Griffiths and Ford swoop on classy Alpine Eagle filly

Daughter of Armidale Stud's first season sire heads to Victoria with \$95,000 price tag

Respected Victorian trainer Robbie Griffiths and his trusted ally, agent Peter Ford, have zeroed in on sons of the late top-class stallion High Chaparral (Sadler's Wells) and yesterday they made

their move for a filly by his new season sire Alpine Eagle at the Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale.

The combination parted with \$95,000, the top price at yesterday's Tasmanian auction, to secure the Armidale Stud-consigned filly, who is by the local farm's Group 2-winning sire Alpine Eagle. *Continued on page 2>>*

Catalyst ready for Guineas

Clayton Chipperfield is confident Catalyst (Darci Brahma) can turn the tables on his CS Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) conqueror Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) in Saturday's Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), with New Zealand's star three-year-old set to meet his old rival on one kilogram better terms under set weight conditions. "He's third-up now. We're meeting them at equal weights and he's been looking for a mile," Chipperfield said. "He's only had the one mile Group 1 race in New Zealand and won it very easily, with the best final 600 metres he's ever run. Hopefully we can get a decent track on Saturday and we'll see that brilliance he's got in the finish that we didn't really see in the Hayes because of the rain and the downgrade of the track." Regarding Catalyst's final preparations, Chipperfield continued: "I gave him an easy gallop on Saturday and he went unbelievable. I'm very, very happy with him. He'll be at his peak for the Guineas." *Morning Briefing page 9 >>*

She was one of 22 yearlings at the record-breaking sale to make \$50,000 or more, which helped Magic Millions break the \$3 million barrier for the first time at this sale.

The average closed at \$30,568, the median was also up year on year at \$26,000, while the clearance rate was a healthy 81 per cent.

Ford yesterday revealed that he and Griffiths were unabashed fans of the High Chaparral sire line and that the pedigree of their top-priced filly also matched well genetically.

The agent said that sire line, along with I Am Invincible and his own sire Invincible Spirit (Green Desert), were the ones that he and Griffiths favoured.

"We love (High Chaparral's son) Toronado - we've got a couple of great Toronados in the stable - and we love Dundee as well, but we haven't been able to get at him just yet," Ford said.

"Any of these sons of High Chaparral, and Tivaci is another one...we are finding they might be the way and they will probably get a little bit further than some of the Invincible Spirit breed.

"We love that line as well such as Shalaa, Territories has a few nice ones and Cable Bay is really good, too.

"They are the sire lines that we seem to like in the stable. They are fairly durable types of horses and, more importantly, ones people want to buy into."

Alpine Eagle, whose progeny averaged \$35,000 with 21 lots sold

yesterday, was trained by Tony McEvoy to win four races from 12 starts, including the MRC Autumn Classic (Gr 2, 1800m) during an injury interrupted career.

"If he had been a little bit better, we wouldn't have been able to access him this easily, I would say," Ford said.

"He was a horse that was just short of being great and if he had been a little bit better he probably would have ended up at Arrowfield or Coolmore or somewhere."

Griffiths inspected the Alpine Eagle filly in Launceston on Sunday before returning to Melbourne and bidding over the phone.

Catalogued as **Lot 37**, the filly is the first foal out of the four-time winner Must Be Mink (Musket), who in turn is out of the Tasmanian Guineas (Listed, 1600m) winner Di's Angel (Racer's Edge).

Must Be You started her career in Tasmania for Bill Ryan before proving successful at metropolitan level in Victoria for Darren Weir.

"As a type she is outstanding. She is beautiful, has a great head, and a great walk," Griffiths said.

"Alpine Eagle was a great racehorse by High Chaparral who is turning out to be a great sire of sires. The Tornados are flying and so are the Dundeels.

"The filly is bred on the same cross as Dundee and the mother of the filly is by a stallion who is a half-brother to the great mare Makybe Diva by Redoute's Choice.

