'Strongest Karaka yearling sale catalogue for some time'

Depth of stallions underpins New Zealand Bloodstock's 2021 offering

concerted long-term commitment by New Zealand stud masters to improve the depth of the country's stallion ranks is borne out in next year's Karaka Yearling Sale with breeders no longer needing to solely rely on the progeny of champion sire Savabeel (Zabeel) to attract international buyers to New Zealand Bloodstock's annual yearling sale.

The catalogue for the streamlined sale, released late vesterday, features 578 lots in Book 1 and another 340 yearlings in Book 2, down from the 677-lot Book 1 and 473 lots offered in Book 2 earlier this year. Continued on page 3>> YESTERDAY'S RACE RESULTS - PAGE 21

<< Continued from page 2 NZB also confirmed that, for the first time, the Book 3 sale will be held entirely online via the company's Gavelhouse.com online auction platform.</p>

Andrew Seabrook, NZB's managing director, believes the depth of the 2021 January sale is as strong as it has been for some time with progeny by Reliable Man (Dalakhani), Tavistock (Montjeu) and Sacred Falls (O'Reilly) performing well across Australasia during the spring.

"The investment (by stud masters) has been fantastic in the past three to five years, particularly in the staying stallions, and we had 13 first season sires represented last January who have two-year-olds now, so anyone of those could put their hands up to be the next big stallion for New Zealand," Seabrook told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

"I think we are in good stead going forward and then we have first season sires like Almanzor and others with their first crop yearlings next year.

As would be expected, the NZB Book 1 catalogue has a bigrepresentation from Savabeel (42) and

the late Cambridge Stud sire Tavistock(35) as well as Ocean Park (Thorn Park) (17), Reliable Man (28), Sacred Falls (nine), and Per Incanto (Street Cry) (21).

Australia's premier stallions also figure prominently in the make-up of the 2021 catalogue with yearlings by Snitzel (Redoute's Choice), I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit), Fastnet Rock (Danehill), Dundeel (High Chaparral) and Pierro (Lonhro) all being offered at Karaka.

First season sires from both countries also have yearlings catalogued including home country stallions Almanzor (Wootton Bassett), Derryn (Hinchinbrook), Satono Aladdin (Deep Impact), Time Test (Dubawi), War Decree (War Front), Mongolian Falcon (Fastnet Rock) and What's The Story (Savabeel).

Gordon Cunningham, whose Curraghmore operation has sold the likes of recent New Zealand 1000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Kahma Lass (Darci Brahma), Aimee's Jewel (Proisir), In A Twinkling (Fastnet Rock) and retired Group 1 winners Unforgotten (Fastnet Rock) and First Seal (Fastnet Rock), holds his latest draft in high regard. *Continued on page 5>>*

<< Continued from page 3 Among Curraghmore's draft is a Raffles-bred Pierro filly who is the second foal out of Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner and New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) placegetter Rock Diva (Lucky Unicorn), herself a half-sister to champion Australian three-year-old filly Shamrocker (O'Reilly), a dual Group 1 winner.

Cunningham also identified a Sebring (More Than Ready) filly who is out of Strada Cavallo (Alamosa). Her first foal, two-year-old colt Khufu (American Pharoah), is already a trial winner for Cambridge trainer Tony Pike, while the Te Awamutu-based vendor also has an Ocean Park colt who is the second foal out of Vitesse (Makfi), herself a half-sister to multiple Group 1-winning sprinter Bostonian (Jimmy Choux).

"We've always had plenty of confidence that there will be good horses to come from each crop on our farm and the draft we'll take to Karaka in January will be no exception," Cunningham said.

"The (international trainers and owners) have come over here for years and sourced good horses, so they know that buying horses at Karaka for their stable is part-and-parcel of their success going forward, so I have got no doubt that they will be operating again next year."

To help make it easier for international buyers to participate, particularly those in Asia, selling on each of the four days from January 24 to 28 will start at 1pm New Zealand time.

Last week's NZB Ready to Run Sale was also conducted in the same time slot and feedback from buyers ensured the status quo was maintained.

The success of the Karaka sale relies heavily on the international market, particularly Australian owners and trainers, and despite the likelihood that a travel bubble between the two countries will not be in place in time for next year's sale, Seabrook remains confident that the company can attract a competitive overseas market.

