Historic Widden Stud takes over Sun Stud's Victorian operation

Anthony Thompson says to survive in an increasingly global thoroughbred breeding industry, stud farms need to get bigger to compete, a realisation which led to his decision to take on a Victorian holding with his family's famed Widden Stud, Australia's

oldest thoroughbred farm.

Widden principal Thompson yesterday confirmed the 154-year-old NSW stud, founded in 1867 and home to champion stallions throughout its long and rich history, will embark on a bold new challenge by taking over the Sun Stud operation, encompassing the eight-strong stallion roster at the Riddells Creek property.

Thompson digs deep at Tasmanian Yearling Sale

Trainer Cameron Thompson yesterday fended off a powerful band of mainland buyers who dominated the top-end of the Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale to keep an impressive \$150,000 son of Darley's first season sire Impending (Lonhro) in his home state.

The highest-priced lot sold at Quercus Park in Carrick was a clear indication that the demand for bloodstock in 2021 had reached the island state, with the afternoon session smashing all previous measures.

<< Continued from page 1 As inspections get underway for the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale, the announcement of Widden's move comes at a time when the Victorian breeding industry undergoes a significant shake-up, with Sun Stud's decision to shut up shop following that of Aquis Farm exiting the state, leaving Leneva Park to fill the void by taking over the Seymour-based stallion business.

"If you tread water eventually you will drown, so it is a bit about the horse business around the world, you get bigger or you will go backwards, so I think it is a really good fit and the things we do we can replicate in Victoria," seventh generation Thompson told ANZ Bloodstock News late yesterday.

"It is something we have been looking at for a while and we had discussed expanding our brand and adding to our business. It is not something that has been opportunistic.

"When the opportunity presented with Aquis getting out of Victoria and Sun Stud and Woodside, to a degree, getting out of the stallion business, we thought if ever there was a chance to do it, there is no better time than now."

In a move aimed at bolstering Widden's presence in Victoria, its Group 1-producing sires Nicconi (Bianconi) and Star Witness (Starcraft) will relocate from NSW, joining Sun Stud's existing roster of Magnus (Flying Spur), Fiorente (Monsun), Palentino (Teofilo), shuttler National Defense

(Invincible Spirit), Ready For Victory (More Than Ready), Squamosa (Not A Single Doubt), Thronum (Snitzel) and veteran Bel Esprit (Royal Academy).

"We are going to look to add some nice young horses down there as well, but I think the marketplace, speaking to the breeders, is crying out for some good proven stallions and certainly Nicconi, Magnus and Star Witness are three top-notch proven sires in Victoria," Thompson said.

One colt already under Widden's ownership is Group 3-winning sprinter Anders (Not A Single Doubt), but Thompson indicated the Ciaran Maher and David Eustace-trained three-year-old was destined to go to stud in the Hunter Valley this year rather than Victoria.

Anders was caught three-wide without cover on the speed from barrier 17 when resuming in Saturday's Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) and he is expected to head to Sydney for The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) next start.

<< Continued from page 3 Victorian arm became a possibility in early January when Macau tycoon Cheng Ting-Kong told staff that his Sun International Group would be shutting its stud business, although it will retain ownership of the Victorian farm, at least for the short-term, after purchasing it in 2012.

Thompson has signed a long-term lease, with an option to buy the property, and he will rebrand the business as Widden Stud Victoria under the deal. Sun are expected to maintain a commercial broodmare band, supporting its own stallions and outside sires, while also operating a racing team.

It is understood that existing Sun Stud staff were briefed about Widden's takeover last week.

The realignment of the Victorian breeding industry has been vast, with Rosemont Stud, through the support of a number of high-profile breeders, ramping up its investment through the formation of a colts syndicate, while US-owned Spendthrift Australia is starting to make an impression through its young stallion roster of locally sourced and US shuttle sires.

Sun Stud principal Danielle Cheng was relieved to have reached an agreement with Widden.

"We could not have wished for a better outcome, it is a privilege to have Widden as the custodians of our farm and stallions," she said.

Charges laid over apprentice jockey death

A Victorian turf club and a trainer have been charged with breaches of the Occupational Health and Safety Act after an apprentice jockey was thrown from a horse and killed. Mikaela Claridge, 22, was riding a section of track known as the "sand trails" at Cranbourne racecourse when the incident unfolded in August 2019. WorkSafe has laid eight charges over the death and will allege Cranbourne Turf Club failed to maintain the sand trails and ensure it was safe to use. WorkSafe will also allege the horse trainer, Saloon Park Pty Ltd, failed to ensure its employees did not ride the sand trails track in the dark. The club has been charged with three counts of failing to ensure, as far as reasonably practicable, that people other than employees were not exposed to health and safety risks. It is also charged with three counts of failing to ensure the workplace was safe and without risks to health. Saloon Park has been charged with one count each of failing to provide a system of work that was, as far as reasonably practicable, safe and without risks to health and failing to ensure the workplace was safe and without risks to health. A filing hearing is listed at the Melbourne Magistrates Court on March 17.

Enthaar presses on to Golden Slipper

Trainer Ciaran Maher told SEN Track yesterday morning that he will continue on with plans to run his star filly Enthaar (Written Tycoon) in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on March 20. He said he "knew she had had a run" the morning after Saturday's Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) contest at Caulfield in which she

started favourite and ran sixth behind Artorius (Flying Artie). The Emirates Park-bred and owned daughter of Written Tycoon (Iglesia) will have a short freshen up and might not run again until the Slipper.

Blamey Stakes on agenda for Le Don De Vie

Well-regarded import Le Don De Vie (Leroidesanimaux) could make his return in this Saturday's Blamey Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) at Flemington. Co-trainer Sam Freedman said yesterday the former UK-based galloper had struggled coming to terms with life in a new hemisphere, but had turned the corner recently. "Just in the last few weeks, he's really started to step-up and he looks a different horse to what he looked in the spring," said Freedman. "He had a really good trial at Balnarring last week so we'll have him nommed for the Blamey on Saturday and we'll give him some thought for that race." Le Don De Vie missed out on a Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) berth last spring after falling short on the order of entry. He made his Australian debut with a second placing in the Geelong Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) before running fifth in the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) behind True Self (Oscar). "We didn't come to this preparation with any main targets set out for him," Freedman said. "Maybe an Easter Cup and then up to Brisbane for a Doomben Cup as he's got the speed to be competitive over 2000 metres. I think he could run a decent race on Saturday and we hope he might be a flashing light for his next run."

Crucial trackwork hitout for Edmonds duo

Golden Slipper contender Alpine Edge (Better Than Ready) will be matched against stablemate

Vanna Girl (Husson) in an important trackwork hitout today. The Toby and Trent Edmonds stable plan to start the pair in a 900-metre jump out on the course proper at the Gold Coast. Alpine Edge, runner-up in the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) when last seen, will race in blinkers for the first time when he returns in the Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick on March 6, with Glen Boss booked to ride. "The jump out will be one of his main hitouts before the Todman," co-trainer Trent Edmonds said. Group 2 winner Vanna Girl is being aimed at the Brisbane winter carnival, with the Hollindale Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) and Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) on her agenda.