"When you start talking about Redoute's Choice, Zabeel and High Chaparral and you get down to Group 1 performers in the family, it all works. She has got the best blood, athleticism and walk to be really good and I think this stallion will really make it."

The sister to Scott Brunton's dual stakes-winning four-year-old Mandela Effect (Turffontein) will also join the leading Tasmanian trainer's stable after connections went to \$80,000 to land the filly one lot earlier.

The Motree Thoroughbreds-consigned filly is the fourth foal, whose three to race have all won, out of the West Quest (Gone West) mare Morell. She was catalogued as **Lot 36**.

Andrew Scanlon, the managing owner of Mandela Effect, who will attempt to make it three wins in succession in tomorrow's Mowbray Stakes (Listed, 1600m) at Launceston, signed for the youngster yesterday.

Brown buys brother to his Firstclass Dreamer

Young Cranbourne trainer Matthew Brown also stuck to a family he knows well by going to \$75,000 to secure the Dream Ahead (Diktat) brother his stakes-placed sprinter Firstclass Dreamer.

Brown bought Firstclass Dreamer for \$35,000 at the 2018 Magic Millions Gold Coast 2YOs in Training Sale, with the now four-year-old gelding going on to win three races and \$131,445 in prize-money, but he was prepared to pay more than double that for his sibling.

"He was one of the picks of the sale of the colts. The brother is a good horse - he has got little issues that hold him back from showing his true ability, but he has shown that he is well above average," Brown said.

"(The yearling) is probably a bit scopier with a similar body type, but he probably has a bit more going for him than his brother.

"The family's gone on a little bit (since I bought Firstclass Dreamer) with Silverhawk winning in town and my bloke got a little bit of black-type. I am still confident that I can win another one in town with him. He was a bit unlucky the other night at Moonee Valley. *Continued on page 6>>*

“On his ability he is a Saturday horse every day of the week, Firstclass Dreamer.”

Catalogued as **Lot 26** and consigned by the Mahoneys, the colt, who is by former Aquis Farm/Emirates Park shuttler Dream Ahead, is the fifth living foal out of the winning mare Luloah (Al Maher), making him a brother to Firstclass Dreamer and two other winners, including the successful Melbourne miler Silverhawk (Artie Schiller).

Brown has been a regular buyer at the Tasmanian sale in recent years and had no hesitation in making the trip across Bass Strait for yesterday's auction.

“We've been here for the past five years and done well buying some nice horses out of here,” he said.

“They look after you down here, so we are happy to come back and hopefully we can find another couple of nice ones out of here.”

Other interstate buyers included Simon Zahra of Ellerton Zahra Racing, who paid \$75,000 for a Star Turn (Starcraft) colt, Brisbane trainer Kelly Schweida, who went to \$66,000 for a son of Dissident (Sebring), and Queensland-based agent John Foote, who took home a colt by first season sire Lionhearted (Fastnet Rock) for \$65,000 as well as three other lots.

John Blacker led the way for the local trainers, purchasing 11 lots from \$6,000 to \$57,500 for a total spend of \$320,500, while David Brunton secured five lots and syndicator Star Thoroughbreds and Randwick Bloodstock Agency combined to take home four yearlings.

Mark Ganderton, another Tasmanian trainer, also bought four yearlings yesterday as did Spreyton trainer Leon Wells, who purchased the Manhattan Rain (Encosta De Lago) half-sister to Sunday's impressive Tasmanian Oaks (Listed, 2100m) winner Still A Star (Toronado) for \$42,500 among his haul.

Armidale Stud was the leading vendor, selling all but three of their 38-strong draft for an average of \$41,114, while Grenville Stud sold 26 of their 40 lots at an average of \$28,519.

The Mahoneys were the leading vendors by average (three or more lots sold), averaging \$45,667 for the three horses they traded yesterday.

<< *Continued from page 6* Magic Millions managing director Barry Bowditch was delighted with how the sale panned out, particularly with the way the local buying bench stepped in with the support of the mainlanders.

