# Inglis Easter to continue as invite-only affair as Magic Millions QTIS sale begins

Flagship sale essential, says Webster, as auction houses prepare contingency plans to deal with Covid-19 consequences

nglis yesterday announced that next month's Australian Easter Yearling Sale will be conducted on an invitation-only basis, with the sales house attempting to proceed with its flagship auction in the wake of the Covid-19 coronavirus crisis.

This comes as Magic Millions begins its

March Yearling Sale at the Gold Coast this morning, with the Bundall sales complex closed to the general public and potential buyers asked to pre-register ahead of arriving at the site.

Both Inglis and Magic Millions have been working around the clock to develop and implement contingency plans as Covid-19 continues to spread throughout the wider community.

Hopes and excitement had been building up in anticipation of the three-year-old's first race, but they can all be dashed to the ground in one split second. There was still a glimmer of hope when the chestnut gelding recovered from the stumble and made his way forward around runners, but another bump at the home turn was to Gray the last nail in the coffin.

Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison announced yesterday that all people entering Australia from abroad would have to self-isolate for 14 days, essentially effective immediately. This followed a Council of Australian Governments (COAG) directive on Friday that all non-essential gatherings of more than 500 people should be cancelled as of today.

The critical phrase, though, is "non-essential" - it is that wording which Inglis managing director Mark Webster hopes will allow the Easter sale to go ahead in some form on April 7 and 8, with invites a potential crowd management tool.

"It's constantly changing so we can't be exactly clear how that will work out. The government has put out a rule around 500 people maximum," Webster told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday.

"We need to work our way through the definition of that. Is it spectators or buyers who are coming in? Does that include people who are actually paid and working in a controlled environment? The selling of horses for our events, most of the people are outside. They are not in an enclosed space.

"There's a bit to work through but I think we will need to make a difference between professional people who are paid - Inglis people and stable staff, for instance. They are there to do a particular job versus buyers and others who are coming through.

"It also talks about non-essential events to which the 500-limit applies as part of their policies. We need to better understand what they mean by that, but we don't consider ourselves to be non-essential.

"We believe the Australian Easter sale is essential. It is a trading event, it is not a public gathering. We can control it through an invitation-only basis by knowing who the vendors are, who the buyers are, who the media are in attendance. That is very different to a gathering where there might be a lack of understanding about who is there and controlling that.

"It's one thing to go to a rock concert that might be on again in a month, but it's another thing to be selling a crop of horses that are living creatures that get older by the minute. It forms an essential part of our economy in the bush in terms of the producers and obviously a critical part of our racing in terms of the supply chain.

"Overall, as an industry, we need to make a case that this is an essential event, not a discretionary one that you can just hold in six months' time or not at all.

"If the government has used those words in the first place around nonessential events, they must have deemed which ones would be essential otherwise they wouldn't have used those terms in their definitions. They are all important things for us to work through.

"We do feel that we will be in a position to put on a sale, but how that is conducted is unclear."

There had been suggestions from the wider racing community that Inglis may move to an all-online format for the Easter sale.

Webster said that Inglis intends to utilise technology to a greater extent than ever before, capitalising on its position at the forefront of innovation, but he is hopeful that it will be a function that goes hand-in-hand with a traditional buying bench as well.

"Technology has to play a big part in it," he continued. "One thing I do know is that Inglis has taken the lead on innovation and technology

over the past ten years and we will be using every innovation that we have developed in that period of time for the Easter sale.

"Perhaps, even with the limits on physical attendance, we will have an even broader attendance than we've had before with people logging in from around the world.

"There will be a lot more transparency about the horses through the use of video, and we expect more and more participation through online bidding from people around the world. To give you an example, we have 3,500 people that have registered for online bidding. We have a wide audience and it is not as if we are starting from scratch.

"In terms of ticking boxes for buyers, I would think that we are

in a position with veterinary reports and people on the ground, we will be able to assess horses and it comes down to preferences, bloodlines, siblings and families that they are interested in. Exactly how that plays out I am not sure."

Webster admitted that the 14-day selfisolation requirements will have an effect on international visitors, with those wanting to attend the two-day sale essentially required to As an industry,

arrive in Australia by the middle of this week. However, he believes that many of their regular buyers from across the globe are already in Sydney.

