Melbourne lawyers living the Slipper dream with share in star colts **Profiteer and Stay Inside**

Couple hit the jackpot as Newgate swoops on stallion prospects in a matter of weeks

elbournian couple Nadia Angelo and Anna Dodgshun are on the equine ride of their lives, sharing in the ownership of arguably Australia's most valuable two-year-old colts, leading Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) seeds Profiteer (Capitalist) and Stay Inside (Extreme Choice).

In a tale defying the odds, not once In a tale defying the odds, not once but twice, the lawyers have two unbeaten colts, Victoria's speedball Profiteer and Sydney-trained Stay Inside, a colt with an electric turn of foot, who have propelled the couple into racing's high-stakes stallion game where money starts at millions, not thousands.

Mick Kent Jr, the co-trainer of ruling Slipper favourite Profiteer, said it best when he alerted a significantly large racing audience about Angelo's and Dodgshun's luck.

"Are Anna and Nadia the luckiest owners you've ever seen? Buy a share in a couple of inexpensive colts. Both syndicated to Newgate Farm and both sitting atop the betting for the Golden Slipper, (It's) like winning the lottery twice," he posted on social media.

Profiteer, the last-start winner of the \$2 million Inglis Millennium (RL, 1200m), is a \$4 favourite for the Slipper, ahead of Stay Inside (\$6) who made it two from two when putting four lengths on his rivals in a matter of strides in the Pierro Plate (1100m) at Rosehill, and the margin would have been significantly further had jockey James McDonald not sat up and smiled for the cameras a 100 metres out from the winning post.

Angelo, speaking to ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday, tried to make sense of a whirlwind few weeks - and the month ahead - which has been years in the making.

"It's pretty lucky, isn't it? I suppose the story goes way back a little bit, but ultimately, we ended up in Profiteer because we raced horses with Roll The Dice Racing and the guys who run that syndicate, Rob (Norton), Leigh (Saville) and Steve (Travaglia), are good mates of ours," she explained.

"We used to have a horse of ours back in the day called Gredington who used to race against theirs in Mahuta and Mahuta kept beating Gredington

in fairly decent races like the Carbine Club Stakes and the Sandown Guineas.

"There were a few races where we pitted up against each other, so we ultimately thought it was better to be in the same horse together, so we started buying shares with them."

And while not the first horse the women have had with Roll The Dice, he is certainly the best.

"I remember one day Rob called us and said, 'I think Jeremy (Rogers) has found us a really good one. He's a nice Capitalist colt,' so my partner Anna and I had a look and we took a share in him," said Angelo, Racing Victoria-owned media outlet Racing.com's lawyer.

"We had an idea that he was a nice colt and he was going through his first preparation, but he kind of blew us away (at Flemington in December).

"(Mick Price and Kent Jr) are level-headed and they don't get overexcited and build up too much expectation.

"We expected him to run well, don't get me wrong, but we were always wary that we needed a two-year-old to run up the straight at Flemington and obviously he had to put it all together in his maiden race."

Such was the manner of the two-and three-quarter length victory, downing spruik horse Ranveer (Winning Rupert) in the process, it left ratings gurus raving and Newgate Farm's Henry Field on the phone to connections soon after negotiating a deal to buy into the son of the stud's first season sire Capitalist (Written Tycoon).

<< Continued from page 3 The deal was done a week before the Millennium and it was a new experience for Dodgshun and Angelo. They bred their first foal born at Stockwell Thoroughbreds last year from a well-bred mare who had her last start in a \$4,500 Victorian picnic race, but syndicating stallion prospects is a whole new ball game.

"That's the first time for Anna and I, but obviously the Roll The Dice boys have had other horses and experience (with studs) but certainly not to this kind of level. So, it was very exciting to have been told that Henry (Field) had called," she said.

"This links in with the Stay Inside story. The boys I am with in Stay Inside also raced Extreme Choice. I wasn't in the horse, but I followed him very closely with them.

"I went to all of his races and he was almost my horse by default, so then Henry did the deal with them before the Golden Slipper in 2016 I think it was. They had that experience and we decided we had to race his progeny, which is why we ended up in Stay Inside.

"To do the deal on Profiteer with Henry and Newgate in January and a couple of weeks later for Stay Inside, it feels unheard of to me. We're incredibly lucky."

Despite the financial windfall - and the possibility of massive "kicker" payments to follow if either colt wins the Slipper - Angelo says the money is the furthest thing from her mind.

Profiteer and the Richard and Michael Freedman-trained Stay Inside

are set to clash in the Todman Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick on Saturday week before the \$3.5 million Slipper at Rosehill on March 20.

"The money's not the driver. From our perspective, we're just excited to know that the horses are going to have a really good life, especially at a leading stud, and the cash that comes with it is just a bonus," she said,

"The next few weeks is going to be pretty nerve-racking and I suppose when there's that much at stake it makes it more exciting.

"I said to my partner I don't know how I am going to sleep for the next four weeks and she is in the same boat,"

As for their increased exposure, Dodgshun and Angelo have also received a first-hand example of the reach of social media after news of Stay Inside's acquisition by Newgate Farm was revealed.

"Anna happened to pick up ANZ (Bloodstock News') tweet and retweeted it and all of a sudden Mick Kent Jr retweeted that and it has just literally taken off overnight," she said.

"You don't spread it around and you don't want to mozz yourself or anything like that. All of a sudden, it has become a bit of a story."

The couple's thoroughbred family numbers an ever-expanding 22 and there is another Extreme Choice two-year-old in training with Mitch Beer at Albury and they also bought into about five of Roll The Dice's Magic Millions purchases.

There might be a few more if Stay Alive and Profiteer continue their winning ways in some of the country's biggest races.

