

The All-Star Mile has been run and won for the first time. Despite much debate, for and against (and I have been on both sides of it at times), I thought it ended up being a competitive race with a worthy winner, Mystic Journey, who produced an exciting effort to claim the lion's share of the \$5 million prize-money.

The pleasing thing was that even though there were a few low-rating horses in the field the margins were no greater than any other normal race. The thing I took most out of the race, though, is the way trainer Adam Trinder and jockey Anthony Darmanin have handled the winner throughout her career which culminated in the big-time success.

They have done an outstanding job with the way they looked after her during the spring and the way she has come on in the autumn which has come about through their patience last year.

Coolmore acquire share in Golden Slipper colt Yes Yes Yes

Son of Rubick finds home at stud after multimillion-dollar deal

oolmore Stud have purchased a 50 per cent share in Yes Yes Yes (Rubick), on the eve of the colt's run in Saturday's "stallionmaking" Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m).

The dominant last-start Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner is a son of Coolmore's first season sire Rubick (Encosta De Lago) and was the only colt in the \$3.5 million race not already part-owned by stud farm interests.

Coolmore's affiliation with the Chris Waller-

trained Yes Yes Was confirmed yesterday by the colt's part-owner Brae Sokolski.

"We are ecstatic about having (Coolmore) in the horse. It was the right time just prior to the Slipper and they are the right partner," Sokolski told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"There was always the option [to hold off] but we thought he had established a very strong base value by winning the Todman, which is a stallion-making race in its own right, and it was the right play to bring in a partner at this juncture."

Sokolski said Coolmore was not the only stud who had made a play for the \$200,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale graduate.

Continued from page 1 "Some of the other leading farms in the country had also recognised his potential to be the leading colt of his generation, so there was a lot of interest, particularly out of the Hunter Valley," he said.

"We were in the privileged position to be able to deal with the leading farms and Coolmore, to me, were the standout choice."

Yes Yes Yes made an impression at his first start, finishing runnerup to Brooklyn Hustle (Starspangledbanner) at Moonee Valley in December, before winning twice at metropolitan level in Melbourne that same month.

A trip to the Gold Coast for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) ensued but he was scratched after being found to be lame after the interstate float trip.

The colt was transferred to the Waller stable in February following former trainer Darren Weir's disqualification.

"He has always been a little bit immature and backward. He has never been one of these colts who is just a readymade two-year-old and when we got him up to the Gold Coast he was never the finished product," Sokolski said.

"Even that trip just matured the horse a lot. He has now furnished into a magnificent, strong two-year-old in that short space of time. There is still a lot to come.

"Weiry always said that we wouldn't see the best of him until : for the race.

probably as an autumn three-year-old which is pretty exciting when you contemplate what he has been able to do at this stage of his career."

Earlier this year, Kitchwin Hills, Glenlogan Park, Neil Werrett and Max Whitby combined to secure a share in Silver Slipper Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) winner Time To Reign (Time For War) and Aquis Farm also bought a share in subsequent Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) placed Free Of Debt (Unencumbered).

Aquis Farm also owns ATC Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) winner Dubious (Not A Single Doubt) as well as Slipper third emergency Bellevue Hill (Pierro).

Current race favourite, Pago Pago Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Cosmic Force (Deep Field), was purchased by the Newgate Farm, China Horse Club, Winstar Farm and Horse Ventures syndicates as a yearling.

Second emergency Rome (Pierro), who is owned by the James Harron Bloodstock colts syndicate, is the only potential stud prospect without a likely stud home should his racecourse career justify him becoming a sire.

Godolphin, who has seven acceptors for the Golden Slipper, own homebred Skyline Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winning colt Microphone (Exceed And Excel) and the Lonhro Plate (Listed, 1100m) winner Bivouac (Exceed And Excel), the first emergency for the race.

