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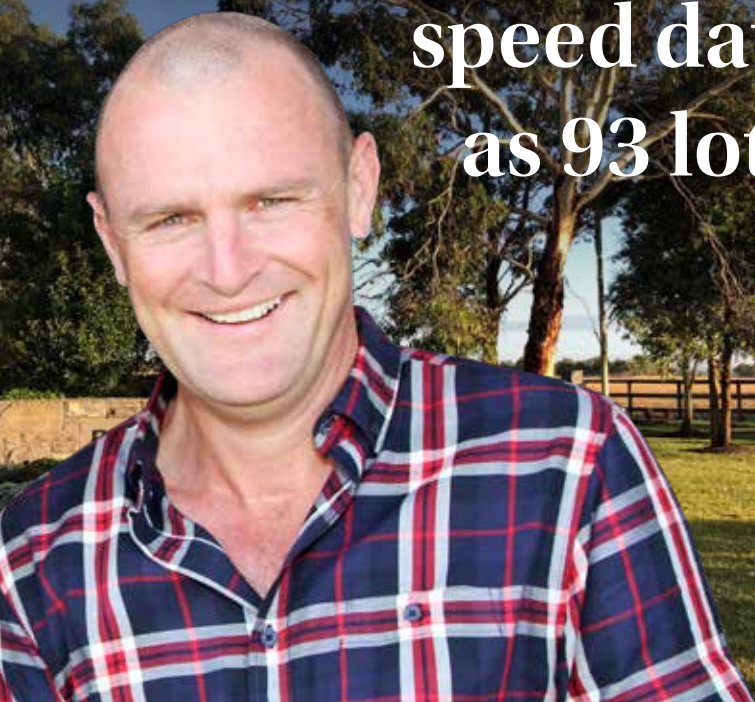

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## Mithen: Digital sale 'like speed dating' as 93 lots sold

ROSEMONT STUD

*Success of Magic Millions Online portal provides comfort to Osarus managing director as France prepares for first internet sale of two-year-olds*

Rosemont Stud's unreserved online sale, which provided the second big test of the new Magic Millions Online system after the Cornerstone reduction earlier this month, closed yesterday with vendor and operator both excited by the results.

The Rosemont Exclusive Online Sale rounded out with a gross of over \$2.5 million for the 93 lots, with an average price of \$30,945.

The sale received attention not just in

Australia but abroad, too, with the Osarus team in France taking heart from the results as they prepare tonight (Australian time) to hold Europe's first digital sale since the coronavirus pandemic was declared.

The Osarus Breeze Up Sale is being conducted entirely over the internet instead of at its original intended location, La Teste de Buch. As a sale of ready-to-run two-year-olds, which featured breeze-ups at a number of regional racecourses and bidding solely online, Osarus is touting the sale as a world first.

#### Victorian industry debates Caulfield Cup move

Racing Victoria's executive general manager of racing Greg Carpenter said yesterday that there would likely be a host of changes to the Melbourne Spring Racing Carnival, should the Melbourne Racing Club proposal to move the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) to the last two Saturdays in November be adopted.

Carpenter confirmed to Racing.com that there was a detailed proposal that had been put before RV and the race clubs but that a decision was still likely to be weeks away.

The proposal, which was first reported by the Herald Sun on Monday night but followed months of speculation amidst the Covid-19 pandemic, involves moving the Caulfield Guineas to November 21 and the Caulfield Cup to November 28. *Industry News page 14 >>*

"We are talking about certainly a European and probably a world first because the Australians have already staged online sales for breeding stock and for yearlings but this will be a real departure with two-year-olds," Osarus managing director Emmanuel Viaud told ANZ Bloodstock News and Racing Post yesterday. "It is exciting and at the same time, we know there will be a lot of people watching how it goes so we know there is no margin for error."

"When I've been there before, I've always found that the auctioneers in the US and Australia conduct business at greater speed than here in France and that is partly to do with their system of reserve prices. We take longer normally but because we are using reserve prices with this online sale that means we will be able to keep the pace up."

"The other difference here is that the hammer is dropped by the evaluator next to me, not the auctioneer themselves. I will be relying on him a lot tomorrow."

"I have watched the online sales from Australia and how they operate. Our sale is more like the Inglis Easter sale. I watched that and, rather than the technicalities of the bidding online, it was to study the pace of the auctioneer and their way of presenting the stock. They used a presenter who would intervene from time to time but it mostly falls to the auctioneer to talk, whereas we will be playing a bit of verbal ping pong."

