Booming markets lead Wall and Redvers to seek rewards in prosperous Australian climate

*Chris Humpleby catches up with Hannah Wall, one half
of Redwall Racing, ahead of their new venture*

The British have long been lured to Australian racing in a bid to plunder the most lucrative prizes, demonstrated best by the groundbreaking Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) success of the Charlie Appleby-trained Cross Counter (Teofilo) last year. However, the broader fertility evident with the Australian racing and breeding landscape has provided fresh leverage for bloodstock agent Hannah Wall and her longstanding boss David Redvers, with the pair seeking to capitalise on the dual positives of exceptional prize-money and a burgeoning resale market with their newly-founded Redwall Racing.

Wall's association with Redvers

stretches back 13 years, while she is also bloodstock manager at the Redvers owned and managed Tweenhills Farm and Stud in Gloucestershire, and Redwall Racing follows hot on the heels of their highly-successful pinhooking ventures Redwall Bloodstock (operating in the northern hemisphere) and Redwall Syndicates (operating in the southern hemisphere). However, as the name aptly suggests, this new project will provide investors with a flavour of the Australian racing scene before the purchased stock, which has been restricted solely to fillies, is resold after two seasons on the track, with the horses having theoretically upgraded their profiles in the interim. *Continued on page 2>>*

Lovett lambasts Cologne authorities following Sunday race cancellation

Australian Bloodstock director Jamie Lovett has launched an angry tirade against the German racing industry and looks set to boycott future yearling sales following the cancellation of a four-runner race at Cologne on Sunday, for which the Andreas Wohler-trained Revelstoke (Toronado) - who carries the same Australian Bloodstock silks as Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Protectionist (Monsun) - was due to be sent-off the hot favourite.

Lovett, who founded Australian Bloodstock with co-director Luke Murrell and whose German-trained interests include last year's Gold Cup (Gr 1, 2m4f) third Torcedor (Fastnet Rock), yesterday expressed his displeasure following news that the 1400-metre contest had been scrapped, in line with a mandate afforded to German racecourses which allows for the cancellation of potentially loss-making races, usually those with fewer than five runners.

Moreover, Lovett lambasted the efforts of the authorities to keep the contest, which was scheduled to be run for €5,100, claiming that Ronald Rauscher - Australian Bloodstock's European racing manager - was told proceedings would only go ahead if connections agreed to race for a prize-fund of zero.

"The prize-money is so strong in Australia, as is the resale market for fillies with black-type and race-form at the broodmare sales," Wall explains. "We've had a lot of success buying fillies, both in Australia and in the northern hemisphere, so we saw an angle in putting together a few people to buy into these horses as yearlings.

"This was a premise that was developed alongside Richard Pegum, who has enjoyed a long association with David Redvers Bloodstock. He's an Australian resident who races a lot of horses down there, while he won the 2008 Breeders' Cup Marathon with the Ralph Beckett-trained Muhannak. He thought it would be a good idea and he is the main shareholder in Redwall Racing."

Expanding on their racing framework, Wall says: "We plan to race the fillies for two seasons with a view to selling them at the end of their three-year-old careers, so it's as much about enjoying the concept of racing in Australia as it is a commercial activity.

"In Australia, if you've got a good filly, you can find yourself in a position to be easily covering your costs plus earning money from the prize-money accumulated.

"There aren't many other places – certainly not in Europe – that you're in a position to do that, which often means it's not a profitable exercise racing horses elsewhere unless you're hitting the absolute heights."



Wall and Redvers have first-hand experience of lucrative racing fillies through their involvement with three-time Group 1-winning speedster Sunlight (Zoustar), who supplemented her Coolmore Stud Stakes (registered as the Ascot Vale Stakes) (Gr 1, 1200m) success in November with a tenacious victory in the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) at Flemington prior to her blistering all-the-way win in the William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Moonee Valley.

Co-bred by Qatar Racing and Widden Stud, who each retain a 12.5 per cent share in the filly, Sunlight was purchased for \$300,000 from the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in 2017 and she has now amassed \$4,378,950 in prize-money. The Tony McEvoy-trained three-year-old has also been a fine advert for the growing reputation of her sire, Widden Stud shuttler Zoustar (Northern Meteor), who is currently standing his first northern hemisphere breeding season at Tweenhills, covering a full book of mares at a fee of £25,000. *Continued on page 4>>*

Redwall Racing will begin life with four fillies under its banner, with Wall and Redvers having purchased a fellow daughter of Zoustar and a filly by Woodside Park Stud resident Written Tycoon (Iglesia) at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, while they added fillies by Widden Stud's late sire Sebring (More Than Ready) and former Darley shuttler Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado) at last month's Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale.

Both fillies at the Gold Coast were purchased in conjunction with Tony McEvoy and will be trained by him accordingly, while the Sebring filly has been sent to Danny O'Brien and the Medaglia d'Oro to Anthony Freedman.

"We haven't taken 100 per cent of the horses – we've taken between 20 and 40 per cent," Wall continues. "This is the other thing that is such fun about Australia – you don't have to go and raise huge figures and commit huge sums to own 100 per cent of a horse. We were able to find the horses we wanted and buy into them with trainers.