Sunlight drawn wide in William Reid

A field of 11 has been accepted for tomorrow's William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Moonee Valley and Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Sunlight (Zoustar) will have to defy the widest barrier if she is to record her third victory at Group 1 level. Trained by Tony McEvoy, \$2.25 early favourite Sunlight has been drawn in gate 11 but will jump from barrier ten after the defection of Champagne Cuddles (Not A Single Doubt), while her nearest market rival the Anthony Freedman-trained Shoals (\$3.20) (Fastnet Rock) - has been handed gate five. Written By (Written Tycoon) is next in the betting at \$9.50 and he will break from gate eight under Jordan Childs.

Embrace Me tackles William Reid

The William Reid field also includes the Danny O'Brien-trained Embrace Me (Shamexpress), who will make the leap into top-flight company having caused an upset in the Typhoon Tracy Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at the track last month her third course and distance success. "Every time she's gone to the races, she's improved and hopefully, she's still on an upward spiral," O'Brien told Racing.com. "She hasn't raced against anything of Sunlight's calibre yet. She beat a group of fillies last start in a Group 3 that weren't the top-line fillies but ultimately, you only find out by going up in grade. The big plus for her is this race is at Moonee Valley. She's a filly that's in great form and she really has an affinity with Moonee Valley."

Change of plans for Consensus

Due to the wet conditions in Sydney,
Consensus (Postponed) will now not take her
place in the Ranvet Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at
Rosehill on Saturday and instead be re-routed

to the Sunline Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) at Moonee Valley on Friday night. "Sydney is just too wet," Stephen McKee said. "We were going for the Ranvet. We ran fourth on a heavy track last year, but I think the track is going to at least be as wet again this year. We decided we needed to race somewhere and we found this one in Melbourne, so we are going there instead. It's only for the one race. We will run on Friday night and then we will decide on whether we might head up to Sydney and wait for the tracks to dry up, or we might come home and may wait to go to Brisbane later."

Begg confident Written By can shine at The Valley

Grahame Begg has also issued an upbeat bulletin on Written By, who finished a two and a half-length sixth in the Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Flemington last month, suggesting he will be well-suited by returning to racing around a bend. "He enjoyed his trip out to the Valley last week and had a good solid gallop," Begg said. "He got to chase one and did a good, solid piece of work so it worked out well. He was a little underdone first-up but that brought him on, but then things didn't pan out right at Flemington in the Lightning. We've kept him nice and well for Friday night and I think he'll run a lot better."

Winx set to face eight in Ryder

Winx (Street Cry) firmed into \$1.06 favouritism:

after nine acceptances were received for the George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m) at Rosehill on Saturday. The opposition includes three stable companions - Prompt Response (Beneteau), Egg Tart (Sebring) and Ringerdingding (Sebring), while the second line of the betting is topped by \$17 chance Land Of Plenty (Stratum), who was last seen finishing fourth in the Futurity Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) last month. Dreamforce (Fastnet Rock), So Si Bon (So You Think), Teleplay (Written Tycoon) and Brutal (O'Reilly) complete the line-up.

Weather to dictate Dreamforce Ryder run

The participation of Dreamforce, however, is weather-dependent with trainer John Thompson eyeing the Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) at Randwick on April 6 for the six-year-old. "As long as it dries up a bit he will run," Thompson said. "He will run up to probably a heavy eight, but if it's a nine or 10 he probably wouldn't run. He is going super. He was probably a bit stiff first-up and then won well second-up. It was a shame we had to scratch him last week because he was in a nice race for him. We pretty much have got to run this week if we want to have him cherry ripe for the Doncaster two weeks after Saturday."

Rain-affected Slipper a concern for Gollan

The prospect of a testing track is also concerning Tony Gollan ahead of Vincere Volare's (I Am Invincible) run in the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Rosehill on Saturday. The two-year-old filly was last seen running third in the Reisling Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) on a Good 4 track earlier in the month and Gollan feels she will not perform as well on a heavy track, but is happy with barrier 11. "I am happy with that. She can roll forward from there and stay out of trouble," Gollan said. "I watched her work this week and she is going very well. On a dry track I would be confident."