"We are very satisfied that by Monday evening we had 70 registered

bidders - owners, trainers and agents from France, Britain and Ireland as well as Spain, Belgium and the Czech Republic. There is a wide buying bench, just as you would want and I think that gives us a chance of achieving the best possible results for the vendors."

While online sales are a novelty and still facing a struggle for market acceptance in Europe, they are now a crucial part of the trading framework in Australia. Inglis and Magic Millions both have digital platforms, as does New Zealand Bloodstock through

Gavelhouse, while bloodstockauction.com is another popular platform.

And, as the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale and the Inglis Chairman's Sale demonstrated, there is an ability not just for online sales but also virtual sales as well, like that which will be offered by Osarus tonight.

Rosemont Stud principal Anthony Mithen is an advocate for online sales after a strong set of results yesterday. *Continued on page 4>>*

"It was a day like no other," Mithen said. "I've never put 93 horses through a sale ring through the course of a full day let alone a few hours. It was like speed dating on steroids."

"What an effort for the team at Rosemont. A real pat on the back to everyone here who put in a remarkable effort to make this sale happen and the support of Magic Millions, which has been incredible. To get a catalogue out and marketed in a way that inspired as much interest and inspections as it did is testament to all concerned."

"We are glad to have partnered with Magic Millions to provide the market with a strong catalogue with nice stock and contribute to the trade market."

"From the truck driver at Rosemont right up to the managing director at Magic Millions we've been one in, all in and in the end I've been proud of the efforts."

"It was pleasing to see horses sold right around the country and indeed a number to international clients," Magic Millions managing director Barry Bowditch said.

"The team from Rosemont Stud showcased their draft incredibly well and we received so much positive feedback from winning bidders and prospective buyers alike."

"The new Magic Millions Online platform worked well again for our second auction and we look forward to our next internet based sale from June 2 to 4."

The top lot was Group-winning juvenile Gold Rush (So You Think), the half-sister to last week's ANZ Bloodstock News Maiden of the Week Tommy Gold (Sacred Falls).

The Matamata Breeders' Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner was purchased for \$295,000 by New Zealand-based bloodstock agent Paul Willetts, in foal to star sire Savabeel (Zabeel).

"Her mother is virtually a blue hen," Willetts said. "Everything she produces seems to run. The Sacred Falls out of Gold Rocks won impressively in Sydney last week as well."

"Gold Rush herself is a good two-year-old winning So You Think mare and she's in foal to the best sire in New Zealand. She ticks a lot of boxes."

The second highest-priced lot was Dequetteville Stakes (Listed, 1050m) winner Split Lip (Your Song), who was sold for \$245,000 to Grand Parkview Stud.

She is due to produce her first foal this spring by Widden Stud's Zoustar (Northern Meteor).

Zoustar was responsible for the top-priced weanling, a chestnut colt out of Nobody Gets (Forestry) from the family of Group 3 winners Musidora (Rock Of Gibraltar), Tulip (Pierro) and Sacred Eye (High Chaparral). He was purchased by FT Racing for \$125,000.

Yarramalong Park went to \$95,000 to secure the well-related filly Goldie River (I Am Invincible) in foal to Russian Revolution (Snitzel).

A colt by Dundee (High Chaparral) out of Redoute's Choice (Danehill) mare Redoute's Fever has topped the Online Arrowfield Weanling Sale on bloodstockauction.com. ### Yarradale announces 2020 fees



Gingerbread Man

YARRADALE STUD

Former Singapore champion Gingerbread Man (Shamardal) has joined the small group of stallions to have their fees raised in 2020, with Western Australian operation Yarradale Stud announcing yesterday that he would stand at his original fee of \$5,500 (inc GST) for the first time since 2016. Gingerbread Man has sired three stakes winners this season; Ima Single Man who won the Karrakatta Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) as well as Neurological and Red Can Man who have taken out Listed races. The Gidgegannup farm also announced that War Chant (Danzig)

would stand again at \$11,000 (inc GST), while Bradbury's Luck (Redoute's Choice) had his fee reduced to \$3,300 (inc GST).

### Queensland expands winter feature race calendar

Racing Queensland has announced ten additional feature races from late June into July at reduced prize-money levels. The Queensland Sapphire Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) will be run at Doomben on June 27 with the Bright Shadow Handicap (Listed, 1200m) at Eagle Farm on July 4. The following week the Sunshine Coast Turf Club will run the Winx Guineas (Gr 3, 1600m) for the first time under its new name, as well as the Glasshouse Handicap (Listed, 1300m). Feature racing will return to Ipswich with the Gai Waterhouse Classic (Listed, 1350m) and Eye Liner Handicap (Listed, 1350m) on July 18. "With the Magic Millions National Sale on the horizon, we wanted to provide some further feature racing, in particular for our fillies and mares," RQ's chief operations officer Adam Wallish said. "The limited program ensures we are able to host feature racing at Ipswich for the first time this year."

