## Locals look to cash in at Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale

*Westspeed bonuses offer big lure for buyers to be active at latest Australasian yearling auction*

The attraction for Western Australian trainers and owners to target their local sale, rather than chancing their arm at the competitive eastern state auctions en masse, had already started well before this year, but that parochialism is expected to be in full force at the Swan

Valley complex this afternoon as the Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale gets underway.

The West's two-day yearling sale, the third of the 2021 Australasian series, is tipped to be underpinned by demand for Westspeed-eligible horses as buyers look to cash in on the lucrative scheme, which is on offer for a relatively small pool of thoroughbreds. *Continued on page 2>>*

Prominent WA agent John Chalmers, one of the leading buyers at the 2020 Perth sale, has been doing the legwork ahead of his local yearling auction and expects to again be a strong player in the market this year.

"It is very difficult for people now to buy outside Western Australia with the incentive of the Westspeed and Platinum scheme," Chalmers told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"Unless you're going away to buy a Snitzel or an I Am Invincible or something, there's no point. You're better off staying home otherwise you're just leaving too much money on the table."

The Westspeed scheme, initiated in 1999, helps incentivise Western Australian breeders while the more recent introduction of the Platinum element, adding an extra prize-money bonus for horses sired by stallions based in the state, boosts the appeal for buyers keen to race their horses in WA.

The international and interstate travel restrictions caused by Covid-19 could also force the hand of buyers wanting to source new racing stock this year.

"(WA owners and trainers) didn't buy as many horses interstate last year either, and I didn't buy as many in New Zealand this year because of the restrictions, but a couple of years ago (Perth buyers) went over to the Classic sale and spent \$1.2 million a week before our sale, buying horses who weren't Westspeed, which I couldn't understand," Chalmers said.

"They have never bought a lot at the Gold Coast, four or five or something like that, and certainly more money has stayed here."

Chalmers bought 19 yearlings at the 2020 Perth sale for a spend of \$797,500. Only trainers Adam Durrant (19 for \$1.14 million) and Neville Parnham (14 for \$1.0395 million) spent more at their local yearling sale last year.

A total of 303 lots have been catalogued across two sessions, the first of which starts at 1pm local time today and features the progeny of War Chant (Danzig), Playing God (Blackfriars), Maschino (Encosta De Lago), I'm All The Talk (Stratum) as well as Awesome Rock (Fastnet Rock), Demerit (Lonhro) and

A Lot (Tapit).

The depth of the catalogue is backed up by the influence of interstate stallions including Deep Field (Northern Meteor), Epaulette (Commands), Choisir (Danehill Dancer) and Flying Artie (Artie Schiller).

Chalmers admitted some of the pedigrees on offer this year were light on quality, but was happy with the types of horses he has so far identified.

"Look, the catalogue is the catalogue. I did the stats the other day and it just reflects the (WA) breeding industry," the long-time agent said.

"Forty-three per cent of the catalogue, the mares are either unraced or never won. It's not flash (in that regard), but the presentation of the horses is good and there's some nice horses here."

However, he predicts the strong market sentiment experienced at the Gold Coast and the Inglis Classic sale to translate to a similar appetite over the next two days.

"And New Zealand was good, too.

Everyone wrote New Zealand off saying it was going to be a bloodbath, but they got out of that magnificently," he said.

"There's no reason why this sale won't be strong."

With Victorians locked out of the Perth sale, locals are likely to be up against a smaller than normal contingent of interstate buyers. Those to have made the trip across to WA include agents Andrew Williams, Bevan Smith and Merrick Staunton as well as Segenhoe's Peter O'Brien.

Gold Coast-based Magic Millions managing director Barry Bowditch, who arrived in Perth on Tuesday, believes the WA sale provides plenty of opportunities for buyers willing to undertake the necessary inspections, either in person or from afar.

"Obviously, the interstate participation in this sale has been somewhat the reason for its success in recent years and it will be hard to quantify until we kick off what the downturn in that spend will be because obviously the Victorians are not able to attend," Bowditch said.

"Then again, we are in different times now and we're hopeful that they will use agents, use us, use the transparency of the information on the website to make an informed decision and participate from afar.

"If you're a local or if you're an interstater looking to compete, given the fact there's not as many people here, there's going to be huge opportunity through the market and, in a buoyant market, which we've seen so far this year, this might be one where the diamond in the rough can be found at the right price."

Bowditch added: "One thing about Western Australia, the horses are extremely well raised and they are extremely well prepared.

"The sires right now are in a very good place for the Westspeed system. You only have to look at the results all over Australia and internationally, the Western Australian product bats well above its weight."

#### Ultra's Buckley explains surrogate mare claims

Ultra Thoroughbreds principal Sean Buckley has hit back at claims his breeding operation contravened Australian Stud Book rules by using artificial insemination and embryo transfers to surrogate mares. Strikeline (Desert Sun), the dam of Nature Strip (Nicconi), and Miss Andretti (Ihtiram) were named as the mares used in the scheme, which is believed to have seen foals born out of the duo by Addictive Nature (Savabeel). Reportedly, Buckley allowed the two mares to be sent to Western Australia in late 2019 to participate in a nationally recognised artificial insemination program, which he hoped would help them be able to conceive naturally and carry to full term in the future. "On the allegations, as best I can understand them from the media, I fail to see what the issue is," Buckley told Racing.com. "The progeny of the two mares born in 2020 were not, and were never going to be, registered. A process was undertaken in 2019 in an attempt to improve their chances of naturally conceiving and carrying pregnancies to terms in subsequent years, in a manner compliant with Stud Book rules. I intend to cooperate fully with any inquiry, but until we have received from RV what matters they are inquiring into, I am really unable to comment further."

