Victoria's lockdown has Inglis Premier vendors anxious about live sale

Andrews leaves state hanging with no certainty when snap ban will end

Victorian breeders are increasingly anxious about the ramifications caused by an unexpected hurdle less than a fortnight out from the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale, the state's major thoroughbred trading auction of the year.

The snap five-day lockdown introduced by Victorian premier Daniel Andrews last

week in response to a hotel quarantine coronavirus outbreak has vendors fearing the much-needed live sale could be hit and put undue financial pressure on breeders, less than a year after other important sales were severely restricted.

Tatura vendor, David Johnson, says his Rushton Park operation lost "tens of thousands of dollars" as a result of last year's Victorian lockdowns and dreads the prospect of his

business again being hit if the Premier sale does not go ahead as scheduled from February 28.

"We're having enough sleepless nights with 20 yearlings without having all this other stuff going on as well," said Johnson, who runs Rushton Park with his wife Kayley.

"It's a hard enough time as it is without having to worry about lockdown. We've got some really nice horses to sell and, looking at how strong the market's been and talking to the trainers, there's a lot of guys who haven't bought horses or haven't been able to so far and there seems to be a real appetite for them.

<< *Continued from page 1* "Up until Thursday, Friday last week, we were very confident of a good sale."

Johnson (pictured right) raised the plight of Premier vendors with Inglis staff yesterday, but he understood it was hard to make firm plans given the lack of certainty provided by Andrews, who yesterday gave little guarantee the lockdown would end as scheduled at 11.59pm tomorrow.

"I've had a couple of conversations with them (Inglis), but I think they are as much in the dark as we are," Johnson said yesterday, adding he would welcome on-farm inspections before the Premier sale if the travel restrictions were lifted.

"From a vendor point of view, we'd love something definitive. That 'this is going to happen if this happens,' but I think they're all up in the air

as well. They would certainly be kicking around a lot of options, plan B and plan C, but it's a pretty congested calendar with Adelaide and QTIS (on the Gold Coast) if the sale gets postponed because of the lockdown.

"I think the Victorian breeders, after last year's Great Southern (being postponed and held online), it will be a real

trainwreck if Premier doesn't go ahead as is. Hopefully, the next couple of days are zero and zero (Covid-19 community cases) and then the government's just got to lift the restrictions and we can get on with life."

Blue Gum Farm principal, Phil Campbell, the leading vendor and seller of three of the top five lots at last year's Premier sale, was trying to remain positive despite the roadblock put in front of the industry.

"Obviously, Victoria's been through a pretty rough patch with the whole Covid thing and it has done such an amazing job to keep it at bay," Campbell said yesterday. "Anyway, it is what it is and we have just got to hope and pray that the five-day lockdown is just that and hopefully not much more, and we can all continue on and have the sale as scheduled."

"I know that's what Inglis is working towards and that is what we and, I am sure, every other vendor is working towards. If it can't, there will be contingency plans but at this stage we're full steam ahead in the hope of being able to ship down to Oaklands Junction a week from (yesterday)."

Inglis would not speculate yesterday on any potential changes to the Premier sale date or format if the Victorian lockdown was extended beyond tomorrow's initial deadline.

Magic Millions sales ready to go

Rival auction house Magic Millions has its own headaches, having pushed back its two-day Perth Yearling Sale, which was due to start yesterday, until Thursday and Friday due to bushfires wreaking havoc in regions surrounding the capital city.

The Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale, thus far, will still be held next Monday as scheduled despite the likelihood that the key market of Victoria may not be able to attend.

Victorian and Tasmanian state manager, Tim Brown, is already on the Apple Isle while on-complex inspections have started in Perth.

The Magic Millions Perth complex was used as an animal refuge from the bushfires, with that being just one obstacle the company has had to overcome in the lead-up to its Western Australian auction.

"Everything has been thrown at us, that's for sure, but the complex is all back in shape very well. We had a lot of help from everybody who was involved with things. The vendors are obviously very understanding of that," Magic Millions Western Australia manager, David Houston, said yesterday.

"The Covid thing, that has put a bit of a dent in things as well, but putting it back a few days has helped no-end because at least we have full gatherings here now without masks. The Victorian problems have impacted us a lot ... but we are going to have a few people coming across from NSW in the next couple of days.

"The fact that we have got from Sunday through to Thursday morning for inspections, there's steady inspections without being run off our feet. It's giving people the opportunity to have a really good look at the horses."

The opening session of the Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale starts at 1pm local time on Thursday.

