Koorungal to sell entire foal crop unreserved through an online auction

Koorungal Stud is a fixture at the majority of the eastern seaboard sales and a regular vendor in Adelaide, but this year the Lamonts have made the bold decision to offer its yearling crop entirely online, bypassing the traditional market.

The southern NSW family-owned stud will next month sell 21 yearlings by stallions

including Magic Albert (Zeditave), Duporth (Red Ransom), Impending (Lonhro), The Brothers War (War Front), Epaulette (Commands) and Super One (I Am Invincible) through the Inglis Digital platform.

Like almost every business sector, breeders have had to adapt the way they sell their horses because of the pandemic and it is for that reason that stud manager Angus Lamont made the call to skip the 2021 sales series to instead sell their yearlings before Christmas. *Continued on page 2>>*

"At the time we made the decision, it was a pretty uncertain time. I didn't know if Victoria was going to open up or whatever else where we might be sitting and that led to the decision," Lamont said yesterday.

"Even though the borders have now opened up, we're happy to back the decision and go that way.

"Some of the yearlings were certainly in the Classic sale, but we just decided rather than pulling the draft apart, we would just go all online."

The costs associated with preparing yearlings for various sales, such as Inglis' Classic and Premier and Magic Millions' Adelaide auctions, was also a factor behind the move.

"The preps you have to do with them, accommodation and transport, x-rays and scopes and all the bells and whistles, it certainly adds up, so this way I think we can find a home for them," Lamont said.

"We might take a hit on some, but hopefully we will have a few surprises with some of the others and it will even out in the wash."

The Koorungal-consigned yearlings will be offered unreserved and an on-farm inspection, hosted by Inglis' Jonathan D'Arcy, will be held at the Riverina property at Harefield next Friday from midday.

Transparency has been bandied around all year as vendors and auction houses have played to a bigger online buying bench. Lamont has watched closely and, in his view, "horses seem to be making their value".

"If you can provide buyers with all the information, they are certainly willing to bid," he said.

"The class of horse we've got there, from nice winning

families, are not the top-end syndicators' horses in some respects, but they are good trainers' horses. These trainers who are buying these sorts of horses can't afford the time to get up to a Classic sale and then they are getting blown out of the water on the ones they want anyway.

"This is probably a bit more of a market for trainers who are sitting at home and looking at these sales online. We thought 'why not try it?'

"We are either going to look like geniuses or idiots, so we will know afterwards, won't we?"

Described as well-grown and well-educated horses by Lamont, the young studmaster believes the draft will also appeal to traders looking for stock to prepare for next year's two-year-old sales.

"We have some lovely colts by Duporth and Magic Albert and there's a really nice Impending colt as well," he said.

"They are pinhooker sort of horses for people who could turn them around and get them up to a ready-to-run sale.

"There is an option there to do that and, the other thing is, all the sires bar Impending have got runs on the board. Duporth and Magic Albert - people have seen a lot of them. They can look at them online and they will see that they are certainly not the culls.

"They are a good line of horses overall."

Koorinal Stud, where Phillip Stokes' Listed-winning sprinter Ancestry (The Brothers War) was bred and raised, has this year welcomed the first foals by ATC Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) and Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Prized Icon (More Than Ready), and his presence could herald an immediate return to the public

yearling sale ring in 2022.

"You have probably got to take a first season horse like Prized Icon to the buyers a bit more and he is throwing some outstanding types," Lamont said.

"If we can get a number up to the Gold Coast and Sydney and Melbourne as well as

Adelaide, it is probably the way we are going to have to go initially, but there will also be horses available online throughout the year.

"Whether this is a one-off, we will certainly know after we assess how it goes."

People wishing to inspect the Koorinal draft on December 4 must RSVP by Tuesday to enable the farm to comply with Covid-19 regulations. The yearlings will be offered through the Inglis Digital December 11 to 16 auction.

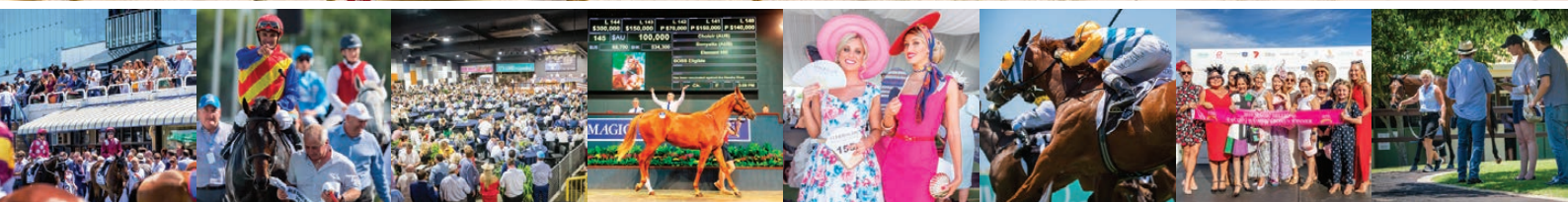

Spectators return to Victorian racetracks

Racing Victoria and Country Racing Victoria have announced spectators will be able to return to racetracks from tomorrow. Operating under COVIDSafe protocols, up to 500 spectators will be permitted to attend tomorrow's meeting at Yarra Valley and Warrnambool's fixture on Sunday. Spectators at these meetings will be allocated a seat and will be unable to move around the racecourse except for specific reasons, such as purchasing food. The first metropolitan meeting to welcome up to 500 spectators will be Sandown on December 2, while Echuca races are also expected to welcome spectators on the same day. RV chief executive, Giles Thompson, said: "We are delighted to be able to welcome spectators back to Victorian race meetings for the first time since early March this weekend at Yarra Valley and Warrnambool, which paves the way for other meetings in the weeks ahead. This is an important milestone for our industry in the Covid-19 challenge and we thank the minister for racing, Martin Pakula, and the Victorian government both for this opportunity and their support of Victorian racing during the pandemic."