#### Five for Flying Artie

Newgate Farm's Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) has taken the lead in the sought after first season sire title (by winners) after the courageous first-start victory of Bourbon

Flyer (2 c ex Kentucky Miss by Foxwedge) on the Kensington track in Sydney yesterday. The fifth individual winner for the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) hero, Bourbon Flyer defeated Syracuse (Sebring) and Trifaccia (I Am Invincible) in the Stud & Stable Staff Awards Plate (1100m). Trained by John Thompson, Bourbon Flyer was a \$50,000 purchase from the 2020 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. He is raced by a syndicate which includes Wilf Mula, who raced Flying Artie with the late Paul Whelan, John Whelan and Newgate Farm's Henry Field. John O'Shea paid \$52,500 for Bourbon Flyer's sister at the 2020 Inglis Australian Weanling Sale while Kentucky Miss, who was bought by Mula for \$250,000 at the Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale last year, has a weanling sister to the pair and she was covered in December by I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit). Flying Artie, who stood for a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) in 2020, leads the first season sire title over barnmate Capitalist (Written Tycoon) (four in Australia), Sooboog (Snitzel) (four) and Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) (three in Australia).

#### Slipper berth possible for Bourbon Flyer

Bourbon Flyer could be set to take his chance in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on March 20 following yesterday's impressive one and a half-length debut win. Bourbon Flyer runs in the same colours as his sire, Flying Artie (Artie Schiller), who finished third in the Slipper in 2016 and Thompson confirmed his promising juvenile will be put on a path to go two better in the Rosehill showpiece. "He's a very professional colt and has been from day one a very straightforward horse," Thompson told Sky post-race. "He has a good horse's attitude and aims to please so there is more to come from him. Flying Artie is a promising stallion, they are all very similar to him, correct, sound athletic horses. We'll have a throw at the stumps at one of those nice two-year-old lead up races and see how we go, it's up to him from here on."

#### Green light for Inglis Premier as lockdown lifted

Mark Webster, CEO of Inglis, yesterday expressed his delight about the Victoria snap lockdown coming to an end, as it means the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale will go ahead as planned on February 28. Webster said on Twitter: "Fantastic news with Vic lockdown to end at midnight, allowing Inglis Premier Sale to be conducted as planned starting February 28 with inspections starting early next week under a Covid safe plan. Sale will also be streamed live." 804 lots are catalogued for the three-day sale, which Inglis' Victorian bloodstock manager Simon Vivian describes as "the strongest Premier catalogue we have ever produced". The sale begins at 10am on Sunday, February 28, with the first 265 lots set to go through the ring on the opening day.

## Crowds back for Blue Diamond meeting

With Victorian premier Daniel Andrews last night announcing that Covid-19 restrictions would ease in Victoria, it was confirmed that crowds will be allowed on track for Saturday's Blue Diamond meeting at Caulfield. Releasing a statement yesterday afternoon, Racing Victoria said as of today: "Spectators (including owners, members and the general public) and non-broadcast media will again be permitted to attend Victorian race meetings. Spectator attendance will be subject to approvals granted to clubs under the Victorian government's public events framework as occurred prior to the Stage 4 restrictions being reimposed. Owners are once again permitted to attend public and private training centres, for the primary purpose of visiting their horse." Racing Victoria CEO, Giles Thompson, said: "We welcome the announcement by the Victorian government today regarding the lifting of Stage 4 restrictions and we look forward to safely welcoming back owners and spectators at our race meetings from tomorrow in accordance with all relevant government directives."

## Love Conquers All to stay at Clear Mountain Fairview

Following on from a successful season at Clear Mountain Fairview, Love Conquers All (Mossman) will remain at the stud for the foreseeable future, principal Bob Frappell confirmed yesterday to ANZ Bloodstock News. "He covered 91 mares in his first season, and the majority of those were full payers, not mares from the farm. Sun Stud are delighted, and it's great for us to be keeping him - the intention is that he won't leave Queensland again. Things are going well for us - Worthy Cause has made a tremendous start too, with two winners from four runners (including the unbeaten Hinged, who won on Saturday at Gold Coast for her second victory) and plenty of nice ones to come." The leading Queensland sire by winners for the 2019-20 season, Love Conquers All stood for \$5,500 (inc GST) last season while Worthy Cause (Choisir) stood for the same fee.

## Fresh is best for Hanseatic

Promising three-year-old Hanseatic (Street Boss), whose spring was cut short after suffering a bleeding attack in the Blue Sapphire Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) last October, is set to make his return in Saturday's Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m). "He was forced to have a long break and it's probably been the best thing that's happened for him. He's never had a long spell and that's the longest time he's had in the paddock and we noticed a real difference this time around." Sam Freedman, who trains Hanseatic in partnership with his father Anthony, told Racing.com. "He is just a lot stronger and put on a lot of muscle. He's taken a bit more time to get ready, which is a positive. We had him in nice and early and he is very fit and ready for this run. It's his target race for this preparation and he has no weight on his back and he loves the Caulfield 1100 (metres). It all bodes well for him. I think it's nice for once he's flying under the radar a little bit. He has been in the spotlight for much of his career, so hopefully he can spring a surprise on Saturday."

