



Australian Easter Yearling Sale moved online as Covid-19 reality hits nation

Inglis also weighing up options for remainder of its 2020 auctions

nglis yesterday scrambled to resurrect its Australian Easter Yearling Sale in a solely digital format after the government ordered the closure of all auction houses on Tuesday night in its latest response to the Covid-19 pandemic causing death and destruction across the world.

The company will use its successful online technology to host the April 5 and 6 sale,

arguably the pinnacle of the Australasian sales series, as a result of the national cabinet tightening restrictions on people movement and businesses Australia wide.

Early yesterday, Inglis confirmed it would not conduct a live Easter sale as initially planned at its Riverside Stables complex in Sydney, but instead horses catalogued would remain on farms for presale inspections and be sold on the Inglis Digital platform.

Racing on hold in four states due to coronavirus scare

Australian racing is in limbo pending the results of Covid-19 tests on a licensed participant, believed to be a jockey.

Until yesterday, racing had been the last major sport still standing with meetings conducted under strict biosecurity protocols and without spectators.

That changed with Sandown called off after two races when Racing Victoria became aware that health authorities had alerted the licensed person they had travelled on a commercial flight on March 12 on which a passenger subsequently tested positive for coronavirus.

RV immediately cancelled the rest of the Sandown meeting as well as two meetings scheduled for today. *Industry News page 9* >>

<< Continued from page 1 The sale dates will remain as the first Sunday and Monday of April after Inglis brought the sale forward by two days in a decision that was announced on Tuesday.

Vendors, particularly those interstate, have been asked to relocate their horses to NSW stud farms to make it easier for prospective buyers to inspect the horses prior to bidding getting under way.

In correspondence to Easter sale vendors last night, Inglis general manager of bloodstock sales and marketing Sebastian Hutch sympathised with breeders and owners about the protocols and economic environment that the auction

would take place in.

"It is understood that this is a difficult situation and that not all vendors will be comfortable with the scheduled arrangements," Hutch wrote.

"We understand that the circumstances are such that it would not be possible to please everybody, but decisions have been made in consideration of the circumstances as they prevail currently and how we are advised that they are likely to develop.

"The market will undoubtedly be very difficult. However, this situation represents an important opportunity for breeders and owners to trade stock.

"We will be working hard to generate further buyer interest and participation in the sale and we encourage all vendors to consider doing the same."

Inglis management also considered a range of options for all of its remaining sales this year, including The Chairman's Sale for bluechip breeding stock and next month's Melbourne Gold Yearling Sale, but they did not reveal any changes to the structure or dates of those last night

The finer details of how the online sale will work - when bidding will start and over what time-frame - is likely to be made known by Inglis today.

"In light of prime minister Scott Morrison's most recent announcements and further restrictions made last night regarding the Covid-19 situation, Inglis is currently re-evaluating the timing and format of its sales schedule for the remainder of 2020," Inglis said in a statement released earlier yesterday.


"The Easter Yearling Sale will not proceed as a live auction but will instead proceed in an online format."

Magic Millions considering options for National sale

Meanwhile, the unfolding coronavirus crisis, with new infections being confirmed daily across metropolitan and regional Australia, has also placed the Magic Millions Gold Coast National Sale in doubt.

The Queensland government closing its state borders to interstate travellers also complicates the issue for the sales company ahead of its National sale, which was scheduled for May 21 to June 5.

Managing director Barry Bowditch yesterday said that Magic Millions would endeavour to hold a live auction if it all possible, which could see the three-week weanling, broodmare and yearling sales being pushed back if government-imposed restrictions appeared likely to be lifted.

"We are in the process of formulating a plan which is obviously a moving target and the best we can say is that we will be looking to host the National sale at some point, but in which way or form it is hard to say," Bowditch told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"We are mindful of the fact that we need to respect the restrictions for the health of the nation at this time. When things come to light, we will be ready and willing to run a horse sale for our vendors."

July, as Inglis has done, shapes as a likely starting point for the National Sale, and Magic Millions also sold broodmares at the Patinack Dispersal Sale in late September 2014.

