### New Zealand racing comes to an immediate halt as Kiwi Easter vendors left stranded

*Australian industry ploughs on for now under strict biosecurity measures*

New Zealand vendors set to sell at next month's Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale will be unable to get their horses to Sydney for the auction as the country's government moved to shut down the nation in an attempt to slow the rate of Covid-19 infection.

The development also saw the immediate suspension of racing in the country for at least four weeks due to the strict protocols imposed yesterday by prime minister Jacinda Ardern.

It comes as Australia's thoroughbred industry governing bodies gained a reprieve from new restrictions announced on Sunday night by prime minister Scott Morrison which saw mass closures of pubs, clubs, restaurants and indoor sporting venues yesterday. *Continued on page 2>>*

### Funstar and Probabeel to clash again

Star fillies Funstar (Adelaide) and Probabeel (Savabeel) are at one-all when it comes to Group 1 clashes and they are set for their next stoush at the highest level when they tackle Saturday's Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m). Funstar has won the two times they have tackled each other in Group 2 company, including last start in the Phar Lap Stakes (Gr 2, 1500m). Neither Funstar nor Probabeel have been beyond 1600m, but both have pedigrees to suggest they will relish the extra trip. "She's by Adelaide, a Cox Plate winner. She is a sister to Youngstar who won two Oaks so she should improve over 2000 [metres] on her breeding," trainer Chris Waller said of Funstar. "When you've got two good fillies like that, it's a good spectacle." Kerrin McEvoy retains the ride on Probabeel after Opie Bosson was suspended last weekend. *Morning Briefing page 6>>*

Racing Victoria and Racing NSW were first to announce that meetings would continue under strict biosecurity measures, which were implemented earlier this month including the banning of the public in attendance.

New Zealand Bloodstock yesterday reacted to their government's news by announcing that its international equine airfreight business would also be suspended indefinitely, a decision that impacts seven vendors who were set to offer horses at the Easter sale

Trelawney Stud's Brent Taylor had two colts, by Lonhro (Octagonal) and Savabeel (Zabeel), set to be offered at the Easter auction but the farm principal confirmed yesterday that the horses were stranded in New Zealand.

"We were advised this morning that the airlines are not allowing grooms on the aircraft with the horses so, therefore, the air transport link is shut down as well, so our yearlings won't be going to Easter even if the sale

is on because they can't get into Australia," Taylor told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"Similarly, we had a filly (Two Illicit) who was supposed to be on the plane tomorrow to go and run in the Vinery on Saturday (in Sydney) and she can't get there either. It's just one of those things that's out of our hands."

Taylor was planning to be a vendor and buyer at the Easter sale but that has now been shelved.

"The thoroughbred industry is resilient, no question about it, but you've got product on the shelf ready to sell being yearlings for Easter," he said.

"That moment of opportunity has disappeared for New Zealand vendors at that sale and we can only hope for our Australian friends that the sale is still able to go ahead in a few weeks' time.

"But there's certainly going to be a reduced demand, you would expect, without the ability to travel. From our perspective, we were very keen to sell there but also we saw the catalogue as a great opportunity to be able to go and buy capital stock. That now becomes difficult if we can't be there and part of it."

While lamenting the lost opportunities caused by the pandemic, Taylor was not against the drastic action taken yesterday by the New Zealand government.

"It's only horses. People's lives and the community is far more important than the opportunity to sell," he said. *Continued on page 4>>*

"We're very fortunate that we have been watching countries from all around the world and being stuck down at the bottom of the southern hemisphere in the ocean, so we've had this buffer and we've foreseen how other countries have reacted in the face of this disease."

Queensland yesterday became the latest state to close its borders, joining Tasmania, Western Australia, the Northern Territory, South Australia and the ACT in imposing a 14-day quarantine period on any non-essential visitors.

So far, the governments of NSW and Victoria have not taken the same action, meaning interstate vendors Mill Park (South Australia), Element Hill, KBL Thoroughbreds and Highgrove Stud (Queensland), Yulong, Woodside Park Stud, Rosemont Stud, Two Bays Farm and A List Stud (Victoria) would still be able to consign their horses at the Easter sale.

However, the staff returning to their home state after the sale

would be compelled to undertake 14 days of self-isolation where a border ban was in place.

Inglis management again met yesterday about its Easter sale but the company did not make public any changes to those already announced last week regarding an invite-only buying bench and the complying with a 500-person limit for outdoor gatherings.