### Peltzer spelled ahead of spring campaign

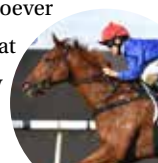
Gerald Ryan yesterday confirmed that unbeaten colt Peltzer (So You Think) will miss next week's J J Atkins Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and be kept for the spring. "He is already in the spelling paddock," Ryan said. "There are plenty of races in the spring - I think anything up to 1600 metres with races like the Golden Rose and the Caulfield Guineas." Unbeaten in three starts, Peltzer won with ease in the Darley 2YO Handicap (1300m) at Randwick last Saturday.

### Rodd on the board after Victorian return

Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m)-winning jockey Michael Rodd registered his first winner since returning to Victorian racing yesterday, guiding the Lindsey Smith-trained Capital Zous (Zoustar) to victory at Hamilton. Rodd had been based in Singapore since 2015 but, with racing shut down in the Lion City because of the coronavirus pandemic, he is one of three jockeys who returned to Victoria to continue riding. He made the trip to Hamilton in country Victoria for one ride and steered the three-year-old gelding, the \$1.85 favourite, to a one and a quarter length win on debut in a 1200-metre maiden.

### Fituese on target for next Rosehill test

Spring plans for stakes winner Fituese (Deep Field) will become clearer once the filly faces what is expected to be her final test this season at Rosehill. A winner of the Denise's Joy Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Rosehill on her latest start, Fituese will be tried over 1200 metres for the second time on Saturday in a benchmark 88 handicap. Although the filly was beaten in her only previous attempt at 1200 metres in the Gosford Guineas (Listed), John Thompson is convinced the distance isn't an issue. "We were thinking of taking her to Brisbane but just with the scenario at the moment we thought we'd just give her one more run here in Sydney, tick the 1200-metre box on Saturday and then give her a freshen up for the spring," Thompson said. "I've got no doubt whatsoever she will run the 1200 but that was just one run too many for that prep in the Gosford Guineas."





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## McEvoy colt to debut at Caulfield

Two-year-old Kahaylaan (Pride Of Dubai) has shown co-trainer Calvin McEvoy enough to take him to town for his debut. Kahaylaan is one of 36 nominations for Saturday's 1100-metre handicap for juveniles at Caulfield where there will be a field limit of 14 plus emergencies - acceptances are due this morning. Kahaylaan has had two jump-outs at Flemington, settling back and finishing out of the placings in his first before sitting on the pace and winning his most recent last Friday. "He's a really nice horse by Pride Of Dubai," McEvoy, who trains in partnership with his father Tony, said. "He has trialled up really well with two solid trials. He's ready to go to the races now. We're going to be throwing him into the deep end a little bit in an open two-year-old handicap but we've got a lot of time for him and I think he can measure up there."

## Stackhouse in contention for Victorian premiership

After surpassing his goal of riding 100 winners in a season, Daniel Stackhouse is now hoping to challenge for the Victorian jockeys' premiership. A city double at Sandown on Sunday and a winner at Echuca on Monday has increased the jockey's tally to 109, just three behind Jye McNeil who has ridden the most winners in the state during the 2019/20 season. "It felt like a great achievement that I was able to do that with still two-and-a-half months of the season to go," Stackhouse said. "My manager and I had targeted at the start of the season to ride over 100 winners." Stackhouse said he did not want to get ahead of himself but admits it would be a great achievement if he could win the Victoria statewide title. "It's something I haven't set out to do but it's near and it's close enough to be able to do it, so I've just got to keep working hard and keep focused for the next two months because a lot can happen in two months as well," he said.

## Waddell ready for Australian test

Rider Jason Waddell said he is at a stage in his career where he would like to test his talents in Australia. "I wanted to be a part of the ship that resurrected New Zealand racing, I really did, but sometimes you have got to do what is

best for yourself and your family and go where the money is," Waddell told NZ Racing Desk. The 34-year-old enquired about a track rider position with Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott last year, however, with his services not being pursued, Waddell's hunger to prove himself grew. "That fueled a fire in me to get back out there on the track to prove to myself that I was good enough to go there. I set myself a pretty hefty target of five Group 1s and ten stakes wins this season, which I don't think many jockeys achieve, and I ended up with four and 11."

