayrock (Fastnet Rock), a sister to

Coolmore stallion Merchant Navy and Group 1-placed Jolie Bay. Offered by Kitchwin Hills at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, she was purchased by Shadwell Stud for \$825,000. Savabeel stands for NZ\$100,000 (plus GST) at Waikato Stud in 2020.

Spell beckons for Hindaam

Hindaam, who has now won three of her five starts, is set for a spell with a view to an autumn campaign. "She looked the winner a long way from home," Hayes said. The Richard and Chantelle Jolly-trained fiveyear-old was sent off the \$3.60 joint favourite with Order Of Command and the duo at the head of the market dominated proceedings. Neighbourhood (Street Boss) was a further three-quarters of a length back in third. Plans for Kemalpasa to run in the Winterbottom Stakes at Ascot on November 28 were scuppered by travel constraints imposed by the coronavirus, but Richard Jolly said postrace: "He's really flying. I hope one day he can crack it for a Group 1 win."

Watch Me Dance prevails in titanic tussle

The WA Champion Fillies Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) has produced some top prospects in recent years, including subsequent Group 1 winners Arcadia Queen (Pierro), Perfect Reflection (More Than Ready), Delicacy (Al Maher) and Dreamaway (More Than Ready). And after Watch Me Dance (3 f I'm All The Talk - Coventry To Rio by Oratorio) took the honours yesterday, last season's top juvenile may have more in store at three. The Steve Wolfe-trained filly scored by a short half-head over Indigo Blue (Blackfriars) with Brave Angel (Tavistock) third in a race that changed complexion a number of times over the concluding stages. "She's the best three-year-old in the state," the Albanybased Wolfe said of Watch Me Dance, who is owned by a Magic Millions women's syndicate. "Everyone knows how hard it is to win a race, but it makes it special. You see (the owners) in the stands and you'd think we'd won the Cox Plate or the Melbourne Cup. You can't put a price on it." Watch Me Dance is likely to be given her chance in the Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m), for which she was a \$34 chance last night.

Shamino back in business

The Phillip Stokes-trained Shamino (5 g Shamus Award - Elumino by El Moxie) returned to winning ways dropped in trip when he took out the Doveton Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Sandown vesterday. Stepped up to 1200 metres last time out on the advice of jockey Jamie Kah, the five-year-old failed to see out the distance, but he made amends under the same rider when seeing off Coruscate (Exceed And Excel) by a length and a half. Tavisan (Tavistock) was a further shorthead away in third. Kah, who is a runaway leader of the Melbourne jockeys' premiership this season with 26 wins, told Racing.com post-race: "I'll put my hand up, it was my fault last time. This horse was crying out for 1200 (metres) or even further but he just doesn't get the trip. He was electric today. I galloped him on Tuesday and, God, he's a good track-worker. He worked amazing and put it together better today. I was actually happy that they didn't go flat out today. Caulfield just left us a bit flatfooted, we couldn't keep up. Today they slackened midrace and allowed us to tack on. He was in a lovely spot and Phil has done a great job to freshen him up. I appreciate this winner today and it has topped off a great carnival for me."

Third-up following two runner-up finishes last month, Avonallo joins Isabella Giles, Lullaby Moon, Elysium and Belloccio as stakes winners for Belardo, who is currently standing for a fee of NZ\$10,000 (plus GST). Avonallo was bought out of Book 2 at the NZB Karaka Yearling Sale, realising NZ\$30,000 to Chris Rutten Bloodstock from the draft of Little Avondale Stud. He is out of an unraced O'Reilly (Last Tycoon) half-sister to the dual Listed-winning and multiple Group 2-placed Marquardt (Shamardal).

11 for Darci Brahma

The Oaks Stud's Darci Brahma (Danehill) brought up Group 1 winner number 11 yesterday when Kahma Lass (3 f ex Distinctive Lass by Orientate) took out the New Zealand 1000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) for trainer Jamie Richards and rider Opie Bosson. Darci Brahma stands for NZ\$15,000 (plus GST) in 2020.