There were again suggestions yesterday that the company would bring forward its sale by a few days but that was not confirmed last night and as it stands the auction will proceed on April 7 and 8. *Continued on page 5>>*

Milburn Creek's John Muir, whose NSW Southern Highlands operation has 15 yearlings catalogued for the Easter sale, implored Inglis to go ahead with the April sale.

The successful businessman did not dismiss the magnitude of the coronavirus pandemic, but was optimistic that another "virus" would help ensure the viability of the Easter market.

"I find that horse buyers have got a virus. They love coming to a sale and buying stock. I picked up the virus myself many years ago and I love being in the horse business," Muir told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

"If I was captain of the Titanic I'd probably say, 'don't worry, folks, we've just taken on ice.'"

On a more serious level, Muir said potential buyers had been inspecting Milburn Creek's Easter draft on the farm in the past week and that was expected to continue in the coming days.

"They've come down to see the stock in person because they may be bidding (on the internet) rather than being there in person," he said.

"(The coronavirus) is a setback, but for the buyers there may never be a better opportunity in their lifetime to come and buy a yearling, maybe at a discounted price."

## Australian racing to continue on

Racing NSW chief executive Peter V'landys, who has also been juggling the crisis as chairman of the Australian Rugby League Commission, confirmed yesterday that racing in the state would continue with strict biosecurity measures in place.

His Racing Victoria counterpart Giles Thompson said his board met yesterday following the latest regulations imposed and that they resolved to press on with meetings.

"The decision to continue racing and training is not one that has been taken lightly, but we make it knowing that Victorian racing will continue to do everything to remain compliant with all the current directives, guidelines and advice established by the Victorian government on the advice of the chief health officer," Thompson said.

"We won't rest on our laurels though. We will continually review this decision in consultation with government and health authorities to ensure that we are acting in not only the best interests of all of the staff and stakeholders in our industry, but their families, friends and indeed the wider community.

"I can't stress enough how important it is for all stakeholders within our industry to ensure they abide by both the government directives and our strict industry protocols and that they ensure that they maintain good hygiene, practice social distancing and self-isolate when required."

Racing Queensland also confirmed it would proceed with race meetings, while South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, the Northern Territory and the ACT are also expected to continue.

Earlier, Victorian racing minister Martin Pakula confirmed that racing in his state, and Australia-wide, had permission to continue for the time being, but admitted that further government restrictions could see a shutdown of the industry if the Covid-19 pandemic worsens.

"Everyone in the industry is making the best arguments that we can make and acting in a unified way to make the case to health officials why (we should keep racing)," Pakula told RSN927 yesterday.

"Racing (Victoria) has been very proactive, it has taken social distancing measures, they put crowds out before they were required to do so. They've already announced the May races (at Warrnambool) ... will be crowd free. They are separating jockeys. They are doing everything right.

"But ultimately health officials will make a decision based on what they think is needed to slow the spread of this disease. As an industry we are going to have to accept and respect that."

The national cabinet is due to meet tonight to discuss further biosecurity measures which could again threaten to stop racing.

### Return options for Gailo Chop

The prospect of a closed border between NSW and Victoria has trainer Matthew Williams playing it safe with multiple Group 1 winner Gailo Chop (Deportivo), entering him for races in both states. Gailo Chop is entered for both Rosehill's Doncaster Prelude (Gr 3, 1500m) and Bendigo's Golden Mile (Listed, 1600m) with Williams likely to accept for both races if the border remains open. "He will definitely run at the weekend, just where I don't know," Williams said. "I see there is a bit of rain forecast in Sydney so there is some chance he may go that way. If he did happen to go he could then stay with Matthew Smith at Warwick Farm who has a few OTI horses and he would then run in the Queen Elizabeth Stakes at Randwick." Longer term, Williams hopes to have Gailo Chop in Queensland for the Hollindale Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) and the Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m), dependent on travel restrictions.

### Glenfiddich to chase Sydney riches

Trainer Robbie Griffiths was last night moving to ensure two-year-old Glenfiddich (Fastnet Rock) was in Sydney ahead of any potential closure of the NSW-Victoria border. Glenfiddich won the Mornington Sires' Produce (1500m) last weekend to earn a berth in Sydney's features in the coming weeks, with the ATC Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and the Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) potential targets. "At least this way he'll be up there and he can run in the Sires' Produce, all going well," Griffiths said. "He's going up to David Pfeiffer and we will work in with him as us trainers work

in with one another all the time. I've only got the one horse so I'll send him up. He'll look after him for me and if he has to send one down to Melbourne with no staff, I'll happily return the favour."