"What's more, Redwall Racing has been able to enter into these ventures in conjunction with other high-profile investors. For example, Antony Thompson and Widden Stud have been very supportive in joining us in the fillies by Zoustar and Written Tycoon."

Expanding on their choice of trainers, Wall adds: "David and I were on the Gold Coast in January and it just so happened that two particular fillies we fell in love with were on Tony McEvoy's list as well. We've obviously had a lot of success with Tony through Sunlight and he's a trainer we get along well with and enjoy having horses with.

"We haven't had horses with Anthony Freedman before, but Ryan McEvoy of Widden Stud, who will be helping us run the day-to-day aspects of Redwall Racing while still primarily being based at Widden, identified Anthony as a trainer we might like to support. We didn't want to put all of our eggs in one basket, but we're delighted with the types we've got and I look forward to seeing how it all works out."

Catalogued as **Lot 484**, the Written Tycoon filly is out of a winning sister to champion two-year-old and Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) heroine Crystal Lily (Stratum) as well as three further stakes-level scorers, while the daughter of Zoustar, who was catalogued as **Lot 565**, is out of the Group 3 winner Fancy Feet (Fath), who herself is a half-sister to the stakes performer Swift Sis (Husson Lightning). *Continued on page 6>>*

Baffert believes Justify, Pharoah will thrive in Australia

...[Trainer Bob] Baffert describes Justify as the type of horse you rarely see, in that he was absolutely the perfect horse, that there was not one box that was not checked off. "With Justify, his body, the way he was built, if he were a body builder, he would have been Mr. Universe," the Hall of Fame trainer said. "He could do it all. Justify, it's very rare to see a horse like him. He was perfect."

... Baffert said when he first looked at Justify's pedigree he thought he had a turf sprinter on his hands. He was not a sprinter and he was untested on the turf, but Baffert believes he would have thrived on that surface. He could not take him to Royal Ascot because the races there conflicted with the American Triple Crown, but he wishes he had had the chance.

"I would have loved to take him over there for the race they have for 3-year-olds, (the G1 St. James's Palace Stakes)," Baffert said. "He would have smoked them. When they're that great they can run on anything. When he gets to Australia and they look at him they are going to go 'wow'. He's always had the wow factor."

<< *Continued from page 4* The former was knocked down for \$410,000 from the draft of Amarina Farm (as agent for Heskett Bloodstock), while the latter realised \$500,000 from Lime Country Thoroughbreds (as agent for Makybe).

"We know the types we really like and these fillies just fitted our mould," Wall continues. "I think the Zoustar filly is outstanding. She is a very close model to Sunlight - very strong, very balanced and very precocious-looking with a great action and a great attitude.

"Tony loved her, as we all did, and it made a lot of sense to try and get in with him on her. She's now in training and I know Tony is incredibly sweet on her. At this stage, I would look to her being the earliest runner for the group.

"The Written Tycoon filly has an outstanding pedigree and she was a gorgeous filly."

In respect to their Easter purchases, the Sebring filly is a half-sister to the stakes-placed Grim Reaper (Domesday) from the family of dual-Listed winner Malice (Teofilo). She was catalogued as **Lot 191** and realised \$210,000 from the draft of Luskin Park.

Meanwhile, the daughter of Medaglia d'Oro, who was catalogued as **Lot 291**, is a half-sister to the Listed winner Haybah (More Than Ready) being out of a winning half-sister to Rebel Raider (Reset), who numbers among his six successes two top-tier victories in the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) and the South Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2500m). She fetched \$170,000 having been offered by Yarraman Park Stud.

This is also an active page given her Lonhro (Octagonal) half-sister Taraayef finished runner-up on debut at Sandown Hillside for the Lindsay Park team last week.

"I thought the Medaglia filly had a lot of class and a lot of quality," Wall says. "She might not be quite as sharp as the Zoustar filly, but she's got a lovely pedigree and it's actually quite a precocious page.

"The Sebring is a very smart filly. Ryan [McEvoy] obviously knows a lot about the good Sebring fillies and we've raced a few in Australia."

Wall's experience of both the Australian racing and breeding scenes is well-founded through her work with Qatar Racing, the joint-venture between Sheikh Fahad Al Thani and his brothers, while Sheikh Fahad experienced Melbourne Cup glory in 2011 when Dunaden (Nicobar), who carried his personal Pearl Bloodstock banner, pipped Flemington stalwart Red Cadeaux (Cadeaux Genereux) in a grandstand finish.

Furthermore, Wall paid compliment to the strength of the market across the entire sales spectrum while pinpointing this brevity as a determining factor to the establishment of Redwall Racing.

"Regarding the horses we've had for Sheikh Fahad, we've often found - from the perspective of trying to buy young broodmares or fillies off the track to become broodmares - it's an incredibly tough market to buy into, so we thought we'd have the fun of finding them as yearlings and racing them for a few years before we target that market.

