Paul Moroney goes to \$185,000 for son of Vadamos

Rich Hill Stud sires lead the way at Book 2 of Karaka sale

ich Hill Stud sires stole the show on the second day of Book 2 selling at the New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale yesterday, as sons of first season sire Vadamos (Monsun) and dual-Group 1 runner-up Proisir (Choisir) topped proceedings, selling for \$185,000 and \$180,000 respectively.

International bloodstock agent Paul Moroney has been particularly taken by the progeny of Rich Hill's new Group 1-winning resident Vadamos, securing the sale-topping Lot 859 for \$185,000, a colt out of the well-related mare Silke Top (Librettist).

"Vadamos is an internationally bred and performed horse," Moroney said. "He's topclass from a Monsun line, which I am a great fan of. They have been really good types across the board.

"I rated this horse as the best mover I saw on the sales ground of any sale across the board. *Continued on page 2>>*

Royal Ascot plans for Waller duo

Chris Waller has confirmed a trip to Royal Ascot is on the agenda for The Everest (1200m) winner Yes Yes (Rubick), while his stable companion Nature Strip (Nicconi) is also being considered for an international campaign. The highclass sprinters are both slated to return in the Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Flemington next month, with Yes Yes Yes having finished third to Nature Strip in a recent barrier trial. Glen Boss has been confirmed as Yes Yes Yes' rider for an autumn campaign that will culminate in the TJ Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Randwick on April 4. "Following that race, he will be set for Royal Ascot where we look forward to showcasing his immense talent on the international stage," Waller said. James McDonald will ride Nature Strip and Waller added: "I am yet to decide on where he will run subsequent to the Lightning but at this stage he has returned in excellent Morning Briefing page 4 >>

He's medium-sized, but he's balanced and just had great shoulder movement. He used his hindquarters and he was clean and correct. He's just a gorgeous colt."

The colt will remain in New Zealand under the care of Paul Moroney's brother Michael at his Matama stables, and the bloodstock agent believes he could be a horse for the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) or New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) in time.

"He has been bought for Mike's New Zealand stable and he will go into the system there," Paul Moroney said.

"I think he could get up and make an autumn two-year-old and potentially be a Guineas and Derby horse. That's what he struck me as and he will get every opportunity to get there."

Moroney said he had been impressed by a number of first season sires at Karaka, but none more so than Vadamos and Waikato Stud's Tivaci (High Chaparral).

"Vadamos and Tivaci are the two who have impressed me the most. Both are leaving good-bodied, athletic horses," he said.

"Tivaci is leaving big, strong horses that trainers should be able to train, while Vadamos is leaving slightly more elegant types with a bit more European quality about them."

Tivaci was the leading first season sire in the Book 1 session of New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sale, with 28 yearlings sold for

an aggregate of \$3.5 million at an average of \$124,821, while Vadamos was close behind with 21 sold for a total of \$2.6 million, averaging \$121,818.

Offered by Valachi Downs, the colt is the fourth foal out of the winning mare Silke Top, who is out of the stakes-winner Zaza Top (Lomitas), making her a half-sister to champion three-year-old and champion older male in Germany, Zazou (Shamardal).

Brent Schumacher of Valachi Downs credited Rich Hill for getting Vadamos to New Zealand and said the session-topping colt could have made Book 1 of the sale.

"Kevin (Hickman) is a major shareholder in Vadamos and encouraged Rich Hill to bring him to New Zealand," Schumacher said.

"To stand a stallion in Germany is a tough and rigorous process. Stallions have to be perfect to stand there.

"We are also really pleased for Rich Hill.

"This colt would not have looked out of place in Book 1 but in Book 2 was a standout. We are pleased that decisions we made in 2017 have panned out and this sale confirms them."

Goldsburys celebrate Proisir pinhook

Second top lot on day two of Book 2 at Karaka was a Priosir colt, who is set for a career in Hong Kong after being purchased by Upper Bloodstock for \$180.000.

It was a terrific result for pinhookers Anne and David Goldsbury of Beckam Equine, who bought the colt as a weanling for \$40,000 at the Karaka May Sale.

"Me and my husband David are simply delighted with how the sale went," Anne Goldsbury said.

"The colt is the only lot we brought to the sale and the price was unexpected. We thought from the interest that he might make close to \$100,000.


"He has been a lovely colt all the way through. We bought him here last May. He can be a little too clever for his own good sometimes but has a nice temperament.

"David is a licensed trainer but I love the babies. We like to buy them as weanlings then take them through to January. If they don't sell, David can take them further and on to the Ready to Run."