### Qld trainers seek border clarification

Racing will continue in Queensland but participants are seeking clarification about what the closure of the state's border will mean for horse and human movement. Yesterday's Murwillumbah meeting featured 16 Queensland trainers, while eight NSW-based trainers have horses nominated for Doomben on Saturday. Horses are expected to be exempt from restrictions but the problem will be for trainers and strappers who accompany them. They could face 14 days in lockdown after returning from a cross-border trip as authorities seek to contain the coronavirus. "The Queensland racing industry is fully aware of the gravity of the situation and that people's livelihoods are at stake," Racing Queensland chief executive Brendan Parnell said. "We will continue to comply with the directives of the government and the respective health agencies in order to limit the spread of Covid-19."

### Hayes delays Hong Kong trip

The closure of international borders has forced trainer David Hayes to remain in Australia as he prepares for his return to the Hong Kong ranks next season. Hayes was due to head to Hong Kong later this week to begin preparing his business and the trainer admits that, once he leaves for his new base, he will not return until travel restrictions are eased. "I'm resigned to the fact that when I go, I'll go and stay there because of the 14-day lock-down," Hayes said.

"I'm allowed to go because I'm a Hong Kong citizen, so I've got no problems going, but I don't want to go and lock myself down for 14 days, stay there three or four days and then come back. I'd have to do another 14 days when I get back. When I do decide to go I might go a little earlier." Hayes was planning to move to Hong Kong in mid-July.

### Doncaster, Sydney Cup weights increased

Weights for both the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) have been raised by a kilogram in response to the Covid-19 crisis, Racing NSW announced yesterday. Avilius (Pivotal) and Happy Clapper (Teofilo) were the original Doncaster top-weights on 58 kilograms; they will now carry 59 kilograms should they run. Avilius was also the Sydney Cup top-weight with 58 kilograms and has now been elevated to 59 kilograms. The spread of weights remains the same. If the top-weight at final acceptances is below 57 kilograms, then weights would be raised further to have a 57 kilogram ceiling.

### One-kilogram penalty for Young Rascal

N E Manion Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) winner Young Rascal (Intello) has been penalised 1 kilogram for the Sydney Cup after his victory under top-weight at Rosehill on Saturday. The William Haggas trainee was originally handicapped at 54 kilograms for the staying feature, but he will now carry 56 kilograms after the penalty and the overall raising of weights is taken into account. He is guaranteed a run, sitting equal sixth in the ballot order alongside The Metropolitan (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Come Play With Me (Blackfriars).



## McEvoy take stock in home state

Trainers Tony and Calvin McEvoy will remain in South Australia at their Kildalton Park complex as the state government closed borders. The stable's stars being aimed at the Adelaide carnival, headed by multiple Group 1 winner Sunlight (Zoustar), are already being prepared from the Barossa Valley facility as the father-and-son partnership bunker down in their home state. If racing is shut down for a period of time, Tony McEvoy said he was likely to keep horses in the stable in readiness for racing to restart. "We will jump the hurdles as they come. But at the moment racing is going ahead and if it was to shut down like the AFL for two months then the horses wouldn't go out of work because there'd be no horses if racing kicked off again," McEvoy told Racing.com. McEvoy also operates a stable in Melbourne at Flemington and is building a complex at Ballarat.

## Cornell appointed SA's equine welfare officer

Long-time Lindsay Park and McEvoy Mitchell Racing employee John Cornell has been appointed as Thoroughbred Racing South Australia's equine welfare officer. "We are thrilled to be appointing someone of John's calibre to this position," TRSA chief executive Nick Redin said. "Equine welfare is something we take incredibly seriously, so we knew we were looking for someone with proven experience and a deep understanding of best practice. John is the perfect fit - he has firsthand experience across all aspects of the industry, as well as a genuine love of horses and racing." Cornell, who will start his new position on April 20, said: "I never envisaged I would step away from McEvoy Mitchell, but I knew I couldn't pass up this opportunity. While I am confident that the vast majority of this industry does the right thing, those remaining few need to be better educated."

