International buyers hold key to success of NZB Ready to Run Sale

*Auction house embraces online technology in hope of
canvassing diverse market at two-year-old sale*

New Zealand Bloodstock's biggest foray into the digital marketplace will be put to the test at its Ready to Run Sale as the company attempts to maintain what it says is its place as the premier southern hemisphere two-year-old auction when it starts today.

There is an underlying feeling that the sale could exceed tempered expectations if the

main export countries, primarily Australia and Hong Kong, embrace the online technology as many bloodstock investors have done in increasing numbers at Australasia since April this year.

Demand for stock to race in Hong Kong remains strong, with the tried horse market particularly "hot" in recent months, and the NZB sale has traditionally been a significant source of higher end horses purchased to head to Asia.

Australian-based owners and trainers will also play an important role in the market, with last year's buyers including expatriate trainer Bjorn Baker, Leon and Troy Corstens, Mark Newnham, Stuart Kendrick, Aquis Farm and agents Andrew Williams, John Foote, Jim Clarke and Cameron Cooke, among others.

NZB sales manager Danny Rolston is optimistic that the key international markets will be active at the sale, but again cautioned vendors about keeping their reserves at realistic levels in an unprecedented period for the industry.

If the scenario eventuates, it could hurt the clearance rate, which in 2019 saw 257 horses changing hands at a clearance rate of 74 per cent.

"All our usual players are comfortable to buy via remote bidding and with agents on the ground, so we've got positive signs that Hong Kong is going to be in operation," Rolston told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

"In Sydney (at the Inglis sale), they were good at the top-end although they were not as obvious at the Gold Coast (at Magic Millions), but they were there and the feedback we're getting is that they are still playing.

"However, it is a bit more unknown with Australia. The inquiry is good, but it is still hard to read whether that is going to cover the bulk of the catalogue or how selective they are going to be."

Five of the top ten highest-priced two-year-olds sold last year were purchased by Hong Kong buyers while Cranbourne-based expatriate New Zealand trainers Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young have also been active for a number of years in the two-year-old market. They bought 12 lots at last year's sale.

There will be 243 horses going through the ring over the next two days after the 311-lot catalogue was hit with 68 withdrawals.

Agent Robert Dawe believes buyers from the premier Asian racing jurisdiction of Hong Kong will be prominent over the next two days.

"The nice horses will sell themselves and I expect the online from Hong Kong to be very strong," he said.

"The vendors can't hide anything these days, they have learned to be transparent."

New Zealand agent Bruce Perry has fielded inquiries from a number of Australian parties seeking assistance in inspecting horses at Karaka.

"I have bought one or two here in the past but I am mostly a yearling buyer. However, I have had some contact with Australia so I am here to look at a few," Perry said.

“There are some really nice horses here ... and the smaller catalogue might help the middle market for the buyers who want a horse but can't compete at the top end.”

One advantage NZB may have over its Australian rivals is the fact that the sale is being held over two days, meaning it could be easier for the buyers to reassess the market overnight and reconsider horses who were initially passed in on day one.

Kiwi agent Bevan Smith, who spent almost four months in Australia earlier this year due to international border travel restrictions, made the decision to return to New Zealand after last month's Inglis Ready 2 Race Sale in order to attend the Karaka auction.

In doing so, he was forced to bypass last week's Magic Millions 2YOs In Training Sale.

“I've seen some nice lots, very happy with what I have seen. Also, I have looked at almost every lot in the sale, although I started with the breeze ups as my base,” Smith said.

“Interest from my Australian and Singapore clients has been such that I spent two weeks in quarantine in order to be here. As a relatively new agent, I have to do the work to become established.”

Smith bought four two-year-olds at Inglis' Sydney sale for clients.

Another relatively new Kiwi agent is Dylan Johnson, who formerly worked for Westbury Stud, and he has been on the grounds this week compiling short lists.

“There's plenty of positives to be gained from the sale. As agents, we can benefit from the technology and information now available,” Johnson said.

“The vendors have done a great job regarding how they market Ready To Run two-year-olds. The quality is here.”

Leading New Zealand racing identities, Te Akau's David Ellis and trainers Murray Baker and Tony Pike, were on the ground yesterday inspecting horses.

Experienced agent Barry Lee said the sales ring body blows could be felt by those vendors who had purchased yearlings at strong New Zealand and Australian markets before the ramifications of Covid-19 had taken effect.

“There might be a few blood noses where vendors have bought in an up market and are selling in an iffy market,” said Lee, the brother-in-law of Sir Patrick Hogan.

“We'll see soon enough. It is definitely a sale in which buyers buy on type. Some of the pedigree pages are a bit thin.

“The good ones will sell well, as they always do.”

Rolston said it was important that the long-term traders were able to sell their horses to allow them to reinvest in stock at next year's yearling sales.

“The guys who have been pinhooking, they realise that it is not a straight-forward year, so we are expecting reserves to be very realistic,” he said.

“The guys who are here, they do want to keep trading, so the horses will be on the market.

“It certainly should be a great opportunity for buyers to invest at great value this year.”

Day one starts at 1pm New Zealand time and the sale can be streamed via the nzb.co.nz website.