"We've worked the sales down there quite a lot from the pinhooking, racing and broodmare side of things for a good few years and the market just seems to be strengthening the whole time. The Australian market also has strength in depth - they're not relying on a couple of individuals to prop the market up."

Wall is also glowing in her assessment of how Australian trainers operate from a business perspective, with share-structures helping to facilitate projects like Redwall Racing from a logistical angle, while she is also positive in her view of the high-quality communication offered

by Australian trainers, which allows the racing of horses on the other side of the world to be marketed as an attractive proposition to British investors.

"There are lots of things in Australian racing that make it very accessible," Wall continues. "You don't have to own 100 per cent of a horse and trainers are set up for breaking horses down into shares as small as 2.5 per cent - it's not a complication to do that.

"Their communication is also exceptional. We've long said that the feedback you get from Australia, especially for those of us who are based in the UK, doesn't ever make you feel like you're out of the loop."

Summarising neatly on the comparison between racing in the northern and southern hemispheres, Wall continues: "We love racing in Britain and our racing is exceptional, but we feel there are a lot of angles to be racing and trading stock in Australia and we had a lot of people who were keen to support us in doing that. Hopefully it will all come off."

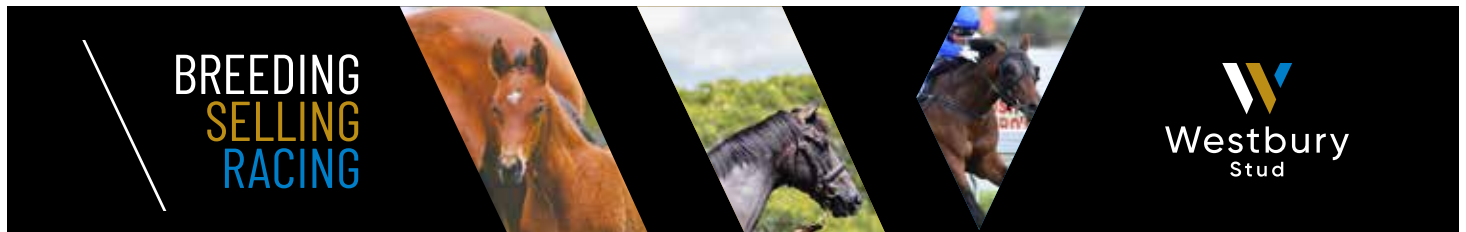

Man Of His Word ready for Wangoom assault

All-Star Mile (1600m) 12th Man Of His Word (Lope De Vega) has been freshened ahead of his assault on today's Wangoom Handicap (Listed, 1200m) at the Warrnambool carnival. Trainer Dean Krongold is banking on dry weather in a bid to run the Listed-winning gelding in the feature sprint race, with concerns about his ability to handle a heavy surface. "He handles the soft, but not the heavy, so we want to see what the weather's doing before making a final call," Krongold said. "The horse is well and we freshened him up and he's going well, so we thought we'd have a crack but if it's not to be, it's not to be."

16 for Australasian Oaks

A capacity field of 16 plus four emergencies have been accepted for Saturday's Schweppes Oaks (registered as Australasian Oaks) (Gr 1, 2000m) at Morphettville, with current market leader Amangiri (All Too Hard) set to jump from barrier two under Todd Pannell. Drawn next to her in three is previous favourite Princess Jenni (High Chaparral), while VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Aristia (Lonhro) is set to break from barrier six. Also at Morphettville on Saturday, a field of 15 is set to contest the TAB Classic (registered as Robert Sangster Stakes), with Spright (Hinchinbrook) assuming early favouritism despite drawing the widest gate.

Sargent happy with House Of Cartier ahead of Oaks

Also taking her chance in Saturday's Schweppes Oaks is House Of Cartier (Alamosa), who has shown a solid level of form since moving across the Tasman from Nigel Tiley to John Sargent. The filly ran sixth in the Kembla Grange Classic (Gr 3, 1600m) before winning over 2000 metres at Hawkesbury and finishing a luckless fifth in the Frank Packer Plate (Gr 3, 2000m). "She has got a bit of quality, she is definitely up there with my other Oaks winners," Sargent said. "I would be very surprised if she wasn't very hard to beat when you look at the quality of the field on Saturday. She might back-up in the Derby the following week."

Shinn on Luvaluva at the Gold Coast

Despite having a strong chance of recording another Oaks success, Sargent will be in Queensland on Saturday with Luvaluva (Mastercraftsman) set to line up in the Hollindale Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) at the Gold Coast. The four-year-old mare returns from a one-race campaign in New Zealand where she finished third in the NZ Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) in early April. "I gave her a week out at Roger James' farm after her race in New Zealand and she did extremely well and Blake Shinn will ride her on Saturday," Sargent said. "She is on target for the Doomben Cup. She is after a Group 1 win really and then she will carry on next season as well."

Causeway Girl to tackle Euclase

Clinton McDonald is planning to run Causeway Girl (Shamus Award) in the Euclase Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) in Adelaide but will also accept for the filly in a 1200-metre handicap at Flemington. The preference remains for the filly to travel to Adelaide later this week for the Euclase with Damien Oliver set to ride. "We'll accept for Flemington just in case we get a bad barrier or something like that," McDonald said. "We're trying to turn her into a valuable broodmare and I'm hoping we can get over there and get a result with her."