Snowden warns not to forget fillies

Despite housing new favourite Cosmic Force (Deep Field), co-trainer Peter Snowden believes Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) winner Anaheed (Fastnet Rock) and dual-Group 3 scorer Catch Me (I Am Invincible) to have slipped under the radar in the build-up to the Golden Slipper. "Anaheed, she's a forgotten horse. She loves the ground," co-trained Snowden told Racing NSW. "She worked on the course proper and it was a bog and she went through it like it was nothing. Catch Me has shown glimpses of absolute brilliance in the past. She has to stretch it to 1200 metres but there's no reason why she won't off a hot speed."

Lyre pleases Freedmans

Meanwhile, Lyre (Lonhro) continues to impress her connections as she bids to become the sixth juvenile to complete the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m)-Golden Slipper double. Lyre won a soft-ground barrier trial at Randwick last week, while she is reported to have worked well at the track on Tuesday, providing connections with optimism she will handle the testing underfoot conditions at the weekend. "Luke Currie was raving about her and said she seemed to love the ground in the trial," Sam Freedman, assistant trainer to his father Anthony, said. "And again on Tuesday morning she galloped on the course proper at Randwick, worked with a mate and went past like it was standing still."

Payne eyes Guineas place with Costello

David Payne is under no illusions of the task facing Costello (Americain) in Saturday's Rosehill Guineas (Gr 1, 2000m), for which crack three-year-old The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) is hot \$1.55 favourite, but he is hopeful the colt can finish in the top three prior to a tilt at the ATC Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) at Randwick on April 6. Costello has landed handicaps at Warwick Farm and Rosehill the last twice and Payne does not envisage the wet track proving problematic. "He's versatile. His half-brother Be Like Dad was a mudlark and he's by Americain so I don't think it should worry him," Payne said.

"The further for him the better. He's a real staying horse and he's got a little bit of class about him. And he's a horse that only just coming into himself, he's just getting there now maturity-wise."

Pride duo set for Redzel match-up

Joe Pride is looking forward to saddling both Ball Of Muscle (Dubawi) and Easy Eddie (Super Easy) in The Galaxy (Gr 1, 1100m) at Rosehill, the market for which is headed by dual The Everest (1200m) winner Redzel (Snitzel), who was beaten a short-head by Ball Of Muscle when the pair met in the Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1000m) at Randwick earlier in the month. "In terms of splitting my two for the punters, I'd go on the track rating," Pride said. "If that track is six or better, I'd go with Ball Of Muscle, if it's worse than six then Easy Eddie. Of Ball Of Muscle, Pride added: "When they've got that, geez, who knows how far they can go. He's just refusing to lay down at the moment." And of Easy Eddie, he said: "People might look at his form and think he only beat She Knows and All Over Bosanova but it's the amount of improvement he takes out of a run. I know he'll be significantly better this week."

Cummings expects Avilius to bounce back

James Cummings is hopeful of an improved showing from Avilius (Pivotal) in the Ranvet

Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at the weekend after the four-year-old finished fifth, beaten a length and a half, when hot favourite for the Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington earlier in March. "He has work to do to build on his unplaced effort in the Australian Cup," Cummings said. "I'm convinced he's gone ahead after having done a little too well between his last two runs. He's capable of more on this testing ground against similar opposition. No doubt it would be a rewarding achievement to turn that form around in such a high-class event."

McEvoy looks forward to Classique ride

Kerrin McEvoy believes unbeaten three-yearold Classique Legend (Not A Single Doubt) has 'more to offer' as he takes a step up in class in the Munro Stakes (Listed, 1200m). Trained by Les Bridge, Classique Legend impressed when winning a Kensington handicap by six lengths on March 6 - his second outing - and he has drawn barrier 11 in a 14-runner field. "His attitude has been great and he's got a bit fitter as we've gone along," McEvoy told Racing NSW. "I liked the way he got through the soft ground on Tuesday morning. I think he's versatile enough and he has that dynamic turn of foot and I think there's still a bit more to offer if he has to pull out a bit more in a race. It's a fair jump in grade that's for sure, a different ball game."