First for Astern

Two of Darley's first season sires produced new individual winners yesterday as Seradess (2 f ex Obsidian Dragon by Hidden Dragon) dead-heated with Cloudy (Frosted) in a thrilling finish to the Roll The Dice Racing 2YO Fillies Maiden Plate (1000m) at Bendigo. The former was a first winner for Astern (Medaglia D'Oro), who won the 2016 Golden Rose Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and was subsequently second in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m). Trained by Mark Kavanagh, Seradess was ridden by Joe Bowditch who believed he had collared the Jamie Kah-ridden Cloudy as his mount joined that duo on the line. "You think you've beaten her (Kah) and she still gets you," Bowditch told Racing. com. "She was very green, she took everything in today and had a good look around, so I would think she'll improve a lot from that." Bred by Quality Thoroughbred Breeding Joint Venture, Seradess was bought by her trainer from the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, realising \$50,000 from the Mill Park Stud draft. She is the first winner from the stakes-placed Obsidian Dragon (Hidden Dragon), who is herself a three-quarter sister to the Listed scorer Danedina (Danehill Dancer). Astern covered 72 mares at a fee of \$22,000 last year, while Seradess is one of 112 live foals to have come from his first crop.

Three for Frosted

Cloudy's (2 f ex Applegate by Exceed and Excel) dead-heat at Bendigo yesterday was the third individual Australian winner for Darley shuttler Frosted (Tapit). Trained by James Cummings, the Godolphin homebred ran third behind stablemate Ingratiating (Frosted) and General Beau (Brazen Beau) in the Maribymong Trial (Listed, 1000m) at Flemington on October 3, while she got off the

mark at the fourth time of asking despite idling under Kah's urgings. "She was just wandering around, she just needed another horse to take us a bit further," Kah told Racing.com. "When the leader (Audrey Girl) stopped, she just wanted to do a bit wrong. The team placed her lovely today, she's maturing every race. She was a bit fierce last start and today she was in a really good rhythm and comfortable. A dead-heat is better than nothing." Cloudy is a half-sister to last season's city-placed juvenile Favell (Street Boss), being out of Ottawa Stakes (Listed, 1000m) heroine Applegate (Exceed And Excel), who herself is a half-sister to Summer Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) winner Yulalona (Dubai Destination). Cloudy joins Ingratiating and Frost Flowers as southern hemisphere winners for Frosted, with all three having already achieved black type. Frosted covered 131 mares at a fee of \$22,000 in 2020, while he is currently standing at Darley's Jonabell Farm in Kentucky for a fee of US\$25,000 (approx. AUD\$31,650).

Entries open for MM National Sale

Entries are now open for the Magic Millions National Sale, which will be held at the Gold Coast throughout May and June. The weanling element of the auction is scheduled for a two-day run across May 20 and 21, while broodmares will come under the hammer between May 25 and 28. Yearlings will be offered across three days from June 2 to 4, with the session of racehorses also offered on June 4. This year's auction will also feature the Shadwell dispersal. Entries for the weanlings, yearlings, race fillies and broodmares close on March 19, while entries for racehorses close on May 25. "We are delighted to again present vendors with the opportunity to nominate for one of the world's leading bloodstock auctions - the National Sale," Magic Millions managing director Barry Bowditch said in a statement. "Not only is the National Sale the peak sale of its type in the southern hemisphere year after year, it is the biggest and best because it delivers the perfect vehicle for all participants to sell and purchase bloodstock across every level. The Shadwell dispersal will be one of the most anticipated auctions on the sales calendar in many years. This will create a huge opportunity for all sellers to capitalise on the momentum that this will generate."

Tagaloa 'spot on' ahead of Guineas

Co-trainer Natalie Young has issued a positive bulletin on Tagaloa (Lord Kanaloa) ahead of his outing in Saturday's Australian Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m). Last year's Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner struggled to find his form in the spring, but he recorded a first victory since those Group 1 heroics when taking out the CS Hayes Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) second-up on February 13 and the three-year-old is reported to have thrived since. "He is really great," Young, who trains Tagaloa in partnership with Trent Busuttin, told Racing.com yesterday. "I couldn't have asked him to come through that last race any better. He did a nice bit of work this morning on the course proper. He really towed me to the line at the 1200 metres and just rolled into it nicely. It was very similar work to what it was going into the CS Hayes. I can't fault Tags, I reckon he's going to be spot on." Tagaloa's last-start win was achieved with on-speed tactics and Young said Luke Currie, who retains the ride, will be issued with the same instructions at the weekend. "I think that's the best way to ride him, to be honest," she said. "He's got that real high cruising (speed). He can really sustain that long 1000-metre gallop to the post and I think that's where he gets a few of his competitors off the bit and under pressure early. I think we will stick to that - Currie knows him really well."

Annabel Neasham has confirmed that Listed winner Mo'unga (Savabeel) will not line-up in the Australian Guineas and is set to remain in Sydney to contest the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) on March 6. Formerly trained by Chris Waller, for whom he won the Dulcify Quality (Listed, 1500m) at Rosehill on September 12, the three-year-old made an eye-catching debut for Neasham when running on to take third in the CS Hayes Stakes.

"We left our options fairly open but with Covid, I couldn't get down there after he ran (in the CS Hayes) so I brought him back up (to Sydney)," Neasham told Sky Thoroughbred Central. "I just felt that a young horse like that, he's only had a few starts in his career, I didn't want to travel him twice in two weeks (to Melbourne). He's come through the run really well, he actually galloped out here (at Canterbury) with Prague on the weekend and you'll probably see him wear blinkers in the Randwick Guineas." Tommy Berry has been booked to ride Mo'unga for the first time in the Randwick Guineas, having partnered him in his first barrier trial for Neasham on January 21.

Poland 'similar to Alabama Express'

Mike Moroney has likened his Australian Guineas contender Poland (So You Think) to last year's star three-year-old Alabama Express (Redoute's Choice), who flew the flag for the stable when winning the CF Orr Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m). The progressive Poland has won two of his five outings, while he heads into the weekend assignment off a last-start success in the Autumn Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Caulfield on February 6. "I'm pleased with the improvement he's made from the spring to the autumn, I think he's improved a lot, which he needs to be up to these (in the Australian Guineas) but I think he has," Moroney told Racing.com. "He's always had it (ability) there. He was pretty immature mentally and physically in the spring, but I think he's really turned the corner. It's pretty similar to what happened with Alabama Express last season as well, and I'm sure he's well up to these sorts of horses."