## Easter sale preview on Sky

The annual Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale Preview airs over the next two weeks, with part one debuting at 9pm tonight on Sky Thoroughbred Central. The first episode features yearlings from leading vendor Arrowfield Stud,

home to three-time Champion Australian sire Snitzel (Redoute's Choice), the rapidly growing Newgate Farm, launching four new stallions including Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Capitalist (Written Tycoon) and Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt). Yarraman Park continues to produce quality yearlings by their breed-shaper I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) while the Bhima Thoroughbreds draft features a magnificent close relation to Winx (Street Cry). Widden Stud again highlights the wonderful power and strength of the next generation of champions as they gallop around the famous Widden Valley paddocks, with a feature lot the brother to star sprinter Sunlight (Zoustar). And breeder of quality thoroughbreds Kia Ora Stud features a half-brother to Friday night's William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner, star filly Loving Gaby (I Am Invincible).

## Capricornia sales postponed

The 2020 Capricornia Yearling Sale has been postponed because of the Covid-19 pandemic, the Rockhampton Jockey Club (RJC) announced yesterday. The sale, scheduled for April 5, was to have been held at Rockhampton Showgrounds, with 91 lots to have gone through the ring. "Unfortunately, we have to admit defeat to Covid-19 and the restrictions that have, and will, be put in place going forward," the RJC statement read. "The health and safety of all our team, vendors, buyers and other interested parties is paramount to our decision making. The situation will be reviewed again by May 29. Further information will be circulated to all stakeholders shortly after this date." Among the sale's graduates have been Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) winner River Lad (Top Echelon) and the Group 1-placed Looks Like The Cat (Husson).

## RV cancels barrier trials

Official flat trials in Victoria have come to a halt in another attempt to keep racing continuing in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic. Racing Victoria confirmed last night that all trial sessions until the end of April, including today's 25-heat set at Kyneton, would no longer go ahead. All jump-outs will also be restricted to local horses indefinitely. "The announcement

to cancel trials and localise jump-outs builds upon the unprecedented actions we have taken over the past fortnight to protect the health and wellbeing of our industry participants and to ensure the continuation of Victorian racing in a safe environment for those whose livelihoods depend on it and for our horses who depend on us," said Racing Victoria chief executive Giles Thompson.

## Pateman guilty of cobalt administration

Trainer Steven Pateman and his partner Jess Barton face a minimum three years on the sidelines after being found guilty of raceday administration of cobalt by the Racing Appeals and Disciplinary (RAD) Board yesterday. The pair were charged with a breach of AR244 after a positive swab was taken from a pre-race urine sample from Sir Walter Scott (Galileo) before he contested the Great Western Steeplechase at Coleraine in September, 2017. It was alleged that former champion jockey Pateman admitted injecting Sir Walter Scott with a number of substances containing cobalt on the morning of the race in a phone call with steward Dion Villella. He later claimed that he was drunk when the statement was made. The pair will be sentenced at a later date.

## Kiwis stuck at home

New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Jennifer Eccles (Rip Van Winkle) and New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) runner-up Two Illicit (Jimmy Choux) are out of the Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) after all international equine flights from New Zealand were suspended yesterday. Two Illicit was scheduled to fly to Sydney today to tackle Saturday's Vinery Stud Stakes at Rosehill. Also scheduled to fly today was Zabeel Classic (Gr 1, 2000m) winner True Enough (Nom Du Jeu), who was slated to contest Saturday's Tancred Stakes (Gr 1, 2400m) for Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman, while Tancred entry Sound (Lando) - a last-start runner-up in the Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) - had not made it back to Australia by the time the suspension was announced, according to trainer Mike Moroney.

## Richardson savours role in HK Derby success

The success of Golden Sixty (Medaglia D'Oro) in Sunday's Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m), making him just the second horse to sweep the Four-Year-Old Classic Series, was celebrated far and wide, but New Zealand trainer Graham Richardson had more reason than most to smile. Sam Beatson of Riversley Park and trainer Ben Foote prepared Golden Sixty for the 2017 NZB Ready To Run Sale, where he was purchased by trainer Francis Lui for NZ\$300,000 on behalf of bloodstock agent Willie Leung. He was then sent to Richardson ahead of his Hong Kong move. "I do pre-train a few for Willie, I've got a couple now and he is a good judge of a horse," said Richardson. "I had Mr Stunning for him too. Golden Sixty is a nice horse and he showed us a lot from the beginning. I remember Cameron Lammas getting off him at the Te Teko trials one day and he said to me, he's a real Derby horse."