11 for Shocking

Rich Hill Stud resident Shocking (Street Cry) registered his 11th individual stakes winner when Dragon Storm (6 g ex Prize Lady by Prized) took out the New Zealand Cup (Gr 3, 3200m) at Riccarton yesterday. Ridden by Craig Grylls, the Chris Gibbs-trained Dragon Storm defeated another son of Shocking, Lincoln King, by a half-head, with a further two lengths back to Hurry Cane (Nom Du Jeu) in third. With sire and dam both previous Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) runners - Prize Lady (Prized) finishing 17th in 2008, a year before Shocking's success - perhaps it is no surprise that Dragon Storm won a big two-mile event in November. Dragon Storm is the third foal to race out of Prize Lady, a two-time Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner, but the first to salute at stakes level; second dam Pen Bal Lady (Mummy's Game) was a threetime Grade 1 winner in California. Dragon Storm was offered for sale twice, purchased for NZ\$55,000 from the Wentwood Grange draft at the 2016 Karaka Premier Yearling Sale before being reoffered at the NZB Ready To Run Sale the same year; he was bought for NZ\$150,000 by Kylin Horse Group. Shocking stands for NZ\$8,000 (plus GST) in 2020.

Fourth stakes win for Concert Hall

The Captain Cook Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) could be a next port of call for Concert Hall (6 m Savabeel - Classic Legacy by Carnegie) after the Roger James and Robert Wellwoodtrained mare raced away to win the Tauranga Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) yesterday. Sent off as the heavy favourite for the weight-for-age feature, Concert Hall raced clear by two and a half lengths over Sinarahma (Darci Brahma) with Siracusa (Sebring) in third. James admits that Concert Hall will excel over further but he is tempted to keep her at the mile for her next outing. "I thought it was a terrific effort," James said. "She really sprinted hard when Vinnie (Colgan, jockey) asked her and it was quite an easy watch in the end. I'm delighted to see her performing like this for her owner as she has allowed us to take our time with her and that maturity, it is now paying dividends. You could bounce bullets off her now she is so tough and resilient. I am toying with the idea of tackling the Captain Cook Stakes at Trentham as she is going so well over the mile at present. That would be the strongest option on our radar at present"

Vale Wally O'Hearn

Popular racing journalist Wally O'Hearn has died at the age of 61 after a lengthy battle with cancer. O'Hearn plied his trade for more than 40 years and worked for a host of publications including the Friday Flash, Best Bets, Sunday Star, Sunday News, DB Racing Annual, Waikato Times, The Informant and was also a regular contributor to the NZ Racing Desk until his passing. The Matamata scribe was also the author of the book Harry, the ride of my life, a biography of champion New Zealand jockey Noel Harris and BJ, The White Robe Legacy, the story of studmaster Brian Anderton. Well-regarded by all in the racing industry, the length and breadth of New Zealand, O'Hearn built a unique rapport with the people behind the horses and could often conjure emotions from even the most reserved participants. His flair for writing came naturally, while he had an incredible historical knowledge of racing. O'Hearn also shared in the ownership of a number of gallopers, including Valante (Tavistock) who provided one of racing's good guys with a great thrill when he won last year's Kiwifruit Cup (2100m) at Tauranga. Jockeys at Riccarton wore armbands in race two as a mark of respect for O'Hearn, who was a partowner of fifth-placed Letsbringiton (Sebring). The St John Gray-trained four-year-old landed the Turffontein Derby Trial (Listed, 2000m) at the course in March, and he underlined his effectiveness at the track once again when pulling two and a half lengths

Divine Queen Tops Keeneland November Sale Session

Divine Queen (Divine Park)
was purchased by Avout
Bloodstock for \$270,000
(approx. AUD\$371,375) to top Friday's session
of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock
Sale in Lexington that saw a robust weanling
market and sustained demand for mares and
broodmare prospects.