"Those who were planning on flying in later, it will have an impact," he said. "There are internationals who are already here who have stayed on through the sales series and there are other internationals who have people on the ground here.

"There are buying groups that would have one or two people on the ground here anyhow even though the partners or the principals may not be here."

While sales in France, the United States and Hong Kong have been postponed or cancelled, Webster said that he would prefer the Easter sale - as well as the two May sales, the Chairman's Sale and the Australian Weanling and Broodmare Sale - to go ahead on schedule rather than waiting for the Covid-19 outbreak to die down.

"I don't think it's a realistic option to delay the sale and hold it in the middle of winter when perhaps this pandemic may worsen," he said. "The horses will be getting older by the minute and they need to be sold and be prepared for two-year-old racing. There's certainly time pressures there and we think there's a whole lot of reasons why our event is actually essential.

"Beyond Easter, we have discussed our other sales but we will learn from what happens at Easter. It's going to be an ongoing challenge but we have to keep going.

<< Continued from page 2 "The health of the country is obviously critical but so is the economy and the employment of people and the welfare of these horses buy ensuring they move on to their new homes to keep the economy of the racing and breeding industry going. It's a big employer.</p>

"All the senior management team have been engaging with clients directly, vendors and buyers. There have been messages and calls non-stop.

"The reassuring thing is, everyone wants it to work, whether they are buyers or vendors. They want to get this done in a safe manner complying with whatever rules are in place but also conscious of the fact that we need to keep doing business.

"We can't all just stop and let the economy stop or we've got bigger problems than the coronavirus. We need to work in a balanced manner to get this done in a safe and controlled manner which is why I think our event doesn't necessarily fit the definition of a general public gathering."

Thoroughbred Breeders Australia (TBA) president Basil Nolan welcomed the Inglis approach, saying that the Inglis Easter sale was crucial to Australia's racing and breeding ecosystem.

"It is imperative to the Australian thoroughbred industry that this sale goes ahead as planned," Nolan said. "Millions of dollars have been invested in breeding and preparing these horses for the global market. It is essential that the sale proceeds, albeit with the assistance of technology as well."

#### Raheen ready for QTIS sale

In the meantime, Queensland buyers and vendors will be ringside on the Gold Coast today for the first of two days of the Magic Millions Gold Coast March Yearling Sale.

All 376 lots scheduled to go through the ring have been subject to the first payment for the Queensland Thoroughbred Incentive Scheme (QTIS), with 105 of them also eligible for NSW's Breeder Owner Bonus Scheme (BOBS).


Nolan's Raheen Stud will have 25 yearlings on offer, including 10 by their resident stallion Golden Archer (Rock Of Gibraltar).

"This year, Raheen has a good, even draft of yearlings by Queensland's leading sires Spirit Of Boom and Better Than Ready," Nolan said last night. "We also are represented by first-season sires Under The Louvre, Sooboog, Air Force Blue and Pride of Dubai.

"One of our highlights is Lot 82, a filly by Bel Esprit; we were reminded what a Bel Esprit filly can do when Kisukano won the QTIS Jewel for two-year-olds on Saturday.

"The QTIS incentive scheme is undoubtedly one of the best schemes in Australia and this sale provides a good opportunity to invest in the Queensland industry."

Group 1 winners Shocking (Street Cry), Buffering (Mossman), Spirit Of Boom (Sequalo) are all past graduates of the QTIS sale, which begins at 10am local time.

#### **Double for Outreach**

Widden Stud's first season sire Outreach (Exceed And Excel) sired two new winners yesterday. Outreach Belle (2 f ex Navarino Gold by Lion Heart) broke her maiden at Grafton over 1000 metres, while Rose Sauvage (2 f ex Turbo Rose by Strategic) was victorious at Coonamble over 1100 metres. Placed at her last three starts. Outreach Belle was purchased for \$1,500 at the Inglis Scone Yearling Sale and has amassed over \$30,000 in prize-money. Rose Sauvage was a \$90,000 Inglis Classic Yearling Sale buy for her trainer Tracey Bartley and is a half-sister to stakeswinner In Good Time (Time Thief). The fillies are the third and fourth winners for Outreach. who covered 110 mares last spring at a fee of \$7,700 (inc GST).