"It's obviously a record sale for the state. To be able to gross more than ten per cent up on last year, when that was a record, is fantastic.

"All the key indicators are great, the average is a record, the clearance rate is 81 per cent, but what I thought was pleasing was the evenness of the buying bench.

"Both the mainlanders and the locals got in and supported the sale really well. You can see that key buyers were here who went away with nothing and leaving money on the table.

"That just indicates how strong the market was."

Graduate success in recent years, which includes Mandela Effect, Mystic Journey (Needs Further) and Bold Star (Needs Further), has become hard for buyers to ignore, according to Bowditch.

"It is a fantastic place to come, Launceston, but the graduates have put a bit of a beacon on this market and it has become a must-attend for buyers back on the mainland," he said.

"We're getting a stronger buying bench each year and the quality of horses indicate that that should be the case."

The Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale will start on Sunday while Magic Millions is preparing for the Adelaide Yearling Sale the following week.



No blinkers for Soul Patch

CS Hayes fourth Soul Patch (Shamus Award) will race without blinkers when he tries to reverse the form with the market principals in the Australian Guineas. "I just don't think they are doing what we would like them to," trainer Ken Keys told Racing.com in respect of the headgear. "I mean, he's been a bit slow away still, so they haven't contributed there, and he still tends to be a bit strong on the bridle. It's just the aggression in him." Soul Patch, who ran third in last year's VRC Derby (Gr 1, 2500m), has been added to the nominations for the ATC Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m)

following an administrative malfunction when Keys initially tried to enter the three-year-old in the Randwick contest. Commenting on the conditions for this weekend's assignment, Keys added: "I think a mile and a quarter is his pet distance but there might be a bit more pace in the race, which will help. He had a good puff after his first-up run. He needed that and there is improvement for sure."

Te Akau Shark favourite for Chipping Norton

BCD Sprint (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle) has been installed as TAB's \$2.50 favourite for Saturday's Chipping Norton Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) after 18 nominations were received for the \$650,000 feature yesterday. Group 1 winners Avilius (Pivotal) and Fierce Impact (Deep Impact) are at \$5 and \$6 respectively, with the former having run an eye-catching fifth when first-up behind Alabama Express (Redoute's Choice) in the CF Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) on February 8. The nominations also include the John Thompson-trained Dreamforce (Fastnet Rock), who is priced at \$6 having run second in the Apollo Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) last Saturday week. He finished ahead of popular veteran Happy Clapper (Teofilo) on that occasion, with the nine-year-old returning for another crack at the Chipping Norton having run second to Winx (Street Cry) in the race last year.

Fierce to make Norton Impact

Matthew Smith has issued a positive bulletin on dual Group 1 winner Fierce Impact ahead of the Chipping Norton, which he hopes will provide a platform to next month's All-Star Mile (1600m). "We thought about the Futurity

but decided to stay at home for the Chipping Norton," he said. "If he goes as well as I think he will, then I hope he gets one of the wild cards into the race (All-Star Mile). But the Chipping Norton won't be easy looking at the nominations. It could turn out to be the best field he's been in yet." The five-year-old was struck into when running second in the CF Orr, but he recovered quickly from that incident and has since won a 1600-metre barrier trial at Hawkesbury. "He just had a couple of superficial cuts on a hind leg," Smith added. "He was over it quickly and won his trial well. He is a happy horse and in a good space so I expect him to go well again."

Options open for Star Missile

In other All-Star Mile news, the Greg Eurell-trained Star Missile (Smart Missile) remains on course for the \$5 million contest at Caulfield having secured a coveted spot in the public vote, but plans for the four-year-old's next outing remain fluid. Star Missile holds four nominations over the coming days having been entered for a Benchmark race at Moonee Valley on Friday night and a handicap at Morphettville on Saturday. He also holds an entry in the Blamey Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) at Flemington on Saturday, for which nominations have been extended after 12 entries were received yesterday, as well as the Shaftesbury Avenue Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m) on the same card. "I'll see how he works in the morning and speak to the syndicate manager," Eurell said yesterday. "But he has come out of his first-up run well. There's absolutely no issues there so he's certainly on track at the moment. It will just be a matter of seeing how he lines up in the morning and trying to work out which race."

