Grounded planes leave horses and shuttle stallions in limbo

International Racehorse Transport halts operations due to Covid-19

International Racehorse Transport (IRT) is working with domestic and overseas authorities in a bid to develop protocols that would allow equine flights to restart during the coronavirus pandemic that has seen air travel cease.

Chris Burke, IRT's managing director, yesterday revealed that the company's last

flight took place on Thursday before a complete shutdown of horse air travel was enacted as world leaders continue to attempt to slow the spread of Covid-19.

"Obviously, in light of what the world is trying to do in terms of reducing the risk, we need to strike a balance between trying to resume commercial operations but at the same time doing it in a safe way," Burke told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday. *Continued on page 2 >>*

Racing Victoria latest jurisdiction to cut prize-money

Racing Victoria will cut prize-money and stand down staff in a bid to reduce expenditure during the coronavirus pandemic.

From tomorrow, RV said 40 per cent of its permanent staff would be temporarily stood down or required to work reduced hours.

The RV board and executive team have voluntarily agreed to a reduction in pay of 50 per cent and 20 per cent respectively. *Industry News page 9 >>*

"The main thing we're working on now is trying to find a medium-term solution whereby flying groomers is seen like aircraft staff and that they are in isolation when they are on the ground.

"The freighter aircraft themselves are playing a more important role than ever flying around the world because there's limited freight moving in the belly of passenger aircraft.

The freighters are having to take on a heavy burden of all these pharmaceuticals and all these other things that we require (being shipped globally).

IRT management has begun talks with major Asian racing jurisdictions in a bid to develop a plan to allow horse movement prior to the peak May to July period.

"We usually have monthly flights to all those destinations (Singapore and Hong Kong) and obviously trans-Tasman flights multiple times a week and then

also imports from the northern hemisphere, so they are all on hold," he said.

"But already we are working with the Hong Kong Jockey Club and the Singapore Turf Club to try and find a solution in the medium to term to allow those racehorses to travel to those Asian countries where they are needed for racing.

"The list of horses that want to get up there is building and, traditionally, May, June, July is a busy time to move horses up to those destinations, so we need to try and find some solutions by then."

New Zealand Air Freight also stopped services early last week after the country's prime minister Jacinda Ardern moved to level four restrictions in the fight against the deadly virus.

The standstill could also make it difficult for the three international horses competing at The Championships in Sydney in the next couple of weeks to return home.

Japan's Danon Premium (Deep Impact), who is targeting the Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) on Saturday week at Randwick, is booked to depart on April 20 but that plan now needed to be reconfirmed while arrangements for UK trainer William Haggas' pair of Young Rascal (Intello) and Addeybb (Pivotal) remain unclear given the current shutdown.

Burke also remains confident that a viable solution can be agreed upon by government officials in time for equine flights to resume to allow shuttle stallions to stand in the southern hemisphere later this year. *Continued on page 3>>*

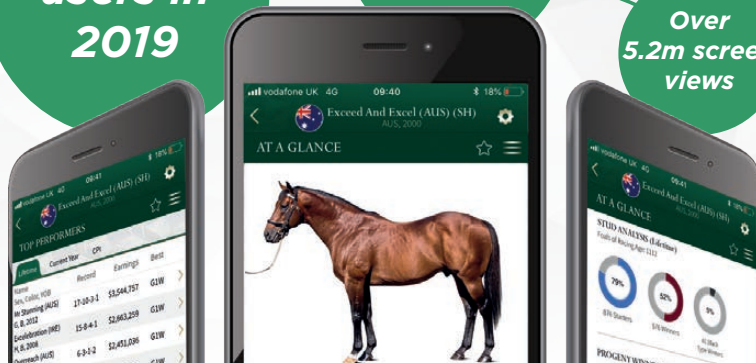

“(If it got to that) then we perhaps need to look at charter options by sending a whole plane up to collect them and bringing them back (to Australia),” Burke said.

“The beauty is, we are only talking about a limited number of people that get on a freighter aircraft.

“Typically, a freighter aircraft would have a maximum of five people on board and if that means that we have to quarantine those staff before they go and quarantine them when they come home, as long as we know we are safe to do it, then we will be looking at those options.”

The likes of high-profile shuttlers such as Justify (Scat Daddy) and American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile) from Coolmore and reverse

shuttler Exceed And Excel (Danehill) from Godolphin, who both operate their own equine flights, and the return of Widden Stud’s champion first season sire Zoustar (Northern Meteor) could be in jeopardy if air transport remains in limbo.