## Oliver on Anamoe, Pike to ride Ingratiating

Damien Oliver has elected to ride Anamoe (Street Boss) for Godolphin in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) over Ingratiating (Frosted) who he has also ridden in all four starts. One of three runners in the two-year-old feature for trainer James Cummings, Anamoe was runner-up in the Blue Diamond Prelude (Colts and Geldings) (Gr 3, 1100m) last start and a Flemington track gallop yesterday, wearing blinkers, convinced Oliver to stay with the colt. Ingratiating, who won last week's Talindert Stakes (Listed, 1100m), will now be ridden by Willie Pike while Damian Lane will maintain his association with the unbeaten filly Arcaded (Street Boss).

## Aegon to cope with rainy Rosehill

Unbeaten Kiwi three-year-old Aegon (Sacred Falls) will make his Australian debut on Saturday when he contests the Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Rosehill. The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained gelding has impressed in his four career victories, including when taking out the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and Karaka Million 3YO Classic (RL, 1600m). Forsman is confident Aegon will cope with the likely rain-affected conditions at the weekend. "He handled a Slow 7 when he won at Taupo and at the trials at Te Rapa and I think it will be similar footing to a heavy track over there," he said. "I am not too worried about it. Back to the 1400 metres is a concern, but that is probably where the slower track helps him a little bit. Up against those ones on a fast track, they might have been a little bit sharp for him over that trip, but the slower ground will definitely help him out." Forsman, who part-owns Aegon with the Zame family, said Saturday's Group 2 was a stepping stone to the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) on March 6. "We want to see him go out and run well on Saturday and prove he is up to that level and hopefully we can press on to the Guineas in a fortnight's time," he said.

## Kersley ruled out of Saturday rides

Freddie Kersley will be unable to ride this weekend due to health reasons. Kersley was set for a book of rides at Caulfield which included It'sourtime (Time For War) in the Zedative Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), Khoekhoe (Turffontein) in the Autumn Classic (Gr 2, 1800m) and San Huberto (Speightstown) in the Mornington Cup Prelude (Listed, 2000m). In a statement released by his agent Mark Guest on Twitter last night, Kersley said: "It's with great disappointment that this coming Saturday I won't be partnering three extremely progressive horses in It'sourtime, Khoekhoe and San Huberto. I'd like to thank those who have supported me. Unfortunately I have had a small health care but look to be back partnering my mounts in the coming few weeks."

## Moonlight Maid back from extended spell

Moonlight Maid (Puissance De Lune), winner of the 2019 Manifold Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m), is set to return from a nine-month absence in Saturday's Mannerism Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Caulfield. Trainer Mitch Freedman decided to give the mare a prolonged spell after a three-year-old campaign that also saw her place in the VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) and Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m). "She had a pretty arduous three-year-old campaign and she hadn't had a decent spell since her mid two-year-old year," Freedman told Racing.com. "She just had a few niggles going on and no major issues, but we thought it was the ideal time for her to go out. She's come back really sound and she's even a bit easier to deal with in all her work. I think she's in good shape. She will be a little ring-rusty and lack a bit of matchday fitness and we've seen her in past preps it can take a run or two for her to get to her top. She's quite a big mare and she's pretty hard on herself at home so we have to look after her."

## Sargent keen to stay ahead of rivals with star filly

John Sargent is hoping he has unearthed a talented two-year-old in Four Moves Ahead (Snitzel), who will bid to remain unbeaten in the Silver Slipper Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) at Rosehill on Saturday. Four Moves Ahead impressed on debut at Randwick last month, winning a two-year-old handicap by two and three-quarter lengths, but Sargent had to wait before running her again due to a cold. "She's won that race and won it well then she had a cold and we had to back off for a couple of weeks," he told Racing.com. "She was cleared two weeks ago so started galloping again, she trialled really well and has improved with the trial. She's ready to go, she's got to get out there now and prove it against the colts." Sargent is hoping Four Moves Ahead will prove talented enough to contest the Golden Slipper, but is focussed on getting some black type to her name this weekend. "I'd love to get some black type with her, that's the first thing you want with the fillies, so it's a very important race," he added.

## Entrapped to be given chance in Typhoon Tracy

Just days out from the Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale, prominent vendor and local trainer Graeme McCulloch will attempt to add value to one of his future broodmares at Moonee Valley tomorrow night. The Whitmore trainer, who races and sells under the Grenville Stud banner, will back up three-year-old filly Entrapped (Fighting Sun) up in the Typhoon Tracy Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), a week after she won at the Melbourne metropolitan track. "We plan to breed with her, so the idea was to try and get a city win with her in Melbourne," McCulloch told Racing.com. "She ran well at The Valley the start before, finishing second, and we were actually going to bring her home last week. She has pulled up so well we will accept in the stakes race on Friday night and try to get some black type, which would be a bonus." The Tasmanian Yearling Sale is on Monday.

