New Zealand Bloodstock prepares for its first major sale since pandemic struck

endors are in uncharted territory ahead of the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale as they attempt to navigate the two-day auction without many of the familiar faces who often underpin the market being at the Karaka complex.

Inspections ramped up yesterday as the reliance on New Zealand bloodstock agents

and their international contacts to help achieve reasonable trading of the 311 lots became apparent for consignors who say they remain optimistic, albeit realistic, about healthy buyer competition taking place from tomorrow.

Prima Park's Kelly Van Dyk said a number of inquiries, including from those potential buyers who are unable to attend Karaka this year, had been more frequent than she expected.

<< Continued from page 1 "We've been pretty busy today and actually pleasantly surprised, but who knows what will happen, being the first New Zealand sale since the world was tipped upside down," Van Dyk said yesterday.

"One very pleasing thing is the number of calls and texts from offshore asking our opinion of many of our lots and that is on top of all the great information available.

"So, we are very hopeful. We have done our best and we will see what happens on Wednesday."

Ohukia Lodge's Jamie Beatson echoed Van Dyk's comments in regards to inspection numbers and interest in the lead-up to the sale.

"We have been quite busy since we yesterday. arrived Busier than expected. It has been very steady," he said.

"We had a lot of phone calls after the breeze ups, mainly from Australia, so that is positive. Interest is good.

"The middle market could be tough, but as always the top lots look after themselves."

Waikato Bloodstock's Ginger Tankard backed up many opinions in saying the sale would be "a guessing game and no one knows" how it will pan out.

"The top 20 per cent stand out and many of these we saw as yearlings," Tankard said.

"We have seen some really nice two-year-olds, though. In fact, we are spoilt for choice.

"With so many top judges, you aren't going to steal one. We have also gone to trials and have seen some as many as three or four times."

Last year's sale averaged NZ\$88,866, with a median of NZ\$55,000 and a clearance rate of 78 per cent.

Unsurprisingly, Australia was the biggest segment of the market, with 93 horses sold for a total of NZ\$8.779 million at an average of NZ\$94,398, while Hong Kong bought 33 lots (average NZ\$143,788).

Singapore's spend was down dramatically last year, with 16 twoyear-olds bought for the Asia jurisdiction, well down on the 41 bought the previous year. That trend has continued at the two Australian sales in recent weeks.

Westbury Stud's Russell Warwick encouraged New Zealand owners and trainers, who last year bought 94 horses at an average of NZ\$79,782, to make the most of this week's auction. Continued on page 4>>

<< Continued from page 2 "The sale is going to be very much in the hands of the vendors but if any sale is to succeed using the online, digital platform, this is the one," Warwick said.

"Buyers have so much information now, so being here physically might not be so important.

"The sale has a great history of success so there is good reason for buyers to be confident in their purchases, even when buying online.

"The other thing is that this sale presents a great opportunity for local trainers and buyers to get some really nice horses without having to compete against overseas dollars."

Phoenix Park's Janine Dunlop suggested the standard of horses on offer was above average but whether that translated into sale results, she was unsure.

"How is the sale going to go? That's the million dollar question," Dunlop queried.

"Our activity has been good and the agents appear to have done their homework. One of the things about the sale is that for two-year-olds to get here they have had to pass all sorts of tests.

"Those in the sale at this point are all pretty good, that's why they are here. As always, the top

ones stand out but I have stressed to my clients that meeting the market is paramount. I stress that at every sale."

Regal Farm proprietors Shane Crawford and Kara Waters, who have four horses set to go under the hammer, are in the fortunate position of having sold a Deep Field (Northern Meteor) colt for \$610,000 at the Inglis Ready 2 Race Sale last month.

"It's going to be a buyers' market, for sure, and the middle could be tough but we are here to meet the market. We are keeping our fingers crossed, even if it looks a little dicey," Waters said.

