# Foxwedge mare Villami's spring campaign up in the air

But full steam ahead to the Golden Rose for Ryan and Alexiou-trained stablemate Peltzer

ptions remain open for valuable stakes-winning mare Villami (Foxwedge) while connections of talented three-year-old stablemate Peltzer (So You Think) see no reason to change course after the colt's performance in Saturday's Run To The Rose (Gr 2, 1200m).

Trained by Gerald Ryan and Sterling Alexiou,

Villami made her first public appearance for the spring when winning a Rosehill barrier trial yesterday but as to when she will be seen next, part-owner David Raphael is unsure.

"She always works well, she relaxed a bit better, and good horses trial well and that's what she did. There's nothing over the top and she just goes out and does it - she's a good filly," was Raphael's assessment of Villami's trial yesterday. *Continued on page 2>>*

## Ban on interstate staff located in NSW-Victoria border bubble to remain in place

<< Continued from page 1 "She's a class horse and she just dropped her head and travelled well. She's got a very set pattern and there's no change with her and we're not trying to stretch her out over more ground as she's not a miler, she's a sprinter."

Villami defeated Belluci Babe (Per Incanto) by a long head in heat five over 900 metres, running 53.47 seconds. Harto (Fastnet Rock) was two and a quarter lengths away in third.

"We will just cruise for the next few days and then decide what we do, but there's not actually a lot of races for her up here in Sydney if you want to stick to fillies and mares races," he said.

"You just have to wait and see where everyone's going, to be quite truthful. There's not a lot of logical options for her."

A \$425,000 Magic MIllions Gold Coast Yearling Sale purchase from Cressfield in 2018, Villami has won twice from 11 starts, including the Fireball Stakes (Listed, 1100m) in March, but her record could have been significantly better, according to Raphael.

"The good filly of Gerry Harvey's (Libertini) beat us one day by a half-head when we were 20-1 and she was even-money," he said.

"We were a bit unlucky not to beat Loving Gaby as well and with different circumstances I think we may have beaten her that day in Melbourne (in the Group 3 Champagne Stakes)

"In her first prep, we weren't able to get out behind Anaheed so we possibly could have beaten her and Flit (in the Percy Sykes). She may have had three more Group wins."

While plans are up in the air for Villami, the picture is clearer for stablemate **Peltzer**, a colt also part-owned by Raphael, who will continue on to the Golden Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) on Saturday week.

Peltzer became one of the most talked about two-year-olds during the winter after an unbeaten three-run preparation, culminating in a four-length demolition at Randwick on May 23. *Continued on page 4>>*

<< Continued from page 2 Resuming this campaign, Peltzer was runner-up in the San Domenico Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m), a race run at a fast tempo set by Anders (Not A Single Doubt), before running fourth in a hecticly run Run To The Rose at Rosehill at the weekend.

The unplaced run was no cause for concern for Ryan or Alexiou and Raphael said feedback from Peltzer's jockey Kerrin McEvoy was also encouraging.

"At the moment, we're full steam ahead. There's been no discussion about changing plans and we're sticking to it," the former race caller and media commentator said.

"It looked like he'd improved from first-up and anyone who saw him in the paddock (mounting yard) would agree and he'll be ready third up. It's not that he wasn't fit, but you know what I mean.

"Everything's gone perfectly this prep, expect for the way the races have been run."

The colt was forced to chase Anders first-up while he also raced close to the tempo set by Farnan (Not A Single Doubt) last start.

"All of us that are in tune with our horse are very happy. It was interesting that people were expecting so much more of him first-up, but I don't think he underachieved and everyone was expecting so much of him second-up and Rothfire's performance was extraordinary," he said,

"Rothfire will be favourite and he deserves to be on what he did the other day but we all know favourites don't win every race. Peltzer was second-up and Rothfire has to do it second-up." Whether Peltzer heads to the Caulfield Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) or is freshened up for a tilt at the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) will not be known until after the Golden Rose.

"We are just going to get to the Golden Rose before we start working out if we're turning left or right," he said.

"He's had two really hard runs and the fact that a couple of those others who had a gut-buster first-up in Mamaragan and a couple of others, they haven't performed to the same level second-up, but our horse did."

Raphael is hopeful that the depth of his on-track team of Peltzer and Villami can be added to this season after securing shares in two high-priced colts.

Raphael's syndicate bought into the Edinburgh Park-bred and sold \$1 million Exceed And Excel (Danehill) colt out of Smokin' Alice (Smoke Glacken) from the Magic Millions sale in January and dug deep again in July at the Inglis Easter Round 2 auction to buy into a son of I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit),

The Bhima Thoroughbreds-consigned colt, who made \$700,000, is the third foal out of Miss Atom Bomb (Encosta De Lago), the half-sister to Winx (Street Cry) and Group 3-winning sprinter El Divino (Snitzel).

Both colts are in training with Ryan and Alexiou.

Raphael indicated that the pair, who are currently in work, were likely to soon head to the paddock for a break rather than be pushed to make the ATC Breeders' Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) at Randwick on October 3.

# All Too Hard colt runs quick time

Yesterday's breeze ups at Eagle Farm ahead of the Inglis Ready 2 Race Sale produced an eyecatching performance on the clock from a son of All Too Hard (Casino Prince), catalogued as Lot 49 and offered by KBL Thoroughbreds. The bay colt clocked 10.33s on the sealed dirt track (Good 4). He is the second foal of Max It Out (Northern Meteor), who has a 2017 gelding by Press Statement (Hinchinbrook) and a 2019 colt by the same sire. ## Tendon injury ends Showmanship's campaign

Showmanship (Showcasing), favourite for Saturday's Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m), will miss the Caulfield contest and the remainder of the spring after suffering a tendon injury. The five-year-old headed the betting for the Group 1 contest after posting six straight wins but owner-breeder Bob Peters has revealed he now faces a stint on the sidelines. "Every tendon is bad," Peters told Racing.com. "It's a bit of a different one. One tendon is a lot thicker than the other one. I haven't experienced one of these before. I've had longitudinal ones and plenty of tears, but they are hard to measure these ones."