Stallions arriving from the northern hemisphere need to undertake 14 days of quarantine before being allowed to return

to stud farms. The breeding season begins on September 1.

“In relation to the shuttle stallions, it’s certainly not something that we have in any way given up on. There’s a lot of time, as you can see it’s a very fluid thing at the moment and seems to change daily,” he said.

“We are working with the government as they want to keep trade going where possible and, obviously, we have to be careful (about coronavirus) whether we are in the air or not.

“Staff are still looking after the horses and, as I said, we are only talking about a small number of people that would need to accompany a horse and we could isolate when they do return.”

Like many businesses affected by the coronavirus shutdown, IRT has placed some staff on leave while Burke contemplates how best to keep the company functioning in a time of strict people movement protocols.

“We are clamping down on expenses that we don’t have to pay and working with landlords and things like that from everywhere around the world,” he said.

“We are tightening the belt but at the same time seeing what (government) programs and measures are in place (to assist businesses). From a business point of view, flights are on hold at the moment.”

Boss with chance for eighth Doncaster Mile

No rider has a better Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) record than Glen Boss, especially on three-year-old colts and geldings, and the champion jockey will be attempting to add another Doncaster to his record with Brandenburg (Burgundy) on Saturday. Boss has won the feature seven times, the last five of those on three-year-olds: Racing To Win (Encosta De Lago), Haradasun (Fusaichi Pegasus), Triple Honour (Honours List), Kermadec (Teofilo) and Brutal (O'Reilly). Hobartville Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) winner Brandenburg drops six kilograms from his last-start fourth in the George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m). "Glen had his choice of a few and he got off him after the Ryder and said he wouldn't be on anything else," Brandenburg's trainer John Sargent said. "He'll run well because he can run on the speed or off the speed, it doesn't worry him. He handles the wet as well."

Newnham eyes Derby, Doncaster glory

Trainer Mark Newnham believes that Saturday's first day of The Championships is the leading day on Sydney's racing calendar and he heads to

Randwick with live chances in both the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) with Quackerjack (Not A Single Doubt) and the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) with Shadow Hero (Pierro). "I would say it's probably the signature day for someone like myself," Newnham said. "I've spent my whole working life at Randwick. I've been fortunate to have four Group One winners already as a trainer and they've all been at Randwick. I've been watching Derbies and Doncasters since I can remember and to me they're two of the traditional Sydney races that are the pinnacle of our sport. We've got a couple of new races that are worth a lot of money but they don't have the history of a Doncaster or a Derby. So if we were to win either of them that would probably be my biggest day in racing."

Racing can continue, says Newnham

Meanwhile, Newnham believes that racing is in a good position to be able to continue through the coronavirus crisis. While many major sports have had to stop competitions during the coronavirus situation, crowd-free racing is proceeding under strict biosecurity protocols for participants - and Newnham believes it can continue that way. "I'm very positive that we can keep going," Newnham said. "I get really upset when I hear members of the industry saying it's inevitable we shut down. Well, I see it the other way. I see that there's no reason to stop when we are doing all the right things. We're being as responsible as we can be, following all the guidelines we've been given and I know that from my staff of a morning."

Bott backs prize-money cuts

Trainer Adrian Bott says that the fact that racing is still proceeding in the midst of the Covid-19 crisis is a positive and that prize-money cuts for The Championships are understandable. Prize-

money has been halved for the eight Group 1 races over the two-week festival, with Bott and his training partner Gai Waterhouse to send out contenders like Con Te Partiro (Scat Daddy) in the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) and Shout The Bar (Not A Single Doubt) in the Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m). "They're the certain measures that need to be taken in order to make racing sustainable at the moment," Bott told RSN927. "We're very thankful for the opportunity that we currently do have and I think we have got great measures in place. The right protocols are there. Everyone is adhering to those and I think there's no reason why we shouldn't be able to continue under those circumstances. And I think that's only a very small price to pay, that everyone is happy and understanding enough to accept."

Bosson on Quick Thinker in Derby

OTI Racing's Terry Henderson is looking to have two Group 1 chances at Randwick on Saturday in two of Sydney racing's most historic events. OTI Racing is set to be represented by Tulloch Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) winner Quick Thinker (So You Think) in the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m), while Neville Sellwood Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) victor Night's Watch (Redwood) may back up in the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m). Quick Thinker will be out to give the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman partnership a third ATC Derby win in six years, with fellow Kiwi Opie Bosson to take the reins. "I think from the Tulloch, we can go into the Derby with some confidence, especially with a little bit of give in the ground," Henderson said. "It will be an interesting Derby. What Castelvechio does I think will be interesting because if they wait for the Queen Elizabeth we would be delighted, but that is probably unlikely."