Early 2021 for Valley crowds return

Meanwhile, Moonee Valley Racing Club chief executive Michael Browell has conceded the return of crowds before Christmas is unlikely, but is hopeful that 2,000 spectators - and potentially double that figure - could be present at the track's first fixture next year. Moonee Valley will host a limited number of owners at

the track tomorrow, similar to what it has done at its most recent Friday night meeting, before looking to increase the numbers next week. "Plans are afoot for having a limited number of members on track on December 4," Browell told Racing.com. The MVRC is currently working through applications with the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services regarding the return of punters, with confirmation of numbers allowed to be decided in the near future. That number would not be any higher than 5,000. "We might not be able to get to that (5,000) number because there might be square meterage limitations in rooms...if you combined that with allocated seating in the grandstand, the number might be 2,000-2,500," Browell added.

Litt hoping to unearth next young talent

Richard Litt is eagerly anticipating the debut of well-bred filly Centro Storico (Snitzel), a \$410,000 purchase from this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, at Rosehill tomorrow, as the trainer looks to the future after relying on stable stalwarts for early success. Centro Storico will make her debut in a 1100-metre handicap following a successful trial at Warwick Farm earlier this month, which she won by a convincing four lengths from Rocklily (Exceed And Excel). Recent recruit Mr Marathon Man (So You Think) also appears for Litt in the Festival Stakes (Gr 3, 1500m). "It has been a complete turnaround the last couple of years," Litt said. "We've got a new property, we've got some well-bred horses, we've got some new owners from all around the world - Hong Kong, Singapore, New Zealand. It's a massive opportunity." Of Centro Storico, Litt added: "She works well, she is very

professional, she never does much wrong. She's a ready-made racehorse really. She seems to be straightforward in her own way but also has a little bit of 'wow' factor about her."

Easy Eddie back from the brink for shot at Starlight

Group 3 winner Easy Eddie (Super Easy) will return to the races for the first time in over a year tomorrow having suffered serious health scares over the past 12 months. The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) placegetter landed a trial at Warwick Farm ten days ago and lines up in the Starlight Stakes (Listed, 1100m) at Rosehill. "He got a virus and he ended up developing pneumonia," his trainer Joe Pride said. "He also got colitis so he was on death's door. He was in a bad way." The six-year-old has been given three conditioning barrier trials but Pride expects him to need the run after his lengthy layoff. He lines up against stablemate Passage Of Time (Northern Meteor) and Pride is anticipating a competitive performance against a tough field headed by the James Cummings-trained pair of class sprinter Viridine (Poet's Voice) and Varda (Lonhro). "Passage Of Time is a little bit more on the spot for this one. He's had three trials as well, he looks really healthy and we're very happy with him," Pride said.

Draw against Gleneagles

Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young are hoping Gleneagles (Capitalist) can prove classy enough to land the Super Vobis 2YO Plate (1000m) at Moonee Valley tomorrow, but are concerned by his tricky draw in barrier 12. The stable took out last year's edition with Tagaloa (Lord Kanaloa), who subsequently landed the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), while the year before Brooklyn Hustle (Starspangledbanner) defeated Yes Yes Yes (Rubick). Busuttin is expecting another strong contest. "Look at the stables. Look at the breeding of the horses. It's going to be a strong race again," Busuttin said. "I was hoping he would get an inside draw and have a soft run but this [barrier draw] changes things. I could wait until Flemington the following week but I don't like two-year-olds running down the straight. There's 18 two-year-olds in the race, I'm not sure why they didn't split them into two divisions." Of Gleneagles, Busuttin added: "He's a smart colt who is a natural runner and we're looking at the big two-year-old races."

Stokes plays down Brazen Boy

Among the opposition to Gleneagles is Phillip Stokes-trained newcomer Brazen Boy (Brazen Beau), who won a Morphettville trial by 14 lengths a month ago. The gelding, who was a well-fancied favourite for the Merson Cooper Stakes (Listed, 1000m) earlier this month but was scratched at the barrier, will go to Moonee Valley with no fanfare according to Stokes, who is keen to play down his chances. "The way I look at it, he's either going to be an 800-metre wonder or he will run the 1000 metres out," Stokes told Racing.com. "He seems okay, so we go there with no fanfare. He's got a low barrier draw, Jamie (Kah) has had a few sits on him now so she knows him, there are a few positives. I'm not going to hype the horse up, we'll just hopefully have a good experience and run well. I'm confident. His work on Tuesday suggested he's going good."

Zahra hoping Prezado's not a one-trick pony

Matthew Ellerton and Simon Zahra are hoping Prezado (Denman) can win away

from Flemington for the first time in almost two years when he lines up in the Carlyon Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Moonee Valley tomorrow. Five of Prezado's six career wins have come at Flemington and Zahra admits options are limited for the six-year-old unless he can prove himself away from home. "There's not a lot of point in being a one-trick pony. Unless we can have more options we're going to be pretty limited as to where we can take him," Zahra said. Prezado ran well in a Flemington jump out on Friday, giving the stable confidence he is in good shape ahead of tomorrow's contest. "I don't think he's ever gone better and also he handled the corner really well, the best he's ever done," Zahra added. "From that draw (barrier one) there's a chance they'll just pin him in that spot and that'll get him around the corner."

Vital Silver seeking Winterbottom gold

Daniel and Ben Pearce are hoping seven-year-old Vital Silver (Wanted) can bounce back to form in the Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Ascot tomorrow. Vital Silver, who finished runner-up to Hey Doc (Duporth) in last year's edition, has not won since the Roma Cup (Gr 3, 1200m) in May 2019 but his trainers are confident he is in great shape to end the drought. "Look, he is a Group 1 performer and has run seconds in two Group 1s," Pearce told The Races WA. "He has shown he is up to the grade and he has certainly earned his spot." Vital Silver came fifth on his last appearance in the Northerly Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m), after finishing the same position in the Black Heart Bart Stakes (Listed, 1200m) second-up. "We've done a similar preparation with him to last year," Pearce said. "He's had a similar time between runs. When he came back from Melbourne last year, we freshened him and he performed really well in the Winterbottom. So, we have followed a similar path and hopefully we can go one better than last year. His work has been great and we gave him a good solid gallop last week. He's had a nice freshen up at the beach this week and we couldn't be happier with him."