If public gatherings remain off limits and state borders closed,

Bowditch did not rule out selling stock online, a marketplace the company has so far avoided.

"Online is, of course, an option to hold these sales and it is a way forward in these times but I think if there is a way to do it safely and properly and effectively I would say holding a public auction to the best of our ability is the best outcome for everyone involved," he said.

The competition between Australia's thoroughbred auction houses is well-known but Bowditch said the Easter sale played a vital role in the breeding industry economy and hoped that it was successful.

He said: "Whatever sale that gets held in this country, and Easter is a huge example of that, has an affect on our clients (Inglis and Magic Millions) as a whole. So, to be able to run a sale of any kind in these times, is important (for all stakeholders involved)."

Hallowed Crown joins Twin Hills' roster



Hallowed Crown

Dual Group 1 winner and second season sire Hallowed Crown (Street Sense) will join Twin Hills Stud for the 2020 season, relocating from Darley's Kelvinside base. "Hallowed Crown was an outstanding racehorse for whom big things are in store," Twin Hills owner Olly Tait said. "His first runners are only three-year-olds and there are a number of his progeny who are showing terrific potential. This quality is backed up by his winners to runners ratio, which is outstanding. We are delighted to have the opportunity to stand another stallion of this quality on behalf of Mr Eduardo Cojuangco Jr, who owns Smart Missile. Smart Missile has had a huge influence on the development of Twin Hills and we hope that Hallowed Crown can have a similar impact." Tait also acquired Denman (Lonhro) from Darley and he stood his first season at Twin Hills last year. Hallowed Crown's fee for 2020 has been set at \$11,000 (inc GST).

Vinery a tough ask for Shout The Bar

Three-year-old filly Shout The Bar (Not A Single Doubt) will face the toughest test of her short

career when she strives to give the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott stable its third Group 1 win in as many weeks in the Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Rosehill on Saturday. "What she did over the short distances was just on class alone which was validated with her run in the Kembla Grange Classic when I thought she was very brave," Bott said. "She's come through it nicely and stepping up to the 2000 metres we always thought would be to her benefit but she's taking on some more seasoned opposition, particularly Funstar and Probabeel. They are two class fillies that have been proven at that level."

ATC Derby still possible for Eric The Eel

Caloundra trainer Stuart Kendrick hasn't given up on Eric The Eel (Olympic Glory) making it to the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) after being forced to cancel a tilt at the Tulloch Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) at Rosehill on Saturday because of difficulties getting him to Sydney. There were no restrictions on the horse travelling but anyone going with him would face a 14 days self-isolation when returning to Queensland. Eric The Eel will instead run over 2200 metres at Doomben on Saturday. "If he races well on Saturday we will look at other options. One is to transfer him to a Sydney trainer but that is debatable. So we haven't given up hope completely but it is a long shot he will get there," Kendrick said.

Schweppervescence for Not An Option

New Zealand trainer Tony Pike's stakes-winning two-year-old Not An Option (Not A Single Doubt) is set for Saturday's Schweppervescence (Gr 3, 1400m) at Rosehill after joining a local stable to continue his autumn campaign. "Not An Option has gone to Richard Freedman," Pike said. "He was in the barn beside us at Rosehill, so he has taken him over just for the next four days until he runs on Saturday."

Gold Fields chasing Bendigo Gold

After missing a spot in the All-Star Mile (1600m), Logan McGill opted to run his stable star Gold Fields (Churchill Downs) in the Anniversary Vase (Listed, 1600m) on the same racecard ahead of the Golden Mile (Listed, 1600m) at Bendigo on Saturday. "We gave him a fortnight off after the Lord Stakes and the plan was to build him up to hopefully get a run in the All-Star Mile, but that didn't eventuate," McGill said. "While he was pretty wound up for the Anniversary Vase, I definitely think he's taken another step forward in his fitness leading into Bendigo which will lead into the VOBIS Gold Mile at Caulfield."