The colt is the first foal out of the winning mare Works Wonders (Darci Brahma), who is out of the stakes-placed Flowers (College Chapel), making her a half-sister to MVRC Vase (Gr 2, 2040m) runner-up Buffett (Danasinga). He was catalogued as **Lot 963**.

Ross Lao of Upper Bloodstock said the colt would remain in New Zealand to be educated by Ben Foote before making the trip over to Hong Kong to continue his career.

<< Continued from page 2 "He is a lovely type with lots of quality," Lao said. "He really stood out in Book 2 and I actually thought he should have been in Book 1.</p>

"He will stay here for another 12 months with Ben Foote, who will get him educated in trials, and then go to Hong Kong.

"He hasn't yet got an owner or trainer yet, but we will soon find out if he is any good. A lot of people liked him in the ring. Everyone is on the same horses, but that was nearly our budget."

With one more Book 2 session to go at Karaka this morning, Highview Stud are the leading vendors by aggregate, selling 16 horses for \$732,000.

The average has increased from day one, with the current figure at \$37,353, but that metric is still down five per cent from last year's average of \$39,606, as turnover has reached \$7,993,500.

A total of 214 of 473 lots have sold at a clearance rate of 68 per cent, down from last year's clearance rate of 73 per cent.

There are 109 Book 2 yearlings still to come under the hammer as the final Book 2 session commences at 11am local time today. A total of 114 yearlings are set to go through the ring in Book 3 this afternoon.

First for Outreach


Widden Stud-based stallion Outreach (Exceed And Excel) sired his first winner yesterday when Pee Dee (2 g ex Hot'n'dreamin by Nothin' Leica Dane) won a 900-metre two-year-old handicap at Scone. The Greg Ryan-trained gelding was retained to race by his breeder David Parker and is the fourth winner out of Hot'n'dreamin (Nothin' Leica Dane), who herself is a sister to dual-Group 1 winner Hot Danish. Out of the Snippets (Lunchtime) mare Bahia, Outreach is a brother to Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Overreach. He had

only one race start where he finished second to Vancouver (Medaglia d'Oro) in the Canonbury Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m). Outreach stood at Widden Stud for a fee of \$7,700 (inc GST) in 2019 and has five yearlings on offer at the upcoming Inglis Classic Sale.

Coyle hoping for White upset

The Jason Coyle-trained White Moss (Mossman), who split Nature Strip and Yes Yes Yes in the barrier trial at Warwick Farm, will make her first start since running down the field in the Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m) last May when she lines up in the

Expressway Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick tomorrow. Coyle earmarked the race as a first-up opportunity for the mare and was not counting on the nominations being extended, nor three of the four late entries - Kolding (Ocean Park), Vegadaze (Lope De Vega) and Kiamichi (Sidestep) - being paid up to run. "You go through the history of the Expressway and generally it's a pretty classy field, but it can throw up a small field," Coyle said. "We were a little bit disappointed with the extended nominations given everyone had their chance to nominate but they were extended and we've got the extra runners there now."



Widden a Slipper cash grab for Away Game

Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) winner Away Game (Snitzel) will try to secure her place in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) when she lines up in the Widden Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) at Randwick tomorrow. The juvenile has accumulated career earnings of \$1,243,800, but as her Gold Coast exploits do not count towards Slipper qualification, connections have been forced to chase the \$83,000 purse up for grabs at the weekend. "We originally planned to give her one run into the Slipper but without the prize-money counting for the Magic Millions, she only has about \$80,000," said Annabel Neasham, who oversees the Sydney operation of co-trainers Ciaron Maher and David Eustace. "If she wins this on the weekend then she probably ensures herself a spot on prize-money and then we can decide if she goes straight into the Slipper or if she runs again."

Randwick return for Royal Celebration

Also at Randwick, the Ron Quinton-trained Royal Celebration (Excelebration) will make his first start in almost a year when he tackles the Hyland Race Colours Handicap (1200m). The son of Excelebration (Exceed And Excel) notched back-to-back city wins as a spring three-year-old having shown earlier promise with placings behind The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) and subsequent Group winner Gem Song (Your Song). Despite the four-year-old's handy fresh record, Quinton has expressed reservations ahead of his reappearance. "He has been off the scene for quite a while so they'd probably be a bit sharp for him at 1200 (metres)," he said. "He is pretty fit, but when they've been off 12 months they can just be lacking in match practice a bit. But he is a lovely horse. He's a pleasure to deal with, he's got a great attitude about him."