# Moonee Valley a plus for Gaby

After finishing second to Bivouac (Exceed And Excel) in the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) last start, star filly Loving Gaby (I Am Invincible) will have the chance to turn the tables on the Godolphin colt when the pair meet again in Friday night's William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Moonee Valley. The three-year-old filly had the better of Bivouac when she won the Manikato Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) over the same course and distance in the spring and cotrainer David Eustace is confident she can do it again on Friday. "Arguably he was unlucky (in the Manikato) but we think she is slightly better around a bend and maybe he is better down the straight," Eustace said. "We'll see how we go on Friday but we're confident we can turn the tables."

# Trial has Personal ready for Slipper tilt

Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) third Personal (Fastnet Rock) was an impressive trial winner at Randwick last Thursday and as she heads into Saturday's Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on Saturday, co-trainer David Hayes believes she could be the forgotten horse. "She was very green in the Blue Diamond," Hayes said. "She's had a month since then and her last gallop before she left was right up there with Group 1 class horses." Craig Williams made the trip to Sydney to trial the filly and takes the ride on Saturday. "Craig won the trial and was not even trying," Hayes added. "I said to him the trial was all about experience, getting on the right leg as she is very fit and I don't care if you run fifth. So I'm very happy with her."

# Moroney still getting to know Aktau

British import Aktau (Teofilo), winner of two of his three Australian starts, will be aiming for a ticket to the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) in the 'win and you're in' Mornington Cup (Listed, 2400m) on Saturday but Mike Moroney admits he is still learning about his talented stayer. "We're hoping that we can win with him to qualify for the Caulfield Cup

and then make it easier on him in the spring," Moroney told Racing.com. "I'm sure he's got the potential and the ability but it's just his first campaign and we're still learning a fair bit about him."

#### Gator set for the paddock

After a disappointing tenth-place finish in the All-Star Mile (1600m) on Saturday, David Vandyke reported that Alligator Blood (All Too Hard) pulled up from the race in good order but is set for a break in the paddock. "I am really surprised with how well he has recovered," Vandyke told Racing.com. "This morning, without any anti-inflammatories, he was in good shape. He was trotting up lovely this morning, he was bright and I am very relieved that he is in such good shape. He will have a lovely eight weeks in the paddock now and we shall look forward to a possibly improved horse in the spring."

# The Odyssey set to become a millionaire

Eagle Farm trainer Kelly Schweida is set for his first million-dollar earner after The Odyssey's (Better That Ready) win in the \$300,000 OTIS Jewel 3YO (1200m) brought the threeyear-old's total prize-money to \$920,800. "I suppose the key is to get to know your horse and work with him," Schweida said. "For instance The Odyssey is a real guts. The more you feed him the more he eats. So this time when he went for a break we made sure he didn't eat too much and that he didn't get too fat. It seems to have worked. He has a good black-type race in him. I suppose it would be nice to say you had trained a million-dollar winner but what will be will be. That is one thing you learn pretty quickly."

### Ready For Caviar second on debut

Black Caviar's two-year-old daughter by More Than Ready (Southern Halo), Ready For Caviar, made her debut at Benalla yesterday, finishing second to the John Salanitri-trained Just A Tribute (Street Boss) by three-quarters of a length. The Lindsay Park-trained filly led for most of the trip but was overrun by the winner in the final few strides. Ready For Caviar is the third foal to race out of the champion mare after Oscietra (Exceed And Excel) and Prince Of Caviar (Sebring), both winners who have now been retired.

# Nestor lands Country heat quinella

Trainer Kody Nestor will have two runners in the \$500,000 Country Championships final (1400m) after celebrating a quinella in the qualifying heat at Coonamble yesterday with Sneak Preview (Smart Missile) beating Fast Talking (Walking Or Dancing). "Both horses are owned by a great bunch of people in syndicates we put together ourselves," Nestor told Sky Thoroughbred Central. "They didn't have the easiest of runs but they were too good. We've got great staff, great owners and they let me do my job the way I want to. I couldn't split them before the race and I think it only came down to the runs they had. If you swap runs you probably swap the result."

#### Bosson makes quick trip back to Australia

Leading New Zealand jockey Opie Bosson has rushed back to Australia amid fears he may not be able to re-enter the country to ride this weekend with nationwide travel restrictions now in place due to the coronavirus crisis. Bosson rode the Jamie Richards-trained Melody Belle (Commands) to third in Saturday's All-Star Mile (1600m) on Saturday and will reunite with Chipping Norton Stakes winner Te Akau Shark (Rip Van Winkle) in the George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m) at Rosehill this weekend. "Te Akau Racing can confirm that stable rider Opie Bosson is currently en route back to Australia and is scheduled to land in Sydney this evening," Te Akau principal David Ellis said in a statement yesterday.