Kindergarten possible for Damaged

An impressive win at Warwick Farm yesterday has Damaged (Exceed And Excel) potentially on course for a tilt at the Kindergarten Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) during The Championships. Damaged, the half-brother to Group 3 winner Shards (Medaglia d'Oro), stopped the clock in 1:03.62. Leading form analyst Dominic Beirne noted on Twitter that only 15 times in the last 32 years had the two-year-olds broken 1:04 over the 1100m at Warwick Farm, with those to do it including Redzel (Snitzel), Winx (Street Cry), Foxwedge (Fastnet Rock) and Bint Marscay (Marscay). "He's pretty push button, which makes life really easy," said jockey Tom Marquand, who rode a double at the shortened meeting. "He showed the promise that he half teased he had. It's always an honour to ride a winner for Godolphin."

Forbidden Love causes upset

There may not have been much support for Forbidden Love (All Too Hard), but the newcomer showed she had plenty of promise with a win at Warwick Farm yesterday. The Richard and Michael Freedman-trained filly settled handy and produced a tough effort on straightening to hold off Godolphin debutant Raison d'Etre (Exceed And Excel) by a length. As with Damaged, Forbidden Love broke the 1:04 threshold for two-year-olds over 1100m, putting her amongst an elite group of juveniles.

New riders for Freedman's strong Championships team

Due to Victorian jockeys being restricted from further participating in the Sydney autumn carnival, Anthony Freedman has secured the services of several different riders to partner his Group 1 contenders. Tommy Berry has picked up the coveted ride on Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Warning (Declaration Of War) in the Australian Derby, while English jockey Tom Marquand was announced as the rider on Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Super Seth (Dundeel) in the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m), although a suspension yesterday now leaves the ride open. With Mark Zahra also out of action, Tim Clark now pilots Santa Ana Lane (Lope De Vega) in the TJ Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on day one of The Championships.

Luvaluva retired

Group 1 placegetter Luvaluva (Mastercraftsman) has run her last race after a tendon injury brought about a premature end to her racetrack career. The John Sargent-trained mare won six of her 30 starts including the 2017 Wakeful Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m). In April 2019 she went to New Zealand where she ran third in the Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m). "It is with great regret to announce the retirement of Luvaluva, having strained a tendon on Saturday at Rosehill. She is a very valuable broodmare and also a half-sister to the stable star Brandenburg. She has been a stable favourite and will be greatly missed," Sargent said on Twitter. Luvaluva is by Mastercraftsman (Danehill Dancer) out of Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare Wansesingyee, while three-year-old colt Brandenburg is by Burgundy (Redoute's Choice). The winner of last month's Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m), Brandenburg is the third-favourite for Saturday week's Doncaster Mile.

Trope makes \$245,000

Group 2 runner-up Trope (More Than Ready) topped the Inglis March (Late) Online Sale, when selling for \$245,000 to Paul Lofitis of The Lofty Thoroughbred Group. The multiple Stakes-performed four-year-old, by More Than Ready (Southern Halo) out of stakes-winning mare Personify (Galileo), has been closely followed by Lofitis throughout his racing career, making it an easy decision for him to pursue the purchase. "We'd like to race him on but the main reason we bought him is for breeding purposes as we have a few nice fillies that will suit his bloodlines," Lofitis said. Trope, who finished second in the Theo Marks Stakes (Gr 2, 1300m) at Rosehill in September was offered by owner Alan Bell who was pleased with the figure realised. "I thought it was great and he reached what I thought was a very fair price for him," Bell said.



Marquand suspended

Tom Marquand will miss the ride on Super Seth in the Doncaster Mile after picking up a careless riding suspension at Warwick Farm yesterday. Marquand was handed a fourmeeting ban for his winning ride on Twice As Special (Testa Rossa) after the stewards found he permitted his mount to shift in when insufficiently clear of the third-placed Flinders (Adelaide), contributing to that runner having to be checked approaching the winning post. Marquand will begin his suspension on April 3 and can resume riding on April 11.