## Colic claims Perfectly Ready

Perfectly Ready (More Than Ready) has died due to colic at the age of 17, Brighthill Farm announced yesterday. Winner of the Goodwood Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) in 2006, his progeny included Thorndon Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Signify and the Group 1-placed Al Strada, who raced in Hong Kong as Twin Delight. He has also had success as a broodmare sire, most notably with Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Aloisia (Azamour). "Perfectly Ready was a wonderful stallion for us here at Brighthill Farm," general manager Nick King said. "His loss will be greatly felt around the farm on a day-to-day basis. Perfectly Ready had

a wonderful character that was noticed and one that touched everybody who was involved with him. He will be greatly missed."

## Shinn in Covid-19 scare

A day after Blake Shinn produced one of his best ever rides in defeat aboard runner-up Playa Del Puente (Elzaam) in the Hong Kong Derby, a coronavirus scare forced the Australian rider into isolation yesterday. Fellow rider Keith Yeung was tested for Covid-19 as a precaution after he reported an elevated temperature and general malaise on Sunday night. Yeung was advised to miss trackwork yesterday morning, along with Shinn and Derek Leung, both of whom had been sitting near Yeung in the jockeys' room during the Derby meeting at Sha Tin. Late last night, it was confirmed that Yeung had tested negative, but he will be tested again this morning as another precaution and will also be stood down from trackwork this morning, as well as from Happy Valley tomorrow night. Shinn and Leung will still ride at Happy Valley, with six and seven mounts respectively.

## Prince Of Arran stranded after Dubai cancellation

A frustrated Charlie Fellowes has expressed concern that Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) runner-up Prince Of Arran (Shirocco) and his staff will be stuck in the United Arab Emirates after the cancellation of the Dubai World Cup meeting. Fellowes had planned to run Prince Of Arran in the Dubai Gold Cup (Gr 2, 3200m) on

Saturday, but the meeting was cancelled over the weekend due to the coronavirus pandemic. "It's incredibly frustrating that Prince Of Arran is now stuck out in Dubai as we'd been asking over and over again if this meeting was going to go ahead and were assured that it was," Fellowes told Racing Post. "Now the problem is getting the horse and Kelly Cochrane, the girl who is with him, back here which might not be easy. If we'd had an inkling that this was going to happen we wouldn't have sent the horse with the other Europeans on Friday. Quite why they left it this late to call it off I don't know but the decision obviously transcends racing."

## Pinatubo behind closed doors

Last season's champion two-year-old Pinatubo (Shamardal) stayed isolated behind the closed doors of Charlie Appleby's Moulton Paddocks base at Newmarket over the weekend and is expected to stay there for the coming weeks. Pinatubo, the highest-rated juvenile in a quarter of a century, is being aimed at the 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) on May 2, two days after the UK's racing ban is scheduled to end. The three-year-old had been seen on the Heath at Newmarket in recent weeks but Appleby is playing it safe. "We can naturally self isolate at Moulton Paddocks so it makes sense to do so in the current situation. It's only recently that our grass gallops here have been usable so Pinatubo and a few others used them on Saturday morning," Appleby said. "We've no issues with the coronavirus here at the moment. If we were concerned about someone, Moulton Paddocks has many separate yards and properties all over the site so it's very suitable for isolation."

**Not A Single Doubt** - Arrowfield Stud's recently retired stallion Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice) landed his 12 individual

Group 1 winner on Saturday when the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained Farnan (2 c ex Tallow by Street Cry) took out the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Rosehill. The son of Redoute's Choice (Danehill) had enjoyed a terrific career in the breeding barn but was retired from mating duties in January due to respiratory issues. He stood for a career-high fee of \$110,000 (inc GST) in 2019

**Pivotal** - Cheveley Park Stud's Pivotal (Polar Falcon) sired his 31st individual Group 1 winner

on Saturday when the William Haggas-trained Addeybb (6 g ex Bush Cat by Kingmambo) won the Ranvet Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Rosehill. The six-year-old British raider fought hard to the line to edge out Chris Waller's Verry Elleegant (Zed) by half a length, with last year's winner of the race and fellow son of Pivotal, Avilius, finishing over five lengths away in third. Addeybb will now head towards the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Randwick on April 11. Pivotal stands at the Newmarket stud for a Private fee in 2020.

**Snitzel** - Not A Single Doubt's former barn mate Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) also sired a new Group 1 winner at Rosehill on Saturday, taking his tally to 14, as I Am Excited (5 m ex Lady Beckworth by General Nediym) landed the Galaxy Stakes (Gr 1, 1100m). Snitzel stood for a fee of \$220,000 (inc GST) in 2019 and is currently the third overall leading sire in Australia by earnings and winners. I Am Excited joins fellow star sprinters Redzel, Trapeze Artist and Russian Revolution as Group 1 winners for their sire.