Lindsay Park keeping the faith in Aysar

Tom Dabernig is confident Aysar (Deep Field), whose runner-up finish in the CS Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) earlier this month was his fourth second in a row, can get back to winning ways in the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Flemington on Saturday. Dabernig, who trains in partnership with Ben Hayes, believes Aysar has a key advantage in being proven at 1600 metres and the fact he has been set specifically for the race should work in his favour. "He got beaten by half a length in the Caulfield Guineas when he started from a wide barrier. I think the Caulfield Guineas is great form for the Australian Guineas," Dabernig said. "Then in the Carbine Club Stakes he looked to have his stablemate Crosshaven beaten but he just out-toughed him. He's run into good horses each time. I thought his second in the CS Hayes Stakes was a great run. They ran the fastest 1400 metres for the day, more than half a second faster than the Vanity Stakes and a second and a half faster than the open handicappers."

Forbes ready for Slipper assault

The Anthony and Sam Freedman stable were delighted with Forbes' (Capitalist) promising 800-metre trial at Goulburn on Sunday and plan to run him at Canterbury on Friday, before heading to the Black Opal (Gr 3, 1200m) at Canberra on March 7. If he runs well in both those contests, he will line up in the Golden Slipper on March 20. "We wanted to give him a good experience and he seemed to have just that," Sam Freedman explained. "We don't generally trial horses like that but we thought he needed a solid hit-out. He'll likely go to Canterbury on Friday night in a two-year-old 1100-metre race and, provided he goes well there and pulls up well, we'll probably go to the Black Opal nine days later. He'll need to win that and, if he does, it gives him 13 days to the Slipper."

La Mexicana in Surround Stakes

Sam Freedman and his father Anthony have another chance at a Group 1 race this Saturday as their ever-improving mare La Mexicana (I Am Invincible) tackles the Surround Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick. "The wetter the better for her," Freedman told Racing.com of the mare, who is unbeaten in three wet track runs. "It's her best chance at a Group 1 and she deserves that chance as she keeps improving, raising the bar and lifting her game." Freedman said La Mexicana could follow the path Lyre (Lonhro) took last year through the Surround to the Sangster Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) in Adelaide. The stable will also run the mare Realm Of Flowers (So You Think) in a 2000-metre Benchmark 88 as a

step on the way to the \$2 million Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) in April.

Marquand set to ride at Randwick this Saturday

Tom Marquand returns to the Sydney riding ranks this Saturday with a ride in both Group 1 races at Randwick. Marquand's Australian manager Shaun Flaherty confirmed the 22-year-old jockey has been booked to ride Prince Fawaz (Fastnet Rock) in the Chipping Norton Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and La Mexicana in the Surround Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m). Prince Fawaz will contest the Chipping Norton Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) second-up. Marquand has also been provisionally booked to partner a Godolphin two-year-old filly, either Testimonial (Medaglia d'Oro) or Sliders (Street Boss), in the Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). Marquand, who has ridden a small number of winners for Godolphin the UK and twice ridden Godolphin horses in Australia for a first and a second placing. His breakthrough Australian Godolphin success was aboard Damaged (Exceed And Excel) at Warwick Farm last March.

Captivant's Slipper hopes to be tested in Skyline

Marquand will also continue his affiliation with the China Horse Club in Australia on the

Peter and Paul Snowden-trained Captivant (Capitalist) when he takes on the Skyline Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick. Peter Snowden said the stable was keen to get a jockey who could commit to Captivant for the duration of his autumn campaign. "There are plenty of riders here but they are all committed to different stables and different horses," Snowden said. "He's a nice horse so you like to have a nice rider on board." By exciting first season sire Capitalist (Written Tycoon), who Snowden trained to win the 2016 Golden Slipper, Captivant came from behind to claim the Victory Vein Plate (1000m) on debut in October before finishing fourth in the Golden Gift (1100m) the following month. The stable put him on ice with a view to targeting the major two-year-old races and they believe he is their main chance for glory in the juvenile showpiece on March 20. "At this stage he is but we will know a bit more about all of them in the next few weeks," Snowden said.

Richards to keep Bold Star and Garner apart

Gordon Richards plans to send Bold Star (Needs Further) and Garner (Barbados) on different paths for the rest of this preparation, after both finished down the field in the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) on Saturday. "Bold Star will push on to the Newmarket at Flemington despite only running tenth on the weekend," Richards told Racing.com. "He was only beaten two and three-quarter lengths and being in traffic he just never got a real opportunity to wind up through his gears. His straight track form at Flemington is really good with two wins and two minor placings in five runs there so we will have a throw at the stumps with him in the big one." Of Garner's future plans, Richards added: "Maybe he was a little bit of a victim being drawn down in gate two where there was some criticism of the track. However, even though he was only half a length behind my other horse at the finish, I felt maybe he could have shown a bit more dash up the straight. We will come back a cog with him for now and he'll run next in the Listed Matrice Stakes at Morphettville on Adelaide Cup day."

Australian Cup next for San Huberto

The Matt Cumani-trained San Huberto (Speightstown) is set to have his first start in Group 1 company in the Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington on March 6. The five-year-old finished runner-up in the Mornington Cup Prelude (Listed, 2000m) on Saturday and OTI Racing's Terry Henderson confirmed it is now all systems go to the Australian Cup. "It was always going to be our target with him," Henderson told Racing.com. "Until Wednesday we were going to go for the Peter Young Stakes but then the field for the Mornington Cup Prelude only had six acceptances by 9:15am. So we thought 'we'll put him in that race as the tempo won't be quite as strong and it won't be as hard as 1800-metres at weight-for-age'. As it turned out, the tempo was pretty solidly run but it worked out well and he's pulled up well out of the race." Meanwhile, Henderson said they are yet to confirm the next steps for the Willie Mullins-trained mare True Self (Oscar), who won the Neom Turf Cup (2100m) at Riyadh at the weekend. "We'll see how she comes out of the race, I think we've got to be careful with how we place her," Henderson said. "She'll come out of the race with a rating of 114 or 115 so she's getting up there."

Tighe increases stable numbers

Peter Tighe, part-owner of Winx (Street Cry), has been busy at recent yearling sales in a bid to increase his team to 60 runners. Tighe purchased seven horses at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sales and another at Karaka 2021. "We tried to get another couple but they outbid us," Tighe told Racing.com. "We were very happy with the team we were able to assemble, both the buying bench and the team of horses." Tighe, who purchased seven fillies and one colt, added: "All the good horses we've had have always been one offs. Unforgotten, Another Dollar, Winx, all the good ones we've had have all been different breeds. We've got a good selection, we bought Written Tycoon, Snitzel, Shillelagh, so we've gone with the old and the new, the tried and the tested, we've gone with a bit of everything. We just need to sit back and see if we can unveil a champion. It's about keeping a nice manageable number

and 60 for me is a very good number. It rolls off nicely, it just hurts when the bill comes in."

Newmarket tilt for Brooklyn Hustle

Brooklyn Hustle (Starspangledbanner) will follow up her fourth-placed finish in the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) with a start in the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) at Flemington on March 6. The four-year-old mare, who was only a neck behind dead-heat winners Celebrity Queen (Redoute's Choice) and Portland Sky (Deep Field) on Saturday, was finishing fourth in a Group 1 for the third time and co-trainer Jason Warren said they hope she can finally go one better in the Newmarket. "It'll take a few days to get over," Warren, who trains in partnership with Dean Krongold, told Racing.com. "It was a brutal result given how well the horse went. The horse was ready to go and she ran up to expectations and it's just stiff not to get the result that she probably should have got." Of her chances in the Newmarket, Warren added: "We go there confident, but I wouldn't say more confident. I think she put the score on the board in the spring when she ran fourth in the Manikato and the Moir so to drop to handicap, it's got to have her right there."