Waller heads Brisbane Group 1 entries

Champion Sydney trainer Chris Waller heads the nominations for the Group 1 races at the Brisbane Winter Carnival after entries closed yesterday morning. The Waller-trained duo Nature Strip (Nicconi) and Zousain (Zoustar) are among 29 nominations for the Doomben 10,000 (Gr 1, 1200m) on May 12, while the Doomben Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) on May 18 has attracted 42 entries, of which Waller responsible for eight. The trainer also has 13 of the 106 Queensland Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) nominations, eight of the 145 Queensland Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) entries and 12 two-year-olds entered for the J J Atkins Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m), which has 163 nominations. The Kingsford-Smith Cup (Gr 1, 1300m) has 67 nominations while the \$1.5 million Stradbroke Handicap (Gr 1, 1400m) attracted 144 entries.

Queensland the plan for Music Magnate

Veteran sprinter Music Magnate (Written Tycoon) is set to begin his third Brisbane Winter Carnival campaign at the Gold Coast on Saturday after trainer Bjorn Baker elected to avoid the Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Eagle Farm last weekend. Baker is looking to run Music Magnate, a luckless last-start ninth at Randwick, in the Australian Turf Club Trophy (registered as Prime Minister's Cup) (Listed, 1400m). "He was ninth, beaten two and a half lengths, but as someone said it was the best ninth you would see. He never got a crack at them," Baker said of the gelding's latest run. "I am thinking he can start his winter in the 1400-metre race at the Gold Coast and we can go from there."

Scarlet Dream pressing on to Queensland

Australian Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) runner-up Scarlet Dream (Sebring) is pressing on for a Brisbane campaign with the Queensland Oaks and the Derby on the agenda. The Mark Newnham-trained filly finished just under two lengths behind Verry Elleegant (Zed) in the Australian Oaks at Randwick and she will have a barrier trial at Warwick Farm on Friday in preparation for her Brisbane targets. "All going well she will run in the Oaks and then possibly the Derby," Newnham said. "She's very fit, but she will have that trial on Friday to keep her ticking over and then she will head up there a couple of days before The Roses."

Super Ex to resume at Randwick

Meanwhile, Newnham is looking forward to the return of lightly-raced colt Super Ex (Excites) in Saturday's 1100 metre benchmark 78 Handicap on Randwick's Kensington track. Having competed only once since the start of last year, Super Ex is set to resume off the back of three barrier trials, including a third in his most recent on April 15. "He has always had well above average ability," Newnham said. "He ran a track record at Randwick one day, which is going back about 18 months, but he has had knee troubles since then. He's taken a while to get fit but I haven't rushed him and he's probably showing the advantages of having the Polytrack we've got in at Randwick now."

Snowden confident Ruby can shine at Warwick Farm

Co-trainer Peter Snowden is confident that lightly-raced filly Reelem In Ruby (Pierro) can atone for her recent narrow defeat at Warwick Farm when she lines up in today's ANZ Bloodstock News Handicap (1300m) at the Sydney venue. Despite drawing barrier seven in the eight-horse field, Snowden is hopeful the filly has enough ability to overcome her wide gate. "She's a talented filly, she's still a bit light and a bit immature and that's why we don't want to give her too many runs this prep," Snowden told Racing NSW. "She's definitely worthwhile hanging onto - she's going to be a nice filly for later on."

Wilde owners win again

The Warrnambool carnival has again proved a happy hunting ground for a group of owners with Symon Wilde's stable. For the fourth year in succession, the owners of Tuesday's debut winner Ginny Ann (War), headed by Warrnambool Racing Club committeeman Dallas Ludeman, have tasted success at the carnival with a two-year-old after the juvenile took out yesterday's VOBIS Gold Strike (1000m) in decisive fashion. "These guys that own her have had an amazing run," Wilde said. "They've won the two-year-old race with colts we've bought and we bought a filly last year and this is her. They're going to have a lot of fun."

Damian Browne retires

Queensland-based jockey Damian Browne has announced his retirement from the saddle after a string of health issues. "Thank you, racing. I have had my last ride," he posted on Twitter yesterday. "My heart and soul wants to get back on the horse, but my body knows the ride is over. Thank you to everyone who supported me, I can't thank you enough." Browne moved to Queensland in 2003 after a successful career in New Zealand and retires with more than 1200 wins to his credit, including 15 Group 1 races. Browne is best known for his association with brilliant sprinter Buffering (Mossman), who won seven Group 1 contests, including the 2015 Al Quoz Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) in Dubai.