## Benchmark option for La Tigeresa

Trainers Jason Warren and Dean Krongold have elected to bypass the How Now Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) with La Tigeresa (Street Cry). The six-year-old mare, a winner of four races, was nominated for the \$160,000 mares race as well as

the Benchmark 90 Handicap (1400m) at Caulfield on Saturday and Krongold said yesterday that the mare would target the latter race. La Tigeresa resumed from a let-up with a fifth placing at Moonee Valley on September 5 over 1200 metres. "It wasn't disappointing at all. There was plenty of improvement to come out of her and she's made those improvements and looks great in the coat now," Krongold said. "Her condition has tightened up so we will expect an improved performance on Saturday."

### Catalyst chasing Everest berth

Catalyst (Darci Brahma) is set to make his return to action in Saturday's The Shorts (Gr 2, 1100m) at Randwick with his New Zealand-based trainer Clayton Chipperfield hopeful the four-year-old can put in a display which earns him a slot in next month's The Everest (1200m). It will be the first time Catalyst has been seen on raceday since his sixth placing in the Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) in February, with that campaign ending abruptly after detecting heat in his joints. "It will be great to see him back out there again and to try and improve on his last run in Australia," Chipperfield said. Glen Boss partnered Catalyst in a gallop at Randwick yesterday morning and gave the trainer the tick of approval ahead of Saturday. "He is a little excited and he was happy with the improvement from his first ride on him ten days ago," Chipperfield said. "We're in good shape for a nice showing on Saturday." Chipperfield is hoping the son of Darci Brahma (Danehill) will put his hand up for a slot in the \$15 million The Everest but is mindful there are other lucrative races in Sydney, including the \$7.5 million Golden Eagle (1500m) which is restricted to fouryear-olds. "Obviously if he goes a very good race on Saturday or was unlucky not to win it and they give us an Everest slot, we would have to seriously consider it," he said. "If we don't, then we still have the Golden Eagle but there are 15 million reasons why we should be running in The Everest. We will get through Saturday first and if he does get a slot in The Everest then we will have to change our plans a little bit to get to the Golden Eagle."

### 'Nonconformist back on track'

Nonconformist (Rebel Raider) appears to be back on track for a tilt at the Caulfield Cup (Gr 1, 2400m) after satisfying connections in a jump-out yesterday morning. Grahame Begg was forced to scrap plans to run the four-year-old at Flemington last Saturday due to the results of blood tests but the trainer reports the situation to have improved with a 1700-metre at Caulfield next Saturday now under consideration. "Everything is good, he's on track," Begg told Racing.com. "His blood picture is fine, so he was right to go to the jump-outs. So he's back on track. (Where we go after Caulfield) is open ended at the moment. He has got plenty of options, races like the Cranbourne Cup, those sort of races are on offering. He could even be a quick back-up into the Turnbull, so who knows?"

### Bella Vella pleases Clarken

Moir Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) hopeful Bella Vella (Commands) was another to please connections in a jump-out yesterday morning with Will Clarken confirming the Moonee Valley contest on September 25 remains very much on the agenda for his McEwan Stakes (Gr 2, 1000m) winner. "That was perfect this morning, just what we were looking for," Clarken told Racing.com. "I just felt she was a little on the fresh side since the McEwen and that was a nice piece of maintenance work without her being knocked around."

### Flying Artie filly wins trial

Princess Bojack, a first crop juvenile by Newgate Farm sire Flying Artie (Artie Schiller), won a barrier trial at Toowoomba yesterday by three lengths. The Michael Nolan-trained filly, who was bred by Tim and Celie Nolan at Murrulla Stud, won by three lengths in 53.49 seconds for the 870-metre heat. Princess Bojack was a \$50,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale purchase by Nolan from the Book 2 session in January. The other two-year-old trial held at Toowoomba yesterday was won by the Glenn Richardson-trained Sherwood Prince (Better Than Ready) who ran a time of 53.81 seconds.

# Perth on cards for Gailo Chop

Veteran Gailo Chop (Deporvito) is set to head to Perth in November for a second Western Australian campaign. Warrnambool trainer Matthew Williams yesterday revealed that the ten-year-old gelding, who was runnerup in last year's Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) at Ascot, would again target the carnival in 2020 but that the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) would be added to his programme. "Last year we only took him over for one run and he performed really well, the class suited him better too," Williams told Racing.com. "This year he'll definitely head over for longer and also run in the Railway. I thought his run first-up in the Makybe Diva was OK, it was all over for him after he missed the start and he ended up three wide and he can't run those sharp sectionals like some of the others. He'll join Harbour Views in the Underwood and I think he'll show he's still got a bit left in the old boy."

## Eye injury sidelines Cockney Crew

Four-time winner Cockney Crew (Maschino) will miss the Ascot Carnival after suffering an eye injury his trainer Kieran McDonagh has revealed. "He had an ulcer removed from his eye and I've run out of time to get him ready and fit for a summer campaign," McDonagh told The Races WA. "I was expecting him to be back in work weeks ago, but although not serious, it's taken him a little time to get over it. The owners

are being cautious and are not in any rush to get him back before he is ready, they won't be taking any risks. It's not a serious injury that threatens his career or anything like that, but I just have run out of time to get him ready for the Perth Cup." The latest news is a further setback for Cockney Crew who was ruled out of last season's Perth Cup (Gr 2, 2400m) due to a foot issue.

# Balaklava straight to suit Master Chum

Rob Wilkinson is hoping the long home straight can help Master Chum (Clangalang) return to winning ways when the six-year-old lines up in today's Balaklava Cup (Listed, 1600m). The four-time winner last tasted success back in February but he hinted he was getting back to his best when finishing close up behind the placegetters in the Leon Macdonald Stakes (Listed, 1400m) last time out. "To win a race like this would be sensational, it would be a big achievement for him," Wilkinson told trsa. com. "We looked at Balaklava due to the bigger track and he might go on to the Murray Bridge Gold Cup and potentially the Tokyo City Cup."