Inspirational Girl holds Railway favouritism

Last night's barrier draw for Saturday's Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Ascot had little effect on the market with the Bob Peters-owned mare Inspirational Girl (Reliable Man) remaining the favourite after being allocated gate 11. Inspirational Girl, who won the Asian Beau Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) last time out, will come into barrier eight should the emergencies fail to gain a start. The five-year-old will attempt to give Peters, trainers Grant and Alana Williams and jockey William Pike three straight Railway Stakes wins after the victories of Galaxy Star (Redoute's Choice) and Regal Power (Pierro) and was the \$3.40 favourite last night. The other main hopes - Lee Steere Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) quinella Kay Cee (Playing God) and Red Can Man (Gingerbread Man) and last weekend's Ascot Gold Cup (Listed, 1800m) victor Too Close The Sun (Carlton House) - drew 13, ten and 16 respectively.

Zahra to ride Affair To Remember

Dan O'Sullivan will rely on leading jockey Mark Zahra as the trainer bids to land his hometown feature for the first time when Affair To Remember (Toronado) tackles Saturday's Ballarat Cup. Regular rider Michael Poy, who partnered the mare to win the Matriarch Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) last start, failed in his bid to have a suspension overturned on Monday, with Poy's manager Reece Murphy pointing O'Sullivan to another client of his in Zahra. "In the present situation it was hard to find a jockey who could stay with her and he (Poy) managed to do so for four starts which helped us a lot," O'Sullivan said. "The

owners liked the way he rode her and wanted to stick with him. Last start, in the run I thought she would get there but it took the entire Flemington straight and the last hop for her to do so." The Ballarat Cup will be run for \$500,000 for the second year in a row and has received a strong set of nominations. "It shows if you put up the good money the good horses will come," O'Sullivan said. "There are Group 1 winners nominated and there are horses in very good form. Affair To Remember needs big, spacious tracks so Ballarat will suit her. Hopefully she can draw a barrier and settle a bit closer in the run."

One More Try for Cup glory

Once again opposing Affair To Remember will be Matriarch fourth One More Try (Dane Shadow), who will finally get a crack at the Ballarat Cup after circumstances prompted her to miss the race the last two years. Trainer Matt Cumani scratched One More Try in 2018 after she drew the outside gate, while 2019 saw her withdrawn due to bone chips in her tibia. "Last year I had high hopes but because of the bone chips we had to get them removed and give her a long spell," Cumani said. "She's racing really well and desperately needs a change of luck. At her last start she would have gone close except for bad luck. She's jumping well but then is slow into stride and that's not helping her." Craig Williams will ride One More Try.

Quiet ride tipped for Al Galayel

A change of tactics for Al Galayel (Zoffany) has been touted as the JRA Cup (Gr 3, 2040m) winner looks to bounce back in the Ballarat Cup after a subpar effort in the Coongy Cup (Gr 3, 2000m) last time out. Al Galayel settled second in the field of eight in the Coongy Cup and,

despite a soft tempo, the leaders weakened with the Ciaran Maher and David Eustace trainee fading to sixth. "Last start we rode him forward but it's just not his pattern," Maher told Racing.com. "They ran easy sectionals, but he'd rather be the horse descending on them. The big track will suit him. I reckon he looks fantastic. The gap between runs won't worry him at all. He hasn't missed any work. He's based at Ballarat and normally comes to Caulfield to do his gallops then goes to the beach for a few days and comes home." Al Galayel is one of six Ballarat Cup entries for the stable, with returning Zipping Classic (Gr 2, 2400m) winner Southern France (Galileo) and last weekend's Sandown Stakes (Gr 3, 1500m) victor Junipal (Reset) joining Al Galayel as safely in the field should the stable decide to run.

The Astrologist out to book Gold Coast trip

The Leon and Troy Corstens-trained The Astrologist (Zoustar) will line up in Saturday's Magic Millions 3&4YO Classic (1100m) with the aim of securing his spot for the auction house's lucrative meeting on the Gold Coast. The ultra-consistent four-year-old has not finished out of the placings in 18 months, with a runner-up effort in the MSS Security Sprint (Listed, 1200m) his latest appearance at Flemington, after winning a Benchmark 64 event first up at Geelong. A win in Saturday's Ballarat contest would almost guarantee the gelding a place. "He's really well, we've freshened him up nicely down at Geelong," Corstens said. "He's going to be much better around the corner, he got lost up the straight, I don't know why he did that, that was a bit unusual because he has raced well up there before but I think back around the bend, the 1110 metres, staying nice and sharp,

it just looks a really nice race for him. He's got a little bit of weight but probably deserves it in this kind of field, looking forward to see what he can do. We'll see how we go on Saturday and hopefully we can get another win next to his name and then we'll just plot a course to try and get him up to the Gold Coast."

Firm Gong to suit Brandenburg

John Sargent is expecting a better effort from Brandenburg (Burgundy) in the \$1 million The Gong (1600m) at Kembla Grange on Saturday with his charge expected to relish a firmer surface. Brandenburg finished seventh in the \$7.5 million Golden Eagle (1500m) last start but Sargent believes the persistent rain that caused the track to be downgraded to a Heavy 9 played against him. "It was too wet for him in the Golden Eagle but still a good run considering he was never on the track," trainer John Sargent said. "That bit of rain 20 minutes before the race really made it hard for him. Hopefully we'll get a good draw on Saturday. He's well in at the weights and he'll go into the race in tip-top order. He had a good hitout on the Polytrack (Tuesday) and he finished off really strongly." Brandenburg's half-sister Luvaluva (Mastercraftsman) finished sixth in the inaugural The Gong last year, with the Group 3 winner and Group 1 placegetter now in foal to Lonhro (Octagonal).