Laming hearing begins

The inquiry into an alleged raceday stomach tubing of horse Jamaican Rain (Manhattan Rain) began in Melbourne on Monday with the three-member Victorian Racing Tribunal panel visiting the Cranbourne stables of Richard Laming. Laming faces two charges relating to the alleged stomach-tubing of Jamaican Rain while stablehands Marnu Potgieter and Zeyaur Rahman face one charge each as it is alleged they were party to the rule breach. The charges followed a raceday stable inspection conducted by the RV Compliance Assurance Team at Laming's stables in November in 2019. Jamaican Rain was engaged to run at Flemington on that day but was withdrawn by stewards after it was deemed she was lame in the near-fore. The VRT panel, chaired by Judge John Bowman, return to the County Court on Tuesday to continue the hearing that is listed to run until Friday. Laming faces two charges – one of stomach-tubing or attempting to stomach tube and another of failing to observe

the direction of stewards in that he hindered or delayed stewards in exercising their powers. Just last week, the VRT announced a three-month suspension for Laming for presenting horse Iam Ekstraordinary to race at Ballarat in 2018 with illegal levels of cobalt in its system.

Maskiell return to the saddle looming

Jockey Jason Maskiell is ready to return to the saddle after a frustrating time on the sidelines with injury. The hoop suffered concussion in a nasty race fall at Geelong on January 7 and was taken to hospital and stood down from riding under the concussion rule for a seven-day period. But, after returning for a handful of rides at the end of January, the 30-year-old had to take another break to recover from a strained neck muscle. Maskiell's manager Dean Pettit says the jockey has been cleared to return to riding this Friday with the hope of being back in the saddle at the races within a week.

Poy set for Sydney debut

Michael Poy will have his first ride in Sydney today as he partners the Wendy Roche-trained Nettoyer (Sebring) in a Canterbury trial. Roche indicated last week she was on the lookout for a committed rider to the seven-year-old mare, who landed the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) last April. "The call came as a bit of a surprise but the stable reached out to see if I was interested in the ride and I took the opportunity with both hands," Poy told Racing.com. "I have never ridden in Sydney or even gone the other way, only when I had the opportunity to ride in France so it will be new to me."

German faces spell on sidelines

Apprentice jockey Lewis German will be sidelined for a few weeks after sustaining a suspected broken collarbone after falling off Dourekn (Che Cosa) at Werribee on Sunday. Dourekn finished third in a 2025-metre 0-58 handicap and German suffered the fall in an incident as horses were beginning to pull up after the race. Stewards will conduct an inquiry into the incident when German, who was transported to a nearby hospital following the fall, is available to give evidence.

NSW deputy chief steward quits

Wade Birch, Racing NSW's deputy chief steward, has handed in his resignation. Birch has been deputy to Marc Van Gestel on the panel since 2019 and his final meeting is expected to be on Golden Slipper day at Rosehill next month. Racing NSW are actively searching for a replacement and further information about the role can be found here.

Buchan Cup rescheduled

The Buchan & Gelantipy Racing Club is gearing up for the rescheduled Buchan Cup Day on Sunday, March 28. Due to Victoria's most recent state-wide snap lockdown, the annual event was postponed from February 13 which had been sold-out weeks in advance to 1,000 patrons. With tickets expected to go back on sale next week, club president Ian Dunkley said he expected the township to once again rally behind the event. "So many people have stood by us," Dunkley told Racing.com. "Some people didn't even want to take a refund that can't attend the new date and have made a donation to the club which is just great."

Vale Niall Power

Niall Power, director of Highclere Racing Australia and Sire Custodians, has died after a battle with cancer. Power, who is from Ireland where he worked as stud manager at Coolmore for 11 years, became stud manager at Wakefield Stud in Scone in 1987. Serving the thoroughbred industry for more than 40 years, Power later led the innovation for online bidding and streaming to take place at auctions in Australia and beyond, with his company Stream Line Media becoming the first to live stream an auction outside of the USA. "It is with a very heavy heart that I have to report that Niall Power sadly lost his

incredibly courageous fight against cancer on the weekend," Harry Herbert, director of Highclere Racing, wrote in a message to Highclere's owners. "Niall's charm and gentle manner touched everyone who met him and we'll all miss him hugely."

NEW ZEALAND

Sound in Auckland Cup bid

Trainers Mike Moroney and Pam Gerard have plenty to look forward to over the Auckland Cup Carnival, following the performance of proven stayer Sound (Lando) on Saturday. Eight-year-old entire Sound finished second in the Avondale Cup (Gr 2, 2400m), a result which firmed his favouritism for the Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) on March 13. "It was only his second run back after Mike (Moroney) gave him a race over 1800m in January at Caulfield," Gerard said. "Troy (Harris, jockey) thought he had the outside horses covered, but didn't quite see the light weight (Robusto) come up the inside, and he was giving her seven-kilos. Troy was really happy, said the horse was out on his feet the last bit but it was still a huge run." Sound ran well for second in last year's Auckland Cup on a hit-and-run mission from Moroney's Flemington stable, with the trans-Tasman conditioners opting for a two-start New Zealand campaign this time around. "With the Avondale Cup being a penalty-free race into the Auckland Cup it was the best option for him," Gerard said. Sound will likely be on a plane to Sydney following the Auckland Cup, where races like the Tancred Stakes (Gr 1, 2400m) and the Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) are possible targets.

Charity share up for grabs in Derby aspirant

Racing fans will have their chance to live their New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) dream next month. Brett Wilkinson, manager of the Montre Moi Syndicate, who part-own the three-year-

old gelding Montre Moi (Showcasing), has put up a two per cent share in the Derby hopeful for the day on Gavelhouse Plus this week, with all proceeds going to Lifeline Aotearoa. Should Montre Moi win the Derby, the winning bidder will take home their \$10,000 share of the \$1 million prize-pool. The successful bidder will also receive full owner privileges at Ellerslie, with the added bonus of a table for four in Cuvée, valued at more than \$1,300. They will also be treated to a behind the scenes experience, including watching the start of an earlier race from the barriers with Auckland Racing Club chief executive Paul Wilcox. "I feel very fortunate to have a horse talented enough to run in the Derby and this is a good way to share the dream while at the same time raising money to assist a vital need in Lifeline Aotearoa," Wilkinson said.

Hermitage gunning for Derby redemption with Rocket Spade

For the second year running, Hermitage Thoroughbreds has a three-year-old trained by Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott with a huge chance to win the New Zealand Derby. Rocket Spade (Fastnet Rock) confirmed his status as a bona fide Derby contender with a tough victory in the Avondale Guineas (Gr 2, 2100m) on Saturday. In doing so, Rocket Spade followed the path of Dragon Leap (Pierro), who subsequently finished fourth in the Derby last year. Eugene Chuang, owner of Hermitage, is hopeful Rocket Spade can provide them with Derby redemption next month. "They're two totally different sorts of horses. We're thinking Dragon Leap is probably a miler now, whereas Rocket Spade is more dour," O'Sullivan said. "He's still got to run 2400 metres. You don't know until you actually try them, but we think he will. Certainly his style of racing suggests he would get further."