Ballantyne dares to dream

Former AFL forward Hayden Ballantyne will hope to spring a Group 1 surprise when saddling 200-1 chance Mankind (Denman) in tomorrow's Winterbottom Stakes. Mankind could only finish ninth in the Colonel Reeves Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) at Ascot earlier this month, but that does not bother Ballantyne, who has sought inspiration from Denis Pagan's Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) upset with Johnny Get Angry (Tavistock). "I am under no illusion he's not the best horse in the race, but he's super fit and he's in the race and he's a chance to do something," Ballantyne told Racing.com. "Anything is possible in the sporting world. I am sure Denis realised that with footy, as I did, that if you're fit and available for a game or for a race, anything is possible and Denis' race a few weeks ago is the perfect example of that. We go in with a very open mind that anything can happen, but we're also realistic and won't be too disappointed if it doesn't."

New chapter for The Harrovian

Toby Edmonds is looking forward to the challenge of preparing The Harrovian (Fastnet Rock), who bids for ten consecutive wins in tomorrow's Recognition Stakes (Listed, 1350m) at Doomben. Stephen Massingham, the previous trainer of The Harrovian, handed the gelding over to Toby and Trent Edmonds after his victory at Doomben on October 31. Massingham had the horse stabled with the Edmonds team for the duration of his Brisbane campaign before formalising the transfer earlier this month. "It was good of him to give us a chance to take him over as he heads towards the Bernborough next month," Toby Edmonds said. "He's a nice horse to have join the team, although a lot of pressure. He's been unbeaten for quite a while so it'll be a good test for us." Under Massingham's care, The Harrovian won 12 of his 14 starts, including the Townsville (2000m) and Cairns (2100m) Cups double last year. Jockey Brad Stewart will be aiming to keep his unbeaten record aboard The Harrovian intact after riding the gelding to victory at his past two starts at Eagle Farm and Doomben.

Jadentom chasing second stakes success

Seven-year-old mare Jadentom (Rothesay) will be looking to land her second stakes win in the Spirit Of Boom Classic (Listed, 1200m) at Doomben tomorrow. Lindsay Hatch, who trains and owns Jadentom, was rewarded for keeping the mare in training when she took out the Weetwood Handicap (Listed, 1200m) at Toowoomba in September. Jadentom followed that up with another handicap win last time out and Hatch believes she has a great chance of recording the hat-trick tomorrow. "We've looked after her from day one and she's only had 28 starts," Hatch told Racing Queensland. "But this will probably be her last season as I expect she'll go through the Magic Millions National Broodmare sale next June. I think she'll be hard to beat again as she's drawn well in the middle of the field. If she can get a good run in the race, she'll look the winner at some stage in the straight. It's been a very good season for us so far and it would be great to win another stakes race with her, but it's a tough race with a lot of chances."

Alleboom to run in Adelaide

Alleboom (Spirit Of Boom) will line up in a 1100-metre Benchmark 66 contest for three-year-olds at Morphettville tomorrow, as Richard and Chantelle Jolly resist the temptation to run the colt in the McKenzie Stakes (Listed, 1200m) at Moonee Valley. Alleboom, who has won three times from six runs, will carry 60 kilograms under claimer Caitlin Jones at his local track. "We looked at the field and the barriers and the horse himself and I've decided to stay home," Richard Jolly said on RSN. "The feeling was just from barrier seven was he's probably not going to be able to slide across with ease and have to do a little bit of work - and he's probably a bit suspect at 1200 metres. He's only had one go at 1200 metres, he drew an outside gate, we tried to hold him up and it went pear shaped. I'm a bit mindful, sixth run in, of travelling again. Had he drawn one, two or three we might be going but we'll stay home. He's drawn one (at Morphettville). He's got a big weight but he's got a bit more going for him. He'll probably bounce on the lead and be hard to run down."

Melbourne goals for Behemoth

Grand Syndicates' flag bearer Behemoth (All Too Hard), who won two Group 1s at Caulfield during the spring, will return to Melbourne in a bid to add to his record early next year. The Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and C F Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) have been earmarked for the David Jolly-trained gelding, who was spelled after his unplaced run in The Everest (1200m) last month. "He's unbeaten at Caulfield over the 1400 metres and he's won the two Group 1s during the spring, so it makes sense to aim him up at them (the Futurity and Orr) at weight-for-age in the autumn," Grand Syndicates' Sam Lyons told Racing.com. "Dave is really happy with how he's spelled. He's done a good job, kept him nice and close to home. We don't want him to get too big. He will come home, carry a bit of residual (weight) and he will give David the freedom to not have to turn the screws on him too hard, too quickly. He will take him nice and slow and get him to where he needs to be." The \$5 million All-Star Mile (1600m) is also an option for the five-year-old.

Breeders' Cup winner shifts down under

The Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott partnership will be looking to turn another promising American into a Group 1 winner with Bulletin (City Zip) joining the stable. Waterhouse and Bott recently farewelled Con Te Partiro (Scat Daddy), who won two Group 1 races for the yard after beginning her career with Wesley Ward, and on paper Bulletin appears an even more exciting prospect. Formerly trained by Todd Pletcher, Bulletin won his first three starts, including the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (Listed, 5.5f) in 2018. He was a long-time ante-post favourite for last year's Commonwealth Cup

(Gr 1, 6f) at Royal Ascot, but did not make the trip after suffering his first defeat, and has yet to return to the winners' circle in five starts since. The speedy colt, who was raced by WinStar Farm, S F Bloodstock and China Horse Club in the US, will race in the China Horse Club's red and yellow silks in Australia for a collective that includes S F Bloodstock's Australian partner Newgate Farm and some of Waterhouse and Bott's stable clients. The news continues a big few days of stable transfers to Tulloch Lodge after Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) was confirmed to be switching to the yard.