Lindsay Park eyes Diamond spot

Lindsay Park has accepted three runners in the Chairman's Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) at Caulfield tomorrow - Aryaaf (Epaulette), Frederick The Dane (Danerich) and Exporter (Exceed And Excel) - with the winner guaranteed enough prize-money to secure a start in the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m). Aryaaf, who won the Ottawa Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) firstup at Flemington in November, is the \$2.90 favourite for the weekend assignment. "She's not a big filly," co-trainer Tom Dabernig said. "Sometimes you get those smaller horses that have a reasonable stride and sometimes you get those ones with the little pokey action. She doesn't move like a small horse." Regarding Frederick The Dane, who has drawn barrier eight, Dabering added: "I think the barrier will suit him as it will give him a bit of galloping room and let him use his action. He's doing all this pretty much in his first prep, so you're never really sure how far you're going to get."

Melham lands Kryptonite ride

Meanwhile, Ben Melham has secured the ride on Rock Of Kryptonite (Fastnet Rock) in the Chairman's Stakes. Both Melham and Damien Oliver have been aboard the Mick Price and Michael Kent jnr.-trained juvenile in recent preparations, but Kent told RSN927: "There was a bit of a dispute (over who would ride), but anyway Mick has gone with Ben. They both wanted to ride him. It can be hard to work those things out, but I think it's a good sign when two top jockeys want to ride this horse. We've given him two jump-outs this time in, where he's won both, and we think a lot of him. We'll look to ride him just behind the speed and finish off. Hopefully there's a bit of speed on."

Dalasan set for Manfred

Co-trainer Leon Macdonald has issued a positive bulletin on Dalasan (Dalakhani) as the Group 2 winner prepares to make his return in the Manfred Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield tomorrow. The three-year-old is being set for the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Flemington on February 29 and the \$5 million All-Star Mile (1600m) two weeks later if securing sufficient votes, while he signed off his last preparation with a half-length success in the Carbine Club Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Flemington. "He's undefeated first-up," Macdonald, who trains in partnership with Andrew Gluyas, said. "He

beat Scales Of Justice in the Spring Stakes so I suppose that makes the form stack up a bit, doesn't it? He's in good condition. We're very happy with the way he's worked. He's done everything asked of him and I'm confident he'll run well."

Miss Leonidas ready for Adams return

Shaun Dwyer, the trainer of Miss Leonidas (I Am Invincible), is confident the five-year-old is in good order ahead of tomorrow's W J Adams Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Caulfield despite having to contend with equal-top weight of 60 kilograms. "Everything's gone pretty well this campaign," Dwyer said. "She's had two jumpouts. She needed the first one and her work subsequently was good, and then her second one, John Keating got off her and said she's back now." Miss Leonidas finished second to Nature Strip in the AJ Moir Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Moonee Valley on September 27 before winning the Caulfield Sprint (Gr 2, 1000m) on October 19. "She's probably raced in stronger company than the rest of this field," Dwyer said. "She really acquitted herself well in the Moir and then in the Group 2, and if the second and third horses were in this I'd say they would be under 10-1 as well."

Nonconformist chasing city win

The Grahame Begg-trained Nonconformist (Rebel Raider) will take the next step up the ladder when he lines up in the John Moule Handicap (1600m) at Caulfield tomorrow. The three-year-old won a 1600-metre Pakenham maiden by six lengths on January 16, having previously placed over 1200 metres and 1440 metres. "He's a very progressive horse," Begg said. "He's answered every question we've asked him so far. We've thrown him a bit in the deep end, jumping to a Saturday race at Caulfield, but in saying that you don't see too many maidens win by six lengths." Looking ahead, Begg continued: "We feel that we want to possibly go on the path of the Autumn Classic and then the Alister Clark Stakes. So we'd like to run him at a mile again on Saturday and then to the 1800 and possibly to the 2000 metres and then I'll put him away."

Distance test for New Universe

Once hailed as a potential Group 1 horse, the Chris Waller-trained New Universe (Darci Brahma) will take on weaker company as he steps out beyond 1600 metres for the first time in tomorrow's Open Handicap (1800m) at Eagle Farm. "The 1800 metres is something new but it isn't the strongest race in recent months," Waller's Queensland manager Paul Shailer said. "Cool Chap beat him last time and he meets that horse 1.5 kilograms better." After he overcame difficulties to win his second Australian start at Rosehill, some were tipping a stakes career for New Universe with the Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) mentioned as a possibility. The gelding has failed to reach those heights but has won another three races in Sydney and Victoria as well as being placed in Group 3 company.

Another win Looming Large for Gollan

Tony Gollan has a long association with the family of two-year-old Looming Large (Spirit Of Boom), instilling confidence in the trainer that his colt can measure up in tomorrow's QTIS 2YO Handicap (1000m) despite drawing a bad barrier (9). "I can't get a decent barrier at the moment but he is a nice horse and this race suits him," Gollan said. "I trained his sire, Spirit of Boom, and Spirit's mother, Temple Spirit. I also trained Looming Large's dam, Miss Leibert, and her mother, Stravain Lady. So I have now trained three generations on Looming Large's maternal side and I obviously know a lot about his sire's side of things." Gollan paid \$75,000 for Looming Large at the 2019 Inglis Classic Yearling Sale. "Obviously, I won Group 1 races with Spirit (Of Boom) but Miss Leibert was one of those horses who gave me a real kick along about eight years ago," he said. "I always thought she would make a decent broodmare and hopefully I will be proven right."