Night's Watch under consideration to back up

An overdue win last weekend in the Neville Sellwood Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m) has syndicator Terry Henderson contemplating the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) on the seven-day back-up for Night's Watch (Redwood). Night's Watch had not won since September, 2018, when he won the Naturalism Stakes (Gr 3, 2000m). "That win was very welcome. He was starting to become a bit frustrating that horse," Henderson said. "He has been racing well, but when they give the others a start it is always going to be difficult. We have got him in the Doncaster and Queen Elizabeth. The Queen Elizabeth I think will be far too tough, but the Doncaster is a possibility. We will just see how he pulls up, but my gut feeling is I wouldn't mind seeing him in the Doncaster."

Top Queensland jockeys split into two regions

Queensland's top metropolitan jockeys will be divided into two divisions when regional racing begins in the state this week. Racing Queensland has introduced the five-region scheme in an effort to combat the spread of coronavirus within the industry. Racing continues with no crowds, while strict biosecurity restrictions are in place at race meetings and in stables. Riders were asked to nominate a region and, from today, they can only compete in that region. In the metropolitan region, riders can participate in Metro North - the two Brisbane tracks and the Sunshine Coast - or Metro South West, which takes in the Gold Coast, Ipswich and Toowoomba.

Maloney heads South West region

Group 1-winning rider Ryan Maloney has chosen to ride in the Metro South West region under Racing Queensland's new regional model. Maloney, who took the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) on Alligator Blood (All

Too Hard), will be based at the Gold Coast, Ipswich and Toowoomba while the coronavirus crisis continues, along with the returning Michael Cahill and Matthew McGillivray. The Metro North West region will be headlined by leading apprentices Baylee Nothdurft and Steph Thornton, as well as top jockeys Robbie Fradd, Jimmy Orman and Brad Stewart.

Wyang Provincial Championship heat rescheduled

The Wyong Provincial Championships Qualifier, which was washed out at Wyong last Saturday, will be run at Newcastle this evening. The \$150,000 Qualifier was called off after heavy rain. Racing NSW instead decided to add it to today's Newcastle card as the 11th race, with the race to jump at 6:05pm local time. Scratchings have been reinstated, with saddlecloth numbers and barriers unchanged. The first three across the line in the 1350m event will line up at Randwick in the \$400,000 Provincial Championships Final at Randwick on April 11.

Sydney Cup fancy Supernova spelled

Hawkes Racing confirmed yesterday that Supernova (Intello) would not be seen again during the Sydney autumn, instead heading for the spelling paddock. Supernova raced twice during the autumn, running on strongly both times for fourth in the Randwick City Stakes (Listed, 2000m) and third in the N E Manion Cup (Gr 3, 2400m). The British import was on the third line of betting for the Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) behind Young Rascal (Intello) and Mustajeer (Medicean).

Alabama Express on the improve

C F Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Alabama Express (Redoute's Choice) is no longer in

veterinary care after a severe infection following his below-par Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) performance last month. The Mike Moroney-trained three-year-old, who was secured by Yulong as a stallion prospect following his breakthrough Group 1 win, was found to have an elevated temperature the morning after the race. "The doctors struggled to find where the virus was coming from and how it was attacking him, but his temperature was high for a long time," Moroney told Racing.com. "It started to drop and we thought we'd be able to take him home but then it spiked again so he had to remain there. He's now back at Yulong and recovering well and we'll bring him back for the spring if all goes to plan."

Bowman appeals Avilius suspension

Jockey Hugh Bowman has appealed a hefty ban that is currently set to keep him on the sidelines for two feature meetings in Sydney in the coming weeks. Bowman was suspended by Racing NSW stewards for failing to ride out Avilius (Pivotal) in the final stages of the Tancred Stakes (Gr 1, 2400m), with the Godolphin galloper grabbed near the post by Mustajeer (Medicean) in the battle for second. At this stage, his 19-day suspension will begin next Monday, meaning he would miss the second day of The Championships and also All-Aged Stakes day.

