Treasure trove of quality mares to light up Magic Millions sales ring

Changing face of Australian market on show as Arcadia Queen and Melody Belle headline day one

Further proof of a market squeeze, spurred on by high-end weanlings realising yearling prices, could flow on to the breeding stock sales as buyers shut out of the foal segment seek race fillies or mares in foal in order to acquire desirable trade stock for the years ahead.

Evidence of the shift in the dynamic of the Australian bloodstock industry is tipped to be on show when the three-session Magic Millions

National Broodmare Sale starts on the Gold Coast this morning.

An array of elite race fillies and mares, to be sold in the opening session, may set the tone for the changing marketplace in which skyrocketing yearling prices experienced this year has forced more end-users to consider the weanling market.

In turn, some industry observers predict more buyers to consider entering the market earlier by purchasing mares off the track or mares in foal with commercial coverings. *Continued on page 2 >>*

"We were actually talking about this (on Sunday) night: how many weanlings were purchased by end users last week and we thought around 75 to 100 out of that Magic Millions catalogue (of 340 sold) were purchased by end users by the Ciaron Mahers and the like," Attunga Stud's Brian Nutt said yesterday.

"That just indicates that they are willing to hang on to those horses for an extra year hoping that they've got a bit of a bargain by buying them as weanlings.

"It does take those 75 to 100 horses out of the sales circuit next year, which means it might create a few opportunities for breeders like us to get something into a yearling sale that may not have got in prior to the end users buying all those weanlings."

Nutt suggested the movement of buyers down the so-called food chain, with more end users pushing into the weanling market, could

see foal pinhookers pay closer attention to the mares' market.

"The way the industry is heading, there are some opportunities to be buying these race fillies off the track, for example, and maybe even putting them in foal and turning them over again next year," he said.

"The mares who are carrying foals to stallions whose service fees have gone up like Deep Field and Capitalist, there are still going to be some opportunities to buy those sorts of mares at this sale."

The Australian broodmare market kicked off with gusto at the Chairman's Sale earlier this month and the level of demand for elite mares is expected to continue this week, but vendors and buyers will receive a clearer guide on just how much bloodstock values have increased year-on-year inside the first hour of the race fillies and mares session this morning.

Champion New Zealand mare Melody Belle (Commands) and Group 2 winner Mizzy (Zoustar) will go through early before Bella Vella (Commands), Fiesta (I Am Invincible) and Arcadia Queen (Pierro) are sold later in the day, prior to the Shadwell Stud Australasia unreserved dispersal of race fillies and mares in foal taking place.

In all, there are eight Group 1-winning mares to go under the hammer today.

"The greatest collection of mares you'll ever see are being sold here (today)," Magic Millions managing director Barry Bowditch said.

"It's a treasure trove and we're very excited that it's here as we've been working hard on this for months now and it's exciting that these mares have made it here."

Attunga Stud will offer two high-class mares about three quarters of an hour into the session, New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Miss Sentimental (Reliable Man) (Lot 523) and dual Group 3 winner Missybeel (Savabeel) three lots later.

"I think there are a lot of buyers here and there's a lot of quality buyers here as well," Nutt said.

"It is nice to see the Kiwis back on the sales circuit. You've got Cambridge Stud, Pencarrow Stud and Little Avondale's Sam Williams and some of the major New Zealand breeders represented, then you've got all the Australian studs as well, so I think there will be enough money to spread around.

"It's going to be a very exciting sale for vendors, in particular."

Some mare owners will be tempted to keep hold of their mares rather than selling given the demand that has been experienced at the yearling and weanling sales this year, but Nutt has advised his clients to take advantage of the current market.

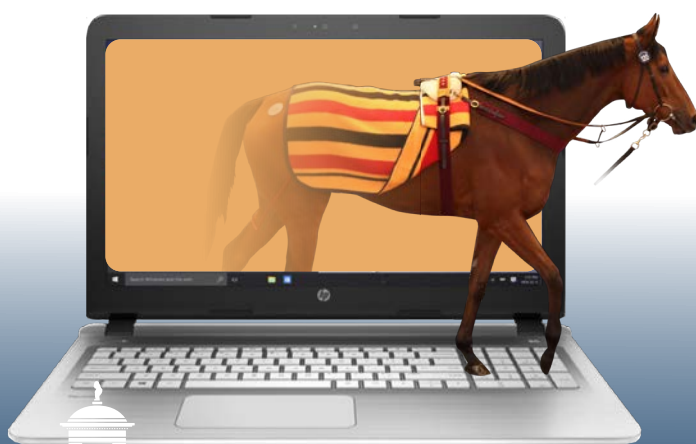
"There will be (a temptation to hold stock), but I have told a few clients that I think they're selling at the top of the market," he said.

"It is not a bad play to take some cash when it is on offer and, in particular, I refer to Tsaritsa, a Group 2 winner in foal to I Am Invincible who we are selling.

"Some of these race fillies we've got have to be sold because they're owned by big syndicates but I think the timing is perfect to have a nice mare in the sale and you are letting someone else have the risk going forward."

Big stud farms to make presence felt

One of the key segments of the buying bench will be the farms investing in mares to support their young stallions and the competition from those players is expected to be fierce.

At the Chairman's Sale, Coolmore signalled its intent to continue sourcing high-class mares for new season shuttler Wootton Bassett (Iffraaj), already acquiring Celebrity Queen (Redoute's Choice) (\$2.5 million), El Dorado Dreaming (Ilovethiscity) (\$1.35 million) and Savanna Amour (Love Conquers All) (\$1.25 million) at Inglis' select breeding stock auction.

It is a strategy the international breeding and racing giant has employed with unbeaten US Triple Crown champion Justify (Scat Daddy).

Coolmore is also launching dual Group 1-winning two-year-old King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice) this year and it can be assumed that some mares bought this week would also be sent in his direction.

Yulong Stud has three new stallions this year, Tagaloo (Lord Kanaloa), Lucky Vega (Lope De Vega) and Yulong Prince (Gimmethelight), and the Yuesheng Zhang-owned business has also taken on Written Tycoon (Iglesia) for his return to the state.

Yulong is also tipped to be a big player in the market in order to support the quartet while Kia Ora Stud's re-emergence as a stallion farm could also add depth to the buoyant market.

Kia Ora Stud is standing last year's champion two-year-old, Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Farnan (Not A Single Doubt) and dual Group 3-winning juvenile and Group 1-performed sprinter Prague (Redoute's Choice) this year.

Vinery Stud has Golden Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Ole Kirk (Written Tycoon) as a new addition on its roster while Widden Stud has Anders (Not A Single Doubt) in the Hunter Valley and Russian Camelot (Camelot) and Doubtland (Not A Single Doubt) being launched at its new Victorian operation this year.

Rosemont Stud, who has Group 2-winning juvenile Hanseatic (Street Boss) standing alongside Shamus Award (Snitzel) at its Victorian farm, will also be active in the mares' market this week.

"We've had a fantastic sellers' sales season so far and the weanling sale was evident of that last week," Bowditch said.

"The expectations are that there's enough buyers here and that they're liking what they're seeing, so all in all, if the market's realistic and the vendors are where they need to be (with reserves), I think we're in for a good sale."

International buyers from Europe, the US and Japan have also had representatives on the ground inspecting mares, which could fuel competition in the mid to top-end of the market.

Bowditch said: "We have been touching base with our international market regularly and ensuring that, if they are looking to play at the sale, that we are getting them engaged, and the response has been pleasing thus far."

"I think at this sale, as most sales are in Australia during these Covid times, that we are very reliant on the domestic market, which has stood strong this year."

The first of three days of the National Broodmare Sale starts at 10am today.

16 for Capitalist

The Tony and Calvin McEvoy-trained Hurtle (2g ex Murtle Turtle by Murtajill) demolished the field on debut at Ballarat yesterday to provide leading first season sire Capitalist (Written Tycoon) with his 16th individual winner. Ridden by Dean Holland, the gelding was sent off a \$2 chance and rewarded favourite backers with a comfortable five and a half-length success over Rock Melody (All Too Hard), with Ostracised (Divine Prophet) a long neck further back in third. It was a timely success for Hurtle's dam Murtle Turtle (Murtajill), who is entered in the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale (**Lot 929**) and will go through the ring tomorrow. The Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) half-brother to Hurtle made \$220,000 at last week's MM National Weanling Sale, when bought by Bevan Smith Bloodstock and Ferguson Bloodstock, while his yearling half-brother by Deep Field (Northern Meteor) made \$380,000 when sold to Asian Bloodstock Services at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in January. Capitalist, who now has 15 Australian winners and one in New Zealand, will stand at Newgate Farm for an increased fee of \$99,000 in 2021.

So Si Bon heads north chasing first Group 1

Lindsay Park will be hoping So Si Bon (So You Think) can give the stable a change of luck in Brisbane when he lines-up in the Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m) at Eagle Farm this Saturday. The team had Fifty Stars (Sea The Stars) engaged in the Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) last weekend, but a slight knee injury saw him scratched from the weight-for-age contest. So Si Bon heads to Brisbane in excellent form with a

two-start campaign planned for the rising eight-year-old. After contesting the Kingsford-Smith on the weekend he will be aimed at the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) on June 12. So Si Bon has been competitive in Group 1 contests previously, but is yet to win at the highest level. The gelding has won two of his last three starts including the March Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Flemington in March before a midfield finish in Sydney. He then returned to Melbourne to claim a second VOBIS Gold Mile (1600m) at Caulfield last month. Since then he's been ticking over at Lindsay Park's Euroa base and he trialled at Tatura last Monday. He finished second over 850m, but was not knocked around, before leaving the following night for Sydney ahead of travelling on to Brisbane. "That was more about giving him a bit of atmosphere away from the farm. He went up to Randwick and spent 24 hours there and then went on up to Rob Heathcote's at Eagle Farm," said co-trainer Tom Dabernig.