"We are on a bit of a high, however, having sold the top lot in Sydney. Lime Country sold on our behalf.

"We did all the prep and sent him over four days before the sale."

New Zealand Bloodstock sales manager Danny Rolston said the vendors who have supported this year's sale would be doing their best to meet the market.

"The vendors are under no illusion regarding the challenges presented by the current circumstances, but they have really risen to that challenge with their individual efforts. For that they should be complimented," Rolston said.

"Feedback has been positive and I think they will be realistic when their lots are in the ring."

Day one of the NZB Ready to Run Sale starts tomorrow at 1pm New Zealand time.

Business as usual as new owners take over Middlebrook Valley Lodge

group of private investors with agricultural links have diversified their interests into the thoroughbred industry after purchasing Middlebrook Valley Lodge in the Hunter Valley as a going concern.

Situated on 149 hectares (368 acres), Middlebrook has a large 22-box yearling barn, an electric walker and round yard, post and rail fencing and yards, a foaling complex, two stallion boxes and yards as well as ample shedding for feed, hay and machinery.

The property also enjoys dual frontage to the Middlebrook Creek and it comes with a 46-megalite irrigation licence.

Middlebrook farm manager Verna Metcalfe will stay on under the new owners.

Operations manager for the group's investors, Michael Grill, told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday that the partners had been investigating expanding into the industry for some time.

"One of the key things for us buying into this business was for us being able to keep the staff that they had there because Verna's got a very good reputation in the industry," Grill said.

"We think that she does a very good job and, essentially, we don't want to see that change.

She is happy to stay on with us and, from our perspective, it's business as usual with the view to grow where we can."

Middlebrook had been under the same ownership for the past 13 years but the former owner did not want his identity published when confirming the changeover yesterday.

Group 1 stars All Too Hard (Casino Prince), Jameka (Myboycharlie) and Divine Prophet (Choisir) are among those horses to have been foaled or raised on the Hunter Valley property.

Grill suggested the new owners would look at ways of growing the business through offering spelling facilities and that they would explore other opportunities, but at this stage ruled out any investment in stallions.

"The property is in very good nick anyway, so there's not too much that needs to be done there, but it's more looking at ways that we can expand areas of the business, possibly some spelling of horses as the broodmare season only goes for so long," he said.

"We'll assess what numbers we can take agistment wise and that's our main goal."

The new Middlebrook proprietors, whose identities have not been revealed publicly, already have other agricultural investments in the Hunter region.

"Like a lot of people, I do enjoy the thoroughbred industry and with the level of investment you see with some of the other places around, it's quite phenomenal," Grill said.

"In general, there's some big plans for Scone by way of the local government and the way they want to invest in the industry there. It's good to get in now and be part of that growth."

Grill's observation of the wider economic outlook, which has taken a hit this year with the Covid-19 pandemic, was positive.

"There's risk in anything that we do, but we did keep an eye on this property for some time and part of that is having long-term staff on board like Verna who can keep the business running smoothly," he said.

"Of course, there could be some impacts there (with the coronavirus), but I feel we could be on the backend of that hopefully and looking at the economy growing in the next few years after this downturn."

The previous owner, who will retain his broodmares at Middlebrook, praised Metcalfe for her commitment to the business.

He said: "Verna's done a great job over the period she's been there."

Waller aiming for back-to-back Gongs

Chris Waller could have up to four runners in his bid for consecutive wins in the \$1 million The Gong (1600m) at Kembla Grange on Saturday, headed by defending champion Mister Sea Wolf (Amadeus Wolf). The oldest horse in Waller's stable, nine-year-old Mister Sea Wolf proved he still has something to offer with a Chelmsford Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) victory during the Sydney spring carnival. Waller's right-hand man, Charlie Duckworth, believes Mister Sea Wolf is going as well as he was when he won the inaugural The Gong last year, although he is likely to shoulder a hefty weight. "The only negative is, we thought last year it was going to be incredibly tough carrying 59 kilograms and chances are he's probably going to get lumbered with 60 kilograms this year," Duckworth said. "But the fact James McDonald is happy to stick with him and ride him again is a positive." Hugh Bowman returns from Melbourne and will partner stablemate Olmedo (Declaration Of War), who will be having just his third start for the Waller yard. The stable also has Reloaded (Snitzel) and Savacool (Savabeel) among entries for The Gong, which has attracted strong interest with 24 nominations in total.