Four Moves Ahead to line-up in Sweet Embrace

The Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) campaign of exciting filly Four Moves Ahead

(Snitzel) is back on course after she impressed her trainer John Sargent in a crucial trackwork gallop at Randwick yesterday morning. A two and three-quarter length debut winner on the Kensington track last month, Four Moves Ahead was scratched from last Saturday's Silver Slipper Stakes (Gr 2, 1100m) after she kicked out and injured a knee while in her box in the lead-up to the contest. However, Sargent said he was happy with how the filly has recovered and confirmed she would take her place in the Sweet Embrace Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Randwick on Saturday. "She did everything right this morning so we can put that behind us," Sargent said yesterday. "Nash (Rawiller) galloped her over half a mile and she came back well. She's a natural two-year-old with a lovely attitude and she's very tractable." Rawiller has been booked to ride the youngster, who is one of 18 nominations for Saturday's \$200,000 prize.

Samadoubt wins trial

Group 1 winner Samadoubt (Not A Single Doubt) edged closer to a return to racing with a five and a quarter-length trial success at Canterbury yesterday. Trained by Bjorn Baker, the 2019 Winx Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) winner has not been seen in competitive action since running fourth in the Craven Plate (Gr 3, 2000m) that October, but he built on last month's promising trial third behind Hungry Heart (Frankel) when coming readily clear of last year's George Ryder Stakes (Gr 1, 1500m) winner Dreamforce (Fastnet Rock) under Tim Clark.

Prague takes out Canterbury heat

On an informative morning of trials at Canterbury, last start Eskimo Prince Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) third Prague (Redoute's Choice) is likely to remain in Sydney after winning the fifth heat over 905 metres. The Annabel Neasham-trained entire settled second behind Jungle Edge (Dubawi) before running past the renowned wet-track specialist inside the final 100 metres to score by a length and a quarter in 53.51 seconds. "He's a bit relaxed in the gates and he was a bit slow away again but he mustered much quicker today, so hopefully that'll sharpen him up for his next assignment," Neasham told Racing.com. "He's not on a Guineas path so I didn't feel the need to take on all the Guineas horses. To me, he's showing that he's going to stay around that 1200 to 1400-metre range. I suspect he'll stay in Sydney, but we'll mull on that for the next few days." Meanwhile, Mick Bell expressed his delight with Jungle Edge as the veteran builds towards a fifth tilt at the Challenge Stakes (Gr 2, 1000m) at Randwick on March 6. "He looked real good," the trainer told Racing.com. "I was a little bit worried he might not be forward enough, he's been in work a long time but I only gallop him when the track is soft." Jade Darose will partner Jungle Edge in the Challenge having maintained her partnership with the ten-yearold yesterday morning.

Classy mares impress in trial

Dual Group 2 winner Haut Brion Her (Zoustar) and Sangster Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) heroine Bella Vella (Commands) were split by just a short-head as the two classy mares dominated the sixth heat of the morning over 905 metres. The latter was ridden by Jason Collett and trainer Will Clarken told Racing.com after the workout: "Jason reported she had to work a little to cross but was lovely and relaxed once she found the front. He also added it felt like she wanted to be there and was up for the contest when Chris (Waller's, Haut Brion Her) got alongside her in the straight. The plan is to run her on March 6 but at the moment I'm not sure whether that will be in Sydney in the Challenge Stakes at Randwick or if we divert to Melbourne that same day and have a crack at the Newmarket at Flemington. With her pending sale at the broodmare sale on the Gold Coast in June, the one thing we do know is she is very much a race-by-race proposition

Dalasan pleases Macdonald in trial

Dalasan (Dalakhani) is being set for a first-up tilt at the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) after pleasing co-trainer Leon Macdonald in a trial at Morphettville yesterday morning. The four-year-old was last seen running seventh in the Mackinnon Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) on November 7 and he worked promisingly under Jason Holder. "We've never dodged a challenge with this bloke before and he has done a mighty job along the way," Macdonald, who trains in partnership with Andrew Gluyas, told Racing. com. "Bearing in mind his fresh record is hard to fault and that he also won the Danehill up the straight at Flemington as a three-year-old, we are going to have a crack with him at the Newmarket first-up. Beyond that the intention is to head on up to Sydney and run firstly in the George Ryder and then to the Doncaster."

Williams hopes Run can break Newmarket hoodoo

The weights for the Newmarket were revealed vesterday and the Chris Waller-trained September Run (Exceed And Excel) is hot favourite to land the \$1.25 million feature having been allocated 52 kilograms. The threeyear-old made a striking return to action when running on to take second behind stablemate Nature Strip (Nicconi) in the Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Flemington on February 13, while victory in the Newmarket would be a landmark one for her jockey Craig Williams, who has yet to land the prestigious handicap. "She drops in weight for her run the other day in weight-for-age and she was awesome in defeat," Williams said at the VRC's autumn carnival launch yesterday. "She is such a weapon down the straight and the way she has come back you either hope they hold their form or hopefully improve, but she has definitely improved and I am really excited about her. She has trained on really well." Nature Strip and last year's Newmarket winner Bivouac (Exceed And Excel), who ran fifth in the Lightning, are joint top-weights on 58.5 kilograms.