# Chauffeur aiming for back-to-back wins

Chauffeur (Snitzel) will attempt to make it two wins in as many starts since joining David Vandyke when the six-year-old lines up in a Class 5 Plate over 1300-metres at Eagle Farm today. Chauffeur won for only the third time in his 24-start career last month and Vandyke told racingqueensland.com: "It was a good win at Doomben first-up for me and I'm hoping he can win again. Since he came to me, he's settled in beautifully and he's thriving. I was expecting him to run well in his first start for us but I wasn't confident he'd win. I think the change of environment and the climate has made a big difference."

# Walker booked for Willoughby ride

Michael Walker has been booked to take the ride on European raider Dashing Willoughby (Nathaniel) in both the Caulfield Cup and Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m). Sir Owen Glenn's Go Bloodstock recently bought a

share in the Andrew Balding-trained Group 2 winner and the operation's Steve O Connor said: "Upon discussing a suitable jockey with Sir Owen, Mick and Janice Mariscotti and Andrew Balding, it became clear we wanted a Victorian jockey with good Cup experience who would suit Dashing Willoughby's racing style. We wanted someone we could trust who was as motivated as ever. Michael ticked all these boxes and we cannot wait for Michael to get his first sit on Dashing when he arrives in a little over two weeks."

### Lane to partner Aspetar

Last year's winning jockey Damian Lane will team up with British raider Aspetar (Al Kazeem) in next month's Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) after trainer Roger Charlton swooped to secure his services for the German Group 1 winner. A tilt at the Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) is also under consideration for the northern hemisphere five-year-old.

## Nancho ruled out of Melbourne Cup

One horse with a European connection who will not be lining up in the Melbourne Cup is Nancho (Tai Chi). The former Hungarian Horse of The Year got jarred up on his only Australian trial to date last month, and his trainer Anthony Cummings yesterday revealed the German Group 1 winner is no longer in contention to run at the carnival. "We did some scans and there's nothing dramatic, but he'll need time and so he's in the paddock and he'll be back in the autumn," Cummings told Racing.com. "He's a nice horse and he'll be fine after a nice holiday and he'll have a productive autumn I might say."

# Inquiry into Farnan ride scheduled

Racing NSW stewards have scheduled the resumption of the inquiry into Hugh Bowman's riding of Farnan (Not A Single Doubt) in Saturday's Run To The Rose (Gr 2, 1200m) to take place tomorrow afternoon. Both Bowman and co-trainer Adrian Bott have been requested to attend the hearing, which will be held at the offices of Racing NSW at 2pm.

# Breaches detected at Toowoomba

Unlicensed track riders and the use of a prohibited substance were discovered by the Queensland Racing Integrity Commission's investigations team following an operation at Toowoomba and Oakey yesterday. "As part of the Toowoomba operation, 41 riders were drug tested, with one trainer stood down pending the results of confirmatory analysis after a preliminary positive screen to a prohibited substance and making admissions to using the substance. A trackwork rider and a stablehand were found to be unlicensed and a trainer was fined \$400 for the breach of the rules. Both preliminary positive screen samples will be sent to a laboratory for confirmatory testing," the QRIC said in a statement. "At Oakey a trackwork rider was also stood down pending the results of confirmatory analysis after returning a preliminary positive screen to a prohibited substance and making admissions to the use of the substance."

# 160 submissions to thoroughbred welfare panel

Former Victorian Premier Denis Napthine believes there is "a real appetite" from both inside and outside the racing and breeding industries to look at how horse welfare can be improved. Napthine heads up the Thoroughbred Aftercare Welfare Working Group panel which has received more than 160 submissions from prominent trainers, owners, breeders and race clubs, as well as welfare groups, veterinarians, equine retrainers, researchers and the general public. "The working group has been very impressed and pleased with the standard and the sheer number of submissions that have been lodged," Napthine said. "It is clear that there is a real appetite from both within and outside the thoroughbred industry to look at how welfare can be improved."

### NSW Racehorse Owners Association finalists announced

Sprint star Nature Strip (Nicconi) and his Chris Waller-trained stablemate Verry Elleegant (Zed), have been joined by two-time Group 1 winner Fierce Impact (Deep Impact) and international raider Addeybb (Pivotal) on the four-strong shortlist for the 2019/20 NSW Champion Horse

of the Year, the results of which are set to be announced at a televised event on October 22.

### Mo'unga Savabeel's latest star

The huge impression created by unbeaten Sydney galloper Mo'unga (Savabeel) with his Rosehill stakes win last Saturday highlighted a significant week for champion New Zealand sire Savabeel (Zabeel), one which also uncovered another two of his possible three-year-old stars. While Group 2 winner The Chosen One boosted hopes of a start in the Caulfield Cup next month with a win in Melbourne, winning performances by Mo'unga and fellow three-year-olds Cornflower Blue and Savannah Cloud added to an exciting time for Waikato Stud, the home of the sensational sire. "It was good week for Savabeel," Waikato Stud's principal Mark Chittick said. "I was happy to see The Chosen One win for his good group of owners and you had to be impressed by Mo'unga's win. He looks a hell of a horse and he was certainly impressive. He's got a big future." Mo'unga raced away with the Dulcify Quality (Listed, 1500m) and is now being set for the Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Randwick on October 10 with his lead-up mission being the Gloaming Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m) at Rosehill on September 26. Mo'unga was bought by Queensland's Aquis Farm from Book 1 at the 2019 National Yearling Sales at Karaka for \$325,000 and is the third foal from Chandelier (O'Reilly), a lightly tried onerace winner who was second in Lowland Stakes (Gr 3, 2100m) and retired after finishing unplaced in 2013 New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m).