## New stakes winners

**Brazen Beau** - Brazen Beau (I Am Invincible) registered his seventh individual stakes winner when Larimer Street (2 c ex Original Choice by Redoute's Choice) built on his promising earlier form to take out the Valley Pearl Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Moonee Valley on Friday night. **Deep Impact** - The late Deep Impact (Sunday Silence) sired his 154th individual stakes winner when Admire Virgo (3 c ex Elusive Wave by Elusive City) justified favouritism to remain unbeaten with a two-length success in Saturday's Wakaba Stakes (Listed, 2000m) at Hanshin. The Yasuo Tomomichi three-year-old scored from Chimera Verite (Kizuna), with American Seed (Tapit) another length and three quarters away in third.

Modernist (Uncle Mo) finished a further two and three-quarter lengths adrift in third. In winning for the third time in five starts, Wells Bayou became the 54th stakes scorer for Ashford Stud resident Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike), who is currently standing for a fee of US\$20,000 (\$35,000) (inc GST).

**Lucky Pulpit** - Ward 'N Jerry (7 g ex Tamarack Bay by Dehere) gained an overdue victory in stakes company when he landed the San Luis Rey Stakes (Gr 3, 12f) at Santa Anita on Saturday. Laden with stamina but tackling this marathon trip for the first time, Ward 'N Jerry outstayed his six rivals in the home stretch, landing the spoils by a length and a quarter to become the 12th individual stakes winner

**Mossman** - Former Vinery Stud resident Mossman (Success Express) landed his 41st individual stakes winner yesterday, courtesy of Diamond Effort's (4 m ex Relativity by Geiger Counter) victory in Saturday's Hareeba Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Mornington. The Clinton McDonald-trained mare kept her unbeaten record this campaign intact, defeating Runson (Delazo) by a neck, with Seabrook (Hinchinbrook) flashing home to finish a further neck away in third. Domenic Romanelli purchased Diamond Effort for \$140,000 at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale from the draft of Cornerstone Stud. Out of the five-time winning mare Relativity (Geiger Counter), she is a sister to four-time stakes winner Second Effort. Mossman was retired from stud duties in 2018.

## Racing must determine its own fate in these coronavirus times

**T**he racing industry needs to make its position absolutely clear in order to ensure its immediate fate is not taken entirely out of its hands during the Covid-19 crisis.

Australian racing has already developed protocols far beyond those in other racing jurisdictions with the highest standard of separation and mitigation measures; temperature checks in place for working attendees and participant reduction with almost 95 per cent located outside.

A preparedness to do even more may be necessary - including no cross state-border competition, at least, in the short term. So be it.

The message needs to be clear. Not a mish-mash of statements from various jurisdictions and various clubs.

Of course, I have a vested interest - and a desire as a simple fan - in racing continuing.

But I do not blithely argue that it must. Rather my pitch is that a sensible decision, based on the best risk assessment and medical advice, is made.

We ought not respond on an emotive basis - or under some sense of duress - but assess the facts and certainly not react on the basis of what others have done before assessing why they have done what they've done.

The Emirates Racing Association has abandoned the Dubai World Cup meeting. Perhaps altruistic, but consider that it has nothing to gain revenue wise from continuing. New Zealand has announced a temporary closure but it is in a state of rebuild.

Government measures, to date, have not brought all activity to a standstill and racing has

already demonstrated its ability to manage this crisis with no incident or Covid-19 outbreak at no-attendee meetings since March 13.

Racing has been able to draw on the experience of managing the Equine Influenza outbreak in 2007.

At Warwick Farm on Wednesday, there will be no fewer than seven separate jockeys' rooms to segregate riders based on where domiciled and where they last rode.

As of last night, any jockey not currently located in New South Wales will not be allowed to attend any NSW racecourse or licensed premises until further notice - and likewise any jockey who leaves the state.

Racing is continuing, under strict management, in major jurisdictions including Hong Kong and Japan and has done so for some time now, along with Ireland. Racing remains a massive employer, directly and indirectly, in this country.

In my state, Victoria, alone, racing generates over \$3.2 billion in economic activity and, more importantly, about 25,000 people depend on it for their livelihood.

Further, following the sport remains a huge source of joy for hundreds of thousands (if not more) of Australians - particularly those in our older, less mobile and coronavirus high risk category - whose passion is not defined by a gambling addiction but rather by following their favourite horses, jockeys and trainers with or without an occasional dollar or two each-way.