Elite Street set for Friday jump-out

Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner

Elite Street (Street Boss) will undergo an important jump-out this week as he prepares to bounce back from his disappointing Melbourne debut. The four-year-old suffered internal bleeding when he ran a distant last in the Lightning Stakes, but Daniel Morton retains faith that Elite Street can revive his campaign ahead of the Newmarket. "He will have a jumpout on Friday with Mark Zahra," the trainer told The Races WA. "I want him to have another go down the Flemington straight. I'm hoping if he has any mental scars from his run the other day this will help him overcome it. He had five days in the paddock after the Lightning taking it pretty easy. He's now at Flemington after being at Caulfield with Nick Ryan. The five days in the paddock coincided with a brilliant spell of Melbourne weather. He got good sun on his back and looks in terrific shape. But if there are any problems with him, he will be coming straight home. I won't be taking any risks, but that decision will be made closer to race day."

Provisional ASM emergencies named

The Lindsay Park-trained Fifty Stars (Sea The Stars) is first in line to gain a start in the All-Star Mile (1600m) at Moonee Valley on March 13 after Racing Victoria released the list of provisional emergencies yesterday afternoon. The emergencies are chosen in order of prizemoney earned - excluding bonuses - in races from 1200 metres to 2050 metres (inclusive) since last February 1. Reigning Australian Cup (Gr 1, 2000m) winner Fifty Stars heads the chasing pack ahead of the Ciaron Maher and David Eustace-trained Away Game (Snitzel). Tagaloa is currently the third emergency with Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott's dual Group 1-winning mare Shout The Bar (Not A Single Doubt) rounding out the top four. All four horses are expected to run this weekend in an attempt to boost their chances of getting into the field by gaining a wildcard.

Rocketing By set for Inglis Dash

Rocketing By (So You Think) will be out to add another lucrative prize to his already formidable record when he lines-up in the \$500,000 Inglis Dash (1100m) at Flemington on Saturday. The progressive colt has won his last three starts, including the \$1 million Inglis Sprint (1200m) at Randwick on February 6, taking his record to four wins from eight outings for prize-money of \$722,115. "He's done a great job the horse and there are a lot of people really excited by him," the three-year-old's trainer David Pfieffer told Racing.com. "He's come a long way this preparation and there could be further to go. After Saturday, he comes home and we'll look at a race like the Arrowfield (Sprint). It's another \$1 million race and it's a Group 2."

O'Brien to pay late fee for Paradee

Danny O'Brien has confirmed he will pay Monday's late entry fee for the Australian Cup with rising star Paradee (Epaulette). The talented four-year-old won her third race in a row when she claimed the Peter Young Stakes (Gr 2, 1800m) at Caulfield on Saturday, with that performance confirming to O'Brien that she is worth supplementing for the Group 1 on March 6. "Initially she wasn't in the noms because we'd been up to Queensland and we thought that we wouldn't produce her to later in the autumn," O'Brien told Racing.com. "But she has just done so well post-Queensland that we ran her in the Peter Young. She put in the sort of performance that suggests she's going to be right in the mix in the Australian Cup. So that's the way we are going to go."

Sky High for The Chosen One

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained The Chosen One (Savabeel) is likely to begin his Australian path towards the Sydney Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) in the Sky High Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) at Rosehill on March 13. The five-year-old was beaten just a neck by Etah James (Raise The Flag) in the Sydney staying feature last year, while he returned to action with a promising second in the Herbie Dyke Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) on February 13. "At this stage he won't race for another three weeks from last Saturday," Forsman said. "The Sky High Stakes will lead into probably the Tancred and then hopefully the Sydney Cup."

Adkins to return at Gosford today

Andrew Adkins will make his return to action at Gosford today when he takes his first rides since suffering serious injuries in a fall at Rosehill last July. Adkins suffered a broken leg, collarbone, ribs and a punctured lung in the controversial incident which resulted in Hugh Bowman being suspended. Adkins, who spent more than two weeks in hospital before continuing his lengthy recovery at home, has three rides at Gosford and a further four at Wyong tomorrow before returning to the city meetings at Canterbury on Friday and Randwick on Saturday.

Iamican in hat-trick bid

Iamican (I Am Invincible) will attempt to post her third successive win when she lines up over 1350 metres at Ipswich today. The four-year-old disappointed last campaign, failing to win in six starts, before connections put her away for the spring. She steps up in distance today after winning over 1000 metres at the Sunshine Coast last month and 1200 metres at Ipswich on February 3. "She's come back in good shape and this looks a nice race for her," Iamican's trainer David Vandyke told Racing Queensland. "Mentally, she's working things out a lot better this time in and sometimes when they win it improves their confidence."

Laming fights stomachtubing charges

The legal team representing Richard Laming and two stable hands yesterday told a hearing before the Victorian Racing Tribunal that all three of the defendants deny charges of an alleged race day stomach-tubing of Jamaican Rain (Manhattan Rain). It is alleged that in November 2019 the trainer illegally stomach-

tubed, or attempted to stomach-tube, Jamaican Rain, who was listed to race that day in a Group 3 contest at Flemington. Laming faces two charges out of the raid carried out by the compliance assurance team following a surveillance operation, while stable hands Marnu Potgieter and Zeyaur Rahman each face one charge of being a party to the alleged stomach-tubing, or attempt to do so. The hearing continues today and is due to run until Friday.

Magic Millions unveil new SA contest

A new \$120,000 race exclusively for three and four-year-olds sold at Magic Millions sales will become part of the South Australian racing calendar. Racing SA and Magic Millions yesterday announced the 3&4YO Classic, to be run over 1400 metres at Murray Bridge from 2022. The race will become an integral part of the new Magic Millions raceday, which will be held at Murray Bridge for the first time on Saturday, featuring the state's richest juvenile race, the Magic Millions SA 2YO Classic (1200m). Racing SA CEO Nick Redin said the innovative 3&4YO Classic would expand the appeal of many yearlings that go through Magic Millions sales, and provide extra opportunities for owners to become involved with competitive and winning horses. "We know that a significant number of two-year-old Magic Millions runners are bred for speed and run accordingly, but this new race promises to provide a different option for some horses, their owners and trainers," Redin said. "It gives incentive to buyers at the upcoming sale to look for horses that will get over further distances. It's a win for breeders and a win for owners." The 2021 Adelaide Yearling Sale will be held on March 9 and 10.