Racing can continue, says Heathcote

Leading Brisbane trainer Robert Heathcote believes racing is in a unique position to carry on through the coronavirus crisis. "Racing held the country together during the depression and even world wars," Heathcote said. "We are in an unusual position because, let's face it, we are an insular lot." Heathcote said racing's long hours meant trainers, jockeys and stable staff did not mix often among the general public. "Even on current race days, without owners and punters, we are not mixing with anyone," he said. "We are not high-risk from the virus if we keep a proper eye on each other. Racing can still produce revenue and keep people's spirits up."

Mildura transferred to Swan Hill

Racing Victoria yesterday announced that the meeting scheduled to take place at Mildura on Monday will now be staged at Swan Hill in order to limit the travel for participants. "The transfer has been made to reduce the travel required to be undertaken by a majority of participants and officials in light of the protocols in place for the safe continuation of Victorian racing during the Covid-19 coronavirus pandemic," a statement from RV read.

Penrith harness employee tests positive

Harness Racing NSW yesterday revealed that an employee of the Penrith Harness Racing Club who was in attendance at the club's meeting on March 19 has tested positive for Covid-19. HRNSW added that the individual had not come into contact with any trainers, drivers or stablehands at the meeting. Further updates will be issued once the outcome of additional tests are known.

NEW ZEALAND

Trainers allowed to work horses

Training stables and stud farms where horses are in containment were among the list issued by the New Zealand government yesterday that may register as essential business services after measures to contain Covid-19 were stepped up. Businesses with more than five people (including the owner) working at each business site, or who cannot achieve social distancing between staff, are required to register. The criteria and registration form can be **found here** . The New Zealand Trainers' Association and the NZ Thoroughbred Breeders' Association plan to provide a template to assist with completing the paperwork which features 11 questions to

provide assurance essential businesses have a plan and process to manage infection risks.

ASIA

Almond Eye potentially stuck in Dubai

Japanese trainer Sakae Kunieda hopes his star mare Almond Eye (Lord Kanaloa) will be able to fly home from Dubai tomorrow, but he admits that there is a possibility that she will not be able to leave the UAE for some time. Almond Eye had arrived late last week to defend her Dubai Turf (Gr 1, 1800m) title, one of 20 Japanese horses to make the trip to Meydan, but the Dubai World Cup meeting was cancelled on Sunday. "I have heard that we might be able to leave on Saturday, but it is still not confirmed. Her departure date is not yet fixed," Kunieda said. "If she is able to return this weekend, we will aim her at the Yasuda Kinen."

INTERNATIONAL

Irish racing shuts down

Ireland is the latest racing nation to fall foul of the coronavirus pandemic after the Taoiseach Leo Varadkar announced that all sporting events were to be cancelled as of midnight on Tuesday, including those behind closed doors, until April 19 at the earliest. The development came just a day after the turf flat season got underway at Naas and means the remainder of the campaign is now in uncertain territory. Irish racing fixtures had been held behind closed doors since March 13 with strict protocols in place, but now racing must stop, with Tuesday's seven-race card at Clonmel the last meeting to take place for the foreseeable future. The enforced shutdown in Ireland means at least 23 fixtures could potentially be lost to the coronavirus, most notably the Irish Grand National meeting at Fairyhouse over Easter, should they not be rescheduled.

South Africa to lockdown for three weeks

There will be no racing in South Africa from tomorrow for three weeks after the country was put into complete lockdown to fight the coronavirus pandemic. Yesterday's meeting at Fairview and today's card at Vaal will be the last fixtures to go ahead before the lockdown is imposed, with no racing permitted before April 17 at the earliest. Racing at the country's eight courses had gone behind closed doors last week with off-course betting shops remaining open at that time. All meetings have been closed to the public since and only essential participants had been allowed access to racecourses on racedays.

Racing NSW followed suit with the Warwick Farm meeting abandoned after five races and Hawkesbury today called off, while Queensland's Eagle Farm meeting was completed in full but today's Toowoomba meeting has been called off.

Yesterday's meetings at Ascot in Perth and Launceston were also abandoned.

The unnamed participant attended Saturday's Golden Slipper meeting at Rosehill and travelled to Sydney by charter flight to adhere to RV's travel protocols.