Tempo the key for Cruze

After a strong-finishing third in an Open Handicap (1600m) last Saturday week, Eagle Farm trainer Barry Lockwood has no qualms about dropping smart sprinter Cruze (Pierro) back in distance on his home track in tomorrow's Queensland Chinese Jockey Club

Open Handicap (1200m), as long as there is plenty of early pace in the race. "I know it isn't ideal going from 1600 back to 1200 metres but this race suits his programme best," Lockwood said. "He likes Eagle Farm and he hasn't run a bad race on the new track. He did win over 1200 metres earlier in this campaign. He will race well on Saturday with one proviso and that is there is plenty of early pace. If there is he will be finishing over the top of them but if there is no pace, he will be in trouble."

Luck on Doughty's side

Gary Doughty and his wife Kelly have had hundreds of winners from their Gold Coast training base but one of their most consistent horses, Benfica Princess (Benfica), who won her eighth race at Warwick three weeks ago, was lucky to make it to the track. "It was Magic Millions day and as she was not eligible for any races that day we thought a 1400-metre TAB race at Warwick with good prize-money would suit her," Doughty said. "We were driving up the highway when an oil tanker overturned on the other side. Our side of the highway was still open but they closed it basically as soon as we got through. So it was probably fate that got us that win." Doughty is hoping for no such dramas when Benfica Princess runs in the Queensland Jockey Club Benchmark 85 (1400m) at Eagle Farm tomorrow. "It's a handy field and she has won three times at Eagle Farm. We just need some pace in the race," he said.

Wait pays off for Star Of Michelin

Stuart Kendrick's decision to skip the summer carnival with Star Of Michelin (Jet Spur) looks set to pay off as the gelding is poised to resume in tomorrow's QTIS Three-Year-Old Handicap (1400m) at Eagle Farm, despite drawing the outside barrier. "I wanted to give him time to mature into his body and he has pleased me since he came back into work," Kendrick said. "He has had a jump-out and then a solid 1200-metre trial so he is ready for 1400 metres first-up. The barrier is no help, but statistics show they can win from wide at the Eagle Farm 1400. We will get a clearer idea of where we are going after Saturday but a race like the Queensland Guineas or something even a bit further could be on the agenda."

Alligator to trial at Sunshine Coast

Star Queensland three-year-old Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) will have one final public outing in a trial between races at the Sunshine Coast on Sunday before heading to Melbourne for a Guineas tilt prior to contesting the All-Star Mile (1600m). "We decided he would benefit from the barrier experience. He will go 1000 metres in a field of five and it should be perfect for him," trained David Vandyke said. "It will be his last solid hit-out before going to Melbourne. It will also be the Queensland public's chance to see him in action this season." Regular race jockey Ryan Maloney will be aboard Alligator Blood in the trial.

Promising Kingdom shows class at Doomben

The Robert Heathcote-trained Emerald Kingdom (Bryannbo's Gift) has confirmed his rating as one of the most promising horses in Queensland with an easy win at Doomben yesterday, marking his fourth victory in a row. "Not many horses can win four in a row and not many can go from a Class 3 to a Class 6," Heathcote said. "I think he has a good race in him. He is a late maturer and reminds me of another of my horses, Deep Image, who is now a stakes winner." Jockey Ryan Maloney also predicted a big future for Emerald Kingdom. "He had plenty on them and he can win in much better company," he said.

Harlem set for third Australian Cup

Dual Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Harlem (Champs Elysees) could make history this autumn as he vies to become the first horse to win the race three times. The Lindsay Park-trained gelding took the first step towards his target race yesterday morning, winning a 1500-metre trial at Geelong. "He didn't have his blinkers on and he was a little bit on the lazy side, but Mark Zahra was very happy with him," co-trainer David Hayes said. "He was pretty effective and we all know he gets much better into his preparation. I know he's better in the autumn and he looks physically fantastic at the moment. It's a pretty big ask to win three (Australian Cups), but he does pop up at Flemington in a 2000-metre race very well."