## Vale Johnnie Roberts

Wyong trainer Johnnie Roberts has died after a long battle with cancer, Racing NSW announced yesterday. The 72-year-old had his last winner in October when Soul Revival (Moshe) won at Hawkesbury. Roberts was an active member of the Central Coast racing community and provided support to the family of Michael 'Jock' Maloney, a trackwork rider who passed away in 2014. Roberts is survived by his two sons, Shane and Brady, as well as his daughter Stacey. A private funeral will be held tomorrow at midday, with the service to be streamed online.

## Job losses at RITA

The Racing Industry Transition Agency (RITA) yesterday announced that 230 roles, including 150 permanent jobs, would be cut as a result of the impact of Covid-19, about 30 per cent of their workforce. RITA executive chair Dean McKenzie said that, while the decision was a difficult one, there was no alternative with TAB monthly revenue almost 50 per cent below expectations and customer numbers down more than 35 percent. "There are incredibly talented, experienced and committed people at the TAB who have delivered so much to our customers and the wider racing industry over many years. We will be very sorry to see them go," McKenzie said. "We have had to make some tough decisions as we focus on the essential parts of our business that generate the funding required to keep the racing industry and many national sporting organisations running."

## JRHA Select Sale catalogue released

The catalogue for Japan's premier yearling and foal auction, the JRHA Select Sale, has been released with 240 yearlings and 200 foals to go under the hammer in mid-July. Among the yearlings on offer are youngsters out of former Australian and New Zealand mares Absolutely (Redoute's Choice), Kirramosa (Alamosa), Lumosty (Fastnet Rock) and More Than Sacred (More Than Ready), while Kirramosa's foal by Lord Kanaloa (King Kamehameha) will be sold, along with a Red Falx (Swept Overboard) colt foal out of Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Southern Speed (Southern Image). The sale will take place on July 13 and 14.

## Singapore racing off until July

While racing is resuming once again in most jurisdictions around the world, Singapore will not start again until July at the earliest, the Singapore Turf Club announced yesterday. The Club will evaluate throughout June whether it is able to stage meetings at Kranji starting in early July. Singapore has implemented one of the strictest lockdowns worldwide after a second Covid-19 wave swept through the city-state.

## Purton looks for advantage at Sha Tin

Zac Purton is hoping to make hay under the Sha Tin floodlights tonight with Joao Moreira sitting out the dirt track fixture due to a riding suspension. The star jockeys are inseparable on 123 wins for the season in a gripping tussle for the Hong Kong premiership. Purton has a full book of nine rides, and, with a 12 per cent win strike rate on the dirt track this term against the absent Moreira's 24 per cent, he is hoping to do enough to edge into an outright lead. "It's a good opportunity to do that, if I can," the reigning champ said. "The races on the dirt are never easy to win, especially at the night meetings but hopefully a couple can pop up for me and help me. It would be nice to get something if I could." Purton has a full book of nine rides tonight.



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## Viva Pataca owner dies

Macau casino patriarch Stanley Ho has died at the age of 98, it was announced yesterday. Ho founded SJM Holdings, the owner of 19 casinos in Macau, but is best known in racing circles as the owner of Hong Kong great Viva Pataca (Marju). Viva Pataca, until recently, was Hong Kong's highest-earning horse of all time with prize-money of more than HK\$83 million; he was passed by Beauty Generation (Road To Rock) last year, whose prize-money haul is now more than HK\$104 million. The South China Morning Post reported in 2015 that Viva Pataca was still in Macau in retirement at the request of Ho and his family.

### Four for Midnight Lute

HILL 'N DALE FARM

Hill 'n' Dale Farms mainstay Midnight Lute (Real Quiet) registered his fourth individual Grade 1 winner on Monday when Keeper Ofthe Stars (4 m ex Sociable by Run Away And Hide) caused a minor upset in the Gamely Stakes (Gr 1, 9f) on the Santa Anita turf. Settling handy, Keeper Ofthestars sprinted strongly upon straightening and raced clear for a length and a quarter success over laterallying Bodhicitta (Showcasing) with Mucho Unusual (Mucho Macho Man) a further nose away in third. Keeper Ofthestars was first sold to Zayat Stables as a weanling for US\$60,000 at

the 2016 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, before being pinhooked for US\$180,000 at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale the following year, being purchased by Tommy Town Thoroughbreds. Midnight Lute stood for US\$15,000 at Hill 'n' Dale Farms in Kentucky this year.