They are not showing any symptoms and if the results come back negative today, authorities hope to get racing up and running again tomorrow.

"As the interstate participant travelled in a private charter flight with two other NSW

participants and to minimise the risk of participants at today's Warwick Farm meeting being exposed to Covid-19, the remainder of the Warwick Farm meeting has been cancelled," Racing NSW said.

"In the event the interstate participant tests negative, Racing NSW will immediately resume racing subject to any government restriction."

RV chief executive, Giles Thompson, said the licensed person did the right thing by contacting them as soon as they were told of their situation.

"We spent a lot of time putting protocols in place and educating the participants," Thompson told broadcaster Racing.com. "The participant has done exactly the right thing and we've been notified and everything we put in place has swung into action.

"The whole point of these protocols is to keep racing going and prevent potential exposures. But when you do have a potential exposure (it is important) to contact and trace as quickly as possible and identify whether there are others that have been exposed and deal with that us well.

"Unfortunately this exposure came before those protocols were put in place, 13 days ago."

The Sydney autumn carnival is scheduled to continue at Rosehill on Saturday with the meeting to feature two Group 1 races, the Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and the Tancred Stakes (Gr 1, 2400m).

The Australian Turf Club was planning even stricter protocols than were in practice at the Slipper meeting.

Racing in New Zealand has been put on hold for a month, while most European racing is also suspended.

In Asia, racing continues in Hong Kong, Japan and Singapore but not South Korea.

Your guide to all things financial as coronavirus continues to affect economy

ssistance to our economy has been flowing thick and fast in the past week. These are the latest initiatives from the government and banking sector. These are very detailed as we really wanted you to have as much information as possible during this complex period.

The federal government and the Australian Banking Association (ABA) have announced stimulus measures to help people impacted by the coronavirus outbreak. They are pretty generous – but necessary.

We have summarised all of the measures below, especially as to how they can be helpful to the breeding and racing industries.



ONE

BANK CONCESSIONS

The banks have been given extra support by the government and the Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) to work with and provide extra help to business owners at this time.

I would encourage businesses to contact their bank to ask how they can support you at this time.

The type of assistance that will be offered by banks will depend on individual circumstances, but can include:

- A deferral of scheduled loan repayments (principal and interest)
- Waiving fees and charges
- Interest-free periods or no interest rate increases
- · Debt consolidation to help make repayments more manageable

Six month deferral on total business loan repayments

The ABA announced on Friday it has put in measures that will support banks in providing business customers with the ability to delay all business loan repayments (principal and interest) for a period of six months.

This provision is available as of last Monday, March 23.

If businesses would like to receive this benefit, they should contact their bank and apply for this relief.

Six month deferral on total home loan repayments – property owners note

Many of you have borrowed to acquire breeding, agistment and stud farms and there is relief in relation to your loan repayments.

The big four banks announced that in addition to the business loan deferrals, they would allow businesses with home loans to also defer the repayments (principal and interest) of their home loans for a period of six months.

If businesses would like to receive this benefit, they should contact their bank.

Update for other mortgage holders

For those without a business who have mortgage repayments, from announcements made yesterday, three of the big four banks are offering relief/moratoriums on repayments. That means they may be able to support you by putting your home loan repayments on hold for six months, with interest capitalised.

Interest rate reduction

The Reserve Bank lowered their interest rates from 0.5 per cent to 0.25 per cent last Thursday.

We encourage you to make sure your bank has passed this rate reduction on to you.





TWO

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT PACKAGE NO 2

a) Income support for racing and breeding businesses

PAYGW refunds to 100 per cent - increased from 50 per cent

These concessions apply to all racing and breeding businesses as their turnovers will generally be under \$50 million; for example, breeders, stud farms, agistment and/or training operations.

Small and medium sized business entities and not-for-profits (NFPs) with aggregated annual turnover under \$50 million and that employ workers will now be eligible for refunds of up to 100 per cent of PAYGW paid (up from the 50 per cent only announced recently).