## Tasmanian Yearling Sale inspections start tomorrow

Inspections for the upcoming Tasmanian Yearling Sale will begin at noon tomorrow and will take place each day leading up to the sale on Monday, February 22. The 123-lot sale will be held for the first time at Quercus Park at Carrick and features progeny from 51 individual sires. Among the yearlings of note is **Lot 106**, a half-brother to unbeaten two-year-old Turk Warrior (Outreach), who is out of Val Royal (Royal Academy) mare Ehor. The son of Zululand (Fastnet Rock) attracted plenty of attention at a recent Grenville Stud open day. [Click here](#) to view the full catalogue.

## Sires still on cards for Lightsaber

The Peter Moody-trained Lightsaber (Zoustar) put in another impressive performance at Sandown yesterday en route to next month's Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Flemington. The two-year-old colt broke his maiden at the second attempt earlier this month and impressively followed that up with a bold front-running display under Dean Yendall in the 1400-metre two-year-old handicap yesterday. Lightsaber defeated Daily Bugle

(Press Statement) by two and a quarter lengths, with Camaguey (Teofilo) another half a length behind in third. The stable confirmed post-race that the Sires' Produce is a likely destination for Lightsaber, providing he pulls up well in the coming days.

## Derive on Oaks path

The Australasian Oaks at Morphettville on May 1 is the target for the Mathew Ellerton and Simon Zahra-trained Derive (Redoute's Choice) after she broke her maiden at the seventh time of asking at Sandown yesterday. Returning the \$2.20 favourite, Derive came a length and a quarter clear of her 11 rivals in the \$50,000 Ladbrokes Plate (1300m) after receiving a canny ride from Jamie Kah to negotiate barrier 12. "She jumped quite well and Jamie summed it up quite quickly as she does, she sat outside the leader and got some soft sectionals and she was too good for them," Zahra told Racing.com. "She probably got a little lost towards the end, she has done that before so she's only going to improve as we step her out in distance and she gets a bit more confidence." Looking ahead, Zahra added: "We think she's going to get over a bit of a trip so the (Australasian) Oaks is probably on our radar. We looked at that race around July last year when she was running around here. She's matured, strengthened into a lovely filly and as you could see today relaxed beautifully outside the leader today so that (rising in distance) shouldn't be an issue going forward."

## Appeal dismissal rules Berry out of weekend racing

Tommy Berry will forego his scheduled rides tomorrow and Saturday after the Racing NSW appeal panel dismissed his appeal in relation to a careless riding suspicion he obtained at Warwick Farm on February 10. Stewards handed Berry a four-meeting metropolitan and provincial penalty, which was upheld by the appeal panel, meaning he is ruled out of Rosehill's meeting on Saturday and will miss a stellar book of rides. Berry's intended mounts included Prague (Redoute's Choice) in the Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and the Hawkes Racing-trained Dio (Zoustar) in the Silver Slipper Stakes.



## Farley suspended in County Mile Race Series

Neil Farley has become the first jockey to be suspended for breaking the whip rules in Racing Victoria's restricted whip race series. Jockeys cannot use the whip more than five times in a Country Mile Race Series contest, but Farley hit runner-up Spanish Snitzel (Choisir) nine times at Swan Hill on Tuesday. He was suspended for nine meetings and fined \$500. Under the rules of the series, Farley will not be able to ride in the final on March 13, while Spanish Snitzel is ineligible to compete in any further heats or the final. Farley's suspension will start at midnight on February 22 and finish at midnight on March 2.

## Kah takes on PR firm

Jamie Kah has signed with management firm Dynamic Sport and Entertainment Group, DSEG principal James Henderson confirmed yesterday. Kah joins fellow racing personalities such as Francesca Cumani, Damien Oliver and Greg Miles under the DSEG banner and Richardson told Racing.com: "Jamie has a whole lot of records ahead of her and she is a wonderful person to boot and hopefully with DSEG's help she can make that leap from the racing world into the mainstream sporting realm. We in racing know she is a star but people on the street would generally only know Gai Waterhouse, Bart Cummings, Phar Lap, Damien Oliver and Michelle Payne, and hopefully soon she will deservedly have her name alongside those as the face of her sport." Kah's long-term racing manager Lachie Weekley will still be in charge of all her riding bookings and racing engagements.

## Racing NSW relaxes Victoria Covid-19 protocols

Following the lifting of the Victorian government's Covid-19 lockdown orders at midnight yesterday, Racing NSW has lifted the directives that were applied to those who had travelled to Victoria on or after January 29. As such, persons that have been in Victoria on or after this date no longer need to self-isolate or get tested on their return to NSW, other than those persons who have attended Victorian exposure sites during this period. Persons are still required to comply with Racing NSW's directions in respect of specific hotspots or exposure sites identified by the relevant government authorities, including the obligation to report any such attendance to the Racing NSW stewards. ## Strathalbyn called off

Yesterday's meeting at Strathalbyn was called off after the second race with jockeys withdrawing their services on the grounds of safety. Stewards, track staff and jockeys inspected a couple of sections of the track before they made the decision to cancel the meeting. The winner of the second race, Jus Tin (Gonski), pulled-up lame with an injury to his offside fore tendon, and jockey Dom Tourneur highlighted that the track may have played a part. "We had jump-outs on it the other day and it probably opened up the track in sections," Tourneur said post-race. "That horse then, he put his foot in a bit of a spot and that's probably the reason he has pulled-up lame because he was good before the race."