## Raging Bull takes Shoemaker Mile

Raging Bull (5 c Dark Angel - Rosa Bonheur by Mr. Greeley), winless since the 2018 Hollywood Derby (Gr 1, 9f) 2but not missing the top four in five Grade 1 starts since, finally returned to the winners' circle on Monday with an emphatic win in the Shoemaker Mile (Gr 1, 1m) at Santa Anita. Owner Peter Brant has become known for bringing horses across from France and campaigning them stateside with trainer Chad Brown; among his best-known horses are Sistercharlie (Myboycharlie) and Dunbar Road (Quality Road) in the US, as well as Sottsass (Siyouni) in France. Raging Bull, though, looks capable of joining that group with his two and a quarter length victory over Next Shares (Archarcharch) and Without Parole (Frankel), suggesting that further big-race victories are in store.

## Former Australian just denied in Monrovia

Team Valor's Grade 3-winning mare Oleksandra (Animal Kingdom) just missed out on adding the Monrovia Stakes (Gr 2, 5.5f) to her record when she went down by a half-length to Brazilian import Jolie Olimpica (Drosselmeyer) in the fillies' feature at Santa Anita. Oleksandra, who was placed in three maidens in Australia in 2017 when trained by Bjorn Baker, has won six of her 11 American starts with a further three placings. She won the Franklin County Stakes (Gr 3, 5.5f) at Keeneland in October and was set to step

out in the Al Quoz Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) at Meydan before the Dubai World Cup meeting was cancelled. Jolie Olimpica, the track record holder over the Santa Anita five and a half furlongs, has won two of her three starts in the US, having won the Grande Premio Jockey Club de Brasileiro (Gr 1, 1600m) at Gavea in Brazil.

## Osarus to conduct first Covid-era online auction in Europe

The first European thoroughbred sale to be held since the Covid-19 pandemic was declared takes place tonight with the Osarus Breeze Up Sale in France. Like sales that have been conducted in Australia in recent weeks, it will be run exclusively online; it is the first test for the new coronavirus-enforced digital era in Europe, where online sales have previously been shunned. Among those to be sold are a Scissor Kick (Redoute's Choice) filly, with the Arrowfield stallion now permanently based at Haras d'Etreham in France, as well as a filly by Waldpark (Dubawi), who raced in Australia during the 2013-14 season.

## 369 entries for first UK meeting back

Connections have greeted the planned return of British racing at Newcastle on Monday with huge enthusiasm as 369 horses have been entered for the fixture. The entry is around twice as large as would be expected for a meeting at Newcastle at this time of year. The behind-closed-doors meeting will be the first to take place in Britain since March 17, when the sport was closed down due to the Covid-19 crisis. The BHA has said all races following the resumption will require final fields to be declared three days before meetings take place "until further notice", which means the final fields for Newcastle will be published on Friday.



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# Melody Belle and Probabeel begin build-up to spring

It may not even be winter yet, but top New Zealand gallopers Melody Belle (Commands) and Probabeel (Savabeel) arrived at the Randwick stables of John Thompson yesterday to begin their preparations for the spring.

The Group 1-winning pair had been spelling at Lime Country, the Burradoo property of Kiwi expatriates Greg and Jo Griffin, along with stablemate Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle).

"Melody Belle and Probabeel are back in today at the stables at Randwick and Te Akau Shark will stay out a little bit longer," trainer Jamie Richards said yesterday. "They've been really well cared for and the fillies in particular have put on a good amount of weight. They are going into John Thompson's stables and our staff member Ashley Handley will be looking after them again.

"We're going to sit tight in Sydney, where the weather is generally a bit better, get them fit, poke them towards a trial, and see how it comes together. We haven't worried too much about particular race plans, as yet."

It has been a momentous season for Richards, who leads the New Zealand premiership on 99 wins. He was stuck one short of 100 when racing was shut down because of the Covid-19 pandemic and had been well on track to chase down the New Zealand record of 143 set by training partners Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman in 2017/18. He hopes to bring

up the century pretty quickly when racing resumes.

"We've got three older horses - Bak Da Master, Al Haram and Richard of Yorke - who are all getting fit and looking pretty good," Richards said. "And horses like Cicciolina and Shebringsmerubies that are probably knocking on the door and can handle a bit of cut in the track.

"We're obviously not renowned for wet trackers in the winter but I think we've got a few bullets there to fire."

He scored 17 stakes wins in New Zealand and a further three, all Group 1 wins, in Australia. In fact, 11 of his 20 stakes wins came in Group 1 races, with his haul including the three legs of the New Zealand Triple Crown - the Tarzino Trophy (Gr 1, 1400m), the Windsor Park Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Livamol Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) - as well as the Empire Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m), the Chipping Norton Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Surround Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) in Australia.

