Classic test for promising Victoria Derby-nominated Karaka colt

*Clean-winded Let's Karaka Deel to start at Caulfield after
luckless Flemington run*

A glowing endorsement from Peter Cunningham had syndicator Cameron Bennett excited about the prospects of Let's Karaka Deel (Dundeel) and 18 months on from the unexpected text message the three-year-old will this weekend press his Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) claims and back up the raps placed on him by the horse breaker.

The lightly-raced colt, trained by Ciaron

Maher and David Eustace, has been carefully managed since his second placing at Bendigo in July and connections stuck to the plan despite a luckless last-start run at Flemington on September 23 by keeping him fresh for tomorrow's Caulfield Classic (Gr 3, 2000m).

Bennett yesterday revealed that Cunningham had compared Let's Karaka Deel with Flying Start Syndications' flag bearer and Group 1-winning mare Amphitrite (Sebring) during the colt's early education at Cranbourne in May last year. *Continued on page 2>>*

"This is true. I've still got it in a text message, my breaker who worked with Amphitrite down in Cranbourne, messaged me after working with him and he said 'this is your next Group horse,'" Bennett told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"He is a pretty good judge. The horse hasn't done it yet, but hopefully the breaker is right,"

Amphitrite won the 2018 Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and would go on to retire from racing as the winner of five races from 17 starts and more than \$750,000 in prize-money. She was sold for a seven-figure sum to Japan

as a broodmare prospect after being retired last November.

"(Cunningham) said that Amphitrite was the best horse he'd touched early on," Bennett recalled.

"She was like a dog was the way he explained it to me. He could stand in the ring, call her over and she would come over, turn left, turn right. She just did everything he asked of her and that just doesn't normally happen.

"I guess that is what makes them better than most horses. They're intelligent and they have that different quality to them."

Let's Karaka Deel was narrowly beaten at Bendigo at his first start, but made up for that with a comfortable maiden victory at Swan Hill on August 24, prompting Maher and Eustace to target the Victoria Derby Trial (1800m) at Flemington on September 23 when the colt, who was ridden by John Allen, was badly held up for a run to be beaten three and a half lengths in 11th by Cetshwayo (Dundeel). *Continued on page 4>>*

"It took me about a day to get off the floor after that run," he said.

"The jockey was shattered but that is racing. He thought he was going well enough to win. That is what they took out of it.

"They have always thought he was a pretty good horse and we've just taken steps along the way and that was one of the races but it didn't pan out."

Momentarily, Eustace and Maher considered backing up Let's Karaka Deel in the Super Impose Stakes (Listed, 1800m) on October 3 but decided against it.

"They were worried with the tracks being hard and he is a better horse kept fresh and we only wanted to give him one more run if he does go to the Derby," he said.

"If he went to the other race (Super Impose Stakes) he would have needed another run again before the Derby, so that's the reason they didn't back him up.

"They were thinking that straight after the race, but 24 hours later, they were never going to go there as they wanted to give him another few weeks.

"He's really clean-winded, he pulls up well and he doesn't need a tonne of work. They keep him on the fresh side."

Let's Karaka Deel was an NZ\$80,000 purchase by Bennett and Pinhook Bloodstock's Dave Mee from the Wentwood Grange draft at the 2019 New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale after the syndicator sought out the progeny of Arrowfield Stud's Dundee (High Chaparral).

"I still remember the first time they pulled him out of the box and I honestly did like him and Dave (Mee) liked him too, which was good, because sometimes there are horses I like that he doesn't," Queensland-based Bennett said.

"We looked at him two or three times and he was from Wentwood Grange who are good breeders with Kolding and a heap of other good horses in a short time."

Flying Start Syndications also has another promising New Zealand graduate in training with Maher and Eustace, the three-year-old **Oceanography** (Ocean Park) who won at Sandown in September.

The colt, who was purchased from Cambria Park, had his last start in the Super Impose Stakes but the talented stayer has since been spelled.

"We have tipped him out. They like him, too, but the Flemington track was rock hard and he just didn't stretch out," Bennett said.

"They tried to keep him going, but he's just a bit sore. He will appreciate time and he got a lot further this preparation than what we thought he would."

Bennett and Mee paid NZ\$25,000 for Oceanography who is by Waikato Stud's sire Ocean Park (Thorn Park).

"I spoke to Dave Eustace (on Wednesday) and he wants to target him towards the Adelaide and Brisbane carnivals. He thinks he's up to that grade," he said.

"Dave did say, 'you wouldn't think he'd win a race six weeks ago and six weeks later he's up to a Listed race' but the Ocean Parks can improve that much in a short space of time.

"They galloped him with some good horses and that is why they thought he had some ability, so we should be able to have a bit of fun with him."

Inglis Ready2Race Sale inspections to start

Inspections begin today at Riverside Stables for Inglis' Ready2Race Sale with the majority of the horses having now arrived at the complex. The action will begin at Warwick Farm racecourse at 10am where 12 horses will take part in an alternate breeze up session. Footage of the breezes will be on the Inglis website within 24 hours of taking place. Sunday morning will see the annual Veuve Clicquot Ready2Race Parade at Riverside from 11am, where a strong selection of the catalogue will be paraded for buyers. The parade will be live streamed onto the Inglis website for those unable to attend. Inspection days are today, tomorrow, Sunday and Monday, with the sale to begin at 10am Tuesday. 'Anthony Van Dyck ready to peak'

Anthony Van Dyck (Galileo) will become the first Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winner to race in Australia when he contests tomorrow's Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m), with stable representative T J Comerford confident the Aidan O'Brien-trained horse can overcome

a wide gate when he tackles the world's richest mile and a half handicap. "It's another obstacle for him but at the same time he's good enough. He's in great form and he looks good," Comerford said. "If he gets a reasonable run he'll be thereabouts. Hopefully Hugh Bowman gets a good run on him. He needs quick ground. I know rain is forecast but it's nothing like the rain at home." Anthony Van Dyck was well-beaten in the Hong Kong Vase (Gr 1, 2400m) the last time he travelled away from Europe, but Comerford said that the long season took its toll on the five-year-old, who also overraced in blinkers that day. "That was the end of a long year. This year we didn't start racing until June. I think he's peaking here," he said.