Mooloolaba Cup next for Ballistic Boy

Rough Habit Plate (Gr 3, 2200m) winner Ballistic Boy (Smart Missile) will continue his march towards the Magic Millions Subzero (2400m) when he heads to the Sunshine Coast. The four-year-old exceeded trainer Chris Anderson's expectations when he produced an impressive last-to-second run in the Red Chase (1350m) at Doomben on November 7 and the trainer will step Ballistic Boy up to the mile in Saturday's Mooloolaba Cup (1600m) at the Sunshine Coast. Ballistic Boy's ultimate goal is the Magic Millions Subzero on January 16 and his final lead-up to the will likely be in the Shoot Out (2200m) at Eagle Farm on January 2.

Cup Night to run in Railway

The Bernie Miller-trained Cup Night (Maschino) has been cleared to run in Saturday's Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Ascot. The five-year-old received a bad knock to his hind cannon in the Asian Beau Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Ascot over a fortnight ago but pleased Miller in a trial over 950 metres at Lark Hill yesterday. "He's come through it pretty good and I was impressed by the trial," Miller told The Races WA. "He took the gap and it was great to see that he wanted to take it, he wanted to race again. We'll head forward at this particular time, but if a hiccup does occur, we will have to pull out and protect him again, but at the moment he is going to the Railway." However, while Cup Night may be fit enough to take his place in the race, Miller is not confident he is fit enough to win the Group 1. "I reckon with what's happened to him he will go into the Railway six lengths behind where we need to be," Miller said. "It's going to be his guts and determination that lifts him and he has got that spirit. Yes, we're going to go in under the eight ball a bit and we will be competitive, but he won't be at the top of his game."

Caulfield Group 1s for Mr Quickie

Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Mr Quickie will be targeted at Caulfield Group 1s once he returns to the track after a short break. The five-year-old finished sixth in the Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington when last seen earlier this month and trainer Phillip Stokes is keen to get him back in the autumn. "There's plenty of races for him in the autumn. There's a couple of really nice races at Caulfield, he seems to go really well there," Stokes told Racing.com. "I think races like the Orr Stakes, that would be a nice race for him, and the Futurity (is where we will head)." The All-Star Mile (1600m), which Mr Quickie finished unplaced in last season, could also be an option.

Australian Cup tilt for Nonconformist

2000m) Coongy Cup (Gr 3, winner Nonconformist (Rebel Raider) will likely be targeted at the Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington in the autumn. The Grahame Begg-trained four-year-old, who finished ninth in the Cantala Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) after his win at Caulfield, has gone to the paddock for a short break, and Begg outlined his plans for the autumn. "Possibly an Australian Cup, going down that path. We will just have a look at it," Begg told Racing.com. "He's going to have a nice break. Unfortunately they don't get much time out between the spring and the autumn because it's such an early autumn in Melbourne. But he's gone to the paddock, he only had four runs under his belt (in the spring). It wasn't an arduous spring preparation."

Future unclear for Santa Ana Lane

A decision on the future of the Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained Santa Ana Lane (Lope De Vega) will be made by his owners in the coming days. The five-time Group 1 winner will head to the paddock after a winless spring and connections are keen to do the right thing by the eight-year-old gelding, despite remaining

confident that he is in fine physical condition. "I will leave it in their hands, but he doesn't owe anyone anything. Ultimately it'll be up to the managing owners," co-trainer Sam Freedman told Racing.com. "He's sound, fit and well but it's hard to know. I thought he was perfect there last week but sometimes mentally they check out, certainly there was nothing physical stopping him. We just want to do the right thing by the horse. What we don't want is to be pushing on with a horse that is going to keep going around making up the numbers."