Horse of the Year Melody Belle swept the New Zealand Triple Crown and the Empire Rose, while Probabeel created history by completing the Karaka Million (RL, 1200m) and Karaka 3YO Classic (RL, 1600m) double in addition to her Group 1 success.

In addition, Cool Aza Beel (Savabeel) became Richards' fourth consecutive Karaka Million winner, Probabeel and Te Akau Shark each won Group 1 races on the same day at Royal Randwick, and Cool Aza Beel and Advantage (Fastnet Rock) emulated the feat at Ellerslie.

Amongst a season of success, Richards nominates the Randwick double as his greatest feat.

"Mainly because of the prestige around racing in Sydney," he said. "It's one of the most competitive racing jurisdictions in the world. We had two runners that day and they both won Group 1 races, so quite unbelievable really.

"That was the highlight, closely followed by the double on Karaka Million night. We thought it would be hard to beat that, but then we did."

Richards added that he and the staff were happy to be back into the training routine at Matamata, after the Covid-19 lockdown.

"We're chipping away, building their fitness and looking forward to them stepping up," he said. "It's great to welcome back proven horses like Advantage, Savy Yong Blonk, Prise De Fer, Need I Say More, Brando and all of those sorts of horses.

"And, it's also great to have the new crop of yearlings coming through and seeing the exciting young horses that Dave's (Ellis) bought. So, it's a good time of year to be back into it."

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# Victorian industry debates Caulfield Cup move

Racing Victoria's executive general manager of racing Greg Carpenter said yesterday that there would likely be a host of changes to the Melbourne Spring Racing Carnival, should the Melbourne Racing Club proposal to move the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) to the last two Saturdays in November be adopted.

Carpenter confirmed to Racing.com that there was a detailed proposal that had been put before RV and the race clubs but that a decision was still likely to be weeks away.

The proposal, which was first reported by the Herald Sun on Monday night but followed months of speculation amidst the Covid-19 pandemic, involves moving the Caulfield

Guineas to November 21 and the Caulfield Cup to November 28.

According to Carpenter, while it was too early to determine what would happen under different scenarios, he said that RV - who would make the final decision about the spring calendar - would look at moving the key lead-up races to the Caulfield Guineas and the Caulfield Cup in the Caulfield Guineas Prelude (Gr 3, 1400m) and the Herbert Power Stakes (Gr 2, 2400m) respectively.

"If some of the Caulfield feature races were to move after the Melbourne Cup Carnival, including the Caulfield Cup itself, we have a responsibility to ensure we have a more than adequate - an outstanding lead-in program - for all those grand finals that I have mentioned, still is in place," Carpenter told Racing.com.

"So, if the Caulfield Cup and the Herbert

Power were to move to after the Melbourne Cup, you'd have to look at what remained there, the timing of those races. Ultimately the Racing Victoria board controls race days so we're hoping that whatever decision is made about how the Spring Carnival looks in 2020, that it will have the support of all the clubs."

Melbourne Racing Club chairman Peter Le Grand told RSN927 yesterday that any decision to move the Caulfield

Cup would not impact either the quality of the race or take away from the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m), which is to remain on the first Tuesday in November.

"If you go back through the races, there haven't been too many Caulfield Cup winners in the last 15 to 16 years that have gone on to win the Melbourne Cup," Le Grand said. "It's not going to affect the race that much. We want it to stand on its own as well. The Caulfield Cup is a very prestigious race and always has been and it will stand on its own."

"I don't think the move will decrease the quality at all. Not a lot of horses go through the Caulfield Cup on a Cups path these days, things have changed."

While no decision has been made by the Melbourne Racing Club as to their preference, Le Grand himself says that his preference is for the move to happen.

"We are exploring options, there's no doubt about that, because our priority is to get our members and our people back to the track and give them the opportunity to see the races, to see the Caulfield Cup, to enjoy the Spring Carnival," Le Grand said.

"We think it's worthy of consideration because when you consider the AFL will be running finals through October against the Caulfield races and the Cox Plate, we think there's some huge advantage if the Caulfield Cup was run later."

"Just imagine if we had a Caulfield Cup with no crowd? That'd be absolutely shattering for our members."

The potential switch has sparked plenty of debate amongst the Melbourne racing community.

David Hayes, who won the Caulfield Cup with Fraar (Topsider) and Tawqeet (Kingmambo), believes that the entire spring should be pushed further back to allow more time for horses to spell during the winter months. However, he doesn't see any reason to change the sequence of races.

"I've said it for years that a later date is better for your horse the further you can get away from winter," said Hayes, who departs for Hong Kong in the coming weeks. "Horses always do better later in the year. The sequence of races has worked for something like 120 years, so don't meddle with that, just move it back three or four weeks and keep it simple."