Through the first five sessions of the auction, being conducted with Covid-19 protocols that include attendance limited to those essential to the sales process and health screening of all attendees, Keeneland has sold 1,028 horses for \$134,078,000 (approx. AUD\$184.42 million), compared with 1,159 that grossed \$169,102,700 through the same period during the non-pandemic sale a year ago.

The cumulative average is down 10.6 per cent from \$145,904 to \$130,426 (approx. AUD\$179,400), and the \$75,000 (approx. AUD\$103,160) median is only slightly below the five-day figure of \$77,000 in 2019. This year's RNA rate is 22.2 per cent.

Friday's session saw 235 head change hands for \$13,032,000 (approx. AUD\$17.93 million), with an average price of \$55,455 (approx. AUD\$76,275) and a \$42,000 (approx. AUD\$57,770) median price. The RNA rate was 19.5 per cent. At the comparable session in 2019, there were 251 horses that averaged \$56,851 on total receipts of \$14,269,500, with a \$43,000 median.

Friday's session produced the largest number of internet bids and purchases during the first five days of the sale, with 431 and 31, respectively, although the \$1,817,000 (approx. AUD\$2.57 million) gross was fourth-highest. To date, 111 horses have been sold via internet, totaling \$13,699,000 (approx. AUD\$18.84 million).

prospect as Lot 1764 by Tom Evan's Trackside Farm, the five-year-old session topper is a daughter of Divine Park (Chester House) who won the Dogwood Stakes (Listed. 7f) and Open Mind Stakes (Listed, 6f) at Churchill Downs and earned \$339,334 from six wins in 23 starts while racing for her Kentucky breeders, Carl Hurst and William "Buff" Bradley, who also trained the mare.

"We bred her, foaled her, raised her and raced her, and we just sold her," Bradley said.

"Pretty much like we did Groupie Doll (two-time champion sold for \$3.1 million). We were very excited to race this filly and then sell her as a mare and know she was going to go somewhere good. We have a lot of the family, and we have to keep the cash flow going and get ready for the young ones coming along. (She had) a lot of class. She showed it in the ring, walking up here, she's all class. She was a very sound race mare; never once did she have

a problem. I think we are very proud of that. (The price) was a bit more than what we were thinking, but we're very happy with it."

"She is a great-moving filly with a great walk on her," Evans said. "She just showed her class that last two days. I think it was great to have her (in Book 3) for that reason (to stand out)."

Divine Queen was produced from the stakes-winning mare Town Queen (Williamstown), also the dam of stakes winner and Grade 3-placed Queen's Award (Medaglia D'Oro) and to the dam of Grade 2 winner The Player (Street Hero).

The top-priced weanling was Lot 1586, a Nyquist (Uncle Mo) colt purchased by Sycamore for \$225,000 (approx. AUD\$309,480) from Mulholland Springs, agent.

Among the pleased consignors was Francis Vanlangendonck, whose Summerfield operation sold all four horses put through the ring Friday for total receipts of \$232,000 (approx. AUD\$319,100).

"It was a lot better than I anticipated," Vanlangendonck said, noting the fervent demand for weanlings. "For the babies, it's been really, really good. The buyers were pretty aggressive. It seems like for these lowered-value weanlings, there is a world of people wanting to buy. Those well conformed that vetted good sold really well, and even some that had issues are starting to sell."

Vanlangendonck said supply and demand forces affected the market as some of the weanlings sold better than he initially thought they would after some breeders withdrew their horses in anticipation of a weak market.

"With people worried about what the market was going to be like, there were a lot of scratches," he said. "I knew there would be a market for weanlings but thought it would be a little timid. When the supply started lowering, I felt we might do OK."

Consignor Reiley McDonald of Eaton Sales

said that as the sale moved into Book 3 Thursday and Friday, trade mirrored a similar market at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"At the September sale, Book 5 was the strongest day by far, horse for horse," McDonald said. "That was a confluence of the second wave of people moving out and the third wave coming in. That is happening here a little bit. I think we are getting ready to see a fall-off after today."