Wolf to defend Gong title

Chris Waller is lining up a four-strong attack on The Gong, led by inaugural winner Mister Sea Wolf (Amadeus Wolf). Like last year, when he won the Shannon Stakes (Gr 2, 1500m) a couple of starts before his win in The Gong, Mister Sea Wolf enters the Kembla feature after a spring in which he took the Chelmsford Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m). "The only negative is, we thought last year it was going to be incredibly tough carrying 59 kilograms and chances are he's probably going to get lumbered with 60 kilograms this year," Waller's assistant trainer and racing manager Charlie Duckworth said. "But the fact James McDonald is happy to stick with him and ride him again is a bit of a positive." Also set to run are French Group 1 winner Olmedo (Declaration Of War), who will head

to the Hong Kong international meeting after Saturday, while the stable also has Reloaded (Snitzel) and Savacool (Savabeel) entered.

Naleigh and Beau Rossa could head east

Will Clarcken is keen to take last-start winners Naleigh (Nostradamus) and Beau Rossa (Unencumbered) across to Victoria this weekend, but he will also accept with the pair at Morphetville and will study acceptances before making a final decision. "Both won well at Morphetville on Melbourne Cup day and then had nice soft trials at Murray Bridge last week," Clarcken told Racing.com. "I could not be any happier with either horse and it will be great to get them to Victoria as they are both Super Vobis horses. Naleigh is entered for a three-year-old fillies race at Moonee Valley on Friday night, which with the bonus is extremely appealing. The Vobis Gold Eureka Stockade at Ballarat on Saturday is the race we are aiming the other bloke at and there is good money up for grabs there. Damian Lane is locked in to ride the horses if they head across."

Bella Vella back one final time

Clarcken's stable star Bella Vella (Commands) will have one final preparation with the stable before heading to the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale next year. Bella Vella was originally purchased as a yearling from the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, meaning she is eligible for their January showcase meeting, but she ended up with Clarcken after selling for \$22,500 through the Inglis Digital platform. Since joining Clarcken, she has earned more than \$750,000. "She will be going to the broodmare sale at the Gold Coast in the middle of next year so this will be her last hurrah," Clarcken told Racing.com. "At the moment the Magic Millions Sprint in January or the Oakleigh Plate in February are two races we have in our minds as possible goals."

Kemalpasa earns break

In-form sprinter Kemalpasa (Magnus) will head for a break ahead of an ambitious campaign in 2021. The Richard and Chantelle Jolly-trained Kemalpasa returned to his best by winning the Linlithgow Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) for

the second straight year before taking out the Kevin Heffernan Stakes (Gr 3, 1300m) at Sandown last weekend. "The horse is in great order and in fantastic form but really we have run out of races for him now," Richard Jolly told Racing.com. "We couldn't get him to Perth for the Winterbottom Stakes so then the consideration was whether to keep him going for the Standish at Flemington or head to the Gold Coast for the Sprint up there on Magic Millions day. However, in the end we think a little break now is best and then when he comes back if his form warrants it, he can have a crack at some of the nice Group 1 races in Melbourne. One race that obviously stands out is the Newmarket because of his terrific form up the straight at Flemington but we think even a race like the Futurity might suit him."

Sooboog filly wins trial

Kitchwin Hills' Sooboog (Snitzel) is yet to have his first winner, with only one starter to his name to date. However, that first winner may not be far away judging by Princess Spice's trial at Warwick Farm yesterday. The Tash Burleigh-trained Princess Spice clearly recorded the fastest time of the three juvenile heats over 803 metres, showing plenty of natural ability to lead from start to finish. Not asked for an effort by Shaun Guymer, the Sooboog filly held off Hide Your Heart (Sebring) by a long head; Jervis Bay (Written Tycoon), a half-sister to Starspangledbanner (Choisir), was three lengths away in third. Hide Your Heart had already trialed, proving too speedy for subsequent Max Lees Classic (900m) heroine Sliders (Street Boss) at Randwick on October 30. Sooboog stands for \$13,200 (inc GST) in 2020.

Eleven Eleven trials well

Magic Millions 3YO Guineas (RL, 1400m) winner Eleven Eleven (Fastnet Rock) trialed successfully at Warwick Farm yesterday as he edges closer to his raceday return. Eleven Eleven, who is set to tackle next Saturday's Starlight Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Rosehill, was ridden quietly by Keagan Latham over the 1200-metre trip and was able to coast through the line, finishing one and three-quarter lengths off the winner in fifth. He is being primed for a return to the Gold Coast and will likely tackle the Magic Millions Cup (1400m) on January 16.

Boblee up to distance challenge

David Vandyke will step Boblee (Shooting to Win) up to 1200 metres for the first time at Ipswich today and he is confident the four-year-old can succeed over the longer trip. Boblee's four career wins have all come over 1000 metres, but Vandyke is keen to stretch the son of Shooting To Win (Northern Meteor) in a Class 5 Handicap today. "He doesn't have to lead and can take a sit in his races," Vandyke said. "He gives me every indication he'll handle the trip even though he's never been over it."