## Tabcorp continues to lose market share

Tabcorp yesterday announced a profit of \$185 million for the six-month period that ended on December 31, 2020. Retail wagering turnover dropped by 28 per cent, but its online betting received a 43 per cent boost. Although total revenue from its wagering and media arm had a slight increase at 0.8 per cent, this was offset by a three per cent decline in earnings. Speaking at Tabcorp's 2020/21 half-year results presentation, managing director and

chief executive David Attenborough reiterated there had been interest from other companies looking to buy its underperforming wagering arm. Entain, which owns Ladbrokes, has been linked with a rumoured \$3 billion deal, while Apollo, a US private equity firm, has also bid. Tabcorp said it had received a number of unsolicited approaches and proposals, with the details to remain confidential with them indicative and non-binding. "There has been considerable commentary in the market about our wagering and media business. We have confirmed we have received a number of proposals and unsolicited approaches in relation to a potential transaction involving this business," the company said in a statement. "They are also highly conditional and subject to numerous requirements such as due diligence, financing and various regulatory and racing industry approvals. The board will take the appropriate time to carefully consider all of the relevant issues and strategic options that arise in respect to these matters."

## Tripp takes stake in BetMakers

High-profile Australian bookmaker Matt Tripp is set to take a \$25 million stake in BetMakers, which is listed on the Australian Stock Exchange. The wagering software and data services company confirmed Tripp's involvement yesterday, signaling his return to the wagering industry after selling his share in BetEasy last year. Subject to obtaining shareholder approval at an upcoming extraordinary general meeting, Tripp will invest \$25 million at an issue price of \$0.70 per share, resulting in the issue of approximately 35.7 million shares. "We are thrilled to have secured Matt Tripp's backing, both in the form of a significant investment in the company and also as a key advisor on strategic and transformational deals that he will now pursue," BetMakers chief executive officer Todd Buckingham told Racing.com. Tripp added: "I am delighted to invest into the company and take on a role to assist in growing the business at scale globally. I see clear opportunities to support that growth through inorganic and organic deals both in Australia and internationally."

## NEW ZEALAND

## Second for Belardo

Haunui Farm shuttle stallion Belardo (Lope De Vega) sired his second individual southern hemisphere winner yesterday when Midnight Rocket (2 c ex Midnight Breaker by Housebuster) made a successful debut at Te Aroha. The Stephen Marsh-trained juvenile showed ability in a number of trials prior to his first racecourse outing and he justified his position as the odds-on market leader with a long-neck success over La Dolce Vita (Per Incanto). Danger Strykes (Astern) was another length and a quarter adrift in third. Midnight Rocket was bought at Book 2 of the NZB National Yearling Sale at Karaka last year, realising \$50,000 to Todd Pollard and his trainer having been sold through the Haunui draft. His yearling brother was offered by Woburn Farm at the same auction last month, being passed in on a reserve of \$80,000. Midnight Rocket is a half-brother to the 2015 Karaka Million 2YO (RL, 1200m) winner Hardline (Showcasing), while he joins Avonallo as southern hemisphere winners for Belardo, with the latter having opened his account in the Welcome Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Riccarton in November. Belardo has sired five individual stakes winners worldwide, headlined by Group 2 winner Isabella Giles, while he stood at Haunui for a fee of \$10,000 (plus GST) last year.

## Johnson brings up 1000th winner

Midnight Rocket was the second leg of a treble on the Te Aroha card for Danielle Johnson, whose victory in the opening Apparelmaster Waikato 1400 aboard the Jamie Richards-trained Feelin' Fancy (Rip Van Winkle) proved a landmark success as her 1000th career winner. The premiership-leading rider emulated her father, Peter Johnson, who rode 1370 winners in New Zealand as part of a long and distinguished career. While unable to be on course to celebrate the victory with his daughter, he was able to watch her reach the milestone remotely at his South Auckland property. "I was out on the farm and I was able to watch it, it was bloody brilliant," he said.

"It was great to see her get it." The Johnsons are potentially the first father-daughter duo to break the 1000-winner landmark globally, although Peter said he was more animated watching his daughter attain the milestone than he was when he reached the figure himself. "It was very exciting watching her get it," he said.

## Milford's Derby hopes go on the line

Stephen Marsh is excited about the New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) credentials of Milford (Savabeel), who will continue on his path to the Group 1 feature when he lines up in the Avondale Guineas (Gr 2, 2100m) at Ellerslie on Saturday. The promising colt broke his maiden in black-type company last start, producing a strong staying effort to win the Salver (Listed, 2100m) at the same track on January 10, and Marsh said the three-year-old has thrived since. "He's had a little break, and we took him for an exhibition gallop last week, and he's worked well since. He's going to go great, but he'll be at his peak for the Derby," Marsh said. "I think he's improved again and I'm really liking what he's doing." Marsh has made use of gear changes to get the best out of Milford and said the addition of side winkers appeared to help him at his last start. "You know, he's a colt, he's got a bit of a wandering mind, and the winkers gave him that little bit more concentration," Marsh said. "Opie (Bosson) rode him at Te Rapa at a mile and said that if he had the side winkers on he might have pulled out that bit extra and won, so we slapped them on and he duly obliged at Ellerslie."