Hackett remains in ICU

Injured jockey Michael Hackett remains in intensive care in Sydney's Liverpool Hospital after being placed in an induced coma following a fall at Tomingley. Racing NSW's Dr Duckworth said on Tuesday Hackett had seen his sedation slowly decreased on Monday afternoon and doctors were now slowly trying to wake him up with commands. He said Hackett had opened his eyes a couple of times to command. Hackett was one of three jockeys to fall in the picnic race on Saturday, with Ricky Blewitt suffering stable in-displaced thoracic spine fractures requiring rest for six weeks, a scapula fracture that will be treated with a sling and a rib fracture that requires rest and conservative management. Michael Gray has a fractured clavicle, which Duckworth will operate on today, and a wrist fracture, which will be treated in a splint.

GPI agrees to Everest slot sale

The GPI Racing slot for the 2019 running of The Everest (1200m) has been sold, subject to the completion of a contract of sale. Vendor Greg Ingham has exercised his right to accept an offer prior to the original closing time of the expressions of interest process, which was 5pm yesterday. He has entered into a Heads of Agreement with a proposed purchaser. An announcement on who will be the 12th and final slot holder for this year's The Everest will be confirmed once the legal process between vendor, buyer and Racing NSW is complete. The \$14m The Everest will be run at Randwick October 19.

Ardrossan to stand at Waikato Stud

Group 3-winning sprinter Ardrossan (Redoute's Choice) has been retired and will stand at

Waikato Stud in New Zealand for a fee of NZ\$8,000 (plus GST) this year. A winner of four of his nine starts and placed at Group 1 level, Ardrossan suffered a career-ending injury when third in the Star Kingdom Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) on an unsuitably wet track. "We never got to see the best of him and he reminds me in some ways of O'Reilly at the start of his stud career," Waikato Stud principal Mark Chittick said. "He had a very limited racing career, but we also got to see his brilliance before he retired. He will get really good support at stud and with this ownership group we will be making sure in the future that a fair few of his progeny end up in Australia."

Busy day ahead for Pitmans at Riccarton

Leading South Island trainers Matthew and Michael Pitman will line-up six runners in the two stakes races at Riccarton on Saturday. The partnership will field three runners in the Champagne Stakes (Listed, 1200m) - All About Magic (Showcasing), Clubcard (Zacinto) and Our Rosette (Highly Recommended - as well as Elfee (Iffraaj), Dynamic (Perfectly Ready) and Carson River (Swiss Ace) in the Daphne Memorial Great Easter Stakes (Listed, 1400m). "Elfee has that class about her," he said. "She has been there and done that at that level, so you have to swing towards Elfee, but Carson River is a horse we do think a lot of and he will get to that level at some stage. He is a horse that is improving all the time."

International

Five for Brazen Beau

Darley shuttler Brazen Beau (I Am Invincible) was provided with his fifth overall winner and second in the northern hemisphere when Brazen Safa (3 f ex Insaaf by Averti) took out the Jim Long Birthday 2YO Novice Auction Stakes (5.5f) at Brighton yesterday. The Michael Bell-trained filly prevailed in a blanket finish to deny Rose Of Kildare (Make Believe) by a neck, with the same distance back to Audio (Equiano) in third. Brazen Safa joins Proper Beau as winners for Brazen Beau in the northern hemisphere, while Inglis Nursery (RL, 1000m) hero Accession spearheads the stallion's trio of winners in the southern hemisphere.

Two for Red Jazz

The Johnny Murtagh-trained Urban Beat (4 g ex Closetocrazy by Blues Traveller) ran out a gutsy winner of the Woodlands Stakes (Listed, 5f) at Naas on Tuesday night to provided Ballyhane Stud stallion Red Jazz (Johannesburg) with his second stakes winner. The gelding showed a determined attitude to fend off the advances of Soffia (Kyllachy) by a neck, with Primo Uomo (Strategic Prince) a further half length adrift in third. Urban Beat joins Snazzy Jazzy as Red Jazz's other stakes winner.

Just The Judge gone

Qatar Racing is mourning the loss of Irish 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) heroine Just The Judge (Lawman) after the nine-year-old mare was put down following complications post colic surgery. An admirably consistent performer, Just The Judge placed third a further four times at the highest level following her Guineas victory as well as recording a second elite win in the EP Taylor Stakes (Gr 1, 10f) at Woodbine aged four. She was subsequently sold for 4,500,000gns at the 2014 Tattersalls December Mares Sale, with China Horse Club taking over the share of the Sangster family, and has most recently given birth to a Galileo (Sadler's Wells) filly foal.

Spendthrift Farm acquire breeding rights to Omaha Beach

Spendthrift Farm has entered into an agreement with Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm to acquire the breeding rights to Arkansas Derby (Gr 1, 9f) winner Omaha Beach (War Front), who will look to add a second Grade 1 to his CV in Saturday's Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 10f). "First, I'd like to thank Rick Porter for the opportunity to stand such a special horse as Omaha Beach," said Spendthrift's Wayne Hughes. "We believe Omaha Beach is one of the best stallion prospects to come around in recent years and see him as a big part of the future at Spendthrift. He is truly a rare package - elite looks, pedigree, sire power, speed, class, you name it. He has everything and we feel the best is yet to come for him. I wish both Rick Porter and Richard Mandella the best this week and beyond with Omaha Beach."