Nash Rawiller to ride in Victoria

Champion jockey Nash Rawiller will ride in Melbourne over the festive season, with Rosehill on Saturday being his last NSW meeting of the year. Rawiller, whose son Campbell rides in Victoria, will reunite with his family and will likely stay until the Gold Coast Magic Millions carnival, with a return to Sydney anticipated in January. Rawiller has only once raced against his 19-year-old son, a Mornington-based apprentice, and the pair will no doubt be hoping to face each other again over the coming month.

TRSA welcomes Murray Bridge funding announcement

Thoroughbred Racing SA are delighted with the announcement of a \$5 million funding commitment for the Murray Bridge Racing Club, which they believe acts as an important step in their long-term strategy to grow horse numbers in SA. The state government grant will help create up to 150 on-course stables and a 70-metre equine pool at the club's Gifford Hill facility with the balance of the project's funding to be provided by TRSA. "Being able to offer these new stables and a state-of-the-art equine pool, adding to the uphill training track already developed, will help us deliver a full on-course service at Murray Bridge. This will give both existing and new trainers a new option in the State," TRSA chair Rob Rorrison said. "It is a key part of growing horse numbers in South Australia which, in turn, will drive further investment and growth in the industry. We are extremely appreciative of the state government's ongoing support."

Hale joins ATC board

Tim Hale has been elected to the Australian Turf Club board on a four-year term, filling the position vacated by Bill Evans, while current ARC director Angela Belle McSweeney was re-elected on a four-year-term. ATC chairman Matthew McGrath said: "We have a strong and united Board with a diverse range of skills, and Angela Belle and Tim will continue to bring a passion for our Club and its racing, as well as extensive business skills."

Allen suspended again

Ben Allen received his second careless riding ban of the week at Sandown on Wednesday, having picked up an eight-meeting suspension at Kyneton on Tuesday. Allen was handed a nine-meeting ban after being found guilty of careless riding on Mighty Oasis (Oasis Dream) in race five at Sandown, after he shifted right on his mount near the 600-metre mark and interfered with Eaton (High Chaparral). Allen will now be ruled out until midnight on December 11. Fred Kersley also picked up an eight meeting suspension in the same race for careless riding aboard Lady In The Sky (Savabeel). His ban will expire at midnight on December 3.

Grafton moved to Coffs Harbour

Sunday's race meeting scheduled for Grafton has been transferred to Coffs Harbour due to the forecast high temperatures. Racing NSW stewards yesterday made the call to shift the meeting with the temperature expected to exceed 40 degrees. It is predicted to reach 33 degrees at Coffs Harbour on Sunday.

Trial session added to Wagga

Wagga, in southern NSW, will host a barrier trial session on Wednesday, December 16, Racing NSW announced yesterday. As a result of the decision, barrier trials scheduled for Wagga tomorrow, Albury (December 12), Corowa (December 17) and Wagga (December 24) have been cancelled.

Three for Sacred Falls

Late Waikato Stud stallion Sacred Falls (O'Reilly) sired this third individual stakes winner yesterday when Zee Falls (3 f ex Zelitist by Zabeel) took out the Lucia Valentina Wellington Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Otaki. In breaking her maiden at start four, Zee Falls ensured trainer Stephen Marsh won the three-year-old feature for the third consecutive year, following on from the victories of subsequent New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Crown Prosecutor (Medaglia d'Oro) in 2018 and Derby placegetter Scorpz (Charm Spirit) 12 months ago. The Johnno Benner and Hollie

Wynyard-trained Key (Exceed And Excel) ran second, beaten three-quarters of a length, while White Lightning (Reliable Man) was a further length and a quarter back in third. Zee Falls was purchased by Marsh from the Waikato Stud draft at Book 1 of the 2019 New Zealand Bloodstock Yearling Sale draft, realising \$130,000. Yesterday's victory continued a purple patch for the ill-fated Sacred Falls, who has produced Group 1 winner Aegon, Group 3 winner All Saints' Eve, and stakes performers Icebath, Tommy Gold, and Salto Angel. Sacred Falls died last December after a short battle with a rare illness of the liver.

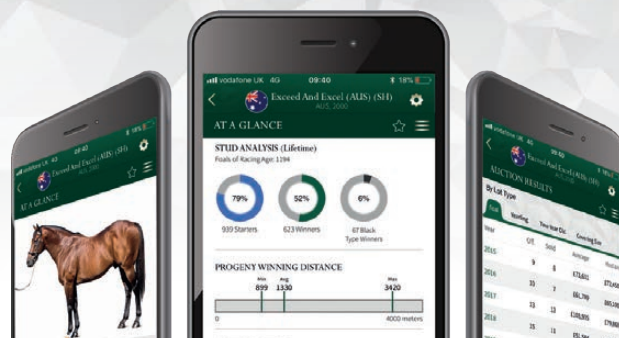
Oaks next as Marsh delighted with Wellington winner

Tavi Mac strongest in Levin Stakes

Progressive five-year-old Tavi Mac (5 g Tavistock - Bellarroof by Marroof) continued on his upward curve when taking out the Levin Stakes (Listed, 1200m) for trainer Allan Sharrock earlier on the Otaki card. A last-start winner of the Matamata Cup (Listed, 1400m) on October 10 having been runner-up in the Foxbridge Plate (Gr 2, 1200m) a month earlier, Tavi Mac shrugged aside his welter burden of 60 kilograms in testing conditions to come home a length and a quarter to the good of Burgundy Belle (Burgundy). Deerfield (Falkirk) was a further three and a half lengths back in third. Tavi Mac will try and make it a hat-trick of stakes wins at Awapuni next month when he contests the Manawatu Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and Sharrock said of his charge: "He has had three goes on wet tracks, two on slow and one on the heavy, and he has won them all. It doesn't really worry him. He had a blow, he hadn't raced in some time. He's a nuggety wee fella. 60 kilograms is quite an impost for a horse who is only 14.3 hands. He just keeps lifting the bar and he did it quite comfortably in the end. We are proud of him."