# Melody Belle team make the most of All-Star experience

Despite Caulfield being closed to owners for the All-Star Mile, Melody Belle's connections still described the day as a "nine out of ten" experience. Melody Belle didn't enjoy the best of luck, finishing off well for third behind the Western Australia quinella of Regal Power (Pierro) and Superstorm (Sebring). However, John Galvin, who manages the Melody Belle Fortuna Syndicate, said that under the circumstances, the day couldn't have been much better. "While it was disappointing not to be at the track, given the facility we had at the casino it was just amazing and a better facility than you would get on-course," he said. "We had a number of large screens to watch the action on, finger food and a bar that we shared with all of the owners from the horses in the All Star Mile, so it was a great atmosphere."

## Travel ban throws autumn carnival into chaos

The announcement of travel restrictions due to the Covid-19 crisis is set to shake up Sydney's autumn carnival with three horses from Japan, including Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) favourite Mozu Ascot (Frankel), now in doubt to make the journey. They were due to arrive midweek. "The bottom line is the three overseas horses already here are right to go but the others must be highly doubtful," ATC General Manager Media Brett de Vine said yesterday. "We've only had an hour to digest this (the announcement) and we really need to get total clarity about what can and can't happen." Several runners from New Zealand will also be affected by the travel restrictions.

# Insurance against closed-doors racing

The cost of spectator-free racing will not be known for some time but the Australian Turf Club (ATC) is insured against losses for its three biggest autumn carnival meetings. Saturday's showpiece Golden Slipper meeting at Rosehill, featuring five Group 1 races, will be held behind closed doors, while the same is expected for The Championships at Randwick on April 4

and 11. ATC spokesman Brett de Vine said the club was insured but would obviously incur losses over the federal government coronavirus protocols in place regarding mass gatherings. "We tell the insurance company in advance what we are budgeting for in terms of a crowd, they determine the pay-out based on that," de Vine said. "We will lose some money but it will be mitigated by the insurance policy. The policy only covers the three major race days - the Golden Slipper and the two days of The Championships."

# Hay roll-out to continue in Wauchope area

The NSW racing industry's support for those still feeling the effects of bushfires continues with the distribution of hay and funds in the mid-North Coast region. The Australian Turf Club Foundation will today distribute more money at Wauchope raised from the recent Racing for the Bushfire Appeal. The funds raised go to people and livestock affected by the summer's devastating bushfires, combined with the ongoing consequences of the drought. About 1000 bales of hay will be distributed this afternoon from the Wauchope Jockey Club to help local trainers and farmers in the area and surrounding districts.

# Thoroughbreds Are Go to launch tonight

The latest venture from Caroline Searcy hits screens tonight with the first episode of Thoroughbreds Are Go, a program that examines thoroughbred aftercare and careers for racehorses post-retirement. The show sets out to include stories highlighting the great athleticism, intelligence and all-round adaptability of the thoroughbred at junior and elite levels of many equestrian disciplines. Tonight's first episode, which will be aired on Sky Thoroughbred Central at 7:30pm AEDT, will look at Krissy Harris' Thoroughbred Sport Horse Association, speak to thoroughbred retrainer Scott Brodie and catch up with Rizon (Zabeel), the 2004 Herbert Power Stakes (Gr 2, 2004) winner who now looks after the next generation of racetrack stars at Blue Gum

# More in store for Oaks runner-up

Vancooga (Proisir) may have been one of the outsiders in Saturday's New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) at Trentham, but her eyecatching effort to flash home into second has connections potentially plotting an Australian campaign - depending on the Covid-19 situation. The Gavin Sharrocktrained filly had only broken her maiden at Otaki the start before finishing second in the fillies' feature, with connections rewarded for paying the NZ\$9,200 late entry fee for the Oaks. "She got home last night and when I came down at 7am this morning she had licked the bowl clean," Sharrock said. "She's a fantastic filly and for the first foal out of the mare (Forty Love), it is a huge tribute to her. She is out of an Ekraar mare from a Royal Academy mare and I'd say she'd stay two miles. The way she has come through the race we may go to the Australasian Oaks in South Australia in May. We are still in discussion and with this Coronavirus you're not quite sure what will be happening, but that is a plan we are looking at."