Three options for Mr Marbellouz

The Kevin Kemp-trained Mr Marbellouz (Love Conquers All) will accept for races at Eagle Farm and the Gold Coast on Saturday but is no certainty to start in either, with his main target being the Weetwood Handicap (Listed, 1200m) at Toowoomba on April 6. Mr Marbellouz was a short-priced favourite for the Goldmarket Handicap (Listed, 1300m) at the Gold Coast before it was washed out last Saturday and he holds a nomination in the rescheduled contest this weekend, while Kemp has also accepted the five-year-old for a 1000-metre contest at Eagle Farm. "We will have a good luck at both fields and decide where he is best placed," Kemp said. "Really, he doesn't have to start in either."

Freedman has high hopes for Chenier

The Anthony Freedman-trained Chenier (Medaglia D'Oro), who recorded an emphatic five and a half-length debut success at Sandown on Wednesday, could be fast-tracked into Group 1 company for a tilt at the Champagne Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Randwick on April 20. "He's only had seven weeks work and normally he'd have another trial but he seems to have very good ability and great natural fitness," Freedman said. "To come here today, off a very minimal prep, suggests he's potentially very good. It's not unrealistic to think that he could be a Derby horse. His mother was placed in an Oaks. He's a very promising horse with a temperament that suggests he could get to a good level."

Dresden Green records first win

Dresden Green (Snitzel) broke his maiden at the third time of asking when securing a half-length success in the Robert Oatley Wines 2YO Maiden Plate (1300m) at Hawkesbury yesterday. Trained by Gai Waterhourse and Adrian Bott, Dresden Green is the first foal out of Asscher (Stravinsky), a placed half-sister to Group 1 winner Shower Of Roses (Zabeel), who also finished runner-up in the Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m), while his second dam, Marquise (Gold And Ivory), was herself a Group 1 winner from the blue-hen Eight Carat (Pieces Of Eight). The colt passed the post first on his second

start, only to have the race taken off him in the stewards' room. Dresden Green was purchased by her trainer, Julian Blaxland's Blue Sky Bloodstock and Kerri Radcliffe for \$1.2 million at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale from the Bhima Thoroughbreds draft.

Clark rides 100th winner for season

South Australian apprentice Raquel Clark rode her 100th winner in a season for the first time after Dream Kisses (Dream Ahead) won the Apprentice Series Handicap (1200m) at Doomben yesterday. Clark reached 99 winners on Sunday with a treble at Port Lincoln and her first season century was never in doubt when Dream Kisses went straight to the lead and never looked like being headed. American Genius (All American) was second for Queensland's Baylee Nothdurft with Victoria's Teo Nugent third on Tziporah (Duporth). Clark arrived in Brisbane on Tuesday night and rode trackwork on Wednesday morning. "I had never ridden the clockwise way of going and I wanted to get a feel for it," she said. "It is obviously a thrill to reach 100 but the idea is to keep going."

Soil testing begins at Ipswich

Geotechnical testing of the Ipswich race track has begun as officials seek a solution to the problems which have resulted in the loss of five recent meetings, despite there being little or no rain. Problems have arisen with the drainage system, which are believed to have been exacerbated by the underlying clay base. The club's next meeting is on Friday week and it is scheduled for two more meetings in the following fortnight, although an RQ spokesman emphasised there was no danger in losing the Ipswich Cup meeting in June, which provides 90 per cent of the club's annual income.

New Zealand

Volpe Veloce aims to bounce back

Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge) will aim to bounce back from her disappointing eighth place finish in the WFA Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) when she runs in the Japan NZ International Trophy (Gr 2, 1600m) at Tauranga on Saturday. "She is very

well," co-trainer Graham Richardson said. "At her last run she was a bit disappointing and it left me questioning myself about how she went. The track at Otaki wasn't right but in saying that it wasn't right for all of them. She just looked uncomfortable the whole way. She never looked happy at any stage in that race. I put her out for a week in the paddock when she got home and then brought her up and hopefully, she will run well on Saturday."