Eligibility will generally be based on prior year turnover being under \$50 million.

These initiatives are:

- The payment will be delivered by the ATO as an automatic credit in the activity statement system from April 28 upon employers lodging eligible upcoming activity statements.
- Eligible employers that withhold tax to the ATO on their employees' salary and wages will receive a payment equal to 100 per cent of the amount withheld, up to a maximum payment of \$50,000 (originally \$25,000).
- Eligible employers that pay salary and wages will receive a minimum payment of \$10,000 (was \$2,000), even if they are not required to withhold tax.
- The payments will only be available to active eligible employers established prior to March 12.

b) An additional payment is also being introduced in the July – October 2020 period – with a maximum of \$100,000 of total PAYGW relief available

The zone for PAYGW relief is now extending into the 2021 tax year, i.e. the September, 2020 quarter.

Eligible entities will receive an additional payment equal to all of the employers PAYGW payments they paid up to June, 2020.

This means that over the whole period of PAYGW relief (January 1, 2020 to September 30, 2020) eligible entities will receive at least \$20,000 (those that don't pay PAYGW tax) and up to a maximum total of \$100,000 (those that do employ and pay PAYGW tax) under both payments.

To qualify for the additional payment, the entity must continue to be active as an employer after June 30, 2020.

This is how the additional payment works:

For monthly activity statement lodgers, the additional payments will be delivered as an automatic credit in the activity statement system. Each additional payment will be equal to a quarter of their total initial boosting cash flow (i.e. the total PAYGW credit paid to June, 2020) for employers in their June, 2020, July, 2020, August, 2020 and September, 2020 activity statements (up to a maximum total of \$50,000).

Example

If the PAYGW tax credit received in the March, 2020 BAS was \$45,024, and then in the



April BAS the credit received was \$4,976 - up to the maximum of \$50,000, for the next four monthly BAS's, the following PAYGW credits would be received: June 2020 (\$12,500), July 2020 (\$12,500), August 2020 (\$12,500) and September 2020 (\$12,500) with a total additional payment being made of \$50,000.

For quarterly activity statement lodgers, the additional payments will also be delivered as an automatic credit in the activity statement system. Each additional payment will be equal to half of their total initial boosting cash flow (i.e. the total PAYGW credit paid to June, 2020) for employers following the lodgement of their June, 2020 and September, 2020 activity statements (up to a total of \$50,000).

The cash flow boost provides a tax-free payment to employers and is automatically calculated by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). There are no new forms required.

c) Cash-flow relief for financially distressed businesses

Tax payments and tax compliance - assistance

The government is offering administrative relief for certain tax obligations, including deferring tax payments for up to four months. This is similar to the relief provided following the bushfires for taxpayers affected by the coronavirus, on a case-by-case basis.

Creditors and directors

If you are owed money or facing pressing debts to repay yourself, this change is quite significant.

The government is temporarily increasing the threshold at which creditors can issue a statutory demand on a company and the time companies have to respond to statutory demands they receive (i.e. from \$2,000 to \$20,000). The package also includes temporary relief for directors from any personal liability for trading while insolvent, and providing temporary flexibility in the Corporations Act 2001 to provide temporary and targeted relief from provisions of the act to deal with unforeseen events that arise as a result of the coronavirus health crisis.

Coronavirus SME guarantee scheme – new business loans

Obviously there are many yearling vendors who could wait a while for yearling sale proceeds or trainers needing cash-flow to get through a period where clients face sudden cash-flow difficulties. For those in this type of category, there is help at hand with acquiring unsecured loans for cash-flow purposes.

Under a scheme titled "The Coronavirus SME (Small and Medium sized businesses) Guarantee Scheme" the government will provide a guarantee of 50 per cent to SME lenders for new unsecured loans to be used for working capital.

This will enhance these lenders' willingness and ability to provide credit, which will result in SMEs being able to access additional funding to help support businesses through the upcoming months.

SMEs with a turnover of up to \$50 million will be eligible to receive these loans.