Sierra Sue chases black type

Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young are sending their lightly-raced mare Sierra Sue (Darci Brahma) to Brisbane in the search of black-type success. Sierra Sue left the couple's Cranbourne stable on Saturday night ahead of running in the Helen Coughlan Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Eagle Farm on Saturday. The uncertainty of air transport from Melbourne to Brisbane forced Busuttin and Young to send her on the less preferred option of travelling by truck. Last week, those accompanying horses flying into Queensland from Melbourne via Air Horse Transport would have been required to undergo two weeks of hotel quarantine under a directive from Queensland Health. On Sunday, Queensland Health relaxed those rules. Young said it was not ideal to send the mare by truck, but uncertainty forced their hand to get her to Brisbane for the Queensland Winter

Carnival. "We've done it plenty of times before. It doesn't take too much out of them but it would have been nice to fly her up on Tuesday night. The way we are going about it, she stopped in Sydney for 12 hours before going on again, whereas if you fly them up, it's six hours box to box," said Young. Sierra Sue has won five of her 10 starts, with four of her victories coming on the country circuit at Sale.

Mugatoo spelled

After running unplaced in last weekend's Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m), Mugatoo (Henrythenavigator) is now going to head for a spell. The All-Star Mile (1600m) winner was eased down and finished nearly 50 lengths behind Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux) and was found to be lame on his off foreleg by Racing Queensland vets, so will require veterinary clearance to race again. "We've just got to do a few more tests," Australian Bloodstock co-director Jamie Lovett told Racing.com. "A couple of little issues have come to light so we're just going to see how that all finishes up. He'll have a break now and he'll be alright in time hopefully ahead of the spring." Sir Dragonet (Camelot), who also finished down the track in the Doomben Cup, will also go for a break.

Polly Grey to race on

Saturday's Lord Mayor's Cup (Listed, 2000m) winner Polly Grey (Azamour) will race on after being withdrawn from the Magic Millions Gold Coast National Broodmare Sale. due to a change in the ownership make-up. The Chris Waller-trained six-year-old, who landed the Epona Stakes (Gr 3, 1900m) in March, was raced by Kylie Fawcett and her brother Brock, her partner Rob Joyce and Aucklanders John and Margaret Thompson, and Kyie sold a 50 per cent interest to John and Margaret to keep her racing into the spring. She will subsequently be bred in partnership.

Kay Cee ready for return

Group 1-winning mare Kay Cee (Playing God) is in top order ahead of her return in this Saturday's Belmont Sprint (Gr 3, 1400m) according to Neville Parnham. The four-year-old mare, who landed the 2019 Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m), has not raced competitively since finishing tenth when attempting to defend her crown in December, but has completed two recent trials. Parnham scheduled her for a third trial outing at Belmont yesterday morning, but changed his plans after seeing the weather forecast. "She had a pretty searching gallop on Saturday morning on the grass," Parnham told TABradio. "There was obviously this expected rain that was going to come and I didn't know how it was going to play with the track. I decided to give her a pretty solid workout with Bam's On Fire and they had a pretty strong workout. I thought she's had the two trials now and she's had a couple of really solid gallops since, and she's not a thick-winded horse, so she's ready to go there on Saturday. She'll perform very well, I'm sure."

Oaks next for Rebel

The Marc Conners-trained Rebel Rama (Dissident) has booked her ticket to the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) after winning the De Bortoli Wines Handicap (2000m) at Rosehill on Saturday. The filly landed the Benchmark 72 by half a length and Conners is confident she can perform in Group 1 company at Eagle Farm on June 5. "She had done nothing wrong, her last start at Newcastle was very good I thought, and she was very unlucky not to win," he said. "We were going to run her a fortnight ago, but we decided to just wait for this race. It seemed the right type of race for her and if she won, we would be entitled for her to go to Queensland and be a legitimate chance in the Oaks with her."

Tofane withdrawn from Broodmare Sale

Tofane (Ocean Park) has also been withdrawn from the National Broodmare Sale after a promising performance in the BRC Sprint (Gr 3, 1350m) at Doomben on Saturday. The Mike Moroney-trained five-year-old mare is winless since taking out last year's All Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) but showed she still retained plenty of ability when finishing runner-up to Emerald Kingdom (Bryannbo's Gift) on Saturday. She will be targeted at either the Queensland Sapphire Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) on June 5 or the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) a week later.

MRC moves Thousand Guineas back to Wednesday

The Melbourne Racing Club has announced the Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) will be moved to the Wednesday of the Caulfield Cup carnival for the first time since 2013. The change in schedule was announced in an email sent to its members and MRC executive director of racing and operations, Jake Norton, believes the Thousand Guineas, which has taken place on Saturday in recent times, will benefit from the change in day. "Having The Thousand Guineas headline the day will reinvigorate proceedings on and off track and we're hopeful of seeing continued engagement and excitement with increased field sizes and attendance trackside," he said.

Caulfield Stakes renamed after Might And Power

Another change to the carnival will see the Caulfield Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) renamed to honour legend of the turf Might And Power (Zabeel). The seven-time Group 1 winner landed the Caulfield Stakes in 1998 and also took out the 1997 Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) by seven and a half lengths. Norton said it was

"only befitting we add Might And Power to the honour roll and immortalise the horse in the Carnival's fixture". Previously run as the Neds Caulfield Stakes, the race will be renamed the Might And Power.

Perth stint key to Hefel form

A three-month sojourn in Perth has helped improve the riding skills of Carleen Hefel who brought up her first city double at Flemington last weekend. The Pakenham-based jockey rode her first Saturday city winner at Sandown earlier in May and at her second meeting riding at Flemington brought up a double. Hefel book-ended the card on the Grant and Peter Dalziel-trained Standoff (Smart Missile) then provided Julien Welsh his first success at headquarters when Don't Doubt Dory (Fiorente) won the final race. Prior to taking a week off to recharge the batteries, Hefel, 31, said the three-month stint in Perth late last year brought about some confidence. "I think it was the consistent riding, having four or five rides on a day. I got a lot of confidence, rode a lot of winners and had some good support. It definitely did me the world of good. I needed a bit of a change, get out of the same routine and it came up at the right time," said Hefel. She said the last month had really picked up with her manager being able to secure better rides. "I hope the double gives me a kick along. It was only my second meeting riding there. My first was the week before and I had a second and a third, so to get a double, it's a big thrill." Hefel is apprenticed to Welsh and he was equally as delighted for the rider as he was in preparing his first winner at Flemington. "She's done a fantastic job and is really starting to mature as a rider. She was starving for rides here, two or three a week, and that's not good enough, so heading over there really brought her on. Now she's riding great," said Welsh.

TROA floats Vic prize-money increases

The Thoroughbred Racehorse Owners Association (TROA) has called for a \$20 million boost in Victorian prize-money levels. The TROA has submitted a detailed proposal to the Racing Victoria board with several suggestions, including raising prize-money for all stakes races and midweek metropolitan contests and bringing in a new maiden bonus of \$5,000 per race. The TROA say this can be afforded by substantially cutting the All-Star Mile (1600m) prize-money from \$5 million to \$2 million and eliminating the ASM marketing budget, which the TROA estimate to be \$2 million per year. The proposal has the backing of the Victorian Jockeys Association and The Australian Trainers Association and will be discussed by the RV board this week.

Melham nearing return

Group 1-winning jockey Ben Melham returned to riding track work at Cranbourne yesterday

for the first time since December when he was disqualified for five months after being found guilty of three betting charges and for giving false evidence. The term ended on Sunday, so yesterday was his first opportunity to ride horses in work. His manager Mathew Alesci told Racing.com: "He'll probably be a bit sore after this morning and he has set no timeframe and will be dictated to by how he feels over the next few days as to when he'll return. It could be Sale this Thursday, Caulfield on Saturday or even Pakenham next Monday."

Stockdale appeal fails

Thomas Stockdale had his 14-meeting careless riding suspension appeal dismissed yesterday for his ride on Gotta Pulse (Ready For Victory) at Moe on May 18. It was deemed that he had insufficient room when shifting his mount out from behind Brazen Delight (Brazen Beau) near the 250 metres and he carried Madam Cha Cha (Choisir) into the path of Margaret's Banter (Hvasstan), meaning Madam Cha Cha had to

be checked. He pleaded guilty to the charge and was originally suspended until midnight on June 5, but had been riding on appeal at Flemington and Sandown on Saturday and Sunday.

Cox Plate plans for Verry Elleegant

Plans to travel Verry Elleegant (Zed) to France for the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) have been put on hold due to the implications of Covid-19 and she will instead target the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2400m) at the spring carnival, part-owner Brae Sokolski has confirmed. "It is highly likely we will remain domestic with her and aim at the Cox Plate, but we are just working through that with Chris (Waller) at the moment," Sokolski told Racing.com. "The Arc was certainly high on the agenda but the logistics with Covid made it difficult. It is not beyond her to attempt it in 12 months' time as a seven-year-old with Covid hopefully behind us, so we will keep it potentially on the radar."