Queenslander Command'n'conquer sold to Hong Kong

Command'n'conquer (Warhead) has been sold to Hong Kong and is set to be trained by David Hayes. Steve Tregea, who trained, owned and bred the four-year-old, confirmed the sale vesterday. Command'n'conquer most recently took out a Benchmark 80 event at Doomben and will leave Australia after five wins from seven starts. "Lindsay Park bought him and they've been chasing him for a while. We put him out for a spell last time they were quite keen on him and they made another approach after he won last (start) and we did a deal after that," Tregea told Racing.com. "It's a very hard decision to sell a nice horse like that. But there comes a point where you have to be realistic about it. I've spent a lot of money on service fees over the years and got some back, but I'm still behind the eight ball, I'd say. So you've got to be realistic. Racing and breeding is a great consumer of money, so you've got to be able to go on."

Hong Kong buyers also eveing Guineas winner

Saturday's Sandown Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Allibor (All Too Hard) could also be heading to Hong Kong after connections received a substantial offer for the three-year-old following his narrow victory over Sweet Reply (Deep Field). Allibor's trainer Symon Wilde was put in a similar situation nine years ago, but made clear that he is keen to keep the gelding in his stable. "My immediate thoughts after the race were this horse is going to improve so much, I don't want to lose him," Wilde told RSN, "But we won the Sandown Guineas nine years ago, and we had some offers

for that horse [So Swift]. After the Guineas, he only had [two] more starts, he sort of went in the wind and did a tendon. Everyone will have to be in agreeance but we'll cross that bridge when we come to it. I don't want to lose a horse like this - he's got so much potential, the graph's still going up with him. You don't like horses like him walking out of your stable, that's for sure."

50 up for Magnus

Leading Victorian-based sire by winners Magnus (Flying Spur) has notched his 50th winner of the 2020/21 season, placing him seventh overall in the national premiership. After producing ten stakes horses last season, including Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Streets Of Avalon, Magnus has been on a successful run this season, with ten winners to his name over the past week. Magnus stands for \$15,400 (inc. GST) at Sun Stud.

Thornton keen to make up for lost time

Group 1-winning jockey Damien Thornton is focused on making an impact this season after missing the spring action due to a broken foot. During his period on the sidelines, Thornton missed out on the opportunity to ride Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner September Run (Exceed And Excel) and Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) runner Humidor (Teofilo), but the jockey is keen to look forward. "I was disappointed, frustrated sitting out and watching all the horses I had been riding do well," Thornton told Racing.com. "But you move on pretty quick and it's good to be back. I'm just moving on to the autumn. I'd like to try and get back to where I was, the spot at Chris Waller will probably take a bit of work to get back. But it's something I am prepared to do. Hopefully I get the opportunities I would have had at the start of the spring."

Racing Australia broadens horse traceability regulation

The Racing Australia Board has finalised and approved a broad set of new rules which aim to enhance the traceability of horses during breeding, racing and retirement. Among the new rules; trainers and owners will be required to more regularly update the status and location of their horses, breeders will be required to provide more information about their horses and industry participants will be obliged to provide traceability notification beyond a horse's retirement. "The introduction of these new traceability rules is the next step in the Principal Racing Authorities' and Racing Australia's ongoing commitment to achieving greater transparency of horse movements and, by doing so, realising improved equine welfare outcomes" said Myles Foreman, Racing Australia CEO.