Midweek return for Heart Of Puissance

The Ciaran Maher and David Eustace-trained Heart Of Puissance (Puissance De Lune), who also won an All-Star Mile berth through the public vote, is set to test his Caulfield credentials when he lines up in a Benchmark 70 first-up option at Sandown tomorrow. A dual winner from three outings, Heart Of Puissance was last seen running third in the Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) in November and tomorrow's contest will determine if he takes his chance in the All-Star Mile. On that note, Racing Victoria is set to announce the four provisional emergencies for the All-Star Mile today and this could be a significant announcement given the lingering doubt over the final line-up.

Doomben warm-up for Gem Of Scotland

Progressive filly Gem Of Scotland (Rothesay) will start out on her path to the \$300,000 The Jewel (1200m) at the Gold Coast on March 14 when she lines up in the The Jewel Prelude (1200m) at Doomben on Saturday. A winner of six of her nine starts, Gem of Scotland has not raced since winning at Eagle Farm on October 12. "She had a slight setback at the track and we could have gone on but she is too good a filly to risk so we gave her a good spell," trainer Rex Lipp said. Runner-up in the Bill Carter Stakes (Listed, 1200m) last May, Gem Of Scotland will once again be considered for the Sydney autumn and Brisbane winter further down the line.

T J Smith an option for Zoustyle

Brisbane sprinter Zoustyle (Zoustar) is likely to have only one trial before heading south for a Sydney campaign. Zoustyle missed the Brisbane summer carnival after a disrupted Sydney and Melbourne spring campaign. "I will probably trial him at Doomben on Tuesday but failing that he can trial on the Eagle Farm grass the following week," trainer Tony Gollan said. "He will really only need one trial before heading south. I am keen to get him to Sydney early so he can settle in. At this stage his first start in Sydney will be in the Group 3 Maurice McCarten Stakes at Rosehill on March 14. It

is an 1100-metre race which usually doesn't attract the really top-flight horses. So it gives us a chance to work him through the grades this time." Zoustyle is entered for the T J Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Randwick on April 4 but will need to be at his best to run.

Hey Doc out of Newmarket

Trainers Tony and Calvin McEvoy yesterday confirmed that three-time Group 1 winner Hey Doc (Duporth) would not contest next month's Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m). The stable told Racing Victoria stewards that Hey Doc jarred up when ninth in the C F Orr Stakes at Caulfield on February 8. "He jarred up in the near foreleg in the C F Orr Stakes which explains his performance," Calvin McEvoy told Racing.com. "Welfare of our animals always comes first, and we decided it was better for him to go for a rest after what has been an incredibly successful comeback." The six-year-old, who won the Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Ascot in November, had returned from a let-up with a second in the Australia Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Moonee Valley on January 24.

Newmarket possible for Nature Strip

A tilt at the Newmarket does however remain a possibility for the Chris Waller-trained Nature Strip (Nicconi), with Racing Victoria's executive general manager Greg Carpenter yesterday tweeting: "Confirmation from @cwallerracing this morning their only Newmarket Hcp entry Nature Strip is currently in Melbourne and will work @FlemingtonVRC tomorrow morning with a decision on a potential start to be made after analysis of all weights once released." Nature Strip was removed from some Newmarket betting markets over the weekend but he has been reinstated with some agencies following Carpenter's tweet.

William Reid return likely for Mystic Journey

Mystic Journey (Needs Further) will make her first start since running fifth in the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) when she lines up in the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Moonee Valley on March 20. "She's back on track," trainer Adam Trinder told Racing.com. "She'll trial on Thursday week at

Hobart and hopefully kick off in the William Reid at Moonee Valley." The winner of the Australian Guineas and All-Star Mile last season, Mystic Journey has been laid low with an infection, preventing Trinder from setting the four-year-old for a repeat bid in the \$5 million contest. "She got a subcutaneous infection in her leg on the back of a veterinary injection," Trinder added. "She missed a bit of training with it. We took a cautious approach and just took a step back and rested her for a little bit and she is just building back up again now. Untimely, but unfortunately that's horses at times. I would have loved to defend her mantle."