Sokolski is also a part-owner in Sir Dragonet (Camelot), who landed Moonee Valley's \$5 million weight-for-age championship last year. "It's the race I've most wanted to win and the one I've had the most romantic connection with, following all the winners through the 90s when I was a kid," he said. "To have the chance to go back-to-back has just strengthened my resolve for the race and I'm just as obsessed trying to win it a second time."

Stars set flight for QLD

Chris Calthorpe, the owner of Air Horse Transport has confirmed a plane load of stars are set to fly to Queensland today seven days after a plane carrying the likes of Ayrton (Iffraaj), Let's Karaka Deel (Dundeel) and Explosive Jack (Jakkalberry) was grounded due to a Queensland Health directive. Some of the horses booked on the flight due to leave today include Group 1 winners Gytrash (Lope De Vega) and Media Award (Shamus Award). "I'll fly up tomorrow night or Wednesday evening. I'll load them all in Melbourne, and I've got some good people in Toowoomba ready to go, so we should be sweet," said Calthorpe. He said he had to jump through a number of hoops to get approved to fly the horses to Queensland, including the need for grooms to be vaccinated for Covid-19. "I'm lucky I've got one (groom) ready. It gets me out of trouble this week. I'll get through tomorrow and then hopefully use the same crew for the next three or four weeks and we should be right."

Lindsay Park's Randwick base up for sale

Lindsay Park are selling their Randwick base, with the property set to go on the market later this week. The property, located on Doncaster Avenue, Kensington, features eight onsite boxes and a three-bedroom house and is valued in the region of \$4 million. Lindsay Park will continue to have a Sydney presence, but plan to utilise Warwick Farm instead. The Kensington property was purchased by Colin Hayes in June 1989, before transferring ownership to David and Prue Hayes in the 1990s and 13 Sydney Group 1 winners have been trained out of the property. The Randwick stable has been the base for Lindsay Park to prepare 45

stakes winners in Sydney, including 13 Group 1 successes as well as 12 Group 2 wins, eight Group 3 wins and a further 12 victories at Listed level.

NEW ZEALAND

Big thrill for Tanner

Trainer and breeder Lucy Tanner had a huge thrill on Saturday when Belle Plaisir (Proisir) became a black-type winner. The four-year-old mare landed the Rangitikei Gold Cup (Listed, 1600m) for Tanner, who spends most her time looking after wind turbines that help power Palmerston North and she trains four or five horses on the side. "They're putting up wind farms in New Zealand. They put up the farm on the Pahiatua Track (near Palmerston North) and are now putting up another 60-odd around there," she said. "I do all the finances and invoicing and all that sort of stuff, and basically run the office. The job really helps pay for the horses." Belle Plaisir is Tanner's second black-type winner as a trainer, having landed the 2012 Hawke's Bay Cup (Gr 3, 2200m) with Flemington (Jungle Pocket).

ASIA

JPN: Four Deep Impact yearlings among JRHA Select Sale catalogue

A total of 248 yearlings and 241 foals have been catalogued for the JRHA Select Sale, to take place at the Northern Horse Park near New Chitose airport on July 12 and 13. Among the highlights are sure to be the four yearlings from the last crop of Deep Impact (Sunday Silence), who died in July 2019. The very first lot is a colt by the sire out of the Black-Eyed Susan Stakes (Gr 2, 9f) winner Go Maggie Go (Ghostzapper). Another colt by Deep Impact for sale is out of triple Group 1 winner Sweep Tosho (End Sweep). Also selling will be a filly out of Beverly D Stakes (Gr 1, 9.5f) winner Watsdachances (Diamond Green), and a filly out of Invincible Spirit's (Green Desert) daughter Jewel Maker. Others to catch the eye in the two-day catalogue include a Heart's Cry (Sunday Silence) colt out of Golden Slipper (Gr 1, 1200m) heroine She Will Reign (Manhattan Rain), and another by the sire out of Poule d'Essai des Poulaches (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Elusive Wave (Elusive City),

along with a colt out of Moyglare Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) heroine Necklace (Darshaan), by Maurice (Screen Hero). Foals by Bated Breath (Dansili), Frankel (Galileo) and Saxon Warrior (Deep Impact) also feature. The intention is for the sale to take place as a live physical auction, and the hope is that international buyers will be able to attend in person. Contingency plans, however, are being prepared.

INTERNATIONAL

Four for Wootton Bassett

Incarville (3 f ex Ilhabela by Azamour) survived a lengthy stewards' inquiry in a thrilling edition of the Prix Saint-Alary (Gr 1, 2000m) at Longchamp yesterday to become the fourth individual elite-level winner for Coolmore's Wootton Bassett (Iffraaj), who will shuttle to Australia for the first time later this year. Ridden by Christophe Soumillon, the three-year-old filly flew down the outside late on to score a last-stride win in a blanket finish, with the first four home separated by just a length. Cirona (Maxios) was a head behind Incarville in second, with Es La Vida (Soldier Hollow) the same distance further back in third. Incarville, who finished second in her two previous runs at Group 3 level, is one of four winners from as many to race out of Ilhabela (Azamour), who is a half-sister to dual Group 1 Classic winner Vahorimix (Linamix). Wootton Bassett, who is currently based at Coolmore in Ireland, will stand for \$71,500 in his first southern hemisphere season.

24 from Nathaniel

Nathaniel (Galileo) sired his second new stakes winner in as many days when Bubble Gift (3 c ex Bubble Back by Grand Lodge) took out the Prix Hocquart (Gr 2, 2200m) at Longchamp yesterday. Ridden by Gerald Mosse, the three-year-old colt picked up late on the outside to defeat Gregolimo (Galiway) by a neck, with Lambo (Protectionist) a length behind the winner in third. Trained by Mikel Delzangles and out of Bubble Back (Grand Lodge), Bubble Gift is a half-brother to Group 3 winner and Classic-placed Bubble Chic (Chichicastenango) and stakes-placed Queen Bubble (Layman). Nathaniel, also the sire Sunday's French Listed winner Nationalista, stands at Newsells Park Stud for a fee of £15,000 (approx. AU\$27,400).

79 for Iffraaj

Consistent four-year-old Reshabar (4 c ex Rait by Tamayuz) was a close up third in Listed company last month and he broke through at that level yesterday in the Prix de Montretout (Listed, 1600m) at Longchamp to become the 79th individual stakes winner for Iffraaj (Zafonic). Ridden by Gerald Mosse, the Markus Munch-trained four-year-old hit the front in the final furlong and stuck to the task to see off the favourite Magny Cours (Medaglia D'Oro) by a neck, while they were two lengths clear of Irska (Hunter's Light) in third. Reshabar is the first foal out of a winning half-sister to Fillies' Mile (Gr 1, 1m) and Poule d'Essai des Poulaches (Gr 1, 1600m) runner-up Nathra (Iffraaj), who also scored at Group 3 level. Iffraaj stands at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket where his fee this year is £20,000 (approx. AU\$36,532).

FR: Group 2 win for Skazino

Cedric Rossi-trained five-year-old Skazino (Kendargent) followed up his first Group win in the Prix de Barbeville (Gr 3, 3100m) earlier this month with victory in the Prix Vicomtesse Vigier (Gr 2, 3100m) at Longchamp yesterday and took his record to 11 wins from 26 starts. Ridden by Mickael Barzalona, the gelding was sent off as favourite and he put up a dominant display to win by two lengths from Valia (Sea The Stars), with British raider The Grand Visir (Frankel) a further six lengths back in third.

GER: Mythico lands German 2,000 Guineas

Mythico (3 c Adlerflug - Madhyana by Monsun) provided Adlerflug (In The Wings) with a posthumous Classic success after a polished effort

in the Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen (Gr 2, 1600m), the German 2,000 Guineas, at Cologne yesterday. The impact of the loss of Gestut Schlenderhan's stallion in April is still to be truly absorbed as he had his best year to date in 2020, with In Swoop leading home an Adlerflug one-two in the German Derby (Gr 1, 2400m). He went on to finish second in the Arc and is already looking a key contender for this year's renewal. A German Derby winner himself, Adlerflug had previously sired a German Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) scorer but had not made his mark in the domestic Guineas until the Jean-Pierre Carvalho-trained Mythico benefitted from a nicely-timed ride by Rene Piechulek. Mythico had been third to Best Of Lips (The Gurkha) in the Preis des Winterfavoriten (Gr 3, 1600m), a key German two-year-old race over course and distance, and second to that same rival in a recent prep race at Krefeld. He made the decisive move with two furlongs remaining and lasted home a short head in front of Best Lightning (Sidestep), with Best Of Lips, who hit trouble in-running at a vital time, staying on for third. Mythico was bred by Dr Thomas Bretzger and races under his Stall TMB, having been bought back for €24,000 when offered by Haras d'Ombreville at Baden-Baden in 2019. He is the third foal of Listed winner Madhyana (Monsun), bought privately at Arqana for €26,000 in 2017 and a full-sister to Mythica, who ran in the German Oaks two years ago and achieved several Listed placings.