He is supported by another Caulfield Cup-winning trainer in Danny O'Brien, who argues that the whole spring should be moved back a month with the Melbourne Cup falling on the first Tuesday in December. O'Brien said that early Melbourne Cup favourite Russian Camelot (Camelot) could instead target the Caulfield Cup if it moves to late November.

"The spring is far too early for our horses," O'Brien told Racing.com. "We rush through our better racing in those early (spring) months when the horses are nowhere near their best and then we shut down from the middle of November when it is the prime time for the animal to be competing at their peak."

"We are stuck with dates in the spring that really don't suit the racehorse. Most of the three-year-olds haven't even turned three by the time they're running for a Caulfield Guineas in early-to-mid-October."

"The best scenario would be for the whole spring to be moved back a month. It would

be fantastic if we had our better races pushed further back into the start of the summer. The Melbourne Cup on the first Tuesday of December makes so much more sense."

A third Caulfield Cup winner, Ciaran Maher, believes that the world's richest mile and a half handicap is no longer the most obvious path to the Melbourne Cup and so the move would not prove too disruptive.

"Obviously, there wouldn't be a traditional Cups preparation for these horses but what is a traditional preparation these days anyway?" Maher told Racing.com. "Years ago, everything used to kick off in the Aurie's Star and then race through the Caulfield Cup to the Melbourne Cup but that never happens now."

"Recent years have shown that there are any number of ways of getting to the Melbourne Cup. As long as you have enough notice to plan, it shouldn't really make a difference."

Maier did say though that a decision needed to be made quickly in order to prepare horses for target races.

"Whatever they do, they need to sort it out ASAP," he said. "Horse programs don't happen overnight so they need to set it in stone so we can then set out horses for which races we want to go for."

"Some of the spring horses are already in and the rest are coming in soon."

However, Mike Moroney was one who did speak out about the potential shift, agreeing with Hayes and O'Brien that the shift should have been made as a whole and not by moving races out of order.

"I would have thought if the shift was to happen this year, which we knew was a probability, that they would have shifted the whole carnival," Moroney told SEN Breakfast yesterday morning. "It's making things fragmented and I think it will make sure that the autumn here next year is very light."

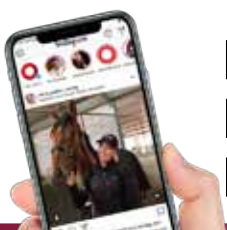
"Sydney looks to be the winners here, they wanted us fragmented which we are. It's just disappointing and it makes you wonder why we've got RVL when you have the clubs running things and making decisions that aren't for the benefit of racing."

"It's about racing, it's not about single clubs doing this and that. If they shifted the whole carnival because of the virus, I could understand that. There are little things you could tweak with but to fragment the whole thing - and not just the spring but the whole year - that's not the way I don't think."

Moroney has Mornington Cup (Listed, 2400m) winner Aktau (Teofilo), who is guaranteed a Caulfield Cup berth, but he admits that his whole preparation will have to be altered if the new schedule is in place.

"It's going to change things for him now," he said. "He'll have a crack at the Melbourne Cup and the Caulfield Cup will be an afterthought, which is not really what we wanted. It's a bit disappointing. His way of getting to the Caulfield Cup would have been going through the weight-for-age races and getting into the Caulfield Cup with as little weight as possible, that was his winning chance."

"Now, we're going to be left with doing that and targeting the Caulfield Cup by itself or are we going to do what we intended which was to go to the Melbourne Cup. We'll have to qualify for the Melbourne Cup and one of our ways of doing it was through the Caulfield Cup."

## Colette and Camelot to fly Classic flag

While a level of scepticism each year about Australia's Classic form is understandable, the facts suggest it's unwarranted and I fancy you dismiss it at your peril in the spring of 2020 - especially if the Caulfield and Melbourne Cups are northern hemisphere visitor-free.

The Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) is the race perennially touted - to the point of hackneyed - for any Derby or Oaks-winning three-year-old. More than cliché, others consider it anachronistic.

The truth is somewhere in between but still more in favour of entertaining the four-year-olds rather than dismissing their prospects as fanciful or a thing of the past.

Interestingly, 14 four-year-olds have won the Caulfield Cup in the past 30 years; exactly the same number were successful in the preceding three decades before international competition and the regular sale of Derby performed three-year-olds to Hong Kong.