South Australia an option for Beyond The Fort

Waverley trainer Bill Thurlow was pleased with the runner-up performance of lightly-raced three-year-old Beyond The Fort (Niagara) in last Saturday's New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) and has mooted a crack at the South Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2000m) for the filly. "We nearly got there, we weren't surprised, she's a pretty good horse," said Thurlow. "She can stay all day and she was beaten by a better horse on the day, but beaten by a more seasoned horse on the day, and in the ground it probably told the last 150 metres. She's not nominated for Sydney and I probably wouldn't appeal to the owners to pay a late nomination to be fair. "She looks good after the race and if she does well she could go to Morphettville for the South Australian Oaks in May."

Asia

The Autumn Sun among Champions Mile entries

A tantalising clash between Hong Kong best's racehorse, Beauty Generation (Road To Rock), and Australian three-year-old sensation The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) could be on the cards after both horses were one of 40 entries received for the Champions Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) at Sha Tin on April 28. Australian representation could also be garnered through the Anthony Freedman-trained Shoals (Fastnet Rock) and the Lindsay Park-trained Fundamentalist (Not A Single Doubt), who finished runner-up to The Autumn Sun in the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). Le Romain (Hard Spun) and So Si Bon (So You Think) complete the five entries from Australia, while New Zealand could be represented by Elusive Treasure (Northern Meteor), Eminent (Frankel) and Vigor Winner (Declaration Of War).

Four Australian-trained horses entered in QEII Cup

The Autumn Sun and So Si Bon hold double-entries in the QEII Cup (Gr 1, 2000m), while Australia could also be represented by the Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained Group 1 winner Extra Brut (Domesday) and the Lindsay Park-trained Harlem (Champs Elysees), a stable companion of So Si Bon. Eminent and Elusive Treasure are also both double-entered. A total of 57 entries have been received for the race.

Enzo's Lad entered in Chairman's Sprint Prize

Telegraph Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Enzo's Lad (Testa Rossa) is one of two entries for New Zealand in the Chairman's Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m), the other being the Graeme Rogerson-trained Ferrando (Fast 'N' Famous). Australia has six nominations, spearheaded by the Anthony Freedman-trained duo of Shoals (Fastnet Rock) and Santa Ana Lane (Lope De Vega). Kris Lees also has two entries in Brave Smash (Tosen Phantom) and In Her Time (Time Thief), while the sextet is completed by Pierata (Pierro) and Viddora (I Am Invincible).

Chang hoping for some Joy at historic Conghua fixture

Michael Chang is hopeful of entering the history books when he saddles two runners at the inaugural fully-operational race fixture at Conghua Racecourse on Saturday - the first meeting in the Mainland under the HKJC jurisdiction. Chang will saddle this

season's two-time winner The Joy Of Giving (Thewayyouare) and last-start victor Happy Rocky (Champs Elysees) in the ten-runner finale, the Class 4 Conghua Cup Handicap. "The Joy Of Giving and Happy Rocky are both going well and the 2200 metres is the right distance for both horses. I expect them to run well," Chang said. "I really think The Joy Of Giving, especially, is in peak form; he's on a nice mark and will only carry 111 pounds with Ben So taking off two pounds."

Cross Counter set for Dubai return

Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Cross Counter (Teofilo) could make his return in either the Dubai Gold Cup (Gr 2, 2400m) or the Sheema Classic (Gr 1, 2400m) at Meydan, according to the Dubai World Cup website. Cross Counter's trainer Charlie Appleby indicated earlier this month that his Melbourne Cup winner was likely to resume in the Gold Cup, although he conceded the Sheema Classic would also be considered.





More to come from Mystic Journey

he All-Star Mile has been run and won for the first time. Despite much debate, for and against (and I have been on both sides of it at times), I thought it ended up being a competitive race with a worthy winner, Mystic Journey, who produced an exciting effort to claim the lion's share of the \$5 million prize-money.

The pleasing thing was that even though there were a few low-rating horses in the field the margins were no greater than any other normal race. The thing I took most out of the race, though, is the way trainer Adam Trinder and jockey Anthony Darmanin have handled the winner throughout her career which culminated in the big-time success.