Haggas setting duo for Sydney trip

English trainer William Haggas will launch a two-pronged assault on Sydney's Championships meeting with Addeybb (Pivotal) and Young Rascal (Intello) set to jet in this weekend. The six-year-old Addeybb, a winner of seven of his 15 starts who was last seen finishing a close second to Magical (Galileo) in the Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 2f) at Ascot in October, will target the \$4 million Longines Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) on April 11, while three-time Group 3 winner Young Rascal is being aimed at the same day's \$2 million Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m). "They are both geldings and the lure of prize-money is obviously a crucial factor," Haggas told Racing NSW. "I think these are old enough, and wise enough, and experienced enough to take the travelling and the racing." Addeybb is set to run in the Ranvet Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and five-year-old Young Rascal the Manion Cup (Gr 3, 2400m). Addeybb is the early TAB favourite at \$4.50 for the Ranvet Stakes on March 21 and at \$8 in the Queen Elizabeth Stakes, while Young Rascal is at \$11 in TAB's Sydney Cup market.

Curator disappointed by Caulfield track

Melbourne Racing Club track manager Jason Kerr has conceded that the Caulfield track played poorly and favoured on-pace runners on Saturday but he said there was nothing in the lead-up to indicate the apparent bias. "It was obviously a pretty disappointing day...to have it perform like that was certainly surprising," Kerr told Racing.com. "I certainly didn't see it coming. With everything leading into the meeting, we were more than happy with it, we had beautiful rain mid-week so we didn't have to irrigate leading in. We moved the rail out three metres, which covered up any wear from the last meeting, which is pretty stock standard. I just went in thinking it was going to be a pretty even day, the track would race well. Obviously it didn't pan out that way and I can't put my finger on why. Usually at this time of year you do a lot of irrigating and it can have an effect on the track, but getting that 60 millimetres of rain in the eight days leading in and 40 millimetres from the Tuesday, so watering wasn't the issue."

Currie undergoes surgery

Multiple Group 1-winning jockey Luke Currie is expected to be sidelined for months as he recovers from a spinal injury suffered in a fall. Currie came off Yulong June (More Than Ready) in an incident after the winning post in the final race at Moonee Valley on Friday night, suffering two fractured ribs and a fractured C7 vertebra, which needed surgery. Currie had an operation on Sunday. "He's come through well," Victorian Jockeys Association chief executive Matthew Hyland told RSN927. "I had a bit of text messaging with him yesterday afternoon. He's had his C6 and C7 fused and had a plate and some screws inserted, so he was recovering. He seems to be in pretty good spirits." Hyland said normally the recovery period would be a minimum of three months. "I think it's a minimum of three months but I don't think anyone would be surprised if it's a little longer than that," he said. Currie was expected to be discharged from hospital last night.

Ben Currie to face District Court trial

Disqualified Queensland trainer Ben Currie is set to face a trial on fraud charges later this year. Currie, 28, was in Toowoomba Magistrates

Court for a hand-up committal hearing yesterday. He is facing charges of fraud dating from November 2016 to March last year, alleging he used an unregulated horse supplement designed to enhance race performance. No date was set for a trial in Toowoomba District Court but it is likely to be later this year. Currie, who is now living on the Gold Coast, was granted bail and did not enter a plea. He is currently banned from training and faces further racing charges at the end of his criminal trial.

VRC happy with Rapid Racing figures

Leigh Jordon, Victoria Racing Club's executive general manager of racing, yesterday issued an upbeat review of the VRC's Rapid Racing concept, highlighting an increase in betting turnover at the recent Flemington fixture. "Our turnover compared to a midweek was about 10 per cent up on a normal midweek meeting," Jordon told Racing.com. "But it wasn't done purely for turnover. It was to put something new and different on and try and attract your non-racing person or the people on the fringe of the sport. It was about trying something different for our existing customers but also trying to get new people involved."