Moroney has confidence in Chapada

A tendon injury to Aktau (Teofilo) has left Mike Moroney with one runner in the Caulfield Cup, but the trainer is confident that Herbert Power Stakes (Gr 2, 2400m) winner Chapada (Bullet Train) can perform strongly on the quick back-up. The scratching of Mornington Cup (Listed, 2400m) victor Aktau means that the Kris Lees-trained Raheen House (Sea The Stars) will line up in the feature. However, Moroney believes that Chapada may be all he needs in the handicap. "You could argue he should have won the Victoria Derby and the Rosehill Guineas as a three-year-old as he had little luck when placed third in both races," Moroney said. "If he had won one of them, or both of them, he wouldn't be getting into a Caulfield Cup with such a light weight of 50.5 kilograms. I've always had confidence in him as he's a really nice horse. I think he's a winning chance. He came through the Herbert Power really well

and he's a natural mile-and-a-half horse. He's had a relaxing week and I haven't had to do any fast work with him. He's adaptable in a race. If they are going slow he can switch off and he's capable of making a forward move. If there isn't a lot of speed, Jye McNeil can go forward on him. He's ticked a lot of boxes going into a Caulfield Cup."

Moor earns Raheen House call-up

With Aktau scratched, his booked rider Daniel Moor will now be legged up aboard Raheen House. "It was disappointing to hear the news out this morning that Aktau had gone amiss," Moor said. "Obviously his last start was a bit lacklustre but the team was confident they had him going in the right direction and a good draw was to his favour, so it was a bit disappointing. But then I quickly spoke to connections with Australian Bloodstock and Kris Lees and I was really pleased they were happy to have me on, which is really good. He has been working well. It's the usual pump-up story, everyone says their horse is flying. But for an outside chance he is ticking over really well from all reports. Getting up to that distance is in his wheelhouse and any rain around enhances his chances. I'm currently doing a rain dance."

Waller unashamed fan of Everest

Chris Waller freely admits he didn't understand the lure of the \$15 million The Everest (1200m) in its first two seasons with his focus on champion mare Winx (Street Cry), but he now says that - having tasted success last year with Yes Yes Yes (Rubick) - he knew he had to be a part of the world's richest turf race again. "It was quite different. With those races, until you've been part of it, they don't register," Waller said. "That was the first year I've had runners in the race. We could see the race evolving and we said we need to change things around and make sure we get some runners. When Yes Yes Yes hit the front it was pretty surreal because I hadn't thought about the financial gain. I just never do that, believe it or not. You just come home disappointed. Obviously, the owners of the horse were rapt, the slot holders were rapt, the stud value on the horse, it was just such a big win and that's what these big races are." Waller saddles up Nature Strip (Nicconi) and Haut Brion Her (Zoustar), with the former looking to recapture his best after two fair runs this spring so far. "We've just got to make sure he's got his confidence up and is ready to go," Waller said. "We haven't panicked."

Eduardo in the zone

Joe Pride believes Eduardo (Host) is ready to run the race of his life in The Everest. After winning his first two starts for the stable, the seven-year-old finished second to Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt) in The Shorts (Gr 2, 1100m) but Pride is certain his horse didn't see the victor flashing down the outside. "I know he got beaten in The Shorts but I don't think Eduardo knew anything about that because he fought off all his challengers and the last bit that grey horse bloused him," Pride said. "He has just got this winning mentality." Eduardo will line up tomorrow off the back of an impressive recent barrier trial where he pulled six and a half lengths clear of the pack. "In his trial the other day, he wasn't content with beating those horses. He wanted to really rub their faces in it," Pride continued. "Even past the post he was like, 'woo hoo, look at me out here'. That's his personality. He just ups the tempo with everything you do. He is not content unless he's doing everything quickly. But he can back it up so that's alright."

Cloud over Kosciuszko favourite It's Me

It's Me (Shamus Award), the short-priced favourite for tomorrow's \$1.3 million The Kosciuszko (1200m), will need to pass a veterinary examination before she is cleared to take her place. The mare's trainer Brett Cavanough advised Racing NSW stewards she was scoped on Wednesday afternoon after developing a cough following a swim in the equine pool. The endoscopic test showed up mild levels of mucus and It's Me was immediately treated with antibiotics. She also underwent a blood test which returned normal results. Cavanough advised stewards It's Me had not missed any training and the unbeaten four-year-old will be scoped again today to check how she has responded to treatment. The results of the endoscope will be sent to Racing NSW stewards and vets, who will decide if she is fit to contest the Randwick contest.

Beer Redoubling to Randwick

It took a long-range plan to come to fruition for Mitchell Beer to get a Kosciuszko runner and he couldn't be happier with how Redouble (Redoute's Choice) has prepared for the \$1.3 million race. Since moving to Albury from Victoria, Beer has had three main goals in mind - to win a Highway Handicap, compete in the Country Championships and have a Kosciuszko chance. He achieved the first goal when Princess Cordelia (Bel Esprit) won a Randwick Highway earlier this year. Sky Call (Domesday) ran a credible ninth, beaten just over two lengths, in the Country Championships Final (1400m) in April, and now Redouble has a live hope in tomorrow's Kosciuszko. "Earlier in the year we got a group together and I got in touch with the owners to try to purchase Redouble specifically to target this race," Beer said. "We didn't get that across the line, but luckily that weekend Princess Cordelia won a Highway and an arrangement was made the following Monday to send him to me with this race in mind. Everything has gone to plan since he's arrived. There hasn't been one day where I was worried or nervous and both his trials have been really good."