TBV announces Award Winners

Thoroughbred Breeders Victoria (TBV) have announced their award winners in a virtual celebration of the Victorian industry. For a fifth consecutive year, Woodside Park's Written Tycoon (Iglesia) won the IRT Champion Victorian sire award. Of the other headline awards, Flit (Medaglia D'Oro) was named TAB Champion Victorian-bred racehorse and Godolphin landed the TAB Champion Victorian breeder award. Godolphin's Andy Makiv said: "I really have to thank the team at Darley Northwood. Without James Manning and his team, we would not have the results on the track and would not be receiving the awards we are tonight. See a full list of the awards below.

Lane suspended

Damian Lane has received an eight-meeting suspension for careless riding, after falling foul of the rules while riding Astro Ruby (Nostradamus) in a three-year-old maiden at Benalla yesterday. Astro Ruby finished runner-up and stewards deemed Lane to have shifted inwards on his mount when insufficiently clear during the final 150 metres of the 1106-metre contest. It was the second suspension Lane has suffered in recent weeks, having received a nine-meeting ban for his ride on Order Of Command (Squamosa) in the Linlithgow Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) on October 31. His latest suspension will commence after Pakenham's meeting on November 26, with Lane able to return for Moonee Valley's meeting on December 4.

Setback for Dunn

Sidelined jockey Dwayne Dunn will not ride again in 2020 after a medical specialist last week dashed his hopes of a return to the saddle. Dunn was injured in a barrier incident at Moonee Valley in September when Shot Of Irish (Canford Cliffs) reared as the gates opened, with the rider seriously fracturing his neck after hitting his head on the stalls. "It's just not healing the way they would have liked," Dunn told Racing.com. "It's a setback for sure as it is still quite painful." He said that a best-case scenario would see him return early in 2021, but a December appointment will determine whether that is feasible.

Persistence paying off for Voorham

Apprentice jockey Teagan Voorham was "stoked" after reducing her riding claim with a double at Morphetville Park on Saturday. Claiming three kilograms, Teagan produced excellent front-running rides to salute aboard Savatoxl (Kuroshio) and City Beats (Ilovethiscity), which followed her win on Journica (Good Journey) at the track five days earlier. "The last couple months have been on the quieter side," Teagan said. "So I was stoked with the results. I only had two wins to go before I lost my three kilogram and Journica knocked one of them off for me. But before that, I'd sort of been sitting on that two since about April, which has been a bit frustrating. So, it's good to finally get rid of it and knock off my three-kilogram claim. I'm down to two kilograms now and hopefully that's the monkey off my back."

Apprentice Wadick injured

Young rider Zac Wadick faces an extended period on the sidelines after he was injured before yesterday's Warwick Farm trials. The 17-year-old, who is yet to have his first raceday ride, came to grief when the John Steinmetz-trained Selective (Excites) reared over and landed on him before the first trial. Wadick was transported to Liverpool Hospital with a suspected pelvic injury, as well as a laceration to his chin. It was later announced that he had fractured both his pelvis and his coccyx, while the chin wound required sutures. He will undergo surgery on his fractured pelvis today.

Rockett warned off for six months

North Queensland jockey Kerry Rockett has been warned off from all Australian racecourses for six months after he provided two urine samples that were from another donor. Rockett was directed to provide urine samples by Queensland Racing Integrity Commission officials at Tolga racecourse, near Cairns, on September 30 and October 12 last year. However, DNA analysis subsequently determined that the samples were not provided by Rockett. The rider was charged with two charges under AR139(1)(b), which states: "A rider breaches these Australian Rules if the rider

refuses or fails to deliver a sample as directed by the Stewards, tampers with, adulterates, alters, substitutes, or in any way hinders the collection of, a sample or attempts to do any of those things." Rockett pled guilty, with QRIC stiping warning him off from any Australian racecourse from November 16 to May 16 next year.

NEW ZEALAND

Media Sensation primed for Breeders'

Peter and Dawn Williams are looking forward to Media Sensation (I Am Invincible) resuming in the Dunstan Feeds Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Pukekohe on Saturday. The Group 1 winner's last raceday appearance was in March, but she has had three trials this preparation and her trainers believe she is primed for her first-up assignment this weekend. "Her trial last week was great, she is ready to race," Peter Williams said. "She has had three trials now so she should be fit enough for it and we are happy with her. She appears to have come up better this year than she did last year." While she is nominated for a number of stakes races over the coming months, Williams said her performance on Saturday will dictate what path she takes. "We will get through Saturday and then decide where we are going with her," he said. "I have got her nominated for some races but we have got to see how she goes on Saturday and that will give us a bit of confidence of where we head next."