NEW ZEALAND

Noble reflects on important Matamata win

Vernazza's (More Than Ready) victory in the Matamata Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) was a special moment in the career of trainer Lance Noble. The former Matamata horseman now trains privately for owner-breeders Brendan and Jo Lindsay at their property in Karaka, but he returned to his old stomping ground on Saturday and triumphed in the prestigious two-year-old fillies' feature. "It was a pretty special win, for many reasons," Noble said. "Having spent over 30 years in Matamata, started my career there and spent 14 years on the committee of the racing club, it meant a lot to go back there and win the flagship race. It was also great that it was sponsored by the Swap family. I leased my very first stable off David and Dale Swap, and they were a huge help to me in terms of mentoring and business advice

when I was starting out. Then there's the fact that Vernazza was ridden by Michael Coleman. We started off our apprenticeships together way back in the 1980s and have been friends for a long time."

Milestone victory for Vernazza

The win of Vernazza is also the first Group winner bred by her owners Brendan and Jo Lindsay since they took over Cambridge Stud and the juvenile promises to provide more joy for her connections. Now the winner of two of her three starts, Vernazza is out of the Zabeel (Sir Tristram) mare Zonza, who won five races for the Lindsays including the Ladies' Day Vase (Gr 3, 1600m) at Caulfield. She is also the dam of their Listed winner Bavella (Snitzel). "It's what we've been working towards and striving for over a long period of time," trainer Lance Noble said. "People can sometimes be a bit dismissive of what Brendan and Jo achieve, putting everything down to money. But it doesn't just happen. We've worked together and built it up. You need the right horses, the right staff and great backing behind you. Brendan and Jo have taken some heavy knocks along the way, but they're hugely committed and have put in a massive amount of work and effort."

Bostonian has Ellerslie hit-out

Dual Group 1 winner The Bostonian (Jimmy Choux) stretched his legs at Ellerslie yesterday ahead of another trip to Australia. The Tony Pike-trained sprinter-miler won a barrier trial earlier in the month and made use of perfect conditions at Ellerslie ahead of a two-start Sydney campaign. "He galloped over 1000 metres," Pike said. "I was thinking of taking him up to Counties for an exhibition gallop on Thursday but obviously they got some rain over the weekend and it was a good surface this morning, so he galloped over 1000 metres. He ran good time and pulled up nice and fit and well so he'll head to Sydney on Monday week and run fresh-up. We've pencilled in the Canterbury Stakes and the George Ryder and then obviously we'll assess it after that. We'll probably give him a week or ten days in the paddock in Sydney then head up to Brisbane for the same races we ran in last year."

Beatson excited by Golden Paddy's success

Riversley Park principal Sam Beatson was delighted to see Golden Sixty (Medaglia D'Oro) continue his winning ways in Hong Kong on Sunday when he landed the Hong Kong Classic Cup (Listed, 1800m) at Sha Tin. Trainer Francis Lui purchased the colt out of Riversley Park's 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale draft for \$300,000 and Beatson said: "It was pretty exciting to watch. He has got a great strike-rate having now won nine of his 10 races up in Hong Kong. Sometimes horses can take a little while to get started, whereas he acclimatised well and straight off the bat he was away." Golden Sixty, who Beatson pinhooked as a yearling for \$120,000, is set to contest next month's Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2000m).