# Tinkalicious takes Millar to career high

Trainer Janelle Millar celebrated the biggest win of her 15-year training career when Tinkalicious (Nadeem) took out the Cuddle Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Trentham on Saturday. Millar had won two Listed races in 2014-15 with Just The Tip (Danroad), having held her licence since 2004-05, but Tinkalicious' win in the Cuddle Stakes represented a new peak. "We've had a couple of stakes wins and quite a few Group placings along the way, but we'd never won a Group race before Saturday," she said. It was a far cry from the beginning of her career, when Millar struggled to syndicate Tinkalicious. "She was passed in as a weanling," Millar said. "I do a lot of leasing off studs, including Sam Williams at Little Avondale, who owns this mare. I broke her in and I always quite liked her. She was very hot at the start, so we had to be patient and take our time with her, but she always showed me a lot of ability."

# Ritchie to form partnership with Colm Murray

In the aftermath of Jennifer Eccles' (Rip Van Winkle) dazzling New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m) win, trainer Shaune Ritchie laid most of the plaudits at the feet of the filly's handler and regular trackwork rider, Colm Murray. Soon, though, the filly will race in the names of both Ritchie and Murray with the pair to form a training partnership from August 1. "Colm is a natural horseman and he has that way about him that I think only the Kiwis and the Irish have with their horses," Ritchie said. "He gets to the stable each morning before me and is very keen and is exactly the right type of person that is great for racing and for our stable. We have a wonderful bunch of staff and he fits in very well. He has been riding the filly (Jennifer Eccles) all the way through and is a major asset for the operation."

#### **ASIA**

#### Four for Just A Way

Shadai Stallion Station's Just A Way (Heart's Cry), named world's best racehorse in 2014, sired his fourth individual stakes winner yesterday when Epos (3 f ex Strike Root by Smart Strike) swept to victory at Hanshin in the Hochi Hai Fillies' Revue (Gr 2, 1400m), otherwise known as the Japanese 1000 Guineas Trial. Epos is the first Group 2 winner for her sire, having produced three stakes winners previously. Epos was given a terrific ride by Yasunari Iwata, bringing her from midfield with a well-timed run to score. The three-year-old filly will now progress to the Oka Sho (Gr 1, 1600m), the Japanese 1000 Guineas itself. The last filly to do the Revue and Oka Sho double was Rhein Kraft (End Sweep) in 2005.

# Saturnalia returns with a bang

Blueblood Saturnalia (4 c Lord Kanaloa - Cesario by Special Week) began his four-year-old season with an effortless two-length victory in the Kinko Sho (Gr 2, 2000m) at Chukyo yesterday. The dual Group 1 winner had not been seen since finishing a distant second behind Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) winner Lys

Gracieux (Heart's Cry) in the Arima Kinen (Gr 1, 2500m) in December. Saturnalia is expected to run next in the Osaka Hai (Gr 1, 2000m) before a potential overseas campaign targeting either the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) or the Breeders' Cup Turf (Gr 1, 12f). His dam Cesario (Special Week) won both the 2005 Yushun Himba (Gr 1, 2400m), also known as the Japanese Oaks, as well as that year's American Oaks (Gr 1, 10f) at Hollywood Park. She has also produced Group 1 winners Epiphaneia (Symboli Kris S) and Leontes (King Kamehameha).

#### Free entries to close for Hong Kong's Champions Day

The last opportunity to enter horses for free for Hong Kong's three spring features closes at 6pm local time tonight. The three features - the HK\$25 million Queen Elizabeth II Cup (Gr 1, 2000m), the HK\$20 million Champions Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) and the HK\$18 million Chairman's Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m) - will again be run at Sha Tin on the same day, April 26, billed by the Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) as Champions Day. Any horse can be entered through the HKJC's online entry form, not just for Champions Day but for any of the city's Group 1, Group 2 or Group 3 races.