Winks' mentoring skills in high demand

Group 1-winning jockey James Winks is establishing himself as one of racing's most in-demand coaches, just six months after he was forced to quit riding following a Syncope diagnosis. "I think the boys that I've been working with have felt that it's been great to relate to somebody that knows what they're thinking and going through, especially after the races," Winks told Racing.com. "Jockeys lose a hell of a lot more than they win and they've got to learn mentally to deal with it themselves and I think it's important that they start to get teams around them so that's what I'm trying to give to everyone." Winks is currently working with ten jockeys across Victoria and New South Wales, including Group 1 winners Jordan Childs, Regan Bayliss and Zac Spain.

Thoroughbred Industry Careers supporting Pony Club Championships

Thoroughbred Industry Careers (TIC) yesterday announced it will continue its major sponsorship of the Pony Club Australia National Championships, to be held this September at the Benalla Equestrian Reserve in Victoria. The event, which attracts the best riders from right across Australia, presents TIC with a prime opportunity to promote careers in the thoroughbred industry and source potential trainees and future employees. A new "Ride to Time" competition will be introduced this year, which it is hoped will further strengthen the synergies between horseracing and equestrian sports.

Apache Cat undergoes radiation treatment

Eight-time Group 1 winner Apache Cat (Lion Cavern) is expected to be back at Living Legends by the weekend having successfully undergone eye surgery. The gelding, who was diagnosed with a squamous cell carcinoma to his right eye recently, received his first dose of radiation by equine veterinary eye specialist Dr Andrew Turner, assisted by human radiation therapist Faye Tuchtan, at South Eastern Equine Clinic vesterday.

Millie will always be a part of the history of Trelawney. Both Cherry and I, along with past and present clients, want to thank Millie for his dedication and commitment to excellence and wish him well for the future." Walls said his decision to depart Trelawney Stud was not an easy one, but felt the timing was right to embark on a new venture. "Brent and Cherry have been consolidating their operation over the past few years," Walls said. "I feel this is the right time for me to step down from my role and seek a new challenge. I would like to thank Brent and Cherry for their support and the opportunities they have given me and I am proud of what we have achieved over the past 22 years."

Group 1 winner Julius retired

Connections of Julius (Swiss Ace) have decided to call time on the career of the Group 1 winner after abandoning plans to run nine-year-old in next month's King's Plate (Gr 3, 1200m) at Ellerslie. It's not the first time the nine-time winner has entered the retirement paddock, having been forced away from the track following his third-placing in the 2018 running of the Sweynesse Stakes (Gr 3, 1215m) after scans revealed he had a hole in his nearfore tendon. His trainer John Bell received positive reports the following year and it was decided to bring the talented sprinter back into work. "We put him out on a large sheep station on the west coast, and we just let him

run around there for quite some time," Bell said. "The only reason why we got him back was because he was chasing the sheep around, he was that well." Julius came back and won in Group 3 company, before recording his first elite-level victory in the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day 2020. "He has been an amazing horse, he's an incredible animal - what he has done and won," Bell said. "It's been a wonderful journey. His last race was going to be the King's Plate, which was the Darley Plate when he won it, but he has done enough and doesn't have to prove anything more. He has been a very popular horse and he has always performed."

Bonny Lass set for Group 2 test

Matamata trainers Graham Richardson and Rogan Norvall head to their local meeting on Saturday with talented yet unassuming filly Bonny Lass (Super Easy) in the Matamata Breeders Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m). An impressive debut winner over the course and distance in late January, Richardson is pleased with the progress of the filly, who upstaged highpriced yearling colt Noverre (Savabeel) when breaking maiden ranks, with that runner enhancing the form by winning comfortably at Whanganui last week. "She's a very natural two-year-old. She just gets up and does what you want her to do and she is not silly about it," Richardson said. "She has only had the one trial and the one race and has just done everything as a professional. She is athletic and is going to be a better three-year-old. She came up quicker and is more of a natural than we thought she would be. What we do after this we are not sure yet. We will keep an eye on her physically and see what her shins are

Auckland Cup likely for Sinarahma

Allan Sharrock will be hoping it's a case of like mother, like daughter, if Sinarahma (Darci Brahma) lines-up in the Auckland Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) at Ellerslie next month. Sharrock trained Sinarahma's dam, Shez Sinsational (Ekraar), to win the 2012 edition of the two-mile feature, and he believes her six-year-old

daughter has the potential to do the same. The mare has only been tested up to 2000 metres, but Sharrock said there are a couple of factors that have influenced his decision. "I have changed tack," Sharrock said. "There is a possibility I might run her in the Auckland Cup. She has always been strong in her races late, it is worth \$500,000, she probably comes into the race at 53.5 kilograms, and her mother won it. Dee And Gee won the New Zealand Cup and she's a Darci Brahma. I have always been of the opinion that a good miler can win the Auckland Cup, as a long as you settle. We will pay a late nomination the week prior, if I am happy enough to go there." Sinarahma has pleased her trainer with her recent performances, including when runner-up behind Melody Belle (Commands) in the Thorndon Mile (Gr 1, 1600m), after missing the start, and running fifth in the Herbie Dyke Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Te Rapa earlier this month.

Surprise package for novice breeder

When Tracey Schroeder bought herself an 'old plodder' to ride and potter around with, she got a lot more than she bargained for. She bought Pretty Woman (Pins) as a reeducated thoroughbred to ride under saddle but has ended up with a valuable broodmare whose first foal is the Southland Guineas (Listed, 1600m) winner Chokito (Vespa). "It's incredibly exciting following Chokito and watching her win," Schroeder said. "One of my daughters had a thoroughbred eventer but other than that I had never had anything to do with thoroughbreds until I got this mare. Chokito winning makes owning the mare ever so special." Chokito has now won four races from ten starts. She won three times at two, and this season she has been placed at each of her four starts, including a third placing in the Gore Guineas (Listed, 1335m). She is part-owned and trained by Warwick Coles who purchased her for \$1700 as a foal in a two for one package on Gavelhouse.co.nz.