US-owned Bourbonaire sold to HK

The victory of Zee Falls in the Wellington Stakes followed hot on the heels of the news that her stable companion, the Stephen Marsh-trained Bourbonaire (Darci Brahma), has been sold

to race in Hong Kong. The Matamata maiden winner was last seen running second in the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), beaten a short-head by Aegon (Sacred Falls), having previously run second in the Sarten Memorial Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m), and Hawke's Bay Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m). Purchased out of the Little Avondale Stud draft at Book 1 of the 2019 New Zealand Bloodstock Yearling Sale for \$120,000, Bourbonaire was raced by Marsh in partnership with an American-based group of enthusiasts alongside bloodstock agents Mike McMahon and Jamie Hill, who oversee the Bourbon Lane Stable Partnership. He will be trained in Hong Kong by John Size. "He is a very high-class three-year-old and he would have been a potential top-liner going forward," Marsh said. "But when you get offered the money they can in Hong Kong you just can't turn it down. We are sad to see him go because we think he is a stable flagship horse. I believe he is going to John Size, which is great. He will get every opportunity there."

Quality book for jockey Satherley

Waikato jockey Lynsey Satherley is making a rare trip to Wanganui this weekend, lured south by a strong book of rides and the prospect of further black-type opportunities to follow. In a career spanning more than two decades, Satherley has had a total of only 21 rides at Wanganui, with a placing her best result. "I don't really travel a lot, and I'd say I've probably only made four or five trips down there in my whole riding career," she said. "It's not something I would normally do, but Murray (Baker) and Andrew (Forsman) told me I could ride Vee Cece in the Wanganui Cup and potentially stay with her for the Waikato Cup, so that's made it well worthwhile for me to make the trip on Saturday. I've also got the opportunity to ride a couple of good chances for Debbie Sweeney, so it's worked out really well." Fourth in the Cuddle Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) in March, Vee Cece (Canford Cliffs) was partnered by Satherley when running a neck second at Te Rapa on November 7. "She does a few things wrong and can be a bit of a handful, but she's got a lot of ability on her day, when she's on song. I galloped her this morning and thought she felt bright and well," Satherley added yesterday.

ASIA

JPN: Triple Crown trio confirmed for Japan Cup

Sunday's Japan Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) at Tokyo represents a first for Japanese racing; in fact, it's most likely a racing first, anywhere in the world. It's not just that it's the 40th running of the Japan Cup and it's not that it will be the first run in its four-decade history with only a handful of people in the stands. Instead, it's the fact that the contest has gathered what may be the hottest field of heavyweights in its history, a field of 15 that features an unheard-of three Japanese Triple Crown champions. The retiring Almond Eye (Lord Kanaloa), 2018 winner of the Japanese Fillies' Triple Crown featuring the Oka Sho (Gr 1, 1600m), the Yushun Himba (Gr 1, 2400m) and the Shuka Sho (Gr 1, 2000m), has drawn gate two as she seeks to become the second two-time winner of the Japan Cup. Regular rider Christophe Lemaire once again partners the five-year-old. Her 2020 successor in the Japanese Fillies' Triple Crown, Daring Tact (Epiphaneia), will jump from barrier five with Kohei Matsuyama aboard. Joining the fillies is exciting colt Contrail (Deep Impact), who won the Japanese Triple Crown - the Satsuki Sho (Gr 1, 2000m), the Tokyo Yushun (Gr 1, 2400m) and the Kikuka Sho (Gr 1, 3000m) - this year. The potential heir apparent to his sire will be ridden by Yuichi Fukunaga. The 15-runner Japan Cup will jump at 5:40pm ADST on Sunday.

INTERNATIONAL

UK: Zoustar foal reaches 62,000gns at Tattersalls

At the time of going to press, four youngsters by Widden Stud shuttler Zoustar (Northern Meteor) had been sold on day two of the Tattersalls December Foal Sale yesterday, headlined by a 62,000gns (approx. AUD\$118,000) colt, who was knocked down to Margaret O'Toole from the draft of The Castlebridge Consignment. The April-born youngster is a half-brother to three winners, being out of a placed Night Shift (Northern Dancer) half-sister to German Group 1 winner

Temida (Oratorio). He was catalogued as Lot 621. These are the first crop of northern hemisphere-bred foals to be offered at auction by dual Group 1 winner Zoustar, who was introduced to northern hemisphere-breeders for a fee of £25,000 when standing at Tweenhills Farm & Stud in 2019. He is currently standing for \$121,000 at Widden and is the reigning champion first and second season sire having produced 16 stakes winners, including three-time Group 1 heroine Sunlight. Zoustar will return to Tweenhills at a fee of £25,000 in 2021 having stood for £30,000 this year. Read tomorrow's ANZ Bloodstock for the full report on Thursday's session at Park Paddocks.

UK: Spectators given go-ahead to return at four tracks on Wednesday

Spectators will be back on racecourses in England for the first time since March when the national lockdown ends on Wednesday after Ludlow, Lingfield, Kempton and Haydock

were all placed under Tier 2 government coronavirus restrictions on Thursday. The decision will enable up to 2,000 spectators or 50 per cent of maximum capacity, whichever is lower, to attend under measures outlined by the government last week. No racecourses are in the Tier 1 areas of Cornwall, the Isle of Wight and the Isles of Scilly. The Tier 1 rules would enable up to 4,000 spectators to attend a fixture. Racegoers have been shut out of courses since March 16, barring two spectator pilots at Doncaster and Warwick in September, with only owners able to attend the races when they have had runners since July.