They have done an outstanding job with the way they looked after her during the spring and the way she has come on in the autumn which has come about through their patience last year.

Trinder got her ready at home in Devonport and did everything down there, so the Tasmanians should be extremely proud of their achievements and showcasing possibly one of the best horses in the country.

I am not going to say she is number two or number three or four behind Winx but if she is not one of the best in the country you would give up. The way she beat her rivals in the AllStar Mile only very good horses can produce those kinds of runs.

There may have been a couple of hard luck stories in the race, but Mystic Journey still had to work in the run and she was also backing up after a potential "peak" run in the Australian Guineas.

Her ability to back that performance up after travelling back to Tasmania in between and then reproduce that performance in 14 days was a remarkable training performance and a great testament to her ability.

She is a lovely neat package, but she can certainly continue to develop. Fillies and mares can grow until they are four, five and six years old. She is only going to get stronger and she seems to be very sound.

Physically, she is a bit Winx-like. She is not a monster like Black Caviar, Makybe Diva or Sunline. She appears to have retained her femininity and is an attractive type of filly who becomes even more so every time she wins one of these big races!

Trinder has floated the Cox Plate in the spring for Mystic Journey and why not if the great mare is going to be retired?

You only have to look at the Australian Cups and the like and the horses she would be taking on - particularly if The Autumn Sun is retired to stud this year. You would have to think she would be favourite in a Winx-out market.

The most impressive part of her wins have been the last 50 metres. In the Australian Guineas she was just going to win and then she put them to the sword in the last 75 metres, and it was the same in the All-Star.

Alizee got a beautiful run through the field and you thought she would just explode but Mystic Journey was far too good after being wide for the entire trip.

I have been a sceptic of the All-Star Mile and I am happy to say I was wrong. I now think it has certainly got a place on the calendar. I would rather the smaller races get pumped up with prize-money rather than new, big races, which was one of the reasons I was against the proposal, but the NSW and Victorian racing bodies appear to be boosting the smaller races as well - so it is a win-win.

Training partnerships the way of the future

On Saturday, Heath Conners, the son of four-time Golden Slipper-winning trainer Clarry, announced that he was giving up training. Heath made the decision public after Villa Sarchi won at Flemington. I had a chat to Heath at Flemington and it was great to see him win again with his last winner at Bendigo on Tuesday (with Neurotic).

He is a good horseman and I trained beside him at Caulfield for a long time and he is a bloody good bloke with a steeped training history in his family.

It is sad to see him go down that path but it is hard to be financially viable with a stable of that size and for someone with a young family he found it difficult to marry the two and he has decided to go down another path. Let's hope he is not lost to the industry.

As the industry continues to evolve I think training partnerships will become more and more common. We have seen Mick Price and Michael Kent jnr join forces and we will see more and more of it.

With the demands on the time of trainers the partnerships might go some way to easing the burden those in charge of their respective stables.

Lyre the forgotten filly?

I haven't got a clear run on Slipper this year but you have to congratulate James Cummings and Godolphin for the terrific season they have had with their two-year-olds. It has been a phenomenal season.

Cummings could have as many as six runners in the race while Godolphin could have seven with the Anthony Freedman-trained Blue Diamond winner Lyre also lining up in the Group 1.

I have said it already in recent weeks, but the Melbourne form continues to look solid, and does that make Lyre somewhat of the forgotten horse in Saturday's race?

I know she is mentioned in dispatches but not at the top end of things.

It was hard not to be impressed in the way Peter and Paul Snowden's Cosmic Force won the Pago Pago last Saturday on the wet surface and it is a shame that the track is probably going to be that way again.

They are Johnny on the spot with a horse in-form and it is one of the more open Slippers I can remember.

The Snowdens know what they are doing and I would think Cosmic Force can handle the back-up. They have the confidence to do that otherwise they probably would have running in something earlier to make the Slipper.

The other great thing about backing horses up is that you are taking away the science of training them. You back a horse up in seven days and you don't have to train them.