HK: Aethero wins trial

Aethero (Sebring) pleased his trainer Caspar Fownes at Sha Tin yesterday morning as he ramped up his preparation toward a return to the races. Sha Tin's 1000-metre course record holder appeared to move freely and with relative ease under championship leading jockey Joao Moreira as he crossed the line first in a barrier trial by a comfortable two lengths, clocking 46.09 seconds. "It was a pleasing trial - it's nice to bring him back and the track condition was beautiful this morning, we just gave him an 800-metre trial and he's come through it nicely," Fownes said. Touted as the heir apparent to Hong Kong's sprinting ranks, the gelding's rise to stardom was put on hold after he was found to have bled in last April's Chairman's Sprint Prize (Gr 1, 1200m), before early season aspirations were scrapped when he suffered a tendon injury last September. "We've just brought him along nice and easy there is no doubt that he is something special, we just need a little bit of luck and we've certainly given him every chance to make a successful comeback - hopefully we can bring him back to his best," Fownes said.

HK: Grateful Heart, Scores Of Fun bid for DBS x Manulife Million Challenge glory

Championship-leading trainer John Size is placing his faith in Scores Of Fun's (Reward For Effort) exceptional resilience as the sprinter shapes to bid for ultimate glory in the DBS x

Manulife Million Challenge at Happy Valley tonight. The four-year-old will line up for his 12th start of the season when he contests the Class 3 Sing Woo Handicap (1200m), hopeful of adding to an impressive 2020/21 haul of three wins, five seconds and a third. If the gelding is again successful, and Grateful Heart (Written Tycoon) finishes outside of the top two in the Class 1 Blue Pool Handicap (1200m) two races earlier, Scores Of Fun will clinch the DBS x Manulife Millions Challenge - and the HK\$650,000 (approx. AUD\$107,000) first prize. Size and Grateful Heart's trainer Danny Shum have claimed four of the past five the DBS x Manulife Millions Challenges and Size is hopeful Scores Of Fun can prevail after triumphing at the city circuit last Wednesday. "He's been in very good shape as the form guide tells you, he goes to the races consistently and he runs the same race every week, so those horses who are consistent all the time, they've always got something else up their sleeve," the trainer said. "He wouldn't surprise me if he ran another good race. There's nothing wrong with him, otherwise he couldn't come back within seven days. His form, he manages to maintain it - he's consistent and, again, he'll have a chance of winning a race."

US: Major studs take legal action against stallion cap

Three of Kentucky's biggest stud farms have filed a lawsuit challenging the US Jockey Club's rule to restrict thoroughbred stallions from breeding with more than 140 mares each year, branding the decision to introduce a so-called

stallion cap a "blatant abuse of power". The complaint, filed on behalf of Spendthrift Farm, Ashford Stud and Three Chimneys Farm, argues that the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission has unlawfully delegated power to the US Jockey Club, and that the new rule breaches the constitutions of Kentucky and the US, as well as federal and state antitrust laws. Commenting on behalf of the plaintiffs, B. Wayne Hughes of Spendthrift Farm said: "The introduction of the stallion cap by the Jockey Club is a blatant abuse of power that is bad law, bad science and bad business." The Jockey Club announced the rule on May 7 last year which, beginning with stallions foaled in 2020, limits the number of mares which can be bred to a stallion in a calendar year to 140. The lawsuit was filed in the US District Court, Eastern District of Kentucky, Central Division.

UK: Godolphin Stud and Stable Staff Awards winners revealed

Rebecca 'Beck' Edmunds of Bryan Smart Racing has been named Employee of the Year at the 2021 Godolphin Stud and Stable Staff Awards. Edmunds receives £10,000 (approx. AUD\$17,820) for winning the award, while a further £10,000 will be shared among her colleagues at Bryan Smart's yard. Edmunds was also the recipient of the Leadership Award, earning herself and her colleagues an additional £5,000 (approx. AUD\$8,910). North Yorkshire trainer Smart nominated Edmunds in recognition of the "exceptional knowledge, unwavering dedication and loyalty" she has brought to his yard over 17 years of service.

Murrulla Stud's Tim Nolan has penalty reduced to 11 months on appeal over horse deaths

unter Valley nursery Murrulla Stud has been granted permission to continue to trade bloodstock, but its principal Tim Nolan will not be allowed to attend thoroughbred sales for the next 11 months after the NSW racing appeal panel yesterday handed down its decision relating to the death of two horses last year.

Nolan was disqualified for two years in December by Racing NSW stewards after broodmare Pending Decision (Strada) and a Dissident (Sebring) yearling colt were both sent to Kankool knackery in May or June last year where they were destroyed.

A licensed breeder, Nolan had not sought certification from a veterinarian or written approval from Racing NSW for the horses to be euthanised, which is required under the rules of racing, and he pleaded guilty to two charges as a result. Nolan said at the original hearing that he was unaware of the rule at the time of the offences.

He also pleaded guilty to providing false or misleading evidence to Racing NSW deputy chief steward Wade Birch on October 26 and to chief steward Marc Van Gestel in a phone call two days later, leading to the initial penalty, but he launched an appeal against the severity of the penalty following the December 18-imposed sanctions.

He was initially penalised for two years relating to the death of Pending Decision, 18 months for the death of the Dissident yearling as well as being handed a fourmonth disqualification for providing false and misleading evidence, to be served concurrently.

At the initial hearing, Racing NSW chief executive Peter V'landys amended the penalty term, which allows Murrulla Stud to buy and sell bloodstock at various Australian sales and related events during the term of Nolan's disqualification, but he is not allowed to attend horse sales himself

Nolan was allowed to attend the recent

Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale and Inglis Classic Yearling Sale in Sydney while he waited for his appeal to be heard, which was conducted on February 12.