Freedman ready for Sydney assault

The Anthony Freedman-trained trio, Chenier (Medaglia d'Oro), Lyre (Lonhro) and Southbank (Fastnet Rock), took another step towards the Sydney autumn carnival at the Balnarring jumpouts on Wednesday and assistant trainer Sam Freedman was pleased with their progress. "Chenier showed a good turn of foot and just had the wood on her (Southbank) this morning... they both seem ready to go for their first-up runs," Sam Freedman told Racing.com. Chenier is likely to target the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) while the Vinery Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) is on the radar for Southbank. On Lyre, Freedman said: "She has come back really well. She never looked right in the spring. She seems to be thriving at the moment. She'll probably head up to Sydney and run in the Light Fingers (Randwick, February 15) then into the Surround (Randwick, February 29)."

Missile on track for All-Star

Star Missile (Smart Missile) continued on his path to the All-Star Mile (1600m) with a low-key, 1200-metre trial at Geelong yesterday morning. Trained by Greg Eurell, the four-year-old - who is currently second in the public vote for the All-Star Mile - finished midfield behind Miss Siska (So You Think), but Eurell was pleased with the effort. "I was pretty happy with it," Eurell told Racing. com "That was the exercise, to give him a day out and a bit of a fitness assessment for us, just to see

exactly where he is. Ben (Melham, jockey) felt that it was a good hit-out, he hit the line well and I'd say, at this stage, we're on track for his first-up run at Flemington on February 15."

Mornington Cup on the agenda for Aktau

Mike Moroney is hoping to target the Mornington Cup (Listed, 2400m) on March 21 with British import Aktau (Teofilo), who will make his second Australian start when he lines up in tomorrow's Mal Seccull Handicap (1800m) at Caulfield. The progressive stayer was bought as a Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) prospect and he made a successful start for his current connections when landing a 1600-metre benchmark race at Flemington on December 21. "He was really impressive first-up and he's trained on very well," Moroney said. "We've given him time between runs. We're trying to keep him in work to have a crack at the Mornington Cup, all going well." The winner of the Mornington Cup earns a ballot exemption to the \$5 million Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) in October.

Concerns raised over Rapid Racing

Concerns have been raised over the random allocation of jockeys in Rapid Racing. Speaking to Racing.com, Sam Lyons, racing manager for Grand Syndications, said his organisation would not rule out nominating, accepting and then scratching their two-year-old Mr Have A Chat (I'm All Talk) if they didn't get the right jockey for their colt at Flemington's twilight fixture on February 9. Warrnambool trainer Symon Wilde echoed those sentiments. "We've got a two-yearold coming out of the Blue Diamond Preview which we really need to race in that race because there's not much else for him compared to the fillies," Wilde told Racing.com. "We had Ollie (Damien Oliver) aboard at the weekend and he would like to stay with the horse. Also, that horse is 15 hands standing on his tippy toes and he's a colt and has got a few tricks. He's not a horse that you want to take a lucky dip on."

Moonee Valley called off

Tonight's meeting at Moonee Valley has been called off due to forecasts of extreme heat. Racing Victoria and the Moonee Valley Racing Club made the decision yesterday after consulting with RV's veterinary department, the Bureau of Meteorology and the respective jockeys' and trainers' associations. The forecast is for 42 degrees in Melbourne this afternoon with the heat lasting into the evening. "The hottest part of the day is predicted to be late afternoon when many horses would be required to travel, and the temperature is currently predicted to be 41 degrees when the meeting is scheduled to start at 6.30pm," RV's Greg Carpenter said. Carpenter said the meeting would not be rescheduled but the club would explore options to hold the Lunar New Year celebrations on February 7.

Eden waiting on VCAT decision

Shea Eden faces a further wait to learn the future of his training career after his appeal over a 15-month ban was heard at the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal yesterday. Eden was banned by the Racing Appeals and Disciplinary Board in March last year for allegedly stomach-tubing his mare Considering (So You Think) at Swan Hill in June 2018. Eden appealed the suspension and has been training under a stay of proceedings since. In an email sent to his owners on Thursday, Eden said a decision on his appeal was reserved for another date. "We thought we had a good morning in at VCAT and with both lots of closing submission and plenty of interaction from the judge, he has now closed the matter and he will go away and put together his decision and advise his verdict accordingly," the email read.

Oaks contingent to become clearer for Marsh

Stephen Marsh still has five fillies in contention for the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) at Trentham in March and the Cambridge trainer is set to saddle two of those Oaks possibilities - Elisa Carolina (Mafki) and Heart Of The Ocean (Tavistock) - in the Oaks Prelude (Listed, 1800m) at New Plymouth tomorrow. The former broke her maiden over 1600 metres on January 3, while the latter finished seventh in the Auckland Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) at her last start. "Elisa Carolina is a nice, strong filly and I think the Oaks comes at the right time for her. She's going really well and getting better all the time," Marsh said. "Heart Of The Ocean has plenty of ability but she's still a bit immature so whether she's ready for our Oaks or might be better off waiting for a race like the Queensland Oaks, we'll just wait and see."