You just take the colt back to the stables and potter him around for the week and keep him happy. One of the things most trainers I know, myself included, are guilty of is over-training them and over complicate it.

The other horses would have galloped on Tuesday and others will be having a sprint up this morning with the risk of things going wrong, while Cosmic Force will be having a cruisy week at home.

The openness of the Slipper is dictated by the fact the number of different favourites the race has had in the past four or five weeks.

The Slipper isn't the only highlight at Rosehill on Saturday, though. Winx lines up for the second last time in the George Ryder and it is an honour to watch her.

I have been fortunate enough to watch her a lot of times, including her four victories in the Cox Plate, two Queen Elizabeths and three of her George Ryders. But unfortunately I won't be there on Saturday, which will be the first time I have missed Slipper day for a good few years.

The Autumn Sun also lines up in the Rosehill Guineas, so I will be sitting back and enjoying the day from afar.

Tasmania's Mystic Journey now the top rated three-year-old filly in Australia



asmania's appropriately named star Mystic Journey (Needs Further) continued her rapid progression through the classes, with a Saturday's victory in the \$5,000,000 All-Star Mile (1600m) at Flemington which has propelled her to be Australia's top rated three-year-old filly of the season, writes Ken Boman.

Her triumph on Saturday, her sixth win in succession and her tenth in 13 starts, resulted in Timeform allotting her a 124 rating, taking Mystic Journey to third place on the 2018-2019 Three-Year-Old rankings, behind only The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) [126] and Cross Counter (Teofilo) [125].

She is now three pounds clear of the next filly in the three-year-old rankings, the Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) winner Arcadia Queen (Pierro) [121], who sits in fourth place.

Mystic Journey's 124 rating was a careerbest being four pounds superior to her 120 prior best achieved in winning the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Flemington at her prior start on March 2.

The Adam Trinder-trained filly, an \$11,000 yearling purchase, has now progressed from winning a Benchmark 70 (1150m) at Devonport in August last year to winning six of her next seven starts with her new 124 peak seeing her as one of the top rated fillies of her age in the past 20 years.

The star line-up in that period being Atlantic Jewel (Fastnet Rock) [128], Alinghi (Encosta De Lago) [125], Mosheen (Fastnet Rock) [124], Miss Finland (Redoute's Choice) [124] and Gold Edition (Lion Hunter) [124].

Her victory on Saturday was achieved despite a wide trip, with Mystic Journey winning decisively from multiple Group 1 winners Hartnell (Authorized) [123], Alizee (Sepoy) [118] and Le Romain (Hard Spun) [122].

The other notable mover on the Timeform seasonal rankings was the Peter and Paul Snowden-trained colt Cosmic Force (Deep Field), who leapt to the head of the Two-Year-

Cosmic Force raced away in the heavy 10 conditions at Rosehill to win by just over seven lengths from Born A Warrior (I Am Invincible) [93] in second place with Stronger (Not A Single Doubt) [92] third.

It was Cosmic Force's second win (two seconds) in four starts and his 118 figure was a jump of nine pounds on his 109 prior best taken in winning the Skyline Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick at his previous start on March 2.

His dominant win in the Pago Pago Stakes, which also proved his ability in heavy going, resulted in Cosmic Force going to the head of the betting for Saturday's Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Rosehill where the

track anticipated to be affected again.

The Coolmore Stakes (TAD Kennedy Stakes) (Gr 1, 1500m), the feature on last Saturday's Rosehill card, saw the Ron Quinton-trained mare Dixie Blossoms (Street Sense) cap a highly consistent record of seven wins (13 placing) in 30 starts in recording her first Group 1 victory.

She won comfortably by two and half-lengths, with the Kris Lees-trained stablemates El Dorado Dreaming (Ilovethiscity) [113] second and Princess Posh (Canford Cliffs) [106] in third.

Dixie Blossom's victory was rated by Timeform at 120, a career-best for the six-year-old mare, being six pounds superior to her 114 prior peak rating.

ylan Mo was elated as he swept past the winning-post on The Show (High Chaparral) half a length ahead of runner-up Super Euro Star (Compton Place) and saluted the victory that sealed his graduation from the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Apprentice Jockeys' School.