Vale Barney Curley

Legendary punter and former trainer Barney Curley, who was the mastermind behind arguably the greatest betting coup of all time, has died at the age of 81. Few men who have crossed the racing landscape

can have divided opinion quite as successfully as the Northern Irishman, whose unlikely recovery from a bout of ravaging tuberculosis as a young man, then his decision to abandon plans for a career as a Jesuit priest and missionary, preserved him for a turbulent life in racing. Born in County Fermanagh on October 5, 1939, Curley failed as both a punter and bookie in his early days, but in the process learned lessons that would turn him into one of the most feared and fabled punters on either side of the Irish Sea. He became both an owner and trainer of racehorses and will be forever remembered with the infamous Yellow Sam coup of June 25, 1975. The Bellewstown master plan involved winning a dire race with "one of the worst horses I've ever owned" and revolved around the blocking of the only public phone at the track, the off-course firms' hedging lifeline. Yellow Sam went on to win at 20-1 with Curley watching from behind a gorse bush on the infield. Winnings equivalent to more than £2 million in today's money were later revealed. Curley nurtured some of the most exalted talent ever to grace British racing. In the saddle, the likes of Frankie Dettori, Jamie Spencer, Tom Queally, Tommy Carmody and Declan Murphy all developed under the tutelage of Curley.

Peltzer to stand at Twin Hills

Unbeaten two-year-old and Group 2-winning three-year-old Peltzer (So You Think) has been retired to Twin Hills Stud in southern NSW for the 2021 breeding season. He will stand at a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST).

Trained by Gerald Ryan and Sterling Alexiou, Peltzer was the winner of all three of his races as a juvenile and he is the highest-rated two-year-old by his sire.

He returned the following season to win the Stan Fox Stakes (Gr 2, 1500m) and the \$1 million Bondi Stakes (1600m) in the spring and returned earlier this year to win the Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) first-up at Randwick.

"He had immense talent. I've only had four horses break 30 seconds from the 1500 metres to the 1000-metre (mark) where I clock them from (at Rosehill), said Ryan.

"The first was Snitzel, then Snitzerland, next was Rubick and this colt, Peltzer.

"It's why I will always have a huge opinion of this horse."

Peltzer defeated subsequent Group 3 winner Anders (Not A Single Doubt) over 1000 metres when having his first start at Kembla Grange as an April two-year-old.

Ryan continued his opening campaign at Randwick where he scored two comprehensive victories by two and four lengths respectively.

"He was a fast So You Think," the trainer said. "He's a gorgeous looking colt with a great attitude."

By Coolmore's champion So You Think (High Chaparral), who covered more mares in Australia last year than any other stallion, Peltzer is out of winning mare Miss Otto (Elusive Quality) who is a half-sister to the stakes-placed Miss With Attitude (Galileo) and Oui Si Attitude (Bianconi).

The half-sisters have produced stakes winners Crown Towers (Camelot) and So We Are (So You Think) respectively. Peltzer descends from the Aga Khan family of French champion Shawanda (Sinndar).

"Peltzer is a glorious looking horse. He has quality, strength and scope. Just lovely," Twin Hills Stud principal Olly Tait said.

"He was a top sprinter, with the class to get a mile. Furthermore, he was unbeaten in three starts as a two-year-old.

"So, he's by a great stallion but came to hand earlier and was faster than his pedigree suggested, a bit like Zabeel or Toronado.

"It's an excellent sign in a stallion prospect. We're thrilled to have him bought into him and having him standing at Twin Hills. It's hard to get your hands on a horse with these credentials"

MUOLLO AND NOVARA PARK GRABBING THE HEADLINES

Luigi Muollo, principal of Novara Park, near Cambridge, has enjoyed several industry highlights over the last month or so and has maintained his presence with the announcement that his stud had acquired new stallion King Of Comedy (Kingman) for the upcoming breeding season.

This news arrived off the back of Muollo being the subject of more headlines in recent months. Over the weekend, Muollo's fledgling young stallion Sweynesse (Lonhro), last season's champion first season sire in New Zealand, reached new heights in his stud career as he struck for his first Australian stakes winner over the weekend through Only Words' victory in the ANZ Bloodstock News The Roses (Gr 2, 2000m).

While the dominance among three-year-olds of his homebred Explosive Jack (Jakkalberry), the winner of, so far, three Derbys and so far, because the colt is set to take on a fourth, the Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m), on Saturday.

Muollo not only bred Explosive Jack, he stood his sire Jakkalberry (Storming Home) for four seasons until his untimely death in February 2018. Explosive Jack represents his final crop and is, by far and away, the best staying three-year-old in Australasia this season. The mere fact that he is attempting to win a fourth Derby, and win in five different states, all this season, is a feat in itself.

Then again, his sire was a tough, world traveller who kept coming up season after season, so perhaps it is no wonder that his son has inherited a similar toughness.

Kiwi Chronicles caught up with Muollo whose first comment was: "Explosive Jack is going to have to do it (win a fourth Derby) the

hard way. The Melbourne-Brisbane flight was cancelled so the colt will have to float all the way."

King Of Comedy (Kingman) will join Sweynesse (Lonhro) and Staphanos (Deep Impact) at Novara Park for the upcoming 2021 stud season. He is the first son of Kingman (Invincible Spirit) to stand in the southern hemisphere.

Although his entire racing career, which yielded three wins from 12 starts, was spent in the racing jurisdictions of Britain and Ireland, a mere notion of his talent is exemplified through Saturday's dominant Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux), who King Of Comedy defeated twice when finishing second, the first in a three-year-old season that at one stage he was the highest-rated in the land.

Regarding Saturday's Doomben Cup win by Zaaki, Muollo stated: "Gosh, Zaaki was really impressive which further endorses King Of Comedy's form," in reference to the two occasions that his new stallion relegated Zaaki

to third, in the Newmarket Joel Stakes (Gr 2, 1m) and in the Newbury Diomed Stakes (Gr 3, 1m).

In a light career of a dozen starts King Of Comedy was a Listed winner at three years over the mile at Sandown, where he also won at two. His best performance was his second to Circus Maximus (Galileo) in the Royal Ascot St James's Palace Stakes (Gr 1, 1m). Third home that day was the Champion Miler in Great Britain for 2019, Too Darn Hot (Dubawi).

Coincidentally, Circus Maximus will stand his first southern hemisphere season not too far from Novara Park, just a few kilometres up the road at Windsor Park Stud.

Muollo had more to laugh about on Saturday when his Sweynesse sired the winner of The Roses through the Star Thoroughbreds-raced Only Words, a horse Muollo couldn't sell with a reserve of NZ\$2,000 as a weanling, but having then raced the horse himself he has maintained an interest since his acquisition by Star.

Winner of the Wanganui Guineas (Listed, 1200m) last spring, Only Words was transferred to Chris Waller's stable soon after her maiden stakes win and has been successful at Canterbury and was placed in the Gold Coast Bracelet (Listed, 1800m) prior to Saturday's breakthrough Australian stakes success.

She holds a nomination for the Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) to be run at Eagle Farm on June 5, as does Muollo's Signora Nera, also by Sweynesse, who was fifth in The Roses.

"Only Words is out of a Darci Brahma mare and I believe Sweynesse has a special affinity with Darci Brahma mares, so I have purchased a few lately," said Muollo. "This might be a mega nick.

"One of the mares I found recently is a sister to the dam of the unbeaten Carribean King, a winner at the Sunshine Coast on Sunday and who is nominated for the Group 1 JJ Atkins."

Nine stakes races were run in Australasia last Saturday and three of the eight staged in Brisbane (six), Sydney and Melbourne were won by runners bred in New Zealand, much to the New Zealand industry's delight.

The Roses was especially notable, in that the first six home were bred in New Zealand. Trailing in behind Only Words was Bargain, a daughter of Ocean Park (Thorn Park), and owned by Garry and Mark Chittick of Waikato Stud. She was a last-start third in the Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) in April.

Third was Charms Star (Per Incanto), having her first run since finishing second in the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m). All three are set to meet again in the Queensland Oaks early next month.

Additionally, Westbury Stud's Redwood (High Chaparral) sired Romancer, winner of The Straight Six (Listed, 1200m) at Flemington, while in Sydney, Polly Grey (Azamour), enjoying career-best form with three stakes wins in her last four starts ahead of her sale at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale today, took out the Lord Mayor's Cup (Listed, 2000m) at Rosehill.

All three stakes winners raced in New Zealand before heading for greater riches across the Tasman.

Romancer is an interesting case and underlines the great versatility of sons of High Chaparral (Sadler's Wells). Redwood himself showed his best form at distances beyond a mile, a distance he succeeded at as a two-year-old. Romancer is the odd-man-out of Redwood's eight stakes winners.

The others have a preference for races of a mile or beyond yet Romancer is proving a proficient sprinter. His racing in New Zealand included success in the 1300-metre Mufhasa Stakes (Listed) at Ellerslie when trained at Ruakaka by Donna Logan and Chris Gibbs.

Not so Little Avondale

Sam Williams of Little Avondale Stud in Masterton will be beaming during his visit to the Gold Coast sales. Although he didn't pocket the proceeds of the half-a-million dollars fetched by the Per Incanto (Street Cry) weanling out of Shadwell Stud's unreserved dispersal draft, on top of the resounding victory by Lost And Running (Per Incanto), in the previous week's Luskin Star Stakes (Listed, 1300m), he will feel that his resident stallion has finally, and belatedly, caught the attention of Australian buyers.