Non-essential attendance to SA racing banned

South Australian race meetings will be run behind closed doors for a minimum of two weeks following the announcement of 18 new Covid-19 cases in Adelaide yesterday. Only essential participants will be able to attend, which means owners, members and the general public will not be able to attend race meetings. Thoroughbred Racing South Australia said vesterday: "TRSA advises that owing to the recent COVID-19 cases being reported in SA, the full set of restrictions regarding attendance by non-essential racing personnel at race meetings, track work, jump-outs and barrier trials have been reintroduced with immediate

Owners allowed to visit **NSW** stables

NSW Owners will be permitted to enter stables or licensed premises to visit and inspect their horses, as Racing NSW relaxed their Covid-19 restrictions further. Trainers will need to keep a record of the owners that attend and record their temperature upon arrival. They will also be required to have appropriate signage reminding owners about Covid-19 symptoms and ensure owners sanitise prior to entry.

Dragon Storm a bright light for Gibbs

Success in the New Zealand Cup (Gr 3, 3200m) with Dragon Storm (Shocking) was a welcome boost for Ruakaka trainer Chris Gibbs, who has endured a tough period due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The Level 3 lockdown in Auckland in late winter meant no horses could travel through New Zealand's largest city, meaning race meetings at Ruakaka were called off and Northland trainers were prevented from taking horses to Waikato race meetings. "That absolutely crucified us because they wouldn't let anybody drive through Auckland to get here," Gibbs said. "It was a disaster for us to be honest. Everybody else could keep operating to a certain extent. We weren't even allowed to drive through Auckland. It made it really hard." The Cup victory for Dragon Storm should help Gibbs prepare him for the Wellington Cup (Gr 3, 3200m) and Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) in late summer, due to his rating being pushed up to the point where he

should be guaranteed a start. "It means that we can set a plan in place and be a bit more selective about what races we go in," Gibbs said. "Before, we had to just try to get him in to qualify him, and sometimes we had to run him in races that weren't suitable. We can work our way back from the cups and really space his runs to keep him nice and fresh."

Two-run prep for in-foal Supera

Supera (Savabeel) will begin her final preparation with the Dunstan Feeds Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Pukekohe on Saturday. The Ken and Bev Kelso-trained six-year-old sustained a minor foot issue that ruled her out of the Livamol Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) at Hastings last month, but she was freshened up with a 1000 metre trial at Taupo yesterday and Ken Kelso was pleased with the run. "I thought it was a good trial," he said. "Over 1000 metres she found the line okay. Her foot issue was only minor and I am happy with her. All going well she will be running in the Breeders' at Pukekohe on Saturday. She will be competitive over 1400 metres on the fresh side." Supera has been served by Valachi Downs stallion US Navy Flag (War Front) and Kelso said she will have two final runs after Saturday before being retired to owner Sir Peter Vela's Pencarrow Stud. "She has been served and is in-foal to US Navy Flag," Kelso said. "She will run on Saturday, then the Cal Isuzu fillies and mares mile and then her last run will hopefully be the Zabeel Classic"

FR: Group 2 winner Van Beethoven recruited to Haras de Grandcamp

Railway Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) winner and Secretariat Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) runner-up Van Beethoven (Scat Daddy) has been retired from racing and will join the stallion roster at Haras de Grandcamp. The four-year-old son of the late Scat Daddy (Johannesburg) shed his maiden tag on his second start at two before backing up a respectable Windsor Castle (Listed, 5f) fourth with success in the Railway Stakes at the Curragh, defeating Marie's Diamond (Footstepsinthesand) by half a length. Having raced eight times at two, the Canadian-bred Van Beethoven competed seven times at three, with his Secretariat Stakes second the best of those efforts. All of his 15 starts came for Aidan O'Brien, and while it was recorded that he had switched to Chad Brown's yard last autumn, his midfield placing in the Shadwell Turf Mile Gr 1, 1m) in October 2019 proved to be his final outing. Samuel Blanchard, who oversaw the arrival of Van Beethoven to the stud, told Jour de Galop: "He comes from a classic American line and won the Railway Stakes at the Curragh in June of his two-year-old career, running no less than eight times between April and September. This is a real guarantee of precocity, at a time when France Galop is upgrading the juvenile category."