UK: Prime Minister reveals plans to reopen betting shops and racecourses

Racecourses and bookmakers in England were given a clear set of dates to work towards for reopening yesterday as prime minister Boris Johnson gave the first details of a 60-page document laying out the steps to leaving lockdown. Non-essential retail, which has for most of the pandemic included betting shops, will form part of phase two of the plan, with April 12 pencilled in as the provisional date if the data surrounding the effectiveness of the vaccination programme continues to be positive. Johnson's plan places each step at five-week intervals to allow proper time to analyse the data and then a week's notice for businesses to prepare to resume trading. On the most optimistic timetable, the return of spectators to sports grounds, including racecourses, will be possible from May 17 with up to 5,000 in attendance, or 50 per cent of capacity. Larger events feature in the final wave of measures due to be introduced on June 21,

two days after the end of Royal Ascot, and could be staged in conjunction with onsite testing, although a separate review will be undertaken on this front.

KSA: 2020 Saudi Cup winnings to be released

Final prize-money distribution from the 2020 Saudi Cup (1800m), which has been held up by indictment against winning trainer Jason Servis, could come within six weeks, the head of the Jockey Club of Saudi Arabia said on Saturday. The minor awards from the 2020 Cup have been paid, but the \$10 million winner's share was frozen by Saudi officials pending the resolution of doping charges involving Jason Servis, who at the time trained the Luis Saez-ridden winner, Maximum Security (New Year's Day). Maximum Security raced last year for owners Gary and Mary West and the Coolmore partners, who had bought into the horse in January last year. Jockey Club chairman Prince Bandar bin Khalid Al Faisal said he hopes the wait is nearly over. "I feel we don't have long to wait [for action on the

United States legal issues]," Prince Bandar said. "I hope that within the next six weeks, we'll put this matter to rest."

IRE: Bloodstock director Ronan Griffin to leave Goffs next month

Bloodstock director Ronan Griffin is leaving his role at Goffs after 20 years next month, citing a decision to explore other opportunities. Griffin, who joined the company as bloodstock assistant, was appointed director in 2011 and his varied roles included the overseeing of the bloodstock department, veterinary matters such as representing Goffs on the Industry Drugs Task Force, pre-sale inspections and post-sale issues. On his decision, Griffin said: "Having started with Goffs in 2000 I feel, having had time to reflect under the current circumstances of Covid-19, that this is a good time for me to explore other opportunities and the time is right for me to make the move." Griffin will leave the company on March 22 having overseen the conclusion of inspections for the 2021 Land Rover Sale

Thompson digs deep for his Impending star at record Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale

Trainer Cameron Thompson yesterday fended off a powerful band of mainland buyers who dominated the top-end of the Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale to keep an impressive \$150,000 son of Darley's first season sire Impending (Lonhro) in his home state.

The highest-priced lot sold at Quercus Park in Carrick, one of six six-figure yearlings in a record-breaking Tasmanian auction, was a clear indication that the demand for bloodstock in 2021 had reached the island state, with the afternoon session smashing all previous measures.

There were no six-figure yearlings sold in 2020 and, more importantly, the average of \$35,872 was up 17 per cent, while the median of \$29,000 increased from \$26,000 last year, figures which observers suggest will provide a boost to local breeders and give them the motivation to reinvest in young broodmares.

The aggregate of \$3,372,000 was also up slightly on last year, despite 21 fewer horses being offered.

Cressy-based Thompson zeroed in on the colt during on-farm inspections a fortnight ago and, along with the support of some new clients, was able to land the standout yearling.

"He is a cracking type, a real early type, from a deep-pedigreed family who has performed on the track, which is good to see," Thompson told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"We love the hot new sire in Impending, being a son of Lonhro, and it is a good combination.

"I thought he would make at least \$100,000 and, not being by a local stallion, he had to go close to topping the sale, but I didn't think he'd make the money he did.

"The sale was so strong today that it really put a cream on top of the horses and that was evident on the lesser ones. It's really good for

the breeding industry."

Consigned by Armidale Stud on behalf of breeders Ken and Jen Breese, the colt is the first foal out of Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) mare Dream Food, a three-quarter sister to the Matthew Dunn-trained stakes winner Snitz and a half-brother to the Group 2 winner, Group 1-placed mare I'll Have A Bit (Smart Missile). His third dam is the Group 2-winning Tickle My (Perugino). He was catalogued as **Lot 104**.

"He was a lovely type, by the right stallion, out of a super family. Ken and Jen have been wonderful supporters of ours, and it was great to get a result for them," Armidale Stud's David Whishaw said.

"It is great to see Cameron Thompson, a young local trainer with some big owners behind him, it's great they are investing in him and giving him some quality stock."

Vandyke makes most of opportunity from afar

When David Vandyke ventured to trackwork early yesterday morning, buying a horse was the furthest thing from his mind, but only a matter of hours later, the prominent Queensland trainer had the second highest-priced lot sold at the sale in his possession.

The Group 1-winning Sunshine Coast-based trainer was yesterday alerted to the fact that the sister to his promising mare Cotton Fields (Deep Field), a last-start Doomben winner, was going through the Tassie ring and, after some due diligence, the filly is heading his way with a \$120,000 price tag.

"I have got David Chester to thank for that," Vandyke, who was bidding online, revealed to ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

"He rang me up and alerted me that she was in and Cotton Fields is a lovely, scopey type of mare who I have had a good opinion of.

"It's a lovely family, it's versatile, there's good depth to it and my spies down there told me she was a lovely type. She is certainly worth giving a go.

"The fact that she's Magic Millions (Race Series eligible) and that I know the full-sister well, she will be an easy sell. I am delighted to get her at that price and I can't wait to see her in the flesh."

By the same sire as Saturday's exciting three-year-old Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) winner Portland Sky - Deep Field's (Northern Meteor) first at the highest level - the yearling is also a sister to last week's Ballina maiden winner Medusa's Fury. She is the fifth foal out

of the unraced Medusa (Stratum), herself a half-sister to Perth Listed winner View The Stars (Galileo) and the stakes-placed sire Olympus (Danahill). Offered by Alva Stud, she was catalogued as **Lot 5**.

Medusa was bought at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast National Broodmare Sale by Belmont Bloodstock's Damon Gabbedy for \$30,000 on behalf of vendor Alva Stud.

Les Bridge trains an unraced two-year-old three-quarter brother to the \$120,000 filly, while Medusa also has an Alpine Eagle (High Chaparral) filly at foot.

Alva Stud's Catherine Hills was hopeful of a big result given she rates her as "one of the best fillies I have ever brought here".

"She was a lovely filly, all her x-rays were good. Her scopes were good and Deep Field is going really well at the moment. I was hoping she would do quite well," Hills said.

"Sometimes things work out perfectly in terms of timing, and the sister shows there has been proven success with Deep Field as well, which meant she had a lot of going for her."

Vandyke plans to continue his patience with the lightly raced Cotton Fields, who has won twice from five starts, and he is already looking ahead to next season with the mare.

"She will have one more run and then go to the paddock," he said.

"I know she is four, but she is a scopey type and she is just going to get better with time. Most of these female horses should be racing (well) at five."

Vandyke has been selective so far this sales season, with yesterday's addition his third yearling in 2021.

"You have got to pick your mark. Overall, they are expensive but I think if you are diligent you can certainly get a bargain," he said.

"I bought a Savabeel for \$250,000 at the Magic Millions and she is a beautiful filly and I got a Pierro filly for \$150,000. Taking those two into this filly, I think I have shopped well thus far.

"I had none on the shopping list in Tassie until a couple of hours ago, but you've got to keep your phone on and your mind open."