"After the win I just saluted. I enjoyed it and it was very exciting!"

Mo's 70th win, in the Class 4 Broom Handicap (1200m), came two years and two months after his first aboard the deliciouslynamed Fish N' Chips (Kyllachy).

Dennis Yip, meanwhile, arrived at his 700th score in his 17th season with a licence. The popular local handler enjoyed the biggest night of his career at Happy Valley almost six years ago when he claimed the champion trainer title on the dramatic final day of the 2012/13 season.

"It's another step," he said. "Every winner is difficult to get in Hong Kong and it's taken me 17 seasons. Today he was drawn a little bit wide but the horse was in very good condition so I used the kid and I told him to jump fast, get him comfortable and then try for the best."

Mo was forced to suffer a three-wide alley in midfield after breaking from gate ten but The Show

was game for the challenge. The eight-year-old's momentum was rolling as he swung even wider into the straight and maintained his run to the wire.

"I just rode him around horses and I could feel he was coming home very strong. I just rode him through the line," Mo said

"I was half-and-half about whether I was going to get the win; sometimes the front-runners are hard to catch-up so I was just doing it step-by-step."

And step-by-step is how Mo will continue: "I will keep going; try my best; keep working hard!"

The rider, who has been guided through his apprenticeship by trainer Danny Shum, notched 24 wins in his first Hong Kong season, 25 despite a bad hip injury last term, and has 21 so far in this campaign.

Yip, meanwhile, had warm words for Mo: "Congratulations to Dylan. I think he will become a good jockey and I will try to support him."

Yiu praises Spirit after Vase triumph

The night's feature, the Class 1 Happy Valley Vase Handicap (1800m) went to Citron Spirit (Invincible Spirit). Trainer Ricky Yiu was full of praise for his stable stalwart who now has six wins on the board from 33 Hong Kong starts.

"He's always a chance because he's a very honest horse. He keeps trying," he said.

Matthew Poon settled the seven-year-old

second-last in the eight-runner field, shifted out on the home turn and rifled home down the stands' side for a three-quarter-length score.

"With the C Course, we weren't sure if it would benefit the front-runner or the back-marker but you've got to ride him the way he enjoys it. He was going to be in the first three and I wasn't surprised he won," Yiu said.

The Irish-bred's second win of the season came two starts after a game second over the course and distance behind Simply Brilliant (Frankel) in the January Cup Handicap (Gr 3, 1800m). Yiu is now short of options for the gelding who went into the evening rated 108.

"At this age, he's a better horse here than he is at Sha Tin," he said. "He's going over 110 now so he'll have to face the good ones at Sha Tin, there's no choice.

"At his age he finds it very hard to compete with the young ones at Sha Tin. Here he has more chance to win. I'll have a good look at the programme now; hopefully, at the end of the season, he might find weaker company and if he does I wouldn't be surprised if he won again."

And Yiu revealed that Citron Spirit might find himself in a leafy, green paddock after this campaign.

"This would probably be his last season," he said. "He's a lovely horse. He's one of my favourites even though I haven't had him long, I enjoy training him. I'd love to see him at a good home when he retires."

Yiu sealed a double when Speedy King (Toorak Toff) won the night's second feature, the Class 3 Ireland Trophy Handicap (1000m). Derek Leung drove the five-year-old to victory.

Poon landed a brace, too. The rider delivered Penang Hall (Bianconi) to land the finale, the Class 3 Holly Handicap (1650m), for his former master David Hall.

Karis Teetan was also in double form as he took his season's tally to 61. The Mauritian landed the opener on the Tony Millard-trained Righteous Mate (Savabeel) and followed up aboard the Tony Cruz-trained Waldorf (Highly Recommended) in race seven.

Zac Purton and Paul O'Sullivan teamed up with Oriental Elite (Star Witness) in race two, and Vincent Ho was in tandem with his old boss Caspar Fownes to take the fourth contest with Perfect To Play (Born To Sea).