Per Incanto, whose book is full for the upcoming season, will be front and centre of this coming week's Magic Millions Gold Coast National Broodmare Sale as his filly, Bonham, goes under the hammer as Lot 707.

In only six starts Bonham has four wins including the Levin Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) in January at Trentham where, at her last start,

two months ago, she also finished second in the Wellington Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m) behind the speedy Need I Say More (No Nay Never).

Her new owners, assuming she reaches her reserve, will have a lightly-raced filly with enormous talent who could easily enhance her value over the next few seasons.

As a broodmare her future is assured. Any stud would salivate over having a Group 1 winner with her attributes on their property. In Bonham's case, her dam is a Redoute's Choice (Danehill) daughter of Banc De Fortune (Galileo), a Sydney Listed winner who was also Group 1 placed.

Due to two Group 1 victories, including the Australian Oaks (2400m), Bonham's grandam, Danendri (Danehill) was ranked the top Australian 3YO filly of her crop.

Danendri's granddaughter, Faint Perfume (Shamardal), matched her, being named the Champion Australian 3YO Filly of 2009-10 courtesy of Group 1 successes in the VRC Oaks (2500m) and the Vinery Stud Stakes (2000m).

Bonham's bloodlines are mouthwatering, to say the least, but the icing on the cake might be that racegoers can witness her racing talent this coming spring and hopefully thereafter.

Time Test on the board

Williams has a second reason to celebrate. Little Avondale shuttler Time Test (Dubawi) sired his first winner, two-year-old colt The King's Horses, a winner in Milan, Italy on May 15.

On debut, The King's Horses led from barrier rise and, although pressured at the 200 metres, came way to score by a length over the 1000-metre trip. In Ireland, four days previously, Time Test's juvenile filly Sunset Shiraz was placed second, also on debut.

This is a promising start for the well-performed son of Dubawi (Dubai Millennium), whose first southern hemisphere crop sold up to \$220,000 at Karaka last January.

Next song for Melody Belle

The darling of New Zealand racing over the past five seasons has, undoubtedly, been Melody Belle (Commands). She made her final raceday appearance in Saturday's Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m), running-on late for fifth and now heads to the sales ring.

Catalogued as Lot 510, Melody Belle joins Bonham and it is going to be very interesting to learn the fate of both.

Melody Belle really captured the hearts of New Zealand racing fans with her sheer determination to get to the line first. From her initial racing season right through to the current season, Melody Belle has always given her best and her best saw her gain an amazing 14 Group 1 victories, a New Zealand record.

Her breeder, Marie Leicester, can be totally proud that Melody Belle continued a fabulous legacy started by her parents, James and Annie Sarten, back in 1937, when they borrowed a mare from a neighbour in order to procure a foal by the great Foxbridge (Foxlaw). The mare missed that first year but the 1939 foal turned out to be Belle Fox, the start of a magnificent history for the Sartens.

Since the mid 1940s, and in nine generations, no fewer than 25 Group 1 Champions and 114 stakes winners can claim a direct line to Belle Fox. The first to succeed at Group 1 level was Supreme Court (Fair's Fair) whose 16 wins included New Zealand's premier sprint, the Railway Handicap (Gr 1, 6f) at Ellerslie. The most recent is this season's standout two-year-old Anamoe (Street Boss) who, after a brilliant second in the 2021 Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), followed up with a dominant victory in Randwick's Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m).

In between, there have been Golden Slipper winners Dance Hero (Danzero) and,

four years before him, Belle Du Jour (Dehere), not to mention the grand miler Grand Armee (Hennessy), a seven-time Group 1 victor, five of them at Randwick.

During the 1960s the Sartens raced the outstanding Star Belle (Summertime) but very nearly didn't. Annie Sarten was intending to sell the filly at Trentham until her husband James stepped in and did a swap. He was keen to race her and his decision proved right on the mark. She won 18 times and was named the Champion New Zealand 3YO of her crop before heading to Melbourne to add three Group 2 stakes at Flemington and Caulfield.

Melody Belle has certainly deserved her retirement from racing and, as long as she finds a great new home and we can watch to see how her foals remind us of her racing days, then all will be well.

The local scene

The sole stakes race run in New Zealand last Saturday was the long-held Rangitikei Cup (Listed, 1600m) at Awapuni. The win, by Belle Plaisir, provided Rich Hill Stud's Proisir (Choisir) with a winning double for the day as well as his fifth stakes winner (third stakes winner this season).

It was a smart effort from Belle Plaisir as she was giving the leader at least five lengths at the top of the straight but gathered him in easily with a strong run from the 300 metres and had the race well under control inside the 100 metres, for what was her fourth career success.

Belle Plaisir is the fifth winner and first stakes winner from her dam Eden (Zeditave), a winning three-quarter sister to Coolmore Classic (Gr 1, 1500m) winner Chlorophyll (Zeditave). Her granddam is a half-sister to Belmont (New York) Grade 1 winner Garthorn (Believe It) from the family of tragically-lost Champion Go For Wand (Deputy Minister).

Undefeated Wonder

Although not seen for four weeks, Courier Wonder (Sacred Falls) continued on his unbeaten, now five-win path, with a decisive three-quarters of a length win in the Sha Tin Vase (Gr 3, 1200m) on Sunday.

The three-year-old was making his first attempt at stakes class and, although pressured over the final 200 metres, lifted strongly in the final strides to claim his maiden stakes success.

His earlier wins, all breaking 1:09 for the 1200 metres, resulted in wide-winning margins but on Sunday, facing his strongest opposition thus far, the gelding clocked his fastest yet, a smart 1:08.16, taking full advantage of his lighter weight.

Strong Kiwi representation

The stunning success of the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale last week included strong participation by a wide range of Kiwi buyers.

Fifteen individual parties invested in 22 lots, signifying a positive outlook by the New Zealand industry.

The top price paid by the New Zealand contingent was by Taylor Bloodstock Marketing of Pukekohe, who shelled out \$140,000 for a neat bay colt by Brave Smash (Tosen Phantom).

The colt's dam, Bella Gioia (Swiss Ace), won twice, was a Classic-placed second in the 2016 New Zealand One Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and is a half-sister to the dam of dual Group winner and New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) second Contessa Vanessa (Bullbars).

He descends from a three-quarter sister to Kodiak (Danehill), sire of Cambridge Stud's top-class sprinter Hello Youmzain, who commences southern hemisphere stud duties later this year.

The second top price of \$105,000 was paid by Valencia Park for a strong, good-boned So You Think (High Chaparral) filly. The filly's grandam is a three-quarter sister to Listed winner Fleur De Chine (Centaine), herself the dam of Australasian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Tully Thunder (Thunder Gulch).

Brave Smash is also the sire of Woburn

Farm's sole purchase as Adrian Stanley parted with \$100,000 for a well grown, tall and attractive filly whose granddam, Luna Wells (Sadler's Wells), won five times, three at Group level, including the Prix Saint-Alary (Gr 1, 2000m) at Longchamp.

Highly respected agent Paul Willetts outlayed \$100,000 for a very stylish colt by Russian Revolution (Snitzel) from an Encosta De Lago (Fairy King) half-sister to the Champion More Joyous (More Than Ready). A great family represented here.

Fellow agent, and one making a good name for himself through being dedicated enough to suffer January quarantine down-time during the current pandemic, Bevan Smith partnered with Kilgravin Lodge's Eion Kemp on three lots.

They secured an attractive dark brown colt by current star sire Capitalist (Written Tycoon) for \$140,000 as well as an Invader (Snitzel) colt, for \$65,000, out of a US-bred Kingmambo (Mr Prospector) half-sister to Hong Kong Horse of the Year Vengeance Of Rain (Zabeel).

Smith also partnered with Kelly Van Dyk of Prima Park in Ohaupo on a Deep Field (Northern Meteor) filly out of the good Brisbane winner Glorious Red (Red Element) for \$90,000.

Deep Field is enjoying an enormous season and the filly is closely related to last November's Stewards Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Sheezallmine (Super Easy).

Hallmark Stud, home to Super Easy (Darci Brahma), took home a Justify (Scat Daddy) filly for \$80,000. The filly's dam, Brilliant Bisc (Elvstroem), was a Randwick Listed winner at two and her granddam, Stella Cadente (Centaine), scored three Group wins, including the Australia Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Moonee Valley. Plenty of residual value here.

Lyndhurst Farm's Mark Treweek snared a strong-looking brown colt by first season sire Lean Mean Machine (Zoustar) for \$55,000. The colt's granddam is a Listed-winning half-sister to the dam of Champion Filly Mosheen (Fastnet Rock) from the family of Might And Power (Zabeel).

Moore looking to go the extra mile with Derby hope

With the first of Macau's 4YO Classic races, the local Group 3 Derby Trial (1500m), set for Saturday, Macau's youngest trainer Nick Moore is eagerly awaiting this morning's gallops, when his Derby hopeful Circuit Miles (Fastnet Rock) will have his final hit out in preparation for Saturday's contest on the road towards the SJM Derby (1800m).

Moore, who is into his second season as a trainer in Macau, is looking to surpass his efforts last year when he saddled up the Derby favourite Hostwin Saturn (Stratum) for a somewhat disappointing sixth, beaten five lengths by Sacred Magnate (Foxwedge).