Typhoon Tracy return for Night Raid

Night Raid (Vancouver) is set for a return this preparation in Friday evening's Typhoon Tracy Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Moonee Valley. The Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr-trained three-year-old has two wins from five starts, including in the Atlantic Jewel Stakes (Listed, 1200m) in September. "She looks outstanding. She won the Atlantic Jewel in the spring at the course and distance. It's a lovely kick-off for her," Kent Jnr told Racing.com. Night Raid was stepped up to a mile when running second to last in the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) on her latest start but the training partnership will stick to shorter distances with the \$160,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale purchase. "We are going to keep her to sprint trips this time around," Kent Jnr continued. "We feel she has come up well. We are very happy with her at home, she does look outstanding. Her work has been very good." Meanwhile, Night Raid's stablemate and winner of the Thousand Guineas, Odeum (Written Tycoon), is scheduled to start in heat one of the Caulfield jump-outs this morning, starting at 7am.

The Harrovian to target All-Star Mile

Connections of Queensland star The Harrovian (Fastnet Rock), a winner of his last 11 starts, will change tack and turn their attentions to the \$5 million All-Star Mile (1600m), resulting in the seven-year-old swerving Saturday's Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and instead waiting for the Shaftesbury Avenue Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m) a week later. "We just thought instead of taking on Arcadia Queen and all those horses

first-up, (running at Flemington) is going to be a bit easier than running into those types on Saturday," Toby Edmonds, who trains in partnership with his son Trent, told Racing.com. Edmonds is also mindful of the impacts of the prevailing lockdown in Victoria. "We are just going to tread water until the end of this lockdown and see what the picture looks like going forward," he continued. "(Running at Flemington instead of Caulfield) gives us a bit more time and hopefully getting towards the All-Star Mile everything will be well contained and back to normal."

Tralee Rose nominated for Lord Reims Stakes

Progressive mare Tralee Rose (Tavistock), who claimed her first stakes success with a seven-length win in the Bagot Handicap (Listed, 2800m) on New Year's Day, will return in Saturday's Lord Reim Stakes (Gr 3, 2600m) at Morphettville. Since finishing fourth in the SA Fillies Classic (Gr 3, 2500m) Tralee Rose has won four of her five starts. The four-year-old could take on some strong contenders on Saturday, with Lindsay Park's Yulong Captain (Galileo) nominated for the race, while the Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained St Leger (2600m) winner Big Blue (Galileo) also holds a nomination after returning from a jumps' campaign in Europe.

Samizdat ready to peak

Michael Gangemi is confident Samizdat (Not A Single Doubt) can continue his preparation in a blaze of glory ahead of an interstate campaign. Samizdat will look to add Sunday's Pinjarra Classic (Listed, 1300m) and next month's Bunbury Stakes (Listed, 1400m) to his last-start victory in the Scenic Blast Stakes

(Listed, 1200m). With three runs under his belt this preparation, Gangemi, who trains in partnership with his brother Chris, could not be happier with Samizdat's condition and expects the five-year-old to run well in the Pinjarra Classic. "I wish this race was tomorrow (Tuesday) because he is going so well," Gangemi told The Races WA. "This is the second of three races we have targeted and he is ready to explode. The step up in distances from 1200 metres to 1300 metres and 1400 metres will suit him."

Queensland Guineas focus for Gotta Kiss

The Queensland Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) will be the winter carnival goal for Proven Thoroughbreds' Gotta Kiss (Not A Single Doubt) after the filly returned to the stables of Steve O'Dea and Matt Hoysted yesterday. "She's had a bit of time off after the Magic Millions and has just finished some pre-training out at Kolora Lodge," Hoysted said. Gotta Kiss will be given a steady build up before she is aimed at the winter carnival, having completed her summer carnival campaign with an unlucky fifth behind Aim (Star Witness) in the Magic Millions Guineas (RL, 1400m) at the Gold Coast on January 16.

Newmarket back on table for Swats That

Troy Corstens has suggested a Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) start for star mare Swats That (Shamus Award) could still be on the cards, after seeming to rule it out after she finished third behind Nature Strip (Nicconi) in Saturday's Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m). "It's still up in the air," Corstens, who trains in partnership with his father Leon, told SENTrack. "We're not going to lock anything in for probably a week or so. We'll let the dust settle and it will be interesting to see what goes to the Newmarket with Nature Strip not going now. It would be remiss of us to just dismiss it. It's such a prestigious race and worth so much money, we've got to think about it." Corstens did however concede that the four-year-old may be better suited away from the Flemington straight. "I reckon she's better around the corner," he added. "I think 1200 metres around the Moonee Valley corner is really her go."