Team Anderton heads south

Brian and Shane Anderton will take eight horses south to Ascot Park on Wednesday and are confident they can return with a winner or two. Our Teddy Boy (Onceuponatime) runs in the Waikiwi Tavern and The Foundry Restaurant Handicap (1400m), carrying 57 kilograms with the assistance of apprentice jockey Rahul Beeharry's three-kilogram claim. "He is a wet track horse and we hope we get the sting out of the ground. He is well in himself," Brian Anderton said. "He is going to go out shortly but he has been doing things right." Anderton will run in-form mare Phyllite (Gallant Guru) in the Waxy's Irish Pub Maiden (1200m) at the beginning of the day. "Phyllite, she is a fast

mare," Anderton said. "We are hoping she goes as well as she has been. Every race she has had, she has gone well. She has got a good barrier draw (five) and has everything in her favour and I don't think the soft ground will worry her too much." Regal Girl (Ghibellines), Crispin (Raise The Flag), Heberite (Raise The Flag), Avino (Ghibellines), Step Son (Raise The Flag) and Dante Fire (Raise The Flag) also lineup for the trainers.

Captain Cook next for James and Wellwood stablemates

The Roger James and Robert Wellwood-trained pair of Group 2 winners over the past week — Hypnos (Reliable Man) and Concert Hall (Savabeel) — have both come through their exertions well and will be aimed at the Rydges Wellington Captain Cook Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Trentham on December 5. "Hypnos came straight home (from Christchurch) and went back to the farm. He will come back in early next week and might go to the water treadmill, which we have used successfully with him before," Wellwood said. "Concert Hall is jumping out of her skin. If I wasn't there on Saturday, you wouldn't believe she'd run a race. We will just keep her nice and fresh and she is going really well over the mile now. It looks a nice race for her and it is probably going to be missing a few stars that you might have bumped into earlier in the spring."

Wellwood gets behind the binoculars

Robert Wellwood filled the void as the commentator at the Taupo trials on Monday, after a rostering faux pas. "We turned up first thing as we had one in heat three and they announced over the loudspeaker that because the trials were only put on at the last minute, somebody at the TAB had forgotten to roster on a commentator," Wellwood said. "Gerald Fell (member of the Taupo Club committee) said that if anyone wants to give it a go, come on up to the commentary box. We had one in the third trial, so I went and did that and they kept saying they were in need of a commentator after that, so I thought why not tick it off the bucket list. It was a very boring trial meeting without anybody commenting, so I thought I might as well give

it a crack." Wellwood called at least half a dozen trials and enjoyed the banter with his mates in the tight-knit industry. "It was basically what I could do in between our own horses that were trialling," he said. "I don't know that I am any George Simon, but it is ticked off the bucket list. Everyone had a bit of a chuckle. It was a bit of a laugh but I think I will stick to training. I wasn't that good at it."

ASIA

HK: Shadow Hero wins trial

Dual Group 1 winner Shadow Hero (Pierro) was first past the post in the final of three Hong Kong trials as he prepares for his first Sha Tin start later this month. Shadow Hero, who is now trained by David Hayes, travelled strongly under Zac Purton before taking the 1200-metre heat on the Sha Tin dirt. Among those behind the four-year-old were Nicconi Express (Nicconi), who raced as Weona Nicconi in Australia, as well as former John O'Shea trainee Sea Of Life (Sebring). Shadow Hero is due to have his first Hong Kong start in a Class 1 event over 1600 metres at Sha Tin on November 29.

HK: Classique Legend steps out at Sha Tin

The world's joint-highest rated sprinter Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt) completed his first piece of fast work on the Sha Tin dirt yesterday in preparation for the Hong Kong Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) on December 13. Classique Legend stands equal-fourth in the LONGINES World's Best Racehorse Rankings with a rating of 125 – placing him at the head of the speed division together with the horse he defeated into second in The Everest (1200m), Godolphin's three-time Group 1-winning sprinter Bivouac (Exceed And Excel). "He's got a great way about him, he certainly has a presence, I think he knows he's a little bit special," new trainer Caspar Fownes said. "He's a proper horse and he certainly gives himself a chance to excel at the top-level, which is where he is at now. He's rated joint-number four in the world now, so that's a massive rating and equal highest rated sprinter with Bivouac." The six-time winner is currently completing a mandatory quarantine period, but is able

to exercise on the track once the locally-trained horses have completed their morning trackwork. "With a view to having him ready for the Hong Kong Sprint we kept him quiet while in quarantine in Australia, we didn't want to take a chance to do anything on the track there while I wasn't hands on there," Fownes said. "We'll try our best to get him as fit as we can in the short period of time that we have and we'll have a trial with him and see if we can have him cherry ripe for the big day."

HK: Chilean Group 1 winner debuts

Fresh off a treble at Sha Tin on Saturday, Alexis Badel will partner one of the most intriguing runners at Happy Valley tonight when he rides Panfield (Lookin At Lucky), a three-time Chilean Group 1 winner who steps out in Hong Kong for the first time in the Class 2 Cheung Hong Handicap (1650m). "He's a nice horse, for sure he has great ability and I think he's pretty fit for this race, so I don't see any reason he won't run a good race," Badel said. "Happy Valley, on debut, in Class 2 is never easy but the horse is pretty fit and he's done lots of work leading into this so I expect him to run a good race." As a four-year-old, the Tony Millard trainee is eligible for the 2021 Four-Year-Old Classic Series, should he progress that far, although entering the ranks on a rating of 85 is never easy. "So far he's done everything great, all of his work has been satisfying so I'm looking forward to seeing how well he can go on the race day," Badel said. The Chilean-bred faces off against ten others including fellow South American

Group 1 winner, Butterfield (Setembro Chove), who last season attempted to scale Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m) heights but was only sixth to Golden Sixty (Medaglia d'Oro).