Lovett lambasts Cologne authorities following Sunday race cancellation

Australian Bloodstock director Jamie Lovett has launched an angry tirade against the German racing industry and looks set to boycott future yearling sales following the cancellation of a four-runner race at Cologne on Sunday, for which the Andreas Wohler-trained Revelstoke (Toronado) - who carries the same Australian Bloodstock silks as Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Protectionist (Monsun) - was due to be sent-off the hot favourite.

Lovett, who founded Australian Bloodstock with co-director Luke Murrell and whose German-trained interests include last year's Gold Cup (Gr 1, 2m4f) third Torcedor (Fastnet Rock), yesterday expressed his displeasure following news that the 1400-metre contest had been scrapped, in line with a mandate afforded to German racecourses which allows for the cancellation of potentially loss-making races, usually those with fewer than five runners.

Moreover, Lovett lambasted the efforts of the authorities to keep the contest, which was scheduled to be run for €5,100, claiming that Ronald Rauscher - Australian Bloodstock's European racing manager - was told proceedings would only go ahead if connections agreed to race for a prize-fund of zero.

Lovett labelled the move as 'blackmail' and 'morally disgraceful', while a statement issued by Eckhard Sauren, president of the Cologne Race Club, expressed his regret at the cancellation of the contest but cited financial

factors as the driving force behind the decision.

"The authorities contacted us on Tuesday via our European racing manager to say the race has attracted four entries and they were happy to keep the race but only if we raced for no prize-money," Lovett told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

"I said that won't be happening because, obviously, we have been supporters of German racing over many years and on more than one occasion we've paid supplementary entries - we've never negotiated and we've just been happy to contribute.

"They then rang back and said if you don't race for zero money we'll just scrap the race. I spoke to Andreas Wohler and he contacted Cologne and we thought there is no way they would do it.

"There have been numerous races in Germany this season that have only had four runners, which is not ideal, but it's certainly not the fault of connections. I found out later on they followed through with the threat and they've scrapped the race."

The running of four-runner contests appears to have created a bone of contention, with these races seemingly having attracted five or more participants at the declaration stage, only for the final field to be depleted by non-runners.

However, Lovett - who stands Protectionist at Gestut Rottgen under the Australian Bloodstock banner for a fee of €6,500 - did not hold back when surmising the situation at

the weekend, which was set to see the return of Gran Criterium (Gr 2, 1500m) runner-up Revelstoke, a son of Swettenham Stud shuttler Toronado (High Chaparral) who is plotting a path to the Mehl-Mülhens-Rennen (German 2,000 Guineas) (Gr 2, 1600m) back at Cologne on May 19.

"I think morally it's disgraceful and given the horse's preparation is aimed towards the German 2,000 Guineas, it throws this into disarray.

"I'm gobsmacked given I've never felt blackmailed by a racing club before, with them saying either race for nothing or we'll pull the race. I thought the bloke was joking.

"On the world scale it's not a big issue but in principle, for us, it is a big issue. We're quite slighted by it. They wonder why they're in decline in Germany. For me, this sums up why their industry is in decline."

Asked if this scenario is likely to influence Australian Bloodstock's future investment in German racing, Lovett replied: "Absolutely it will. I've got a group of investors who were keen to go to the sale at Baden Baden. We were obviously excited about the thought of seeing the Protectionist yearlings go through the ring and supporting the sale and leaving yearlings on the ground in Europe, as we've done in the past.

"This is what annoys me the most – their industry is on its knees over there and we're not asking to be favoured.

"Again, it will mean nothing to them because they're very narrow-minded in their thinking – I've learned that over a number of years. It will be a blip on the radar when we decide not to go over there, but their industry needs participants to go into Germany and to buy the five or six or a dozen yearlings that we had intended to."

In reply, Sauren issued a regretful statement over proceedings and highlighted the difficulty of attracting runners to compete against the highly-rated Revelstoke, which created a loss-making scenario.

"We knew from the beginning of last week

that it would be difficult to get starters for this race because of the good rating of Revelstoke," Sauren said.

"We have discussed this with Mr Rauscher since last week and we told him that we wanted to make the race but we can't afford to have a race with only four horses because it would cost us at least €3,000.

"We told Mr Rauscher that we have to either get support with sponsorship or runners for the race. Yesterday, we were told that there will be no sponsorship for the race and it was not possible to get more runners, so we were stuck with four including Revelstoke.

"We are very disappointed about the whole situation, especially because of the

good relationship we have had with Australian Bloodstock over the years."

Revelstoke now looks set to head straight to the Mehl-Mülhens-Rennen without a preparatory run, a scenario Lovett admits is workable without being perfect.

"That race was there for a reason," he said. "We'll get around it – we might have to go first time out at a mile, which is doable, but it's the principle of the whole thing.

"We've never wavered in our support for German racing, but for them to turn round and do this, it's really left a sour taste in our mouth."

Musings from Hong Kong and afar after Champions Day

In the now narrow world of racing form lines, last December's Hong Kong Vase form certainly held up on Sunday when - competing a remarkable 9600 kilometres apart - Waldgeist won in Paris and Exultant and Lys Gracieux were narrowly denied at Sha Tin.