## Kiwi Ida thriving for Group 1 test

Kiwi Ida (Squamosa) is in fine fettle heading into Saturday's Tarzino Trophy (Gr 1, 1400m) with the John and Karen Parsons-trained mare staying in the Waikato after her fresh-up sixth placing in the Foxbridge Plate (Gr 2, 1200m). The multiple Group 2 winner will race over her preferred 1400-metre distance at the weekend but has six lengths to find on Avantage (Fastnet Rock). "She was pretty brave given she was fresh-up and she never got closer than four-wide to the fence," Karen Parsons said of the mare's Foxbridge Plate

run. Kiwi Ida holds a nomination for the Windsor Park Plate (Gr 1, 1600m) but is a doubtful starter in the second leg of the Hawke's Bay Triple Crown, with Parson's notion of stretching the mare likely to be over-ruled. "I've got her in the mile, and I wanted to try again because she is older and stronger and her racing style looks like she will get it, but John and Chris (Johnson, jockey) don't think she will get the trip. She is going to go to the Taranaki Breeders' Stakes on October 10."

## Demonetization to miss Tarzino

Demonetization (All Too Hard) has been ruled out of the Tarzino Trophy trainer Nigel Tiley has revealed. The talented but injury plagued Group 2 winner looked to be back to his best with two wins this preparation before an eye-catching fourth-placing in the Foxbridge Plate last start. However, a bruised heel has halted his Group 1 aspirations this weekend. "Unfortunately he bruised a heel and I think his chances of making the race were slightly less than 50-50," Tiley said. "We have to take the shoe off him and the chances were that we wouldn't be able to get the shoe back on him until Wednesday or Thursday. It is quite an expensive exercise to keep paying up, so we thought we would take the cautious approach and have a crack at the Windsor Park Plate. I hope he gets a start."

## Public allowed back on Hong Kong tracks

Members of the public will be able to attend the races again in Hong Kong from Sunday as part of a slight lifting of the tight Covid-19 restrictions that have been enforced over the past two months. The Hong Kong Jockey Club has confirmed groups of four will be allowed on course from this weekend's Sha Tin meeting, provided they have an advanced table booking. Racegoers will only be admitted to the track if they abide by the public health measures put in place, including temperature screening, filling in a declaration form and wearing a mask. These arrangements will be in place for a further four meetings - September 20 (Sha Tin), September 23 (Happy Valley), September 27 (Sha Tin) and October 1 (Sha Tin).

# Hayes camp pleased with Beauty Generation ahead of return

Beauty Generation's (Road To Rock) campaign ramped up a notch yesterday morning at Sha Tin with a 1000-metre turf barrier trial under Zac Purton which connections hope will lead to a fourth consecutive win in the Celebration Cup Handicap (Gr 3, 1400m) in a fortnight's time, before pointing him to his main target, December's Hong Kong International Races. Hong Kong's standout miler of recent seasons galloped by the winning post eighth behind Amazing Chocolate (Sepoy) in a time of 57.14s and advanced after the line to lead the pack around the bend. "He's come out of it well," trainer David Hayes said of the now eightyear-old. "He was beaten a bit for speed in the middle stages, but I thought through the line was pretty strong and more importantly Zac said he felt like his old self."

## Mr Malek on Guineas path

Mr Malek (Swiss Ace) is being aimed at the Singapore Guineas (Listed, 1600m) following his impressive win at Kranji on Saturday. It was the first time the son of Swiss Ace (Secret Savings) had been tested over a mile and he passed with flying colours. "He needed to win to progress to the Guineas and he's done just that," trainer Lee Freedman said. "If he didn't run well, we could have gone back to sprints and pressed towards the Lion City Cup instead. When you know you're going to bump into a

horse like Inferno in the Guineas, first you must make sure your horse can run the trip. Mr Malek is a horse who still has scope for improvement, but he will take Inferno on in the Guineas. At least, I know the horse can run the trip and it's not an unknown quantity any more. On that run, he's going to the Guineas."

Last year's Epsom Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winner Anthony Van Dyck (Galileo) is among a sixstrong team of top-class horses trained by Aidan O'Brien who will enter quarantine at Ballydoyle today with a view to contesting races at the Spring Carnival. The current Melbourne and Caulfield Cup top weight will be joined in quarantine by Santiago (Authorized), the winner of this year's Irish Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f), plus fellow northern hemisphere three-yearold Tiger Moth (Galileo) as O'Brien's three cups possibles. Also under consideration for an Australian trip are last year's Mackinnon Stakes winner Magic Wand (Galileo), who has that race and the as possible targets, Armory (Galileo), who could contest the same two races and 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) runner-up Wichita (No Nay Never) who is in the frame for a tilt at the Cantala Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m).

# Honor A.P. to stand at Lane's End

Grade 1 winner Honor A. P. (Honor Code) was

due to arrive at Lane's End Farm's Kentucky base yesterday after it was decided to call time on his racing career following the revelation he suffered an injury when finishing fourth in last week's Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 10f). "Honor A. P. showed brilliance as a two-year-old from the first time I saw him train and replicated it as a three-year-old defeating the future Kentucky Derby winner," trainer John Shirreffs told Bloodhorse.com. "He ran a super race in the Derby and we later found that he came out of the race with an injury, so all things considered, what he accomplished was something special." A half brother to three black-type horses, Honor A. P. is out of the multiple Grade 1 winner Hollywood Story (Wild Rush). He is Honor Code's (A.P. Indy) highest-priced yearling after being knocked down to David Ingordo for Lee and Susan Searing's CRK Stable at The Saratoga Sale, Fasig-Tipton's select yearling sale, for \$850,000 in 2018. A fee has yet to be announced.

# Harry Eustace to take over licence at Newmarket yard

Harry Eustace is set to take over from his father James as the licence holder at Park Lodge Stables early next year. Eustace junior, the brother of Ciaron Maher's training partner David, spent time with Lee Freedman and Peter Snowden, and also oversaw the preparation of Addeybb when he took out a pair of Group 1s in Australia earlier in the year, in his present role as assistant to Derby-winning trainer William



# Ban on interstate staff located in NSW-Victoria border bubble to remain in place

he easing of coronavirus restrictions in Victoria, particularly in regional areas, will have no immediate bearing on horse movement protocols or the Racing NSW edict that staff from the southern state cannot work north of the border without undertaking quarantine.