"We don't see any reason why that won't be the case in January. Karaka is still the place to buy those good, tough, sound middle-distance horses and staying horses and we have got so many stallions performing well at the moment," Seabrook said.

"There is no reason why the Australians won't be active. The other thing in our favour in January is that the pinhookers walked away last week a lot more confident than we were heading into the sale. Normally, when the Ready to Run Sale is strong, the yearling sale in January follows on as well.

"I am not saying it is going to be up on this year - that would be foolish of me - but what happened last week does give me a bit more confidence."

The release of the NZB Karaka catalogue comes soon after Australian auction houses Magic Millions and Inglis released their catalogues for the Gold Coast and Classic Yearling sales respectively.

Trekking wins trial

Dual Group 1 winner Trekking (Street Cry) put the finishing touches to his preparation for Saturday's Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Ascot by winning a barrier trial at Belmont yesterday. Trained by James Cummings, Trekking finished fourth behind Hey Doc (Duporth) in the Winterbottom 12 months ago and the six-year-old appeared in top form ahead of this weekend's \$1 million feature under Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) hero Willie Pike, getting the better of Excellent Dream (Dream Ahead) in a five-horse line-up that also included Lindsey Smith's unbeaten Chantrea (Puissance de Lune). "Obviously, Willie (Pike) is not used to the way James (Cummings) trains his horses but we just said 'come out neutral, get some cover and let him find his stride nicely the last furlong'," Cummings' representative Nacim Dilmi told The Races WA. "He's pulled up very well which gives us another great indication he's going well into Saturday's race." Trekking is one of 16 acceptances (plus one emergency) for the Winterbottom Stakes. He is Sportsbet's \$2.50 favourite to add to his wins in the 2019 Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) and 2020 Goodwood (Gr 1, 1200m) and provide Pike with another big-race success. The barrier draw is set to take place this evening.

Hit The Shot sold to Hong Kong

Progressive stayer Hit The Shot (Dundeel), last seen running second in the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) at Flemington on October 31, has been sold out of Matt Cumani's yard and will head to Hong Kong, joining the stable of 11-time champion trainer John Size. Formerly

owned by Gu Tao's emerging operation Zhongli Thoroughbreds, who paid \$190,000 for the colt at the 2019 Inglis Classic Yearling Sale from the draft of Arrowfield Stud, Hit The Shot won a Ballarat maiden first-up on August 11 and has been placed in three of his four subsequent starts, including the Caulfield Classic (Gr 3, 2000m) prior to his Derby run. Cumani said he was thankful of the support Zhongli Thoroughbreds had given him and understood why they accepted the deal. "He is a horse that's shown a lot of promise. We were yet to see the best of him," Cumani told Racing.com. "He is a horse that would have gone on really well and been really successful for the rest of his threeyear-old year and into his four-year-old year."

Thompson out to continue winning form

John Thompson, who sits in the top ten in the Sydney trainers' premiership with nine city wins this season and is on target to match his 36 victories during the 2019-20 term, is looking forward to a fruitful autumn campaign with \$1 million The Hunter (1300m) winner Sweet Deal (Casino Prince). Thompson, whose spring successes also include the Tramway Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) win of Dreamforce (Fastnet Rock), believes tentime winner Sweet Deal is still improving at the age of six. "They were talking about retiring her after last autumn. The owner basically said to me, 'do you think she's had enough?' and I said, 'are you cracking jokes, she's just coming good'," Thompson said. "She has done so well it wouldn't surprise me to even see them race on a bit longer. We are planning for her to come back in the autumn through those mares' races. She will be first up in the Guy Walter, Coolmore, Queen Of The Turf and then we will possibly go for a freshen up then and go to Queensland for a race like the

Tatt's Tiara." Thompson is again poised to have a feature race presence on Saturday with Primitivo (Sebring) set to resume in the Festival Stakes (Gr 3, 1500m) at Rosehill. The six-year-old is one of 20 nominations for the traditional lead-up into next month's Villiers Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) at Randwick.