Waldgeist was a comprehensive winner of the Group 1 Prix Ganay in a performance which underlined the evenness of world racing competition in the 2000 to 2400-metre genre. In winning the contest, he put the much-vaunted Ghaiyyath firmly 'back in his box' and

as a result stamped himself as an improved horse and a likely force in 2019.

Last year's Vase saw Waldgeist finish a most unlucky fifth behind Exultant and Lys Gracieux after he'd earlier finished just length and a three quarters behind Enable in the Group 1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Exultant and Lys Gracieux, of course, finished second and third behind the extraordinarily neglected Win Bright in last Sunday's Group 1 QEII Cup.

Win Bright went off at 47/1. Can you believe it? He was understandably ignored by the local punters given their lack of familiarity

with him, his trainer and his jockey, but his prospects were surprisingly downplayed by the Japanese media, who questioned his class. Not, though, his trainer Yoshihiro Hatakeyama, who said "confident" when asked before the race whether he was just hopeful or more bullish than that.



Win Bright proceeded to win in track record time, running 1.58.81 and becoming the first horse to go under 1.59.00 for the distance at Sha Tin. He'd won the Group 2 Nakayama Kinen at his previous start, beating Lucky Lilac [twice placed behind Almond Eye in last season's Japanese classics], the Group 1 Mile Championship winner Stelvio and Suave Richard, who went on to be placed in the Group 1 Sheema Classic in Dubai.

Meanwhile at Kyoto on Sunday, Fierement was also running fast to take the Group 1 Tenno Sho Spring in 3.15.00 - a time which would win every Melbourne Cup ever run by a fair margin.

Waldgeist, Win Bright and Fierement have something in common. They're all entires older than three, with Fierement being a four-year-old and the first two named a year older again.

Win Bright looks to be the classic example of a Japanese horse peaking at five. So many of them do. He's now had just 18 starts.

It also emphasises the Japanese intent on proving their horses internationally, often more than once, and especially before considering

whether they are worthy of standing at stud. Maurice and Lord Kanaloa are notable recent examples.

It is a strategy which clearly works - unlike Australia's penchant for prematurely standing moderately-performed and barely-tested three-year-olds - given the depth of quality among the Japanese horses. That depth was illustrated by Kluger running so well through Sydney's autumn.

In addition, that depth almost certainly awaits Hong Kong's brilliant miler Beauty Generation in the Group 1 Yasuda Kinen on June 2 even if Almond Eye does not run. My intelligence is that Almond Eye pulled up quite distressed after her Group 1 Dubai Turf win and her immediate future is unclear.

Waiting in the wings is Danon Premium, who's won six of seven starts, while his resume includes commanding wins over the aforementioned Lys Gracieux and Stelvio.

Jockey Zac Purton is up for the challenge but mindful of how tough it is in Japan, as he observed last week when asked about his memorable international wins.

"Aerovelocit winning in Japan was special," he said. "It's very hard to win in Japan against their horses there. They've got a lot of depth to their races. You're not just taking on one horse you're taking on about ten or 12 every time you go there, so it's really, really hard."

The Yasuda Kinen has proved beyond the grasp of Hong Kong since the Brett Prebble-ridden Bullish Luck, the horse who stopped stablemate Silent Witness' winning run at 17 and was placed in a Dubai World Cup on dirt, won in 2006.

Connections have talked of wanting to break the Silent Witness winning sequence with Beauty

Generation but, really, that's pretty silly as the horse is a six-year-old and only half way there and Silent Witness did it from debut. Also a bit silly is compelling trainer John Moore to retire at the end of next season (although the rules have been changed before).

What mightn't be so silly - given the Fuji-size mountain to climb in Japan - would be to consider the Cox Plate in the absence of Winx.

It's all the sort of stuff we can now contemplate, even if only for modest amusement, as compelling action from the racing world comes to our lounge room televisions almost daily.

For instance, the running of a number of Royal Ascot trial races takes place on the Ascot card tonight. Not to mention the 2,000 Guineas this Saturday plus the 1,000 Guineas and Kentucky Derby this Sunday.

Lady Pauline, the Wesley Ward trained half-sister to Royal Ascot conqueror Lady Aurelia, will be the centre of attention today (tonight) as she steps out in the opening race. Ridden by John Velazquez, Lady Pauline romped to a nine and three-quarter-length victory on debut at Keeneland.

Nick Smith, director of racing and communications at Ascot, conceded in Hong Kong that the Royal meeting is now centred - from the viewpoint of international runners - on the Americans in general and Wesley Ward in particular.

Also appearing tonight is John Gosden's unbeaten Kingman colt Calyx, who contests the Commonwealth Cup trial. He's hasn't appeared since winning the Group 2 Coventry Stakes at last year's Royal meeting where he beat the subsequent Group 1 Phoenix Stakes winner Advertise.