He is hopeful the son of Fastnet Rock (Daneshill) is the right horse to give him his second local Group 1 victory after Hostwin Saturn's brilliant Macau Guineas (1500m) win last season.

"He is going to have his final hit out on Tuesday with Luis (Corrales) on top. I've purposely spaced his runs out, and Saturday will be his first run for seven weeks since he won easily over 1800 metres," Moore said.

"He had a nice trial last Tuesday over 1000 metres against a couple of the main Derby horses (Beauty Bolt and Simon Fubuki), and has come out of that in great shape.

"I want him peaking on Derby day, last year with Hostwin Saturn he peaked too soon. His Guineas win was his high, and by Derby day he had just gone a little over the top."

Moore rates the Joe Lau-trained Snow Storm (Mossman) as the one to beat in the Derby, even though the horse is currently rated lower than Circuit Miles.

"Joe is just the master when it comes to the Derby, he brings them along slowly and has them peaking right on the day," Moore added.

"His four Derby wins prove that. I liked Snow Storms win last Saturday, he hit the line well and his time was very good. And it was a

clever move by Joe to take on a lower-class race, rather than get straight into the Group 3 next Saturday.

"Snow Storm is lightly raced and still learning, that's three straight wins now."

Of the other Derby contenders, Moore names Beauty Bolt (Redoute's Choice) and Simon Fubuki (Medaglia D'Oro) as the main dangers.

"Both of them will be in the Derby Trial and will be tough to beat," he said. "Beauty Bolt hands down has the best form, she competed against the highest level in Australia, only two lengths away in Group 2 over 1600 metres at Flemington (Edward Manifold Stakes), and ran fourth in the VRC Oaks behind Miami Bound. That said, Beauty Bolt is mare, and often they can be a worry in Asia with the extreme humidity.

"Simon Fubuki is the highest rated on 90 points, so yes, we meet him at a disadvantage on the equal weights Saturday at 1500 metres. But come Derby day and the 1800 metres, I think I've got the right horse for the day.

"I feel he is just starting to come good in his coat, physically he looks great and he has a great attitude, he never leaves a feed. He has a great pedigree by Fastnet Rock, the same as

Pearl Green who won our 2018 Derby, and he is out of a Dehere mare and he has placed up to 2200 metres in Victoria."

Nick is the third generation of the famed Moore Racing Dynasty to train in Macau.

His grandfather, the legendary George Moore, widely regarded as Australia's greatest jockey, moved to the enclave after his mandatory retirement from Hong Kong, where he won 11 Champion Trainers' Titles.

George trained for two seasons in the enclave from 1994, finishing runner-up in the Trainers' Title in both years. He won the 1996 Macau Derby with Winning Touch (Triumphal March), ridden by his son Gary, and also trained the first three runners across the line.

A former top-class international jockey, Gary won seven Hong Kong Jockeys' Championships before setting up his training operation in Macau. In 13 years in the enclave, Gary won eight Macau Trainers' Titles before returning to Australia to train at Rosehill.

Nick's younger brother James, at the tender age of 23 years, took over part of Gary's Macau stable in the 2014-15 season and won the Macau Guineas with Kelowna Star (Sufficient) in 2016.

Gary also won the Macau Guineas in 2014 with Hostwin Donatello (Show A Heart), but couldn't go that extra yard in the Derby when running second to Best Season (Bahhare). My Dark Chocolate (Street Cry) was another Derby runner-up for Gary in 2010 behind Luen Yat Forever (Honours List). Whilst he had more than 700 Macau winners to his credit, and just about every feature Cup trophy on his mantelpiece, a Derby win eluded Gary, and that's where Nick has his heart set on going one better.

Nick spent 13 years working with his father, firstly in Macau as a trainer's assistant, and later as his assistant trainer. When Gary made the move back to Australia in 2014, Nick followed, and after spending two years there with Gary, he had one year under John Sargent.

The move back to Macau was an easy decision to make for 38-year-old Nick, who grabbed it as soon as the opportunity arose.

"My wife Jerusa Antunes is Macanese and her family is here, and I love Macau, so we didn't think twice about it," he said

Arriving just before the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, it was not an easy start, but Nick was heartened by the changes that had already been put in place by the MJC.

"I was surprised at the changes they had made with the transformation of the old stabling area," he said. "The new stables are much more open, with big windows that the horses can see more of the surroundings outside.

"They allow a lot of natural light in and have a great airflow through them. It's good for the horses, they are very content. Also, the new swimming pool system is great, and as you can imagine it gets plenty of work during the very humid weather here.

"It's not been easy with the Covid situation and our borders closed for so long, so sourcing new owners has been difficult, but the new Buyers Incentive Scheme was a great success with 49 new horses arriving just last month," he added.

One of those horses was the former Sha Tin Vase (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Thanks Forever (Duporth), who was formerly trained by Nick's uncle, John Moore, a seven-time Champion Trainer in Hong Kong, and one of the Club's most revered conditioners.

"He is a magnificent horse that beat Hot King Prawn in his last win there and has won over HK\$13 million in prize-money," said Nick.

"He suffered a bleeding attack and had to be retired from Hong Kong. With the MJC's more liberal stance on bleeders, Uncle John recommended that the owners send him here.

"He has arrived in super condition and I will just take my time with him and possibly look at running him early September. The owners are very happy, as they wanted to keep him racing if possible, and Macau is one of the few places that he can."

Like all clubs worldwide, the MJC has felt the brunt of the pandemic, but has fared better than most. With racing on hold for long periods around the world in the early pandemic days, thanks to outstanding management of the Macau government, racing only halted in the enclave for a total of 32 days.

The Club is anxiously awaiting the reopening of the Hong Kong - Macau Border, and with the mass vaccination programs already underway in both regions, it's only a matter of time before they can welcome their Hong Kong owners and racegoers back to the track.

The Buyer Incentive Scheme that offers a full refund of an owner's HK\$70,000 permit, or the full refund of the airfare (optional), proved a great success with 49 new horses arriving in April. The Club is already planning another shipment for July/August.

Whilst Covid-19 has delayed some projects within the Club, the installation of a new infield tote board with a diamond vision screen is expected to proceed in the coming months.

Macau only has a population of around 650,000 people, with the bulk of the MJC's owners being Hong Kong based, however a new avenue has opened up for the Club with the Guangdong - Greater Bay Development Area, a region that is home to 67 million people.

The high-speed train link that will take commuters from Guangzhou to Zhuhai is designed to link up with Macau's Light Rapid Transit (LRT) system, with a stop that is conveniently located right at the front door of the Macau Jockey Club.

The fast travel and easy access to Macau from the Greater Bay Development Area opens up a whole new market for sourcing new owners and racegoers to the Club.

BOOST BREEDING SUCCESS AND REDUCE OPERATIONAL COSTS

For seasonal breeders such as the horse, the lengthening days of spring have long been associated with increased fertility, enhanced performance, improved coat condition and better health and well-being. We recommend that Long Day light therapy begins no later than July 1st to ensure that mares are ready for breeding in time for the official start of the breeding season.

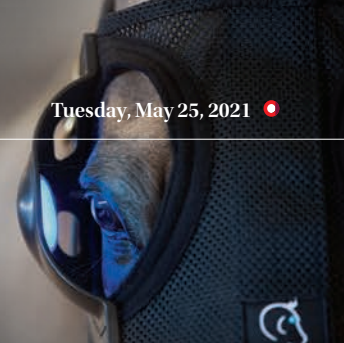
Having a mare stand in a stall for 16 hours per day to facilitate light therapy is not the best option for her fertility. Mares are less stressed and show improved uterine tone when at grass in herd environments and constantly moving. New first season sire winners

Sooboog - Kitchwin Hills sire Sooboog (Snitzel) continued his excellent start to life at stud as he landed a ninth individual winner, his second in three days, at Newcastle on Saturday. Victory looked unlikely for Bitcoin Baby (2 f ex Hard To Find by Elusive Quality), as she spotted the leader In Spades (Dissident) four lengths ahead entering the straight, but she flashed home to win in the final stride. Sent off the \$3.40 favourite, in the same silks as Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux), Bitcoin Baby was making her debut for the Gerald Ryan and Sterling Alexiou stable. An \$8,500 purchase out of the Inglis Digital December sale in 2019, she was resold as a yearling two months later, selling for \$65,000 at the Inglis Classic Sale. Earlier in the week, the Darryl Ward-trained Dublin De Quo (2 f ex Jibina by Northern Meteor) brought up his eighth winner when scoring at Warwick. Sooboog, who sits third in the leading first season sires by winners table behind Capitalist (Written Tycoon) and Star Turn (Star Witness), will stand at Kitchwin Hills this season for an unchanged fee of \$13,200 (inc GST).

stablemate Joan Of Arc (Galileo) in the final stride of the Irish 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) at the Curragh on Sunday, providing Galileo (Sadler's Wells) with his 90th individual elite-level winner. Sent off at 14-1, the Aidan O'Brien-trained filly produced a late turn of foot to run down Joan Of Arc and score in a photo-finish, with No Speak Alexander (Shalaa) a length back in third. Unraced last season, Empress Josephine made a winning debut at Naas in March but had failed to score in two subsequent runs at Group 3 and Listed level. Out of dual Group 1 winner Lillie Langtry (Danehill Dancer), Empress Josephine is a

sister to seven-time top-level winner Minding, who was second in this race in 2016. Galileo, the sire of 336 individual stakes winners, stands at Coolmore in Ireland for a private fee.