Melbourne trip on hold for in-form Platoon

Neville Parnham has not given up on an interstate campaign for two of his top stable gallopers. Platoon (Playing God) and Indian Pacific (Zoustar) were unable to secure a place on a flight departing Perth for Melbourne last night, but all is not lost according to Parnham. "Bob (Peters) rang me to say only Arcadia Queen and Regal Power were going on the plane from his team tonight," Parnham told The Races WA. "I was hoping to get one of the remaining other berths, but Chris Calthorpe from the air transport company had committed it to Greg Bond. Bondy is taking across Minstrel and needs to be in Sydney quickly. But if the Victorian government ease the Covid-19 restrictions all is not lost. It all depends on what they do, but we can still get across by plane next week. If that's the case then Platoon and Indian Pacific will go to Melbourne." Interstate plans were confirmed for Platoon after his sizzling last-to-first win in Saturday's Cyril Flower Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Ascot. Racing first-up since the Perth Cup (Gr 2, 2400m) in January, the gelding came with a withering finish and scored by half a length. Indian Pacific has not raced since finishing fifth in last month's Miss Andretti Stakes (Listed, 1100m).

Siblings to Sunlight and Loving Gaby step out at trials

A brother to Sunlight (Zoustar) and half-sister to Loving Gaby (I Am Invincible) contested yesterday morning's two-year-old trials at Hawkesbury for Team Hawkes, with both running second in their respective heats. Dio (Zoustar), a \$1.1 million purchase out of last year's Inglis Easter Yearling Sale, made late headway in the colours of Orbis Bloodstock to finish three-quarters of a length behind Substitution (Smart Missile) in Heat 8. Two heats later and Gstaad (Sebring), a half-sister to dual Group 1 winner Loving Gaby, was given a similar hit out, again finishing three-quarters of a length adrift when second to unraced filly Mascherata (Tivaci), who won her second trial for trainer John O'Shea. Elsewhere, the Go Bloodstock-owned Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) colt, Mea Culpa, won Heat 3, finishing one and a half lengths ahead of Auspicious Cloud (American Pharoah).

Hey Doc wins jump-out in 'fantastic day out' at Avoca

Four-time Group 1 winner Hey Doc (Duporth) returned with a jump-out win at Avoca yesterday. Co-trainers Tony and Calvin McEvoy were pleased with the 800-metre hit out, and will target the seven-year-old at the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) second up after contesting the Bob Hoysted Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Flemington on February 27. "Hey Doc had a fantastic day out at Avoca this morning, he was very stimulated by going to Avoca, as was I," Calvin McEvoy told Racing.com. "He jumped, led and won as you would expect. He had a good, healthy blow after the gallop and I think he'll come on from this first jump-out. I think running in the Bob Hoysted would get us on the right leg ahead of the William Reid and when you're a top-class horse there's not a lot of races you can run in."

Glenesk expands into online sale consignment

Glenesk Thoroughbreds will be expanding their operation to offer draft consignment on online platforms in 2021. The leading consignors, owned and operated by Brett and Rachael Howard, have sold million-dollar lots Villa Verde (Not A Single Doubt) and Invincibella (I Am Invincible) in broodmare sales since 2015. "In 2021 we will

be looking to better our 2020 results at these two prestigious broodmare auctions," said Brett Howard. "Now that we have the public auction space covered, we want to advance into the online auction space. We want to become the first farm in Australia's to specialise in online auction consignment." The online trade in thoroughbreds has increased exponentially in recent years, with the Inglis Digital platform achieving turnover of \$53 million in 2020.

Pinhookers target Playing God in Perth

Playing God (Blackfriars) has been bolstered by two stakes winners in as many weeks, as Ex Sport Man claimed the Magic Millions WA 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) and Platoon scored a second stakes success in the Cyril Flower Stakes. Following the dispersal of Mungrup Stud's yearlings last year, where Playing God formerly resided, pinhookers are hopeful of profiting from his success at the Perth Magic Millions Yearling Sale this Thursday and Friday. Geisel Park will offer Lot 39, a sister to Platoon they purchased for \$80,000. "She's a gorgeous filly and the feedback has been very positive," stud manager Conor Dunlop said yesterday. "They unloaded her from the float just as Platoon was winning at Ascot. We were doing cartwheels." There will be a further six yearlings pinhooked at the Perth Magic Millions Sale after being purchased from the Mungrup dispersal sale, including Lot 122, a colt out of Countess of Tiba (Second Empire) a \$50,000 purchase for Westbury Park.