INTERNATIONAL

First for American Devil

Haras du Grand Chesnaie's American Devil (American Post) sired his first stakes winner yesterday when Lupo Nero (3 c ex Okapina by Okawango) took out the Prix Tantieme (Listed, 1600m) on heavy ground at Saint-Cloud. Ridden by Pierre-Charles Boudot, Lupo Nero successfully followed up his win in a conditions race at the track last month, defeating five-year-old Mon Ami L'Ecosais (Orpen) by half a length, with Godolphin's Telemaque (War Front) a further two and a half lengths back in third. American Devil, a Group 3 winner in his racing career, has had 21 winners from 55 runners as a stallion and stood for a fee of €2,500 (approx. AUD\$4,065) in 2020.

Australian buyers active at Arqana

The Andre Fabre-consigned Arapaho (Lope De Vega) (Lot 418) will continue his career in Australia after Mark McStay's Avenue Bloodstock and trainer Bjorn Baker won out at €140,000 (approx. AUD\$227,610). An impressive winner of the Prix du Pont Neuf (Listed, 1400m) in May, Arapaho was bred by Elisabeth Fabre's Ecurie Peregrine and was purchased privately by Coolmore after winning by three lengths on his debut. Flambeur

(Mizzen Mast) (427) is another heading to the southern hemisphere after trainer Matthew Smith landed the Listed winner over the phone with a bid of €100,000 (approx. AUD\$162,580). Also shopping for horses to run in Australia was OTI Racing's John Hammond, who struck for the two highest-priced lots from the Aga Khan Studs consignment. Hammond landed three-year-old colt Ashim (Stormy Atlantic) (346) at €90,000 (approx. AUD\$146,320), who has won twice from six starts and earned a rating of 83 from limited chances. "He's a nice horse on the up and he's coming off a good run," said Hammond. "He's an improving three-year-old and beautifully presented." Also set to represent the same interests is the 91-rated Vardani (Charm Spirit) (394), who is two from three for Alain de Royer-Dupre and is a half-brother to the Aga Khan's excellent stayer Vazirabad (Manduro). "He has good form on fast ground and I thought he was impressive when winning at Chateaubriant," said Hammond, who gave €72,000 (approx. AUD\$117,050) for the three-year-old. "It was firm ground and he came from behind that day."

SPRING CARNIVAL The issues arising

What a delight it was to watch racing from Sandown last Saturday.

What a tragedy it would be if it were to be sold.

Sandown is the best racetrack in Australia (in my opinion). It is the best servant to the Victorian industry.

It generates the most exciting racing which, for whatever reason, translates better on television than any other track and - let's face it - we are doomed to become largely a television sport.

An asset sold is lost forever and invariably regretted.

Peter Le Grand and his Melbourne Racing Club committee can leave a lasting legacy or have history shame them.

The MRC, like all clubs, has a responsibility to the greater good of racing, not simply to their members. If for no other reason than that without strong, vibrant racing they won't have any members to worry about.

Of more immediate concern is racing's social licence and our hold on same which is growing, not fatally but worryingly, more tenuous.

The industry has acted excellently in handling the rehoming of racehorses and few reasonable people now do not fail to understand how well horses are cared for in racing stables.

As a consequence of racing taking better charge of animal welfare, that very issue - which

threatened so darkly in the wake of last year's 7.30 Report - ironically assisted in our push to justify the continuation of racing through this year's pandemic.

However, a number of issues emerged or re-emerged during spring racing which demand action. They were led by the death of Anthony Van Dyck after the Melbourne Cup.

Yes, "today's news is tomorrow's fish and chip wrapper" is as real now as when Friday night's dinner was indeed wrapped in old newspapers.

And "no comment" will readily quell any story.

However, racing cannot afford to take this approach as others will keep the story of Melbourne Cup fatalities and associated breakdowns alive.

Action must be taken.

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing's Victoria Carter told Monday's Asian Racing Federation Webinar: "There are some minority groups with strong views on racing and we would be unwise to ignore them."

This is just one of several social licence concerns which may not yet threaten catastrophe - in fact I'm sure they are well short of that - but they are real and if you don't believe so then I humbly suggest you may need to spend more time outside your racing, social bubble.

The racing industry must acknowledge and act on these issues; reinforce government backing; alter its emphasis on gambling and perhaps - above all - expand and promote its positive contribution to the economy and community.

Among the key issues are:

The whip.