St Leger Ideal for Baker's mare

She's Ideal (Dundeel) will be on trial for a Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) campaign when she takes on a seasoned field of stayers in the ATC St Leger Stakes (2600m) at Randwick tomorrow. The five-year-old will back up having won over 2000 metres last Saturday with her trainer Bjorn Baker reporting her to be in top shape. "Her win last week was remarkable with the interference she got at about the 700 all the way to the 400. I thought it was a really big win under the circumstances," Baker said. "She looks to have come through well, she gets in with no weight, Rachel King is on. She has only had one run over the 2400 and she won that day. I think 2600 will really suit her." If the lightly-raced mare can prove her credentials at Randwick, Baker confirmed it would open the door to a Sydney Cup campaign. "That would be the first plan of attack, to look at a race like the Sydney Cup in the autumn," he added.

Golden Eagle possible for Just Thinkin'

A bold show from Just Thinkin' (So You Think) in tomorrow's Spring Mile (1600m) at Randwick could see the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained four-year-old join stablemates Dawn Passage (Dawn Approach) and Riodini (Proisir) in the \$7.5 million Golden Eagle (1500m) on October 31. The three-time winner disappointed when contesting the Hill Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) on his most recent start but Bott is hoping he can bounce back to his best tomorrow. "I don't know if it was a combination of being thrown in the deep end under the weight-for-age conditions and the class probably just finding him out," Bott told racingnsw.com. "Or whether he's a genuine 2000-metre horse just yet. He gave us the indication he was looking for it so we wanted to test him. It might be those factors combined led to a below par performance or he just didn't race up to his best. Back to the mile, blinkers on, we're trying to freshen him up a bit and try to get him back racing to his best. If he's sharp enough over a mile we'd like to see him progress to the Golden Eagle."

Awesome Pluck makes Qld home

A year on from finishing eleventh in The Kosciuszko, Awesome Pluck (Pluck) will make his latest return to action on the same day when he contests the Lexus Handicap (1200m) at Doomben. Now trained at Eagle Farm by Desleigh Forster, Awesome Pluck pleased new connections in a 1000-metre barrier trial at Doomben on October 6 when he finished third to the Tony Gollan-trained Niedorp (Not A Single Doubt) when ridden by Leanne Henry. "Leanne never let him go in the trial but from what he's shown me at home there's no doubt what sort of horse he is," Forster said. "He's a really good horse and I'm probably lucky to get him. I train a few horses for his owner, Dale Miller, and I was fortunate to be the one to get this horse because he could've given him to any number of trainers. He's still only a class four horse, keep in mind, so we've got options with him. I've only given him the one trial but he's done plenty of work at home and we'll just assess him after Saturday to see where we head with him."

Aqua Vite to continue Morrissey's Doomben form

Scott Morrissey is confident Aqua Vite (Northern Meteor) can bounce back from his last start ninth at Eagle Farm when the eight-year-old returns to Doomben tomorrow to contest an open handicap over 1600 metres. "He led as expected last time but I think he got away from me and put on a bit of weight after his previous run when he finished third at the Gold Coast," Morrissey told racingqueensland.com. "He's getting older now and I think he also felt the track a bit that day. He'll go a lot better this Saturday after I gave him a good hit out on Tuesday. It's also about riding him right so I'm expecting him to roll along in front and he'll be better suited over 1600 metres."

Jollys get behind SA spring series

Father-and-daughter training combination Richard and Chantelle Jolly prepared Schilldora (Artie Schiller) to win the inaugural Rebel Raider Series (1200m) final in 2018 and the duo have given their backing to this year's TAB Spring Bonanza initiative ahead of the first of seven \$100,000 finals. "I think it's a pretty popular initiative, not just for this Saturday's race, but the whole lot of the series," Richard Jolly told trsa.com. "It gives our horses over here a chance to win a decent race. There's a carrot at the end of it, with decent prize-money for horses that wouldn't normally run for that kind of money, so it's a good incentive."

Cup Night to overcome wide draw

Bernie Miller believes a wide barrier draw will not prove to be too much of an inconvenience to Cup Night (Maschino) when the five-year-old chases his ninth career win in tomorrow's Northerly Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Ascot. "I would prefer a wide barrier than barrier one," Miller told The Races WA. "It's not the end of the world where he is to be honest. I won't be giving any instructions to Pat (Carbery, jockey), I will be leaving it up to him, but I imagine he will go back. If he does have to come from behind, I think he has the ability with luck in running to run over the top of them."

Glenfiddich still a chance for Coolmore

Peter Moody remains hopeful that he can salvage something from the spring with Stutt Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) winner Glenfiddich (Fastnet Rock), with the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) still a possibility following a throat operation which ruled him out of the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m). "We are hoping. The horse has come through its procedure well, he is in great shape," Moody said. "He had his first morning back doing a little bit of work at the farm this morning after the vets inspected him yesterday. At this very early stage we are very happy with him and we will just play it by ear for the next week or ten days. He will do a little bit of fast work maybe in the latter part of next week and that will tell us whether we are kidding ourselves or not. But at this point in time it's very positive heading towards the Coolmore."

Sir Dragonet impresses Maher

Ciaran Maher is satisfied with how Sir Dragonet (Camelot) has settled into life at Werribee as he prepares to tackle both the Cox Plate and the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m). "He is an exciting horse. He has great European form," Maher said. "He has traveled well, he has come with a good fitness base on him. He has done a couple of little pieces of work on the grass. James Winks is doing the trackwork on him, which is great, he has got a lot of knowledge and a really good horseman. He's very happy with him. He did a piece of work on Tuesday over about seven furlongs and just rolled up the last couple in about 25 (seconds). He's very upbeat about him. We will get him out to The Valley to have a look around there Saturday and maybe get on Tuesday. One of those days we will do a little piece of work with him, a little bit more serious. I couldn't be happier with him, he has a clean set of lungs."