Later in the session there were back-to-back six-figure lots with an Alpine Eagle colt, the third foal out of well-performed Tasmanian

stakes-winning mare Testamarriage (Testa Rossa), bought by well-known agent John Foote, with the assistance of Merrick Staunton, for \$110,000 before a Lonhro (Octagonal) filly with a strong pedigree made \$100,000.

The Alpine Eagle colt, catalogued as **Lot 68**, was offered by Armidale Stud, while the Grenville Stud-consigned filly was bought by Victorian trainers Robbie Griffiths and Mat de Kock in conjunction with agent Peter Ford. She was catalogued as **Lot 69**.

Grenville Stud also sold a colt by its first season VRC Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m)- winning sire Zululand (Fastnet Rock) for \$100,000 to the partnership of China Horse Club, which raced the sire, McEvoy Mitchell Racing and Belmont Bloodstock.

Bred by Graeme and Bart McCulloch, who also bred Group 1 winner Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor), the colt is the third foal out of two-time winner Benoit (Domesday), a half-sister to New Zealand Group 1 winner Ekstrema (Ekraar) and the stakes-placed Maradona (Mr Nanaho) and Pellegrini (Mr Nanaho). He was catalogued as **Lot 87**.

The McCullochs later sold another son of Zululand - the half-brother to boom Tasmamian two-year-old Turk Warrior (Outreach) - for \$100,000 to Lindsay Park, who were bidding online. Catalogued as **Lot 106**, the colt is the sixth foal out of Tasmania dual Listed winner Ehor (Val Royal), herself a half-sister to the stakes-placed Party Crasher (Jade Robbery).

Records set at Quercus Park

Yesterday's sale was the first staged at Quercus Park in Carrick, near Launceston, and the results, Magic Millions Victoria and Tasmania manager Tim Brown says, will provide an impetus for local breeders to raise the bar in terms of quality in the years to come.

Brown would have

taken the results achieved yesterday if they were put to him three months ago.

"And I will take them today as well," he declared. "We got six for \$100,000 and over this year, which is fantastic.

"That is a great result at the top end. Some of the lesser horses were hard (to move) as they have been in other sales, but on the whole, considering Tasmania had that three-month hiatus from racing last year, I think the trainers and the local buyers have come back extremely strongly.

"There's an impetus now at the top end and I do believe that more people are going to follow that better end of the market and reduce the number of average mares and move on with producing more commercial stock."

The leading sire was Armidale Stud's Alpine Eagle, who averaged \$46,167 from 21 yearlings sold, ahead of Zululand who averaged \$42,067 (15 lots sold). Armidale also took the leading vendor honour, selling 26 yearlings for \$1.197 million at an average of \$46,038 ahead of Grenville, which traded 18 yearlings at an average of \$44,278.

Queensland-based agent Foote, who went to Tasmania last week to inspect yearlings before returning to the mainland in preparation for the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale, was the leading buyer with eight lots for various clients. Interstate buyers bought 47 yearlings while two were also sold to Hong Kong clients.

Sky's the limit for outstanding Aegon

New Zealanders made their presence felt across the Tasman on Saturday with the superb winning performance by Probabeel (Savabeel) in the Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) while most impressively, the star of Aegon (Sacred Falls) is rapidly ascending and his Australian debut in the Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m), against some of Sydney's best three-year-olds, had commentators gasping for superlatives.

A shade slow to begin, Aegon improved along the rail to keep in touch with the pace but, rounding into the Rosehill straight, was in need of a run. Hugh Bowman looked tempted to move out at the 300 metres but that route was denied so he had to look towards the inner.

Approaching the 200 metres and now with a clear view, Aegon pounced, drove through one off the fence, took over at the 100 metres, then raced away by a length and three-quarters, Bowman sitting quietly the last 50 metres.

Post race, co-trainer and part-owner Andrew Forsman reported that Aegon had come through the race in good order. "I spoke with Bjorn (Baker) this morning and he has pulled up really well. He sent through a video," said Forsman. "He just had a quiet canter, put a saddle on him and gave him a stretch of legs.

"That was about it really. He looks in really good order so all seems good," said Forsman, who had one or two doubts pre race, while confirming that the horse will progress to the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m).

"We thought he'd improved this preparation but you're always a bit nervous about how his form might measure up and how the horse might measure up in that company. The track was a bit of a worry and how it was playing and where he would be in the run but, thankfully, his ability shone through and he did measure up.

"It's definitely the Randwick Guineas next and no one has made any decisions until we get that race out of the way because what he does there will answer a fair few questions we've got, but we would like to try him over further so we'll see what comes of that race then decide after that," continued Forsman.

Aegon and Forsman were the subject of a call from Greg Carpenter on Sunday, raising the possibility of a start in the rich All Star Mile but Forsman responded: "I sent my message this morning (Monday) and confirmed that we won't be going that route, just stick to our original plan. I'm sure that's the right thing to

do by the horse and keep him to his own age group for now."

Classic winner Aegon remains unbeaten in five starts, the last four all in stakes races.

That he was third favourite would have surprised his many Kiwi admirers. His ability to finish strongly has been evident in all his previous races. When presented with a gap he charges hard and in a tight finish he knows where the winning post is.

The way he surged from the rear, then fought off a very determined Bourbonaire (Darci Brahma) in the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) last November was significant.

After an eleven-week break he showed up at Ellerslie for the Karaka Million 3YO Classic (RL, 1600m) and had to repeat that effort, this time against Te Akau's fine filly Amarelinha (Savabeel). He gives as good as he gets, displaying real tenaciousness to keep his nose in front when it counts.

By comparison, Saturday's Hobartville Stakes was decided well short of the post when he drove through at the 200 metres and 100 metres later he was in total control.

His style of taking his time to find his feet has worked out well so far. The competition will only become more fierce so his being

able to produce when asked then fight off his opponents will be mighty handy when the heat and quality of Sydney's racing shows its true force during the next month or two.

Jamie Richards and the Te Akau troop will no doubt be floating on air after Probabeel's super win but could they also be cementing their plans for Amarelinha?

On her performance against Aegon in last month's Karaka 3YO Classic she must be a solid chance to plunder some of the rich Sydney fillies' races this autumn.

Both Aegon and Amarelinha hold a nomination to the Rosehill Guineas (Gr 1, 2000m) as well as the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m).

The two have bloodlines in common: Aegon is by O'Reilly's (Last Tycoon) son Sacred Falls from a Zabeel (Sir Tristram) mare while Amarelinha is by Zabeel's (Sir Tristram) son Savabeel from an O'Reilly mare.

Aegon's dam, Toss Up (Zabeel), won once and has foaled four winners, two by O'Reilly and two by Sacred Falls. Her fifth foal to race, a filly by Tivaci (High Chaparral) named Single Tail, was sixth at her first start two weeks ago in Victoria.

His granddam, the stakes-placed Tale Of The Cat (Storm Cat) mare Heads Or Tails, scored wins at Ellerslie and Riccarton and claims as her half-sister the Ellerslie Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Good Faith (Straight Strike) as well as Spring (O'Reilly), the dam of Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Daffodil (No Excuse Needed), one of her three Group 1 successes.

Spade emerges a Derby contender at home

Two Group 2 races took place last weekend, the Avondale Guineas (Gr 2, 2100m) and the Avondale Cup (Gr 2, 2400m), both traditional lead-ups to the New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) and the Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) respectively.

Wexford Stables' Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott have a solid grip on the New Zealand Derby, to be run on March 6, with their three-year-old colt Rocket Spade (Fastnet Rock).