Moore, Chin and Corrales Dominate at Taipa

rainers Nick Moore and Stanley
Chin, along with jockey Luis
Corrales, took the spoils on the
weekend's racing, with both Moore
and Chin picking up three winners each and
Corrales booting home four for the two days.

Moore, who is in his second season as a trainer, kicked off Sunday with a surprise win with his newly acquired Beat The Market (Time Thief), who made light work of barrier 12 under Frankie Choi to win the 0 to 45 Special Conditions Race over 1500 metres.

Beat The Market had been a winner of three races in the enclave prior to Sunday when prepared by Stanley Chin, but had not won since August 2019. At his first run for the stable, the gelding was well supported but struggled in the run and finished a dismal ninth behind Northern Legend, beaten over 12 lengths.

"When he first came to my stable this season, I just tried taking all the gear off him like the blinkers, the lugging bit and noseband." Moore said.

"I wanted to start fresh, but I realised after the first run the way that he raced that he did need the blinkers and so we put them back on. His work had been ok, so I just told Frankie (Choi) to ride hard from gate 12 and get him forward as he is very one paced. He did a good job and after the win I thought we might be in for a good day here, as I was very keen on Hostwin Saturn and Hostwin Euphoria later in the day."

Moore was spot on with his forecast for both runners with Hostwin Saturn (Stratum) scoring a brilliant first up win in the Class 1 and 2 over 1200 metres under Roger Yu.

Hostwin Saturn had won three races last season on his way to the Macau Derby (Listed, 1800m), where he was sent off favourite. After beginning very slowly in the Derby, the bay gelding found himself in traffic and then did a lot of work in the race. To his credit, he was only beaten five lengths.

"I was very confident today even though it was only 1200 metres; his first run in Macau was over 1200 metres and he ran a great race, only beaten one and half lengths in a good field and good time. He did well in the break and his trial was first rate before this race."

"He will make a good cup horse this season, and I'd like to think we might get a run in the Hong Kong – Macau Trophy if it's possible to have it next year."

Moore's promising Derby prospect Hostwin Euphoria (Street Boss) saluted under Luis Corrales in the Class 3 over 1500 metres, to give Moore his treble for the day; but not after a tussle with the early leader Casino Mok (Casino Prince).

"Hostwin Euphoria is still learning all about the game. I told Luis (Corrales) to be positive on him from the outside gate, and he did a great job to park off the leader. He took a while to get going in the straight but then he just outstayed them."

With just 18 runners for the new season Moore has posted five winners and two placings.

Luis Corrales surged to the lead in the rider's standings with four winners over the weekend racing to give him an early one-win lead in the Jockeys standings with 11 winners, one in front of Eric Cheung who is on ten victories.

Corrales opened his account for the weekend with an easy victory on the Joe Lau prepared Crown Of Gold (Duporth) who scored fresh up in the Class 3 over 1350 metres on the sand Friday night.

Joe Lau did a fine job with Crown Of Gold last season winning four races in succession, and taking him from a rating of 40 to 71. The son of Duporth did a top job in the Derby running a close fourth behind stablemate Sacred Magnate (Foxwedge), after finding a spot of trouble in the run. Friday night's easy win showed the five year will be a force to be reckoned with in the Cup races this season.

On Sunday Corrales was quick off the mark in race two with One Belt One Road (Haradasun), who jumped out of the ground late to win the Class 4 & 5 over 1200 metres.

Hostwin Euphoria gave Corrales his second win in the Class 3 over 1500 metres, with the Panamanian rider closing his day with a victory on the Stanley Chin-trained Master Paradise (Charge Forward) in the Class 6 over 1500 metres.

A five-time champion senior rider in the enclave as well as being champion apprentice twice in 1999 and 2000, Corrales is shooting for a sixth Macau title which would put him on par with Brazilian Manoel Nunes, who won six

championships in the enclave before relocating to Singapore.