NSW-Victoria border trainers have been the most affected by the stern response of chief executive Peter V'landys to the Covid-19 second wave in Victoria, firstly by stopping racehorses from entering NSW, as well as imposing a ban on Victorian-based staff from undertaking their duties if employed by a trainer north of the border, even if they were in a "travel bubble".

The movement of horses from Victoria to NSW stables and racecourses, which had been banned since July 8, was once again permitted late last month, but under tight protocols, including a 48-hour quarantine period for the horses at a spelling farm, before entering a licensed premises.

Albury trainers Mitch Beer and Donna Scott have been harshly affected by the restrictions, with not only horses stranded in Victoria, but also staff who reside in neighbouring Wodonga.

Some of Beer's stable staff, who lived on the Victorian side of the Murray River but within the border travel bubble, have been living in temporary accommodation in Albury in order to keep their jobs.

Moruya-based Natalie Jarvis was another country trainer known to have been impacted by the ban on horse movement.

Racing NSW chief steward Marc Van Gestel yesterday said that the state industry's governing body would not be easing the ban on staff, despite Victorian Premier Daniel Andrews moving regional areas to step three of its Covid-19 recovery plan.

"In terms of personnel, we are taking advice from our biosecurity expert who provides us

with updates as we go through to these matters," Van Gestel told ANZ Bloodstock News. "The changes there (in Victoria) don't really assist us all that greatly because the processes are with the border bubbles.

"For instance, an (employee) who is based at Albury, that lives at Wangaratta or Wodonga, can go to Albury, and is then able to travel to Wagga or Canberra race meetings, those persons can come in contact with the normal population or, alternatively, if those persons remain at Albury, there is still the potential for some infection to cross over to staff members, and we'd be in the position where there's the potential for it to have a (detrimental) impact on the industry."

Van Gestel added: "At this point in time, we haven't made any changes to our protocols, but we will continue to take our expert advice, and if there's some risk assessments that say that there's an acceptable risk, we might look to make changes.

"It is encouraging with the Victorian numbers and they're maintaining quite stable levels and the numbers are starting to come down at the same time, so they are all things we are considering."

There were 41 cases of Covid-19 reported in Victoria yesterday and there has not been a positive coronavirus case in the Albury-Wodonga area for 65 days.

The chief steward would not be drawn on the identity of Racing NSW's biosecurity expert when questioned yesterday.

Meanwhile. Van Gestel also stated that the horse movement protocols between Victoria and NSW were operating satisfactorily.

"The (horses) are going to spelling properties and they are doing 48 hours turnaround and then being moved into stables," he continued.

"We're processing applications on a daily basis and that seems to be working quite well at the moment."

# Shadwell back in business as \$2 million Tapit colt stars at Keeneland

ith a barrage of bidding firepower lighting up the board at Keeneland, the final minutes of the September yearling sale's elite Book 1 were so electric on Monday that buyers and sellers alike could almost forget about the coronavirus cloud that has subdued enthusiasm for bloodstock.

Among the final 11 horses to go through the ring during the second of two Book 1 sessions, four surpassed the magic seven-figure threshold, including a \$2 million (approx AUD\$2.73 million)

Tapit (Pulpit) colt who became the overall sale leader and a \$1.9m (approx AUD\$2.59) Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday) filly who took over the top position for her gender.

"It was a frantic end to the session," exclaimed Keeneland director of sales operations Geoffrey Russell. "Under the current circumstances, we are very pleased with the session. We are back to that great intensity of bidding, the going back and forth. The atmosphere and electricity returned, so that is wonderful."

"For 30 minutes at the end of the sale, we felt like there was no Covid," added Keeneland president-elect Shannon Arvin.

Overall, 100 yearlings were reported sold for a gross of \$44.535m (approx AUD\$60.81m) and an average price of \$445,350 (approx AUD\$608,000). Just as during Sunday's opening Book 1 session, however, more than half the horses catalogued were either withdrawn or reported as not meeting their reserve prices.

In looking at Book 1 figures for the two days combined, including ten additional sales reported after bidding action ceased on Sunday, 216 yearlings have been sold for a total of \$86.445m (approx AUD\$118m) and an average of \$400,208. Fourteen yearlings were sold for \$1m (approx AUD\$546,400) or more, including nine on Monday.

Those figures are down, not surprisingly, from the first two sessions in 2019, when 240

horses were sold for gross of \$101,183,500 (approx AUD\$138,152,400) and an average of \$421,598 (approx AUD\$575,635). With 2019's Book 1 comprising three sessions, 20 yearlings were sold last year for \$1m or more including the \$8.2m sale-topping American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile) half sister to Into Mischief and champion Beholder (Henny Hughes).

# Shadwell ramp it up after sluggish start

Monday's session started sluggishly, and it took a seven-figure boost from Hamdan Al Maktoum's Shadwell Estate Co. to transform the almost plodding pace to the more breathtaking level long associated with the September sale.

About midway through the session, Rick Nichols, general manager of Shadwell Farm in Lexington, bid \$1.6m (approx AUD\$2.18m) - at that time, the highest price of the sale - for a Medaglia D'Oro (El Prado) filly who is a half-sister to Group 3 winner Sergei Prokofiev (Scat Daddy), who was in the news himself on Monday with his move to Whitsbury Manor Stud.

That bid was the first major transaction of the auction on behalf of the Maktoums, who typically lead the September marketplace with purchases for Shadwell and Godolphin.

Nichols said he had received the go-ahead

from Sheikh Hamdan before the session started to acquire some top fillies, although he noted that the directive was for quality, not quantity.

He said of Sergei Prokofiev's half-sister: "She's just a beautiful filly, extremely well bred, and her conformation is correct. She is just one of those you've kind of got to have. [Shadwell's] broodmare band [in America] is starting to get a little old, so we need to rejuvenate it a little bit. We're out looking for a nice colt but mainly concentrating on some nice fillies."