Carlyon possible for Meteorite

The Tony and Calvin McEvoy-trained Meteorite (Deep Field), who could only finish second of four when sent off the \$1.50 favourite at Moonee Valley on Friday evening, could be given a quick chance of redemption in Saturday's \$140,000 Carlyon Stakes (Listed, 1000m), one of two stakes races rescheduled after their original date in August was washed out. "We'll see how he comes through his run," Calvin McEvoy told Racing.com. "I've had a plan that if he won then we'd go there. Although he didn't win he still ran very well." Meteorite was one of 18 nominations received yesterday for Moonee Valley's Carlyon Stakes. Included among the potential opposition are recent Doveton Stakes (Listed, 1000m) runner-up Coruscate (Exceed And Excel) for James Cummings, as well as the Mathew Ellerton and Simon Zahra-trained Prezado (Denman).

Stewards give Brazen Boy a tick

Brazen Boy (Brazen Beau), who missed his intended debut in Sandown's Merson Cooper Stakes (Listed, 1000m) following a barrier incident earlier in the month, has obtained his barrier certificate from stewards and is cleared to race. However, trainer Phillip Stokes yesterday said the promising juvenile, who won an Adelaide barrier trial by 14 lengths on October 27 prior to getting down in the gates at Sandown, is not guaranteed to make a start at Moonee Valley on Saturday, despite holding an entry in the 1000-metre contest for two-year-olds. "I'll just see how he works tomorrow (Tuesday) morning as physically he's fine but it's just in the back of your mind that his campaign hasn't gone to plan and whether it's worth just having a break and going again," Stokes told Racing.com. "He had to get his barrier (certificate) after what happened at Sandown so it's hardly been an ideal prep for him, but he bounced out (of the barriers) the other day and showed that speed that is his forte."

George Moore next for Scallopini

Scallopini (Snitzel) will renew his rivalry with Jonker (Spirit Of Boom) in the George Moore Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) as co-trainer Matt Hoysted vesterday confirmed the six-year-old is being set for the Doomben sprint on December 5. Scallopini ran eighth in the Keith Noud Quality (Listed, 1200m) on November 14 as Jonker produced a blistering front-running display to win by four and a half lengths in a sensational time of 1:07.83, eclipsing the previous 1200-metre track record set by champion sprinter Takeover Target (Celtic Swing) in the 2005 Summer Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m). "They ran along at a fast pace with sustained speed the entire way and he ended up further back than we would've liked from the wide gate," Hoysted, who trains in partnership with Steven O'Dea, said. "He was probably out of his comfort zone for a lot of the race at that frenetic speed, but we were really pleased with his closing splits and the way he attacked the line. He'll go to the George Moore and we're really happy with the way he's progressing this prep."

Enthaar to target Diamond and Slipper

Co-trainer Ciaron Maher has outlined future plans for the talented juveniles he and David Eustace have unleashed in recent weeks. Enthaar (Written Tycoon) shot to the head of the early betting for next March's Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) when she blitzed her Gimcrack Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) rivals by three lengths on debut at Randwick last month. "She'll go to the (Blue) Diamond (at Caulfield in February) before heading up for the Slipper," Maher told Racing.com. "I think she's the type of filly capable of doing it (Group 1 double)." Stablemate Sneaky Five (Fastnet Rock), who is unbeaten in two runs in Melbourne and Sydney this spring, is also heading to the Golden Slipper, but first she will attempt to land the \$2m Inglis Millennium (RL, 1100m) at Warwick Farm in February having already netted the \$1 million Golden Gift (1100m) at Rosehill. Fake Love (I Am Invincible), who is owned by similar interests to last season's Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) winner Away Game (Snitzel), will follow a similar path to the Gold Coast as the latter did, taking in a leadup contest in Brisbane. Fake Love won the Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Caulfield in October prior to her last-start fourth in the Ottawa Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) on November 5.

Festival focus for Tradewind

The Adelaide Festival of Racing is on the agenda for Tradewind (Trust In A Gust) following his neck success in the \$175,000 VOBIS Gold Eureka Stockade (1400m) at Ballarat on Saturday. The son of Trust In A Gust (Keep The Faith), who

won the corresponding race in 2013, made it two wins from four starts under Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m)-winning jockey Jye McNeil to take his career earning to \$137,950 in prizemoney alongside a further \$21,000 in bonuses. "We think he's still got a lot of upside," trainer Ryan Balfour's racing manager Matt Kelly said. "He's a colt, so we'll look at some of the bigger races both here (South Australia) and in Victoria in the autumn."