Alice Tinker set for Classic mission

Also at New Plymouth, Ngaire Fraser is looking forward to saddling Alice Tinker (Il Cavallo) in the Woburn Farm Classic (Gr 3, 1200m). The promising juvenile broke her maiden second-up at Otaki on January 6 to provide her sire, Il Cavallo (Choisir), with his first winner. "She ran a huge race firstup at Ellerslie and just got caught. Then she got a cough so for a month, she did practically nothing," Fraser said. "She's a great eater, I mean a huge eater. I've never seen a two-year-old eat the way she does in all my years so I thought the trip away and the 800-metre race (at Ptaki) fitted nicely with what I was wanting to do with her. This is a big jump from a Monday Otaki maiden but we're all in the same boat. We really like her and we think she can run well. It will be a long drive home if she doesn't go any good anyway."

Cups removed from Japan roster

The Japanese Department of Agriculture and Fisheries last week removed four races - the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m), Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m), Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) and George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m) - from the list of contests Japanese racing fans will be able to bet on this year. And while the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m), which went the way of Japanese star Lys Gracieux (Heart's Cry) in 2019, remains a punting proposition so long as there is Japanese involvement once again, Moonee Valley Racing Club chief executive Michael Browell said the club would not issue Japanese invites just for the sake of having the race carried into that country. "As we did last year, we'll embark on a recruitment campaign, talk to the key connections, identify the key horses, but we don't want to go chasing the horse that might be rated 110," Browell told Racing.com. "We need to get a horse that's rated 120-plus to justify it."



Amazing Star dazzles for Purton and Ting at the Valley

mazing Star (Darci Brahma) put in a dazzling performance to take the Class 2 Stubbs Handicap (1200m) at Happy Valley on Wednesday and continue the fine form of trainer Jimmy Ting.

The improving five-year-old destroyed his rivals. A fast break to lead followed by a strong middle section had them working hard to keep tabs, and a determined drive to the line sealed a length and three-quarter success for the \$1.40 favourite.

"He's been going well this season and he did it the hard way tonight from a wide gate (12)," jockey Zac Purton said.

"He had to do some work early and had pressure applied to him again at the 600 (metres) but he kicked away nicely and did a good job."

But while the rider was pleased, he offered a note of caution for the future.

"He didn't have much left tonight so he needs to come on from that," he said.

Ting, with eight wins from the last seven race meetings, was a tad taken aback by the manner of Amazing Star's victory in a time of 1.08.99 (23.37, 22.04, 23.58).



"Amazing - Amazing Star!" he said. "The horse was in better form last time he ran. This time he was a bit fat, for him, but he won so easily, so I was a bit surprised with how he did that."

Amazing Star tipped the scales pre-race at 539 kilograms, his heaviest racing weight and five kilograms up on his previous win back in December. But the extra pounds didn't blunt the gelding's speed as he made it a hat-trick for the season so far.

"He's a very fast horse but it was his first time in Class 2 so I was afraid he'd have horses chasing him, but we were lucky that no horses could," Ting noted.

"At this stage there's a race on February 26, but I don't know whether I'll run him or not. I'll talk to the jockey and see what he says – I just need to see if the horse is in good form or not."

Amazing Star's win sealed doubles for Ting and Purton. The champion jockey kicked off with Shouson (Star Witness) while the trainer was also on the mark with Golden Glory (Patapan).

Shouson was a warm order in the opener, section one of the Class 4 Kennedy Handicap (1200m), and justified his price of \$1.90 with an easy success.

The John Moore-trained gelding burst clear with 200 metres to go and kept on well until Purton eased him through the final few strides to pass the post a length to the good.

Golden Glory was runner-up to Shouson last time out and the form stood up well as the Ting-trained nine-year-old boxed on determinedly to score by two lengths under Silvestre de Sousa in section two of the Class 4 Kennedy Handicap (1200m).

Albert ends So's wait

Chris So ended a run of 56 days and 84 runners without a winner, stretching back to December 4, when Master Albert (Magic Albert) put his best foot forward in section three of the Class 4 Kennedy Handicap (1200m).

"Finally!" the trainer said. "Over a month with no winner; we have to keep going, that's racing. Sometimes the draw is no good and things don't go your way."

Karis Teetan has stuck with the six-yearold through eight starts this term and has never placed outside the top five, with six top four finishes prior to this evening's score – the gelding's second win at start 33.

"This horse has just been knocking on the door, he's still in good form and we keep going," So added.

Teetan was in California dreamland as he landed a treble thanks to the Tony Cruztrained pair California Legend (Camelot) and Californiadeepshot (Deep Field).