Riordan injured in fall

Victorian apprentice Liam Riordan was taken to the Swan Hill hospital after a nasty fall in race four yesterday. Riordan and fellow apprentice Logan McNeil fell after the line in the Maiden Plate (1600m) on Incarnadine (Reliable Man) and Devega Rouge (Lope De Vega) respectively. It was confirmed late yesterday that Riordan had a broken collarbone and a bruised lung, but McNeil was unhurt.

Syndicators on track despite uncertainty

Uncertainty around the Covid-19 pandemic has created concern about trainers and syndicators being able to pay bills. However, at this stage, syndicators are reporting that most owners are proving reliable. "Our billing system is a little different at First Light Racing but talking to people in the industry most are reporting that owners are being really good during these tough times," First Light Racing's Tim Wilson told Racing.com. "No one is putting themselves above others, people aren't trying to get out of it, I think people are galvanising together and doing what they can. Everyone is in this together, we need to take care of each other, there will be people that are affected more than others so we will help everyone individually and make sure we get through this together just like the government is saying."

Sydney racing fraternity mass online

The Annual Racing Mass, which has traditionally welcomed in the Sydney autumn, has adopted a new format this year due to coronavirus restrictions. Prize-money cut likely for Caulfield Cup

Melbourne Racing Club (MRC) chief Josh Blanksby admits that this year's Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) will likely be worth less than the \$5 million for which it has been contested the past two years. Blanksby appeared on RSN927's The Verdict on Monday morning, where the topic of NSW's prize-money reductions for The Championships was raised. He admitted that Caulfield's flagship event was likely to face a

similar fate. "As I sit here, I'd probably say you'd think it would be reduced," Blanksby said. "But we want to work with all the clubs and Racing Victoria to make sure it's done in a concerted sort of way and what's required. It could be a very different Cup. I'm not sure if international participation will be high on the agenda for those coming or us seeking it as well, so it could be a different landscape."

Queensland trainer fined for NSW positive

Gatton trainer Brenton Andrew has been fined \$5,000 after his galloper Sugar Buzz (Mulaazem) returned a positive to dexamethasone in a post-race urine sample taken after winning at Ballina on January 5. Andrew pled guilty to a charge of presenting a horse to race with a prohibited substance in his system. Sugar Buzz was subsequently disqualified, with the Peter Stanley-trained Jahez (Sepoy) awarded the race.

Virus halts Pippie's South Australian campaign

Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) winner Pippie (Written Tycoon) will remain in Melbourne with travel restrictions making it difficult to head interstate. The original plan for Pippie, who finished a last-start fourth in the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m), was to target the Robert Sangster Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Morphettville. However, she's now likely to head to the \$200,000 VOBIS Gold Sprint at Caulfield before heading for a spell. "We had three options with her - we could go back to her home state of Queensland or send her to Sydney or Adelaide - but now the restrictions are pretty well enforced in different states and the owners just felt it was best for her to be safe and sound at home at Mornington," co-trainer Chris Meagher said. "We'll head to that VOBIS Gold race at Caulfield and then we'll have a break and concentrate on the spring."

'Bool carnival set for shake-up

The Warrnambool May Carnival is likely to be condensed with Country Racing Victoria (CRV), Racing Victoria (RV) and the Warrnambool Racing Club set for crucial discussions this week about the headline event. It was already announced that the three-day festival would be closed to crowds due to Covid-19, and the program looks set to be significantly overhauled. "CRV, the club and Racing Victoria are mulling over that at the moment," CRV chief Scott Whiteman said. "It is clear that the carnival won't be run as we know that carnival and love it. However we are keen to see racing occur down there. I wouldn't like to say for sure what will happen. There are a fair few moving parts, but we are hoping to have it resolved this week. I would dare say at very best we would run two days there. So the programs will be altered significantly."

NEW ZEALAND

Zed's name up in lights

Verry Elleegant (Zed) further enhanced the profile of her sire on Saturday when winning the Tancred Stakes (Gr 1, 2400m) at Rosehill. Zed (Zabeel) has sired two individual Group One winners, with 2013 Makfi Challenge Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner Survived and now the triple Group One-winning mare. Grangewilliam Stud principal Mark Corcoran, who stands Zed, was delighted with the win in what has been a trying few weeks. "It was a huge result, she won pretty impressively," he said. "She is just settling so much better now. She has been a bit tricky, but it looks like they have got to the bottom of her now, which is great. Zeds are pretty slow-maturing horses and she is getting stronger and bigger all the time, so I think next season she is going to get even better."