UK: Hollie Doyle wins Sunday Times Sportswoman of the Year

Record breaker, Group 1 victor and now an award winner. Hollie Doyle's unforgettable year became even more memorable after she was crowned the Sunday Times Sportswoman of the Year for 2020 on Wednesday evening. The

24-year-old has enjoyed an unprecedented amount of success this season, which has included breaking her own record for most wins by a female jockey in a calendar year and a memorable double on British Champions Day at Ascot last month, headlined by her first top-level success aboard Glen Shiel (Pivotal) in the British Champions Sprint (Gr 1, 6f). She also rode her first winner at Royal Ascot among other trailblazing achievements and became the first jockey to win the award in its history, joining sporting icons such as Dame Jessica Ennis-Hill, Dame Kelly Holmes and recent dual-winner Dina Asher-Smith in claiming the prestigious prize. "I'm blown away to have won the Sunday Times Sportswoman of the Year award," Doyle said. "It's been an unusual year in so many ways and I feel very grateful to have been able to do what I love day in, day out. Seeing my name compared to the previous winners of the award like Dame Jessica Ennis-Hill and Dame Kelly Holmes is pretty crazy and humbling."

The Magic Millions 2YO Clockwise Classic, the only race in Victoria to be contested right-handed, has not been a strong pointer since it was first run in 2012 with only one winner going on to win a stakes race - The Goodwood (Gr 1, 1200m) victor Despatch (Written Tycoon).

Five of the eight winners have progressed to the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) at the Gold Coast, with only one - Carriages (Hinchinbrook), who ran eighth in 2015 - finishing closer than 13th.

However, Readily Availabull looks poised to improve on that record after his last-stride success in the \$250,000 feature over Prince Amongst Men (Winning Rupert), with Rambeau (Brazen Beau) back in third.

It was a piece of shrewd programming by the Warwick Farm-based Sargent, with his charge all but assured a spot in the \$2 million Magic Millions 2YO Classic in January. He will be racing for extra prize-money there too, being owned by an all women's syndicate.

"I went to the Ballarat Cup meeting a couple of years ago and I saw this race and thought that I'd like to find a horse and train it up to win it," Sargent told Racing.com. "When he worked well during the week, I thought that this would be a good chance to do it."

Rider Michael Dee added: "What gets him across the line is his temperament. He's just a lovely, relaxed colt. That's going to take him a long way.

"He can improve, bearing in mind that it's only his first start. He didn't have as much

Second season sire Bull Point (Fastnet Rock) has only had a handful of runners to date, but he has already produced nine winners, including the Listed-placed Encountabull for trainer John Sargent.

The Kingstar Farm stallion, something of an enigma on the racetrack but also incredibly talented on his day, looks poised to strike further success this season after last Saturday's win by Encountabull's stablemate Readily

speed as the others, so that just shows that in time he could get over slightly further and relax and show a good turn-of-foot."

Sargent bought Readily Availabull for just \$25,000 from this year's Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale, having been impressed by then-juvenile Encountabull.

The Armidale Stud-consigned Readily Availabull has already recouped his purchase price, with the \$139,700 winners' cheque easily covering the outlay.

Readily Availabull is the second winner from four runners out of Sydney metropolitan winner Readily (More Than Ready); her other winner, Sixty One Tigers (Rothsay), finished seventh in a Clermont Benchmark 45 just over an hour after Readily Availabull's debut success.

While there is little by way of black-type in his immediate family, third dam Lucy Limelight (Hot Spark) produced European stakes winners Los Verdes (Persian Bold), Primas Agere (Hamas) and Nord's Lucy (Nordico).

Nord's Lucy is the dam of Group 2 winner

Roller-coaster recovery continues for Playing God

Darling View Thoroughbreds stud manager Brent Atwell has been riding a roller-coaster of emotions with Playing God (Blackfriars) and I'm All The Talk (Stratum) this month.

Atwell and his father Clive brokered Western Australia's biggest ever deal for a locally-based stallion when they purchased Playing God from Mungrup Stud earlier this year. A week later they shook hands on another big-money signing when I'm All The Talk also transferred from the Great Southern to their property at Mundijong on Perth's southern outskirts.

Playing God mare Kay Cee began November with an outstanding victory in the Lee Steere Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and I'm All The Talk took the brand to another level when his filly Watch Me Dance completed the Champion Fillies (Gr 3, 1600m) - WA Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) double at Ascot last Saturday.

But the racetrack celebrations have been tempered by Playing God's ongoing fight for life after undergoing surgery for a displaced large colon on November 11

"It's been very stressful and at one stage it felt like the walls were closing in," Atwell admitted this week. "We were lucky to catch it early but he's not out of the woods yet.

"Peter Harding and Annemarie Cullimore at the Ascot Vet Clinic have been fantastic. They

are monitoring him closely ahead of a long recovery and rehab. Hopefully, he can return to normal stud duties in 2021."

Playing God had covered 96 mares and was looking at a final book of 120 before being hospitalised. He stands for a WA-high service fee of \$13,200 (inc GST) while I'm All The Talk is priced at \$6,600 (inc GST).

"I'm All The Talk will cover over 90 mares now and he's doing a good job handling the flow-on," Atwell said. "He's been a revelation this season and has settled in here without any problems."

The Atwells had already pin-pointed Playing God as a champion sire of the future when Mungrup announced its closure in July.

"We had seen him winning two Kingston Town Classics and he was already getting runs on the board with his first couple of crops," he said. "Dad and I put together a deal with Ron Sayers (Yarradale) while Graham Daws (Dawson) and David Moore (Elvira Park) are also involved.

"We also inspected I'm All The Talk while down at Mungrup and were both blown away. It was the first time we had seen him in the flesh because he had come straight across from Sydney to Mungrup, which is a four-hour drive down the Albany Highway.

"He's an outstanding individual and we put together a syndicate that includes Chris and Andrea Gales (Gervase Park) and Ben and Jo Duncan (Forest View)."

I'm All The Talk sired the WA Guineas quinella on Saturday with Watch Me Dance defeating Em Tee Aye. Of her, Atwell said: "She's a very talented filly and tough, too. She won the Champion Fillies on a bog track and was on a seven-day turnaround. They said she couldn't back up but she was the one you wanted to be on in running.