## Avondale meeting to go ahead at Ellerslie

Despite Auckland returning to Level 2 Covid-19 restrictions, Saturday's Avondale Guineas and Cup meeting will be run at Ellerslie as planned. However, access to the racecourse will be limited, so while owners and members are permitted to attend the general public are not. More information can be found [here](#).

## Carston launches three-pronged Southland attack

Riccarton trainer Andrew Carston will launch a three-pronged assault on the Southland Guineas (Listed, 1600m) at Ascot Park on Saturday. The final leg of the southern Guineas triple crown series has opened with the absence of Showemhowitsdone (Showcasing), who landed the first two legs, and Carston's charge will be led by Gone With The Wind (Sebring), who flew home to finish third in the Dunedin Guineas (Listed, 1500m) at Wingatui on February 6. "I am really happy with her," he said. "She has come through Dunedin in good order. It was a super run. She settled back last and hit the line strong." Gone With The Wind has drawn barrier five at the weekend and she will once again be ridden by Chris Johnson. "She has got a good barrier this week, which is definitely going to help," Carston said. "She is just a filly who is a work in progress. She has taken a little bit of time to work it out, but she has always had ability. The step-up to a mile will suit her and the weather looks good, so that will help." Gone With The Wind will be joined by her maiden stablemates Milford Sound (Ocean Park) and Allasera (Zacinto) on Saturday. "Milford Sound went super at Dunedin last start," Carston said. "He came from last to run fourth. He is a horse who has a sense of timing about him. He is just getting it all together and he is definitely looking for the mile. He has drawn one, so he is going to get every chance. I can't fault him at all." Carston continued: "Allasera has drawn the worst out of the three of them. He is going to need a bit of luck from barrier 13. He is a nice horse who has done everything right and is going the right way. He is definitely not out of it."



## Vale Sam Brosnan

Former studmaster and trainer Sam Brosnan has passed away aged 99. Brosnan, father of successful trainers Mark, Peter and Maryann Brosnan, trained a host of winners from their former Oaklands Stud base. Brosnan stood a number of successful stallions including Palm Beach, Belmura, St Puckle and Neanderthal, the latter sire of 13-time winner Our Countess, placed in both the New Zealand and Wellington Cups and dam of Great Northern Hurdle (4190m) winner Star Count (Star Wolf). Our Countess was also the granddam of 2011 Great Northern Hurdle winner Southern Countess (Stark South), who was trained by Peter Brosnan for Sam and his late wife, Marj. St Puckle was the sire of Lloyd Williams' first Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner What A Nuisance, in addition to Group 1 winners Oopik and Kenann. Brosnan was noted as a trainer of jumpers, while he also trained Lady Sue (St Puckle) to win the Avondale Championship Stakes

(Gr 2, 2000m). A service to celebrate the life of Brosnan will be held in the Rosa Chapel in Matamata at 1:30pm today.

# IT'S IN THE BLOOD

## TREVOR MARSHALLSEA'S IN-DEPTH PEDIGREE ANALYSIS

**S**ometimes looks can be deceptive. But sometimes results can be too, especially when there's a learned eye involved.

Linda Monds, who bought the famed Tyreel Stud in 2014 and became the breeder of Everest (1200m) winner Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt), went to the Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale in 2016 to expand her breeding stock. Among others, she had her eye on a mare named Couredge (Show A Heart).

She'd done precious little on the track, claiming a Wyong maiden in 2013 among ten starts for Chris Waller, but was from a tidy family. She was also in foal to Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) winner Shamus Award (Snitzel). Moreover, she had a weanling, by Choisir (Danehill Dancer), at the same sale. Monds cast her eye over him, very much liked what she saw, and her mind was made up to go hard for Couredge when she entered the ring.

But she wasn't the only one.

"I had to fight pretty hard for her," Monds tells *It's In The Blood*. "There were a lot of people there who'd identified her as a mare they'd like in their band."

It took some, err, courage, but Monds won out, purchasing the then six-year-old Couredge for \$190,000.

"She didn't do a lot on the racetrack, but she's a lovely looking mare herself, and I'd checked out the Choisir yearling and he was an outstanding type. When you see what they can produce, you can have a fair bit of confidence that they'll do it again," Monds says.

"Plus, she was a Show A Heart mare – I didn't have one of them – so I just felt that she was a great outcross, and in foal to Shamus Award, and just felt I liked that mating."

Still, some results have been encouraging, but others less so.

Couredge's first foal, for her previous owners, became the Smart Missile (Fastnet Rock) gelding Smartedge, who has won five from 31 for Team Snowden, including four in town, before moving north to the Tony Gollan stable.

A few months after Monds bought her, Couredge threw her Shamus Award colt. Fetching Monds \$150,000 when sold to Darby Racing at the 2018 Inglis Classic sale, he's become the now four-year-old gelding named Academy – winner of five from 16 for Warwick Farm trainer Mark Newnham, including three in town.

Following his birth, the first thing Monds did was send Couredge back to Choisir, hoping for something that might look as attractive as that weanling. In September, 2017, a filly arrived.