Allen booked to ride Mugatoo

Allen, who rides Avilius (Pivotal) for Godolphin in the Caulfield Cup and Santiago (Authorized) for Coolmore in the Melbourne Cup, will take his first ride on the Australian Bloodstock-owned Mugatoo, with the four-time stakes winner's regular jockey Kerrin McEvoy instead aboard Probabeel (Savabeel).

Avenue Of Pleasure tops Inglis Digital sale

Avenue Of Pleasure (I Am Invincible), a granddaughter of Carry On Cutie (More Than Ready) has topped this week's Inglis Digital October (Early) Online Sale at \$205,000, purchased by successful Victorian owner Gary Lechte. The three-year-old filly was one of five lots that sold for \$100,000 or more, bringing the Inglis Digital six-figure tally to 74 lots since 2018. The October (Early) Sale concluded with a gross of more than \$2.34 million, a clearance rate of 84 per cent and an average of \$16,100, the highest so far this year. Lechte purchased three of the top five lots, buying out fellow owners in Exeter (Fastnet Rock) for \$110,000 and Pulitzer Prize (Fastnet Rock) for \$100,000. Those horses, along with the second top lot Surooj (Sebring), were all offered by Lindsay Park Racing (as agent). "They're all great results for our owners," Lindsay Park Racing's Dom Rhoden said. "Surooj, for example, was owned by Shadwell and has form at Group 2 level as a two-year-old and she's now sold for \$140,000 to Scone trainer Mark Schmetzer and I'm sure will be very competitive for her new connections. We offered nine horses in this October catalogue - and collectively they've sold for almost \$650,000 - it's just unreal how strong this online market is." A 36 per cent share in New Zealand Group 1 winner Callsign Mav (Atlante) was purchased by Nelson Thoroughbreds for \$85,000. "A group that are already part-owners in the horse, got together to buy out my share," Jeremy Cross said. "I'm over the moon with the result."

Haut Brion Her's half-sister for sale

Lady Millions (Charge Forward), a half-sister to Group 2 winner and Everest candidate

Haut Brion Her (Zoustar), is being offered for private sale by agent Brett Howard of Randwick Bloodstock. The unraced 11-year-old mare, who is due to foal to Star Turn (Star Witness) this month, is already the dam of the stakes-placed Malahide (Shamus Award), a Michael Costa-trained mare with winning two-year old form. She is being aimed at the 2021 \$1 million Magic Millions Fillies and Mares Handicap (1300m) at the Gold Coast. Lady Millions is being offered for sale by Howard Blight who has a yearling filly by Deep Field (Northern Meteor) out of the mare. Lady Millions is currently located in the Hunter Valley and available for inspection.

Newitt hit with ban

Craig Newitt will miss the Cox Plate Carnival after receiving an eight-meeting ban for careless riding at Caulfield on Wednesday. Newitt pleaded guilty following his ride on the unplaced Al Passem (Al Maher) in the Village Stakes (Listed, 1200m). His suspension will start at midnight on October 19 and finish at midnight on October 26.

Tayla Childs out of action

Apprentice Tayla Childs is facing a stint on the sidelines after discovering she had suffered a broken ankle in an incident at Kyneton on Tuesday. Having initially thought it was just a sprain, Childs rode two second-place finishes on the card before learning the full extent of her injury yesterday. She will require surgery on her ankle.

Doomben meeting moved to Eagle Farm

Racing Queensland yesterday announced that the Brisbane Racing Club race meeting on Wednesday December 16 will be run at Eagle Farm as opposed to Doomben. Accordingly, there has been distance changes made to some of the races on the program. The Benchmark 75 handicap, which was to be run over 2000 metres, is now a 2100-metre race, the Class 5 handicap has been upped 50 metres to 1400m, while both the Class 3 Handicap and maiden handicap drop 50 metres to 1000 metres. The remainder of the program for the meeting remains unchanged.

Vale Anthony Hodder

Former NSW trackwork rider Anthony Hodder has died, aged 56. Hodder, who was born in Cowra, died recently at Orange Hospital. "Tony was a real larrikin and was one of the best work riders I've seen - he had a clock in his head," said former trainer Bill Molloy. "He worked for Kerry Walker and my son Andrew and also trainer Greg Mance. He regularly rode Caulfield Cup winner Cole Diesel in his work and Tony lived for fishing." Her work was outstanding this morning (Thursday). If they couldn't beat her last time, they won't get close to her this week. That's just how confident I am going into Saturday."

Rain hits Hastings

Track conditions at Hastings were rated a Slow 8 yesterday ahead of the final day of the Hawke's Bay Spring Carnival following heavy rainfall

during the week. "We had 10.5 millimetres on Tuesday and then we had 14 millimetres on Wednesday night," Hawke's Bay track manager Richard Fenwick said. "It has helped the farmers out but hasn't helped me out. They are talking rain or showers up until Friday morning, which isn't ideal. It is meant to fine up tomorrow and then on Saturday."

Miss Aotearoa out of 1000 Guineas

The Jamie Richards-trained Miss Aotearoa (Per Incanto) will miss the New Zealand 1000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) having suffered a setback which will require minor surgery. A classy last start winner of the Hawke's Bay Breeders' Gold Trail Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) on the first day of the Hastings Spring Carnival, Miss Aotearoa has won both of her starts as a three-year-old, resulting in her being installed as favourite for the November 14 contest.