Gold Ship - Uberleben (3 f ex Meine Theresia by Roses in May) landed the Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) (Gr 1, 2400m), the second leg of the Triple Crown for fillies, at Tokyo, providing her sire Gold Ship (Stay Gold) with his first elite-level winner. Having been placed four times in Graded company, the Takahisa Tezuka-trained filly notched her first stakes success with a one-length win over Akaitorino Musume (Deep Impact), while rank

outsider Hagino Pilina (Kizuna) was a nose further back in third. "She suffered from colic in February and has shown a slow but steady recovery," winning jockey Mirco Demuro said. "She broke smoothly today and it did worry me a bit that we were dead last in the backstretch but she responded well when the pace accelerated from the third corner and showed her tenacity in steadily advancing in the straight. She was strong pulling away and holding off the others. The added distance wasn't a problem for her at all. I'm thrilled - it's always wonderful to win a Grade 1 race." Gold Ship, the winner of six elite-level contests during his race career, is the sire of three stakes winners and stands at Big Red Farm in Japan.

Leroidesanimaux - A sensational display of dominance from the Annabel Neasham-trained Zaaki (6 g ex Kesara by Sadler's Wells) saw the British import run riot in Saturday's Doomben Cup. The Hollindale Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) winner of a fortnight earlier, Zaaki was making just his fourth start in Australia having posted two wins at Group 3 level in his native UK, and defeated Toffee Tongue (Tavistock) by seven lengths, with Brandenburg (Burgundy) in third, a further two and a quarter lengths in arrears. Zaaki is the third individual Group 1 winner for Brazilian-bred stallion Leroidesanimaux (Candy Stripes), who now has as many Group 1 winners as he does at Group 2 and 3 level. The sire of emphatic Dubai World Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Animal Kingdom, Leroidesanimaux is also the sire of Argentine 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Una Cabeza. Leroidesanimaux died in 2016.

Power - Helvic Dream (4 g ex Rachevie by Danehill Dancer) narrowly got the better of odds-on favourite Broome (Australia) to land a thrilling edition of the Tattersalls Gold Cup (Gr 1, 1m2f) at the Curragh, providing Power (Oasis Dream) with his first winner at the highest level. The Noel Meade-trained gelding was neck and neck with the Aidan O'Brien-trained Broome during the final furlong and battled best to

score in a photo, reversing the placings from the Mooresbridge Stakes (Gr 2, 1m2f) run at the track earlier in the month. True Self (Oscar), who landed the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 3, 2600m) at Flemington for the second time in November, was a length back in third. Helvic Dream is the first foal out of unraced mare Rachevie, who is also the dam of Group 3-placed filly Flirting Bridge (Camelot). Power, the sire of New Zealand-bred Group 2 winners Mighty Giant and Gift Of Power, will stand at Oaklands Stud for NZ\$13,200 in 2021. The win provided Meade with his first Group 1 winner on the flat as a trainer and he said: "I just can't believe it to be honest with you. I'm thrilled. I've been second in the Guineas twice and placed in Classics and Group 1s, fourth in the Epsom Derby, but that's the first Group 1 winner. It means a lot."

New stakes winners

Arcano - Four times stakes placed from five previous attempts, Cirano (3 c ex Concerto Finale by Footstepsinthesand) had his day on Sunday in the Premio Mauro Sbarigia (Listed, 1600m) at Rome and became the 16th individual stakes winner for his sire Arcano (Oasis Dream). Cirano, who was recording his fourth win from

11 starts, forged through in the final furlong before grabbing the rail and grounding it out win by half a length from Convivio (Casamento) and Cantocorale (Helmet), who were split by a short head for second and third. Cirano's dam Concerto Finale (Footstepsinthesand) was a winner and is a daughter of the stakes-placed Connessa (Invincible Spirit). Arcano started out at Derrinstown Stud in Ireland in 2011 but relocated to Allevamento di Besnate in 2016 where he has stood since and his fee this year was €5,000 (approx. \$AU7,877).

Fastnet Rock - Champion sire Fastnet Rock's (Danehill) 174th individual stakes winner - and 23rd of this season - arrived after the Chris Waller-trained Nudge (4 m ex Julinsky Princess by Stravinsky) flew over the top of the field in a fast-run Pam O'Neill Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) to claim her first success at stakes level. Nudge, a \$380,000 purchase for her trainer and Guy Mulcaster Bloodstock at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in 2018, had hit the frame twice at stakes level, notably when third in the Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) in 2018, but secured her first stakes success when notching a third career win at Doomben, defeating Yamazaki (Real Saga) by a length and a half, with Paradee (Epaulette) in

third, a further three-quarters of a length adrift. Out of Julinsky Princess (Stravinsky), a three-time stakes winner and placegetter in the New Zealand One Thousand Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), Nudge is a half-sister to dual Group 1 winner in New Zealand Julinsky Prince (Darci Brahma). Fastnet Rock stands at Coolmore Stud, where he commands a \$165,000 fee in 2021.

Frankel - Frankel (Galileo) added another stakes winner to his tally, his 69th, when Mostahdaf (3 c ex Handassa by Dubawi) emerged as a serious contender for Royal Ascot honours by taking out the Heron Stakes (Listed, 1m) at Sandown on Thursday evening. Carrying the blue and white Shadwell silks, the John and Thady Gosden-trained colt made it three wins in as many starts as he made a successful turf debut with a smooth half-length victory over favourite Highland Avenue (Dubawi). Bullace (Toronado) was the same margin away in third. The homebred Mostahdaf, who is a half-brother to last season's dual Group 1 winner Nazeef (Invincible Spirit), was given quotes of 5-1 for next month's St James's Palace Stakes by the northern hemisphere bookmakers following his latest success. Frankel stands at Juddmonte's Banstead Manor Stud near Newmarket for a fee of £175,000 (approx. AUD\$320,000).

Goldencents - Nocentsinkentucky (4 g ex Greeley's Geisha by Mr Greeley) landed the Jagersro Sprint (Listed, 1200m) on Sunday to provide Goldencents (Into Mischief) with his 12th individual stakes winner. The Fredrik Reuterskiöld-trained four-year-old, who was making his second start in stakes company after an unplaced effort in the UAE 2,000 Guineas (Gr 3, 1600m) last year, justified being sent off the short-priced favourite with a comfortable win over Gulfstream Tiger (Elusive Quality), taking his record to eight wins from 12 starts. Goldencents, a three-time Grade 1 winner in the United States, stands at Spendthrift Farm for a US\$15,000 (approx. AU\$19,400) service fee.

Golden Horn - Darley stallion Golden Horn (Cape Cross) sired his fourth individual stakes

winner when Ad Infinitum (3 f ex Madame Hoi by Hawk Wing) overcame greenness to win the Height Of Fashion Stakes (Listed, 1m 2f) at Goodwood on Friday. The David Simcock-trained three-year-old crept from back in the field under Jamie Spencer to take up the running in the home straight and kept her rivals at bay through the final furlong to win by a length from Lady Hayes (Kodiak) with Aura Blue (Iffraaj) a further neck behind in third. The 25-1 chance scored at her second start, having finished fourth at 50-1 in a Kempton maiden over a mile and three furlongs in December. Ad Infinitum is a half-sister to US Grade 2 winner Nancy From Nairobi (Sixties Icon). Her dam, Madame Hoi (Hawk Wing), was stakes-placed and is a half-sister to Phoenix Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) runner-up Amadeus Mozart (Mozart), from the family of top level winners Fascinating Rock (Fastnet Rock) and Cesario (Special Week), as well as the Group1-placed multiple Group 2 winner Gothenberg (Polish Patriot). Golden Horn stands at Darley's Dalham Hall at a fee of £20,000 (approx. AUD\$36,600).

Hot Streak - Royal Ashirah (2 f ex Royal Visit by King's Best) followed up her debut win last month and remained unbeaten on her second start in the Premio Alessandro Perrone

(Listed, 1100m) at Rome to become the third individual stakes winner for Hot Streak (Iffraaj). The Sebastiano Guerrieri-trained juvenile tracked the pace and was driven through to win by a length from Lollipop Girl (Dandy Man), with the pacesetter Listening (Desert Prince) staying on for third. Royal Ashirah was a £13,000 Tattersalls Ireland September Sale purchase by Scuderia Semeso and she is out of Royal Visit (King's Best), who is a half-sister to stakes-placed Colour Blue (Holy Roman Emperor) and to the dam of Group 1 winner and sire Sioux Nation (Scat Daddy). Former Tweenhills resident Hot Streak relocated to Haras d'Annebault this year where he stood for €3,500 (approx. AU\$5,514).

Kodi Bear - Rathbarry Stud resident Kodi Bear (Kodiak) sired his fourth individual stakes winner when Diablotine (2 f ex Fridoline by Septieme Ciel) took her unbeaten record to two with victory in the Prix des Reves d'Or - Jacques Bouchara Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Vichy on Friday. Trained by Hubert De Nicolay, the filly followed up her five length debut win at Chantilly last month with a two and a half victory. Ma Noire (American Devil) filled second spot, with Glenall (Coulsty) another length and a half away in third. Group 2 winner Kodi Bear stands for a fee of €6,000 (approx. AUD\$9,440).