Lane heads to Japan

Top-class Australian jockey Damian Lane has travelled to Japan where he hopes to secure a three-month licence. Lane, who won the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) on Mer De Glace (Rulership) and Lys Gracieux (Heart's Cry) in the Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) before combining with the same mare to take out the Arima Kinen (Gr 1, 2500m) last December, is currently completing 14 days isolation in Japan. However, he hopes to be cleared to compete from April 19, when he is scheduled to ride Salios (Heart's Cry) in the Satsuki Sho (Gr 1, 2000m) at Nakayama.

INTERNATIONAL

Derby-winning trainer to join forces with son

Paul Cole, who won the Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) in 1991 with Generous (Caerleon), will link up with his son Oliver in a training partnership, one

of the first British trainers to take the opportunity. Training partnerships are now a common sight elsewhere in the world, particularly in Australia and New Zealand, and the British Horseracing Authority introduced dual licences last year. Cole, who has been training near Lambourn since 1987, believes it is time to welcome Oliver - his assistant - into the fold. "Oliver has got a lot of young owners who are coming in, and I've got my old ones who still want me to train, so it would be stupid for us to have two different yards—it doesn't make sense," said Cole, who was crowned champion trainer in Britain in 1991. "It's much the same as it has been for the last five years, anyway".

Gordon Lord Byron to race on

More than six years after Gordon Lord Byron (Byron) won the George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m) at 1500m, trainer Tom Hogan is preparing the Irish galloper for the 2020 flat season - whenever it resumes. Now a 12-year-old, Gordon Lord Byron has won 16 of his 108 starts, having

competed all over the world. Last season, he didn't win - in fact, he hasn't won since taking the Greenlands Stakes (Gr 2, 6f) in May, 2017. However, he was rarely far away and a win at 12 isn't out of the question. "He was ready to run for the start of the season but obviously we're in an uncertain period at the moment," said Hogan. "He's in right old form and has done a few nice bits of work. Retirement won't suit him, but that's going to be his problem some day! He doesn't do the paddock, every day we keep him exercised and active, which is what he loves."

The staff members to be stood down are being encouraged to take accrued entitlements via annual leave and long service leave while those with minimal entitlements will be offered 20 days annual leave in advance.

Starting from next Monday, RV's contribution to the prize-money for all Victorian flat and jumps races will also be reduced until further notice.

- Metropolitan - a 20 per cent reduction in prize-money contribution per race.

- Country - 10 per cent provided that no TAB race is conducted for less than \$20,000.

RV said prize-money contributions to individual races by racing clubs and sales companies, which predominantly occurs during the major carnivals, would be at the discretion of those parties.

Super VOBIS and VOBIS Gold bonuses will be reduced by 15 per cent in metropolitan races and 7.5 per cent in the country, while next month's The Showdown will be reduced from \$1 million to \$905,000.

The \$500,000 VOBIS Gold Guineas has been reduced by almost \$50,000 and other



VOBIS Gold premier races will be reduced by 20 per cent in town and 10 per cent in the country.

"The Covid-19 pandemic has had an incredible impact on the world as we know it, affecting livelihoods and our way of life," RV chairman Brian Kruger said.

"Racing is not immune to that and thus we have had to make some incredibly tough decisions today around our workforce and prize-money which fuels participation in our industry.

"These are not decisions that we have taken lightly, however the impacts of the past fortnight and the nation's rapidly evolving economic crisis means that we must act now to help soften the blow for Victorian racing.

"It has become clear that this pandemic and the associated economic crisis will have a long-term impact on our industry if we don't seek to mitigate the impact now.

"It is critical for the long-term viability of the industry that we reduce our expenditure to help compensate for the short to medium term reduction we will have in our revenues.

"Equally, this will ensure that we are in the best position to support the industry if a shutdown occurs and to subsequently lead the rebuild of Victorian racing."

The move follows on from NSW, South Australia and Queensland cutting prize-money and, in some cases, reshaping race programs.