Ashburton to cap off busy period for Pitman

Matthew Pitman will cap off a whirlwind week when he sends a ten-strong team to Ashburton on Sunday. The trainer has this week moved home and seen the birth of his second child, all while trying to manage his string. "When it rains it pours. It's been a busy time, but the family is all really excited," Pitman said yesterday. "The team is racing well at the moment and I think we can be pretty competitive all day long." That team will be headlined by last-start winner Watchmaker (Pins) who will jump from barrier seven in the Barneswood Farm Stakes 3YO (Gr 3, 1400m). "It's exciting to see if Watchmaker can go on from what he did the other day where he was pretty impressive," Pitman said. "We have always known he is capable of doing that. He has been screaming out for 1400 metres and even a mile."

Go Racing double at Tauranga

Stephen McKee brought up a winning double for syndicators Go Racing at Tauranga on Wednesday with Lord Ardmore (Reliable Man) and Savappiel (Savabeel). Under a positive ride from Sam Spratt, Lord Ardmore travelled in a handy position in the 1400-metre contest before letting down in the straight to win by a

neck. McKee said the three-year-old benefited from a step up in distance and he was pleased with the effort. "It was good to see him progress from his first up run," McKee said. "I thought he was unlucky not to run second last start. The step up to 1400m helped and he finished strongly against some older horses." Later in the day Savappiel delivered a brave effort to win the Tauranga Event Centre Venue Hire 1600 under a front-running Sam Spratt ride. "She was good," McKee continued. "She had a bit of space between her runs because of track conditions and it was a good progression. It wasn't the plan to lead but she did well and was challenged down the straight and finished strongly. We don't have any set plans for her but she will probably stay in rating 65 company in a few weeks' time."

Williams named NZTBA Personality of the Year

Rick Williams was yesterday named as the Personality of the Year and Julian Corban the Mary Lynne Ryan Young Achiever when the last of the Ebbett VW New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Association National Breeding Awards were announced. World record for digital platform as Spanish sells

Three-time Group 2 winner Spanish Whisper (Lope De Vega) yesterday became the highest-priced thoroughbred to ever sell through a digital-only platform when her breeders Daniel Nakhle and Darren Brady fought off significant international interest to buy out their fellow shareholders for AUD\$1,202,500 through Gavelhouse Plus.

"We've bred and raced her, fallen in love with her and I have a big grin on my face from having been able to secure her tonight," Nakhle said.

"We looked around the international market for mares with similar credentials and at the price I think we've got great value.

"Darren and I have invested heavily in the family with an outstanding half-sister by Savabeel on the ground and her dam going back to Savabeel, we now just need to do some homework and choose a stallion in Australia for her to visit before she comes home to New Zealand."

Nakhle and Brady raced Spanish Whisper in New Zealand as a two-year-old, with the filly winning the Matamata Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) and placing in the Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m).

Joined in the ownership by Darren Thomas under his Seymour Bloodstock banner, the filly crossed the Tasman and joined the Lindsay Park Racing team of David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig.

Placing behind Group 1 winner Mystic Journey (Needs Further) in her first preparation in Melbourne, she returned strongly to take the Kewney Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) as a late three-year-old.

The Flemington 1400 metres was where she would again strike success as a four-year-old, taking the Let's Elope Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) in September last year. She retired last month as the winner of four of her 23 starts, earning AUD\$469,213.

"We have really enjoyed racing her with Darren and the Lindsay Park team and now share in the ownership of others with them so we can still look forward to cheering on runners in the Seymour Bloodstock colours," Nakhle said.

"I know it's a lot of money but I honestly think she is better bought than sold at that, I hope the boys consider my favourite Danehill line horse Merchant Navy as a potential mate," commented Thomas.

"I reckon Pilko [Mark Pilkington] and I would be stitched on buyers of the resultant progeny if offered in the 2023 Karaka Sale."

The Spanish Whisper price tag eclipsed the previous record of NZ\$670,000 (AUD\$625,000) set by New Zealand 1000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) heroine Hasahalo (Savabeel) through the same platform in March, while it was also bigger than the \$1.14 million reserve on Pan Sutong-owned mare Spinning Memories (Arcano) through the Magic Millions digital platform earlier this year; she was passed in for \$1.135 million.

A 25 per cent share of Ebor Handicap (1m 6f) winner Mustajeer (Medicean) was sold for AUD\$320,000 through Inglis Digital in October last year, placing a value of \$1.28 million on the eight-year-old, who contests tomorrow's Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m).

However, in terms of full ownership, Spanish Whisper now sets the bar globally.

"The feedback on her as a type was very bullish and she was easy to recommend so it was no surprise to have clients bidding from Australia, Hong Kong, Japan and Europe as well as New Zealand," gavelhouse.com general manager Haylie Martin said.

"This was certainly the fairest approach in terms of transitioning the ownership from the racing into the breeding phase of her career and obviously the safest with her being able to stay in the paddock at Newhaven Park."

Spanish Whisper hails from the family of Group 1 performer Glowlamp (Encosta De Lago) and honest stayer Offenbach (Danehill), as well as Europe's 2002 Horse of the Year Rock Of Gibraltar (Danehill).

Starspangledbanner colt brings 360,000gns as buoyant Book 2 draws to a close

Any amount of anxiety would have been perfectly understandable ahead of Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, but in the event it would have been almost entirely unwarranted.

The three-day auction produced a trio of sessions that can only have surpassed the expectations of even the most optimistic out there, with the year-on-year declines in evidence across the key market metrics nothing like as dramatic as might have been feared.

Turnover closed at 48,362,500gns (approx. AUD\$93 million) - just 136,000gns shy of the record total in 2019, while the average was down just three per cent to 75,920gns (approx. AUD\$146,250) as the median hit 50,000gns (approx. AUD\$96,250), down ten per cent on the 55,500gns returned last year.

The clearance rate was identical to 12 months ago at 85 per cent as 637 of 747 offered yearlings found a buyer.

Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony hailed the "remarkable resilience" of the markets seen across Books 1 and 2 of the October Yearling Sale. He said: "At the conclusion of Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale last week we expressed our sincere thanks to all those who contributed to a yearling sale which, although conducted amidst a backdrop

of global turmoil, performed with remarkable resilience.

"The message at the conclusion of Book 2 of the October Yearling Sale is very similar. We are enormously grateful to every single participant over the past three days, not only for their individual contributions to a sale which has held up remarkably well under the circumstances, but for working with us every step of the way in our efforts to stage the sale in as safe an environment as possible.

"The Covid pandemic continues to wreak havoc in all walks of life and to have conducted nine sales here at Park Paddocks since the last week of June is a mighty achievement by all concerned and could not have happened without a huge collective effort."

The top lots from all three sessions of Book 2 are set to carry the Godolphin blue after Sheikh Mohammed's chief talent scout Anthony Stroud went to 360,000gns (approx. AUD\$692,750)

for the Starspangledbanner (Choisir) colt out of Violet's Gift (Cadeaux Genereux) consigned by Ballyhimikin Stud late on Wednesday.

"I thought he was an outstanding individual and looks like a very fast horse," said Stroud.

"Starspangledbanner has done very well and he comes from a very good farm."

The colt, a half-brother to the Listed-placed Kodiak West (Kodiac), joins the 400,000gns Kingman (Invincible Spirit) colt from Norelands Stud secured on day one and the 675,000gns Lope De Vega (Shamardal) colt who topped Book 2 after changing hands on Tuesday.

Stroud Coleman Bloodstock secured 29 yearlings for an outlay of 5,420,000gns (approx. AUD\$10.81 million), and Stroud went on to reflect on three days of vibrant trade at Park Paddocks.

"It's great the sale has gone so well," said Stroud. "There's been some very nice horses and there's been a very good vibe with lots of different buyers active. It's been fantastic and I think Tattersalls have done a great job."

Stroud's most notable purchases were made on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin operation, while Shadwell also spent 5,327,000gns (approx. AUD\$10.63 million) on 36 yearlings. The agent summed up the views of many within the industry when he expressed his gratitude for the Maktoum family's ongoing support.

"I think all of us are eternally grateful for everything the Maktoum family do, not only in

the sales rings but across the whole bloodstock industry," said Stroud. "They've really shown their true mettle when times are challenging in a way that none of us have ever experienced before.

"For them to come and support the sales and support peoples' livelihoods, I think Sheikh Mohammed and Sheikh Hamdan are the most amazing people. This year we've needed them more than ever because of the current situation. You can't underestimate how much they've done for the industry."

Crisford secures Churchill filly

A filly from the debut crop of Coolmore's Churchill (Galileo) led the market for much of the session after Simon Crisford, acting for MV Magnier, went to 340,000gns (approx. AUD\$654,250) for a well-related filly from Croom House Stud.

The March foal is out of the Grade 3-placed Pussycat Lips (Holy Roman Emperor), dam of two winners, namely Dick Poole Stakes (Gr 3, 6f) third Special Purpose (Scat Daddy) and the Listed-placed Roulston Scar (Lope De Vega), who is in training with Crisford and his son Ed.

"She's a lovely racy, active filly and MV Magnier loved her and suggested we should buy her," said Crisford.

"I've got the half-brother, Roulston Scar, so there was a connection there already as well. She showed herself off so well and she comes from a fabulous farm so it's very exciting."

Churchill's most expensive progeny to date is the filly out of Date With Destiny (George Washington), who went the way of Stroud Coleman at 350,000gns on day one of Book 2.

His debut yearlings were also in high demand during Book 1, with 13 lots generating an average of 123,615gns off a €35,000 covering fee.

One more for MV

Magnier's name also appeared on the docket of the Mastercraftsman (Danehill Dancer) filly out of Simkana (Kalanisi) offered by Parkway Farm, with Cormac McCormack responsible for striking the winning bid of 325,000gns (approx. AUD\$625,000) on the Coolmore man's behalf.

The dam, a half-sister to the brilliant

Sinndar (Grand Lodge), has already clicked with Mastercraftsman through Simannka, a Listed-placed homebred of the Aga Khan's.

Denis McDonnell of Parkway Farm said: "I bought Simkana [for €57,000] out of the Aga Khan's after she had foaled Simannka - this is a nicer filly than Simannka though. Simannka was bought by Paul Makin for €200,000 and was shipped to Australia - she was supposed to be a Group filly but unfortunately Paul Makin died and she never ran."

Juddmonte seeing double

It did not take long for big sums to be spent on Wednesday as Juddmonte's Simon Mockridge went to 310,000gns (approx. AUD\$596,500) for an Oasis Dream (Green Desert) colt offered by Newsells Park Stud during the session's opening exchanges.

Oasis Dream carried the Khalid Abdullah silks to victory in three Group 1s, namely the Middle Park Stakes (6f), the July Cup (6f) and the Nunthorpe (5f), and has since spent 17 seasons on the Banstead Manor Stud stallion roster, from where he has sired 17 elite-level winners.

When asked what had caught the attention of the Juddmonte buying team, Mockridge said the colt, who is out of a daughter of Zamindar (Gone West) and Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) heroine Pure Grain (Polish Precedent), boasted a striking similarity to his sire.

"To put it bluntly, he's the spitting image of Oasis Dream at this stage," said Mockridge. "He's a great walker and bred on the same lines as Kingman so he was an obvious one for us. I hope he'll be a good horse, he's certainly bred to be."

Mockridge also reflected on a successful October Yearling Sale for Banstead Manor resident Kingman, who supplied two seven-figure lots during Book 1, including the 2,700,000gns half-brother to Galileo Gold (Paco Boy) bought by Oliver St Lawrence.