There is also the issue of the welfare of the horse on whom the sport-cum-industry is centred.

Trainer Robbie Griffiths, president of the Australian Trainers' Association, outlined this message yesterday when interviewed on Racing.com.

"I think it (a ban) would be crippling, absolutely crippling to everyone in racing because we can't just close our doors," he said. "We've got a horse welfare issue that we need to attend to. We can't just go home and hibernate for two, four, six weeks, whatever it takes for the virus to burn out, because we've got to come to work every day, clean the boxes, feed and water the horses and make sure they're cared for.

"So, because the horses need constant care, we can't close the doors like other businesses. I think it would be absolutely devastating in racing if we are closed."

That is part of the reason why racing is unlike any other industry. Ask any CEO who

has walked into a position of authority in racing and thought to himself, "I'll nail this in a couple of weeks." It just doesn't happen.

Again, I stress this is not a myopic plea to abandon all reason and simply keep racing.

It is a plea that we do our best to keep the industry operating if medical authorities accept that it is not an unacceptable risk to continue to do so.

# Henrique and Hamel chasing premiership honours

**B**razilian Fausto Henrique and Frenchman Jean-Baptiste Hamel have emerged as serious contenders for the title of Macau's Champion Jockey after both kicked home doubles on the weekend.

Both riders have been in superb form in recent weeks with Henrique in third spot in the rider's standings on 22 wins, and Hamel in fourth position on 21 victories. Roger Yu still leads the way on 24 winners after booting home one winner on the weekend, with four-time champion Luis Corrales in second spot on 23 wins.

Henrique struck first on Friday night when he scored on Stanley Chin's Win Win Hooray (Bel Esprit) by virtue of a lovely rails-hugging ride in the Class 3 & 4 over 1050 metres.

On a night where some riders were content to skirt a bit deep away from the rails, Henrique summed the track up perfectly after the rain came with the rail riding slick all night.

Henrique then produced a gem of a ride on the Tony Fung-prepared Mr Fortune (Jet Spur) in the last of the night, the Class 4 & 5 over 1510 metres.

Mr Fortune, the race favourite, was drawn out in gate 11 and, with just 110 metres to the first turn, Henrique did a brilliant job to position the favorite in fourth spot on the rail. From then on the three-year-old enjoyed the run of the race off the speed before darting between runners at the top of the straight and powering away for a strong win.

Hamel's joy came on Saturday's turf card when he got off to a flying start on the Nick Moore-trained Hostwin Euphoria (Street Boss) in the Class 4 & 5 over 1200 metres. Hostwin Euphoria is a nice neat-looking three-year-old that was a \$150,000 purchase at the 2018 Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale.

Hostwin Euphoria was well-schooled having won barrier trials at both Rosehill and Warwick Farm prior to being sent to Macau,

and judging by Saturday's win, he is going to develop into a handy commodity that will get over more ground.

Nick Moore also provided Hamel with his second winner in Hostwin Shadow (Longhorn) in the Class 2 & 3 over 1200 metres. The grey enjoyed a cosy run off the leader Thehorseiswithme (I Am Invincible) before ripping away for an easy win. His runtime of 1:10.9 was only two ticks quicker than Hostwin Euphoria's early win in the lower grade, which bodes well for the younger Hostwin Euphoria.

The Hostwin double continued the wonderful start for Moore to his training career, giving him five winners from only 23 runners to date. Hostwin Euphoria and Hostwin Shadow were his only runners on Saturday.

With five months of the season remaining, the jockeys' championship is shaping up to be an intriguing battle. Henrique is in his third season in Macau and now well established with owners and trainers. Hamel only arrived for the final three months of last season, but has quickly garnered support to put himself in the top bracket in the enclave.

Chin is eyeing the four-year-old classics as a prelude to the Derby for his highly-talented galloper King Of Glamour (Eurozone), who scored a nice win in the Class 1 & 2 over 1500 metres.

Stable apprentice Eric Cheung did a fine job on the gelding, getting across from gate nine to find the rail in seventh spot after 300 metres. His mount enjoyed a nice run well off the pace before improving approaching the home turn. With a line of four battling it out at the furlong, King Of Glamour swooped on them quickly and sprinted away with a winning break.

Luen On Poseidon (Pierro), who was runner-up to Bring Me Speed (Sebring) in last year's Macau Guineas (Listed, 1500m), was coming on strongly late under Dayversom Barros after having to squeeze through a tight gap on the rail, and ran King Of Glamour to a short head on the wire; Trillion King (Myboycharlie) was a distant third.