The Mauritian punched the air when the latter – a two-from-two winner at Kembla Grange pre-import – passed the post a length and a half clear in the Class 3 Queen's Road East Handicap (1200m) for an impressive debut win.

"He's been trialling good, he's won both races overseas – I thought it might be tricky with the draw (12) but I had to be very confident, I had to make him understand everything about racing," Teetan said after Californiadeepshot had surged to the lead, settled into a rhythm and then kicked decisively for the line.

"He'd been to Happy Valley to trial so he knew what to expect, but what surprised me was how quickly he got that rail and that's what won him the race. Once he got it he switched off underneath me until I needed

him to quicken."

The middle leg of Teetan's trio came on the tough California Legend, who set the pace, battled on down the straight and held the lateclosing Dionysus Collin (Dream Ahead) by half a length to take the Class 4 Oi Kwan Handicap (1800m).

Cinq makes two for Moreira

Joao Moreira completed a double when he delivered Cinquante Cinq (Tavistock) through a sweet, cutting run to take the night's silverware, the Class 3 Volunteers' Challenge Cup Handicap (1650m).

Benno Yung's charge went off the \$2.10 favourite but Moreira was last-but-one and

waiting on a split as the field of 12 took the home turn.

When the runners fanned, the cool rider angled inward for an opening and his mount quickened powerfully to hit the lead 100 metres out, scoring handsomely by two lengths.

"I was very lucky to get a split on the inside, it opened beautifully for me and he didn't just win, he won very impressively so he deserves some respect," Moreira said.

And the rider believes the manner of that success indicates that the lightly-raced five-year-old – who now has two wins from eight career starts – might cope with a rise to Class 2.

"He's done it very well today and off a light weight he might give it a shot," he said. "He showed a lot of gate speed for me and I wasn't sure how we were going to handle it because Benno said he would like me to ride him a little bit quiet, but I was going to end up three-wide so I kept bringing him back and back.

"Good horses do what he's done, he relaxed nicely, responded to my indications and when I got there in a comfortable position I could feel like he was coming strong to the end."

Moreira teamed up with Frankie Lor for an earlier success when Blooming Spirit (Spirit Of Boom) overcame top weight to land the Class 5 Morrison Hill Handicap, his first win at the 13th attempt and his first outing at 1650 metres.

The finale, the Class 2 Tin Lok Handicap (1650m), went to the Richard Gibson-trained Harmony Hero (Elvstroem). The five-year-old surged down the rail to overhaul BMW Hong Kong Derby (Listed, 2400m) entrant Reliable Team (Reliable Man) by three-quarters of a length.

Hong Kong racing continues at Sha Tin on Sunday, February 2.

Offered at the Gold Coast by Yarraman Park Stud, Rulership is a son of their resident flagbearer I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit), who has sired eight individual two-year-old winners this season and sits second to Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) on the juvenile sires leaderboard by earnings - a title he won last year.

One of five named foals, three of whom have

raced and all of whom have won, Rulership is out of the Listed-winning Dehere (Deputy Minister) mare Devoirs, making him a brother to the Blue Diamond Preview (F) (Gr 3, 1000m) runner-up Jedastar.

His second dam, Velasco (Flying Spur), was a Group 2-winning and Group 1-placed juvenile who was ranked joint-third filly on the New Zealand free handicap in 2003-04.

Devoirs does not have a yearling this year, but she has produced a filly foal by Yarraman Park's Hellbent (I Am Invincible) and is back in foal to the Group 1-winning son of I Am Invincible.

Outstanding closing sectionals for brilliant Caulfield winner Hanseatic

odolphin-raced colt Hanseatic (Street Boss) demonstrated a rare brand of acceleration in his brilliant victory in Saturday's Blue Diamond Prelude (C&G) (Listed, 1000m) at Caulfield, which was highlighted by outstanding sectional times.

After being trapped deep from his outside barrier (11), Luke Currie rode patiently and settled Hanseatic just beyond midfield (deep with cover) before making a wide move nearing the home turn.

The talented colt then showed a great turn of foot, dashed to the front at the 200 metres and drew away to win easily by two and a half-lengths from the Robbie Griffiths-trained Glenfiddich (Fastnet Rock), with the Lindsay Park-trained Fixated (Hinchinbrook) back in third.

The time for the 1000 metres was a quick 57.48, with Hanseatic producing very fast closing sectionals of 43.55 (last 800m), 32.93 (last 600m), 21.59 (last 400m) and 10.97 for his final 200 metres.

Perhaps even more impressive was Hanseatic's 200-metre breakdown for the last 800 metres - 10.62, 11.34, 10.62, 10.97 - which featured three splits under 11 seconds, two of which were recorded in the final two 200-metre sections - a feat which is rarely achieved.