Last Saturday, Craig Grylls waited until the

600 metres to move him forward, got a nice run through near the top of the straight, then pulled five-wide upon straightening. A length back at the 300 metres he gradually levelled up, took over inside the 200 metres and stayed on best to the line to win by a neck.

On New Year's Day Rocket Spade claimed the Auckland Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m), his maiden black-type win, beating Jason Belltree (Ferlax) and On Display (Showcasing). In Saturday's 500 metres further Avondale Guineas, the result was identical, Jason Belltree and On Display finishing second and third.

ANZ Bloodstock News caught up with co-trainer Andrew Scott: "Rocket Spade pulled up really well. He's got a terrific foundation behind him and has a great constitution as well. We gave him a light workout this morning (Monday) and he has a bit of energy about him so we're thoroughly pleased with the way he's come through the race, both physically and mentally.

"It's now fingers crossed that he has a good fortnight and that he stays sound. We are certainly pleased with where he is at the present time. Going by the way he pulled up he will improve with the run. He had a good blow after the race."

When asked about the Auckland Guineas result being identical to the Avondale Guineas result, Scott added: "They are all pretty even and they are all progressing well. It (the Derby) should be a real contest. A lot of those behind him will benefit from their first run over ground."

Former NZ-trained runners have their day

From a purely racing standpoint, New Zealand had a banner Saturday in Australia.

Aside from Probabeel and Aegon, former New Zealand-trained and raced Subpoenaed (Rip Van Winkle) added a second Group 2, the Millie Fox Stakes (Gr 2, 1300m), to her Golden Pendant (Gr 2, 1400m) victory at Randwick last September.

Originally with Tony Pike, Subpoenaed won her only start at two, beating the speedy Listed winner Rainbow Dash (Showcasing) as well as seventh placed and later boom gelding Catalyst (Darci Brahma).

Sent to Chris Waller, she has now scored a further four times, all in Sydney and has earned more than \$500,000 in 18 starts.

A similar story surrounds the former Graham Richardson-trained Defibrillate (Shocking), whose first three races in New Zealand resulted in two wins after which he was sent to Victoria and the stable of Patrick Payne.

Richardson kept a share in the gelding along with high profile owners, cricket legend Brendon McCullum and champion jockey Lance O'Sullivan. The six-year-old is in top form, taking out Saturday's Mornington Cup Prelude (Listed, 2000m), his fourth win on the trot. Since his export Defibrillate has scored seven times (two stakes) from just ten Australian starts.

Although not raced in New Zealand, Tralee Rose, the daughter of the late Tavistock

(Montjeu), annihilated her 11 rivals in the Lord Reims Stakes (Gr 3, 2600m) at Morphettville, her fifth success in her last six starts. She looks to have a royal chance of adding the Adelaide Cup (Gr 2, 3200m) next month.

Her acceleration once straightened for the run home was eerily similar to the drubbing she gave her opponents in the Bagot Handicap (Listed, 2800m) at Flemington on New Year's Day. The only difference being that at Flemington she cleared out by seven lengths, whereas at Morphettville she let the field off with a mere three-and-half-length beating.

Other Kiwi-bred Australian city winners were formerly New Zealand-raced Ellerslie winner Lord Vladivostok (Tavistock). He took out Morphettville's Zilzie Handicap (1800m) where he has scored three times in his last four starts from the Michael Hickmott stable at Murray Bridge.

From the same stable, well-known race photographer Trish Dunell was represented

by her four-year-old mare Unlaced (Niagara) in the Furphy Handicap (1600m).

Twice a winner in NZ this time last year, Unlaced ran fourth in the 2020 Lowland Stakes (Gr 3, 2100m) and this victory marked her first in town, taking her record in South Australia to three starts for two wins.

Meanwhile, at Eagle Farm, Romakash (Roc de Cambes) added his second victory in town for a career total of ten in the win column.

Loss of stallions hard-felt

On a down note, three of the above results cannot be taken advantage of by breeders since the stallions involved are no longer with us.

Well documented is the loss of both Sacred Falls (sire of Aegon) and Tavistock (sire of Tralee Rose) in late 2019. Sacred Falls was the youngest, yet could count seven stakes horses among his progeny, including three stakes winners. With his eldest just four-year-olds, his loss is only just beginning to be realised.

With eight crops of racing age, Tavistock

had established himself very strongly (26 stakes winners) and had many years of service to look forward to before his too-early demise.

Also lost, in August last year, is former Windsor Park sire Rip Van Winkle (Galileo), not only the sire of Subpoenaed but of recently passed star Te Akau Shark and 31 further stakes winners.

The loss of these three sires has left a sizable hole in the proven category of New Zealand's stallion ranks.

Fung off to fast start

Tony Fung got his year off to a flying start by picking up Saturday's feature, the Good Fortune Handicap (1500m), with six-year-old turf champion Lover Paradise (Canford Cliffs), and The Good Year Handicap (1350m) with his latest sand star Hostwin Aurora (Red Element).

On Macau Jockey Club's first raceday for the Chinese New Year, Fung saddled up both Lover Paradise and Kelowna Star (Sufficient) in the Class 1 Good Fortune Handicap, his first runners for the year.

Lover Paradise was handled to perfection by Japanese rider Massa Tanaka, who gave Fung the perfect start with a brilliant win, while nine-year-old Kelowna Star ran on strongly under Luis Corrales for fourth place.

Lover Paradise, who has often had a tendency to over-race in the 1500-metre contests, settled nicely under Tanaka and was always traveling kindly on the back of the leader One of the Greats (Snitzel). Once in the straight, Tanaka raced clear and had plenty in hand to hold off favourite Pearl Green (Fastnet Rock), with Top Mountain Legend (Manhattan Rain) in third.

The victory was the first leg of a double for Massa Tanaka, who won the next event, the Happiness Handicap (1500m), on Money Link (Red Jazz) for trainer Stanley Chin.

Hostwin Aurora, meanwhile, is emerging as Tony Fung's latest sand star, after he destroyed his opposition in the 1350-metre Class 3 over under Luis Corrales, winning by an eased-down four lengths.

An Australian import who raced there under the same name, Hostwin Aurora was well beaten in his three runs at Doomben, the Gold Coast and Kembla, but the four-year-old appears to have found his niche on the Macau sand, with two wins and two seconds from his five starts on the surface.

Geoff Allendorf was another who cheered in

the Year Of The Ox with a double for the afternoon.

Allendorf won the opener, The Prosperity Handicap Division One (1500m), with Turquoise Success (All Too Hard), who was given a lovely front-running ride by Shogo Nakano.

Turquoise Success had been a beaten favourite on numerous occasions in his 12 runs prior to Saturday, all over the sprint distances of 1200 metres on the turf and 1050 metres on the sand. In a bold move, Allendorf stepped the four-year-old up to 1500 metres and he reaped the rewards.

"I've been wanting to run him at 1500 for a while, but each time I put him in he got balloted out. I've always thought it would suit him with his breeding," said Allendorf. "He works like a Class 3 horse in the morning and I'm surprised he has not won a race until today."

"I was a little concerned that he might go a bit hard, that's what he has been doing in the 1200-metre races, so I put Shogo (Nakano) on him; no one here rides a front runner better than he does. He just gets them to relax so well; we've seen it time and time again."

"The horse shows so much potential in his work, so I'm hoping he can relax in these middle-distance races and go on from here."