#### INTERNATIONAL

#### 35 for Siyouni

France's champion sire Siyouni (Pivotal) was rewarded with his 35th individual stakes winner yesterday as Simona (4 f ex Monava by El Prado) scored a first black-type win in the Prix Exbury (Gr 3, 2000m) at Saint-Cloud, the first Group race of the French flat season. Rated well on the speed by Alexis Badel, the Francis-Henri Graffard-trained Simona recorded a two-length win over Jerome Reynier's Spirit Of Nelson (Mount Nelson) with his stablemate Pappalino (Makfi) holding down third. Siyouni stands for €100,000 (inc GST) at Haras de Bonneval and will be represented in Saturday's Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) by the Jean Dubois-trained See You Soon.

#### 34 for Raven's Pass

Darley stallion Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) sired his 34th stakes winner yesterday when Pisanella (3 c ex Painting by Peintre Celebre) took out the Prix Omnium II Stakes (Listed, 1600m) at Saint-Cloud. The three-year-old colt, who has now won twice from two starts, defeated The Summit (Wootton Bassett) by a head with Choice Of Raison (Zoffany) a further two and a quarter lengths away in third. Pisanella is one of three winners out of Painting (Peintre Celebre) and is related to Ranvet Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) winner The United States (Galileo) as well as dual Group 1 winner Hermosa (Galileo). Raven's Pass stands at Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland for a fee of €10,000 (inc GST).

#### 38 for Soldier Hollow

German-based sire Soldier Hollow (In The Wings) landed his 38th stakes winner yesterday when Emoji (3 f ex Exotic Rose by Manduro) Prix La Camargo Stakes (Listed, 1600m) at Saint-Cloud. Unbeaten from two starts, the three-year-old filly defeated Galova (Galiway) by two lengths with Anobar (Anodin) a further length and a quarter back in third. Emoji is the first foal to race out of the placed mare Exotic (Manduro) who herself is a half-sister to Group 3 winner Enzio (Next Desert). Group 1 winner Soldier Hollow stands at Gestut Auenquelle for a fee of €30,000 (inc GST) and is also the sire of 2017 Ranvet Stakes winner and 2015 Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) third Our Ivanhowe.

#### 17 for Elusive Quality

The late Elusive Quality (Gone West) added a 17th Group / Grade 1 winner to his record on Saturday when Ce Ce (4 m ex Miss Houdini by Belong To Me) won the Beholder Mile (Gr 1, 8f) by more than three lengths on the Santa Anita dirt. It was just Ce Ce's fifth start, having debuted in April last year for trainer Mike McCarthy,

and a first stakes victory. Bred in Kentucky by Bo Hirsch, whose last Grade 1 win was with Ce Ce's dam Miss Houdini (Belong To Me) in the 2002 Del Mar Debutante (Gr 1, 7f), Ce Ce is a half-sister to Papa Clem (Smart Strike), winner of the 2009 Arkansas Derby (Gr 2, 9f). Elusive Quality died at 25 at Darley's Jonabell Farm in March, 2018.

# Baffert duo stamp Kentucky Derby claims - but when?

Bob Baffert knows what it takes to win the Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 1m2f), but the Covid-19 pandemic has the champion trainer believing that he will be preparing his three-year-olds for a "June or September" Derby, rather than the first Saturday in May. Baffert, who has won the Kentucky Derby five times, including with the last two Triple Crown winners in Justify (Scat Daddy) and American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile), produced two leading contenders for the Churchill Downs feature in the space of 30 minutes. At Oaklawn Park in Arkansas, Nadal (Blame) served up a gutsy win to take the Rebel Stakes (Gr 2, 8.5f), while at Santa Anita, Charlatan (Speightstown) won an allowance over a mile by more than ten lengths. "It's hard to get excited if the Kentucky Derby is not run in May. It won't be as majestic and won't be the same event. They have to run it in May for the good of the sport. There's enough time to figure out ways to run it safely and not impact the wagering."

# O'Brien prepares classy squad for Dubai

Aidan O'Brien is pushing ahead with Dubai plans for a number of his classy older horses, even as doubts linger over whether the world's richest race meeting will proceed at Meydan on March 28. O'Brien told the Dubai Racing Club's notes team that his team will likely include Mackinnon Stakes

(Gr 1, 2000m) winner Magic Wand (Galileo) in the Dubai Turf (Gr 1, 1800m), Investec Derby (Gr 1, 12f) winner Anthony Van Dyck (Galileo) as well as Fleeting (Zoffany) in the Dubai Sheema Classic (Gr 1, 2400m) and Kew Gardens (Galileo) in the Dubai Gold Cup (Gr 2, 3200m). He is also hoping to run Sergei Prokofiev (Scat Daddy) in the Al Quoz Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m), while he is likely to run one of his five entries for the UAE Derby (Gr 2, 1900m) - Battle Of Liege (War Front), Fort Myers (War Front), King Of Athens (War Front), New World Tapestry (War Front) and Year Of The Tiger (Galileo) - depending on who gains a berth.