And to tie it all back to Hong Kong, the then Richard Fahey-trained Vange, who turned in the best Coventry run bar the winner, is now with Frankie Lor at Sha Tin. He suffered a tibial stress fracture last September and was discouragingly scratched from a recent barrier trial. But if Lor can get him right, I fancy he'll be a star in his new home.

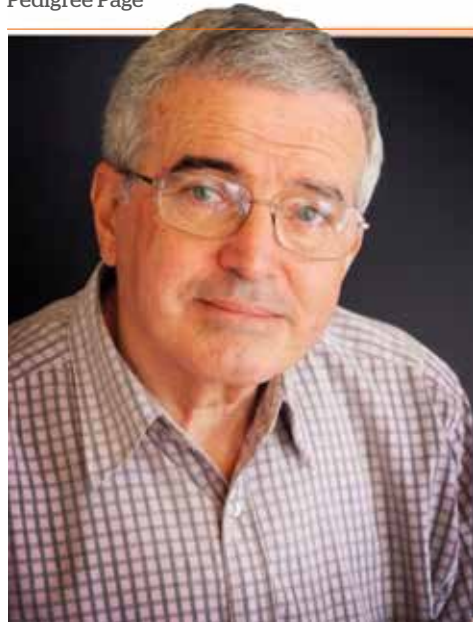

Excited by Snitzel's latest star

After some key results last Saturday, two-time champion sire Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) locked up his third straight Australian title for the 2018/19 season with earnings now topping \$21 million.

At Eagle Farm in Brisbane his highly talented and consistent four-year-old daughter I Am Excited (Snitzel) achieved a new career high with her win in the weight-for-age Victory Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m), while at Hawkesbury five-year-old mare Irithea (Snitzel) became the Arrowfield Stud's stallion's 90th stakes winner with a tenacious victory in the Hawkesbury Crown (Gr 3, 1300m).

In winning the Victory Stakes, I Am Excited upset dual Everest (1200m) winner Redzel (Snitzel), earner of more than \$15.5 million, who finished second, beaten three-quarters of a length, in a time of 1:09.64. Redzel was found to be lame after the race and will now be spelled over the winter.

Despite the circumstances of her win, there was still much merit in I Am Excited's strong finishing performance, which was her sixth success and fourth at stakes level, adding to her earlier stakes victories in the VRC Gilgai Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) (registered as the Baguette Stakes), ATC Darby Munro Stakes (Listed, 1200m) and the ATC Fireball Stakes (Listed, 1100m). I Am Excited also has another

eight stakes placings from her 20 starts to her credit, which has seen her amass \$743,325 in career earnings.

A Group 1 win over the 2019 Brisbane Winter Carnival would set the seal on I Am Excited's racing career, but regardless of whether or not she reaches those heights, she is, with her high quality international pedigree, an outstanding prospect as a producer.

Not sold at public auction, I Am Excited was bred in NSW by Bruce Reid Racing and is the third foal out of Randwick 1100 metre winner Lady Beckworth (General Nediym), whose second foal is four-time stakes winning filly Flippant (Hinchinbrook).

Lady Beckworth also produced two-year-old winner Lord Beckworth (Not a Single Doubt), promising two-year-old Jonah (Hinchinbrook),

who has been three times-placed in Sydney this season, while she has a weanling colt by Yarraman Park's I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit). The mare, now owned by SF Bloodstock LLC, is due to foal to Russian Revolution (Snitzel) later this year, the resulting foal will therefore be a three-quarter relative to I Am Excited.

By the brilliant General Nediym (Nediym), also damsire of Group 1 winners Jameka (Myboycharlie), Hey Doc (Duporth), Lasqueti Spirit (Beneteau) and Sizzling (Snitzel), Lady Beckworth has an exciting female pedigree behind her being a half-sister to Regard (Zabeel), the dam of Group 1-winning pair Atlantic Jewel (Fastnet Rock) and Commanding Jewel (Commands). Lady Beckworth and Regard are two of nine winners out of the superbly bred import Nanshan (Nashwan).

Nanshan was bred by none other than Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation and was placed in Britain before being brought to Australia by Rob and Jenny Ferguson who, for reasons not known, later sold her to Emirates Park Stud, who bred Lady Beckworth.

Nanshan's sire Nashwan (Blushing Groom) was a champion whose most important victories came in the 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m), The Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f), the Eclipse Stakes (Gr 1, 1m2f) and the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m4f) although at stud he proved only a qualified success.

A half-sister to Cheveley Park Stakes (Gr 1, 6f) winner Embassy (Cadeaux Genereaux) and Group 2 winner Tarfshi (Mtoto), Nanshan, who died in 2011, was herself out of a Cheveley Park Stakes winner named Pass The Peace (Alzao) from a family packed with black-type.

I Am Excited's sire and dam are both linebred to Northern Dancer (Nearctic) giving her a total of six lines of this international breed-shaper, but none are closer than in her fifth generation.

Other features of I Am Excited's pedigree are duplications of Nasrullah (Nearco) and three lines of champion Sir Ivor (Sir Gaylord).

All three crosses of Sir Ivor are in I Am Excited's sixth generation and come in combination with sons of Northern Dancer.