Shelby Cobra spelled

Shelby Cobra (Toronado), who was sent off the \$1.65 favourite to make it three wins from four outings in the Eureka Stockade, is set for a spell having only finished sixth, beaten just under six lengths by Tradewind. "He's as good as gold (after the run)," his trainer Mike Moroney told Racing.com. "He just raced tired. He's had enough. So he is going to the paddock." Moroney said he would let the dust settle before making an autumn plan for Shelby Cobra, who followed up his Sale maiden win in October with a one-length success in the Springtime Stakes (Listed, 1400m) on November 7.

TRSA ready for busy period

Adelaide's racing authorities remain confident its participants and officials can cope with the unprecedented workload they face in the coming weeks as racing resumes following Covid-19-enforced disruption. Today's rescheduled meeting at Naracoorte will be the first of six consecutive days of racing in South Australia, with another four meetings scheduled for next week. Thoroughbred Racing South Australia CEO Nick Redin said the busy period, which was prompted by the state's short-lived circuit breaker lockdown last week, presented a set of unique challenges. "I've been here at TRSA for 12 years and it has certainly never happened in my time," Redin told Racing.com. "I know it happens on a constant basis interstate but what people don't realise is we are in a unique situation here in South Australia. We are basically one big pool of resources and our teams - whether it be officials, trainers or jockeys - cover the entire state. There were lengthy discussions to ensure we could make this happen and now the foundations have been laid and we are confident we will

deliver." TRSA chief steward Johan Petzer said his team would monitor fatigue in the riding ranks. "All up we have ten race meetings and a set of trials over the next 14 days so it is a big load for both teams," Petzer told Racing. com. "We are very mindful of the jockeys and the enormity of their workload in the next fortnight. The riding brigade will be monitored constantly and without hesitation any rider who is feeling fatigued will be afforded the necessary leeway."

Inspirational Girl Pike's top seed

The Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) at Ascot on December 5 is the next target for Railway Stakes heroine Inspirational Girl (Reliable Man) and winning jockey Willie Pike is keen to maintain his association with the Grant and Alana Williams-trained fiveyear-old. "She used to get off the bridle and struggle a bit, whereas on Saturday I was getting a lot of pressure early and she wore it very well. I think that is what won us the race," Pike said. "I would be more than happy to stick with her heading to the Kingston Town. She does get four kilos more under the weight-for-age conditions, but I don't think it will matter too much. I think she is looking pretty good." Powerhouse owner-breeder Bob Peters, who was winning his fifth Railway at the weekend, added: "The Kingston Town is the logical step. She has pulled up well. The top five in the Railway she will meet worse at the weights, but the rest she will meet quite well at the weights."

Material Man retired

Star Western Australia performer Material Man (Vital Equine) has been retired after succumbing to an ongoing injury following the Railway Stakes. "The day has been coming for a while and father time has finally caught up with him unfortunately," trainer Justin Warwick said of the nine-yearold, who was set to try and go one better in the Kingston Town Classic having finished runnerup in 2017 and 2018. "He had some swelling there after his Railway Stakes run to a suspensory ligament that we have been managing for a while. It flared up a bit after the race and the risk to keep racing with him would just be too high. He hasn't got much left to prove. He has been an amazing horse for us. The owners keep all their horses whether they're stars or not so he is in for a good retirement." Material Man ends his career as the winner of 16 of his 37 starts, including the 2018 renewal of the Perth Cup (Gr 2, 2400m). Raced by his owner-breeders Michael and Jill MacDermott, Material Man earned \$1,869,175 in prize-money.

Golden Flag lines up for second Jericho

Golden Flag (Raise The Flag), runner-up to classy stayer Ablaze (Raise The Flag) in last year's Jericho Cup (4600m), is primed to go one better in Australia's longest Flat race at Warrnambool on Sunday. "We know he can run the trip, which is a big positive going into this year's race. Also I don't think there are any Ablazes in the race this year," trainer Patrick Ryan Jr said of the sevenyear-old, who is one of 33 nominations for the 4600-metre marathon. "Last year Golden Flag and Ablaze cleared out from the others and his form this year is nearly identical. He was beaten three-quarters of a length by Ablaze. He's had a similar preparation. His form is nearly identical to last year and he's going just as well." Ryan jr will also be represented by Superleggera (Rip Van Winkle) in the \$300,000 event, with the trainer having purchased the five-year-old for \$5,000 from an online auction after he'd had three starts in New Zealand. Since joining the stable he's had six outings, including a last-start win over 3200 metres at Echuca. "He's a onebatter. We stepped him up from 2000 metres to 3200 metres and he handled it and now we're going out to 4800 metres," Ryan Jr continued. "He'll be the least experienced horse in the race but he stays all day and he'll be set for next year's Grand Annual, as will Golden Flag." Golden Flag will be ridden by Tommy Ryan and Superleggera by Nathan Newton.