Daredevil - Former WinStar Farm resident Daredevil (More Than Ready), who relocated to Turkey towards the end of 2019, sired his third individual stakes winner on Saturday when Swiss Skydiver (3 f ex Expo Gold by Johannesburg) ran out a dominant winner of the Gulfstream Park Oaks (Gr 2, 8.5f). Third in a Fair Grounds Grade 2 on February 15, the Ken McPeck-trained Swiss Skydiver continued on her upward curve by pulling three and a quarter-lengths clear of Lucrezia (Into Mischief) in second. In what proved a thrilling finish in which a blanket could have been thrown over the first four home, Zousonic (Zoustar) was a further nose back in third, while the same margin separated her from the fourth-placed Spend (Snitzel). Deep Field covered 256 mares at a fee of \$44,000 in 2019 and his other stakes winners are Cosmic Force, Dig Deep and Xilong. He will be represented by a Torryburn Stud-consigned colt at next week's Inglis Easter.

Deep Impact will have three representatives at next week's Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale.

Holy Roman Emperor - Coolmore's durable stallion Holy Roman Emperor (Danehill) sired his 86th individual stakes winner on Monday when Numerian (4 g ex Delicate Charm by High Chaparral) took the Devoy Stakes (Listed, 1m 2f) at Naas. The Joseph O'Brien-trained Numerian had twice been placed in stakes races as a three-year-old, but a gelding operation has brought out his best and he looks bound for Group races. He defeated last season's Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) favourite Sir Dragonet (Camelot) by almost three lengths, with Halimi (Teofilo) back in third. Holy Roman Emperor stands for €15,000 (\$27,525) (inc GST) at Coolmore's Castlehyde Stud.

I Am Invincible - The Ciaran Maher and David Eustace-trained Holyfield (2 c ex Hurtle Myrtle by Dane Shadow) took his record to three wins from four starts when delivering a knockout blow under Tom Marquand in Saturday's The Schweppervescence (Gr 3, 1400m) at Rosehill. In doing so, the upwardly-mobile juvenile became the 55th individual stakes winner for Yarraman Park Stud's flagbearer I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit), whose stellar recent run included a

second Group 1 success for Holyfield's stable companion Loving Gaby in last week's William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Moonee Valley. After current withdrawals, I Am Invincible has 44 lots catalogued for Inglis Easter.

Into Mischief - Spendthrift Farm stallion Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday) sired his 69th individual stakes winner on Saturday when Bemma's Boy (5 h ex Arcing by Arch) landed the Pan American Stakes (Gr 2, 12f) on the turf at Gulfstream. Making a deserved breakthrough in Graded company having been Grade 3-placed on his last outing in January, Bemma's Boy showed a good attitude under Florent Geroux, getting the better of Zulu Alpha (Street Cry) by a neck. Current (Curlin) was a further head away in third in what proved a dramatic finish to the staying contest. Into Mischief, who is currently standing for a career-high fee of US\$175,000, is also the sire of dual Breeders' Cup winner Goldencents. Into Mischief has two yearlings catalogued for next week's Inglis Easter.

Lope De Vega - Ballylinch Stud's Lope De Vega (Shamardal) enjoyed more success in the southern hemisphere when Vegadaze (4 g ex Rainy Daze by Commands) landed the Star Kingdom Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) at Rosehill to become the stallion's 67th individual stakes winner worldwide. Famed as the producer of star sprinter Santa Ana Lane and last month's Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) winner Gytrash, Lope De Vega unearthed another high-quality performer when the Anthony Cummings-trained Vegadaze fended off a duo of representatives from James Cummings' operation. Manicure (Exceed And Excel) ran second, beaten a neck, with a further half-length back to Kementari (Lonhro) in third.

New Approach - Cascadian (4 g ex Falls of Lora by Street Cry) secured the Doncaster Prelude (Gr 3, 1500m), in the process providing Darley stallion New Approach (Galileo) with his 52nd individual stakes winner. Mask Of Time (Holy Roman Emperor) ran second, beaten a neck, with Gaulois (Street Cry) another length and a quarter adrift in third. Cascadian, a French import who

Red Hot Choice - Late stallion Red Hot Choice (Redoute's Choice) sired his second stakes winner on Saturday when Red Hot Tip (3 g ex Zedlink by Zedrich) took out the Melvista Stakes (Listed, 2200m) at Ascot. Midnight Blue (So You Think) finished second, beaten three-quarters of a length, while Criminal Code (Maschino)

was a further length and a quarter adrift in third. Former Mungrup Stud resident Red Hot Choice spent five seasons at stud, covering a career-high book of 23 mares - at a fee of \$3,300 in - in 2015. He died in 2017, while his other stakes winner is the Listed scorer, and Group 3-placed, Sanabreanna. Red Hot Tip is now a dual winner from six starts, with yesterday being his first foray into black-type company.