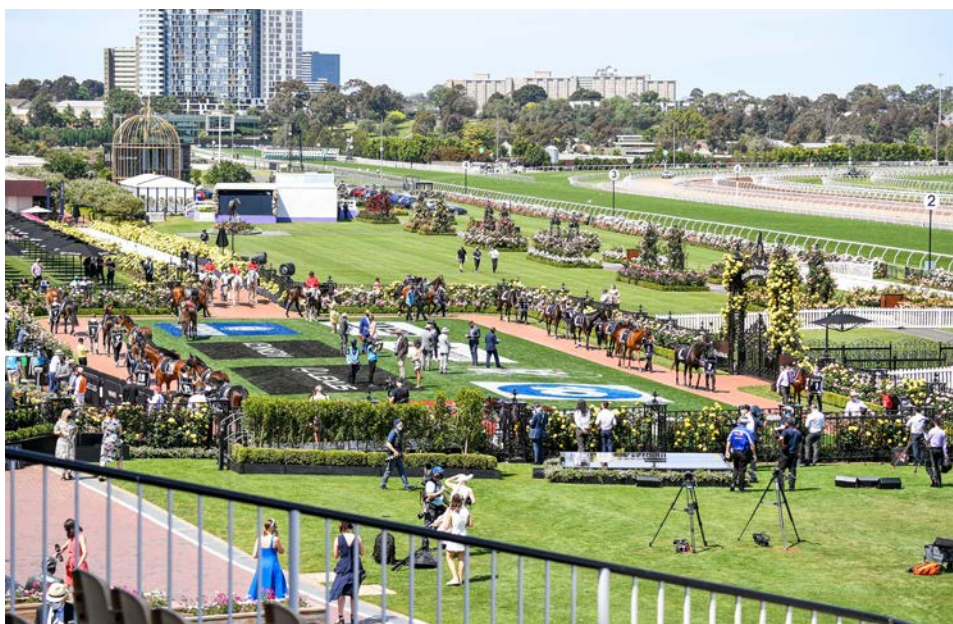
Racing Victoria is absolutely right to be pursuing reform of the whip rules with the ultimate aim of only allowing jockeys to carry one for safety purposes. This must happen. Forget the pub test, try justifying its use to children.

This is not to appease minority groups - as much as I agree they cannot be ignored - but to reflect mainstream community attitudes. It is the broad population we cannot afford to alienate. It is a course of action advocated by the RSPCA which is not an "extremist" organisation nor one which has called for a ban on racing full stop.

Contribution to the broader community.

While Tabcorp's support to charities and community organisations totalled approximately \$12.6 million in FY 2020 (aside from wagering revenue generated for governments) racing's contribution to the community is largely invisible in this country. What better counter to any negative perceptions of the sport than highlighting its benefits to the economy and society.

The gambling stigma.


The social, fashion, dining and great sporting, competitive elements of racing need to be highlighted, along with the countless number of compelling horse and human interest stories. Our racing television coverage is saturated with uninteresting form analysis which is unappealing and entirely illogical given that the so-called professional punters aren't interested in anyone else's opinion and the fun bettors, like me, are only interested in the occasional push for a roughie. A five-minute diatribe on why a 6/4 chance is a good thing based on sectional timing data and (good heavens) average starting price is a waste of precious air time which should be filled with interviews or feature vignettes on industry personnel.

Obscene levels of prize-money for a number of races and state to state rivalry.

A trim from the top to greater spread the prize-money (and perhaps even to make a greater contribution to worthwhile causes) would not reduce the general stimulus which underpins yearling sales. It might, however, stem the flow of money from this country on international purchases and enhance racing's community standing.

Government support.

Governments will respond to the positives of job creation, economic stimulus and community engagement as advocated by one voice rather than by bickering states or by bickering bodies within the states.

What is a primary production activity?

Over the years I have written ad nauseum about what the ATO considers to be a “business” of horse breeding and/or racing for income tax purposes.

This is a crucial topic as, unless your activity is considered a business by the ATO, losses cannot be deducted nor can GST registration be applied for.

In addition, the ATO has many concessions targeted towards ‘Primary Producers’ who conduct a ‘business’ and thus it is no surprise that many of my rural clients want to know if they are conducting a Primary Production (PP) business for the purpose of utilising these concessions. I’m sure the curiosity of my clients extends to the readers of my articles, so this article will focus on:

What is a PP activity? What are the concessions they are eligible for?



1. Tax concessions for ‘Primary Producers’

Primary producers face a number of challenges that can adversely affect their operations and cash flow.

From a tax perspective, the concept of ‘primary production,’ or more specifically, a ‘primary production business’ is relevant because primary producers are provided with, as noted above, a range of income tax concessions that are not available to other businesses.

Although primary producers are subject to the general rules relating to assessable income and allowable deductions, primary producers (and certain other landholders) receive special concessions under the Tax Act. Those most relevant to breeding/racing are listed below.

- Profits may be taxed on a concessional basis in the case of forced sales and death or destruction of livestock and insurance recoveries on loss of livestock (spread over 5 years) or loss of trees by fire.
- Special provisions relate to the treatment of livestock, as distinct from other kinds of trading stock, in calculating a primary producer’s taxable income, e.g. mare and stallion write-off rules.

- A depreciation deduction is allowable on various structural improvements on land used to carry on a primary production business.

- Capital expenditure on a water facility is deductible immediately if post-12 May 2015 expenditure, otherwise over 3 years.

- Capital expenditure on fodder storage assets is deductible immediately if the start time is on or after 19 August 2018, otherwise post-12 May 2015 expenditure is deductible over 3 years.

- Post-12 May 2015 capital expenditure on fences is 100% deductible.
- Capital expenditure in establishing horticultural plants (including grapevines) is deductible over their effective life.

- Capital expenditure on a landcare operation for land in Australia used at the time for carrying on a primary production business is deductible immediately.