King Of Glamour has put together a fine record with five wins and three seconds from his nine starts. Saturday's win came off an unlucky neck second to Oneofthegreats (Snitzel) over 1500 metres on February 22.

Chin will target the Derby Trial (1500m) on May 16, then the Macau Guineas on June 13 on his way to the Derby (Listed, 1800m) set down for July 19. Chin was a neck runner-up to Pearl Green (Fastnet Rock) in the 2018 Derby with Royal Garden (Remind).

Cliffy Lai took the prize for the most daring ride of the day when he led most of the way on the New Zealand import Qian Gua (Cape Blanco) to win the Class 2 over 1800 metres.

Lai, who has only just returned to riding after a four-month break, drove the five-year-old out of the gates to lead the field out of the straight the first time, setting up a good tempo. On the back, the gelding was momentarily headed by The Moon's Back (Hussonet) before Lai again upped the ante to take charge again.

Qian Gua was let loose by Lai from the 600 metres and put a gap in the field to straighten up with a six-length margin over the rest; he gave nothing a chance from there on to win easily.

Prepared in Macau by K H Leong, Qian Gua was friendless in the betting going out at more than 50-1. The victory was even more surprising given that Qian Gua had only had one run prior for a 12th of 14, beaten 16 lengths over 1050 metres on the sand.

Japanese rider Masa Tanaka is off and running in Macau with a double over the weekend to add to his breakthrough win in the enclave a fortnight back.

Tanaka again teamed up with trainer Geoff Allendorf - who provided him with his first winner Luen On Success (Lord Kanaloa) - only on this occasion it was Luen On Prosperity (Written Tycoon) in Friday night's Class 4 & 5 over 1200 metres on the turf.

Luen On Prosperity made it win number two from his five runs to date and continued the good run of success for the Allendorf stable, and gave him win number 22 for the season.

Tanaka then backed up again on Saturday to win the Class 5 & 6 over 1800 metres on the Alan Tam-prepared So Yummy (Kuroshio).

Tanaka is Macau's newest jockey having arrived in January. He has ridden at 10 racedays to date and is now just starting to establish himself locally.

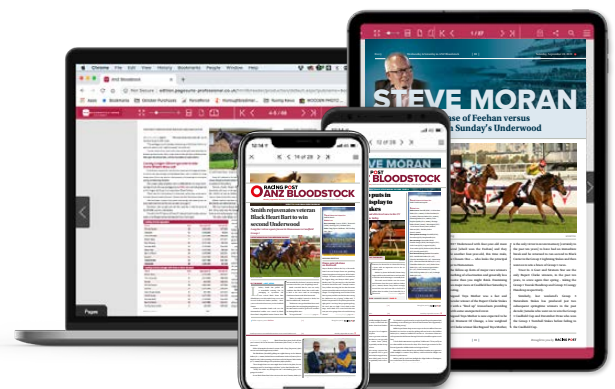
Shogo Nakano, Macau's other Japanese rider is into his second year with the club, and the likeable jockey booted home win number six for the season with a nice ride on Ventures Elite (Battle Paint) from the Leong yard in the Class 6 over 1350 metres on Friday night.

Ventures Elite was rated perfectly on the lead by Nakano before racing well clear in the straight to defeat Numberone Mingxuan (Bullbars) and Eric Cheung, with Filial Piety (Highly Recommended) and Stephane Ladjadj in third.

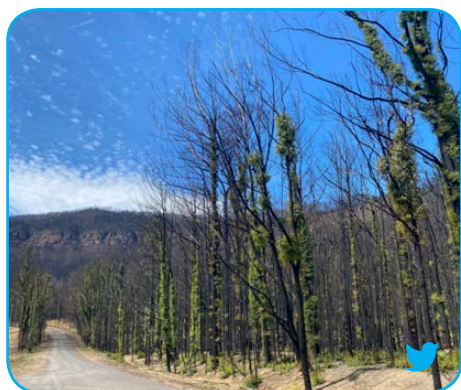

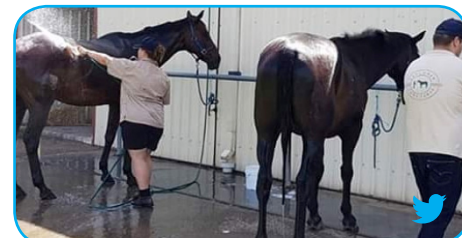