Lonhro - Varda (4 m ex Wild Queen by Loup Sauvage) came from last to first in an extraordinary finishing burst to take out the Chiefs De Beers (Listed, 1110m) at Doomben on Saturday, and in the process become the 91st individual stakes winner for her sire Lonhro (Octagonal). The Godolphin-raced mare Varda was a debut winner as a two-year-old, and won four consecutive races last winter, including a half-length defeat of subsequent William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Masked Crusader (Toronado). Winless in three efforts at Listed level since, she bounced emphatically back to form, defeating long-time leader Kylease (Choisir) by three-quarters of a length, with Mishani Hustler (Exceedingly Good) in third. Lonhro, the sire of 12 elite-level winners, stands at Darley's Kelvinside property for \$66,000 in 2021.

Mastercraftsman - Former shuttler Mastercraftsman (Danehill Dancer) sired his 79th individual stakes winner when his daughter Tribal Craft (5 m ex Snoqualmie Star by Galileo) built on the promise of her return at Ascot last time out with a game victory in the Bronte Cup Fillies' Stakes (Gr 3, 1m 6f) at York on Saturday. The Andrew Balding-trained five-year-old was always travelling best of the seven strong field under David Probert, and she picked up well in the closing stages to go on and win by two and three-quarter lengths from Urban Artist (Cityscape). Makawee (Farhh) was another three-quarters of a length away in third. Now the winner of four of her 18 starts, Tribal Craft is out of the Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare Snoqualmie Star a half-sister to Listed winners Snoqualmie Girl (Montjeu) and Snoqualmie Boy (Montjeu), while third dam, the stakes placed Golden Rhyme (Dom Racine) is the dam of Racing Post Trophy (Gr 1, 1m) winner Seattle Rhyme (Seattle Dancer) and La Favorita (Seattle Dancer), from who Australian Group 1 winner Eagle Way (More Than Ready) as well as stakes winners Soaressa (Twining), Impressive Eagle (Rubiton), Impressive Eagle

Nathaniel - Nationalista (4 f ex Rime A Rien by Amadeus Wolf) got off the mark in stakes company when landing the Prix Haras du Lion (Listed, 2000m) at Le Lion d'Angers on Sunday, earning Nathaniel (Galileo) his 23rd individual stakes winner. The Mathieu Brasme-trained four-year-old finished fourth at Listed level last start but improved on that run to defeat Control Tower (Youmzain) by a length, with Tree Valentine (Fastnet Rock) the same distance further behind in third. Out of Rime A Rien (Amadeus Wolf), Nationalista is a half-sister to Group 2 winner Soffia (Kyllachy). Nathaniel, the sire of wondermare Enable, stands at Newsells Park Stud for a fee of £15,000 (approx. AU\$27,451).

Night Of Thunder - Former Darley shuttler Night Of Thunder (Dubawi) sired his 20th individual stakes winner when his daughter Sopran Basilea (3 f ex Kathy Best by King's Best) posted her second win in four starts by taking out the Premio Mario Incisa Della Rochetta (Listed, 2000m) at Milan on Saturday. Zelandia

(Olympic Glory) finished second with La Gualtieria (Arcano) filling third spot.

Pivotal - Earlswood (3 c ex Field Of Miracles by Galileo) took out the Gallinule Stakes (Gr 3, 1m2f) at the Curragh on Sunday to earn Pivotal (Polar Falcon) his 154th individual stakes winner. The Johnny Murtagh-trained colt, who gained a free entry to the Irish Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f) with the win and is also entered in the Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f) on June 5, pulled clear of Arturo Toscanini (Galileo) in the closing stages to score by one and three-quarter lengths. Snapraeterea (Buratino) was another three lengths back in third. Earlswood, who placed at Listed level at Chester on his previous start, is the third winner from as many runners out of Group 2-placed mare Field Of Miracles (Galileo). Pivotal, the sire of 32 individual top-level winners, was retired from stud duties at Cheveley Park Stud earlier this year aged 28.

Proisir - Trying for the sixth time in stakes company, the Lucy Tanner-trained Belle Plaisir (4 m ex Eden by Zeditave) claimed valuable black type as she won Saturday's Rangitikei Gold Cup (Listed, 1600m) on her home track at Awapuni. Sent off a \$23 chance, Belle Plaisir defeated Quiz Kid (Iffraaj) by a length and a quarter, with Hartley (Azamour) two and a

half lengths behind the winner in third. With victory she became the fifth individual stakes winner for fledgling Rich Hill Stud stallion Proisir (Choisir), who earned a fee increase to NZ\$12,500 for his seventh season at stud.

Protectionist - Amazing Grace (3 f ex Amabelle by Danehill Dancer) broke her maiden in style on her fifth start when taking out the Diana Trial (Gr 2, 2000m) at Berlin-Hoppegarten to become the second individual stakes winner for Protectionist (Monsun). The Waldemar Hickst-trained three-year-old was held up by Rene Piechulek and she came wide and picked up well in the straight to run down Noble Heidi (Intello) and win by three-quarters of a length, while Theodora (Ito) was a further length and a half back in third. Amazing Grace was second on debut at Chantilly last July and returned to run second in a Listed race at Cologne in September and third in the Preis der Winterkönigin (Gr 3, 1600m) in October, before running fifth on her seasonal reappearance and only other start earlier this month. She is out of the Listed winner Amabelle (Danehill Dancer) and joins Lambo, who landed the Bavarian Classic (Gr 3, 2000m) on May 1, as the first two stakes winners for Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Protectionist, who stands at Gestut Rottgen for €6,500 (approx. AU\$10,240).

Sea The Stars - It proved to be third time lucky in Group company for Sea Of Sands (3 c ex Salve Haya by Peintre Celebre) when he landed the Derby Trial (Gr 3, 2000m) at Berlin-Hoppegarten on Sunday, having placed at Group 3 level on his previous two starts. The Jean-Pierre Carvalho-trained colt got the better of favourite Lord Charming (Charm Spirit) by a head, with Vallando (Lord Of England) two lengths behind the winner in third. Sea Of Sands is the fourth winner from as many to race out of three-time winner Salve Haya (Peintre Celebre), while her second dam is the German Champion Salve Regina (Monsun). The win provided Sea The Stars (Cape Cross)

Star Witness - Widden Stud's Star Witness (Starcraft) scored his 20th individual stakes winner courtesy of the Chris Munce-trained Rhapsody Rose (2 f ex Ritzy by Medaglia D'Oro), who claimed the Bill Carter Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Doomben on Saturday. A \$120,000 purchase from the Bhima Thoroughbreds draft at the 2020 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Bitcoin Baby held off the Chris Waller-trained pair Hoover Lucy (No Nay Never) and Morioka (Maurice) by a neck and half-length margins respectively. She is the first foal out of the Medaglia D'Oro (El Prado) mare Ritzy, who was a \$500,000 yearling from the Inglis Easter sale. Ritzy, who has a Dundee (High Chaparral) weanling colt, is a half-sister to VRC Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) and BMW Stakes (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Fiveandahalfstar (Hotel Grand). Star Witness enters his 11th season at Widden Stud, where he will stand for a fee of \$16,500.

Twilight Son - Twilight Son (Kyllachy) sired his second individual stakes winner when Twilight Spinner (3 f ex Spinatrix by Diktat) posted a wide-margin success on soft going in the Cecil Frail Stakes (Listed, 6f) at Haydock on Friday. The David O'Meara-trained filly had shown promise when following a debut third at Pontefract with a comfortable win at Ripon two weeks ago. This time, the lightly-weighted Twilight Spinner raced at the tail under Shane Gray before switching out and looming upside the lead with a furlong to race. When asked to quicken, she burst clear for a six-and-a-half-length victory over Ventura Diamond (Dandy Man) with another length back to Mamba Wamba (Mehmas) in third. Twilight Spinner is out of the stakes-placed ten-time winner Spinatrix (Diktat) from the family of the Redcar 2YO Trophy (Listed, 6f) victor Dubai Dynamo (Kyllachy), the winner of 18 races in all, and his Woodcote Stakes (Listed, 6f)-winning full-brother Sadeek. Twilight Spinner is from the first crop of dual Group 1 winner Twilight Son who stands at Cheveley Park Stud for a fee of £5,000 (approx. AUD\$9,150).

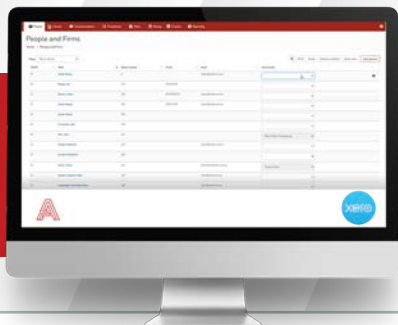

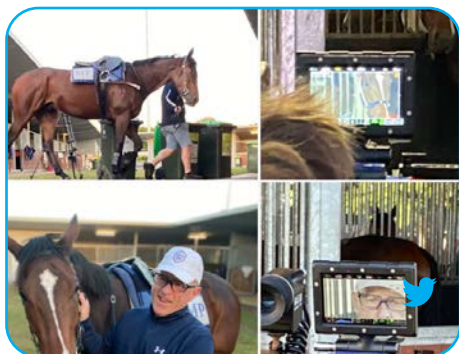