Cup runner Trigger dies

Popular European stayer Double Trigger (Ela-Mana-Mou), winner of the 1995 Ascot Gold Cup (Gr 1, 2m 4f) and favourite for that year's Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m), has died aged 29. A winner of 14 of his 29 races, including three victories in the Goodwood Cup (Gr 2, 2m), Double Trigger initially retired to East Burrow Farm in 1998, and then moved to Clarendon Farm Stud in Wiltshire in 2010, where he stood for three seasons. He died of a suspected heart attack at Clarendon on Sunday morning. John Haydon of Clarendon Farm said: "Ron Huggins, who

continued to be involved with Double Trigger throughout his life, bought him as a yearling, and he went on to become the top stayer of his generation, with the Ascot Gold Cup being the highlight of his career, trained by Mark Johnston." At stud, Double Trigger supplied a number of notable National Hunt winners. He was bred by Dene Investments out of Solac (Gay Lussac). Solac bred nine winners from 12 foals including the Group 2 scorer Double Eclipse (Ela-Mana-Mou), who notably finished second to his full sibling in the 1995 Goodwood Cup.

He'll Haunt Us won the rich maiden race on Magic Millions race day at the Gold Coast on January 11 and jumped straight into stakes company to claim a second win from four career starts. Time For War, who sired last season's Silver Slipper Stakes winner Time To Reign, died at the age of five in 2016 from colic having served two seasons at stud.

Trade Fair - The late Trade Fair (Zafonic) sired his 14th individual stakes winner on Sunday when Free Trade (5 g ex Lady Xena by Dr Johnson) picked up the Pinjarra Classic (Listed, 1300m). Free Trade has now won seven races and has never finished out of the first three in his 14 starts, accruing prize-money totalling \$343,885. Trade Fair, a dual Group 3 winner in Europe and the sire of Grade 1 winner Trade Storm, was put down in 2018 at the age of 18 after it was discovered he had multiple cancerous tumours.

Hamel secures four-timer on Saturday

French rider Jean-Baptiste (JB) Hamel dominated Saturday's mixed turf and sand race programme with a brilliant four-timer on the afternoon.

Hamel was in sparkling form and kicked off his winning run with a lovely front-running ride on the Alan Tam-prepared Diamond Gold (Denman) when he dictated the pace to perfection in winning the Class 4 over 1500 metres on the turf.

Diamond Gold was left in front soon after the start and Hamel made the most of it until the home turn. After kicking clear at the 250 metres the son of Denman (Lohnro) scrambled over the line to beat Association Eight (Charm Spirit) (Charlie Chan) by a short-head, with Royal Master (Golden Archer) (Peter Lao) a neck away in third.

Hamel had to wait until race six, the Class 2 and 3 over 1600 metres, to notch up his second winner in the Tony Fung-prepared Tremendous Wins (Turffontein), who came with a strong late surge to down race-favourite Still So Cute (Thewayouare) (Dayversom Barros), with Ojala (Epaulette) (Massa Tanaka) in third.

Acing Pro (Helmet) from the Alan Tam yard was the next of Hamel's winners in taking out the Class 3 and 4 over 1350 metres, giving Tam two for the afternoon.

Then it was left to Tony Fung's Hostwin Prosperitis (Redwood) to ring up number four for Hamel in the last of the day, the 0 to 45 rated

special conditions race over 1350 metres, which also gave Fung a double on the afternoon.

Hamel, who arrived in Macau for the last three months of the previous season, managed to boot home eight winners, which were enough to entice him to stay on in the enclave.

Saturday's four timer took Hamel to 13 winners for the current season, and with former champion jockey Ruan Maia relocating to Singapore and Oscar Chavez relinquishing his Macau license, it opens the door for greater opportunities for him.

Geoff Allendorf was another trainer that led in a double for the afternoon with two very progressive horses in Draft Camp (Dream Ahead) and Oneofthegreats (Snitzel).

Draft Camp came with a brilliant finish late under Fausto Henrique to down Casino Mok (Casino Prince) (Massa Tanaka) in the Class 3 and 4 over 1200 metres. In the next race, Oneofthegreats led throughout under Japanese rider Shogo Nakano to win the Class 2 over 1500 metres.

After Saturday's racing, Tony Fung leads the trainer's standings on 23 winners with Geoff Allendorf in second spot on 20 victories. Third spot at the moment is even between Stanley Chin, Alan Tam and Sio Cheong, who are all on 13 wins.