McDonald said the mares who fit buyers' criteria were still selling well during Book 3, but, as with every other sale, for those who fall below the mark there are few buyers.

"The mares that are legitimate, there are buyers here for them," he said. "For horses that just have holes in them—they are a little old or their foals don't vet right—there is no market for those."

He said weanling buyers continue to be selective and are not forgiving if an individual has any veterinary issues. But they are willing to pay a premium for those that hit the mark.

"The weanling buyers are not putting up with any veterinary flaws," he said. "If you jump through the hoops—you're a nice physical and you're clean (on the veterinary reports)—then you will get as much here as you will for a yearling. There is money out there, and people get hungry. Everybody gets shuffled back by the earlier higher-priced horses and get hungry in Books 3 and 4 because the pinhookers make their living reselling the foals."



Buddies lands Panasonic Cup, Cruz considers Hong Kong Mile

tenacious all-the-way win from Buddies (So You Think) in the Class 1 Panasonic Cup Handicap (1400m) at Sha Tin yesterday had trainer Tony Cruz considering next month's Hong Kong Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) as the gelding's next step.

"Looks like I have to, we might as well give it a go – what's there to lose? – otherwise there's no race for us," Cruz said, regarding the fiveyear-old's participation in December's HK\$25 million (approx. AUD\$4.43 million) contest.

Buddies' victory was the tough on-pacer's seventh win of his career and his second at Class 1 level, and this time he succeeded off a mark of 105, the third highest-rated in the contest behind top-weight Fast Most Furious (Lope De Vega) and Jolly Banner (Lonhro).

"We'll see how much his rating goes up and we might have to end up going to the Group races because the programme in Hong Kong is pretty limited to where you can go but we'll go wherever we can that's over an appropriate distance," Cruz said.

Matthew Chadwick's well-judged frontrunning ride had the bay crossing the line in a time of 1m 21.80s, a length ahead of the fastfinishing Lucky Express (Toronado) and Super Wealthy (Epaulette).

"Every win is good but my horse did well he did what he had to do," Chadwick said.

The Australian-bred was trained by John Moore – who was compulsorily retired – last season, and won his first five races for the seven-time champion trainer.

"We all thought he had a great chance - it goes back to when John Moore trained him, he had apprentice Jerry Chau on the horse and he won with a very fast time (1m 20.88s)," Cruz said.

"And when the owners asked me would you like to train this horse, I said 'sure, I'd love to' because what I saw was pretty impressive."



Buddies

Buddies' success gave Chadwick and Cruz a fourth win together this season, and the jockey is keen to team up again at the Hong Kong International Races.

"The Hong Kong Mile will be a completely different ball game with some strong frontrunners in there as well, so it'll be very interesting," Chadwick said. "Time will tell to see what happens and what path he takes but I haven't got a ride yet in the Mile so if I was offered it, I wouldn't be turning it down."

Cruz has tasted success in the Hong Kong Mile previously with Lucky Owners (Danehill) in 2003, Beauty Flash (Golan) in 2010 and Beauty Only (Holy Roman Emperor) in 2016.

"Matthew (Chadwick) definitely knows how to ride and whatever opportunity I can give him, I would love to have him on my horses," Cruz said about his former apprentice who partnered the handler's California Memory (Highest Honor) to back-to-back wins in the Hong Kong Cup (Gr 1, 2000m).

Cruz sealed a double when Hong Kong International Sale graduate (ISG) Beauty Angel (Dark Angel) bagged his fourth consecutive win in the Class 3 Panasonic Massage Lounger Handicap (1800m).

Forte excels on debut

That effort also sealed a double for Joao Moreira, who earlier scored on another ISG, the Caspar Fownes-trained Forte (Per Incanto) who excelled in the Class 4 Panasonic IH Warm Jar Handicap (1000m) with a gritty debut success.