Dunn returns at Sandown

Dwayne Dunn will make his return to race riding at Sandown tomorrow with the veteran booked for two rides. Dunn will partner Silly Point (Hallowed Crown) and Lass Vegas (All American) as he makes his comeback from a barrier incident in September which resulted in him breaking bones in his vertebrae. It could prove to be an unexpected busy week for Dunn, who is in the mix for rides in three Group 1 races on Saturday. Already confirmed on board Wolves (Wolf Cry) in the Blue Diamond and Bold Star (Needs Further) in the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m), he could also pick up the ride aboard Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Ole Kirk (Written Tycoon) in the Futurity Stakes.

Childs facing a stint on the sidelines

Jordan Childs is expected to be out of action for some time after he revealed the full extent of the injuries he suffered in a fall at Moonee Valley on Friday night. Childs was taken to hospital with what was assumed to be a dislocated shoulder after being dislodged from Zacobur (Vancouver) in the closing stages of the 3YO Benchmark 64 Handicap over 1200 metres. However, scans revealed several fractures to the ball of the shoulder, as well as damage to tendons and soft tissue in the area. The 24-year-old underwent surgery over the weekend and is expected to remain under observation at Royal Melbourne Hospital for another night or two.

Rawiller ahead of time in recovery from injury

Brad Rawiller is hoping to be back riding trackwork later this week - a month after suffering a broken collarbone and puncturing his lung in a fall at Bunbury. "I am optimistic," Rawiller told Racing.com. "When it happened they told me it would be a minimum two months out so I am tracking ahead of schedule. Once I jump on a horse I'll be able to reassess my fitness and know where I am at. I haven't given up hope of (race) riding in a fortnight's time."

Sam Payne suspended

Sam Payne has been suspended for seven meetings after pleading guilty to excessive use of the whip on Sunday's shock winner Shapurb (Toronado). The Danielle Loos-trained four-year-old defied her \$101 odds to get off the mark at the fourth time of asking in the opener at Colac. However, the winning ride came at a cost to Payne, who broke the whip rule after using his whip on nine occasions prior to the 100 metres, and 15 in total. His suspension will start at midnight tonight and expire at midnight on February 21. He was also fined \$500.

Racing NSW tightens Covid protocols

Racing NSW yesterday announced new measures following the Victorian government's lockdown announcement. Any person that has been in Victoria (other than those who

have only been in the NSW/Victoria border community) on, or since, January 29 must not, without the permission of Racing NSW, attend a NSW racecourse or licensed premises until further notice. Individuals who have only been in Victoria in the area defined as the NSW/Victoria border community since January 29 and have not been to any other area of Victoria, may attend a NSW racecourse or licensed premises, provided that they wear a face mask at all times. Jockeys who fall into this category are to be segregated in a separate jockeys' room on raceday from the jockeys who have not been to Victoria since January 29. Racing NSW will continue to monitor the Covid-19 cases in Victoria and are expected to provide a further update today.

Picnic meets set to proceed

Picnic racing is expected to resume this weekend, even if Victoria's state-wide lockdown is extended beyond tomorrow evening. Representatives from both Woolamai & District Racing Club and Yea & St Pats Racing Club confirmed yesterday that both club's are prepared to run behind closed doors if required this weekend. Woolamai is set to race on Saturday with Yea due to race on Sunday. The Buchan & Gelantipy Race Club made the decision last Friday to postpone Saturday's meeting with discussions underway to find a new date for the event.

NEW ZEALAND

Aimee's Jewel joins Victorian stable

Group 3-winning mare Aimee's Jewel (Proisir) has joined the stable of Kyneton trainer Charles Cassar as she looks to add Australian black type to her CV. The four-year-old won three of her seven starts for Trudy Keegan, with victory in the Canterbury Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Riccarton in November preceding an eighth and fifth-placed finish in the Captain Cook Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and Manawatu Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m). Keegan, who remains in the ownership of Aimee's Jewel, said it had been very clear from the outset that principal owner Troy Pannell would transfer the mare across the

Tasman should she show enough ability. "Charles Cassar is his main trainer," Keegan said. "Right from the get go with all of Troy's horses, and he has got five with us, we had always been under the guideline that we would get them going here in New Zealand and if they showed enough and were good enough, they would ultimately try and get black type in New Zealand before heading over to Charles. We have always known that Aimee's Jewel would head over there at some stage and it was really a matter of when."