"Kingman has had an extraordinary sale, but then he's an extraordinary horse," said Mockridge. "Physically he stamps his stock very well and his progeny obviously meet the commercial market so we're delighted. He's had another fantastic year on the track too, of course."

Another big result for Cregg Stud

AUD\$577,500) for the Kodiak (Danehill) colt out of Supreme Occasion (Teofilo) on Wednesday.

Supreme Occasion, a half-sister to the Group 3 scorer Decado (Danehill Dancer), won two races while in training with David O'Meara. Further back this is the family of La Collina (Strategic Prince) and Fox Chairman (Kingman).

"A lot of work went into these horses but I was hopeful as they were my two bankers," said a delighted John Noonan, whose son Denis led up the youngsters. "I wish Godolphin a lot of luck with the Kodiak, he's a lovely colt. I bred the dam, Supreme Occasion, then leased her and I bred the granddam, Pirie, too. Supreme Occasion is back in foal to Invincible Army."

Coleman catches his Breath

International participation has been central to the strength of trade seen at Book 2, with the likes of Peter Brant's White Birch Farm and the Hong Kong Jockey Club featuring among the sale's top spenders.

More Hong Kong money poured into the market when Matt Coleman of Stroud Coleman Bloodstock went to 280,000gns (approx. AUD\$583,850) for the Bated Breath (Dansili) colt out of Shy Audience (Sir Prancealot) offered by Redpender Stud.

"We bought him for John Size in Hong Kong," said Coleman. "We thought he was a fast-looking

colt with a great attitude. He's a big, strong, great-moving horse and we knew he'd be expensive as he's such a good model. He'll be pre-trained here and then head out to Hong Kong."

The colt's dam has bred one winner from as many runners, with the two-year-old colt Harold Shand (Acclamation) having struck for Richard Spencer. The mare, an unraced daughter of Sir Prancealot (Tamayuz), is a half-

sister to the likes of Toormore (Arakan) and Estidhkaar (Dark Angel).

Coleman expanded on the types he was after for Hong Kong, saying: "We're trying to buy horses with good physicality, by proven sires and who can go on quick ground. Bated Breath is a proven horse, his stock act well on fast ground and the Dansili line works well out in Hong Kong."

'Extraordinary and unique'

In his end-of-sale chairman's statement, Edmond Mahony said: "Newmarket is very much the hub of the European racing and breeding industries and the last few weeks have demonstrated that, despite all the obstacles, business has been able to continue, albeit at lower levels than in recent years.

"Newmarket has an extraordinary and unique infrastructure and never more has this been apparent than at Books 1 and 2 of the 2020 Tattersalls October Yearling Sales.

"Book 2 has without doubt benefitted from the momentum established at Book 1 and similar to last week, the buyers have consistently remarked on the quality of the stock being offered. "Participation from throughout the Gulf region continues to be hugely influential and the sustained involvement from American, Australian and Hong Kong interests has also been notable alongside determined domestic involvement. Tomorrow we move on to Book 3 of the October Yearling Sale which is another Tattersalls yearling sale that consistently attracts buyers at all levels of the market and we will conclude the 2020 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale on Saturday with Book 4."

Chau shines at Happy Valley with first Hong Kong treble

Apprentice Jerry Chau sealed his first Hong Kong treble at Happy Valley on Wednesday night when the Tony Cruz-trained Buddies (So You Think) took the finale, the Class 2 High West Handicap (1650m).

"It feels like a dream – it's amazing, everything went to plan, it's just unbelievable," the 20-year-old said.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club Apprentice Jockeys' School product returned to Hong Kong from Australia at the back-end of last season and is indentured to second-season trainer Douglas Whyte, best known as Hong Kong's iconic 13-time champion jockey.

"He's got a lot of people behind him and I think that he's showing everybody, including himself, that with the help and the support, he can be a very competitive rider in Hong Kong," Whyte said.

Chau has returned seven wins from the first 12 race meetings this term, including his maiden treble, but sits out the next two meetings due to suspension.

"I have a break coming up but after that I'll just keep working hard. I won't sleep very well tonight though, I start work tomorrow at 4am to work five horses," Chau said.

Whyte, Hong Kong's winning-most jockey with 1,813 wins and an all-time prize money record of more than HK\$1.5 billion (approx. AUD\$271.2 million), praised his apprentice for the performance.

"He's got lovely balance," Whyte said. "He's got a lovely seat on a horse, he still needs to fine tune his start to the straight, his positioning and relaxing a horse and staying out of trouble, but he's got a lovely style about him and the most important thing is that his horses run for him – if a horse runs for you that's where it all starts."

"I have been helping him, but it's not just me it's the whole force behind him: Felix Coetzee does an amazing job with the apprentices,

and so does Amy Chan – he has a good group behind him."

Chau's treble included two wins for the Cruz stable. The first of those came aboard Bullish Brother (Reward For Effort) in section two of the Class 4 Mount Kellett Handicap (1200m), before Buddies added the extra gloss to the rider's night.

"Bullish Brother was really tough, I knew in the last 200 metres though that he could pass the leader, so I just kept his momentum and he did well," Chau said.

Chau kicked off his three-timer with victory aboard the David Hall-trained Sumstreetsumwhere (Highly Recommended) in the Class 4 Victoria Gap Handicap (1650m).

The 10-pound claimer's other two mounts on the card finished second and third.

Back-to-back for Tashidelek

Whyte was not to be completely outshone by his apprentice: the legendary jockey-turned-trainer ensured he didn't go home empty handed when Tashidelek (Street Cry) took the Class 3 Mount Davis Handicap (1800m) under Alexis Badel.

"He's done a great job – I've only had him for two starts and he's won both of them so if he can make his way to Class 2 then he's done a great job," Whyte said.