Shadwell finished the session with three purchases, all by Medaglia D'Oro and including one colt, for a combined \$2.475m (Approx AUD\$3.38m).

Breeder and consignor David Anderson of Anderson Farms in Ontario paid tribute to the \$1.6m filly's dam, the nine-year-old Tapit mare Orchard Beach, whose first four foals have now been sold as yearlings for a total of \$4.05m.

"She's just been outstanding," he said. "I bought the grandmother [the Unbridled's Song mare Song And Danz] in foal carrying Orchard Beach. Unfortunately, when I brought Orchard Beach to [2012 Keeneland September] sale, she came up lame. I bought her back [for \$200,000]. It was just a fluke.

"And here she is. She's put a lot of food on the table for my family.".

# Son of Tapit swaggers to the top

The biggest star of the day, however, was the swaggering, sale-topping \$2m grey son of Tapit bred by Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Farm as the second foal produced by Grade 1 winner Tara's Tango (Unbridled's Song). He was consigned as hip 435 by Eaton Sales, agent for Stonestreet.

It took the combined forces of four major operations to secure the Tapit colt: Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, which campaigned Tapit's Belmont Stakes (Gr 1, 10f) winning son Tapwrit in partnership; Gainesway Farm, which stands Tapit and Tapwrit; Robert LaPenta, another partner in Tapwrit, and Winchell Thoroughbreds, which raced and retained a major interest in Tapit.

Aron Wellman of Eclipse said Banke thought so highly of the colt that she wanted to be involved with the ownership group.

Wellman told reporters: "Hopefully between all of us we have plenty of good mojo. All I care about is that you are interviewing our partnership after [the colt] wins a Grade 1."

Banke added: "He has a lot of energy. He's also speedy and he's the man. I view him as being an excellent, excellent prospect,"

Like Orchard Beach, Tara's Tango is blazing a trail as a commercial broodmare. Last year, Godolphin paid \$2.15m for her first foal, a Medaglia D'Oro colt who has been named Alexander Valley and who is in training at Belmont Park in New York for his debut.

#### Best in for Into Mischief

Just minutes after the Tapit colt was sold, Larry Best of OXO Equine continued his acquisition of offspring by leading American sire Into Mischief when paying \$1.9m (approx AUD\$2.59m) for a filly out of the Medaglia D'Oro stakes-winning mare Taylor S, a half-sister to Grade 1 winner Liam's Map (Unbridled's Song) and promising young sire Not This Time (Giant's Causeway).

Best bought four yearlings in the first :

two sessions for a total of \$4.1m (Approx AUD\$5.6m), with his purchases including two fillies and a colt by Into Mischief and a colt by Pioneerof The Nile (Empire Maker).

"Book 1 has been unbelievably strong - it blew away my expectations," said Best, who focuses on the very top of the market.

But Best is not the only one collecting yearlings by Into Mischief, who sired recent Kentucky Derby (Gr 1, 10f) winner Authentic. The Spendthrift Farm stallion led all Book 1 sires with 20 yearlings sold for a total of \$13.085m (approx AUD\$17.87m) and an average price of \$654,250 (approx AUD\$893,300). Two other seven-figure fillies by Into Mischief were sold on Monday with each costing \$1.025m (approx AUD\$1.4m).

Donald Adam of Courtlandt Farm bought hip 275, produced by a stakes-placed granddaughter of undefeated champion and Broodmare of the Year Personal Ensign (Girolamo), while Liz Crow signed the ticket on behalf of a client she would not disclose for hip 405, a half-sister to Grade 1 winner Gift Box (Twirling Candy).

# Medaglia D'Oro also on most wanted list

Joining Into Mischief, Darley's Medaglia D'Oro also racked up three seven-figure yearlings sold on Monday, including hip 442, the \$1.4m (approxAUD\$1.91m) half-sister to Grade 1 winner Salty (Quality Road) acquired by agent Robbie Medina on behalf of Joseph Allen.

One hip later, a Medaglia D'Oro filly out of stakes winner Thirteen Arrows (Stop Traffic) was sold for \$1.1m (approx AUD\$1.5m) to What Time Is It Racing, represented by UK native and current California-based trainer Dan Blacker.

The principal of What Time Is It Racing is new to the sport, said Blacker, who added: "This filly just seems like a superstar. I am really thrilled."

In other high-level action, Texas-based veteran owner Mike Rutherford continued to wager on the success of Triple Crown winner American Pharoah by spending \$1.2m (approx AUD\$1.64m)

on the stallion's daughter out of Grade 1-placed Modification (Vindication), who was cataloged as Hip 291.

"Probably too expensive, but she was beautiful, the best filly I've seen, a powerhouse," said Rutherford, who has previously raced the likes of Grade 1-winning fillies Lakeway (Seattle Slew) and Cara Rafaela (Quiet American). He noted that he currently has six offspring of American Pharoah in training.

American-based buyers dominated the action in Book 1 as coronavirus travel restrictions and worries clearly played a role in reducing international trade. However, Japan's Yuji Hasegawa, who in 2019 spent \$1.5m at this venue on the Tapit full-brother to dual American champion Unique Bella, has been successfully bidding via the internet, Russell indicated.

After receiving information from advisors on the sale grounds, Hasegawa bid from Japan to land a pair of beautifully bred colts by Tapit and Arrogate (Unbridled's Song) for a total of \$1.575m (approx AUD\$2.15m).

The \$825,000 (approx AUD\$1.12m) Tapit colt, sold late on Monday, is the second foal out of Breeders' Cup Distaff (Gr 1, 9f) winner Stopchargingmaria (Tale Of The Cat), whereas the \$750,000 (approx AUD\$1.02m) son of Arrogate is a half-brother to Grade 1 winner Weep No More (Mineshaft). The price for the Arrogate colt is the highest paid to date for a yearling from the late stallion's first crop.

# It's time to end the whip debate - and here's how

hen will the protracted and generally silly debate, reignited last week by Racing Victoria, over whip rules come to and end?