The government will provide eligible lenders with a guarantee for loans with the following terms:

- Maximum total size of loans of \$250,000 per borrower.
- The loans will be up to three years, with an initial six-month repayment holiday.
- The loans will be in the form of unsecured finance, meaning that borrowers will not have to provide an asset as security for the loan.

Loans will be subject to lenders' credit assessment processes with the expectation that lenders will look through the cycle to sensibly take into account the uncertainty of the current economic conditions.

As part of the loan products available, the government will encourage lenders to provide facilities to SMEs that only have to be drawn if needed by the SME.

This will mean that the SME will only incur interest on the amount they draw down. If they do not draw down any funds from the facility, no interest will be charged, but they will retain the flexibility to draw down in the future should they need.

The scheme will commence by early April, 2020 and be available for




new loans made by participating lenders until September 30, 2020.

Quick and efficient access to credit for small businesses

Similar to the unsecured loans concession outlined above, the government is trying to make it easier for cashstrapped businesses to acquire assistance via less lender obligations lenders will need to meet in the coming six months.

The government is providing an exemption from responsible lending obligations for lenders providing credit to existing small business customers.

This exemption is for six months, and applies to any credit for business purposes, including new credit, credit



limit increases and credit variations and restructures.

Responsible lending obligations do not currently apply to lending which is predominantly for a business purpose, but it can take time and effort for lenders to be satisfied that the money borrowed meets this test. By providing a temporary exemption from responsible lending obligations, this reform will help small businesses get access to credit quickly and efficiently.

d) Income support for individuals

Jockeys, strappers and farm hands, as well as administration, racing club and veterinary employees - these are amongst the category of industry workers who could lose their livelihoods in the coming months.

Over the next six months, the government is temporarily expanding eligibility to income support payments.

A new, time-limited coronavirus supplement will also be paid at a rate of \$550 per fortnight. This will be paid to both existing and new recipients of the JobSeeker Payment, Youth Allowance Jobseeker, Parenting Payment, Farm Household Allowance and Special Benefit recipients.

Jobseeker Payment and Youth Allowance Jobseeker criteria will provide payment access for permanent employees who are stood down or lose their employment; sole traders; the self-employed; casual workers; and contract workers who meet the income tests as a result of the economic downturn due to the coronavirus. This could also include a person required to care for someone who is affected by the coronavirus.

Asset testing for the JobSeeker Payment, Youth Allowance Jobseeker and Parenting Payment will be waived for the period the coronavirus supplement is being provided. Income testing will still apply to the person's other payments, as per the current arrangements.

$e) \, Temporary \, early \, release \, of \, superannuation$

The government is allowing individuals affected by the coronavirus to access up to \$10,000 of their superannuation in 2019-20 and a further \$10,000 in 2020-21.

These super payments are tax-free and the money they withdraw will not affect Centrelink or Veterans' Affairs payments.

To apply for this early release of super, you must satisfy any one or more of the following requirements:

- · you are unemployed; or
- you are eligible to receive a job seeker payment, youth allowance for jobseekers, parenting payment (which includes the single and partnered payments), special benefit or farm household allowance; or
- on or after 1 January 2020: you were made redundant; or
- your working hours were reduced by 20 per cent or more; or
- if you are a sole trader your business was suspended or there was a reduction in your turnover of 20 per cent or more.

If you are eligible for this new grounds for the early release of super, you can apply directly to the ATO through the mygov website: www. my.gov.au. You will need to certify that you meet the above eligibility criteria.

To ensure you receive your payment as soon as possible, you should contact your fund to check that they have your correct details, including your current bank account details and proof of identity documents.

f) Temporarily reducing superannuation minimum drawdown rates – for accounts in pension phase

The government is temporarily reducing superannuation minimum drawdown requirements for account-based pensions and similar products by 50 per cent for the 2019-20 and 2020-21 income years.




The government is also reducing both the upper and lower social security deeming rates by a further 0.25 percentage points in addition to the 0.5 percentage point reduction to both rates announced on March 12.

This measure will benefit retirees holding these products by reducing the need to sell investment assets to fund minimum drawdown requirements.