Allen unable to defend title

John Allen, who landed last year's Jericho Cup aboard Ablaze, won't be back to defend his crown after it was confirmed that he no longer satisfies the criteria to ride in the unique contest. To participate, jockeys must hold a current jumps license and Allen, who didn't ride at all over jumps last season, failed to renew his at the beginning of the new racing season.

Connections in no rush to make Blood call

Allan Endresz will take his time on finding a new stable for Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) after it was announced on Sunday that the owner and his 15-strong string had parted company with David Vandyke. The four-year-old is set to undergo surgery on a kissing spine, which will rule him out of action for between four and six months, leaving Endresz with ample time to mull over his options. "I've got probably 14 trainers that want him. They're Sydney, Melbourne based," Endresz told Racing.com. "Alligator is in for his surgery next week. The vets are giving us a good prognosis on that...so he should come back pretty good. We're going to leave it for a few months and make a proper assessment. We are going to leave him down there (in Sydney or Melbourne) and give him the best opportunity we can to tackle the big races. The best opportunity will be somewhere within Flemington or Randwick. That will allow us to really settle him down and have a fair crack." Endresz said he was keen to see Alligator Blood compete in the 2021 Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m). "He will be turning five, so it should be perfect for him really," he added.

'He was a wonderful horse'

Vandyke yesterday paid tribute to Alligator Blood, whom he trained to win nine of his 15 starts for prize-money of \$1,834,750. "Our season together has come to an end. We are just going our separate ways," Vandyke told Racing.com. "It's just the way life has gone. We are headed in different directions and that's where it is. I'll miss him. He was a wonderful horse and obviously gave us all great joy. We became very close. We spent a lot of time with him, took him to Sydney and Melbourne. All relationships with horses and people end at some point. I take away great memories which will live with me forever."

A trio of last-start runner-up performers feature

among a five-strong team Debbie Sweeney will take to tomorrow's Te Rapa meeting with her charge set to be led by Covenant (Swiss Ace) in the \$400k Herbie Dyke Stakes Noms 8/12 (1400m). The four-year-old has been runnerup in two of his three career starts and Sweeney said he will need plenty of luck after drawing the outside gate in the 16-runner field. "He is a really nice horse and he goes well," Sweeney said. "I hope we get a little bit of rain for him. He has got a bad draw. He doesn't seem to be having much luck in the draw department. I think he has drawn the outside in every start. But he is a nice horse and as long as he gets a little bit of luck he will be a really good chance." While Sweeney would like the forecast rain to arrive for Covenant, she is hoping it will stay away for two of her other runners. "Our Beeskees needs a good track, so we are hoping we don't get much rain for him," she continued. "He is really well and he is very consistent, especially when he steps up over ground. He got a little freshen-up since his last run at Hawke's Bay and he is really well, he should go an honest race again. Extersea has got a good draw (3) in his race. He is on the quick back-up from Rotorua the other day. It was a good run last week. He got out in front and was leading by about six lengths and was just nabbed in the last bit and still battled on well for fourth. He wants a really good track. Now he is back on the better tracks he is showing what he can do." Sweeney is particularly looking forward to the opening race on the card where both Truth Beknown (Roc De Cambes) and Lady Gwendolyn (Poet's Voice) will be vying to break maiden ranks. "They are very consistent and they both deserve to pick up a race soon," the trainer continued. "I really like both of them and it is hard to split those girls. They try really hard. They should be right in the finish."