"Steve Wolfe has done a marvellous job and, at the weights, she can make it a hat-trick of Kingston Towns for the fillies after Arcadia Queen and Kay Cee."

The winner's share of the \$1 million in

prize-money amounts to \$590,000 and that would put I'm All The Talk on par with Kermadec (Teofilo) and Pride Of Dubai (Street Cry) at the top of the Australian second-season table. It would also see him challenging Blackfriars for the WA premiership.

"I'm not discounting Em Tee Aye, either," Atwell added. "He was also on a quick turnaround off that Heavy9 the week before and went down fighting on Saturday. We bought his dam Azita (Oratorio) for \$35,000 at the Mungrup dispersal and she foaled a filly by I'm All The Talk in September."

Kay Cee's chances of back-to-back Kingston Town Classics (Gr 1, 1800m) dipped slightly with a mediocre effort in the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) on Saturday. She had looked as good as ever winning the Lee Steere Stakes on November 7 and trainer Neville Parnham

expects to see the real Kay Cee when she steps up to 1800 metres at weight-for-age on December 5.

Having three front-line candidates for Perth signature event will be an anxious watch for the Atwells but nowhere near as nerve-racking as counting every day one at a time with Playing God.

Evergreen Iffraaj sees off young pretenders at Tattersalls December Foal Sale

The opening session of the Tattersalls December Foal Sale saw several aspiring young stallions take their first opportunity to shine in the shop window before the headline-grabbers arrive later in the week, but it was the far more established Iffraaj (Zafonic) who ended up sealing Wednesday's leading honours.

Dalham Hall Stud's resident, who spent 12 seasons shuttling to Haunui Farm before his four-time Group 1-winning son Ribchester took over the mantle for 2020, is venerable enough for not only a marquee-name stallion son in Wootton Bassett but even to have his grandson Almanzor providing progeny at this sale.

Selwood Bloodstock's February 11-foaled Iffraaj colt, a half-brother to promising 90-rated stayer Smart Champion (Teofilo), was bought by Ross and Peter Doyle for 57,000gns (approx. \$AUD108,500).

"He's a good-looking horse out of a Shamardal mare and by a top stallion," explained Ross Doyle. "He's for Pier House Stud and the plan will be to come back for the October Sale next year."

Selwood Bloodstock, James Read's Somerset operation, was also responsible for the second highest-priced transaction of the day, an Oasis Dream (Green Desert) colt bought by Glenvale Stud for 50,000gns (approx. AUD\$95,300).

Although both were short of the corresponding session's top lot of 65,000gns last year, it was pertinent that the average climbed 16 per cent to 11,741gns (approx. AUD\$22,350) from 10,091gns, and the median even more impressively by 60 per cent to 8,000gns (approx. AUD\$15,250) from 5,000gns.

The clearance rate was one per cent down on 2019 at 68 per cent, with 135 of 201 lots offered sold, for turnover of 1,585,100gns (approx. AUD\$3.02 million), down seven per cent from 1,695,300gns.

Eye on the prize

One to make a notable showing among the freshman sires was Expert Eye (Acclamation), whose first ever foal to go through the ring was bought by Michael Fitzpatrick of JC Bloodstock for 41,000gns (approx. AUD\$78,150).

An exhilarating performer on his day, Juddmonte's son of Acclamation (Royal Applause) concluded his career winning the Breeders' Cup Mile (Gr 1, 1m) two years ago

and was initially put on the market by Banstead Manor at a £20,000 fee.

The April 24-born grey colt consigned by Dukes Stud had been given a helping hand by the appreciable performance of his dam White Cay (Dalakhani), a George Strawbridge mare who is a half-sister to Coronation Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) winner Balisada (Kris).

She had already bred two decent performers for the Barnett family through Dynamic (Teofilo), a Listed winner in France for William Haggas, and Cay Dancer (Daneshill Dancer), who ended up landing the Bewitch Stakes (Gr 3, 1m) at Keeneland for Chad Brown.

"Expert Eye is stamping them, and he was one of very few in the catalogue who was a sibling to two stakes winners," said Fitzpatrick, a successful pinhooker who confirmed the foal would return to market as a yearling.

"There was a nice back pedigree and he comes from a very good breeder."

Charlie Wyatt of Dukes Stud, a nursery at Ashley just outside Newmarket, was similarly encouraging about Expert Eye, saying: "I think he's a good representative for the sire. I've seen a few of them and they look nice sorts."

Rajasinghe standing proud

There will be some pretty happy people should Rajasinghe (Choisir) maintain the pace he set with his first foals to walk into the ring.

The 2017 Coventry Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) winner was initially offered at £5,000 by the National Stud and he ended up with a colt inside the day's top four when Redpender Stud purchased a half-brother to fair French performer Whistle (Dabirsim) for 46,000gns (approx. AUD\$87,500).

Lot 256, just the sixth individual to go under the hammer and the first of three Rajasinghes to be offered, had earlier been bought for 37,000gns (approx. AUD\$70,500) by agent Larry Stratton.

Whitwell Bloodstock consigned the chestnut colt out of the unraced Lucia De Medici (Medicean), in turn a daughter of Middleton Stakes (Listed, 1m2f) winner Jalousie (Barathea).

"I've followed Rajasinghe ever since he won the Coventry Stakes – I bred in partnership the

second-placed Headway [now named Happy Family in Hong Kong], who was beaten by a head," said Stratton.

"Rajasinghe's sire Choisir is a good influence. This is a nice colt and has been bought for a partnership and is for resale."

Joe Callan, nominations and marketing manager for the National Stud, said: "We're very excited with Rajasinghe's first foals, they all have great substance, are great movers, and obviously he was a very fast horse.

We're looking forward to the future with him."