Australia remains on cards for Concert Hall

Group 1 winner Concert Hall (Savabeel) is still being aimed towards an Australian campaign, but her connections are just figuring out which path to take. The six-year-old has gone from strength-to-strength this campaign, winning three of her five starts and finishing runner-up in her two other assignments, culminating in victory in the Zabeel Classic (Gr 1, 2000m) at Ellerslie on Boxing Day. But a barrier incident at New Plymouth last week where the mare parted company with Danielle Johnson before scaling a fence and was ultimately caught in a kids playground, cast a shadow on her Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) aspirations. Trainers Roger James and Robert Wellwood are keen to test her at the highest level in Australia, but a decision on that will be made later this week. "We are still contemplating Australia, it's just a matter of which way we get there," James said. "It will be worked out this week and I intend to approach Auckland to see if we can have an exhibition gallop there and work from there."

Cheaperthandivorce still an Oaks hope

A tilt at the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) still remains on the cards for Cheaperthandivorce (Savabeel) after her sixth-placing in the Waikato Guineas (Gr 2, 2000m) at Te Rapa on Saturday. Co-trainer Roger James was slightly disappointed with the result but said there were some underlying issues. "It was a little below my expectations, but she was troubled a bit by a seasonal complaint at the time, so maybe that had something to do with it," he said.

Northern features for Capitalist's Mozzarella

Nick Wigley and Kayla Milnes had an exciting spring with stakes-winning three-year-old Matchmaker (Makfi) and now Mozzarella (Capitalist) is giving the pair something to look forward to in the autumn. The promising two-year-old posted a comfortable four-length victory at Riccarton on Saturday, her second successive win, fulfilling the promise seen in her by her trainers. "We were sort of expecting it because we used the first run just as a trial," Wigley said. "She was always going to improve from that. I think she will improve further, we haven't done much with her. She potted around in the surf for a fortnight and that run will improve her even further. She seems to have pulled up pretty well, she ate up on Saturday night, which is a good sign."

Riddell delighted with Group 1 win

Jonathan Riddell didn't have a great start at Te Rapa on Saturday, failing to make the weight for two of his six booked rides but, by the end of the day, he'd recorded a surprise Group 1 victory aboard Royal Performer (Medicean), finished second in another, and guided the exciting Gold Watch (Swiss Ace) to his fourth successive win. "I had success at the weekend, but I haven't got ahead of myself. I enjoyed it, but man, it's a tough game," Riddell said. "It's challenging. There are times I could have walked away. But this is my life, and the weekend was awesome." Riddell was not expecting Royal Performer to beat Melody Belle (Commands) in the Herbie Dyke Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m), but he went in hoping for a strong effort after watching videos of the well-travelled gelding's six prior New Zealand starts, three of which he had won. "Every race he's had in this country I thought was good. I came in with a lot of confidence after doing the form," he said. "Once he drew gate one, it was a case of just putting him there, and he ran a great race. He's a serious horse."

Waikato courses on standby

Officials at Eilerslie remain hopeful that Saturday's meeting, which features the Avondale Guineas (Gr 2, 2100m) and the Avondale Cup (Gr 2, 2400m), will be able to take

place even if the Covid restrictions put in place on Sunday night are extended. However, if the meeting is unable to be staged as planned it is believed that it will be transferred to either Te Rapa or Te Aroha.

ASIA

SGP: Beasley back in the saddle

Singapore racing fans will be delighted to see an old familiar face back in the riding ranks this week - Danny Beasley. After bringing the curtain down on a successful 25-year riding career to join Daniel Meagher as his assistant trainer in 2017, Beasley has come full circle, with the Singapore Turf Club granting him a jockey's licence effective from yesterday until December 31. Beasley, who retired from race riding at Kranji in 2017, had in excess of 2,000 winners to his name when he hung up his boots, including 528 recorded in Singapore. In Australia, he won 14 Group 1 races in 15 years, headed by Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Polar Success (Success Express), as well as wins in the Doncaster Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) and Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) on Grand Armee (Hennessy), and the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) with Miss Pennymoney (Brocco).