Abu Dhabi out to break maiden

If either Truth Beknown or Lady Gwendolyn are able to get off the mark in Beefeater Garden Bar 12/12 (2100m) they will have to get the better of the consistent Abu Dhabi (Haradasun). The Shaun and Emma Clotworthy-trained five-year-old heads into the race having been runner-up in each of his last five starts. "He is a really consistent horse, I really hope he

The consistent six-year-old was once again piloted by Elliot's son Ryan, who forewent the Premier day at Pukekohe to retain the ride on the family favourite. "It was a very good run on Saturday, he went well," Elliot said. "It was nice that Ryan came down to ride him, he is pretty committed to him." Rock On Wood finished runner-up to Hypnos (Reliable Man) in the Hawkes Bay Spring Sprint Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m) at Hastings first-up and Elliot was buoyed by the Roger James and Robert Wellwoodtrained gelding's subsequent victory in the Coupland's Bakeries Mile (Gr 2, 1600m). "It was a good run for Hypnos and it was good to see him win down south," Elliot said. The trainer noted her charge is more forward this year compared to last season and she will now head south to try and snare Group 1 honours in the Captain Cook Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) on Saturday-week. "He has had two races under his belt now and this time last year he had just had the one, so he is a little more forward," she continued. "I am

planning on going to the Captain Cook at Wellington on December 5 with him, and then the Thorndon Mile in January."

James and Wellwood to have two in Group 1

Rock On Wood is likely to face both Hypnos and his stablemate Concert Hall (Savabeel) in the Captain Cook with the pair set to take identical form lines into the race. Hypnos finished runner-up first-up at Hastings in October before winning the Spring Sprint and then the Coupland's Bakeries Mile. Concert Hall has also been on song, winning the Thompson Handicap (Gr 3, 1600m) and Tauranga Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) in her last two starts, after finishing runner-up to Dawn Patrol (Dawn Approach) first-up at Ellerslie. "Hypnos appears to have come through his Coupland's Mile run well," James said. "He has had a few days in the paddock and he has been to the water treadmill and returns to the stable today. Concert Hall has come of age and I have been happy with her since her run. They are two nice horses and the benefit of maturity is showing now. They are both in line for the Captain Cook Stakes at Wellington in a fortnight."

Collett chalks up treble

Sam Collett has designs of a great summer aboard the exciting mare Levante (Proisir) after her stunning return to racing in the Counties Bowl (Listed, 1100m) at Pukekohe on Saturday. The victory was part of a three-win celebration for Collett on her birthday, having also landed the Fasttrack Insurance 2YO Stakes (Listed, 1100m) aboard Brix (Sweynesse) and the Vernon and Vazey 1400 with Our Alley Cat (Atlante). The Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on New Year's Day at Ellerslie is Levante's next target, and Collett is excited at the opportunity after the acceleration she displayed in the Counties Bowl. "It's what we're all after, a horse that shows that kind of turn of foot. It makes our job very easy," Collett said. "I was worried they may go a wee bit fast for her over 1100 metres, but she proved me wrong. I don't think she's limited to a sprint trip by any means, but she seems to be doing that pretty well at the moment."

Seven for Just A Way

Danon The Kid (2 c ex Epic Love by Dansili) maintained his unbeaten run and in the process provided his sire Just A Way (Heart's Cry) with a seventh individual stakes winner when taking out yesterday's Tokyo Sports Hai Nisai Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m). The Takayuki Yasuda-trained juvenile followed up his win in a newcomers' race at Hanshin back in June by defeating Titleholder (Duramente) by a length and a quarter, with Jun Blue Sky (Duramente) another three-quarters of a length away in third. Multiple Group 1 winner Just A Way stood at Shadai Stallion Station for a fee of ¥4.000.000 (approx. AUD\$52.668) in 2020.

HK: Tighter admission policy announced

The Hong Kong Jockey Club yesterday announced a tightening of restrictions on those able to attend race meetings over the coming weeks following a review carried out in response to the worsening of the Covid-19 situation. For four meetings, starting with tomorrow's Happy Valley fixture, members of the public will be prevented from attending while only two owners per runner will be allowed on course. Additionally, the HKJC announced limited opening hours for its off course betting outlets for the corresponding period.

UK: Hopes rise for surprise return of racegoers

The racing industry in Britain was preparing itself for an unexpected boost last night with the UK government expected to announce the limited reopening of stadia and sports venues - including racecourses - when it unveiled plans for what will replace the English national lockdown on December 2. Up to 4,000 people will be admitted to outdoor sporting venues in the areas of the country least affected by Covid-19 in tier 1, a number which would drop to 2,000 in tier 2. The Times reported. The Times also tweeted there remains a doubt as to whether betting shops will be allowed to open in any of the tiers. British racing has been conducted behind closed doors since its return to action on June 1, with the exception of two small pilot meetings at Doncaster and Warwick in September.