Stanley Chin's three winners over the two days of racing took him to equal first spot on the Trainer's table with nine wins alongside former 2015 – 2016 Champion trainer Sio Cheong, with last year's leading conditioner Tony Fung in third spot on eight wins.

Chin picked up his first win on Friday night in the Class 4 over 1510 metres with City Gold (Outstrip) who was ridden by his former apprentice Eric Cheung.

Master Paradise was the second winner for Chin over the two days when he scored on Sunday, with his promising stayer Star Of City Gold (Swiss Ace) winning the last on Sunday the Class 4 over 1800 metres, ridden by Japanese rider Massa Tanaka.

Chin who was Champion trainer in the 2018-2019 season is bullish about his chances for a second title.

"Last season we had a lot of new horses that didn't quite live up to expectations due mostly to immaturity and a few issues," said Chin.



"The horses are more mature and they are thriving, as well I've picked up some more new horses that I have high expectations for so it's all coming together."

Trained in Britain by David Menuisier, Belloccio followed up his recent win at Salisbury by defeating favourite Cirona (Maxios) by a length and a quarter. Kergrist (Milanais) was another neck away in third. Haunui Farm shuttler Belardo will have his first southern hemisphere two-year-olds this season, while Darley last week announced Belardo would stand at Kildangan Stud in Ireland for an unchanged €10,000 (approx. AUD\$16,150) in 2021. At the weekend, Belardo secured his fifth stakes winner and first in New Zealand, when Avonallo (2 c ex Real Angel by O'Reilly) landed the Welcome Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Riccarton. The Jamie Richardstrained juvenile pulled two lengths clear of his eight rivals under Opie Bosson. Follow Your Dreams (Contributer) ran second, while Global Beauty (Highly Recommended) was a further two and a quarter lengths further back in third.

Worthy Cause - Ain't She Lovely (2 f ex Backpacker Express by Big Brown) took out a 1100-metre maiden at Ipswich on Wednesday

to provide first-season sire Worthy Cause (Choisir) his maiden winner with just his second runner. The John Zielke-trained Ain't She Lovely, bred by Dovedeen Stud, had finished unplaced in her first two starts but was nothing short of impressive on Wednesday. Sent off a \$4.40 chance under Georgina Cartwright, the filly made all and quickened nicely in the straight to defeat Portobello Road (Dream Ahead) by one and three-quarter lengths, with Air Force Rocket (Air Force Blue) finishing four lengths behind the winner in third. The Group 3-winning Worthy Cause stands at Clear Mountain Fairview Stud for a fee of \$5,500 (inc. GST) in 2020. His only other runner to date, Star Twinkle, finished unplaced at Toowoomba in September and has not been seen since.

He got the better of the Henk Grewe-trained Dolcetto (Gleneagles) by half a length, with favourite Virginia Storm (Soldier Hollow) two lengths behind the winner in third. Adlerflug stood at Gestut Schlenderhan in Germany for a fee of €10,000 (approx. AUD\$16,300) in 2020.

All Too Hard - Vinery Stud Stallion All Too Hard (Casino Prince) sired his 18th individual stakes winner when Allibor (3 g ex Libor Lady by Exchange Rate) took out the Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) for trainer Symon Wilde and jockey Dean Yendall. The three-year-old prevailed by the minimum of margins over Sweet Reply (Deep Field), with a further length and three-quarters back to Valanetti (Sebring) in third. Returning \$4.40, Allibor fended off the \$2.70 favourite Sweet Reply despite idling in the closing stages to join the likes of dual Group 1 winner Behemoth and Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) hero Alligator Blood as stakes winners for his sire, who is standing for a fee of \$27,500 (inc GST) in 2020. Aimees Babe died in 2018 and Irish Girl is her only foal.