INTERNATIONAL

Six for Mehmas

UK: Chester announces plans for rapid testing

Officials at Chester racecourse are pushing to host up to 5,000 spectators at the track's May festival with rapid mass Covid-19 testing set to be in place for all racegoers on each of the fixture's three days. Under the plans announced yesterday, mass testing could take place at three separate sites, which will allow for 1,800 tests to take place per hour with all attendees being given a designated entry time to avoid congestion. Racegoers will also be given a specific seating area in their assigned enclosures on raceday, with a one-way system in place, as well as staggered exit times once racing has finished. The meeting, which this year is scheduled to take place on May 5-7, features key trials for the following month's Classics with the likes of subsequent Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winners Shergar (Great Nephew) and Ruler Of The World (Galileo) among the winners of the Chester Vase (Gr 3, 1m 4f) which most recently went the way of subsequent Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) winner Sir Dragonet (Camelot).

Moodie backs long held high opinion of General Beau and pays up for Blue Diamond

There was nothing last minute about astute Victorian breeder David Moodie's decision to fork out the \$55,000 final late entry fee for his colt General Beau (Brazen Beau) to run in this Saturday's \$1.5 million Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Caulfield.

"We were never not going to pay up for him unless something went wrong between last Saturday week and today," Moodie said. "You don't get too many opportunities to have a live chance in these types of races."

The former Racing Victoria chairman is adversed to paying up at the various stages of entry required under race conditions for the dozens of young horses he breeds each season.

"I'm opposed to paying up along the way and paying for horses that are never going to make it. I wish they didn't inflict it on owners, it would be a lot simpler.

"There are plenty of \$1.5 million races floating around in this day and age where you are not subjected to pay up eight or nine months earlier."

Right from when the attractive bay was a foal growing out on his property in the Macedon Ranges, Moodie, who bred and raced 1996 Blue Diamond winner Paint (Raami) and 2010 Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Crystal Lily (Stratum) had General Beau earmarked as having the potential to make the cut in Australia's major two-year-old races.

"He's a lovely, lovely horse. He's the perfect horse. He's not hugely tall, he's average size, but just strong. A beautiful animal all round. You couldn't breed a nicer horse full stop. He's as good a type as you could ever hope for.

This campaign, the Mat Ellerton and Simon Zahra-trained colt has won both the Blue Diamond Preview (Listed, 1000m) and Prelude (Gr 3, 1100m). The last horse to win those key lead up races for the colts and geldings and go on to take out the main event was Sepoy (Elusive Quality) in 2011.

"He's done enough to have a throw at the stumps.

"I've done this a couple of times before and pulled it off. I'm not necessarily suggesting he will do it again but we will have a go."

General Beau has been ridden on every occasion in his four-start career by last weekend's Group 1 Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) winning jockey Jamie Kah.

Currently the leading rider on the Melbourne premiership, Kah will stick with him on Saturday.

"I rate him a real genuine chance and a real good horse that hasn't got the credit he deserves to date because they are always looking for something to flash home," Moodie continued.

"I think he's a real live chance. I just hope he doesn't draw (barrier) 16 or 1."

It's not only the barrier draw that Moodie has to worry about, it's also star filly and raging race favourite Enthaar (Written Tycoon) although Moodie remains pragmatic about her.

"She either wins and wins easily, but her biggest risk is herself, she's got to do everything right and settle and run it right out."

Like General Beau, who carries Moodie's prolific Contract Racing colours, the Emirates Park-bred and raised filly Enthaar will also be flying the flag for home bred horses on Saturday.

"You look at the domination of Darley/Godolphin and those winning all these races. A high percentage are homebred," Moodie added.

Coolmore owns Head Of State in partnership with the likes of Waller, Sir Peter Vela, Debbie Kepitis' Woppitt Thoroughbreds, Peachester Lodge and Robert McClure and he is a half-brother to Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Man From Uncle (Uncle Mo). Head Of State was bred by Brad Crismale and his unraced dam, Derelique (Danehill Dancer), was bought by Colm Santry Bloodstock for the Crismale family for \$80,000 from the

2009 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. Her offspring have since sold for almost \$2 million. American Pharoah is standing in Kentucky for a fee of \$100,000 (approx. AUD\$128,500) in 2021.

Capitalist - Newgate's freshman sire Capitalist (Written Tycoon) became the sire of five individual winners to date after he notched a double on Saturday. The John McArdle-trained Tycoon Humma (2 f ex Humma Mumma by Bel Esprit) ran out an impressive winner of a maiden (1000m) on debut at Bendigo. The filly beat Chairman's Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) fourth Frostin' (Frosted) by two and a quarter

lengths, while Midwest (Zoustar), who started out unplaced in the Blue Diamond Preview (Listed, 1000m) was third. 