Bargain buy rocks on the sand

ustralian import Rock To Road (Stryker) has proved a real bargain buy for owner Mr Mok Shing Fung with the chestnut winning his fourth race in Macau in Friday night's Class 2, and running a new class record in the process.

Ridden by the inform Eric Cheung, Rock To Road made it win number three on the sand when he put paid to a smart lot of Class 2 gallopers, with a strong win in the 1050-metre sprint in the slick time of 1.01.1 seconds, snipping .03 off the old standard set by The Pirate King (Red Element) in 2019.

Rock To Road began well and found himself parked in third spot in the run, before peeling out to challenge early leader Gem Glory (I Am Invincible) on straightening. The gelding let down nicely and darted clear to win over Sport Genius (Ocean Park), with Gem Glory in third.

Disappointment of the race was the heavily bet favorite Circuit Master (Bernardini), an ex Australian Godolphin galloper formerly named Esperance, who was backed by punters as if there was no tomorrow. Circuit Master after being hard ridden early found himself out in no man's land, and battled to finish fifth, beaten six and quarter lengths.

Rock To Road is a former Chris Waller horse that raced in Australia as Beidi, where he was bred and raced by Ingham Racing. From 14 starts the gelding only managed to win two races, a two-year-old maiden at Canterbury over 1100 metres, and a Benchmark 65 at Eagle Farm over 1300 metres.

Given that the Eagle Farm win was his final start before being offered up for auction at the 2019 July Inglis Online Sales, his purchase price of a modest AUD\$25,000 was a real bargain for Mr Mok Shing Fung. Rock To Road has now won four races, three on the sand and one on the turf, and is the only horse to have a victory over Golden Conqueror (Rothesay), Macau's current reigning sand champion. On the day in question

Rock To Road finished all over the top of Golden Conqueror at odds of \$2190.50 for the win.

After Friday night's win, the five-year-old is now nudging the HKD\$1 million mark in prizemoney.

Eric Cheung continued his great start to the new season with a double on Friday night's card to take him to 12 wins for the new season, and to the top of the list in the jockey's standings.

In fact, Cheung was one of three jockeys who between them rode all six winners on the night's card; aside from Rock To Road he scored a runaway win on Heart Of Iu Cheong (Intrinsic) in the Class 5 & 6 over 1600 metres for his former master Stanley Chin.

Heart Of Iu Cheong, a UK import, scored his maiden victory when he destroyed his rivals with a massive seven and a quarter length win over the bolter Tokei Shinsei (Swift Current), with Epinart (Thorn Park) in third.

The winner ran a nippy 1.39.0 neat for the distance and had plenty in reserve on the line after being eased down over the final fifty metres.

On the night when the track was riding slick, five class records went by the wayside; the others being Tak Fai Of Pins (Pins) in the Class 5 & 6 over 1050 metres, Hostwin Prosperits (Redwood) in the Class 3 & 4 over 1350 metres, and Mr Half Lamma (Battle Paint) in race two, the first division of the

Class 5 & 6 in 1.39.2 that was later eclipsed by Heart Of Iu Cheong.

Frenchman J B Hamel is another that is off to a good start to the season with his double taking his winning tally so far to nine.

Hamel was seen to advantage on both Hostwin Prosperits in the Class 3 & 4 over 1510 metres, and Hostwin Aurora (Red Element) in the last, the Class 4 over 1350 metres, both for trainer Tony Fung.

Hostwin Aurora was making his Macau debut, and after appearing to be struggling in the run mid-race, finished powerfully late to beat Collateral Mission (Reckless Abandon), with Majimaster (Sizzling) in third.

The double put Tony Fung on a line of three for the early lead in the trainer's standings, the others being Stanley Chin and Sio Cheong with all three conditioners on ten wins apiece.

Peter Lao was another to score a double for the night to join Cheung, and Hamal in dominating the program.

Lao scored on the Rambo Tse runners Tak
Fai Of Pins in race one and then backed up
quickly in race two on Mr. Half Lamma.

Mr Half Lamma showed plenty of fight to outgun River God Choi (Casino Prince), with Rayson Warrior (Redwood) in third.

The win gave Rambo Tse five winners for the season from only ten runners, a win rate of 50 per cent and a place rate of 60 per cent.