In the judgment handed down yesterday by the appeal panel, chaired by Richard Beasley SC accompanied by panel members Judy Foley and Jim Murphy, it took into account evidence tabled at the original hearing, which found Pending Decision had a hoof injury "associated with laminitis in the right hind limb" in a report compiled by Dr Peter Carrigan on November 11. It was an issue which Pending Decision had suffered for four years. She also slipped a foal in April 2020, a consequence Nolan believed was due to the laminitis.

The Panel found: "Clearly, this decision (to send her to the knackery) was not based on the expert judgment of a veterinarian. However, the appellant has long experience with horses, which guided his decision. He felt she 'didn't have any quality of life due to her lameness."

The Dissident colt, of whom Nolan was a part-owner and breeder of, suffered a "deep foot infection" of the right hand foot, Dr Carrigan found, and the issue was managed from March 19 last year until April 6 when the problem had deteriorated and deemed the horse's prognosis as "pretty poor".

Although a veterinarian's opinion was not sought by Nolan prior to the colt's death, Racing NSW veterinarian Dr Toby Koenig agreed that euthanising the horse was an option which "would need to be taken into consideration and balanced

against the significant invasive procedures that would be required" to treat the horse.

In defending his initial misleading evidence to the stewards - it was corrected about a week later -Nolan said he was "confused and panicked" when receiving the phone call from Birch, in which he claimed Pending Decision had died from colic, a position he repeated to Van Gestel.

On appeal, Nolan was handed a reduced nine-month disqualification for the death of the two horses and a four-month ban - two months of which is to be served concurrently - for providing false or misleading evidence.

The panel said that the breaches of the rules were "towards the lower end of the scale" and kept the alteration of the rules implemented by V'landys in place for the period of the reduced penalties.

"Before setting out our reasons, the panel wishes to make one matter very clear. We understand the importance of (the welfare rules). Its stated objective is 'to ensure the welfare of thoroughbred horses from birth, during their racing careers and on retirement," the judgment read.

"It is a rule that goes to the heart of serious welfare concerns relating to the racing industry. A breach of either (of the rules) has the potential to cause a great deal of damage to the image and integrity of racing. Mr Van Gestel submitted, correctly, that breaches of these rules can have a seriously negative impact on what he described as racing's 'social licence'.

"The panel accepts that. We also understand that the purpose of imposing a penalty for breach of these rules is the protection of the image and integrity of the sport, and to send a message to the racing public and the public in general that racing will not tolerate conduct of the kind caught by these rules.

"However, the panel has an obligation to reach what it considers to be a just decision based on all of the relevant facts relating to the breaches of (the rules) here."

Nolan was contacted by ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday but he did not wish to comment.

The 11-month disqualification is due to expire on January 23 next year.

Neither was a saint but each generous of spirit and wonderful company - the loss of two press-room greats

aul Haigh and Ray Huxley died within three weeks of each other this year. Same age, 76. Same lament, prematurely - notwithstanding well lived lives and immeasurable contributions to the written word on horseracing.

Their funerals were last Thursday, thousands of kilometres apart. From Aberystwyth in Wales to Malvern in Victoria, Australia.


It would be inaccurate to describe these two great racing journalists as close friends. However, they were acquainted and had they lived in the same country - let alone the same city - I have no doubt they'd have been the best of mates.

They first met in Hong Kong. Hucka proffered Hoto (Haigh of the Orient) such sage advice on specific punting and travel endeavours, Haigh was moved to ask - at our next meeting - "why had I not earlier introduced him to the great man?".

Each wrote beautifully. Haigh perhaps a little more acerbic and whimsical, Huxley a little more Runyon-esque when the mood took him.

Often, at least to me, it seemed they were able to create wonderful prose despite work being considered a necessary evil and an unwelcome distraction from pursuing other pleasures including the punt.

They brought wit and charm and what might be called the pathos of the punt to the coverage of horseracing - an art which may not be extinct but is certainly on the endangered list.

They thrived through a time when nobody, even those with no interest in horseracing, needed an explanation of what you actually did when your job description was "racing writer".

Their genius was centred on the ability to capture imaginatively and often romantically their observations and to cut to the heart of the matter. The mundane pursuit of quotes, which is absolutely mandatory for the rest of us mere race writing mortals, was often simply not required.

"Huxley was a beautiful writer but he wasn't one for filling his stories with quotes," observed Danny Power in his Inside Racing obituary.

Haigh, on day one of his stint with the Hong Kong Jockey Club, confided in me: "you know I've never really done this...in thirty odd years of writing about racing".

That is, gone to the track early in the

morning in pursuit of a line or two from a trainer or jockey. He simply hadn't needed to.

May God and the Carlyon family forgive me but sometimes I preferred many of the best of Huxley's musings to the wonderful horseracing observations of Les Carlyon. Carlyon knew and wrote about the courage of great horses, but Huxley perhaps better knew that some were more courageous than others and frequently and fearlessly bet accordingly. Haigh's writing never disappointed.

Haigh and Huxley were quick-witted, quirky, irreverent and anti-establishment.

They stood apart from, not all, but most of their contemporaries, not so much because of their ability, but simply because of who they were and thus young journalists craved their acceptance or approval.

Haigh and Huxley were a "few" years older

than me. The precise number matters less and less as you get older but the gap not so great as to eliminate any thoughts of your own mortality.

With that also comes a sense of dread about the mainstream coverage of horseracing. Daily newspaper coverage continues to diminish and, in many cases, where still reasonably abundant it lacks impartiality, flair and amusement.

I cannot speak for the UK, but in the early years of Huxley's career in Melbourne there were more than 30 people employed covering racing in some fashion or another. The Herald-Sun no longer has racing writers, it's all outsourced.

Yes, there's a multitude of websites servicing the converted but any sport will quickly slip down the pecking order without prominence in daily newspapers and free-to-air television. It's then a rapid path to elimination from the mainstream psyche and their relevance and then, worse still, to no community support or downright opposition to the sport.