Savabeel - New Zealand champion sire Savabeel (Zabeel) brought up his 105th individual stakes winner when Hindaam (3 f ex Bayrock by

Sent out as second favourite with Daniel Stackhouse aboard, the Tom Dabernig and Ben Hayes-trained filly, sporting the colours of Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell operation, swept home from last down the centre of the track to defeat La Mexicana (I Am Invincible) by a half-length with Star Of Uma (I Am Invincible) a further length and three-quarters away in third. Bred by Windsor Park Stud, Hindaam is out of the placed mare Bayrock (Fastnet Rock), a sister to Coolmore stallion Merchant Navy and Group 1-placed Jolie Bay. Offered by Kitchwin Hills at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, she was purchased by Shadwell Stud for \$825,000. Savabeel stands for NZ\$100,000 (plus GST) at Waikato Stud in 2020.

Sebring - Black On Gold (7 g ex Fools Gold by Commands) battled well under a smart ride from Brenton Avdulla to take out the Ladies Day Cup (Listed, 1600m) at Hawkesbury, providing Sebring (More Than Ready) with his 64th individual stakes winner in the process. Sent off a \$19 chance, the Chris Waller-trained Black On Gold cut the corner entering the straight and pulled clear of the field up the inside, defeating Archedemus (Lope De Vega) by three-quarters of a length, with Savacool (Savabeel) two lengths behind the winner in third. Despite having won seven times in 43 previous starts, this was a first at stakes level for the seven-year-old. Sebring, winner of the 2008 Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) stood at Widden Stud before dying from a heart attack aged 13 last year.

Shanghai Bobby - Black Horus (5 h ex Julia's Star by El Prado) took out the Premio Chiusura (Listed, 1400m) at Milan on Sunday to earn Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) his 35th individual stakes winner. The Luciano Bietolini-trained five-year-old just got up ahead of Cirfandli (Overdose) in a three-way finish, with Visayas (Cable Bay) a close-behind third. Ridden by Craig Grylls, the Chris Gibbs-trained Dragon Storm defeated another son of Shocking, Lincoln King, by a half-head, with a further two lengths back to Hurry Cane (Nom Du Jeu) in third. With sire and dam both previous Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) runners - Prize Lady (Prized) finishing 17th in 2008, a year before Shocking's success perhaps it is no surprise that Dragon Storm won a big two-mile event in November. Dragon Storm is the third foal to race out of Prize Lady, a twotime Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner, but the first to salute at stakes level; second dam Pen Bal Lady (Mummy's Game) was a three-time Grade 1 winner in California. Dragon Storm was offered for sale twice, purchased for NZ\$55,000 from the Wentwood Grange draft at the 2016 Karaka Premier Yearling Sale before being reoffered at the NZB Ready To Run Sale the same year; he was bought for NZ\$150,000 by Kylin Horse Group. Shocking stands for NZ\$8,000 (plus GST) in 2020.

So You Think - Carif's (5 h ex Norzita by Thorn Park) win in the Sandown Cup (Listed, 3200m) provided Coolmore resident So You

Think (High Chaparral) with his 30th individual stakes winner. The 14-year-old, whose outstanding race record included ten Group 1 successes, is also the sire of Quick Thinker, Nakeeta Jane and Sopressa. He stands for \$38,500 (inc GST) in 2020.

Street Boss - Anamoe (2 c ex Anamato by Redoute's Choice) broke his maiden with a short-head success in the Merson Cooper Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Sandown to provide Darley stallion Street Boss (Street Cry) with his 41st individual stakes winner. The

Godolphin homebred, who is trained by James Cummings, built on the form of his Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) fifth when repelling the challenge of Forbes (Capitalist), while The Art Of Flying (Flying Artie) was a further two and three-quarter lengths away in third. A half-brother to Leopardstown Listed winner Anamba (Shamardal), Anamoe is one of four winners from Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) heroine Anamato (Redoute's Choice). Street Boss is standing for a fee of \$27,500 (inc. GST) at Darley's Northwood Park this year.