Reliable Man - Westbury Stud shuttle stallion Reliable Man (Dalakhani) sired his third individual Group 1 winner on Saturday when Inspirational Girl (5 m ex Be Inspired by Zabeel) landed the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Ascot. English Channel - Calumet Farm stallion English Channel (Smart Strike) sired his 54th individual stakes winner on Sunday when Unique Diamond (5 g ex Diamond Dilemma by Sinndar) took out the Premio Roma Vecchia (Listed, 2800m) at Rome. The five-year-old had nine wins from 30 starts entering his weekend assignment but had yet to break through at stakes level, with a fourth-

The well-fancied Flower Of War (War Chant), who was sent off at \$2.35, could only finish fourth. Frost Giant, who has previously stood at Yarradale Stud, was based at Irish Hill and Dutchess Views in the United States for a fee of US\$2,500 (approx. AUD\$3,425) in 2020.

Trained by Claude McGaughey, North Dakota ran fourth in the Sycamore Stakes (Gr 3, 12f) at Keeneland on October 15 and he built on that form when getting the better of Red Knight (Pure Prize) by half a length. Ziyad (Rock Of Gibraltar) finished a further head adrift in third. Bred in the purple, North Dakota is a half-brother to Grade 2 winner and leading sire War Front (Danzig) and dual Grade 2 winner Teammate (A.P. Indy) being out of the Grade 1-placed Starry Dreamer (Rubiano). Medaglia d'Oro, sire of outstanding race-mares Rachel Alexandra and Songbird as well as dual Grade 1-winning Spendthrift stallion Bolt d'Oro, will stand for a fee of \$150,000 (approx. AUD\$205,400) in 2021.

Mount Nelson - Dato (4 c ex Dear Lavinia by Grand Slam) took out the Grosser Dresdner

Siyouni - Honey Cake (3 f ex Pink Anemone by Dansili) took out the Prix Ceres (Listed, 1400m) at Fontainebleau on Thursday to bring up Siyouni's (Pivotal) 43rd individual stakes winner. Remarkably, Siyouni was the sire of the first four horses home, with Private Romance finishing one and three-quarter lengths behind Honey Cake in second. Femina was a neck behind in third, while Marly brought up the Siyouni quartet in fourth. Aga Khan Stud's Siyouni, the sire of this year's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Sottsass, has had his fee raised to €140,000 (approx. AUD\$227,850), up from €100,000 (approx. AUD\$162,750), for 2021.

Sweynesse - Last season's New Zealand champion first season sire Sweynesse (Lonhro) produced his third individual stakes winner on Saturday when Brix (2 f ex Somethymesoon by Postponed) took out the Fasttrack Insurance 2YO Stakes (registered as the Counties Challenge Stakes) (Listed, 1100m) at Pukekohe. Still a maiden after three starts, the Glen Harvey-trained Brix pulled out plenty under Sam Collett to defeat second favourite Quattro Quinta (Darci Brahma) by a short neck with three-quarters of a length to Cool Change (Showcasing) in third, just in advance of market leader Beldarra (Hinchinbrook). Purchased for \$45,000 at this year's NZB Premier Yearling



Siyouni AGA KHAN STUD

Sale out of the Kilgravin Lodge draft, Brix is the fourth foal to race out of the Group 3-placed Somethymesoon (Postponed), who herself is a sister to Post Thyme, a stakes winner on both sides of the Tasman. Sweynesse stands at Novara Park for NZ\$6,000 (plus GST) in 2020.

War Chant - Chantorque (3 f ex Contortion by Redoute's Choice) took out Saturday's Placid Ark Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Ascot to continue on her upward curve and provide Yarradale Stud resident War Chant (Danzig) with his 44th individual stakes winner. Trained by Russell Stewart, Chantorque was winning for the fourth time in five outings when she came home a length and a quarter too strong for Charleton

Eddie (Shooting To Win) at her first start at Listed level. Mystical View (Canford Cliffs) was another half a length adrift in third. Chantorque is one of three winners from three foals to race from the winning Redoute's Choice (Danehill) mare Contortion, who herself is out of the Group 2-placed It's Who Deanie (Fuji Kiseki). War Chant is standing for a fee of \$11,000 (inc. GST) in 2020 and his progeny include three Group 1 winners on three different continents, Silent Sedition having taken out the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Moonee Valley, Midnight Interlude the Santa Anita Derby (Gr 1, 9f) and Kingsfort the National Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) at the Curragh.