#### Tetaze takes Latinoamericano

Argentina scored a home victory, and a quinella to boot, in South America's most prestigious race, the Gran Premio Latinoamericano (Gr 1, 2000m) with the Roberto Pellagatta-trained Tetaze (Equal Stripes) taking out this year's feature. The race is shifted between tracks in South America, with San Isidro in Buenos Aires this year's host. Crowds were kept out due to Covid-19 concerns with a rain-affected track also complicating matters. However, Tetaze relished the conditions under Gustavo Calvente, racing clear for a two-length success over favourite Mirinaque (Hurricane Cat). The 2021 Gran Premio Latinoamericano will be held at Monterrico in Peru.



# Debutant Heavenly Dancer lands from the clouds

iwi trainer Stephen Gray felt bad for the big party of owners who had come down to Kranji to see Heavenly Dancer's (Echoes Of Heaven) race debut when their pride and joy blew the start yesterday.

Hopes and excitement had been building up in anticipation of the three-year-old's first race, but they can all be dashed to the ground in one split second.

There was still a glimmer of hope when the chestnut gelding recovered from the stumble and made his way forward around runners, but another bump at the home turn was to Gray the last nail in the coffin.

The S\$75,000 Restricted Maiden race was a 1000 metre speed scamper where an interruption in any way, shape or form usually means it's game over.

Add the fact that upfront, Michael Clements' newcomer Latent Power (Shamexpress) and Louis-Philippe Beuzelin were showing a clean set of heels after they pinched a three-length break on the pack despite coming off a horrendous four-wide trip; only the foolhardy would still believe in a miracle.

But the testing journey eventually told on Latent Power, and right on cue, Heavenly Dancer, under Vlad Duric's trademark hard whip-riding, started to sprout wings at the rate of knots on the outside.

One was shortening, one was quickening. As is the case for such scenarios, the victor would hinge on how fast the finishing line comes up.

As the clocker stopped the watch at 59.84, it was Heavenly Dancer in Gray's Copperbelt Racing silks, who got a short head in front of Latent Power's white face. Favourite Brutus (Rubick) ran third another two lengths away.

After roaring Heavenly Dancer to the line from an untenable position, Gray and the owners could let their unbridled joy explode at the winner's box.

"When he missed the start, and got bumped at the turn, I said 'no chance," said Gray.

"Only good horses like Emperor Max and Lim's Cruiser can get away with it, and do what he did. To win like that when he was knocked around is fantastic, he should have won easily.

"Gary Carvell picked him at the trials. He's owned by a syndication of Kiwi owners including John Laxon, Laurie's (nine-time Singapore champion trainer) son. Craig Geehman then syndicated the remaining shares to local owners.

"We bought him from the Campins (New Zealand bloodstock agent), just like another good horse of ours, Sky Rocket. He was actually sold to Hong Kong interests, but we made an offer for him and they took it. I liked the horse a lot, we gave him two 1000m trials and he kept getting better and better.

"I think he'll end up becoming a very good horse. I've always preferred buying young, unraced horses like him, instead of secondhand horses.

"A first race over 1000m can be testing for

such young horses, but there are some nice horses coming up and we thought it'd be better to split good horses."

Duric said he had to switch to Plan B when Heavenly Dancer bombed the start and was blown away by his turn of foot in the straight.

"The plan was to run third or fourth, but he was nervous at the barriers and bombed the start. I just let him come back under me and ride him for luck," said the Australian hoop.

"When I put him out at the top of the straight, he was very impressive. It was a very good gallop, he is a very nice horse."

As for Clements, he could not have been happier with Latent Power's first-up second place, even if he felt he was stiff in defeat.

"Latent Power has been a really difficult horse to prepare. I'm really pleased with his first run," he said. "If he had got a barrier, he wins the race. There was a lot of speed and pace, he will come on from that run.

"I would've liked to have put more work into him, but he's a very headstrong horse. It was a very good run given he had a pretty soft prep."