- Capital expenditure incurred in connecting power to land or upgrading the connection, and also for capital expenditure incurred on a telephone line on or extending to land on which a primary production business is carried on, is deductible over 10 years.

- The incomes of individual primary producers may be eligible for averaging tax offsets, helping to smooth out their tax liabilities.

- Deposits to the Farm Management Deposits Scheme are tax deductible with corresponding assessability when the deposits are withdrawn.

Additionally, individuals that carry on a PP business may be eligible to make PAYG instalment payments twice a year (rather than quarterly) if their PP income exceeds their deductions in the 'base year'.

Primary producers may also be eligible to pay GST in two instalments.

There are a range of other tax concessions that are not necessarily specific to primary producers, such as the 'Small Business Entity' concessions (e.g., an immediate write-off for the cost of certain depreciating assets), fuel tax credits, and research and development tax offsets.

1.1 Other concessions may apply to primary producers

It should be noted that various non-income tax related concessions may also be available to primary producers. For example, some States/Territories provide a land tax exemption for primary production land, or stamp duty concessions (e.g., where farmland is transferred between family members as part of an intergenerational succession plan). Another example is the potential concessional treatment of farmland under the age pension assets test.

The following discussion considers the concept and significance of a 'primary production business' for income tax purposes. It should be noted that the general focus relates to small to medium sized businesses, including family-owned businesses.

What is primary production?

The concepts of 'primary production' and 'primary production business' are central to accessing the various tax concessions that are only available to primary producers.

The phrase 'primary production business' is defined in the Tax Act. In this regard, a taxpayer (whether an individual, trust, company or partnership) is taken to carry on a primary production business if the taxpayer carries on a business of:

- (a) cultivating or propagating plants, fungi or their products or parts (including seeds, spores, bulbs and similar things), in any physical environment; or
- (b) maintaining animals for the purpose of selling them or their bodily produce (including natural increase); or
- (c) manufacturing dairy produce from raw materials that you produced; or
- (d) conducting operations relating directly to taking or catching fish, turtles, dugong, beche-de-mer, crustaceans or aquatic molluscs; or
- (e) conducting operations relating directly to taking or culturing pearls or pearl shell; or

- (f) planting or tending trees in a plantation or forest that are intended to be felled; or
- (g) felling trees in a plantation or forest; or
- (h) transporting trees, or parts of trees, that you felled in a plantation or forest to the place: or
- (i) where they are first to be milled or processed; or
- (j) from which they are to be transported to the place where they are first to be milled or processed.

It is clear from the above definition that the activity being carried on by the taxpayer must amount to the carrying on of a 'business.' Whether this is the case is a question of fact our web site has numerous articles to this topic, see www.carrazzo.com.au. However, to constitute a 'primary production business', the activity must also fall within one of the above categories of PP activities.

2.1 Examples of 'primary production' activities

The following is a non-exhaustive list of activities that generally constitute 'primary production.'

- Aquaculture (e.g., the farming of fish, shrimp, oysters, algae, and other aquatic organisms).
- Artificial breeding services (e.g., selling semen collected from bulls owned and maintained to provide artificial breeding services for the beef cattle industry).
- Commercial fishing.
- Crop growing (e.g., barley, grain, wheat).
- Dairy farming (i.e., manufacturing dairy produce from raw materials produced, including milk, cheese, yoghurt, curd, butter, cream, custard, ghee, ice cream, quark, whey).
- Forestry operations (e.g., planting or tending trees intended for felling, or transporting felled trees for milling or processing).
- Horse breeding – see below.
- Horticulture (e.g., growing plants or trees for their produce or sale, including fruit, vegetables, olives, vines, nuts, grains and non-food crops such as flowers, plants, ornamental trees, etc.).
- Rearing livestock for sale (e.g., cattle, poultry, rabbit, sheep, pigs, goats, kangaroo and freshwater crayfish).
- Rearing livestock for the production and sale of their bodily produce (e.g., cows and goats for milk, chickens, quail and ducks for eggs, sheep for wool, cow for hide, ducks for feathers/down and bees for honey).

2.2. Examples of non-primary production activities

The following is a non-exhaustive list of activities that are generally not considered to be 'primary production' activities:

- Agistment (where land is used solely for agistment) – see below.
- Beach worming (as worms are not considered to be 'animals' for primary production purposes).

- Horse racing as a stand-alone activity - see below.
- Lease of land, plant or machinery to an entity operating a primary production business.
- Live sheep exporting (as distinct from traditional farming operations).
- Kelp harvesting (if operations are limited to gathering storm cast kelp).
- Selling standing timber (without tending or felling the trees).
- Wind farming

2.3 Primary production activities and the racing industry

As you can see from above, **horse breeding** is noted as a primary production activity, thus the PP concessions noted above are available to horse breeders.

Horse racing without associated breeding activities is not a PP activity.

“Pin-hooking” (where weanlings acquired are later sold as yearlings) can also be reasonably argued as being a PP activity on the basis that it meets the definition of “rearing livestock for sale” (see above).

Agistment is often misunderstood – it is not a PP activity unless it is integrated with other primary production activities of an entity. ATO rulings note that that it is not a PP activity where it is the sole activity of a business.