Though two years apart, the two full siblings began racing around the same time.

That weanling, who fetched a hefty \$325,000 as a yearling at the 2017 Magic Millions Gold Coast sale, became a Hong Kong gelding called Moon Peaks, who so far has found more troughs. Debuting in November, 2019, he had 13 starts for one placing, finally breaking through for a win last Boxing Day, and now has a record of 16: 1-1-1.

Thankfully for Monds, her judgment has been validated by his little sister, who's turned out quite differently. Sold, again to Darby Racing, on the Gold Coast in 2019 for \$160,000, she also went to Newnham and was named Every Rose.

A striking chestnut with four white socks and a broad white blaze, she won her only attempt at a barrier trial, at Warwick Farm, and then, a month before Moon Peaks' modest debut in Hong Kong, she won the Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) on debut at Randwick.

She was placed in stakes class at her next two starts but unplaced in her next four, amid



light preparations as she grew into her skin. But last Saturday at Randwick, resuming from a spell, the three-year-old gave a loud sign of some possibly greater glories ahead. First up from a spell and defying a \$26 price, reflecting her mixed form, she crossed from gate 14 of 14 to lead, kicked clear at the top of the straight and fought doggedly to win by a neck in the Light Fingers Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m).

"She was always that tough looking type, just a really solid girl from day one," Monds says.

"She's got such a strong hindquarter, which is what I'd seen in Moon Peaks as well as a weanling. But I saw Every Rose win on Saturday and just saw a different horse to earlier on. She's a lot more mature and just looked like she wanted to be there, and she definitely wanted to win that race.

"I'd never make a trainer because I'd have probably withdrawn her, being a wet track from a wide gate and her first run back," she adds with a laugh. "But Mark Newnham felt very confident she'd run a good race. Plus she got a damn good ride by Josh Parr. He rode her like she was the best horse in the race.

"When I bought Couredge, I needed to increase my broodmare band at all different levels. I just thought she was a good middle-level mare. She had a nice appearance herself, she produced a nice physical article, and it was always my goal to purchase at all different levels, so she fitted into that. But I think she's raised the bar a bit on herself now."

More recently, Monds "added some leg" by breeding a Hinchinbrook (Fastnet Rock) filly from the mare – which Darby backed up again to buy for \$250,000 last Easter – and which is now in work with Newnham as Brook's Edge. Then a Hellbent (I Am Invincible) filly fell to Greg Hickman on the Gold Coast last month for \$150,000.

Couredge now has an Exceed And Excel (Danehill) weanling colt on the ground, and

is in foal to the same stallion again, a mating Monds believes "hits the nail on the head".

Looking deeper into Every Rose's pedigree, there was more cause for optimism than mere looks.

Couredge's dad Show A Heart (Brave Warrior), who formerly stood in Queensland, continued to perform as a broodmare sire from limited opportunities. He's currently 28th on that table in Australia, his daughters' progeny also include Sovereign Award (Shamus Award) and smart two-year-old Extreme Warrior (Extreme Choice).

Couredge's dam Alternative Edge, a two-time city winner by Rory's Jester (Crown Jester), was a prolific producer, with more than a dozen named foals. Her second one Youth's Edge, a gelding by Jeune (Kalaglow), won seven races including over 2500 metres in Listed class in Adelaide. Her fifth was the mare Vintedge (Flying Spur), who won two black-type races including the Matriarch Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) of 2011.

Though now 25, Alternative Edge still has her own offspring racing, with Sausedge – also

by Shamus Award – a Rosehill winner who placed twice in Sydney last month.

Alternative Edge herself had the pedigree to do well, as a sister – out of city-winning Godswalk (Dancer's Image) mare God's Girl – to Racer's Edge, a multiple stakes winner who claimed the CF Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) of 1996.

God's Girl was out of How Bright, named for her sire Bright Finish (Zilzal) and a certain mare named How Now. That daughter of In The Purple (Right Royal) was of course an outstanding galloper of the 1970s, winning a host of races including four Group 1 equivalents in the Caulfield Cup (2400m), Caulfield Stakes (2000m), AJC Oaks (2400m), and VATC Underwood Stakes (2000m).

For Every Rose to approach the status of her fifth dam will take some doing. But going on Saturday's win, her future looks how bright now?

# Charity Fun charges into Derby contention with brilliant Happy Valley win

**D**anny Shum is considering an audacious tilt at the BMW Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) in March with Charity Fun (War Command) after the Irish import's stunning victory in the Class 3 Hung To Handicap (2200m) at Happy Valley last night.

Contesting only his second race in Hong Kong, Charity Fun surged to a four-length win over Xiang Bai Qi (Azamour) and Arrogant (Ocean Park) under Karis Teetan, prompting Shum to ponder making a late Derby entry for the son of War Command (War Front).

In the midst of another excellent season, Shum was impressed by the authority of the win after the lightly-raced gelding rattled over the final 400 meters in 22.7 seconds.

"He is a good horse, even in his first start, he was amazing for the last 80 metres," Shum said.

"You don't see many northern hemisphere horses come here and run the 1650 metres in their first start like he did, he looked like a superstar.