Turquoise Success recorded 1.28.6s for

the 1500 metres, which was two seconds faster than the Second Division taken out by Luen On Success (Lord Kanaloa), also prepared by Allendorf. It was win number three in Macau for Luen On Success and also provided the first leg of a treble for jockey Luis Corrales.

"It's a great start to the year for not only myself but for my owners Mr Tang, who owns Turquoise Success and also has a half share in Luen On Success with Mr Thomas Lau," said Corrales. "They have both been good supporters of the stable."

"I definitely think Luen On Success can also go on to better things. His runs since we gelded him have been an improvement, and Luis (Corrales) gave him a lovely ride. The time wasn't flash but he won with a bit in hand."

Luis Corrales was the star of the afternoon, booting home three winners to take him three clear in the riders' standings on 25 victories, with Eric Cheung second on 22 winners and Peter Ho third on 21.

As well as Luen On Success and Hostwin Aurora, Corrales was successful on the Alan Tam-trained Premier Choice (Hidden Dragon) in the Lai See handicap (1050m).

It was win number seven for Premier Choice, all of which have come on the all-weather surface.

Danger Strykes (Astern) was another length and a quarter adrift in third. Midnight Rocket was bought at Book 2 of the NZB National Yearling Sale at Karaka last year, realising \$50,000 to Todd Pollard and his trainer having been sold through the Haunui draft. His yearling brother was offered by Woburn Farm at the same auction last month, being passed in on a reserve of \$80,000. Midnight Rocket is a half-brother to the 2015 Karaka Million 2YO (RL, 1200m) winner Hardline (Showcasing), while he joins Avonallo as southern hemisphere winners for Belardo, with the latter having opened his account in the Welcome Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Riccarton in November. Belardo has sired five individual stakes winners worldwide, headlined by Group

2 winner Isabella Giles, while he stood at Haunui for a fee of \$10,000 (plus GST) last year.

Flying Artie - Newgate Farm's Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) took the lead in the sought after first season sire title (by winners) after the courageous first-start victory of Bourbon Flyer (2 c ex Kentucky Miss by Foxwedge) on the Kensington track in Sydney on Wednesday. The fifth individual winner for the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) hero, Bourbon Flyer defeated Syracuse (Sebring) and Trifaccia (I Am Invincible) in the Stud & Stable Staff Awards Plate (1100m). Trained by

John Thompson, Bourbon Flyer was a \$50,000 purchase from the 2020 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. He is raced by a syndicate which includes Wilf Mula, who raced Flying Artie with the late Paul Whelan, John Whelan and Newgate Farm's Henry Field. John O'Shea paid \$52,500 for Bourbon Flyer's sister at the 2020 Inglis Australian Weanling Sale while Kentucky Miss, who was bought by Mula for \$250,000 at the Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale last year, has a weanling sister to the pair and she was covered in December by I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit). Flying Artie, who stood for

a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) in 2020, leads the first season sire title over barnmate Capitalist (Written Tycoon) (four in Australia), Sooboog (Snitzel) (four) and Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) (three in Australia).

Kiss And Make Up - General Phelps (2 c ex Rose General by General Nediym) won the Year Of The Ox 2YO Handicap (1006m) at Grafton on Thursday to provide Aquis Farm's first season stallion Kiss And Make Up (More Than Ready) with his first winner. Bred and trained by Steven Phelps at Ballina, the Matt McGuren-ridden colt overhauled the favourite Buck Pharoah (American Pharoah) who was posted wide for the trip. Baronial (Dream Ahead) ran third. Having his first start, General Phelps keeps up the perfect record for his dam, seven-time winner Rose General, who has now had four foals to race for four winners. Kiss And Make Up stood for a fee of \$8,800 (inc GST) at Aquis Farm's Canungra base in 2020.

Rommel - Pixie Chix (2 f ex Snow Pixie by Snitzel) broke her maiden at the fourth attempt in the Peoplestart 2YO Plate (1000m) at Ascot on Saturday to earn first season sire Rommel (Commands) his second winner from four runners. Trained by David Harrison, Pixie Chix scooted clear of her rivals to win by one and a half lengths over Featherweight (Snippetson), with Safety Fuse (Safeguard) another three-quarters of a length back in third. On Friday, Pixie Chix's brother topped day two of the Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale for a Book 2 record of \$180,000, selling to Neville Parnham. Pixie Chix is the first foal out of Snow Pixie (Snitzel) and was bought from last year's Perth Yearling Sale for \$20,000. Western Australian Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) winner Rommel stood at Mogumber Park for a \$4,400 (inc GST) service fee in 2020.

New Group/Grade 1 winners

American Pharoah - Coolmore's American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile) notched his third

elite-level winner, and first on dirt, when his son Cafe Pharoah (4 c ex Mary's Follies by More Than Ready) landed the February Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Tokyo on Sunday. Bred by Paul P Pompa, Cafe Pharoah is the fifth foal produced by Grade 2 winner Mary's Follies (More Than Ready). Cafe Pharoah was purchased for current connections, owner Koichi Nishikawa and trainer Noriyuki Hori, by Emmanuel de Seroux's Narvick International at \$475,000 when offered by Eddie Woods at the 2019 Ocala Breeders' Sales March Two-Year-Olds in Training event. Shuttler American Pharoah will stand at Ashford Stud for a fee of US\$100,000 (approx. AUD\$127,000) in 2021.

Deep Field - Deep Field (Northern Meteor) capped a remarkable day for Newgate's stallions on Saturday when Portland Sky (3 c ex Sky Rumba by Shrewd Rhythm) dead-heated with Celebrity Queen (Redoute's Choice) in Caulfield's Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) to earn the son of Northern Meteor (Encosta De Lago) his first elite-level winner. The Matt Laurie-trained colt took the lead with 200 metres to

run but was joined on the line by Celebrity Queen, with the pair unable to be separated in a photo. Kemalpasa (Magnus) was a head behind in third. Deep Field, the sire of seven stakes winners including Cosmic Force, Dig Deep and Xilong, stood for a service fee of \$55,000 (inc GST) in 2020.

Flying Artie - The Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained Artorius (2 c ex Gracie's Lass by Redoute's Choice) flew home at Caulfield on Saturday to take out the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), earning Newgate's Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) his first stakes winner at the highest level. Sent off at \$13, Artorius defeated Ingratating (Frosted) by three-quarters of a length, with Anamoe (Street Boss) one and three-quarter lengths further behind in third. Redoute's Choice - Celebrity Queen (4 m ex Celebrity Miss by More Than Ready) joined Portland Sky on the finishing line in the Oakleigh Plate to earn the late Redoute's Choice (Danahill) his 39th individual elite-level

winner. Trained by Grant and Alana Williams, Celebrity Queen produced a late run up the inside to finish level with Portland Sky and split the Group 1 honours. Redoute's Choice, who has 177 individual stakes winners to his name, died at Arrowfield Stud aged 22 in March 2019.

New stakes winners

Blackfriars - Last Of The Line (4 g ex Catch The Cat by Royal Abjar) produced an explosive finish to take out the Detonator Stakes (Listed, 1800m) at Ascot on Saturday, earning the late Blackfriars (Danehill) his 42nd individual stakes winner. Trained by Stephen Miller, the four-year-old impressively defeated \$2.70 favourite Montelena (Rubick) by three-quarters of a length, with the pair well clear of Paddy's Shadow (Dane Shadow) who finished over five lengths behind the winner in third. Last Of The Line was making his first start in stakes company on Saturday and now has six wins from just nine starts. He is a brother to Listed winner Black Felix, who was the first foal out of Catch The Cat (Royal Adjar). Blackfriars was euthanised in late 2017 after he broke a leg following surgery for colic. He was Champion WA stallion for the seven consecutive seasons prior to his death.