When the use of the whip is banned.

And that's what should happen short of an independent study producing irrefutable evidence that it is necessary for the jockey's safety. I'm not aware of such a study. I can scarcely recall seeing a jockey dramatically employ the whip as a safety tool.

Would an incredibly dangerous job be made significantly more perilous in the absence of a whip? Perhaps there are other measures which could be taken to make race riding safer but, historically, such notions have generally been paid lip service only by administrators.

As it is, the jockeys - certainly the best of them - are gradually phasing out the whip themselves. Take a look at Willie Pike on Perfect Jewel winning the Group 3 Cockram Stakes at Caulfield on 29 August.

The last race at Flemington last Saturday is also worth a look. September Run and Swat's That finish full of running under hands and heels from their (fine) respective riders Craig Williams and John Allen.

Interestingly both draw the whip, in almost token fashion, when the race is all but over which I can only put down to force of habit or perceived expectation. A habit created, mostly, by trainers throwing kids on the chaff bag or mechanical horse with a stick in hand.

Proposed rule changes still hinge on a number of strikes which is patently absurd. Does one strike too many deserve sanction? What about two or three?

I would argue there is no longer such a thing as "appropriate" encouragement.

What about the jockey who brazenly flouts the rules in an Everest or Melbourne Cup and

then produces the expert witness to declare the jockey suffers from dyscalculia?

Giles Thompson, CEO of Racing Victoria, last week said: "It is Racing Victoria's view that progress on whip reform is needed now, and that the industry nationally, acting in its best long-term interests, should continue to work towards a prohibition on the use of the whip for purposes other than to protect the safety of horses and jockeys. It is critical that jockeys are permitted to carry a whip to ensure their safety, and jockey safety is something that we will always advocate."

This stance is commendable but comes with, in the interim, another rule change based on the number of strikes.

Why not act now? Perhaps RV would charge me with not understanding the politics and the behind the scenes machinations of such a move.

I would counter with the fact that, in this extraordinary year, the maxim of "where there's a will there's a way" has never been better demonstrated than with the near instant application of social restrictions and economic support via packages such as Jobkeeper.

The simple facts are that, in this era, using the whip is an unacceptable look and rules based on number of strikes are unworkable.

It is not the thin edge of the wedge. A ban of whips will not precipitate a raft of other changes.

This is an issue which racing itself effectively created when it moved away from the long term "excessive use" ruling. It was not prompted by tens of thousands marching down the street.

This argument is just as irrelevant as the one which asserts the "new" whip doesn't hurt - it just makes a noise. Well, mimic the noise. It's all red herring stuff.

The simple facts are that, in this era, using the whip is an unacceptable look and rules based on number of strikes are unworkable.

Even the equestrian world is beginning to acknowledge there's an appetite for change as was outlined, last year, in a report to the International Society for Equitation Science.

"You would be well removed from reality not to recognise that there is significant pressure for change and we've addressed that. To sit and do nothing would run the risk of decisions being made which would not be suitable to our members, or in our view, may not be in the best interests of the industry," AJA chairman Des O'Keeffe told ANZ Bloodstock News last year.

O'Keeffe added that the Australian Jockey's Association (AJA) was opposed to a wholesale ban on the use of the whip citing the whip "as a vital piece of equipment for any horse rider with regards to safety and appropriate encouragement."

I would argue there is no longer such a thing as "appropriate" encouragement.

This debate, last year, saw prominent owner Lloyd Williams say "there is no place in the modern world for whips" and Giles Thompson asserted "I don't see the whip being sustainable in the long term."

Victorian Jockeys' Association chief executive Matt Hyland, who said his association was not consulted before last week's RV announcement, rebutted last year's push for change saying: "Until you ride trackwork or in a race you have no idea how important they are to safely guide a horse."

That may be fair enough but the whip's use to "safely guide a horse" can now be its only acceptable use.

# JobKeeper 2.1 & extra help for Victorians

n Covid world, economic circumstances can change quickly, this forcing the Government to extend the JobKeeper program to beyond the original 27 September 2020.

The first changes to the JobKeeper program were announced in late July (i.e. JobKeeper 2.0), and before we could get a new release out, they changed again around 2 weeks later on 7 August 2020, i.e. this update known as JobKeeper 2.1. JobKeeper 2.1 was released as a direct result of the worsening economic conditions in Victoria due to its Covid "second wave" and resulting lockdowns.

We knew we were safe to advise on 2.1. when, on 15 August 2020, the Government passed the legislation for these new rules, extending the JobKeeper Payment **until 28**March 2021. The extra payments will be:

- subject to further decline in turnover tests for a business;
- 2. would be paid at reduced rates;
- there may possibly be an extension of the deadline for a business to pay employees to satisfy the wage condition; and
- other issues relating to the wage condition and eligibility of individuals.

This release also covers:

- The expansion of eligibility for employees who are hired by 1 July 2020;
- The third round of Victorian
   Government Business Support Grant

- supplementing the JobKeeper program; and
- The Victorian Business Survival and Adaptation Package.

#### 1. Business Eligibility

In order for businesses to receive further payments they will need to demonstrate that they have met the relevant continuing decline in turnover tests to be eligible for JobKeeper for each preceding quarter.

#### 1.1 December 2020 Quarter Test

From 28 September 2020, businesses and not-for-profits will be required to reassess their eligibility with reference to their actual GST turnover in the September 2020 quarter. They will need to demonstrate that they have met the relevant decline in turnover test during this quarter to be eligible for the JobKeeper Payment from 28 September 2020 to 3 January 2021.

This is different from JobKeeper 1.0 in that projected turnovers are no longer allowed and monthly turnovers are no longer considered. We also note that the alternative tests for JobKeeper 2.0 are at the moment unchanged.

The threshold rate for the decline in turnover continues to be set at 30% for businesses with an aggregated turnover of \$1 billion or less. Businesses with an aggregated turnover of over \$1 billion has a turnover threshold of 50%.