The win was the 12th time this season that championship leaders Fownes and Moreira have struck in tandem.

"We picked this race a while ago for him and he had a good preparation into it; he was a bit immature when I got him but he learned through each trial and progressed nicely, and I was happy to get that winning result," Fownes said.

The four-year-old stepped away only fairly from barrier five but managed to hold a position midfield. Once he hit the front, the gelding was challenged then headed by United We Stand (Delago Deluxe), before a driving Moreira got him over the line a length and a quarter to the good.

"It's always hard to win in Hong Kong firstup with a young horse, so it was a good effort and hopefully he can get stronger and improve through the season," Fownes said.

The gelding was the second highest saletopper at the 2020 July Sale, with the hammer falling at HK\$6 million for the New Zealandbred.

"He was the one I liked the most and I'm glad we got him, obviously he was a little bit expensive," the trainer added.

Badel takes three

Alexis Badel sealed his fourth double this term and promptly made it a first treble when 21-1 shot Ping Hai Bravo (Red Dazzler) charged from off the pace to overhaul the 1.3 favourite Joyful Fortune (Nicconi) in the Class 3 Panasonic Thermo Ventilator Handicap (1000m).

"Ping Hai Bravo was a strong chance for me," Badel said of the John Size-trained galloper, who was stepping down to the minimum distance for the first time.

"When I studied the race, I thought he was going to run well over this trip, and honestly, I was quite confident. After the start, he was travelling so well and when I asked him to pick up, he responded straight away. I was very confident even coming from so far back."

The in-form Frenchman moved to 14 wins for the term, with five wins from the last three race meetings.

Badel kicked off his three-timer

with victory aboard Super Red Dragon (Starspangledbanner), who launched late to grab the Class 4 Panasonic 4K TV Handicap (1200m) at his 17th Hong Kong start – the gelding has finished runner-up five times.

Badel's second win came when Namjong Sings (Your Song) denied another short-priced favourite, Cheerful Days (Smart Missile), in section two of the Class 4 Panasonic Air-Conditioner Handicap (1400m). The runner-up closed off with enough merit to suggest he is a four-year-old with smart potential.

Beauty Rush (Helmet) moved Vagner Borges to double figures for the season. The Brazilian ace put in a skilled front-running ride aboard the John Size-trained five-year-old in the Class 3 Panasonic IH Cooker Handicap (1400m). Paul O'Sullivan rolled off the back of his midweek double with another win, grabbing the Class 4 Panasonic Washing Machine Handicap (1600m) with Casimiro (Albrecht), who rolled from last-to-first under apprentice Jerry Chau.

Diamond Rhyme (Sebring) got off the mark and gave trainer Frankie Lor his fourth win since the start of November, with Derek Leung driving for the win in section one of the Class 4 Panasonic Steam Oven Handicap (1400m).

Antoine Hamelin and Dennis Yip combined in the opener, the Class 5 Panasonic Nanoe Handicap (1600m) with Happy Win Win (Zoffany), who grabbed his first Hong Kong win by three quarters of a length.

Leaving the back straight she moved up two spots, moved out at the 600m but into the straight had plenty to do. Opie Bosson found a split at the 350m, drove her through and went after the leaders. Third, a half length back inside the 200m, she then grabbed a narrow lead at the 100m but to the line was in command, away by three quarters of a length when it mattered. A super run from Miss Tycoon Rose who was equal last at the 1000m, tracked the winner from the 600m but went wider into the straight. From the 200m she switched towards the inner and finished strongly for a very good second.

Cornflower Blue had a nice run in fifth (rails) from the 600m, hugged the fence into the straight then moved out a lane to share the lead approaching the 200m. She was caught by the winner near the 100m and nosed out of second at the post. Tinker McPhee sat seventh rounding into the straight, dived through along the inner starting the run home, shared the lead at the 200m but was swamped near the line. Tokorangi ran on quite well from well back to claim fifth. [LJ]