Exceed And Excel - The Peter Moody-trained Oxley Road (3 c ex Bonnie Mac by Thorn Park) impressively took out the Zeditave Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield on Saturday to bring up Exceed And Excel's (Danehill) 182nd individual stakes winner. Oxley Road - who was ANZ Bloodstock News' Saturday Spotlight runner - led all the way to defeat It'sourtime (Time For War) by one and three-quarter lengths, with Valaquenta (Street Boss) the same distance behind in third. Darley stallion Exceed And Excel has 16 top-level winners to his name including Oxley Road's brother, Exceedance.

Empire Maker - Mnasek (3 f ex Washington Bridge by Yankee Gentleman) proved to be in a different class to her six rivals as she stretched clear to take out the UAE Oaks (Gr 3, 1900m)

in effortless fashion on Thursday and in the process become the 65th individual stakes winner for the late Empire Maker (Unbridled). Away smarter than on her previous start when second in the UAE 1,000 Guineas (Listed, 1600m), the Doug Watson-trained filly made it two wins in three starts as she came home six and a half lengths clear of the running-on Nayefah (Super Saver). Last Sunset (Teofilo) was another two and a half lengths away in third. Mnasek is the sixth foal out of the US Grade 2 winner Washington Bridge. Empire Maker, the sire of 13 individual elite-level winners, including the likes of Royal Delta and Pioneer of The Nile, died last year at the age of 20.

Fastnet Rock - Parure (3 f ex Fontein Ruby by Turffontein) thrived on her first start in stakes company at Caulfield on Saturday, taking out the Autumn Classic (Gr 2, 1800m) to earn Coolmore's Fastnet Rock (Danehill) his 168th individual stakes winner. The Tom Dabernig and Ben Hayes-trained filly defeated Butter Chicken (Savabeel) by a long neck, with Khoekhoe (Turffontein) another one and a

quarter lengths behind in third. A day later, Chequerboard (3 f ex Chi by Zabeel) comfortably took out the Tasmanian Oaks (Listed, 2100m) at Launceston to provide Fastnet Rock (Danehill) with his 169th stakes winner. The Tom Dabernig and Ben Hayes-trained Chequerboard was sent off the \$1.55 favourite and justified those odds with a one and a half-length defeat of Queen Adele (Adelaide). My Squeeze Louise (Mongolian Khan) finished five lengths behind the winner in third. Chequerboard always looked in control of the race under Brendon McCoull, who eased her to the front rounding the home turn. She maintained a comfortable distance over Queen Adele down the straight, with the Cindy Alderson-trained filly battling on to finish well clear of the chasing pack. Shuttle stallion Fastnet Rock stood in Australia for a 2020 service fee of \$165,000.

I Am Invincible - Home Affairs (2 c ex Miss Interiors by Flying Spur) built on his Canonbury Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) second last month to take out the Silver Slipper Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) at Rosehill on Saturday and become I Am Invincible's (Invincible Spirit) 63rd individual

stakes winner. Trained by Chris Waller, Home Affairs defeated Rocket Tiger (Cluster) by a head, with Direct (Siyouni) finishing another one and a quarter lengths back in third. I Am Invincible stood at Yarraman Park for a service fee of \$209,000 in 2020.

Into Mischief - Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday) sired his 87th individual stakes winner when Hibiscus Punch (6 m ex Bellini Sunrise by Machiavellian) landed the Barbara Fritchie Stakes (Gr 3, 7f) at Laurel Park on Saturday night. The Justin Nixon-trained six-year-old was winning for the third time in eight starts as she beat Estilo Talentoso (Maclean's Music) by two and a half lengths. Club Car (Malibu Moon) was another three and a half lengths away in third. Bred in Kentucky by her owners Edward Seltzer and Beverly Anderson, Hibiscus Punch is the first stakes winner from her dam, the Machiavellian (Mr. Prospector) mare Bellini Sunrise. All eight of the dam's foals to race are winners. Into Mischief stands at Spendthrift's Kentucky farm for a fee of \$225,000 (approx. AUD\$286,000) in 2021.

Medaglia D'Oro - Medaglia D'Oro (El Prado) edged closer to another significant milestone when New Trails (7g - Issaqueena by Mr. Prospector) returned from a 12-month absence to provide the Darley stallion with his 149th individual stakes winner courtesy of a two-length success in the Curlin Stakes (Listed, 2000m) at Meydan on Thursday. Trained by Ahmad Bin Harmash, the seven-year-old emerged from deep in the pack to get up late and register a first win since taking out a handicap at the same track back in January 2019. Now the winner of four of his 15 starts, New Trails ran on to defeat the Godolphin pair Dubai Icon (New Approach) and Real World (Dark Angel), who were split by a short head crossing the line. New Trails is out of the winning Mr. Prospector (Raise A Native) mare Issaqueena, who herself is a half-sister to US Listed winner Charley Tango (Maria's Mon). He is a half-brother to four winners including US Grade 2 victor Tizaqueena (Tiznow). Former shuttler Medaglia D'Oro

stands for US\$150,000 (approx. AUD\$193,800) at Jonabell Farm in Kentucky this year.

My Admiration - Cryptic Love (5 m ex Abitcryptic by Bletchley Park) caused an upset in the Pinjarra Classic (Listed, 1300m) on Sunday to provide Westbury Park stallion My Admiration (Encosta de Lago) with his second individual stakes winner. The David Harrison-trained mare grabbed the inside rail down the home straight and just got up in a photo finish under Jason Whiting, with the first five horses finishing within half a length of the winner. Western Temple (Dream Ahead), like the winner sent off a \$31 chance, finished a nose behind in second, with Son Of A God (Playing God) a short head further behind in third. My Admiration, winner of the 2012 Chairman's Trophy (Listed, 1600m) in Hong Kong, is also the sire of last year's Magic Millions WA 3YO Trophy (RL, 1200m) winner Cryptic Wonder. Both his stakes winners are out of Bletchley Park (Caerleon) mare Abitcryptic, who foaled an unnamed colt out of My Admiration in 2019.

Rulership - Grandiose (6 h ex Cherir by Sunday Silence) took out the Diamond

Stakes (Gr 3, 3400m) at Tokyo on Saturday to earn Rulership (King Kamehameha) his 17th individual stakes winner. Trained by Yasuhito Tamura, the six-year-old defeated Authority (Orfevre) by a neck with

Pont Des Arts (Heart's Cry) a further five lengths back in third. Rulership, the sire of Group 1 winners Mer De Glace and Kiseki, stood at Shadai Stallion Station for 6,000,000 JPY (approx. AUD\$72,300) in 2020.

Vespa - Chokito (3 f ex Pretty Woman by Pins) got off the mark in stakes company when taking out the Southland Guineas (Listed, 1600m) at Invercargill on Saturday, earning Vespa (Elusive City) his first stakes winner. The Mel and Warwick Coles-trained filly led all the way to defeat Milford Sound (Ocean Park) by a short head, with Gone With The Wind (Sebring) a further one and a quarter lengths back in third. Vespa began his stud career at Wellfield Lodge, where his first three seasons saw him cover a total of 209 mares, before moving to Valachi Downs for the 2020 season. Vespa, who has eight winners from 25 runners, stood for a 2020 service fee of \$5,000.