The victory resulted in the Anthony Freedman-trained colt, who is unbeaten in two starts having won the Merson Cooper Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Sandown Hillside on debut

on November 16, becoming the favourite for the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Caulfield on February 22.

The fillies' division of the Blue Diamond Preview (Gr 3, 1000m), resulted in an allthe-way win for the Ciaron Maher and David

The quicker overall time was due to A Beautiful Night running the first 200 metres of the race (from the barrier) in 13.10, while Hanseatic clocked 13.77 when eased back in that early part having been caught deep.

A Beautiful Night still produced very smart closing times, clocking 44.04 (last 800m), 33.53 (last 600m), 22.25 (last 400m) with her final 200 metres in 11.34.

After beginning smartly for John Allen, A Beautiful Night travelled comfortably in the lead before grabbing a break at the 200 metres. She then showed gameness in holding off a late challenge from the Peter and Paul Snowdentrained Fresh (Fastnet Rock) to score by a longneck.

Fresh also went well on the watch. After being trapped wide from a difficult barrier (11) and racing in sixth place, she fought bravely, clocking 43.89 (Iast 800m), 33.27 (last 600m), 22.08 (last 400m) with her final 200 metres in 11.20.

he serving barn is one of the most stressful places on a stud farm and things can go wrong very quickly if an excitable 600kg stallion isn't in good hands.

A no-nonsense attitude with some TLC is a prerequisite and Kristy Reynolds combines both as the stallion manager at Scenic Lodge in WA.

Reynolds, 21, took sole charge of Snippetson, Universal Ruler and Dash For Cash in the season just gone and she came through with flying colours according to the stud's general manager Jeremy Smith.

"Kristy is naturally-gifted with horses and has advanced through our system since starting here through work-experience at school," Smith said. "I noticed she just seemed to click with the stallions and was very keen to take on the challenge when the stallion manager position became available.

"It was a massive call to give her such a responsible role. The stallions are our most important asset and I did question whether she was mature enough to ensure covers are done safely with no risk to the stallion, mare or staff.

"I'm delighted to say the stallions have responded to Kristy. Particularly Snippetson. He absolutely loves Kristy and I have seen a big change in his personality which shows in the way he's covering mares

"With that first stud season under the belt,

I'm sure Kristy will have learned so much and I look forward to seeing her progress further."

Snippetson has made a successful sea change from the Hunter Valley to Western Australia. Tinsnip emerged from his first crop to claim Champion WA 2YO honours last season and he followed up with Gemma's Son who is pre-post favourite for the \$250,000 Magic Millions 2YO Classic.

"He's my favourite," Reynolds agreed. "You have to bond and be strong – mentally and physically – so he listens and knows what's required."

Kristy grew up in Perth's eastern suburbs at Maida Vale before the family moved to Lower Chittering following the death of her father in 2012. "Mum wasn't into horses. She took a lot of convincing when I told her I wanted a career in the industry but relented when she realised I had a passion for working with horses.

"I've always had a connection to stallions and loved the idea of working with them someday. Scenic Lodge has provided me with an opportunity and it's like a dream come true."

Reynolds went to school at Bullsbrook College and had two years' work experience at Scenic Lodge in Years 11 & 12. "That expanded into a full-time job in 2017 and it's given me the chance to let my love and understanding of stallions shine through and reflect in my ability to do the job well and to the best of my ability."

The Bullsbrook College connection has also turned into full-time employment for her former schoolmates Teagan Hollister and Lily Smith. "We're like one big family at Scenic Lodge. Everyone looks out for each other."

The Scenic Lodge team will be out in force when Gemma's Son runs in the Magic Millions 2YO Classic at Pinjarra on February 8, a week before this year's Perth Yearling Sale. He's trained by David Harrison for syndicate that includes his wife Jenny, Graham & Megan Donovan, Keith & Carol Holly and Lex & Shirley Piper.

meeting and then bolted in by four-lengths at Ascot on the Australia Day long weekend.

"She's a late October foal and is a really nice filly with time on her side to keep growing," Reynolds said. "Lily led in Gemma's Son last year and he was a lovely type with a beautiful temperament. We're full-on prepping for this year and one of the standouts is the Blackfriars sister to Friar Fox (Lot 83)."

Reynolds also breeds Quarter-Horses. Her latest foal is by WA-bred sire Best I Get An Invite who is based in NSW from USA mare Maybe Vital Signs who boards at Scenic Lodge.

Stallion handlers aren't as crucial in the Quarter-Horse industry. Artificial insemination (AI) is legal and all Kristy had to do was pay for a shipment of frozen semen!