The gelding joined Whyte's stable in the off-season from the stable of the recently retired John Moore, and has won both of his starts for his new yard.

"He stepped into my yard and he hasn't put a foot wrong," Whyte noted. "He's been a pleasure to train and he's probably one of the favourite horses in the yard, not because he's won but because of his whole attitude – he's a beautiful horse to be around and he's a lovely horse to be a part of and be associated with."

French ace Badel sent the gelding forward from gate 10 to sit outside the lead, before taking over at the 300-metre mark to record a half-length victory.

"He's a nice horse – he's going well," Badel said. "The slow tempo with a wide gate was a big advantage for him because I was able to travel easily enough on the bit and didn't have to use too much energy to get him to travel – it was a great effort."

Tough win for Ted

Karis Teetan returned from a two-meeting suspension with a tough, on-pace victory aboard Here Comes Ted (Per Incanto) for trainer David Ferraris in the first section of the Class 4 Mount Kellett Handicap (1200m).

The New Zealand-bred rolled forward under the Mauritian ace from the wide draw but was caught three-wide early on as Chau kicked up to sit inside of him aboard Sprint Forward (Lope De Vega).

Teetan though, kept his cool and chose to roll forward and take the lead at the 650-metre mark, but the apprentice was not done and the gallopers vied neck-and-neck in the straight, with Teetan's mount prevailing by a neck.

"I came out and I didn't want to lead and I was forced to keep moving but I think it worked out well: when those horses came to challenge me, he kicked well," Teetan said.

The four-year-old takes his record to two wins from 13 starts in Hong Kong, both wins coming at the city circuit under Teetan.

"He was drawn in gate 11, we tried to push forward but the young apprentice just kept him wide," Ferraris said. "He had no choice but to go forward otherwise he would have been three-deep. It was the right choice in hindsight – the best choice and he won a very good race."

The bay took ten starts to get his first win, but now has two successes from his last four runs, including two other top three finishes.

"He's very courageous, this horse. He's a very nice little horse and he won't stop here – he'll carry on and win a few more," Ferraris said.

Joao Moreira also returned from a two-meeting suspension with a win and did so aboard the John Size-trained Wild West Wing (Exceed And Excel) in the Class 4 Mount Gough Handicap (1000m).

Matthew Poon and Francis Lui combined in the Class 3 Lung Fu Shan Handicap (1200m) with Le Terroir (Star Witness), who secured his fifth Hong Kong win.

"The horse had a good draw and he hit his straps last start and I think today he just

got every benefit, but thanks to Francis Lui for giving me the ride," Poon said.

The gelding was grabbing his first win for his new handler and did so with the addition of the tongue tie for the first time.

Derek Leung and Dennis Yip combined in the opener with Fantastic Fabio (Hidden Dragon), who grabbed his sixth career win, scoring in the Class 5 Wan Chai Gap Handicap (1200m).

Hong Kong racing continues on Sunday at Sha Tin with two Group 2 contests, the Sha Tin Trophy (Gr 2, 1600m) and the Premier Bowl (Gr 2, 1200m).

length and a quarter with a head to Naples (Street Boss) in third, impressing her rider Mark Zahra.

"I've had a bit to do with her and ridden her in both of her jump-outs. Ciaron's stable is great at getting two-year-olds to the races early in the season and she is a fine example," he said.

"She was quickly out and when she kicked she gave nothing else a chance. She has showed speed and she's beautiful. She sat in the gates and never turned a hair in the gates and was very professional."

Bred by Segenhoe Thoroughbreds, Fake Love is the third named foal - and the first winner - out of dual Listed winner Anatina (Fastnet Rock), who was narrowly beaten in the 2014 The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) by Tiger Tees (Dubawi).

She was sold to Oakmont, the outfit of Colt Pike and Hannah Mathiesen, at the 2019 Magic Millions National Weanling Sale for \$380,000, and while she was offered at this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, she was passed in for \$425,000 off a reserve of \$450,000.

Anatina has a Hellbent (I Am Invincible) yearling colt, while she missed to both So You Think (High Chaparral) and Deep Field (Northern Meteor) last year. She is a half-sister to another Listed winner in Pricked (Thorn Park), as well as Quack It (Ustinov), the dam of Villiers Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) hero Quackerjack (Not A Single Doubt).

Third dam Mother Duck (Luskin Star) won the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) in 1986 and was

placed in the inaugural Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) behind Snippets (Lunchtime).

The Magic Millions 2YO Classic is likely to be the aim for her descendant Fake Love, with the stable aiming to take back-to-back victories in the juvenile feature after Away Game (Snitzel) - who is also raced by Mathiesen - took victory last year.

In fact, Maher drew favourable comparisons between the two fillies.

"She'll be targeted towards the Magic Millions Classic now. She's got a bit of black-type and hopefully she can follow in the same steps," Maher said.

"Away Game, she was very durable. This horse is probably of a similar shape, but probably a little bit stronger even. You never know, hopefully she's a little bit better.

"To think Hannah came down here and worked for us for six months and found Away Game and then to find another one the very next year. It's great for David Gillies too, it is one of his first horses in the stable and had his colours on."

The Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) has been won by subsequent Group 1 winners like Qafila (Not A Single Doubt), Meurice (Strategic) and Testa Rossa (Perugino) on debut, and trainers Ciaron Maher and David Eustace hope that Fake Love (2 f I Am Invincible - Anatina by Fastnet Rock) will be able to join their ranks after her impressive victory at her first start on Saturday.

Backed into \$5 equal favourite, Fake Love showed plenty of professionalism, scooting along on the lead to defeat Extreme Warrior



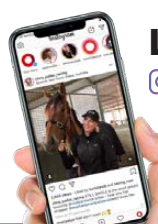

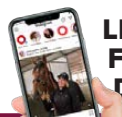