Smart sprinter Washington DC (Zoffany), introduced by Bearstone Stud for a realistic £6,000, was another to produce a good initial showing when a colt from Bearstone's family of Prix de l'Abbaye (Gr 1, 1000m) winner Glass

500 at the Valley for Fownes as Moreira and Purton take three each

Explosive Witness (Star Witness) ensured Caspar Fownes' moniker the 'King of the Valley' rang true at Happy Valley on Wednesday as the handler brought up a significant milestone with his 500th win at the city circuit in the Class 2 Chai Wan Kok Handicap (1000m).

Fownes has the most wins at the Valley of any active trainer on the roster, his heroics at the course include six wins in a day, and this term he has 17 wins under the Happy Valley lights – more than any other handler.

"I love this track – it's been really good to me, I'm pretty good at placing my horses here and you need a lot of luck when you come here as well," Fownes said.

Fownes was first licensed for the 2003/04 season and he landed the first of three champion trainer titles not long after in the 2006/07 season. Among 916 Hong Kong wins in total, he's forged a brilliant career presenting heroes of the turf like Lucky Nine (Dubawi), The Duke (Daneshill), Super Satin (Daneshill Dancer), Green Birdie (Catbird) and Southern Legend (Not A Single Doubt).

"This is what the game is about, whether

it's Class 5 or Group 1 – I just love it, I'm passionate, I always give it everything," Fownes added.

The leading trainer in the championship took his seasonal tally to 28 wins, following the earlier success of Royal Racer (Dreamscape), as he put the foot down in his bid for a fourth title with a midweek double.

"I said to my boys at the start of the season that I'm going for it this year, I think we've got the horses spread across the classes and I'm just going to put the foot down and see what happens – if I win, I win and if I don't at least I gave it my best shot," Fownes said.

A late rally from Explosive Witness sealed Fownes' double, the six-year-old making it three wins in succession following an injury-plagued first three years in Hong Kong.

"That horse is special to me – we bought him from one run, he had a hefty price tag on him and he came here and he just drove me nuts – it broke your heart," Fownes said.

The Australian import won on debut at Moonee Valley in March 2017 but had to wait three years to break his duck in Hong Kong.

"Every time you'd get him prepared for a race it'd just go by the

wayside and you'd just have to build him up again," Fownes said. "He missed well over a year. It was well documented and I just knew he had so much talent.

"It's so nice to now see that when owners are patient and now he's on his way to paying them back and he's won his last three – he can certainly close off with a massive sectional here," Fownes said.

The 86-rater scored at his first try in Class 2 on Wednesday against a solid field under Alexis Badel, who earlier kicked off his double with victory aboard the Frankie Lor-trained Virtus Star (Sebring) in the Class 5 Yau Kom Tau Handicap (1650m).

"The horse has been brave and courageous and he showed one more time he was very competitive and he's in great form this season," Badel said.

Virtus Star took 22 starts to snare his first Hong Kong win, but he now has three in succession and sits on the cusp of a step up to Class 4 with a pre-race rating of 31.

The win was the first of a double for Lor, who secured the second section of the Class 4 Tai Lam Handicap (1200m) with the lightly-raced Rewarding Together (Pierro) under Joao Moreira.

Moreira and Purton take three each

Championship leading jockey Joao Moreira bagged a treble on Wednesday, as did current champion Zac Purton. With six wins between the duo, they were only two of three jockeys to win a race on the card.

Moreira kicked off the evening with victory for Frankie Lor, but closed it out with powerfully Caspar Fownes aboard Royal Racer in the Class 4 Tsing Lung Tau Handicap (1650m).

"I said to Caspar it wasn't a pretty ride but very efficient because I had to come wide at the last corner, but I knew what I had underneath – I had a full horse underneath," Moreira said.

"I pretty much looked after him in the first half and when I pulled him out and asked him to get going he responded very well and he ran away from them."

Moreira's three-timer featured a win aboard Ambitious Heart (Captain Sonador) for trainer David Ferraris in the first section of the Class 4 Tai Lam Handicap (1200m).

Meanwhile, Purton kicked off his treble in the first section of the Tsing Lung Tau Handicap (1650m) aboard Total Power (Dundeel) for trainer David Hall. The win was the jockey and trainer's fourth together this term.

The five-year-old bay spent the off season at Conghua and bounced into the winner's enclosure following two trials at his 11th Hong Kong start.

"He's another horse that we have had in

Conghua. He had his first trial there and I think it certainly hasn't hurt him," Hall said.

The gelding was a two-time winner pre-import, also placing in the Inglis 3YO Guineas (RL, 1400m) at Scone behind Wild Planet (Animal Kingdom), who subsequently won the Theo Marks Stakes (Gr 2, 1300m) at Rosehill.

"Every horse that has come back from

Conghua has performed really well for us so we're really happy with the way things are going up there and it certainly contributed to him winning first-up over 1650 metres with 133 pounds on his back," Hall added.

Wednesday's success was the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m)-winning handler's 12th victory this season.

A well-judged front-running ride from Purton followed in the Class 3 Kap Shui Mun Handicap (1200m) aboard the Danny Shum-trained Grateful Heart (Written Tycoon), who made all for a tidy half-length success.

"He's just taken a little bit of time to strengthen up, he showed some ability in his early trials but under race pressure he was a little bit weak," Purton said. "This season he's had the benefit of the off season and like a lot of horses he's just come back better for it."

Purton closed out his three with victory in the finale aboard ex-John Gosden trainee Holy Heart (Holy Roman Emperor), who scored back-to-back wins at the Valley by taking the Class 3 Sham Tseng Handicap (1650m) by a neck.

Hong Kong racing continues this Sunday, November 29, at Sha Tin.

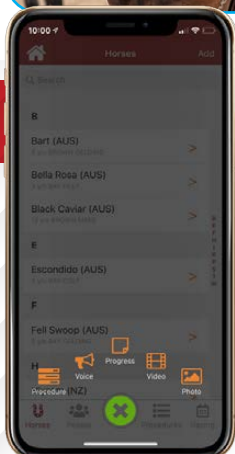