First winner for Nick Moore

Macau's newest trainer Nick Moore notched a first success in his own right when the highly promising Sport Genius (Ocean Park) (Luis Corrales) made light work of his opposition in the Class 5 and 6 over 1050 metres.

Nick is the son of eight-times Macau champion trainer Gary Moore and grandson of the legendary George Moore, arguably Australia's great jockey.

Granted a trainer's license at the start of this season, Moore with his small team had only started nine runners prior to Saturday's race day.

Sport Genius had been one of those and turned in a sound performance from the extreme outside gate of 12, when he led before tiring late for a creditable fourth, beaten two lengths behind Winnie Star (Medaglia d'Oro), who remains unbeaten from three runs.

On Saturday it was a different story, with a more experienced Sport Genius bursting away from the gates to lead comfortably before racing away over the final 200 metres to win softly by four lengths over Tak Fai Of Pins (Pins) (J B Hamel), with Crown Of Gold (Duporth) (Breinell Yamzon) in third.

Nick Moore spent 13 years working under father Gary in Macau firstly as a supervisor and

later as his assistant trainer. In 2014, when Gary relocated to Rosehill, Nick followed and spent two years with Gary and then one year with John Sergeant.

Wanting to take a break from racing Nick ran a cleaning business for two and a half years before the racing bug came back to bite.

"I missed working with horses and it had always been my intention to come back to Macau. I contacted some of my owners and they agreed to support me, especially Jason Tam, who has been a good family friend for many years."

"When the opportunity became available to come back and train here I grabbed it and I'm very grateful to the Macau Jockey Club for giving me the opportunity to start my career here."

Nick has high hopes for Sport Genius who he feels is still very immature.

"He is a lovely horse and there is still so much improvement in him. He won with plenty in hand and he is only three, so it's all in front of him."

"He was bought for NZ\$46,000 at the New Zealand Ready To Run Sale for the Shining Star Racing Syndicate who race a lot of horses here and I'm really grateful to them for giving me such a nice young horse."

At the moment Nick Moore has 12 horses in his stable with two more arriving on the next quarantine.

Two other newcomers from the stable that ran on Saturday also caught the eye: Hostwin Euphoria (Street Boss), who was beaten a nose and a head in a great four-way finish in race two, the Class 4 and 5, and Hostwin Saturn (Stratum), who ran a creditable eighth, beaten

four lengths after overracing and having a wide run in the Class 2.

Ricky Choi is another fledgling trainer that enjoyed a good day on Saturday leading in a double and pulling off what will be the upset of the season with the 200/1 shot Rock To Road (Stryker) in the Class 2 over 1050 metres.

In a performance that left racegoers in shock, Rock To Road (Breinell Yamzon) finished right over the top of the \$1.5 favourite, the formerly unbeaten Golden Conqueror (Rothsay) (Roger Yu), with Desi Style (Captain Sonador) (Horace Lam) a distant third.

Rock To Road is a former Ingham Racing horse that was prepared in Australia by Chris Waller. He raced 14 times under Waller for a win in a two-year-old Canterbury maiden early in his career and then won at his latest run at Eagle Farm last May in a Benchmark 65, so the gelding obviously has some talent.

His debut run in Macau was only a fair eighth behind Oneofthegreats over 1200 metres on the turf before the gelding won a barrier trial on the sand last Tuesday morning in fair time, although this evidence was certainly not striking enough to knock off Golden Conqueror, who was looking for five straight wins.

Given the slick time of 1.01.6 it's onwards and upwards for Rock To Road, especially on the all weather.

Chinese Hero (Smart Missile) was an earlier winner for Ricky Choi in the Class 4 and 5 over 1200 metres under Roger Yu, with Choi coming within a short head of a treble with Association Eight (Charlie Chan) just failing to catch Diamond Gold in the Class 4 over 1500 metres.

Choi only has a stable of 14 horses in work and from 41 runners this season has posted seven winners and 10 placings.