Haigh and Huxley could have readily and eloquently, in print, put any racing naysayers back in their box. They wrote in a style which engaged even those with just a passing interest in horseracing.

Both had forthright opinions which they were happy to express publicly. That was certainly the case in 2009 when Haigh resigned from the Racing Post and, rightly or wrongly, lamented that the publication had become a "cheerleading tip sheet whose agenda is being dictated by bookmakers".

Whether that was true then (or now), he was somewhat clairvoyant in predicting the influence corporate bookmakers would have on racing coverage in England and Australia.

Alan Byrne, chief executive and editor-inchief of the Racing Post, was able to put those differences aside in the Racing Post's obituary. He said: "Paul was an immense talent, a real prose stylist. We were lucky to have his beautifully crafted columns adorning the paper for so many years.

"He upset plenty of people along the way, but sometimes that is what columnists do. When he left us, you could say that he slammed the door behind him on the way out. But that should not detract from the amazing contribution he made to the Racing Post over a long period. We extend our sympathy to his

family and friends following Paul's sad passing."

A good turn of phrase and generally resisting over-embellishment were keys to Haigh and Huxley copy.

Haigh, anything but an ordinary man, seemed to understand all men while Huxley certainly understood punters.

Huxley, wrote of the Cox Plate winner Our Poetic Prince whose Brisbane campaign in 1989 was probably one campaign too many: "Like a boxer who hangs around for the one fight that will ruin his reputation, the brilliant Our Poetic Prince isn't dancing anymore. Yesterday he once again became a punching bag for those with faster feet when..."

He recalled Flemington trainer Tony Lopes asserting the perfect filly should have "the head of a princess, the neck of a duchess and the backside of a cook" and that Dandy Andy's 125-1 win over Vo Rogue in the Australian Cup was such a surprise "that had Russ Hinze won gold on the parallel bars it could hardly have caused a bigger shock".

Haigh's books The World's Greatest Racecourses and The Racehorse Trainer are excellent. Even the former. I wondered how he would make descriptions of racecourses brilliantly entertaining but, somehow, he did. It began with the wonderful tale of the advent of the horse box (float) and Lord George Bentinck's sting with Ellis in the 1836 St Leger (a tale Huxley would have loved).

And while fireside chats were not his long suit, he always managed to summarise the contemporary world and even get to the heart of Ryan Moore's public reticence in a 2014 TRC interview. He wrote:-

"We live in an age of overstatement and exaggeration. It's one in which helpless laughter is considered the ideal default position; tears of joy or horror are more or less mandatory, and "OMG!!!" is the normal reaction to even the mildest bit of new information. Reserve, on the other hand, is often misinterpreted as arrogance. Shy people are mistaken for "stuck up." People who play life mostly with a straight face are often dismissed as dull.

"Or even – ridiculous misapprehension in this case - dim-witted.

"Ryan Moore has never been an air puncher. In his youth, already recognised as something of a successor to the incomparable Lester Piggott, not just in terms of talent, but in his reluctance to deal with the media, he got a reputation for being "difficult." What was that about? Was it shyness?

"The question amused him. "I think I'm still difficult," he said, smiling. "No, it wasn't that exactly. Early on I was a bit shy. And then I was told I wasn't very good at talking to camera. So I thought 'OK.' I just like to think about things more than I like to talk about them I suppose. That's all it is."

Paul and Ray were great fellows. Ray introduced me to Mickey Newbury and the real version of American Trilogy made more famous by Elvis - and to Lagavulin and to one of its natural habitats, the Bar at the Peninsula

in Hong Kong. Paul's passion for many things, including test cricket, was infectious and reinvigorating. He was the best of company at so many international race meetings and in Melbourne when he was working on The World's Greatest Racecourses.

He was later mortified that he had not acknowledged the "little" assistance I'd given him. Not that I was bothered by that.

Brough Scott, in the foreword to that book, asked if the author was "a wasted scholar or just a race fan with a travel pass" before describing him as "the most entertaining, exasperating and enlightening writer of his era".

He also provided some background to Haigh's fascinating heritage about which he'd always been a little vague. The name Haigh came from his step-father.

His natural father was a Russian named Yelin whose father was a court musician in St Petersburg and mother a half French, half Ethiopian model in Paris. Haigh's racing fire was lit at Ascot - in Perth not Berkshire - when he attended university in Western Australia.

Huxley was born in Newcastle but soon after moved to Melbourne and lived in Brunswick and then Braybrook - running his mother's bets to the SP (starting price) bookmakers who operated in various locations including laneways. His stepfather worked at The Truth newspaper which gained Huxley a foot in the door of the newspaper world which would become his life and, in which, he'd be followed by siblings Dennis and Glenn.

Hucka's fortunes on the punt were a greater roller coaster than that at any amusement park. However, he never ever failed to settle - even if it was a while coming home on some occasions.

John Berry, following Haigh's death, wrote that "the British racing press room has lost one of its legends".

Friend, punter and former journalist Lawrence Wadey describes Haigh as "the best company and so extraordinarily modest". Friend, punter, journalist and constant travelling companion Neil Morrice said "the launch of the Racing Post led to a friendship I'm certain few such political polar opposites could achieve. Following the erudite Paul was an enriching experience".

In Aberystwyth, his daughters Victoria and Catherine could not hide their grief as they spoke of the father they loved. I watched, and aside from anything else, was so sad at the thought that his great joy of grandfather-hood had been cut short.

In Malvern, former race caller Bryan Martin was the celebrant at Huxley's funeral which was capped at 20 attendees, largely his racing journalist mates and wife Val and siblings Dennis and Sandra. Keith Hillier, Pat Bartley, Shane Templeton and Brian Meldrum affectionately relayed many a Huxley tale.

Neither was a saint but each generous of spirit and wonderful company. Much deserving of a few words, however inadequate by their standards, penned in their memory. And there should be no cap on the number of words written about these two men.