### 1.2 March 2021 Quarter Test

From 4 January 2021, businesses and not-for-profits will need to further reassess their turnover to be eligible for the JobKeeper Payment. They will need to demonstrate that they have met the relevant decline in turnover

test with reference to their actual GST turnover in the December 2020 quarter to remain eligible for the JobKeeper Payment from 4 January 2021 to 28 March 2021.

#### 2. Reduced JobKeeper Payments

The JobKeeper payment rates will be reduced for both the December 2020 and March 2021 quarters.

#### 2.1 December 2020 Payment Rates

From 28 September 2020 to 3 January 2021, the JobKeeper Payment rates will be: \$1,200 per fortnight for all eligible employees who, in the two fortnightly pay periods before 1 March 2020 or 1 July 2020, were working in the business or not-for-profit for 20 hours or more a week on average, and for eligible business participants (e.g. if business as no employees) who were actively engaged in the business for 20 hours or more per week on average in the month of February 2020; and \$750 per fortnight for other eligible employees and business participants (i.e. those working less than 20 hours or more a week on average).

#### 2.2 March 2021 Payment Rates

From 4 January 2021 to 28 March 2021, the JobKeeper Payment rates will be: \$1,000 per fortnight for all eligible employees who, in the two fortnightly pay periods before 1 March 2020 or 1 July 2020, were working in the business or not-for-profit for 20 hours or more a week on average and for business participants who were actively engaged in the business for 20 hours or more per week on average in the month of February 2020; and \$650 per fortnight for other eligible employees and business participants.

#### 3. Wage Condition Deadline

Given the possibility that it may take an amount of time for a business to assess their eligibility for JobKeeper, they could be put them in a position that they have assessed that they are eligible to the JobKeeper payment AFTER the end of a particular JobKeeper fortnight (e.g. the fortnight ending 11 October 2020) and would be in a position where they haven't yet paid each eligible employee the JobKeeper amount.

The ATO will have discretion to extend the time an entity has to pay employees in order to meet the wage condition, so that entities have time to first confirm their eligibility for the JobKeeper Payment.

## 4. Issue relating to the wage condition and eligibility of individuals

The most notable coming out of JobKeeper 2.1 are:

- 20 hours per week for "eligible business participants" (EBPs) how will the "20 hours per week on average for EPBs without payroll records? Under 2.1, the partial rate of \$750 (from 28 September) and \$650 (from 4 January) will apply where the individual was actively engaged for less than 20 hours per week on average. The term "actively engaged" is not defined under the JobKeeper rules and has never had to be measured this precisely; and
- New employees who have previously nominated with a former employer There is a restriction in the JobKeeper rules about preventing an individual from being an eligible employee if they have given a nomination notice to another entity, or the ATO will prevent new employees (i.e. employed since 1 March 2020) from being eligible where they have previously nominated with a former employer. It is clear this rule was designed to prevent two employers claiming JobKeeper for the same individual for the same employee at the same time.

However, there cannot be a risk of 'double dipping' in this case as the previous employer is unable to continue to claim JobKeeper for an employee who has been terminated. The policy intent to include more employees in JobKeeper

based on a later employment date of 1 July 2020 will be very limited unless this rule is amended.

## 5. The expansion of eligibility for employees who are hired by 1 July 2020

From the fortnight beginning 3 August 2020, any employees who are hired by 1 July 2020 (was previously 1 March 2020) and meet the previous JobKeeper nomination requirements, will also be eligible to receive the JobKeeper payment.

## 6. Third Round - Victorian Government Business Support Grant

To support businesses impacted by Covid-19 restrictions, a third round of one-off grants will be made available to eligible businesses under the Business Support Fund – Expansion program.

The amount of the one-off grant will be from \$10,000 to \$20,000 for employing businesses in Victoria.

This grant is designed to supplement the JobKeeper Program for Victorian employers who are doing it tough. To be eligible for the grant, a business must:

- Operate a business in Victoria;
- Be part of the JobKeeper program;
- Employ people (other than the business participant);
- Be registered with Worksafe on 30 June 2020:
- Have an annual payroll of less than \$10million in 2019-2020 (ungrouped);
- Be registered for GST;
- Hold an ABN at 30 June 2020;
- Registered with your responsible Federal or State regulator; and
- There may be implications for businesses with adverse findings by regulators, under external administration, deregistration (or petition to deregister) etc.

If the business' annual payroll is less than \$650,000, it will receive \$10,000. If its annual payroll is between \$650,000 and \$3 million, it will receive \$15,000. If its annual payroll is between \$3 million and \$10 million, it will receive \$20,000.

## 7. The Victorian Business Survival and Adaptation Package

The Victorian Government is investing \$3 billion to help businesses impacted by ongoing restrictions and prepare for COVID Normal business. The package will help businesses survive and keep Victorians in jobs.

- Grants of up to \$30,000 will be provided specifically for Victorian licensed bars, restaurants, pubs, clubs and hotels.
- A competitive grants program will support metropolitan and regional business chambers and trader groups.
- Grants of up to \$20,000 to help alpine businesses pay a service charge to Alpine Resort Management Boards.

There will be additional funding, tools and resources to help businesses adapt and prepare for reopening under COVID normal settings:

- \$20 million voucher program to assist sole traders and small businesses in building their digital capability;
- \$15.7 million package to help Victorian exporters get their products to market and establish new trade channels; and
- \$8.5 million expansion to the 'Click for Vic' campaign to encourage more Victorians to support local businesses.

There will be tax and cashflow support from the Victorian Government:

- \$1.7 billion in payroll tax deferrals for the full 2020-21 financial year;
- \$41 million to bring forward the 50% stamp duty discount for commercial and industrial property for all Regional Victoria:
- \$33 million to defer the planned increase in the landfill levy for six months;
- \$30 million to waive 25% of the Congestion
   Levy this year, with the outstanding balance deferred;
- \$27 million in liquor license fee waivers for 2021; and
- \$6 million to waive Vacant Residential Land Tax for vacancies in 2020.