So, simply they're winning at a rate of almost once in every two years and the more recent sample period, since 1990, has seen six northern hemisphere trained winners take the race and four of those denied locally trained four-year-olds. You could well argue, in fact, that the impact of the four-year-olds in the Caulfield Cup is on the rise rather than waning.

All but one of the past 14 Caulfield Cup winning four-year-olds had a top four finish in a Derby or Oaks at three. The one exception was Let's Elope

(Nassipour), who did not contest either Classic in New Zealand but did win a Group 3 fillies race at 2000 metres at set weights (the Centaine Stakes).

The ATC Oaks winner Colette (Hallowed Crown) and SA Derby winner Russian Camelot (Camelot) are the obvious hit picks among this season's Classic winners, while it would be premature to dismiss the ATC Derby form of Quick Thinker (So You Think) and Zebrowski (Savabeel) on the basis of the winner's afterthought run behind "Classic type" Kinane (Reliable Man) in the Packer Plate.

The James Cummings-trained Colette recorded her fourth straight win when she trounced Toffee Tongue (Tavistock) in the ATC Oaks. Toffee Tongue, of course, then won the Schweppes Oaks from the VRC Oaks-placed Moonlight Maid (Puissance De Lune).

The ATC Oaks remains a significant race and anything but anachronistic. While not all winners - as is the case with any race - go on to exalted status; all but two of the past ten ATC Oaks winners have progressed - at four - to win at Group 1 or Group 2 level or run extremely well in a Caulfield Cup.

The record of South Australian Derby winners, this millennium, is not as enticing



- other than Caulfield Cup winner Mummify (Jeune) - but the victory of a northern hemisphere bred three-year-old is without precedent and therefore without historical context.

What we do know, from a historical perspective, is that no horse so lightly raced - it was Russian Camelot's fifth start - has won the South Australian Derby in modern times. And we know that when it was keenly sought - as it arguably was this year in our changed racing circumstances - in the 1990s it produced Cups winners and placegetters Shiva's Revenge (Nassipour), Subzero (Kala Dancer), Count Chivas (Lord Ballina) and Markham (Salieri).

Not to mention that Russian Camelot, despite conceding about five months in age to the placegetters Dalasan (Dalakhani) and the Victoria Derby winner Warning (Declaration Of War), literally toyed with them and that he's prepared by Danny O'Brien who - assuming David Hayes still heads to strife-torn Hong Kong - will be the only 2020-21 Australian trainer who can boast having trained a Caulfield Cup, Melbourne Cup and Cox Plate winner.

Further depth among this season's three-year-old ranks may also be proven via the Packer Plate despite the winner Kinane's subsequent defeat in last Saturday's Gunsynd Classic.

Every so often, the something-of-a-consolation Frank Packer Plate proves better than its accorded status - most notably when Might And Power (Zabeel) won it in 1997 - but there are several other examples and this year may be one of them with an impressive Kinane beating subsequent winner Bottega (Snitzel); the untapped Entente (Dundeel); the above

average Chuck A Luck (Nagarra) and the Derby winner Quick Thinker.

Kinane then conceded an impossible start, last Saturday, behind Supergiant (Red Giant) and Ballistic Boy (Smart Missile) who just might be better than most pundits have so far acknowledged.

While Queensland racing proceeds this year, without a Derby and Oaks, more will be revealed at Eagle Farm on June 6 and 13 with the running of the Rough Habit Plate and The Roses; the latter likely to feature Toby and Trent Edmonds' exciting prospect Vanna Girl (Husson).

Often believing what you see is more illuminating than over-analysis and I will happily be hitching my wagon to the spring four-year-olds Colette and Russian Camelot (and perhaps others) this coming spring -

whether sitting in the stands or still in the lounge room.

The only caution is don't commit too soon as Might And Power is the only one of those 14 contemporary four-year-old Caulfield Cup winners to have won first-up in the new season. Nine of the 14 were Australian bred; five from New Zealand.

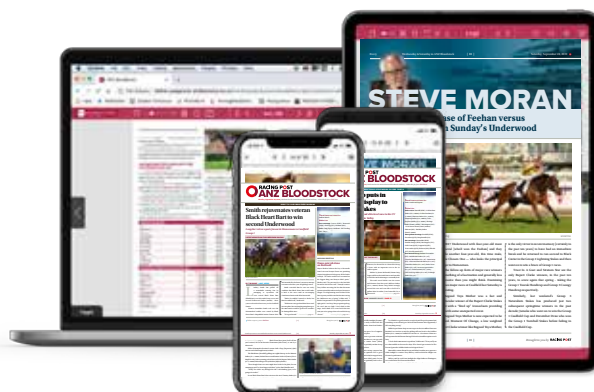