"So, I was pretty comfortable coming to this race, even though it is a big step up from 1650 metres to 2200 metres. In Ireland he was racing over 2000 metres so I knew he could do it, there were some good trials at Sha Tin so it was all very good going into it, he is just a nice horse.

"The owner gave me one instruction and that was to win by as far as possible because he wants to get the rating up to enter into the Derby – that is the target.

"We have to see – we will need another race at Sha Tin to see what he does there to give me more confidence.

"I will sit back, talk with Karis and the owner and have a think about it, we know 2000 metres is no problem for him.

"The only problem would be going from a Happy Valley Class 3 to a race like the Derby. It is not easy so we need to think very carefully."

Teetan was similarly taken by the performance.

"The first time, he surprised me by the way he finished off the race (when fourth to Wealthy Delight over 1650 metres at Happy Valley on 20 January)," he said.

"I knew there would be some improvement coming from that because I don't think he was near ready first time but his ability made him run so well.

"We trialled him at Sha Tin and he trialled really nicely – today we had a perfect run but you could see how much he had improved.

"He was travelling nicely and when I put pressure on him, he responded nicely – he could be a nice little horse coming along."

Formerly known as Pontchateau in Ireland, Charity Fun had only two starts before export, winning a 2000-metre maiden at Fairyhouse for Paddy Twomey in June last year.

John Size will consider backing up Scores Of Fun (Reward For Effort) next week at Happy Valley to chase ultimate glory in the DBS x Manulife Million Challenge after the sprinter moved to within striking distance of claiming the HK\$650,000 series first prize with a narrow success in the first section of the Class 3 Hip Wo Handicap (1200m).

Collecting 15 points for the victory under Teetan, Scores Of Fun improved his overall tally to 57 – nine points shy of series leader Grateful Heart (Written Tycoon) on 66.

Size, whose double on Wednesday night left him only one win behind Caspar Fownes (43-42) in the trainers' championship, said he would assess Scores Of Fun over the next few days.

"We'll see how he pulls up," Size said. "Anything's a possibility."

If Size sends the chestnut back to the city circuit after his slender win over Shouson (Star Witness), he could overhaul Grateful Heart if he is successful next Wednesday. However, Grateful Heart is also set to run next week and will bid for a fifth win for the season.

Igniting (Starspangledbanner) (40) won his third race in the series by taking out the second section of the Hip Wo Handicap (1200m), meaning Grateful Heart and Scores Of Fun can't be displaced from the top two.

Igniting was the final leg of Matthew Poon's treble after he had earlier secured a race-to-race double with the David Hall-trained Red Brick Fighter (Artie Schiller) in the third section

of the Class 4 Mut Wah Handicap (1200m) and the Dennis Yip-trained Joy Avenue (Echoes Of Heaven), who was heavily backed late before landing the Class 5 Wai Yip Handicap (1000m).

Zac Purton and Size revelled in a rare collaboration as Savaquin (Savebeel) notched an emphatic victory in the Class 3 Hoi Yuen Handicap, the Savabeel (Zabeel) gelding's second successive triumph over 1650 metres at the city circuit.

Purton replaced suspended Joao Moreira on the promising four-year-old.

Jimmy Ting hopes to unveil more stable newcomers after A La King (Denman), a Privately Purchased Griffin, claimed the second section of the Class 4 Mut Wah Handicap (1200m).

"I think he's only 70 or 80 per cent fit – he's still a little bit fat," Ting said. "This field was a bit weak and we were lucky to have a good draw (gate one) – it helped him a lot.

"I think he will improve, he's still very green.

"There are some more PPGs coming up, I've got some nice horses in the stable."

Jockey Neil Callan had watched the Denman (Lonhro) gelding trial at Conghua Training Centre and approached Ting to enquire about riding him.

"Jimmy kindly he let me have a trial on him and he gave me a nice feel in the trial. He just felt like there was plenty to offer. He's a nice, robust type. He has a bit of scope," the Irishman said.

"It wasn't a very strong race but he's a likeable type. He had a good blow after the race. He should improve off it."

Tony Cruz maintained his strong mid-season impetus with Mercurial (Hussonet), who overcame a wide gate under Jerry Chau to

post a tough win in the second section of the Class 4 Mut Wah Handicap (1200m).

Hong Kong racing continues at Sha Tin on Sunday with the running of the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (Gr 1, 1400m), Citi Hong Kong Gold Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) and Hong Kong Classic Cup (Gr 1, 1800m).

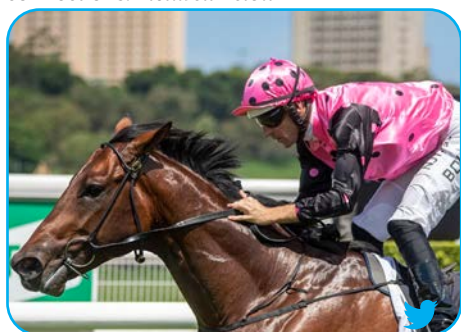

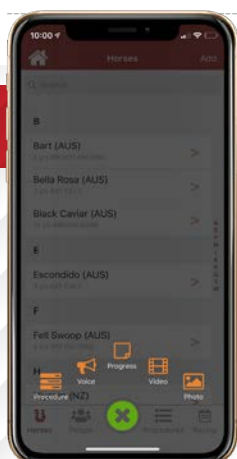
